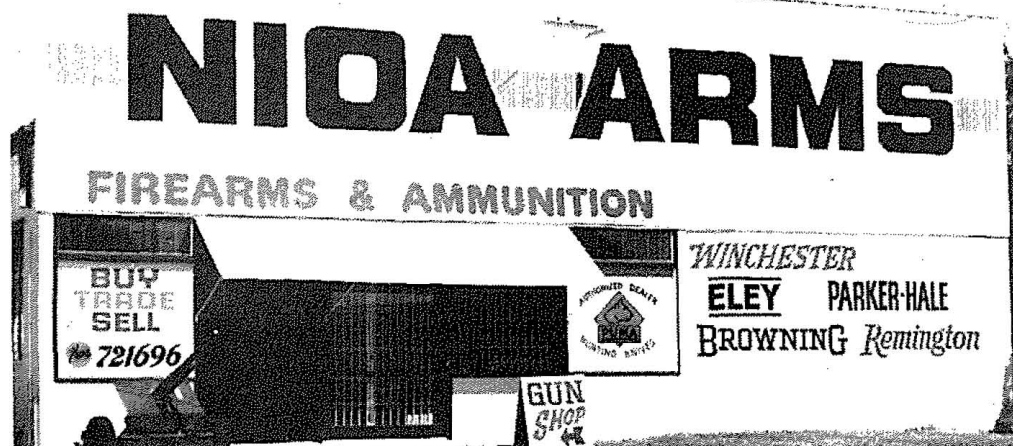

SECRETARY'S NOTES

THE EXCITING 80'S!!! Yes, the 1980's are with us ALREADY. Before we start predicting some of the possibilities of the future, let's look at the Association's 70's performance.

In 1970, the ACTA was considering constitutional changes, and it is even rumoured that the matter of a National Headquarters was being talked of. The decade finished with both projects still incomplete.

However, other good things did happen. For example, in 1973 Australia won a team's medal in the World Moving Target Championships held in Melbourne. That team included Doug Smith, Peter Wray, Ken Lowry and Jim Ellis. This development heralded the start of a steady increase in this country of the number of devotees to the Olympic disciplines in clay target shooting.

Admittedly, the development of International skeet has been limited, but performances put in by top competitors like Graeme Boyd and Ian Hale during 1979, must encourage other competitors to keep trying.

At the start of the decade, membership of the Association was approximately 5000 spread over 238 clubs. At that time clubs in Papua New Guinea were affiliated with the ACTA a situation which changed when that Country gained its independence.

Despite this loss, membership had increased to 10500 by the end of 1979, spread over 282 clubs.

In a financial sense, dramatic changes occurred during the ten years.

At January 1, 1970, the Association had accumulated funds of \$3719. By the end of 1976, this figure had dwindled to a deficit of \$6352.

After a major reassessment of its policies, the Association was able to make a remarkable recovery to end the decade with accumulated funds totalling a healthy six figure sum.

The seventies saw Australia go metric. This drastic change caused the community some short-lived inconvenience. In the case of sporting associations, some major decision making crises arose from metrication, and the ACTA was not immune.

The Executive Committee, after assessing all of the possibilities, decided to make straight variations, as opposed to conversions. For example; 16 yards became 16 metres, 50 yards became 50 metres, and shooting clay targets became harder.

Naturally, scores deteriorated, and possibly some competitors became somewhat frustrated. Many readers will remember the mammoth shoot-off in the 1974 National Double Barrel Championship at Melbourne, where Warren Charlton and Vin Ryan battled for three days before Charlton won on the 620th target. The best recorded score since then, under metric conditions, has been posed by Bill Jones of Illawarra Gun Club, who shot 301 straight during a tournament at Sydney's Royal Aero Gun Club back in 1977.

On the commercial scene, there has been a change in the relationship between the Association and its sponsors. For many years, it appeared that the ACTA and the majority of its affiliated clubs believed that an entitlement to trophies and other assistance from Winchester and ICI (now Eley) existed.

Today, although both Companies are still strong supporters of this sport, not only have many other commercial organisations seen their way clear to assist the Association, but in return, it appears that the sponsor is getting a better deal for its dollar.

In fact, it is this strengthening support from sponsors that has created what appears to be a "growing pain". During the last three months of the year, a tremendous number of major tournaments were available on the calendar, almost to the point where there were insufficient competitors to go around. This is a situation that administrators at all levels must watch closely.

Another area in which major progress took place in the 70's was in the growth of State Associations. Nevertheless, this development also had its attendant disadvantages, the most obvious being that another link was introduced into the communications chain. This looks as a serious disadvantage if State Associations fail to keep clubs and shooters informed.

Much effort has been put into improving the relationship with another major shotgun user group, the Field and Game Federation of Australia. This is proving to be beneficial to both parties.

Still on the subject of communications, an energetic push has been made to identify the nature of this sport in areas of government, at Federal and State levels. That this policy has been eminently successful can be measured from the degree to which funding assistance is forthcoming.

The largest single item of assistance has been from the Commonwealth Government in the form of a \$50 000 grant, which enabled the ACTA to appoint a full time director of coaching.

Relatively few sports in Australia have this privilege and the Association must take full advantage of the opportunities created by this appointment.

There were many other highlights of the seventies, but space limitations preclude them being listed here.

Now, to the eighties! What does the next decade hold in store for Australia, and what effect will national developments have on clay-busting.

As the new decade is entered, there are signs of brittleness in the shooting sports area. Many of these are probably connected with the tightening economic situation and discussions with management from the various firearms and ammunition companies would bear out this statement.

Tangible evidence can be drawn from the Eley development during mid 1979, when a decision was made to close its production facility and source all of its products from overseas origins.

Even variations in marketing policies have played a part, with retailers being offered a variety of "buy now, pay later" type deals.

There are few predictions which could be made with any degree of confidence — however one is that Constitutional Change will occur within the ACTA, and benefits will be clearly seen in management areas.

The next prediction is that legislative pressures will increase, as will attacks from anti-noise pollution groups. In fact, it could be claimed that the noise problem insofar as Clubs are concerned, will be the biggest single obstacle confronting the Association in the eighties.

State Associations will continue their growth and will play an increasingly important role in management of the Association.

There will be greater recognition of a need for a National body to promote, develop AND PROTECT, the shooting sportsmen. This need could be filled by changing the role presently being played by the Australian Shooting Association, and the ACTA is continually promoting this idea.

What about a National Shooting Ground? Although the recent referendum clearly gave management a mandate to proceed with its establishment, the Association is still a long way from deciding where it will be located and how it will be financed.

