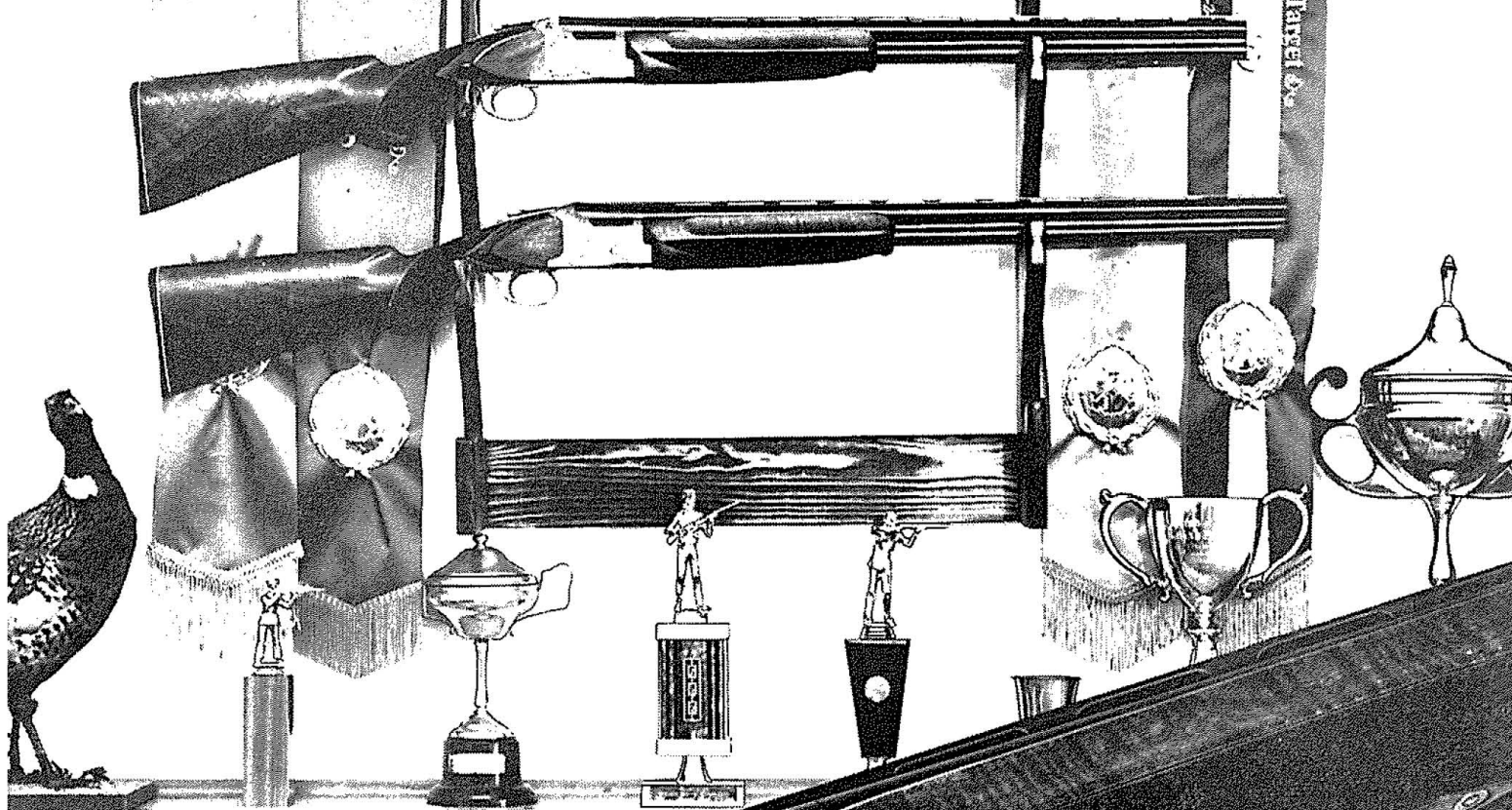

AUSTRALIA'S SHOOTERS STARS OF COMMONWEALTH

In the best performance ever in Commonwealth Games history, Australian shooters captured 16 medals in the 20 shooting events. The sixteen person team amassed the highest medal tally of any nation competing in the shooting events, to easily lead the table.

The four shotgunners won at least one medal each in a marvellous performance of skilled dedicated shooting.

SATURDAY OCTOBER 2

TRAP TEAMS 200 TARGETS

It was a magnificent start to shotgunning events with Ellis and Rumbel taking Gold for Australia.

