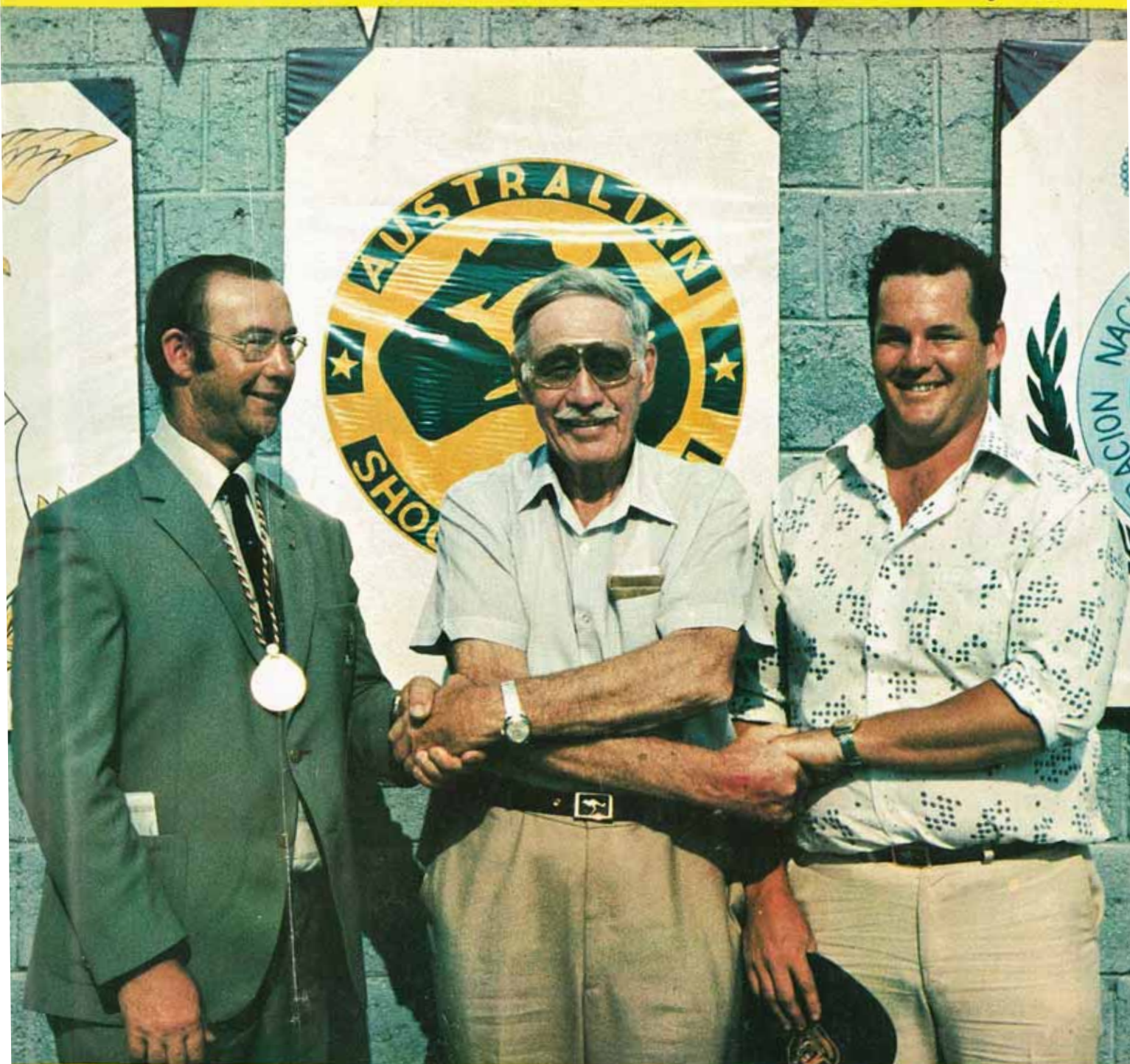

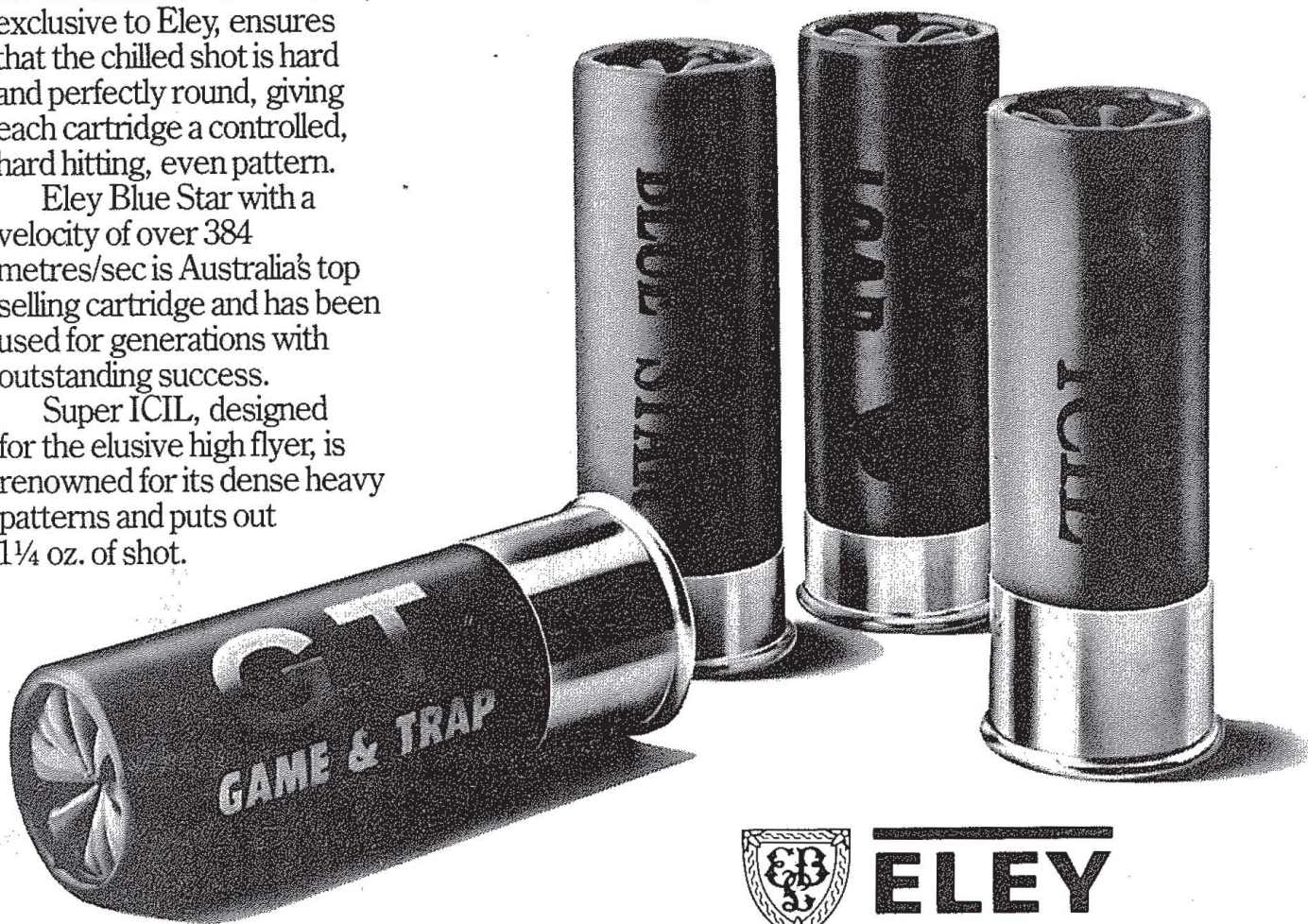

# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The ups and downs of clay target shooting! Last month my column was full of good news mainly arising from the Nationals. Yet since then, it seems that the world has fallen in.

The annual meeting decision to disallow a fee increase, despite the fact that inflation is continuing to run in double figures, has set back some of the Association's growth plans quite seriously. This subject is discussed in more detail elsewhere in this issue.

Then, we had a tied vote in a ballot to decide the 1981 President. This was the second time in two years that a tied ballot for a high office had to be broken by drawing of lots. Such a situation indicates a serious fault in the "pecking order" system, as more mature associations have created a "career path" for their top honourees.

For example, the junior vice president this year knows that after graduating to senior vice president, he is certain to become the chief executive. Under this system, a non-performer can either be trained to fill the top role, **OR** can be replaced at an early stage by someone more capable.

Such is not the case yet in clay target shooting, but ultimately, I'm sure the situation will develop.

Then came my resignation. A situation developed where I found that I could no longer be certain that I would be able to perform to the satisfaction of **all** members of the Executive Committee, and the general membership. Yes, it was a political decision, and a most difficult one at that.

It has been said that "I took the easy way out when certain events did not go my way." In case that is a widely held view, let me dispel it immediately.

For obvious reasons, I do not intend to use this column to develop a debate on the whys and wherefores. The Management Committee statement on the subject in the June issue of C.T.S.N. said all that is required.

Nevertheless, I **do** intend to use the column to record some expression of gratitude.

The first thank-you is to the many, many honorary officers throughout the Association who have made (and continue to make) a very worthwhile contribution to the sport's growth.

Without the workers, the sport is nothing, and one hopes that the competitors who visit their favorite club each shooting day realise that, before they can fire a shot, someone behind the scenes has already done a full day's work (or more).

A special thanks must go to the commercial supporters from the firearms and allied products fields, who accepted me at an early stage, despite my previous industry allegiance, and have continued to pour a big dollar into clay busting.

Still on the money side, I wish to record a special vote of thanks to the Australian Government, which, through the Department of Home Affairs and Environment is making a valuable contribution to the development of sport in Australia. The Departmental officers have shown a remarkable awareness of the needs of sport, and have been specially understanding of the specific needs of clay target shooting.

It may be of interest to readers to know that, since July 1977, the Australian Clay Target Association has received a total of \$100,000 in direct assistance from the Federal Government.

At the time I joined the Association's administrative unit, there was some sort of taboo about seeking sponsorship from **outside** the firearms industry. Early in 1977, that myth was laid to rest, when Air New Zealand and Ansett Airlines of Australia joined the list of active supporters.

Mr. Maurie Davis, the recently retired Chief Executive of Air New Zealand was extremely generous, and his lead has been followed by Mr. Gareth Court, Mr. Geoffrey Johnstone

(and Mr. Bill Murray in the early stages), all of Air New Zealand's Australian operation.

Resulting from the break into the travel field, Jetset Tours established a useful relationship with the Association which proved to be of mutual benefit. Mr. Lionel Landman, Executive Director of Jetset Tours, provided a high level of assistance to the Association (and helped me out of some horrific situations) and with the aid of Jetset staff, made arrangements for the movement of A.C.T.A. teams look easy.

To the officers in various State Departments of sport, we list a special thank-you. These people are in a difficult position when liaising with administrators from national sporting associations, as their first priorities relate to state matters.

Despite this basic problem, I have **always** been warmly received during my visits to these departments, and in fact, **all** government relationships have been held very high in my regard.

Despite all the special categories that have already been listed, I'm sure that no-one will be offended to know that there is an even more special one still to come. I am referring to the staff unit, which really is unique in this country insofar as its dedication to the job is concerned.

Not only do the girls in the National office have to suffer the idiosyncrasies of club officers, but they have also had to put up with me. In other words, they have truly been "the meat in the sandwich".

Their wish to provide tops in service has **never** diminished, and the only reason that the level of their service has ever dropped was pressure of work.

Thanks girls, you've been great, and I owe you a great debt for your unqualified support **at all times!**

So, what does the future hold? Firstly, let me say that the increase in the Association's financial reserves from the 1976 level of **MINUS** \$23,000 to the current position of \$130,000 is unlikely to be repeated.

