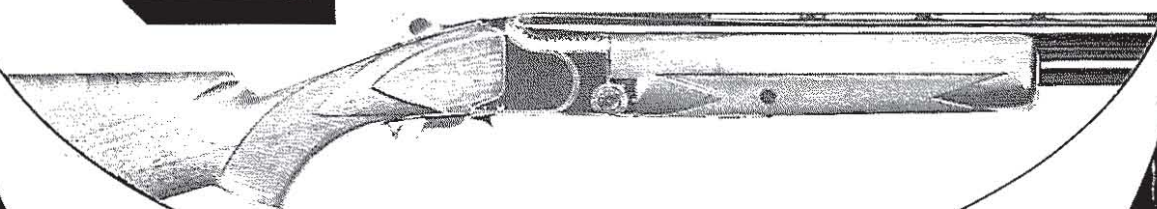

Editor's Notes



The October 1975 issue of ACTA Shooting News commenced the 29th year of continuous publication.

* * *

To all club secretaries and advertisers alike, copy for all publications closes on the first day of the month preceding the date of publication.

Australia has been beset by many labour stoppages during 1974 and 1975 and it has been necessary to fully adhere to this copy closing deadline to ensure production and to maintain mailing schedules.

* * *

REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such Club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any such persons joining Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1976 affiliation fee of \$10 is due and payable on January 1, 1976.

All club shooter members are reminded that their 1976 Association fees are due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1976.

These shooter registration fees are \$10 for the 1976 calendar year, whilst juniors are registered for \$1 for the year. Juniors receive a handicap card; but do not receive any publications of ACTA "Shooting News". Registered juniors seeking the publication must register for the full \$10. Irrespective of the class of registration fee, juniors are included in the ACTA Public Liability Insurance Policy as published herein — coverage is to \$200,000 — whilst the premium is borne by the ACTA.

However, where registered ACTA persons have a common address, and are related, then on request only one copy of Shooting News is to be sent and a reduction of \$2 is permitted for the additional registered shooter at the time of registration.

Only subscribers to ACTA "Shooting News" may send \$8 direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

April 1976 "Shooting News" will be mailed only to those financial — that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 13, 1976.

As from January 1, 1975 clubs were to use metric handicap marks on the shooting lanes with targets to be thrown to the metric measurements of legal targets.

Handicap marks from 1-1-75 to be in one metre intervals from 1 to 25 metres, inclusive, on shooting lanes one metre wide, radiating out from the trap at the same angles as the existing shooting lanes.

* * *

All new installations to be constructed to the new metric measurements but it is not intended that existing traphouses or tower shooting stations be reconstructed.

Effective NOW, the inward movement of one metre on re-registration is completely discontinued.

The rules updated as at September 1975 are effective NOW and, as such, are to remain in force for a period of five years without alteration:

The shooting rules will soon be produced in pocket size rulebooks which will be then available as follows:

- (a) a free copy of the handbook to member clubs;
- (b) a charge of \$2 will be made to shooters seeking a personal copy of the rules handbook.

Meanwhile, clubs have been mailed a copy of this (November, 1975) publication of ACTA "Shooting News", which includes a pre-stapled but removable copy of the now newly applicable shooting rules.

Clubs seeking clarification or interpretations of the shooting rules, as published in November 1975, should contact their nearest Referee Examiners.

Reference, December 1974 Shooting News, page 5, column 1, item 16 — "a ladies interstate teams' match may be conducted during the same programme as an Interstate Trap Teams' Match using the same targets and conditions except that teams be of six ladies with best of five top scores to count".

RULES CORRECTION

1. The rules of the International Shooting Union as published within November 1975 ACTA Shooting News have evidently been superseded and we have requested a copy of the latest rules and amendments accordingly from the ISU.

2. Meanwhile the following amendments must be made to all copies:

(i) ISU Skeet — See page XXIII, item 10 (of November 1975 News) — delete last sentence and substitute: "If the shooter has scored the first 24 targets 'dead', he shall repeat the shot at another low house target for the 25th target before leaving the station."

(ii) ISU Trench — See page XXX, item 30 (g) — delete "4th" and substitute "3rd".

