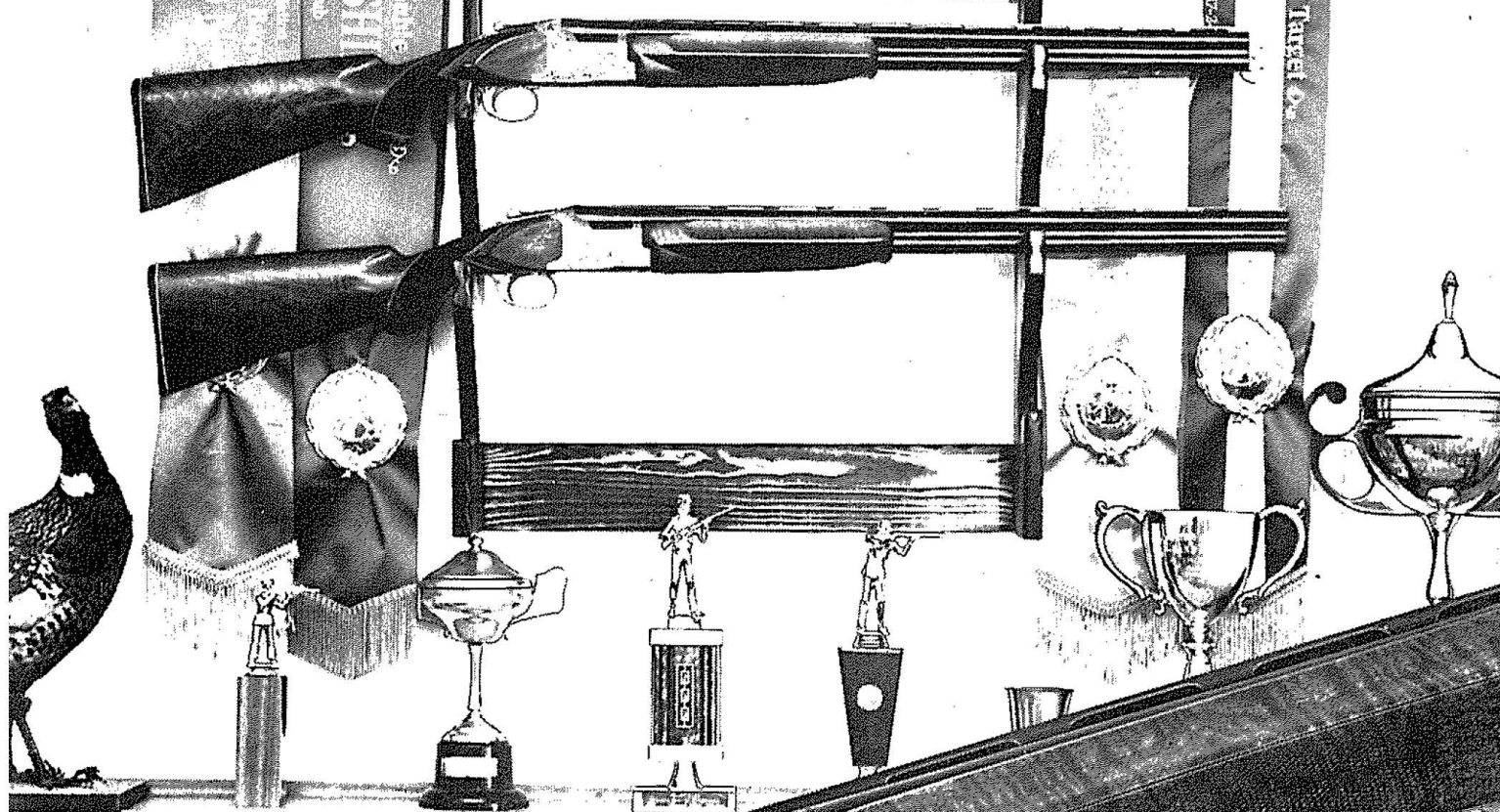

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Things are hotting up in clay target shooting again, after the slight pause over the Christmas and New Year period.

We are now a month into 1982, Brisbane Commonwealth Games year. Competition among shooters of the I.S.U. disciplines is hotting up too, as evidenced by the fine performances over the Australia Day week-end in Canberra. World silver medalist, Jim Ellis, had to call on all his experience and skills to hold out John Maxwell. Tied on 196 after the 200 targets the shoot-off over a further 25 targets was a very tense affair. Both shooters were in top form, and Jim's experience told in the end, running the 25 clean, with John dropping one target.

