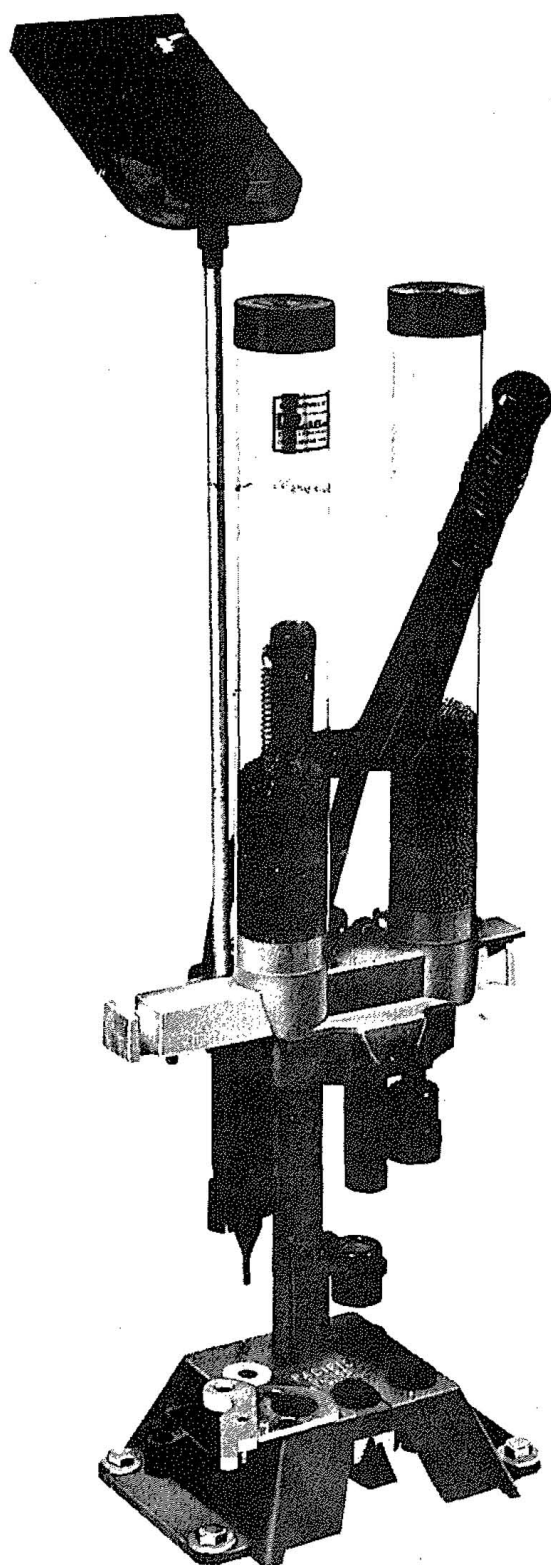

The sudden and tragic death of National President Ron Porter in March, followed by that of Newton Thomas in May cast a cloud over the Association for some time.

In April, the biggest ever National Trap and Skeet Championships were conducted at Melbourne Gun Club. The enormity of this tournament has prompted some changes for Brisbane in 1982, such as the shooting of 50 targets in one visit to the traps.

Internationally, it's been a good year, with the best ever performance by an Australian in World Championships — Jim Ellis' silver medal in Trench in Argentina. The Air New Zealand Trap team visited the Grand American Tournament in August, and a team of 5 shooters has recently returned from the New Zealand South Island Championships, failing by a narrow margin to win the Air New Zealand Trophy.

Firearms Legislation has become one of the major problems of 1981, I've no doubt it will worry us even more in 1982.

The 1982 New Zealand Clay Target Championships will be held at Christchurch Gun Club from March 6 - 13. Elsewhere in this issue is an advertisement for travel and accommodation, which I urge all shooters to read carefully.

The team to represent Australia in the Glenn Cup will be chosen in New Zealand during the Championships. Providing the team members have booked through the National office, they will have air fares refunded upon return to Australia.

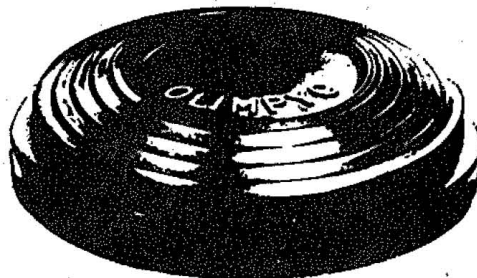

Why Not Give Us A Go.

Firearms Safety Instructors Graduate

Victoria Sets Example of Co-operation and Sets Highest Standards.

At the conclusion of not less than three years hard, complex and highly responsible lecturing and instructing in the intricacies of Firearms Safety and Gun Handling, eighteen Firearms Safety Instructors took their final examinations to graduate and win the coveted Hunter Safety Instructor Badge. In the Rylah Research Institute in Heidelberg Victoria on November eight those graduates who comprise the cream of the elite instructors were the only survivors of the eighty two who nominated early in 1980 to undergo the gruelling dedication and performance tests requisite to being considered eligible to take the final examination to gain the highly prized state Hunter Safety Instructor badge issued by the Steering Committee on Hunter Education and Safety, under the auspices of the Ministry for Conservation Fisheries and Wildlife Division of the Victorian Government.

The very special qualifications laid down by the Steering Committee on Hunter Education and Safety (SCHES) are those approved by that committee which is made up of delegates from the Victorian Police Department, Education Department, Youth Sport & Recreation Department, Ethnic Affairs, Fisheries & Wildlife Division, the Shooting Sports Council, and all codes of the Shooting Fraternity.

The format is briefly:—nominees are selected by their own shooting disciplines after an approved period of lecturing and instructing extending for not less than one year; these nominees then take the SCHES Instructor Guidance Course prior to commencing the probationary period, a full eighteen months during which period a log book credential is maintained. At the appropriate time the log books are called in and inspected, and the records verified; if an Instructor has completed at least one lecture or instruction session on Firearms Safety to a group of people each calendar month, he is then eligible to be selected as a candidate to take the final examination. The written examination was no easy task and the hour allowed for the paper was barely sufficient time for all to pass 'the toughest Exam taken in many years'.

The written paper was a component part of a seminar controlled by experts, — the State's best — in Firearms Law, Firearms Safety, the Wildlife Act, Field First Aid, Bush Survival, Instructing and Teaching, the Shooter Oriented Public Relations.