The main reason for this statement is that the A.C.T.A. is now far more active in development projects than in previous times.

But, the main point on money is that registered shooters must overcome their tendency to be envious of the expenditure that doesn't relate **directly** to them. How many times do we hear "the A.C.T.A. spends too much on overseas trips".

That criticism is bull-dust!! The **ONLY** way any sport in Australia will elevate its general standard is to seek international competition. The Australian Government recognises the need, is evidenced by its willingness to subsidise team travel expenses.

Yet who cares that Jim Ellis won a Gold Medal recently in a top international competition. It's time that **all** clay busters cared.

You (the registered shooters) have elected Executive Members to administer and manage your sport. If they do a good job, give them a word of praise — if they botch the job, vote someone else onto the committee. But, for the good of the sport, **QUIT THE KNOCKING!!**

I heard a radio announcer recently tell a knock knock joke. It reminded me of our sport, because the answer to "Who's there?" will be **NO ONE** unless we all lift our game.

In the past six months, there have been significant sackings and resignations in many areas of public life. In most (if not all) cases, they have come about because of disloyalty within the victim's own "team".

I see a real risk of clay target shooting slipping into the same mistake. I hope I am proved completely wrong.

A further area of concern, in connection with the future, is that a serious danger exists that national unity will be replaced by state parochialism. One of the great themes promoted by the late Ron Porter, and echoed by Newton Thomas, was that sport generally needed to be **national** to survive.

My successor is Ian Hill of Ashburton, Victoria. Ian joined the administrative unit on June 9, and is very enthusiastic to learn what Australia's booming sport is all about.

# THE JUNIOR SHOOTER

The problems that confront the junior taking up the shotgun are very different to those facing the would-be riflemen. In both cases we have the problem of physique. A junior is not just a small adult, but he has different bodily proportions. His neck is markedly shorter in proportion to the adult, his arms and legs are often much longer, while his trunk may be much smaller in proportion to his height.

A second problem is in the arms available. All the major arms companies recognise that in the junior shooter lies their future. If they can get a firearm into his hands, then he is liable to look back on that piece with affection and, other things being nearly equal, in a choice, then he will choose from that company's line-up.

However, while this scaling down of rifles applies, it applies naturally enough only to rimfire rifles. When we turn to the smooth bores, then the situation is similar in that Harrington & Richardson have a model 490 Topper Junior which is a single shot with a stock proportioned to the needs of the Junior shooter.

Others in the junior field are Ithaca with its model 66 Supersingle Youth and Winchester with its 37A Youth model. However, nobody imports such guns and for a very simple reason, these guns are in 20 gauge in modified or half choke boring, saving the Winchester at improved modified or three quarter choke. Half choke guns are not suitable for trap competition in 20 bore as their owners would be very savagely handicapped against a twelve bore in full or improved modified choking.

The Australian Clay Target Association does not run separate competitions for 20 bore guns, the reasoning behind this is that nobody shoots a twenty bore as there is no ammunition available for it except imported stuff and that costs just as much as a twelve. The cost of imported twenty gauge ammunition will probably rise markedly in the near future if additional duties being sought by local manufacturers against imported cartridges are granted.

This arises simply over local costs due to the high cost of labour here as against the cost of labour in an area such as the Phillipines, an area to which one of our ammunition makers has already moved.

By eliminating all the smaller calibres this rationalisation made the path of the local manufacturer and retailers much easier as they did not need to carry more than one gauge in guns or shells as stock. However, it does have a marked effect on the junior shooter in that his costs are the same as for an adult and as a consequence, his father may well defer the day when he takes to the boards.

There is a very strong case for junior competition which is already going great guns in Victoria, where a forward looking Education Department and interested head masters have taken advantage of the industry's offers of assistance. Rainbow High School is a case in point and the Principal, L. G. Barr has already run a highly successful match with the help of Winchester and the Victorian Clay Target Association. This has set the South Australian Association off, and it is running (or by now will have run) a State Schoolboy and Schoolgirl Clay Target Championship at the South Australian Gun Club, which shoots at grounds off the Point Wakefield Road, about twenty kilometres north of Adelaide itself. This competition is of special interest as, while the Girl's section was open, the Boy's had an age barrier at 15, which broke the competition into Junior and Senior. Here again, Winchester has offered the loan of firearms and a box of ammunition per competitor.

However, while a twelve bore with its stock shortened to thirteen inches (— thirty three centimetre) pull is a big help, a stock needs more modification than merely cutting four centimetres off the butt to make it fit junior shooters.

While Remington has only a small presence in Australia, I had been urging the marketing of the LT model 1100 here. This is an auto-loader in 20 gauge with a total weight of only

2.9 kg or 6½ lbs in ventilated rib styling. The length of pull is 33 cms (—13 inches) while the barrel is offered as full or modified in 71 cm (—28 inches) length, in 66 cm (—26 inches). Improved cylinder, or in 58 cm (—23 inches) length in Improved cylinder or Modified choke. Since the LT-20 does not carry a thick recoil pad, then the addition of a suitable pad will take up some of the slack as the junior shooter grows.

Length of barrel is important, there is absolutely no need for a junior to be handicapped by holding up an overlong barrel. What constitutes an 'overlong' barrel makes interesting reading. In a magnum twelve bore, a length of 63.5 cm (—25 inches) will give patterns equal to any longer barrel. For a company that puts its money where its mouth is, BSA and I for one, only wish I'd had the money to buy one when they were about. This gun is legal being over the 63 cm minimum barrel length. A double gun doesn't have some fifteen centimetres of action in front of the trigger before the barrel begins, which doesn't make the problems of the junior shooter any easier.

However, this Remington LT model is coming in and Newcastle Gun Club already has some of their member's wives and women friends using these pieces.

Changing over to the new rules will reduce the angle the clays will travel in, to a maximum of 90° for Singles, while the height is set at three metres with an upper and lower limit of half a metre to this figure at a distance of ten metres. This limitation as well as the standard distance to be 15 metres for all open championships, will make competitions much more even since club traps with little peculiarities of behaviour will be readily picked out and the oddities corrected.

This will result in longer matches, and the more skilled our juniors become, the more they will be penalised because of their size. What is implied in this statement is that the smaller shooter is always penalised more by recoil than the bigger one. Admittedly, we are not back in the days when a captain of infantry made the comment that he could always tell what number of guns had fired in damp weather by counting those troops still standing. However, the shot weight for match work is 32 grams and this means 1.128 ozs of shot not larger than number 6. This shot charge is driven by a 3 dram equivalent to give a muzzle velocity of some 1200 f.s. (—365.7 m.s.) in 12 bore shells.

Some shooters prefer to use the 2¾ dram loading as it tends to give tighter patterns with its muzzle velocity averaging out at 1145 f.s. or 349 m.s. Recoil too is a little less.

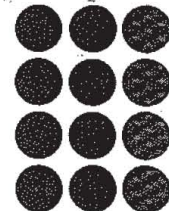

# THE ELEY REPORT

One of ELEY's greatest friends in the shooting world sadly passed away on May 25th last. Newton Thomas was a legend in his own lifetime in the sport and a greater gentleman never walked this earth. He joined ICIANZ as an ELEY Technical Research Officer in the late 1940's when ELEY was the sole manufacturer of sporting ammunition in Australia. Newton became virtually the showroom window for the ELEY excellence which matched any opposition production from anywhere else in the world. His lists of National Championships are still a record, as is his participation in Mackintosh teams. However, this was just one aspect in which he excelled. His value to ELEY came from his vast knowledge of ballistics in all aspects of ammunition and his research and technical advice in this area took him all over Australia seeking out conditions and the variables in our climatic regions, living, shooting, and generally sharing life with the users of ammunition throughout this vast continent.

From his research and knowledge he passed on to our manufacturing plant the needs of shooters in Australia and these were developed and adjusted so that ELEY became synonymous with shooting in Australia. Consequently, because of the travel and the nature of the man himself, Newton mixed personally with shooters from every walk of life and was held in esteem not only for his obvious shooting capabilities but for his personal characteristics. It could truly be said that he never wavered from the strong ideals he set wherever he went and he was just as much at home sipping tea with the Governor-General as he was swapping shooting tales around the campfire.

Newton Thomas became totally involved with the improvement of shooters and shooting generally within Australia, and with Charles Whittle he started off the schools' shooting programs over twenty years ago. He organised and participated in innumerable instructional days at clubs teaching literally thousands of shooters.

Newton retired from ELEY on the 3rd October, 1978. We were never able to replace him adequately. A life of ease and relaxation was not for Newton, and he was soon heavily involved with the Australian Clay Target Association and a leader in its national coaching scheme. Probably Newton did more to gain national recognition for the A.C.T.A. than any other single individual. For example, in the first twelve months of his appointment as National Coaching Director, he worked in a completely honorary capacity. It was only after Government grants were made to the A.C.T.A. and a much larger national scheme was able to be organised, that the A.C.T.A. and Newton took advantage of this to develop one of the most sophisticated State Director and zone coaching organisations of any sport in Australia as a whole network right down to club level was developed with accredited coaches. Consequently now the A.C.T.A. is one of the few national sporting bodies that can boast of a highly organised efficient and successful national coaching scheme and this has been almost entirely due to the energy and foresight of Newton Thomas and the time and effort he spent in forcing the scheme through, despite his failing health.

Newton has coached and managed many international teams overseas and was always highly respected as a

guiding influence for all members. His total pride in everything Australian gained the respect of other countries' officials and competitors, and he became a truly great international figure in our sport. More recently, Newton was Assistant Manager to the shooting section of the Commonwealth Games and was selected as coach for the shooting team for the 1980 Olympic Games. It was only in late 1980 that Newton, because of his continuing ill health, resigned from his position as National Coaching Director, and he underwent some open-heart surgery, after which he spent some three months fighting his way back to reasonable fitness. Despite this setback and the boycott of the 1980 Olympics, Newton still filled with enthusiasm and vigor, worked extensively on the alternate trip for the shooting team to United States and Mexico from which he has only just recently returned.

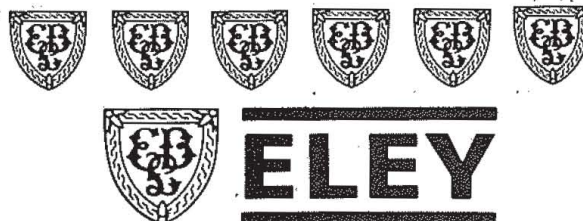
Perhaps it is fitting that this team was possibly the most successful international team that has left Australia as one of Newton's dreams was to see our flag be given proper respect in top international competition. He saw it go up many times in these Mexican Championships and he had an especially happy time during it, but one wonders how much strain he must have been under whilst the team was enjoying so much success.

Newton was never known to miss a duck opening and, even after his long illness this year, he was out there with everyone else on opening day to maintain the tradition. He only shot one duck and was quite amused when it turned out to be a humble mountain duck. Not one to look back, Newton lived life to the full and there were still a lot of things for him to do, a lot of people to see, and a lot of ideas which he kept bringing out to help the shooting sports right until the last day before his final heart attack.

We would suggest that, as when he left ELEY, he will prove to be irreplaceable in the shooting world, as there are many champions but legends are few and far between.

As a company we have made a suggestion for a Newton Thomas Memorial Award to be presented each year at the A.C.T.A. Championships and we hope that the National Executive will accept our proposal, so that this fine gentleman's name will live forever in the annals of the sport he loved so much.

Vale Newton from all your friends. You will be sorely missed.

## THE JUNIOR SHOOTER (Cont'd)

Now to the junior or lady shooter, recoil is the name of the game.

I remember one bright character whose lass showed interest in having a crack at the traps. Her male slipped an ICIL Special into a light Spanish field gun without a recoil pad and handed her the piece. She was wearing only the lightest of blouses and when the piece went off she was distinctly unhappy. Even before we left the club house she was wearing a big black bruise. Her male thought it a hell of a joke, but she was a very attractive lass and her father owned half the district. Before the night was out, she wasn't sporting his engagement ring and we had lost a potential member.