This was a great performance, 196 is right in world class, particularly when shot at A.C.T. International Gun Club, not the easiest of grounds.

John Maxwell's 196 was his best ever in Olympic Trap and earned him a special award. This was a medal presented by the Federal Government for achievement during the Australia Day Sporting Festival.

National Training Squad Manager/Coach Peter Quire was pleased with the scores posted by his squad and remarked that in the past, in an event such as this, Ellis and Rumbel would be way ahead at the end of 200 targets, whereas now they are being pushed by the Maxwells, Longs and Porters.

Competition for places in the Australian team for the Brisbane Games will be fierce, if the Canberra week-end is any indication of what's in store.

Queanbeyan/Canberra Gun Club conducted a very successful two day tournament during this same week-end. Many visiting shooters were there for the two days, Bill Iles figuring prominently in the prize list, winning a colour television and a trip to New Zealand.

Robbie Smith of Royal Aero was looking very trim. He is in strict training for the nationals and wants to lose a further five kilos before Brisbane in May.

I have great pleasure in announcing a new National Award for Juniors.

Mrs Audrey Thomas has given the Association an amount of money to be held in trust, the interest from which will provide the necessary funds to purchase a prestigious Silver Medal, to be awarded to the top junior shooter in Australia each year.

The medal, to be known as the Newton Thomas Junior Award, will be presented to the junior shooter with the highest score, taken from the junior team shoots at each State Trap Carnival. In the event of tied scores, a countback will take place to find the top junior in Australia. Junior shooting was of great interest to Newton, so Mrs Thomas has very graciously offered this award to perpetuate her late husband's interest in junior shooters.

The Association's Management Committee expresses its sincere thanks to Mrs Audrey Thomas for her most generous offer.

NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

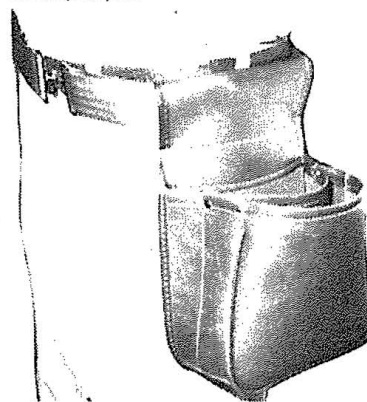

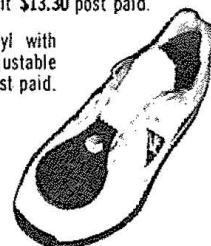

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1982

As I have been appointed Handicapper for the Brisbane 1982 Nationals, I thought it necessary to advise you of the following which will be strictly enforced.

1. **ALL** current 1982 Handicap Cards regardless of your Grade, along with your 1981 Card will be required by me for checking **before** you nominate.
2. All Handicap Cards will have to be stamped by me before Nominations will be accepted.
3. **NO** nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is unavailable unless your Grade, Handicap Trap and Skeet is confirmed by your Club Secretary on a Statutory Declaration Form.
4. If a Statutory Declaration Form is signed you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the ACTA until your handicap and grade is verified by the Executive Committee.
5. Unless you are a new shooter or haven't shot for a long period and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot) your handicap will be A Grade 0 Skeet and 25 Metres. (This is your responsibility. Make sure your Club Secretaries fill in your cards correctly).
6. Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable.
7. If an error is made on your card have your Club Secretaries neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly and sign it.
8. Any **obvious** low score entered on Handicap Cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. (Rule 106).
9. Please watch the Handicap Board. If your name appears on the board, report to me.
10. If you happen to be down graded and you don't wish to be, please advise.
11. Remember to fill in your cards at all times, i.e. all events other than those not applicable, as I have a complete set of Clay Magazines and I can read very well.

Good shooting and see you in Brisbane.

SHELL TO SPONSOR AUSTRALIA'S 1984 OLYMPIC TEAM

The principal sponsor for the Australian Olympic Federation's team for the XXIIIrd Olympiad will be the Shell Co. of Australia Ltd., the acting Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, Mr Michael Hodgman has announced.

Mr Hodgman said Shell, which was the AOF's principal sponsor in the previous two Olympic Games, was to provide \$210,000 towards the cost of sending a team to the 1984 Olympics.

"This is a most welcome reaffirmation of Shell's faith in Australian sportsmen and sportswomen," Mr Hodgman said.

