



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I am very sorry to report that the Parents of Doctor Paul Cains were tragically killed in a car accident in Tasmania recently. The thoughts of us all are with Paul and his family at this time.

During my recent visit to U.K. with the Trap Team, some very useful meetings were held with the International Council of the U.K. Associations and the C.P.S.A. The major point, to emerge from these meetings was the agreement to conduct postal competitions for ladies and juniors along similar lines to the Mackintosh Team Shoot. Details are reported elsewhere in this issue. I am very hopeful that a U.K. team will visit us for our National Trap Championships in Adelaide in 1983. Many shooters from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales expressed an interest in coming to Australia to compete, as did the controlling body.

Down the Line shooting in U.K. differs in some ways to our practices in Australia. Traps are set to throw targets between 50 and 55 yards, i.e. 46 to 50 metres. Angles are set at a maximum of 221/2° either side of the centre line. A staff of four looks after each layout, these are trapper, button pusher, referee and scorer. The standard of button pushing is very high, each team in the Home Countries International having its own specialist to push the button for all of its squads. The referee's task is simpler as he only has to worry about watching the target in flight and calling the result. Points scoring is used for almost all Down the Line shooting, with shooters moving from track to track after each has shot five targets from each track. This certainly speeds up shooting with squads averaging twelve minutes for each round of 25 targets. Events generally are conducted over 100 targets even in club shoots, anything less is unusual.


"ONE POINT SEPARATES SCOTS & AUSTRALIANS AFTER 400 TARGETS"

The 1982 U.K. Trap Team left Melbourne on Friday July 9 on board THAI International Flight TG 982 bound for Bangkok and London Via Delhi. Team members Bill Iles Melbourne, Larry Dimasi Mildura, Pud Burgess Cobar, and Kevin Perkins Illawarra, had gathered in Melbourne on the Thursday for a final workout at Melbourne Gun Club. Our thanks to President Bob Buchan for the use of the facilities at Melbourne together with the donation of practice targets. Winchester Australia had also very generously donated cartridges for team practice at Melbourne and for competition use and training in U.K.

The Association's International Sub-Committee entertained the team at dinner prior to departure on the Thursday evening.

The party travelled very well, Pud Burgess being asleep before we had reached Seymour, and "Perky" waking each time food or other refreshments were mentioned. Larry Dimasi smiled all the way to London, while lies and Hill averaged one hours sleep. Of course they had smaller seats than the others.

Ford Australia had arranged for the use of an Australian LTD whilst in England. This was delivered at Heathrow. Airport, where the team set off for the 320 mile drive to Carlisle. A couple of pit stops for fuel, a lunch break and we were in Carlisle just $5\frac{1}{2}$ hours after leaving London. Motorways M1 and M6 made the going easy, as did Bill Iles's capable driving and Hill's navigation.

The Chairman, President and Committee members of the Carlisle and District Club met us on arrival at our hotel and made sure we were settled in.

On Sunday, the Carlisle Club conducted a 100 Target event. Despite jet lag nd lack of sleep the team were keen to get to grips with English targets and decided to enter this competition.

The Carlisle Club is situated about 12 miles west of Carlisle at Kirkbride, very close to the shores of Solway Firth. We had heard that the wind came up with the tide, and that conditions could alter dramatically during the day. Being sited on an airfield the land is flat and background good for shooting Clay targets. At the end of the day Kevin Perkins and Bill Iles had shot 291-300 points to finish in equal 6th place. Not far behind were Pud Burgess and Larry Dimasi. This was a good performance under the circumstances and gave the team a chance to see some English Targets.

This 100 Target event began at 11 a.m., was finished by 5 p.m., and only two traps were used. Entries numbered over 100 and squads took just 12 minutes to shoot 25 targets moving from track to track after 5 targets. This method certainly speeds up shooting. The weather was cool and overcast, and the light fair, black targets were used.

