



Nationals month, and most things seem to be in readiness for the Big one. The trophy list too is a big one, with some changes being made to the list from last year.

As examples the 1982 Skeet Champion will walk away with an elegant Grandfather wall clock. The Double Rise winner will be presented with a **Technics** Hi-fi system.

The Champion of Champions will receive a **National** remote control Video Recorder. The Trade is again supporting the Championships in a big way with plenty of guns being made available.

Grade winners are not forgotten with prizes such as 400 day mantle clocks, microwave ovens, Stereo Cassette AM/FM radio recorders and quality dinner services.

Two new Perpetual Trophies will be be presented for the first time in Brisbane. These are the Ron Porter Remembrance Trophy, very kindly donated by Mrs Muriel Porter and the Porter family to perpetuate the memory of late husband and father, former National President Ron Porter. This valuable trophy and replica will be presented to the competitor with the highest aggregate score over the six trap events.

The second is the June Gawith Perpetual Trophy, for presentation to the winner of the 2nd Australian Womens Double Barrel Championship. Mrs June Gawith of Jeparit, Victoria, was the winner of the 1st Australian Womens Double Barrel Championship, conducted at last years Nationals in Melbourne and has very kindly donated this trophy for perpetual competition.

After 27 years of Liberal rule, Victoria now has a Labour Government. Just when new firearm legislation will be introduced is not known, nor are the changes to be made to the current laws. It is likely that a Committee will be set up to examine in detail the proposed legislation before it is drafted. We hear that people involved with the shooting sports will be invited to sit on this Committee.

It is my view that the average John Citizen regarded firearms legislation as a non-issue in the Victorial election, particularly in Metropolitan Melbourne.

Enjoy your shooting and see you in Brisbane.

AROUND THE TRAPS

Wednesday 3rd March 1982

It is nearing A. G. M. time, and because of some changes in our administration system, by the engaging of independent accountants to advise, and assist in compiling our balance sheet and accounts for year ending 31st December, 1981, I spent most of this day at A.C.T.A. office in consultation with Bill Hall, accountant from Deloitte Hoskins and Sells, and our Executive Director, Ian Hill. From discussions I feel member clubs and shooters in general will be advantaged in the way it is intended to compile and furnish annual meetings. Part of this day I spent at Melbourne Gun Club with Ian Hill and Bob Buchan. The T.V. cameras were there making a documentary on shot gun shooting for viewing on A.B.C. Stars for the show were members from Melbourne Gun Club. Victorian State coach George Biggs seemed to be playing the leading role, with Melbourne Gun Club President, Bob Buchan looking after action effects.

Thursday 4th March 1982

Travelled to New Zealand to attend the New Zealand National Championships that were being held at Christchurch Gun club, Yaldhurst. Amongst the four hundred and fifty competitors were forty Australian shooters. The total

numbers was down slightly on last years Nationals held in Hamilton, New Zealand, so I was told, however, they were conducted under ideal weather conditions and appeared to be very successful for the organisers. The Championships commenced on Saturday 6th March with the 1982 New Zealand I.S.U. Ball Trap Championship being the first event on the card. The result was a draw after a three round shoot off between John Woolley, (Christchurch) and Gavin Searle (Belfast), both shooters along with two others carded 49/50 in the event. A tie was declared when after three further rounds Woolley and Searle were still even with three clean rounds of twenty-five. The drawn result was a first in the history of the New Zealand Championship. The 1982 New Zealand Skeet Championship attracted 230 entries, with 1982 Australian Champion, Adrian Cousens being amongst the field. Adrian was keen to add the title to his list of major wins, however the shooting machine John Woolley of New Zealand was in great form to win his second title in a row, scoring 68/68 for the Championship. Only eight possible fifties were scored in the event. Henry Weitzel, Australia was the only shooter to offer any opposition to Woolley and finished second with 67/68. The New Zealand Clay Sparrow title went to Murray (Gunner) Cameron, New Zealand 45/45. Out of the

305 Entries only nine shooters carded clean scores. John Wooley, went close to winning this title by finishing second in the event 44/45. In the Double Rise title only two shooters scored possible thirties to qualify for the best of five pair shoot off. They were Bill Iles who was referred to as the "burly Australian" by the New Zealand press, and Gavin Patin, Papakura. Iles was untroubled to shoot five pair in the shoot

off, while Patin missed two targets. There were 285 entries in the event. The New Zealand Single Rise Championship, which is known as Double Barrel event by Australians, saw three hundred and thirty three shooters enter the event, with it taking a two and a half hour shoot off to reach a result. The practically unbelievable happened, when John Woolley, the

magic skeet shot, laughed and smiled to himself, as twentyseven shooters dropped out of calculations, leaving him the winner, with a score of 241/241, Murray Cameron, New Zealand was second 240/240, with Australian Michael McVi-. cor, third 237/237. Three hundred and twenty-eight entries in the New Zealand Single Barrel Championship, and Ray Black from Timaru emerging a winner. There were only eight possibles in the fifty targets qualifing round with Iles and Whittakers being contenders. Only a short shoot off of eleven targets required to select placings with Ray Black, New Zealand first 61/61. John McMillan, New Zealand, 60/61 second and John Whittakers, Australian third 59/60. Joan Longmore, Australia had some success when she won the New Zealand Ladies Single Rise Championship. The last event on the programme, the New Zealand Point Score Championship went to New Zealanders, L. Coppins first, M. Cook second and John Wolley third. The Australian team, consisting of Kevin Longmore, Jon Whittakers, Bill Iles, Stephen Philips, Peter Flack and Michael McVicor, were not good enough to win the Glen Cup for Australia, and were beaten by the New Zealand team, who shot the possible 120/120 against Australia's 118/120.