Every member should try to become involved in the Association's affairs, as such an action would dramatically ease the burden on the present Club Zone and State committee members.

The recent growth has increased the work load of the "honoraries" markedly, and if the Association is to continue to progress, ways must be found of sharing this burden.

In conclusion, the Administrative Unit extends to you, a sincere "Seasons Greetings" and may all your scores be good scores during 1980.

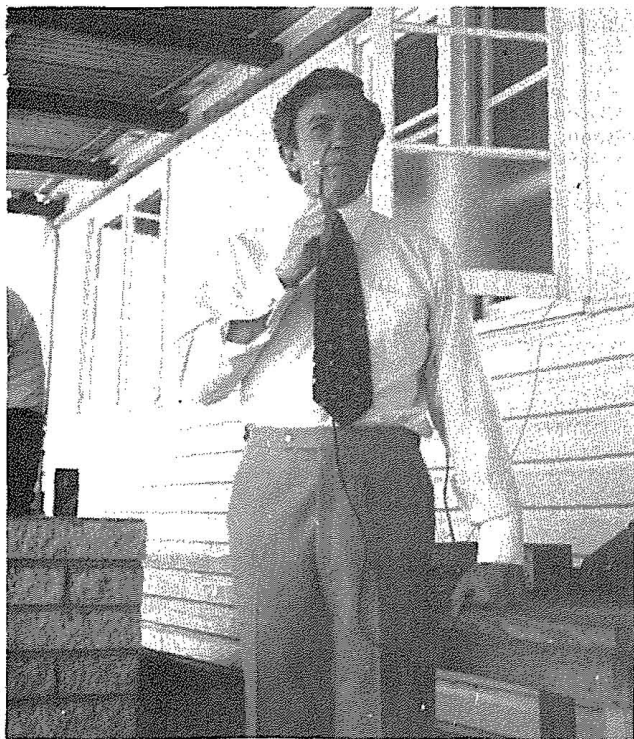

NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE HIGHLIGHTS OF 1979

A record entry, together with the highest standard of trench and I.S.U. Skeet shooting seen in Australia since the World Championships in 1973, marked the 1979 National Championships.

The matches were conducted at Downside International Gun Club, Wagga, New South Wales on November 3, 4 and 5.

This Club is barely two years old, and already caters for the four major types of clay target shooting.

Able lead by Peter Wheeler, President, and Leila Parr, Secretary, the Committee and members have established a Club of very high standard. Equipped with trap grounds, two I.S.U. (and standard) skeet grounds, and an Olympic trench, the Club matches its first class shooting facilities with a very comfortable spacious clubhouse.

Much midnight oil was burned in preparing for this major tournament, which, despite the record entry, ran like clockwork.

There were several highlights to the match - the first being the arrival of a strong New Zealand contingent, headed by New Zealand Clay Target Association General Secretary, Sid Hanson, and Director of Coaching, "Bricky" Gunn.

Friday, November 2, had been set aside for practice. By mid-day, it was obvious that, not only was a big attendance assured, but the standard of the match was going to be at a high level.

John Harris and Kevin Hopkins, of Cunderdin Gun Club, Western Australia, were showing a lot of interest in the administration of the match. Cunderdin has been announced as the venue for the 1980 National Olympic Trench and I.S.U. Skeet Championships.

The Club's facilities were stretched to the maximum as competitors shot round after round of practice to get the feel of the ground.

By late afternoon, there were five squads of trench shooters, and two squads of skeet on the board, thus ensuring an early start to the competition the next morning.

The competition started right on time on Saturday, November 3, in weather conditions that promised to be very hot through the middle of the day.

John Maxwell of Illawarra Gun Club (N.S.W.) started extremely well in the trench with two 25's. The other shooters to match this performance, were McGowan and Smith. Russell McGowan of New Zealand, was probably the most surprised shooter on the ground, as he had not produced a 25 since Munich in 1975. The drought had broken with a vengeance.

Doug Smith's opening 50 was a real delight to watch and clearly demonstrated the brilliance of this shooter. This is the first competitive trench match Doug has competed in since the 1977 Nationals.

Others to start well included Terry Rumbel, 23-25; John Petriella (Canberra) 23-23; Bruce Lassen (N.Z.) 23-24; Jon Whittakers (Echuca) 23-23; Greg Long (Frankston/Aust) 24-25; Jim Ellis (Canberra) 23-24;

At the conclusion of the first round, the tournament was officially opened by the Hon. W.C. Fife, Federal Minister for Consumer and Business Affairs. Mr. Fife's electorate of Farrer includes Wagga and he was a logical choice.

Furthermore, Mr. Fife had earlier this year officiated at the opening of the Albury-Wodonga Gun Club, where he developed a skill in clay busting by outshooting the City of Albury Mayor, Alderman John Roach.

In his address, Mr. Fife complimented the Club on its foresight and dedication, making special reference to the "self-help" theme, so vividly demonstrated by Peter Wheeler and his crew.

After the first day, three rounds had been completed - the Club is to be commended for the fact that 40 squads were put through in the day, over only ONE layout!!

Leaders were Smith and McGowan on 74's with Rumbel on 73. Maxwell had slipped to 21 in his third round, leaving him on an overnight aggregate of 71.

After a quiet 22 in his first round, Neil Berry hit his straps and rattled on a 24 and 25 to aggregate 71.

Jim Ellis, showing a consistency based on experience, shot a 23, 24, 24 to close on 71 also. Bill Iles, Metropolitan Clay Target Club, fired a 23 and 24 to finish the first day on 68, after a disastrous 21 in the first round.

The skeeties had been doing very well, the star performer being Ian Hale (Frankston/Australia) who shot a 24, 25, 25 to finish on the first day on 74. This gave him a substantial lead over the nearest competitor who was John Summers on 71 (24, 22, 25).

Considering that the twenty seven strong field was a record, for a National ISU Skeet Championship, the standard of the scores was very high. The newer competitors showed a lot of talent - the lowest first day score was 16, which suggests that slowly, a greater depth is being developed in the ranks of ISU Skeet shooters.

Sunday, (the second day of the competition) dawned hot and breezy. It was felt that the weather conditions might slow the "Kiwis" down a little. It was a forlorn hope, as McGowan, and Bruce Lassen carded 25 and 24 respectively in the first round. Brian Cummings was also under notice with a 24, which he followed up with a 25 in the second round.

Neil Berry continued his finishing form from the previous day with a 25, followed by 23 and 25 to close the end of the second day on 144.