The Management of the Carlisle and District Club had arranged for the team to practice on the Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, prior to the competition on Friday and Saturday. This was very much appreciated by all, and ensured that everybody was at their peak for the big events. An average of 100 targets was shot by each team member in each training session, they all found the Wnchester Trap 100 shells to their liking. These are manufactured in Italy. On the Thursday evening prior to the International Teams Match, Ian Hill attended the International Council Meeting of the U.K. Associations. The A.C.T.A. had suggested that a postal competition should be conducted for ladies and junior teams, along similar lines to the Mackintosh competition. All countries agreed readily to this suggestion which will begin in 1983. It was agreed that teams of 5 ladies and 5 juniors should shoot at 100 targets, with all scores to count. Juniors will be those under **18** years when the event is shot.

An invitation was issued to each country to send a team to our Nationals in Adelaide in 1983, failing that a composite team would be welcome, made up of shooters from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. This invitation created a lot of interest and is almost certain to be accepted.

Earlier this day the team had been given a Civic reception by the Mayor of Carlisle, Councillor Donald Fell. We were made most welcome and were conducted on a tour of the Civic Centre. 1982 is the 1900th Anniversary of the founding of Carlisle as a civil settlement and is commemorated by the minting of a special coin in bronze. All team members were presented with one of these medallions. We had great pleasure in investing the Mayor as a member of the Royal Order of the Kangaroo, and presenting him with a Bannerette to mark our visit. His hospitality was excellent and was curtailed only by our need to practice later in the day. This visit was featured on Border Television and BBC Radio Cumbria.

Friday dawned fine and clear with a strong wind blowing from behind the shooters. All was in readiness for the conduct of the Four Man Team's Match for the "Van Diemens Trophy". It was shot in conjunction with the International Team Match between England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

With the wind from behind, the targets were dipping and had to be watched carefully. The Australian team shot in a squad of four, our button pusher throughout being Malcolm Brown, a member of the local club who had assisted us greatly during training.

Everybody was keyed up ready to start, just the right amount of butterflies to produce a good performance. At the end of the first 25 targets Australia led with 298/300 points, Iles and Burgess clean, Perkins and Dimasi pulling a second barrel each. Ireland were in second place on 295, Scotland 293, England 284 and Wales 283.

Round Two was not so good for Australia, Iles and Burgess put together two more very good 75's while Perkins shot 72 and Dimasi 70. This gave us a total of 590, one point behind Scotland on 591, Ireland 585, England 570 and Wales 560.

After a break for lunch and gathering of thoughts it was into Round Three, Bill Iles again shot a brilliant 75 as did Larry Dimasi, Pud Burgess pulled one second for 74 and Kevin Perkins dropped two points for 73. This totalled 887/900 and tied Scotland with one round to go. Ireland was on 878, England 864, and Wales 851.

The wind was still blowing strongly from behind as the team approached the tracks for the last round. Tension was high, and faces were drained of all colour as concentration took over for these last vital 25 targets. Again it was Bill Iles who shot a brilliant 75, he was joined by Kevin Perkins, the small figure working so hard for Australia, while Larry Dimasi pulled a second for 74, with Pud Burgess on 72.

And so it was over with Scotland winning the Van Diemens Trophy by one point 1184/1200 to Australia 1183. Ireland 1168, England 1159 and Wales 1147.



To average 295.75 points was an excellent performance, shootng 397 out of the 400 targets. This was the same as Scotland who pulled one less second barrel to win by the odd point. All had shot well throughout a day when conditions certainly were not easy. The team were a shade disappointed that they had failed by the narrowest of margins to win the van Diemens Trophy. The Manager however was proud of them all as they had shot their hearts out for Australia. On reflection it was probably not a bad thing politically to leave the Trophy in U.K. for 2 years.

Bill fles was the toast of the Australian camp after his brilliant 300 points, matched by only one other shooter on the day, the Scottish Captain Jim Stafford.

With the Australian flag proudly flying from the LTD, we headed back to our hotel to shower and prepare for the International Banquet in the evening.

"South Australian Gun Club"

This was a glittering affair, with the Mayor and Mayoress of Carlisle attending as guests of the C.P.S.A. Mr Roy Greatorex, President of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association was host for the evening, more than 400 people being in attendance. All competing team members wore blazers, the like of which the Australians had not seen before. Some were almost covered with badges and pockets won in International competition, a very colourful sight.

