





Executive Director's Notes

In recent times, there has been some talk that suggests clay target shooting is slipping in numbers. Such is not the case, and in almost all States, registrations are up on the same time last year.

It is my belief that attendances have dropped at certain clubs, consequently it is felt that numbers generally are also dropping.

So let us look at some of the reasons that some clubs are failing to attract good crowds. Predominantly, the situation arises from a "head in the sand" attitude which fails to recognise that we are catering for a 1980 type shooter, rather than a 1970 type shooter.

One only has to look at the advertisements in Clay Target Shooting News to realise that many clubs are simply repeating last year's programs, month after month. Maybe the management of these clubs should be showing more imagination in producing programs that are more in tune with what the "paying customer" wants.

I clearly remember Malcolm Fuller, well known New South Wales shooter, saying on numerous occasions "clay target shooters want to have fun!" The message clearly is: **THINK MORE WHEN DEFINING PROGRAMS.**

The other aspect is that shooters are becoming more discerning and take particular notice of trophy values, compared to entry fees.

In some cases, clubs may be well advised to delete trophies from some events and offer medals only. In fact some clubs have already done this with a moderate degree of success.

SHOOTING GROUND COURTESY

In recent weeks, I have particularly noticed the incidence of shotguns being carried over competitors' shoulders. While this is great provided that one keeps walking in the one direction, it is when the competitor stops or turns suddenly that his neighbour is likely to get a whack in the ear.

Maybe all registered shooters should make an effort to carry their "broken" guns around a shooting ground in the crook of their arm.

Still on the subject of courtesy, the general standard set at Melbourne Gun Club really has to be seen to be believed. Standards of behaviour in the clubhouse are always tops, and the type of dress also seems to reflect a pride in being at that particular club.

There is no reason that such an attitude should not exist on a much more widespread basis. After all, if we wish to attract more people to our sport, and at the same time, show it off more to the public, some of our standards will HAVE to improve.

CLUB PRIDE

Recently, I had the opportunity to attend a two-day training seminar at the Toowoomba Gun Club in Queensland.

The club President Robbie "Scoop" Donovan and his Committee had worked long and hard to present their club in the best possible light, despite being in the midst of the worst drought in living memory.

I can recall past President, Tom Robinson, telling me at the Nationals in Perth that Toowoomba was "the best club in Australia."

Perhaps if Tom had said "one of the best clubs in Australia," I would now have to agree with him. His wife Glenda, worked for the two days providing a cuppa and food service, and with Secretary Ken Miller created an excellent impression on the fifty or so visitors.


ACCURACY OF 1980 REGISTRATION CARDS

AUSSIES AGAIN SUCCESSFUL IN NEW ZEALAND

(Staff Writer)

Almost one hundred Australian shotgunners made the annual trans-Tasman trek to the New Zealand Trap and Skeet Championships during March.

The 1980 series was conducted at Christchurch Gun Club, where a record crowd attended.

The standard of competition matched the attendance and many Australian visitors commented on the smooth and efficient way in which the program was run. Congratulations are extended to the New Zealand Clay Target Association under the leadership of President Colin Stott and Secretary Sid Hanson, and the Christchurch Gun Club for the wonderful job they did.

The competition events commenced on March 22, when the first match was the UIT Ball Trap Championship. Australia got off to a great start when John Maxwell of Illawarra NSW, carded the only 50, to win the match outright. Max Walker (Auckland N.Z.) and Ray Turner of Terranora Lakes NSW scored 49's, and in the shoot-off for the minor placings, Turner's 21 was good enough to secure second.

Neil Berry of Shepparton (Vic) kept the Aussies on the march when he won the second event, the Grouse trophy (which is a sixty target medley event). Berry tied with New Zealander Danny McGowan in the qualifying round, each scoring 58-60. The shoot-off went only seven targets before Berry emerged the winner.

Into Monday, March 24 and this was a day for the skeeties. Two hundred and ninety-one enthusiasts entered and despite many individual 25's, only seven possibles resulted. These seven tied shooters included well known Kiwis Bruce Lassen, Murray Cook, Merv Pratt and Jim McKenzie, accompanied by Ken Lowry of Melbourne Aust.

The shoot-off went into the second round before Jim McKenzie became the 1980 champion - his score was 80-80. Second was John Elliott (Hawkes Bay, N.Z.) and third was Murray Cook (Ashburton, N.Z.).

Jim McKenzie must be known as the "Grand Old Man" of New Zealand clay busting, as he has the most impressive track record of any present competitor. This was his seventh New Zealand Skeet Championship, and took his total number of championship wins to a figure in excess of 300.

McKenzie overcame great personal discomfort to win the 1980 event, because of a serious attack of arthritis. This forced him to actually change his gun hold position, and as a consequence, his ability to win the event clearly demonstrates the depth of this man's talent.

Then followed the Skeet International Teams' Match. Australia lined up with a team which included Ken Lowry, "Barney" Rooke, Bill Iles, Ian Hale and Bernie Smith. New Zealand's selection looked pretty formidable and included Jim McKenzie, John Elliott, Murray Cook, Merv Pratt and Bruce Lassen.

The match resulted in a one target win for New Zealand and was its first victory since 1973. The score was - New Zealand 123-125 to Australia 122-125.

Day four was Double Rise day. The records continued to topple and over 340 shotgunners faced the starter. The event was conducted over fifteen pairs, at the end of which there were no possibles and only two 29's. These were recorded by popular Southland (N.Z.) shooter Joe Wilson and Peter Telford of Mount Gambier (S.A.).

After an exciting shoot-off, the New Zealander emerged the victor, scoring 61-62. The gallery was then entertained to a wild "haka" demonstrated by Joe Wilson - few can repeat his particular version of this traditional Maori dance. John Rowe of Wagga (NSW) was third.