During October 1975, a selected sub-committee of executive committee members investigated the workload of the ACTA Secretary and the handicap card processing system, and decided that as insufficient monies had been made available in past years, and the office had only managed to obtain very second-hand equipment from time to time:-

1. Some \$1138.50 be allocated to the immediate purchase of a new filing system, plus \$379.50 for the first requirement of new record cards.

2. That, should we ever advance to a computer system, (minimum present day cost \$35,000) that a five digit shooter registration numbering system be commenced immediately. This number to appear on all shooter handicap cards commencing 1976 and on each shooter card file within ACTA central records, and ultimately on all shooting news wrappers. The number to be used in all correspondence from and to clubs and each such number never to be transferred or re-used.

3. Clubs, when forwarding 1976 shooter registrations, to use the existing registration form number 3 until mid 1976 when a pad of these forms will be forwarded to clubs for future use.

4. An individual sheet to be produced and supplied to clubs for shooters to fill in and hand to their club when paying annual registrations and club annual fees. Clubs to then retain these completed forms within their own files as complete records of their members each year. Clubs to transfer the information from these shooter forms to the registration list for mailing to ACTA.

5. Maintain the policy that where there is a difference between the club registration information, and that within ACTA records as to a shooter's handicap and class or grading that the greater numbered trap handicap or the lesser numbered skeet handicap grading be marked on the new handicap card.

6. That ACTA office be painted throughout to be more habitable.

Noumea (New Caledonia) announce that their 1976 Championship programme will be conducted during October 5-8, 1976, and they expect visitors from USA, Canada, Japan and France.

Breaks and long-run breaks are a credit to the shooter competitor but as some shooters do not seek badge recognition the recognised policy has always been that the shooter himself must lodge the claim to the shoot secretary for confirmation of his skill.

Concerning the 1975 National Championships, shooter R. L. Garth of Frankston G. C., Victoria, has now claimed recognition of a 246 break as the highest break shot in Tasmania to date — he produced this 246 total of broken targets during the 1975 National Championships at Tasmanian Gun Club, Launceston during 10, 11 and 12 March, 1975 over the National Single Barrel Championship 13, Australia-New Zealand Championship (50 + 27 in a shoot-off for 5th placing in "A" class + 10 in a shoot-off for ANZ Team selection), ANZ Teams' Match 20, Australian

International Trap Team 100, a shoot-off for International High Gun 20 thence in the champion of champions event 6 = TOTAL 246. It is hereby noted that shooter Garth shot 358:360 points in the Teams' Match plus the High Gun shoot-off. High Gun was won with 359:360 by S. Marshall of Hobart (Tas.).

Trapshooting endurances in USA

(With acknowledgements to Trap and Field, September, 1975)

On October 26, 1974, at Oak Grove, La., a five man team shot at 3000 clay targets per shooter commencing at 7.20 a.m. and finished at 9.45 p.m.

On Saturday 17-5-75 at the Singleton Rod and Gun Club, Oxford, Massachusetts, Winchester Western sponsored a marathon clay target shoot. Members of a six man team each shot at 4000 registered targets in 13 hours 37 minutes for a team average of .9750 (23,400 × 24,000). Highest individual average was Bill Anzaldi .9867 (3977 × 4000). Six Winchester Super X Model 1 autoloading 12 gauge trap guns each with full choke and 30 inch barrels were used and there were no malfunctions. "AA" traploads were used — 12 gauge, 2¾ inch shells, 1½ ounce loads, US shotsize 8. Traps were Westerns. Targets Winchester White Flyers. Weather sunny, moderate winds, temperature mid 80 deg. Fahrenheit. Some 300 attended.

On Saturday 21-6-75 five other trapshooters lined up at 6.00 a.m. at Pike's Peak Gun Club of Colorado Springs, Colorado and finished 19 hours 15 minutes after shooting at 4100 doubles targets each. Average was .9350 over the 20,500 targets. Around 10 a.m. it rained for an hour and a half but by noon the sun was out and the wind died down. At 7.30 p.m. a short break for a B.B.Q. steak then they continued under lights. At 11 p.m. the deputy sheriff drove up to advise that the neighbours were complaining about the noise but as the desired number of targets had not yet been reached they shot on. Each shooter used Remington R×P ammunition with light loads for both shots to minimise recoil effects.

