Executive Director's Notes

Happy New Year - on behalf of the staff unit of the Australian Clay Target Association, I wish each reader all the success you are seeking during the year.

If one looks at economic pointers, it could be claimed that 1981 will be a difficult year. Yet, we said the same at the beginning of 1980, but clay target shooting survived and even

prospered during that period.

Still on the subject of economies and progress, 1981 is the third successive year in which the Association has NOT increased registration fees. In that time - that is 1979, 1980 and now 1981 - inflation has done the usual nasty things to operating costs with the results that it appears certain that the Association just broke even in a financial sense in 1980.

Furthermore, a quick look at the financial plan for 1981, which is printed on page 64 of this issue, will show that we

are treading a financial tight rope this year.

Your Executive Committee has undertaken an exhaustive study of the Association's finances, and in co-operation with the Finance Sub-committee, has decided that an increase in

registration fees must be sought for 1982.

The mechanics of such a recommendation require a decision to be made at the 1981 Annual General Meeting. It will be at this meeting, to be held in Melbourne on April 21, that your club representative will be asked to vote on an Executive proposal that the standard registration fee be increased from \$20 to \$30, to become effective in 1982. The recommendation will also make provision for increases in the concessional registration fee with the exception of juniors, where the annual fee will remain at \$1.

Generally, the reaction to the news of the fee increase has been one which reflects the current attitude towards all price

rises - they are an established fact of life!

There is also a relatively small but important number of registered shooters who are opposed to the increase. In the main, the opposition is based on a questioning attitude - one which says "it is all very well to ask the rank and file to pay more, but tell us why.'

This is a healthy and productive approach, and one which management applauds. Hopefully, the answers to the question WHY? will be found in the 1980 financial report (to be circulated to clubs early in 1981) and the financial plan for

Readers are asked to analyse these documents if they have an urge to know what is happening in the expenditure of members' funds. The Executive Committee these days is following a policy of "open management" which gives all registered shooters a voice through the Club-Zone-State-National structure.

Perhaps you feel that money is being spent on projects that are not producing sufficient benefits - if this is so, tell your club committee!

No matter what other factors may apply, the one thing that is certain is that the ACTA will require additional income during 1982 to enable it to continue its development projects,

especially the coaching program.

It is in the area of coaching that the Australian Government has shown its confidence in clay target shooting, and is providing an annual grant of \$22,000 to support the full time employment of a Director of Coaching. The Government has also made a grant of \$5000 this year to assist in the funding of specific coaching projects.

The real issue is that every club member — THROUGH HIS CLUB — has the right to voice an opinion on matters relating to the Association's policies. He (or she) must also recognise that members of the Executive Committee have been elected to

the decision making area.

Getting back to the fee increase it can be explained in practical terms as the equivalent to less than one cartridge a week. That's right — if each shooter saved one factory loaded cartridge a week for fifty weeks, he would have the equivalent to \$10 which is the amount that the recommendation says the fees should go up. Not a lot, is it?

Anyway, the good news is still around us. Planning for the National Championships is well advanced, and the supporting

trade display looks like being most extensive.

The new rules are to be introduced this month. There has been a great deal of input from a variety of sources and the set of rules, in general terms, looks pretty good.

The trap handicapping formula is attracting plenty of attention, and you are asked to give the system a chance to settle in. Any fine tuning that may be necessary can only be undertaken after the bugs have been found.

We hope 1981 is a good year of shooting for you.

FROM THE (VACANT) DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Most readers will have noticed that the December issue of "Clay Target Shooting News" carried an advertisement calling for applications for the position of National Coaching

It can now be announced that the Association's first full-time Director, Newton Thomas retired officially on December 31, 1980.

Newton's health has deteriorated in recent months, and in early December he underwent major heart surgery to replace a faulty valve.

It is pleasing to report that Newton is recuperating and showing good progress. However, under the circumstances,

he felt that he should slow down, and there was no way that he could do this, and still work in Australia's booming sport.

Consequently, the Association now must fill the vacancy. The position has been advertised nationally and overseas, and the Management Committee is hoping to announce the name of the new appointee shortly.

Meanwhile, Newton's performance will be a hard act to follow, and in his term of office (the first few months in an honorary capacity and the balance as a fully fledged staff member) has effectively implemented a novice training program which has now been accepted at level one in the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme. This is a scheme administered by the Australian Government and the Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly.

State Coaching Directors have also played a major role in the development of the Association's coaching schemes.

Newton brought public attention to clay target shooting early in 1980, when he was awarded an ORDER OF AUSTRA-LIA MEDAL for his services to sport.

There are few people in Australia who can match Newton's broad experience in the shooting sports, and his contribution over many years, first during his long service with Eley and more recently with the ACTA, has been enormous.

W.A. GOLD FIND

The sandgropers have struck GOLD! On November 9, Cunderdin Gun Club President John Harris won the 1980 Australian Olympic Trench Championship with a world class score of 191-200 — and won it AT HIS OWN CLUB.

On the same day, at the same location, Ian Hale (of Victoria) won his second successive Australian ISU Skeet title — his score was 194 to give him a clear victory over second place-getter John Summers, also of Victoria.

A total of sixty two competitors contested the two matches — forty in the trap, and twenty two in the skeet. Quite possibly, the match would have attracted more interstate visitors, but the effects of the airline refuellers strike not only were sufficient to deter people from attending BUT ALSO SERIOUSLY DELAYED THE RETURN of those who did travel from the eastern states.

