

COMMONWEALTH GAMES — by the time these notes are printed, the Commonwealth Games will be only a week away. The program for shotgun events is as follows:—

Saturday October 2 — Trap Teams Match 100 targets Sunday October 3 — Skeet Teams Match 100 targets

Monday October 4 — Trap Individual Match first 100 targets

Tuesday October 5 — Trap Individual Match final 100 targets

Thursday October 7 — Skeet Individual first 100 targets Friday October 8 — Skeet Individual final 100 targets.

Brisbane Gun Club, in Mt Petrie Rd., Belmont, is the venue. I am sure many shooters will be there to support Australia's representatives.

What are our Gold Medal prospects?

Jim Ellis and Terry Rumbel must rate very highly in both the Team and Individual trap events. In Edmonton, Canada in 1978, Rumbel was the Bronze Medal winner with 183/200, beating Jim Ellis into fourth place in a shoot-off. With Ellis 2nd and Rumbel 6th in the 1981 World Championships, our team medal chances look very bright. The English are very confident that Peter Croft will do extremely well in trap, and not much is known about the form of the Canadians at this time.

Ian Hale and Alex Crikis will represent Australia in skeet, as they did in Edmonton in 1978. On that occasion Hale finished 6th and Crikis 10th. The gold medal winner in Edmonton, John Woolley of New Zealand, must be the main danger to Hale and Crikis, remember he was the winner of our National Title at Easter with 197/200, beating Ian Hale by one target.

All four shooters have been carefully prepared for the Commonwealth Games under the direction of National Training Squad Manager Coach, Peter Quire. Peter is expecting at least two gold medals from his charges.

Jim, Terry, Ian and Alex, move into the games village on September 20, and will be finely tuned ready to take on the Commonwealth in the battle for gold.

They have the best wishes of all shotgunners in their quest for medals.

Honorary Life Registration was bestowed upon Mr Roy Holtfreter, of Northam, W.A. at a recent meeting of the Executive Committee. This was in recognition of the outstanding service given to the Association, as an Executive Member for Western Australia, over the past ten years.

RECORD ATTENDANCE AT VICTORIAN SCHOOL BOY AND SCHOOL GIRL CHAMPIONSHIP

Melbourne Gun Club on July 29 was the venue for the fourth School Boy and School Girl Annual Clay Target Championship. Some 375 students from 57 schools, each fired at twenty targets from 15 metres to decide the winners for 1982.

Shooting commenced at 10 a.m. and finished by 3 p.m., the competition being single barrel shooting only.

Nominations were up by 53 on last year. No doubt entries would have been higher had Victoria not been in the grip of a severe flu epidemic during the winter months which kept big numbers of students and teachers away from school.

Victoria has in excess of 115 Secondary schools statewide participating in a firearms training program. Many Gun Clubs provide their facilities and coaching help at no cost. It is at this level where the students get their introduction to Clay Target shooting and firearms awareness.

Numerous club personnel teachers and club coaches came along with their school teams to help with the duties of refereeing, scoring etc., 357 students fired at something like 8,000 clays during 5 hours of shooting. Full marks must go to all concerned with the organising of the program.

Six of the Melbourne Gun Clubs' 9 traps were put into service and judging by the rapid increase in numbers, I'd take a guess and say that next year we could expect to have to use 9 traps.

What a great thing it would be if eventually it could result in all states joining in the tournament so that we have a National School Boy and School Girl Championship each year with all states participating.

Winchester Australia has sponsored the Championship since its inception several years ago. A lot of credit must go to Lyn Barr Prinicipal of Wangaratta High School who has organised the Championship each year from the beginning. Lyn also wrote the Gun Safety manual for Secondary Schools, this manual is the most comprehensive booklet I have seen on the subject of safe shotgun handling. Winchester Australia are to be congratulated on their gesture of underwriting the cost of printing and producing the manual.

Generally speaking the standard of shooting was excellent right down to Junior boys.





