



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

WORLD SILVER FOR JIM ELLIS

At the time of writing, great news is filtering through from Argentina.

Jim Ellis has won the Silver Medal in the Trench event at the World Moving Target Championships held at Tucuman, Argentina. Terry Rumbel also shot exceptionally well to finish in sixth place.

This is the best ever performance by an Australian in the World Championships, and to have our two entries finish in the top six in the world, is a fantastic performance.

Congratulations to Jim and Terry from all clay target shooters. While details are sketchy at this time, it is known that the Gold Medal was won by a Russian, with 197-200. Jim shot 194-200 to take the silver, and Terry carded 191-200 to finish sixth.

The third Australian competitor at the World Championships was Alex Crikis, who shot 186-200 in ISU Skeet to finish in 44th place.

It is hoped to give a full report in the next issue.

The Association's Executive Committee met in Sydney over the weekend, October 31/November 1. An enormous amount of work was done during the two days. One of the most significant decisions taken by the executive was the resolution to levy all adult registered shooters \$5 to form a Legislation Fighting Fund.

The first Association Legislation Officer was elected to co-ordinate legislation matters on a National basis. He is New South Wales executive member, Rob Parker. A full report of the Executive meeting will follow in the next issue.

By the time these notes are read, the five shooters who made the team to the New Zealand South Island Championships will have returned to Australia.

Leader Tim Catling (WA) and his charges will have competed for the Air New Zealand Trophy against a team of New Zealanders at the Championships, conducted at the Christchurch Gun Club on November 13, 14 and 15.

We'll end up this month where we started, by saying again "Well done, Jim Ellis and Terry Rumbel." Roll on Commonwealth Games, Brisbane 1982.

HANDICAPPING — NATIONALS 1982

As I have been appointed Handicapper for the Brisbane 1982 Nationals, I thought it necessary to advise you of the following which will be strictly enforced.

1. ALL current 1982 Handicap Cards, regardless of your grade, along with your 1981 card, will be required by me for checking before you nominate.
2. All Handicap Cards will have to be stamped by me before nominations will be accepted.
3. NO nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is not available, unless your grade, handicap, trap and skeet, is confirmed by your club secretary on a Statutory Declaration form.
4. If a Statutory Declaration form is signed, you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the ACTA until your handicap and grade is verified by the executive committee.
5. Unless you are a new shooter, or haven't shot for a long period, and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot): your handicap will be A grade, 0 Skeet and 25 metres. (This is your responsibility. Make sure your club secretaries fill in your cards correctly).
6. Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable.
7. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretaries neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, and sign it.
8. Any obvious low score entered on Handicap Cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. (Rule 106).
9. Please watch the Handicap Board. If your name appears on the board, report to me.
10. Remember to fill in your cards at all times, i.e., all events other than those not applicable, as I have a complete set of Clay Magazines, and I can read very well.

Good shooting and see you in Brisbane.

WINCHESTER TOURNAMENT, HOBART — 1981

The honours for the Tasmanian section of the Winchester Tournament held at Hobart Gun Club on 24th and 25th October, 1981 were divided between a top line winner of numerous championships and a young seventeen year old star of the future.

Sperry Marshall took the honours with overall High Gun for the two day shoot while relative newcomer Brett Smith, son of the Hobart Club's treasurer Keith, outshot all the competition to post the only 50/50 of the tournament to be location High Gun.

The weekend's programme got under way with the Winchester 50 targets Trench Championship. The A-Grade winner was Burnie shooter Ian Rist who posted two excellent 24/25's to take the honours. The in-form Stuart Browning easily accounted for B-Grade with 47/50 and was unlucky not to score even better after his brilliant first round of 25/25. Another visiting northern competitor, R. Groves, emerged with C-Grade honours 41/50. The current National Ladies Champion, Nanette McCallum easily won D-Grade with an excellent 42/50.

Number two event was the Winchester Skeet Championship with the popular Paul Marshall taking A-Grade honours with 25/25. That well known northern identity Peter Thurley easily took B-Grade 25/25. C-Grade was a second win in a row to R. Groves who scored an impressive 22/25. The best 7 Handicap and Over winner was a surprise to Bruce Norton who as a late entry scored 20/25.

The final event for the day was Winchester Single Barrel Championship with former Hobart member, now Rosebery shooter, Graham Appleby, outlasting Ian Rist in a great tussle to win A-Grade 58/61. The visiting northern shooters were well in the act with M. Von Stieglitz winning B-Grade also after a shootoff 30/36. C-Grade went to the popular and hardworking Hobart shooter Archie Bryan 25/33. Another popular win was the Front Marker with Committee member Fred Morgan scoring 21/30.

The shooting was followed in quick time by the Club's Barbecue and social night which proved to be another successful venture, mainly through the efforts of the Ladies Social Group. The night's entertainment was kept moving by "Big Terry" Weeding, ably assisted by his two cohorts, Stan

THE ELEY REPORT





Friday, October 9, 1981



The South Australian Clay Target Association conducted their State ISU Carnival over this weekend. The program started on the Saturday, but I was unable to attend all three days. Several Victorian ISU shooters made the trip and helped make the competition keen for the locals.

Ian Buchanan, Brian Chandler and Ken Rose, Frankston Australian, Jim Finis, Ron Wakefield and Jim Blythman from Mildura, all made their presence felt and supported what was to be a great program. Jim Finis, Mildura, would have to be classed as the top shot over the weekend. 

Metropolitan Gun Club conducted an afternoon shoot, with cash as the stakes in all events. Harry Belmore, who was one of the original foundation members and president of the club in its early days, is back as the club president for 1981-82.

