





LEGISLATION

"Around the Traps" is the title of the President, Laurie Connor's column. My column could well be titled "Around the Committee Meetings". but it wouldn't be half as interesting! However, these meetings have a great relevance to all of us when the subject of legislation for the control of fire-arms is raised. Such a situation now exists. As you will have seen from the past two editions of the C.T.S.N., the Sherbrooke Shire Council is trying to stop our friends from the Field & Game using their Lysterfield range because of the noise. Now if the range happens to be set up in the vicinity of a housing estate, you could understand the problem, but this is far from the case. It appears that just a few people are trying to stop the legitimate recreational pursuits of many. Now. just consider your own gun club. How would you cope if your local Council decided to close you down? To defend any such action. funds would be needed - lots and lots of money. Now, if the Lysterfield problem can be overcome in shooters' favour, then your Council and mine would be far less likely to take us on ratepayers don't like seeing their money wasted.

So this particular court case is a test case, and the results of it will affect us all. The A.C.T.A. has already given \$1.000.00 to the Field and Game to support them, but we don't have any funds set aside for legal battles. whether they be against local councils or State Fire-arms legislators. Because of the lack of money specifically for this purpose, the Management Committee came up with the idea of a \$5.00 levy on all adult registered shooters. In other words, the money collected by the levy would be invested and would be used ONLY to protect shooter's interests. This suggestion has been circulated to the Executive Committee and will be discussed at the meeting at the end of October. Now it is up to you to let your State representative know how you feel about kicking in \$5.00 to this fund, or maybe drop a line to the National office — YOUR OPINIONS ARE NEEDED.

A.S.A.

Protection of shooters interests was very much on the agenda at the July meeting of the Australian Shooting Association. The A.S.A. is the umbrella organisation for all competitive shooting, but until the last meeting was pretty well just a travel agent for international representatives. The A.S.A. decided which competitors should represent Australia. and made the arrangements. Following the "SHOOTING IN THE EIGHTIES" workshop in Canberra last year. the A.S.A. has re-organised itself. The meeting in July agreed unanimously to re-structure the whole organisation to allow it to promote shooting in every way and defend shooters rights wherever they may be challenged. Standing Sub-Committees will be formed to look after each area of interest, such as INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION, PROMOTION, LEGISLA-TION. On behalf of the A.C.T.A., I submitted a proposal for an A.S.A. Legislative Fund, similar to the one suggested for the A.C.T.A., and all the affiliates to the A.S.A. thought it was a worthwhile idea and it will be one of the first items on the Agenda for the Legislation Committee.

The A.S.A. is to get a new Consitution to allow any shooting organisation to join, and the first and biggest to do this should be the Field and Game Association. The A.S.A. intends to offer representation to any fire-arms organisation, so that competitive and recreational shooting can speak with one voice. The benefits of a strong united body are obvious.

INTERNATIONAL SUB-COMMITTEE

Re-organisation and re-structuring are all the go at the moment. The International Sub-Committee of the A.C.T.A. has needed a face-lift for some time. In the past, many criticisms have been levelled at it by the "I.S.U. Contingent" and the standard DTL shooters, and to some extent the criticism has been justified. So it was decided to re-structure the International Sub-Committee, giving it more authority and more responsibility to run its own affairs. To accomplish this, I made a proposal to that Committee at its June meeting, and the other members added their ideas and changed a few things around and now it will go to the full National Executive for further discussions and alterations, if necessary, before it is given the final seal of approval.

It is most important for everyone to realise that the National Executive has the final say so on anything to do with clay busting. A bit like the Federal Government. Everyone on it has been elected by you, through your club, your Zone and your State. It is designed to be a democratic group and everyone on it has an equal vote and equal say.

The guidelines for the Management Committee are laid down in the constitution, but the International Sub-Committee has never had clear cut instructions to follow. The proposal for the National Executive to vote on in October suggests that there be five members on the Committee. One of them would be the National Training Squad Manager/Coach. who, although selected by the International Sub-Committee. must be confirmed in the job by the full Executive. The other four representatives on the Committee will be elected directly by the Executive and will consist of two members nominated by State I.S.U. Sub-Committees. one member to represent "standard" clay busting and one member from the Management Committee. The Chairman would be selected by the members of the International Sub-Committee.

