The Executive Committee decided that the 1977 National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland, commencing from Wednesday, May 25, 1977 -with the actual period of the Championships yet to be determined.

As indicated in December 1975, February and March 1976 publications, an Executive Sub-Committee, after investigation, agreed that the central records system be updated. Although in the long-term it will be of great advancement, its implementation has caused delays in the issue of the 1976 handicap cards, but these are being processed and despatched in the sequence in which they were received. The five-figure number as allocated to each shooter will remain permanently with that shooter and clubs are asked, when forwarding any information on handicapping, class shooting, change of address or future re-registrations, to quote both the number and the shooter's name - this would then help to overcome the varying use of shooter initials or nicknames or similarly named but different shooters.

The attention of all concerned is drawn to the following copy of a letter received by the New Zealand Clay Target Association from the New Zealand Customs Dept.:

"The department has received representations about the tendency of visiting International competitors arriving in New Zealand to take part in sporting activities, to bring in equipment which appears to be in excess of that normally required.

I would like to bring to the attention of your organisation that goods imported temporarily by visitors to New Zealand may qualify for duty concession provided certain conditions can be fulfilled. One of the requirements of the concession is that the goods must be for the importers own personal use and not for sale, gift or disposal in any other way.



Claybirding down under

Gunworld special report — "Things are done differently in Australian shotgunning circles, but the challenge doesn't change".

Launceston, Tasmania, was the scene of the 1975 Australian National Championships, sponsored by the Australian Clay Target Association. Titles were competed for by nearly four hundred Australian shooters. Visitors from New Zealand, New Caledonia and America were in attendance.

Although Australian skeet is exactly the same as in the United States, trapshooting has differed somewhat from the American version. With Australia making the conversion to the metric system as of January 1, 1975, the differences were compounded. In America, trapshooting consists of three events, sixteen yards, doubles and handicaps. Targets are thrown fifty yards at angles of approximately twenty-two degrees to right and left of centre. The Australian version of the sixteen-yard event is called Single Barrel, now shot from 16 metres (17.3 yards) with targets thrown fifty metres (about fifty-five yards) at angles of thirty-five to forty-five degrees to left or right of center.

Australian doubles, called Double Rise, are virtually identical to the US event, except that the targets are thrown farther — hence faster — and the shooter stands at sixteen metres instead of sixteen yards.

The handicap event is shot from eleven to twenty-five metres (twelve to twenty-seven yards). The system of handicapping in Australia is peculiar in that it allows some of the best shooters to compete at short handicap marks. For example, one of their finest shooters, Jim Ellis, who, placed fourth in the world championships at Berne, Switzerland, at Olympic Trap, is allowed to shoot from the nineteen metre mark, whereas in America, only women, juniors and the physically handicapped shooters in wheelchairs and the like are allowed to shoot that close in handicap events. In America, even the beginners are handicapped at twenty-two yards.

These short handicaps are an overwhelming advantage in the high overall or High Gun competition. Ellis, in fact, tied for the High Gun title which he had won previously in 1970. He lost the shoot-off to one of the Winchester shooters who was shooting from the twenty-three metre mark.

By current ACTA rules, all industry personnel can and do compete as amateurs in the national championships, and including such events as the Olympics and world championships.

Since 1970, when Winchester Australia Limited entered the Australian market to compete with Imperial Metal Industries, both companies were allowed by the ACTA to offer specially branded shells for the nationals. The shooting fraternity has benefited greatly from this healthy competition and the industry support given the ACTA has been generous. In addition, and reminiscent of America around the turn of the century, there has been active recruitment and subsidising of some of the top Published with acknowledgment to "Gunworld" magazine of California, USA and with the kind permission of the writer, Elgin T. Gates – ACTA's honorary and unofficial liaison officer in USA.

Australian shooters by both companies which, in addition to their own shooting personnel, has left the genuine amateur weekend shooter pretty well out of the running.

Fortunately, this phase, while helpful during the development of the sport, now may be ending. Officials of both Winchester and IMI told me that a gentlemen's agreement has been reached to the effect that no more subsidising will be allowed. Hopefully, this agreement will be honoured by both sides. At the same time, the ACTA itself, may be moving toward creating what is called an industry or professional class similar to that being used in America wherein industry personnel compete against each other for separate trophies, instead of shooting for the amateur prizes.

