REVIEW — 1976

This is not meant to replace the Annual Report to be submitted to the Annual General Meeting, but is simply a brief precis of the highs and lows of Australian clay target shooting in the year just ended.

The year started poorly, with difficulties being experienced with the introduction of a new system for the issue of handicap cards; the system seemed jinxed right from the beginning. The situation was aggravated by having to employ temporary staff to overcome the back log of work - this was an expense for which we had not budgeted. Then the situation improved considerably with the West Australian Clay Target Association conducting what must be regarded as one of the best National Championships ever. (See the financial statement elsewhere in this issue!) The results included names of younger shooters and this is surely good for the sport.

May 1976 saw the transfer of our National magazine, the "Shooting News" to Waterwheel Press in Shepparton, and after a quiet beginning, some of the benefits from the change are

starting to become evident.

July and Olympic Games time. Peter Wray was our shotgun representative in Montreal, but after some good performances in practice, he found weather conditions during the competition most upsetting (as did the majority of competitors) and finished with a score of 173/200.

August 1976 came with its usual cold bleak weather (at least in the Southern States) and it also brought the bleak news of the resignation due to ill health of the A.C.T.A. Secretary-Editor,

Mervyn Berry.

Then into September with more bad news when President "Tup" Pedersen suffered a collapse on the eve of the Executive Committee meeting, However, Vice President Ern Hawkins, ably supported by temporary staff member Shirley Pike, who was acting as Secretary, kept the show on the rails pending the appointment of a replacement for Mervyn Berry.

Later in the year, others of the National Executive Committee to suffer serious health problems included Roy Holtfreter (W.A.) Harry Williamson (Vic.) and Bob Buchan (Vic.). Fortunately, all of them are on the way back to health as this is being written.

The situation took a turn for the better in late November when ACT-International Gun Club was host Club for the National Trench Championship, won in a "cliff-hanger" finish by Executive Committeeman "Pud" Burgess.

There have been a number of financial setbacks during the year, and we enter 1977 in a poor financial state. However, all systems are in "go" condition, and providing that everybody connected with our sport can provide some input, there is no reason why 1977 should not be the best in the history of our Association.

HAPPY NEW YEAR and good shooting!!!

Because of increased utilization of space in the "News", difficulty is being experienced in accommodating all the detail contained in shoot reports. In the December issue of the "News" almost one third of the Victorian results had to be omitted because of lack of space, and in spite of the axing of 'eyeopener' results from all reports in this issue, a large number of N.S.W. results have had to be dropped. Your opinion of the value of the result section in the "News" would be appreciated, because this is YOUR magazine and its content material should be what the shooter wants. Let's hear, please!

A.C.T.A. Moves Into Computer Age
From 1st January, 1977, the A.C.T.A. membership accounting procedure has been converted to a computer based system. Computer Resources Company Pty. Ltd., has designed a system which it is hoped will dramatically speed up the Association's administrative processes. By the time this issue of the "News" is distributed, more than 2,500 1977 Registration Cards will have been sent out, whereas in 1976, the first cards were not processed until late March. The new system depends for its success on full use being made of registration (or membership) numbers - in all your dealings with Clubs, and similarily in any correspondence with National or State Associations, please use your registration number. Sufficient flexibility has been built into the system to allow for future growth and development.

Very rarely does this sort of change occur without some minor bugs showing up, and it will occasionally be necessary for shooters and Club Secretaries to show more patience and tolerance than usual. The change provides a wonderful opportunity to correct our basic records therefore it would be appreciated if any errors in names or addresses could be reported

to the National Office promptly.

This move is one of the most significant and progressive moves in the history of the A.C.T.A. and will provide a number of advantages in years to come - the immediate benefits are improved accuracy and reduced time in processing of registrations.

Furthermore, the move gives all of us an opportunity to control labor costs, at a time when this particular aspect is a major worry of all service organizations.