Also programmed on the fourth day was the 1980 Clay Sparrow Championship. Australia's vocal Tony Bradshaw was confident of successfully defending the title he won in 1979, but this wasn't to be.

Twenty seven possibles were recorded in the 25 target event, and the final results appeared on the board just as darkness engulfed the ground.



We are hard at work tracing the problem which appears to be, at the time of writing, primer troubles. Our new trap cartridges will have a different primer even given the fact that, until Perth, and since, there has been little concern with the present type of primer.



152 years of excellence

AUSSIES AGAIN SUCCESSFUL IN N.Z. Cont'd

First was Roger Wasey of Manuwatu (N.Z.) second was Paul Thompson of Melbourne (Vic) and third was the very consistent Ken Lowry.

Then came the big occasion - the New Zealand Single Rise Championship (equivalent to the Australian Double Barrel event) and the Glenn Cup for international trap teams.

The Single Rise became a marathon, and saw the creation of a New Zealand event and long break record. One of Australia's most promising young shooters, Kevin Thompson of Wyong (NSW) won the event with a score of 505. Second was Murray Cameron and third was Tony Bradshaw of Melbourne (Vic). At the close of the first day of the Single Rise competition, 205 targets had been shot and there were still six shooters in the tie breaker.

Tremendous tension developed as Tony Bradshaw dropped out in the 470's to be third. This left Cameron, a 40 year old policeman from Hutt Valley (near Wellington, N.Z.) in a knockdown, drag out war with the blonde headed youthful Thompson.

Thompson showed a continuation of the form that won for him the 1979 Australia-New Zealand Trap Championship at Griffith, and after eleven gruelling hours forced Cameron into error. Cameron grassed his 505th target to leave Thompson the winner of the blue ribbon event.

Immediately after the shoot-off had been completed, Australia faced New Zealand in the Glenn Cup Trap Teams' Match. Australia's team, known as the Air New Zealand Trap Team included Tim Catling (W.A.), John Murphy (Tas), Don Beelitz (S.A.) Tony Bradshaw (Vic), Rex Northcott (NSW) and Richard Dean (Q'ld). New Zealand was represented by Murray Cameron, J. Hedley, John Thompson, A. Kemp, Brian Cuming and R. Brash.

The match finished in a tie, with Australia being the current holder, retaining the cup. (A full report on this match appears elsewhere in this issue).

Being pressed for time, the organizers pushed on with the New Zealand Single Barrel Championship, in which the defending champion was Bill Brunton.

Incredible though it may seem, only two competitors carded a possible, one of them being the same Murray Cameron who had featured in the marathon shoot-off concluded earlier in the day.

In the shoot-off, Cameron proved himself to be one of the unluckiest shooters around when he again filled second place - AFTER MISSING THE FIRST TARGET IN THE SHOOT-OFF.

The winner and the only other possible in the qualifying round, was the popular Queenslander Jim Elliott, one of the stalwarts of the Gladstone Gun Club.

Jim's win, with the score at 51-51, was the high point of his shooting career. However, as he said later, he received an even bigger thrill when he was asked to captain the Australian team in the New Zealand versus Overseas Visitors Teams' Match. He said "I am a great believer in team sports and hope that team competitions continue to be encouraged in clay target shooting!"

Friday, March 28, was the final day of individual competitions. The main event was the New Zealand Pointscore Championship. The winner of this event proved that if one has talent, he can compete in either trap or skeet competition.

John Woolley, 1978 Commonwealth Games Skeet Champion and winner of the 1980 South Pacific Regional Skeet Championship showed that he is no slouch in trap events when he held off a spirited challenge from John Power (Wagga, NSW), George Shaw (Waitemata N.Z.) and John Thomson (Rotorua N.Z.) to win with a score of 210-210. Two New Zealanders filled the minor placings.

(Woolley has been named in the five man shooting team to represent New Zealand at the 1980 Olympic Games. Although seedings are not announced publicly, informed sources consider John to be the number one seed. It is obvious that the training and competition hardening that he has gained during his recent twelve months stay in Australia has been of great benefit.)

The tournament concluded on Saturday March 29, with the New Zealand section of the 1980 Mackintosh International Trophy Match. The results of this event will be announced at the Home Countries Championships to be held in Wales in the second half of July.

On return to Australia, most of the entrants who had contested the New Zealand series spoke in terms of high commendation of the hospitality they had received.

Len Hubbard, of Melbourne (Vic) had been appointed delegation leader for the Australian group, spoke in glowing terms of the organizational ability demonstrated by the Christchurch Gun Club. He also expressed his pride at the great sportsmanship he experienced during the visit.

A TRIBUTE TO A FINE SHOOTER



On Monday 24th March, 1980 Sydney Gun Club saw the ending of an era with the death of their esteemed patron, Harold Knight.

Harold, at the grand old age of 87, was one of nature's gentlemen. Born in Victoria on 13th June, 1982 he was the only remaining original member still attending Sydney Gun Club. He was elected to the first committee of Sydney Gun Club in 1951 and remained as a committee member until the time of his death. He had been patron and a life member of the club for ten years.

When the A.C.T.A. decided on veteran shooters Harold was one who could without doubt qualify for that title. He shot live birds for years in Victoria and was a member of the Noble Gun Club for many years, prior to the advent of "Clays".

One of his greatest enjoyments in latter years was to sit at the Gun Club and tell the stories of the early days to new shooters, he would always spin a good tale.

As one person remarked at his funeral "I'd never heard him say a bad thing about anyone, we'll miss him."