It is interesting to note the shooter's names listed on the Foundation Boards, when the club first started, some of whom are still shooting today. In conversation with Harry, he outlined the club's future, making mention of the fact, the club has \$18 000 in the bank, and providing another long term lease could be entered into with their landlords, further development could be expected. The land where the gun club exists is owned by a company called, the Clay Target Development Club. A 20 year lease was taken out in 1964, and an attempt will be made to call a meeting of shareholders early in 1982 to extend this for another 10 years.

Wednesday, October 28, 1981


Victorian Gun Club, a club that is known to conduct night shoots every Wednesday night, received a visit from me on

DEATH OF MR J. R. (ROSS) BAILLIE

One of the leading and most respected identities in the Australian firearms industry — Mr John Rossiter (Ross) Baillie, who was Managing Director of Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd — died in Victoria recently.

Mr Baillie, who was 52, died suddenly at his Geelong office on October 6.

Mr Baillie joined Winchester Australia in 1966 after having worked since 1947 with an English-based trading company for whom he became National Sales Manager in Melbourne.

Widely respected throughout the community and his industry, Mr Baillie was a member of the Executive Committee of the Victorian Chamber of Manufactures, Geelong. He was also a member of the Geelong Businessmen's Club, the Geelong Gun Club, the Geelong Golf Club and a former member of the Rotary Club of Geelong.

Mr Baillie will be remembered by all within the firearms industry as one of its toughest marketers and as a man who was wonderful company socially.

After a number of years with F.W. Green and Co., with whom he ultimately became a director, Mr Baillie joined Guthrie and Co. as General Sales Manager.

Two years later, he switched to the embryonic Winchester organisation to take up the post of marketing Manager. Mr Baillie steered the new company through its formative years and, in 1971, was appointed Marketing Director and a member of the Board.

In 1974 he was appointed Managing Director in place of Don McCall, who had been transferred to Canada.

When Ross Baillie first joined Winchester, there was a staff of 50. At the time of his death the company had grown to the point where it employs 260 people and become a dominant force in the firearms and associated products market.

One of the most imaginative people seen in the Australian firearms industry for some time, Ross Baillie kept up a steady flow of new and successful ideas, both in marketing and development.

In spite of his application to his job, he maintained a strong family commitment.


In the words of Bruce Burns, Marketing Manager for Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd: "Ross was the only man I knew who successfully combined two marriages — one with his wife, Pat, and the other with Winchester."

Ross Baillie's funeral was held in Geelong and attracted many mourners, including former business associates who came from other states to show their respect for a man who had made such a significant contribution to the industry.

Ross Baillie is survived by his widow, Pat, and two children, Carol and Keith.

Following Mr Baillie's death, Mr J.J. Canning has been appointed acting Managing Director of Winchester Australia.

CONFEDERATION OF AUSTRALIAN SPORT

The 1981 Sport Australia Awards are drawing close, and nominations have been pouring in to the Melbourne office of the organisers, the Confederation of Australian Sport, during the past few weeks.

This performance year concluded on September 30, which ensures that both winter and summer sports get a fair deal.

More than 150 nominations have been submitted, and the final six in each category will be voted on by an academy of leading sportspeople throughout Australia.

The Gold Award for Male Athlete of the Year will be a difficult category with performances by people such as Geoff Hunt (squash), David Graham (golf), Danny Clark (cycling), and Jim Ellis (clay target shooting) sure to figure prominently in the voting.

The voting will be just as tight in the Female Athlete of the Year category where lady golfers, Lindy Goggin, Jane Lock and Edwina Kennedy, have all been nominated, together with Elizabeth Blencowe (canoeing), Sue Cassell (Ten Pin bowling), Cheryl Miller (roller skating), and many others.

Juniors also feature strongly in the list of nominations and there is sure to be tremendous interest in the Junior Female Athlete of the Year and Junior Male Athlete of the Year categories.

After looking through the nominations, one begins to realise that Australian sport is not as bankrupt in the 'elite athlete' area as many people believe.

The Confederation of Australian Sport has presented a submission to the Australian Government, on the subject of "The Effects on Sport of Australia's Foreign Policies."

One of the prime reasons for the submission was the Australian Government's attitude towards Australian sport's participation in international tournaments in countries other than South Africa, but in which South Africa may be a contestant.

The Department of Foreign Affairs has been "leaning" very heavily on sporting associations to "encourage" them to withdraw from competitions under these circumstances.

Yet one of the prime factors in the development of elite athletes is to gain as much international competition as possible.

The consequent conflict is of deep concern to sport, and it is hoped that the contents of the Confederation's submission will encourage the Government to review its interpretations of policies so Australian sportspeople get a better deal. ○



EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

I have been associated with clay target shooting for the past seventeen years and have shot at many clubs in that time. Over the past year, I've seen more dissatisfaction among shooters than in the previous 16 years. With the dissatisfaction has come falls in attendance numbers at shoots, this drop off in numbers should be treated in alarm by our Executive members, who need to find out why, then rectify the matter.

As I see it, there are three main reasons for the drop in shooter numbers:

(1) The Handicapping Formula.

The percentage system is NOT working satisfactorily and will not do so. The genuine shooter, who tries to do his best at all times, is being moved back too fast, and not getting anything to show for it, except a percentage on a card. Also, it is almost impossible for a 23 or 24 metre shooter to shoot 95%, as weather conditions will beat him.

Then you have the ? shooter, who can go out and win a gun or such today, tomorrow he shoots 16/20. Then wins another big handicap, follows with an 18/20. In actual fact, he can win one or two big events, keep his percentage below 95% and go in a metre. "HOW CAN THIS BE FAIR?"

We already have "TOP" 25 metre shooters, shooting off 21 metres, there is no way a new shooter can compete against them or for that matter, a genuine shooter on any other meterage.

(2) Championships.

Moving Championships in to 15 metres in my opinion and many, many other shooters opinions also, was the worst thing that could have been done.

