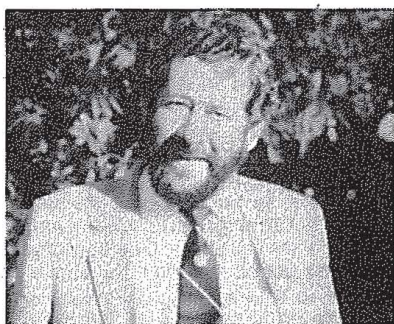

My involvement as Minute Secretary to the International Sub-Committee gave me an immediate insight into the dedication shown by honorary officers of the A.C.T.A., who are prepared to give up week-ends to further develop the aims of the Association.

As I write these notes, I can envisage problems arising with this issue of C.T.S.N., because of the protracted mail strike we've been suffering in Victoria.

No mail has gone in or out of the National office for a week, so if you're awaiting something from us, and it hasn't arrived, we're sorry, we haven't been able to get it to you.

The same applies to the July issue of C.T.S.N., which will no doubt be delayed leaving Shepparton. We know it was produced on schedule and would have gone to the post on Tuesday 23rd June, had it not been for the strike.

## COMMONWEALTH GAMES - BRISBANE 1982 SELECTION PROCEDURE

The International Sub-Committee recently laid down rules for selection for the Commonwealth Games Team.

- 1) Competitors must be members of State training squads, to be eligible for selection in the National Training Squad.
- 2) A competitor who resides in a State that has no State Squad, may be nominated by his State Association, who will forward his/her name to the International Sub-Committee.
- 3) Only those competitors who have made the National Training Squad will be considered for selection for the Commonwealth Games Team.
- 4) The only exceptions to the above are recipients of awards under the Federal Government Athlete Award Scheme, who will automatically be considered for membership of the National Training Squad.
- 5) Competitors who are selected in the National Training Squad **MUST** compete in all events as follows:
  - a. National Olympic Disciplines Championship, Melbourne Gun Club, September 4,5,6, 1981.
  - b. 200 Target Event conducted in his own State, preferably State Olympic Disciplines Championship. This event must be conducted before 1982 National O.D. Championship.
  - c. National Olympic Disciplines Championship, Brisbane Gun Club, Easter 1982.
- 6) After the 1982 Olympic Discipline Nationals, the National Training Squad will be reduced at the discretion of the

International Sub-Committee, from scores posted in the 3 events listed above.

7) The National Training Squad Manager/Coach will devise a training and competition program, leading up to the Commonwealth Games.

8) The final selection of two representatives for each of the Olympic Disciplines will be made by the International Sub-Committee as close as possible to the Commonwealth Games, as allowed by any parameters placed on us by the A.S.A. or Commonwealth Games authorities.

The International Sub-Committee believes that the above selection procedure will enable the best possible team to be selected to represent Australia.

The International Sub-Committee has promised that it will leave no stone unturned to obtain finance.

They hope to obtain funds from the Federal Government, for the National team, to help with training costs. ○

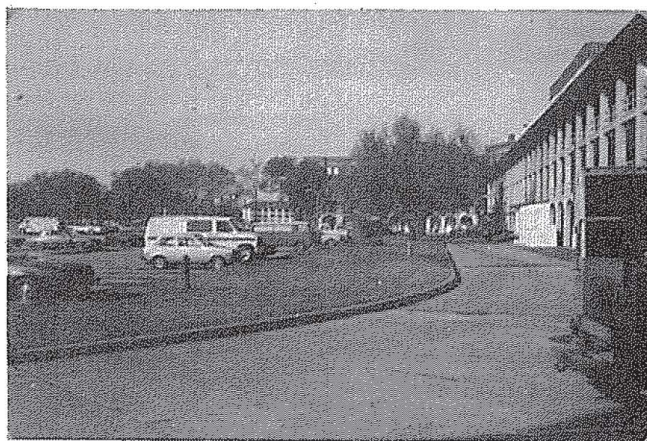

# REPORT ON FORT BENNING

FROM TOP INTERNATIONAL SKEETIE — IAN HALE



• Accomodation Area — Fort Benning.

Fort Benning is situated in Columbus, Georgia. This is in the South East part of America. The Fort is about 9 miles from the city centre and is known as the home of the infantry. The camp was founded in 1918 and named after the confederate major, Henry Lewis Benning. The United States Army marksmanship Unit was established in 1956 and its mission was to improve Army wide competitive marksmanship. All disciplines are shot at the Fort, shotgun, rifle and pistol.

There is a complete gunsmithing organisation set up in the Armory, with some of the finest competition gunsmiths working on all types of firearms. The USAMU can boast many team successes over the years, and this proves that their ideas and training techniques are successful.

The unit is commanded by Colonel Parmentier, himself a top sports administrator and manager. The shotgun section is commanded by Lt. Colonel Jack Horner. Jack is a well known top shooter who competed in the Griffiths Nationals with good creditation. Coach of the shotgun section, trench and skeet is Burl Burnham. He is a top rifle shot, accomplished shotgun shooter, and a very very clever coach.

The shotgun range has three ISU skeet layouts and two trench layouts, with a clubhouse that was General George Patten's officer's club in World War II. There is a further structure where members of the unit are provided with lockers and rest areas, plus an administrative office for the coach and Colonel, with an adjacent office for the administrative Sergeant.

Competitors and individuals under instruction at the Fort are housed in a place called Olson Hall which is a horseshoe shaped apartment complex of about four stories. Each room has two beds, shower, toilet, colour TV, fridge and plenty of hanging space. Not the Ritz but comfortable and clean. Cost of accomodation is \$US2.00 per day.

Each competitor is provided with an authority paper enabling him to eat in the army dining room and the food here is excellent with a wide selection. One could eat as much as wanted for about \$5 to \$6 per day for three meals.

## Training:

The shotgun range runs clinics throughout the year. Everyone is invited, invitations being sent through the national magazines or ISU register. The training clinic format is as follows—

Friday night arrive. Saturday, class room lectures, varying from fundamentals to technical procedures, motivation and concentration, plus a good question and answer programme. I was very interested to note how those running the clinic arranged for top shooters to sit in front of the audience. The speaker could then ask them different questions and the answers from these stars helped a lot of people. The audience could also ask questions of these people. This procedure lasted for Saturday and Sunday.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday were devoted to instruction, with the coaches going through instruction with individuals and making extensive use of the video unit. Thursday was official practice. On Friday, Saturday and Sunday an official 300 target match took place, where pupils were able to put into practice all they had learnt whilst at the clinic. It is interesting to note that most major matches for ISU in the U.S. are of 300 targets. Those people in the know say that this toughens up the competitors to enable them to prepare for 200 target matches in world competition.