STUDENTS SHOW TOP TALENT

"Go back to your schools and sell gun safety and remember that shooting in this state is dependent on the guys who stand behind the school teachers' was the very strong message given by the headmaster of the Rainbow High School Mr. Lyn Barr at Geelong Gun Club on Thursday 23rd April. He was speaking at the closing ceremony of the Winchester-Student Clay Target Shooting Championships of Victoria."

In his address to teachers, students and visitors he also said that: "It is important also that everybody who is involved in the sport get behind it because it is a marvelous game for the kids and with support we can keep costs down."

"Today, we have had some 60 schools and just on 300 students competing and with the wonderful support from Winchester and a lot of hard work from the Jeparit Gun Club we have been able to give the students a fine tournament with targets and cartridges supplied for a nomination of \$4.50".

The tournament was a 20 target event in three divisions, senior boys, junior boys and girls. It was held under the direction of Barry Wembridge as shoot marshal. Administration was controlled by Lyn Barr and his wife Dawn with help from Frank and Margaret Pitt and Jim and June Gawith of Jeparit. A contingent of gun club supporters led by Stan Newcombe lent support on the shooting tracks.

The accent was on safety and simplicity for the benefit of the students and this was all stressed by shoot marshal Wembridge before the event started. Shot in two visits of ten targets, the event ran as smoothly as any tournament for senior shooters.

In the senior boys event it was Chris Vandenberg from Bell Park High School who ran the 20 single barrel targets with only two mistakes. His score of 18-20 was good enough to take the title outright. Runner-up Steven Muller had to survive a shoot-off to take this position with a score of 21-25. He is a student at Warnambool North Technical School.

The champion junior boy was Mark Rogers whose score of 17-20 gained him his title outright. Darren Kilfoyle was runner up with 21-25. Rogers is from Echuca Tech. and Kilfoyle from Colac Tech.

Christine Wakefield of Mildura High School, well known in shooting circles was the favourite and eventual winner in the girls section with 18-20. Runner up on 12-20 was Julie Bird from Birchip High School.

The shoot itself was a marvel of administrative efficiency. School groups on arrival registered with the office and the students were squadded. Competitors found their name on the scoreboard and when their squad was called they collected the required number of cartridges and went to the trap.

Comments around the ground from experienced shooters and administrators was that they had never seen such a high degree of responsibility and decorum from such a large group of youngsters.

Speaking with Lyn Barr the 44 year-old dynamo from Rainbow High School it was discovered that there is a depth of commitment to this student program that dates back 20 years or more.

"It was when I was at Mansfield that the whole thing started" he said. "Charlie Whitla was running something similar near by and we sort of got together and the first inter school program and competition got under way. We have come a long way in the 20 years until now. This is the second of the Student Championships and we can look forward to bigger and better tournaments in the future".

"I would say that what we have here today would have to be only 10 per cent. So you would be looking at 3800 to 4000 kids in Victoria that are being instructed in Firearms safety" he said.

When asked if the safety course was part of the normal school curriculum he said that in most cases it was an extra-curricular activity. Like most other enrichment activities, time had to be made available for it. In his school the subject was covered in an extended lunch hour each week. The kids were transported to the shooting ground for an instruction period of about an hour. Other schools worked in the afternoon but in most cases the instruction was very similar to the Driver Education Program.

On the subject of the expansion of the scheme he said: "We have gone ahead of the resources available in many of the schools. We must get to the stage with the Education Department and the business firms that support us to providing some instruction and coaching for the teachers. They must be given the expertise to be able to carry the program forward in the schools. The department already does this in driver education where the teachers go to Shepparton for the intensive pre-driver course."

"What we are looking at now is the step of providing a base of 100 teachers, trained in gun safety, over the next three years. This would then cover nearly every secondary school in the state. After that, all you would need to do is to top-up."

To do this he said: "We would be looking to run a very intense three day seminar on the subject using the best talent available. This would of course include the coaching expertise of the A.C.T.A.. If we don't the whole momentum of this programme will founder a bit".

"There is another aspect too. We have proved that it is successful, there must now be some input from government departments. We are financing the program ourselves even to running raffles to keep the costs down for the kids. Government will have to look at it and say..OK if we are, through the school system, producing a generation of safe gun handlers and teaching them something of the morality of shooting then it must be worthwhile and a good investment."

Discipline is very strict he said and it developed a form of self discipline in the youngsters that was very evident. Kids in the shooting class develop a sense of responsibility that is so marked that even the community is impressed. Local farmers even contacted senior students in his school to help with vermin control on their properties.

Other aspects of the safety program which spin off into the community have occupied the thoughts of this very practical educator.


"On the one side it provides the safety instruction but on the other it provides both the country and city kids with an opportunity of using leisure hours without teams and without the need for support

services. If you can get kids to really enjoy going out shooting they do not need other people to help them, they can do it themselves. The same thing applies to fishing. It is an established fact that by 1985 there will be a 35 hour week and by the year 2000 a 30 hour week. If schools cannot react to that you are going to have a lot of disaffected young people who spend most of their time on pin ball machines and other things like that. Country schools have a real opportunity to do something positive. The schools commission sees the activities such as shooting, fishing and other outdoor pursuits as an important element in the schooling of kids", he said.

Another important thing was that clay target shooting sports gave an opportunity to kids who were not attracted to the traditional sports such as football and cricket he said. It gave them a very excellent chance to compete on equal terms without peer pressure, the challenge was great enough to provide a measure of character enrichment and self confidence that is essential in any youngster's life he added.