It was a great New Zealand Nationals thanks for your "Kiwi" hospitality. The "Aussies" will be back next year.

After the New Zealand Nationals, I took a trip around the New Zealand South Island, to view their beautiful scenery. I visited and shot at the Ellesmere and Banks Peninsula Gun Club in my travels.





The week-end of the 20th — 21st March saw the final round in Tasmania for the National Training Squad eliminations. The State Association was lucky enough to persuade Peter Quire, National Coaching Director and Training Squad Team Manager, to come to Hobart for the week-end. It was a good opportunity for Peter to see top Tasmanian shooters in action and to talk about coaching.

Tasmania, with less than 400 registered shooters, is lucky enough to have two trench and three I.S.U. Skeet layouts. In recent years interest has fallen off in these events, but with the introduction of the National Training Squad eliminations, Trench fever is running high in the Apple isle. The Fairness of the selection procedure obviously appeals to shooters all over Australia. It is scores and only scores that count to make the Top Squad.

In the two previous eliminations, Ian Rist of Burnie had already carded a 94.25% average, and Alan Styles from Scotsdale was in close contention with 92.25%. John Murphy and Robbie Elmer were also in the low nineties, proof of the strength of Tasmanian shooting. During the week-end, Peter Quire was closely questioned on the performances of Mainland competitors, and he was able to confirm how near the top the Tassie battlers are getting at their first attempt.

Conditions on both days were ideal although certain traps were prone to release broken targets. A previous attempt to hold this elimination in Hobart was called off because of a serious broken target problem. It is to the credit of the newly formed Tasmanian I.S.U. sub-committee that they were not prepared to slow down the traps, but postponed the event to shoot better quality, harder targets thrown the full distance.

The first day saw a nervous start to the proceedings with some unforgivable targets being missed. There seemed to be a lack of concentration amongst the squads and whilst individuals expressed condfidence in themselves, they were not completely convincing. The quiet arrogance found in champions seemed lacking. At the end of the day, the most improved competitor of the series Stewart Browning of Hobart lead the field with 93, Alan Styles put in a solid peformance with 92, but Ian Rist could only manage 89. "Risty is nursing a nasty stone an inch or so below his left

kidney, but he had his personal personal physician on hand giving professional advice on how a change of foot position would result in the painless breaking of the left swingers. To his credit, Rist ignored this advice completely and didn't miss a left hander all week-end — it was the high straight-aheads that caused the problem!

At the end of the first day, the video equipment was set up and Peter Quire showed his tape, "The Phychology of Winning". This is a tremendous motivational tape and must





Conditions on the second day were just as good as the first. The warm sun persuaded the delectable lady spectators to don the briefest of shorts and, far from distracting the competitors, inspired them to greater things! Our heartfelt thanks for bringing them go to the "Italian taxi-driver", although "Ex-Army" from down South did nearly have a coronary!

There was a new confidence in the air. Old rivals dared each other, to win. This was to be a good day. Targets were broken cleanly and concentration was absolute on the firing line. As it turned out, all the leaders improved their scores. Stewart Browning shot as to finish with 188 and the outright win. Alan Styles also improved by two targets making 94, to finish second on 186. The best score of the day was a beautiful 96 shot by Ian Rist, seven up on the first day, to take third spot on 185.

However, Rist's 185 did not improve his 400 target percentage which stayed on 94.25%, sixth overall in the Australia wide eliminations. Styles gained one percent to finish on 93.25% and Stewart Browning made a big jump to end with 92%. John Murphy put in another work man like performance scoring 183 on the day to also average 92% whilst Robbie Elmer fell into a hole breaking only 173 to maintain his 91.25% average.

Tasmania can be proud to have five competitors averaging over 90% in this elimination series, and of course there's always the Marshall brothers, Graham Appleby and Jack Blake in reserve. If only we had a State Coaching Director.....!

After the presentations, the video was again brought into action, this time showing the competitors in action. Peter Quire was able to show clearly obvious mistakes of some competitors and also point out some good techniques. The video-camera is an invaluable tool in coaching and certainly the National Association should have a unit for the Coaching Director. There is an old Chinese proverb "A picture is worth a thousand words" — how true!

The week-end was a total success and T.A.S.A. and its I.S.U. Sub-Committee is very grateful to Peter Quire for his help and advice. The National Coaching scene is in good hands, and with Peter's help coaching will start again in Tasmania.