Conditions were good at Belmont for the 11am start, thirteen teams entered for this new event at the Commonwealth Games. The wind was variable but mainly light, fine,

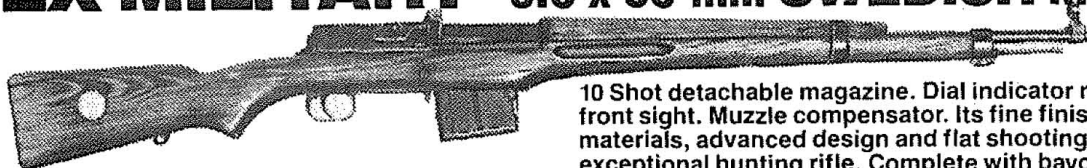
sunny conditions ensured good light. Facilities at Brisbane Gun Club had been upgraded to help spectators. Temporary stands were erected behind ground one, which gave an excellent view of all the action.

Jim Ellis was the first of the Australian pair to commence. He looked in top form and had been training exceptionally well, winning the badge match the previous week.

A hard right-hander was Jim's only problem in the first round as he scored 24. Terry Rumbel followed Jim onto ground 1 and immediately showed that he too was in good form. Some doubts had been expressed about his training form, but like all true champions, Terry has the ability to lift his game when it matters, in top competition. He looked like running the round clean, so well was he shooting, however the very last target got away, to give him a solid 24.

After round 1, Australia led with 48/50 from Scotland and England 46, New Zealand 44, and Canada 43. Other 24's in round 1 came from Peter Croft of England, and Martin Girvan, Scotland. Nobody had shot the 25.

Australia stretched the lead in round 2 when Ellis ran them all for a fine 25. Terry Rumbel had trouble with one target for Australia to score 49 in the round and total 97/100. Scotland moved into second spot on 93, England 92, and Zimbabwe fourth on 90. Canada had disappointed dropping 13 targets in the first 100, former World Champion John Primrose starting with two 21's and George Leary 22 and 23.

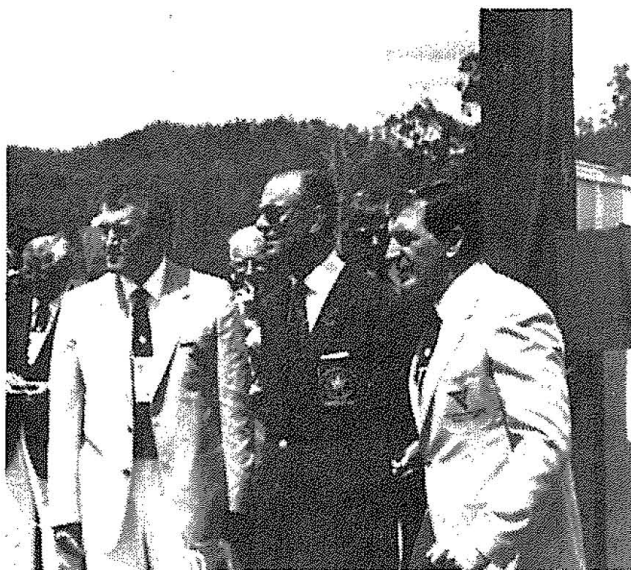
Australia increased the lead in round 3 to 5 targets, with both Ellis and Rumbel shooting solid 24's. Scotland were still in second spot on 140 and England a target back on 139. George Leary of Canada, Ian Gordon Zimbabwe, and Graham Geater New Zealand, all shot perfect 25's.

It looked at this stage, how far Australia, with one round to go, and both shooters in top form. Jim Ellis seemed to relax a bit in the last 25 and dropped three. James Young of Scotland in the same squad as Jim, fared even worse letting four go by. Peter Croft of England shot 23 in his last round to move England into second place with one round of 25 targets left to complete the match.

Terry Rumbel went at the task with his usual rhythm and though he dropped 2, was very solid.

Peter Boden ensured Silver for England with 24 and the second Scot Martin Girvan carded 22 to give Scotland the Bronze, one target ahead of Canada.

Gold for Australia, the first ever in Commonwealth Games competition by the fine margin of 4 targets from England, and Scotland a further 3 targets back for Bronze. Enormous

cheers echoed around the Belmont complex as Ellis and Rumbel were announced the winners. Coach Peter Quire's grin was from ear to ear after a tough day spent shooting every target with his charges.

The hard work, the money, the time spent training, all the self discipline, the result was worth it, Australia's first Commonwealth Games shotgunning Gold medal.

Both Ellis and Rumbel had shot 95/100 to total 190/200 for the Gold. Canadian George Leary after a slow start, shot the last 50 straight to also card 95. Welshman Denis Brown, suffering from flu started badly with 18 and 21, but then shot 49/50 in his last two rounds.