The most important new job for the Committee would be preparation of a budget for the next year and the Financial Statement for the previous year. I believe that it is vital that this committee, which is responsible for spending a fair amount of money, show ALL shooters what funds it wants and exactly how it spent the funds it was given.

Letting people know what's going on. COMMUNICATION. is a big problem for any organisation, so it has been suggested that the details of all the meetings be sent not only to all Executive members, but also to the State Associations and State I.S.U. Sub-Committees. To make quite sure no-one thinks the Committee has any secrets, it is suggested that observers be allowed to be present at meetings. Now this proposal will be discussed by the Executive and afterwards the full details will be published in this magazine.

TALK BACK

Talk back radio is very popular, communication is a two-way business which is why I suggested this "Management Committee Column" back in January. I believed. and still do, that you, the reader, should get to know more about what is happening from the people on the Management Committee who are trying to run the sport. We are all shooters, like you, and we all love the sport, and want to do the right thing for it. Sometimes, we get the feeling that this magazine is like talk back radio, but everyone else has their sets turned off! This is YOUR sport and YOUR magazine, so why not make the communication two way, write to the C.T.S.N. and give your opinion, your suggestion. your criticism.

PHONO PULLS

One of the matters the Executive would like to know about from individual shooters and clubs is Phono Pulls. It has been suggested the A.C.T.A. buy enough sets for use at the "Nationals", but we want to make the best buy, so we would like to hear your experience of them. We need to know who made them, what they cost, and any problems with their use. Send your replies to the National office.

I have tried to keep this column straightforward and about topics that interest the shooters all over Australia. A big fat "Editors Mailbox" in the next magazine will tell me if I have succeeded.



CLAY SHOOTING TERRITORY STYLE!

The social atmosphere of Clay Shooting was never more evident than at the Katherine Gun Club's Annual Charity Shoot for the Katherine School of the Air, held at "Ballongilly" over the long weekend in June.

For those who have yet to venture to the top end, read on and envy those who were at the shoot in the glorious

Northern Territory sunshine and clear skies.

The Katherine School of the Air is a unique style of teaching for children in outback Northern Territory, where students operate in classroom style over their radio sets. This annual shoot is one of their main fund raising events on the calendar and the efforts of their staff, particularly the convenor of their shoot, Pam Crellin, along with some parents, made sure we were all well fed, watered and suitably tired the whole weekend.

Ballongilly is the station property of Ern and Pauline Rayner, situated some 40 km from Katherine township. The Rayner's turn over their property, home and Gun Club facilities to the K.S.A. for this event.

For the uninitiated, it must surely be one of the most enjoyable times you could ever have and the events of the weekend could not be accurately described in writing. Ask any of the many interstate visitors who now plan part of their annual holidays to come visit "Ballongilly" and you too. will front up one day. The challenge is out now. Next winter come up and see us.

The three day shoot commenced on Saturday. June 6th at 10 a.m. Over two traps fronting onto the most glorious expanse of N.T. bushland you could imagine. The fully equipped two lay out Club is from an elevated position about 8 km from the homestead upon which everyone descended at nightfall to camp on, in and around in a unbelievable assortment of tents, swag rolls and in fact, in many instances, on natures mattress (the ground). They breed 'em tough in the Territory.

Event 1 was a 10 target single barrel eye opener and was won outright by Mick Milera, carding the only possible.

Event 3 was won by the 'Nooka' Kid. Paul Farnam. with an impressive 101/102 points from 'dead eye' Allan Hobbs 100/102 and Darwin Gun Club president Bill Horner third with 71/75.

Shooting finished just before dark and a spirited session at the 32 metre mark (similar to the 19th hole) worked up an

appetite for the voluminous dinner that was provided free as were all the meals for the weekend, back at the homestead.

