

Those of the Association's members who take an interest in the development of their sport will read the report carefully. In this way, they will be well equipped to discuss policy issues.

However, such a depth of involvement is not everybody's scene, and readers who treat clay busting as a casual recreation will probably go straight to the results pages to see if they can recognise any winners' names.

In spite of the variation of interest, which exists in every sport, there is one major aspect which ALL members should realise and acknowledge. This is the immense amount of time that the honorary administrators devote to this sport, simply to ensure that when you and I arrive at the club next Saturday, a match or some fun shooting will be available.

Just for the Executive Meeting alone, the fifteen members of the Committee had to spend many hours briefing themselves in preparation, followed by hours spent travelling to the meeting venue.

The actual meeting took two full days (Saturday and Sunday) and two nights. Many of you would say that you could find a better way to spend a weekend.

Yet, these decision makers gave their time most unselfishly in the hope of reaching decisions which will guarantee the future of clay target shooting.

The advent of State Associations has brought about some decentralisation of administration, and in theory, should be working well, in most cases, this is so, but one or two State Associations are suffering from too heavy a work load on too few shoulders.

It should be remembered that our sport will **only** continue to grow if the work load can be distributed fairly, AND put in the hands of competent people. Can YOU help?

In addition to electing a new President (Mr Ron Porter of Brisbane was elected to the Association's top office — see report elsewhere), the Executive Committee approved two new appointments

These were Mr Ray Mason of Devonport, Tasmania, and Richard Dean of Roma, Queensland.

Mr Mason has been a long time supporter of Devonport Clay Target Club — previously called Mersey Gun Club — and is a past President of the club. He is also the North West Zone Coach in Tasmania's coaching scheme.

Mr Dean also comes to the Executive Committee from a coaching background, as he was one of the first Zone Coaches to be accredited by the Queensland Clay Target Association. He has since resigned as Zone Coach, to concentrate more fully on State and National administrative policy making activities.

# EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

A series of management and Executive Committee meetings were held in Sydney during the weekend of September 26, 27 and 28. A number of major developments occurred during these meetings,

and many are summarized below.

Probably the most momentous news was the election of a new national President, in the person of Ron Porter of Brisbane. Laurie Connors retains his position as national Vice President (and Chairman of the International Sub Committee) while Dr Paul Cains of Burnie, Tasmania, has been appointed to fill the vacancy on the Management Committee. The Management Committee now consists of Messrs Porter, Connors, Holtfreter and Dr Paul Cains.

New faces to appear at the meeting were those of Mr Ray Mason of Devonport, Tasmania, who has been elected to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Don Taylor, and Mr Richard Dean, of

Roma, Queensland, who filled the vacancy which was left when Ron Porter moved into the president's position.

It is of interest to note that the meeting proceeded extremely smoothly under Ron Porter's Chairmanship, and provided clear evidence that members of the Executive Committee responded to

Ron's particular form of leadership.

The first part of the meeting, after the election of office bearers, was taken up by the presentation of a number of sub committee and

special project reports.

Such matters as administration and finance were covered in detail, followed by reports detailing the progress being shown by the International Sub Committee, the Development Sub Committee, and the Finance Sub Committee.

Probably the most important report in an immediate sense reflected the deliberations of the Rules Sub Committee and this matter will be reported in detail later in this article.

The other major item of interest related to the development of the Association's national headquarters, and this item also will be reported in detail later.

The following items should be of interest to readers:
FEE INCREASE RECOMMENDED FOR 1982
After a detailed analysis of the Association's finances, and consideration of the projected estimates of income and expenditure, the Executive Committee resolved to recommend to the 1981 Annual General Meeting that registration fees for full adult members be in-

creased to \$30 per annum, becoming effective from January 1, 1982.

There will be corresponding fee increases for second family members, and subscriptions to Clay Target Shooting News. Junior fees

will remain at \$1 per year.