The results of the Mackintosh postal competition were announced during the evening. The Australians were hopeful of winning yet again but for the first time in nine years it wasn't to be. Results were as follows:

It is now perpetually a part of the Home Countries International, and will be shot for each Two years.

He had shot 225 targets in two days single barrel and thoroughly deserved his victory.




• The stars of the Home Countries International, Scots Captain Jim Stafford and Bill Iles, both shot perfect scores of 100/300.

was the same as the day before in the team shoot, 1183. In the two days competition the Australian four had shot 795/800 targets, 2366/2400 points. This was a tribute to their ability, dedication and determination to do well for their country.



SELECTION PROCEDURE FOR 1983-84 NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD AND SELECTION OF THE 1983 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM.

To be conducted at Melbourne Gun Club — April 23 to 28

The International Sub-Committee has agreed to the following procedure to be followed by shooters who wish to seek selection.

The International Sub-Committee DEMAND that the rules that have been set down will be adhered to by all States before their shooters can be eligible for selection.

RULES

- (A) All States to conduct three (3) eliminations of 200 targets in Olympic Trench (15 trap) and I.S.U. skeet. One of those eliminations MUST BE that State's State I.S.U. Championships. In the State of Queensland, approval has been given to conduct two (2) eliminations in the Northern area and two (2) in the Southern area and the third elimination must be the Queensland State I.S.U. Championship. The reason for this is the enormous distance and size of that State.
- (B) All three (3) eliminations for both disciplines must be completed by the end of March 1983.
- (C) Results of each eliminations MUST be forwarded to the National Executive Director, arriving within seven (7) days of competition. Failure to carry out this demand of seven (7) days, the shooters score results will be discarded.
- (D) The National office MUST be informed as to the dates and location of each State's eliminations and all events MUST be advertised in Clay Target Shooting News. State's may advertise each elimination separately or all three eliminations at the one time. Failure to carry out this condition of advertising will result in scores from that State not being accepted.
- (E) The Trench program setting for each State's elimination will be available at the National office two days prior to each elimination. It is the sole responsibility of the States to obtain the program setting.
- (F) Targets to be used for all eliminations must comply with the specifications of requirements of I.S.U. targets as laid down by the U.I.T.

- (G) Shooters who participate in all States three (3) eliminations except Queensland will discard their lowest score. In the case of Queensland where they are allowed under rule A two (2) in the North and two (2) in the South, the following rule is laid down. If a shooter shoots (2) two in the North plus (2) two in the South, his first two scores are the scores that count, plus his State's Championship. He then will be able to discard his lowest score.
- (H) Shooters must average 90% or more in their own State's eliminations before they can be eligible to be selected for the National Training Squad and selection of the 1983 World Championship team.
- (I) All Shooters who comply with Rules must meet on a shoulder to shoulder basis over the 200 target Commonwealth and 200 target National I.S.U. Championships, i.e., 400 targets. Shooters will then be selected on the basis of first past the post. If we only require one, two, three or more shooters, those who finish in the highest order would be selected.
- (J) When arriving at the Commonwealth and National Championships, all shooters who are eligible under those rules as laid down will all commence from scratch.
- (K) A \$5.00 levy will be placed on all shooters at the Commonwealth and National Championships.


SPECIAL NOTICE TO ALL I.S.U. SHOOTERS

All shooters are eligible to compete at the Commonwealth and National Championships. They are also eligible to win. Dates for I.S.U. Commonwealth and National Cham-

pionships:

- Saturday 23rd and Sunday 24th April Commonwealth Championships — 100 targets each day. If unable to be completed on those two days, it will be finalised on 25th April (Anzac Day) in the afternoon.
- Monday 26th, Tuesday 27th, Wednesday 28th National Championships — 75 targets on the 26th and 27th and 50 targets on the 28th.

Firearms Control

As host of the campaign by the Shooting Sports Council of Victoria to oppose registration of firearms proposals during the recent Victorian State Election Campaign, the Sporting Shooters Association brought world authority on firearms legislation Colin Greenwood to Victoria to speak at a number of public meetings and to speak to politicians and the media.

The following is the paper presented by Colin Greenwood at these meetings. It is published to inform shooters of the effects of registration around the world and the likely "benefits" of such legislation to Victoria.

