

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

WOW! Has clay target shooting arrived!

Let's look at the list of achievements in the sport over recent weeks.

Mexico — Benito Juarez International Tournament, which is one of the world's top tournaments, saw Jim Ellis win a Gold Medal in the Olympic Trap event.

His team mates also shot well. Rumbel carded 192 in trap and Hale 191 in skeet.

Meanwhile, back home, the Australian Trap and Skeet Championships were conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club in Victoria and attracted over a thousand individual contestants.

Included in the list of competitors were contingents from America and New Zealand, and a sole entry from New Caledonia.

The extent of media coverage for the tournament was also a record. National television news reported some of the action, and personalities featured regularly in newspaper and radio reports.

To a large extent, this was due to the professionalism displayed by the tournament Publicity Manager, Pat Browne, who worked tirelessly to provide all the necessary data.

Soon after the conclusion of the Nationals, which was celebrated at a top class dinner dance held at a swanky Melbourne restaurant, the Executive Committee elected Laurie Connors as the 1981 President. Roy Holtfreter is his deputy.

Laurie has twice previously been National President, in an acting capacity, and therefore comes to the top office with a great deal of experience.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL NUMBER ONE

Late in 1979, the Association's Executive Committee decided to introduce a premier award which could best be described as "the knighthood of clay-busting".

It was named THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL, and was to be awarded to people whose contribution to the development of the sport was of the greatest value. No specific guidelines

were set as to the category of person to whom awards would be made, because the general feeling was that valuable contributions could be made at any level.

The **maximum** number of awards to be made annually was set at three, to protect the integrity of the Medal. 1980 was the first year in which nominee's for the Medal were considered, and a decision was made to make **no** presentations in that year.

Then, earlier this year, immediately following the tragic death of Ron Porter during his term as National President, the Management Committee met urgently and declared that the Presidential Medal Number One should be awarded to Ron Porter posthumously.

The basis for the award was the total and completely unselfish dedication Ron had shown to the development of clay target shooting since he first accepted the challenge of clay target shooting in the early sixties.

Since that time Ron Porter occupied many important administrative positions, from Club level right through to senior government committees.

At the time of his death, Ron Porter had some unfinished projects still on his plate, amongst which was the matter of the 1982 Commonwealth Games shooting events. Another was his driving desire to further expand a "national identity" within the Australian Clay Target Association.

Despite these "unfinished" projects, Ron's track record was a very impressive document, and left the Management Committee in no doubt as to the decision regarding the Medal. (Most of the story of Ron Porter's contribution appeared in the Memorial Supplement which was included in the April issue of Clay Target Shooting News.)

However, the next problem was to decide how to handle the presentation of the Medal to the Porter family. The answer to this problem was found when advice was received that Mrs Muriel Porter and her family were planning to attend the 1981 Australian Trap and Skeet Championships.

Agreement was reached that the presentation would be made during the Prizegiving Banquet, which was held at a leading Melbourne restaurant at the conclusion of the championships.

Part way through the presentation of High Gun Awards, President Laurie Connors called the Porter family to the stage, and presented the package which contained the beautiful gilt Presidential Medal, together with a replica to Mrs Porter.

In accepting the award on behalf of her late husband, Mrs Porter showed remarkable poise and made a sincere plea for total support for Ron Porter's concept of a united national structure for Australia's booming sport.

The audience of over 400 people gave the Porter family a standing ovation as the group returned to their table.

The cased medallion was proudly shown to many of the guests by Mrs Porter, and great interest was shown by the international delegations from U.S.A. and New Zealand.



BIGGEST EVER SHOOTING EVENT EVER HELD IN THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE.

Over 4000 competitors do battle for the six major Australian titles.

DAY 1, SATURDAY, APRIL 18,

It was go from the very first shot fired in the 1981 Nationals series. An amazing 409 shooters lined up to contest the 12th Australian Skeet Championship.

The attendance was a trend that continued right through the series, this Skeet number exceeding the previous best set at Griffith in 1979 by 146.

In perfect conditions and shooting over seven grounds at the immaculately prepared Melbourne Gun Club, Vince Borg of Marconi Gun Club, Sydney, fired the first shot to get the Nationals under-way.

Control of the series was vested in the hands of Tournament Director Brian Clark and Shoot Marshalls, Frank James and Leon Gibson.

From the outset the competition was fierce. There were 40 possibles in the first round. It was also obvious that sheer weight of numbers would preclude the finishing of the event in one day.

Fancied starters, defending champion George Biggs and ISU skeetie Ian Hale were in immediate trouble, both dropping a couple of targets in the first round.

But as the scores started to go up in the second round there were some big names showing. Guy Beddington of NSW posted the first 50 followed closely by Adrian Cousens of Victoria. Cousens was considered around the ground as a form shooter. John Woolley, current New Zealand Skeet Champion was next, and a highly fancied shooter for top honours. Angelo Zapalla, a Queenslander and Veteran Ray Melville from NSW were next followed by Ken Lowry who was also fancied. Canberra businessman, Steve Balogh, Big Billy



THE ELEY REPORT



Congratulations must be given to all concerned with the recent Championships at the Melbourne Gun Club. Their success certainly demonstrates the potential of the sport and the need for even more facilities.