Election Result Commentary

It is to be hoped that the 430,000 licenced shooters of Victoria do not have cause to regret their failure in many cases to register their protest against the Labor Party policy on firearm registration.

The Anti-Gun group has already cost shooters in excess of \$65,000 in **legal fees** in a fight to save **one** shooting ground at Lysterfield.

Although that outcome was to a degree a victory, it was very costly and can only be classed as hollow victory.

Labor has already stated it has a 'MANDATE' from the people of Victoria to implement its platform policies and included are —

Registration of all firearms and the limitation of number of firearms a shooter may own.

You were made aware that registration of firearms in Great Britain originally required an annual charge of half-a-crown and it is now twenty five pounds plus an additional twenty pounds for every firearm purchased from time of initial registration of firearms by owner.

Once registration of firearms becomes law, the charge can be escalated to cover administration costs (or provide revenue) and the police force in Great Britain claim the charges now being made are not in excess of administration costs for registration.

The unfortunate part is that registration does not affect the number of firearms in the hands of criminals and that was the "reason" given by the Labor Party for requiring gun registration

You were aware that strictly registered and controlled pistols which make-up only 3% of all firearms are used in 40% of all armed hold-ups.

Obviously, the "reason" is suspect.

From the out-come of the election, it would appear that the bulk of shooters have that universal Australian attitude of "she'll be right mate!" or do they intend to be law-breakers and not register their firearms.

If it is to be the latter, this will result in a pool of firearms for the criminal which can be stolen with little chance of ever being reported.

The fight that the Shooting Sports Council of Victoria put up to protect **your** civil rights was obviously not recognised, and it is hoped the shooters and firearm owners who represent in **excess** of 20% of all voting public do not have cause to regret their apathy.

Obviously there were other issues than your sport to be considered and you have registered your vote.

Maybe dedicated firearm owners and shocters will now be deprived of their favorite sport by legislation or cost or both.

Î cannot imagine dedicated football supporters allowing their sport to be gradually taken away by stealth - can you? It is now your problem.

MEDIA TO BE SHOOTING'S TARGET.

The Australian Shooting Association is planning to appoint media consultants to promote all aspects of the sport. The first steps were taken at the A.S.A. Council meeting late in February. The A.S.A. is blossoming into an effective organisation to represent both competetive and recreational shooters. A constitutional conference before the Council meeting produced a draft constitution acceptable to all Affiliates. The hard work and good will shown by the Delegates is most encouraging.

The Council meeting the following day decided to conduct its affairs according to the guide-lines of the new constitution, which will be ratified after legal advice is given. Most significantly the Field and Game Association were welcomed as a full Affiliate of the A.S.A., completing the representation

of the major shooting bodies.

During the course of the meeting standing committees were created in the areas of Legislation, Finance and Promotion and Public Relations. For too long shooting has been the "secret sport". The achievements of shooters are only known to their fellow competitors. Under the Chairmanship of Dr. Paul Cains (ACTA), a position paper has been drawn up for discussion with several media consultants. It is hoped that by seeking professional advice, shooting may take its rightful place in the media. It is proposed that effective communication channels will be set up at National and State level.

The shooting sports will make a significant contribution to Australia's medal tally at the Commonwealth Games and shooting must be ready to publicise these achievements.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

As one of the many trapshooters who shoot skeet only at Nationals or shoots where skeet is included in the High Gun, I write the following which I think could only benefit the Skeet Nationals if they were to be separated from the Trap. We all must agree that skeet got its big shot in the arm when it was included in the J. Newton Thomas High Gun.

If and when we do get our National Ground or as the system is today we run two weeks of Nationals, one of Skeet and one of Trap or any part thereof, we would not require any more skeet layouts than we already have at National Grounds.

This is a double barrel attack on our expenses. (1) We would only have to move our National staff to the one location, not to two different venues. (2) It is the working men and women who keep this sport alive, so if they wish to shoot both this must be the most sensible answer. I believe the sport would suffer if we were to adopt two different venues and shooters would find it very difficult and expensive to attend two venues, i.e. Brisbane - Trap, Melbourne - Skeet.





As a father with four other Shooters in the family, due to the inconsistencies of the Handicap System, A.C.T.A. will no doubt be four Shooters short next year. All being young Shooters, it has got to the stage where keenness is no longer a factor in the art of Clay Busting.

Trophies are now non-existent as they cannot compete with the present Handicap System, i.e. A grade 14 metre Shooters when these four Shooters are still C Grade 14 metre Shooters. One son in particular has been shooting for 3 years winning only 1 Trophy, which put him back from 11 to 12 metres. Another son not having won a Trophy since the new system came in, has,like many others, had a gut full.

I feel that if the present Handicap System is to continue, yearly A.C.T.A. Fees will have to rise in compensation for Shooters we will lose from the sport.

Mr Bob Ridler's letter stated the facts as most Shooters see them and I would urge the A.C.T.A. Rules Committee to act and act quickly before the Sport becomes strictly professional, as only top Shooters will be able to participate.

