

A meeting in Brisbane of the Nationals '82 Organising Committee enabled me to get up to date with the planning for May next year, and to see the progress being made by the Public Works Department to ready the Belmont complex for the Commonwealth Games.

Sporting Associations are generally saddened by the allocation of \$2.885m to the Sport Development Program. This is identical to last years allocation, so inflationary pressures reduce it by 10 percent in real terms.

Added to this, the dramatic increases in domestic and international travel costs in the last year, effectively reduce the allocation by as much as 40 percent. The 2½ percent across the board increase in sales tax hasn't helped either, so all in all, a very ordinary budget for sport.

The Association's Management Committee met in Melbourne. August 22 and 23. A very long agenda was worked through, with many recommendations coming out of this meeting, to be put to the full Executive when it meets at the end of October.

I'm completing these notes after another week-end involved with the sport.

Friday morning it was out to Melbourne Gun Club to see the start of the I.S.U. Nationals, before going to Tamworth to witness the New South Wales Trap Carnival.

Over one hundred shooters at Melbourne for the National Trench and I.S.U. Skeet Championships, with a strong contingent of nine shooters from Western Australia making the long journey to Melbourne.

Congratulations to Terry Rumbel and Graeme Boyd, winners of the Trench and I.S.U. Skeet titles. A full report will appear in next months issue of Clay Target Shooting News.

Picturesque Tamworth Gun Club at Loomberah outside Tamworth, was the site for the 1981 New South Wales Trap Carnival. About 200 shooters attended each of the three days.

It was a great opportunity to meet many shooters from interstate. A full report of the Carnival will appear next month.

#### **OUR GREATEST GAME BIRD**

Charlie Milner, 60, drained his whisky glass and said: "As far as I'm concerned the season could close tomorrow. I've shot enough — 55 in three months."

We were having a Christmas drink at Charlie's home on the outskirts of our town of Wonthaggi in Victoria.

A few days earlier, Charlie and his 32-year-old son, home for Christmas dinner, had barrelled another three snipe 200 metres beyond Charlie's back fence.

NO WAY could I go along with Charlie's closure of the October through February season at the end of December.

There is still the challenge of finding snipe around permanent water such as springs, estuaries, tidal swamps and on inlet islands. They shift to them when swamps dry up.

Charlie overlooks 300 acres of farm land favored by snipe and matched only by 300 acres on the opposite side of town.

These localities are known to every snipe shooter in a town of 5,000 where EVERY shooter seems to go after snipe.

There were 200 birds over Charlie's back fence 300 acres on opening day. He and two mates bagged 30-odd.

The town's keenest snipe shooter Joe Gheller, 56, had the daily bag limit of 15 by 8 am.

By the time the season was a fortnight old, the district had copped 11 inches of rain in six weeks.

It seemed that all the snipe in the world — claimed by a Japanese conservation group to number only 20,000 — were in our district.

They were not, because 200-mile distant SW Victoria was also having the greatest season in memory.

I learned this on suggesting to our state Fisheries and Wildlife body that the opening day be altered from the first DAY of October to the first SATURDAY of October.

Work prevents many shooters from going out on a week day. But the F & WL says snipe could not stand the pressure; and that for a few years yet, opening day will remain on the first DAY of the month.

I had the first fortnight of the season off work, and went out each Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

At 55 years of age, one needs a day to recover from plodding around in mud for a few hours.

There were two to five of us on those opening fortnight shoots, and we topped the 200. 45. 44 and 38 were our best tallies.

On one of the days, the ACTA's since-dead director of coaching Newton Thomas and his mate. Keith Mueller, both of Melbourne, were with us.

Police checked us out that day.

A well-intended Field and Game Association member saw mobs of ducks in the air where we were shooting snipe. Police turned up to investigate a complaint of ducks being shot out of season.

We were in the clear.

Newton had shot game all over Australia. NZ, New Guinea, the UK, America and Europe. But not until he shot near a South Gippsland hamlet that day, had he been checked by police or wildlife authorities.

#### Incidentally, like all of us, Newton used to miss.

He used 8s in a full choke pump. To not damage a close bird, he shot down the side of it. Fancy being THAT good!

He did not better the snipe shooter's average of one bird every three shots.

