





Secretary's Notes

In the 'old'days, this time of the year was reported to be the quiet time of the year, when the administrative unit had an opportunity to catch up on the work which had been deferred from earlier in the year. WOW! How times have changed! This year, something seems to have gone wrong with the recipe. Not only have the needs of FOUR touring teams to be attended to, but two major promotional projects have been undertaken.

The first involved an invitation to 500 sportsgoods retailers to subscribe to 'Clay Target Shooting News'. For many years, the magazine has been used to 'preach to the converted'. In other words, the Association has not had access in a publicity sense to the outside world. As a preparatory step to putting the journal on general sale, it was considered that an attempt should be made to get the message to commercial interests connected to our sport. After all, every purchaser of a shotgun is a potential clay buster. The response, thus far, has been encouraging if not quite dramatic.

The second promotional activity involved sending a reminder to those of the Association's 1977 members who have not renewed for 1978. The response to this letter has been quite surprising. Because registration renewals need to be paid through a Club, it is too early yet to assess the success of that aspect of the response. However, the interesting point is the number of replies received from members who do NOT intend renewing their registration. The replies have indicated a number of reasons for the non-renewal. In time, these reasons will be analysed and a report will be forwarded to Clubs for consideration. The really rewarding point is the rapid increase in involvement which has occurred in recent months.

For a long time, it was very depressing to witness the apparent lack of care which was shown by 'grass roots' members. Nothing seemed to worry them, as long as a target appeared when they called "PULL"! However, in recent months, the mail arriving at the National Office has increased quite measurably, and the number of incoming 'phone calls has reached a stage where a further line has to be considered. A large proportion of this increased communication is from people who wish to express a view on a subject of National concern.

What a far cry from the 'bad old days'. After all, this is YOUR Association and it can only develop along acceptable lines if all members express their opinions openly. It is to be hoped that a member who wishes to register an opinion will always receive a hearing at the National Office. However, it is equally as important that these same opinions be expressed at Club Committee level. This is where policy formulation starts on the 'consolidation trail' through Zone and State Councils.

Anyway, enough of the sermon. Let's move onto the September Chapter of the 'A Shooter' saga! (For those of our readers who don't recognise the reference, a letter signed by 'A Shooter' appeared on Page 24 of July Issue of C.T.S.N.) The correspondent has NOT honoured his or her side of the deal. C.T.S.N. has accepted your challenge, 'A Shooter' — WHERE ARE YOU? You have now had six weeks since the publication of your letter, in which you made a conditional promise. C.T.S.N. met the condition. NOW YOU SHOULD EITHER HONOUR YOUR PROMISE OR PROVE YOURSELF TO BE A COWARD, AN ANONYMOUS COWARD AT THAT! A number of the more conservative responses to 'A Shooters' outburst have been published in Editor's Mailbox, elsewhere in this issue.

On the subject of staff, the Association has suffered a serious setback. Irene Coghlan, who joined the Administrative Unit in April, is leaving for Papua New Guinea at about the time this journal goes to press. Irene became Mrs Bill Jolly on August 5th and Bill has accepted a senior retail position in Port Moresby for two years. Irene has had responsibility for the implementation of the Kalamazoo accounting system the Association is now using and her departure is a serious loss. Her husband, Bill Jolly, will be remembered by Nationals competitors as an accomplished referee—he has also been a member of the Committee of Melbourne Gun Club. The couple have made a significant contribution to our sport and will be missed after their departure. I'm sure I speak on behalf of all members when I extend to Irene and Bill best wishes for a successful future together.

Well, that's about it for now. When you are reading this, I hope to be in the U.S.A. congratulating the Australian Trap Team on its performance at Vandalia.

TRAVEL Cont'd

Moving now to the USA group, which is due to depart from Sydney on August 3rd, there are 31 people in that party, including the official six man team which was selected during the '78 Nationals. However, a change has occurred in the identity of the Western Australia member of the team — Robin Bailey succumbed to the pressures of his new business. Fortunately, Tim Catling who was next in line for selection, was able to quickly re-align his business schedule and has now taken Robin's place. The other members of the Air New Zealand Team are: Peter Tink (Queensland), Robbie Smith (NSW), Bob Cartledge (Vic), Graeme Appleby (Tas), and John Hutchings (SA). The official Australian entry in the International match to be conducted at Vandalia (USA) includes only five shooters, necessitating a further elimination before Australia's final team is named.

This 31 strong group is being fully escorted by one of Jetset Tour's most experienced Tour Leaders, Wendy Bartley. Wendy has been operating "the North American run" for some time now there are very few problems which will defeat her. There is always the chance that she will come back a converted clay target shooting enthusiast and will take membership of the Association.

NOUMEA - '78

Now, let's look into the future. The next official "Special Promotion" will be the Jetset-ACTA group to New Caledonia. Due to leave Australia on Friday, September 29th, the group will be away for eleven days.

No better description of New Caledonia can be found than in the Jetset Tours brochure: "A paradise of sunny climes washed by the balmy breezes of the trade winds. A land where light informal clothes are adequate all year round, with the addition of a sweater in the cool of the evenings. The average temperature variation for the twelve months is only 6° C".

It is interesting to note that Australia has a number of links with New Caledonia; apart from being ocean neighbours. The suburb of La Perouse in Sydney is called after the famous French navigator of the same name. After leaving Australia in his two ships, 'La Bossole' and 'L'Astrolabe', both ships and all hands were lost on the Vanikora Reefs just off New Caledonia. Another thing to reflect on as the sleek International jet takes you on your way is that an Australian aviator covered the route first. He was Victor Rafferty who took 11 hours and 20 minutes to fly his de 'Havilland Moth from Australia to New Caledonia. Yet another link is that New Caledonia boasts a world-famous coral reef, second in size only to our own Great Barrier Reef.