I continue to be astonished at how competitors sacrifice their own chances in order to referee and officiate for their fellow competitors. Usually officials officiate and competitors compete and never the twain shall meet. For shooting, being competitors themselves, the officials know their needs and, if possible, arrange programs accordingly. In other sports, the contestants are often treated as a logistic problem there to provide the officials with a reason for existing and nothing else. I must also add that I have been associated with a whole range of sports in Australia one way or another and, although I know he has his critics, Noel Southey stands head and shoulders above his contemporaries as by far the most conscientious and efficient sports administrator its been my good fortune to meet.

The Melbourne Gun Club was beautifully presented, everyone was most friendly as usual, the "Rembrandt" was the ideal location for the "Finale" dinner and, as usual, Melbourne's weather was nigh on perfect.

The only disappointment we had as a company was our lack of outright winners. Last year, we made a big fuss about how many winners shot with **ELEY** despite our problems in Perth. At Melbourne, more shooters used **ELEY** and invariably we had a good representation in the shoot-offs but only Jon Whittakers took a title. So, after all the furore in 1980, I came up with a little egg on my face. It's not the first time however, and I suppose it will not be the last, but we are hoping for a little more luck in Brisbane and so that shooters such as Doug Smith, Richard Dean, Warren Charlton, Graham Willett, John Woolley, Trevor Reschke, John Eddy, Darryl Wiese, Ray MacDonald, Ian Hale, Graeme Boyd, Alex Crikis and Greg Woodbine — all top men every one will agree and avid **ELEY** users — come through with more than one title between them. As it was, Trevor Reschke, Graham Willett, Greg Woodbine, Peter Lorman and Jon Whittakers were all chosen for the Grand American — in fact, **ELEY** shooters won four of the places in this team. This time, Brian Mark has no need to present his bicycle to the local orphanage.

The product we were very pleased with. We brought two of our technical people out to the site to talk with shooters and discuss their needs, but generally the new loads and packet presentation were very well received. Our major problem now is supply, but the tap can be turned on with everything checking out so well in the only place which matters, out on the shooting apron in competition.

New products which have been on the drawing board for some time will now be released immediately. We are about to market a LOW-NOISE, FIELD & GAME cartridge for use at clubs where the noise factor is a problem and for general use in the field and simulated field layouts.

Our people have worked very closely with the F&G Association in developing the specifications and we feel sure all into this aspect of the sport will welcome our innovations.

Our other new member of the range is WIDE-SPREAD. This is a softer shell with a special wide spread wad which can be used by those wanting a quick spread for closer range shots.

These two additions will just about complete the range for **ELEY** shotshell — nonetheless, we will not be satisfied until we regain the position **ELEY** once held on the Australian market so a true alternate can be offered to the products of our American and European competitors.

Iles and his mate Bill Attwood weighed in with 50's and so did Roger Wasley from New Zealand. Overnight then, with the event running into Day 2 there were 10 possibles.

DAY 2, SUNDAY, APRIL 19,

With weather holding, and with a 9.30 am start to tidy up the odd ten or so squads from the previous day, the Skeet match continued. Just one more possible 50 was posted in John Summers and the 11 squared off for the shoot-off.

First to go was Guy Baddington of NSW who lasted just five targets, and two targets later Angelo Zappala put his gun in the rack.

Bill Iles made it to 61 until a high 4 got away from him and in the same round Ray Melville slipped up. John Summers and New Zealander Roger Wasley were also early casualties.

The shoot-off, with tension mounting then ran to 67 targets when Ken Lowry had some trouble with a low 6. Bill Attwood in very good style went on to 116 before he dropped one.

Steve Balogh a 38 year-old businessman from Queanbeyan/Canberra then stuck it out with Cousens and Woolley to 139 when he too succumbed. A high 4 caused John Woolley some faster heartbeats in the sixth round but apart from that it was very good controlled skeet shooting from he and Cousens. Ironically it was a low 6 that caused the problem for Woolley in the seventh round and we were left with the 12th Australian National Skeet Champion in Adrian Cousens.

Cousens, a 33 year-old transport manager from Bairnsdale in Victoria and his trusty cut-down Browning A grade shot Win. 275 Skeet shells to win the championship. He ran fifth in Perth last year and this win is the culmination of a lot of hard work in his 8 year shooting career.

Woolley, current New Zealand Skeet champion used a Browning C grade and Eley Special Skeet. Third placegetter Steve Balogh used a Perazzi and Win. 325 Skeet.

Cousens' final score in winning was 167/167.

Ladies honours were with Deserie Huddleston — we knew her in last year's Perth Nationals as Wakefield — with a fine score of 47/50. Ray Melville with the only 50 in the Veterans division was tops there and young Bruce Wellington of Geraldton in WA survived a shoot-off with Barney Rooke's daughter Maree to take the Junior Division 56-60.