Riverina Identities Die

Two long serving, widely known shooting identities died late in 1976. They were Mr R. McNamara of Griffith, and Mr E. Albert of Barellan. Mr McNamara was a member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee during the late 1940's and early 1950's, and a Past President of Griffith Gun Club.

Mr Albert was a foundation member of Barellan Gun Club and was well known to New South Wales and Victorian Shooters.

The National President and his Executive Committee join all shooters in expressing their sympathy to the respective families.







1976 National Trench Championship

A.C.T.-International Gun Club, Canberra, was the venue for the 1976 National Trench Championship which was conducted over three days — 75 targets on Saturday 20th November, 75 targets on Sunday 21st November and the final 50 targets on Monday 22nd November.

During practice on the Friday, it quickly became apparent that our standard is steadily improving. Admittedly, one would expect to find the best shooters at the premier event on the Olympic Trench calendar, but this year the top bracket shows much more depth than in the past. Perhaps the fluorescent orange targets helped scores a little, as they can certainly be identified more quickly on exit from the trench.

The practice session was very well attended and augured welf for strong support for the Championship. In addition to the "regulars" such as Wray, Ellis, Burgess and Charlton, some of the fresh names to have good practice scores recorded against them were Farr, Byrne, Rumbel, De Vries and Simms.

It was disappointing to see no shooters from the International Gun Club, S.A. where a 15 Trap Trench is in operation.

FIRST 75 TARGETS

Saturday saw a prompt start to the programme, and after a few nervous first rounds, the forty-seven strong field settled down to produce some very solid performances. Jim Ellis, who had flown across from Hobart, showed the way with seventy-five straight for the day. A tremendous effort was turned in by John Farr of Brisbane who shot 23, 25, 24, to aggregate 72/75. Another surprise was sprung by that very likeable Victorian, Bob De Vries (a strong supporter of Olympic Trench in his home State) who produced one of his best ever efforts to record scores of 24, 25, 24 for a 73/75 — obviously Bob has gained some benefit from his recent international experience in Singapore.

Young Trevor Byrne from Shepparton showed that he is still "burning" by coming in with a 70/75 (25, 23, 22), 'Pud' Burgess 73-75 (25, 24, 24), Peter Wray (Australia's Montreal Olympic representative) 72/75 (24, 23, 25) Warren Charlton 70/75 (22, 23, 25) and Maurie Quirk (the Tahmoor Terror) 72/75 (22, 25, 25) all showed the benefit of their experience, especially under the changing light conditions that affected some squads during the day.

A most unfortunate occurrence involved Michaelis Bayley's popular firearms representative, Ray Johnstone, who was advised by police of the death of his grandmother. All shooters extend to Ray their deep sympathy in his loss.

The progressive position on Saturday night was: J. Ellis 75/75, R. De Vries 73/75, A. Burgess 73/75, P. Wray 72/75, M. Quirk 72/75, J. Farr 72/75, L. Cooper 71/75.

Earlier in the day, the programme was officially opened by Senator John Knight, Senate member for A.C.T. and a strong supporter of A.C.T.-International Gun Club. During his address, he gave cause for renewed hope that the Club will be allocated its own ground in 1977. This will be a giant-sized step forward for I.S.U. shooting in Australia.

SECOND 75 TARGETS

Sunday got away to a prompt start and the Club's organization was slick and well planned. No re-squadding had occurred so shooters knew exactly what was expected of them. The weather had become very changeable, although when the sun shone it was quite hot.


The day started well for Warren Charlton when he shot a 25 in his first round. A 25 was also produced by Terry Rumbel. Ellis shot 24 to give him a progressive score of 99/100, truly a world class mark. The tension started to mount and it appeared likely that the day would finish with seven or eight shooters all with a chance. However, "Lady Luck" took a hand in the form of a dramatic weather change. The wind became very much stronger and the light worsened. Two or three squads were seriously affected and the scores reflect the degree of difficulty of shooting the very erratic targets. Bob De Vries shot a 21, Jack Henwood a 20 and Warren Charlton a 19.