However, for those who were stranded, the hospitality of the Western Australians was a real bonus.

The matches were held at the Cunderdin Gun Club where the facilities and equipment were of world standard. The club members have put in an enormous amount of time, money and effort, and now have a facility valued at over \$80,000, and one of the best in Australia.

The National titles (Olympic Trench and ISU Skeet) were programmed to span three days — November 7, 8 and 9. Practice was available on Thursday, November 6.

Interstate visitors who arrived early had made their way to Cunderdin from Perth (a distance of 160 kilometres) by varied means including the use of a ten passenger bus kindly made available AT NO CHARGE by the Ford Motor Company of Australia

New South Wales was represented by Deserie Huddleston, Cliff Bailey and Vic Flower (Vic was in the last stages of a round Australia holiday); ACT was represented by Jim Ellis; Jim Briggs attended from Hobart, Tasmania; National Vice President Laurie Connors, John Summers, Ian Hale and Billy Iles travelled from Victoria; South Australia was represented by Ross Ritchie, and the balance of the field was made up by Western Australian shooters.

(Probably the travelling highlight was created by the colourful Billy Iles, who, with wife Michelle and family **drove** from the east to Cunderdin for the tournament — at least Bill didn't have any worries over aircraft delays!)

Practice day was hot, with the club being a hive of industry as the last touches were put to the first-rate preparation of the facilities.

THE ELEY REPORT



DUCK SEASON 1981

Everyone seems to be concerned about the coming Duck Season, especially as there will be shortages in northern and western New South Wales, but the scene in Victoria and South Australia is much brighter.

ELEY has always been, obviously, vitally involved in the Season as our Blue Star No. 4 has been, for many years, the top-selling duck cartridge.

For 1981 our major theme will be responsible shooting. If the sport is to continue as it should, it is important duck shooters are all educated as to gun care and duck recognition — particularly protected varieties.

Consequently, a "Know Your Duck" poster has been prepared in conjunction with the Fisheries and Wild Life Department. This will be printed in full colour and is available upon request.

As well, a series of double page advertisements, in two colours, are to be published to encourage duck recognition in half-light by outline and shape.

Then there will be sets of 12 Drink Coasters on sale at subsidised prices. For \$5 or less, 12 different ducks are featured in full colour. On the other side will be printed their names and full descriptions. This way shooters can test their ability to recognise the difference between legitimate or protected species at a glance.

All the more reason for us to join the fight with the majority of the Shooting Associations and Traders to prevent the I.A.C. from accepting the submissions of our main competition, who are seeking general rises from 21% to 30%. This is an expensive sport already. We should all be doing our utmost to keep prices down, especially against artificial rises caused by government taxes via tariff protections.

Scores were moderate during practice with most of the locals watching the interstate "imports" very closely. Trap shooters Billy Iles and Jim Ellis added a bit of life to proceedings, and also provided some entertainment on the skeet field.

OLYMPIC TRENCH MATCH

Friday, November 7 was the first day of the championships and the trap match was due to start at 8.30 a.m. Shoot Marshal Kevin Hopkins assembled the O.T. (Olympic Trench) shooters at the appointed hour, and showed them a full series of targets.

One target in particular drew a sharp intake of breath from the shooters as it sped left and high extremely sharply. It was obvious that "program five" was not regarded as one of the easiest available.

The first squad consisted of National Vice-President Laurie Connors, C. Hyder, T. Harris, J. Hopkins, R. Herridge and S. Wilson. Herridge was quickly into stride and scored 22, while Harris mustered a 21.

Other creditable scores in the first round included Geoff Hayward's 24 (Geoff is WACTA President) Billy Iles 23, Jim Neve with 24, John Harris (23) and Roy Holtfreter (24).

Three rounds (75 targets) were completed on the first day, and at the close of shooting, local hero John Harris was one target ahead of international star Jim Ellis, Billy Iles and Roy Holtfreter, who were tied on 69.

Ellis had shot the only 25 of the day, and even 24's had proved to be most elusive.

The second day of the OT match, Saturday November 8, was again very hot with a light breeze. Some competitors in early squads had difficulty in seeing the target exit from the trench because of sun glare making the target blend into the stone-dust background.

The difficulty occurred only at a particular time and on only one or two targets in the program — all connected with the angle of the sun.

Overnight leader John Harris produced a 25 in his first visit of the day, and extended his lead to two targets over Ellis, who could manage only a 24. Iles and Holtfreter slipped to 21's and this lapse cost them any real chance of challenging the

Kalgoorlie competitor Jim Neve was providing pretty tough competition and added three 24's to his first day aggregate of 67 to have 139 against his name at the 150 mark.

Harris added 24 and 23 in the next two rounds to close on 142 at the end of the second day. Hes shot a brilliant 25 in the third round for an aggregate of 138, and Ellis had 140 on the

Executive Committee member Robin Bailey who was competing in both matches, was showing remarkable stamina, and shot 70 (23, 23, 24) on the second day for a progress score of 137, with Executive colleague Roy Holtfreter on 135. At this stage Roy was leading in "B" grade, while in "C" grade, a great tussle for the lead was developing between T. Harris (Cunderdin) on 129 and Ross Ritchie (South Australia) on 127.

By the end of the second day, visiting competitors were starting to feel the combined effects of the marathon match AND the heat, and it was expected that the final 50 targets would provide some surprises.