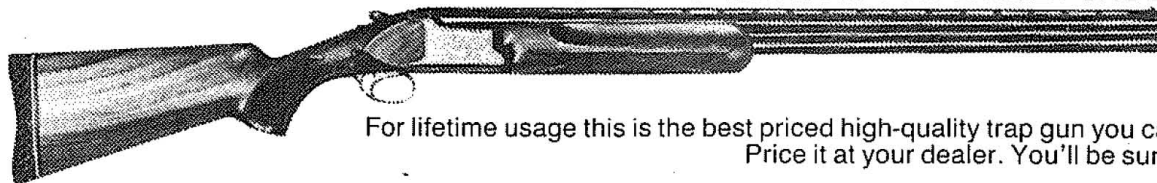
H.R.H. Prince Phillip, The Duke of Edinburgh paid a visit to the ground during the morning, taking a keen interest in the shooting.

SUNDAY OCTOBER 3

SKET TEAM — 200 TARGETS

Eleven teams lined up for the start, two fewer than in the trap event. Weather again fine, light breeze, could Australia make it two out of two in the teams matches. The competition looked tough, Canadians Altmann and Gabriel, Englishmen Sheffield and Sykes. Altmann had won the badge match with 99/100, Woolley New Zealand with young teammate Paul McGowan were also expected to do well.

Hale and Crikis had been training well, coach Peter Quire was confident.

Alex Crikis was the first Australian to visit, quickly settling down after missing his first target, to shoot a solid 23. Ian Hale followed with a brilliant 25 to have Australia tied on 48 with Canada and Northern Ireland. New Zealand were one away on 47 with England 46.

25's had been carded by Gabriel Canada, Hale Australia, Woolley New Zealand, and Willis Northern Ireland.

Round 2 was again very tight with Crikis and Hale shooting 24's. This totalled 96 for the half way stage and had Australia still tied for the lead with Canada and Northern Ireland.

Canada's Fred Altmann, and England's Jim Sheffield shot the 25 in this second round.

Altmann the Canadian is known as the executive skeet shooter because of his habit of taking a brief case to the layout with him.

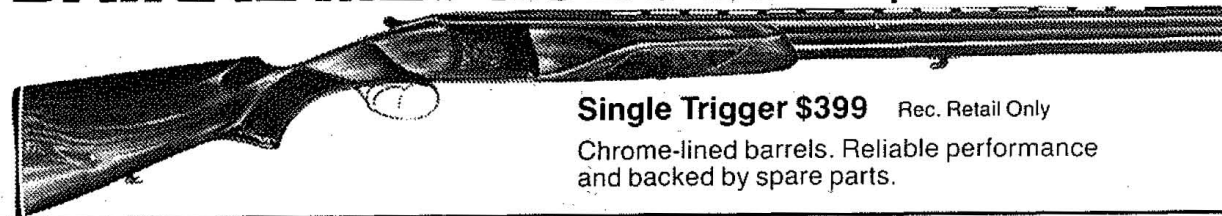
A quick peep showed the brief case to be almost packed with shooting glasses of all colours, which are changed often to suit the light conditions. He carries more glasses with him than Tom Lucas takes duck shooting. This observer saw Altmann change shooting glasses three times during the first two rounds.

Into round 3 with Crikis shooting 23, Hale 24, Canada ran 47 to still tie Australia, with England making it a three way tie going into the last round, after a 48 total. This 48 from England was to eventually clinch the Silver medal as Silver and Bronze were decided on countback.

Perfect 25's were shot in the third round by Sheffield of England, Woolley New Zealand, and Clague, Isle of Man.

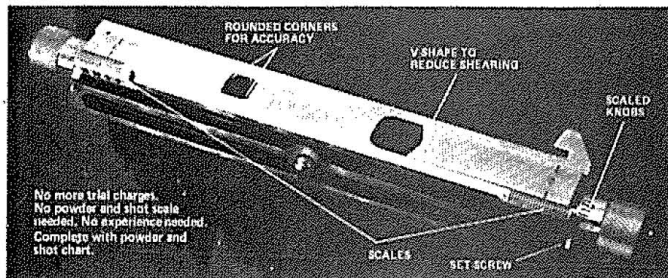

To say the match was tight at this stage was understating it, very tense and nervous faces were to be seen getting ready. Altmann was checking glasses, packets of shells were nervously emptied into pockets. Altmann Canada 23, for 166, Sykes England 24 for 167, and Alex Crikis Australia, a brilliant 25 to put them one target ahead on 168.