"Any Olympic Games should be seen as a great opportunity for sport, private enterprise and government to work together for the betterment of sport as a whole. I hope Shell's example will encourage other companies and individuals to indicate at an early date that they will be Olympic sponsors as well," the Minister said.

"I am sure many Australians will take up this call and demonstrate, in turn, their faith in the characteristics long-recognised as being an integral part of the make-up of Australian athletes...individual skill, determination, courage, resilience and, above all, willingness and ability to help themselves obtain their goals."

Mr Hodgman said the principle of self-help was part of the basis of the Commonwealth's attitude to sport in Australia today.

"While nurturing this in our athletes through grants to national sporting organisations under the Sports Development Program, the Commonwealth Government is complementing it by providing funds for those areas that are common to all sports. In the 1981-82 Budget nearly \$1 million was provided for international competition, nearly \$500,000 for coaching and \$860,000 for administrative support under the Program," Mr Hodgman said.

"The Government has also recognised that some areas require a firmer financial base than can be provided by sporting organisations run largely by volunteers. That is part of the reason for establishing the Australian Institute of Sport which covers, to date, eight sports (seven of which are Olympic sports) and will cater for 188 athletes in 1982.

"It is also why we are providing \$25 million over three financial years, on a dollar-for-dollar basis with the States and Territories to construct international-standard sporting facilities that will compare more than favourably with similar facilities overseas," Mr Hodgman said.

"These facilities will enable Australians to train and compete on an equal footing with overseas competitors and will attract the world's best to provide them with top class competition in their own country."

Mr Hodgman said the Department of Home Affairs and Environment was soon to consider a detailed submission from the AOF seeking Commonwealth funds to supplement those the AOF and its sponsors had provided to carry out its training program leading up to the 1984 Olympics.

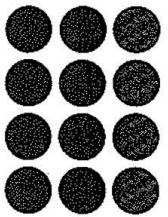
"I know this will be looked on favourably and we, in turn, will look to the AOF to fulfill its responsibilities and field for Australia its finest team yet — a team which, I believe, will number about 370 athletes."

Mr Hodgman said that as well as financial support, it is very important for the athletes to receive positive psychological support from everyone in the community.

"The AOF, Shell and the Government have recognised this and, in this regard, I am pleased to see that International Public Relations has been engaged to carry out the AOF's funding activities and I hope their efforts will be met by the community with a response that will match the efforts of our athletes as they prepare to push Australia back to the tops of world sporting ladders," Mr Hodgman said.

The reloadability of the FOB case has been tested at our ranges, and we have found that we can obtain between 12 and 18 reloads which, added to the reliability of the cartridge itself, makes this product extraordinary value.

During the year he competed as a member of the N.S.W. junior team.

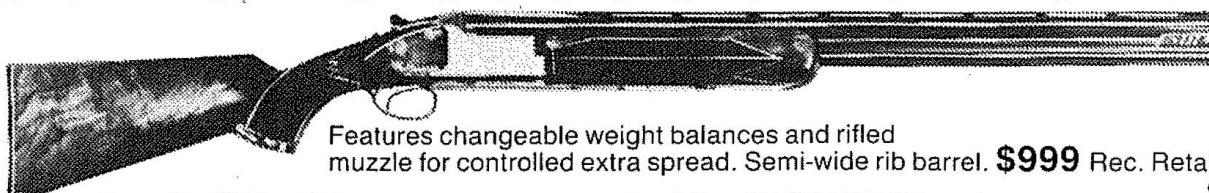
Chris, who is the son of Bill and Elaine Warren of Young Road, Boorowa, also has a string of minor trophies to his credit.

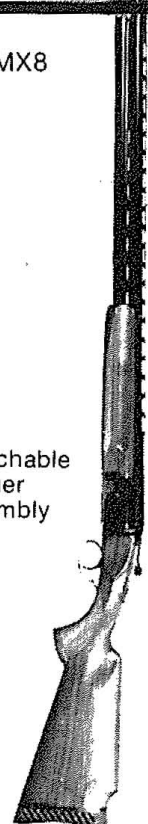
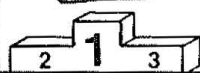
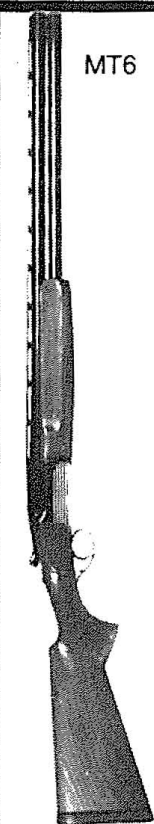