In contrast to the permanent national shooting grounds at Vandalia, Ohio, Australia allocates the championships to a different state each year. The Tasmanian Gun Club had spent the better part of a year preparing their grounds for the 1975 championships, the first ever to be held in Tasmania. Extra traps for a total of seven, plus two skeet fields, were installed.

After a series of preliminary events over three days, the National Skeet Championship -12 gauge - was shot on two days. The event consisted of fifty targets, one round of twenty-five targets each day for all competitors. In the variable windy weather, only nine perfect scores of 50x50 were shot, including Winchester's Ken Lowry, the 1972 national skeet champion, and J. Newton Thomas, IMI's field technical officer for twenty-five years, who is a living legend in Australian clay target shooting circles.

Without question, Thomas is one of the most personable shooters in Australia. Over the years he has won every national title in Australia, some of them three or four times. In addition, Thomas has given much time and effort in helping and instructing new shooters.

In the tense miss-and-out shoot-off — as all Australian shoot-offs are — Kevin Flaherty, an Adelaide builder, took the measure of the industry men by breaking another fifty-eight targets without a miss for the national championship. Richard Aquilina

of New South Wales took second and Winchester's Ken Lowry third.

The first trap championship was the Double Rise. From the first pair of targets thrown it was obvious that the new increase in distance from sixteen yards to sixteen metres, plus the extra speed of the targets, would keep the scores down. On top of this was a strong, chilly, incoming wind. John Porter, a young shooter of 21 from Brisbane, Queensland, won the championship outright with 45x50 while many of the top guns couldn't break 40x50. Second went to Colin Hawkins of Hawkesbury, NSW, and third to N. Jackson of Wygong.

After the match, unbroken targets were picked up between sixty and sixty-five yards from the trap where they had fallen in long grass and in face of the incoming wind. "There won't be any long shoot-offs this year", was the the comment heard on all sides. The prophesy proved true.

The Grand Australian Handicap is fifty-targets the same as all championship events — from eleven to twenty-five metres. It seemed unreal to watch shooters walk down to the eleven metre line in a handicap event, but that's the way it is done in Australia. It would seem impossible to miss that close to the traphouse, were it not for the fact that full choke patterns are so small as to be a liability at that distance.

There were, in fact, only three twenty-five metre shooters on the grounds at the national championship — two Australians and myself — probably not more than half-a-dozen shooting at twenty-five metres or more. The problem in Australian handicapping is that all shooters are moved forward one yards each year, no matter if their handicap average is one hundred per cent during the previous year. Handicapping is done on the value of the trophy or prizes won, not on scores or averages.

In addition, two shots can be fired at each target. A break by either shot is scored. The 1975 national champion was a New Zealander, Merv Pratt, who shot 50x50 from the seventeen metre line and broke eighteen more in a nine-man shoot-off.

One interesting fact of Australian shooting is that six-man squads are used, the same procedure as in ISU or Olympic Trap, with the competitors firing at one target from each post then moving to the right until the round of twenty-five targets is completed.

Australia's most popular event, the national Double Barrel championship, was shot with just over 400 entries. Competitors stand at sixteen metres and get two shots to break the target. As in most events, there are three classes, A, B and C. To give a comparison of how difficult the targets are from the new distance of sixteen metres and flying to sixty-five yards as against the sixteen yards and fifty yard targets shot at Melbourne last year, there were only eleven 50x50 scores at Launceston as against 104 at Melbourne. The continuing windy weather at Launceston was a bit difficult, but the resulting shoot-off proved the point again. Whereas in Melbourne the shoot-off went to a record score of 664, Jim Ellis, an IMI shooter, won the championship with a mere twenty-four extra shoot-off targets.

The Single Barrel match previously described was won outright by a Hobart shooter, Sperry Marshall, with the only 50x50 of the day. Again, the extra distance, the faster targets and the blustery weather kept scores down. Nine shooters at 49x50 shot off for second through fifth places with P. Clegget of Victoria taking second and IMI's J. Newton Thomas copping third.