When the dust of the clinic settled down we were fortunate enough to be able to train in the same environment as the people at Fort Benning do, and it was here that I learnt a lot. First of all, I had a discussion with the coach and he suggested the way in which I could get the most benefit from practice. He told me how I shot with reference to the technique of leading or to any faults that would have to be wiped out. The training format is very well disciplined and this discipline from day to day instills the discipline required to win medals. Their training method is to shoot 100 targets and attempt to gain as high a level on the 100 as possible. If any misses occur, the shooter may discuss with the coach after the round, but he **must not** take repeats at this stage. The reason for this is that there is no pressure to hit the target and if the competitor breaks up the 100 shots he no longer has an incentive to try hard for percentage shooting. Any misses will be repeated after the daily targets are shot. When approaching a big match the daily targets are increased to 150.

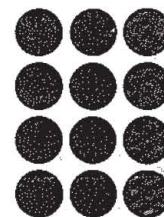

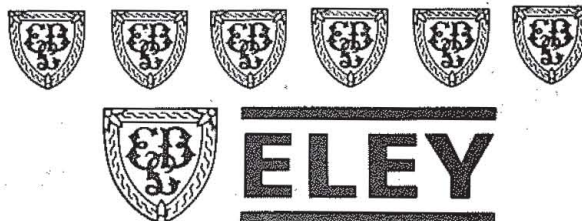

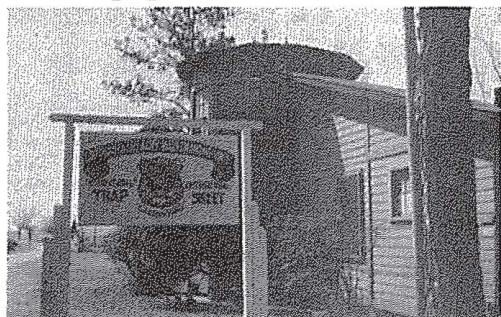

Shooters rest between rounds; they play a little pool or trap score or referee for the next squad. This simulates the time lag between rounds in competitions. The procedure of percentage shooting instills enthusiasm and dedication in each individual shooter. Each shooter at Benning is encouraged to coach as much as possible, and courses to enhance the individual's performance in this area are provided from time to time.

As I noted before, there are three skeet fields and two trench layouts and they are set up each with different backgrounds. This breaks up the sighting fields and is of great importance in making the shooter really look for the target.

When the shooter has a problem the coach prefers that he works it out for himself. If he is able to do so, this makes him a better shot. However, if he is having real problems the coach will step in and set him right. He may not commence his daily percentage shooting until these problems are sorted out.

Both trench and skeet shooters have many discussion periods where they can iron out problems and reap the experience of the coach. Many queries raised by individuals are shared by the crew, and many problem areas are sorted out during this discussion time.

### Summary of our Stay:

The people at Fort Benning could not have treated us better. Granted we had a lot of friends in the US team before we went there, but we made a hell of a lot more before we left.

Jack Horner took us into his home to meet his family and the hospitality and friendship shared ensured our welcome. We attended functions at the officers' club and we were entertained by the liaison officer and NCO from the Royal Australian Regiment posted at Benning. His wife and family and friends made us most welcome and a great night was had by all.

The training schedule at Benning was intensive but we reaped the reward of hard work with our results at Mexico.

My opinion of Benning is that it is the most up-to-date training base for the shotgun sports available to us. Personally, I would like to train there a couple of times a year, as the discipline more than anything brings the shooter into line. There is just so much to be learnt there, and a complex such as this is not available anywhere else in the world. (With the exception of communist countries.)

The clinics are available to anyone, and, if given the chance, our shooters would certainly benefit from the Fort Benning shoots and clinics.

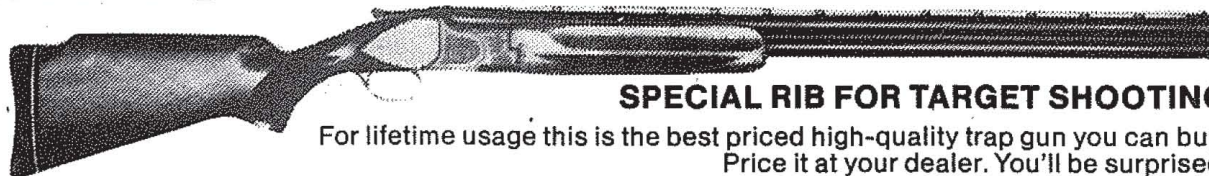

# FIREARMS LEGISLATION

L.G. Connors

## SHOT GUNS or YO-YO'S for Australian Shooters?

Many articles are being published in various magazines and the press, in certain States, in relation to future gun legislation that will affect shooters wishing to purchase guns as collector's items, or use firearms for their chosen sport. This does not necessarily apply to any one particular State, and can have far reaching detrimental results to human rights, if allowed to develop without challenge from responsible bodies and shooters. State Associations, Club Administrators and shooters in general, from within their own States, should familiarize themselves with their existing gun laws and the possibility of changes, likely to occur by change of Governments within their State. Victoria is one State facing such a problem, should a change of Government occur. The Victorian Branch of the Australian Labour Party is looking to changes in the present Shooter's License system. Adopted Policy 151 reads: 'All firearms to be registered and possession of firearms to be restricted to those requiring them for essential occupational and limited supervised recreational purposes'. One A.L.P. Branch admits 'section 151 has caused a great deal of embarrassment to them. It states it is absolutely necessary that this is replaced immediately by a sensible policy that is realistic, practical, that can be implemented, and above all a policy that has the support of large sections of the community. They admit the present A.L.P. policy is very vague, in breach of civil liberties, and impossible to enforce. For instance the supervision of 60,000 duck shooters on the opening day is just not possible. Part of a press release put out by the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia I read, said A.L.P. policy 151 is, that all firearms be registered and possession restricted for essential occupational purposes and limited supervised recreation. The policy

makers have spelt out that the licensed shooter would **NOT** be permitted to keep recreational firearms at his home. In fact, it has been stated by the A.L.P. policy makers, that they ultimately want to prohibit private firearm ownership altogether. The repercussions from such a policy are many, and would affect law abiding firearms users, rather than reduce serious crimes caused in our society by the criminal use of firearms. On the 5th May, 1981, representatives of the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia, Victorian Clay Target Association, The Victorian Field and Game Association, and the Sporting Shooters Council of Victoria, meet with a sub-committee, representing the Civil Rights and Law Reform Policy Committee.

On reading a report of this meeting by the Sporting Shooters Council of Victoria, clear notice was served that the Sporting organizations are unanimous in their opposition to:

"individual firearms registration"  
"prohibition of private possession of firearms in licensed homes"

"arbitrary restrictions on numbers and types".

There are 360,000 plus shooters license holders in Victoria and if they are interested in the welfare of their sport, they would be making sure they get behind the sporting bodies that are looking after their interest. United we are a strong voice. Funds are required at both National and State levels to combat all anti-firearms groups. Should you be called on to contribute to such a fund, I recommend you give it all the financial support you possibly can.

It is my view we do not have a GUN problem — we have a PEOPLE problem. This being so, alterations to existing gun laws that affect the civil liberties of responsible citizens require questioning and action.