Most shooters had travelled some distance to get there that day and headed off to their various camping places for the night early. However, enter Lockie McKinnon the station manager, who not being a shooter, had ventured to the Katherine races for the day and had suitably fleeced the local book-makers and rocked back at about 1 a.m. and wanted to 'kick on.' Finding all in bed, he busied himself around the kitchen emptying another dozen or so tinnies and nobbling the sweet curry chilli powder which surely must have been administered with a coal miners shovel.

Concurrently, the cool of the evening nutured a host of tired bodies into a happy dream of a hearty 8 a.m. breakfast and a next day's shooting at clays that looked like red tractor tyres against the perfect blue background but . . . 5.20 a.m. heralded the first of a barrage of shots fired into the air followed by several others trying in what has become tradition now, to outdo each other.

All up and finished breakfast early, everyone in convoy style makes their way back up the escarpment to commence day two.

After a 10 target handicap eye opener. divided by five shooters the premier event was started with some 75 entrants. The K.S.A. 

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION CHANGES WILL PROVIDE STRONGER SUPPORT FOR AUSTRALIAN SHOOTERS

Over two million shooting enthusiasts and sportsmen are to receive stronger organisational support for their activities due to a re-structuring of the Australian Shooting Association.

tion. The re-organisation was agreed upon by delegates during a General Meeting of the ASA held in Canberra on the weekend of July 3 and 4, 1981. The changes will safeguard the autonomy of the five original shooting associations, while providing a stronger national framework for the efficient implementation of the Association's pursuits.

The decision came as a result of recommendations from Gleeson and Power. Management Consultants, after an indepth review of the structure of the ASA carried out with the

help of Federal funding.

Major changes will include a new Constitution providing for the admittance of all competitive and recreational shooting bodies into the ASA and the appointment of an Executive Officer to provide administrative leadership and assistance on a full-time basis. Provision is also being made for the employment of professional assistance in the area of public relations. In addition to Government assistance, it is expected that the Association will be funded by industrial concerns.

The meeting also witnessed the election of David Watts as ASA President, Dr Paul Cains as Vice-President, and Don

Brook as Secretary.

Mr Watts is a Sydney Managing Director with considerable experience in the administration of shooting sports. For some time he has been president of the Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia and is past president of the New South Wales Amateur Pistol Association. Dr Cains is a Tasmanian physician with a long-standing interest in skeet and trap shooting. He is a keen competitor and administrator.

Don Brook is well known as a small bore rifle shooter and has been involved in competition and administration for many

years.

Commenting on the ASA re-organisation. Mr Watts said. "The changes will allow all shooters to enjoy the benefits of a professionally run Association. For too long we have lacked the strength that only a unified voice can provide. This re-structuring provides us with a base from which the interests of shooting sportsmen and women can be projected and, where appropriate, protected."

In addition to assisting with the organisation of such well known events as the shooting sections of the Olympic and Commonweath Games, the ASA, through its affiliates, provides advice and facilities for all types of shooting and actively promotes the recognition of wild life management and the conservation of game animals. It promotes and assists in the education of young people in the art of safe shooting, firearms etiquette and the law as it affects shooters and hunters.



HOW TIGHTLY GAME WILL SIT

(by Tom Gannon)

A fox would not budge out of a 10m. by 20m. patch of blackberres last July. Yet 50 metres away two shots had been fired and three of us were talking and tossing 4-kg. rocks into the patch.

Only when terriers, picking their way under the blackberries, barked at the fox did he bolt.

Later, a fox trotted over a hill, and heard and saw us 400 metres away on another hill, on farm land. It quickened speed and disappeared in a gully. A shot fired in its direction did not put the fox to flight, so it was presumed to have slipped into a hole.

I was relieved to be asked to keep watching for the fox while my mates walked 800 metres down and up awfully steep hills. and got it with the terriers. The caution of this fox is typical of "red men" in a frequently-hunted patch where the shutting of a car door will make them bolt.

Yet at times they sit so tightly that they won't move until a dog lunges at them.

Game birds are the same. A duck will occasionally not break cover with the first burst of shots. Other times they take wing when hunters are hundreds of metres away.