The Australian-New Zealand championship was shot from sixteen metres. Two shots are allowed to break the target but there is a noved twist in the scoring: Three points are scored if the target is broken with the first shot; if the first shot is missed the target is broken with the second shot, two points are scored; and zero if both shots miss. The possible point total for fifty targets is 150x150. Alf James of Victoria shot the possible score along with Andy Tie of Portarlington and IMI representative, Warren Charlton of Wagga, NSW. James took the national title with fifteen extra targets, forty-five points, in the shoot-off.

The final event was the Champion of Champion's Cup shot from twenty metres by all competitors, two shots to break the target, either to count. IMI's Warren Charlton, coming fully into form after setting the Double Barrel shoot-off record of 633 targets in 1974, won with ease, breaking forty-five more targets in the shoot-off. A surprise entrant, Jacques Bareth of New Caledonia, came in second and Winchester's Ken Lowry took third.

The prestigious High Gun title was a classic confrontation between the two ammunition companies. Ken Lowry of Winchester against Jim Ellis, shooting for IMI, both with scores of 431x450. The shoot-off consisted of a half-round of skeet, five pairs of doubles and five targets each of the other championship events. In spite of Ellis' five metre advantage at handicap, nineteen against Lowry's twenty-three metres, the doubles proved to be Ellis' Achilles heel. He missed five of the ten targets while Lowry missed two doubles plus one handicap target to take the High Gun title.

The hospitality of the Australian shooters and officials toward overseas visitors was of the highest order. In addition to two American shooting tours to Australia in 1972 and 1973, led by Roy Foxworthy on Indianapolis, three Australian shooters. Barney Rooke, his wife and Vin Ryan visited the US Nationals in 1973. In 1974, Rooke brought a reciprocal tour of thirty-one Australians to America, shooting at Las Vegas, Nevada, in Wisconsin at the national championships, to Vancouver to shoot with the Canadians and finally a stop off at Hawaii on Maui Island for a match arranged by the ATA Hawaiian delegate Michael Baldwin and his wife.

This exchange of the clay target shooters between Australia, New Zealand, America and now New

Caledonia has created an atmosphere of international goodwill and competition that resulted in the donation of a perpetual trophy by B. Rooke of Australia, John McMillan of New Zealand and Elgin Gates of the United States to the ACTA for international team competition. Put into competition for the first time at Launceston, the trophy was won by the New Caledonia team with a score of 118x120, with Australia and New Zealand in a tie for second at 116x120 and the United States fourth with 115x120.

As a final facet or interest as regards clay target shooting in Australia, at least ninety-five per cent of the guns used are of the over/under types representing virtually every make in the world from Winchester to Perazzi, Remington 3200, Bently, Bernardelli, Beretta, Breda, Nikko, Browning, Miroku, Franchi. SKB, Merkel, Shadow, Stirling, Lames, Condor and Baikal, to name a few.

Ammunition for the national championships comes in considerable variety, and Australian shooters love the big bang. There is no powder restriction although shot is limited to $1\frac{1}{8}$ ounce in a choice of 6, 7, 8 and 9. For the handicap events only, $1\frac{1}{4}$ ounces of shot is allowed.

Both Winchester and IMI offer a wide range of loads. Winchester has the two loads familiar in America, AA in $2\frac{1}{4}$ and 3 dram. They also offer AA Club Special, a $3\frac{1}{4}$ dram load with a wide pattern wad for skeet and sixteen metre shooting; Ranger, a $3\frac{1}{2}$ dram load; and Super Ranger, a $3\frac{3}{4}$ dram load. IMI loads are not designated in dram equivalents, but range from their new Special Trap shell of approximately 3 drams to Hi-Skor, that shoots like a $3\frac{1}{2}$ dram load and has the old felt wads to spread the pattern; Blue Star skeet and trap, loaded to 1260 feet per second; Blue Star trench for Olympic trap with nickel plated shot; and a handicap shell, ICIL, loaded with 1¹/₄ ounces of shot.

Clay target shooting is rapidly growing in Australia. There are now over 250 clubs and 6000-odd registered shooters. The per capita of shooters against total population is almost double that of America.

In years to come, there should be a healthy exchange of competition between the four countries mentioned herein and probably some rule standardisation. More countries are expected to join in the future. It will be a healthy growth for the sport,