The candidate who passes all tests and the final examination has thence proved himself worthy of the honour of being accredited and having qualified is entitled to wear with pride the coveted blue and silver Badge which displays the State

Government emblem on the left end, and carries a rosette in which his current and subsequent accreditations are displayed in the form of a small number being the year of currency.

The wearers of that badge, this elite group of Firearms Safety Instructors are the only ones officially approved and recognized by the Government Departments above mentioned, and accepted by all sections of the Shooting Fraternity; so when you see a man wearing that Hunter Safety Instructor badge, you will know he is someone with a wealth of knowledge, a host of experience and the official qualifications to render you unlimited service and assistance in the channels of Firearms Safety and all related activities.

To date only twenty six Instructors and Instructor Examiners are entitled to wear that badge, denoting the cream of the elite, for they were drawn from the ranks of those dedicated and responsible men who devote many hours, a great deal of effort, and no little personal expense, working tirelessly in the gigantic task of advising, guiding, training as many persons as time makes possible of the numerous thousands of people who are firearms owners and users. I believe it appropriate to say, that Shooters are a very responsible section of our community, and not one would ever pass the opportunity to correct carelessness, to identify irresponsibility, or to highlight negligent stupidity often, far too often, the done 'thing' of thoughtless, selfish people. The rapidly increasing numbers of Firearms owners throughout Australia, presents a picture in which there are at least thirty such persons for every shooter.

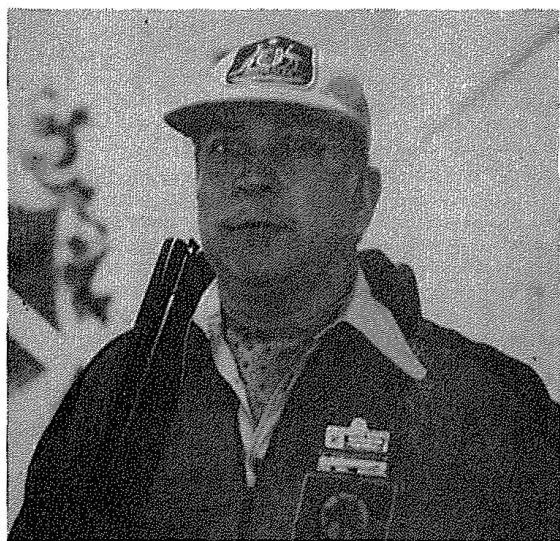
Those who are not in any way associated with Firearm or Shooting organizations, are of course, by-and-large quite unfamiliar with the correct and safe handling procedures and the safety practices which are routine systems and second nature to the trained shooter. Some ten years ago this developing scene became apprehensive to all members of the Shooting Fraternity, and among the figures those overwhelming odds included the criminal element which was seen to be increasing in activity, so the concerned shooters searched around to try to identify a means whereby Firearms Training, Safety and Qualifying could become a natural controlled system, in like manner to the training testing and licencing of motor vehicle drivers.

The enormity of the task seemed to be initially, quite impossible until a small group of dedicated enthusiastic Shooters assembled a cross section of the best working systems being used in other countries, and commenced the task of combining together all the common denominators familiar to all sections of the shooting scene, with the practical criteria required by such as the Police and Education authorities, the Youth Sport & Recreation Dept., the Olympic Federation, the Wild Life Divisions and all other related and associated bodies having a direct interest in the subject. The Steering Committee was formed, coming into being early in 1975 with the co-ordinating body being the Ministry for Conservation.

It was mooted that the first step would be to set up a handbook as a guide to expounding the aims and objects of the collective representation, and to conduct pilot courses and experiments in an endeavour to value the principles emanating from the use of such handbook. By mid 1976 it became apparent that the 'Hunter Education and Safety Manual' was in need of up-dating and reprinting, and two years testing, checking, experimenting and compiling eventually produced the 'Hunter Safety Handbook' which when approved by all representations in the Steering Committee was printed in 1979, and has been the basis or platform, of all approved Firearms Safety Training activities since then.

In an endeavour to secure the complete support and approval of all parties concerned, the Steering Committee then had the task of progressing the level of Instructor activity to a point where a standards minimum could be identified and accepted, and then set up a system whereby those indulging in the never-ending tasks of lecturing,

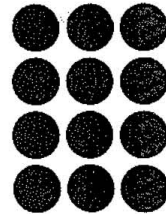

THE ELEY REPORT



FROM RON CLARKE

In the sports footwear field, there are over 268 different brands in U.S.A. — so you could say it is a pretty competitive field despite the size of the market.

One of the biggest in recent years has been the "Brooks" brand, and as we have a vital interest in this area with "Le Coq Sportif", it was of considerable import to us to discover just what went wrong when "Brooks" were forced into a scheme of arrangement recently to pay their creditors. The lessons could well be translated into the ammunition market, as marketing is marketing whatever the product.

Brooks had a very competitive manager, who ripped apart the market with lots of promotion and many special deals. Trouble was his product could never equal his estimation of it and, by August 1981, some retailers were finding 30% of their "Brooks" sales had to be returned because of some faults.

It has long been our contention that you get what you pay for.

There are a number of brands being spasmodically marketed in Australia, or which have come onto it recently. Naturally, to grab some turnover, they have been made to a price. The same thing applies to the ammunition you buy.

Believe you me, the traditional brands do not enjoy great profit margins, so to sell under them something has to be sacrificed — be it simply quality control. Normally the saving is a compromise in the quality of componentry as over 80% of the cost of any ammunition is in the materials, savings in labour can only be minimal no matter what the difference in labour rates, be they in Hungary or the United States.

So if you buy cheap, then your ammunition will not be as reliable as that which you buy from the well-known brands, such as ELEY or Federal.

The proof of the pudding is in competition shooting when one missed target can be fatal. There, only the top brands are in use.

For example, of the shooters chosen in the ACTA National Training Squad, all use either ELEY, Browning or Winchester, with seven of the eleven preferring ELEY products. Similar stories can be seen in smallbore or pistol squads.

As a newcomer to the sport, it always seems strange to me that shooters can spend so much money and time to get to a competitive shoot or hunting ground, and then compromise on their ammunition, so that the whole purpose of going could be lost for the sake of a few dollars.

It seems our competitors never tire of spreading rumours about the ELEY organisation. ELEY remains ELEY, and will always do so. What's more, ELEY will always be a force on the Australian market.