The International Teams Match against New Zealand which followed resulted in a win for Australia. Fine 25's from Cousens, Attwood, Lowry and Summers and a trip-up on three targets by Balogh left Australia with a score of 122-125. The New Zealanders, despite 25's from Woolley and Wasley had too many missed targets by Viscovich, Peterson and Savage and finished with a score of 120/125.

Day 2 continued with 695 shooters facing the traps in the 27th Australian Single Barrel Championship, an attendance that exceeded the previous record by 154.

But the going was tough with only 22 of the 695 posting first round possibles. With the big turn-out it was obvious that this event also would run into a second day.

As scores were posted in the second round it was obvious that there would be very few possibles.

First to put a 50 together was Barry McDonald of New Zealand. He shot in Squad 1. Then came Greg Woodbine of Queensland and Trevor Reschke of South Australia. Jon Whittakers, double barrel winner from Griffith in 1979 put his 50 up in squad 38 and then the bottom dropped out of it and there were no more who could go the distance.







DAY 3, MONDAY, APRIL 20.

With the Single Barrel hanging over into day three and nominations pouring in for the Double Barrel to follow fog set in to disrupt the tidying-up of the event. But, around 8.00 am the shoot marshalls were able to get under way.

The SB shoot off was somewhat of an anti-climax. First to go was Tevor Reschke who duffed his very first target. Just two targets later it was Barry McDonald of New Zealand who put his gun in the rack then at four, Greg Woodbine from Queensland let one slip by. This left John Whittakers with only the fourth target to shoot for the championship.

He did so and the very elated 37 year-old grazier from Deniliquin in NSW had a Single Barrel title to add to his Double Barrel win at Griffith in 1979.

And so to the Double Barrel Championship, the one that all who aspire to greatness in clay target shooting are looking for. With a field of 800 it was a title worth winning. It was also a sight to be seen, with Melbourne Gun Club strained to its limits to handle the huge field.

It was also some sort of minor miracle that, with superb co-operation and good marshalling, the first 50 targets for the whole field was completed in the one day. When the dust had settled here were just on 70 possibles, a figure some said was a bit low considering the entry.

Tidying up of the Single Barrel was in progress whilst the Double Barrel got under-way. 'A' grade winner was the runner-up to Whittakers, Greg Woodbine of Queensland Larry Feutz, a young New Zealander who was having a good first visit to Australia grabbed 'B' grade honours. He ran a score of 49/50. A score of 46 was all that was needed for Chris Corderoy of N.S.W. to take 'C' grade honours.

Nanette McCallum, 47/50 was the best lady, Peter Sheridan, whose 48 made him the best Veteran was joined on the same score by Patrick Calandro to win the Junior section.

Sheridan is from S.A. and Calandro from Victoria.

DAY 4, TUESDAY, APRIL 21.

With the weather still holding, the dozen squads of possibles in the Double Barrel from Day 3 lined up to sort it out. It was to be a long shoot-off with many chances. By mid-morning it was down to a squad consisting of Jack Henwood and Trevor Byrne of Victoria, Kevin Gittings and John Maxwell of N.S.W. and Greg and Ken Stevens of Queensland.

The score ran easily past the 150 until the first of the Stevens in Greg let his 174th get away. He was followed by Gittings at 188. Past 200 and Ken Stevens had trouble with the 211th leaving Maxwell, Henwood and Burne to battle it out. They cruised along to 400 and it looked as though it would be a repeat of the Ryan/Charlton marathon in 1973.

But the vagaries of clay target shooting popped up once again. John Maxwell let both barrels go at the 401st without a result. Then Jack Henwood did exactly the same thing on the next target leaving Trevor Byrne to shoot it to become the 1981 Double Barrel Champion. He did so.

But once again controversy reared its ugly head as spectators and officials decried the use of the public address system during the latter part of the shoot-off.

Whilst the incident was not as dramatic as Perth in 1980, it is sure to be discussed for a long time into the future.

Being all 'A' graders the result were decided on this final shoot-off for all positions in the Overall and that grade. Earlier on, the 'B' grade had also been settled with Wayne McFarlane of New Zealand running to 91-92. 'C' grade was won by Jan Schuster, 13 year-old son of Eurocut boss, Dieter Schuster. It was his first National series and he was delighted.

Defending champion from 1980 Russell Mark put a 50 straight together to win the Junior championship whilst another Henwood in Sam, ran to 68 to take the Veterans division in the open event.

For the first time ever, the Womens Section was run as a separate event. Forty four ladies faced the traps and it was June Gawith of Jeparit, Victoria who was the victor from Helene Dittmer of New Zealand. Christine Wakefield of Mildura took third place. Gawith shot a score of 51/53.

In a sensible programming move, Shoot Marshall Frank James put the ANZ Trap Championship (Points Score) on whilst the DB shoot-off was in progress. Some 581 competitors had nominated for this one and it was vital to many of them for their place in the Mackintosh Team.