New Caledonia is a French dependency with both French and English being used freely and widely understood. Noumea is a colourful cosmopolitan city situated on a peninsula of many bays. It is old and new! A city of 100-year-old homes and monuments that rub shoulders with modern businesses and chic boutiques. French and English voices bid for your attention, with THIRTY Malanesian dialects in the background. Money holds no qualms for even the uninitiated. One Australian cent is roughly equal to one French Pacific Franc, usually referred to CFP.

Westley Richards Monkeytail Rifle and other gems of the Past

Part 2

(PAUL GRIBBEN, Cosgrove Gun Club) Remarkable progress came in 1875 with the perfecting of the superb Anson Westley hammerless action, well known for its strength and small number of parts, later copied under licence by other gun makers. Mr Anson being a foreman and Mr Deeley the Managing Director of the Company.

In 1884 came an improved fore-end ejector mechanism, plus the famous box lock action with its remarkable detachable locks, a hinged cover plate excluding both dust and water, which could be removed, and the locks simply lifted out with the fingers, using no screws or pins. Some of the big game shooters of that period had an extra pair of locks made in case of accident when shooting in remote Colonies, at the remarkable price of Ten Pounds. When one views these sets lying snugly in their neat leather case, one is amazed at the low price as they, like the rifle, are a work of art.

In 1910 the big game shooters were able to purchase fine double hammerless ejector rifles fitted with detachable locks and single trigger, and hinged cover plate with cheek piece in stock in .577 calibre, neatly engraved. Added touches of perfection came with leaf flip upsights, combination day and night fore sights and W.R.registered hinged foresight protector plus best quality flatsling swivels, and to make it even better, the stock had a steel pistol grip hand cap with a tiny trap door containing a spare fore sight all for the price at which one may well wonder - ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY POUNDS!

The same model 12 bore shot gun was then available (less all the sighting frills) at about 110 Pounds and for an extra 10 Pounds a solid leather brass bound gun case could be purchased.


After 1910 the Firm turned its attention to the development of the over and under system of rifles and shot guns, commonly called "OVUNDO", the rifle barrels being milled and drilled out of a solid piece of metal.


Recoil was not employed to actuate the one trigger mechanism, but used a definite separate trigger cocking mechanism for each lock, and so made, that heavy charges would not cause the rifle to "double"

Bolt action sporting rifles were made up using Mauser type bolt in a great variety of calibres. They provided sportsmen with all sorts of accessories for their sport. Making scopes, mounts, cases, and catered for the full range of ammunition from .22 HP to the mighty .600 NITRO EXPRESS.

Westley Richards & Co. Ltd. had been granted Royal letters of Patent for over 100 inventions connected with guns, rifles and ammunition, and claimed to have enjoyed three-fourths of top leverhammerless gun trade during the early years of this century.





A TALE OF 2 BROWNINGS by PAT BROWNE

John M. Browning invented the Auto Loading Shotgun, and it has come a longway since 1900. Pat Browne had some surprises when he took a look at the latest version.

To be very honest with you, I did not have any idea of what was in front of me when I innocently accepted an offer from 'debonaire' Dick Ayres to shoot a Browning Auto Five at Duck Opening this year. The offer had come about as we were reminiscing about the old days when it was virtually the only quality auto loading gun you could buy. I have had one in my gun cabinet for night on 20 years and its performance had never been questioned, in fact it is probably, no not probably, it is, the finest auto loading and the most famous shotgun in history.


The gun was duly delivered to me, and it was removed from the cover and a couple of packets of shells put through it during a lullin proceedings at the local gun club prior to duck opening, to check functioning. The next time it came out of the cover was in the dark on opening morn. It was around 10.00 a.m. whilst things were quiet with the quackers that I suddenly discovered my first surprise. Sitting in the blind with the gun across my knees I was idly reading the bits and pieces stamped on the barrel and remarked to Ian Campbell that the modified choke was certainly doing the job when I turned the Browning over. There before my very eyes, was stamped on the barrel 'Made in Japan'. Well to say the least, I was dumbfounded. Probably one has been conditioned over the years to the fact that nearly all the Brownings we see come from Belgium. I certainly have thought this way, and this discovery sort of left me a bit bewildered.


I never gave the gun a thought before this discovery but my curiosity was aroused and all sorts of thoughts were going through my mind as the surprise seeped in. To me it felt like a Browning, it certainly functioned like a Browning, with that familiar clanking double shuffle, it certainly looked like a Browning and by crikey it was certainly as well finished as the Browning I have known in the

Closer examination on the spot, and one must admit it was only cursory, showed, apart from the barrel stamping, the only difference was the butt plate. No mention of FN, just the 'Browning' logo on a plain background. Interest then centred on the performance, and it must be reported that there were no problems. I must say though it was frustrating, sitting there in the middle of a duck swamp with a Japanese manufactured Browning auto five in my hands with all those unanswered questions. I have the answers now and we will look at them as we progress with this gun