AROUND THE TRAPS

Saturday 2nd, Sunday 3rd, January 1982

For me, 1982 and my involvement in clay shooting is off to a good start. I received a phone call from Coffs Harbour Gun Club President, Stan Simmonds, to be their guest at their annual New Year two day shoot. The hospitality extended to my wife, Agnes, and me, over the few days we were there was great, as well as an excellent program being organized for competitors, the social side of shooting had not been forgotten by club members and administrators. The Gun Club, and surroundings is one that is on the list as a possible for National Ground development. Depending on the outcome of a feasibility study being implemented by the A.C.T.A. on a National Ground, there is no doubt in my mind, Coffs Harbour has a great deal of potential for such development.

The club now features four D.T.L. layouts, two skeet, a tower, and a universal trench ground. A carpeted club room and bar are provided, with excellent toilet and shower facilities available for on-site campers. It was surprising the number of faces one recognized on the traps. Past President of the A.C.T.A., Ern Hawkins and his wife Verlie were there, Arch and Alice Rowe, Yamba, N.S.W., from Victoria, Ron Moore, Wangaratta, Trevor Nash, Karen Williams and Bert Bertschik, Melbourne, Harry Moore, Mildura, as well as top shots, John Porter, Brisbane & Terry Rumbel, Taree Wingham.

Well known personality Don Scowcroft was there competing in the events, he put up some good scores too.

The weather was hot, but perfect for shooting. The first event, a Trophy event was won by Greg Stevens from Brisbane, with a score of 43/43. The Single Barrel Banana Republic Classic, saw Laurie Cooper from Taree N.S.W., win overall 25/25. In the Graded Points Warren Toward shot 60/60 to win the 11-14m group, Peter Fitzalton 59/60 won the 15-19m group, and John Fryer 59/60 collected 20-25m section.

The El Presidente Trophy Shoot results were 11-14m, winner, Andrew Gull from Moree. 15-19m Charles Tattam, Moree, and Greg Stevens, Brisbane winner of the 20-25m group. The meterage group winners in Coffs Harbour Grand Classic were 11-14m Kevin Frazer, Tamworth 55/55, 15-17m Geoff Walters, Tamworth 44/44, 18-21m John Duykee, Taranora Lakes, 88/88, Terry Rumbel, Taree Wingham was

After a long shoot off with Terry Rumbel, Tony Alvaro from Sydney collected High Gun over the programme. Graham Cameron from Grafton won the junior High Gun with Karen Williams, Melbourne winning the Ladies High Gun. It was a great shoot, and I recommend it to anyone wishing to add it to their shooting calendar for 1982-83.

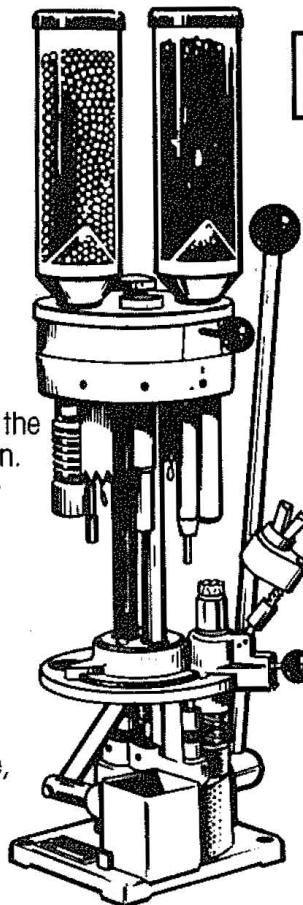

SPORT NEWS

The 1981 edition of the TAA National Sports Congress was held in Melbourne in mid-December and proved to be the most successful yet.

The congress consisted of three components — the sport Australia awards and the annual meetings of the confederation and the coaches assembly.

SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS TO STAR ATHLETES

Melbourne's Southern Cross Hotel ballroom resounded to the thunder of applause for Australia's top sports stars on Thursday, 10th December, when Sport Australia Awards were presented to winners in eleven categories.

Each award was presented by a National identity, most of whom had been sports heroes — the list of presenters included:

The Rt. Hon. J. M. Fraser, C.H. M.P.

Sir Robert Law-Smith

Betty Cuthbert; John Konrads; Bob Skilton;
Shirley De La Hunty (Strickland); Bill Roycroft;
Sid Patterson; Frank Sedgman; Wayne Reid.

In each category the three finalists had been brought to Melbourne as guests of the Confederation and TAA, and attended the presentation.