It was about this time in the program that some of the less fancied of the competitors started to emerge. So it was that 'B' grader, Benni Scotta of the Veneto Club in Melbourne put his 50 first barrels together and then held off a challenge from fellow 'B' grader Peter Lorman and 'A' grader Dick Piotrowski to take the title.

He held it together for nine targets to finish with 177/177 points. Piotrowski had to settle for 'A' grade honours with 176/177 and Lorman who pulled a second barrel on his very first target was 'B' grade champion on 152/153.

Chris Corderoy of NSW gained 'C' grade honours with 145/150. Putting together a consistent string of results in the ladies sections was Nanette McCallum who with a score of 147/150 took that trophy. On the same score in the Veterans division was Peter Caddy of Barmera S.A. to win. Rusty Mark made it two in a row in the Juniors with a score of 149/150.

In conjunction with the points score was the Alan Brown Teams Match. Teams of club registered shooters, no more than five per team, compete with their scores being aggregated. The winner this year was WANGARATTA GUN CLUB. Representing the club were Tony Penney, Dick English, Ennio Cavedon, John Rigoni and Brian North. They shot a combined score of 727/750.

DAY 5, WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22.

Team Day and it was hot competition for Mackintosh places. Eight down was the cut-off point and there were some big

Then followed the International Teams Match between Australia, New Zealand and the United States. The five hot-shots from the DB did the honours for Australia. Trevor Byrne, Jack Henwood, John Maxwell, Greg Stevens and Kevin Gittings put together a score of 244/250 to win.

It was a new format for the Double Rise, 25 pairs with two visits to the traps. From the start it was obvious that there would be very few high scores. In the first round there were some very long faces as scores were posted. It looked as if the lone 47 on the board would win it for a young 'B' grade farmer from Maryborough in Victoria, Adrian O'Connell. There came another however and in a tight tussle that went just five pairs it was 'A' grader Bill Jones of Illawarra who had to settle for the 'A' grade only and leave O'Connell with the overall.

O'Connell's final score was 63/70 and Jones won 'A' grade with 62/70. John Farmer on 51/60 was the 'B' grade champion, he is from Morwell in Victoria and Tasmanian Bill Richardson grabbed 'C' grade honours with 43/50.


Peter Caddy was the top veteran on 39/50 and 42/50 was enough to get the Junior trophy for Steve Schonenberg of Queensland.

DAY 6, THURSDAY, APRIL 23.

Grand Australian Handicap day and 562 hopefuls lined up to do battle. From the outset it was obviously going to be a front markers' event as the wind was tricky.

With the large entry it was dark before the last squads faced up in the second round and so the result was held over until the following day.

DAY 7, FRIDAY, APRIL 24.

As predicted it was a front marker shoot-off when the nine possible lined up in the fresh morning air to decide the 32nd final of the Grand Australian Handicap.

Just 12 targets were required for the result. First to go was young Victor Burgess of Cobar from the 19m mark then followed in quick succession, Rod Collins, Laurie Hull Adrian Cousens (Skeet winner), Ron Briggs and Harvey Potts. Then in three targets it was all over. Max Feltdman dropped his 60th then Rod Polla-Mounta of Morwell, duffed his 62nd leaving Ralph Dellar of Mildura to shoot his to win. He did so. Della won it from the 18m mark and took home the \$5000 Remington 3200.

The meterage division winners show in the results summary.

In the ladies division, Helen Briggs put together the only 50/50 to win and Howard Durbridge had to survive a shoot-off to take the veterans at 54/56. Young Victorian, Chris Vandenberg also had to shoot 64-65 to take the Junior division.

The all important teams match for the Glenn Cup followed and it was the Kiwis who set the pace. A 20 target match for 6 shooters from each country shot in two visits of 10, they had it shot to pieces in the first visit when they ran it clean. Their team of Mabe (20), Pratt (19), Sampson (20), Clark (20), Cook (20), and Woolley (20) were too good for the Australians and won by one target. Australia was represented by Scotta, Kable, Dean, Lorman, Maxwell and Piotrowski.

Also finalised was the interstate Trap Teams Match. This was won by Western Australia by one target from Victoria and New South Wales. W.A. were represented by Darrell

Wiese, Tim Catling, John Eddy, Wayne Pilkington and Ray McDonald. Their score was 123/125.

Also in the tight schedule of the final day was the very first Comark Deauville Doubles Match. Forty two family pairs faced the traps and it was the father & son combination of Pud and Victor Burgess of Cobar in N.S.W. who shot the only 20 and took home a skeet gun each with the compliments of Commercial Marketing.

And so to the final event, the Champion of Champions. We also lean on the old hackneyed phrase that its 'hard to keep a good man down'. From a field of 541 it was the evergreen Ken Lowry of Melbourne, Victoria who put it all together in an abbreviated version, survived the shoot-off and won.