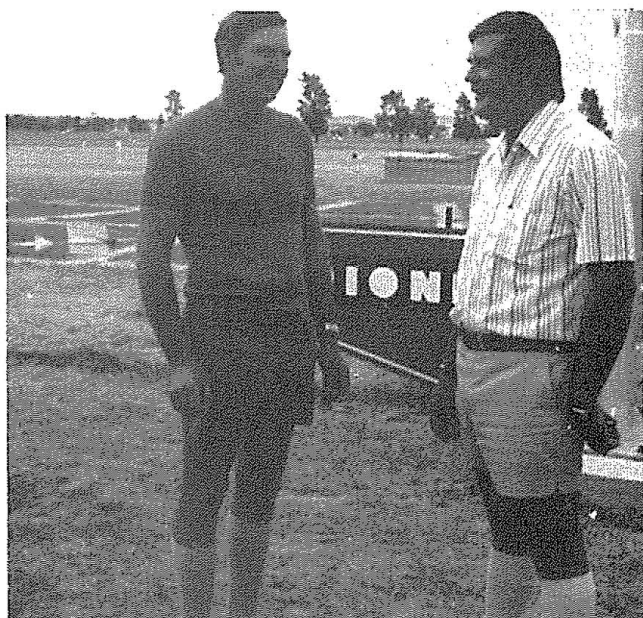
Ellis continued to apply the pressure with successive rounds of 24, 25, 25 and actually gained two targets on Doug Smith, who carded 24, 23, 25.

Bill Iles broke his own heart by starting with a 22 and then firing a brilliant 50 straight. Greg Long had difficulty getting into the groove in the first visit, and matched Iles' 22, which he followed with two 23's.

Cummings of New Zealand maintained his form and finished the day with a 93, for a match aggregate of 142. (It had become pretty clear that it was fortunate for Australia that no teams' match had been added to the program!) The other leading "Kiwis" in Lassen and McGowan had two day aggregates of 141 and 147 respectively.

At the end of 150 targets, the trench scoreboard showed McGowan one target clear of Smith and Rumbel on 146, with Ellis on 145 and Berry on 144. The stage was set for a tough last fifty.

Meanwhile, the skeet match continued and Ian Hale was literally running the legs off his opponents. The second day saw him return a

three round score of 74, the same as for the first day. Thus, with a match score of 148, Hale was in an unassailable position.

Crikis continued to experience "starting" problems with a 21 first up, followed by 25 and 23. Woolley of New Zealand was showing the form which won him a Gold Medal at the 1978 Commonwealth Games, and carded 23, 24, 25 for the day, for a match aggregate of 141. John Summers had moderate rounds of 22, 24, 22 to finish the second day on 139.

Young Paul McGowan, son of the leader in the trench match, Russell McGowan, was showing tremendous benefits from the discussions he was having with Australia's internationals, and was breaking the magical 20 mark regularly.

Graeme Boyd, whose international debut in Italy had been so successful, shot three 23's, but a 21 on the previous day left him well out of the running.

"Barney" Rooke who was of great assistance to the New Zealand contingent, was also busy getting "his act together" on the ISU skeet field, and shot three 22's to finish the second day on 130.

Into the third day, and one of the most remarkable features was that, not only were the competitors standing up to the conditions well, but the Club personnel were also doing a magnificent job.

In particular, staffing was tested to the fullest extent, as the Monday was a normal week day for most people. As a consequence trap-ers and referees had to be recruited from a wide area, and it is to the credit of neighbouring Clubs that they rallied to the support of Downside International.

One could feel the tension rising as the first trench squad took its place on the track.

It appeared that the top competitors were coping with the pressure very well, and Smith, R. Clay of Cerberus Gun Club (Victoria). Rumbel, Iles, Trever Byrne, (Shepparton Clay Target Club) K. Livingstone (N.Z.), R. Collins of Leeton Gun Club, Berry, Ellis and Lassen all carded 25's in the first of the two rounds making up the last fifty targets.

Going into the last round, three shooters - McGowan, Smith and Rumbel - were tied on 171 with Ellis perched on 170 and Berry on 169. It almost looked as though the finish had been scripted, as never before had Australia seen such an exciting finish to a trench match.

Ellis shot a 24, which left him to sweat it out while the leaders waited their turn. Smith carded a 24, which took him to a match total of 195, one ahead of Ellis, and a world standard score. McGowan and Rumbel still had a chance to win outright if one could clean-skeet the last round.

Both carded 24's leaving Ellis in fourth slot, and the three 195's to shoot off. The New Zealanders got out their box of Maori tribal tricks, but apparently, failed to read the instructions because it was

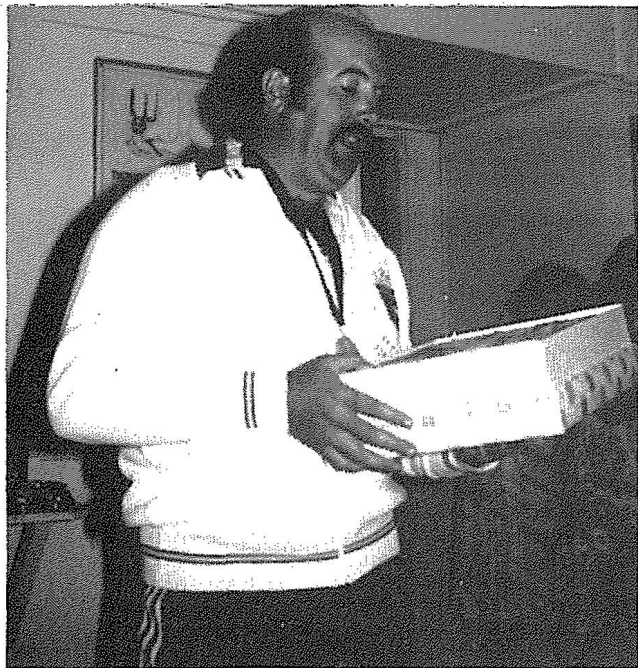

Russell McGowan who failed to read conditions properly in the shoot off, which started under very gusty wind conditions.

McGowan dropped his first target, Rumbel dropped two in the first five, and Smith, two in the first ten. Rumbel and Smith were able to get back into the groove and clean-sheet the rest of the round to each finish on 23.

The Kiwi wasn't so lucky and finished on a dismal 19. Nevertheless, it was the greatest trench shooting performance seen from a New Zealand competitor for many years, and provided tangible evidence of the benefits to arise from international competition.

