Editor's Notes



It is recommended to clubs within the State of Victoria when conducting shoots on Sundays that shooters be made at least honorary members of the club concerned to comply with section 29B of the Firearms Act of 1958.

To whom it may concern:-

- (1) Australian shooters shooting in New Zealand are not handicapped on such performances within ACTA shooting rules.
- (2) Member clubs and shooters alike are asked by the ACTA Executive committee to consult their nearest Executive Committeeman or Referee Examiner on all matters of shooting procedure, to reduce the workload of ACTA secretary. By direction, this paragraph has also been asked to quote "these honorary persons have volunteered for and have been accepted for these positions and their respective decisions should be on a national basis."

Interpretations of A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules Handbook (effective September 1975)

1. Page 5, Rule 1 (a) states "firing points to be 3 metres apart" BUT, Diagram Page 10 shows "2.812 m" apart. The correct measurement is 3 metres and all handbooks should be amended immediately.
2. A.C.T.A. Rules Supervisors report that some shooters and clubs are not observing Rules 20, 157 and 158 in that —
 Rule 20 — Registered competitors who shoot at unregistered or unaffiliated clubs render themselves liable to disqualification.
 Rule 157 — Club managements or a member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee have the right to re-

handicap any obviously underhandcapped shooter immediately.

Rule 158 — Clubs when registering a shooter for the first time must clearly indicate whether the shooter is a complete novice gun handler, or has had field or other experience before a 11 metre mark can be approved. Failure to provide this information will result in the shooter being placed on 16 metres.

Concerning the Editors Mailbox Section of May, 1976, A.C.T.A. Shooting News pages 16 to 19 — and also to page 2 of that publication, any shooter seeking to proceed to Sth. Africa for the indicated 1976 Championships may freely do so as an individual but the proposed tour arrangements have been withdrawn.

Quite a number of shooters appear to change their respective addresses from time to time and this causes quite a problem to maintain the mailing list — especially when we do not receive notification of change. However, we keep records of such mails returned but have sometimes found that returns to us marked by the postal authorities as "not at this address" are not always correct.

We are using a new printer as of May 1976 and an unprecedented number of copies of the May 1976 A.C.T.A. Shooting News have been returned to us.

Many of them are within the changed address category but many more have the complete name and address section removed.

Maybe this has been caused by excessive use of adhesive and this our printers are investigating but in the meantime, we just have no idea as to which shooter(s) have missed receiving their May copies and can only trust that June is better for us all.

A.C.T.A. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Where a State Association exists, then clubs seeking approval to conduct open championships during 1977 should make their submissions accordingly before Wednesday, June 30.

Where no state association exists then clubs seeking such approval for 1977 should lodge their requests, under Rule 27, with the A.C.T.A. before Wednesday, June 30, but it is most advisable that clubs make themselves known to their respective Executive committee members.

Late applications receive no consideration.

The Executive Committee will then receive these total submissions on prepared agenda lists and their decisions

will be published in A.C.T.A. Shooting News, probably in November, 1976.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted by the club between January 1 and December 31, 1977.

Preference will be given to clubs which:—

(a) have the capacity to conduct the various types of shoots, i.e., the capacity in both equipment and current management. (NOTE — oscillating traps must be used, that is, Snipe, Dams, Winchester and the like, but NOT "plus" traps.)

(b) have submitted proposed dates together with their requested title events.

If no club advertising material has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title event, then the Secretary-Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned at the late insertion rate.

Clubs allocated State Titles events by the Committee are expected to advertise these State events in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News".

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs which fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly, or which fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize moneys may be handed to any shooter without his previous submission of his current handicap card (see Rule 18) correctly classified and progressively marked showing his shooting performance to date. It is the responsibility of a designated club official to progressively mark the shooter's card (see trap rules 100F and 155A).

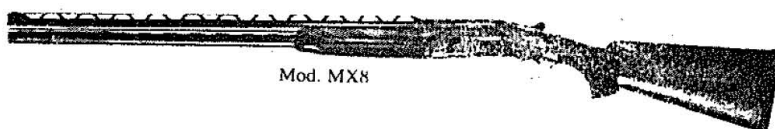
It is then the responsibility of the club secretary to notify A.C.T.A. central records, using the handicap return form, of any changes in:—

- (a) a shooter's class for common mark shooting;
- (b) a shooter's change of handicap as prescribed in the handicapping formula.

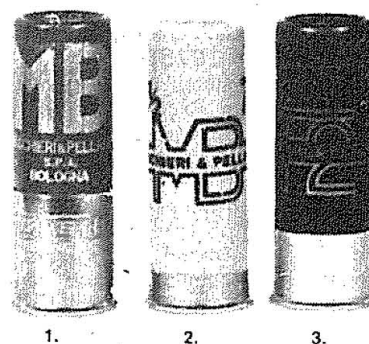
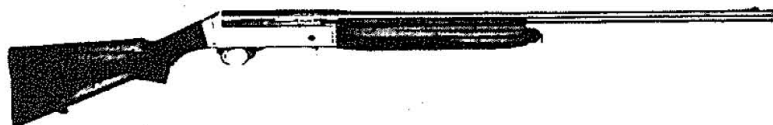

NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Australian Shooters Outstanding Success

80 odd Australian shooters competed at the New Zealand Nationals this year. Teams represented Canada, New Guinea, New Caledonia, Australia and New Zealand. After a couple of Sweepstake matches a Trophy Handicap was conducted and First Prize was a colour T.V. and was won by a new shooter, Grant Thatcher of Tumut, N.S.W. with 119-119. 2nd prize a Winchester Pigeon Grade Trap Gun went to Trevor Resch of Mt. Gambier, S.A.