Championships should mean just that, the top shooter on the day, not an endurance test.

Zone, State and Commonwealth and Champion of Champions titles, really meant something before the 15 metre mark was introduced. Now it is feasible for a Club Championship to go to a much longer break than a State or Commonwealth title, OFF THE SAME MARK.

Where is the PRESTIGE of winning a Zone, State or Commonwealth title in that? It's not there. All it means is you have a different colour sash.

Also, some clubs are still running Championships on a 1st, 2nd and 3rd basis, they are losing shooters by doing so. Most C grade and some B grade shooters know they have no chance of a place, so why compete.

Then there are Clubs who only give A B C grade trophies on Championships. This is unfair in a lot of cases, as you can get two "A" shooters, shoot a big break, and the second place getter gets nothing.

(3) Far too many shooters are forgetting clay target shooting is a sport by playing in the percentage system. I can't see what satisfaction anyone, knowing he is a more than capable back marker, can get from winning three or four metres in front of his genuine mark.

My suggestions on these matters are:—

(1) All shooters for 1982, revert back to their handicap marks as of 1/1/81, and we go back to trophy value for handicapping.

(2) Championships revert back to 16, 18 and 20 metres with trophies for Overall, A, B and C grade. Clubs could add 2nd in A, B and C grade for open shoots, at their own discretion.

(3) Clay target shooting is a sport, treat it as a sport, not as a win at any cost venture.

I hope that shooters, Executive members etc., will consider these thoughts as they are meant, for the betterment of our sport.







EDITOR'S MAILBOX

The Editor,

Dear Sir,

Recent ill-informed comment about the Victorian A.L.P., Firearm Policy has alarmed gun owners and in the interest of truth, may I set out the following facts:

The amendments proposed by the Australian Labor Party are similar to the successful South Australian legislation, both in the issuing of licences and the registration of firearms.

The objectives of the policy are intended to reduce activity with firearms that have resulted in death, accidental injury and vandalism.

As in South Australia, the amendments will not disadvantage the law-abiding owner or would-be owner, and aim at preventing the irresponsible use of firearms by irresponsible persons.

Collectors, sporting shooters and gun owners generally will not be inhibited from owning more than one firearm and existing pistol, farm and junior permits are not affected.

To ensure that no organization or individual is disadvantaged, interest groups such as pistol, rifle and gun clubs, farmers associations' and collectors will be requested to advise on drafting amendments to the Firearms Act.

It is intended to create a Firearms Consultative Committee to advise an incoming Labor Government on the implementation of the policy, the Committee to be made up of police, the legal profession, the firearms industry and sporting organizations associated with firearms.

Present procedures for the issue of a shooter's licence in Victoria are so elementary as to be non-existent. Under the Labor Party's policy, licences would be issued only after the applicant had satisfied an issuing officer of his or her understanding of the safe handling of weapons and a practical knowledge of the laws related to firearms and their use.

A shooter's permit would not be issued across the counter on request unless special circumstances prevailed.

Registration of firearms will not restrict the number of firearms a person may own but would assist in ensuring that there was a record maintained of all firearms and their whereabouts and provide for private individuals either purchasing or selling firearms to be obliged to notify a central firearms bureau in the same manner as licensed firearms dealers are required at present.

There will be a procedure created to enable persons aggrieved by any decision made in respect of the issuing of a licence or other related matters to appeal against such decision.

It is recognized that criminal activity with firearms is increasing in our community and, as South Australia has

found, strict controls over the issuing of licenses, combined with registration, has shown a reduction in illegal use of firearms.





INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING UNION

Regulations for Olympic Trap and Skeet, Part 1.

Chapter 1 – General

- 1.0. 1 Application and scope of the technical regulations: At competitions where world records may be established, and which are under the supervision of the UIT, these regulations must be strictly adhered to.
- 1.0. 2 The UIT recommends that in tournaments where World Records cannot be established, such as regional or national competitions, the programs prescribed by the UIT should be conducted in accordance with the rules of the UIT.
- 1.0. 3 It is the desire and attempt of the UIT to achieve uniformity in the conduct of the shooting sports the world over. This is in the interest of greater development of the sport and of the shooting fraternity.
- 1.0. 4 These rules shall govern the conduct of all competitions under the supervision of the UIT. Any item which may not be specifically covered in these rules shall be decided by the Competition Jury in conjunction with the Chief Range Officers.
- 1.0. 5 Organization and Execution of Competitions: The host country or federation shall form an Organizing Committee for the general preparation and execution of the competitions. It shall consist of experienced representatives of the host country. One or more representatives of the UIT may be invited to serve as technical adviser(s) without voting rights.
- 1.0. 6 The technical aspects of the individual events shall be the responsibility of the Chief Range Officer. He shall have assistant range officers to aid him.
- 1.0. 7 Promotion and publicity shall be given all due consideration: Press, radio and television personnel shall be given every consideration and cooperation in keeping with the proper conduct of the coverage. They shall be given guidance and information in the placement of their equipment so that it will not interfere with competitors or officials. Room(s) with necessary office and communication equipment shall be made available for their use. Filming, recording, and interviews should be done during the training periods of the competitors or following competitions.
- 1.0. 8 An accurate results list must be prepared by the results office immediately following the competition, and make such information available to the publicity media.
- 1.0. 9 In all competitions under the supervision of UIT each competitor will bear a starting number on his back to aid in identification. Starting numbers will not bear commercial advertising of any type.
- 1.0.10 Large score boards should be conveniently placed where current results may be rapidly posted for the convenience of the public and press. The boards should be erected a sufficient distance away from the competition area so that loud discussions by spectators will not disturb the competitors.
- 2.0. 2 Guns: All types of shotguns, including automatics may be used provided that their caliber does not exceed 12 gauge. No handicap will be allowed for shooters using guns of a smaller than 12 gauge.