Gun handling and correct approach to the task of shooting moving clay targets was something I really admired considering that with few exceptions most boys and girls were not using what we could term the properly fitting gun, which is no doubt the most troublesome detail with youngsters growing up. Girls Champion was C. Wakefield of Mildura with 22/25, followed by J. Van der Brand of Traralgon, who scored 20/25. C. Flavel from Rainbow High School came third with 16/20.

G. Spink of Wangaratta Technical School, took the Junior Boys Championship with 22/25 edging out S. Askew of Sale Technical School 20/25. A. Pitt of Rainbow High School 18/20 was third.

The senior boys' championship fell to a very consistent shooter R. Kelymack of Bell Park Technical School. His score of 29/30 also earned him the champion of champions sash.

He was hard-pressed by D. Hare of Wodonga High School, who scored 28/30. Third was S. Dignan, of Colac High School on 37/40 after a taxing shoot-off. Wangaratta Technical School won the Teams Championship with 38/40. Two teams on 36/40 tied for second place — Echuca Technical School and Bairnsdale Technical School.

Each of the individual winners and runners-up received a sash, cup and trophy given by the sponsors, Winchester Australia.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

A meeting of the Executive Committee was conducted in Melbourne on Sunday and Monday, September 5 and 6.

This followed a very successful meeting of State Presidents and Secretaries, conducted on the Saturday. In a first for the Association, State Presidents and Secretaries were invited to attend the Executive Meeting as observers.

Resignations and Appointments

Mr R. C. Mules of South Australia had tendered his resignation prior to the meeting. It was accepted with regret. Bob Mules was the longest serving member of the Executive Committee, having been appointed in March 1964. His place has been taken by Mr Brian Growden, of Bordertown.

1983 Trap Nationals

As with Brisbane, 50 targets will be shot in one visit to the traps. A change for Adelaide however is that the 50 targets will be shot on the one trap, competitors taking enough ammunition with them to the trap, to complete the 50 targets. Squads will pause after 25 targets, to refill pockets ready for the second 25. Squads will consist of five shooters, who will shoot at five targets before changing lanes. Black targets will be used throughout the Tournament.

1983 Skeet Nationals

The 1983 Skeet Nationals will be conducted at Melbourne Gun Club over four days, commencing on Wednesday November 16. All events will be graded A.A., A, B, and C.

Four hundred targets will be shot over the four days, there will be four 50 target events, and two of 100 targets. The 100 target events will be the Commonwealth Skeet Championship and The National Skeet Championship. The Champion of Champions will be the high Gun over the 400 targets.

A two man Teams Match will be conducted over the 400 targets for nominated pairs, not necessarily from the same club.

An Interstate Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match for teams of five, with all scores to count, will be conducted in conjunction with the fourth 50 target event.

An all Australian Skeet Team of 15 shooters will be selected over the 400 targets. All Australian teams of 5 ladies and 5 juniors will also be selected over 400 targets.

A.C.T.A. branded shells will be used at both Trap and Skeet National Championships in 1983.

Referee's Association

New Rules as proposed by the Referee's Association were accepted by the Executive Committee, and will be implemented on January 1, 1983. These new rules, together with abridged rules for Referees, will be printed in C.T.S.N. prior to January 1983.

The major change is in the handicapping formula, where most problems have occurred.

Data Processing

The Executive Committee accepted the recommendation from consultants Deloitte, Haskins and Sells, to purchase in-house micro-computer equipment. The changeover will take place over the next two months. A full report will follow in C.T.S.N.

Veterans

Following many complaints about the 30 years continuous service condition applying to Veteran concession registration, the Executive Committee resolved that any shooter attaining the age of 65 years be eligible for all veteran concessions, as from January 1, 1983.

Ladies and Juniors National Trap Teams

The U.K. Associations had agreed to conducting postal competitions for Ladies and Junior National Teams as from 1983. The teams will be selected at National Championships, and will consist of five shooters, all scores to count. They will shoot at 100 targets, pointscore.

Administration Manual

Q.C.T.A. Secretary Bev Grice, and the Executive Director, have been given the responsibility of producing a National Administration Manual, for use by Clubs, Zones and State Associations.

Many other items were discussed over the two days of the meeting.