I got a few of our town's keenest snipe shooters — Italians — together one night and, despite bottles of home-made wine, crystal clear in my mind were their conclusions that snipe are

- · less difficult to hit when approached down-wind.
- NOTHING spooks them more than a voice,
- · 8s are the ideal size shot,
- $\bullet\,$  you are over-gunned at anything tighter than half-choke (modified).

I was out with one of them one day and did not bother to shoulder my ¼ and ¾ Browning game gun on a snipe that seemed out of range as it got out of a drain.

But Ugo Andrighetto, 50, brought it down at 30 metres with 10s from an open skeet gun.

The bird was only winged, but it showed what can be done with light shot and an open boring.

During November I ran out of No. 8 shot; and for a few outings, used 7s loaded for trap. They were too heavy; they knocked birds about.

Sevens are great for long shots, but most snipe are taken inside 20 yards.

#### Smother him as he rises, and he's yours!

Earlier, I mentioned that our Italian "forum" stressed the importance of not talking. Not even to your dog. Whistle him, wave to him, shake your fist, BUT DO NOT TALK UNLESS YOU WANT TO RISK FLUSHING A BIRD OUT OF RANGE.

Snipe take so little notice of a dog that they invariably resettle within 50 yards. Besides, such birds would probably not be put up by the shooter.

Because we use dogs, we always walk INTO the wind. That way the dogs warn of birds ahead. Occasionally they set them.



#### OUR GREATEST GAME BIRD (Cont'd from page 4)

A dog also saves legs and time by retrieving; and time in tracking a wounded runner.

A dog covers MANY times more territory than a shooter. And 90 per cent of snipe shooting time is spent in locating birds.

A snipe will often run at right angles to a shooter. But this diversion will not elude a dog. Snipe run up to 60 yards.

A snipe's skylark coloring makes it as hard to see on bare ground as a stubble quail; but here again, a dog proves its value by scenting the bird.

A dog is also indispensible when, after the initial burst of shooting, snipe tend to hide in heavier cover.

If a lone shooter approaches a hatch of cover where a snipe landed, the bird will go out the other side.

But with a dog to put it out, and a shooter each side of the patch, one generally gets a shot.

#### Besides, shootin' ain't shootin' without a dog and a mate!

Snipe return to the same spots year after year. In growing holiday resorts around our South Gippsland coast they are in edge-of-town housing developments. Where the development embraces THEIR land, they feed in backyard drains.

A couple of hundred are spread through a sub-division at the entrance to Cowes on Phillip Island.

There are a dozen resident birds in the industrial estate where my bird dogs are exercised morning and evening.

It is advisable to not shoot every bird in a patch. If a few are left, they call in others for NEXT time.

While snipe are waders, they often congregate a mile from water. Ferny, sandy rises are favorite places for a snipe camp.

We have been hitting such a locality about five times a season for 10 years. We've even come upon them there, taking dust baths. They arrive there about a month after the season has opened, and stick around for three months.

The most favored place to find them is in waist-high scrub. Then their rise is accompanied by audible wing-flapping against the scrub.

If there are also trees in the scrub, the snipe can easily bring you undone with their aerobatics to avoid a tree.


Incidentally, they perch in trees, on windrows and occasionally on fence posts. And when they launch from these "pads" they have a LOT in their favour.

For the first month last season we weighed birds. They ranged from juveniles of 120 gms (4-oz) to mature birds of 190 gms (7-oz). Most were juveniles. One had been banded in Japan four months earlier when seven months old.

The signing of the Japanese-Australian Migratory Bird Agreement put the current season in doubt.

But a F&WL drafted questionnaire circulated among Victorian Field and Game members showed that birds were so numerous and so widespread that a closed season was not justified.

Snipe shooters would be serving their own cause by filling out a similar survey this season.

#### COMMITTEE COLUMN

Lengthy discussions are carried out at every A.C.T.A. Executive meeting on how we can encourage a greater input from shooters to assist in making decisions within our administrative structure. These talks usually finish upbackat square one, leaving most of us just as much in the dark as ever.

We try desperately to formulate policy which will have your blessing, only to find that you are not overly satisfied anyway.

Just how to create a form of communication which is acceptable to all parties concerned, for the present, escapes me.

Perhaps one area which gains more shooter criticism than any other at the moment is that of the rules. There is no doubt that the rule book is the chronicle which has the most direct and all-encompassing effect on all shooting members within the A.C.T.A.

