## **SECRETARY'S NOTES**

It is rewarding to the Administration of the A.C.T.A. as well as a welcome sign of progress that more and more shooters are "involving" themselves in their sport. No activity can continue to function without "workers" and in voluntary work areas. workers are traditionally hard to come by. It is certain that the development of State Association is assisting in this regard as more shooters are provided with an opportunity to see the benefits of their efforts and this aspect provides a great incentive

The response to our call for advice on the need to include results in the C.T.S.N. (Clay Target "Shooting News") has been overwhelming — about 90% of those who replied want the re-sults included — O.K., so be it!

Elsewhere in this issue, reference has been made to standards - a shooting accident recently occurred on the grounds of one of our affiliated Clubs and a Skeet trapper suffered serious eye damage. It is opportune to repeat a statement made by the President of the N.S.W.C.T. Association, Mr Ern Hawkins:

'Perhaps we should take the incident as a severe warning. There was certainly no suggestion of any careless behaviour at Hay but from time to time we do hear of dangerous practices on shooting grounds.

On behalf of our President may I implore you to look closely at the whole safety side of our sport. Make a special effort to check over your facilities and look for locations where the unexpected might happen; check for holes or gaps in trap houses safety walls, chutes etc. and take some action to see that referees and officials maintain safety on the tracks.

Many people decry our strict shooting safety rules but they are there for a purpose and should be strictly complied with. One reported shooting injury in close to fifty years of clay target shooting is too many — let us see that it never reaches number two." However, we have one growl — when members change their

address, please will they advise C.T.S.N. We are now approaching a situation where everybody who is eligible for a copy of CTSN is receiving one but we still have a significant number of each issue returned marked "Left address". There are some areas where we cannot provide the ultimate in service without a little more help from both Clubs and shooters. This includes the

use of membership numbers in all communications. "Nationals fever" is starting to grip us and, we hope, you too. Your President 'Tup' Pedersen and I recently visited Brisbane to look at progress and were most impressed. Without doubt, we are in for our biggest and best National series ever. If the hospitality extended to "Tup" and I is any measure of general Queensland hospitality, the social life will be as enjoyable as the shooting side. Reference must also be made to the way T.A.A. looked after the two of us - they certainly turned on the "red carpet" treatment. By the way, the T.A.A. "Package Deal" offer is still available to any who wish to take advantage of it (Details from A.C.T.A. office 03 639777).

### PRESERVING STANDARDS

You may well ask "What standards?" or "What are standards?" Since its inception, the A.C.T.A. has endeavoured to provide administrative back up for, and direction to, a group of Clubs, which in turn provide facilities for shooting sportsmen to enjoy their sport. For any democratic system to work the needs or wishes of the majority normally "set the standards". However, in shooting, an extra dimension is added because of the need to preserve safety. By intelligent drafting of rules together with a high level of control and supervision these standards have been set and maintained at an acceptable level - the majority still en-

joys its sports activities and all share in the safety. Can this state continue, or are our standards being allowed to slip? In the last issue, attention was drawn to problems associated with dress - the only comments to come back to us indicate that our readers agree with the statements the article contained. This issue, we want to go a little further and suggests that a little complacency is creeping into our Clubs as far as behaviour is concerned. "Lairising" on shooting tracks has increased, foul language in mixed company is more noticeable and even the effects of grog are now being publicly displayed to a greater extent than before.

Due to a recent incident at a Club, where a shot was fired in circumstances contrary to the rules, two shooters have had their registrations suspended. On a similar theme, but not involving the same risk to safety, four members of a southern State Club have been given a three months "holiday" — for misconduct on the shooting ground, "What does it matter?" you may ask. It matters because each incident has involved lack of self-control, which is ideal atmosphere for a shooting accident to occur. The Clubs concerned in these cases are to be commended for their courage - let others follow the example and we may achieve a level of standards, where we can all be proud to be labelled as a shooter AND STILL HAVE A LOT OF FUN!

### I.S.U. SCENE

#### Antibes (France) World Championships

There is a disappointingly slow response to requests for performance details from shooters who wish to be invited to the final qualifying round from which the team for Antibes will be selected.

The dates and venue for the final qualifying round are as follows:

I.S.U. SKEET - MELBOURNE GUN CLUB - 14th & 15th May.

