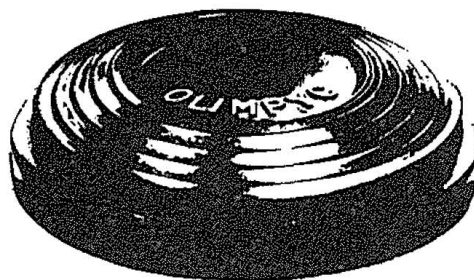

Wednesday May 12, Thursday May 13

Eight days of keen competition began with shooter number 463, Peter White from Cranbourne, Victoria, firing the first shot in the 13th Australian Skeet Championship.

The entry totalled 238, 171 fewer than in Melbourne in 1981. This trend continued right through the program with numbers being down on Melbourne. While no one expected the 1981 entries to be beaten, many expected more shooters to make the trip to Brisbane.

The Skeet Championship was conducted over 2 days. It soon became clear that few possibles would contest the shoot off. Some wags were heard to remark that the traps had not been adjusted since the National I.S.U. Skeet Championship held on this ground at Easter, so fast were the targets being thrown.

Only three shooters had the magic 50 on the board. Ray Melville from Tamworth, New South Wales, John Turton, Ashburton, New Zealand and Geoff Salmon, Winchester Sales Promotion and Advertising Manager from Melbourne.

John Turton was the first to go, letting the third target past him. Ray Melville and Geoff Salmon then traded target for target until Geoff dropped his 64th to leave Ray the 1982 Champion.

Maree Rooke of Wagga, New South Wales, started what was to be a marvellous series for her by taking out the Ladies and Junior divisions of the Skeet Championship.

The International Skeet Match between Australia and New Zealand concluded Thursday's program, resulting in a win for Australia by six targets. Representing Australia were Ray Melville, Geoff Salmon, Guy Beddington, John King and Kevin Perkins.

Friday May 14

Grand Australian Handicap day and 464 competitors faced the starter. For the first time, fifty targets were shot in one visit to the traps. Competitors certainly appreciated shooting the 50 in one visit, however, keen observers remarked that it did seem to detract from the atmosphere of the Nationals with fewer people remaining on the ground all day.

Claybusting on Brisbane's ground is never easy, the gully running along the line of traps makes the breeze, however slight, do funny things. It was clear from the outset that possibles would be scarce in all trap events.

At the end of the day, only two shooters had managed to break all fifty targets. Jan Schuster, 15 year old son of the Eurocut boss Dieter, from 14 metres, and a shooter who was to figure in the results for most of the week in Graham Willett, the Stationmaster from Sebastopol Club in Victoria. The shoot-off lasted just ten targets with Willett dropping his 60th, leaving the schoolboy to break his to win, which he did.

Celebrations went on far into the night in the Eurocut establishment as Jan admired the Remington 1100 Limited Edition shotgun he had won, together with his Eley silver badge, and MEC re-loader for top junior.

Julie Neve from Eastern Goldfields Club in W.A. was top lady from Maree Rooke, Wagga and Helen Wiese, Narrogin, W.A. in third place.

Adrian Hayes, Hawkesbury, N.S.W. won the Veterans Division, he too was to make regular appearances on the winners dais as the week progressed.

Friday concluded with the staging of the 2nd Comark Deauville Doubles Trophy Match for family teams. This event, sponsored by Commercial Marketing Co. of Sydney attracted 48 teams to compete for the excellent trophies which would be awarded down to fifth place. A change to the rules of competition this year allowed husband and wife teams to enter, as well as members of the one family a generation apart.

The match proved popular for both competitors and spectators, as it was concluded under lights.

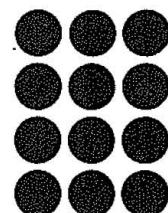
After the shoot-off, Alf and Harold James from Maryborough, Victoria, emerged as the winners, each taking home a Simson Skeet Gun for their efforts.

Our new cartridge Widespread was certainly well received and although no titles were actually won using them, all competitors who gave them a try commented on how smoothly and quickly they broke targets with an amazing lack of recoil.

J. Newton Thomas Memorial Award

This award was conceived and made available by Eley with the kind permission of Mrs Audrey Thomas, and is awarded to the person who has contributed most to the clay target shooting sports in the previous 12 months.

The nominations are made by individual clubs and associations and forwarded to the ACTA executive for the final decision.

This year Bev Grice from the Queensland Clay Target Association was awarded the trophy for the tremendous efforts she has made in making Clay Target shooting socially more acceptable at a Government and private level, her untiring efforts in organising the Nationals office and the time she has spent with both local and State Governments promoting all aspects of Clay Target shooting.

Our Congratulations go to Bev and the ACTA for their excellent choice.

We would like to thank all these who competed in the Eley Classic and congratulate all the location winners along with John Murphy.

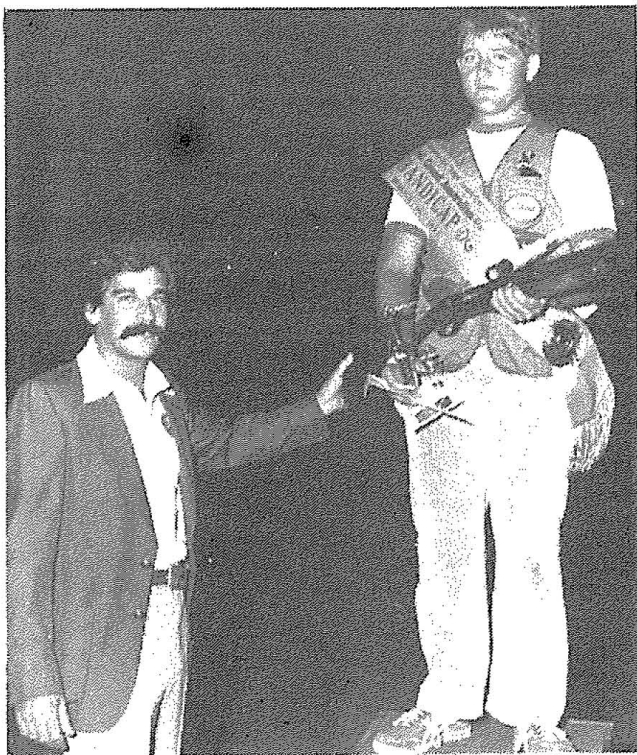

rifles. In third spot were Bill and Ken Stevens from Ipswich, Q'ld., while Tom and Thelma Meadows from Brisbane, the only husband and wife team in the placings filled 4th place. Another father and son combination, Ron and Brian Garth, Frankston/Australian Club, Victoria, finished fifth.