The problem seems to emanate from the fact that ELEY falls under a marketing division of IMI Operations Australian Pty. Ltd. which, for want of a better name, we have called Ron Clarke Sports. Two other lines of sports products, besides ELEY, have been linked into this group — the Lyrebird range of general sports products and the Le Coq Sportif range.

Although separate sales organisations are maintained, the computer, accounting, stationery, merchandising, management and internal sales staff have been rationalised into the one integral group for obvious reasons.

It lowers the previous distinct overheads considerably and makes us one of the larger sporting merchandisers in Australia.

May I finish this year by wishing each of you personally, friend and foe alike, a safe and happy Christmas, and may we all enjoy lots of success in 1982.

teaching and instructing could be guide trained, tested and qualified. A group of Core Instructors who had worked on and with the project since its inception, progressively eliminated all identifiable problems, and under the guidance of the late Shooting Master J. Newton Thomas encouraged all sections of the Shooting Fraternity to develop their own internal instructors and select or nominate their respective best to undergo a Instructor Guidance Course to commence a probationary period during which their work, their efforts, their achievements and their findings would be evaluated. Early in 1980 all sections of those groups represented on the Steering Committee selected and nominated a total of eighty two Instructors to undergo the long hard test leading to becoming an Accredited Firearms Safety Instructor. It has been mentioned above that the first qualifying and graduating ceremony saw just eighteen Instructors prove their metal and become the 'Cream of the Elite' by receiving from the Ministry for Conservation the coveted badge bearing those magic words, HUNTER SAFETY INSTRUCTOR.

The core group Instructors now identified as Hunter Safety Instructor Examiner, together with the new graduates, form the nucleus of a force to be developed and expanded so that in Victoria alone the 370,000 licenced firearms owners who are not members of any Shooting organization will progressively reach all sections of the community in gaining advice guidance, and wherever required training in the sadly neglected subject of Firearms Safety. These highly trained and qualified men, despite the fact that their every expense is borne personally, can be called on to lecture, advise, teach and instruct in this vital need, and all the while they will be recruiting and training new Instructors so that the work may be more rapidly completed and the immense backlog of un-informed Firearms owners and users be reduced, to the overall betterment of all.

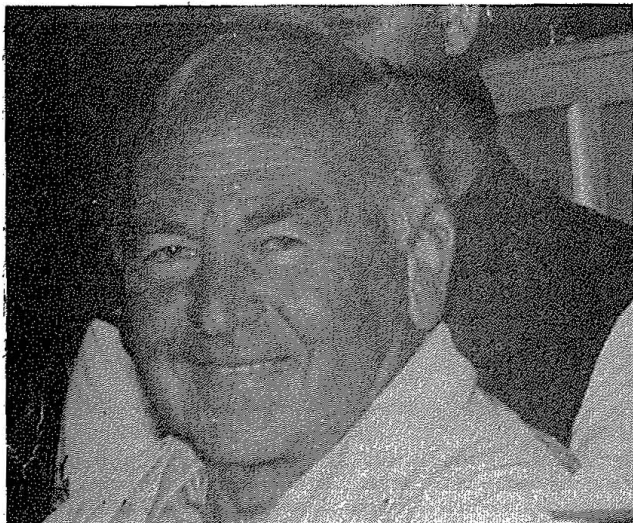

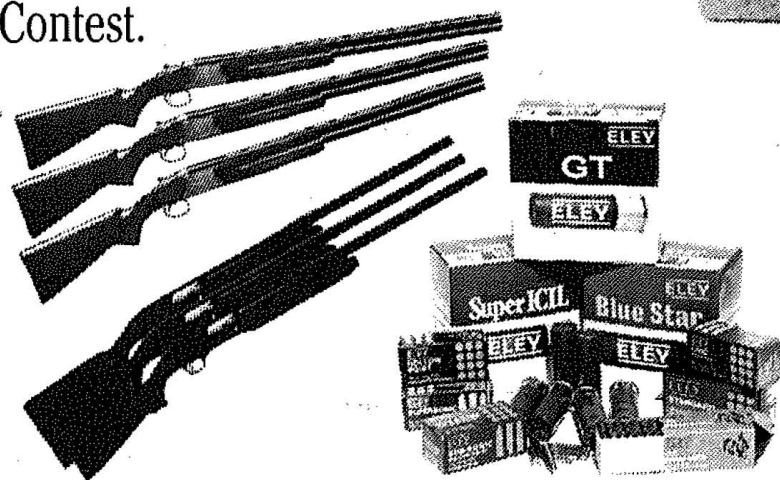
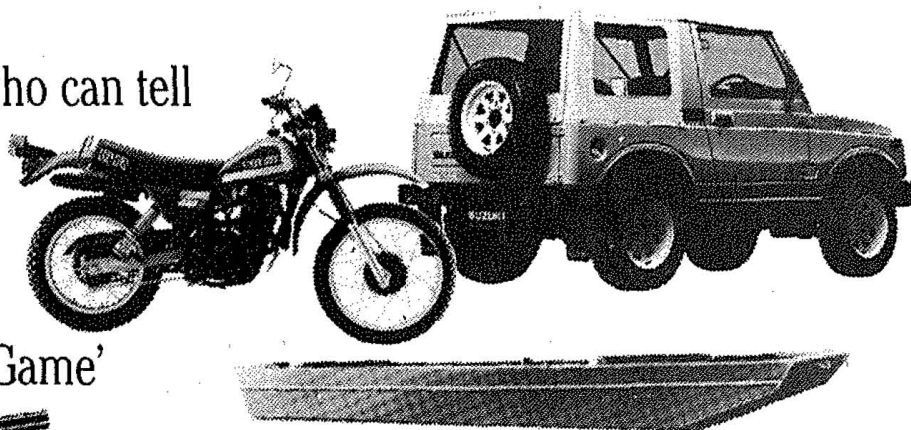

ELLIS AND RUMBEL TOPS IN TUCUMAN

Tucuman, Argentina was the venue for the 1981 World Moving Target Championships, October 30 to November 1.

Those who were there witnessed the best ever performance by an Australian in the World Championships when Jim Ellis, A.C.T., took out the silver medal in the Trench event. The Championship was won by Asanov, U.S.S.R., 197/200, with Jim Ellis 194/200 in second place. Terry Rumbel, N.S.W., carded 191/200 to take sixth place. A great performance from Jim and Terry to finish in the top six in the World.

Alex Crikis, Vic., competed in the I.S.U. Skeet event, finishing in 44th place with a score of 186/200.

