The International Sub-Committee and Management Committee met at the National office over the Anzac week-end. Long agendas were worked through and many decisions made

Because of pressing personal matters, Dr. Paul Cains has withdrawn from the position as Manager of the D.T.L. team to compete in the U.K. in July. Paul has done a tremendous amount of work in preparation for this visit and was commended by both Committees for the job done.

It was decided that the 1983 Olympic Discipline National and Commonwealth Championships will be held in Melbourne over the period April 23 to 28.

Final eliminations for the Commonwealth Games and World Championship teams will be conducted in Brisbane over 400 targets, in June. Targets for these eliminations have been generously donated by Mr Serge Zuffo of Olimpyc Targets. Another fine example of the help being given to the National Training Squad in preparation for the Commonwealth Games.

The Management Committee made some decisions regarding the National Ground Feasibility Study, work will commence soon to gather the necessary data. A recommendation will go forward to the full Executive of the Association to support in principle the A.C.T.A. Shooting Association and their proposal for the shooting complex in Canberra.



1982 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Fine Double to Ellis Hale makes amends in Commonwealth Skeet Title

The 1982 National and Commonwealth Olympic Discipline Championships were conducted at Brisbane Gun Club over the Easter period.

The National Championships were used by the Commonwealth Games Foundation as a "dress rehersal" to test officials

and equipment.

Sixty six shooters were squaded on Easter Saturday to commence battle for the '82 National Olympic Trap Championship. First round possibles came from Connolly, Rumbel, Budd and Flower. At the end of 75 targets, World silver medallist Jim Ellis had hit the front on 73-75, Seymour and Lowry were one target behind, with Long, G. Stevens and Flower on 71.

A second 73 on day two put Jim Ellis two in front of Greg Long with Rumbel and Collinson three targets further back on 141. Porter, Lowry and Collins were tied together on 140.

The final 50 targets saw Jim Ellis drop 2 to win the gold medal with 194/200 Greg Long took the silver 2 targets behind Ellis on 192, and John Porter shot 49/50 on the last day to win the bronze medal with a final tally of 189. These were good scores as intermittent showers throughout the three days made conditions difficult.

The equipment worked well in both trenches, after slight modification by Public Works Department officers.

A field of 23 faced the starter in the National I.S.U. Skeet Championship.

John Woolley of New Zealand ran the first day clean to lead by one target from Alex Crikis, with Ian Hale one further back

on 73. Cameron was on 72, Summers 71, and Boyd, the 1981 title holder on 70.

Ian Hale shot them all in the second 75 to lead Woolley by one with Crikis in third place on 146. Boyd improved his position with a brilliant 75 to add to his first day's 70, while Summers again had trouble carding 71.

Day three, the final 50 targets, Woolley again shot brilliantly breaking them all to card 197/200. Hale dropped two and had to settle for the silver medal, one target behind on 196, with Alex Crikis taking the bronze with a score of 194.



A two day training camp for the National Squad was held after these Championships when a lot of work was done with a Sports Psychologist from the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra.

The Commonwealth Championships were conducted over the two days April 15 and 16, 100 targets per day. Fields were smaller for these titles as many shooters had returned home to start work after the Easter break.

At the end of day one, the Olympic Trap shooters had performed very well, ten of the 35 shooters scoring 90 or better

Jim Ellis led with 97 by one target from John Maxwell with Terry Rumbel in third place on 95. On 93 were Ken Stevens, Garry McDonald, Stan Collins and Dennis Lymn. Evergreen Bill Stevens had shot consistently for 92, one target ahead of John Byrnes of South Australia. John Porter had started quietly with 90 and was tied with Norm Simms from A.C.T.

Day two dawned fine and clear, the improvement in the weather saw scores improve too, with 13 scores of 90 or better.