The change of gun is not permitted between stations of the same course, the same applying for functioning parts of the gun, unless the referee ascertains a malfunction which cannot be remedied quickly (see Art. 6.0.10).
- 2.0. 3 Personal attire: It is the responsibility of the competitor to appear at the shooting station dressed in a dignified manner appropriate for a public event.
- 2.1. 1 Compensators or other devices which serve like purposes are prohibited on all guns used in UIT Trap Shooting.
- 2.1. 2 Ammunition: Before shooting, the length of the cartridge shall not exceed standard specifications of 70 mm. Shot load shall not exceed 32 grams (loading tolerance of +0,5 grams). Pellets shall be only spherical in shape, made of lead or lead alloy, and not larger than 2,5 mm diameter (+ 0,1 mm tolerance). Shot may be plated. Black powder, tracer, incendiary, or other specialty type cartridges are prohibited. The Referee or Jury member may remove an unfired cartridge from a shooter's gun for inspection.
- 2.2. 1 Before firing, the length of the cartridge shall not exceed standard specifications of 70 mm. Shot load shall not exceed 32 grams (loading tolerance of +0,5 grams). Pellets shall be only spherical in shape, made of lead or lead alloy, and not larger than 2.0 mm diameter. (+0.1 mm tolerance). Black powder, tracer, incendiary, or other specialty type cartridges are prohibited. Shot may be plated. Cartridges must be of normal loading. No internal changes may be made which will give an extra or special dispersion effect, such as inverse loading of components, crossing devices, etc. Each round of skeet will be completed with cartridges of one type only, those being the ones with which the round was started. The Referee or Jury member may remove an unfired cartridge from a shooter's gun for inspection.

Chapter 3 Courses of Fire

- 3.0. 1 Individual Seniors: Competition consists of 200 targets for Continental, World Championships & Olympic Games shot in 8 (eight) series of 25 targets each. They may be shot in two days at 100 targets each day or in three days at 75 + 75 + 50 targets. Under extremely crowded conditions a competition may be scheduled for four (4) days at 50 targets per day.
- 3.0. 2 After 150 targets a portion of the shooters (up to a maximum of 50 %) with the lowest scores, may be eliminated from the remaining rounds of the individual competition. If details of the competition are insufficient in the program, the procedure for this elimination will be decided by the Jury before the start of the competition.
- 3.0. 3 Teams Seniors: The number of shooters per team is regulated by the UIT General Regulations. The team competition will be decided by the totals from the results of the individual scores over the first 150 targets (first 6 series) fired.
- 3.0. 4 Women and Juniors: Individual and team competitions according to the provisions made in the UIT General Regulations.

Chapter 2

Arms, Ammunition, and Clothing

- 2.0. 1 General: All devices, ammunition, or equipment which are not mentioned in these rules, or which are contrary to the spirit of these rules and regulations are not allowed. The Jury has the right to examine the shooter's ammunition and arms at any time there is reason to believe that these rules are being violated. Team leaders are held equally responsible that their team members use equipment which is in accordance with these rules.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

As a clay target shooter who notched up, in open competition at the age of 14½ years, the Donald Mackintosh Cup, and was one of the few who pressed for and set the example for International shooting by attending the 1966 World Shooting Championships in Wiesbaden, I feel qualified to comment on our sport of "shooting."

There is a hackneyed phrase of "United we stand, divided we fall." All shooting groups, combined, will ensure that our sport will not be endangered by the very real "Anti-Firearm Lobby."

This group is attempting to limit and, if possible, outlaw your right to own and use firearms for even legitimate competition purposes.

One of their catch-cries is that shooters are those horrible people who kill poor cuddly furred or feathered creatures and thereby play on emotive public response.

If they have their way, the only firearms will be those in the hands of criminals, police and the Services.

Are you prepared to accept this imposition on your 'Civil Rights' and surrender, or have the number of sporting arms you own limited by arbitrary legislation.

I was disappointed to read the article by R.J. Young, where in he intimated that the trapshooter should opt out of any umbrella group covering firearms other than shotguns.

The reference to an umbrella group could be aimed at the Shooting Sports Council of Victoria, which is made up of representatives of all law abiding and responsible firearms groups. This Council was deliberately formed to give a united loud voice to our politicians, and rebuff the very real threat of the "Anti-Gun Lobby."

The Council agrees with and champions the tightening of existing legislation and demands that irresponsible firearm owners and persons who menace others with firearms should receive the full weight of the law (without remissions).

The proposed gun legislation expressed by the ALP is unacceptable, and if any other political party proposes similar legislation, it also must be rejected.

Shooters, whatever your political persuasion, write to your member, or would-be member, and demand of him/her, the party policy on firearms, and harass him/her, until you get your answer in writing.

If you value your sport, don't be apathetic, but let your voice be heard.

There are 500 000 law abiding firearm owners out there in Victoria alone, so stand up and be counted for your sport.

Do you want your sport to be another political victim like the Olympians to Moscow, the South Africans to New Zealand, or the English cricketers to India.

Come on shooters — let's hear from you — a stamp is only the cost of one shotgun shell, and if you do not get the right answer from your member, you can forget shotgun shells for good.

Even gundog breeders and bowmen are girding their loins for battle because all out attempts to communicate with the gun legislators have been rebuffed.

The time for sabre rattling is over.

ISU REGULATIONS (Cont'd from p.16)

Chapter 4 Targets

- 4.0. 1 Specifications: Diameter: 110 mm (± 1 mm); Height: 25 to 26 mm; Weight: 105 grams (± 5 gr.). Targets can be all black, all white, all yellow, all orange; or the full dome may be painted white, yellow, or orange; or a ring may be painted around the dome in white, yellow, or orange.