Rumbel and Smith again took to the tracks, and Rumbel repeated his effort of the previous round - he dropped his second target. In spite of a desperate attempt by Smith to shoot a 25, he grassed the tenth target. Both contestants then shot clean through the rest of the round to remain tied on 24.

So the shoot-off went into the third round. Excitement was at fever pitch when the two finalists returned to the ground, each looking a little ragged around the edges. Both Rumbel and Smith had already shown tremendous talent - it was a disappointment that one of the two had to be relegated to second place.

The eighth target proved to be too elusive for Smith and one could feel a tremor pass through the tense crowd. Could Rumbel hang on, was the question everybody wanted to ask.

Using all the experience gained from overseas competition, Terry Rumbel shot the round clear, to finish a very worthy Olympic Trench Champion for 1979.

The tight finish in the trench match had taken some of the attention from the skeet match, where Ian Hale, sitting on 148/150 overnight, had the chance to equal or better the Australian record score of 197, set by John Summers in winning in 1978 title.

Unfortunately, Ian had a slight lapse in concentration and carded a 23 in his first round on the third day. He regained all his skill in the second round to finish with a 25 for a match aggregate of 196 - what a wonderful performance from a guy who had obviously taken up the challenge issued earlier in the year by the Association's selection panel. He is a worthy 1979 champion.

John Woolley came home like a champion to shoot 50/50 on the last day, while John Summers carded a 49 and Graeme Boyd joined Alex Crikis on 46.

During the presentation of trophies, the Club President, Peter Wheeler paid tribute to his willing band of workers, and also the tremendous level of sportsmanship that all competitors had demonstrated during the tournament.

The match was run as a sporting event should be - plenty of competition, plenty of fun but NO POLITICS!

Special mention was made of the important part played by trophy donors, which included Winchester and Eley. Also worthy of mention was the contribution made to the match by the attendance of eighteen New Zealand competitors, and the two enthusiasts from Cunderdin in Western Australia.

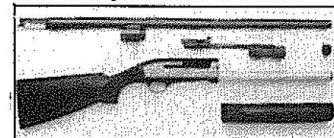

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS RUNNING BOAR — LINZ, AUSTRIA — 1979

(from John Gorman S.S.A.A.)

The Austrian Shooting Confederation celebrated its 100th birthday by hosting the 1979 World Championships in Running Boar and Cross Bow. The championships were held in the town of Linz, the provincial capital of Upper Austria. The city of 200,000 population is situated on the Danube River near Vienna.

The Australian team of Brian Wilson, Colin Robertson and Graham Winslade left Tullamarine on the 12th August flying Cathay Pacific's new 747 service to Hong Kong, then onto Swissair for the remainder of the journey to Linz. The fourth member of the team Allan Moskwa was at the last minute, unable to go due to sickness.

This team was the youngest ever sent by the S.S.A.A. to compete in an International Competition. It confirmed the Association's confidence in it by performing exceptionally well, both as competitors and sportsmen. Some very favourable comments were received from U.I.T. officials in London on the team's performance and conduct during the World Championships.

Brian Wilson at sixteen, the youngest member of the team was able to show the benefit of his parent's coaching by scoring a 543 in the Fixed Runs which placed him 42 out of 80 competitors, a really great performance. In the Mixed Runs Brian shot a 353, which placed him 45 out of 75.

Colin Robertson performed well with a 514 which gave him 56th spot and in the Mixed 338, with a 50th placing. Graham Winslade, in his first International shoot scored a 493 for 60th place. In the mixed runs a 335 for 52nd place.

Special thanks to Swissair, who were particularly helpful when the team could not get information from the organizing committee in

Austria. Swissair arranged through their Linz office to supply all necessary information, transport and accommodation. Team members reported that the trip was a great experience. Scores in the future will reflect the team's improvement.

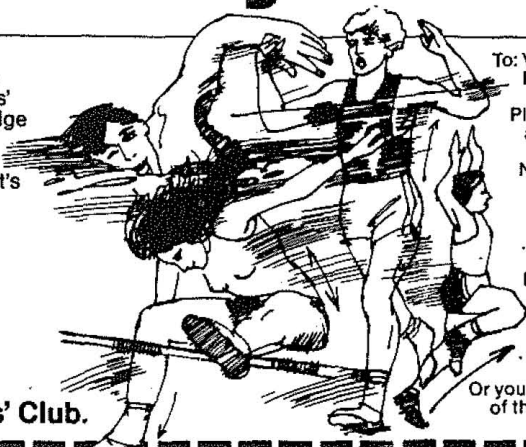

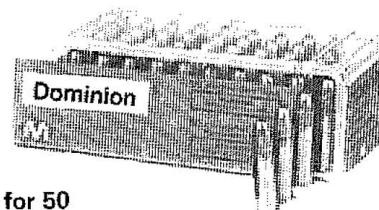

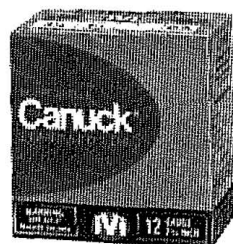

PERTH W.A. SEPTEMBER 29 & 30, 1979

(Reprinted from 'V.F.G.A. News' November 1979)

Thursday 27th, 10.20 pm.

Melbourne Airport Ansett Terminal.

A large contingent of Victorians approx. 93 in number met up with N.S.W., Tasmania and Canberra members to board a special flight to W.A. We find a couple of Victorians have never flown before and are frantically looking for a way out, but after being surrounded by a few bigger members, and a quick trip to the Jackaroo bar, we convinced them that planes are the only way to fly.

Friday 28th, 1.30 am. Perth Airport.

Up at 5.30 and out to the ground, we are now all convinced that we know where we went wrong on Saturday and all confident of shooting high scores, but as history shows, it was not to be. FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

NERVES

All of us in some degree or other suffer from the nervous tensions created by everyday life but it is in sport that one comes in direct conflict with this thing commonly known as nerves.

How often have I been told by shooters, "I was too nervous", "I was shaking so much I could not shoot". Also how often have I been told, "No wonder that you can shoot. You have absolutely no nerves whatsoever".

In both the above cases the thinking has been incorrect, as in answer to the first statement that, "I was too nervous", I know that one has to be in a high state of nerves to bring out one's best performance in shooting. As to the second, "you have absolutely no nerves whatsoever", I feel that only for the fact that I was highly nervous, even at times to the extent of feeling physically ill, I would have had little success.