Quail and snipe can be just as jumpy. Yet at times they have to be kicked up.

Fellow Korumburra (V.) GC member Ken Bell recalls the time that foxhounds had gone away on a deer. To kill time, Ken and a companion strolled through a ferny patch where a deer was often roused. Nothing moved. They were in mountainous Walhalla country and rolled a boulder through the patch. It cut a path within three metres of a stag. Not until the dogs returned and the patch was checked for a third time did he break.

Hog deer are noted for taking off after a hunter has walked past.


Sunday.



PETER QUIRE — AN INTRODUCTION

NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD MANAGER/COACH, PE-TER QUIRE, GIVES US SOME INFORMATION ABOUT HIS SPORTING BACKGROUND

I have been asked to tell you, the shooters of Australia, a little about myself and will do my best, as talking about oneself is not an easy task.

I grew up in Bordertown, South Australia, and my father and grandfather were keen hunters and shooters. Dad was a great duck shooter with eyes like a hawk, and a depth of knowledge of game and their habitat. He was a live bird shooter, and watching him introduced me to competitive shooting. I did not myself shoot live birds, but did sense the enjoyment and excitement of competition. So to shoot well, for me, began with wanting to be as good a shot as my Dad

I was introduced to clay target shooting in early 1960 by Don Fleetwood of Adelaide, and even though I had played football and most other sports, clay target shooting seemed to me to be the ultimate. It has everything, skill, stamina. concentration and determination are all involved, and it is a sport where there are no limits, even if shooting by yourself. you have yourself to better. To add to this, there is the great spirit of comradeship amongst the shooters. My love of the sport has never diminished.

There were no coaches in those days, but with the help of people like Bob and Keith Mules, Cal Hollow, Mr Lawson Senior and Hilary Baynes. I reached a fairly high standard and won my share of championships. Luck made it possible for me to shoot 338 straight in competition, most of it against Ray Kimber. I say luck because not everybody has the

Teaching shooting and safety with the Field and Game Association made me aware that it is necessary to be more than a good shot to give people the confidence in their own ability to so something, and at the same time discovered the pleasure of helping someone else to enjoy my sport.

When the South Australian Clay Target Association appointed me as State Coaching Director. I started coaching in earnest, and have since applied my energies and talents to becoming as good a coach as is possible.

Newton Thomas was a most important influence on my enthusiasm, and as a friend and mentor, gave me the benefit of his great knowledge of shooting at international, national and local levels. He encouraged and inspired me.

Mv appointment to manage and coach the National Training Squad gives me an opportunity to help those squad members to reach their potential. In doing this I will be serving my sport, you the clay target shooters of Australia and ultimately, Australia itself. Australian shooters are. I believe, as good as or better than any in the world, and with your support, the National Training Squad members, the International Sub-Committee and myself will serve you well.



Part 3 of the ISU Skeet column is a step-by-step explanation of how best to shoot each station. I am afraid I cannot claim any points for the wording of the following text, as it is, in the main, directly from the U.S Army Marksmanship notes on how to shoot ISU Skeet. And we thank the unit for making these notes available to us.

Before I go into the text, I would like to take a small space and talk about practice.

First of all, practice is where confidence is bred: practice is most important - not just time to fill in. Some people feel that, if they practice ten hours per week, they have to be a champion. It is no use practising unless it is constructive. because the technical sports require so much practice to bring out that excellence required for high scores. Boredom can enter into the practice session. It is imperative that you set goals for yourself at each practice session - you will certainly enjoy it more, and your technique will benefit from this.

Now, down to practice. For the novice, shoot 50 targets. Do not take any repeats. After the 50 targets are completed. work on stations, checking gun position, feet position, etc.

For the more experienced shooter, shoot 100 targets. putting pressure on yourself to attain as high a percentage of hits as you can. You should have the practice goal to beat your previous practice score. If you shoot 100 straight, improve on the hits, improve on your technique.


After you finish practice on the 100, shoot stations, working on gun positions, check yourself that you are not getting away from the basics of good shooting.