The basis on which this recommendation was formed is very clearly connected with Australia's current rate of inflation. The last fee increase occurred in 1979, which means that by 1982, inflation alone will have accounted for cost increases of approximately 40%. In this light, a fee increase of \$10 per member does not seem exorbi-

A great deal of discussion centred around the present conflict within the Australian Shooting Association, with the theme being to find a means of best resolving the conflict, without total disintegra-


tion of the shooting sports.

It was acknowledged that the Australian Small Bore Rifle Association appeared to have acted in a way that was seen publicly to be not in the best interest of the Australian Shooting Association, and the two ACTA delegates to the Australian Shooting Association have been directed to table this issue at the next meeting of the ASA.

The current tension within the affiliates of the Australian Shooting Association is extremely poorly timed, as it comes at a time when the Federal Government has made a grant of \$49,000 to enable the Australian Shooting Association to appoint a full time Executive Director. There seems to be no sense in appointing a full time administrator, if the various affiliates are not in full accord, and this places a very heavy responsibility on the shoulders of all delegates attending the next meeting of the Australian Shooting Association to clear the air, and in this way guarantee the future solidarity of the Australian Shooting Association.

#### **EXCELLENT NEWS FROM FRANCHI**

A new interchangeable choke gas operated automatic shotgun has been developed by Franchi technicians which we will have on the Australian market early in 1981, well in

time for duck opening.

Other news from Franchi includes the improvements which have been made to their Barrage Trap and Skeet guns. The original Barrage models were introduced in 1978 and quickly became renowned amongst our shooters, despite some minor "bugs" such as imperfect sear contact and trigger hangup. Both faults have now been rectified in our latest shipment.

On the service side, our warranty gunsmiths are providing a super repair service fully backed by Franchi. And a full quota of spare parts for all Franchi arms,

old and new, has just arrived.

Franchi 1½ webb slip pads are now in stock. These provide the shooter with more recoil reduction over the single webb pad and are less bulky than the double webb, and so will be a valuable addition to the already popular slip pad sales.

Our ELEY Shooting Glasses are enjoying national acclaim. These interchangeable three lens sets are priced around the \$20 mark. Stocks are nearly depleted (once again we underestimated the market) but more are on the way in sufficient quantities to ensure we shall not run out again.

The format is for clubs to run a junior event in conjunction with a normal double barrel contest with a State final for sash and cash. If possible, we should then like to extend this to a National contest with all State winners getting full expenses to compete against each other at a suitable site and occasion.

John Summers, one of Australia's best skeet shooters, has been promoted in the ELEY organisation in the shuffle that followed West Australia manager, David Henthorn's, departure overseas. John will be operating in Western and North Western Victoria, as well as some metropolitan accounts.

#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT (Cont'd)**

#### NATIONALS'81

Although there was extensive general debate relating to the progress with planning for the 1981 National Championships, the major decisions reflected three particular areas:

- (a) Nominations will be slightly increased over previous year's levels.
- (b) The Double Rise Championship will be conducted at two visits to the ground instead of one as in previous tournaments.
- (c) That an incentive will be introduced to encourage competitors to nominate in early squads.

Full details of these changes will appear in December issue of Clay Target Shooting News, when a full report on progress for the 1981 National Championships will be published.

The supply of cartridges and clay targets for the tournament was also discussed, and these matters will also be included in the full report, to appear next month.

# CONFERENCE FOR STATE ASSOCIATION PRESIDENTS AND SECRETARIES

Following the introduction earlier this year of a conference for State Association Presidents and Secretaries, considerable dis-

cussion centred around the degree of success of the initial project, and the preferred regularity of future conferences.

There was unanimous agreement that the 1980 project was an unqualified success, and the general feeling was that such a conference should be repeated during 1981.

It was then resolved that the time interval for such conferences following 1981 would be two yearly.

Every effort will be made to encourage State Associations to play a much more active part in the 1981 conference, and planning will start almost immediately.

#### 1982 COMMONWEALTH GAMES

This subject is too extensive to be fully reported in this brief comment, and a detailed report will appear in a later issue of Clay Target Shooting News.