Abbreviated, because due to the sheer weight of numbers the event was shortened to 20 targets each of DB, SB and PS.

Evergreen, because Ken Lowry is no stranger to National wins having several Skeet and Double Barrel titles to his name.

In the shoot-off, Lowry ran his five targets of each discipline straight to finish with 125/125. 'A' grade honours were left with Ray Morrisson of Victoria on 147/150 and 'B' grade was won by Peter Willett of Victoria with 121/125. Another Victorian, Greg Schier on 98/100 was the 'C' grade champion.

Nanette McCallum continued on her winning way and put together 90/100 for the ladies title.

Alex Bremner with a fine 95/100 was the Veteran top gun and Chris Warren only missed the 2 points to card a 98/100 for the Junior title.

So, as everybody rushed away to get to the final presentation night at Rembrandt's Restaurant, calm finally settled on Melbourne Gun Club where every attendance record in Australian Clay Target shooting had been broken. We had six new National champions. All that was left to do was to honour the High Gun winners and wend our weary way home.

In a most professional presentation by Arthur Higgins, Sports Editor of GTV9 and after some hasty figuring by penciller Hawkins, we had the High Gun winners.

In another break with tradition the Browning High Gun was allowed to be won again by the same person.

So, almost ten years to the day when he won his first High Gun at a Nationals it was Jim Ellis of Canberra who was the top man. Jim's score for the overall was 481/500. He also won the J. Newton Thomas Cup and capped off a wonderful April in the shooting world. He had just returned from the Benito Juarez Games in Mexico where he had won Australia's first ever shotgunning Gold Medal in top International Competition (a full report on this feat will follow at a later date).

Nanette McCallum topped off a great Nationals Series with a double in the Ladies High Gun Section. Her scores 455/500 (overall) and 418/450 (trap only) gave her both titles. It is a long time since we have seen anybody but a Wakefield up there on stage.

The overall Trap High Gun award went to Greg Woodbine of Queensland with a score of 450/488. He went home with a \$650 knife with the compliments of Puma. Points Score winner Benni Scotta with 421/450 was 'B' grade High Gun and Rodney Hart's 404/450 was the best in 'C' grade.

The veterans High Gun was won by Ted McRae of New Zealand and Russell Mark took home the Junior Section High Gun Award.

Of some consolation to the Juniors was his parting statement of 'you will be pleased to know that this is my last year as a junior', oh the reckless urge to grow old!

So as the dust settled and the weary competitors and officials did their best to get out of Melbourne with a hostess strike in full swing the time had come for a look at the whole series and what we left behind.

There can be no doubt that the Nationals were the biggest ever. It will be many years before the attendance records are broken. The Melbourne Gun Club grounds were in wonderful condition and the supporting facilities were well provided.

But there was no doubt that these facilities were strained to their absolute limit. An aggregate attendance of 4159 for a week of shooting is just too much for any gun club to handle. It seems that clay target shooting is fairly and squarely at the cross-roads. Where it goes from here is anybody's guess.

Decisions made during the Nationals on the political side have left a lot of the observers such as me just a little puzzled and it will be interesting to see if the sport can keep the momentum going.



PRIZEGIVING BANQUET IS GREAT FINALE TO '81 NATIONALS.

After the last shots were fired in the 1981 Champions of Champions Cup event at the Australian Trap and Skeet Championships, competitors and friends rushed from the shooting ground to prepare for the social event of the year.

The "Prizegiving Banquet" was about to commence, and all the guests wanted to be present when the action started.

The venue was the top-class outer suburban restaurant known as "REMBRANDTS", and the car parks filled rapidly as over 400 guests poured into the place.

Mr John Lopes, a part-owner of Rembrandts, was on hand to ensure that all the last minute arrangements were completed and held a 10 minute staff briefing at which the 60 waitresses, stewards and supervisors were given final instructions on their duties throughout the night.

Guests were greeted by a glittering display of the trophies to be presented later in the evening. The trophy display was highlighted by very effective floodlighting and was flanked by gleaming models of new aircraft to be introduced by Air New Zealand and Ansett Airlines of Australia later in 1981.

After complimentary sherries, guests were seated at carefully arranged tables, and were introduced to the compere for the evening, Mr Arthur Higgins, from the National Nine T.V. Network.

A three course meal was provided and despite the fact that the main course was delayed almost an hour (not the fault of the restaurant staff) the food was of a very high standard.

The premier award of the night was undoubtedly the high grade Browning shotgun, donated by F.N. Sports of Belgium through its Australian agents, Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. The Browning is accompanied by the J. Newton Thomas Cup, and is the most prestigious trophy of the tournament.

1981 is the first year where the restriction on the number of occasions that the award can be won by any one person had been removed, and it was disappointing to find that the winner, JIM ELLIS, was unable to attend the dinner.