The idea that struck me immediately was that it could be interesting to compare this test gun with a FN Browning to see if there was any drop off in the quality and finish with the change to Japanese manufacture. My old mate Don Fleetwood of S.A. Sportsgoods came up with a new FN Browning and the comparisons were made. We think you will be surprised at the results. You know, they have been making firearms in the Meuse Valley and at Licentric and Licentric a

and at Liege since the 14th Century, and I for one would like ten cents for every sporting shotgun that has been manufactured in that part of the world. Over the years the quality of the better class guns that have come from Liege has become legendary, and more particularly since the conglomerate firm of Fabrique Nationale d'Armes de Guerre was formed in 1888. Today we know this firm as Fabrique Nationale, Herstal or even simpler as FN Sports. The big explosion in the field of shotguns however came in the early 1900s when a FN director went to the USA to discover something





about, would you believe, bicycles. He met a man called John-Moses Browning, aninventorof somenote and obtained manufacturingrightsfor a 7.62mm cal. pistol which was quite revolutionary in

its automatic operation.
It was a nuge success becoming the accepted official sidearm of several countries. But it was in 1902 that we see the first appearance of the famous Browning Auto Five. John Moses Browning went to Herstal to see the FN people with the design of the Auto Five as he could not interest any manufacturer in the USA with it. FN, having had some considerable success with John Browning in the past signed a contract for the manufacture of the gun almost immediately. John Browning must have thought it was a goer also, he ordered 10,000 of them the very same day.

cartridge recoil. In the fully recoiled position, the bolt unlocks and holds back whilst the barrel moves forward under the influence of the barrel return spring around the magazine tube. The fired shell is retained by the extractor hook and is kicked clear of the ejection port by an ejector lug as the barrel moves forward. At this time also a new cartridge is released from the magazine and is pushed back on to the shell lifter which lifts it upwards and trips the bolt release to allow it to close under its own spring power, chamber the shell and leave the gun cocked and ready to fire again. Like we say it is a very well proven system that has stood the test of time.

Now let's look at the refinements that are built into the Browning that set it a bit apart from its imitators. Some, if not all, of these refinements are seen on other recoil operated auto loaders in various degrees of sophistication, but you can rest assured that the original design came from Browning. Firstly we have the split



This two way agreement set FN on the path of what was to become probably one of the most prolific sporting firearms partnerships in history. In fact it was only some five years later in 1907 that John M. Browning agreed to allow his name to be used on the guns manufacture by FN. So, FN/Browning came into existence and since that time some three million Auto Fives have hit the market in all parts of the world. Surely this must be some sort of record.

But like most things, the winds of change cometh and some years ago there came some sort of tie up between FN, Beretta and the Browning Arms Company in the USA. Little things began to happen, such as the fact that we were informed that the Auto Five was not completely manufactured in Herstal but some of the bits and pieces and the assembly had been shifted to Portugal. It was about this time that some of us more inquisitive scribes began to notice that the old faithful hump backed Browning was not as well finished as it was in the past. The gun we have for comparison in this test we are led to believe comes from the land of Christopher Columbus and has a defect that to some may be minor, but to us seems a bit indicative of the bit of a slump the gun hit over the past year or two.

Let's not however, get too wrapped up in the history bit, but have a look at this Browning that has reached us from the land of the Rising Sun. From the outset, let's also get one thing straight. We are not saying that when FN transferred some of its operations, to Portugal that the Auto Five became a heap of junk, nor are we saying that the Japanese version is a return to top quality, only time will tell this. What we can say is that whatever tie up there is with the Browning Arms Company in the USA, FN in Belgium, Miroku in Japan and Winchester in this country, they have between them come up with a Browning Lightweight Twelve in an Auto Five configuration that loses nothing to its illustrious predecessor.

The gun we have for testing is the Lightweight Twelve with a 71 cm modified barrel, chambered for the 70 mm cartridge and stocked for field use. In all respects, this gun is the daddy of all the long recoil operated auto loaders. It has the refinements and little do-dads that make an auto loader a pleasure to use. With the advent of the gas gun, the old long recoil gun has become a little redundant, but it is still there in the market place slugging it out with its now more popular cousins. John Browning's original design of using the energy created by the cartridge firing to unlock the gun, eject the fired shell and chamber the next shell automatically has been with us now for well nigh 80 years. More to the point however, is that the basic design of the Browning has not altered at all in this time. Surely this must say something about the design.

In simple terms, the way the Browning operated is as follows. When ready to fire the bolt is closed in the locked position, a lug engaged with the top of the barrel extension. On firing the whole barrel and bolt assembly moves backwards under the influence of

lifter. A simple thing you might say but one that makes the life of the auto user a little easier. In practical terms it means that you can feed more shells into the magazine without having to fumble for the operating button on the side of the gun. It requires a deal more precision engineering and fitting in the trigger and bolt assembly but Browning did it at the turn of the century and it is still there today.

Secondly, there is the magazine cut off. To be very honest with you I have not used this feature very much at all in the many years that I have used the Auto Five. But in actual fact it is useful in some situations, for instance when you wish to change the chambered cartridge for something different without disturbing the magazine loading. Another big point in its favour is the fact that with the cut off lever in the closed position you effectively turn the





gun into a single shot. This is a great boon when using the gun as a training weapon with youngsters and it is in this context that I have used this feature. Thirdly, there is the braking system.

This is probably the most misunderstood operating feature of the Browning and the one that gets gunners into more trouble than any other. The modern Browning that we have for test has the whole braking system explained by way of simple diagrams inside the fore-end. The main operative parts are the 'bronze friction piece' a split bronze brush held snugly around the magazine tube, bevelled at each end. On the front side or muzzle end this bevelled edge engages with a matching belel on the backside of the barrel retaining ring.



The barrel extension. Note recess for lock-up and groove for extractor.


The other operative piece is the 'friction' ring itself, a thin bronze bush with a bevel on the inside of one side only. When firing heavy loads this friction ring is at the muzzle end of the spring with the bevel facing forward. This means on recoil the bronze friction piece will get a maximum 'squeeze' and give a hard braking effect on the recoil action. When you are on light loads you transfer the friction ring to the receiver end of the magazine tube with the flat side towards the muzzle thus reducing the braking effect and allowing the lighter loads to operate the gun properly.