Jim Ellis was his usual quick and efficient self, shooting an immaculate 98 to take the gold medal on 195. John Maxwell, who was disappointed in the National Championship, returned to peak form with an excellent 98 to take the silver medal at 194. Terry Rumbel was consistent with another 95 to win bronze on 190, after surviving a shoot-off with Stan Collins for third place. Stan had shot well throughout this Championship to record his 190. John Porter again came home very well to card 98 on the second day. As with the National Championship, his second hundred targets was top class.

Jim Ellis again demonstrated his class by winning both titles. His vast experience shows in the cool and efficient way he goes about his shooting.

Fifteen shooters lined up for the Commonwealth I.S.U. Skeet Championships. At the end of the first 100 targets, Ian Hale showed that he meant business with a brilliant 99, while Nelis, Madsen and Junior Craig Meuleman were tied together



Day 2 saw Hale go further ahead to street the field, winning the gold medal by 8 targets with a score of 195. Alex Crikis had to shoot-off for the silver medal with Craig Meuleman, both carding 187. This was a fine performance from the 16 year old Junior from Melbourne, who obviously has a bright future.





MILDURA GUN CLUB EASTER CARNIVAL

Mildura Gun Club member Larry Dimasi set a new Australian record at the Club's Easter shoot.

Dimasi shot 536 straight, to easily add an extra 65 to the previous National record of 471 set last February at Wagga by

Jon Whittaker, Deniliquin.

Larry's tally consisted of 16 targets in the Olimpyc Target Double Barrel Championship, followed this with 128 in the night Championship, which he won and then 392 consecutive targets in the Eley Classic the next day. Dimasi was beaten in the Eley Classic by his long time shooting mate and Mildura Gun Club member and top shot Jim Finis, who claimed 393/393 to be Overall Classic winner and recipient of a house-hold deep freeze valued at \$300 for his wife Cherie and a ticket for himself to attend the 1982 Brisbane Nationals.

A total of 115 shooters attended the four day tournament, with visitors being from most major shooting centres in Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and Tasmania.

Amongst the visitors list and guests of the club, were members of the A.C.T.A. office staff in Mrs. Pam Jacobsen, her husband Bill and family, Carole De Groot and Leanne Day.

A special event "The Office Staff Championship" was added to the program to give the girls an opportunity to test their skills and be initiated into our sport of clay shooting. Well known shooter and regular visitor to Mildura's Easter Shoot, Dudley Edgerton from Frankston/Australia elected himself to the position of Coach and mentor to the Girls.

He had many offers of assistance from several shooters, but rejected all politely. I am unable to publish the winner as Dudley has not furnished us with the results.



LEGISLATION OFFICER'S REPORT

By now all of us are fully aware that the Labor Party forms the Government in Victoria, a fact that most of us within the legislation field regret very much.

Our battles will begin when this new Government attempts to introduce their proposed restrictive firearms legislation. Already the Australian Clay Target Association has contributed some \$6,000 towards a campaign to combat the Labor Party law makers and this money has come from the A.C.T.A. Legislation Fighting Fund.

The Victorian Shooting Sports Council is now monitoring every move made by the Victorian Government to enable us to

move quickly when the time arrives.

From discussions with other Legislation Officers throughout the Australian shooting movement, I have gleaned the sad state of affairs within N.S.W. We now know for sure that the N.S.W. Government is also keeping careful watch on the success of their Victorian counterparts and is preparing to introduce similar restrictions if the Victorians are successful. The time, therefore, is fast approaching where we are going to have to stand up and be counted.

At this juncture, I would like to offer my thanks to all the clay target shooters throughout Australia who put their five dollars into the A.C.T.A. Legislation Fighting Fund without argument. Believe me, this fund is a definite step in the right direction in the field of shooter self-help.

A number of you would have read the article written in the

March 1982 issue of the Readers Digest, entitled "Needed: Stricter control of firearms — NOW". This article is a classic example of emotional, ill-researched and biased journalism.

The type of reporting which is, while absolutely ludicrous, damaging to honest law-abiding citizens.