# ONE FOR THE KIDS

"Bans never work. The fate of prohibition in America and the modern drug problems are good examples. With firearms, the only responsible course for schools to take is to teach kids how to use them safely. That's real education".

The speaker is Lyn Barr, principal of Rainbow High School in Victoria. We are talking over coffee in the lounge of the Melbourne Gun Club.

Outside, students from 53 high and technical schools all over Victoria are working their way through twenty rounds single barrel, all off 16 metres.

It is Friday, 5th June, 1981. The 3rd Victorian Schoolboy-Schoolgirl Clay Target Championships are well under way.

Lyn Barr isn't a claybird shooter himself, but I can see that he believes deeply in what is going on out there. "A showcase of gun safety", he calls it.

He has spent years on promoting gun safety in schools by way of courses taught as part of the school curriculum. Today is a monument to his efforts, yet it is not enough. Lyn wants to see more schools involved.

"Involved in state championships?", I ask. Yes, for that will mean that more gun safety courses are being taught. To this end, Lyn and his helpers have prepared a students' gun safety manual to sell for \$1.00 (Winchester, bless 'em, have heavily underwritten the costs of production) and have gained Education Department approval for 35 teachers to attend a how-to seminar in September.

A little more discussion, and I begin to see where the championships fit into the scheme of things. Interschool

competitions are woven into the teaching strategy to serve several purposes.

Firstly, they **motivate** and eventually **reward** the kids. Although everyone knows that only a handful can win prizes, everyone also knows that these occasions are thoroughly good fun. Participation is the thing. It must be, otherwise the kids wouldn't leave their home town at three in the morning, as some of them did.

Secondly, they provide a **goal**, to be judged trustworthy enough to shoot under the school's name.

Finally, they bring kids together in a **climate** which demonstrates quite forcefully that safety is more than a local concern.

Such events have a long history. Regional championships go back some 20 years to a match between Mansfield High School and Wangaratta Technical School. The first State shoot took place in 1979 when 170 entrants met in Jeparit. The following year, 223 went to Geelong. This year, the total was 305.

The growth, remember, reflects the increasing involvement of schools. The impetus comes from within the school system. Shooting associations and the firearms trade are confined to a helping role, to answering calls from the organisers. They assist by providing facilities, personnel and financial sponsorship.

Both Eley and Winchester have done their bit at regional level, but the State championships have depended on Winchester backing.

This has included issuing all entrants with free ammunition to prevent problems arising from inexpert re-loads, a requirement laid down by the organisers. Not surprisingly, Winchester chose to hand out their new AA 275.

So how did it go? Were the 1981 championships a "showcase of gun safety"? In a word, yes.

I spent a lot of time wandering up and down, watching the behaviour of the youngsters as they shot, retired, treated fellow competitors with great sportsmanship and returned their guns to the rack. Not once did I see a firearm handled carelessly. The school courses work.

Two points, however, bear mentioning. It was obvious that some schools need to put more emphasis on teaching their students **how** to shoot, for marksmanship clearly has some relationship to student motivation. In addition, too many kids fronted up to the trap without hearing protection. Senior boys' champion was Russell Mark, 17, of Ballarat East High School, who shot 20 straight.

Russell should need no introduction. He has a string of junior National titles to his credit — double barrel, single barrel, double rise, skeet, high gun — and the Australian open double barrel as well. He was taught to shoot by his father, Brian Mark, who pops up everywhere disguised as the advertising and sales promotion manager of Winchester Australia.

Runner-up was Darren Newlyn of Orbost High School with a score of 19/20.

The junior boys' championship went to Gavin Treloar, 14, from Kyabram High School, with 18/20. Gavin comes from a shooting family. Father, mother, sister and brother all handle a gun, their local club being Echuca. If memory serves me correctly, the Treloar home is no stranger to clay target trophies.

A chirpy little cocksparrow, Grant Prior, made it two for Kyabram High by taking second place in the juniors after a shoot-off.

Not to be left out, 15 year-old Linda Mueller, also from Kyabram High, took out the girls' championship with a creditable 16/20.

Linda started shooting at the beginning of the year and is the only shotgunner in her family. She does not know whether she will be able to continue after she leaves school, but she says she really enjoys breaking targets.

Girls' runner-up for the second year in a row was Jenny Ey of Hopetoun High School.

Each of the six received a magnificent cup and sash donated by the sponsors.

The teams' championship, a new event, ran to a double shoot-off. With hundreds of eyes boring into their backs, the two teams kept the pressure on each other. The result was undecided until the last man lost his last bird — if he'd hit it, another attempt to separate the contenders would have been necessary.

Final score was 61 to 60 in favour of G. Cox, S. Davis, J. Palmer and R. Erry of Benalla Technical School, one of the original homes of schoolboy shooting. The school received a perpetual trophy while the individuals were presented with gold watches and medallions, all donated by Winchester.

Runners-up were B. Hubbard, S. Rigney, P. Toll and B. Rollison of Boort High School, who each received a transistor radio and silver medallion, all donated by Winchester.

Bob Buchan then presented both teams with Melbourne Gun Club medallions.

Just before the presentations we were treated to demonstrations of Skeet and Olympic Trench by Trevor Byrne and Russell Mark.

Many people were responsible for the day's success. The drive and dedication of Lyn Barr and his colleagues was evident. The Melbourne Gun Club provided its facilities free of charge, with president Bob Buchan and other members pitching in. A team from the Jeparit Gun Club, the Pitts, Newcombes, Hansells and Gawiths, plus Dawn Barr, handled the office operations on the day.

A.C.T.A. coaches attended, as did members of the police force. Winchester Australia picked up the tab. And scores of interested adults (teachers, parents, club shooters and coaches) prepared the kids for the big day and provided the transport.

To all of these, and the ones I've missed, congratulations.

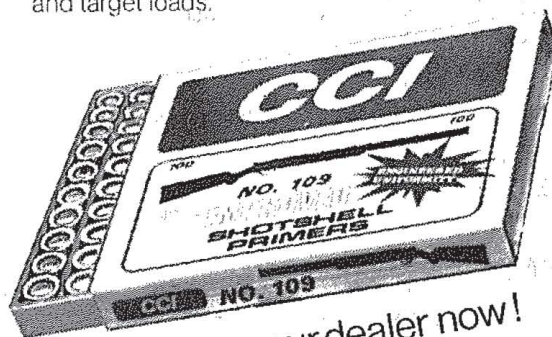

# INTERNATIONAL SUB-COMMITTEE MEETS IN MELBOURNE

R. F. BUCHAN — CHAIRMAN

The International Sub-Committee met at the National Office, June 13 and 14.

Due to the resignation of National President, Laurie Connors as Chairman of the International Sub-Committee, Dr. Paul Cains (Tasmania) joined the Sub-Committee at the suggestion of the Management Committee.

National Training Squad Manager/Coach, Peter Quire was elected to the Sub-Committee at this meeting.

A proposal for the re-structure of the International Sub-Committee was put to the meeting by Paul Cains. After long discussion and certain amendments, the proposal was sent to the full Executive for ratification.