I have yet to know a top shooter anywhere in the world who did not suffer from the nervous tensions brought about by competition. One of the finest shots I ever knew used to chew 'Aspros' to try and help with his "nerves", but I do not hold with this, as whatever you take to try to help your nerves, will eventually have some adverse effect. It is far better to realise this early and work towards using nerves as a very beneficial and necessary adjunct to the success in shooting competition.

The question then arises, "how does one go about using nerves to benefit their shooting"?

Firstly one must realise the value of being nervous and gain confidence in the fact that you have to be nervous to shoot well.

Some people use nerves as an excuse for poor shooting but I feel that they should look elsewhere, as nerves are a most necessary and valuable part of a shooter's equipment.

Realise also that everyone who competes against you has the same problem and has to fight his or her own little battle of control.

Concentrate on and become interested in the next shot you are going to fire to the exclusion of all other thoughts and you will find that you will forget your nerves but they will be there working for you as they must if you are to shoot well.

I was always highly nervous prior to a match, many times having great difficulty sleeping at all the night before a major one, and one time looking back over six months shooting, I suddenly realised that over that period it was when I was the most nervous before a match that I shot my best.

Realise that when you are extremely nervous you are in the best condition to shoot well, and use your nerves to that effect — you will not shoot well without them. ○

PERAZZI

**WHAT IS IT THAT MAKES IT SO POPULAR!
IS IT AS GOOD AS IT IS CRACKED UP TO BE?
PAT BROWNE EXAMINES AN MX-8 TO SEE.**

I had never seen a Perazzi before 1973. I had read about the exploits of Ennio Mattarelli and the incredible rapport that had developed between he and Daniele Perazzi. Probably it was a fit of extreme confidence when Mattarelli said to Perazzi 'Build me a gun to my specifications and I will win a World Championship'. Perazzi did, and Mattarelli was as good as his word, he won the gold in the 1964 with a score of 198/200. From that time the gun has become a legend.

But, there is more to a gun than one man's use of it. It would be fair to say, that the talents of Daniele Perazzi as a gunmaker, with the guns that bear his name are as good as any you will see. We are having a look at the MX8, probably the most popular of the competition models and a gun that has a great track record.

In Australia the Perazzi has had a slow acceptance, but the gun is gaining in popularity each year. Distribution at the moment is in the hands of Peter Wray for the eastern states and Tony Yozzi for west coasters.

The acceptance to my mind revolves around the burgeoning sophistication Australian competitions shotgunners are realising exists in the specialist field. Shotgunning in this country, has in its isolation, become very conservative, but over the past year or so there has been an awakening to the fact that there are other people in the world that know something about the business of breaking clay targets. Maybe this is a simplistic approach but I think it has a lot to do with our International involvement both in Europe and the America's.

Probably the gun itself is not that radical, the low profile approach to gun design has been around for a long time. The bifurcated lump principle has a lot going for it, but we see it in the Beretta, Remington, Krieghoff, Franchi etc. etc. What is different however is the gun originally designed for competition shooting and with the concepts of the Olympic trench discipline in mind. So, in its basic form the MX8 is pure competition ordinance, with all the attributes that make it a gun the competition gunner can rely on. This is exactly the way it stacked up on my test bench.

Something that sticks in my mind is the comment made to me some years ago by the manager of the English Trench team. He told me quite seriously that the English team had looked at the Perazzi but decided against them because the actions were too soft and they would wear out too quickly. I recalled that conversation when I read recently of the legendry Dan Bonillas, when in Italy at the Perazzi factory having trouble with the action of the Perazzi he had been

shooting since 1971. He had some wear alright, but only after shooting over 200,000 shells through the gun! That certainly says something about the reliability, does it not.

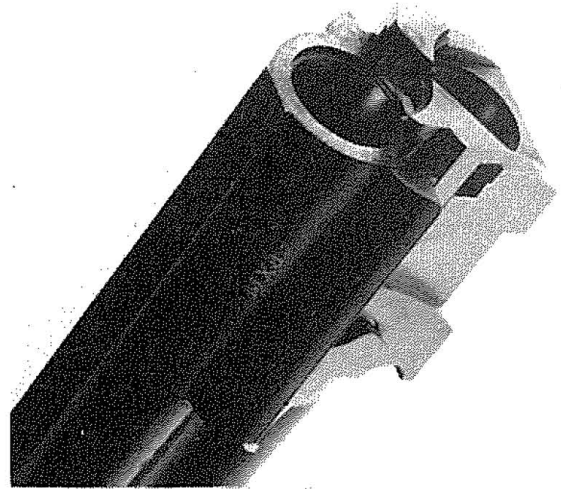
But enough of the esoteric ramblings, let us look at the gun in question. A glance at the specifications panel shows that there is nothing much out of the ordinary. What the specification does not show however is the excellent workmanship that shows in all facets in the guns design and manufacture. The MX8 is a boxlock with a very flat, unadorned solid forged frame. Forged from solid steel, it has a very massive feel about it. Strength is gained from adding metal around the sides of the action. Hinging comes from protrusions on each side of the action sides which engage with recesses machined in the sides of the monobloc. Locking comes from three main sources. Firstly there are the bifurcated lumps that protrude from the mono block around mid-way between the chambers and engage with recesses in the action face. The main locking bar which retracts under the influence of the top lever engages these lumps on closing of the gun. In normal parlance these are the bites. Secondly there are the triangular recesses in the monobloc which engage with the protrusions on the action sides. Thirdly there are the quite massive side flats that sit firmly on the side of the action and take care of the axial forces so important in stacked barrel designs. The forging, machining, fitting and finish of the action is to say the least - superb.

In practical terms, the triggers are excellent. In mechanical terms the reasons are obvious. There is some argument in smooth bore design circles over the relative merits of coil springs versus leaf springs for hammer power. There has been a swing away from leaf springs in modern shotgun design, but I am of the opinion that economic considerations have a lot to do with this. Traditionalists will have us believe that the leaf springs makes for smoother and crisper triggers. I find it hard to buy into this argument as I have seen and used excellent versions of both. A case in point would be that on our test bench at the moment we have both the Perazzi and the Rottweil. Both have superb trigger actions, but the Perazzi has leaf springs, the Rottweil coil springs. The very flat action of the Perazzi may have had a lot to do with this choice of power for hammer drive and if there is to be a weakness in the gun it would be here. However design, manufacture and fitting again are of the

highest order. Angle of attack, sear operations, safety, ejector triggering and cocking are well fitted and slick in their operation.