The qualifying round will be shot in conjunction with the Commonwealth I.S.U. Skeet Championship.

OLYMPIC TRENCH — MELBOURNE GUN CLUB — 18th & 19th June.

The qualifying round will be shot in conjunction with the Victorian Olympic Trench Championship.

These dates are not far away and shooters wishing to compete in the qualifying rounds should ensure that some performance details are submitted in the next few weeks.

It is important to realise however, that the two events listed are open to all comers.

### International Trap & Skeet Club (W.A.)

International-type shooting in Australia received a further shot in the arm recently with the formation of the International Trap & Skeet Club in Perth. Under the Presidency of Jules Steiner, there is no doubt that the Club will become a most successful West Australian headquarters for this branch of Clay Target Shooting.

# "R & L Sky" Olympic Trench Postal Trench Teams' Cup

Two Taree-Wingham members, Ron and Leonna Sky have donated a cup for the express purpose of a postal Olympic Trench Teams competition, to be called The R & L Sky Olympic Trench Postal Teams Cup. It is their hope that a competition of this type will help to promote Olympic Trench competition. The rules of the competition are as follows:—

- 1. To be shot over a 100 target event.
- 2. Teams of 6-5 scores to count.
- 3. At least 3 members of each team must be registered with the Club for which they shoot. 3A. Limit of 3 teams per Club.
- Teams must be shot and scores sent to the ISU Subcommittee one month prior to the National Championships.
- Score sheets to be signed by referee and secretary and submitted to the sub-committee within one month of the date of the shoot.
- Teams must shoot at a recognised Championship on a 15 trap ISU Olympic Trench lay-out.
- Open to all affiliated Clubs in Australia that care to field a team.
- 8. Cup to be presented at Australian National Championships each year. The Club who holds the cup is responsible for the cup being brought to National Championships in good
- order and condition. 9. Each shooter from the winning team will receive a cartridge
- pouch by courtesy of SKB.
- Rules may be altered at the discretion of the ISU Subcommittee.

At the Open Trench Championships held at our Taree-Wingham Club in January the Cup was displayed and the above rules passed around for approval by the visiting shooters. Everyone in attendance approved of same and four teams were submitted and shot in conjunction with the N.S.W. Olympic Trench Championship. The teams were A.C.T.-International: E. Kavanagh 91, B. Scanes 92, M. Quirk 94, N. Simms 90, B. Prosser 87, S. Koludrovic 78 - best 5 scores total = 454. Melbourne: A. Bould 89, B. Battagol 90, M. Baker 87, L. Nuzzoleze 90, R. DeVries 85 and T. # **'Pud' Burgess Still Top Shot**

### THREE DAY OLYMPIC TRENCH CHAM-**PIONSHIPS HELD AT TAREE-WINGHAM GUN CLUB**

The three day Olympic Trench Championships held at Taree-Wingham Gun Club on Australia Day Anniversary week-end attracted a number of inter-state shooters and although shot in heat-wave conditions proved a very successful shoot. Quite a number of the shooters had arrived on Friday and 25 attended practice on Friday afternoon. On Saturday the first 75 targets of the New South Wales Northern Zone Olympic Trench Championship was conducted and in the first 25 targets Tony Rowe shot the only possible with Eugene Kavanagh, "Pud" Burgess and Terry Rumbel on 24 and John Hall, Ray Johnstone, Bob. Wilson, Mike Baker, Maurie Quirk, Barry Battagol and Dennis Devlin on 23.

The second 25 targets were shot by Laurie Cooper with "Pud" Burgess, Maurie Quirk, Bob Boggiss on 24 and N. Simms, John Hall, Barry Scanes, Paul Thompson, Max Barton, John Farr and Ed. Milham on 23.

The third and final round on Saturday saw Barry Scanes and Terry Rumbel shoot 25 with Laurie Cooper, "Pud" Burgess, R. Johnstone, Paul Thompson, Vic Flower and John Farr shooting 24 and Eugene Kavanagh, N. Simms, J. Hall, Graham Wilson and M. Barton shot 23.