All three shooters had trained at the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning, Georgia, prior to the competition in Argentina. Whilst Ellis and Rumbel ran into peak form during this period of training, Crikis, who was shooting brilliantly at Benning, seemed to lose some of his sparkle by the time the World titles commenced. He has learnt a lot from the visit, and did suffer somewhat by being the only Australian in Tucuman for the Skeet event, with Ellis and Rumbel arriving as his event was finishing.

At the end of day 1, Asanov, the Russian, was a joint leader with Ellis 72/75 and Rumbel 70/75. Asanov led clearly at the completion of 150 targets, Ellis added another 72 and Rumbel 71.

The final 50 targets saw both Ellis and Rumbel run them clean for a very strong finish.

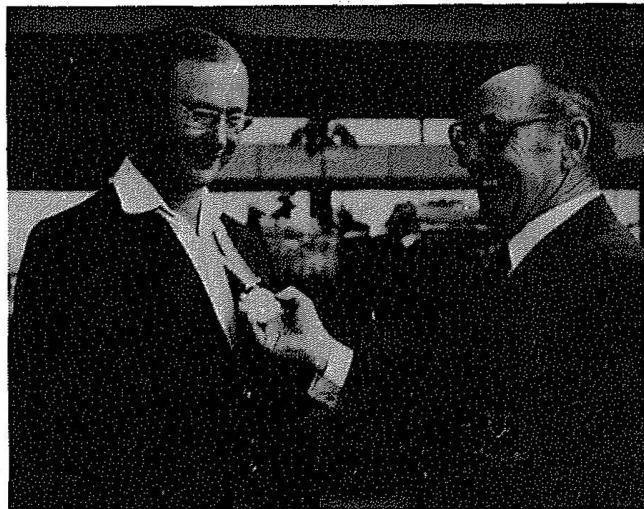

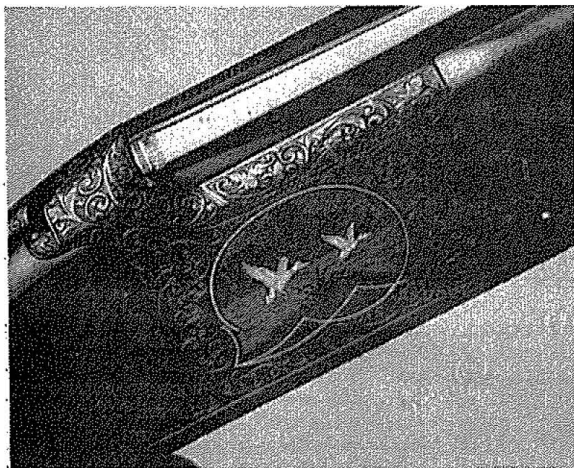

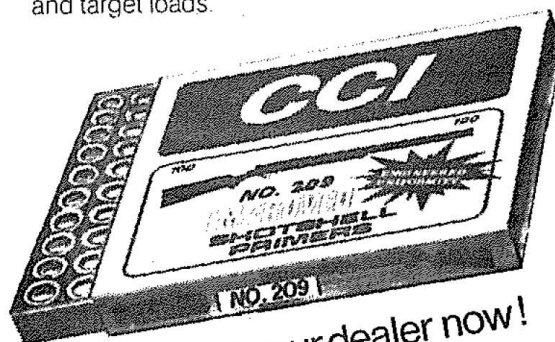

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

Staff Writer

The International Sub-committee, Management committee, and executive committee, met in Sydney during the period October 30 to November 1. Summarized below are the most significant of the decisions taken by the Executive committee at this meeting.

FIREARMS LEGISLATION

In order to establish a Firearms Legislation Fighting Fund, it was decided to levy all adult registered shooters \$5.00 for the year 1982. This money will be put into a special account, and can only be used for firearms legislation fighting purposes. Guidelines for use of monies from the fund will be set by the Management committee and clubs applying for assistance from the fund will have to lodge applications through State Associations. The \$5.00 levy is compulsory and registrations for 1982 will not be processed unless accompanied by the levy. So serious is firearms legislation, that the Executive committee elected New South Wales Executive member Rob Parker, as the associations first legislation officer. His tasks will be to collate and co-ordinate data from the States. It is also recommended that each State Association should appoint a legislation officer.

RECOMMENDED FEE INCREASE 1983

Consultants, Deloitte, Haskins & Sells, had been retained by the Association to look at the fee increase necessary for 1983, taking into account development projects in the future. Following acceptance of the consultants report, it will be recommended to the 1982 Annual General Meeting that registration fees for 1983 should be:

Full Adult Registration	\$30.00
Second Family Member	\$15.00
Junior shooter	\$1.00

on the basis of the expert professional advice received. The consultants report is published in full elsewhere in this issue.

1982 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The program for the National Championships to be held at Brisbane Gun Club in May 1982 was confirmed. It was decided that all trap events will be conducted in one visit to the traps, moving five traps between rounds. The only exception to this is the Champion of Champions event which will still be shot in one visit to the traps, but shooters will move a minimum of three traps between rounds. There will be an increase in nominations for the 1982 Nationals, however, ladies and juniors will pay half nominations and will be eligible to win all trophies that are applicable to every competitor.

INTERNATIONAL SUB-COMMITTEE

The Executive accepted a proposal to re-structure this Sub-committee. It is now made up of the following: Mr R. F. Buchan, Chairman, from Victoria. Mr P. Quire, National Training Squad Manager/Coach, from South Australia. Dr P. Cains from Tasmania, Mr W. Stevens, Queensland and Mr J. Scott, New South Wales.

The commonwealth I.S.U. Skeet and Trench Championships for 1982 will be held at Brisbane Gun Club, immediately following the 1982 Olympic Discipline National Championships. This will provide a carnival of I.S.U. Shooting.

NATIONAL GROUND

Reports on proposals for Port Macquarie and Dubbo were looked at by the Executive. It was decided that a feasibility study be initiated into National Grounds, using the Dubbo site for the collection of the necessary data, with reference to the study made by the A.C.T. Shooting Association.

A.C.T.A. REFEREES ASSOCIATION

The Executive committee agreed to form a referees association, to replace the current Rules Sub-committee. State Associations have been asked to convene a meeting of Rules Supervisors, Referee Examiners, and Referees within their State, to elect one person, preferably a practising Referee to the National Referees Association. It is planned that this Association should hold its first meeting during the 1982 National Championships in Brisbane.