The author of the politicial propaganda uses terms such a "litany of slaughter and mutilation" when referring to shooting accidents. A definite attempt has been made throughout the article to suggest that shooting accidents and crimes involving firearms have become the greatest scourge to society within our country. Nothing has been mentioned of the crimes committed with the assistance of a motor vehicle or of the accidents occurring with motor cars.

I strongly recommend that you read this article and thereby understand just what sort of opposition you are up against. Realise that some people, through their ignorance, prefer to take away your rights, thus enabling them to gain social recognition while improving income. After all, do not tell me that items are printed in the Readers Digest free of charge. I wonder just how much the story I am talking about was worth.

Many shooters throughout N.S.W. at least, have already cancelled their subscription or refused to buy further copies of the magazine in protest, and many have written to the Readers Digest informing them of their objection. Personally I feel that there should be a retraction of the offending article.

Legislation matters are always controversial, the anti-gun movement is often secretive, therefore, if you have any information or enquiries, please don't keep them to yourself, let us know immediately.

To the end of March, \$34,660 had been collected for the Legislation fighting Fund. \$6,000 was given to the Shooting Sports Council of Victoria for the election campaign. The remainder is invested at 24 hour call with Alliance Holdings at. 15%.

Confederation of Australian SPORT NEWS

NATIONAL SPORTS PLAN

One of the most contentious issues confronting sports administrators at present is the high cost of air travel, both domestic and international.

In a country the size of Australia, use of air services by sportspeople is vital if all facets of the sport are to be developed.

Yet, such development is inhibited because the cost of utilising airline services has gone beyond the reach of many sporting bodies, especially those with limited financial resources — and just about all national associations fit into that category.

In recent **ABC Sport** radio programme, Confederation of Australian Sport Executive Director, Garry Daly, canvassed this issue and the following is a summary of his comments:

"In July, 1980 the Minister for Transport, Mr. Ralph Hunt, apparently at the request (some say insistence) of airline executives, issued a statement to the effect that the airlines should put their house in order and eliminate incidences of pricing erosion which had not been approved by his Department.

"Sport immediatley felt that repercussions of that statement as all travel privileges were removed. We thought then, and still do, that this was unfair and went beyond the intention of the Minister insomuch that arrangements hinging upon promotional or advertising benefits should remain, as they represented normal commercial deals struck with all areas of commerce and industry.

"That thinking was rejected and in a very short time, an estimated \$4 million was added to sports' domestic air bill.

"Re-enter the Minister! He decided, following requests from the Confederation and others, to offer some small relief and so he approved a group travel discount of 15% compared with the usual 10%. It made some difference but not a lot.

"Time passed and some of the sports stopped complaining but not the vast majority.

"Last December at their Annual General Meeting, delegates of national sporting bodies decided to enter into a co-operative purchasing arrangement whereby all the travel of participating bodies would be given to one airline in an endeavour to restore the travel privileges previously enjoyed.

"One of the effects leading to this action was the reduction of an estimated 26% in the level of travel being undertaken by the sporting bodies due to removal of privileges and increasing airfares.

"Twenty six percent reduction means less administrative capability, less sports coaching and educational exchanges and perhaps worst of all, less competition for our athletes.

"It also means \$10 million less revenue for the airlines, reduced revenue for accommodation chains, particularly at weekends when most sporting events occur and even greater sporting islolation for Western Australia and North Queensland, as sporting bodies hold meetings and competitions in centres which are the least costly to reach.

Midway through 1981 when the setting up of an Inquiry to deal with domestic airfares was being mooted, the Confederation held discussions with both airlines and concensus seemed to exist for four way discussions on matters affecting sportspeople and the airlines, to be held between representatives of these parties and the Deaprtment of Transport to reach some common ground.

"Unfortunately, one of the airlines is now making noises that seem to suggest the Confederation was represented by "deaf people" who picked up the wrong message.