If you have disciplined practice sessions, you will cut your learning time down, and you will have a disciplined approach to competition.

Don't forget you are quite welcome to write in to this column and ask any questions you might have on skeet. and we will try to answer them for you.

INTERNATIONAL GUN CLUB PRESIDENT TEAM SHIELD SHOOT A TOTAL SUCCESS



400 target events to pick International teams are being used in some countries.

After just having competed in the U.S.A. National tournament in ISU Skeet, I came into contact with a 400 target event. It was with interest that I spoke to Herb Chambers, field representative for the N.R.A. and John Hunt, U.I.T. representative, so I could find out why the most successful country in ISU Skeet teams in the world used a 400 target match. The answer was that the 400 target match simulates the time, acclimatisation and pressure of world championship. This, they feel, can bring out the four best people to represent the United States. The formula must be good - the U.S.A. holds the world record for team scoring and many gold medals for teams in international matches.

Because the U.S. is about the same size as Australia, they have the same problems as we do, in so much that travelling to major shoots out of State is restrictive, so they hold Elimination matches in each State, and the winners of these matches have the right to compete in the final tryout. This is the fairest possible way to each competitor. Naturally, the U.S. has a lot more ISU shooters than we do at this time. But a 400 target match would certainly give everybody a feast of ISU. Also we could enjoy other countries coming to our country to compete for the same reasons other countries go to the U.S.A. to compete in their 400 target match.

Let's face it; if someone is going to travel 20,000 miles, they

want to press the trigger more than 200 times.

The U.S. keeps the National ISU title strictly for U.S. citizens, but a Visiting Countries Match is also incorporated within the event. They have a 4-man team match and also a 2-man team match, so this is to maintain more interest within the event.

The teams are picked at the end of the 400 targets and are the first 4 past the post in Men's Open, Ladies' Open, and Junior, taking into account that in ISU rules junior's stop at 21 years.

The 400 target match is an excellent one, and it will be interesting to see what the comments are after this year's Victorian ISU carnival, where there are 3 individual 100 target matches occurring, with a High Gun over the 300 targets. The V.C.T.A. is to be complimented on giving ISU shooters a feast of ISU shooting; but it also gives the aspiring ISU shooters the chance for a greater introduction to the ISU sports. I hope we get a great roll-up. It will certainly be a great warm-up for the National ISU titles that will be held a week later at same Gun Club (Melbourne Gun Club).



GUN EXPERT ON THE MOVE





RULES CORNER

There seems to be some confusion among referees as to the procedure of conducting an event where six shooters in a squad are allowed a sighter target not to count.

To clarify the situation, number six shooter commences by shooting his or her sighter target first followed by number two, then three, four and five.

Number one shooter then shoots the sighter target, reloads and commences the competition.

A further recommendation for referees when being asked to view a target prior to the commencement of an event by number one competitor, is to ask the competitor to call for the target.

This enables the competitor to ascertain the type of release he can expect from the Referee.

This may be of some assistance to Referees and shooters in

There still seems to be some confusion with the wording of Trap Rule 74 in relation to the recording of scores for eye openers by some clubs.

Even though Rule 74(c) states, "All standard targets fired upon in competition etc.," this does not over-ride Rule 74(A) where eye-openers are noted as not being included, so to avoid any further confusion on this rule, do not include eye-openers in common mark classifications.







I am a registered junior clay target shooter and having shot my first Nationals at Melbourne Gun Club in 1981. I would like to suggest for your consideration and to hopefully have included in the future National program the following changes:

- 1. That a junior and ladies overall High Gun be included in the National program, including the skeet, this would then highlight the one won by the best junior and lady.
- 2. That in all events, there are juniors, ladies and veterans trophies of first, second and third (as I personally think that there are sufficient numbers now attending in all these sections), again this would only be in line with other gradings.
- 3. That nominations for juniors and ladies (mainly juniors) be at half nominations or at a greatly reduced price. My reason for this is that in nearly all cases, a junior is the son or daughter of a registered shooter (and the lady being the wife or young daughter) and it does become a financial burden on parents to have to pay full nominatons for themselves and

their children. Also the majority of clubs in my area charge half nominations for juniors and ladies where the parent is also a shooter

It seems to me that if clubs can encourage juniors and ladies (and new shooters) this way, that our National Association should do the same. After all, juniors of today are your future clay target champions.