Commenting on the success of the tournament, A.C.T.A. Vice-president Laurie Connors said: "It is the greatest thing that has ever been brought into clay target shooting. A lot of people today, when you mention a gun, react badly due to ignorance. These kids will grow up knowing what weapons are like and whilst they may never go on with trap shooting, perhaps 10 per cent may, but the other 90 per cent will know what shooting is all about and the pleasure they have had from it.

"From this point of view it is a great thing for the sport and we should be pressing to increase this sort of activity in all states. I would like to see the A.C.T.A. give it a lot more support. You know, when kids compete such as this, people are amazed at their ability both on the safety side and the scores that they shoot.

"You see the way these kids handle the guns, the way they look after them, the competent way they carry them around the ground. This shows a pride in what they are doing. It is education in the right direction".

Commenting on the day, Gary Turner a teacher from Hopetoun High School said: "It must make kids aware, they are forever picking other kids up for not doing the right thing on the safety side. I

know that if they go out shooting on the week-ends and one of their mates is not doing the right thing they will be the first to let him know".

The final comment came from Lyn Barr, who, when closing the tournament, said: "We still have many high schools and technical schools in the state where if you mention shotguns they throw their hands up in horror and say 'no-way' will we have those in the school. It is only by us showing that we can do it well and that we can demonstrate safety like we have today and by what we do away from here, that in the future we will get this type of activity into all schools the way it should be".


When the yatch left Gladstone she was again in competition, this time for the Gladstone to Bundaberg race which she also won.

The club is grateful to the A.C.T.A., and local press who assisted all sponsors to gain maximum coverage.







Newton who has been the Australian Clay Target Association's Director of Coaching for almost two years was named in the Australia Day Honours List. His citation read "For long and valued services to clay target shooting".

The award is tangible recognition of the countless hours Newton Thomas has devoted to such community services as addressing groups of Scouts, Rotary Clubs and many others. More importantly, he has made a major contribution to improving the community attitude to safe handling of firearms by teaching the correct handling and techniques.

However, some of the lesser known of Newton's activities revolve around game conservation. His deep knowledge of Australia's flora and fauna has made him invaluable to such bodies as the C.S.I.R.O. and the Victorian Ministry for Conservation in projects relating to game management.

He has also been commissioned by the National Museum to assist with various projects.

The firearms user group was also represented at the Investiture by Mr E. Millett, who was admitted as a Member of the British Empire.

Mr Millett's award which was announced in the 1980 New Year's Honour list, was for 40 years of dedicated service to the Melbourne Institute of Applied Science, as an honorary adviser and curator of arms.

He also owns a museum at Ballarat (Victoria) known as "Montrose Cottage". At this location, he has an extensive collection of historic arms and ammunition, together with an assortment of militaria.

The occasion was a great and touching moment for Newton Thomas and heavily emphasises the growing awareness in the community of the shooting sports. The awards were presented by His Excellency, Sir Henry Winneke, Governor of Victoria, and the formal ceremony was followed by a luncheon on the beautifully maintained lawns outside the Ballroom at Government House.

JUST HOW GOOD IS MICHAEL CARREGA?

There is some discussion in European circles at the moment as to the 'best trench shot ever'. The vexed question of 'best ever' is an evergreen subject that has occupied the conversations of shooting men since who knows when.

Michael Carrega, co-holder of the world record (199-200) with Angelo Scalzone of Italy seems to have a justifiable claim to the title.

No other trench shooter can claim four world championships, nor can anybody claim two world championships in a row. Carrega can and in the process can claim that most of these titles have been won with a shotgun.

Montecarlino was the latest in his march to fame. Having to shoot a 25 in his last round to win, he did just that. Shooting the "Manufrance" a gun that has caused some sort of stir in shooting circles he ran the last 25 straight, using three second barrels. This gave him a score of 194-200, one target better than consistent Russian Alexander Assanov. The Manufrance gun incidentally is the basis for the patent on the new Browning Supertap 80 series of competition guns. We are seeing some of them on the tracks in this country at the moment.

Carrega is a most interesting character. A native of Corsica (which makes him a Frenchman) he has already had several different careers. Apart from a stint as a coral diver he also has some claim to fame as a concert pianist. He certainly plays a great tune with a shotgun.

It will be most interesting to see if he can make it live at Moscow.







Friday 15th February 1980

A kilometre allowance is to be paid to our State Secretary to assist him in attending Zone Carnivals and Annual General meetings, where it is humanly possible for him to do so. This fellow deserves all the encouragement he can get. The amount of work he is doing for the shooter may not be obvious to all, but the State Association and shooters in general are getting good mileage from this guy. George Biggs has been re-elected State Director of Coaching for a further two year period.

Should a constitutional change take place at the A.G.M. at Perth, Connors and Abbott were elected to represent Victoria on National Executive. The meeting commenced at 10.55 a.m. and concluded at 3.50 p.m.

Friday 29th February to Tuesday 11th March 1980

This time was taken up attending the 1980 Nationals in Perth W.A. As usual the W.A. hospitality was first class and on arrival at the airport, there to greet us was Darryl Wiese, their public relations officer, and doing a good job too. If you happened to be watching some of the shoot-offs for the events you would have noticed he is not a bad shot either. I won't dwell on actual results here as they no doubt will be published in full, elsewhere for all to read. Having the Americans and New Zealanders present added tremendous color to our Nationals.

It is obvious, we again pressed the facilities available by the attendance of over a hundred more shooters than when it was conducted in Perth in 1976. If the growth of shooting continues in the same vein over the next few years, it is obvious more facilities will be required to conduct the tournament there again.

For those who were unable to attend the A.G.M., I can report, in my opinion it was probably one of the best I have attended. 2. Team Selection.
3. Funding of teams in training and competition.
4. Select juniors for training.
5. Rules pertaining to International shooting.
6. Applications for funds.
7. Postal competition in International shooting.