However, it can now be reported that the Commonwealth Government and the Queensland State Government have guaranteed the funds required to upgrade the Belmont shooting complex to enable the shooting section of the 1982 Commonwealth Games program to be held successfully.

Right up until the end of September, the fate of the shooting events was still unknown.

#### MEETING WITH CPSA

Dr Paul Cains had recently undertaken a private trip to Great Britain, during which time he arranged consultations with the Executive Officers of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association. Dr Cains presented a detailed report to the Executive Committee Meeting, which showed that there are a number of areas in which both the Great Britain and the Australian Association could gain some benefits by closer co-operation.

# NEW SHOOTING RULES — TO BECOME EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1981

Following the publication of a draft of the revised shooting rules, which appeared in the July issue of Clay Target Shooting News, there has been a most responsible reaction from clubs and interested shooters.

The Rules Sub Committee received well over 100 comments in relation to the proposed changes, most of which were of a most constructive and responsible nature.

The Rules Sub Committee, under the Chairmanship of Mr Arch Rowe, considered all of the comments that were received, and then tabled the final draft of the revised rules for Executive Committee approval.

Such approval was forthcoming and the confirmed rules will be published in the earliest possible issue of Clay Target Shooting News.

It is planned to print a complete new rule book, which will be available for distribution early in 1981.

The Rules Committee is to be commended for the tremendous amount of detailed work that went into the preparation of the final submissions.

It is of interest to note that the Executive Committee's policy in relation to the new rules is that the rules should remain in force for a period of five years, excepting those relating to grading or handicapping, or involving monetary values, which may be considered from time to time.



#### NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS FORWARD ROSTER

Based on the assumption that National Championships will continue to be conducted on a State by State roster system until at least 1985, the following roster was resolved:

1981 — Victoria; 1982 — Queensland; 1983 — South Australia; 1984 — New South Wales; 1985 — Western Australia.

Naturally, the extent to which this roster can be followed will depend on the availability of satisfactory venues in each of the selected host States, consideration being given to the financial ability of the particular host State, and any developments in relation to the establishment of a National headquarters.

#### PROGRESS WITH NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

Due to constantly changing circumstances, the decision resolved at the March meeting of the Executive Committee to make a decision at this meeting on the location of the National Headquarters had to be rescinded.

One of the major reasons for the rescission of the original decision was the knowledge that the Commonwealth Government was embarking on a support program for the establishment of national sports facilities. Such a plan would need to be considered in conjunction with the ACTA proposals, which in turn, required further time.

However, the Management Committee was able to submit a detailed report to the Executive Committee on the continuing investigations, and it is highly likely that a town and country planning consultancy will be retained in the near future to undertake a specific feasibility study on behalf of the Association.

It is of interest to note that the Canberra project being promoted by the Australian Capital Territory Shooting Association is showing renewed possibilities, with the ACT Shooting Association President, Mr Val Paral, currently well up stream in detailed negotiations with the National Capital Development Commission.
AIR NEW ZEALAND SUPPORT PROGRAM

Members of the Executive Committee were most excited to find that Air New Zealand had agreed to increase quite substantially its level of support for clay target shooting in Australia.

One of the immediate consequences of this increasedlevel of support can be measured by the fact that the Association is to introduce a special series of State oriented elimination matches during 1980/81, from which an Australian team will be selected to compete at the South Island Championships in New Zealand during late 1981.

The International Sub Committee has been given the responsibility of determining the conditions of this match, and information on the subject will be sent to State Associations as soon as possible.

The Executive Committee expressed its deep gratitude to Air New Zealand for the way in which this international airline, known as the "Pacific's Number One", continues to support clay target shooting in Australia.



Americans are great on statistics and it is interesting to note trends in shooting that have parallels in this country. Our sister publication 'Trap & Field' in the USA carried the report recently that shooting attendances were down slightly in that country during

remembered however, they only report the big ones as distinct from us where we carry a short summary of every club shoot in the coun-

Performance rates very highly in the States, and some of these competitors who ran 200 straight in 200 target single barrel events.