We need new Shooters into the sport to carry on as the older Members drop out. Under the present system young Shooters participate for maybe six months or so and in lots of cases give the game away as everyone likes to win once in a while. If no encouragement is given to new participants in this regard, they will find some other sport without the high cost involved in Clay Busting.



THE SCIENCE OF FIRING A SHOT GUN AT MOVING TARGETS

Barney Rooke, N.S.W. Director of Coaching

Whether we are shooting at fast flying ducks or trying for a 25 straight at trap or skeet, the top shooter is relying heavily upon **natural** sighting equipment and that is his eyes. In shooting, your eyes are the windows to your brain. They are the sensors that set the target image in perspective, relative to speed, distance and angle of flight, all of which is conveyed to your brain to cause the mental and physical reflex functions that lead to firing.

The actual sequence of shooting involves five functions:

(1) Locating and/or target recognition.

(2) Estimating the angle of target departure.

(3) Estimating the apparent speed of flight.

(4) The shooters response to mental signals relayed by the eyes to the brain.

(5) The firing of the gun, a complicated procedure involving the movement of the body before and after firing, and finishing with a proper follow through.

It should be obvious that the above procedures take place in a very short time by the excellent natural reflex action that your body is capable of producing the ability to quickly locate and shoot a fast moving target.

Done properly, everything takes place in the space of two seconds or less.

Let me state at this time that if the shooter actually understands what is involved with helping his eyes and brain to work properly, if you understand the methods used by the champion shots to blend learned physical skills with natural reflex ability, and if he or she understands the true nature of pointing a firearm, you will become a better shot.

Now to understand your eyes. One basic assumption is required at this point. We must always assume that the gun is always used and fired from the same shoulder as your master eye. In shooting with both eyes open, one eye will normally take over the actual alignment and co-ordination of the aiming weapon. This eye is the master eye, proper aiming begins with excellent natural or corrected vision.

Binocular and Monocular Vision.

Your eyes serve in two particular functions, binocular and monocular viewing. When we line up one object for sighting on another, or when we place one object in relationship to another using **one** eye, we are sighting with monocular vision. Imagine you are closing one eye and sighting through a rifle scope. Now, in binocular vision you would be using both eyes, not just one.

Examples of mechanical sporting devices that require two eyes are range finders and binoculars.

With both eyes open, you are best equipped for sensing and estimating apparent speed and direction. In short, your eyes serve as range and direction finders for your brain. The human eye is particularly unique. It can serve in either a monocular or binocular function whenever you wish. This is why top shooters constantly advocate using both eyes for shooting. There is nothing available anywhere that can help you better than your own two eyes. Today, many of our leading champions at bench, silhouette and pistol shooting use both eyes open. They have learned that using your natural equipment to its best advantage leads to better scores.

Sighting and Focus.

If you've used a camera you would realise that when the lens is set for normal distance viewing, the very close objects get fuzzy and are not outlined clearly. The same applies to your eyes They will not give sharp vision very close and at a distance at the same time. Try this by holding up your finger at arms length, now focus your eyes at 20 yards and you will notice that the tip of your finger is not clearly in focus, but the distance will be.

Here's the trick to what to do with your shotgun to allow your eyes to do their best work in pointing. Move all the sighting apparatus that is clear and sharply defined into your sighting area and ignore everything else that is out of focus or fuzzy. For this reason, the top shooters do not use the centre bead of their shotguns for sighting at a target. Instead, they ignore the middle sight and shoot off the tip of the gun exclusively. In short, their own eyes serve as the rear sight and the tip of the gun becomes the front sight.

Doing this brings your natural binocular vision into play. With both eyes open and ignoring the centre bead, the left eye of right hand shooter sees under the barrel even though both eyes are viewing over the barrel. It's no trick, it's just that this eye is a true work horse in shooting, even though it's not the master eye. Also, the left eye has no barrel blocking its vision and the eye has a clear view for estimating critical speed, angle of departure, and most importantly, initial target viewing.

Conversely, if you use the middle bead of your shotgun for anything other than initial alignment or gun canting, you are defeating the easy method of learning to point a shotgun. When you drop your vision when sighting at a moving target to the centre bead, you cause the barrel to turn solid for the master eye. This can easily see the centre bead true, but now with a solid, it can miss viewing the target leaving the trap from the right side. Most important, if vision is sharp up close, it can't be sharp at target distance. Also, the left eye becomes confused by its nature of being located to the left of the rib of the shotgun. It is incapable of ever doing a good job of seeing the centre bead. The result is that the right eye looks at the centre bead and the left eye somewhere else and neither are fully concentrating on the moving target. You must have both eyes on the moving target at all times to correctly shoot using both eyes.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE 1982 ANNUAL MEETING



During the many years of my involvement in the administration of clay target shooting, from club to Executive level, I never anticipated I would achieve the honour of becoming Meeting of this Association.

My Report is being presented with the intention of informing members of the major decisions and actions made

informing members of the major decisions and actions made by your Executive since my election to Presidency on April 25, 1981.

The 1981 Annual General Meeting, at which I was Acting President, proved to me, by the attitude and questions asked by delegates present, that there was discontent with the administration of the Association in general.