It was also agreed that as from even date, meetings of this committee would be convened every two months. A more comprehensive and informative report should be available at a later date.

Wednesday Night 9th April 1980

Being in Melbourne on a Wednesday night is most unusual for me, however seeing I was not to return to Mildura until Thursday night, I took the opportunity to visit the Victorian Gun Club. A gentleman I know, and one known to many shooters throughout the Melbourne area in Vince Mollica, is the President of this club. Quite a few changes and improvements to their club rooms have taken place since I last visited there. Both my wife and I were made most welcome by the President and shooters present. Thanks for your hospitality Victorian Gun Club. On the shooting side a twenty target cash handicap was conducted, followed by a twenty target cash division Championship. Seventy shooters entered the events and in the Championship, Russell Spicer shot 48-48 to take the cash for first place, Harry Horfort collected second with 47-48 and Ray Morrison 30-31 was third. Because of the situation in the Melbourne city area, which I might add, is only about twelve kilometres from Melbourne G.P.O., shooting has to be completed by 11 p.m. Even with this curfew there was time for what is called an "off the fence" event. It proved they are well organised at administration level.







THE APPEALATHON STORY

During July 1979 Rod Franklin (Vice President) Perth Gun Club and Ian Cargeeg (Past President) put their heads together to plan a rather large task.

This task was to raise \$7000 for the Channel 9 Appealathon which supports four major charities in the West. Channel 9 in the past has realised over \$1,000,000 a year toward these causes by running their television station for 24 hours with non stop entertainment and asking the Western Australian public for donations. Various clubs and organisations give generously but the clay target shooter has for some reason best known to himself left this type of charity drive alone.

After much deliberation Rod and Ian felt that if they could get just \$12.00 or \$1.00 per month from each registered clay target shooter in the West their task would be complete. No other sporting body has ever raised this type of money for Appealathon and to be first for such a minor sport would really be a feather in our cap.

The idea was a great one but the response was a complete and utter disaster. Five cheques came through the mail and a further 26 donations were collected at major shoots. The total at this stage \$372.

For the next nine months at every major shoot Rod and Ian's voices were heard over the PA. The response was still poor and certainly did not look like improving.

However all was not lost because during one of our trade luncheons Roy Holtfreter, Executive Member of the A.C.T.A. came up with a complete new thought.

"Why not run an Appealathon shoot at Northam Club."

The wheels were then set into motion and the shoot was scheduled to start at 12 noon on Wednesday the 28th November 1979. Northam members and their wives worked like trojans supplying a magnificent smorgasbord lunch and refreshments to all. Kaiser Stuhl wines also came to the party as they usually do and shooters with guests had a terrific afternoon's outing. What a success, Northam raised \$774.00. The total now rose to \$1146.00.

During the next couple of months a few more donations filtered through the system and the tally was slowly climbing.

Knowing now that we were just a short distance from target the Perth and Azzurri Gun Clubs got together to run a further Appealathon shoot on Wednesday the 16th April 1980, just 4 days before we were to present our cheque to Channel 9. Again people came out of the woodwork. Kaiser Stuhl with their wines, Eley, Winchester and Browning with their cartridges like they did at Northam and free salads and beer all donated. The BBQ went on till all hours as did a dress auction run by Ken Holman when most were to say the least under the weather. Channel 9 also attended this marvelous day and took some great footage.

"How much? \$2150.00". Our total now was just short of target by \$450. The following Saturday Rod and Ian came to Perth to run our final raffle. They didn't have to, members and the club of Perth made up the balance. We now had our \$7000 which was presented live on Channel 9 the following Sunday. The Western Australian Clay Target shooters had done it. Never had a sporting body like ours given so much to such a great cause.

COMBINED COACHING AND ADMINISTRATION WORKSHOP AT TOOWOOMBA

In what is believed as another first for clay busting in Queensland, a co-ordinated training program for club coaches and club administrators (Presidents and Secretaries) was held at Toowoomba Gun Club during the weekend of April 12 and 13.

The project was arranged by the South-east Zone of the Queensland Clay Target Association, and was strongly subsidised and supported by the Queensland Department of Sport.

In its two year history, the Queensland Clay Target Association has introduced a number of fresh initiatives, and is playing a major role in the development of the shooting sports.

The brain child of QCTA Secretary, Mrs Bev Grice, the project was very well supported by clubs in the Zone. The program was arranged in two sections, with coaching training featured on the two days, and the administrator's session on the Sunday.

Zone Coach, Stafford Smith, chaired the "training of the trainers" session and brought to the workshop a standard of professional presentation which was maintained throughout the weekend.

After a brief address by Queensland Director of Coaching, Bill Stevens, Stafford explained the basic purpose of the training project, which was directed at preparing club coaches for accreditation. He placed heavy emphasis on the need for complete consistency throughout the coaching team — a consistency which can only be achieved by ALL personnel adhering rigidly to the context of the "Basic Coaching Manual". This is the training aid that has been jointly developed by Newton Thomas and "Bricky" Gunn of New Zealand, and has been accepted by the Association's National Coaching Council as the ONLY standard to be used.

Members of the training group were then asked to each lead a session on the subjects listed in the manual. The abilities de-

monstrated by these "novice trainers" in training were extremely encouraging and suggested that the total novice training policy has a great chance of success.

The attendance included:

Additionally, the National and State Associations were represented by Ron Porter of Brisbane, and Toowoomba Gun Club was represented by President "Scoop" Donovan and Secretary Ken Miller.

The Saturday discussion closed at 5 p.m., and was followed by a most relaxing and informal barbecue.