The new Referees Association would be responsible for all facets of Refereeing, new rules, rule changes, appointment of Referee examiners, and Rules Supervisors and arranging Referee instruction days at State and Zone level.

An important change to trap rule 103C, emanated from the Executive committee meeting. As from January 1, 1982, 200 targets will have to be shot at before inward movement can apply and there will be only one inward movement in twelve months.

COMPUTER INVESTIGATION

A Consultant from Deloitte, Haskins & Sells had carried out a review into the Association's data processing services and requirements. His report and recommendations were discussed by the Executive Committee, and it was decided to implement the recommendations.

In summary, these are that in the short to medium term, the Association should use a bureau specialising in mailing and membership systems. We should approach such companies, asking them to quote for supply of a processing service on the basis of a fixed price for a specified level of service and on-going support. The quotations should include any set-up costs and an estimate of annual costs.

The course of action chosen should be suitable for at least two to three years, after which an in-house computer should be a much more viable option.

The above recommendations arose after finding that processing costs are too high.

SKEET NATIONALS

An opinion poll of shooters will be conducted through Clay Target Shooting News, to gauge opinion regarding the conduct of separate Skeet National Championships. This poll will be run in the March 1982 issue of C.T.S.N.

OUTSIDE ACCOUNTING SERVICE

The Executive Committee agreed in principle to the appointment of an outside Accounting Service for the production of the balance sheet and annual accounts of the Association. This service would also provide a quarterly progress towards budget statement for use by various Sub-Committees. ○

CONFEDERATION OF AUSTRALIAN SPORT

CABLE TELEVISION ENQUIRY

In recent times, the Confederation of Australian Sport has completed the processing of nominations in the SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS, has presented evidence to the public inquiry into Cable and Subscription Television Services, and has completed a number of submissions to the government.

Of particular interest to sport is the panel which is enquiring into the feasibility of introducing Cable or Subscription Television Services into Australia. The inquiry is showing great interest in the attitudes of sport in Australia. Earlier this year, the confederation presented a detailed written submission to the Inquiry. This was then followed up by attendance at the public hearings, where heavy emphasis was placed on the need to protect the interests of Australian Sporting bodies against unreasonable competition from packaged programs sourced overseas.

Reference was also made to the needs of low profile sports, and the possible effects of cable television on this group.

In general terms, sport sees great benefit to come out of the introduction of cable television. Experience in North America indicates that programs with a sports theme are high on the list of popularity.

The advent of cable services should provide opportunities for the low profile sports to achieve greater media response. However, as is the case with other types of community activities, great care will need to be taken in protecting the interests of the sporting group and participants to ensure that any programming agreement entered into, is of mutual benefit.

EXTENSION OF FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SPORTS INITIATIVE

Over the past few years, a major part of the Australian Government's Sports Development Program has been directed towards up-grading the administrative standards of sport.

This has resulted in over forty national sporting federations benefiting from the opportunity to appoint a full time Executive Director. A further ten appointments have been made in the coaching area.

As a means of servicing these appointments, annual discussion workshops have been held at which general round-the-table discussions have enabled participants to share their problems with peers.

The idea of workshops has now been extended to the special group of people who devote all of their spare time to the voluntary administration of sport.

Late in November, forty representatives of national sporting federations met in Canberra at a conference hosted by the Australian Government through the Department of Home Affairs and Environment.

The purpose of the project was similar to the theme adopted for seminar exercises for full time administrators. The frank exchange of views that took place was most encouraging.

The conference co-ordinator, Dene Moore, (Acting Director of the sports Development Program) was questioned on the success of the workshop and replied: "In designing the format for the workshop, we were concerned that participants might be overawed by the occasion and be reluctant to become fully involved."

He continued: "Our fears were groundless and the level of co-operation and willingness to learn was really great!"

The workshop concentrated on basic subjects of relevance to all sports administrators. These included:

- Problems experienced by honorary sports administrators.
- Communication.
- Should the association be considering the appointment of a paid employee.
- Sponsorship in sport.

The net result of the workshop was that almost forty significant people in the administrative area of sport have returned to their associations with a better appreciation of what they are about and where administrative standards may be improved.

However, the long term benefit will be measured by the extent to which attendees pass their newly acquired expertise down the line to all the subordinates. ○

1983 Registration Fees

We refer to the meeting held earlier this month between yourself and Mr Connors of the Australian Clay Target Association and our Messrs. Hall and Herborn concerning the level of registration fees for 1983 and 1984.

We have reviewed the Association's financial statements for the years ended 31st December, 1979 and 1980, the 1981 budget, and made certain projections for the 1982, 1983 and 1984 years.

We have been advised that the Association is planning for the following development projects to commence and that consideration is to be given for their implementation in arriving at a fee for 1983 and 1984.

- (a) More comprehensive insurance cover for Shooters, say \$2 per head.
- (b) Formation of a Referees Association — Budget of \$5,000.
- (c) International Sub-Committee matters, including team travel, training camps for National Training Squad — Budget \$15,000.
- (d) Possible purchase of National Headquarters.
- (e) General promotion of clay target shooting — Budget of \$5,000.
- (f) Coaching, provision of video tape facilities — Budget of \$5,000.
- (g) Feasibility study — National ground — Budget of \$4,000.

We attach hereto (attachments 1, 1A) the actual revenue statements for the year ended 31st December, 1980 and budgeted statements for the 1981 year as presented to us by the Association. From these statements and information supplied we have prepared budgeted statements for 1982, 1983 and 1984 as attached (attachments 2, 2A).

In arriving at our budgets the following adjustments have been made:—

- (a) Where appropriate a 10% inflation projection is provided.
- (b) Ammortisation of computer ceases 1982.
- (c) Possible increases in audit and accounting fees.
- (d) No allowance has been made for any change in computer services presently in existence.
- (e) Depreciation adjusted for anticipated purchase of Association vehicle.
- (f) Reduction in executive meeting expenses as advised.
- (g) 1982 reduction in Club Newsletter costs due to in house production.
- (h) No provision is made for abnormal salary increases.
- (i) Overseas team expenses allowed for in each year are at minimum levels and will be offset to some degree by Government Grants. Additional expenditure is included in development projects for 1983 and 1984 to provide further funds to upgrade shooters' standards.
- (j) National Ground Development costs, a reduced amount in 1982 but a development project in 1983 and 1984.
- (k) Association car expenses, a reduced amount due to anticipated purchase of Association vehicle.
- (l) As no real estimates are available for the cost of a National Headquarters we have not provided for any direct allocation of funds, however a proportion of any surplus existing in each year could be transferred to a special reserve account.
- (m) We assume the registrations will remain at approx. 10,000 shooters as there are likely to be gains and losses on a fee increase. Exact figures are not available for the breakdown of registration categories, ie adult, 2nd family member and junior member under 17 years of age, but for the purposes of the calculations we have used 8,200 adults, 1,350 second family members and 450 junior members.