Stocking of any competition gun is probably more important than, any other factor in performance. Krieghoff have a saying in their literature that goes -- 'The gun shoots, the stock hits'. Think about it. It makes a lot of sense. Gunfit is probably one of the most misunderstood facets of shooting competition in this country. The stocking of this Perazzi is too big all round. Some will condemn a gun for this. I applaud it. Let's take a simile. Say you buy a car: do you sit in it and drive it just like you got it: Of course you don't. You adjust the seat to get the best and most comfortable driving position. So it is





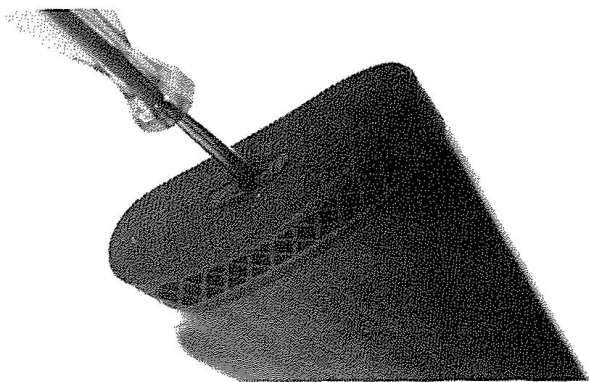

with a competition gun. You buy the gun and then have the stock adjusted to suit yourself. The Perazzi stocks come in a bewildering array of shapes and sizes and maybe you will be able to get what you are looking for off the shelf. But, if you can't, alter the one you have. The finish, checkering and fitting of all woodwork on our test gun was well above average.

Let us take an overall view now before we move on to performance considerations. The Perazzi is a distinctive looking gun. It has the look of a gun that has a definite purpose. In its unadorned or basic form it has quite a spartan look. The finish is excellent, blueing is as good as you will see on any gun and the polish is well above average. Mechanical operation has the quiet authority that is the hallmark of better quality double guns. It closes smoothly with a gently 'click' that shows excellent fitting in the action. It opens easily and the fired shells eject with an imperceptible 'snick' that indicates a well designed and fitted ejector mechanism. Trigger operation is crisp with both barrels letting go at around 2 kilograms. The gun cocks by way of a single cocking bar which runs through the floor of the action and it does this on opening. The ventilated side ribs with distinctive diamond pattern set the gun apart in the gun rack.

Performance was as good as the appearance. At the pattern plate I ran a variety of 'AA Family' competition shells through the gun. Perazzi chokes are regarded by many as being the best in the world. After looking at patterns thrown by the test gun I would be inclined to agree. The patterns with 'AA 300's were a joy to behold. At 76% (bottom), 82% (top) they were even dense and absolute dead on point of aim. There was a loss of a point or two as we went up the scale in power from the 300's to the 325's, the 350's and the big booming black 375's. All patterns showed remarkable consistency. Over the traps the gun was a joy to use. It is a little heavier than one is normally used to but the balance is excellent. It mounted very easily and pointed very precisely. One is hard pressed to explain the difference between a high and low framed gun in recoil sensation. My only advice is to try a low frame gun like the Perazzi; you will like the difference.

In all we fired some 1076 shells in testing from mild factory loads and reloads to the most powerful shells we could find. There were no malfunctions.

In the market the Perazzi fits into an interesting slot. Prices are a bit nebulous, generally speaking you can buy one over the counter for around the \$2,100 mark. Again, prices are relative, stacked up against the A grade Browning, which sells around the same price, the Perazzi wins hands down on the competition side. It comes into direct competition with the recently introduced Rottweil and in my brief look at both guns it would be a brave man that separated these two. The Remington 3200 presentation grade at \$1,895 is not in the same class and the SO4 has priced itself out of this market slot. But, I regard the Perazzi as good over the traps as the SO4. In summary then, Perazzi MX8 is probably one of the most suitable guns in the Australian market for the exacting disciplines of trap and trench shooting. Representing excellent value for money it is superbly made, finished well and presented in a well fitted gun case. It is not a gun for the beginner, but for the experienced competition gunner it warrants a very close look.

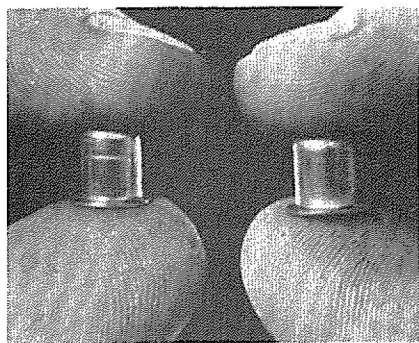
PRIMERS

VICTORIAN FIREARMS TRADE FUN DAY

(d) to examine and make submission to relevant bodies in relation to existing and proposed firearms legislation and any amendments thereto.

(e) to promote social functions involving the firearms industry.

KEVIN THOMPSON WINS "SPORTSMAN" OF THE YEAR" AWARD

Twenty-two year old Wyong Gun Club member, Kevin Thompson, has been named as the Central Coast Sportsman of the year for 1979. The award — the most prestigious local event of the year — is jointly sponsored by the local Radio Station 2GO, Gosford and the Bank of N.S.W.

Kevin qualified as Sportsman of the Week back in March, 1979, after winning the Australian-New Zealand Points Score Championship, 2nd in the Australian Single Barrel Championship and gaining selection in the Australian team to tour the U.S.A. in September. Roger Davis — N.S.W. professional golfer of the year, who finished fifth in the British Open Championship and won the Victorian Open.

Bret Austine — Winner of 12 gold medals in National, Victorian, Queensland and N.S.W. Trampolining Championships.