Gabriel Canada, Sheffield England, and Hale Australia were all in the last squad to shoot to decide the medals.

Hale dropped an early target to tie England, Sheffield dropped one too to put Australia back in front. Gabriel was working very hard and was still clean. Station five saw real drama when Sheffield dropped another. Tragedy struck when Ian Hale missed the double on this station to put Canada in front with England and Australia tied. In one of the best pressure performances seen at Belmont, Brian Gabriel completed a magic final 25 to clinch the Gold medal for Canada, with a team total of 191. Tied on 190 were England and Australia, the Silver going to England on a countback.

To decide the placings, individual scores are added together for each round, beginning with the final 25.

Both England and Australia had scored 47 in the final round, but in the third, it was England 48 to Australia 47 to win Silver.

The skeet teams match had been a mammoth struggle with Canada being just too good.

John Woolley had given notice of what was to come with an individual score of 99/100. Gabriel Canada, and Sheffield England, had both shot 97's to be next best. The Australians shared their 190 on 95 each.

This event was to be shot over two days, 100 targets each day. After Australia's gold medal win in the Team Match, hopes were high that Ellis or Rumbel would win the gold.

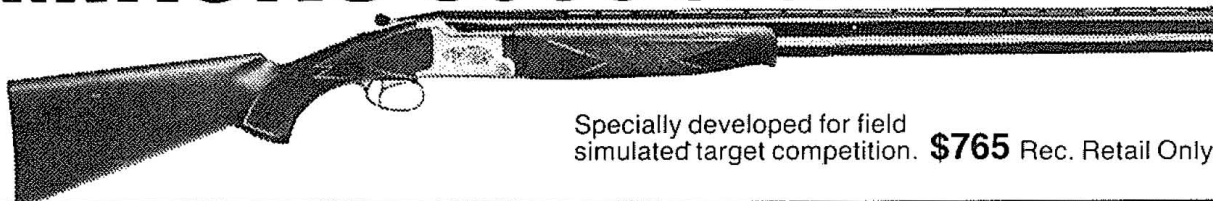
Terry Rumbel attacked the targets right from the start in a very positive way, carding a brilliant 25 in his first round. The wind was quite strong and Terry was shooting his targets very quickly. This was the only perfect score in Round 1,

Peter Croft — England, George Leary — Canada, Denis Brown — Wales, Robin Collins — New Zealand and Shu-Ming Cheng — Hong Kong, all on 24, Peter Boden — England 23, Jim Ellis a disappointing 22.

Terry Rumbel again shot a perfect 25 in Round 2 to lead on 50, followed by Croft England 49, Ellis who shot the lot on 47, with Collins New Zealand, Boden England, Brown Wales and Connolly Zimbabwe, all together on 46.

Another clean round saw Rumbel two targets in front at 75 targets from Croft on 73, Peter Boden and Denis Brown, Wales on 71. Jim Ellis clearly upset by a newspaper report, dropped further behind with another 22 to be on 69.

The last round of Day 1 had Terry Rumbel dropping two targets to reach the half-way mark on 98/100, three clear of Boden and Croft England. One target further back on 94 was Denis Brown Wales, now recovered from flu, with Jim Ellis and James Young Scotland on 93.

Overnight leader Terry Rumbel dropped one target in his fifth 25, to still lead by three, from Boden and Croft. Round six, another solid 24 from Rumbel totalled 146 which put him 4 targets ahead of the Englishmen Boden and Croft, with Ellis two further back on 140.

The strain of leading all the way started to take its toll in Round 7 when Rumbel let 4 targets go by without breaking. Boden and Croft shot solid 24's to be only one behind with the last 25 coming up. Ellis carded 23 to be three behind the Englishmen.

Rumbel was the first of the top three to finish his 200 targets shooting 23/25 in his last round to total 190. This meant that both Croft & Boden could win outright by shooting the 25. Croft was next to finish dropping one target to tie Rumbel on 190.

All eyes were on Peter Boden as he began his last round. Very deliberately, with great concentration, targets were demolished one by one. One or two were scratchy, but all were broken.

A fine performance, running the round clean under enormous pressure, knowing he had to shoot the lot to win the Gold Medal.

Peter Boden is 35 years old, comes from Bedworth in Warwickshire and has been shooting for 15 years. Asked about the pressure in the last round he said there was plenty, but that he had won before from the same position and knew he was capable of doing it. I also commented that he didn't seem to watch targets other than his own. Was this deliberate, apparently fixing his eyes on the grass two to three metres in front between shots, deep in concentration. Whilst it wasn't deliberately done, it was a habit he had developed. He believes that the 10 to 12 seconds between closing his gun and shooting, is ample time for his eyes to adjust to the light and background.