The most significant of these was the fact that a \$10 fee increase, recommended by your Executive, was defeated. Whether the increase was justified or not, it proved we must at all times administer the affairs of the Association in a most professional way, and to the satisfaction of the majority of the professional way, and to the satisfaction of the majority of the members we represent.

I feel, up to the time of preparing this report, in areas that were of grave concern, changes have been instigated. Most importantly, the Melbourne based firm of Detoitte, Haskins and Sells was engaged by us to investigate and report on the Association's computer operation and costs.

Their report and recommendations of operation were accepted by your Executive and are now being implemented in an attempt to reduce excessive costs that had been proven within this area.

within this area.

You will be pleased to know their services have also been retained as independent advisers to the Association for future development of our computer processing service.

Our accounting system, which also had come in for criticism, has been restructured, and the services of independent outside accountants obtained to assist and advise on our administration procedure.

The long term benefits from this will be fully evident by end

Moving on to other sectors of our sport, the formation of State and National Training Squads in the Olympic Disci-plines has increased the interest of many shooters, State Associations and administrators alike within this discipline, so much so, we witnessed a restructure of the International Sub-Committee.

It now carries representation from a number of States, with all States being given equal opportunity to be involved.

Gaining the services of National Training Squad Manager/

Coach, Peter Quire from South Australia, as our full time

Coach, Peter Quire from South Australia, as our full time National Coaching Director, will prove to be of immense benefit to further develop the general growth of our sport. Hereto, I must congratulate Jim Ellis from A.C.T. on attaining a Silver Medal at the 1981 World Championships in Argentina. Also Terry Rumbel from Taree-Wingham in NSW for his sixth placing in the same championships. Because of their performances at world class level, both of these shooters were recipients of Federal Government training grants in 1981 and again in 1982. Let us hope all of this will assist in bringing Gold medals to Australia in the shot gun sports at the 1982 Commonwealth Games in Brisbane.

Games in Brisbane.

National Ground

To me, this has been a somewhat disappointing project since the idea was first envisaged in 1979.

since the idea was first envisaged in 1979.

Several promising possibilities have been investigated with no firm decision yet being made. It could well be that by the time this report is being read, there may be further information available on a National ground. The reason being, your Executive, at the October 31/November 1, 1981, Executive meeting, recommended a feasibility study to be instigated into National grounds, using the Dubbo site for the collection of the necessary data. Let us hope from this feasibility study, definite decisions on a National ground will be made in 1982.

A.C.T.A. Referees Association

State Associations have been requested to assist in

State Associations have been requested to assist in forming a seven man A.C.T.A. Referees Association. These seven men forming our new A.C.T.A. Referees Association would meet at the 1982 National Championships and after that, at regular intervals subject to budgetry considerations.
They will be responsible for all facets of refereeing, rules

changes, appointment of Rules Supervisors, Referees Examiners, organising referee instruction days at State and

Zone level, and arranging speakers for such days.

This Committee will be responsible for the training and general up-grading of our Referees.

Legislation Levy

In my travels around the clubs, and discussions with a great number of shooters throughout Australia, I am pleased with the way the Legislation Levy has been accepted and

supported.

We need to stand united and fight against any gun laws and legislation that might effect us, as responsible firearms users, and/or, our civil rights as law-abiding citizens. It is essential funds be readily available from our Association for use by States to combat any unrealistic legislation. Do not be defuded into thinking changes in gun control in one State will not necessarily affect you in your State. Gun legislation is a National problem.

National problem.

During the course of this meeting, the 1981 balance sheet and financial affairs of your Association will be submitted for your approval. An attempt has been made to present this to you, giving details of income and expenditure so that it can be easily understood by Mr Average Shooter. Normal accountancy practice has been used in compiling costs and detailing them respectively. All registered shooters and delegates throughout Australia would have had the opportunity to study the financial statement, as it has been published in the Shooting News for perusal, prior to this meeting. This is a first for your Association which no doubt will be general practice in the future.

The 1983 registration fee increase is another agenda item.

The 1983 registration fee increase is another agenda item in which you will be asked to give support.

Again, every attempt has been made to inform and communicate with members, by publishing the suggested increase in Clay Target Shooting News for members perusal and deliberation, long before this meeting. It can also be noted the services of independent accountants have been engaged to assist in collating our anticipated administration and development costs for the next three years.

1981 National Championships

The unexpected high shooter attendance created problems for the organisers in conducting and administrating the Championships. Notwithstanding all this, our gratitude must be extended to the Committee and members of Melbourne Gun Club for the way in which they presented their facilities for the running of the tournament. All this assisted in creating an excellent overall profit, which has been well covered in the administration report.

In closing, I extend my personal thanks to my Exeuctive colleagues for their assistance and dedication to the development and progress of our sport in general throughout Australia during 1981.

ANNUAL REPORT 1981

The year under review has been one of marked contrasts,

which has seen some low and high points.

The tragic death of National President, Ron Porter in March, followed by that of Newton Thomas in May, had a marked effect on the whole of the sport for some months afterwards. These two men had made an enormous contribution to the Association over the years, their knowledge and enthusiasm will be missed.