Saturday May 15.

Double Barrel day greeted us with a break in the weather. Until now, Greg Newey's cowboy hats were to be seen on most heads, to keep the sun at bay. Though still warm, (warmer than Melbourne anyway) the stiff breeze sent cloud and frequent showers scudding across the grounds. We were told it was turned on to make the Mexicans feel more at home. Conditions certainly were difficult for the shooters and from an entry of 522, only 12 possibles were shot.

The shoot-off wasn't to last long, inside 30 targets we were down to Barry Kable from Royal Aero, N.S.W. and Larry Dimasi, Mildura, Victoria. These two didn't go much longer either when Kable let his 97th target go without breaking, leaving Larry Dimasi, the fruit grower from Victoria's Far North West as the 30th Australian Double Barrel Champion.

Larry's good form over Easter at his home club when he broke the long break record with 536 targets, prompted him to make the journey to Brisbane. This was a popular win to a fine sportsman, and earned him the Grand European Shotgun kindly donated by Winchester Australia as his major prize. Barry Kable was left as the winner of A Grade with 96/97, Don Wilson from Tatura, Victoria, won B Grade with 76/77 and Stuart Boyden, Moree, with a score of 49/50 captured the C Grade trophy.

Adrian Hayes again collected the Veterans Division prize with 49/50.

The second Womens Double Barrel and Second Junior Double Barrel Championships were run in conjunction with the Open event. Thirty ladies had entered to do battle for the trophies again donated by Winchester Australia. The winner was Deserie Huddleston of Griffith, New South Wales, who took home a Winchester Model 101 Pigeon Grade Trap gun, with a score of 49/50. Second place and a dress watch was won

by Vicky Deeley of Gemfields, Queensland, on 47/50, with Thelma Meadows, Brisbane, Third 46/50.

Twenty four juniors lined up for the Junior Double Barrel, with trophies for the event also donated by Winchester.

Up for grabs was a Model 101 Pigeon Grade Trap gun for the top junior.

Fifteen year old David Wilson, son of Rex Wilson and a student at Henry Kendall High School in Gosford, New South Wales, won the day after a shoot-off with Chris Warren of Boorowa, N.S.W.

David, who has been shooting for 2½ years won with a score of 56/57 from Chris 55/56, and Scott Hetherington, Mt Gambier, S.A., in third place, 48/50.

A highlight of the Presentations this day was the award of the Val and Fred Horton Trophy for the oldest competitor. Ninety one year old Jim Medway from Gunning/Dalton club in N.S.W. was presented with his trophy by National President, Laurie Connors.

Sunday May 16, Single Barrel

Conditions were again difficult on the Sunday morning as 482 competitors did battle for the 28th Australian Single Barrel Championship. So difficult in fact that nobody managed a possible.

At the days end, it was a squad of five 49's who were to shoot off for the title. Graham Willett, Stephen White, Stan Collins, Bill Iles, all from Victoria, and Pud Burgess from New South Wales. First to go was Collins, with his clubmate from Bairnsdale White, dropping his very next target to exit also. Bill Iles missed his 57th target to leave the contest a match in two, between Pud Burgess and Graham Willett. Pud duffed his 60th, Willett shot his and it was all over. A fine win to Graham Willett and very sweet after his disappointment earlier in the week. Along with the Eley silver badge went a Franchi Over and Under, kindly donated by Eley Ammunition as part of Willett's spoils.

A Grade was won by Pud Burgess, 58/60.

A find double went to Nanette Meredith of Korumburra, Victoria, when she took out "B" Grade and the Ladies Division of the Single Barrel.

Joe Keeley, a helicopter pilot from Taupo, New Zealand, was delighted to win a micro-wave oven as the best in C Grade with 46/50.

Adrian Hayes, Hawkesbury, N.S.W. added another ice bucket to his collection by winning the Veterans Division, and David Wright from Dysart, Queensland, won a Franchi 500 Automatic Shotgun donated by Eley Ammunition, as top Junior.

To complete Sunday's shooting we had the third staging of the Interstate shoulder to shoulder Trap Teams Match. The fashion stakes were definitely won by the team from Western Australia, who looked resplendent in gold and black track suits, and gold shooting jackets complete with black swan. Defending the title won in Melbourne in 1981, the sandgropers had their colours lowered by the big "V", represented by Willett, Boyd, Iles, Shepherd and McKenzie, with a score of 124/125.

Queensland too were turned out in identical shooting jackets, New South Wales I'm told will be well kitted out for next years match, which will certainly add more colour to the event.

Monday May 17 — A.N.Z. Points Score

The weather had settled down again by Monday morning and all was in readiness for the 21st Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship. Nominations numbered 428, and many determined faces approached the traps to ensure a place in the International Team to shoot for the Mackintosh Trophy. At day's end, only two had shot the possible, Bill Stevens from Ipswich Club in Queensland, and Double Barrel winner, Larry Dimasi from Mildura, Victoria. Two targets only were necessary to give us a winner with Larry pulling a second barrel on his second target to leave Bill with the title. Bill's score was 156/156 and was put together with his usual deliberate care. He remarked afterwards that the night before the event, he had thought long and hard as to why he wasn't shooting better. He came up with the answer that he just wasn't working hard enough to shoot the targets. This thought certainly paid dividends to give Bill the title and the S.K.B. under and over shotgun, donated by Borsimex, as his major trophy, along with the Eley Southern Cross silver badge.