A lot of gunners that I know ignore this simple adjustment and suffer the consequences in the form of gun malfunctions with light loads. Worst still is the habit of setting their dear old Browning for light loads and banging off the heavy stuff on this setting.

You do not have that many gun malfunctions, but you will suffer other major penalties in the form of whopping recoil, split fore-ends and a mangling of the more delicate parts of the bolt and yoke mechanisms. Simple attention to the braking system will give you years of trouble free life in this department.

An old gunsmithing mate of mine gave me a tip on cleaning and maintenance of the Auto Five braking system many years ago that is worth passing on. It is so simple as to seem ridiculous.

Get yourself a deep container that will take the magazine tube vertically almost down to the receiver. Fill it with two stroke fuel (50:1). Remove the barrel and fore-end and swish the braking system around in the container of fuel making sure that it is nice and clean. Remove it from the container and stand it vertically to dry. Reassemble and you are back in business. What happens is that the petrol gives the whole mechanism a good clean out but the little bit of oil that is in the mixture will leave just the right amount of lubrication on the outside of the magazine tube for trouble free operation.

So much for these little features, let's now have a close look at the Japanese Browning and see how it stacks up against its counterpart from Europe. Direct comparisons can be odius at times but we had no compunction at all in comparing these two. After all they are both offered as Browning Auto Loaders and we are of the opinion that it will be some time before all the European versions will depart from the shelves. Let's get straight to the point.

The Japanese version is better finished by the length of the straight. Blueing is better, deeper and better polished. Stocking and checkering are superb and equal too, if not slightly better than the European version. Wood to metal fitting was excellent in both models and could not be separated. Mechanically the guns were identical. In fact when we stripped both guns it was difficult to see any difference in the parts. Miroku have obviously got some good oil and perhaps even some tooling from the boys at FN. I only hope to hell we have put the right parts back in the correct guns.

Little need be said about the set up of the test Browning apart from the fact as mentioned earlier, that it is set up as a field gun. Essentially Browning have three types of stock, this one which is in fact a compromise between the high trap stock and the very low game stock which has a considerable amount of bend. This stock at 365-45-65 mm is one that will handle almost everything.


It can handle the field stuff and we gave it a real good run on the ducks for about six weeks and it is just as comfortable on the trap field.


There are plenty of real successful trapshooters around that swear by this gun and they have the scores on the board to prove it. The pistol grip has that nice even taper and a diameter of 127 mm common to a lot of Brownings. It again is a sensible compromise between the straight English style and the full abrupt pistol grip. The nice slim fore-end is very comfortable and very firm in the hand. The gun was very responsive in pointing out targets be they feathered or inanimate. The humpback shape has never worried me but some like the streamlined look of the 'johnny come lately's' in auto loading design.

Let's be honest, a Browning would not be a Browning without this receiver shape. The neat, narrow vent rib was a cause of some comparison in the two models. On the Japanese version it was nice and straight giving an excellent sighting plane. On the European



model there was a distinct mismatch of the rib and the receiver groove. As mentioned earlier this may be a minor point with some but it disturbed most gunners that looked down the rib of this gun.

Other testing at the pattern plate and with our trusty measuring instruments showed nothing untoward. The barrel was stamped Modified and that was exactly what it was with normal fodder, chambers barrel and choking measured out spot on.


We put some 609 shells through the test gun in firing tests consisting of light and heavy loadings in both factory loaded fodder and reloads. The gun would baulk at very shoddy reloads as will most auto loaders. We had 26 malfunctions, mostly failures to eject with doubtful reloads but a few feeding failures were evident in the early tests due probably to a little new gun stiffness. Overall we were most impressed with the functioning and as one staff member remarked, it performed like a real Browning.'

Be that as it may, in this scribes humble opinion, it is a real Browning. I have seen nothing in this gun that would have me believe otherwise. In fact I will stick my neck out and say that marginally it is a better gun than the Brownings we have seen over the last year or two. I am not sure if this version will be replacing the European version, but I have a feeling that it will do so in the future.

If it does you can rest assured that in the future when you go to buy a Browning Auto Five you are still getting what John Moses Browning designed in 1902. The design is still there and you can rest assured there has been no compromise in the quality of manufacture. I don't think I have looked harder at a 'gun on our test bench in a long, long time, and the surprise that I got in February last in the middle of a duck swamp has turned to confidence in the fact that the old Browning is still in there with its bang-shuffle-clank. To coin a phrase . . . the venerable old Browning is alive and well and living in Japan, long may it do so. It leaves our test bench with an unblemished reputation. O

Bill was well-known for his kite flying in the Barmera area, and as well over the years had travelled to many shows throughout Australia, and overseas, performing his high class act. A few of the countries he was engaged by to fly were New Zealand, his country of origin, Hong Kong, Japan, Djarkarta, New Guinea and twice to the Middle East. For shooting, targets were difficult and it was a cold day with a strong breeze blowing across Lake Bonnie. The Patron Germein trophy was won by Henry Reinders, Loxton, second Dennis Pfeiler, Barmera and third was shared by Leon Pfeiler, Loxton and Jim Blythman, Mildura. Patron Hall Trophy, first Trevor Shaddock, Barmera, second Henry Reinders, Loxton and third Max Trout, Barmera. Skeet Championship - Leon Pfeiler, Loxton, the only possible was first, Peter Caddy, Barmera second and Robbie Robertson, Mildura third.