Now a 12 bore gun weighing 3.4 kg ( $-7\frac{1}{2}$  lbs) has a recoil of 19.2 ft. lbs or 2.65 kgm. This markedly more than the 15 ft. lbs ( $-2.07$  kgm) which was found by experiment to be the maximum free recoil level for soldiers at the turn of the century, when most European powers were setting-up new small bore military cartridges. It is not reasonable to suppose that a lad of today is any tougher or better able to withstand gun-headache than the adults of that period. The preferable level was found to be ten to twelve pounds which equates to a figure of 1.38 to 1.66 kgm.

In short, the level of the twelve bore trap cartridge as favoured by most adults under the rules today is at a level which will give a lot of adults, gun-headache over a protracted session, much less a junior. It is significant that on the bench rest the .222 Remington rifle cartridge gives better results for new-comers than other cartridges of equal accuracy but markedly more recoil.

The young shooter needs a cartridge with less recoil and that can be pursued in two directions. There is the low recoil cartridge as marketed by Winchester, where the velocity is reduced or alternately we can leave the velocity at the 1200 f.s. level and reduce the shot weight. The problem is compounded by the fact that an eight pound (or three and a half kilogram) gun is too heavy for protracted use by shooters of light physique.

They would be better served by a lighter gun more in line with the weight levels of centre-fire rifles at about the three kilogram level.

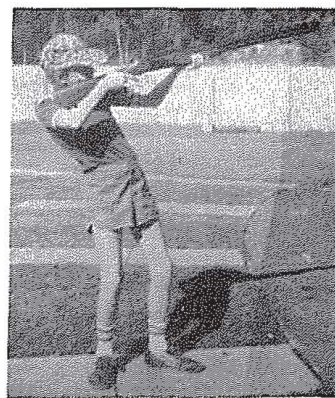
If the gun weight is brought back to a more reasonable level of 6 $\frac{3}{4}$  lbs (or 3 kg) then we have a piece which is within the weight levels which can be handled by a junior or lady shooter without undue fatigue. To go back to this weight in readily available guns we have to move down to the 20 gauge. To bring the recoil level down to one which does not cause gun-headache then we need to get back to an ounce or 28.35 gram loading. To keep the recoil level in line with a maximum of about 2.07 kgm, then a 28.35 gram shot charge would carry a powder loading equivalent of two and a half drams, which would give a recoil velocity level of 15.7 ft. lbs (2.17 kgm) and a shot velocity of 1165 f.s. ( $-355$  ms).

This would represent a top level for many juniors of the 15 plus group, and possibly too much for the girls and the under fifteen group who would be better suited by a shot charge of  $\frac{7}{8}$  oz ( $-24.8$  grams) at 1210 f.s. ( $-368.8$  m.s.) which would give a recoil energy figure of 13.2 ft. lbs ( $-1.8$  kgm). This is a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  dram equivalent loading.

Well the theory of the business is one thing, but what do the customers think about it. Here, there will be trouble straight away as many boys want to use the same cartridge as their fathers. If dear father uses a twelve bore firing a three dram equivalent loading behind 31.9 grams of shot in a four kg gun, then his son will try to do the same thing rather than lose face by using a lighter gun and load. To date there has been very little real thinking about the future of the sport, but inevitably the same pressures will be brought to bear on trap and skeet shooting as has faced the NRA.

Ranges have been closed steadily over the years as people buy up land adjacent to ranges and then having bought cheaply due to the fact that there was a range adjacent, they start a campaign against the noise and in time they succeed in getting the range closed. Up goes the value of their properties and everyone bar the shooters are delighted. If the junior shooter is brought into the shooting game more fully, then much of the power of the vociferous anti-gun lobby will be

stopped. It is one thing to complain against a group of males, but quite another when family groups are involved. If ever the shooting movement needed the younger shooters then it does now — of both sexes!

If this premise is accepted, then all the rest needs to be looked at and some provision made for the younger shooters of both sexes. In the United States, competitions are run in four gauges or bores. Competitions are held in 12, 20, 28 and .410 bore. Winchester, which is now our sole Australian ammunition manufacturer, has already decided to extend its huge plant at Geelong in Victoria and add twenty gauge and .410 shells to the line-up.

There need be no shortage of suitable shooting equipment as this must be the only country in the world where initially lack of competition in the ammunition field has allowed to get to such a point in an endeavour to maximise profits that only one gauge was manufactured. It is a highly fortunate circumstance that a second manufacturer appeared and this concentration on a single gauge is now gone.

Very largely the future of the gun clubs and shotgun shooting is in the hands of the National Executive of the A.C.T.A. The action by Winchester in promoting junior matches in Victoria and lately in South Australia is commendable, but can only have a long term effect by widening the range of shotgun shells offered to cover at least the three main gauges, 12, 20 and .410. If there is an adequate number of competitions promoted in those gauges by the governing body in each state.

Once the range of competition is widened, the suitable guns will rapidly become available as this will provide a fresh stimulus to the gun trade, which has been languishing for some time. This slackening has been a direct result of buyer resistance in what is an over-priced commodity. This is not Europe where only the wealthy can afford to shoot, but in time the same restrictive will apply if police succeed in their efforts to go back to the war-time limitations of the 1940's when all guns and rifles had to be registered separately. Even in England and Germany, this does not apply and game is ever so much more restricted in those two countries than here. The answer is in promotion of shooting so that in one form or another, it is open to men and women, boys and girls.

Lighter guns and smaller gauges will widen the opportunities of many to take part, removing the physical handicap that is imposed by sex or age. The more popular the sport becomes, then the greater chance all those interested have in staving off the sort of legislation presently being proposed by Mr. Page, secretary of the Police Federation of Australia and New Zealand. This proposes that all firearms should be registered as are pistols. Among other issues is that anyone requiring more than three firearms be called upon to show good reason.

This anti-gun lobbying should be met head-on and the more members we have by widening the shooting possibilities, the more likely that our sport will continue without all these regulations. No amount of regulation ever stopped a law breaker, only the law-abiding ever heed these regulations, which never go before a Parliament as they should if this country was a democracy in the full sense of the word. ●

# SHOOTING GREAT DIES

Noel J. Southey

One of the best known and most respected personalities ever to appear on shooting grounds through Australia died on May 25, 1981, aged 66. He was Jenkin Newton Thomas, O.A.M.

Since he underwent heart surgery in St. Vincent's Hospital, Melbourne late last year, Newton had been troubled with a deep seated infection in the chest cavity. It was complications arising from this infection that finally took his life.

The interest that Newton had in shooting goes back to his boyhood, when he was raised on the family property at Barham in New South Wales.

He had been a proficient handler of firearms since the age of 8, and was widely acknowledged as a better than average hunter very early.

It was during the years of his youth that Newton developed a broad knowledge of Australian flora and fauna, a knowledge that in later life was to make him a valuable adviser to various government conservation agencies.

After gaining his Matriculation Certificate, he left school, but demonstrated an almost insatiable appetite for learning. Newton read extensively and through books and personal observation developed still further his already extensive knowledge of the Australian outback and native animals.

Because of his bush-shooting experience, Newton became expert in the use of all types of firearms on the target range. However, it was his love of shotguns which predominated, and he became a formidable opponent, firstly in live pigeon competitions, and more recently in regular clay target tournaments.

In the early part of the second world war, Newton enlisted in the Army and his knowledge of firearms was put to immediate use. After a short stint in Darwin, he was transferred to a Repatriation hospital in Melbourne with suspected typhoid.

Although it turned out to be a false alarm, Newton was transferred to civilian employment within the Department of the Army, and was given a senior ballistics job in Brisbane.

After the war, Newton Thomas joined I.C.I., which was then the only major cartridge manufacturer in Australia.

Newton's position was titled "Field Technical Officer" and provided him with an opportunity to combine business with pleasure, and he became widely recognised as a top authority on all matters relating to shooting.

A number of new products were given tough field tests by the young expert, who also filled a useful public relations role for I.C.I. due to his total honesty and credibility.

However, it was probably through his competition shooting activities that Newton Thomas was most widely known.

He modelled his target shooting style on that of champion pigeon shooter "Calrossie" Sutherland, who was also an I.C.I. personality.

After moving to clay target shooting, Newton amassed an enviable record of appearances in Australian Mackintosh Trophy teams, winning his way into twenty two teams, in which he achieved the exalted position of Team High Gun on seven occasions.

Newton Thomas' greatest single attribute apart from his integrity, was his ability to concentrate totally on the task at hand. This approach ensured success and these successes were usually at the highest level.

As an example, Newton won the following events in Australian Trap and Skeet Championships:

Champion of Champion Cup — 3 times

Double Barrel Championship — 4 times

Single Barrel Championship — 3 times

Double Rise Championship — Once

Skeet Championship — Once

Australia — New Zealand Trap Championship — Once



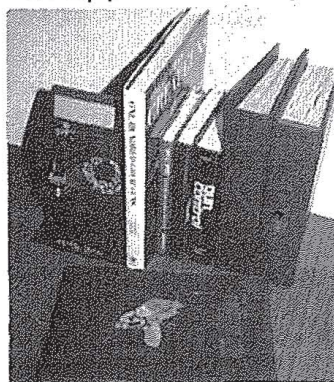

In the mould of a true champion, Newton turned to administrative activities as his way of putting back into the sport a return for the enjoyment he had derived from it as a participant.

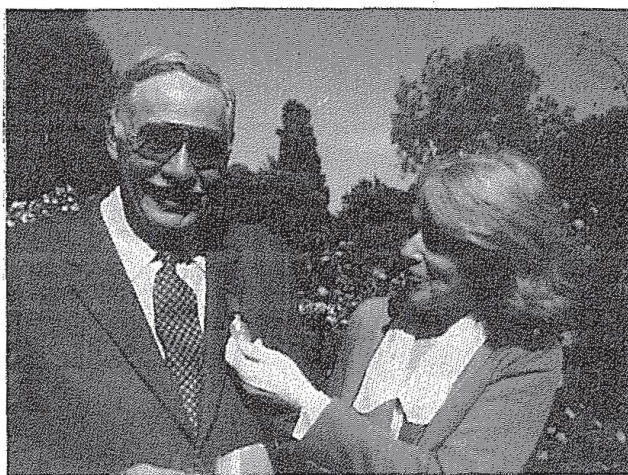
In 1974, he was appointed as coach of the Australian shooting team which competed in the World Championships held in Bern, Switzerland.

That team was managed by Mr. W. R. Morgan of Tasmania, who later joined the A.C.T.A. National Coaching Council, of which Newton was the Chairman.

Then in 1975, Newton was selected to attend an advanced coaching program at one of the world's most renowned firearms training centres, the Fort Benning Advanced Marksmanship Unit, run by the U.S. Army.

During his visit, the Australian established a lasting friendship with Colonel Bill Pullum and Colonel Parmentier — Bill Pullum is the author of the advanced marksmanship book titles "Three Position Rifle Shooting".

### SHOOTING GREAT DIES (Cont'd)

The contacts established by Newton during his visit have proved to be most helpful in connection with arrangements leading to more recent visits to the centre by Australian shooting athletes and coaches.

Since the Switzerland tour, Newton held a number of other official team positions including manager of the shooting section of Australia's 1978 Commonwealth Games team, which competed in Edmonton, Canada.

However, Newton's biggest contribution to the development of clay target shooting came from his appointment as National Director of Coaching, firstly in an honorary capacity, in September 1977.

Then in January 1979, he became the Association's first full time Coaching Director, a position which was made possible by a generous financial grant of \$60,000 over three years from the Australian Government.