I am delighted to be able to return to Australia so soon after my last visit but on this occasion I find myself in a delicate situation. Australians do not need outsiders (and particularly what I think you call wingeing Poms) to tell them how to vote in the coming election. I hope I will not be seen as interfering. It is of no concern to me whether this Party or that is elected.

If I can offer anything it is as an uninvolved and dispassionate observer of the scene who has made a detailed study of gun control issues in various parts of the world and in the U.K. in particular. I hope you will see me as an outside academic offering you information and not as someone interfering in an election issue in another country.

I find it very sad indeed to listen to the arguments which are being put forward. It seems to me that you all have the same stated objectives the politicians of all Parties and the shooters. If everyone is being open and honest about their objectives then all are seeking.

to help control armed crime

to help reduce accidents involving firearms

to reduce vandalism involving firearms.

Everyone is agreed these are desirable objectives and no-one seems to dissent.

All the argument, then, is about methods. You are all agreed about what you want to do but you disagree about how to do it.

What a great pity then, that discussion on how to achieve agreed objectives has to be reduced to a party political wrangle. With great respect to your politicians, an important and very complex subject is being trivialised. It is becoming a piece of dogma to be dealt with on a shallow level. Whatever the outcome of such a debate it can hardly be in the best interests of anyone. If there is to be any contribution towards solving the three problems mentioned it will be found through careful study, dispassionate consideration and the application of logic. These attributes are unlikely to be found in the highly charged situation when attitudes have polarised.

One of things which I find disturbing in the gun control debate is the tendency for people to keep on re-inventing the wheel. You in Victoria do not live on a separate planet. In other States, in other countries or at other times people have been seeking to control the actions of criminals by impositions on the law abiding. Hundreds of different schemes have been proposed or adopted. Various methods of controlling legititmately held guns have been imposed and can be evaluated. We have the results of all that experience. We need not speculate about many of theories. We know what the result will be. My task is to look at what I am told are the issues in the light of the collective experience of other people and to do so dispassionately and not in defence of some rigid dogma.

The first point at issue is the basic theory that it is necessary or desirable to reduce the numbers of firearms in the hands of the public so as to reduce the numbers available to the oriminal.

You can look across the world country to country. You can look across the countries state by state. You can look at one country or state at different times. No matter how you look at the problem there is no way in which any relationship can be found between the numbers of legitimately held guns and the rate of armed crime.

You can find countries with high armed crime rates and high rates of private firearms ownership. You can find countries with high armed crime rates and low levels of firearms ownership. You can find countries with very low ownership and very low armed crime rates.

There is no connection.

Anyone approaching the problem from that angle starts from a fallacy and cannot possibly reach a sound conclusion. It is equally fallacious to assume a relationship between the strictness of gun control systems and the rate of armed crime. That relationship simply does not exist in either the historical or international context.

One can examine a number of examples.

It is inevitable that in this debate someone is bound to quote the situation in America and in particular in cities like New York. Handguns in New York have been very strictly controlled since 1911. The number legitimately owned and registered is very low indeed and it is now practically impossible to own a handgun legally. The Police Commissioner estimates that there are three million illegal handguns in that city and if that is true gun ownership levels in New York are higher than in other parts of the U.S.A. where there is little or no control.

One of the documents produced to support further gun registrations suggests that a recent reduction in gun homi cides in Canada is a result of newly imposed strict controls. That suggestion is grossly misleading. There has been no change in handgun control in Canada since 1934. In 1977 a system of firearms acquisition licences was imposed for new purchases of long guns. Existing guns were not affected. There is no registration of firearms. Between 1977 and 1978 gun homicides rose slightly but between 1978 and 1979 they fell by no less than 30. Such changes in homicide figures are common and have occured all over the world. We are not given figures for crimes such as robbery where long guns feature rarely in comparison to pistols. There is no evidence from the Canadian experience that the proposals relating to the registration of firearms will have any effect in Victoria.

Germany too has been quoted as an example of country where strict gun control has produced a low homicide rate. In contrast with the proposal of the annual re-registration of firearms in Victoria the German shooter's licence is valid for life though permits are needed for new acquisitions of firearms. There is no registration.