FORBIDDEN SUCCESS

It has always been my ambition to write a short story of this type since returning from an overseas shooting holiday in 1977. This biography of a shooter caught between an overwhelming urge to travel and shoot has ended in sarcastic and often unnecessary squalid remarks. This story can be taken whatever way the hat fits.

I once had said to me after writing the article in C.T.S.N. entitled "Moscow be damned or be damned" that it was the biggest heap of diarrhoea he had seen. Needless to say this oritic no longer shoots. As one becomes more competent in the clay shooting game and gradually climbs the stardom ladder the critics become louder. I have noticed that success at any level inspires envy and curiosity in almost equal proportions. With the death wish upon you in shoot offs, anybody who steps out of the ranks and achieves success in any clay field is inevitably the object of close scrutiny and suspicion. The general shooting fraternity feasts on shooting gossip — the appetite seems insatiable.


A suitable process of winners can take place in our bigger programs, such as a C grade winner taking out a Grand Prix Overall can sometimes rely on having his success concreted, yet a man or lesser woman who, by his/her own unaided efforts earns the same success, often is branded a parasite taking a big share of the cake.

Likewise ISU shooters are accorded more column inches in this magazine than the winners of our National Titles, local Winchester Tournaments and State and Commonwealth Championships. To some people success is a mention in the local paper, to others it is the gold watch and the testimonal dinner at the end of forty years drudgery.

Finally, those of us who have ever been caught in the searchlights that sweep the noman's land between chance, fame and obscurity can expect little mercy from the custodians of public opinion.

We, the shooters who have afforded to rise up the ladder are considered fair game for every marksman who is content to stay in the middle. We as the game, appear to have no closed season even in our own territory.

Friday 13th - Saturday 14th - Sunday 15th August, 1982. The Victorian State Skeet Carnival was conducted at Mildura Gun Club over this weekend. Numbers were well below the previous Carnival attendance, when it was hosted there in 1980. I feel, the number of major tournaments that are available for shooters today has some effect on attendances. States are running Zone and State Carnivals giving shooters the opportunity to shoot in their own backyard, without having to travel long distances to major tournaments. Our economy, along with the Australia wide drought conditions that prevail at the moment have some bearing on the shooting activity, making shooters a little more selective on when and where they shoot.

A meeting of Skeet shooting enthusiasts was conducted on Friday night with the 1983 Skeet Nationals being the major

topic. Discussion took place on the number of targets, to be shot, types of events and the number of days the titles should be conducted over. The meeting provided valuable information as to what the shooter wanted by way of trophies etc. **Sunday 22nd August, 1982.**

A field of about 40 shooters participated with Roy Warren from Gunbower taking a double on the day by winning the Ganawarra Double Barrel Championship and the Silent Rise Graded Championship. Roy also won the 15-19m trophy in the Trophy Handicap. Brian Reade is the President, and with his members runs a good shoot. Brian has just returned from a fishing and shooting trip that took him North and coincided with the Darwin shoot. He tells me, it was a great trip and well worth seeing Australia's outback.

The Referees Association met for the second time over these two days, to finalize the rules alterations being recommended to the Executive meeting in September for implementation in 1983.


This Association has studied all of the recommendations put before it by clubs, shooters, and state Associations in regard to the rules. The changes they are recommending to be made, have been arrived at, after long debate and deliberation of the material it has had before it. No doubt, after all the work time and money spent on trying to improve the existing rules the recommended changes will not meet with the approval of all shooters and club administrators.

Wednesday 25th, Thursday 26th August, 1982.

The A.C.T.A. office claimed most of my time over these two days. Along with our Executive Director Ian Hill, visits were made to Winchester Australia and Eley Ammunition. Both of these firms are major supporters of our sport throughout Australia, and in particular, our National Championships. Bill Hall, our accountant from Deloitte Haskins and Sells was

The S.A. State Association was conducting their State Skeet Titles over this weekend. They had a field of some 50 entries with top Victorian shots making the trip. A Zone Down the Line Trap Carnival was run in conjunction with the Skeet. This created a few problems for the organizers as it was difficult to get enough workers to keep the show going. I am of the opinion unless a club has the facilities and staff a Skeet Carnival with 50 shooters is best run as an individual tournament and not tied in with D.T.L. events, particularly when Skeet shooters are requesting to shoot at a minimum of 100 targets per day, and separate National Skeet Championships are soon to become a reality.