The colour will be included in all programs for competitions which are under the supervision of the UIT.

- 4.0. 2 Random samples of the targets taken from different cartons will be examined by Technical Delegates before the beginning of competitions to ascertain that they meet the specifications. Organizers who are in doubt about their targets should submit samples to the UIT sufficiently in advance of a championship to allow corrections to be made if the targets do not meet the specifications.

- 4.0. 3 The color of a target which is selected for a championship will be such that it is clearly visible against background under all normal lighting conditions. The same color targets must be used for practice.

Chapter 5 Range Standards

- 5.0. 1 General: Ranges which are constructed in the Northern Hemisphere should be laid out so that the direction of shooting is toward a North to North-easterly area. This places the sun at the back of the shooter as much as possible during the shooting day.

- 5.1. 1 The Olympic Trap field
The Trap Pit: A trap house will be constructed so that the upper surface of the roof must be on the same elevation as the surface of the shooting stations. Interior measurements of the trap house should be approximately 20 meters from end to end, 2 meters from front to rear, and 2 meters to 2.10 meters from the floor to the inside roof. These dimensions


will allow freedom of movement of the working personnel and sufficient storage space for targets. See Plates A and B.

- 5.1. 2 The traps (throwing devices): Each pit must have 15 traps attached to the floor or to the front wall of the pit. The traps must be divided into 5 groups of three (3). The center of each group must be indicated only by a painted mark on the roof. The distance between traps within each group must be equal, from 1.0 m to 1.10 meters. The distance between the center traps in the groups shall be 3 to 6 meters and will normally be 3 meters to 3.30 meters.

- 5.1. 3 The traps shall be installed in the pit so that the pivot point of the throwing arm will be 0.50 meters (± 0.10 m) below the top of the roof of the trap house when the trap is set at the 2 meter elevation. And, set-back 0.50 meters (± 0.10 m) from the front edge of the roof. See Plate A and B. Traps may be fully automatic (self loading and cocking), semi-automatic (hand loaded and self cocking), or manual (hand cocked and loaded). Each trap will be provided with a means to seal the elevation, angle, and main-spring tension after these have been inspected and approved by the Jury. All traps must be provided with the technical means allowing for a target setting always on the same spot. All traps which are hand loaded will have two stops fixed to them. The stops are necessary to prevent accidental or deliberate movement of the target forward or backward on the throwing arm, changing the pre-set directions of the target. Each trap will have the elevation and angle sectors marked in increments of 10° .

- 5.1. 4 The traps can only be released by an electric-manual or electric-microphone system. The electric-microphone release device must be provided with an automatic delay of 0.1 – 0.2 seconds. The control systems will be placed in a position so that the puller can clearly see and hear the call of the shooter. The release devices must guarantee equal distribution of targets to each shooter in a series of 25 targets. This distribution must be: 10 targets to the right, 10 targets to the left, and 5 targets to the center. In other words, in a



The two annual competitions, the Handicap and Off Gun are still not resolved with only one event to count remaining in the year.



WINNING AT TRAP

"THE INNER CIRCLE"

Travelling around the country trap shooting I am continually impressed by how much knowledge and experience people have, and how seriously people take their shooting. It's fantastic. But why then don't more people win events more of the time? Why do some people's learning curves level out and never seem to rise again? Why do people complacently fall into established "pecking orders" within their club? And why the frustration, the anger and the inability of some people to shoot well all the time.

Even at the highest levels of sport, where all the top competitors are sharp both physically and mentally, it fascinates me how some consistently emerge as "even better than the best," particularly under the pressures of a National, World or Olympic competition. Certainly they possess skills, whether consciously or sub-consciously, that would be helpful to all of us to learn.

SHOOTING "OUT OF YOUR MIND"

Think back to your last successful event and try to remember how you felt during the competition. Most people's descriptions include the following: "I felt good," "I felt relaxed," "Things seemed to go my way," "It seemed too easy." All these descriptions imply effortlessness and almost surprise at the outcome. Athletes in most sports use similar phrases, and the best of them know that their peak performances never come when they are thinking about it. In fact they seem to come when they are "out of their minds."

In this state the good shooters, are not conscious to what is happening around them, but in fact are more aware and concentrated on speed of the targets, the subtle changes in the strength and direction of the wind and other conditions. They aren't aware of giving themselves lots of instructions, like take the correct stance, keep the head down on the comb, swing smoothly, they just do it.

They are conscious, but not thinking, not over-trying. They seem to be immersed in a flow of action which requires their energy yet results in greater smoothness and accuracy. The "hot streak" usually continues until they start thinking about it and try to maintain it. As soon as they attempt to exercise control they lose it. Consider the classic scene of a shooter with sixteen straight targets and then missing the seventeenth or eighteenth in a twenty target event. The question then is: How do we become "out of our minds" without thinking about it?

THE DISCOVERY OF TWO SELVES

Here is an idea to help us better understand what happens within us. We divide into two. Self 1 and Self 2. Self 2 is the computer, the unconscious, automatic door. Self 1 is the teller, the director, the worrier. The kind of relationship that exists between Self 1 and Self 2 is the prime factor in determining one's ability to translate his knowledge of technique into effective action.

Decide for yourself the value of this typical scene. You are on station five with no targets down. You have successfully smashed extreme right hand targets from station five hundreds of times before so that Self 2 knows exactly how to do it. All of a sudden Self 1 gets into the act, as if he doesn't trust Self 2 to do it right. "Now this is important, we can't afford to blow it here. Be sure to swing smoothly, lead the bird, careful, careful," pull the trigger once, pull the trigger twice . . . lost.