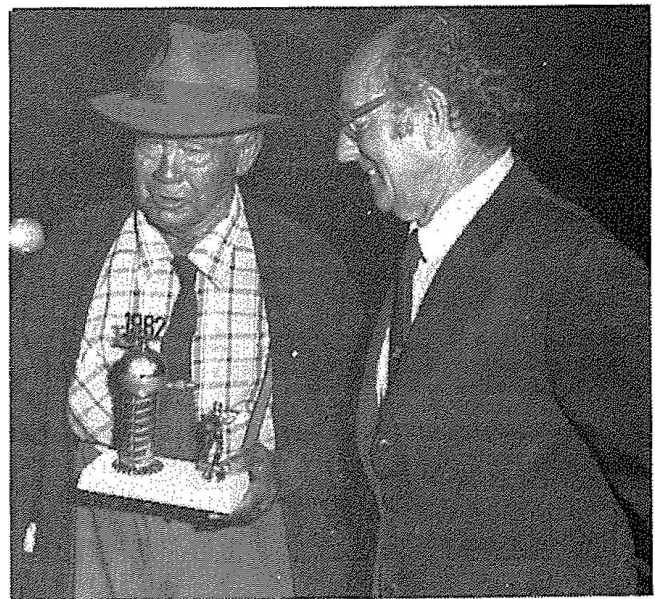
Larry Dimasi topped A Grade with 155/156, while Tom Comerford from Townsville took out B Grade honours on 147/150.

Maree Rooke from Wagga took a treble in this event, winning C Grade, Ladies and Junior trophies with her score of 146/150.

Top Veteran was Clarrie Barnes from Mildura on 144/150.

The Allan Brown Team's Match for five man club teams was run in conjunction with the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship and resulted in a win for the team from Mildura, Victoria, which comprised Larry Dimasi, Jim Blythman, Jim Finis, Clarrie Barnes and Gordon Wakefield. The winning score was 719/750.

The day was rounded off with the 8th International Trap Teams Match. Teams from New Zealand, New Caledonia, Papua-New Guinea and Australia competed, with Australia, represented by Larry Dimasi, Barry Kable, Don Wilson, Leon Gibson and Stuart Browning winning by 3 targets from New Zealand. New Caledonia and Papua New Guinea were in third and fourth places.



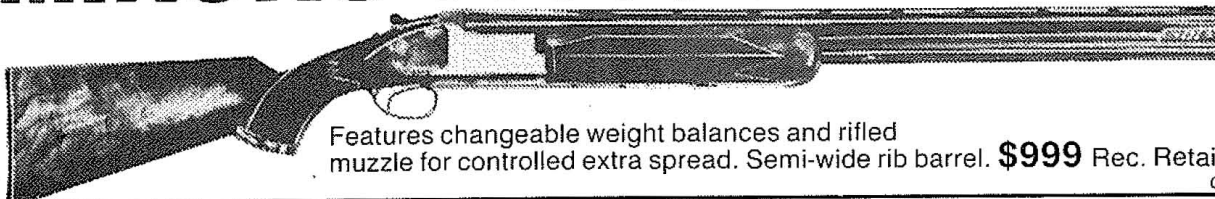
• Oldest competitor, 91 years old Jim Medway with National President Laurie Connors.

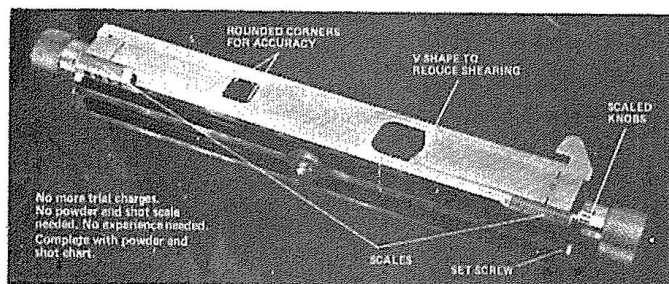

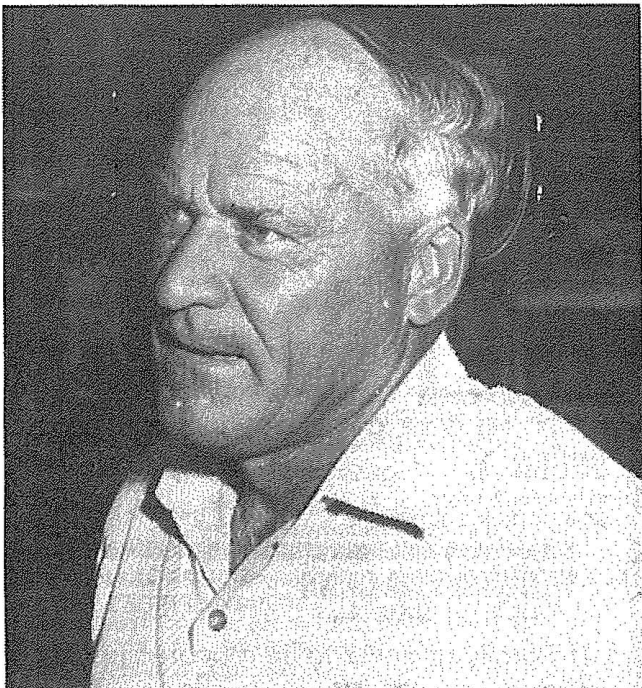

Fourteen points down was good enough to gain a place in the International Team to shoot the Mackintosh the following morning.

Tuesday May 18 — Mackintosh and Double Rise

With the weather still excellent, the thirty shooters in the Team lined up. They shot well, the best 25 of 30 scores to count as Australia's score. This aggregated to 7348/7500, six points higher than Melbourne in 1981.

Doug Smith of Queensland was High Gun of the team with a very convincing 299/300. Doug pulled a second barrel on his 14th target, being the only slight blemish on an excellent 100 targets. Bill Iles, shooting in the same squad as Doug Smith who had fired two at his sixth target, looked as though he would tie Doug until he was forced to pull a second on his very last target to score 298. Kevin Perkins from Illawarra, N.S.W., and Garry Webster from Cunnamulla also shot very good 298's.

The Trap Team to shoot against England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales in Cumberland in July was announced at the completion of the Mackintosh Team shoot. These were the four shooters with the highest scores in the National Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points score and Mackintosh Team shoot. Unfortunately, Doug Smith of Queensland is not available, he had qualified in second place.

The team which will compete for the Van Diemens Trophy against the Home Countries, and also in the British Open is, Larry Dimasi, Mildura, Victoria, Bill Iles, Melbourne, Kevin

Perkins, Illawarra, N.S.W., and A. M. (Pud) Burgess, Cobar, N.S.W.

A very experienced team of top shooters who are sure to acquit themselves very well in U.K.

With team photographs completed after the Mackintosh shoot, all was ready for the 22nd Australian Double Rise Championship. The hopefuls numbered 300 in this difficult event. It was won outright in fine style by Bill Iles of Melbourne with 47/50. This was Bill's second major Double Rise title this year as he had won the New Zealand crown in March, in Christchurch.