Wednesday, 5th July, 1978

Cosgrove Gun Club Under shocking cold and wet conditions, Cosgrove conducted their annual July shoot. Owing to the conditions numbers were down on recent years. However one hundred shooters still managed to get there to enter the big event.

Being a mid-week shoot, and knowing the profession of many shooters in attendance, it was obvious the usual "sickie" had been taken from work for the day. Others looking hard at the sky informed me it was too wet to work and they were on wet pay. However, it wasn't too wet to shoot, and the first event got under way with it being overcast and light rain falling. Phil Pettit from St. James was first and won for himself the U.O. shotgun. I believe he also won this event last year. Graham Cartledge from Shepparton collected second and John Maxwell from Heathcote was third. In the thirty target Championship, Laurie Connors, Mildura collected "A" Grade and O₁All and "B" Grade went to David Edwards, Finley N.S.W. and "C" Grade to Neil Hendy, Wangaratta. The program high gun was also won by Neil Hendy.

Something I noticed at this shoot was a number of South Shepparton Technical School boys arriving at the shoot by bus and entering the first ten target event. These boys I am told are trained in gun safety and how to shoot at the Shepparton Gun Club every Wednesday by Art teacher, Rocky Furci. The boys are brought to Cosgrove to get first-hand experience in seeing a competitive shoot in operation and to get the experience of shooting in competition themselves. Rocky their instructor is also a keen shooter

himself.

Another item of interest was the type of traps being used at Cosgrove, to throw clay targets. I believe they were designed and built by some of their club members at the approximate cost of \$300 to \$400 each. This was for materials only. There is no doubt, they are a great machine.

I was talking to members of the Albury Gun Club now being established, and they borrowed one of the Cosgrove traps to use as a proto-type and made six for their own club, and these will be operating in the near future.

Traps are a major cost item for clubs and if they can be obtained in the manner above, it is to the club's and shooter's advantage. I know of several trap units being made at a minimum cost by club members in various areas and all are operating with great success.

To name a few, they are, Frank James and Ken Burton in the Kerang area, Zeke Bratke at Loxton Gun Club S.A. and Jack Wilkinson of Mildura. Jack made two sets of skeet traps for Mildura Gun Club for their skeet layouts, also incorporating his own design hopper feed for clay targets. Any club looking for equipment at reasonable cost should have a yarn to some of the boys mentioned.

Sunday, 9th July, 1978

The Victorian State Association held a meeting of State Council at Ballarat on this day. The meeting was convened at 10.30 a.m. finishing at approximately 5.30 p.m.

All North West Zone Council were present, also Terry Scott, our Zone Treasurer came along to sit in and observe and listen to proceedings

A large agenda was tabled and dealt with, and it is of interest for North West Zone clubs to note the following:

A Winchester Tournament will be conducted by Jeparit Gun Club in October and Kerang Gun Club in November 1978.

International Shooting Scene

The big talk on the International scene is the Commonwealth Games. The four clay target shooting members of the team were joined in a concentrated training session by their World Championships team mates during July — that is just prior to the departure of the Commonwealth Games team.

The training camp was under the control of the National Coaching Director, Newton Thomas, and ran from July 12th to 16th. The venue was the Melbourne Gun Club where the facilities installed for the 1973 World Championships provided a high technical standard.

The camp was planned to ensure that the only thing the team had to concern itself with was shooting targets. ALL arrangements were handled by the Director and ACTA administrative staff, together with willing workers in Bob Buchan, Bill Henwood, George Breman, Dick Hawkey, Reg Boyce, Bob De Vries and Merv Whitelaw. The creation of the training camp was made possible through a grant of \$3000 from the Federal Government. The money was used to cover assembly fares, accommodation, meals, targets, cartridges, ground rental and labour.

That the project was successful is beyond doubt. The team members involved were:

Trap — Rumble, Ellis, Berry, Porter and Lowry. Skeet — Crikis, Hale, Guyatt, Summers and Avison.

Each shooter fired at up to 200 targets each day, and in all cases bettered 91% average for the duration of the camp. Weather conditions were far from kind, being cold and windy, with varying light conditions making it difficult to "pick up" the fluorescent targets out of the trap (the "skeeties shot at black targets for the duration of the camp).

Of particular interest is the fact that on average, the skeet scores were 2% better than the trap scores, thus reversing the belief that Australia had a better chance in International Trench events.

The pressure was kept on each team member all through the camp and there were some very tired bodies returned to Melbourne Airport for the trip home at the conclusion of the camp.

On Sunday 23rd July, the major part of the Games team assembled in Sydney under the control of Les Martyn, team manager, and Jim Berry, assistant manager. Kitting was scheduled for the next day, and the team left from Sydney at 8.30 Cont'd on page 20



The Geelong region's economy will receive a shot in the arm from a \$1 million expansion program at the Point Henry Plant of Winchester, Australia Pty Ltd.

Winchester Australia manufactures sporting ammunition and explosives.

The managing director of Winchester, Mr Ross Baillie, said yesterday the expansion would mean additional employment opportunities on a progressive basis.

"Even more significant are the dollars we will be spending in Geelong," he said.

Mr Baillie said: "Contracts for the expansions program would be placed with local companies for buildings and equipment items required where possible.

The expansion program would provide work for Geelong people

in this way, he said.
"We will be assisting other Geelong companies by the money we spend," Mr Baillie said.

Winchester employs 170 people in the Geelong area.

Mr Baillie said the sort of jobs that would become available at the Point Henry plant would be skilled jobs.

The expansion program will accommodate an expansion in the company's product range.

Some of the \$1 million would go to updating some of the existing facilities in the plant.

Most money would be spent on additional buildings and equipment to manufacture the new products, Mr Baillie said.