"All this is a bit sad when you consider the effects on sport of the current airlines' policies, particularly in view of TAA's well publicised problems due to not enough tails on seats.

"We need to find some relief from the problems of reduced domestic travel and, so it seems, do the airlines. Our problem is that both domestic airlines need to agree on a course of action.

"The loss of over 25% of the sport travel potential seems to be a classic case of "cutting off your nose to spite your face" doesn't it?

"What do you think, sport?"

Because of the gravity of the situation, the Confederation presented a submission to the Independent Air Fares Committee (a Federal Government authority) in which the issue has been described in detail and a case put for special concessions for sporting organisations to be restored.

Furthermore, we have recommended that sporsorship agreements between sport and the airlines be restored to the status they held prior to that fateful day in July 1980.

Federal Budget time is again imminent and the Confederation is endeavouring to co-ordinate the 'sport lobby', to ensure that all Members of the Federal Parliament are aware of the financial needs of sport and the benefits which can flow to the community at large through the rapid development of sport.

It is not difficlut to develop an argument that states that the needs of Australia's six million registered sports participants are being inadequately catered for through the Government allocation known as the Sports Development Program. This is the category which covers such vital activities as international competition, appointment of Executive and Coaching Directors, research projects and improved administrative, coaching and communications techniques.

It is difficult to accept the situation established by the 1981/82 Budget allocation, which was set at the same level as that of the previous year — in other words, no adjustment even for inflation!

At a time when sport is making an increasing contribution to the health, fitness and morale of our nation, and is becoming more and more effective as an avenue through which greater international understanding and co-operation can be achieved, Governments must be encouraged to pay more heed to the sporting community's financial needs.

On the other hand, there is heavy responsibility on the shoulders of sport at large to ensure that its requests for assistance are based on fact rather than fiction. Also, sport needs to recognise that Australia is going through difficult economic circumstances, in which it is impossible for any Government to just pluck a big lump of money out of the air.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

Handicap shooting in the A.C.T.A. seems to be a dying event. Firstly we had a method of handicapping based on a trophy value which had no bearing on the shooters ability. We now have a system of percentages which is in no doubt the correct method but it is almost impossible to implement and is open to manipulation. It also inherited the misdemeanors of the previous system.

I would like to suggest a simple performance system that eliminates these two problems. Handicapping should take place when it is obvious that a shooter has mastered his current mark.

- A shooter shall be handicapped one metre if he shoots fifty targets straight from his handicap mark. A shooter shall be handicapped if he shoots one hundred targets straight from his handicap mark. All events, Double and Single Barrel to be counted.
- No shooter shall be handicapped more than two metres on one days shooting. Handicap movements shall occur at the end of each days shooting and only targets shot on that particular day shall have a bearing on handicapping. Previous days scores not carried on.
- 3. New shooters shall start on the handicap mark of eleven metres. Each year when registration takes place, all shooters who have not had a rearward movement in the previous twelve months shall be moved forward one metre, providing they are behind eleven metres. Compulsory . . . Secretaries shall notify the A.C.T.A. office of handicap movements occuring at their Gun Clubs so that a computer entry can identify those shooters not eligible for inward movement.

The basic components of this system are sound, the number of targets shot and limits on metreage movements could be set by popular opinion. But please keep it simple and effective.



SHOTGUNNER'S GUIDE

Monte Burch is the latest in a long line of authors who has written a manual of basics for budding shotgunners. His volume, written from the point of view of a skilled field hunter and professional gunsmith, is quite comprehensive.

In 162 pages, Burch takes the reader from a history of the smoothbore through to an excellent chapter on gun maintenance and care. The hardback book is very well indexed.

Chapters on choosing a shotgun and choosing a correct shotshell are very American orientated but the chapters on gun fitting and learning basic shotgun skills are very universal in their application and are of value in Australian conditions.