The example of Japan is often quoted. Guns are effectively banned in Japan and the armed crime rate is very low indeed. Indeed crime of all sorts is rare and is actually falling. Before we assume that strict gun controls and low levels of firearms ownership are the key, we should note studies done of Japanese/American community. They show that despite the availability of guns and other influences, crime rates in those communities equate with those of Japan and not with those of America. This indicates that the key lies in social factors and not in gun control.

Those who say, "Look at America" would do well to look at Switzerland. There, each man is in the army and must keep an assault rifle, a pistol or a submachine gun with ammunition at his home. In addition private gun ownership is positively encouraged and ownership levels are very high indeed. There are effectively no controls and yet Switzerland has the lowest armed crime rate in the Western world.

Sweden, on the other hand, has slightly less access to firearms but gun ownership and use is promoted by the State. Their armed crime levels are rising.

Speaking recently in the House of Lords a Government spokesman Lord Avon said, "The most extensive research has shown that there is no relationship between the numbers of firearms held on firearms certificates and the rate of armed crime." He was right. The link simply does not exist. There is a mass of evidence and a mass of experience but no-one has been able to establish such a link.

It seems to me, therefore, that there is no justification for a policy which seeks to limit or reduce the numbers of legitimately owned firearms.

If you look at the arithmetic you will see why. In England we have possibly two million shotguns in circulation. That is an estimate because we have no registration. About two hundred shotguns would fill the criminal market. Even if there was a link between legitimately owned guns and the guns used in crime — which there is not — the ratio is ten thousand to one. It would therefore be necessary to eliminate ten thousand legitimately owned guns to have some chance of getting at a single criminal gun.

Registration of guns seems to be the central issue. Registration is nothing new and you can make your own judgement of the contribution it would make to controlling crime, vandalism and accidents. There is a mass of experience across the world.

We in England register pistols and rifles but not shotguns. The extent to which the different types of weapon are used in crime does not vary according to whether or not they are registered. Taking robbery as the example, pistols are used twice as frequently as shotguns and rifles feature vary rarely.

It is suggested that registration provides the State or the police with information about all the weapons in circulation. One must ask, firstly, why they want that information.

In England we have been trying to register pistols since 1920. Careful research suggests that after sixty years the number of illegally held handguns exceeds the number legally held. After sixty years of trying very hard we only register half the handguns — and that half that does no harm.

I have tried very hard for a long time but I have yet to find a case where registration prevented a single crime or cleared up

a single crime which otherwise might have remained undetected. You would expect that if the system worked its advocates would be able to produce many concrete examples of its success. I have been asking them to do so for many years. None of them can do.

But if registration does no good, what harm can it do? Certainly in England registration is used by the police as a tool to reduce the numbers of rifles and pistols. People are asked to justify their need for this gun or that and those who have owned guns without complaint for many years suddenly find themselves deprived of them.

There has built up a very considerable anti-police feeling amongst otherwise law abiding citizens who resent what they see as harassing.

It is extremely time consuming and costly. The full cost of a three year 'shooters licence' for shotguns is estimated by the Home Office to be £8. For registered guns it is £20 with an additional £20 for new guns registered during the three year period.

Possibly the worst effect is that it creates criminals. Only half the handgun owners in England register their guns. Those who do not are criminals. But the vast majority do not see themselves as other than honest respectable citizens who have a war time souvenir or who have inherited a family heirloom.

We might perhaps ask those shooters present tonight which of them would register all their guns if it became mandatory.

In my view registration does no good but a tremendous amount of harm.

Annual re-registration is also proposed. This would create a constant uncertainty about whether renewal would be granted and must substantially increase costs. The idea that shooters come from the higher income brackets has been dispelled in England. There was a widely held view that shooting involved Dukes on the grouse moor with the peasants driving birds over them. In fact, shooting is predominantly a working class sport and in England over 60% of shooters fall into that category. I do not know what the situation is in Victoria. In England increased administrative costs have been inflated and used as a policy instrument to reduce the number of shooters. It is working class shooters who have suffered most under this system.