Many of the "experts" were saying that the greater experience of some of the interstate competitors would overshadow the early "luck" of the locals.







To completely wreck such predictions, John Harris shot 24, 25 on the third day to completely demoralise the rest of the field and chalk up a winning score of 191/200.

Jim Neve shot 23 in the second last round to total 162 with one round to go. With a strong chance of a 1-2 result for W.A. Billy Iles also turned into the last stanza with an aggregate of 162, so the minor placings were to provide an exciting finish.

To add further excitement, all were in the last squad so a real cliff hanger was guaranteed. Iles showed unusual brittleness when he dropped his first TWO targets, and in a most uncharacteristic display, Ellis allowed his first target to escape unscathed. (Whoever wrote the script for this finish would rival the genius of Alfred Hitchcock!).

James Neve missed his eighth and eleventh targets - this made his chances of filling second place pretty remote, but he was still showing remarkable talent.

Ellis had another lapse on his fourteenth and was followed by Iles whose fifteenth target joined the earlier two he had missed.

Then, the whole world caved in on the youngster, Neve, who lost five of his last ten targets, while Ellis and Iles steadied to run home without further error.

So the overall placings finished as:

1981 Australian O.T. Champion and Gold Medal Winner

John Harris 191-200 187-200

Runner Up and Silver Medal Winner - Jim Ellis Third and Bronze Medal Winner - Bill Iles 184-200

In "A" grade, Jim Neve (180) had been edged out to first place by the consistent Robin Bailey, who aggregated 181 for the match. Vic Flower was third on 175, after recovering from a disastrous first two rounds of 19, 20.

The "B" grade section had been a most exciting contest throughout the whole match, and resulted in a win to the hard-working Roy Holtfreter, who scored 175, Second was Murray Alexander, 173, and third was the popular President of WACTA, Geoff Hayward on 171.

Young T Harris had looked safe in "C" grade until the last round when his 21 let the experienced Ross Ritchie in, and his 24 was good enough to snatch victory.

I.S.U. SKEET MATCH

The Australian 1981 I.S.U. Skeet Championship attracted a field of twenty-two competitors. The entry list included the two Eastern States "hotshots" Ian Hale and John Summers. However, tremendous support came from local shooters, and it was encouraging to see the level of enthusiasm for this extremely difficult form of clay busting.

As was the case with the trench match, 24's were difficult to find, and only five clean rounds appeared on the score board

during the whole match.

Young enthusiast Jim Neve started well with a 21 in the first squad of the match, and in the second, Grant Hyder carded 23. Robin Bailey racked up a 21, then Summers and Hale shot in squad three to both record 23's. David Kevill got

away to a shaky start with a 19 but made a great recovery to score 23 in his second round.

However, the first day undoubtedly belonged to Jules Steiner. First, he saw a life-time dream reach fruition when the first shot of an Australian Olympic discipline clay target championship in Western Australia was fired. Secondly, he saw it all happen on a club that he has maintained an interest

Thirdly, Steiner scored 21, 23, 22 to aggregate 66 for the day and found himself in equal third slot with Grant Hyder on the progress scoreboard.

Ian Hale shot 25 in his second round, and John Summers carded a clean sheet in his third, and the two hot-shots ended the day just one target apart - Hale on 72 and Summers on 71.

David Kevill overnighted on 64, one target behind Clayton Hyder. Jim Neve failed to hold his starting form and crashed to a 17 in the second round, followed by a 22 to aggregate 60 for the first day.

Bill Kennamer, Clayton Hyder and Kevin Hopkins comprised a short first squad on the second day. All three had performed very creditably the previous day, but had difficulty coping with the early start. All scored less than 20, to greatly diminish a chance of a placing.

Hale moved two targets further ahead of Summers in their first 25 of the day, and then each shot 24 and 25 in the next two rounds.

After two more good rounds, Steiner apparently allowed the excitement of the official opening to upset his concentration and could manage only 16 in the third round for his aggregate at the 150 mark to be 123.

David Kevill was looking good with 23 and 24 but a 19 in the third left his aggregate showing as 130. W. Jones showed excellent poise for a C grader when he shot a 23 in his first detail, and added 18 and 19 to be sitting on 116 going into the last day.

Jim Neve had a more consistent day, recording 22, 21 and 20 to have a progress total of 123. Popular local, Bob Thompson, who was acting as host to some of the Eastern states visitors, started the day well with 21, but faded to 15 and 18 in the next two rounds.

John Kevill was performing very consistently in B grade, and at the last turn, was tied with Clayton Hyder, who had a commanding margin of nine targets.

In "C" grade, Jim Neve was well clear (123) of Kevin Hopkins (120) and W. Jones (116).


Going into the final 50, Hale had a break of four targets over rival John Summers, and was shooting brilliantly. It would have taken a miracle for John Summers to have any

show of winning. Each shot 24 in the second last round, then Hale wrapped the match up with a clean last round — match aggregate of 194 and a world class score.

David Kevill continued his steady performance, and his final day score of 21, 23 gave him a match aggregate of 174,

good enough to secure third place overall.

"B" grade was still tight for the minors, although Grand Hyder's total of 170 had given him victory, John Kevill eventually conceded second place to Clayton Hyder, whose score of 167 was two targets better than John's.

Jules Steiner finished a clear winner in "A" grade with a match score of 160, having recorded 19 and 18 on the final

day.