Newton immediately created and implemented a National Coaching Council, and with the support of its members, proceeded to introduce a novice training scheme. In this project, substantial assistance was obtained from "Bricky" Gunn the Coaching Director of the New Zealand Clay Target Association, and Tibor Gonczol, Coaching Director of the Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia.

At a later stage, Newton enlisted the aid of the Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly, and worked closely with Mrs. Val Beitzel to prepare a clay target proposal

for a level one coaches accreditation scheme, which was eventually accepted by the government sponsored Australian Coaching Council.

In the last two years of his life, the shooting sports' hero achieved the pinnacles of personal achievement.

Firstly, in January 1980, the sport of clay target shooting gained national prominence when Jenkin Newton Thomas was listed in the Australia Day Honors list as a recipient of the ORDER OF AUSTRALIA MEDAL — an award of which Newton was extremely proud as it accentuated his intensive loyalty to Australia.

The second achievement occurred in April 1981, when Newton was coach of an Australian shooting team competing in a top class international competition in Mexico. The team brought home several medals including 3 gold and 1 silver.

Australian shotgunner extraordinaire, Jim Ellis produced an incredible performance to win the Gold Medal in the Olympic Trench competition, a victory which was a total reward for the dedication and patience shown by the combination of coach Thomas and athlete Ellis.

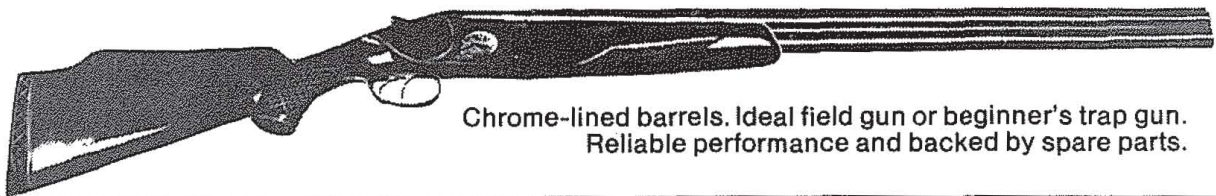
Jenkin Newton Thomas has left his mark on the shooting sports in Australia and internationally.

His willingness to listen, his ability to advise and counsel, his obvious intelligence and compassion, his depth of understanding, his dedication and concentration, his loyalty and support, but most of all, his type of humble sportsmanship will long be remembered.

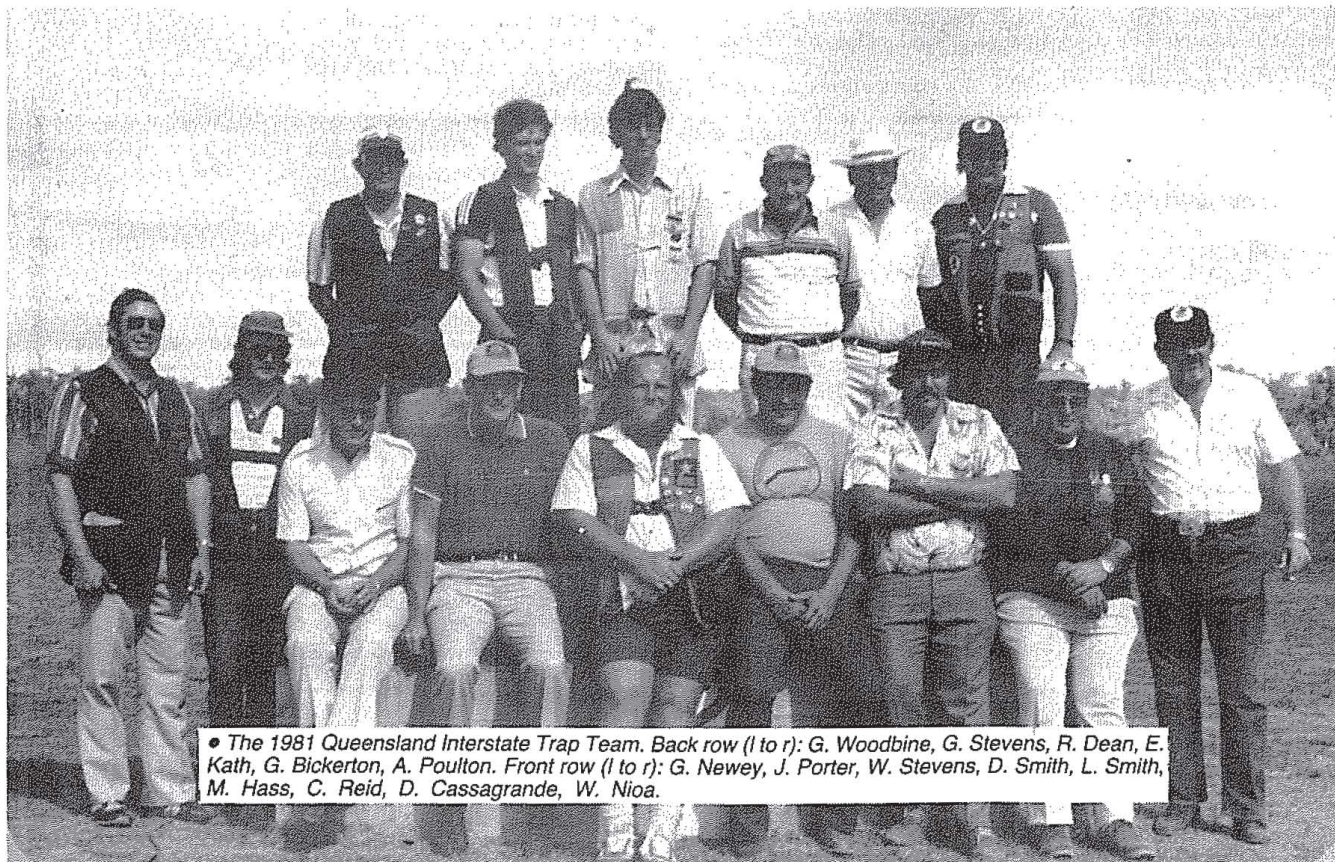

# COMMITTEE COLUMN

*One of the innovations introduced by the late Ron Porter was a C.T.S.N. column in which members of the Association's Management Committee express their views on a particular subject.*

*This month's contribution has been prepared by National Vice-President, Roy Holtfreter, of Northam, Western Australia.*

As a member of your Management Committee I would like to make a few comments about Clay Target Shooting News. It has been said that this has become a production far too expensive for us, is "full of garbage", and does not provide its readers with the type of reading they require.

The critics claim that the prime purpose of C.T.S.N. is to provide a results summary of recent shooting events and details of forthcoming programmes. Thirty odd years ago this was all that was provided but surely the editorial section, although limited by the number of contributors, despite repeated requests by the Executive Director as Editor, for articles of interest, is entertaining, sometimes provocative to draw necessary comment, and generally in the interests of our sport.

Just about four years ago the Australian Clay Target Association's official journal consisted of about 48 pages of results and programmes in a two colour cover and supported with commercial advertisements inserted by those trade supporters of long standing who probably considered the cost as a donation to clay target shooting.

I believe that in the intervening period, due to increased interest and support by affiliated clubs and other contributors the magazine now provides something of interest to all readers. As a direct consequence of the wider variety of subjects now being covered and the subsequent analysis by our commercial advertisers that the readership has increased, we have the position of a larger edition, presented in a 4 colour cover, which is self supporting, instead of a major cost to the Association.

It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that we now have a magazine in which the general format suits the majority of shooters, and if the intention of management to develop the editorial section with support from those shooters capable and interested enough to contribute, and continued backing from our commercial sponsors, comes to fruition, we may yet see this magazine on newsagent's shelves as the official mouthpiece of the shotgunner.

At no time has Clay Target Shooting News been held out as a medium solely for the use of Management, and if there are members, clubs or anyone connected with the sport who disagree with opinions (such as this) expressed in the magazine, I would expect those people to take advantage of the opportunity to express their counter-views through the same pages. Constructive criticism would never be viewed by me, and I am sure all other members of your Executive, with anything but favour.

It has been said that Clay Target Shooting News should be restricted to cover the interests of affiliated gun clubs and their members. However as I see it we should use C.T.S.N. to promote all types of shooting, with a heavy bias towards all forms of the shotgun disciplines, both in Australia and overseas, and maybe attract membership from other shooting organisations. It is essential that we be seen to be part of a shooting family rather than operating in complete isolation and it surely is completely logical for each division of the shooting sports to be publicly in support of the others, particularly with the frequency and nature of community attacks on us generally, because of recent events. Perhaps I am wrong in my assessment of your requirements from Clay Target Shooting News and if so would appreciate your comments. However if we are on the right track perhaps you would be prepared to assist with a contribution.

# TRIBUTE TO NEWTON THOMAS

## *All time's wasted wot's not spent shootin'*

This colloquialism sums up the life of Newton Thomas, however, in more recent times, Newton had altered his priorities and had accepted a role that changed the meaning of the above saying to:

All time's wasted wot's not spent workin' for shootin'

Newton Thomas was a true sportsman who excelled in any sporting activity he tried. He was an accomplished cricketer, played a very good game of tennis, and hit a golf ball hard and straight.

But it was his shooting feats that made him the internationally recognised sportsman that he was at the time of his death.

Newton Thomas started shooting at the age of 8, and quickly developed a hunting skill. Later he moved naturally into competition shooting, and became an enthusiastic and competent live pigeon competitor.

By the early forties, Newton had discovered Clay Target Shooting. In fact, I'm told that one of the first skeet matches he contested was at the original Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham, where he and others shot over traps imported by General Motors — this was about the time General Motors was taking over from the local ownership of the Holden plant.

Newton's record in Clay Target Shooting is unique in that he had covered the complete spectrum from competitor to coach to manager of International Teams.

He is the only person ever to have won every championship on the Nationals Tournament Program —

He won the first Australian Skeet Championship, which was held at Perth in 1970 — score 60/61.

His performance in connection with the Mackintosh Teams International Trophy is equally impressive. He first gained a place in the Australian Team in 1948, when the event was held at the Australian Gun Club in East Burwood, Victoria. His score was 90/100 (in those days, broken targets were scored, not points). The match was won by England.

Then followed a total of 24 appearances over the following 28 years.

Newton only missed the team in 1952, 1956, 1961 and 1974.

In 1951, he became the first shooter to record '100 straight' for any competing nation in the Mackintosh Competition.

Then, in 1959, he and a Mr. Kerr of New Zealand became the first team members to shoot 100 with the first barrel. Newton won the high gun award in the Australian team a total of ten times, and ran 100 straight eleven times, including a clean points score four times.

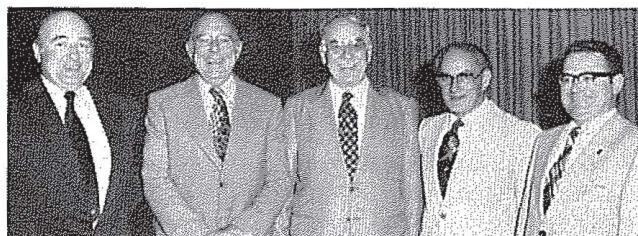
On the administrative side, Newton built a most enviable International record, starting with an involvement as an official during the 1956 Olympic Games.

Then in 1973, he coached the Australian Olympic Trench Team that was so successful in the world moving target championships, held at Melbourne Gun Club.

In 1974, he accompanied the Australian team that competed in the world titles at Bern in Switzerland — again as coach.

In 1977, he managed a shotgun team that went to Antibes, France, and the following year, was manager of the shooting

section of the Australian team that competed in the Edmonton Commonwealth Games.

In 1979, he managed Australia's shotgun entry in the World Championships held in Montecatini in Italy, and then, again as Manager, took a team to Christchurch in 1980 for the South Pacific Regional Championships.

But Newton's "Putting Back" into the sport went much deeper! After many years' service with the ICI organization, during which he conducted many hundreds of student training programs on the subject of safe handling of firearms, Newton Thomas accepted a position as the honorary coaching director for the Australian Clay Target Association. This was in 1977.