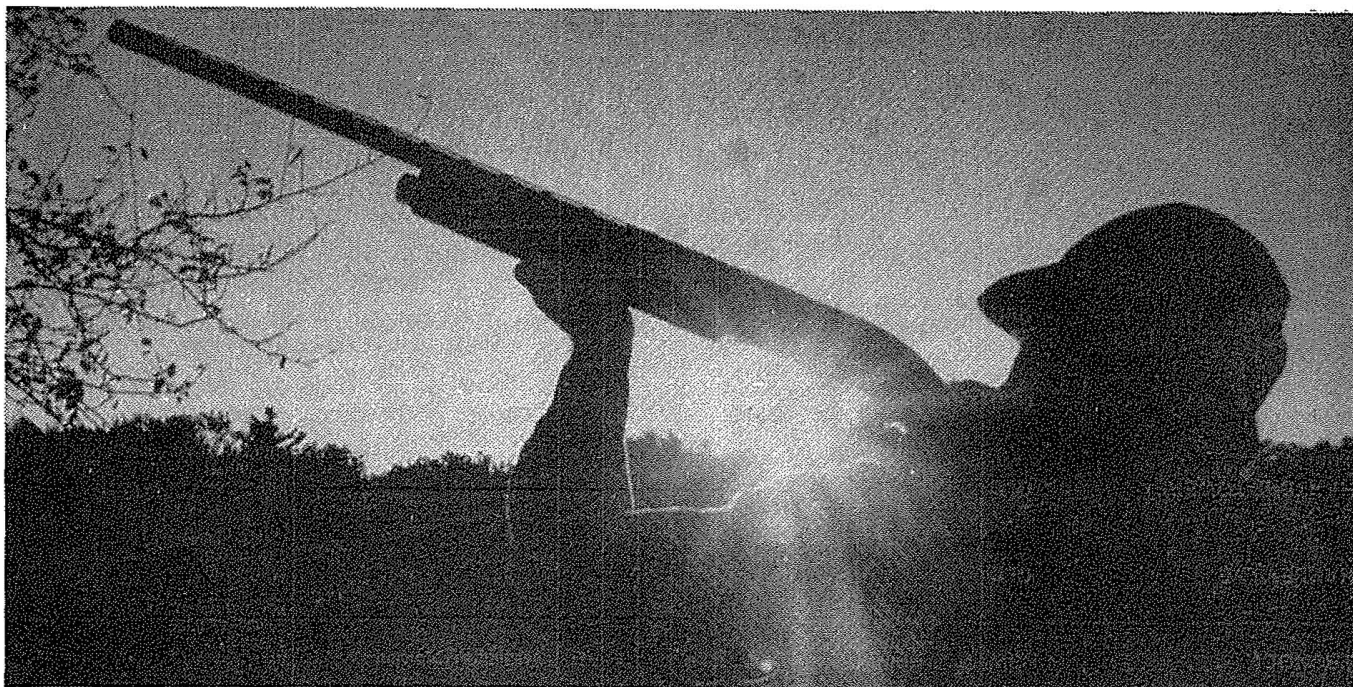
Greg Ellery — National 750cc power boat champion. He also won the Queensland, Victorian and N.S.W. 750cc championship and is the Central Coast champion.

Clay Shooters in general will be happy to see that our sport can come out on top in an area which caters for some 65 sporting codes ranging from Ten Pin Bowling to Deep Sea Fishing. Kevin's achievements have indeed made a lot of people in the area "sit up and take notice" and his Club mates and I'm sure Clay Shooters everywhere join together in congratulating Kevin on such a fine performance.

Since the Nationals in Griffith he has won a total of 37 Championships, Trophy and High Gun Events throughout N.S.W., made the Northern Zone and State Teams for the second year in succession, toured the U.S.A. representing Australia and just 4 days before the judging of the Sportsman of the Year award won the N.S.W. Night Double Barrel Continental Championship at Moree. It was this win which finally swayed the judges in favor of Kevin and won him the title of Sportsman of the Year. ○

Perth — ACTA Nationals

The colour insert which appeared in the December issue of CTSN, in which the 1980 Nationals Tournament was promoted, has created enormous interest.

The ACTA is grateful for the involvement of the Western Australian Department of Tourism in the project.

The Department has agreed to place its mobile "Travel Centre" on the grounds of the Perth Clay Target Club for the major part of the tournament.

Consequently, visitors will have the best possible facilities available, through which to make arrangements for day tours and other activities.

Ansett Airlines of Australia personnel have reported that bookings for the Super Apex airfares from the eastern states have been particularly heavy, and it appears that the attendance at the 1980 Nationals will be a Western Australia record.

Readers should be reminded that block bookings at the various accommodation houses will lapse on December 31 (that's NOW!) after which intending competitors will have their bookings (through Ansett) processed on a "first come, first served" basis.

The Western Australian Clay Target Association is continuing to work hard on preparations and Tournament Director, Brett Watts has been active in developing a recognition with the Perth-based media groups.

Intending visitors from the eastern states are asked to co-operate with authorities in relation to firearms permits. An application form is published on page 18 of this issue of CTSN. It should be completed and returned to the National Office as soon as possible. This will enable the ACTA Administrative Unit to obtain a group visitors' permit on behalf of the various state groups. ○

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION REPORT

The Australian Shooting Association, headed by Peter Papps, held its second meeting for 1979 in Canberra on December 1.

The agenda was extensive, and the meeting took over twelve hours to complete. All affiliates were fully represented, and included: Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia; Australian Small Bore Rifle Association; National Rifle Association of Australia; Sporting Shooters Association of Australia; and Australian Clay Target Association.

The ACTA was represented by the Chairman of the ISU Sub Committee, Mr Harry Somers and the National Secretary-Manager.

One of the main items discussed was the allocation of special grants received from the Australian Olympic Federation and the Federal Department of Home Affairs. The purpose of the AOF funds was to assist with pre Olympics training.

Resulting from a submission prepared earlier in the year, the Australian Clay target Association was allocated \$2175, which will be offset against the World Championships 1979, and the 1980 South Pacific Championships, each of which has been considered as a pre Olympics training event.

The Department of Home Affairs' money had been allocated to assist in defraying the costs incurred by the coaching personnel who attended the Fort Benning (USA) training program. The ACTA received \$400, to offset against the expenses involved in having its South Australian Coaching Director, Peter Quire, participate in this project.

Another major decision relates to the planning of a seminar to be held in Canberra during early June 1980.


The objectives of the seminar have not yet been officially defined, but discussions at the meeting have clearly indicated that the purpose will be to consider the promotion and development needs of the shooting sports in Australia. One element of the seminar will cover legislation.

An invitation to attend the seminar will be extended to all shooting bodies, and other associated groups.

In the past three years, under the leadership of Peter Papps, the ASA has matured considerably, and there are signs that, in a revised structure, it can protect the interests of Australian firearms users for some years to come. ○

NOTABLE WEEKEND FOR TASMANIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

Possibly the most notable event to take place in clay target shooting in Tasmania in recent years occurred at the Tasmania Gun Club's ground just south of Launceston at Evandale on the weekend of October 13 and 14, with the official opening of a new Olympic Trench layout by the State Minister for Sport and Recreation, Mr H. Holgate, with the Warden of the Evandale municipality, Mr D. Chugg, also officiating. Unfortunately, the first three official targets shot at by Messrs Holgate, Chugg and Club President David Perry emerged unscathed.