I would like to thank Paul Cains for the amount of work he has put into this proposal.

The new International Sub-Committee, which comprises R. F. Buchan, Chairman; W. Abbott (Vic); R. Walker (N.S.W.); P. Cains (Tas); P. Quire (S.A.) with Executive Director Ian Hill acting as Minute Secretary, is very anxious to get on with the big work-load before it.

For the first time a job specification was agreed upon for the National Training Squad Manager/Coach. We feel that shooters in general, future Sub-Committees and the job holder, will benefit from this having been done.

National Training Squad finance took a lot of deliberation, as we are aware that this is a touchy subject.

We do have a real need for finance to fund the operation of the training squad, so a proposal has been put to the National Executive, to seek funds from State Associations levied at the rate of 20c per adult registered shooter. Yes, this would mean some states giving much more than others.

We await confirmation from the Executive, so that an approach can be made to State Associations.

The Committee would like to hold a National Squad Training Camp, prior to the South Pacific Regional Championships later this year, subject to finance being available.

The possibility of a sporting exchange with China is being investigated by the Federal Government, the Management Committee has put a proposal to Government, which is fully endorsed by this Committee.

Air New Zealand support for the A.C.T.A. was discussed at great length, and as evidence of our appreciation for this support, we are suggesting that competition for an Air New Zealand Trophy be conducted between teams from Australia and New Zealand at the South Island Championship in New Zealand later this year. We will suggest that the A.C.T.A. provide trophies for this event.

Selection procedures for the 1982 Commonwealth Games team dominated discussion for some time. This matter is covered in a separate article elsewhere in this issue of C.T.S.N.

The Air New Zealand Trap Team for the Grand American Handicap Tournament, Mackintosh Trophy Team event, World rankings of Australian Olympic Discipline shooters and this year's World Championships in Tucuman, Argentina were other points fully discussed by the International Sub-Committee.

I would like to thank this Sub-Committee for their thoughts, frank discussion and willingness to work for the good of clay target shooting.

## "STOP PRESS"

The Australian Shooting Association has advised that the South Pacific Regional Championships set down for October 2, 3 and 4 in Brisbane have been abandoned.

Because of major works being carried out to upgrade the Belmont complex for the Commonwealth Games in 1982, the venue will not be available.

It is hoped to run a suitable event prior to the Commonwealth Games as a dress rehearsal.

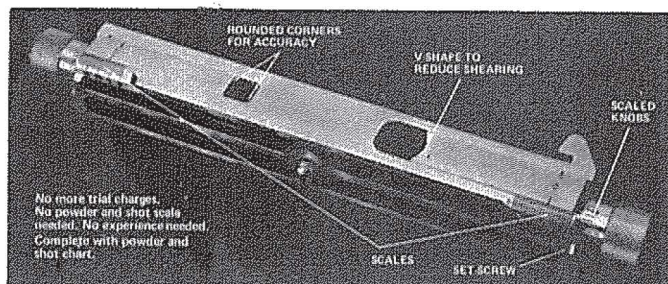

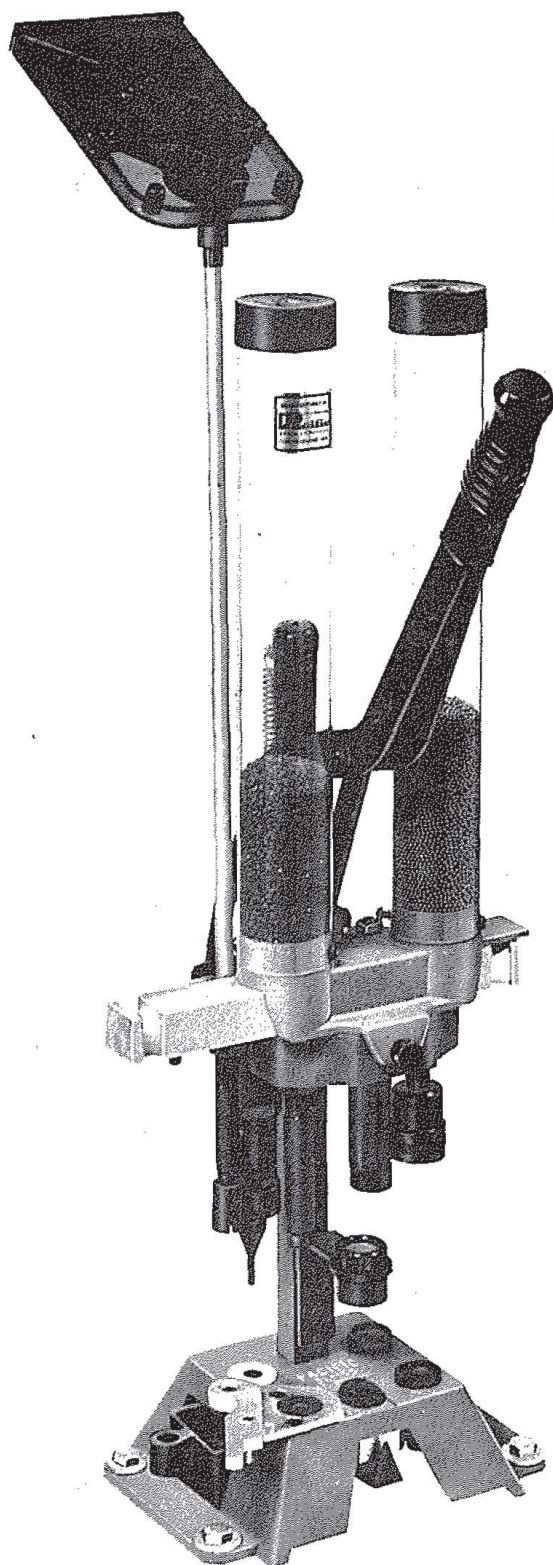

## PAPUA NEW GUINEA 1981 NATIONAL ISU CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1981 PNG National ISU Championships were held at the Port Moresby Clay Target Club over the period 28th May to 1st June. By recent PNG standards the shoot was well attended with 16 Skeet entrants and 19 shooters competing for the Trench title.

The PMCTC organising committee was extremely pleased to receive entries from five Australian shooters. Neil Wade (1980 PNG ISU Trench winner) and Arthur Kenna travelled from North Queensland to compete for the second successive year. Three other shooters made a longer journey from N.S.W. — Bruce Noll, David Menck and Graham Wyatt. The two "Chinese Bandits", Ken and Les Cheung from Mount Hagen, were the only other non-Port Moresby competitors. All visiting shooters were accommodated with members of the PMCTC.

A day of practice and panic was held on the 27th May. The panic was caused by the High House trap, which produced more broken targets than the combined efforts of all shooters. This was finally fixed to the satisfaction of all concerned, allowing them to commence Trench practice in the afternoon. The gremlins were obviously having a field-day, as the phono-release on Station 2 appeared to be 'buggarap pinis'. PMCTC Secretary Alan Ware called on 10 years' PNG experience and electrical engineering to work some black magic and replaced a blown fuse. Everything worked and practice scores indicated that good shooting could be expected over the next four days. A pleasant evening BBQ was held at the home of Bryan Roper, allowing the visitors to meet the PNG competitors.