Consequently, Mr Ross Baillie, Managing Director of Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd., had to make the presentation to a "phantom" recipient, a situation which should not have developed. (It should be noted that Jim Ellis had been home for only one day after his four weeks tour to Mexico before attending the Nationals. Furthermore, his wife, Ann, had presented Jim with their second daughter just prior to Jim leaving for Mexico, so there were mitigating circumstances attached to his non-attendance at the presentation).

The Trap High Gun Awards were then presented, with the 'A' Grade trophy being a valuable PUMA Presentation Knife, gold plated and a beautifully hand engraved handle. The trophy had been donated by Eurocut Pty. Ltd. (importers of Rottweil cartridges) and was presented to the winner, Greg Woodbine (of Queensland) by that company's Managing Director, Mr Dieter Schuster.

Laurie Connors presented the 'B' and 'C' Grade High Gun Awards (Toshiba stereo equipment) to Benny Scotta of Veneto Gun Club (Victoria) and Rodney Hart of Tasmania respectively.

The two ladies awards — donated by Eley and Mrs Muriel Porter — were won by Nanette McCallum of Tasmania. The trophy donated by Mrs Porter was a 22-piece Memory Lane tea set, valued at \$250.00.

The Eley award was presented by Ron Clarke, General Manager of Eley Ammunition. This was the seventh time the Perpetual Trophy had been presented, and was the first occasion that Deserie Wakefield (now Mrs Huddleston) had not won it.

The junior award, the Everett-Attwood Cup (donated in 1980 by Bill Attwood of Australia and Trevor Everett of New Zealand to promote junior competition) was presented to winner Russell Mark by past President, "Tup" Pedersen.

Unfortunately, neither of the winners of the two veterans' awards were present to receive their trophies. The Cec Herbert Cup had been won by Ted McRae of New Zealand, who had left earlier to board an Air New Zealand flight home. The other award had been donated by Fred and Val Horton of Sydney and was won by Bill Wickham of Echuca (Victoria).

AIR NEW ZEALAND TEAM AWARDS

During the Nationals, an Australian team had been selected to compete at the 1981 Grand American Tournament. The team was announced at the Prizegiving Banquet, and a presentation was made by Geoff Johnstone, Air New Zealand's Melbourne representative.

In making the announcement, Mr Johnstone commented on the close relationship that had been developed between his airline and clay target shooting, and wished each team member well in his overseas competition.

The team will be amongst the first to be carried aboard the new Air New Zealand 747 Super B's, due to come into service in July.

LAURIE CONNORS WINS PRESIDENTIAL BALLOT

Following a turbulent period during which the Australian Clay Target Association has had five changes of President since mid-1980, Mr Laurie Connors was officially elected to the top office at an Executive Committee meeting held in Melbourne on Anzac Day.

After a series of three tied ballots, the decision was resolved by drawing a name from a hat. This is the second successive occasion that the Executive Committee has had to resort to this means of determining a ballot result, in connection with the office of President or Vice President. (Mr Connors was elected Vice President in Perth in March 1980 after a tied vote with the late Ron Porter.)

Mr Connors had twice been thrust into the position of Acting President in the past eight months and therefore is quite experienced in the top role.

The other nominee in the ballot was Mr Roy Holtfreter, of Northam, Western Australia, who was then elected Vice President.

Mr Connors comes to office at a critical time in the progress of clay target shooting, as the Association is facing some severe growing pains. His most pressing and immediate problem is to recruit a replacement for the Executive Director, whose resignation becomes effective on June 12.

Another quite serious problem is that of finding a path through the economic obstacles created by the refusal of the delegates at the Annual General Meeting to approve a fee increase for 1982.

This is also of critical importance because the decision comes at a time when a number of the Association's development projects are at an advanced stage. A good example of the type of project which could be seriously affected by the rejection of the fee increase is the novice coaching scheme.

New Faces on Executive Committee

At the 1981 Annual General Meeting, three new appointments to the Executive Committee were announced. They were: **Mr Darrell Wiese, Western Australia** who has replaced Mr Robin Bailey. Mr Bailey was forced to resign due to pressures arising from his new business in Perth.

Mr Jim Scott, New South Wales has taken the place of Mr Arch Rowe of Yamba. Mr Rowe had completed over ten years service on the Executive Committee, including the last four years as Chairman of the Rules Sub-Committee. Mr Rowe will continue to Chair the Rules group pending a reorganisation of the Association's technical arm.

Mr Rowe was awarded an Honorary Life Registration for his service to the sport.

Mr Robert Parker, New South Wales who after some years as firstly the Secretary, then the President of Queanbeyan Canberra Gun Club, has joined the Executive Committee in place of Mr Len Bird, who had retired.

As a result of the election to the office of President of Victorian Laurie Connors, **Mr Robert Buchan** has returned to the Executive Committee after an absence of three years.