Laurie Connors was elected President of the Association at the April meeting of the Executive Committee. He came to the top post with a deal of experience after twice being Acting President of the Association.

The coaching arm of the Association has suffered during 1981 due to the lack of a National Coaching Director. Some of the momentum created had run down, but happily this has been put right by the appointment of Peter Quire as National Coaching Director from January 1, 1982.

Financially, 1981 has been satisfactory in that the budgeted surplus was exceeded, largely due to the success of the National Championships. The Management and Executive Committees kept a close watch on expenditure throughout the period to ensure that tight budgetary controls were maintained.

With registration fees remaining the same for 1982 following the decision of the 1981 Annual Meeting not to grant an increase, even tighter housekeeping will have to operate, to maintain current reserves.

Traditionally this report addresses itself to certain specific areas of activity, this year does not differ.

1. INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

Australia featured in eight International competitions during 1981.

1.1 Benito Juarez Tournament — Mexico

Jim Ellis, Terry Rumbel and Ian Hale were members of an Australian Shooting Association team to compete in this tournament in March.

This trip was arranged by the Federal Government to compensate shooters who had withdrawn from the Moscow Olympic Team in 1980. The Benito Juarez Tournament ranks third in the World behind the Olympic Games and World Championships.

Jim Ellis of the A.C.T. was successful in the Olympic Trap event winning the gold medal from Ernie Neel of U.S.A. in a shoot-off. Terry Rumbel shot very well to finish in sixth place, while Ian Hale finished tenth in I.S.U. Skeet.

1.2 Mackintosh International Teams Match

Australia was again successful in this postal match with a score of 7342-7500. The eighth consecutive win for Australia.

1.3 Glenn Cup

This match for D.T.L. teams from Australia and New Zealand was won by New Zealand by one target.

Representing Australia were: Benny Scotta (Victoria), Dick Piotrowski (NSW), Peter Lorman (NT), John Maxwell (NSW), Richard Dean (Qld), and Barry Kable (NSW).

1.4 Grand American Tournament

An Australian team was selected during the Nationals to compete in this the world's largest D.T.L. tournament. The five man team comprised Trevor Reschke (S.A.), Graham Willett (Vic.), John Maxwell (N.S.W.), Peter Lorman (N.T.) and Greg Woodbine (Q'ld). This team was known as the Air New Zealand Trap Team, and the Associations Executive Committee would like to thank Air New Zealand for their considerable assistance in making this project possible.

1.5 International Trap Teams Match

This was conducted during the Australian Trap and Skeet Championships. Competing Nations were USA, New Zealand and Australia. Australia was successful with a score of 244-250.

1.6 International Skeet Teams Match

This too was conducted during the Nationals and resulted in Australia being too strong for New Zealand. Competing for Australia were Bill Attwood, John Summers, Adrian Cousens, Steve Balough and Ken Lowry.

1.7 New Zealand South Island Championships

An Air New Zealand Trap Team competed for the Air New Zealand Trophy at these Championships held at Christ-church Gun Club.

Australia was represented by Tim Catling (WA), Adrian O'Connell (Vic), Garry Bollen (SA), Keith Woods (Tas) and lan Sleigh (Qld). New Zealand were victors by three points. The Executive Committee again expresses its appreciation for the assistance received from Air New Zealand to make this event possible.

1.8 World Moving Target Championships

The 1981 World titles were contested at Tucuman, Argentina. Jim Ellis and Terry Rumbel were assisted by the Federal Government and the Association to compete in these Championships. In the best ever performance by an Australian in World Championships, Jim Ellis won the silver medal in Olympic Trap. Terry Rumbel finished in sixth place, just three targets behind Ellis. A wonderful performance, two Australians in the top six of the World. Alex Crikis went to these Championships on a private basis and finished 44th in I.S.U. Skeet.

A very busy year internationally, topped off with fine performances in World Championships.

2. NATIONAL COMPETITION

The biggest Australian Trap and Skeet Championships ever held were conducted at Melbourne Gun Club in April. The usual contingents from U.S.A. and New Zealand made the journey to compete. More than 1000 individual shooters took part, some problems were experienced due largely to the enormity of the tournament. The Victorian Clay Target Association is to be commended for the job done in arranging these championships. The Executive Committee extends gratitude to trophy donors for their strong support.

Melbourne Gun Club was also the venue for the National Olympic Discipline Championships in September. This tournament too attracted record entries.

The Champion of Champions was Ken Lowry, Victoria, and the winner of the 1981 Grand Australian Handicap was Ralph Dellar of Victoria.

3. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Mr Ray Mason (Tasmania) resigned during the year. His place was taken by Mr Fred O'Brien.

Mr Len Bird and Mr Arch Rowe (NSW) retired at the April meeting of the Executive, replacing them were Mr Jim Scott and Mr Robert Parker. Mr Rowe was awarded an Honorary Life Registration for his services to the Executive Committee. This same honour was bestowed upon former National President and member of the Executive for nine years, Mr Ern Hawkins. Mr Robin Bailey (WA) retired in April and was replaced by Mr Daryl Wiese. Mr Kevin Bowring (NT) resigned in April.