The two other chapters on hunting and competitive shooting have a lot of value as far as tips are concerned but again they are slanted towards the American scene. There is a very good section on American Skeet that would be of immense value to the young Australian gunner who was contemplating a go at this demanding sport.

Burch writes in a conversational style that is very easy to read. It is obvious that areas of competence, field shooting, maintenance and reloading are his forte.

For a first up book for a newcomer to the field of shotgunning it is highly recommended. It covers all the basic points required to make one a cometent gunner. For the experienced gunner the information is a little sketchy and can be found in more detail in other publications.







However, there is a fairly simple remedy in the hands of the Federal Government right at this moment. For each of the last four years, the Government has had a financial commitment to the Brisbane Commonwealth games of \$2.5 million. As this should not recur in the 1982/83 Budget, it seems logical that the \$2.5 million, since it is already earmarked for sport, should be re-directed into the Sport Development Program.

Such a move would certainly be reflected in greater development activity by national sporting associations, because their individual grants would become more realistic.

But that is not the end of the line!

Other areas of the Sport and Recreation category are also crying out for increased financial allocations. The Australia Games project and the Australian Institute of Sport are two initiatives that must be supported through realistic grants. The potential benefits to Australia from these developments are enormous and they must not be retarded by lack of Government funding.

The next month or two will be critical in terms of budget discussions, and sportspeople at all levels throughout Australia are urged to contact Members of Parliament with a view to convincing Govenment that the financial needs of sport are genuine and of wide importance to the community generally.





It appears that the efforts being made by the Dysart Gun Club to provide regular coaching for new shooters is paying dividends if the number of new faces is any indication. Recent shoots have shown a marked predominence in this area.

The program the club is promoting is spearheaded by Zone Coach Col 'Curly' Ennis, who introduced the newcomers to the sport via the A.C.T.A.'s audio visual presentation on the basics of gun fit and trap shooting. This was followed up by demonstration and practice on the lanes. Full emphasis is placed on safety and developing sound basics as well as developing confidence. This is especially important in ladies and junior shooters.

Club philosophy behind the program is that if the sport is to continue to grow, the newcomer must be encouraged and assisted as much as possible — it is the new shooter who will build the sport. As a further incentive, the Club Executive had introduced an incentive prize of a \$10 open order on a local sports store for shooting requisites. This prize is awarded to the most improved new shooter on the day. It is hoped that not only will this provide encouragement, but help to somewhat offset the high costs of getting into this sport.





THIRD A.C.T.A. COACH WINS COVETED STATE BADGE

by Kit Franceswilliams

On Sunday November eighth, Harry Brooksby Victorian Zone Coach travelled from Warrnambool to Heidelberg to take his final exams and gain official HUNTER SAFETY INSTRUCTOR accreditation, as laid down by the Steering Committee on Hunter Education & Safety under the auspices of the Ministry for Conservation, Fisheries & Wildlife division.

Together with seventeen successful candidates from other Shooting codes, Harry had completed the minimum one full year as an active Instructor in his own shooting code (ACTA) before he was eligible to be nominated for the initial S.C.H.E.S. Instructor Guidance Course and the subsequent probationary period, during which accreditation is only considered if candidate has made time to instruct, lecture and teach firearm safety to a minimum of one group of people per calendar month, for eighteen months... the candidate's record of activities in his Logbook Credential is verified at end of that time and if he has met the minimum criteria and survived the endurance-cum-dedication test, he is then invited to take a comprehensive written examination a component part in a seminar controlled by experts in Firearms Law, Firearms Safety, The Wild Life Act, Field First Aid, Instructing and Teaching, and Shooter Public Relations: if, he passes his examination — with only a four percent margin allowed he earns the right to wear, for one year, the coveted Hunter Safety Instructor badge which is approved by the Steering Committee, itself being made up of delegates from the Police Department, Education Department, Youth Sport and Recreation Dept., Ethnic Affairs, Fisheries and Wild Life Division, Shooting Sports Council, and all sections of the Shooting Fraternity. Only two other ACTA Coaches have earned the right to wear the coveted badge which identifies the elite' of the Firearms Safety Instructors: one is Victoria's State Coaching Director, George Biggs and the other Metro Club Coach Kit Franceswilliams.