With this in mind, Jim Scott, Executive member for New South Wales, has presented a draft of a "Referee's Association" to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee. Jim has placed a great deal of thought and effort into this proposal with the equity of competition for all clay target shooters paramount at all times.

By presenting this to you now through the C.T.S.N.. we are offering you a classic opportunity to help in the policy making of your chosen sport.

Basically, the draft proposal for the formulation of a "Referee's Association" calls for an end to over-complicated rules and regulations, and for them to be replaced with competition law, convenient to both interpret and implement.

Jim has come to this conclusion after very careful study of the trials and tribulations being experienced by shooters, referees and club administrators in carrying out their respective sections of our current system.

The proposal put forward for consideration does not just criticise and ask for action to be taken. Jim has provided a "suggestion style" list of objectives and actions on which to base the entire project.

Briefly, these are:

- (1) Inform all A.C.T.A. members through Clay Target Shooting News of the "Referee's Association" discussions. thereby permitting input from the shooters who are most directly affected.
- (2) State Associations to convene a meeting of their Rules Supervisors, Referee Examiners and Referees for discussions on the situation.
- (3) From these meetings, one delegate from each State to be elected to the "Referee's Association".
- (4) The seven men to constitute a new rules Sub-Committee to meet more regularly, and to canvas the feelings of the members more often than is at present practicable.
  - (5) This group to be responsible for all facets of:-
    - (a) New Rules
    - (b) Rules Changes
    - (c) Appointment of Rules Supervisors
    - (d) Appointment of Referee Examiners
    - (e) Referees instruction clinics

with our system, and why not? Difficult, complicated and controversial rules to interpret; some juries not backing referees decisions; some shooters who are not referees themselves sniping and snarling; these are all factors which go towards disheartening the volunteers already in service and preventing others from taking on the job.

There you have it. Now, how about your bit! Jim and I would be only too happy to hear from you on this subject, just as soon as you are able to see your way clear to put pen to paper.

The next subject which I wish to talk about grieves me deeply, for it indicates the unfortunate state of affairs our communications system is in.

At present we have a situation where our I.S.U. Nationals dates clash with the N.S.W. State D.T.L. Carnival 1981 and 1982. We are at present carrying out an investigation into this "state" of affairs in the hope it will be rectified.

However, there is no doubt that such a clash should never occur, placing competitors in the position of having to choose between disciplines and in future, if anything of this nature rears its "ugly head", I can assure you that the National Executive will not permit the conflict.





It is with deep regret that the CTSN announces the death of a well respected shooter in Mark Edgar.


Mr Edgar aged 65 years was honoured by approximately sixty shooters at a service held on August 8, 1981 at the Springvale Crematorium.







#### MENTAL DISCIPLINE

The three ingredients that make a winning performance are confidence, ability and mental discipline.

The three are so closely aligned that, unless they are interlocked, the competitor's performance is certainly impaired.

Confidence. All the confidence in the world is worth very little if the competitor has not the ability to perform the task. On the other hand, if the competitor has all the ability, but is not confident enough to put that ability into motion, then again, that performance is impaired. This is where mental discipline enters the game.

I find that confidence and ability are arrived at by positive practice. If you practice a skill correctly, you will become efficient in that skill or skills, and confidence in yourself will become greater as your efficiency increases. The competitor must mentally train himself to practice correctly. And I find the easiest way of doing this is by goal setting.

Here is an example. Your goal is to win the 1500 metre race at the Olympics. You know that, to win the race, your time will have to be, say, 3 mins, 50 secs., but you, at this time, are running 4 mins, 10 secs. — 20 seconds over the required time. If you go out to practice and try and run 3:50, then you will be sadly disappointed. And possibly your confidence will be

dampened. The correct way to obtain that 3 mins. 50 secs. is to make yourself an objective. If your best time, so far. is 4:10, then tomorrow's training should be 4:08, and the next day 4:6 and so on. This makes your training more positive and interesting and, as your time gets lower, your skills improve.


If you find you have not the ability required to perform your objective, go to the coach, find out what you have to do to improve your ability and make that your objective. To improve your technique, will help you get to your objective time, thus getting you closer to your goal-time.

Some people call this brick-building: slowly building brick by brick, improving your technique, improving your confidence. And, with the daily challenge, making you mentally tough.