In 1979, the position became full time, and Newton joined the associations staff unit. He remained in that post until December 1980, when he had to retire due to the health problem that finally led to his premature death.

The highlights of Newton's international involvement came earlier this year when his health improved sufficiently to allow him to accompany an eleven-strong Australian squad to the Benito Juarez Tournament staged in Mexico.

This is one of the top shooting matches in the world, and Newton's lifetime of patience and leadership was rewarded when the Australians won several gold and silver medals.

Apart from the gold medal won brilliantly by Jim Ellis in the Olympic Trench Match, the breakthrough was produced by young running boar shooter Bryan Wilson, who, under Newton's guidance, carded a score many points above his previous best, even in training, and won the gold medal in the junior division.

Very few people have any comprehension of the tremendous willpower that Newton had to display when he accepted an office job. Previously, he had enjoyed the complete freedom of the outdoors, and the transition to an office job was most difficult for him.

However, his dedication to the sport won through, and Newton applied himself very well to the task of creating and implementing a coaching program for the A.C.T.A.

As you know, he was awarded an "Order of Australia" medal for his contribution to the development of Clay Busting. This award was a fitting reward for the man's unselfish efforts to promote the shooting sports and brought great credit to Clay Target Shooting.

During his long sporting career, Newton showed an honesty, a dedication, a level of concentration and a total sportsmanship that was a wonderful example to the young people with whom he spent so much time.

At times like this, grief is paramount, particularly with the immediate family, that is Audrey, Jane and Newton Jnr.

Still, I remember at the recent funeral of the Late Ron Porter, the Reverend Barry Dangerfield pointing out that just because a person has physically departed from us, we are not deprived of his spirit and his memories for a long, long time.

Rarely have I walked in the shadow of one so tall.

## NATIONAL SQUAD

Since the appointment of Peter Quire (South Australia) as Manager/Coach of the national training squad, the International Sub Committee has the task of naming the members of the squad.

Financing the squad continues to be a major problem, and it is obvious that in the early stages, the self-help principle will rule supreme.

Nevertheless, the fact that Ellis and Rumbel have been awarded training grants by the Federal Government provides a new incentive for competition in Olympic Trench and International Skeet.

Following the successful introduction this year, the National Athlete Award Scheme may be expanded in 1982, and it should be the objective of management to see the names of two skeeties appear in the award list of 1982.

## 1981 AIR NEW ZEALAND TRAP TEAM

Arrangements for the Australian squad to visit the 1981 Grand American Tournament are almost complete.

The team, under the leadership of Trevor Reschke of Mt. Gambier, will leave Australia on August 16 (flying Air New Zealand's new Boeing 747B) and will arrive at Vandalia on August 18. The team will officially contest two matches, and is expected to do very well.

## 1981 NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1981 Championships in Olympic Trench and International Skeet will be held at Melbourne Gun Club on September 4, 5 and 6. This match will be the final event leading to selection of the Australian teams to compete in the 1981 South Pacific Regional Championships.

Also, the match will be important in terms of selection of the shotgunners to represent Australia in the 1982 Commonwealth Games.

## ELLIS RANKED EIGHTH IN WORLD

A recent issue of the "American Shotgunner" magazine carried a listing of the world's top ten in Olympic Trench and International Skeet.

For the first time ever, an Australian achieved a ranking, with Jim Ellis filling eighth place.

Since the listing appeared, Ellis has captured his Gold Medal in Mexico, so one would think that he may now be ranked sixth. C'mon Aussies, C'mon!!

## 1981 NEW CALEDONIA TOURNAMENT

President of the Club de Tir Caledonien, Dr. Patrick Meaume, has advised C.T.S.N. that the 1981 New Caledonian Clay Target Championships will be held in Noumea in October.

The match, which is the eighth in the series, will span the period from October 18 to October 23. Four clay target games will be included — they are Ball trap (the wobble trap match!), Universal Trench, Olympic Skeet and Parcours de Chasse. Practice will be available on October 16 and 17.

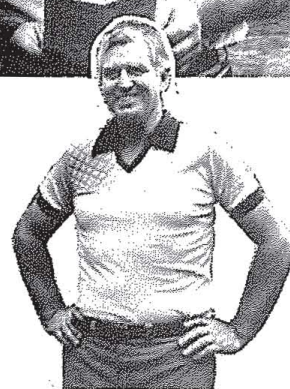

# ALL 747s ARE NOT CREATED EQUAL

On May 31, AIR NEW ZEALAND entered a new era, when it took delivery of the first of its new Boeing 747 Super B's.

The introduction of the Boeing 747 Super B to the AIR NEW ZEALAND fleet has prompted a modification to the airline's livery.

The most noticeable change is the disappearance of the "canoe stern post" effect created by the band of colour sweeping down the fuselage and up the tail.

The tail is now a separate feature but the white koru still appears out of a solid blue mass trimmed with turquoise.

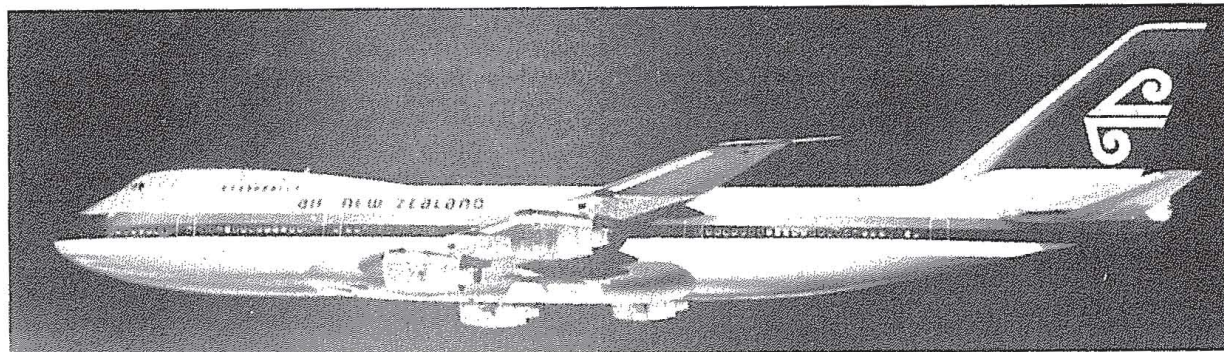
The New Zealand national flag will be prominently displayed on the aircraft fuselage after the airline's name.

Not only has AIR NEW ZEALAND changed its livery but it has also made changes to the interior decor of the new aircraft.

## FIRST CLASS

AIR NEW ZEALAND'S first class cabin in the Boeing 747 Super B will offer exclusive luxury to 16 passengers in bed-length recliner chairs, each clad in a soft sheepskin fleece.

The chairs, designed and manufactured by the West German company, Recaro, are accepted internationally as being the most comfortable sleeperette chair available.

Recaro, spent two years designing the aircraft chair and each one costs about \$8,000.

AIR NEW ZEALAND will be the first airline operating across the Pacific to offer first class passengers the revolutionary Recaro seat.

The cabin is fully screened off from the main aircraft entrance and other cabins and is equipped with its own gallery and toilets.

The space and luxury of the cabin is set off by a three dimensional woven photographic mural on the front bulkhead showing a tranquil New Zealand forest scene.

## PACIFIC CLASS

AIR NEW ZEALAND'S Pacific Class located in the upstairs lounge of its new Boeing 747 Super B aircraft, will cater to economy class passengers seeking greater comfort, prestige and service.

Access to the private cabin is by a rectangular staircase instead of the old spiral steps. This is more attractive and easier to navigate, particularly for elderly people or those carrying hand baggage.

Once upstairs, passengers enter a small, intimate self-contained cabin with its own dedicated cabin staff, full gallery equipment and toilets.

Passengers in Pacific Class will receive complimentary in-flight service benefits such as special headsets for film and audio use, liquor and wines and a choice of main course for meals.

The cabin service will be considerably upgraded from economy class and will include glassware, linen serviettes, cigarettes, after dinner mints, a selection of hors d'oeuvres, canapes and cheeses, as well as first class gifts such as sockettes and eye shades.

## ECONOMY CLASS

A total of 388 economy seats laid out in four spacious cabins on AIR NEW ZEALAND'S new Boeing 747 Super B aircraft.

From the front to the rear of the aircraft, the cabins seats 60, 112, 88 and 128 passengers. The first cabin behind First Class with 60 seats will be a preferential area for the airline's frequent travellers.

The economy seat is the latest design Fairchild Burns 200 Mark II manufactured in the United States and one of the lightest seats yet developed.

The Fairchild seat features special padding in the back to produce a slightly "winged" effect which allows maximum comfort and ensures a sleeping passenger remains in his own seat.

## INTERIOR DECOR

AIR NEW ZEALAND has selected the flora and fauna of New Zealand as the medium to add this dimension to the cabins of its new fleet of 428 seat Boeing 747 Super B aircraft.

Some years ago, AIR NEW ZEALAND commissioned New Zealand artist Bruce Harvey to paint a series of native New Zealand birds to be used on the airline's menu covers. His prints of the Kea, Kingfisher, Kiwi, Tui, White Heron and Fantail will be reproduced in mural form to cover the inflight movie screens throughout the airline's new 747 fleet.

## ENGINEERING/TRAINING

AIR NEW ZEALAND has spent over a million dollars in the last nine months sending its engineers around the world to complete training on the Boeing 747 aircraft and its engines.

Training has been only part of a huge preparation for AIR NEW ZEALAND'S engineering division. Over \$11 million has been spent on the support systems for the airline's fleet of five Boeing 747 Super B aircraft, covering equipment, tools and the setting up of a \$4 million engine overhaul shop.

A range of costly equipment has to be bought, such as jacks to lift the aircraft off the ground for undercarriage tests which cost \$200,000 each.

Behind these preparations a massive amount of documentation has to be compiled — refuelling manuals, spare-part inventories, maintenance manuals, a monitoring system for all the parts changed on the aircraft and a recording system to mark the history of every single component.

Thirty crews, comprising 120 pilots and 30 engineers, will have been fully trained to fly the B747 by the time they are introduced.

This has involved technical courses in Auckland with the assistance of Boeing instructors and flight simulator training with Boeing in Seattle or Qantas in Sydney. The pilots also undergo flight training on actual B747 aircraft before being licensed. AIR NEW ZEALAND'S own simulator will not arrive until the middle of next year.

AIR NEW ZEALAND'S first Boeing 747 Super B will carry the "milestone" 1000th Rolls Royce RB211 jet engine.

But it will have a limited tenure on the wing of AIR NEW ZEALAND'S first 747, for the jet is to be retrofitted with Dash 524D engines of 24,040 kgs lb thrust when these become available next year.

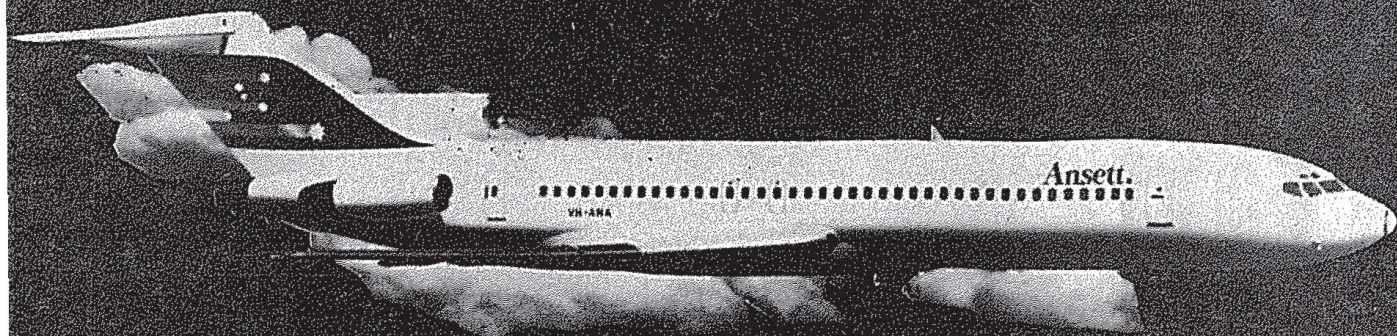

# Service Award of the Month

Since January 1, 1980, the Australian Clay Target Association has been using the computing capacity of Control Data Australia.