THE OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE DUBBO GUN CLUBS NEW SHOOTING GROUNDS 12/4/81

Having decided to move from its old "Terramungamine" site in 1978 the committee looked at many sites and finally local farmer Keith Simmons was approached by Errol Tucker and the 30 Hectares purchased. The Rural Bank agreed to the loan and construction of the clubhouse and tracks commenced in late 1980. Club member and local builder Max Perring gave his support and knowledge and directed the operation. Many local tradesmen and volunteers from the club worked hard under Max to complete the grounds. Local carpenter John Knight spent many hot summer days working on the site. Club President Murray Roberts also spent all the school Christmas holidays working on the site as well as nearly every day since then for some period of time. Local business houses supported the Club by supplying the materials as cheaply as possible.





• View of Track 3 from the roof of the clubhouse at Dubbo Gun Club.


speech Noel Southey made mention of the emotional and ill-informed attacks on the legitimate ownership of firearms by the media and he hoped that Mr Mason would take the opportunity to see how responsible firearm ownership was organised. Mr Mason in the opening speech made mention of the need in the community for firearm education and how the Dubbo Gun Club and other bodies could play a part in this education. He expressed the opinion that this would be of more benefit than harsh legislation.

Mr Mason also made mention of the fact that the club had constructed the grounds without any assistance from State or Local Government. He admired the self help spirit and felt sure that this would stand the club in good stead for any future applications for grants. After the official opening Mr Mason and other guests then watched the shooting for some

Situated as it is in the middle of N.S.W. the committee feels that this concept must have some merit. 



BOOK REVIEW

"TRAP & SKEET SHOOTING"

by George Biggs

It is very rare for one to be able to review a book and talk to the author at the same time. But when George Biggs handed me a copy of his work "Trap and Skeet Shooting", I was able to sit down and have a long talk with him about it.

It is also nice to be able to look at a 'first' in any field and in this publication we have, in my opinion, the first definitive book on the sport of clay target shooting in this country.

In 64 pages, George Biggs has distilled 40 years of experience and technical know-how into a form that will be invaluable to both the beginner and the experienced shotgunner. It is written in a very easy and relaxed style that will appeal to all who like to just pick up a book and browse. Experienced gunners, however, will find that chapters on particular problems are easy to locate.

The book is profusely illustrated with both line drawings and photographs, the line drawings being of superb clarity and very informative.

In the foreword by Dr Raymond Young, very well written incidentally, he sums up George Biggs' career from the point of view of one who has been helped in his clay target shooting by a good coach.

Dr Young's quote of, "there might be a few men with greater technical knowledge, several who can equal his ability with a gun, and one or two with a greater record of success. I am quite certain however that there is but one man with the honesty and altruism of George Biggs who so willingly makes himself available to the beginner", sums up the George Biggs' style in a nutshell.

George himself then traces the history of clay target shooting from the 1860's in Europe and America to the present day in Australia. In this introduction he draws on history that very few shotgunners would know. It makes fascinating reading for all of us who have a love of the sport. The chapter on the old 'Nobel Clay Bird Gun Club', the daddy of the sport in this country, is remarkable as an historic insight into the beginnings of our sport.

But then George is in to the things he knows best. All the little points that go towards making you a better shotgunner, whether it be over the traps or in the field.

He starts with the basics of gun fit and mounting then talks about stance, sight alignment, the need to lead the moving target and the necessity of swing through. All of these subjects are covered in a succinct style that is easy to read but full of solid advice and information.

Very sensible advice on gun selection and barrel lengths follow and the whole section is full of very good illustrations and photos to reinforce the points that George makes.

The best in-depth treatment of Australian Trap Shooting I have ever read follows and George applies the previously discussed basics to this game. Each lane is discussed and analysed with excellent photos and illustrations to back it up.

Skeet shooting gets even better treatment. George has a leaning towards this discipline and has made a deep study of the techniques required and it shows. Again the discussion is excellent and the illustrations and photos superb. This section is required reading for anybody who has an urge to shoot skeet and anybody who has a problem with the game.

He winds up the book with a brief discussion on cartridges and reloading together with a list of excuses commonly used by clay busters. One has a feeling that if they could digest all of the information that George Biggs has put between the covers of this book there would be no need for them.

To my mind, Dr Young sums the book up very well in his final thought in the foreword when he says, "Therefore,

should you meet a tranquil and happy sportsman with spacers in his stock, the chances are that George Biggs has improved both his sporting ability and the quality of his life", with that I agree.







TRAINING CAMP

Dear Sir,

Could I have a little space in your MAILBOX Section?

I notice in your Mailbox section, letters from a "Shooters daughter" J. Brennan and A. R. Jamieson on the subject of Veteran, Super Veteran status, for older Members of the A.C.T.A.

This is a well worth while idea to allow many older shooters an opportunity of further clay busting, but a careful perusal of the rules would show, that the one demanding 30 years continuous membership, before being accepted as a Veteran, would exclude just about all the older shooters in Australia!

Going back 30 years, what clubs were shooting clays? Most were of the live bird variety and it is pretty certain that very few, if any, were members of the A.C.T.A. IN THOSE DAYS. Live bird shooting was made illegal around 1954-55 which is about 26 years ago, well under the 30 years stipulated as continuous member of that body.