The seven network provided a national live telecast of the function, in which the "Anchor Man" was top sports commentator Peter Landy.

Just prior to the start of the function, Prime Minister Fraser was guest of honour at a private cocktail party, at which he was introduced to members of the "Patrons of Australian Sport" club. This "Club" consists of representatives of commercial organisations, which have provided substantial financial (or product) support to the Confederation of Australian Sport.

After the cocktail party, Mr Fraser joined almost 500 guests in the ballroom for the presentations. During the pre-television segment of the evening, Confederation president, Wayne Reid, presented Mr Fraser with a 14 carat gold brooch, cast in the form of the Confederation's official logo.

The Prime Minister proudly wore the gift in his lapel for the rest of the evening.

The guest list included the chairman of the Australian National Airlines Commission, Sir Robert Law-Smith; general manager of TAA, Mr Frank Ball; senior executives from each of the category sponsors; members of the patrons of Australian sport club; presidents and secretaries (or executive directors) of national sporting federations; 1980 presenters and, where possible, winners; and the presenters and finalists for 1981.

The range of trophies made a most impressive display. Designed by Brian Sadgrove of Melbourne, the awards had been cast in solid metal and hand engraved by Anpas Pty. Ltd. A novel and widely accepted touch was added by the managing director of Anpas, Mr Frank Gatt, when he also manufactured a coaster depicting the Sport Australia Award Motif, one of which was presented to each guest as a souvenir of the occasion.

The format of the televised presentation included video taped segments depicting the top 1981 performances of the finalists in each category.

SQUASH STARS TAKE OUT GOLD AWARDS

The two top individual categories were the last to be presented. They were "Female Athlete of the Year" and "Male Athlete of the Year".

Squash players dominated these categories, which had been sponsored by the confederation itself. The presenter was the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. J. M. Fraser and the capacity crowd was hushed as he read out the names of the finalists in the women's category —

ELIZABETH BLENOWE
BEVERLEY FRANCIS
VICKI HOFFMANN

The winner was announced as Miss Vicki Hoffman, whose performances throughout the year had been little short of miraculous.

Then came the "Male Athlete of the Year" award, which was won by last year's runner-up, Geoff Hunt, also from squash. (Geoff also won the ABC "Sportsman of the Year" award, announced early in January).

It was obvious from the audience reaction that Geoff's win was a most popular choice and clear recognition that his feat of remaining at the top in a physically demanding sport for such a long time had caught the imagination of the Australian sporting public.

One of the most encouraging aspects of the evening was the obvious pleasure the presenters derived from being in the sporting spotlight again. Australia has a long and highly valued sporting tradition and it is good that projects such as the Sport Australia Awards can bring past national heroes into public focus once again. Furthermore, their presence adds dramatically to the atmosphere and status of sport's only peer-recognition award program.

CAS AGM OF HIGH STANDARD

The Confederation of Australian Sport annual meeting was held at Melbourne's Flemington Racecourse on Friday, 11th December, 1981.

Attended by delegates representing National Sporting Associations, the 1981 CAS annual general meeting was the second component of the TAA National Sports Congress and undoubtedly the best yet held.

Confederation president, Wayne Reid, opened the meeting and extended a special welcome to guests included amongst whom were the Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, the Hon. I. B. C. Wilson and senior members of his staff, Paul Brettell and Dene Moore; members of the Sports Advisory Council, Jim Barry (also a CAS director), Pamela Barham, Jenny Cheeseman and Terry Valeriot from Canada, who had

come to Australia specially to talk on matters relating to the Coaches Association of Canada.

Minister Wilson, in presenting the keynote address to the meeting, spoke on the objectives and purpose behind the Federal Government's sports policies.

He spelled out the need to co-ordinate the activities of the three levels of government — local, state and federal — and said that it was no longer appropriate to expect the money, the Enthusiasm and expertise to emerge from any single source.

The minister spoke in some detail on the various elements of his government's sports policy, including the national athlete award scheme, the sports development program and a new initiative, which provides assistance for athletes in whom great potential has been seen, but outside the "Elite Athlete" areas.

On the subject of the Australian Institute of Sport, Mr Wilson advised that 180 students would be accommodated for 1982 and told of the Government's satisfaction in the way the performances of Institute athletes improved so dramatically during 1981.

Mr Wilson closed by committing his department to continue to develop, refine and implement a national sports policy.

The election of office bearers resulted in a new face being added to the board — that of Harry Nederveen, of the Australian Hockey Association and a long standing supporter of confederation initiatives. Three retiring directors were returned to office — they were Jim Barry, Wendy Ey and John Newman.