The enthusiasts in "C" grade continued to fight it out, and the final scores showed Jim Neve (166) four targets ahead of Kevin Hopkins (162) with W. Jones filling third place on 152.

It had been a most exciting match, with the facilities and targets of international standard. Very hot weather had had a debilitating effect on many of the contestants, especially in cases where the shooter was competing in BOTH matches.

OFFICIAL OPENING

The official opening of the 1980 Australian Olympic discipline championship was performed by Member of Parliament Mr Norm Baxter.

In a ceremony which was staged in the afternoon of the second day, and which attracted strong support from local council and other dignitaries, Mr Baxter reminded the audience that the Cunderdin Gun Club had re-located on land which originally belonged to his family. As a consequence he felt a close affinity with the club, and was delighted to have the chance to open the first ever Nationals (in these disciplines) in Western Australia.

It was obvious from Mr Baxter's address that he had researched his subject well, as he traced the history of the club from its start in 1952. Mr Baxter placed heavy emphasis on the club's self help programs and highlighted the fact that few

Other guests in the official part included Mr Ray McPharlin M.L.A. (Club Patron), Mr Laurie Reynolds (Cunderdin Shire President), Mr Laurie Connors (Vice President. Australian Clay Target Association) and Mr Geoff Hayward (President, Western Australian Clay Target Association.)

As the match ended, and the presentation of trophies was taking place, competitors and spectators realised that they had just been part of a history making occasion. Many firsts were recorded, and the Committee and members of the host



The ground had been beautifully prepared by the Club President, Noel Dwight and his Committee and many shooters commented on the way in which the shoot was presented.



AUSTRALIA SUCCESSFUL IN THAILAND INTERNATIONAL

Australia's skeet and trap team has just returned after successfully competing in the first Thailand International Clay Target Championships.

The match was staged at the Hua Mark sports stadium, located about seven kilometres from the centre of Bangkok.

The official team was headed by Bob Buchan (Melbourne) and included Graeme Boyd (Albury), John Maxwell (Woollongong), Ray Collinson (Townsville) and Greg Long (Melbourne).

Other Australians to compete in the match were Alex Crikis, Peter Blackmore, Tom Lucas, Graham Ash, Bill Iles (all of Melbourne) and Stan Collins of Bairnsdale.

A "scratch" skeet team was formed, and consisted of Alex Crikis, Graeme Boyd, Peter Blackmore and Bill Iles. These four shot brilliantly to win the Gold Medal with a score of 561/600, eight points ahead of Japan which won the Silver

Alex Crikis went on to win the Gold Medal in the individual event, scoring a world class 192. Boyd finished on 190, and Blackmore on 188.

In the trap match (Olympic Trench), an official Australian team, consisting of John Maxwell, Greg Long, Ray Collinson and Graeme Boyd, was beaten for the Silver Medal by a team, entered by Frankston-Australian Gun Club after a countback was used to break a tied score of 490.

The Australians found difficulty in shooting consistent scores under tricky conditions.

The Trap Teams' Match was won by Japan (524/600), second was Frankston-Australian Gun Club, and, because of a regional policy restricting medal awards to one per entrant nation, the Bronze Medal went to Thailand which scored 477.

The results of the individual match were: Gold Medal — M. Obara, Japan 186/200 Silver Medal - Lee Kum Cheuk, Singapore 179/200

Bronze Medal — John Maxwell, Australia 176/200. Despite the inconsistency of the trap team members' scores, the project seems to have been a total success. Manager Bob Buchan said on arrival back in Australia that he was extremely proud of his "boys" performance, and went on "in addition to being great competitors. they have been very

active ambassadors for our great nation!'

It was a weary but happy squad that arrived at Sydney Airport late on Monday December 15, after a series of frustrating setbacks had delayed their return by twenty four



RAAF RETAINS ARMED FORCES TRAP SHOOTING SHIELD

On Thursday 13 November 1980, the RAAF played host to the Navy and Army trap shooting teams at the RAAF Gun Club, RAAF Base Point Cook, Victoria. The occasion was the 1980 Inter-Service trap shoot for the IMI Shield, a perpetual trophy originally donated by the now ELEY AMMUNITION organization way back in 1935. Due to the efforts of the groundsmen and the Gun Club Committee members, the picturesque shooting grounds and surrounds were in immaculate condition. Unfortunately, nothing could be done about the weather and the squads lined up for the first round on the hottest November day for 14 years and in a strong northerly wind gusting up to 35 knots. Practice in the morning had indicated that the targets were going to be quite difficult and conditions had worsened by the afternoon.

At the end of the 5 target eye-opener, it appeared that home ground familiarity would favour the RAAF when they turned in a score of 29/30 to Army's 24/30 and Navy down to 20/30. However in round two, the start of the IMI Shield Competition, both Navy and Army served notice that they were not about to give in easily and all three teams carded a 26/30. Round three showed Navy beginning to trail a little when they dropped seven targets but Army and RAAF kept the pressure on with a 28/30 each to remain level. It was not until the final round that RAAF eventually drew clear with another very well shot 28/30. Army could not improve on 25/30 and Navy continued to trail with a struggling 24/30.

Army were second with a fairly close 79/90 and Navy were third on 72/90. These were not record scores but all shooters are to be commended on a very fine and consistent performance under extremely difficult conditions.