Shot sizes were (US) 8½'s on the first and 7½'s on the second. There were no misfires. Each shotgun was a Remington 1100

Of further interest, the "Grand American" (equivalent of Australian National Championships) is now contested over 72 trapshooting layouts.

President's message

As we move rapidly through the year of 1975, I can look back to a satisfactory period of consolidation after the March elections.

If I have pleased and satisfied you it will be shown in the next (1976) elections, however, I can, and do, only go by the rules.

These rules as I see them, consist of three basics: "Safety, Equity, Sportsmanship".

We go out most afternoons at the weekends, to this our chosen sport, with our friends. Whether we win or lose is not the main objective. Remember that part of the Olympic Creed — "not to have won but to have taken part".

On the advice of a sub-committee, funds have been allocated to update the central recording system.

There will have to be some changes in our financial structure to keep up with the inflationary trend, these will be discussed at the Annual Meeting in Perth but unfortunately the decisions made there will not take effect until 1977.

This has been a rewarding year honoured by you electing me your President. I have visited each of the States, renewed acquaintances with old friends and have made many new ones. I have tried to make the Association not a policing organisation, but rather of a friend to assist and help the shooters.

Next February, we in the Eastern States will, I hope, cross Australia to Perth to join the "sandgroppers" at the Nationals — the best yet — the greatest line-up of high guns and trophies since their inception. I have seen the preparations at the Perth Gun Club and have promised them 300 visitors.

There, after six days of intense competition, we will have chosen the best 30 shooters to represent Australia — our greatest honour for any trapshooter.

Be in it fellows, let us show the W.A.'s how to get the guns and the team badges.

Now in closing, may I wish you all a safe and happy Christmas and a healthy and prosperous New Year. Good shooting; see you in Perth.

Observations by Steve Stevens

Having represented Australia as a trench style shotgun shooter at clay targets in the teams' section of the World Moving Target Championships at Munich, September 10-19, 1975, it is my opinion that this Olympic style of shotgun-shooting will not be accepted by the Australians from the existing down-the-line style of shooting, UNLESS we become aware of a number of contributing factors:

1. This is our chosen sport and whilst some say we only go to a club for sports sake, this is not so with

any single one of us BECAUSE, we all, each and everyone, seek individual satisfaction and this satisfaction is in improving one's own ability. If you shoot 99:100 several times, your individual feeling would be to further improve on your own performance.

2. One factor never to be forgotten is that in one other country, the shooters openly seek to shoot at quantities of clay targets in terms of thousands of cartridges — and who in this world wants to do that, because, remember the overall cost. Nevertheless, this appears to be the way many Australians are heading.

3. It appears to me that the 15 trap and 5 trap trench systems provide for us the individual challenge of achievement WITHOUT the likelihood of reaching a stage of shooting enormous scores in that the thrown targets are of a more challenging nature because of their speed and flight variation.

4. To my finding there has never yet been produced a fair and equitable method of handicapping. This belief is not because of not liking this or that but simply because I believe that there is no simple successful formula.

However, in trench shooting, whilst every shooter competes from the same shooting handicap, that is, from a common mark, each such shooter is handicapped to a particular grade — example: A grade, B grade, C grade or D grade — or as many grades as the attendance deems desirable by the respective performances. Such handicapping (in Europe) occurs for that day after the first round has been shot — that is, after 25 or 50 targets — depending on the prescribed type or number of target events.

It appears to me that you will not shoot a false score in your first round for the sake of your handicap as this would only influence your own result and the handicap grading only lasts for that day.

5. There are several differences in the styles of shooting down-the-line and trench but the basics are the same.

(i) The stance is exactly the same one for the other — feet in a comfortable position ensuring balance maintained no matter which direction the target takes.

(ii) The body has a slight lean into the gun for both styles of competition.

(iii) Observations of some of the world's current top shooters and coaches find that (assuming all shooters are right handers) the left hand and elbow are kept directly below and in line with the fore-end of the gun. The reason is that the target must be shot from the shooter's body. Thus, the left hand is kept underneath the barrel to prevent it directing the gun — it is merely to overcome the weight of the barrel(s). The right elbow is at an angle from the body suitable to that person. Canting, although considered a problem in Australia, is not so deemed in European competitive shooting.