Annual licensing or registration is nothing new. You have it in other parts of Australia and in other countries. In Britain licences are valid for three years, in other countries they are valid for longer periods and in some cases for life. There is no evidence to show that any benefit would result from annual licensing or registration.

The police, of course, need to link their system of recording convictions with the shooters licence record. I am sure they do this now.

I have been asked on a number of occasions since I arrived about the origins of gun control in various countries. Research revealed that logic and good sense rarely enter the picture. Emotionalism is the usual spur and that is often linked to an isolated incident. Rarely — indeed almost never — does scientific research or logic play a part. In France gun control is a military matter concerned only with preventing the next Revolution. Rifles are freely available without



COMMENTS FROM THE NATIONAL COACH

This is a plea and explanation to all Clay Shooters on behalf of myself and the shooters that are to represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games and the World Championships in Caracas.

It is a natural human reaction for us not so dedicated, talented or skilled shooters to feel a mixture of admiration and jealously for the Champions of our sport, for most of us we would like the status but not the work or sacrifice involved, so we are inclined to knock what we don't achieve ourselves. As a nation Australians don't set much store on people who excell in any walk of life.

In our sport to be selected for National Squad or Team the shooters have to be highly skilled, they would have had to have the motivation to develop their skills to that level in the first place, once chosen to be a member of an International Team they must embark on a regime of training that would frighten most people, they have to be physically fit, skilled to the extreme and psychologically in tune. To attain this standard they forgo much of the normal pleasures of life,

Top shooters families have to be supportive, understanding and co-operative, they have to accept the sacrifices as well. The absences from work involve them in loss of wages and loss of promotion. We must remember that they will be competing against people who are employed by the Army or are subsidized so have no worries about employment or cost of competition. People who are looked upon as national herces in their own countries.

There are compensations, the pursuit of excellence and its attainment, the excitement and glory of representing your country, the self-fulfilling knowledge that you can achieve greatness and can perform some thing better than most people in the world, and most importantly I think, the gaining of approval from your fellow shooters, friends and family.

This is the point that I am getting at, it has been proven time and time again just how important it is for top athletes of any sort to have the encouragement, acceptance and support of other athletes, in our case other shooters, and to have the backing and support of the administration of the sport, be it club, State or National.

We should be proud of our Top Shooters, they represent not only the Clay Target Shooters but all Australians and they are in a real sense the show case for our sport. If this pride and acceptance is felt by the Shooters themselves it gives them much greater desire to perform well and helps them to feel pride in themselves their abilities and their ambitions.

TRADE TOPICS REMINGTON MODEL 700 CLASSIC RIFLE TO BE PRODUCED IN LIMITED RUN FOR THE 257 ROBERTS CARTRIDGE

In 1982 Remington will offer shooters an opportunity to obtain a limited production run of its Model 700 Classic bolt action Rifle for an old but still highly regarded cartridge, the 257 Roberts.



In Belgium there are no controls on .22 rifles or shotguns but they are extremely concerned about any concealable weapons. Swordsticks are apparently classified in the same way as handguns. These attitudes seem to arise from incidents in the late 19th Century.

In Britain we had no gun control until 1920. Any attempts at control had been heavily defeated in Parliament and there was an absolute right to keep arms. The British Parliament defended that right very firmly indeed. Suddenly, in 1920, strict controls on rifles and pistols were pushed through Parliament without opposition and with Ministers talking only vaguely about the problem of armed crime. When I came to look at the armed crime rates they were falling steadily from a low position. For a long time I could find nothing to explain the change of attitude on the part of the Government and the sudden acceptance by the Parliament of measures which they had fought tooth and nail.

The answer came when some secret Cabinet Diaries were released. Revolution was everywhere. There had been anarchist troubles in Britain and the Russian Revolution was clearly uppermost in the minds of senior politicians. Industrial troubles in Britain, which led to the General Strike, looked more like leading to a Revolution.

The Cabinet discussed matters like the strength and loyalty of the Army, how the R.A.F. could be used against insurrection and how loyal citizens could be mobilised. It was said "The loyal citizens of this country are without arms. What is

needed is a Bill to licence arms so that they may be available to the friends of the Government."