In handicap events, 27 competitors ran the 200, again single barrel. Of these, eight were from the 27 yard line, the equivalent of our 25 metres. The double rise competitiors were on the mark as well, 32 of them ran 100 straight in reported competition.

As this is written the 'big one' is on in the States. We refer of course to the 'Grand'. We will bring you a report on this biggest of shooting events in this column in next month's issue.

For those who remember Frank Little with the USA Trench team in 1973, he is having a purple patch in trap shooting ATA style at the moment. He ran 200 straight and then 50 in the shoot-off to win the Central Zone championship in July. It was nearly a double when he ran 100 straight double rise but lost the shoot-off. But his 687-700 was enough to win the HOA (High Gun).

Judy Wegner, who lots will remember from Perth took both ladies events at the same championship. Her scores were 197-200 in the singles and 97-100 in double rise.

October 5 is 'National Trapshooting Day' in the USA and some 200 clubs will participate in the promotion. Trapshooting in that country is very public relations minded and this national promotion goes a long way towards promoting the sport.

The ATA provides a publicity kit for clubs participating, together
They say that reports of shoots in the USA ran to 2,100. It must be with a variety of trophy packages to suit the type and style of shoot emembered however, they only report the big ones as distinct from being run. Clubs tackle their programs to suit local conditions. Some run their local club championships on the day together with demonstration shoots for the public.

Most clubs have indicated that they will schedule 'non registered' figures make interesting reading. During the year, there were 178 events for members of the public who wish to compete. One club is even offering free targets and shells to all participants under the age







# AIR NEW ZEALAND AGAIN SUPPORTS CLAY BUSTING

(Staff Writer)

Association representatives met with senior marketing executives from Air New Zealand late in September, to review the relationship that has developed between the two organizations since their first joint promotion in March 1978.

At that time, Air New Zealand provided substantial assistance in getting a trap team to the New Zealand National Championships.

Since then, the degree of support that has been forthcoming from the airline known as the "Pacific's Number ONE" has been of tremendous value to the ACTA. The benefit has been felt exclusively in the area of developing international competition for D.T.L. TRAPSHOOTERS — the category into which 90% of the Association's membership falls. In this way, the greatest possible cross-section of competitors has seen the value of the support.

In 1978 and 1979, the ACTA fielded an "Air New Zealand Trap Team" at the biggest clay target tournament in the world, the Grand American Tournament.

The purpose of the review undertaken at this meeting was to convince the airline that its program of assistance was worth continuing.

Air New Zealand's response was overwhelming, and provided tangible evidence that if clay target shooting can continue to support its major sponsors, the sponsors in turn will stick to the ACTA.

As a direct result of the Air New Zealand decision, Australia will enter another representative team in the 1981 Grand American Tournament. The team will be selected during the 1981 Australian National Championships.

A further exciting development is the creation of the Air New Zealand Elimination Series. Made possible by substantial assistance in transporting a trap team to New Zealand, a series of matches will be conducted, one per state, from which an Australian team will be selected.


The International Sub Committee has been given the job of defining the match conditions, and State Associations will be advised accordingly.

The selected team will then compete in the 1981 New Zealand South Island Championships.



It is particularly well matched to the needs of young shooters and hunter-safety programs.

The Model 1100 LT-20 "Limited" will be produced with a choice of two, 23-inch, vent rib barrels in either improved cylinder or modified choke. Overall length will be 42 inches and average weight, an easy-carrying 61/4 lbs.

A significant advantage of this newest Model 1100 is its versatility. As young shooters grow to the point at which a full size stock would fit them better, a standard replacement butt stock can be obtained. With this option, a single Model 1100 LT-20 "Limited" could be utilized at various ages by a number of youngsters in the same family.

As an additional option, any of the extra barrels of standard length for the Model 1100 LT-20 can be interchanged at any time on the "Limited" version enabling owners to convert the gun from one version to the other at will.