Winchester Australia has a \$10 million investment in the Point Henry

The company record a record profit for the financial year ending November 30.

Mr Baillie said he expected the expansion program to be completed about mid-1979.

Mr Baillie said he could not reveal what products would be added to the Winchester range because the business was of a delicately-based nature.

"One reason is the products we make, and the other is that we are one of only two companies in Australia in this area," he said.

Mr Baillie said he was confident of expansion for the company in Geelong.

"The expanion places renewed emphasis on the company's confidence in the continued growth of the region and fully endorsed the original decision to locate its manufacturing facility in Geelong," he said.

The Winchester plant was opened by the former Premier of Victoria, Sir Henry Bolte, in April, 1967.



Organisers are expecting the attendance to exceed 600 competitors on the major days, which when family are included will mean an extra 1200 people converging on Griffith for the period. Already, accommodation has been block booked and arrangements

are in the hands of Ansett Airlines of Australia.

The National Clay Target Championships were last held in Griffith in 1972, when the attendance broke all previous records. On that occasion, the crowd was swelled by an "invasion" by a party of touring American competitors.

Because of the success of the 1972 visit by the U.S. group, National President, Ern Hawkins, will make a determined attempt to get another party of Americans to attend in '79. He is accompanying the official Australian Trap team, sponsored by Air New Zealand, which is currently touring U.S.A. During the tour, brochures featuring the '79 Nationals and the tourist potential of-"the country of wine and rice" will be freely distributed and are expected to arouse a great deal of interest.

Promotion will also be undertaken in Great Britain, Singapore, New Guinea, New Caledonia and New Zealand. Should a contingent arrive from each of these Nations, it will create another first as the most diverse collection of international competitors seen in Australia since the 1973 World Championships were held in

Melbourne.

It is of interest to know that the local community have cooperated to provide the Griffith Gun Club with tremendous support. The local Tourist Information Centre, headed by Robin Gaison (pronounced Jason) has provided wonderful assistance, whilst the Shire Council and local business houses are all fully committed to an assistance program.

So don't miss what will most certainly be the greatest Nationals series ever. Come to Griffith in March 1979. O





Editor's Mailbox

National Shooting Complex

Dear Noel,

May I, on behalf of the newly formed A.C.T. Shooting Association, embracing 11 Canberra Shooting Clubs, (900 members), join in the debate on National shooting grounds and share the latest informa-

tion with the readers of "Clay Target News".

In July 1977, the A.C.T. District Clay Target Association submitted a letter to the regular meeting of the Australian Shooting Association, asking for permission to conduct a feasibility study on llocating a National Shooting Complex in Canberra. The project called for incorporation of all Olympic disciplines as well as the traditional D.T.L., Australian skeet, simulated field and sporting

The majority of the readers will be particularly interested in the provision of multiple D.T.L. lay outs to cater for State and Na-

tional clay target events well into 1990 and beyond.

Readers will readily recognise the well known names in the clay target world - Brian Prosser (A.C.T. International Gun Club), Brendan Smith (Bungendore Gun Club), Merv Lyons (Queanbeyan Canberra Gun Club), Bevan Brown from Sporting Shooters and Howard Tankey, then President of the Association. They all signed the submission to the A.S.A.

The writer of this letter had the privilege of presenting the scheme verbally to the A.S.A. meeting. Permission granted, the investigation began. The very first meeting with the officers of the Department of Capital Territories and the National Capital Development Commission, revealed a fundamental weakness in our approach. We were still thinking as clay target shooters only. Both officers suggested to us that we broaden the base and in-

corporate in our planning, all shooting disciplines and clubs in this area. Such a move would assure intelligent utilisation of land, economies of scale and viability of the whole project.

The Commission showed us a piece of land (350 acres) and suggested we produce a feasibility study with a preliminary design of the Complex. The Department of Capital Territories left us with the challenge of uniting all shooters in the A.C.T. and rallying their support. In addition, we were to produce evidence that we can finance the project.

We were delighted by the friendly reception and the soundness of the advice. A meeting was called and with another well known clay target shooter - Jim O'Connor, in the chair, the AC.T. Shoot-

ing Association was born.

The elected Steering Committee was given the task of producing the study and of negotiating with relevant authorities. Six months was inadequate time to do it properly; nevertheless, a com-prehensive study with 80 pages of text, plans and sketches, together with photographs of overseas installations, was presented at the next regular meeting of the A.S.A. Such a study costs around \$5000. Whilst some delegates made kind comments about the depth and scope of the study, the meeting tossed it aside without any ceremony. I pleaded for further time to complete the investigation, which revealed a considerable degree of promise Subsequently, and rather grudgingly, a letter of "No thank you" was despatched to us after my remonstration.

The rejection created a backlash on the local scene. When I reported to the A.C.T. Shooting Association Steering Committee, it was decided to carry on with the investigation and go it alone if need be. The clubs rallied and we plunged into further work; and as we went along, the story became more interesting. We decided to interview heads of relevant Departments. Through this contact we met with the Minister for Capital Territories, The Right Hon. R. Ellicott. We also consulted with senior police officers, experts from the Australian Institure of Criminology, members of the Legislative Assembly and Chamber of Commerce. In addition, one of the A.C.T. Senators and both Local Members of Parliament also

promised their support.

It was a revelation to us to observe and listen to comments from people, who, whilst not shooters themselves, took an enlightened and appreciative attitude to our proposal. As it turned out, we ourselves failed to see wider ramifications of our scheme.Our concern was primarily centred on a first class shooting facility, to allow Australian shooters to reach proficiency and excellence to be projected onto the International scene.