In the evening, shooting training films were shown, which provided clear supporting evidence for the procedures discussed during the lecture sessions earlier in the day.

On Sunday, novice shooters (in fact, anybody who had a desire to learn a little more about shotgunning) were invited to the Club, and the club coaches were given a chance to apply the knowledge they had acquired the previous day.

Club President Bob Donovan had been interviewed on a local radio sports program and had taken full advantage of the opportunity to not only sell the total story of "Australia's booming sport" but also to extend a personal invitation to the community at large to come along and see for themselves what the sport is all about.

Over twenty novices turned up, and the Club coaches in general maintained the Saturday standard throughout the teaching of the novices.

The overriding factor that was heavily emphasized over the two days was safety - the slogan "START WITH SAFETY - FINISH WITH SAFETY" was enthusiastically followed.

Clear proof that simplicity brings success was seen when all of the novices broke targets. It has long been the policy of Newton Thomas that an uncomplicated program has a much greater chance of success than one which depends on a high level of technicalities.

After the intense training, many of the club nominees in attendance submitted themselves to an accreditation test and the following are now fully accredited club coaches for the purpose of novice training:

R. DeLuca, Ballandean; R. Wells, Toowoomba; D. Cameron, Warwick; L. James, Brisbane; C. Witt, Gold Coast; B. May, Sunshine Coast; M. Gough, Kallangur; L. Stolberg, Gympie; R. Duffy, Bundaberg.


Meanwhile, Ron Porter spent his Sunday chairing the "Administrator's Conference". The feature of the program was a taped address prepared by the recently retired Queensland Director of Sport, Ron Leahy.

In his address, Mr Leahy briefly described the creation and development of his department, and followed this introduction with a very clear description of the department's functions, and defined the areas in which sports can reap advantages from the types of assistance provided by his department.

This tape was prepared exclusively for the Queensland Clay Target Association, and provides clear evidence of the esteem in which the QCTA is held by the State Government.

Other topics included in the program were "The Structure of the A.C.T.A.," "Preparation of Applications for Government Subsidies"; "The Importance of Club Committees"; after which a general question and answer session was held.

As was the case with the coaching session, the attendance was most encouraging. It included President and Secretary of the host club, Bob Donovan and Ken Miller; President and Secretary of Gold Coast Gun Club, Colin Witt and Val Hutchinson; Daphne King, new Secretary of Warwick Gun Club; Chub Smith, President of Ballandean Gun Club; President and Secretary of Brisbane Gun Club, Dave Evans and Chris Payne; Sel Horn of Kingaroy Gun Club; Allister McIntyre, Secretary of Texas Gun Club.

The level of interest proved that a genuine need exists for these educative type projects, and all in attendance agreed that their time had been well spent.

Mrs Val Hutchinson of Gold Coast Gun Club expressed a view shared by a number of other club representatives, when she asked for details of the ACTA insurance cover.

The meeting was told that the area of insurance was on in which ALL club committees are urged to talk to an accredited insurance expert, in relation to specific club needs under the general insurance heading.

One of the important lessons to be learned from this successful project is that Zone Councils have a very important part to play in conducting projects of this nature.

Particularly in states where the geographic area is large (Queensland is a good example) the success of the State Association is very heavily dependent on the active promotion of Zone activities. This is a form of decentralised administration and provides a means of positive communications which would otherwise be lost.

The QCTA is very enthusiastic about this whole concept of integrated training sessions, and four similar projects will be held during the balance of 1980 - one in each of the following centres, Rockhampton, Gemfields (Anakie), Central Burnett and Townsville. If the standards which were established at Toowoomba can be maintained throughout the series, the QCTA will have established a strong coaching and administrative base at all clubs which will have attended the program.

NORTON RELEASES SPECIALIST SHOOTER EAR PROTECTION

A range of specialist ear protection has been released for hand gun and rifle users in Australia.

The range comprises a specifically designed muff, and a sonic ear valve which filters harmful high level noises.

Industrial safety expert, Norton Pty Ltd, developed the hearing protectors in the USA after demand from sports shooters, military, police and security organisations.


Shooters were in danger of permanent hearing loss after exposure to constant barrages of noise as loud as 175 decibels.

The damage is usually irreversible by the time effects are noticed by the victim.

According to the Product manager, safety products division of Norton, Mr G. Williams, the Sonic-Two ear valve and the Gun Muffler had been shown to cut temporary hearing loss during gun fire to only two decibels.

Audiologists generally agree that a temporary loss of up to five decibels is insignificant.

The Sonic Two ear valve is not simply an ear plug, although it is designed to fit comfortably into the ear passage.

It is constructed of soft silicone rubber, encasing a removable metal cylinder which houses a diaphragm baffle system.

Hearing protection is accomplished by a complex acoustical passageway.

A moving diaphragm responds to sounds of different amplitudes and sharpness characteristics, filtering the impact on the user.

It is still possible to hear normal conversation - particularly important for range shooters who need to hear instructions.

The silicone rubber inserts are non-toxic, non-allergenic and easy to clean.

They will be sold in Australia with a belt pouch.

Mr Williams said most Australian shooters were forced to adapt sometimes cumbersome industrial ear muffs to their needs.

Norton has designed a specific 'gun muffler' ear muff.

It is angled along its lower edge to avoid fouling the shooter's rifle stock - a problem with most muffs which have cost points in competition.

The Norton 'gun muffler' ear muff is lightweight.

It is fitted with a ratchet headband which hold the cups firmly in place, but can be worn over the head, behind the head or under the neck.

The ratchet system prevents slippage of the muff.

Norton has conducted extensive tests of both its new hearing protectors.

One test involved 34 Californian law enforcement students who spent two days on a range under the surveillance of an independent testing authority.