This arrangement was a direct consequence of a changed format for the Association's processing, recommended in a study report by Computer Contractors late in 1979.

The A.C.T.A. Administrative Unit operates a "hard copy" terminal in its Blackburn office, which is linked by Telecom cable to the "numbers cruncher" located at C.D.A.'s new computing centre at Knoxfield. A hard copy terminal is one which has the capacity to produce a typed report — as opposed to a VDU, or visual display unit, which provides a picture of the required data or report on a TV like screen.

Through the installation of this terminal, the Association had obtained a degree of flexibility of processing, which it lacked previously, due to being totally reliant on an outside bureau for ALL its data preparation processing, and report production.

The Association now has the potential to process members' registration renewals within moments of their receipt in the National Office. However, due to the need to control costs of processing, the timing of processing runs is regulated to suit 'traffic' requirements. (It should be noted, however, that most report printing is done by Control Data on **high speed printers**.)

In peak times — that is, December through to April, batches of membership "transactions" are processed three to four times a month. At other times, processing is limited to twice monthly. In addition, a full membership roll (totalling almost 400 pages) and a set of wrappers for use with the monthly issue of "Clay Target Shooting News" produced monthly. To give readers some idea of output comparisons, the preparation of C.T.S.N. wrappers in 1976 totalled 8000 and took **five** girls four full days. Today 10,000 wrappers can be produced during an overnight processing run.

The Association's computer systems are designed to accommodate additional needs, as they arise, including the possibility of a centrally controlled performance classification system. In other words, shooters' handicap and grades could be processed through the computer, instead of by hard working club officials.

Computer Contractors Pty. Ltd. has continued to provide technical support to the Association since the implementation of the present systems, and recently undertook a review of some programs, where savings have since resulted.

Many critics of the expense of running the computer-based membership accounting system overlook the size of the master file (usually around 13,000 individual blocks of data) and the extent to which printed reports are produced. The direct comparison of costs for 1980 are:

Computer Costs — \$17,498 (including \$4,500 support costs)

Comparative Manual Costs — based on 1976 staff levels and salaries — \$40,000 (at 1981 rates, this is equal to \$60,000).  
NET SAVINGS \$12,500 (plus vastly improved services)

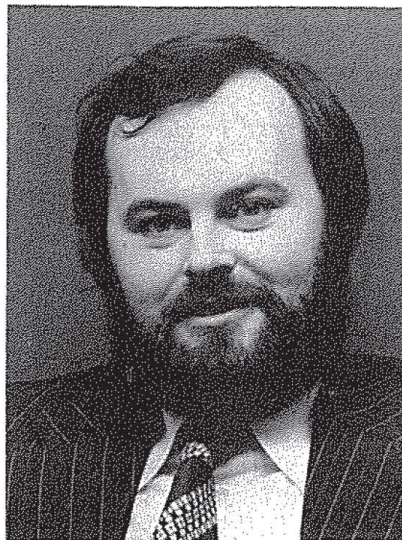
Meanwhile, the 'numbers cruncher' end of the system is being handled by one of Australia's leading computer companies — Control Data Australia, to which the **SERVICE AWARD OF THE MONTH** for July is given.

The personal contact between the company and the A.C.T.A. is in the hands of Mr. Jamie Bridgman, a sales consultant with not only a firm grasp of computing techniques, but also a flair for understanding the rather unique needs of a client such as the Association.

Mr. Bridgman is a regular visitor to the A.C.T.A.'S Blackburn headquarters, and maintains a constant watch on the growth of the processing requirements.

The actual processing site has only been operating since September 1980 — previously, processing was handled at a location in St. Kilda Road, Melbourne.

The new location is only a few minutes' drive from A.C.T.A. headquarters, which makes the delivery of stationary and the collection of reports very convenient.

Named The Australian Computing Centre, the building was conceived, designed and constructed to provide optimum network processing facilities for users of the Cybernet System (which is the system to which the A.C.T.A. connects) the CALLL/370 and PLATO services, and to meet the expanding needs for distributed data processing through the eighties.

Construction of the 0.8 hectare site commenced in February 1980, and the 2900 square metre building was completed and ready for occupancy on the target date of September 1, in the same year.

### FOR THE TECHNICAL

The Centre houses three powerful CYBER systems, including a 170 Mode 760 mainframe, which has dramatically enhanced overall processing capacity. Central processing power of the Cyber 760 exceeds that of the Cyber 73 by as much as 700%.

Increased communication's line capacity and more sophisticated error detection equipment has been installed to provide improved error detection and quicker data transfer capacity.

Sophisticated security systems are provided to meet high levels of data integrity, protecting both data transmission and access to processing systems.

Security of the building is complete and includes:

- \* All access for normal purposes is channelled through one entrance.
- \* All other secured access points are monitored through a surveillance system which also monitors for emergency situations such as fire.
- \* A mimic panel containing the detection systems is located within the computer room and has direct external links to both fire and security services.
- \* Card key protection is provided to foyer and the computer room.
- \* Detection systems are installed in strategic areas, and are activated whenever the premises are vacated.
- \* The Centre also possesses an array of back-up services to ensure the continual operation in the event of electrical, mechanical or water services failure.

To sum up, the Australian Computer Centre is amongst the most modern and sophisticated in the Southern Hemisphere, and the Association is proud to be connected with such a professional organisation. ○



## TWENTY YEARS AT MUNDUBBERA

The Central Burnett Gun Club is 20 years old in June. Jeff Johnson (Secretary) has provided the following information.

In 1957 some enterprising gentlemen borrowed a plus trap from Kingaroy. This was installed at the Jockey club at Gayndah and a program was shot in conjunction with the orange festival, to aid the golf club.

The next orange festival was in 1959. Once again the trap was borrowed from Kingaroy and an event was shot in conjunction with the festival.

On Queen's Birthday weekend 1961, a program was once more shot in conjunction with the orange festival, this time for a small trophy. This weekend has been retained as the club's annual shoot ever since.


In July 1961, a shoot was held at McGilvray's orchard. The program was designed so shooters would use only 25 cartridges, to keep cost down. This was so successful that another shoot was held in August.

On the 9th of September 1961 a meeting was held at the property of Mr A. McGilvray with the intention of forming a gun club. The meeting was successful and Mark Shelley was elected the first president of the Gayndah Gun Club.

In December 1962 the club's name was changed to the Central Burnett Gun Club. This was brought about because members were equally distributed from Monto, Mundubbera and Gayndah. About this time the club moved to its present location at Mundubbera and has operated from there successfully ever since.

Past Presidents were: M. Shelley 61-64, G. Ethel 65-66, S. Kentish 67, D. Gull 68-69, B. Parr 70-71, N. Willson 72-73, J. Delaney 74-75, J. Trott 76-77, K. Vicary 78-79, N. Willson 80. Patrons were O. B. Bloxsome 62-71, J. Trott 72, R. Goody 73-75 and R. Parr 76-80.

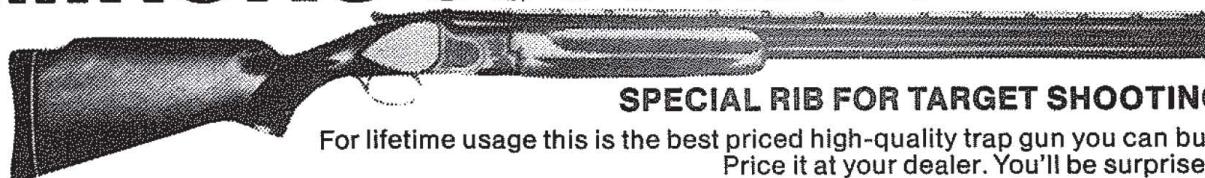

# MEXICAN GOLD FOR ELLIS

*Jim Ellis, Australia's leading shotgunner takes Gold at the Benito Juarez Games in Mexico City.*

Benito Juarez was a Mexican revolutionary and the games named after him certainly produced some revolutionary performances from the Australian shooting team who competed there.

Held in April at Mexico City, the shooting tournament attracted teams from all the top shooting nations. Included in the entry were teams from U.S.A., U.S.S.R., Mexico, Spain, Italy, Brazil, Canada and Australia.

Australia fielded teams and individual entries in Trench, Skeet, Running Boar and the various Pistol disciplines. These competitors also spent an intensive preparation at Fort Benning prior to competition in Mexico.

Rated by shooting commentators around the world as the third most important shooting competition after the World Championships and the Olympics, any performance there must be rated as world class.

Speaking to competitors on their return to Australia it is quite remarkable the performances put up considering the conditions. Ian Hale likened the conditions to shooting in a perpetual fog with gritty particles that got in the eyes. He was full of praise for the Trench competitors, particularly Ellis who stuck to their guns and made it through to the victory dais.

Winning dais it certainly was for Ellis. He started the first day full of confidence and ran a 74 which put him one target ahead of Ernie Neel, the American who he was to meet in the shoot-off.

Both shooters carded 74's on the second day and the relative positions remained the same. It was a 48 for Ellis on the final day but Neel put together a 49 to lock the championship up on 196/200.

The shoot-off was a tense affair. Neel dropped an early target to give Ellis the edge which he held on to by running the 25 clean and taking the gold medal.

Doyen of shotgunning in Australia, J. Newton Thomas who was the coach of the team said on his return, "it was a wonderful shoot-off to see the way Ellis shot.

"He shot superbly well with his 196, which is world standard, together with Ernie Neel, and in the shoot-off, well I have never seen him shoot better. It was superb, he was just so steady, he never looked like missing one where Neel rushed one on about the seventh target", he said.

Speaking highly of the pre-match visit to Fort Benning, the Army Marksmanship Unit in America, Newton was of the opinion that there was not that much to learn by the Australian shooters.

"What you do there", he said, "is condition people, match condition people. Our people are competing against the Neel's and the Howard's, the top shots in America."

It was the same for all the disciplines he said, and mentioned that the pistol competitors gained a lot from shooting alongside the Americans as a comparison and a base to measure performance.

"Fort Benning", said Newton, "was the major factor behind why we performed so well in Mexico. The ability we had to stabilise ourselves and develop technique was good. There was nobody at Benning who did not lift their performance levels. Most important was that most of them lifted their levels to above their Australian Standard and this is what we want."

Citing the cases of Alex Taransky, pistol shooter and Brian Wilson, Running Boar, he said, "look at Alex, he had never shot more than 540 in Free Pistol. I told him to set out not to just get out there and bloody well shoot like you always do, but to go out and beat your last score. I want to see you before you leave Benning beat 550. The Pistol people are a bit wary of me telling them anything but I told them they had to alter their thinking from Australian conditions. They had to lift their thinking to a different level and I said until they did they were not going to win at world level."

"Alex was shooting 545 and 550 and varying a lot around that score, then he shot a 560 and was through the sound barrier so to speak, a score on the board he had never shot before."

"It was the same with the kid Wilson who won the Running Boar Junior Gold Medal. He had shot quite a lot of running boar with good success as an 18-year-old. He knew a lot about rifle shooting, his mother had given him quite a lot of training and help".

"At Benning I told him not to compete against anyone there but to compete against himself and his own best scores. After you beat your own best score then look to the next one, I told him. If they look to beat their best score each time they are going to improve. Looking for possibles is silly because the gap is too great."