Based on the above information and discussions with you we have prepared two budgets for 1983 and 1984 using the following registration fees.

As indicated above a registration fee of \$25 results in a small surplus in 1983 and a breakeven situation in 1984 if planned development projects were carried out. There would be no funds available for any capital budget item.

If it is considered necessary to set aside funds for the acquisition of a National Headquarters, registration fees of \$30 should be levied. This will result in expected surpluses of \$58,680 in 1983 and \$44,030 in 1984 which could be allocated to a reserve for acquisition of National Headquarters.

We trust we have provided you with the information required for the Association to set an adequate registration fee to carry out its objectives. Thank you for the opportunity to undertake this assignment.

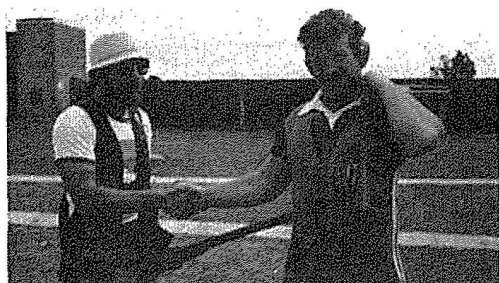

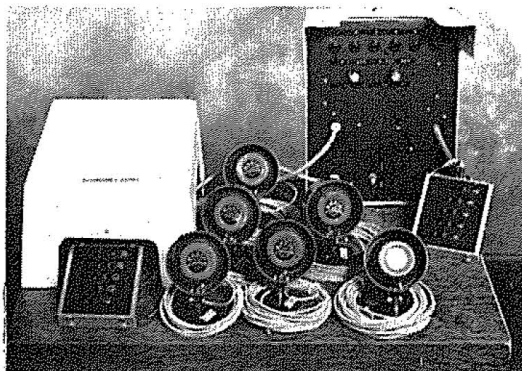

FIREARMS LAWS AND USE

Geoff Rabbidge

The first Australian National Conference on Firearms Laws and Use was held at the University of Western Australia, 25-27 June. Speakers at this Conference were world authorities on firearm laws, the implementation of these laws, of firearm crime and its effect, and of the use of recreational firearms in the community, and their effect upon conservation and shooting. They came from the United States and England, Australian Universities, representatives of shooting associations within Australia, Police officers from most states, New Zealand and Hong Kong, students of the law from most parts of the country, Government officers from the regulating authorities to the instigators of law, such as the Attorney General's Department. Over 300,000 words were spoken during the seminar and references were made to many books, research studies and submissions containing millions of words.

To condense all of this information into a summary, one would think to be an impossible task. In real truth, it gets down to four headings:

SOCIO-ECONOMIC STABILITY, COMMUNICATION, EDUCATION and FIREARMS DEPENDABILITY

Socio-Economic Stability

Professor Richard Harding, who recently published a book titled "Firearms and Violence in Australian Life" stressed a great deal on comparisons between Australia and the United States — Comparisons that both Professor Franklin Zimring and Professor Don Kates from the United States refuted. They pointed out that Australia does not have the socio-economic problems of the United States. We do not have the black ghettos, the Puerto Rican problem or the Mexican illegal immigrants, so that to compare Australia with the United States in regard to the use of firearms in crime is not practical.

Similarly, to compare Australia and other countries of the world is also difficult and misleading. Within Europe, societies are more disciplined, more stable in their social existence. Take as an example Switzerland, a country that has firearms in every home, yet a minimal amount of crime. Most of the population are gainfully employed and are earning excellent wages. The general consensus of the Seminar was that it is futile believing that withdrawing firearms from the community will have any impact whatsoever on the crime rates. It was suggested by Professor Zimring in his paper that we must project 30 years forward in our planning, and that the answer to the social problem of crime and violence was to create a society where no need for robbery and murder exists. The result of the workshop reports given at the end of the meeting was that the band aid treatment of trying to cure crime through gun laws was not a practical proposition.

Colin Greenwood, in his paper, pointed out that there is a great danger in believing such band aid treatment will cure the problem, for matters of far greater importance are likely to be overlooked.

The general feeling of most at the meeting was that Governments in all States, and the Commonwealth, should put more effort into curing the social and economic ills of this country, rather than waste money and effort on firearm controls for law abiding people.

Communication

One of the most obvious weaknesses within our Australian system is the lack of communication between Governments, the Police Forces, the law makers and the users of firearms. One of the great benefits from a seminar such as the one under discussion, is that it supplies a forum at which all of these levels can meet and discuss their various viewpoints, and from that, gain a better understanding of each others attitudes and problems. If such communication can be maintained after the Conference, a great deal of benefit will arise.

In an over-lunch discussion with an Assistant Commissioner of Police, he said to me —

"One thing that comes to me from this Conference, is the possible lack of appreciation both I and my staff have of the attitudes of the recreational shooter, and the public at large. What I would like to see is sufficient funds to have a staff structure so that my officers in suburban and country stations could knock on every twentieth door, at least once a month, introduce themselves to the occupiers, inform them that the police are their friends, and are there ready to assist them at any time. If such communication could be developed, we could get back to the rapport that existed years ago, in the smaller communities.

Much of today's demands by Police Forces for placing unnecessary restrictions upon law abiding citizens pursuing their chosen recreation of shooting, would never arise".

A general consensus of the Seminar was that every effort must be made to have all levels of users law makers and law administrators meet and discuss proposed amendments to any laws, so that an acceptable control, if needed at all, could be resolved.

Education

The need for education was paramount in the minds of all. This need was stressed in practically every paper given during the Conference. When the discussion of firearm accidents and firearm vandalism came forward, the general feeling was that education within the schools, with an in-depth course on not only safe handling of firearms, but in firearms use, was essential.

The police officers who gave papers from both South Australia and Western Australia stressed greatly the requirement to obtain a shooters license in those States, through a thorough knowledge of safe handling of firearms. They suggested that if shooter licensing served no other purpose than this safety element, it was well worthwhile.