Sunday was a scorcher with temperatures soaring over the century (farenheit of course) and under difficult con-ditions so far as heat was concerned the final 25 targets of the zone championship was shot. "Pud" shot a 25 to win the Championship and the AA Grade with a score of 97/100 with Victor Burgess, Barry Scanes, Paul Thompson, M. Quirk, John Gooley, B. Battagol and Bob DeVries shooting 24 and Bruce Noll, S. Koludrovic, B. Walton, E. Kavanagh, N. Simms, R. Johnstone, V. Flower, T. Rumbel, D. Devlin and J. Farr shot 23. Final results of Northern Zone Championship were:--

The first 50 targets of the New South Wales Olympic Trench Championship were also shot on the Sunday and the first 25 targets were shot by "Pud" Burgess, R. Johnstone, B. Scanes, R. Boggiss and T. Rumbel with B. Noll, A. Bould, E. Kavanagh, B. Prosser, P. Thompson, V. Flower, R. Lowry, G. Wilson, J. Farr and G. Blackman on 24 and N. Simms, M. Quirk, B. Battagol, D. Devlin on 23.

Sunday finished up with no possibles in the second 25 targets of the State Championship, A. Burgess, J. Johnstone, I. Nuzzoles, V. Flower, R. Lowry and E. Milham shot 24 and B. Walton, V. Burgess, E. Kavanagh, N. Simms, B. Prosser, B. Scanes, B. Johnson, T. Rumbel, G. Wilson, E. Wilson shot 23. A complimentary tea was served at the Club on Sunday night and Monday saw another hot day and the final 50 targets of the State Championship.

The third 25 targets were shot by Ray Johnstone with A. Bould, A. Burgess, J. Hall, M. Baker, M. Quirk, R. Lowry, T. Rumbel and J. Farr on 24 and S. Koludrovic, L. Cooper, T. Lucas, M. Barton on 23.

The final 25 targets were something of a cliff hanger with Ray Johnstone on 74/75 and "Pud" Burgess on 73 with Ray Lowry and Terry Rumbel on 72. Maurie Quirk shot the only 25 in the last round with B. Walton, N. Simms, J. Hall, R. Johnstone, P. thompson, B. Battagol, T. Rt mbel and J. Farr on 24 and "Pud" Burgess, B. Scanes, T. Rowe, R. Boggiss and M. Barton on 23. Ray Johnstone won the Championship and A grade with a

tremendous score of 98/100. AA Grade had to be determined by a shoot-off with "Pud" Burgess and Terry Rumbel both on 96/100. The shoot-off was tense as in the first round Terry dropped his second target and "Pud" his 10th and 11th and it looked as though Terry had it won and then dropped his third last target to make the score 23/25 each. The second round was a perfect score for "Pud" and Terry dropped his 8th, 18th and 25th targets. Final scores were:---


The overall High Gun, very generously donated by Winchester Australia Limited, was won by A. M. "Pud" Burgess with a score of 193/200 over the three days. Other top scores on the week-end were Ray Johnstone and Terry Rumbel 189/200, Maurie Quirk and John Farr 187/200.

In all 51 shooters participated over the three days, 46 in the Zone Championship, 43 in the State Championship and the remainder shot for targets only - having never shot Olympic Trench before.

On the Monday morning Taree-Wingham Gun Club donated a case of Winchester cartridges to be sold by "dutch" auction, the proceeds of which to be donated to the A.C.T.A. Overseas Travel Fund. Bruce Noll very capably carried out the duties of the auctioneer and the grand total of \$558.00 was collected. The cartridges went under the hammer to Melbourne shooter Barry Battagol.

The Club felt the shoot was an outstanding success and appreciated the great distances so many of the shooters travelled to be present. Eight came from Melbourne, four from Brisbane, four from A.C.T. International and the remainder from far and wide in New South Wales.


Mrs Leonna Sky (Asst. Sec.) displays the trophies.





### SHOOTERS MAKE BIG DONATION TO CHARITY

# WERRIBEE GUN CLUB CHARITY SHOOT HELD ON THE 27/2/77

On the 27th February 1977 the Werribee Gun Club Charity Shoot in aid of the Werribee Mentally Retarded Children Building Fund was held at the Club grounds in Leakes Road, Werribee.

Quite a lot of preparation had gone on over the preceding months in order that this Charity Shoot could take place.