The fourth retiring director was Kevin Humphreys, of New South Wales. Kevin, who was also chairman of the executive committee of the coaches assembly, had decided not to seek re-election; due to heavy business commitments.

Another new face to come to the board table is that of secretary general of the Australian Olympic Federation, Judy Patching. Judy replaces Tom Blue, of Queensland, as the AOF delegate on the Confederation's Board.

Two major developments arose from the meeting. The first was approval to proceed with a plan to establish a professional society for sports administrators, to provide a formal means of recognition of levels of skills.

This proposal was the result of a recommendation made by a committee that had spent eighteen months investigating the needs of sports administrators. It was the original intent to formulate a policy to provide an education program for administrators. However, this role is now being filled by State Governments and the committee quickly realised the need for a national co-ordinating group to monitor the state-based education courses and to then provide recognition for the skills required or demonstrated by sports administrators.

The second initiative was to approve the creation of a corporate entity to be known as CAS Marketing Services Pty. Ltd. The purpose of this group, which will operate under the control of the CAS Board, will be to provide professional advice or services on request from National Sporting Associations.

A number of experts in specialist fields such as legal services, accounting, promotions, will be taken in under the CASMS umbrella and their services will be available to member associations at preferred rates. CASMS will also be available to act as a bulk procurement agency, should the need arise.

The meeting maintained an extremely high standard throughout, part of which was due to excellent chairmanship by Wayne Reid and part of which was to the quality of the venue at Melbourne's Flemington Racecourse.

During the luncheon adjournment, Mr Brian Dixon spoke on the subject of "Sport for all", a subject on which he is a world authority and linked the concept to the "life. Be in it." program.

After Mr Dixon had finished his address, the confederation presented plaques of appreciation to the members of the "Patrons of Australian Sport club."

Friday, 11th December, 1981 will be listed as a very successful day in the history of the confederation of Australian Sport.

Why Not Give Us A Go.

A.C.T.A. LEGISLATION LEVY

When the National Executive members discussed the introduction of a levy to gain funds for a Legislation Fighting Fund, we were fully aware that we would encounter our fair share of difficulties.

We realised that in the field of legislation awareness, our organisation was a long way behind many of the other shooting bodies throughout Australia.

Therefore we reasoned that it was high time we started becoming as involved as any other body for the protection of all the shooters registered with the A.C.T.A.

Our methods may have been "clumsy and unprofessional", however, our motives were at all times honest and we thought, in every shooter's interest.

According to some of the criticisms being levelled, it is obvious that we of the Executive Committee forgot that to become part of the A.C.T.A. administrative unit, we are expected to be infallible. For not living up to this expectation, I apologise and will try to do better in the future.

At no time did the Executive seek to "rip you off". We are genuinely concerned with the way in which shooting sports have become vulnerable to social and political pressures over recent years and the rapidity with which these pressures are escalating. Recently I have had discussions with representatives from different sectors of shooting sports in Australia, have attended legislation seminars addressed by experts in the legislation field, thereby realising the inadequacy of the A.C.T.A. within the firearms legislation field.

In an attempt to remedy this situation, we decided to set up a specific fund to be called a Legislation Fighting Fund while we are learning the fundamentals from other experienced people within the field, people who have had their fingers on the political pulse for many years.

The fighting fund HAS been instigated and monies have already been invested at a good rate of interest on twenty four hour call. The great majority of shooters have backed the scheme and are willing to bear with us and assist.

Basically the fund has been set up to combat unfair actions by any strata of government or other body towards our registered shooters and their clubs in the pursuit of the sport of clay target shooting.

Therefore I don't ask you to just follow along blindly, but to help in any way possible so that we can all work together, towards making our sport readily available to future generations.

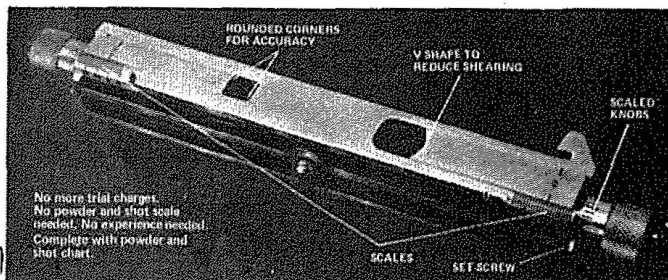

I subscribe to the view that if you win something you should be prepared to cop a metre, after all that is what handicapping is all about.