(iv) The most accepted method of sighting is to shoot along the rib although some top shots prefer to shoot above the rib.

(v) It is most important that the gun never moves from the sighting position — shoulder or eye. This is the considered reason that stock length is increased for trench shooting as opposed to down-the-line shooting. The longer stock is less likely to move from sighted position even though the targets are faster and have a greater variation both vertically and laterally.

(vi) The accepted point and sight position is at the white marker on the trench, just below the lip.

The target must be sighted immediately it emerges. Most countries consider this the most important single factor in shooting targets. The more you concentrate on seeing the target emerge, the area appears to magnify.

(vii) Respectfully, the standard of shotgun cartridges as used in Europe appeared to be designed to be faster yet without noticeable recoil. Chokes of guns used in European Trench Shooting were mainly three-quarter-and-full and full-and-full, but, as all cartridges used contained a cup wad, choke was controlled by the wad and not the gun.

(viii) According to the answers coaches gave to competitors' questions regarding guns, the barrels need to be heavier by some five grammes to smoothen the swing.

Open season for protected game shooting throughout the Commonwealth — 1976

Today in all civilised countries, the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Native fauna is at all times the property of the Crown and is (a) permanently protected, or (b) protected, or (c) pest fauna.

The sale of wild game is forbidden in most States and eggs must not be taken for any purpose.

Complete information is available from the various State Departments as listed. Licences may be obtained from these respective addresses or from the various police stations.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Department of Fisheries and Fauna, 108 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, 6000 (phone 25-5988) from whom a free guide is available.

All visiting interstate or overseas shooters should present current handicap cards, identification papers and firearms at the first police station encountered in Western Australia for licensing.

The only game which may be taken in this State are ducks and quail.

There are two different open seasons for duck shooting:

1. Throughout the inland and northern areas, there is a continuous season.

2. In the south-west and Eucla Land Divisions, the season may be varied from year to year depending on biological conditions. The season dates and bag limits are:

Probably January 3 till provisional closing date yet to be confirmed (maybe March 27).

Licence — \$2.00; bag limit, 10 per day.

The open season for Stubble Quail only is usually January 1 to June 30 each year — all other species are protected.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

National Parks and Wildlife Service, 135 Waymouth Street, Adelaide, 5000 or Box 1782 GPO, Adelaide 5001.

Generally the open seasons on protected game species, such as various duck and quail, open on the 3rd Saturday of February annually.

The following is a guide from 1975 but proclamation changes each year and depends upon surveys.

No person shall:

(a) Shoot at animals or birds on any Sunday;

(b) Have a gun in his possession on any Sunday for the purpose of shooting at animals or birds on that day;

(c) Traps, nets, snares, nooses are prohibited.

Gun licences cost \$2 annually to those over 18 years. A firearms licence for persons under 18 years must be obtained from a police station. Gun licences do not authorise persons to shoot without the consent of the owner or occupier.

Dates awaiting confirmation and gazetting were:

Duck season: probably from 6 a.m. Saturday, February 21 until 6 p.m. Saturday, June 26.

Bag limit: 12 ducks per person per day of the following species only. Wood Duck (Maned Goose, Black Mountain, Grey Teal, Blue Winged Shoveller, Pink Eared, White Eyed, Chestnut).

Note: Musk, Blue Billed and Freckled Ducks must not be taken.

Special note: No ducks of the species listed above may be sold at any time.

Quail season: Bag limit 25 per person per day. South of 36 degrees latitude, probably from 6 a.m. Saturday, February 21 until 6 p.m. Saturday, June 26. North of 36 degrees latitude, probably from 6 a.m. Saturday, April 3 until 6 p.m. Saturday, July 26.

Snipe: Probably from 6 a.m. Saturday, February 21 until 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 31.

NORTHERN TERRITORY

Administration — Arid Zone Research Institute, Animal Industry and Agriculture Branch, P.O. Box 291, Alice Springs, 5750.

All shooting laws within Northern Territory are unchanged from previous years.