New and old friendships were temporarily put aside after the squads were drawn for the first 100 targets of ISU Skeet. A good standard was established in the first round with two 24s

and several high twenties being recorded. It wasn't until the third round that the first possible was scored, when Bruce Noll competed a flawless exhibition of shooting. By the end of the first day Bruce had established a comfortable lead with 92-100, followed by David Menck on 87 and Les Cheung with 86.

Noll started the second day with a first round of 20, his lowest score of the event. However he came back with a vengeance to record two successive 25s and a 24 to win comfortably with 186-200. David Menck and Les Cheung maintained their placings with overall scores of 172 and 170 respectively.

At the close of nominations on 31st May, 19 entries had been received for the Trench Championship. Shooting got underway promptly, and during the first round two PMCTC members, Graeme Norris and Sam Barton, recorded possibles. Graham Wyatt maintained that he "might have" had he not been subjected to a muzzle-to-eyeball confrontation with an angry wasp prior to his eleventh target. The wasp had been worth three targets, as Graham had to be content with a 22.

Norris carded another perfect score in the third round, as did Barton in the last round of the day. After the first 100 targets Norris and Barton were joint leaders on 95, followed by the consistent David Menck with 90. Bruce Noll, having shot well to record 68-75, crashed in the fourth round with an uncharacteristic 14.

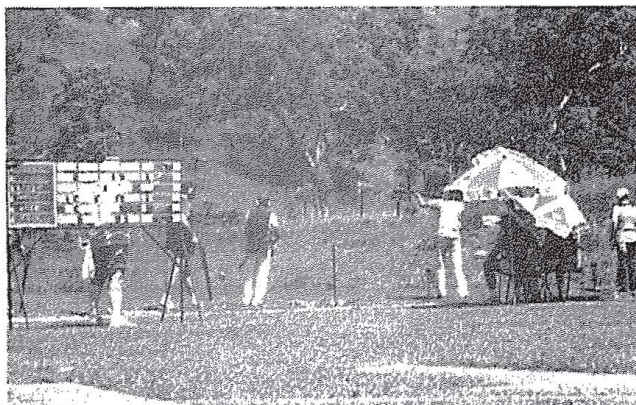
After 175 targets Sam Barton appeared to have a mortgage on the Champion's red-yellow-and-black sash with a score of 163, 3 ahead of Norris. However in his last round Sam dropped eight targets to record an overall score of 180. All attention was focused on Norris in his last round. The buzzer signalled an ominous start when he dropped his first target. However he shot the next 23 cleanly, only to miss his last target of the event. Norris came in with an overall score of 183, a new PNG record. Sam Barton took second place with 180. Menck remained on the trophy list with a score of 177 to take third place, one point ahead of Arthur Kenna and Neil Wade.

In an unofficial teams competition conducted over the trench event, the visiting Australian shooters were victors by seven points over the PNG 'Lahara' team.

The competition concluded with a presentation dinner in the PMCTC Club House. It was a most enjoyable evening to cap-off four good days of shooting. The presence of the Australian visitors was a highlight of the competition, and helped some local shooters lift themselves to record their best ever personal scores.

Although ISU shooters are few in number in PNG, they are all keen to improve through competition. Visiting shooters are assured of a warm welcome, heaps of hospitality and a place in a squad.

**Sunday 5th April 1981**

If you have been a regular reader of this column, you no doubt have read of my visits to the Ouyen Gun Club. It is run by Peter Kay, a local wheat farmer in the area, and on whose property the club is situated and Brian Loxton, the town's prominent builder, hardware and sport store operator. Both are keen shooting enthusiasts and organize about three or four shooting tournaments each year. Coaching of juniors and novice shooters continued during the afternoon, with a gun safety session being held at night by George Biggs.

Along with many other shooters from all over Victoria, N.S.W. and S.A. I attended the funeral of the late J. Newton Thomas, at Barham N.S.W., his original home town. Newton was known as the Gentleman of our sport, always ready to

## ECLIPSE ALL-PURPOSE SHOTSHELLS FROM FULLER

As announced in the July issue of "Clay Target Shooting News", Fuller agencies of Sydney has secured the Australian distribution of Eclipse shotshells

Although a totally new name on the shooting scene in Australia, Eclipse has been known around clay target shooting circles in U.S.A. for around thirty years — but as a target manufacturer.

The Eclipse shotshell has two features which are likely to make it attractive to clay busters. First, the traditional brass (or steel) head has been omitted, which makes the hull very much easier to reload.

The second feature is probably even more important — the price of the product is attractive. Add to this the fact that early tests have shown the product to be re-loadable at least four to five times.

There are four loadings in the Eclipse range, and each loading has a specific hull color.

GREEN means light load 8's (2¾ dram equiv. x 1" 8 oz (32 gram)

ORANGE means heavy load 8's (3 dram equiv. x 32 gram)

RED means heavy load 7½'s (3 dram equiv. x 32 gram)

BLUE means light load 8's (2¾ dram equiv. x 29.5 gram)

Incidentally, the one ounce load is particularly comfortable, and should prove to be a useful junior or training cartridge.

Ray Stafford, re-loading expert for the American magazine, TRAP and FIELD, recently tested the cartridges, and his report appeared in the April 1981 issue. It is reproduced here with the approval of TRAP and FIELD editorial staff. CTSN is grateful for this approval.

"Eclipse Cartridge, a division of the same company that makes Eclipse Targets in California, has come out with a new shotgun shell, as announced last fall in this magazine. It is a




• Fig. 1 - The first test rounds showed that shells crimped too deep blew out after reloading as few as 3 or 4 times.

full plastic shell, with no brass whatsoever, and as of right now it comes in three loads. Each load is color coded. The green shell is 2¾, 8; the red shell is 3-dram, 8, and the orange shell is a 3-dram, 7½. Color-coding the shells makes it unnecessary to stamp each shell with what load it is because the color identifies the load in the shell. (A fourth shell, a one-ounce shell, is planned.)

The shells I tested worked very well. In part of my tests, I shot the shells out of the automatic, and it left no marks or anything that would hinder the performance of the shell on firing: in other words, the ejector did not leave any marks nor did rip part of the rim off the back of the shells. I shot approximately a case of shells at singles and handicap and doubles, and they all performed very well. I had no problems whatsoever. The shells are designed to be cheaper than other shells that are on the market now. Depending on the area that they are sold in, they are supposed to be marketed at approximately \$10 a case less. This makes them desirable to buy and shoot once, but I also wanted to test for re-loadingability.

When conducting the test, I took the shells and a DL-155 Pacific loader with me out to the range, to make it easier than

running back and forth to the house. I set up my loader right on the gun rack at the club, and I picked out the one load that best matched a 3-dram shell: Winchester 209 primer and the Eclipse T-1 was with 18 grains of 700x. (Note that you may use their wad with this shell.) This is supposed to produce a velocity of 1,201 fps and at a pressure of 9,674, an average that they have come up with at the factory.