This daily routine holds you in good stead at top level competition because of the mental toughness to go out and make yourself excel day after day. On the big day, if you are mentally tough enough to go out and do better, you will find you will reap the reward.

Winning — is the reward for correct positive practice and the mental discipline to put all that hard work into perspective.







#### TRADE TOPICS (Cont'd)

#### RECLAIMED SHOT

Just released onto the market with this issue of the Australian Clay Target Shooting News is what is believed to be the first commercially available reclaimed shot in Australia.

Probably many people sitting waiting for their turn to shoot have thought about reclaiming the shot which was being systematically deposited onto the ground. If any of their thoughts were carried further they would have found that reclaiming shot from Clay Target shooting grounds is not as easy as it first seems.

A Sydney company, NAKUBA PTY. LTD.. has developed a system for reclaiming shot, removing all the dirt in the process and then grading it into sizes 7.8 and 9. The company claims that all oversize, undersize and badly deformed shot is discarded in the grading process.

A spokesman for the company. Mr John Watson, says that either wet or dry separation can be used depending on the ground conditions and the clubs locality. For most clubs the first step is to take off the top 5-7 cms. prior to the separation process.

When the shot recovery is complete the ground can be topsoiled and replanted in accordance with the clubs needs. A recovery rate of 90-95 percent is claimed for this method.

If for some reason the top 5-7 cms, cannot be taken off another process which picks the shot off the ground can be used. However, the company says that this method is much slower and a recovery rate of only 40-45 percent can be expected.

The reclamation program of NAKUBA PTY. LTD. promises to be a boon to Clay Target shooting in Australia providing a source of money for the clubs and much lower priced shot for the shooter.

At present the company is on site at the New South Wales Gun Club and is prepared to travel anywhere in Australia to work gun club grounds. Interested clubs should contact Nakuba Pty. Ltd. in Sydney.







#### TASMANIAN AMATEUR SHOTGUN ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER

Clay Target shooting in Tasmania is once again experiencing an upward trend after being in the doldrums for the past

Statistics show that "country" clubs are attracting more shooters to their programmed shoots whilst "city" clubs are still experiencing a downturn in numbers. There must be a reason for this trend and the former "big" clubs must be wondering what that reason is. Is it the friendly atmosphere experienced at country shoots, or perhaps the programs are more attractive to shooters? Do the clubs with bar facilities promote the social side of their club to the detriment of the competitive aspect?

These questions can only be answered by Club Administrative Personnel and if clubs wish to continue as viable sporting clubs they must examine their priorities and take action to rectify their decline in popularity. This is a competitive world and unless clubs are prepared to compete at all levels they will not attain the success they desire. Shooters will not attend clubs where they are not made welcome and feel that perhaps

they are not wanted.

Isolated clubs continue to experience a fall off in numbers and one can feel some sympathy for these clubs because with the increase in costs of travelling, shooters are not prepared to travel great distances to attend shoots. The population of such areas is usually small with many sporting bodies seeking to attract the local sportsmen and women to their particular sport. Once again the word compete is to the fore and clubs in isolated areas must implement recruitment drives in an endeavour to attract members.

The administration of some clubs could be improved with little effort — remember the smooth running of shoots in itself is an attraction to shooters. Who wants to sit around for hours day or night, whilst club management sort out their problems. Breakdowns in equipment occur and this has to be expected, but not shoot after shoot at the same club. Mechanical maintenance prior to shoot day and having spares on

hand would alleviate many problems.

'Finally a reminder to all shooters, if you have any grievances at either Club, Zone or State level don't hesitate to contact your club delegate, or the State Association directly so that your problem can be discussed, and if necessary action taken to remedy the situation. If it is deemed necessary you will be invited to attend a meeting to present your case. Don't grumble to other shooters or friends at the local bar because unless you are prepared to bring your problem to the notice of your club or State Association it will continue to exist. Problems don't go away without some form of action.

The time is opportune for shooters to pull together in an endeavour to keep our sport of clay target on the upward path and hopefully raise it to an all time high. In the words of Calvin Coolidge "We cannot do EVERYTHING at once, but we can do SOMETHING at once".






Event 5 Presidents Trophy was won after a shoot-off by W. Maryiska, 2nd C. Reid, 3rd E. Hass.