What impressed this observer is the rhythmic way Bill shoots Double Rise targets, apparently breaking each target a pre-determined distance out from the trap. This distance not altering as he moves from lane to lane. This was a popular win to a fine exponent of the art of shooting double targets.

Russel Mark of Werribee, Victoria, was successful in A Grade shooting 56/60. Don Wilson, Tatura, showed up again in B Grade, winning with a score of 43/50, while John Beale of Gladstone, Queensland, took off C Grade honours with 35/50.

Best lady was Deserie Huddleston of Griffith, N.S.W. 39/50. Top Veteran in Double Rise was Keith Cameron of Gold Coast Gun Club, Queensland, on 39/50 and top Junior, Nick Gabbe of Goroke, Victoria, 41/50.

Wednesday May 19, Champion of Champions

The final day of the '82 Nationals attracted an entry of 337 to contest the 42nd Champion of Champions Cup. Seventy five targets in one visit to the traps. Twenty five double barrel, 25 points score and 25 single barrel. Again conditions were ideal. No one however could match the skill and experience of A. M. (Pud) Burgess of Cobar, New South Wales, as he shot the only possible to win the event outright.

Pud was in Brisbane being measured at Fletcher Jones for his uniform for the U.K. trip, when presentations were taking place. It was a very thrilled Mrs. Burgess who was asked to accept the trophies on Pud's behalf.

Bill Iles 164/165 won A Grade after a shoot-off with Graham Willett and Larry Dimasi, while Don Wilson, Tatura again showed his superiority among the B Graders to win with a score of 123/125.

Charlie Miller from Brisbane Gun Club was successful in C Grade, shooting 119/125.

Popular and hard working Q.C.T.A. Secretary, Bev Grice was the star among the ladies winning with 119/125, while Adrian Hayes, Hawkesbury again led the Veterans Division with 121/125.

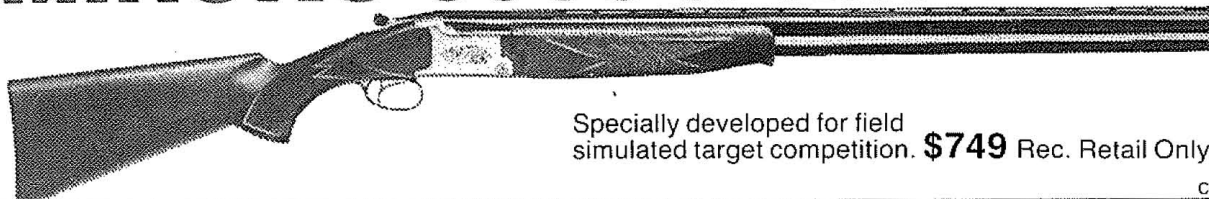
Top junior was Lance Nelis of Brisbane, 115/125.

As some calm settled on Brisbane Gun Club, it was time to look back over the eight days of shooting. The targets were difficult, as they should be according to the rules. We had six new worthy National Champions, skilful and experienced shooters all, who had triumphed over sometimes difficult conditions to beat the best in Australia. Tournament Director, Richard Dean and his assistant Les James, Shoot Marshal Gerry Chizzotti and his assistant Brian Mundt, Office Manager and Treasurer Peter Allars and his band of helpers, Jan and Leanne in the A.C.T.A. Office. All gave sterling service and must be congratulated on the job done.

There were a few minor hassles, nothing of magnitude, all in all an enjoyable series.

The High Gun boards had been checked, so it was a quick shower and off to the Greek Community Centre to present the High Gun Awards and enjoy the wind-up to the '82 National Championship series.

Sixteen years old Maree Rooke of Wagga Wagga, New South Wales, was thrilled to receive a similar trophy for C Grade, her score being 418/475.

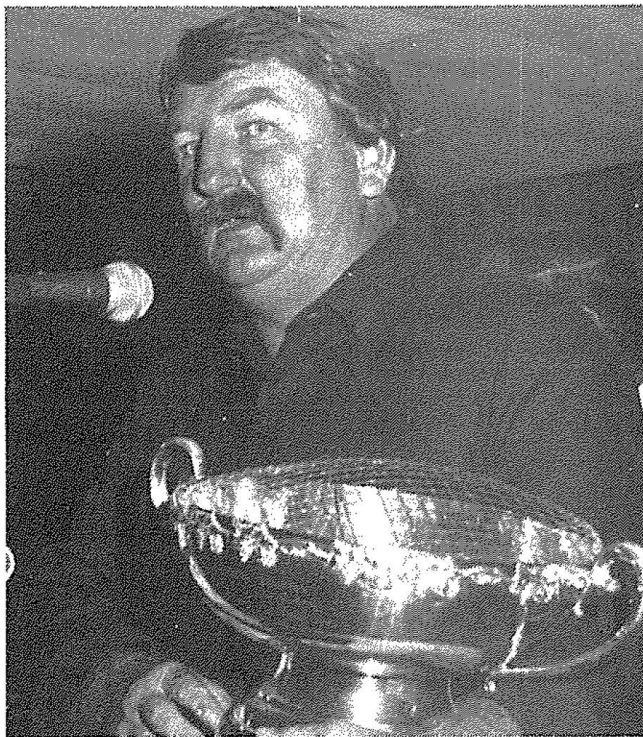

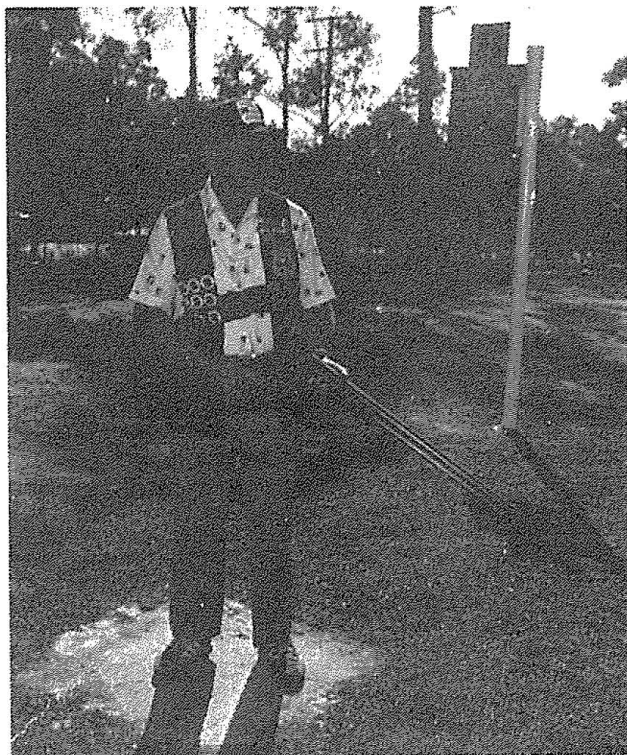

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

Staff Writer

The Association's Executive Committee met in Brisbane on Thursday, May 20. Mr. Laurie Connors of Mildura, Victoria, was re-elected unopposed as National President. Mr. Roy Holtfreter of Northam, Western Australia, was also re-elected unopposed to the position of Vice President.