The Educator saw the influence of a well disciplined group on a newcomer to shooting, in the teaching of safe handling of firearms. The Civic authorities saw the benefit to the community as a whole from increased tourism. The police saw drug free activity for young people. Who can argue against that?

sociation.

Our new redesigned scheme is called "Canberra International Shooting Complex". It will be built in stages to International standards. The financial backbone of the project will be the Country Club, situated on site of the Complex, fully licensed (with pokies), initially with cafeteria, later with restaurant, and operating daily. An underground miniature range, for air rifles and air pistols, will cater for junior training and competition. Squash and sauna, gym and meeting rooms, will also appeal to the social member.

We are determined to succeed and willing to share the social facilities with other less fortunate sporting clubs and associations of this community. The A.C.T. Sports Council will endorse the scheme. We are approaching the 10 000 shooters in this community, who are not represented or affiliated with any clubs. We have invited shooting clubs outside the A.S.A., such as Field and Game, Practical Pistol Club, and Air Rifle Association, to participate.

Having surveyed the annual returns of several licensed clubs in this community, we know that a club with a membership of around 3000 members can generate revenue of \$100 000 nett per year. With a social club of this capacity sponsoring the range, junior training

and competition, do we need to fear the future?

We received a subtle nod to go ahead and apply formally for a long term lease for an excellent site (300-400 acres) located in an area with other tourist facilities, low cost motels, public golf club, and situated close to the main highway for easy access for cars and caravans. We are assured of support for the project by the Legislative Assembly. It means that the land would be offered as a grant, with only rural rates to pay. In real terms, the value of such land is well over \$250 000.

Would the reader advise us at this stage to call a halt and wait until the delegates to the A.S.A. reach an agreement; that is if

they could agree within their own association!
We are convinced that NOW IS THE TIME, and we must take a chance and get on with the business. We have made one major breakthrough; we are united in our approach. Not until the administrations of our shooting associations put into practice the spirit of the I.S.U. Constitution (which speaks of friendship and cooperation between shooters) to which they all subscribe, will the sport progress.

We strongly recommend that the National head offices of shooting organisations, be located in the National Capital. As shooters, we are not utilising the same democratic political process, which gave our manufacturers the privilege of tariff protection, costing the sport millions of dollars over a period of years. We will not come of age as a National association, until we learn to create a National image in the Federal sphere; just look at the National Rifles of America.

Fellow shooters, if you are interested in our project and wish to take up foundation life membership of our Country Club, send us a letter - A.C.T. Shooting Association, P.O. Box 712, Fyshwick, A.C.T. 2609; we would be only too happy to send the application form. Your name will be commemorated on the Honour Board in the foyer of the club.

Our foundation life membership fees were set at a modest \$150.00 single, \$200.00 for a family. Fees can be paid in four instalments. In adddition, debentures will be issued and donations gratefully accepted for a specific purpose. This means that a keen shotgun enthusiast can donate towards D.T.L. or skeet equipment, without fear that his donation will be directed elsewhere.

As residents of the National Capital, we must act with enterprise and imagination; after all we are the only shooting organisation in the Federal sphere. All our National associations still reside either in Victoria or N.S.W.

We were thinking on behalf of all Australian shooters in our initial approach and let no man accuse us in future of parochial attitudes. Such accusations must be directed to men who today

We are living in a democratic society, which offers us the opportunities to reassess our course and restructure our organisation to meet the challenge of today - new gun laws, environmental issues, noise pollution and fear of guns by the general and ill-informed public. We need a truly National magazine, covering all disciplines and dealing with important issues affecting our sport.

It goes without saying, that our facilities will be shared with visiting shooters, for whom we are planning to offer low cost accommodation and caravan park facilities.

Editor's Mailbox Cont'd

Dear Noel,

In response to recent pleas from various quarters, I, as an average run of the mill shooter would like to make my feelings known

In the last few editions of CTSN there has been a lot written about Australian shooters reaching world standard and being able to compete successfully overseas. Not wishing to join the band of knockers who complain about the costs involved in shooting, I feel I must say something.

I have been shooting for about three years, and more recently as a member of the committee of a gun club, have become familiar with the costs involved in running successful shoots and maintain-

ing a financial club.

However, I feel that the main reason our shooters don't reach International standard is the costs incurred. I have no doubt that the chosen few who have the honor of representing our country do their utmost to live up to that honour. But in my opinion the answer does not lie initially in coaching and subsiding these shooters.

The best way of improving the standard of these shooters is to have pressure put on them by an ever increasing band of young enthusiastic competitors. Lets face facts. What percentage of registered ACTA members can afford to compete at the Nationals, especially when paying such a high price for cartridges. I feel the ACTA should put more effort into the area of cost especially cartridge and component costs. As cartridges manufactured in Austrália are advertised in overseas publications for about half the price we pay for them, I feel that a comparison between our costs and those of our counterparts overseas would be appreciated by all concerned.

Our club has a policy to promote and subsidise junior shooters at all club shoots, in all events. The scores posted by some of these juniors is proof of benefits gained by them and the sport as a whole. However it is a shame that a lot of these prospective champions cannot obtain their ultimate potential because of the costs involved. These set of circumstances are also experienced by a lot of senior newcomers to our sport.

I would also like to congratulate the A.C.T.A. on a great magazine and encourage other "run of the mill" shooters to express their views and to take an active part in the running of their particular club.

To the Secretary A.C.T.A.

I am reluctant to write to you, merely on the grounds of knocking, so to speak, an article included in the A.C.T.A. magazine, written by another so called sportsman shooter. We have our fair share of what I would call Knockers, and I do not wish to be seen as one, but the article I refer to is the one in which a particular referee has been accused of favouring a friend, with NO targets at a State Shoot, so that his scores would improve and therefore enhance his place in the State team.