"Anyway, before the match at Mexico I told young Brian to go out and shoot against his best score and forget the others. He ended up beating the American juniors by 12 points or more. His performances were remarkable, he improved 20



points or so overall and from memory he shot a 596 in one of the slow runs which is definitely world class."

When questioned on how the Americans reacted to Jim Ellis, Newton said that they treated him with a great deal of respect since he was rated by an American magazine as being in the top ten trench shooters in the world.

It was in February, in "The American Shotgunner" where columnist Patrick Lynch rated Ellis 8th after Carrega (France), Basagni (Italy), Gianni (Italy), Leary (Canada), Tinoko (Portugal), Vallduvi (Spain) and Aszuki (Spain).

"The funny thing is," said Newton, "the overseas people like Terry Rumbel more than Jim because they reckon his style is better. I think this is fair comment as there would be very little in it if Terry had the same opportunities as Jim."

As the team returned from Mexico the spoils can be counted up and they look impressive. Apart from Ellis' gold, shotgunnings first, the male pistol shooters had their first major win and Brian Wilson's Gold was the first Junior gold ever won by Australia in shooting.

The results of the Tenth Benito Juarez Championships have been reported in full by team manager, Mr. Peter Anderson. They are as follows:

## NEW RULES UNDERGO MINOR CHANGES

The Association's Rules Sub-Committee met in April, and, after considering a number of aspects, placed details of recommended changes before the full Executive Committee.

The approved changes are:

1. Although trap handicapping is still based on percentage performance, a standard performance rating of 95% has been set to apply to **ALL** marks. For example, a 16 metre shooter will have to record 95/100 on handicap targets from his mark of 16m to qualify for backward movement. **THIS CHANGE BECOMES EFFECTIVE ON JULY 1, 1981.**
2. In connection with common mark classifications, any shooter who has been classified 'A' GRADE cannot be re-classified as 'C' GRADE. (This was an omission from the rules as previously printed.)
3. Performances in Single Barrel events are **NOT** to be used for purposes of re-grading or re-handicapping.
4. **FROM JANUARY 1, 1982**, all competitors registering for the first time will be placed on 14 metres. At the same time

all registered shooters who are forward of 14 metres will be moved back to that mark, and these will be subject to the normal effects (forward or backward movement) of the handicap formula.

**IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT DETAILS OF HANDICAP CHANGES (TRAP OR SKEET) AND COMMON MARK GRADE CHANGES MUST BE REPORTED TO THE NATIONAL OFFICE PROMPTLY!**

5. Turning now to the Skeet Handicapping formula, provision now exists to limit outward movement to one target in each six months, and then only if the increased allowance is still justified. Any decreases in handicap allowance shall be applied immediately they become due.

As soon as the above changes were confirmed, moves were made to have a new Rules Book printed, and supplies are now available from the National office.

The price is unchanged at \$2.00 each, including postage.

# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING KNOCKS OUT FEE MOVE

*In what can only be described as a vote of no confidence in the Executive Committee, the club delegates attending the 1981 Annual General Meeting of the Australian Clay Target Association threw out a recommendation for a fee increase.*

Following a review of the Association's finances which was undertaken by the Executive Committee, it prepared a recommendation that, from January 1, 1982, the annual registration fee for a standard adult member be increased from its present level of \$20 to \$30. Various arguments could have been used to support the increase, not the least of which was the very simple and therefore easily understood point about inflation running at a rate of approximately 10% per annum.

Additionally, the Association has introduced many new initiatives, including international competition for standard trap and skeet shooters, all of which have to be paid for.

In spite of this background information, the recommendation was "turfed out". The most serious aspect of the rejection by the meeting is that it flies in the face of serious constitutional danger.

The Executive Committee has been elected by club delegates to administer and manage the affairs of the Association.

**Yet, despite this charter, it has its decision on probably the most important single subject it handles — that is, the matter of income levels needed for survival — overturned by the same voters who elected the committee members.**

**Thus, there was a clear expression of no-confidence in the Executive Committee expressed by the meeting.**

The standard of the meeting was not high, as probably was to be expected when such a sensitive subject as money was being discussed. Delegates generally have difficulty in divorcing the "hip pocket nerve" sensitivity from this sort of debate, and that point alone probably justifies the concept of leaving such important policy decisions as fee levels solely in the hands of the Executive Committee. After all, if the Committee botches the job, the electorate has the opportunity to do something positive about it each year, when Members present themselves for re-election.

been in the warehouse for almost **four** years.

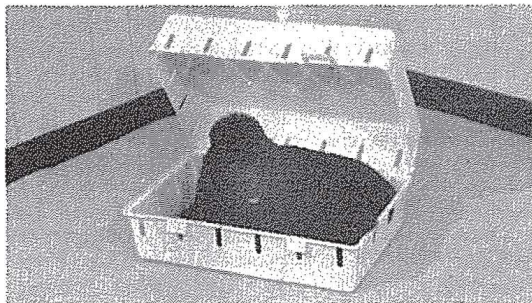
The double storey building is literally bulging with stock,

The national wholesale operation is held together by a very  
small but able team, which includes Dave Billingham, Bar-  
ney Piercy, and Howard Smith (who is a nephew of the  
renowned Mick Smith).

Fred Horton is also on the team, but now works mainly  
from home, where he performs incredible 'surgery' on telesco-  
pic sights.

Keith started part-time in 1951 with PECAR 'scopes, and  
then developed a full time business in 1956.

Over a period, the Herron business has accumulated a  
range of high quality products, the most recent of which is a  
**'VARI-KENNEL'** dog's kennel, which is strong and durable  
and has a wide range of applications.

For many years, Keith Herron has held the Australian  
distribution rights for Hornady projectiles, which are eagerly  
sought after by rifle and pistol enthusiasts. Readers will  
recall that the founder of Hornady Products was tragically  
killed in a light aircraft crash in U.S.A. just a few months ago.  
The plane plunged into a lake, and it was many weeks before  
Mr. Hornady's body was found.

Meanwhile, a memorial service was held in New York, and it  
was attended by Keith Herron.

Back to the product range. Keith has recently added the  
U.S. made deluxe DOSKOCIL gun cases to his "stable" and  
they are priced to sell. Made from vinyl covered rigid metal,  
with a full length piano hinge, three locks and solid padded  
handle, prices start at a recommended retail of around \$43.50  
(for a two pistol case).

Keith was telling me that his range of MTM "Caseguard"  
products has been a real winner. Made from impact resistant  
plastic, there is an MTM carrying case for virtually every type  
of cartridge.

The other big news is the acquisition of MARLIN firearms.  
Since winning this brand some months ago, Keith Herron has  
waited patiently for his first shipment. The position has been  
made more difficult, because four or five other Australian  
importers have recently imported quantities of Marlin  
firearms from U.S. "jobber" sources. However, these impor-  
ters are unable to gain access to the full range and Herron's  
first shipment is already almost fully committed.

Just before I left the Punchbowl warehouse, the "boss",  
Keith Herron, confided in me that he some times wishes he  
could get some of the big quiet that seems to be afflicting some  
of the other importers "just for a chance to catch up!" he says!

### NEW CARTRIDGE DEAL FOR HUNTERS AND CLAY BUSTERS

Shotgun shooters, especially trap and skeet shooters, will be interested in some news on the shotshell scene.

Two new brands have appeared on the market.

Coincidentally the ECLIPSE cartridge is also being manufactured by a clay target maker. A short range of only four types is available — all loads are filled into a one piece plastic hull with no metal head.

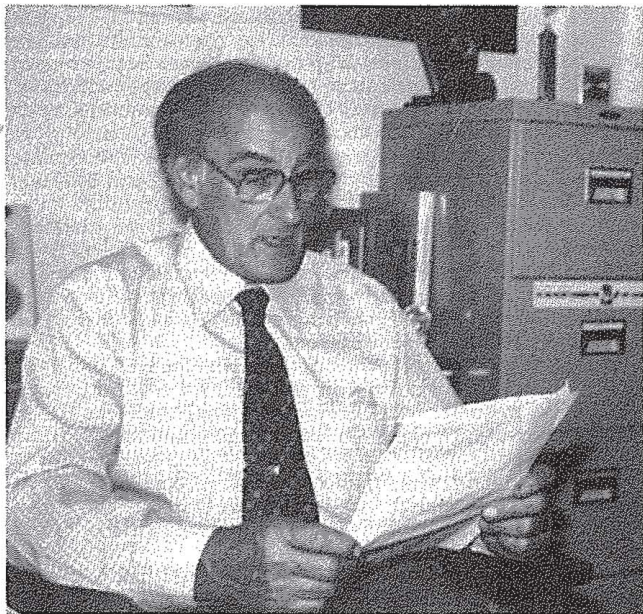
### NEW AUSTRALIAN PERAZZI DEAL

# BIG COACHING PROJECT AT WAGGA

from 'Barney' Rooke

## REPORT OF COACHING OF COACHES SEMINAR HELD AT WAGGA — MAY 29, 30, 31 1981

In conjunction with the NSW Department of Sports and Recreation, the NSWCTA held the first "coaching of coaches" seminar held in Australia for clay target shooting was an outstanding success. It was held near Wagga, on May 29, 30 and 31.

The seminar was due to start at 7.30 p.m. on Friday night but was delayed until 8 p.m., to allow some of the course lecturers to arrive, after attending the funeral at Barham (some 250 miles from Wagga) of the late National Coaching Director, Mr Newton Thomas.

The project was opened by John Harding, Regional director of Sports & Recreation who introduced his staff and welcomed everyone, after explaining the camp procedure and the role that Sports & Recreation had played in the organising of the seminar.

The course was then outlined by Barney Rooke (Director of Coaching in NSW) and the role and responsibility of the coach, also of the shooter requiring coaching.

The next presentation was on CASCA and was presented by Noel Southey. A special thanks must go to this man for his untiring devotion to clay target shooting. When he accepted the job of explaining the part that the Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly plays for all coaches, Noel's job was made all the more difficult when he only had about 24 hours notice to prepare his lecture.

After attending the funeral of Newton Thomas, he drove to Wagga and presented his intensive presentation, then drove back to Melbourne.

Barney Rooke specially thanked Noel for the job he had done as National Executive Director and in lifting the ACTA to a very high level, and was very sorry to lose a man of his ability to someone else. This was very strongly supported by the whole assembly.

Ron Clarke, from Eley gave an excellent lecture on eye perception, a new device to train your eyes to identify objects and react to what is seen. This is a great training aid for shooters where identifying the target is most important. The aids may be purchased or hired from Eley. Ron spoke on how practice does not make perfect, but **perfect practice makes perfect**. Practice must be done with a purpose. This concluded the program for Friday night.

**Saturday 9 a.m.** The first of the special lectures got under way with Daryl Chapman (Assistant Director of Sports & Recreation of NSW) and Nigel Champion (Sports & Recreation Department Sports officer) combining their lectures. Nigel covered the role of the Coach. This lecture was professionally presented and covered areas relating to the person you are coaching; the damage done to pupils by parents and other people; how the coach can be a powerful influence on juniors; the importance of feed back; how to make changes; how video can help.

Daryl Chapman then took over and spoke of the different relationships between coach and pupil; different personalities; high and low levels of motivation; how the performer becomes his own analyst; work rate and task execution.

The group was then split into four sections. Ian Hale, Victorian Zone Coach presented a paper on "shooting methods". We gained much from Ian's experiences at Fort Benning. I must congratulate Ian on his presentation of a very fine lecture. In all he gave 7 lectures, totalling 10½ hours. He also spoke of the Australian Team's achievements in Mexico. Then, at night he gave a presentation of gun fit and stance with coloured slides.

"Pud" Burgess kindly took over for Alby Stanford (Southern Zone Coach) as Alby was not able to lecture for medical

reasons. 'Pud', the former NSW State Director did a fine job on the importance of gun fit and how coaches can recognise problems in coaching.