I hope to be attending the Nationals in Brisbane and this would be my last year as a junior. I would like to see my suggestion included in the Brisbane and future Nationals.

I would also like to make it clear that these are my own ideas, formulated by talking to other juniors and shooters at the Melbourne Nationals and around my own area and I believe that it would greatly increase the number of juniors shooting at our Nationals.

I enjoy my shooting with many other juniors and ladies. and would like to see these suggestions put into effect.



As well as the normal extensive catalogue section which is updated each year, the 1981 edition carries some interesting articles on a diverse range of subjects.

For the collector and historian and the front loading school there are stories on the West Point Museum, Muzzle Loading Shotguns, Collecting Guns for Investment and The Immortal Luger. There is more history in Flint, Frizzen and Steel, an indepth story on ignition systems and a close look at Finland's Lahti Pistols.

For the airgunners, James Greismer looks at the latest in air powered rifles and handguns and Chuck Adams discusses the role of Trajectory in hunting with longun and bow. For the tinkerers there is a superb article on the do's and don'ts of Home Gunsmithing with an excellent set of tables and charts telling you what is within your capabilities for various weapons.





DO WE DEFEND?

NOTE

Mr David Watts is the National President of the Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia. He is most concerned at the growing strength of the attacks being made on the rights and priviledges of the responsible firearms user - that is, the hunter and competitive shooting sports people.

The following message was prepared for inclusion in the magazine "Pistol Shooters' Bulletin". However, it makes a lot of sense for readers of CTSN also.

As shooters you must all be aware of two important matters that may affect your enjoyment of our sport.

First, you will all have noticed the constant media harping for more stringent firearms laws, as if by passing more laws our society will become less violent. Second, there is a real (and quite logical) call for uniform firearms regulations.

As pistol shooters we are already governed by strict, but in my view generally fair, Acts and Regulations that both licence and register the shooter and the pistol. In short, we as pistol shooters, are already bound by the strict laws that proregulators seem to want (short that is, of those who favour total prohibition).

There is certainly some logic in aiming for uniform firearms Acts and Regulations throughout the country particularly if the uniform laws follow those of some enlight-

Where then is the problem? Where is the danger to our sport?

The danger, friends, is that while we sit back and hope that reason will prevail, it may not. We may indeed have uniform laws, and they may not be to our liking at all.

Many of you are also rifle shooters or shotgunners, and in that capacity you have an interest in any changes in laws relating to these areas.

It is my strong opinion that we, as shooters, are not taking these matters seriously. We tend to wait and hope that there will be no change that will affect the enjoyment of our sport, and we will only begin to agitate for effective collective action after the event. Then it may well be too late.

There are nearly 50,000 members of the Australian Shooting Association to which the APSUA is affiliated. Hopefully this number will be even greater soon when the ASA may be enlarged to embrace other disciplines. I believe that if we were each prepared to contribute financially, say \$1 per year, we would be able to engage the appropriate experts in public relations and in the processes of government, to effectively monitor the situation and to counter the anti-gun propaganda with reasonable argument.

Please think about it. Do you like the situation as it is now? Are you prepared to leave the entire work of dealing with future firearms laws and with the anti-gun section of our society with the few dedicated individuals who continue to raise their voices in alarm at the merest mention of regulation of any sort.

Think about it.

Would you be prepared to increase your capitation fees by a \$1 per year to provide for professional help? I think we should. I also think that the time is now.

The ASA management is studying the matter and will be putting a strong recommendation to the ASA Council comprised of delegates from each affiliate. How should your delegate vote?

You are the APSUA. It is your view at the grass roots of our Union that really matters. Please communicate your opinion on this very important matter to either your State Association and/or directly to the Bulletin.

I am hoping for a large and positive response.