Only two possibles were recorded and after a short shoot-off Warrant Officer John Powell managed to regain some prestige for the Army team, and the Individual High Gun award for himself, by holding off Corporal Allan Forc of the RAAF.

In the final event of the day, an invitation handicap for all shooters and guests, the Navy too claimed some of the kudos when Chris Carroll, long time Navy shooter and now ex-Service manager of the Navy team, won over Sergeant Phil Baldock and Corporal Jim Crosbie, both of the RAAF, with a very respectable 37/38 considering the still very blustery conditions. A fitting end to a fine day of competition highly enjoyed by both the competitors and the quite large crowd of spectators and supporters. This report would not be complete however, without recording the sincere thanks of both the participants and the guests for the fine efforts of the Point Cook Base catering staff and the individual contribution of Mr Rob Schwarz of WINCHESTER AUSTRALIA who served as the official referee for the entire competition.

LIBERAL/COUNTRY PARTY POLICY INITIATIVES IN SPORT

In the period leading up to the recent election, the Government proposed a number of major initiatives in sport which would add to the already proud record it had in this area. The present Government had already stamped itself as having done more for sport than any other previous Federal Government.

The Minister for Home Affairs, Mr Bob Ellicott, in a recent statement, said, "The implementation of these initiatives will mean that there is a comprehensive program at the Federal level designed to promote excellence in sport. These initiatives would build on to and extend the impact of the Government's other sport programs. Of particular significance in this regard are the Australian Institute of Sport. The Sports Development Program and The National Coaching Accreditation Scheme."

International Standard Sports Facilities

Mr Ellicott said that, as announced in the Prime Minister's speech, the Government would provide over the next three years. \$25m on a dollar for dollar basis towards the development of international standard facilities for the States and Territories. These facilities will be planned and constructed in co-operation with each State or Territory Government concerned.

On the basis of what the Government believes are the existing priorities of those Governments, these facilities would include:

New South Wales — a multi-purpose indoor

sports hall;

Victoria — an equestrian centre

and a hockey field:
 a shooting complex

Queensland — a shooting complex South Australia — an indoor aquatic centre:

Western Australia — a ballistics complex:

Tasmania — a rowing and canoeing

course:

Northern Territory - a multi-purpose indoor

sports hall.

The Government will also construct the track for an international standard motor racing circuit in the Australian Capital Territory.

Mr Ellicott said that the lack of adequate international standard facilities had been drawn to the Government's attention by the Recreation Minister's Council, the Sports Advisory Council and the Confederation of Australian Sport.

"The provision of these facilities will enable our athletes to train on a similar basis to their overseas competitors and avoid situations where they compete in international competitions with equipment or in localities they are unused to. Moreover, it would enable Australia to be more successful in attracting international competitors," Mr Ellicott said.

Australian National Games

Mr Ellicott said that it was important that Australian athletes engage in high level competition within Australia. To facilitate this objective the Government would provide funds in co-operation with the States for the holding of Australian Games with a view to their commencing in 1983 on a biennial basis.

It is envisaged that the Games would rotate between the States and Territories. The Government would continue discussions with the States and Territories and sporting bodies on how the Games will be

organised and run.

In 1981 the Government would, as a forerunner to Australia Games, provide \$200,000 for the holding of special games at Brisbane using the facilities constructed for the 1982 Commonwealth Games. This will enable the facilities at Brisbane to be given a trial run and also present potential members of the Australian Commonwealth Games team with an opportunity for top level competition.

National Athlete Award Scheme

Mr Ellicott said that the National Athlete Award Scheme is designed to help our athletes to stay at the top. It will provide awards which will reimburse them for the costs of such things as training and competition, travel and living expenses, and the costs of specialised coaching and equipment. It will be restricted to world ranked athletes.

-Mr Ellicott said that up to \$150,000 would be made available in 1980-81 for the scheme.

"The actual grants to be made each year will depend upon the number of athletes who have attained world ranking, the training programs each athlete submits, and the funds available."

Mr Ellicott said that recently he had made the first award under this scheme to top Australian swimmer. Michelle Ford.

Pre-Event Training Funds

Mr Ellicott said that the provision of pre-event training funds by the Government for the Commonwealth Games and the Olympic Games had proved to be successful in raising the performance standards of Australian athletes in such events.

"The Government would provide further funds for pre-event training for the Commonwealth Games in 1982 and the Olympic

Games in Los Angeles in 1984."

Mr Ellicott said that in 1980-81 the Government would provide \$115,000 to assist Australian athletes in pre-event training for the Commonwealth Games. Further funds would be provided in 1981-82 for this purpose.

North East Zone: 37/50 South West Zone: 31/50 North Central Zone: 37/50


Therefore, we have come up with a tie.

CUNDERDIN — CAPITAL CITY OF AUSTRALIA'S INTERNATIONAL DISCIPLINES

The 1980 Australian Championships in Olympic Trench and ISU Skeet were held at Cunderdin Gun Club (known as CMT Gun Club - which stands for Cunderdin, Meckering and

Cunderdin is a relatively small but very active farming community about 160 kilometres east of Perth. The popula-

tion is less than 2000 people.

Tammin) over November 7 to 9.

The championships were an exciting experience for all concerned, particularly the Western Australians. Not only was the tournament the culmination of ten years of solid work by some dedicated people, but a number of Western Australian names appeared in the results summary.

Early in the 1970's, Jules Steiner (well known in international shooting circles) started trying to convince people that a need existed in Western Australia for a top standard

Olympic Trench and ISU Skeet facility.