The weather was perfect and the programme was away on time with 89 shooters from various parts of Victoria entering in the Premier Event of the day, which was the 20 Target Double Barrel Handicap.

After all squads had shot it was found that only 7 of the 89 shooters had shot the possible score of 20 targets. The shoot-off commenced almost immediately to determine the first three placegetters, with shooters dropping out as they missed a target.

"C GRADE" 1st Mrs J. Young 27/28, 2nd L. Calandro 26/28, 3rd A. Cecchini 24/26.


The winners of each grade received a Sash/Trophy with trophies going to 2nd and 3rd placegetters also.

### The Two Greeners

I am not writing about a cased pair of shot guns by the above makers, but of a combination of father and son who for 92 years, provided the World with the most efficient guns and rifles.

William Greener was born about the turn of the 19th Century, and commenced his gun making firm on his return from London, where he had been working for John Manton (the father of British gun making) to establish himself in 1829 in his native town of Newcastle, England.

His first book "The Gun" published in 1835 at a time when very little had been written on the subject.

Six years later, he wrote "The Science of Gunnery" dedicated to Prince Albert, which besides embodying "The Gun" dealt with Cannon, and contained criticisms of other workers in the same field.

Owing to difficulties of supply he transferred his firm to Birmingham in 1844.

His criticism of the Proof House at Birmingham led to the promoting of the Gun Proof Act of 1855.

Regarding his gun improvements, we find him to be the first to discard perforated vents in percussion gun breeches, he was also instrumental in improving the hardness and quality of barrels, by the introduction of more steel into their content.

His improvements to the harpoon gun led to his weapons being adopted by the Scottish Fisheries, and many of them are still to be found in the collections and Museums of the World.

His greatest achievement was the discovery of the expanding bullet for muzzle loading rifles, the musket to which Mr Greener adopted his bullet was an 11 bore and although the trial of his invention proved that a rifle could be loaded as easily as a smooth bore whilst still retaining its accuracy, no notice was taken of it by the Government, yet in 1852 the Government awarded Minie, a Frenchman 10,000 pounds for a bullet of the same principle as Greener's invention of 1836. Mr Greener was aggrieved by this, and the Government eventually admitted the justice of his claim, and gave him 1000 pounds from the Armoury estimates of 1857. As a sporting gun maker, Mr Greener had by now, 1845-58, reached a position of acclaim, proved by the fact that he was appointed to make guns for the Prince Consort, and at the 1851 Exhibition he received the highest award for guns, and barrels perfectly forged and finished. At the Exhibitions of Paris and New York in 1853 and 55 respectively, silver medals were awarded to him for his classic percussion sporting arms.

In the flourishing days of the Southern States of America, where he sent guns of highest finish, up to 75 pounds were paid for them.

His two groove rifles met with success in South Africa, and with the profits, he built a new factory at "Rifle Hill Aston Manor" in 1859, where the firm enjoyed considerable prosperity. About this time he published his last work "Gunnery in 1858"

About this time he published his last work "Gunnery in 1858" which was written in an unpleasant spirit, as he challenged other writers of articles on fire-arms in a most hostile manner. He did not confine himself to gunnery, and among the numerous inventions were Davey Lamps, a self-righting life boat worked by means of water ballast, and a mechanism by which 4 gates could be worked at once for level crossings. In 1847 he also patented an electric light system.


Although he lived until 1869, he did not take kindly to the breech loaders and scoffed at them as pretences.

In a field trial of 1859 the muzzle loader shot gun proved superior as both pentration and patterns were better. This, no doubt, led Mr Greener to say that there was little chance of the use of breech loaders becoming popular, but we must remember that the muzzle loader had been improved upon for hundreds of years, and the breech loader was only just in its earliest development.


His son who had become a gun maker in his own right, took over both businesses on his father's passing, and had in 1864 already produced his first patent gun an under lever pin fire shot gun, which had a top bolt locking devise.

In a later edition — more about his son (William Wellington Greener) who made history in the breech loading field of gun making and the development of the science of choke boring of shot guns.

# George Biggs at Wakehurst



The Wakehurst Gun Club was the scene of some feverish activity on the 5th and 6th of February, when the one and only George Biggs officiated at a Gun Seminar. The Wakehurst Committee headed by President Noel McMichan planned the exercise as a practical demonstration of their determination to assist shooters in the only way possible — get professional advice.