So the discussions went on, and what emerges is that gun control had nothing to do with armed crime but was a measure taken by a frightened Government which did not trust the people. Had they looked they would have seen the guns were predominantly in the hands of loyal and responsible citizens. One is bound to recall the question of an earlier world statesman, "What kind of country is it dares not trust its people to have arms."

If, as I have suggested, the number of legitimately owned firearms in the community is not a factor in the armed crime rate and if measures such as gun registration will not work what measures are likely to control armed crime?

Armed crime is a complex phenomena. Studies will show that the rates of armed crime can be linked to societal attitudes and responses.

It is naive in the extreme to suggest that simplistic measures like gun registration will reduce armed crime or accidents or vandalism. We have been wrestling with the problem for so long that, if simplistic solutions would work, we would by now have eliminated or controlled it.

Professor Frank Zimring has the reputation of being the most anti-gun academic in the world. When I attended the Perth International Conference he said, "Australia does not have a gun problem, it has a media problem." He then went on to say that if Australia wanted to avoid the type of gun crime problem which the U.S.A. is experiencing you should not look to the guns but to avoiding the social situations which generate such crime.

If you want to see how armed crime is generated and how it can increase, look at the experience of London in the last year. The use of firearms in crime such as robbery rose from 767 cases in 1980 to 1415 cases in 1981 and the number of instances in which guns were fired rose from 42 to 102. That increase went hand in hand with a massive 48% increase in robberies — primary in 'muggings' but including places like shops and sub postoffices.

The increase occurred disproportionately in those parts which were involved in last years riots and where police responses had been inadequate. The riots themselves sprang from the lunacy of allowing intolerable social conditions to grow and failing to control minor crime and disorder. From minor orime and minor disorder unchecked a minority graduated to major crime and major disorder — also unchecked.

The increase in the use of firearms in crime in London last year had nothing to do with the availability of guns. It had to do with the failure of the police to maintain control and the failure of the State to allow the police to deal adequately with a minority of deviants.

1982 Q.C.T.A. WESTERN ZONE TRAP CARNIVAL TO BE HELD AT CONDAMINE GUN CLUB

The Condamine Gun Club welcomes you to the 1982 Western Zone Trap Carnival on the 18th and 19th September.

Condamine, a small country town situated on the banks of the Condamine River is famous for its Condamine Bell, invented by Samuel Williams Jones who was a blacksmith in Condamine from 1867 to 1878. He was the first to manufacture stock bells using sheet metal from a cross cut saw or pit saw. He called them Bull Frog Bells and stamped S.W. Jones on the tongue.


In 1966 a keen gunshooter, Lou Hasted, then licensee of the Condamine Hotel, impressed a group of citizens with his keenness to start a Gun Club in Condamine.

A committee was formed with "Jinks" Jenkins as President, Penny Sheahan Secretary, Neville Beeton Treasurer. Lou Hasted was Club Captain with Fred Jenkins as Patron. The major obstacle then was finding funds of \$600 for a trap. This was solved with Lou purchasing the trap for the Club, the money to be repaid when the Club was financial enough. This was repaid in 1968. Through the efforts of Lou and the willingness of members the Club was soon preparing for its first Annual Shoot in 1967.

At this shoot a contingent of New Zealand shooters made their way to Condamine. They appreciated the Condamine hospitality so much that on their return to New Zealand they had made a beautiful trophy, named appropriately "the Kiwi Trophy", which is shot for annually by Condamine Gun Club members in conjunction with an event at the Annual shoot.

During 1970 the Club moved to its existing site on the Condamine Racecourse and Recreation Reserve where they were able to use the facilities of the newly constructed Condamine Golf Club. In 1971 the Club constructed its office and store room. Until 1975 the Club operated with the one trap, availing themselves of the generosity of sister Clubs to provide a second trap and spares in case of breakdowns. 1975 saw the purchase of a second trap; 1979 a third trap layout, construction of two brick traphouses and the purchase of a third trap. 1982 has to date seen the construction of the third brick traphouse, lights installed on one layout and the purchase of a new hydraulic trap.

Condamine, one of the early towns of Queensland, has a colourful past.