Terry Rumbel put on the 'star turn' of the day by repeating Jim Ellis' score from the previous day of 75/75.

Progress scores on Sunday night were: J. Ellis 146/150 (75, 71), A. Burgess 144/150 (73, 71), T. Byrne 142/150 (70, 72), J. Farr 142/150 (72,70), E. Kavanaugh 140/150 (69, 71), T. Rumbel 140/150 (65, 75).

Peter Wray was on 138 and Warren Charlton on 136, giving them very little chance for a place (even they don't believe in Miracles!)

FINAL 50 TARGETS

Monday was very cold with a few showers and the pressure was really on the top group because the younger shooters were showing no signs of "breaking". Ellis started with a comfortable 23, while Burgess moved one point closer with a 24. To prove how the "youngsters" could handle the pressure, Trevor Byrne produced a 25, but John Farr hit a bad patch and his first round was a 22. Maurie Quirk's 25 gave him a flicker of hope for a minor placing.

Into the last 25, and Ellis reproduced his earlier score of 23 for a total of 192. At this stage, John Farr had already finished with 187, and in spite of a 25 in the last round, Charlton finished on 184. Trevor Byrne then shot 24 for an aggregate of 191, leaving Burgess still to shoot. The weather wasn't getting any better and Burgess needed a 24 to tie with Ellis or a 25 to win outright. It is now a matter of history that the experience gained in International events, together with tremendous personal dedication and determination stood him in good stead and 'Pud' shot his 25 for an aggregate of 193/200. What a great "cliff hanger" type finish to a really exciting shooting match.

The final results were: 1st A. M. Burgess, Cobar NSW, 193/200; 2nd J. Ellis, Berrigan NSW, 192/200; 3rd T. Byrne, Shepparton Vic., 191/200; 4th J. Farr, Brisbane Qld, 187/200; 5th M. Quirk, Tarmoor NSW, 186/200.

The Club President, Brian Prosser, in making the presentation of trophies, thanked very sincerely the trophy donors. He pointed out that assistance from industries connected with our sport is too often taken for granted, and that due recognition must be given to the assistance gained by Clubs from donation of trophies. The trophy list was:

(The National Executive Committee also wishes to thank the trophy donors for their strong support).

As a final gesture of the Club's goodwill, Brian Prosser handed a cheque for \$100.00 to National Secretary, Noel Southey, to be added to the I.S.U. Travel Fund. This sort of support will ensure that ultimately we will get into International shooting on a bigger scale.

A.C.T.-International Gun Club is a young Club, with their, Olympic Trench facilities only becoming operational in May 1975. It was formed a little earlier with an inaugural membership of eleven. Their membership has grown to over fifty headed by a most enthusiastic Committee. President, Brian Prosser proudly boasts that one of the major reasons for the strength of the Club is that all his Committee are equally as enthusiastic and can be relied upon to do the jobs delegated to them. This was borne out during the weekend as the whole programme ran like clockwork. Secretary Mrs Sharmon Simms and her staff had the administrative side under control, and those who said that the event should not have been held on a "one layout" ground had to eat their words.


The Club has plans drawn up for a new complex to be developed, which will eventually include two Olympic Trenchs and three I.S.U. Skeet grounds.

There is a distinct possibility that an international standard Small Bore Range could be built on the adjacent site, so bringing Australia one step closer to having another complex capable of being used as a venue for World Championships. (Melbourne Gun Club successfully conducted the 1973 World Championships).


Shooters were very vocal in their praise for the hospitality extended to them over the four days and all agreed the standards set were compatible with a National Championship.





I.S.U. SCENE

Australian Shooting Associa-**Annual Meeting**

The Australian Shooting Association, which is the controlling body for I.S.U. type of shooting in Australia (this includes Running Boar, Pistol, Small Bore, Large Bore and Shotgun) took on 'new look" at its Annual Meeting held in Melbourne on December 4th.