An election was conducted for two places on the Association's Management Committee. Three people were nominated for these positions, Mr. Robert Parker of New South Wales, Mr. Richard Dean of Queensland, and Mr. Robert Buchan of Victoria. Mr. Parker and Mr. Dean were elected to join the National President and Vice President on the Management Committee.

Dr. Paul Cains of Tasmania did not seek re-election to the Management or International Sub-Committee. His place on the International Sub-Committee, as the Management Committee's representative has been taken by Richard Dean.

Three new faces appeared at the Executive Committee table for this meeting. Ken Coppleman, Tasmania, Neville Seis, Northern Territory, and Leighton Martin, South Australia.

Skeet Nationals

The Executive Committee decided that a separate Skeet Nationals Championship series be conducted in 1983. The dates and venue are still to be decided, but it is planned to hold the Tournament in Victoria. It was agreed that Skeet Nationals be allocated on a State rotation basis, and that a minimum of 5 lay-outs be available.

All Executive members are to discuss the proposed Skeet Nationals with their State Associations in relation to the

length of the series, the type of competition required, and the time of year, and report back to the next Executive meeting.

Trap Nationals

The 1983 National Trap Championships will be conducted from April 11 to April 16 at the South Australian Gun Club. The Club will be conducting the pre-Nationals on Saturday April 9 and Sunday April 10.

State Presidents & Secretaries Meeting

A meeting of State Presidents and Secretaries will be held on Saturday September 4, 1982, followed by a two day meeting of the Executive Committee, September 5 and 6. State Presidents and Secretaries will be invited to attend the Executive meeting as observers.

RELOADS AT NATIONALS

The Executive Committee decided to defer a decision on the use of reloads at Nationals until the next meeting. A full investigation is being undertaken into all aspects of this matter, including the value of trophies donated by the Industry each year, and the possible effects the use of reloads would have on industry participation in National Championships.

Australian Teams.

As from the 1983 Nationals, Australian teams will be selected for ladies and Juniors, in addition to the Open team.

The Executive Director will be submitting a proposal to the U.K. International Council regarding postal matches for ladies and juniors run along similar lines to the Macintosh Team shoot, during his forthcoming visit.

AROUND THE TRAPS

Sunday April 25, 1982

The International Sub-committee met on this day at the A.C.T.A. office in Melbourne. It is well known now, this committee is responsible for all facets of our international shooting, be it D.T.L., Skeet or Olympic trap and skeet. It is also responsible for providing a budget for its operation to the full Executive for approval. Its financial year runs from 1st July to 30th June. It is obvious a great deal of money is required to fulfill all the desires of this committee. Its recommendation on 1982-83 involvement for our shooters include United Kingdom trap team to be selected at Brisbane Nationals, Commonwealth Games, training camps, World Championships, Caraca and Canada, skeet team to either America or Great Britain, all of which require a great deal of funds to implement.

In my conversations with a great number of shooters, they all agree with the concept of sending our top shots to compete in other countries, to further their experience. To assist with moneys required to implement these trips, a \$5.00 levy has been placed on State, Commonwealth and National I.S.U. Championships. Also \$3.00 was added to the 1982 National D.B., S.B. and Point Score Championships and purposely set aside for the Great Britain trip. Industry too, is assisting with funds needed. Winchester Australia and Eley Ammunition donated guns to be raffled and drawn at the Presentation Dinner to be held at the completion of the 1982 Nationals, a great gesture by these two firms.

It has been agreed your National Association will be responsible for the conduct of all future National and Commonwealth I.S.U. Championships. These have previously been hosted by clubs throughout Australia.

Monday April 26, 1982

A meeting of the Management Committee was held at the A.C.T.A. office on this day. The 1981 accounts and balance sheet were discussed, together with results of the first three months of our 1982 operation. Our Accountants, Deloitte, Haskins and Sells now provide quarterly operational costs against budget. This should prove beneficial to the Executive in its general administration. Deloitte, Haskins and Sells are also engaged to implement the first stage of the Feasibility Study, on our National Ground. I will keep you posted on the progress, as I am most anxious to see a final decision made on this project as soon as possible.

Tuesday April 27, 1982

Part of this day was spent at the A.C.T.A. office attending to administration before heading for my home town Mildura, where I stayed the night, packed a case and headed for Emerald in Queensland. Gemfields Gun Club, forty kilometres out of Emerald were hosts to the Queensland State Carnival, over Saturday 1st, Sunday 2nd and Monday 3rd May 1982. I was invited, and as it was only the weekend before the pre-nationals at Brisbane Gun Club, I thought I would make the effort to be there. The club has only recently established itself in the area, and is equipped with excellent facilities, in five D.T.L. trap layouts, spacious club rooms with office, bar, kitchen and good toilet and shower amenities. It also has powered sites available for caravan and tent campers on the ground. These were in full use by some of the two hundred and seven shooters who attended the Carnival from all over Queensland, with visitors from South Australia in

Saturday May 8, 1982

I arrived in Brisbane and attended the pre-Nationals being conducted by the Brisbane Gun Club prior to the commencement of our National Championships. I was impressed with the grounds and could see a considerable amount of work had been put into their preparation. The 1981 Annual Report had been published in the May C.T.S.N. giving all delegates the opportunity to read and study same, prior to attending the Annual General meeting. to come from the meeting was my re-election as President of your Association for the ensuing twelve months. I deem it a great honour to hold this position again, and will do my utmost to represent you all, and work on your behalf. Your Vice President is Mr. Roy Holtfreter, with the Management Committee consisting of L. Connors, R. Holtfreter, R. Parker and R. Dean. The A.C.T.A. Legislation Officer is R. Parker. The newly formed Referees Association will be meeting on the 21 & 22 June, 1982 in Melbourne to further discuss our rules. All State Associations, clubs and shooters will be kept well informed on their activities.