The students used Smith and Wesson .357 Magnums, flanked by control shooters on their side to create a barrage of sound.

Tests on the hand pieces revealed a muzzle reaction of between 166-170 decibels.

The students each fired 18 rounds of Remington 158 grain hollow-point steel jacketed ammunition from a six inch barrel within two minutes.

The tests were repeated several times in a 78ft concrete roofed and floored semi-enclosed range.

Surrounding shooters ensured the students were exposed to 54 rounds every two minutes.

The test revealed a temporary threshold shift (hearing loss) of less than two decibels using either the Sonic Ear Valves or a muff.

The ear valves returned marginally better results - an average loss in both ears of 1.35 decibels.

The muffs resulted in a loss of 1.59 decibels.

According to Mr Williams, Norton expects to sell its range in Australia in equal numbers of muff and valve.

"Both offer similar protection," he said.

"It is up to the individual to decide which is most comfortable and applicable to his or her own needs."

Retirement of Firearms Industry Identity

After 47 years service for the Melbourne based sportsgoods dealer Evans & Balfour Robert Richards retired on April 3, 1980.

Readers could be excused for asking "who is Robert Richards?" because he has been known to all in the firearms industry as "Phil".

The nickname became necessary because, at the time that Bob Richards joined Evans & Balfour both of the original partners were still in the business. They were Vernon (Mac) Evans and T. R. (Bob) Balfour.

Naturally the boss was not going to change his name, so T.R. Balfour said to young Richards: "If I had a son he was going to be called Phil — from now on we will call you Phil!" For 47 years the name has stuck.

"Phil" commenced duties with E & B in October, 1933, as a parcel packer and message boy. He was required to make regular visits to the wharves and to shipping company offices, as most of the stock that was merchandised by the business was of imported origin.

At this time, Les Turner (the governing director today) had already joined Evans & Balfour after a short period with Alcock & Pierce. The gunsmith was Joe Harle, another name still widely known amongst clay target shooters.

Over the years, "Phil" Richards has seen a number of changes occur in the sports goods industry, and especially in his own company.

The emphasis in Evans & Balfour today is more heavily slanted towards firearms than in past times. Phil can remember when Les Turner and members of the Evans & Balfour staff would put on badminton demonstrations. There would be a small charge for admission to the demonstration, which would usually prove to generate sufficient money to allow a Club to be started in the particular venue used for the demonstration. In this way, the E & B team was instrumental in the establishment of many dozens of badminton clubs, and the business grew as a result.

During war years, "Phil" Richards and the E & B group organised regular fishing competitions, the proceeds from which were donated to the Australian Comforts Fund — which was a voluntary organisation connected with Australia's war efforts. It was about this time that "Phil" became President of the Fishing Tackle Traders Association.

In post-war years, Evans & Balfour has concentrated more and more on firearms, especially the specialist trap and skeet gun market. "Phil" Richards has proved his versatility in developing, and maintaining a deep and intimate knowledge of firearms and the industry.

By this time, "Phil" had been appointed General Manager of Evans & Balfour and was in day to day control of one of the biggest firearms businesses in Australia.

A lesser known side of the operation, but of importance in the overall viability of Evans & Balfour, is the activity of Diamond Sports Company. This is a wholly owned subsidiary and specialises in the manufacture and wholesale distribution of sporting goods.

Probably the best known product to come out of Diamond Sports Company is the DIAMOND recoil pad for shotguns, many thousands of which are in use throughout Australia.

"Phil" Richards has fond memories of his working life with such industry identities as Ted Jones, who was Sales Manager for around 10 years. (Ted died in 1979), Eddie Garnett, who was a very talented gunsmith and became workshop supervisor after Joe Harle left (Ed-

die is now with Michaelis Bayley Trading), and Dick Sharp, the most recent workshop supervisor. (In fact, Dick Sharp has now purchased the service and repair division and operates it with his son, Kevin.

He has devoted much of his time to lay-preaching, and has been connected to the Uniting Church at Ivanhoe for the last 20 years. During this time, he has been superintendent of the Sunday School, and was foundation secretary of the Bellfield Pre-School Centre.

During the '39-'45 war, "Phil" Richards saw service in New Guinea, where he rose from the ranks to become a major, and was Ordinance Officer for the Port Moresby area. He was one of the first Australians into Milne Bay after the Japanese occupation in 1943.

"Phil" or Bob will spend his retirement spending more time on his two main loves — his family (his wife, a son and two daughters) and his home at Venus Bay, which gives him the opportunity to fish whenever he pleases.

Very few people in the sportsgoods industry have been known as a thorough gentleman as has been Robert Richards, who has gained the respect of all who have come in contact with him.







From the desk of the National Coaching Director

YOUR GUN — by Newton Thomas.

Too many shooters neglect the most important part of their equipment — THEIR GUN!

A gun, irrespective of what one pays for it, is only a machine. It should be serviced and maintained in a regular manner.

In my shooting career, which spanned many years, I had a total of two misfires — both in International matches and both due to ammunition fault. Every 18 months, and certainly no longer than two years, I had my guns taken down, the firing pins checked for both length and tension.

It will be found that, after years of work, both firing pins and hammer springs will shorten and consequently become inefficient. This is a gradual process and first makes itself apparent by an occasional misfire, which increase in number as time goes by, thus creating a real problem.

There is a great tendency to blame the cartridges when misfires occur. However, if you get misfires when you use several varieties of cartridges, you must look to your gun.

Once the firing pin starts to shorten or the hammer spring becomes critical to cartridges, which, although they may be correct as to manufacturing tolerances, are on the lower limit of sensitivity, it is then that the problem of misfires will start to rear its ugly head.