By thinking too much and trying too hard, Self 1 has produced tension in the body. Furthermore he heaps the blame on Self 2 . . . "X&? . . ." Of all the times to blow it. Can't you get your act together?" In hindsight, if someone had told Self 1 (your mind) to do nothing during the shot but concentrate on the speed and angle of the target you probably would have powdered the clay perfectly and gone on to powder the rest with a bit of extra confidence.

So shooting "out of your mind" is really just a matter of shutting Self 1 up so that Self 2 is allowed to perform in its excellent way.

THE SHOOTER'S WORKBENCH

John Mosher is a very practical fellow and his book is a very practical treatment of many projects that appeal to practical shooters, the making of their own particular brand of nick nacks.

In four sections and 24 chapters he discusses most of the requirements for crafting shooting accessories.

Section one deals with tools and materials and although aimed at the American market can easily be converted to Australian conditions. Mosher likes to work with simple basic tools.

In section two he delves into projects for the range. Bench-rests, both permanent and portable are described together with rifle rests both sandbag and adjustable. Mosher also outlines how to print your own targets and how to make an adjustable portable target stand to hold them. Plans are also included in this section for a portable chronograph stand.

Projects for the shooters home bench are covered in Section three. Various stands, racks and bins are described. A stand and carryall for powder charging equipment and one for turrethead powder measures get full treatment as does a turret to store dies. He also describes how to make a component dispenser, a rifle rack, a checkering cradle and even the humble wooden cleaning rod.

Section four is devoted to the workbench itself. Firstly Mosher discusses the reloading benchtop and then describes the construction of six complete benches. They range from the simplest economy model through to the biggest and most comprehensive loading centre you have ever seen.

As Mosher points out, shooters are doers and they love to tinker. To this end he has supplied a book that will fire the imagination of those who like to retreat to the workshop and play with the accessories that make the shooting game so rewarding.

The book is written by a practical man and whilst the amount of illustration is a bit lean there are full step-by-step instructions for each project together with a full list of materials. For the shooter with a do-it-yourself leaning, be he novice or expert, this book will be a welcome addition to the shelf, even if it is only to fire the imagination.

GETTING IT TOGETHER

Getting it together means Self 1 is totally supportive of Self 2 and does everything possible to help Self 2 perform up to its potential, which in most people is nearly limitless. When the two are in harmony, one's peak performances can be reached. When Self 1 the ego mind, is constantly chattering away, constantly "thinking," and constantly deriding Self 2, Self 1 does nothing but interfere with the natural doing process of Self 2, causing frustration and poor performances. The most important skill Self 1 can learn is to become an objective rather than a judgmental observer of events. See events simply as they are; don't judge them as good or bad. It's when emotions are added to events that people begin to get overconfident or start to freak out, both of which seriously inhibit clear decision making and performance.

One must realise the value of remaining calm, detached and objective in the midst of rapid and unsettling changes. If a shooter in your squad is distractive in his behavior or the trap is malfunctioning, all these things are events which you may not have expected and which may even cost you a target. But they've happened; there's nothing you can do about it. Given the chance to think about the situation as good or bad, the optional Self 1 will start to fall out, give up, and the situation will get worse. But the player of the Inner Game will remain calm because his judgmental mind is quiet allowing Self 2 to spontaneously and accurately figure out the best way to make the most of the situation and do its best from that point on.

CONCENTRATION . . . THE HERE AND NOW

The key to an undistracted mind, hence the key to the Inner Game, is relaxed concentration. Concentration is the act of focusing one's attention. As the mind is allowed to focus on a single object, it stills. As the mind is kept in the present, it becomes calm. Concentration means keeping the mind here and now. You drop a target, an easy straight away, while cursing the fact you call for your next target. Your minds in the past. You miss that target too and in anger and frustration you open the gun, throwing away the spent shells

and resign yourself to a bad finish taking the opportunity to call yourself a loser and consider selling the gun. Your mind is worrying about the future outcome. Your head is blown, your event is blown and you're everywhere but in the present.

The art of keeping in the present is a difficult skill which must be respected and practiced hard. Remember, the outcome is only the sum total of all the mini-events leading up to it. Focus your energy on successfully completing each mini-event . . . one target at a time. Don't even let your mind consider the importance of the outcome. As Albert McGuston puts it "watch the pennies, and the dollars will take care of themselves."

If you feel your mind drifting away from the present, gently bring it back, giving it something of interest to focus on. Watch the targets for speed, watch for the contours on them and powder the target. There's no question that when the mind is in the present, focused exclusively on what's happening right there and then, things seem to happen slower, decision are more spontaneous and accurate, and the body has more energy.

THE MEANING OF COMPETITION

Why do we shoot clays? Out of sheer love for shooting, for the enjoyment of competing, or as an extension of our ego needs to excel at something, to feel like a winner. In our achievement oriented culture one thing comes through loud and clear; excellence is valued in all things, and a man is measured by his competence in various endeavors. That is, you are a good person and worthy of respect only if you do things successfully.

In this light it's frightening to realise that people use clay bird shooting with all its inherent fickleness, uncertainties and inequities, as a standard for judging selfworth. But notice your own attitude as you go to school or work Monday morning after winning or not winning on the weekend. On the one hand you feel happy, confident, on top of the world . . . on the other, depressed, lacking confidence, and feeling like you'll never succeed in anything. But you are exactly the

same person you were on Friday: you've just let the outcome of the shoot dominate your outlook on yourself.

The fundamental skill which underlies all others of the Inner Game is the ability to see winning for what it is . . . overcoming obstacles to reach a goal, where that goal might be shooting your first 50, getting into a state team or winning an Olympic medal. Often, reaching the goal itself may not be as valuable as the experience that can come by making a supreme effort to overcome the obstacles involved. Thus the competition can be more rewarding than the victory itself, though it takes a certain level of maturity to see this.