A State President and Secretaries meeting will be held on Saturday September 4, 1982 in Melbourne. This will be followed by an Executive meeting on Monday 5 and Tuesday 6 September, with all State Presidents and State Secretaries being invited to sit in at the Executive meeting as observers. It was also recommended by the Executive, an attempt be made to create a postal competition for ladies and junior teams, as now exists with the MacIntosh team trophy. This to be encouraged between those countries now competing in the MacIntosh trophy. The ladies and junior teams to be selected at the National Championships. It was also ratified by your Executive that the American Skeet be separated from the D.T.L. Nationals, and a separate Skeet Nationals be instigated. The first of such Nationals is to be run in Victoria in 1983. Further discussion will take place on the Skeet National format and dates to conduct it at the next Executive meeting, to be held in September, 1982. Let us hope the Skeet Nationals are given proper planning and organizing for the first two or three years, to make sure they receive the shooter support required to make them a success. This will also encourage greater shooter participation in this discipline, making the Skeet Nationals a viable and worth-while venture for the A.C.T.A. and shooting in general.

After spending three days in Surfers Paradise enjoying a little relaxation after the Nationals, it was back to Melbourne to the A.C.T.A. office. Needing urgent attention was a submission to the Federal Government through the Department of Home Affairs and Environment, for financial assistance under the Sports Development program for 1983.

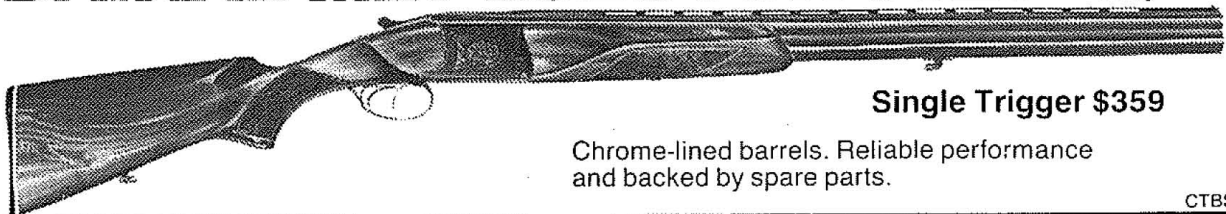

I was very disappointed to see the results of our Nationals in Brisbane. Only 20 possibles in 7 events, for those who did not attend, 3 skeet, 2 handicap, 2 Points Score, 1 Champion of Champions, 12 Double Barrel, with 500 plus shooters.

During the last few years, we have debated many things, in the hope of swelling our Championship attendances, from National grounds to graded shooting at Nationals, which I believe we could well do without and now separate Trap and Skeet Nationals. At National or club level, it is the new shooters we are trying to encourage to take up our sport. The old faces are always there to help swell the crowd. We all travel a long way and pay big money these days for the opportunity to shoot at our Nationals, so let's standardise our targets, bring back the great shoot-offs with targets they can hit, or our attendances could well be diminishing.

Brisbane's ground was very difficult to shoot with fluro targets and the changing light, but I do believe the targets were thrown at maximum angles and distances.

At the A.G.M. the question was asked "Why are you throwing illegal targets at these Nationals?" The answer from the Chair was "Our instructions to the Committee running the Nationals is to throw maximum distances and maximum angles". Would you believe this contrary to the A.C.T.A. rules.

CONGRATULATIONS TO THE "NEW BROOM"

The Cain Government is to be congratulated on its immediate action in implementing firearms legislation. The registration of firearms and limitation on numbers of firearms that licenced firearm owners may own could well cut down on the present illegal importation of firearms.

The requirement of criminals for imported firearms could be eased by the number of firearms in the hands of once law abiding citizens which will not now be reported when they are stolen.

The additional work for the police in training and questioning prospective licence holders, tracing firearms, etc. will add problems to that already overloaded department which cannot even now cope with licence issues.

This staff shortage will enable the government to reduce unemployment by the training of some hundreds of additional police to cope with the added workload. The Police Department will also be able to get additional computer facilities to enable firearms to be registered on shooters licences although the fact that current three year licences will take some little time to get into the system is disappointing. However, at last Police generally will become knowledgeable about firearms.

The additional revenue required to service this of course must not be taken from the general public but from those people foolish enough to own registered firearms.

If the charges are made steep enough the owners will have to dispose of their firearms and this glut of firearms that few will be able to afford to own should reduce the import bill.

Firearm manufacturers world-wide will have to seek markets other than Victoria to unload their wares upon — maybe the other States will oblige.

The reduction in the hunting shooters will allow the game populations to explode but mother nature will decimate over population by allowing the normal balance to be restored by the slow death through starvation and drought conditions as has occurred in the past where pelican and ibis colonies have been decimated by the indiscriminate draining of wetlands.

However, the main objective will be achieved and hopefully soon after the turn of the century some small reduction may be made on the four or five hundred criminally used firearms of the million or so legally or illegally in circulation in Victoria.

The action taken will also cause most of the gun clubs to close down in Victoria except where an elite group can afford to build a reinforced concrete bunker to store their firearms. Unfortunately the police training group will have to replace the volunteer firearm instructors who will be lost by club closure.

The millions of dollars currently subscribed by firearm owners and the volunteer building of nesting boxes will have to be covered by the Conservationists who doubtless could be taxed to replace shooters contributions to Wild Life Management.

However, mother nature may decimate the wild life which has depended on shooters care and allow conservationists to continue their unproductive bird observing albeit, diminishing numbers.

In conclusion why should Victoria take any notice of proven world-wide findings that gun registration has no effect on criminal use of firearms or on the illegal possession of firearms.

Why shouldn't the Cain Government re-invent the wheel — they may even be able to build a better mousetrap or do a Wran on Victoria's power.

Doubtless further brilliant legislation will be introduced to cover crime with knives, 4 x 2's, broken bottles and the occasional strangulation which after all cover the bulk of death and injury criminally inflicted — after the car of course!