Trigger pulls also will alter with years of wear — some will wear light and others heavy, and some will vary, sometimes light sometimes heavy.

When my guns were checked the request to the gunsmith always was: "Check the firing pins for length, the hammer springs for length and tension, and the trigger or triggers for weight of pull". (I always did — and still do — like a crisp 4lb pull on the first barrel and 4 1/4 lb pull on the second). "Check the other working parts of the gun and lubricate the action."

I have one gun in my possession that has fired over 750,000 shots. It has been fired by many hundreds of shooters throughout the world, and in that time has only had one minor problem — which did not stop it being used.

This gun was only given reasonable care and a lot of hard work, but always had regular service of the kind I have illustrated above. It was the gun that the two misfires occurred in, both proved to be ammunition fault.

This gun is still in perfect working order and is a good example of the point that I am trying to make.

Eley displayed an impressive range of models at the 1980 Nationals — a display which created a lot of interest.





QUERY ON NATIONAL TOWER BREAK

After news that a new national tower break record was being claimed was published in March issue of Clay Target Shooting News, a number of telephone callers questioned the validity of the claim because they believed that the host club had not complied with Trap Rule 80(a).

(Trap Rule 80(a) reads: Break badges will be recognised in sequences of 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, 250 and so on, provided these are shot over automatic traps under double or single barrel conditions and in regular competition on one day only excepting over a program of two or more successive days.)

The club, Metropolitan Clay Target Club (located in Victoria) was contacted, and the Secretary, Len Hubbard, has provided the following information:

"In 1973 we installed a SNIPE trap in our tower, replacing an old PLUS trap. Whilst not automatic in operation, it was automatic in changing angles. We shot over this trap for 3½ years.

Since that time, we have used a Winchester White Flyer trap continually. During competitions, the trap is set to comply to all Tower rules, and the only times that it is used as non-oscillating is when we have novice shooters for training or for a special side-on practice prior to duck opening."

Len Hubbard went on to express his concern at the nature of some of the criticisms and suggested, in strong terms, that all those who wish to comment have a strong obligation to check their facts first.

The record was established by a new member of Metropolitan Clay Target Club, John Smith, and the Association again takes this opportunity to congratulate you John, after shooting 372 straight.





Bev. is currently the secretary of the Queensland Clay Target Association, a keen competitor as well as a very efficient administrator, who took up the sport of clay target shooting in 1976, and her shooting ability has been shown by her wins in the womens section of the Nationals in Brisbane 1977, Adelaide 1978 and Griffiths 1979. She is the current Ladies winner of the Queensland section of the Winchester Tournament, and as she puts it ... "I love the sport and enjoy the job. It's a lot of headaches and hassles, but it's a lot of fun too." On behalf of all women shooters I would like to extend our congratulations on your new appointment and may success be yours in the future.

Nationals fever is over for another year and results show from Perth that Deserie Wakefield once again dominated the women's section, winning both the Trap and Overall Ladies High Gun trophies. Perhaps Deserie did not win in the same style that she did in Griffith 1979, in fact her name did not appear on the winners list in two events, but her overall good shooting certainly made her a worthy winner of yet another Ladies High Gun Award.

New names appeared in the women's winning circle, Margaret Slee, Albany W.A., 3rd Australian Skeet Championship, 3rd Australian Double Rise Championship and another 3rd in the Australian Double Barrel. There was great excitement when Colleen Ireland, Perth, won the Ladies Section of the Australian/New Zealand Trap Championship and also took second in "C" grade of the open division. Two other W.A. ladies appeared with a 2nd to June Roach, Bunbury, Grand Australian Handicap, and a 2nd to Norma Ball, Kojunup, Single Barrel. Visiting women shooters from the U.S.A. also made their presence felt with Judy Wegner, 2nd Double Rise and 1st Champion of Champions. Donna Urling, U.S.A., showed our women how it was done in the Single Barrel and took two 2nd placings in the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship and the Champion of Champions Cup. Donna also was a member of the official U.S. team in the International Trap Match and her score for this event was 46-50, which I must add was not the lowest score of the team which consisted of 4 men as well as herself.

Some of the women from the Garden State also had their day, with Christine Wakefield winning the Grand Australian Handicap and running 2nd to big sister in the Skeet. Margaret Pitt, Jeparit, showed up with a 3rd, Grand Australian Handicap and June Gawith, also of Jeparit, 3rd Single Barrel, with Thelma Meadows of Brisbane taking 2nd place in the Double Barrel. We were unable to attend Perth Nationals this Year, but from all whom I have spoken with who were able to attend, Perth really turned it on, weather-wise, hospitality wise and shooting wise, which all goes into making yet another very successful nationals.

Whilst on the West, news has reached me that Kaye Holtfreter, daughter of Roy, became Mrs. Andrew Butcher on January 1st. Festivities were held at Hannibals Night Club and it was reported to be the wedding of the decade, best wishes to you both.

Shooting at the moment seems to be experiencing a slump, a drop in the number of shooters, overhead cost for clubs increasing, and a general feeling of the doldrums. What makes money for a Club? Throwing targets? Perhaps Clubs should look at ways to encourage shooters to shoot more, for example I would like to suggest that one day per month, we shoot just for the love of it and help the clubs, but human nature being what it is even I don't think that would work. So maybe a few encouragements might work - like a shooter that nominates for the whole program, a reduction of 25%. A shooter who travels in excess of 200 kilometres a similar reduction, with the cost of petrol as it is today. Instead of the expensive trophy, free nominations for the winner of a championship for 3 similar events, but not all on the one day, to get him/her back to the club on three more occasions. These type of incentives certainly work in Europe and I feel are certainly worth a try here.