The Seminar attracted an excellent response from members and visitors who participated enthusiastically in both the theoretical and practical aspects of the programme. Patron Arthur Freeman was not going to be left out either, returning as fit as ever after a 9 week stint in hospital (completely reconditioned) and calmly announced his 78th birthday on the Sunday and yet another trophy he was donating to the Club to celebrate the event.

The Club was able to take advantage of the lecture room facilities of the National Fitness Camp for the theoretical sessions which commenced each day. George started with the very basics of what shot guns are all about, followed by the fundamentals of DTL and Skeet shooting. The importance of proper gun fit was stressed time and again. Needless to say, everybody seized the opportunity to be "checked out".

Each lecture was followed by a lively question time prior to the practical sessions. Your editor has reminded me to include details of the questions and answers. So here they are:


2. What are your views about barrel length?

A. You will remember my comments about pointing. The optimum length for trap is 30" — it is easier to point than a 28" barrel. In USA some shooters use 32" barrels, but this sounds a bit unwieldly to me. For Skeet 28" barrels rather than 26" for the same reasons.

**Q.** Is their such a thing as a universal gun for DTL, skeet and field?

A. Not really, at the very best it would be a compromise. You can use a trap gun for shooting duck for example and a skeet gun for short range shooting like quail (here the skeet bore will help you too — remember what I said about the pattern opening up quickly?) If you recall what I said about elevation in a trap gun you will have the answer yourself about using a field gun for trap. I know there are many wiley old shooters who pad the stocks of their field guns when shooting trap, but this is for experts not beginners. As I said before, you must be able to hit the target when it is sitting on the end of the barrel. Blanking out targets to get the required elevation is not conductive to good scores.





**Q.** A friend of mine told me that the wire brushes supplied with gun cleaning kits scratch the barrel. Could you answer this question, and also give us some hints on gun care and storage?

A. Your leg has been pulled. The wire brushes are designed to remove the plastic deposit and other detritus from the inside of the barrel. There are a number of reliable proprietary solvent cleaners designed for the purpose. The plastic deposit is from the passage of the wad down the barrel and must be removed. With the development of the plastic wad the incidence of lead fouling has been reduced to almost zero.

The enemy of all ferrous metals is rust, and guns are no exception. All metal parts should be lightly oiled before storage. Ideally, guns should be stored horizontally in a rack or muzzle down in a cupboard. I say this because oil and wood are long term in the not good bed fellows and you do not want oil draining down into the wood of the stock.

Finally, avoid storing guns in cases. This can cause sweating with disastrous results in terms of rust that old enemy I spoke of earlier. Finally, have the action cleaned once per year.

Q. What about some hints for the reloader. I believe some mix powders from different manufacturers?

A. I hope you are wrong. Let me say here and now "follow the manufacturers instructions implicitly." I mean this in the very widest sense not only the recommended powder loadings but everything else, wads, primers, etc. There are some among us who think that they are gaining on their fellow shooters by cranking up charges above recommended levels. They are in reality doing no such thing, but what they **are** doing is raising barrel pressures dangerously and "blowing" the shot pattern. Past a certain point, increased shot velocity is a myth, if that is what they are after. As far as shot sizes are concerned, use 7's for DTL and 9's for Skeet.

This is such an important topic that recapitulation will not go amiss:

1. Store powder and primers in a cool dry place.

2. Don't mix powders

- 3. Buy or borrow a set of powder and shot scales.
- . 4. Follow the manufacturers instructions.

George and Betty Biggs did not escape from Wakehurst without a small presentation from the Club (a Knirps umbrella each) made by President McMichan, plus Club badge No. 200 for George. In reply George offered the Club a trophy which was gratefully accepted.

You guessed right — we have invited George and Betty to come back later in the year.

# **TRADE TOPICS**

Your magazine has not been able to offer "scoop" news for many months — nor can it now. However we are the first journal to **officially** report the "marriage" between Winchester Aust. Pty. Ltd., and the Browning and Beretta Companies.

We were advised on 1st March by Mr Brian Lowry, Marketing Manager of Winchester Aust. Pty. Ltd., that distribution agreements to cover Australia and New Zealand, have been signed by his company with F. N. Sports Ltd. (the Browning manufacturers), and Beretta (Armi), (the Beretta manufacturers). Mr Lowry stated that a fully detailed policy together with pricing, will be available to the trade around mid March.