Go to it Boys! You will certainly prove your point to some 20-25% of Victorians who currently own firearms that you have been given that "MANDATE" and regardless of increas-

ing crime, drug offences, incest or whatever — firearm registration is to be a further imposition on their civil rights and assistance to criminals.

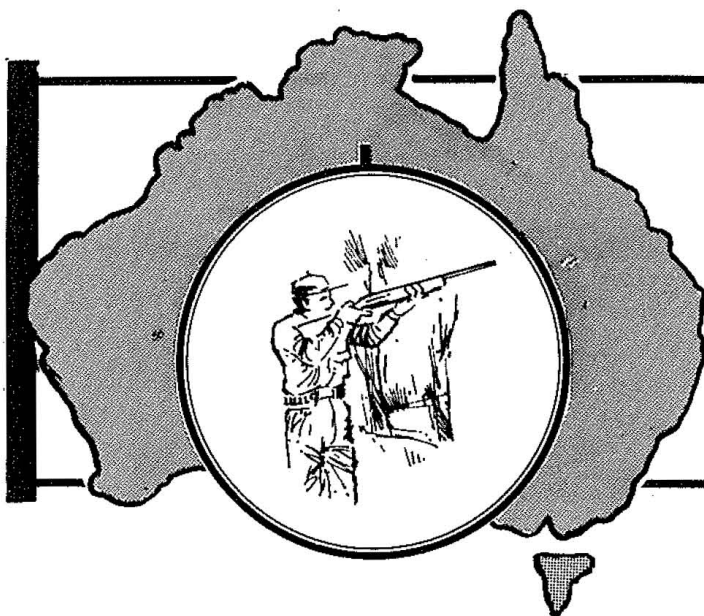

The major decision taken by the meeting was to increase registration fees, the increase to become effective on January 1, 1983. The new fees will be:

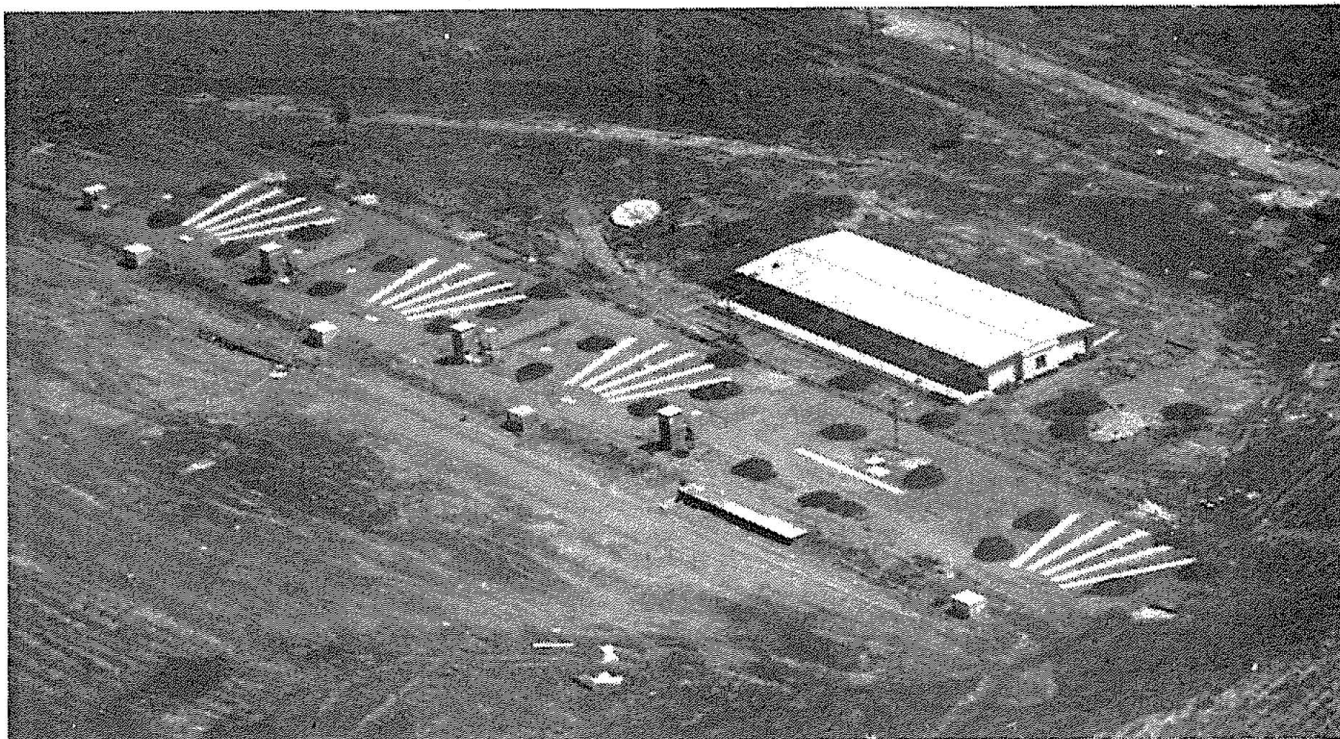

FROM THE DESK OF NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Peter Quire

A scientific article by Dr Losel in the February issue of the UIT magazine gives the results of a study on the effect of differences in light density over each eye. He goes into a great deal of detail in explaining the experiments used, and the minute functioning of the eye, but I will quote the section of his article that I found interesting, in the hope that you will too.

"If an eye - spectacled or non-spectacled is more darkly adapted than the other eye, through a shadow-giving cap or a special head bearing, due to the restriction of the upper part of the field of vision, when following a clay pigeon, which is flying from left to right with relative darkening of the left eye, the target seems further away than it really is, this is the result of sensory illusion."

Dr Losel reaches the conclusion that trap and skeet shooters should avoid slanting the peak of their cap to one side or dipping the head too far to one side, because of the difference in the state of adaption between both eyes, which can lead to the wrong interpretation of the flight path of the clay.

As in a lot of things Dr Losel has scientifically proved what common-sense has told us. I can't remember seeing a Clay Shooter with the peak of his cap over only one eye, and we have always taught that dipping the head was incorrect.

Still it is good to know that there are scientific reasons for doing the things we do.