I do not know which shoot the letter refers to, or who the shooter and referee where, what greatly concerns me is that this Shooter has to so cowardly write a letter to the magazine slandering at will the reputation of this referee, instead of, if he was so concerned at what he did, or did not see, the time to take appropriate action was on that day, at that club, before any scores, teams or whatever, had been finalized. I am sure that like my own club, all clubs have a shooters jury, or dispute committee made up of the most learned and senior members, to handle matters such as the one suggested by this article.

Being both a referee, and referee examiner, I take personal affront at this letter, which does nothing else but throw doubt and misgivings at all referee's and the system we follow. I have no doubt that the system is far from perfect, but until such time that it is, I ask, NO DEMAND; that if this shooter as he calls himself, has proof of any misconduct, he must be made to produce this evidence to the A.C.T.A., the controlling body, where a proper and correct assessment of the facts can be undertaken and appropriate

action taken if needed.

We the shooters are the only ones that suffer from this insipid form of back stabbing, and if we are to continue to enjoy our sport with our referee's unselfishly officiating for us, not being paid, and taking on a thoroughly thankless job, in all kinds of weather, and suffering undignified abuse from our so called sportsman, I feel that we all have to stand by our referees and protect them when required, from this type of deformation.

So A SHOOTER, I suggest you forward your documented proof, so that justice can be seen to be done, if need be, by the appropriate body concerned, and rather than go off half cocked and put a damaging slur on a handful of hardworking dedicated referees, if the occasion arrives that you feel some matter requires attention, bring it to the attention of the club officials concerned, not afterwards as in this case. Who knows if you have a legimate beef what damage may have been done by your not acting when you should have.

It is all very well to knock, abuse, or backstab the officials in our sport, how many times do our officials, and I include all officials, from the top A.C.T.A. level to our referees and scorers, how many times do your hear praise, or even a polite thank you given to our

referees and scorers, unfortunately not many.

All referees have a hard time at one stage or another, but the job is made twice as hard by this type of pen poison, and it is no surprise that some of our most dedicated referees have had a gutful and turned in the badges, rather than be tarred with this type of insult and injustice.

I also have enjoyed the sport for many years and hope to continue to do so, but after reading an article such as the one signed A SHOOTER, I begin to wonder if the pride and involvement shared by me and my fellow referees is really worth the effort.

I would like you to print the following in C.T.S.N. to Promote Discussion on Club layouts, facilities and grading of Cham-

As a shooter who travels to various Clubs it is amazing to see the different level of club facilities etc that exist and the following sug-

gestion might perhaps give "food for thought".

 All Clubs throught Australia should be given a rating or grade (similiar to the R.A.C.V. Caravan booklet) and could be graded A, B, C, D, etc depending upon trap layouts, Clubroom and toilet facilities etc. i.e. perhaps the following could apply.

(i) 3 D.T.L. or more layouts with the required Clubroom and

facilities - 'A' Grade.

- (ii) 3 D.T.L. or more layouts with not such a high standard of Clubroom and facilities - 'B' Grade.
 - (iii) 2 D.T.L. layouts with the required Club room and facilities 'C' Grade.
 - (iv) 2 D.T.L. layouts with sub standard Club rooms and facilities 'D' Grade.
- (v) 1 D.T.L. layout with required club room and facilities Grade.
 - (vi) 1 D.T.L. layout with sub standard Club rooms and facilities
 - Correspondingly all Championships would be graded thus.
 - (1) Commonwealth Titles and State Carnivals (2) State Titles Some 'B', Some 'C' Grades.

 - (3) Zone Titles 'C' Grade.
 - (4) District Titles 'D' and 'E' Grade.
 - (5) Club Titles 'F' Grade.

Therefore Clubs with 'A' Grade rating would receive A, B, C, D, E, F, titles if so required.

Clubs with 'B' Grade rating would receive B, C, D, E, F,

titles and so on.

I feel that something on the above lines would help lift the standards of our clubs.

Many people will debate that the big clubs will benefit from such a plan but surely it is these clubs who have outlaid more expense and who best cater for shooters whilst not on the shooting tracks.

As stated earlier lets have some discussion on what you the shooter thinks.

George Biggs Advises

A reader from Northern New South Wales has written: "...have been having trouble with my Miroku 800 W under and over trap gun. Recoil is the problem. The load that I have been using in my reloads is 18 gm of Du Pont 700 X, AA wads and 32 grams of shot. The gun length is: Pull 14%, Heel 14% and Toe 14%. Could you please advise me how to reduce the recoil?"

The answer provided by George Biggs is:

"The Miroku U/O MOD, 800W is quite a good trap gun, weighing approximately 73/4 lb and as such should not be a contributing factor as far as excessive recoil is concerned. Actually, the heavier the gun, the less recoil effect is felt by the shooter.

"I'd suggest that your load of 18 gm 700x powder is a little heavier than need be, especially if you are using VIHTAVUORI oriming. I'd advise loading 17 gm instead. This lighter load will

certainly reduce the recoil effect.

You could also switch to either Winchester powder No 452 using 19.5 gm, or Nobel NO 78 using 20.5 gm. Both these powders are low recoil powders. They produce a velocity of approximately 1150 F.P.S. and are also readily available, all states. Nobel 78 Bush size is .497"—Win 452 Bush size is .413, No 28.

"Finally, the fitting of a recoil reducer into the butt of the stock would prove very satisfactory in solving the problem for the shooter who is susceptible to recoil."