All firearms must be declared at the nearest police station into Northern Territory, for licensing and/or registering within two days of entry.

Ducks and Geese (except Magpie Geese, Burdekin Ducks and Pigmy Geese) — open season in all of Northern Territory, north of the 18th parallel of south latitude, from July 1, till October 30, annually.

Magpie Geese — open season in all of Northern Territory north of the 18th parallel of South latitude from August 1 to December 30, each year.

Buffalo and marine crocodile or red kangaroo are now protected over the entire Northern Territory and may be shot only under licence.

Other partly protected species may be taken after procurement of special licences.

Pests which may be destroyed at any time, other than in sanctuaries, include Feral (wild) rabbits, donkeys, pigs, camels, cats, goats, foxes, dingoes, wedge-tailed eagles and snakes of all species.

TASMANIA

National Parks and Wild Life Service, Magnet Court, Sandy Bay or P.O. Box 210, Sandy Bay, Tasmania, 7005.

Japanese Snipe: 4th October, 1975-31st January, 1976. Licence fee: \$2. Bag limit: 15 per day.

Wild duck: (Grey Teal, Chestnut Teal, Black Duck, Mountain Duck only. All other species are wholly protected). 6th March-30th May, 1976. Licence fee: \$3. Bag limit: 10 per day, of which not more than 2 shall be Mountain Duck.

Fallow Deer: 13th March-11th April, 1976. Licence fee: \$5. Bag limit: 1 per day; season limit, 3 deer.

Muttonbird: 27th March-30th April, 1976 (North and South).

Pheasant: (Adult Male Pheasant-King Island only). 5th June-13th June, 1976. Licence fee: \$3. Bag limit: 3 per day.

Japanese Snipe: 30th October, 1976-27th February, 1977. Licence fee: \$3. Bag limit: 5 per day.

VICTORIA

Subject to confirmation and press statements from the Fisheries and Wildlife Division, 1976, Firearms licences may be increased to \$9 for a 3-year period, with Duck licence possibly \$4, Quail licences possibly \$3, and Deer licences possibly \$12.

Fisheries and Wildlife Division, 632 Bourke Street, Melbourne, 3000.

Wild Ducks: from 3rd Saturday of March (20th) until 31st March.

Stubble Quail: from 1st Saturday of March (6th) to possibly March 27, thence from 1st Saturday of May (1st) to possibly last Saturday of June (26th).

Snipe (Jack): open July 1st to the following May 31st annually (i.e., closed month of June only).

Hog Deer: open only during the month of April.

(Note: shooters when obtaining licences also receive field shooting handbook. Handbooks will be available from police stations during January, 1976.)

NEW SOUTH WALES

Dates of open season: Duck — usually second last Saturday in February to last Saturday in April (10 weeks). Quail — first Saturday in May to last Saturday in July (12 weeks).

Bag limit: Ducks — variable according to seasonal conditions, for example — 1973 Duck Season — aggregate of 20 ducks on opening day and 10 ducks every other day.

Quail — variable according to seasonal conditions, aggregate of 25 quail per day and maximum of 50 quail in possession.

Licences: Game licence for duck and quail shooters (combined licence) are required and cost \$4.00 and are issued free to pensioners who present their pensioner card. Income from the sale of licences is used for wildlife management purposes. These are obtained from Clerks of Petty Sessions at all courthouses within New South Wales or at the office of the National Parks and Wildlife Service, 189-193 Kent Street, Sydney.

QUEENSLAND

National Parks and Wildlife Service, care Animal Research Institute, Fairfield Road, Yerongpilly, Queensland, 4105.

Open season fauna permit (personal use) \$5.

For the 1975 year the arrangements as provided within the Order in Council of 8-5-75 were:

Wild Duck (most species) open season varied accordingly to districts from 7-6-75 to 30-8-75 or 5-7-75 to 27-9-75 inclusive. Maximum 12 permitted to be taken each 24 hours.

Brown or Stubble Quail 14-6-75 to 30-8-75 inclusive. Maximum 12 permitted to be taken each 24 hours.

Snipe (Australian and Pin Tailed) 6-9-75 to 25-10-75. Maximum 6 to be taken each 24 hours.