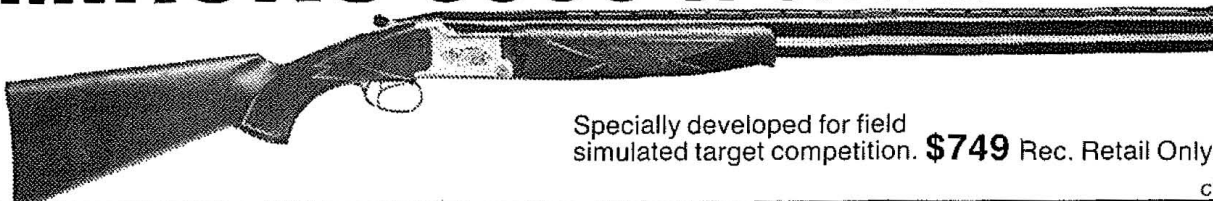

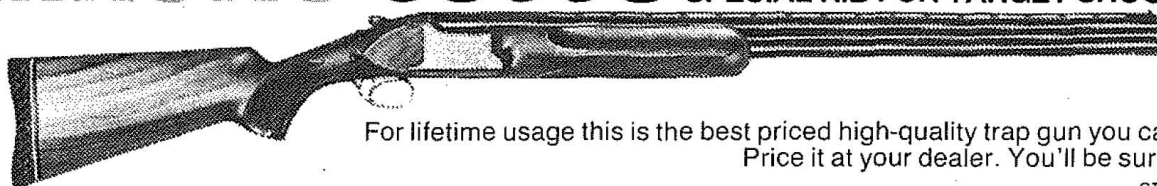

SA COMPANY WINS CONTRACT FOR RIFLES

An SA company has won a contract to supply to Canada 100 right-handed and 20 left-handed target rifles for a prestige international shoot.

The company, Omark Australia Ltd., received the order from the Canadian Rifle Association for use in the Palma Shoot, to be held in Canada next June.

In the competition, all competitors must shoot with identical rifles which are issued to them by the organisers and may not be modified in any way.

The competition is held every second year in different countries.

It is the third occasion in 10 years that Omark has been selected to supply the rifles.

The general sales manager of Omark, Mr Ben Kirby, said the company no longer manufactured sporting rifles — only target rifles for the National Rifle Association.

SUCCEEDING AWAY FROM HOME

Tim Catling, W.A. Coaching Director.

Why is it that many shooters who shoot top scores at their home clubs do not reproduce that form away from home, particularly at District State or National Carnivals?

The answer to this can be a complex one, but in most cases it is a lack of application.

So many shooters go to these bigger events as a holiday, in as much as they drink too much, stay up too late, and generally destroy their chances of a good score. If your answer to the above is "I only want to have fun and a few days off" then that is fine, but I am sure most of us would like to shoot well and can do so if a few simple guide lines are followed.

Firstly, use your shooting at your club to build up a system that you can fall back on at the big events, then you must have the comforting knowledge that you have a proven system to use, as the strange crowd and ground is often enough to put one out of step.

The old saying "The shooter who can wait, best wins the big events" is mostly true. In club shooting, you don't have to wait very long between visits to the traps, whereas at Carnivals, long periods between visits can be very hard to handle. Here, a little time-using such as refereeing, scoring or card-playing can be useful, **NOT** another visit to the beer tent or food stall, as neither of these two do anything for a shooters performance.

Make sure you are ready for your squad, and a little brisk movement just prior to shooting can be of help. If you just sit around, certainly if it is hot, you can become very slack.

Dr Brian Nettleton, of the Melbourne University, has proved that movement to "stir up the system" is most certainly helpful.

Think positively about your shooting, particularly if the conditions are poor. It helps to realize that good scores are always shot in any conditions, so, why not yours.

Don't let your mind dwell on that strange habit in some area that the referee might have, or the very unusual call one of the shooters in the squad has, but get on with your own shooting of the targets **"ONE AT A TIME"**.

A little tip that has helped many is the one of thinking as you load your gun, "see it, then shoot it", as so many shooters try to shoot a bit faster at the big events instead of building up rhythm and timing which will lead to a good score.

Also develop a clean and positive call, for with the extra background noise of carnivals, the referee needs to hear you. However, a very loud call can lead to "jumping at the target". If nerves are a problem, then a few deep breaths, relaxing between each, will do wonders. It also helps to realize that all the good shots are nervous too.