The Executive committee met twice during 1981, during the National Championships in Melbourne, and at the end of October in Sydney. All members of the executive are to be commended for their untiring efforts on behalf of all registered shooters, to develop the sport.

4. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Grants totalling \$15,800 were received from the Sport Development Program during the year under review.

- (a) Administration Grant \$3000.
- (b) National Coaching Director appointment costs \$1800
- (c) Coaching Projects \$6000
- (d) Overseas Team Travel \$5000

Management thanks the Minister responsible for Sport, the Hon. Ian Wilson, and the Sport and Recreation Division Officers in Canberra for their considerable assistance during the year.

5. NATIONAL COACHING COUNCIL

This Council, which is made up of State Directors of Coaching, met in Melbourne in September. At this meeting, it was agreed to seek Accreditation at Level 2 of the Australian Coaching Council Accreditation Scheme. Work is now proceeding towards this aim. As mentioned previously, coaching did suffer somewhat during 1981 due to the lack of a National Director.

6. ADMINISTRATION

A complete review of the Association's data processing services was undertaken during the year. It was found that processing costs were too high in relation to the level of service received. The Consultants Deloitte, Haskins and Sells, have made recommendations that will be implemented after the bulk of 1982 registrations have been processed.

Trading has continued to make a worthwhile contribution to the Association's income during the year.

Management would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr M. T. Hastie of the Finance Sub-Committee for his advice and help with investment of Association funds.

7. MEMBERSHIP

Cost pressures continued to affect clay target shooting during 1981. However, despite increases in the price of shotshells, re-loading components, travel and accommodation, membership was slightly ahead of 1980.

The major increase was again in second family registrations, highlighting the family involvement in the sport.

The number of clubs affiliated during 1981 was 282. New clubs welcomed during the year were: Walcha, Norfolk Island, Mandurama District, Orana, Blue Waters, Bundella and Condobolin Lions, all from New South Wales and Springsure, Goondiwindi and Mungungo Social from Queensland.

8. STATE ASSOCIATIONS

Per capita grants to the value of \$9946 were returned to State Associations during 1981.

Most states are receiving assistance from Government to fund various projects. The Northern Territory Clay Target Association has been particularly successful in obtaining funding assistance for the development of the new complex in Darwin.

9. NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD

The first National Training Squad in the Olympic Disciplines was selected during 1981. Under Manager/Coach Peter Quire of South Australia, the Squad has been hampered somewhat by lack of funds.

The Squad has been training to a program laid down by Peter Quire, who is monitoring reports closely.

10. LEGISLATION

So seriously do the Executive Committee regard legislation matters, that at the Sydney meeting in October, it was decided to levy adult registered shooters \$5, to establish a Legislation Fighting Fund. The money collected would be invested at 24 hour call and would be available to combat unfair actions by any strata of Government or other body towards our registered shooters, and their clubs, in pursuit of the sport of clay target shooting.

A grant of \$1000 was made to the Victorian Field and Game Association to help in their fight to remain at the Lysterfield complex.

The Victorian A.L.P. proposed policy on firearms control is restrictive in parts to the point of being extreme. Shooters in some States feel that this is not a National problem, however, the Police Federation and the Bank Officer's Association are speaking with one voice, and a National voice, and are advocating that all States have similar legislation. 1982 is sure to be a year of much concern in this area.

11. PROMOTION

National President, Laurie Connors, has continued the tradition of extensive travel to most parts of Australia to ensure that Association policy is pomoted to as many clubs and shooters as possible. He has visited most States since coming to the Association's top office.

12. AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

Progress was made during 1981 towards the re-structure of the A.S.A. Graham Fell was appointed Executive Director and commenced duties in December. A new constitution is being prepared, which if adopted, will make the A.S.A. truly representative of all the shooting sports in Australia. The Association is represented on the A.S.A. Council by Mr R. F. Buchan (Vic) and Dr Paul Cains (Tas).

13. NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

Selection of a site suitable for use as a National shooting ground still eludes us. Discussions took place with the Shire Council at Port Macquarie during the year, investigations showed that the land available was not suitable. The Executive Committee decided at the October meeting that a feasibility study should be initiated into National grounds, using the Dubbo site for the collection of the necessary data, with reference to the study made by the A.C.T. Shooting Association. This study will be carried out in 1982, and hopefully a decision made.

The Principal activities of the Association are:
To promote, develop and encourage the sport of clay target shooting.

The surplus for the year ended 31st December, 1981, was \$20 623. No provision for income tax was necessary.

An amount of \$8540 was transferred during the year to General Travel Fund Reserve and \$1483 was transferred from this reserve for funding participation in the 1981 World Championships. An amount of \$1517 was transferred from I.S.U. Travel Fund Reserve for funding participation in the 1981 World Championships.

With these exceptions and apart from normal amounts set aside for depreciation, no other material transfers to or from reserves or provisions have been made during the financial year.