Both these men are numbered among the eight current Instructor Examiners attached to the Steering Committee.

Early in 1980 some eighty-two would-be candidates underwent the Instructor Introductory Course to commence their probationary qualifying period, however, only twenty-six survived to make the grade; these twenty-six elite instructors having proved themselves and graduated are the only Firearm Safety Instructors officially recognized by the above mentioned Government Departments.

When you see a shooter wearing the Silver & Blue badge with the State Government emblem on one end and current accreditation shown by the figure 81 in a rosette, then you will know that the wearer is a man who can really be useful having a wealth of information, because as instructors go, he is one of the best of the elite'.

How many shooters have enough stamina and dedication to earn accreditation and win the right to wear the official State badge of a Hunter Safety Instructor?????

It seems to me to be a really first class challenge to anyone who thinks they have what it takes.....

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Great news from Tasmania, Robby Elmer has been appointed as State Coaching Director for Tasmania. Congratulations Robby and welcome to the Coaching Team. Robby will join George Biggs, Tim Catling, Barney Rooke, Bill Stevens and myself on the National Coaching Council. The coaches accreditation scheme can now go ahead in Tasmania under Robby's guidance.

The I.S.U. Nationals in Queensland finished a year filled with improving scores in Trench and Skeet. Our top shooters are constantly shooting world class scores, this is exciting and means that the future on the International scene is bright

for Australian clay shooters.

Our National squad will be competing in an elimination for the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane in June. The top two shooters in Trench and Skeet will represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games, and the top four will also be our representatives for the World Championships in Venezuela. All the squad members have maintained an equally high standard throughout the year, so may the best men win.

In top class sport of any kind, the use is made of Sports Psychologists who specialize in helping sportsmen to perform at an optimum level, whether they are in an International competition or just competing locally. Our sport of clay shooting requires a great deal of self-control and self motivation. Once we are on the track nobody else can pull the trigger. Our sport is one where performances are affected by stress, tension and lapses in concentration.

We have been lucky enough to obtain the services of Mr Jeffrey Bond, a qualified Sports Psychologist based in Canberra with the Institute of Sport. Mr Bond works with the Coach and is able to, by testing, define causes of stress and ways to control it in individual shooters. Mr Bond attended the two day coaching session held for the National Training Squad after the I.S.U. Nationals and will continue in an advisory capacity after the eliminations in Brisbane. Mr Bond had previously worked for various sports bodies and has been most impressed by the dedication of our shooters.

By the time this is printed, a Down the Line Team will have been chosen to represent Australia in an International competition against a representative Team from England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland. This Team will represent all clay target shooters in Australia and I am sure they will have our support and will bring home the Clay Target "Ashes" in their bags. Go get them boys.

Other basics like proper gun and eye alignment. Proper gun and target relationship. Correct sight picture of lead and follow through.

Correct stance and body balance.

I repeatedly pointed out that the new shooter, in order to learn, must be shown by practical performance and lecture discussion, how to go about hitting targets. It is the trained and experienced instructor who can do this.

Harry Brooksby, South West Zone Coach, using the overhead projector gave an excellent talk on the will to win and coping with tension and pressure in competition. Harry had prepared a number of transparencies for the occasion. Harry stressed the importance of:—


- 1. Physical fitness.
- 2. Shooting ability and training.
- 3. Mental control and discipline.

My parting shot, which is aimed at the experienced shooter, is keep your eye on the target in the following way:

Maximum concentration on seeing the target leaving the trap.

Bright and clear is a must — followed by an equally bright and clear sight picture of gun and target relationship at moment of trigger let off.