This total interchangeability of barrels also provides one more interesting option. Shooters who might like the idea of using the 23 in-ch barrels on their regular Model 1100 LT-20's can order them separately as extra barrels.



# **USEFUL INCREASE IN** FEDERAL GOVERNMENT **FUNDING SUPPORT**

(Staff Writer)

The shooting sports have received a substantial increase in the level of Federal Government funding assistance for 1980/81, when compared with previous years.

The total allocation for the current year is \$93,700, of which \$35,000 is earmarked for clay target shooting.
The clay target share is further broken down as follows:

\$22,000 for the continuing full-time employment of the National Coaching Director.

\$3,000 for general administrative purposes.

\$5,000 for coaching projects. \$5,000 for international competition overseas.


Equally as exciting is the news that the total allocation has made provision for the appointment of a full time Executive Director for the Australian Shooting Association.

In recent times, the extent of ASA activity has increased quite substantially, and the work load has certainly had a detrimental effect on honorary officers of the ASA such as Peter Papps and David

However, the big question is "Are the affiliates of the ASA pre-pared to support such a move?" In fact, the Government grant re-cognizes this problem, as an attached condition reads "this grant is subject to the majority of ASA affiliates agreeing to the appoint-

There can be no doubt that such an appointment would produce tangible and important results in a very short space of time, WITHOUT any intrusion into areas already being covered by existing individual Association administrative units.

Equally as exciting is the indication that, if the ASA appointment is made, a recognizable section of the commercial organizations attached to the shooting sports is also prepared to assist with financial support.



Turning now to electoral promises, the degree to which the shooting sports are emerging as a major force was clearly emphasized in

the Prime Minister's policy speech.
In this speech, Mr Fraser referred to a sports facility development. program, which would span three years, and into which the Federal Government, if re-elected, would put \$25 million on a dollar for dollar basis in co-operation with State Governments.

The important factor in the speech was that TWO of the eight projects listed, were shooting complexes. A 25% share for shooting looks good eh?

# VICTORIAN **COACHING SCENE**

OPEN REPORT TO ALL CLUBS

Our number one priority for this year was the appointment, training and accreditation of as many club coaches as possible during 1980, so that by achieving this goal, Victoria would have a fully operating coaching system right down to club level.

As of this date we have 78 appointed club coaches. Approximately 60 coaches have done their training. Of this number, 36 have gained their accreditation certificate and club coach badge.

I'm delighted with reports that several of our larger clubs are now conducting regular weekly novice instruction training. Many smaller clubs also report coaching instruction on their regular shoot days. In country areas it is obvious that school boy and young shooter interest is very much on the increase. This coaching work is being done by accredited club instructors. I'm sure everyone will agree that this action augers well for the future of our novice shooter instruction program.

It is in the interest of every club to support their club coach in every way possible so that the new shooter will be made to feel welcome to our sport and so further develop the novice shooter's confidence in his ability to become a better shot. We will also promote and practise a responsible attitude in the use of firearms at all times and at all levels in all places.

THE CLUB COACH

Our club coach is a suitable person who is appointed by his club. He is then given training, and after accreditation, is issued with club coach badge and certificate of authority. He should be the only person permitted to instruct at the club level.

The club coach training plan is designed to produce uniformity of coaching instruction. According to our manual it will provide a basic knowledge of skill and technique which will allow coaches to perform more effectively than they would perhaps otherwise be able

Of course the application of this knowledge will remain flexible, according to the talent and ability of the individual coach.

Training aids like charts, slides, etc. are being prepared for issue to each coach during the next few weeks. Please advise your zone coach if you can use any of these aids or write me direct.

During May, our Victorian I.S.U. sub-committee announced the appointment of Victorian State I.S.U. skeet and trench training squads of six shooters each squad. The State Coaching Director was appointed coach to both squads and asked to take charge and also to prepare a training program. This has been done with copies to all squad members. State President, Bob Buchan, and A.C.T.A. secretary, Noel Southey have also been given copies. (Noel asked for copy for sending to other states.)