There is so much merit in the idea of Veteran status that the A.C.T.A. SHOULD immediately make it all possible as a happy alternative for the oldies to enjoy comradeship and shooting for at least a few more years remaining to them. So many have given unstinted support in the fields of club administration, working bees, for decades. Presidents, secretaries, committeemen so many unsung sportsmen have given way to the younger generation or "progress" still wanting to help and shoot, but finally realising retirement looms inevitably.

The A.C.T.A. can do a great service to these men. Surely a reward such as a Veteran's badge would encourage them to shoot on. Many still do of course, but there must be a lot of shooters in a similar position to "Shooters Daughter" who would be encouraged, and should be, to shoot on, as a Veteran with all the benefits that go with it.

The A.C.T.A. should revise the rules so that age, and age alone, be the only requirement needed for entry, possibly by endorsement from the shooter's own Club.

Those clubs at present allowing Veteran Status are to be congratulated wholeheartedly, a good beginning, but please let it be open to all who can qualify as aged Veterans and not to a privileged few.

Dear Sir,

Can you help me to obtain an up-to-date copy of the ISU Rules of Skeet, please.

I want clarification, in particular, of rule 36(b) as it appears in the booklet "ACTA Association Shooting Rules January 1973."

I was refereeing a squad in which one member broke both of the targets in a double, on three consecutive occasions. I was told that this should be scored lost and lost (O and O). I replied that the only rules which I had, gave the shooter one more turn, and that then he would be scored "dead and lost" (1 and O).

No more was said, but after the match a Brisbane shooter approached me, to tell me that Brisbane had an ISU Referee for Skeet in the southern hemisphere, and that the correct ruling for the situation outlined above was "lost and lost". I said that the book said "dead and lost". He replied that the rule had been changed.

Now how in the name of all that is holy, can a referee function in that sort of situation. If one cannot go by the written word, then it is impossible. Referees have a difficult enough job as it is. Surely it is somebody's business to see to it that the shooting public is kept informed of that sort of thing, and somebody's business to see to it that someone does keep everyone informed.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NORTHERN TERRITORY COACHING DIRECTOR

(By Kevin Bowring)

The TOP SHOT, the one who consistently occupies a place on the Podium, is the one who makes the fewest mistakes. This fellow has, after years of practice, reduced shooting to a few vital basics.

One of the most important basics was highlighted during the Coaching Council Meeting in June, by an outside speaker, Mr. Brian Nettleton, Senior Lecturer in the Dept. of Human Movement Studies at Melbourne University. It cannot be stressed too highly, that the shooter must recognise the target and its speed and direction at the earliest possible instant after it leaves the trap.

Brian has been involved in studies with ball sports, which indicate that the most important area of a target (ball's) flight is the first 1/3rd of its travel, and successful footballers can carry out all the preparations for interception and further action from the information gained by that first 1/3rd movement of the target.

Just to verify this has an application at the trap. I carried out some tests of my own. One of our local trap layouts, which is only used at night, is lighted in such a way that the first 10-12 feet of a target's flight is not illuminated. Then the target suddenly appears, brightly glowing, two feet or so above the traphouse and with a fair headstart on the shooter. Scores on this trap are consistently below that achieved on traps lighted in conventional manner — back-marker scores, where early identification of the direction and speed of the target becomes critically important if the target is to be intercepted before the pattern of shot is dispersed. For example, a 25 metre shooter must have fired to make an interception of the target at 15 metres from the traphouse, i.e. 25m plus 15m equals 40m or about maximum range at which a broken target can be guaranteed if the pattern is precisely directed. Beyond this range, holes in the pattern reduce hit probability markedly — so, if the target is identified and its direction and speed established within 15 feet of the first sighting, then on the first mentioned trap (trap "A") that point when the swing gets under way will be 12ft plus 15ft or eight metres from the traphouse, leaving seven metres in which to track, pass and shoot at the target. The conventionally lighted trap (trap "B") for comparison, gives an advantage of a further 3-4 metres or a 50% improvement in time and distance to achieve a hit. Scores have proven beyond doubt that the first 10 or 12 feet of a target's flight is critically important to perfect scores. On trap "A" shooters regularly "stab" at the target. The smooth swing and follow through is lost. Logically, if we go back to the 16 metre mark, the shooter has approximately 19 metres of the target's flight to smoothly track, pass, shoot and follow through, which gets back to the main reason for focussing your attention where the target will be spotted at the earliest possible instant after it leaves the trap — to give more time for a smooth swing and follow-through and to eliminate the error of lifting your head or eyes when the target suddenly appears outside the area of your concentration.

FOOTNOTE: Advice has just been received that Kevin Bowring has resigned as State Coaching Director for Northern Territory. Kevin manages a large sports store in Darwin, and the growth of the business has left him no time to devote to the development of coaching programs.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Mrs Muriel Porter, widow of the late National President, Ron Porter, has asked CTSN to express her gratitude to the great number of people who comforted her and the family when Ron died.