Paul Thomson and Adrian Cousens from Victoria collected their share of Skeet Titles. South Australia's Ray Kimber won


Adrian Cousens, one of the Victorians to make the trip collected the Skeet High Gun with a score of 197/200.

1982 NATIONALS TARGETS

Following criticism of the targets thrown at the Brisbane Nationals in May, Q.C.T.A. President Neil Hardy presented a paper to the Executive Committee recently on this subject. The matter was fully discussed and it was agreed that the Neil Hardy paper has the full backing of the Executive Committee, and should be re-printed in C.T.S.N. It was further noted that shooters are welcome to observe the setting of traps each morning during the Nationals.

- 1. Every morning at Brisbane Gun Club the Assistant Tournament Director Les James, the two shoot marshals and myself set the traps as per Trap Rule 6(a)...not less than 45 metres nor more than 55 metres (measured horizontally at trap level)...subtending an angle at the trap of 45 degrees right and left of the centre line. At Brisbane Gun Club targets land in the gully and the only way to
- Gun Club targets land in the gully and the only way to accurately assess distance is to stand on the line of the 50 metre pegs. Les James did this religiously to ensure targets passed the 50 metre peg at the level of the traps. The traps were set for height, windage, distance and then set to hole no. 5. Anyone with mechanical knowledge of White Flyer traps will agree that they CANNOT throw to 45 degrees either side of straight away in hole no. 5.
- 2. Brisbane conditions for wind and changing light are notoriously difficult. The fickle wind can cause right hand targets to rise and left handers to fall alarmingly. A trap cannot be made to compensate for this and the effect on targets varies with the wind. Fluoro targets have proven the best in the wide variety of light conditions to be experienced on the grounds.
- 3. The aim of the organizing committee was to provide the best possible legal targets for the conditions. THE TRAPS WERE NOT SET TO MAXIMUM DISTANCE OR ANGLE. From where the shooter stands it is impossible to accurate ly assess if the target passes the 50 metre peg at the level of the traps yet the critics have this supernatural ability.
- 4. To complain about the targets is really an excuse to not accept that the reason for missing targets is their inability to produce a champion's score in difficult conditions. In the Pre-Nationals the traps were set the same, and in easier conditions scores were far better. Whinging about targets is poor sportsmanship which is growing alarmingly in clay target shooting."

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

The attached letter relates to queries I had insofar as shooting on Sundays is concerned and relating to spotlight shooting in Victoria. Following an incident last Sunday of a confrontation between a Police Constable (of senior rank) and a person in possession of a firearm on private property, I believe there is a great need for clarification. As this letter quite clearly spells out the facts related to both subjects and is of utmost interest to shooters, I would like you to place it in the Shooting News for all to see.

It is quite obvious that from last weekend there are some police also who are unaware of the law in relation to shooting on Sundays. Although the letter is dated 15th December 1980. Nothing has changed from that printed.

Mr G. L. Willett.

In reply to your letter dated 26th November, 1980, I wish to advise you of the information you require.

In answer to your first question, Section 29(b) of the Firearms Act relates to Sunday shooting and is set out as follows:—

"Any person found engaged in shooting for pleasure, sport or profit of any kind whatever on Sunday, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty" —

and Section 29(c) relates to carrying a firearm on a Sunday and provides penalty for any person found doing so. It should be noted by yourself that Section 29 indicates that the shooting should be for pleasure, sport or profit and as so eliminates any offence in destruction of vermin and as such you are permitted to shoot the vermin you have listed in Question 2. There is no indication in the Act that it must be the owner of the property who is the person to destroy the vermin and as such your employee would be in a position to do so.

In relation to your query on spotlight shooting in Question 4, there is no law relating to the use of spotlights for shooting purposes. The offence committed by these persons is firing bullets or missiles across land used in connection with primary production or on roadways. If your activities are restricted to your own property or that of your neighbour, with permission, there is no offence, but I must point out that it is the activity of spotlight shooters that draws the attention of police and as such, intended activity should be notified to your local Police Station to save unnecessary enquiry and attention.