I took five shells, loaded them and shot them, then I would load the shells again and shoot them. I shot and alternated shooting them in an automatic and then through my single barrel. The only problem I had on the first five that I ran through is that one shell made it through three re-loadings before most of the crimp blew off. On the fourth re-loading, the next two shells blew part of the crimp off, but the other two shells made it through five loadings. I found out after further testing that the problem on the first test was that you cannot crimp the Eclipse shell as deep as you crimp a Blue Magic or AA case, or a paper case for that matter. The plastic or Eclipse shell is a different texture; it is not the same plastic that Winchester and Remington use. It is a little thicker. Therefore, if you crimp it deep — down approximately  $\frac{1}{8}$ " as

most people do on a Winchester or a Blue Magic — it blows the end of the crimp off.

Since five shells took me a long time to do it was a little cold on the day that I ran the test, I repeated the procedure using three shells to cut down my re-loading time. This time I crimped the shells just deep enough to hold the crimp down, trying to follow what they looked like originally. I then re-loaded the shells 10 times. None of the three cases slipped or even became very black on the end. The cases were still in exceptionally good shape.

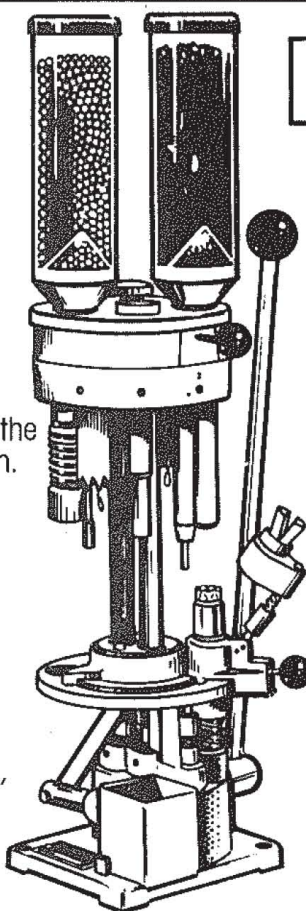

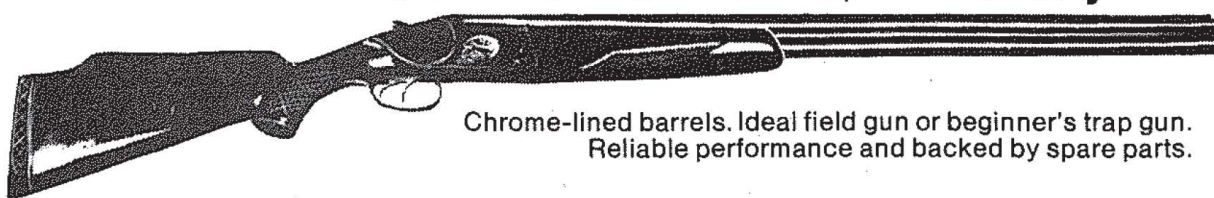

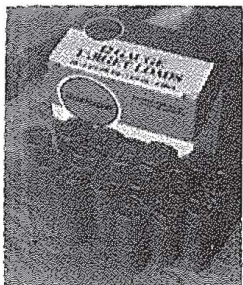

Then I went out to shoot about 200 of the new shells at everything, and they performed very well. I went home on my Siz-O-Matic Re-loader, on which I do most of my re-loading, and loaded 200 to 300 shells. In the other picture, you can see approximately how deep I crimped them, and you can also see that the shell did load very well through a progressive-type loader.

I have heard from some people in my area that the red cases will re-load more times than the orange, and that the green case will also re-load a few more times than the orange. In other words, the color of the case seems to have something to do with the re-loadability. I talked to Larry Mesch of Eclipse on the Winter Chain about the shells, and he said the color used in the plastic could have something to do with the strength of the case. The green ones that I loaded I had no problem with as long as I didn't crimp them very deep.

I did keep an eye on the primer pocket because of the plastic case, and the primer was still just as tight after 10 re-loadings as was the case or the primer pocket when they were brand new, so there should be no problem there. The resizing through either machine was very easy since the case goes back to its original size after firing. There was no resizing problem whatsoever with them.

The one thing that I would caution everyone about is that if you try to load any wad except the Eclipse wad, you will have a pressure problem. It would not only be a little hard on your guns, but it is dangerous. The size of the Eclipse wad is much smaller in diameter than the AA or Remington wad or any wads on the market since those are made for the AA and the Blue Magic cases. The inside diameter of the Eclipse shell is smaller than other shells, and the diameter of the Eclipse wad matches it. If you load the AA or Remington wad, you will increase the pressure quite a bit, and it will blow the end off the shell; in other words, the crimp will go out with the wad. So let me caution you — do use the components that are on the chart for the shell that they are recommended for.

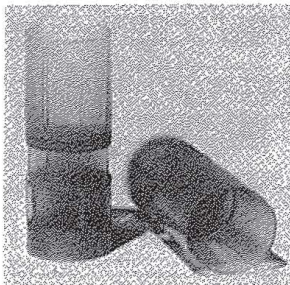
In each shell box and with the wads, the company includes a re-loading chart, showing various primer and powder combinations with Eclipse's T-1 wads (reproduced here).

The new Eclipse shell comes loaded with 5% antimony shot — considered by industry standards to be hard shot. It is good hard shot in the shell, and it seems to be of high quality.

I think, that from the test and from what I have loaded, that the Eclipse shell does do a good job at re-loading, and it is a good shell to buy. Availability may be a problem in some areas for a while, so if any of you has any problems or any questions drop me a line about the new shell and I'll see if I can answer them."

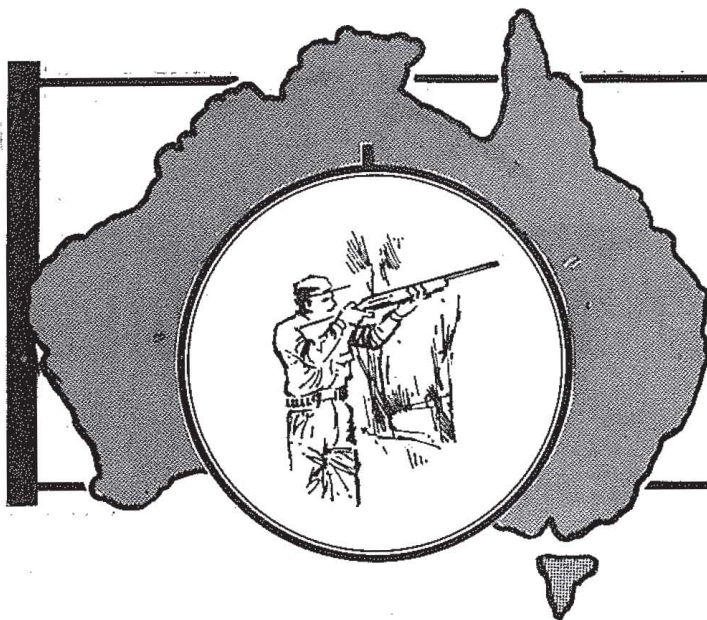

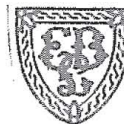

## EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Editor,

Early in February I submitted that in-depth consideration should be given to a practical alternative to the raising of Membership Subscriptions.