The announcement comes after literally months of rumours and "fact", and now allows a further consolidation of the Browning and Beretta interests in Australasia.

To enable the new products to be accommodated within the very professional Winchester sales machine, a new division has been created with Brian Mark adding a further "hat" to his responsibilities as Sales Promotion Manager, and being responsible for sales of the new products — Rob Schwarz has been appointed as Brian Mark's assistant with the title of Product Supervisor (Browning, Beretta and Bear — a range of archery products).

One of the fringe benefits of this agreement is that it will enable Winchester to continue with Browning cartridges (both shotshells and .22's) and shooters may be assured that a revamped version of Browning cartridges will be available at the 1977 Nationals.

On behalf of their Company, Ross Baillie (Managing Director) and Brian Lowry have confirmed that a Browning Presentation Gun and an S58E Beretta will again be amongst the High Gun awards at our 1977 Nationals.

Brian Mark recently spent a few days at the World Archery Championships held in Canberra — he reports that they obtained a great amount of television coverage and had a large gallery of spectators most of the time. These are amongst the many areas where we need to **develop our sport**.

With economic pressures increasing in the firearms and ammunition industry, as with most other industries, combined with a greater trend towards the use of reloaded cartridges, both major ammunition manufacturers have advised the A.C.T.A. that from 1st Jan. '77 the donation of cartridges to Interstate Team representatives has been withdrawn. This is to the shooter's advantage in that he will be free to use in the competition round, the type of cartridge he chose to use in the qualifying round.

The "Grapevine" has it that the ever-popular Ray Johnstone of Michaelis Bayley Trading (the SKB distributors) has had his area responsibilities increased to include all branches — previously he was responsible for mainly Victoria. Ray, together with MBT's Firearms and Marine Products Manager George Rath were telling us that they still have pleasant memories of the most successful SKB promo conducted at Royal Aero Club (NSW) late last year — the shooting programme attracted 115 entries.

year — the shooting programme attracted 115 entries. To keep some balance in our "anti-media" outbursts, we commend 3XY, the Melbourne based radio station for its sponsorship of an exhibition called "Expo 77" late in 1976. The exhibition included sporting clinics and shooting sports were represented by the well known Alcock & Pierce company ably supported by Sporting Shooters Association of Australia members. Although the format of the "clinic" was kept very simple at least it was an attempt to promote the **safe handling** of firearms as a community service.

IMI Australia Ltd, especially through its Victorian Sales Manager, Don Hobill, has provided great support to the newlyformed Victorian Clay Target Association. Don, whose wife Glenys, is patiently waiting the arrival of their second child when this is being written, is under tremendous pressure as present because of the critical shortage of clay targets. Although targets have been short for the past two years, the position today is extremely serious.

It is of concern to all connected with Clay Target Shooting that the lack of supply of targets is now restricting the development of our sport. It is wasted effort to promote shooting, create a demand, and then be unable to satisfy that demand.

By the way, a word of advice for the benefit of those Clubs still





# TRAPSHOOTING WITH ELGIN GATES



At a clay target tournament, have you ever watched men whip their guns up and call for the target with scarcely a pause? These are what I call speed shooters. There are many of them.

Right off the bat let me say that, while I have seen some good speed shooters, I have never seen one of top championship calibre, at least not in America. And I've shot on squads with all the top champions. Some are more deliberate than others, but none are real speed shooters.

There are good reasons for this, namely the eyes. All the top shooters I know shoot with both eves open, but down the ranks there are many who are unaware of which eye is their master eye, and this is extremely important. Here is a simple test to let you determine which is your master eye: With both eyes open, point to a distant object with your right forefinger, arm outstretched, just as you would point to anything. Now close your left eye. If you are still looking directly at the distant object over your forefinger with your right eye, then the right eye is your master eye. For right-hand shooters, this is correct. Now, with your finger still pointing, close your right eye, leaving the left eye open. Your finger will now be pointing — as seen by your left eye — considerably to the right of the distant object. The opposite, of course, is true for lefthand shooters. If you are one of those righthand shooters with a master left eye, then you have a serious handicap. There are two helpful solutions. One is to close the left eye when shooting, thus forcing the right eye to see the target over the rib of the gun and follow it. Slightly bet-ter, if you use shooting glasses, is to put a small piece of opaque tape about a half-inch square on the left lens in just the right place to block out the front sight or bead from the left eye, and thus prevent the left eye from taking over and dominating the sight picture. Otherwise, if the left eye, being the master eye in this example, does take over the sight picture, the result is called cross-shooting and the shooter will shoot to the left of the target.