The player of the Inner Game is in a moment-to-moment effort to let go distractions and stay centered in the here and now, where his total energy goes towards doing his best. As he proceeds through an event each target merely becomes a guide to his own performance. And his satisfaction and happiness come in the end when he knows that he performed well against challenging obstacles. As an added bonus, the successful players of the Inner Game will find they are enjoying the sport much more, and walking off with more than their share of the trophies. ○

Monte Burch is the latest in a long line of authors who has written a manual of basics for budding shotgunners. His volume, written from the point of view of a skilled field hunter and professional gunsmith, is quite comprehensive.


In 162 pages, Burch takes the reader from a history of the smoothbore through to an excellent chapter on gun maintenance and care. The hardback book is very well indexed.

Chapters on choosing a shotgun and choosing a correct shot-shell are very American orientated but the chapters on gun fitting and learning basic shotgun skills are very universal in their application and are of value in Australian conditions.

The two other chapters on hunting and competitive shooting have a lot of value as far as tips are concerned but again they are slanted towards the American scene. There is a very good section on American Skeet that would be of immense value to the young Australian gunner who was contemplating a go at this demanding sport.

Burch writes in a conversational style that is very easy to read. It is obvious that areas of competence, field shooting, maintenance and reloading are his forte.

For a first up book for a newcomer to the field of shotgunning it is highly recommended. It covers all the basic points required to make one a competent gunner. For the experienced gunner the information is a little sketchy and can be found in more detail in other publications.




• New trench facilities — Taree Wingham Gun Club — with newly painted Club House in background.


At this stage the Trench at Taree-Wingham Gun Club is the best working and the best to work trench in the eastern states of Australia. While in the past it has been good enough to have a trench lay-out with a scramble box and basic necessities, little or no improvement has been attempted.

However shooters at Taree-Wingham don't faint from the sun on their backs and are not hampered by rain trickling down their glasses. Sun and rain protectors have been made and the scramble box and its operator and scorer have been housed in an elevated operating room. The benefits of this work were immediate: more comfortable shooting conditions mean better scores — while it is no trouble to get other members to do the operating work.



series of 25 targets each group of traps must throw targets according to the following distribution: 2 targets from the left side trap, 2 from the right side trap and 1 from the center trap in each group as the shooters progress across the line.

After each 5 targets the selector index must be advanced one stop.

- 5.1. 5 The Shooting Stations: Five shooting stations will be arranged on a straight line at a distance of 15 meters to the rear of the front edge of the trap pit. Each station will be prominently marked with a square 1 meter x 1 meter and directly centered on a line with the middle machine in each group of three. A sixth position will be marked about 2 meters to the rear and slightly to the left of Station 1 where shooter No. 6 may take his position. All 6 positions will be furnished with a table or bench where the shooters may place their extra cartridges and paraphernalia. The shooting stations will be constructed firm and level in all directions. Each station will have a small block of wood, piece of carpet or rubber about 15 cm square or round upon which the shooter may rest his gun.

From 3 to 4 meters back of the line of the shooting stations a path must be provided to be used compulsorily by the shooter moving from Station 5 to Station 1. Shooters will not pass between the path and the shooting stations.

Shooting stations must have adequate protection against sun and rain.

- 5.1. 6 Target distances, angles and elevations: Traps are to be set before the beginning of competitions. The settings must be examined approved and sealed by the Competition Jury. Any adjustment that has to be made must only be made when all shooters have completed 50 targets on that range. The traps must be set according to the schemes laid down in UIT regulations.

a) the height of the target's path above the level of the trap house roof and 10 meters forward of the throwing point shall be between 1.5 meter and 3.5 meters.

A tolerance of 0.5 meters (a minimum of 1 m and a maximum of 4 m) is permitted. (Plate C).

b) After the traps have been adjusted and approved by the Jury one trial target will be thrown from each machine in sequence. These trial targets may be observed by the shooters. All competitors, coaches, team officials, etc. are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the Jury has examined and approved the setting of the traps.

- 5.2. 1 Skeet fields

A skeet field consists of 2 houses (High and Low House) and eight shooting stations arranged on a segment of a circle of 19.20 meter radius, with a base chord exactly 36.80 m drawn 5.49 m from the center of the circle.

The center of the circle is known as the target-crossing point and is marked by a stake. Station 1 is located at the left end of the base chord, and Station 7 at the right end when facing the center while standing on any point of the segment of the circle. Stations 2 to 6 inclusive are located on the periphery at point equidistant from each other (the exact distance between the center of stations 1 and 2, 2 and 3, etc., is 8.13 m on chord). Station 8 is located at the center of the base chord. (See Fig. 1).

- 5.2. 2 Shooting Stations

Shooting Stations 1 to 7, inclusive, are a square area 91 cm on a side, with two sides parallel to a radius of the circle drawn through the station marker and being on the same level. Shooting station 8 is a rectangular area 91 cm wide by 183 cm long, with the long sides parallel to the base chord. The location of each shooting station shall be accurately designed. The marker for Shooting Stations 1 to 7, inclusive, is on the center of the side nearest the target crossing point. The marker for Shooting Station 8 is on the center point of the base chord and being on the same level as Station 1 - 7.

- 5.2. 3 Traps

a) A skeet field comprises two houses: the High House (PULL) and the Low House (MARK)

b) Each trap house contains a throwing machine (a trap) in a fixed position.

c) The target thrown from the "High House" must emerge at a point 91 cm behind the Station Marker 1 (measured along the base chord extended) and 3.05 m above the ground level.





I.S.U. REGULATIONS (Cont'd from page 54)

The target thrown from the „Low House“ must emerge at a point 91 cm behind Station Marker 7 measured along the base chord extension moved 76 cm to the exterior of the base chord and 1.07 m above the ground.

- d) Targets properly released must pass through an imaginary circle 91 cm in diameter.

The center of the circle will be 4.57 meters above the target crossing point.