All of us have different ways to build ourselves up for a "Big Event", but by giving a little thought to what happened last time will help you improve for next time. Don't be afraid to experiment, particularly if you have not been scoring well.

Finally, I subscribe to the idea that if you shoot better, you will have more fun, so a little extra effort to have more fun must be worth it. Remember, good luck plays a part, and the more you practice and concentrate, the more good luck you will have.

I sincerely hope that one or more of the thoughts I have expressed will help some of you to enjoy your shooting more. ○

RECAP OF 1981 AT CHARTERS TOWERS

Hard work by the Charters Towers Gun Club members during 1981 paid off, as was shown by the increase in attendance of visiting shooters, larger prizemoney, more sponsorship and better facilities at the Club grounds.

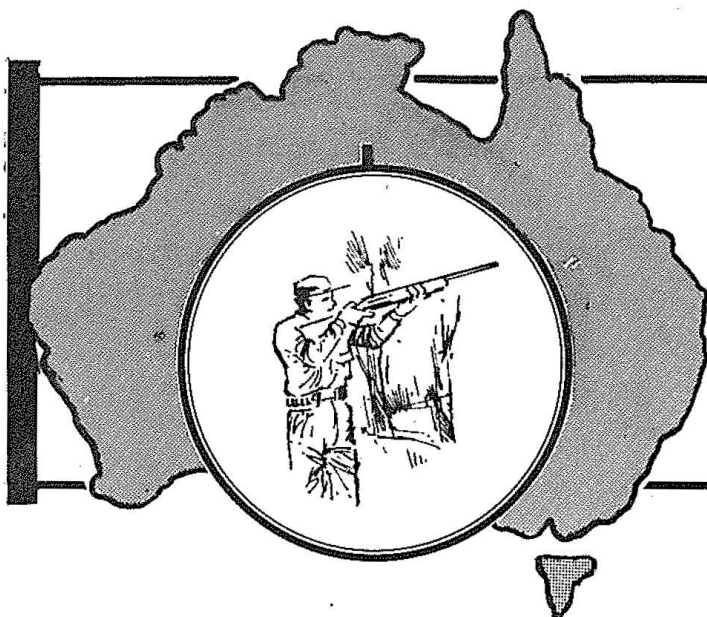

This is my first letter to the A.C.T.A. since I started shooting in 1950. I hope you will find time to read it, and, if you think fit, to print it.

It is my firm belief that all shooting in Australia should be shot from a common mark. As our Championships are being shot 15m, let us say from there. I.S.U. shooting has been around for a long while and I don't see them moving up and down.

Cut out all double barrel, both barrels equal shooting, and go to point score and single barrel. For handicap, create say another grade and give points or targets start as in skeet.

Double barrel shooting is costing shooters large numbers of shells in shoot-offs with the second and third place getters receiving nothing. Surely the shooter hitting his targets with the first barrel must be shooting the better at the time.

Ian, would you also kindly clarify the following through the A.C.T.A. News.

A shooter double loads shooting singles in Skeet. He shoots at the first target with an automatic gun and it fires O.K. He then calls for his second target only to find that the empty shell has caught in the action. About sixty percent of referees are calling lost target, saying it is the responsibility of the shooter to see that his gun is loaded at all times, when of course it is an allowable malfunction.

O.K. fellers, the flack suit is on and buttoned up, so let me have some.

Dear Ian,

With pen in hand to advise shooters on our latest move in the Labour gun ownership controversy, I read the letter to Mr J. Cain, reprinted in February C.T.S.N.

Whilst agreeing that the letter is one form of protest, I would recommend the time be better spent on a personal protest by all shooters to their Labour M.P. or the Labour Candidate.

When informed the Labour opponent of Sir P. Lynch was Mr David Hassett of Mt Martha, an appointment was made to meet him at Mornington Clay Target Club on January 9th, 1982.

Mr Graham Matthews (known by Sth. Eastern Zone Vic. members to say a word or two) and myself (also known to assist) and Mr Hassett, we toured the Club and gave details of gun safety, type of guns and general format of club shooting. Mr Hassett admitted that he was not fully informed on shooting and did not realise that there were different firearms for each type of shooting. After a considerable time of both receiving and giving information, Mr Hassett was adamant in his views that the Labour Party would not endanger the responsible shooters right to own and use his firearms.

He stated that the Labour Party would try to control the misuse of firearms and their policy was aimed in this direction.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr Hassett for his time and effort and I believe that all shooters would be given a fair hearing if they are willing to inform their representative of their needs.