In order to help the squad members to improve their shooting performance, I've prepared a folder in manual form which contains useful information about the techniques of shooting International skeet and trench. Each member has been issued with a copy.

The I.S.U. Squads commenced their training and coaching program on June 21. Complete records are being kept of each shooter's scores at practice and in competition. I am also keeping note of promising shooters' performances during the elimination events over the next 8 months.

It would seem that after 21/2 years of operation our coaching system has been of great benefit to the novice shooter, and the young shooter at the technical school and high school level and this is as it should be. However, it is very obvious to me that the mature shooter is badly in need of help with regards to his equipment and how it should be used correctly. I believe that a special course should be introduced in gun fitting, correct gun mounting and proper gun holding. This is where bad habits develop and poor scores are the result to say nothing of the bruised cheek and sore shoulders that follow.

I'm not forgetful of the wonderful effort my zone and club coaches are putting into our cause. For this I'm very grateful and I thank them very much indeed. I'd also like to thank the V.C.T.A. executives for their cooperation and the help they give.







7 were successful, they were:



# "THE CHALLENGE OF THE EIGHTIES"

The Annual General Meeting of the Victorian Clay Target Association was held recently. It was conducted during the most successful State Trap Carnival.

The Executive Director was invited to address the meeting and the text of the speech is published at the request of a number of peo-

ple who believe it carries a national message.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to speak to you at this time, as we are entering a most challenging period in the growth of clay target shooting.

I say challenging because of the opportunities that are available if we are good enough and quick enough to grasp them.

The last few years have seen a dramatic growth in our sport — growth in three ways. The first can be measured in tournaments such as this, which were unknown a few years ago. What great progress has been made when you consider that 250 competitors have contested this program so far.

The second factor concerns the money area - in 1976, the association had a debit or minus figure under the heading "Accumulated Funds" in its balance sheet. Today, we have the encouraging figure of \$145,000 placed in relatively high interest yielding investments.

The third, and possibly most important factor is the numbers game — in 1976 the national membership of the Australian Clay Target Association was 7,500. By the end of 1979 this figure had grown to 10,500 a massive 40% increase.

However, towards the end of 1979 the rate of growth slowed a little, partly due to economic pressures, and partly due to the difficulties

caused by growth in itself.

By this, I mean that the administrative structure was having difficulty coping with the strains caused by the numeric growth.

State Associations have played a major role in assisting the sport to reach its present levels, and have become most important in the total management scene.

This is very evident when one looks at national trap and skeet championships. Since State Associations took over the running of this annual tournament, the standards and results have improved dramatically.

Earlier this evening, you heard president Bob Buchan refer to the amount of work that has already been done in relation to the staging

of the 1981 Australian Championships.

A number of specialist sub-committees have been created, and are well advanced with the detailed planning for what will be the biggest shooting tournament Australia has ever seen.

This brings me to a vital point and a matter of deep concern to all sports administrators. There seems to be a a growing tendency to concentrate many major functions onto one pair of shoulders. A good example is Laurie Connors, who, apart from being vicepresident of the Victorian Clay Target Association is National vicepresident, member of the Management Committee, chairman of the International Sub-committee, and a member of the Working Party investigating likely sites for the establishment of our national head-

Does this seem a fair distribution of the work load? It is my firm belief that this problem is of major importance - especially at a club level. We must spread the work load more evenly - involve more of our younger people.

One of the big benefits to accrue from spreading the workload will

be that decisions will be more representative.

At the present time, management decisions too often reflect the opinions only of experienced competitors. This occurs because we always look for the most successful or most popular person for election to committees.

This can be self-defeating, as the resulting decisions are based on the thinking of top rating shooters - perhaps a sprinkling of fresh untried ideas directed at encouraging novices should be developed. We have a better chance of getting these ideas from people in that category. This suggestion is just as valid at State Council level as it is at club level. Another bonus comes from the fact that the younger men and women are very enthusiastic and energetic.