The target crossing point must be measured from the level of Station 8 (see Fig. 2).

- e) In calm weather conditions the target must carry a distance not less than 65 meters and not exceeding 67 meters.

5.2. 4 Shooting boundaries

- a) The shooting boundaries of Stations 1 to 7 are 40.23 meters from each throwing house. For the shooting station the shooting boundary is determined by the crossing point between a straight line running from Station 4 to Station 8 and the target crossing point.

- b) Suitable markers shall be placed at points 40.23 m from both the High House and the Low House, on a line of the target flight path, to indicate the shooting boundaries. Similar markers shall be placed at a distance of a regular target (65 - 67 m).

- 5.2. 5 Safety measures: A shield must be installed at the opening of each traphouse so that the trap operator is not visible to the shooter, when he is firing at Station 8. This precaution is desirable as a safety factor for the protection of the trap boy from possible injury from direct or ricocheting shot. As a further safety precaution there should be a barrier (wire or rope) located 7 to 10 meters behind the Shooting Stations 1 to 7, and roughly following the course of the semi-circle on which these stations are located.

No spectators should be allowed within this barrier. The Referee or Jury member is responsible for enforcing this rule.

5.2. 6 Timer

The traps shall be operated by an electrical or mechanical device which is so installed as to allow the operator (puller) to see and hear the competitors. For all international competitions the use of a "Timer" is mandatory. This device will allow for the release of the targets within an indefinite period of time, varying from instant release up to a maximum three (3) seconds after the shooter has called for his target. The releasing device shall be so constructed that only one (1) button (or switch) can be used to release the Doubles Targets.

Chapter 6 Competition Regulations

6.0. 1 Shooting order - Squadding

- a) A squad normally consists of 6 competitors except when the drawing will not permit an even distribution;
- b) In international competitions the drawing will be made so that the shooters of each country are distributed over the various squads so that no squad will contain more than one shooter from one country (when possible).
- c) Drawings are made by the Jury on a pre-determined day and time and announced to the delegates of the various nations so that they can be present. Attendance at the drawings by delegates is optional.
- d) The Jury may proceed with the drawing whether delegates are present at the announced time or not.

- 6.0. 2 It is the shooter's responsibility to be on the proper station at the right time with sufficient ammunition and necessary equipment (See Chapter 8 "Penalties").

- 6.0. 3 Once shooting has been started it shall continue according to the program without interruption, except for mechanical breakdown. Only the Chief Range Officer may interrupt the shooting, with the Jury's agreement, in the event of heavy rain or storm deemed to last a very short time.

- 6.0. 4 The shooting positions
The shooter must stand with both feet within the limits of his station.

6.0. 5 Regular and irregular targets

Regular target

A regular target is any unbroken target that is called by the shooter and released according to these regulations.

- 6.0. 6 Broken target: a broken target is any target not whole according to Art. 4.0.1. The shooter getting a broken target must repeat the shot on a regular target, regardless of whether he hit or missed the broken target.

Malfunctions

6.0. 7 Firearms

Any shotgun which cannot be safely fired, which "doubles" automatically, does not ignite the powder charge and fails to eject due to a mechanical defect is considered to be "disabled" under this rule.

The following are not considered "malfunctions":

- malfunctions due to faulty manipulation by the shooter;
- failure to place the cartridge in the proper chamber of the gun by the shooter;
- empty shells in the chamber or chambers.

6.0. 8 Ammunition

- a) The following are considered malfunctions of ammunition: Failure of ammunition to fire or function properly, i. e. failure to fire provided firing pin indentation is clearly noticeable;

- when there is only firing of the primer;
- when powder charge has been omitted;
- when powder charge is not ignited. Components of the load remaining in the barrel shall be considered as evidence of defective ammunition. The Referee must decide.

- b) The following are not considered as defective ammunition:

- wrong size cartridges.

- 6.0. 9 In all cases of disablement or malfunction of gun or ammunition and upon the decision of the Referee that this has not been caused by the shooter himself and that the gun is not repairable quickly enough, the shooter has the option of using another gun if one can be obtained without delay (within 3 minutes after the Referee has declared the gun disabled). If not, the shooter may leave the squad and finish the remaining targets of the round at a time decided by the Referee or when a vacancy occurs and the shooter obtains the permission of the Referee. (Except for the penalties in Art. 8.0.5).

If the gun is repaired before the end of the round the shooter may be allowed to rejoin his squad with the permission of the Referee.

- 6.0.10 The shooter is allowed a maximum of two (2) malfunctions per round of 25 targets regardless of whether he has changed his gun or ammunition. The third and subsequent malfunctions of either gun or ammunition are considered excessive. Each regular target attempted thereafter on which an excessive malfunction occurs shall be declared "LOST", whether or not it was fired.

- 6.1. 1 Squads which are composed of less than 6 official competitors in the drawing of lots should be filled with proficient shooters for the duration of the championship. These auxiliary shooters should have scores posted in the normal manner on the large board and the official score card in order to provide continuity, however, their names or nationality will not be listed in any document.

- 6.1. 2 When the shooter is ready to fire, he raises the gun to his shoulder and calls crisply and loudly "pull", "los", "go", or some other signal of command; after which the target shall be thrown at once. (Art. 5.1.4). The shooter must not leave his station before the shooter at his right side has fired a regular target, except when the shooter has completed the shooting from Station 5. In the latter case he must immediately proceed to Station 1 (6) being careful that he does not disturb the shooters who are on the line as he passes by (see Art. 6.1.8).

- 6.1. 3 Time limits

A shooter must position himself, load his gun and call for his target within 15 seconds after the shooter to his left has fired at a regular target or after the Referee has given the signal to commence firing.

In cases of non compliance with the above, the penalties provided in Article 8.0.7 will be applied.