His vision was not shared by too many others, so in 1976, Mr Steiner created a new club known as the International Skeet and Trap Club, and proceeded to look for a suitable site for a range.

Meanwhile, he had become a valued adviser to the Cunderdin Gun Club committee, which was showing a deep interest

in expanding the club's facilities.

Consequently, late in 1977, a decision was made to completely remodel the club's layout, which then consisted of two DTL fields and one standard skeet field.

The new layout was to include an Olympic Trench, two DTL fields, and two ISU Skeet fields. While this may seem lavish for a club with such a limited potential "market", the courageous committee showed a remarkable faith in its ability to attract visiting competitors, provided that the facilities were of the highest standard.

An order was placed overseas for Spieth equipment, and working bees were organised to commence the site works.

Some unbelievable things happened during the next few months. The Kevill brothers supplied a portable concrete batching plant, some of the biggest earth moving plant in the area "mysteriously" appeared at the gun club, and club's small but effective band of workers dug and spread and carried and poured, and did all the other things that must be done whenever a club is being established.

President John Harris kept a firm eye on progress, and ensured that expenditure was controlled within budget. Substantial funding assistance had been obtained from the banking system, for which club members had provided

guarantees.

Then in 1978, the next piece of the jig-saw fell into place when the equipment arrived from overseas. Valued at around \$27,000 the order included seventeen self cocking hopper fed O.T. traps (the two spares can be used on a skeet field) and two hopper fed, auto loading skeet traps, plus scrambler timers and ancillary equipment.

The trench is fully concreted with a semi-cantilevered roof, with the traps located on two slotted rails, which makes for quick change-over when necessary. The skeet trap houses are fully bricked and can be used for either standard or ISU skeet.


The Spieth equipment has proved to be so satisfactory that the club has recently bought more traps to be used in the conventional DTL fields.

When it was announced that the 1980 Olympic discipline nationals were to be held at the club, a new phase of the

development was triggered off.

This stage included the spreading of 1000 tons of crushed metal to fill the ground, carpeting of the roomy clubhouse, provision of a canopy over the trench shooting stations and erection of a verandah, complete with concrete floor, on the clubhouse.

Initially, the squad will cater only for Olympic Trench and ISU Skeet and will be based at Cunderdin.







THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP UNIVERSAL TRENCH — A WORM'S EYE VIEW.

This is my fourth attempt at an article which always turns out not only giving the impression that I am 'knocking' the Australian system but that I also qualify for the appellation been shooting five minutes and he knows it all'.

It is somehow comforting to know that no-one knows more about his opponents' clout than the horizontal heavyweight, and being a perpetual 'canvas-back' myself, there can be no doubt that my perspective will be different. To continue in the 'stumblebum' theme and throw some muck about with a 'bloody shovel' might just help fertilise the odd seed.

F.I.T.A.S.C. organises a world championship in Universal Trench which is open to all visitors and the hosts eliminate to make up a comfortable number. This Championship pays good dividends down to the 30th. place and I anticipated that many top shots would shoot for themselves thereby leaving places in National teams for the 'blooding' of some new talent. For once I was right and Giovanetti, the Olympic champion and Baldi, the defending champion appeared on their own. Similarly Peter Croft was not in the British team and a couple of youngsters were given a go. (In a couple of cases they got a right bloody blooding to boot.) Other than a certain amount of fear, no — terror, conjured in my mind by the name Montecatini, wrecker of Australian Trap teams, I was quite unprepared for what I found.

About 250 seemed a comfortable number for the Italian Federation who undertook the organisation. About one hundred places were filled by visitors and the balance made up of Italians whose depth of talent I had erroneously been led to discount a little. The Italians had eliminated upon scores from the 'Grand Italia' held at Montecatini the week before and the scoreboard still stood unchanged. Dr. Rossi led me to it and sadistic as most medicos are, enjoyed my gulps and squawks.

In short, some thirty odd squads with a 190 and several 180's in each of them. I cheerfully pointed out that Universal Trench was more difficult and anyway no-one could keep up that standard two weekends running. In fact, Italians filled twentyfive out of the first twentyseven places and pound for pound knocked hell out of their guests. On the average, scores were some 2% down of the O.T. results — which is exactly what Peter Wray has said for years.

As all Australians know it is impossible to convert O.T. to Universal Trench. Someone should have told the Italians because in about thirty minutes by pulling ten traps out of each bunker and inserting a small printed circuit board the change was made. Spring tensions were not altered and angles set on the beautifully maintained hopper fed traps which threw a pretty solid, yellow target the full legal distance.

The 'Maestro' was called in to adjust one trap in each bunker so as to produce the '24' maker'. This target required malevolent genius to set up and is very hard indeed to hit (of course you get it 5 times on Universal) as evidenced by the red devil who pinched my cheek when some hot shot (no less than Baldi) dropped three in a row in practice.

Perhaps my expression 'Red Devil' should be explained. The Italian 'National Executive' are poured into magnificent red shooting jackets by a good tailor. They commanded respect like a Master of Fox Hounds, refereed tirelessly and unobtrusively, yet still found time to make friends and enjoy life. Never to hear a voice raised or a loudspecter bleat was bliss and prompted me to tell Ivo Gotini that his brains were only exceeded by his beauty. Gotini backed towards the wall until he realised that I was both married and hysterical. Quite seriously, I was really impressed, the referees knew the Federation rules as if they used them all the time — which they do of course.