We started this talk by using the word "challenge". One of the most important challenges confronting all sports and particularly

clay-busting, is the matter of communications.

We often use this term without fully understanding its meaning. Its meaning is defined in the dictionary as "imparting or exchange of information". In practical terms, it means "The Accurate Transmission of Information".

Another vital point point to realise is that communicating is only successful if the receiver of a message gets the same "vibes" or meaning as that given by the sender.

Communications is a word which covers a wide range of specific

In relation to sports, it affects almost the whole operation — from the media right through the administrative, technical and development areas, down to the relatively lowly but nevertheless vitally important chat around the bar, after the match.

One of the things that is disturbing to management is the very common Australian habit of "knocking". It is quite evident in our sport, and when one considers the subject in the context of communications, can be very destructive.

Imagine the effect of 10,500 clay busters all telling of the enjoy-

ment they derive from their challenging recreation.

If this happened, I suspect that the progresssive clubs would be inundated with membership applications from people falling over themselves to try this rewarding activity.

Another productive area of communications is that of public speaking. Our sport has an unlimited potential for providing speakers to groups such as school councils, Apex, Rotary, Lions, radio and T.V., sports talk programs, sportsmen association dinners the list is almost limitless.

The theme remains the same - if we discipline ourselves to constructively promote the shooting sports, especially clay target shooting, almost every social situation becomes a public relations stage.

So far, we have talked about only external communications (very

briefly, at that)!

Equally as important, if not more so is the subject of internal communications. The transmission of thoughts is very much a two way deal - communications must be up and down!.

All organizations are heavily dependent upon the human element for success. The standard of that success reflects the humans' ability to make decisions, and that ability depends on the quality and quantity of information available.

Clay Target Shooting has recently undergone a national restructure which seeks to improve the channels of internal communications. It is now up to humans to take advantage of these new avenues and provide better data to the various levels of decision making.

One of the needs of all sporting groups, including clay busting is to speed up decision-making. In this way, communications can be accelerated, and we can be first to take advantage of whatever opportunity is available.

There is a need at Club, Zone, State and National levels to create a core group which can make urgent decisions outside of general and

committee meetings. These groups can easily be formed, can be given certain powers

by Committee resolution, and then must be backed by the club, Zone or State Committee. All Club and Zone secretaries should develop an ability to answer

all "day to day type" correspondence promptly. This creates an "active" image for the sport, which is important. Just this one move

can lead to a chain reaction of accelerated activity.

A very real threat to the association's new "Club-Zone-State-National" structure exists in the form of constipation of the communications pipeline through each level of authority waiting for an official meeting before action is taken on all matters.

Naturally, there are some matters which cannot be handled except by a meeting, but even in these cases, prior discussion will result in more efficient decision making.

Reporting is of vital importance - for example; each club delegate at this meeting has a heavy responsibility to report the proceedings to his club committee - yet how many of you have really thought about your responsibilities in this way.


One of the greatest communications systems available to you is Clay Target Shooting News. This magazine belongs to the Association's registered shooters and should be better utilized to communicate the good news, from State and Zone Councils to readers, expecially readers from other states.

# FROM THE DESK OF THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN **COACHING DIRECTOR**

Because of the ever increasing costs of shooting, I would like to share with you my thoughts on the value of "DRY PRACTICE".

A few minutes spent every day in gun handling, pointing and muzzle control will, I am certain, improve each and everyone of us.

One of the best excercises I have come across is to stand in front of a full length mirror and in the "Gun Down Position". Then with your eyes closed, shoulder the gun and when you feel that you are in a good shooting position open your eyes. You should find that the image in the mirror points directly back at you. Also you will be able to observe that the main points, such as:-

Are your eyes level.

Are you leaning forward and not sideways etc., are only too obvious. When you can do this 8 times out of 10, I know your shooting will improve, (you may find this exercise harder than you think).

The other great excercise is to shoulder the gun with the right hand only (left hand for left handed shooters) and learn to control

the muzzle, by turning the shoulders.