Permit me to reapeat my suggestion with the request that you might publish my suggestion to solicit members views and possible approval

The levying of all members will, I believe, reduce the Membership a percentage; it will oblige 'small' shooters to subsidize 'big'shooters; and tend to create a measure of dissentment, quite unnecessary and unwanted.

I submit, as a more practical solution, that every shooter should pay say Fifty Cents each time he nominates for any competition: the shooter sheets record the number of shooters and every month each Club should lodge a return briefly sum-totalling the shooters and attaching a cheque to cover the 50 Cent accumulation figure, levied.

Such a system will ensure accurate records, penalise no one, create no sectional hardships, and ensure that those who shoot actually subsidise their respective amount of participation. Such a new steady monthly income to the Association will not be dependant on Members only, — and of course their envisaged subscription increase — but to every nominating shooter at every Club or Shoot; and by simple arithmetic the end result in net annual revenue will be far greater than any \$10 increase attaching to current subscriptions.

I suggest that a simple circular is the only extra element necessary to place the system into immediate operation.

# "BUSHIES BATTLE FOR GUNNS GULLY TITLE"

The annual Gunns Gully Bush Shoot was held in the timber adjacent to Hawkesbury Gun Club on May 30 & 31, 1981. The outcome showed the local shooters how a shotgun is meant to be used, on simulated "field targets". Shooters came from Gulgong, Cessnock, Dubbo, Newcastle, Cooma, and several Field & Game branches, all in all it resembled a small Boggabri shoot. The "Bushies" took more than fifty percent of the overall prizes, plus the Championship Title and the Five Man Team Shield. A clean sweep to the "Gentlemen of the Land", well deserved wins, and the envy of most shooters in the event, who hope to give them a better run for their money next year, that even sounded like Boggabri!

The shoot opened on Saturday Morning with a single round of twenty five targets on a cash divide system. Seventy odd shooters contested the round, with several possibilities on the board it was considered to be a good lay-out, and competition promised to be keen. The fifty target trophy event was next up and the result showed that the "Gentlemen of the Land" were to make their presence felt, with five of the eight places going to them. In the 11-13m group: 1. Joe Caruara, 2. John Nichols, 14-17m: 1. Max Holland, 2. Paul Heterick, 18-21m: 1. Peter Clarkson, 2. Barry Scanes, 22-25m: 1. Guy Beddington, 2. John Fryer.

The weather had been fairly unsettled around the district the previous week with heavy rain and overcast conditions prevailing, however, Saturday was good and it turned fairly hot in the later hours, but not to be the case on Sunday. The rain kept up all day, not drenching falls all the time, but just enough to turn the paddock into a mush of all things you expect to find in a cow paddock.

For Sunday the format was the same as Saturday, a single round and then two rounds to determine the "GUNNS GULLY BUSH SHOOT" Champion, and what team could rack the best aggregate score. Despite the rain and the lousy conditions it brings, the shooters lined up to do battle with the targets, together with the wise-cracks about "a wet backside, all we need now is the fish", or "who said golfers are bent?" One trap boy, drenched to the skin, said to another that if his dad ever chipped him again for doing something dumb, he was going to ask him what he was doing out in the rain with his raincoat wrapped around his gun, and him getting wet.

The first station was a simple(?) LEFT quartering bird running along a fence line, about the same height as said fence, three targets — double barrel.

The second station was a left quartering bird about two metres high, going behind a tree about fifteen metres from the trap, and appearing about forty metres further out, a left climber over a tree line never to be seen again, both double barrel. Then doubles, the right on call, the left on gun report.

Station Three was four targets, double barrel, coming at and over the shooter by ten metres from the trap so 25-30m out. Most shooters seemed to think they were surface-to-air missiles by Sunday afternoon. Station Four three fair double rise. Station Five a left quartering bird that tried real hard to hide behind a tree if you let it go too far, a right straight away that tended to turn left if allowed to go too far, then doubles. Station Six, the last, was very interesting, if you're into Hari-Kari or playing chicken. The trap was set on the side of a hill some 45-50m out, and 5m above the shooter, the right-hand incomer carried across the creek and landed some 1-2m beside the shooters left ankle if missed, but if hit too close showered in all directions, the message was very clear; "shoot it quick", rather like dealing with a Kamikaze Duck! The left hand bird had the same trajectory but disappeared behind a large clump of trees about the time you figured you had the lead all worked out, only to reappear 1m off the ground, 10m out to your left with about 5m left to travel before plonking onto the ground.

The A.C.T.A.'s SE Victorian zone has voted \$500 to Lysterfield, and recommended to its 12 member clubs that a levy of \$1 a shooter be struck at each club's next three shoots.

The Korumburra gun club has adopted the recommendation.

Other shooting bodies, including the trade, are backing Lysterfield.

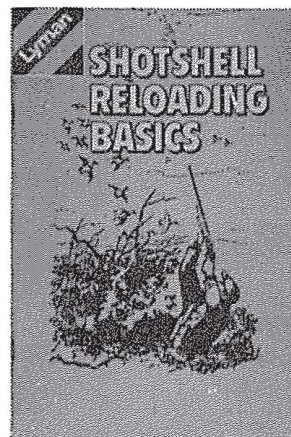

In addition to the basic reloading information, there are excellent chapters on reloading rifled slugs and buckshot, information that is hard to come by in this country. All the major American powders are covered including the three commonest available in Australia, Winchester, Hercules and DuPont.

A limited number of tested combinations in tabular form are listed in all gauges from the ever popular 12 gauge down to the .410. There is a tendency to stay with lighter loads and all shot weights are in ounces.

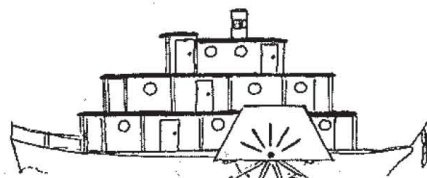

## EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

With reference to the letter by Graham Ash, President of the Frankston/Australian Gun Club, placed in July Clay Target Shooting News.

While agreeing with the main theme of Graham's letter, I feel that I should clear up an error with regard to costs incurred.

Legal costs to date, in fighting the case quoted, run to the order of \$30,000.00 Graham has no doubt picked up part of the resume' put out by the Association, giving some background to the case and stating that the case could, when heard, run for four weeks.

Costs estimated by legal services employed by the Association were given as \$4,000.00 per day in court, ie. 20 days by \$4000.00 equals \$80,000.00 In fact, in the eventuality that the case does come to court, the total costs could exceed \$100,000.00. However, this is currently not the case.