So many shooters towered over my mediocrity that I really lost track for a time. The Olympic Champion clearly meant business and many national groups, unable to compete in Moscow, were all set to knock him off. They did not make it. My money was on one Silvano Basagni, bon vivant, human and from my viewpoint the greatest shooter in the world (as distinct from a clay busting machine). As it happened. Basagni and Giovanetti were tied after 275 targets and 90% of those present were disappointed to see Basagni tie for third place with their National Champion Danna and Marocchi after a difficult last round. Naturally the Italian team destroyed all opposition in spite of a junior shooter having a torrid time.

All this was happening on Universal Trench which is classified as a 'novelty event' and 'dead duck' in Australia. Somehow the message has not reached all those poor Italians who are currently pouring the concrete for even more shooting stands to accommodate both Universal and Olympic Trench. These Northern Italians must be a really wierd lot—they actually enjoy their daily practice and in Bologna alone there are sixteen clubs which own at least one Olympic Trench.

One fully equipped Olympic Trench and two extra bunkers allows three Universal Trenches for a medium size shoot. A simple matter of supply and demand. Probably this is why our teams fail in the inclement Italian environment — they are just not good enough. All this saddens me because I have hit many targets whilst being carried by the great Basagni shooting on my left. This Italian Master nearly impressed me as much as Neil Berry at the 1st. Pacific's; the day Neil picked himself up and shot 147 straight in filthy weather conditions. However there is not a group of Knight errants who will magically and unpractised carry Australia to the Gold medals. Of course we can take the Russian/American alternative and make soldiers of our stars — at the expense of the masses.

Italians are not rich and they only shoot Trench, Universal or Olympic, at a cost that must be minimal and based upon bulk purchases. The main difference is at a fundamental level of shooting philosophy. Italians seem to use their club in its fullest sense by calling most evenings to shoot a round or two and meet their friends. This is a true example of shooting for fun where the only man to beat is the 'Maestro' who sets up the traps. Thus, every day, they practice what George Biggs preaches and programme their mental computers until the vast majority become very good shots indeed.

By contrast, Australians are offered Trench, Skeet, D.T.L. and even exotica; the same day but at substantial expense. (Practice is relatively neglected.) Such is the price of affluence—to be a Jack of all trades and master of none.

To add insult to injury, a controversial team selection is made each year and misery is a subsidised shooter who fails.

The possibility exists that shooting must be accepted for shooting's sake and like most other amateur sports, be rewarded by nominal trophies. Perhaps this might be the key to having fun?

A few hours after leaving Italy we were honoured to be the guests of the Chevalier David de Lossy, President of the Belgian Association who is the inventor of the ZZ's. His ground is meticulously maintained — that word again — and placed on the most windy part of his estate. The fascination of this true Z.Z. shooting was only matched by the Chevalier's 300 year old Chateau which was used by both William of Orange and Louis 14th. when commanding their armies in the field.

The Chateau contains prominent photographs of Mackintosh who is spoken of in the same breath as King George V. There is a reloading device 'temporarily' fixed to a casement after presentation by Mackintosh about a century ago.

When shooting at these Z.Z.'s, I was unusually and spectacularly lucky mangling a considerable series of helices with 36 gram Maionchis. No one was impressed, it was expected and Mackintosh would have done it better! Yet I felt no resentment, present Australian travellers live on the goodwill built up by Mackintosh and his compatriots.

Again speciality is seen, again the shooting for a name written on the club list of Champions and perhaps a little flack from the multi-nationals who see small future from a full fun day on one box of shells.

In England, thanks to the good offices of the C.P.S.A. I attended the preparations for the Grand Prix (Parcours de Chasse). The course was to be entirely new for equities sake and the Trap siting was by Bob Armistead, father of Parcours in England. The day was spent in this expert company with England's National Coach Clarrie Wilson acting as safety officer. Setting up such a course is a specialist occupation. Guaranteeing safety is very difficult and yet again the idea of one or two nearly impossible targets at every station; the key to a happy conclusion.

I was particularly impressed by one constant factor in all these countries. No excuses! There is no dishonour in being beaten by a Trench target at full chat, a Z.Z. on a windy hill or a tree weaving 'battue' target at Parcours de Chasse which travels nearly 200 yards.

In contrast, we Australians must find an excuse when a 'dolly dropper' is clearly missed. Where are we going? Handicap shooting is no longer profitable. Several clubs have the courage to experiment with the apparently retrograde step of A.T.A. shooting. Indeed, the challenge of the 80's is for D.T.L. to survive. On the subject of D.T.L.: Italians: 'what is that?' Clarrie Wilson: 'For old ladies and little boys.' Famous English Gun: 'Shot 100 straight again last week and came no-where (for the last time.)

Belgian view: 'I remember D.T.L. a few years ago'. A Frenchman: 'D.T.L. - What is this?'. C.P.S.A. salaried executive: 'D.T.L. persists as a function of overall growth in new areas. Generally the percentage of D.T.L. adherents is dropping as the beginners mature to accept the challenge of a difficult discipline.' Naturally, all these people except the last mentioned, were biased either by genuine ignorance of D.T.L. or by the commitment to a speciality.