In any case that I have referred to, it must be remembered that the actions of the shooter must be "bona fide" for the destruction of vermin and not just a case to shoot rabbits or other animals for sport or pleasure under the excuse of vermin destruction.

The new legislation will go before the Victorian Government in the Spring Parliamentary session and will undoubtedly be passed.

Continued reference to this legislation and gun-control will only bring shooters into dispute with the general public and will denigrate the work of those who have used the only available avenues open to the shooters (i.e. access to the government) to see that the views of the shooters are made plain to the Legislators.

The legislation will be a reality so shooters should accept the situation, live with the system, and stop "rocking the boat".

Whilst at the typewriter I feel that an answer to Chris Hughes' letter in the CTN for September is required.


SAPPHIRE TROPHIES BRING LARGE CROWD TO GEMFIELDS SHOOT


Some fine shooting from Malcolm was seen at the weekend.




INTERNATIONAL GUN CLUB S.A. BIRTHDAY SHOOT







CONFEDERATION OF AUSTRALIAN SPORT NEWS

SPORTS CONFERENCE IN FINLAND

Australia was represented at the recent Congress on International Understanding and Sport held in Helsinki, Finland by Executive Director of the Confederation of Australian Sport, Mr Garry Daly.

Approximately 300 delegates from 39 countries attended the Congress, which was conducted under the auspices of the International council for Sport and Physical Education.

The themes of the Congress were:

- (a) The extent, content and organisation of international co-operation in sports in the past, present and future.
- (b) Specific negotiations were undertaken with overseas information resources.
 (c) Hermitted the identification of a second data in the identificati
- (c) It permitted the identification of experts, to whom Australia's sportspeople should be exposed, particularly in the "Sport for All" program areas.(d) It lead to the appointment of the Confederation of Austra-
- (d) It lead to the appointment of the Confederation of Australian Sport to the Sport and Leisure Committee of I.C.S.P.E. (The International Committee for Sport and Physical Education).

1982/83 FEDERAL BUDGET COMMENT

Following the announcement by Treasurer John Howard of the 1982/83 Federal Budget, and its consequent impact on sport, Confederation of Australian Sport President, Wayne V. Reid has issued the following statement:

"The overall allocation for expenditure on sports facilities and activities is \$24.585 million in six years. Of the total funding directed to sports areas, \$4.0 million has been allocated to the Australian Institute of Sport for its ongoing cost and \$7.3 million for facilities; \$180,000 to Australia Games; \$500,000 for preparation of Australia's 1984 Olympics Team. These areas are highly deserving of Government funding and the Confederation believes they should receive the maximum Government support possible. The Institute in fact received less than it hoped for, but media reports attributed to its administration indicate that it is satisfied with the result."

"Looking at the budget allocations, the sporting community at large would have to be grateful to the Government in respect to these highly visible, highly needed areas of expenditure. There is, however, a problem area that has not received the attention it needs and that is in the Sports Development Program."

"The \$305,000 increase over last year to \$3.19 million, spread over 119 national sporting bodies, will not give any impetus to our Sports Development Programs. New projects, including those funded by the Federal Government are placing continually greater demands upon the capabilities of sports administrations and with rising costs, the ability of many sporting bodies to meet these new demands may well be overtaxed because of limited resources."

"Following the Budget announcement, representatives of the Confederation met with the Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, Mr Tom McVeigh in Canberra on Thursday 19th August, 1982 and expressed the foregoing comments to him."

"The Minister was empathetic to this viewpoint and he acknowledges that the weakest link in the financial provisions is the Sports Development Program. It is pleasing to record his willingness to discuss with the Confederation this prime area of concern."

"It is quite clear that the critical period for a case to be presented on behalf of the sporting community is the next 4-5 months and although the result may not, subject to whether an early election is held, be seen until August next year, the work has already begun."

Sportspeople in general need to become more involved in the lobbying process, as Federal Politicians must be made aware that sportspeople are also voting people.




TAREE-WINGHAM GUN CLUB