It would be wrong to allow the thought that \$80,000.00 had already been spent and have no supporting statements to this end.

I thank Graham and his Committee for their generous offer, no doubt we will need every cent which we can raise, for the battle is far from over, a fact that Graham is no doubt very aware of and as stated in his letter, is of vital importance to all shooters.

It should be stated that the injunction sought by the Shire Council did not succeed and we are still shooting at Lysterfield and hope to continue to do so.

I agree with the sentiments expressed by Graham in his closing paragraph, 'united we stand, divided we fall'.

Once again on behalf of the V.F.&G.A., I would like to thank the members of the A.C.T.A. and especially Graham and Frankston/Australian Gun Club for their support.

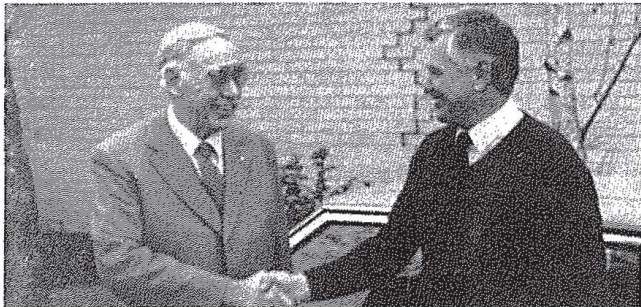

I would like to place on record a few words in the memory of J. Newton Thomas, O.A.M.

Newton was not only a great shooter, a great sportsman and a great teacher, he was also the embodiment of an era of

gentlemanly conduct. He believed that man has within himself the ability to adapt and change to circumstances, and that if any shooter was to be great, it would be himself, his own strengths, intelligence and application that would achieve that greatness.

Support and encouragement can be given externally, but man excels beyond just natural ability by dint of his own inner strengths and determination. J. Newton Thomas had just such inner strengths.

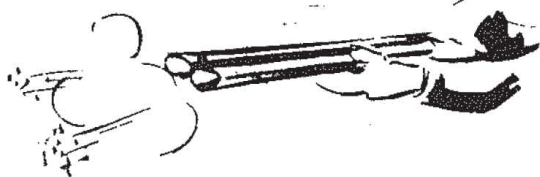
It was not a domineering, loud insistence on his way of thought that helped many, including myself to searching for our own inner strengths and ability, it was rather the quiet encouraging friendliness that enabled people to realise their full potential as Coach or Shooter, able to stand on their own two feet in what they undertook. Newton's greatness lay in his ability to let people be themselves while at the same time encouraging them to use their own strengths to a greater extent.

Newton was respected as a shooter and as a man. He was truly an ambassador for our sport. The fact that our shooters performed so well in Mexico was for Newton a great joy. Jim Ellis gaining a Gold medal, and the others shooting so well was the best gift anyone could have given Newton.

J. Newton Thomas may have died in a physical sense, but his spirit will live on, not only in my memory but in the success of all Australian Shooters.

Bwana died the other day, 66-years-old and suddenly he's gone like that big black duck you see in the falling light of the evening flight.

But what an awful lot he has taken with him. The knowledge and the memories only he could tell because he was the only one that could remember. The soft gentle voice which pulled the memory, back thirty, forty even fifty years or more, incidents that will become part of the folklore of shooting in this country.

My God, I am going to miss those laid-back talks we had about the old days. Days when you could walk into a duck swamp and hear the eerie silence give way to a roaring crescendo as tens of thousands of birds got up with the sun. Days in gentle swamp bottoms when a 30 minute walk and a keen eye would put a dozen plump snipe in the bag. Days when the dogs performed their own ballet on the three-cornered-jacks but the quail hunting was so good it couldn't be missed.

Newton Thomas was an old young man, whatever that means. Just a couple of weeks ago we had a chat. He had just returned from Mexico and I knew he was busting to talk to me about Jim Ellis and his gold medal.

But no, first it was the easy chat and enquiry as to how my duck hunting was going and some reminiscences on the area I hunt. One always felt comfortable with the man, that easy going friendship that stands a lot of kidding and teasing and words are never strained.

Our last chat was no different, although he looked drawn and a bit pale from earlier surgery the eyes sparkled and the familiar smile had the moustache bristling as he relayed to me the intense excitement of Jim Ellis' gold medal win. It is the measure of the man that he went to Mexico to be there when the fulfilment of a life's work came to fruition. Some say he should not have gone, but to see the look on his face when he produced a copy of the American Shotgunner to show Ellis listed in the top ten, I say he was in the right place at the right time.

If a man can love and respect another man, I would say that I loved and respected Newton Thomas. I have a deep and lasting respect for what he stood for and the way he stood for it. After we parted, from that last meeting some weeks ago, I never saw him again.

To say I will miss him, the shooting sports in Australia will miss him, is not saying very much. But the fact of him being gone means a big change for me, a change I could have done without.

No longer can I run an idea past him to get a reaction. No longer can we sit down, he with his orange juice, me with a scotch and soda and talk about the outback he knew and loved so well. No longer can I have those deep discussions on technical matters and shooting psychology that would go on for hours.

All this of course is deeply personal and one could go on for pages, but to know Newton Thomas is to know what I mean, there are lots who knew him in this country.

I sincerely hope you have a Newton Thomas in your life and I sincerely hope he lives with you all of your shooting days. A man who can share those moments in the duck blind when the rising sun sets the clouds alight, a man who can share the magic moment between point and flush, a man who can be relied on to listen when you have that frustrating round of skeet.

In this stupid bloody world we live in at this time, the loss of a man such as Newton creates a hollow in life which is hard to fill. God knows we are short enough these days of intelligent men who temper their knowledge with understanding, compassion, dedication and loyalty with a liberal dash of humble sportsmanship. Like I say, to lose one is to leave a big hollow.

When I have put the last full stop on this column I know exactly what I am going to do. I will take an old Model 12 from the rack, a gun Newton knew and loved, put an old duck hunting jacket on and with son, Patrick and dog, Suzy will slip quietly away to gun the evening flights on the lake.

It will give me a chance to think. It will give me a chance to tell young Patrick about Newton Thomas the man. I will tell him of the thousands of championships he won, or about the Order of Australia medal he received, he will learn of these no doubt when he gets older and follows the sport of shotgunning. The legend is already there, the shooting prowess the civil honours are part of it, to be recalled and discussed in years to come.

No, I want him to hear about the man, the man who had the qualities of character to be able to do the things in life he loved, to do them at a standard of excellence to build the legend. I hope to be able to explain to him the level of self discipline required to do these things, but above all, I want him to understand why his old man will often say in his presence he was proud to know J. Newton Thomas.

So, this evening I hope there are some teal flying because I would dearly love to be able to take a brace with a nice clean left and right, I know Newton would like that.

But no matter what happens, I am going to say my goodbye to a friend in a spot I know he would have loved to be.

I also know, when I do say 'goodbye old friend' it will not only be for myself, but for thousands of shotgunners throughout this great land of ours who have had the privilege and honour to have known J.N.T.