One speaker stated he saw no need in society to allow investors in firearms to have these in their possession. Quite obviously, he had never learnt the history of firearm manufacture, or the engineering techniques that brought about their development. He was not mindful of the fact that many of the modern engineering processes and machine tools that make our motor vehicles, and many other items of community comfort were first developed to manufacture firearms. Nor was he aware of the art required for the delicate engraving. His concern only was the danger to the community should these valuable firearms fall into the hands of criminals. It was put to him that an investor takes a very great care of gold, diamonds and other such valuables, in his possession, and most certainly does exactly the same with a firearm.

Firearm Dependency

In a paper given by the writer, it was pointed out the unique situation of Australia with the major problems of the rabbit and the difficulty these pose in the future, now that myxomatosis has lost its impact; the dangers, if foot and mouth disease spread through the wild pig, goat, cattle, horses, etc.; of the value that the recreational shooter played in containing these noxious animals; and the potential such shooters could play in the future in replacing poisons and other methods that cannot be selective, and if used extensively, would quickly eradicate our native fauna.

Summation

The majority consensus of most of the gathering, in my opinion, can be summed up in Professor Gordon Hawkins' words—

"There is no cause as yet for consternation about the impact of FIREARM OWNERSHIP".

Colin Greenwood's last words of his address on the international scene—

"There is no evidence that strict systems of firearms control can reduce armed crime".

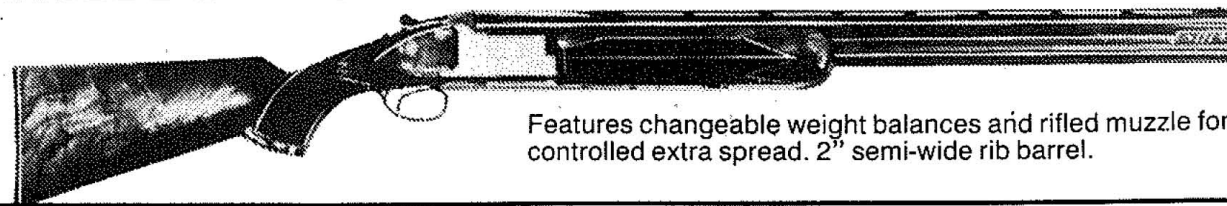

For reasons best left unsaid, I now feel that such an article might be construed as derogatory to my country of present residence if read out of context or by persons less well intentioned. Suffice to say therefore, that after 10 months of fairly heavy going, during which time I almost took up bowls or golf, I have finally become a licenced shooter and weapon owner again. The sport is not as popular or as well catered for here as in Australia, partly because of the expense but largely because of the very stringent gun laws applying here. I hasten to add however, that with an almost continuous history of weapon-associated insurgency and terrorist activity dating back to 1941 and still continuing today, such gun control is fully appreciated and completely justified. On the other hand, I am delighted to report that the fellowship and camaraderie among the shooting fraternity here is as warm and open hearted as that which I have experienced throughout Australasia. That aspect of the sport at least, has not changed.

Since the arrival in the country of RAAF Chaplain David McLeod, who, benefitting from my experiences, was able to complete the licencing procedure in only about five months, we have enjoyed some modest success and more importantly have become accepted by a wide circle of friends and acquaintances across the nation. Being the only two non-Malaysian clay target shooters in the country makes us easily remembered!! It is also very pleasing to note that whenever we meet shooters who have been associated with visiting Australian teams or individuals, that association is invariably spoken of in warm and friendly terms. Keep up the good work ACTA members. The Australian clay target shooter now enjoys an enviable reputation throughout Singapore, Malaysia and Thailand. It would be a pity to see that image tarnished by the ill-grace of a thoughtless or selfish minority.

I would have no objection should you care to publish the foregoing paragraphs. I would, at this point, like to express my thanks to you and your hard working staff for your assistance in the past and particularly for ensuring that my copy of the ACTA News is now reaching me on a fairly regular basis. Be assured that it is avidly read. May I also take this opportunity to wish you personally, your staff members individually, and the organisation as a whole, continued success, the compliments of the Festive Season and best wishes for the New Year.

YOU AND YOUR CLUB DELEGATE:

Who or what is a delegate? World Book Encyclopedia defines a delegate as "a representative chosen by a group of people to speak or act in its interests". A delegate chosen by his or her club should be someone with the DESIRE and ABILITY to represent that club at all times, whether at zone, state or national level.

In my experience of serving on committees over a period of many years I have seen time and time again delegates attending meetings in which they have little or no interest. The usual response when these people are questioned further is that they are there because no one else would attend. If clubs are in the position where they do not have a member who is prepared to act on their behalf and in their interest then they are better off without a representative. A hand raised merely to "go along with the majority or with his or her mates" could adversely affect the result of an important decision.

Who makes a good delegate? A delegate should be someone who is prepared to attend all meetings at which his or her club is entitled to have a representative, and in doing so must be able to take an active part in any discussion on topics covered at such a meeting. (Prior notice of agenda items is usually given). The delegate must be prepared to listen to both sides of any debate and then evaluate the views put forward and make a decision which will, a. benefit his or her club; b. benefit the sport as a whole.

There will be times when decisions made will not benefit some clubs but concessions have to be made if the future of the sport will benefit from that decision. Personal view points are at times a valuable part of a discussion but should not be allowed to dominate any decision a delegate makes. Remember you are representing a group of people, not yourself.

Perhaps the most important pre-requisite for any delegate is that he or she is prepared to report back to his or her club. There is no point in attending meetings if no feed back is given to the club. Ideally a written report outlining all decisions made and expected future developments should be presented. How many times do we hear "I didn't know anything about that". Communication at all levels is of vital importance. Clubs cannot actively contribute to any zone, state or national association if they are not aware of developments or decisions made.