The newly elected Chairman is Peter Papps, the A.C.T.A. delegate and a Past Vice-President of the A.C.T.A. The Secretary-Treasurer is David Hillan, a very experienced shooting administrator, who managed the Shooting Team for the 1976 Montreal Olympics. Clay Frederick, of the A.S.B.R.A. (Australian Small Bore Rifle Association) was elected Vice-President, and this re-organization has encouraged many observers to believe that International type shooting in Australia is about to "come of age". A tremendous amount of work lies ahead of the A.S.A. to get Australia to the point where it has facilities and competitive standards equal to anything else in the world.

There is also a school of thought which feels that the A.S.A.

should broaden its base and ultimately become the National "voice" for all types of shooting in Australia, competitive or otherwise. The other A.C.T.A. delegate was "Pud" Burgess, who is very dedicated to promoting International Shooting in Australia and is one of the forces behind raising funds for future

Shotgun team tours.

World Moving Target C'ships Antibes, France

The I.S.U. Sub-Committee of the A.C.T.A. met on Sunday 5th December and decided that Australia will field a team at the Antibes Championships, to be held between 5th September and 17th September 1977. However, it will be necessary to fulfill two conditions to quality for selection — firstly the shooter must be able to pay his own costs, and secondly he must achieve a qualifying standard.

The selection process will be as follows:

All interested shooters should ensure that scores from all I.S.U. type events of a duration of 50 targets or more conducted between May 1976 up to May 1977 for Olympic Trench (or Universal Trap) and up to April 1977 for I.S.U. Skeet, are submitted to A.C.T.A. office to facilitate the maintenance of a "shooter history". This will require the co-operation of the Secretary of the Club at which the events are held - shooters should ask him to forward their scores to A.C.T.A. office.

From the details of scores, a list of shooters to be invited to a final qualifying competition, to be held at Melbourne Gun Club, on dates yet to be confirmed. It is anticipated that about 20 Trench and up to 10 Skeet shooters will be on these lists. To make it easier for those who are shooting both disciplines, the Trench and Skeet qualifying events will be held at separate times. Both events will be of 200 targets duration and will run in conjunction with a major event such as a State Championship.

At the conclusion of the final qualifying round, the selection committee will then review each shooter's performances. together with other related data, and will subsequently name the

team members.

A travel agency has been asked to prepare a costing, and by the time this is being read, the information should be available

from the National office (telephone 03-639777).

It should be remembered that all I.S.U. shooters are being asked to pay an additional annual registration fee of \$20.00, which is being used to develop an "I.S.U. Travel Fund." Naturally there will be a small subsidy for the Antibes team from this fund. The \$20.00 should be paid before the end of February, 1977.

TRADE TOPICS

Advice has been received from Mr David Tietjen, Australian Marketing Manager for Boustead Pty. Ltd., that a small quantity of aids to shotgunners and Gun Clubs has recently arrived from the Remington Arms Company in the U.S.A. The range includes handbooks on skeet shooting and trap shooting fundamentals together with skeet and trap score sheets.

The two books, written by D. Lee Braun for the Remington Sportsmen's Library, giving hints on shooting either trap or skeet are also available and would make excellent "front

marker's" trophies.

Boustead's also have some films which are of great interest to both shooters and conservationists. An enquiry to the A.C.T.A. National office will get some action.

Graeme Bailey, prominent West Australian firearms and fishing distributor, passed through Melbourne recently after spending a few days in Sydney. However, in spite of a recent ul-cer operation, together with busy Sydney schedule, Graeme was looking very fit and suntanned.

Meanwhile, the effects of Australia's substantial devaluation. of the dollar were felt very quickly in shooting, with a number of major importers increasing prices immediately after the announ-

cement was made.