Tony Manchi (Northern Zone Coach) took time off from his studies in Sydney for a Commercial Helicopter Pilot's license, to lecture to the group. He covered swing, lead, follow through and foot position.

Dick Toshack (Western Zone Coach) took the job of covering the safety aspect of coaching. Dick is an excellent coach, and gets his message across to the club coaches very well. Congratulations Dick on a job well done.

Kevin Longmore (Riverina Zone Coach) was moved around to assist the other zone coaches and I am sure that the experience he gained will be of valuable assistance in the future. The Riverina Zone can be very proud of this man.

"Barney" Rooke filled in whenever required to allow the Zone coaches to listen in on Ian Hale's lectures.

At 2 p.m. Saturday, all groups moved together for the final lecture from Daryl Chapman and Nigel Champion. Nigel spoke for quite some length on the limiting factors in sport performance covering inducement; inborn potential; heat; cold; attitude; lifestyle; diet; smoking; training; rest and the type of fitness relating to our sport.

Daryl then covered nature of skill; classifications; sports that require a continuous performance; the constant change of environment. Daryl and Nigel were expert lecturers and had done their homework in relation to clay target shooting. The rest of the afternoon was taken up with the four groups completing the coaching Manual lectures.

Saturday night, a group discussion took place with a panel made up of the State Director, all zone directors and Ian Hale ready to answer any questions relating to coaching. Merv Lyons spoke of the accreditation test saying that one question in particular was ambiguous. This was answered by 'Pud' Burgess as he pointed out that the late Newton Thomas had designed those questions to make the coaches think before giving an answer. **If the coaching manual was followed, no problems would be encountered.**

'Barney' Rooke spoke of the importance of feed back from the club coaches on the grants from Sports & Recreation Department, and a major project of raising approximately \$2,000 to purchase video equipment. The discussion concluded at 10.30 p.m.

Sunday morning, the final lectures were completed and 20 club coaches were accredited, while many club coaches joined CASCA. The seminar was then wound up with a group discussion.

Thank you to all concerned in the organising of the weekend. Special thanks to Sport & Recreation for its financial help. Vince Phillips then closed proceedings at 12 noon.

As State Director, I wish to thank all that attended — your attendance certainly made the effort worthwhile. To all other State Directors I strongly recommend to you to organise a **Coaching of Coaches Seminar** along the same lines. I would only be too pleased to give any assistance and information that would help you.

Finally I believe that we should make a start on our Level 2 program.

Thirty five clubs were represented by seventy eight people.

# Special Executive Meeting Held In Melbourne

Immediately after the conclusion of the 1981 Nationals, the Association's Executive Committee met to elect the 1981 President.

There were a number of other matters on the agenda, one of the most contentious being the Victorian Clay Target Association report, in which it expressed a lack of confidence in the Executive Director, Noel Southey.

The Victorian Association also expressed concern over an issue connected with the payment of meeting expenses to a past Victorian Member of the Executive Committee.

Debate on these controversial issues introduced an emotional atmosphere into the meeting, which set the scene for a difficult series of ballots to elect the 1981 office bearers. The ballots were reported in the June issue of Clay Target Shooting News.

Earlier during the Nationals, the Rules Sub-Committee had met, under the leadership of Chairman, Mr. Arch Rowe. This meeting prepared a series of recommendations relating to minor rules revisions, and these recommendations were then tabled at the full Executive Meeting for endorsement. This subject is reported under the heading 'Rules Corner' elsewhere in this issue.

Naturally, the subject of the proposed site for the National Headquarters consumed a lot of time, and arrangements were confirmed for discussions to continue in relation to two possible sites in New South Wales. Furthermore, renewed interest is being shown in this subject by the committee of the Frankston-Australian Gun Club in Victoria.

Other matters included:

## 1. 1982 National Championships —

The 1982 Australian Trap and Skeet Championships will be held at the Brisbane Gun Club during May 1982. The program will commence with the skeet championship, which will be held over two days.

The 1982 Olympic Discipline Nationals will also be held at the Brisbane Gun Club, as part of a major international tournament. The match is scheduled for the Easter period.

## 2. Computer Expenses —

Now that the Association's in-house computer systems have settled down, it was agreed that an "audit" would be conducted to establish if further program changes could be implemented to effect further savings.

## 3. Government Funding —

In the light of the Association's inability to recruit a replacement to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Coaching Director Newton Thomas, a proposal has been put to the Federal Government. In this a request was made to allow the Association to combine the position of the Executive Director with the duties of the Coaching Director.

The Committee approved this approach, which was intended to be only an interim step, pending the appointment of a full time Coaching Director.

(The request has since been rejected by the Sports Advisory Council.)

## 4. State Association Conference —

As a follow-up to the very successful conference of State Association Presidents and Secretaries in June 1980, the Association had planned the second edition to be held later this year.

Due to the serious financial pressures created by the Annual General Meeting decision to refuse a fee increase in 1982, the Executive Committee cancelled the conference. So far, no plans have been made for a replacement project.

## 5. Staffing Levels —

As a result of a request from the Victorian Clay Target Association that an independent treasurer be appointed, a general discussion took place on current staff levels.

The meeting was advised that the administrative unit had been struggling to survive a situation, where, to save money, the staff members had been reduced by one person since June 1980.

The move had created undue hardship and pressures on the remaining staff members, and it was planned to increase the staff complement by at least one during the last half of 1981.

In relation to the appointment of an independent treasurer, no background information or details of proposed benefits had been provided with the request, and the issue has been left to the Management Committee to consider.

## 6. Next Meeting —

The next meeting is scheduled to be held in Sydney on October 31 and November 1, 1981.

## 7. General —

The meeting was held in the conference room of the Nunawading Motor Inn, located only a short distance from the A.C.T.A. Blackburn office.

Unfortunately, Bill Horner of Darwin was unable to attend the meeting, due to the interruption to airline schedules caused by the stoppage by air hostesses.

The meeting commenced at 8.30 a.m. and finished at 7.00 p.m. It was a difficult day, and all Members were relieved when it was over.

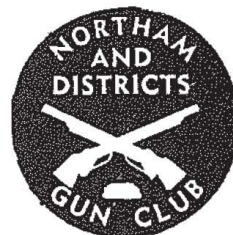

## A.G.M. KNOCKS OUT FEE MOVE (Cont'd from page 27)

As an example, it was claimed that the last fee increase cost the Association a loss of membership. The FACTS are that, when the last fee increase occurred in 1978 (the standard adult fee went from \$15 to \$20) the total membership improved marginally.

Let's face it — NO ONE LIKES PRICE RISES! Yet, your glass of beer or petrol for the car or the three course meal at your favourite restaurant ALL cost more today than they did in 1978.

**Well, the same principle applies to your sport. In fact, the Executive Committee should have been commended for the job it has done in restricting cost increases without reducing standards.**

**THINK ABOUT IT!**

So, the clear message is **TIGHTEN YOUR BELTS!** The Management of the Association now has the totally unenviable task of maintaining the sport's growth potential, without eating into the financial reserves that have been so painstakingly accumulated since 1976.

It has taken four years to develop a nest egg of just over \$120,000 yet this could be seriously eroded in a very short time if other ways of developing income cannot be found.

It is a most formidable task that now faces your Executive Committee. One of the most obvious changes that will occur will be that, especially in relation to coaching projects, State Associations will have to play a far more active role in a financial sense.

On the subject of general administration costs, the situation is grim because the Association's own 'razor gang' had already been through the list of forecast expenses for 1981 with an ultra-sharp knife, and it is difficult to see where further major savings can be effected.

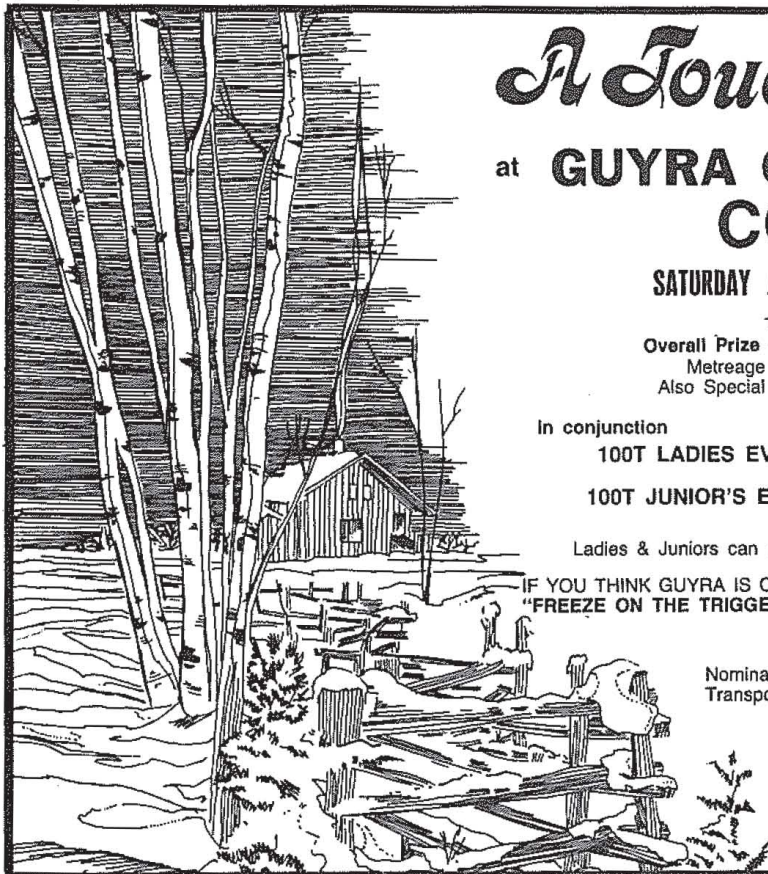

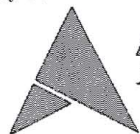

## FROM THE DESK OF THE N.S.W. COACHING DIRECTOR

by 'Barney' Rooke

Trap shooting in Australia has reached an era of individual professionalism. This aspect of amateur trap shooting has always been with the sport from its beginning.

The big difference between the past and the present is that the average winning scores are now higher and there are more than just a few super shooting champions.

In the past, each era had its share of super shots who achieved National recognition. Today we still have such a group of highly talented stars within our competitive ranks. But now we have to contend with twenty or thirty of these potential super winners — any shooter in this group can and will beat the field day in and day out.

Now if the present day shooter expects to become a consistent winner, he must build his shooting career upon a proper foundation. This can be accomplished by two different methods. The first and most common approach today is by proper coaching and correct practising.

Most shooters in the past used the trial and error system to become better shots. Many such shooters never improve with this system. They either become discouraged, run out of money or find good excuses.

Today, many shooters fit into this category and without proper help, they will most likely never become better shots, and will continue making the same mistakes over and over again.

What this shooter needs is to learn new and correct methods of breaking targets. All shooters can accomplish this through proper and correct coaching from trained coaches.

Today, the natural ability approach to trap shooting is not enough to keep winning consistently. Within every shooter lurks the desire to win and be recognised as a consistent competitor or even a National Champion. Such a dream can be within grasping range with proper instructions and a positive attitude on the shooter's behalf.

Even with the best type of equipment, the most positive attitude and good instructions from a coach, it's a long hard climb to the top. If you think reaching the top will be easy — even with proper coaching — you are in for a surprise. Every top National or State Champion has paid the price at one time or another.

Shooting lessons are now offered by nearly all clubs throughout Australia through Club coaches who are being trained in the correct methods.

However, if any shooter thinks that by taking lessons he will become an over-night success, forget it! His or her chances are either slim or none. Shooting lessons are like a good foundation under a house — without it the house is never as solid as it could have been.

It's the shooters choice to struggle for years to break higher scores or to consult a coach for the easier approach for higher scores.

The age of coaching has finally arrived in clay target shooting. However, if it is to succeed, full support must be given by club and State Association officials.