No shares or debentures were issued by the Association during the financial year.

The Memorandum of Association of the Association forbids the payment of a dividend to members.

The Executive Committee took reasonable steps before the Statement of Income and Expenditure and Statement of Assets and Liabilities were made out to ascertain what action had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provision for doubtful debts, and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts.

At the date of this report the Executive Committee is not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debts or the amount of provision for doubtful debts inadequate to any substantial extent.

The Executive Committee took reasonable steps before the Statement of Income and Expenditure and the Statement of Assets and Liabilities were made out to ascertain that the current assets of the Association other than debtors were shown in the accounting records of the Association at a value equal to or below the value that would be expected to be realised in the ordinary course of business.

At the date of this report the Executive Committee is not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributable to the current assets in the accounts misleading.

No charge on the assets of the Association has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report to secure the liabilities of any other person.

No contingent liability of the Association has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report.

No contingent or other liability of the Association has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the linancial year which in the opinion of the Executive Committee will or may substantially affect the ability of the Association to meet its obligations as and when they fall due.

At the date of this report the Executive Committee is not aware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt with in the report or accounts which would render any amount stated in the accounts misleading.

The results of the Association's operations during the financial year were not in the opinion of the Executive Committee substantially affected by any items, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1981

NOTE 1. Statement of Accounting Policies

- (i) The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement have been prepared in accordance with the Historical Cost Convention.
- (ii) Fixed Assets

Depreciation, except on computer software, is based on the diminishing value method and the rates are adjusted so as to write off the asset over its estimated useful life. Depreciation on computer software is based on a straight line basis so as to write off the asset over its estimated useful life.

NOTE 2. Donations

In 1978 the Association first received travel grants from its travel agent. A separate bank account titled A.C.T.A. Travel Grant Account was opened and grants when received were credited to this account.

Where applicable grants were, (a) refunded to members, (b) used for the benefit of A.C.T.A either by payment of expenses or by transfer to A.C.T.A. General Account as donations. Not all of the operations of this bank account were reflected in the Association's Annual Accounts in prior years. This bank account was closed on 3rd September, 1981, the balance being credited to the Association's General Bank Account.

An amount of \$1,590, being travel grants received, is included as donations this year. This income relates to prior years.



Only when the eyes define the target sharply can they both together clearly estimate range, angle of departure and speed. If you can understand all this, you're on your way to better scores.

All this means that the human eyes are intended to work together. They've learned that closing one eye when aiming lowers the efficiency of the other. The lesson here is that both beginners and experienced hunters and competition shooters should strive to shoot with both eyes open at all times. There are of course normal exceptions to this and that is people with defective vision.

I make the claim now that I can improve your scores by special practice methods of dry firing, this will improve the co-ordination between your eyes and your brain and muscles. Our aim is to teach the eyes to point with the tip of the gun and give you confidence in your ability to sight quickly and accurately via an instinctive method of only watching the moving target.

To make this method work to the best advantage, the gun should mount easily for you. If it fits correctly, strive for a balance of motion carrying the stock to your cheek, not your cheek to the stock. Sight over the tip at some moving object. The trick is not to look at the tip of the gun, just let its image float into your field of sight. Keep the tip of the gun on the beak of a flying bird or try to follow a butterfly if moving clay targets are unavailable. Your goal is to simply concentrate on the target 100% with the tip of the gun. This is the same concentration you should use to pick up a moving clay target, it's relaxed concentration with attentive binocular viewing. It's important to keep the eyes relaxed. Tight eyeballs lead to jerky motion and body tension, and your aim is to be smooth as well as fast. Proper sighting involves a minimum of motion, keeping it simple for your eye-brain computer.

Remember, do not sight along the full length of the barrel or look directly at the bead or muzzle, but focus both eyes on the target. You will notice immediately that you will be a faster and instinctive shooter.

A tip for those shooters that have to wear prescripton glasses. Make sure that the frames come high enough to look out of the centre of the prescription lens. People that make special shooting glasses will build the prescription a little higher than centre.



HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1982

As I have been appointed Handicapper for the Brisbane 1982 Nationals, I thought it necessary to advise you of the following which will be strictly enforced.

- ALL current 1982 Handicap Cards regardless of your Grade, along with your 1981 Card will be required by me for checking before you nominate.
- All Handicap Cards will have to be stamped by me before Nominations will be accepted.
- NO nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is unavailable unless your Grade, Handicap Trap and Skeet is confirmed by your Club Secretary on a Statutory Declaration Form.
- If a Statutory Declaration Form is signed you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the ACTA until your handicap and grade is verified by the Executive Committee.
- Unless you are a new shooter or haven't shot for a long period and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot) your handicap will be A Grade 0 Skeet and 25 Metres. (This is your responsibility. Make sure your Club Secretaries fill in your cards correctly).
- Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable.
- If an error is made on your card have your Club Secretaries neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly and sign it.
- Any obvious low score entered on Handicap Cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. (Rule 106).
- Please watch the Handicap Board. If your name appears on the board, report to me.
- 10. If you happen to be down graded and you don't wish to be, please advise.