Monday saw the start of the Nationals with the Single Barrel. Conditions were far from good with a very strong following wind that made the targets duck and dive. Maurie Quirk of Narellan, N.S.W. came in with the only 49-50 to take his first National Title, 9 shooters with 48 had to shoot off and Jim Dillon of Christchurch 2nd and Barry Kable, Sydney 3rd. The overseas Teams match was won by Australia with a score of 343, New Caledonia 2nd with 327 points.

Tuesday. The Double Barrel Championship saw seven Australians, one New Caledonian and seven New Zealanders shoot the possible 50 targets. Among the Australians were Maurie Quirk, Laurie Cooper, Barry Nellis, Jack Henwood, Alf James, Jim Ellis, Bill Dalzell. Maurie Quirk missed his 88th target for 3rd place and this left Jack Henwood and Frank Fryers (NZ) to shoot on. The excited Australian supporters watched fine shooting by both competitors until Frank Fryers lapsed on his 127th target and Jack Henwood holding concentration disintegrated the next target with his first shot to give him his first National Title. Australia was then 3 up on N.Z.

Wednesday was Sweepstake matches for the N.Z. to select their MacIntosh Team. These matches were used by Australia to select the Glenn Cup Team. The Australians won the Glenn Cup by just one target 112 to 111 by N.Z.

Thursday. The Mini Target Championship saw only 7 shooters shoot the possible 25 targets. 3 Australians, Bill Abbott, Werribee, Vic., Bob Smith, Goulburn, N.S.W. Len Crema, Sydney, managed the possible. The shoot off was done in poor light, Bob Smith missing his first target, Bob didn't see the target until it was 50 yards from the trap. Ken Donaldson, of N.Z. gave New Zealand their first Title with Bill Abbott runner up. The Double Rise Championship was won outright by Harry Fryers with the only 30-30. 28 shot off for placings but no Aussie was able to match their scores. The score now was 4 wins going to Australia and 2 for New Zealand with the Skeet and I.S.U. to go. The general talk was who would take these two titles. Most shooters were able to shoot their first round of Skeet after the Double Rise but because of a trap breakdown 6 squads had to shoot the next day. Possible 50's were shot by 5 Aussies and 3 Kiwis. The Aussies to make the shoot off were George Biggs, Jim Ellis, Maurie Quirk, Barney Rooke, Richard Aquilina. After one round had been shot only three shooters remained, Barney Rooke and Richard Aquilina and a young New Zealander. Another round was shot clean by these three. At the start of the round the N.Z. boy missed his high target off station 1. Rooke and Aquilina go to station 4 when Barney missed his low target and Richard making his shot good took his first National Title, the score 112-112. He had been runner up twice in Australia.

The Overall High Gun, a Winchester Presentation Grade U-O was won by Maurie Quirk, N.S.W., two targets ahead of John Wolley, of N.Z. There was no disputing Quirk's win as he shot brilliantly right through the Championships.

With only the Skeet to go Maurie Quirk and John Woolley were equal score. The pressure of those last 50 skeet targets must have been great and Maurie showing a true champion's ability, shot the 50 targets when John only managed 48.

The I.S.U. was a walkover for Jim Ellis shooting a 49-50 to take the Title outright. 2nd place went to Bruce Noll, Condoblin, N.S.W. 47:50.

The N.Z. versus Australia Skeet Team match was won by N.Z. The Australians performed badly in this event except for Richard Aquilina who shot the only possible 25. (New Zealand five targets dropped, Australia seven targets dropped).

The New Zealand Championships were a credit to their Association in the way they were conducted.

Entries being near record. 7 traps were used each day for Championships and one trap open all the time for practice. Each day a sweepstake event was run each afternoon after the Championship was completed.

The Australian shooters excelled by gaining first place in 7 of the 10 events conducted.

The conduct of the Australian shooters during the Championships was excellent and by far the greatest number ever to compete and judging by their comments all wish to return to Hamilton (N.Z.) next year. The Championships will be held at the new Hamilton Gun Club from 19th March to 27th March. Any Australian shooter wishing to make the trip can contact me or Wagga Travel Service for further details.

It appears that a large number of New Zealand shooters will be competing at our Nationals in Brisbane next year and I think they will be after the Australian Titles and I wish them the best of luck, the more competing the better as competition is what this game is all about. I welcome competitors from any country and if they are good enough to finish in front of us well good luck to them. One thing I have experienced in other countries is the common bond of sportsmanship amongst Clay Target Shooters and I am proud to be a part of it.