The next thing about eyes — and the main reason why some of the top shooters are deliberate — is to let their eyes refocus **out** to the top of the traphouse **before** calling for the target. Let me explain it this way: When I raise my gun, I instinctively check the beads on the rib to verify that I have the correct sight picture. At this point my eyes are focused on the beads. Then I hesitate about 3 seconds to let my eyes refocus **out** to the top edge of the trap house where the target will appear. Here is another simple test to illustrate the point: Hold your finger up about eighteen inches from your eyes and focus sharply on it. Hold this focus and you will be aware that distant objects are indictinct or blurred. Now, suddenly let your eyes refocus out to the distant object. There will be a distinct interval of one or two seconds before your eyes are refocused sharply on the distant object. Thus, the man who whips his gun up and calls for the target in one quick move may be ready mentally and physically, but his eyes are refocusing.

A few shooters claim they always have their eyes focused out to where the target will appear and never have to worry about the sight picture or position of the beads. Maybe so, and if these same shooters could guarantee that they could mount their gun exactly the same way on their shoulder each time and put their face on the stock exactly the same each time they raise the gun, i'might agree with their technique. As it is, I want to make dead sure I get the same sight picture for each shot, and the only way is to verify it with my eyes.

If you have ever had the feeling that the target is a sort of blurred streak when it comes out of the traphouse, or you have trouble picking it up quickly, your eyes probably aren't focussed out to the traphouse. The older a man gets — and I'm speaking about us middle-aged shooters again — the longer it takes his eyes to refocus from the sights on the rib of his gun out to the traphouse. Need I say more?

One more point. The human eye, in one respect, is exactly like the iris and lens of a camera. When the light is dim, you open the iris of the camera to get more light. But, at the same time, you **decrease** the depth of field or focus. At, say, F1.5, the depth of focus is very shallow and critical. At F22, virtually everything from six or eight feet to infinity is in sharp focus. Thus the man who wears shooting glasses with very dark lenses is shutting out the light and reducing his depth of focus. Lighter lenses, which still cut out the glare, will let more light in, causing the iris of the eye to contract, thus increasing the depth of focus considerably, definitely an advantage in trapshooting.

Next time you are on the practise field, try focusing your eyes sharply on the top of the traphouse or on the grass just beyond before calling for the target. You should see the target better. And if you can see it better, you ought to have a better chance of hitting it.

## **RULES CORNER**

At a recent major shoot a query arose as to the eligibity of a shooter to be considered for a High Gun Award when he had shot for "targets only" in one of the prescribed qualifying events.

The following is an extract from a reply given by Mr E. Hawkins, Rules Supervisor from N.S.W.:

"There is no way that a competitor may shoot in an event for targets only and still be eligible to use his score in that event for High Gun purposes.

"Firstly, as you state in your letter, Rule 26 covers the situation. However I do not believe that the competitor would be eliminated from the High Gun entirely. My ruling would be that the scores in any events that were shot for targets only would not be counted but the scores in any events for which the full nomination was paid would still be counted in the high gun. Obviously with the complete score of one event missing, it would be difficult for a competitor to win the high gun, but not impossible.

"Secondly, one of the purposes of a high gun is to encourage competitors to shoot the entire programme for the benefit of the club, and, if we allowed targets only scores to be used, we would be defeating the purpose.

"The payment or otherwise of optional sweepstakes would be irrelevant to the eligibility of high gun scores."

(The introduction of this section has created a certain degree of interest — let's have some more questions — Sec.)

A perennial topic for conversation around Clubs is the matter of trophy values for the purpose of handicapping. The rules require Clubs to show the value of trophies prior to the commencement of the programme. At least this provides shooters with an opportunity to know the extent to which a penalty will be imposed in the case of a win.