I agree with Reg Clarke's dislike of single barrel shooting, and points score to a lesser degree. The shooter who consistently shoots his targets with the first barrel is no doubt the better shot as Cecil Herbert says, but single barrel and points score favours the experts at the expense of the also-rans who are the ones dropping out of the sport.

TOP SPORTS PSYCHOLOGIST VISITS AUSTRALIA

In the world of sports psychology there are few names that are better known than that of Doctor Brent Rushall.

Doctor Rushall is Professor of Coaching Theory at Lakehead University, Thunder Bay, Ontario, Canada. He is recognised as a world authority in the field of psychology and its practical application to sports and coaching.

The Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly has been successful in getting Dr Rushall to Australia during June and July.

During his visit, which will take in Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, Canberra and Brisbane, he will speak at a number of coaching workshops.

The workshops provide Australian coaches with a great opportunity to learn from this talented visitor.

SPORTS AID VISIT TO VANUATU

An unusual request for assistance was recently received through the Australian Government by C.A.S.

The new Government in Vanuatu, which gained its independence on July 1, 1981, had requested advice on the nature of sports organisational structures that should be considered for the effective administration of sport in that country.

The Confederation quickly responded by sending a staff member to Vanuatu in an advisory capacity.

After a round of discussions with all interested parties, including senior Government Ministers and Departmental Officers, and representatives of national sporting organisations, a series of recommendations was presented to the Government.

As a direct result, the Vanuatu Amateur Sports Federation has been formed, and in addition to improving the general status of sport in the nation, will also nominate five delegates to represent the views of sport on the National Sports Council, which is expected to be created by legislation to be enacted in August.

One of the most interesting consequences of these developments is that Vanuatu has sought affiliation with the Commonwealth Games Federation, and may be represented in the Games being held in Brisbane later this year.

During this visit, it became very apparent that any assistance that can be offered to Vanuatu by Australian sporting organisations will be eagerly accepted.

An urgent need exists for rule books and coaching brochures, in the following sports: soccer, netball, basketball, swimming, windsurfing, canoeing, cricket, tennis, handball and volleyball.

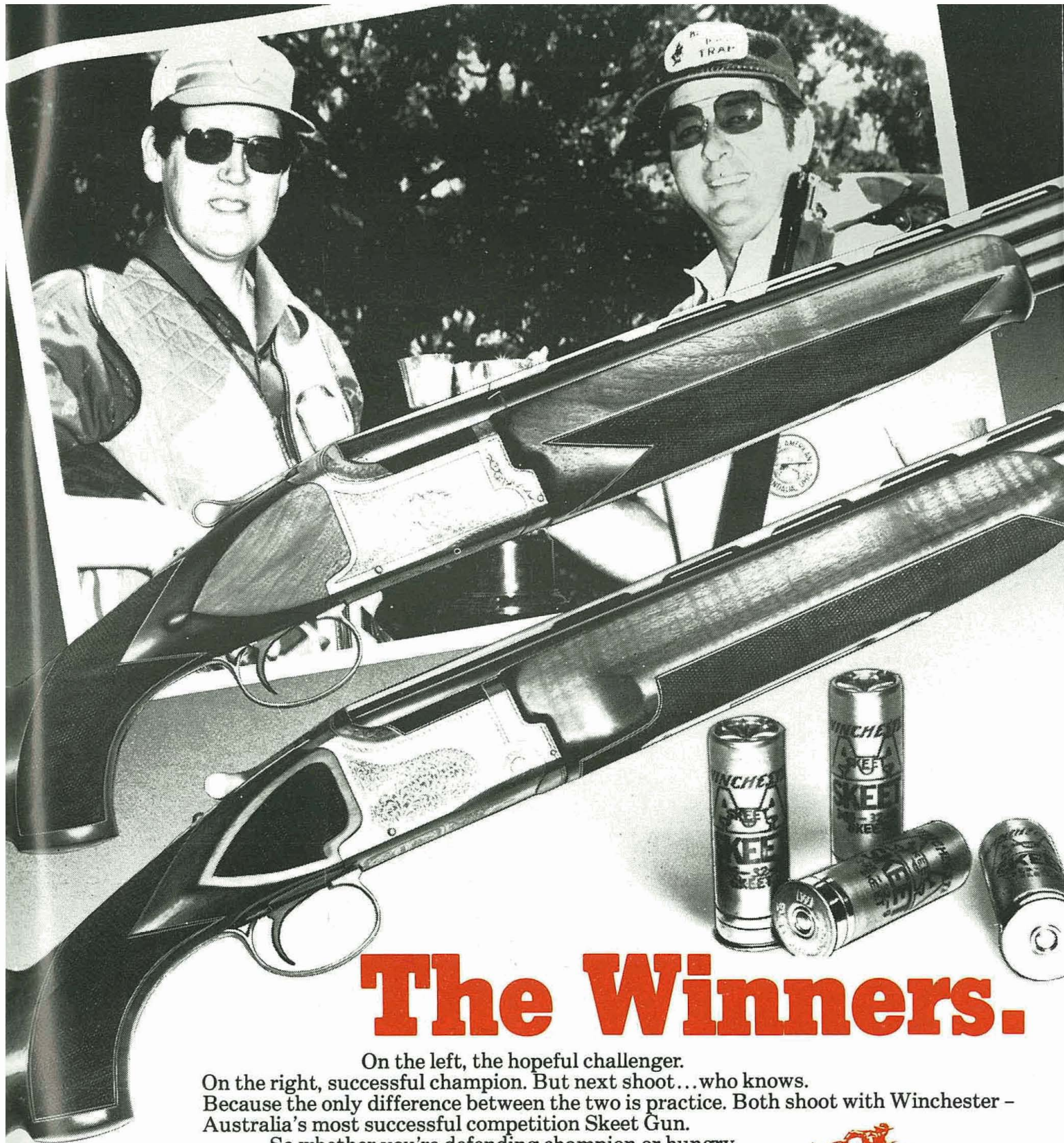

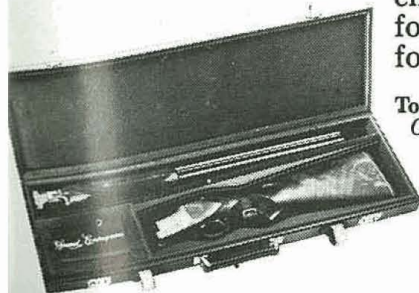