The opening of this Trench layout was the culmination of 18 months of hard work carried out by an enthusiastic steering committee from Tasmania Gun Club, consisting of John Boer, Chairman, Allan Hudson, Peter Thurley and David Perry, who after conceiving the idea had the physical work of installation completed in six months.

A great deal of praise must also go to Mr Bill Blaskett who organised the supply of the smooth operating "Rossini" traps from the Italian manufacturers. Mr Bob Morgan, the Tasmanian chairman of the I.S.U. committee was also extremely helpful in supplying a great deal of the technical details needed to set up such a layout.

The first official competition on the layout was the Tasmanian Trench Championship and selection of the State Team. A Grade winner was popular and brilliant shooter Robbie Elmer from Cressey Gun Club, with a very creditable 92-100. B Grade went to hard working target chaser John Murphy 85-100. C Grade winner was Artie Holmes, while R. Meikle took D Grade honours with a fine 80-100.

The State Team selected was R. Elmer, D.R. Taylor, J. Blake, A. Styles, J. Cashion and R. Meikle with State coaching director Jack Blake gaining team High Gun with 46-50. Roy Garwood and Dennis Whiteley were presented with commemorative trophies for being the first shooters to record possible 25-25 in official competition.

The only other event on the day's program was a 20 target points graded. Winners were: A Grade, J. Murphy 59-60; B Grade, R. Cannell 60-60; C Grade, J. Sturzaker 59-60; and best 11 metre shooter S. Headley 45-60.

The Sunday's program was another important event in the State shooting calendar with the Tasmanian Gun Club being host to the State ACTA Skeet Championship, State team selection and the Shell Shield inter-club competition.

The day dawned to reasonable conditions but quickly deteriorated to an extent which made some targets extremely difficult to follow. The first 50 targets decided the State Grade winners and selection of the State Team plus High Gun.

Norm Curbishley from Tasmania Club gained A Grade honors with 47-50, which under the conditions was a very good score, but the glory for the day went to dedicated worker and shooter Roy Garwood from Hobart Gun Club who not only won B Grade, but also took the High Gun sash with 48-50. Going on to prove his consistency, Roy also snared the State Team High Gun 45-50 and was a member of the victorious Shell Shield Team. The C Grade title went to W. Richardson 44-50 and J. Sidnell took the D Grade honors with 37-50.

The State Team selected was R. Garwood, N. Curbishley, K. Copleman, W. Richardson, D.R. Taylor, L. Williams, J. Blake, J. Dixon, R. Elmer, R. Mason, A. Styles, K. Campbell, D. Whitely, T. Smyth and R. Young. Roy Garwood was High Gun in the team's match with Ken Copleman, Don Taylor and Norm Curbishley all tying on second place.

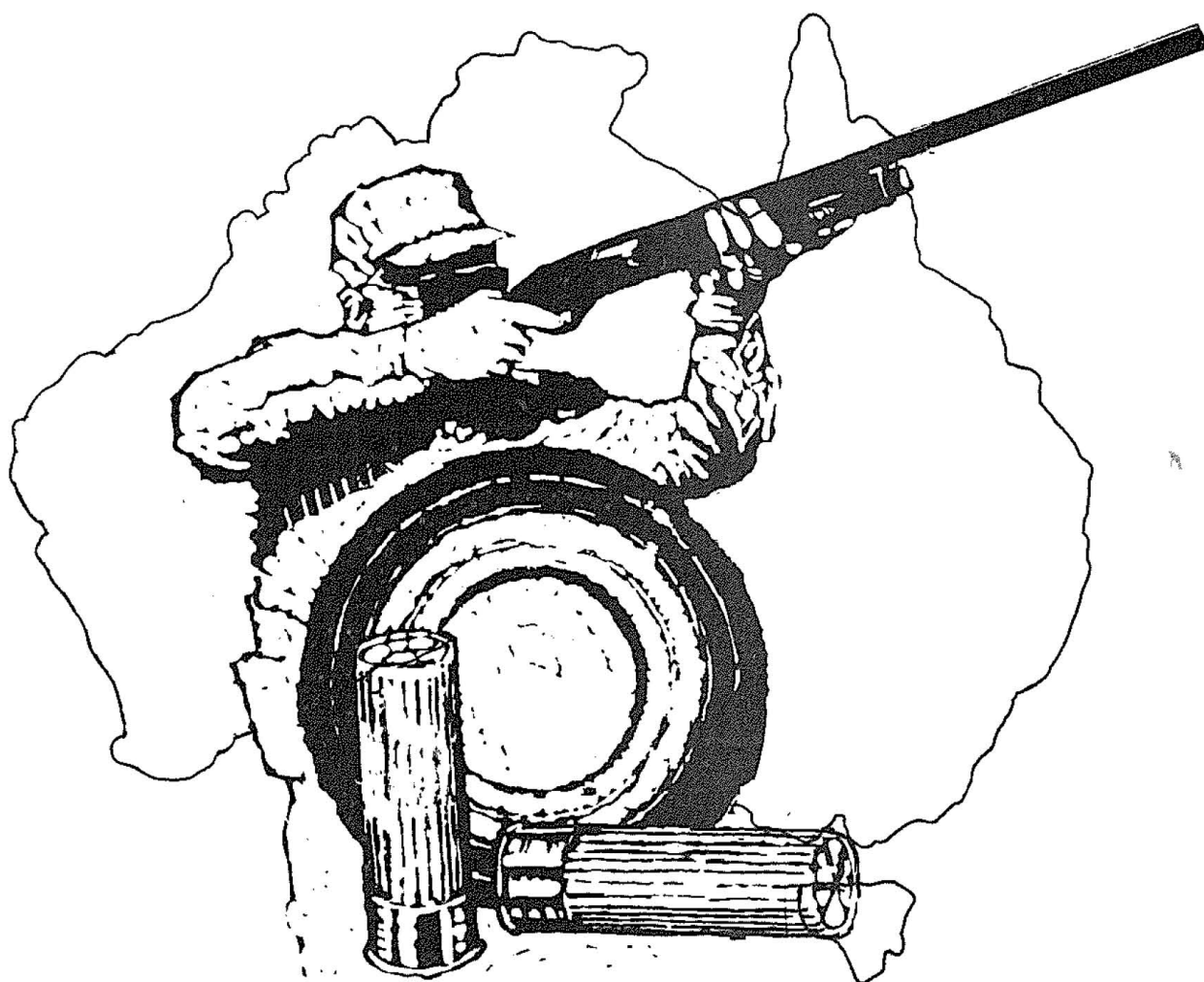