WELL KNOWN VICTORIAN TRADE **IDENTITY DIES** —

It is with deep regret that we report the death of the very popular Keith Olive. Keith was State Sales Manager for Victoria and Tasmania for Winchester Aust. Pty. New South Wales Clay Target Association Third Annual Report — 2nd October, 1976

Once more I believe we can justly claim to have completed a very successful year.

Four of our past member clubs have not re-affiliated but over-

all our club membership has increased from 53 to 56. First time members welcomed this year are Moree, Wakehurst, Deniliquin, Young, Parkes and Broken Hill while Inverell rejoined since reforming after a short recess.

You will have noted from the Balance Sheet that we are operating with a very small running cost and that we have more than doubled our credit in the past year.

As a State representative body we are gaining further recognition and we have been able to achieve some results.

Our representations to the Education Department has gained a better reception from school headmasters when arranging safety instruction or shooting competitions for school children. Our membership on the Police Shooting Range licensing Committee has allowed us to sort out several club problems satisfactorily and to date we have been told that no club has been refused a licence.

Any club that has not yet submitted an application for a range

licence is strongly urged to do so without delay.

A request from a city council near Sydney for details on the setting up of a shooting complex has been complied with and we are anxiously awaiting the outcome of their offer. If proposals come to fruition the State Association could end up with a shooting range consisting of eight D.T.L. fields, three or four skeet fields and two trench systems.

We are now submitting applications to the Sports & Recreation Service of N.S.W., for a share in the distribution of "Pools" money. It is thought that the State Association could be partially subsidised for the cost of running the qualifying events for shooters to go into the Interstate Teams matches. Sports & Recreation have again included all N.S.W.C.T.A. open shoot program details in their sports calendars which are distributed to tourist beaureaux, schools, libraries, etc.

We have made a number of recommendations to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, some of which have been agreed to and some not. The important thing is that we are fully recognised and that our recommendations are being accepted for consideration.

Our 1976 program booklet has proved to be a tremendous success and a special tribute must go to I M I and Winchester who shared the total cost of its production.

Both companies have again agreed to supply the '77 program booklet and we give them our grateful thanks. There is no doubt that their generosity, in providing what would be our largest operating cost item, has placed us in our present healthy financial position.

The Interzone Teams Competitions have proved to be very popular. The atmosphere surrounding this event for Denis Hunts trophy at Royal Aero Club last year provided a spirit of sportsmanship we must see continue. There are indications that this years shootoff will be even better.

This year for the first time there will be a final shootoff in the Interzone Skeet Teams Competition.

A perpetual trophy has been donated and the six shooter Zone teams will decide the issue at Coffs Harbours Skeet carnival in

You will be aware that the 1976 National Championships were run by the West Australian Clay Target Association with great success. This move will set a pattern and there is no doubt that our Association will be obliged to do the same in 1979. We should start to prepare for this now.

I would claim now that the N.S.W.C.T.A. is doing more for the promotion of shooting and for shooters in general than any other body set up for the purpose. We are providing an incentive to other States and indeed Victoria have followed our lead and have decided to use our Constitutional setup almost as is.

There has been great interest shown at the Zone level of our Association. This has been very evident over the past year and I





The Club's first automatic trap was installed in 1955, followed by a second in 1961. These were replaced in 1963 by two electric DAMO traps. A third trap went in during 1968. Lights were installed in 1963 and were extended in 1973.

The new Clubhouse was built at a cost of \$8,200.00, and includes a fully equipped kitchen with hot water and full refrigeration. A new brick toilet block has been erected, costing a further \$4,300,00.

It is this type of improvement which is necessary for our sport to grow as our wives and children are quite prepared to share Dad's day out if some comforts can be provided. Easy to understand Cowra's claim to be "Best in the West" isn't it?



Mechanical equipment is the latest "Rossini" pneumatic cocking traps, and a fully transistorised electronic control box.