Perhaps most rewarding for me were the regular meetings with the international administrative leaders of our sport. Naturally, very high level talent is retained by both the I.S.U. and F.I.T.A.S.C.; on the shot-gun council of the former and the directorate of the latter. I was very impressed by the altruism and patience devoted to the theme of international unity whatever the flag. Olympic or non Olympic, being 'trooped' at the time. Unfortunately interdisciple respect, like charity, begins at home.

Pat Browne once wrote along the lines that international shooting was a lusty infant in Australia. This is journalistic licence of course. Actually Australian international trapshooting is a cranky teenager - just look at its parents! I have only been interviewed once by a journalist upon the subject of Trapshooting. My published opinion was that Australia should not send a team of shooters to the next world championships (U.I.T. or F.I.T.A.S.C. — the management is the same) but rather a team of administrators; perhaps selected by the shooters! Perhaps it behoves good 'parents' to go to enormous lengths to establish the true interests of their charges. Perhaps there is even a case for the 'National Ground' - dozens of them.

"Maybe I shouldn't tell you this but word's going around town that your boss chases girls. And at his age yet. He's about eighty, isn't he?'

"That he is." replied his secretary. "Let him chase girls. Dogs chase cars all the time but when they catch one. can they drive it?'


1980 VICTORIAN TRADE DAY DISAPPOINTS



A.S.A.'S BATTLE SCARS ON MEND

(Staff Writer)

After six months of bloody battle, the Australian Shooting Association is on its way back to health.

At the 1980 Annual General Meeting of the Association, which was held in Canberra on November 29, many of the divisive issues which have arisen in recent months were addressed by delegates in a frank and responsible way.

Chairman, Peter Papps, maintained a tight control over the meeting at which the Australian Clay Target Association was represented by its National President, Ron Porter and the Executive Director.

Papps was first elected as ASA President in 1976, after representing clay target shooting for a period! At the election of office bearers at the recent meeting, he was returned unopposed after having made it clear to delegates that he would require a much greater level of support and assistance if he was to continue.

The position had become very demanding, especially in view of the Olympic Games boycott (which came perilously close to destroying the ASA), the continuing problems connected with the shooting section of the 1982 Commonwealth Games program, and the natural growth which has occurred in the administrative work load of all shooting disciplines.

Much of the early part of the meeting was consumed by efforts to untangle the mess created by actions taken earlier in the year by the Australian Small Bore Rifle Association. Although that body obviously believed it was acting in the best interests of its members, there seemed to be remarkably little control over what some of its leading administrators and athletes said publicly.

Interestingly, the ASBRA has had a change of chief executive, and Mr Clay Federick of Sydney has taken the place of the previous incumbent Mr David Hillan.

Probably, the greatest disappointment to come out of the meeting was to find that the sub-committee which was created to look into the possibility of restructuring the ASA to reflect the opinions expressed at the 1980 Shooting Sports Discussion Workshop, had no report to present.

Even worse was the fact that the sub-committee, which is headed by Clay Frederick, had not held its first meeting. This rather disinterested attitude is a serious rebuff to the 110 delegates representing ALL facets of the shooting sports. who, at the Discussion Workshop, caused a unanimous resolution that a broadening of the base was not only necessary but URGENT! Obviously, the sub-committee didn't get the message.

As a consequence of this set-back, the Council of the ASA has formed a Management Committee which consists of the President, Vice President (Mr David Watts of the Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia), Secretary (Mrs Carolyn Anderson) and one other member (for 1981 it will be the ACTA's Executive Director). The first task that has been allocated to the Management Committee is to complete the task of defining a possible restructure plan. A deadline of January 25, 1981 has been set.

Another subject, on which a great deal of spirited debate occurred was the matter of funding the upgrade of the Brisbane shooting facilities in readiness for the 1982 Commonwealth Games

The scenario has become so complex that it is now very difficult to define areas of responsibility. About the only certainty is that time has defeated the shooting sports, in the sense that every effort was being made to have the revamped facilities ready for an international match, originally planned for October 2, 3 and 4, 1981.

The match will still be held, but on a vastly reduced scale, and on the comparatively primitive equipment which is currently installed. Naturally, the invitation list will have to be severely pruned.

On the subject of overseas competition, Government financial assistance has been made available, which is sufficient to allow the nominated 1980 Olympic shooting squad (excluding small bore rifle shooters, as this discipline was represented. at the Moscow Olympics) to compete in Mexico in March as an alternative competition to the Olympics.

The match that has been selected will be held in Mexico City, and is known as the Benito Juarez Tournament. It is a match that attracts a large international entry and has the reputation of being one of the best shooting tournaments in the

The squad will train at the American Army Advanced Marksmanship Unit of Fort Benning, for a week before the

An exciting future now lies ahead of the Australian Shooting Association, PROVIDED THAT ALL AFFILIATES PRODUCE A GREATER EFFORT. The opportunity to appoint a full time administrator must be taken up (the Australian Government has made a \$49,000 grant to facilitiate such an appointment over the next two years).

The Q.C.T.A. consists of registered clubs in Queensland. The State has been divided into four zones. Each zone has its own Executive elected from clubs within its zone - three delegates from each zone make up the State Executive.

All Commonwealth and State Championships are allocated to the zones. The zone council then allocates these to the clubs, (usually at a meeting). Clubs must make an effort to have a delegate attend all meetings, putting forward your ideas or constructive criticism. In this way, it is brought to the attention of the Zone and State Executives, thus obtaining the maximum benefit from the Association.