Add to the above TWO:— A little backyard work on swinging past a point while firing the action (use snap caps) without stopping or hesitating then you will be on the way to better scores which should

lead to more fun.

Always remember shooting should be fun, and surely a little effort to have more fun, particularly for free, must be worthwhile.

# Editor's Mailbox

It was with deep regret that I read "Shooting a Line" by Pat Browne in your August edition of Clay Target Shooting News.

I believe I have a comprehensive knowledge of the whole insidious incident but was isolated from the emotional atmosphere that occurred in the east. For the benefit of your members and the record I would like a few important facts made known.

The present A.S.A. Constitution has a clause which, we now know, will allow ANY of the affiliated bodies to take the decision to be excluded from an A.S.A. resolution. I admit, it was regrettable that ultimately it was a magistrate who had to interpret the clause as being valid in this instance.

At the time of the Canberra "Workshop" every smallbore rifle shooter present, including myself, was stunned by the personal action taken by Ms Hill. The A.S.B.R.A. was officially never involved with Ms Hill's action although we were obviously sympathetic to her motives. The A.S.B.R.A. at their council meeting held only one week prior to the "Workshop" had resolved "that the A.S.B.R.A. discussion and comment be confined to the A.S.A. with prevision for legal advice". It was only after the Workshop and the A.S.A. meeting that the A.S.B.R.A.'s legal action was contemplated and considered necessary.

I personally believe that had the A.S.A. been as united as the national athletics or swimming bodies, both multi-disciplined sports such as ours, then maybe this nationally emotional decision of boycott would have been resolved likewise — left to the personal conviction and conscience of each competitor. Had this been the decision it appears that the A.S.A. would have only seen one other person (a non participant I believe) attending Moscow.

In view of my opinions of the A.S.A. expressed above I found the opinions of the five national presidents at the "Workshop" amazing but the interpretation of Clay Fredrick's opinions as quoted by Pat Browne was blatant emotional journalism. The statement made in his article "the smallbore man Fredrick, told the conference that shooting organizations with strong administrations were an impediment to the shooting sports" would have been accurate if it read that strong administrations were an impediment to the Australian Shooting Association's development.

Finally, I hope the "Discussion Workshop" was the start of the beginning of an efficient unified A.S.A. for ALL firearm users in Australia. I agree with Graham Dempster when he said "this needs open and honest discussion between disciplines, the A.S.A. and govemment". Owen Oliver



Consequently, the task of developing and improving the sport in this state should be much, much easier than say, Western Australia.

Before closing, I want to briefly touch on the State Coaching Scene. The State Director, George Biggs, and his small band of zone and club coaches seem to be experiencing difficulty in getting the sort of support from Club and Zone Administrators that they require to get the organized novice training program under way.

The VCTA shares the National Policy that there should be a novice training officer or club coach at every club in the state (and fully accredited), before the end of 1980.

Please encourage your club to push this project as hard as possible as such a policy guarantees our future growth.

Three days ago, we saw 254 students assembled on this shooting ground. 5000 clay targets were shot at and not one breach of etiquette occurred. That result is the product of a properly constructed novice training policy.

You may be interested to know that the Victorian Ministry of Conservation has convened a seminar to be held at Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology on Saturday, May 10.

All shooting disciplines have been invited to send delegates to this workshop which is the first of a series. The objective is to create the nucleus of a training group which can be used to train secondary teaching staff the fundamentals of safe handling of firearms.

In this way, we can shortly commence "in service" training schemes for teachers who can then introduce hunter safety training as an elective subject at their school.


Imagine the effect on the public image of firearms users in five years time if 80% of secondary school students have been through a program designed to show the right side of firearms use.

We are talking about the challenges of the eighties. Really, the opportunities facing the shooting sports are limitless. Time prevents me from further developing this theme, so I'll finish with the thought

"Get your backside into gear! The sky's the limit".

Although place names and dates would have to be changed, the subjects touched on in the address apply virtually to every state, particularly the matters relating to coaching and communications.