At the time of your next club elections remember your delegate is YOUR voice, so make sure that you elect someone who is capable of acting on your behalf. An association of dedicated people will achieve much more than a group made up of those with little or no interest in the future of the sport. O

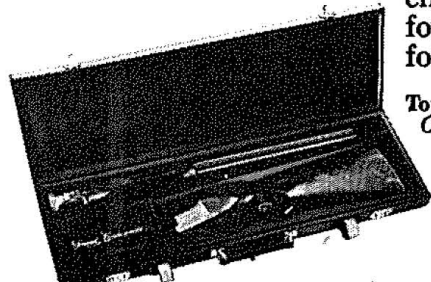

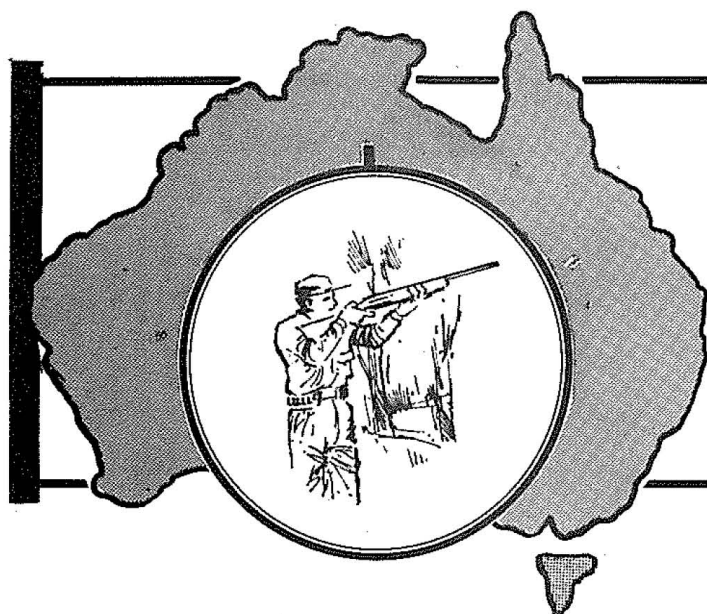

Professor Don Kates' opening remarks—

"It may be argued that any legislation that would reduce the number of pistols in circulation would substantially reduce the number of aggravated assaults. The argument rests on two mistaken premises — first, it assumes that restrictive legislation would prevent criminals from obtaining firearms; second, the argument assumes that guns are used in most aggravated assaults, whereas the fact is that they are only used in a small percentage of such assaults".

And in his concluding remarks—

"It is indeed a morbid, sick society but again, reacting by banning camping knives, hand guns, shotguns and other weapons, is to trivialise the illness and treat its symptoms to the exclusion of its substance. Americans did not invent all of this. There is blame enough to go all the way around, but we do need to remember what the trouble really is. It will not do to blame the weapon — we are going to have to begin by blaming ourselves — then we can start applying a corrective".

Robert Mitton, in his address 'An Historical Insight into the Background of Firearms Legislation in Australia' concluded by pointing out

"That the most firearm restrictive State in the Commonwealth, was Western Australia, but that State had the highest crime levels" and punctuated this with an article from the Perth Times, headed 'Perth is the most violent city in Australia'

He said—

"Indeed the signs were again appearing in Western Australia of an even more repressive attitude being taken, along with an apparent inability or unwillingness, on behalf of the Government, to understand or come to terms with, inherent failings of their registration system. It could well be that the Government may consider interfering with the appeal provisions of the current Act, because shooters had recently initiated numbers of successful appeals in the Courts against the Commissioner's refusal to license firearms. This indeed would be a sad regression from our established democratic values and principle, and would be tantamount to an admission of failure on the Government's behalf, to draft and properly administer workable and satisfactory firearm legislation".

Assistant Commissioner, South Australian Police - David Hunt, in a most interesting and detailed paper on the functioning of South Australia's firearms act, and of the operation of the consultative committee, stated—

"The effects of the operation of the consultative committee was generally considered that the establishment and operation has removed considerable pressure from the Registrar, in that it is seen as an independent body operating under its own guidelines."

Kevin Caimanos of The Sporting Shooters Association of Western Australia said—

"The places with high levels of the rights of citizens to own firearms had directly related high levels of freedom. The Government that feels it cannot trust its citizens to be armed, cannot be trusted by those citizens to preserve their freedom. Unfortunately, it often seems in our society that the greatest threats to freedom come, not from the would be anarchists, or extreme political groups, but from those very sources that are entrusted with the fostering and preserving of those freedoms, our elected representatives and organisations such as our Police Departments."

Superintendent Mark Forkin, officer responsible to the administration of the Western Australian firearm licensing and registration scheme, spoke on firearms legislation in Western Australia.

He stated—

"The licensing policy is aimed at the benefit of the citizens of Western Australia as a whole, and it was inevitable that some firearm owners find this difficult to accept. He stressed that both the firearm and the shooter have to be licensed by the Commissioner of Police, having a discretion

to issue or revoke a license and not to renew it as a matter of right. A license is really no more than a privilege that is sought by the applicant, not as a right. It is important to note that being a financial member of an approved organisation is considered a good reason to obtain a firearm, and the legislation is so contained in the Firearms Act. Another good reason in the legislation is where a long gun is reasonably required for the purpose of destroying vermin on land, used by the owner for agriculture. There is no collectors license as such, but allowances are made for firearms that are considered to be a collectors item. All licenses are renewed after 12 months, with the exception of a curio license, which attracts only an initial fee. The most notable differences between the Western Australian firearms act and those of other States is in Western Australia, every application for a firearm must be accompanied by a good reason."

He concluded his address by saying—

"In general, laws are intended for those persons who have chosen to live outside the code of living that society has evolved, and they are the persons who find it difficult. The law abiding citizen has little to fear, as he lives within society, and is seldom affected by laws that were made for his own protection."

In the paper, Conservation and Shooting, Geoff Rabbidge referred to an article "UP IN ARMS" written by journalist John Clare, in which his opening remarks were—

"Guns have become associated with every malfunction of the male ego".

Rabbidge concluded his paper by saying—

"Yes John Clare, in the minds of many city dwellers, who have not found the satisfaction and useful purpose of putting out duck nesting boxes in swamps, of harvesting the surplus, so that there will be sufficient food to keep a healthy ecological balance; who have not received the heartfelt thanks of a farmer for ridding him of a mob of wild pigs that destroyed half of his sorghum crop, and left

He went on to recommend that all heed Colin Greenwood's remarks from his book "Firearms Control" which read—

"To continue with the process of attempting to deal with the criminal use of firearms by placing more restrictions on legitimate users, is not likely to achieve anything. The great danger lies not in the ineffectiveness of such restrictions, but in the belief that they will solve the problem. Whilst this mistaken belief persists, the real problem will not receive the attention and action that it clearly, and urgently requires."

Greenwoods' words concisely summarised, in advance, the final decision of the Firearms Laws and Use Conference