A shoot-off was necessary to separate Terry Rumbel and Peter Croft in second place. Rumbel dropped two targets, but it was good enough to win the Silver Medal. Jim Ellis shot a, very nice 25 in his last round while watching Terry Rumbel in the shoot-off with Croft, to finish in fourth spot on 188.

A great victory to Peter Boden, who scored two 25's in his eight rounds and no tally worse than 23.

No excuses are offered but this observer believes Jim Ellis was affected by the critical report published in a southern newspaper prior to the Individual Competition.

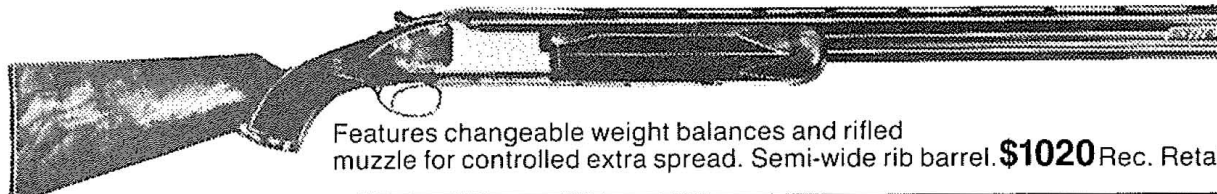

Thursday October 7

SKEET INDIVIDUAL — 200 TARGETS

After the Teams Match it was clear that the Individual Event would be keenly contested.

A top field of 23 included the Defending Champion, John Woolley of New Zealand, Canadians Altmann and Gabriel, Englishmen Sykes and Sheffield and Australians Hale and Crikis. Others to impress in practice were Dunlop of Scotland and the youthful Indian Hari Sandhu.

One hundred targets were to be shot each day, four hours of intense concentration on each of the two days. Five 25's were recorded in the first round, by Sykes, Woolley, Hale, Dunlop and Altmann. Crikis had problems with two targets and was one behind Sheffield on 24.

Sykes and Altmann again shot clear rounds to lead on 50 from Woolley and Sheffield 49, with Hale, Dunlop, Crikis and Sandhu all looked together on 48.

In Round Three Sykes again went clear to lead on 75 from Woolley 74, Sheffield and Altmann 73, Hale 72, Gabriel 71 and Crikis who was disappointed with his 22 for a total of 70.

Day 1 of the skeet ended with Sykes and Woolley tied on 99, Hale after a good 24, three targets back on 96 with West of Northern Ireland. Crikis was in equal sixth place carding 94. Altmann of Canada had faltered with a disastrous round of 18. The stage was set for the final 100 targets with ten shooters within 5 targets.

Prime Minister Frazer had watched intently, taking a great interest in the skeet. Another visitor to the complex was

Premier of Queensland Joh Bjelke-Petersen, who is Patron of the Queensland Clay Target Association.

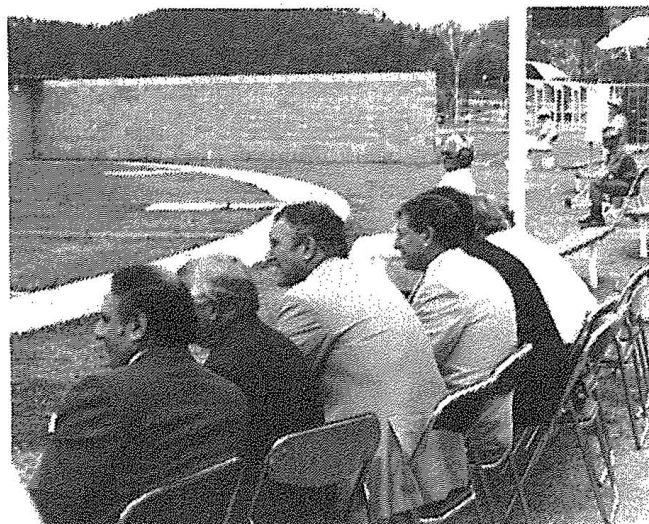
Friday October 8 will long be remembered as the day Ian Hale shot the lot under enormous pressure. Hale was bitterly disappointed with his last round in the Teams Match the previous Sunday and was out to prove a lot to the critics.

Joint overnight leader Woolley went merrily on breaking his first 50 on the final day to lead on 149. Wally Sykes, the quietly spoken Suffolk man had shot two 24's to be in second spot 2 targets behind with Hale shooting his 50 brilliantly, to be one further back on 146.

West Northern Ireland, Gabriel Canada and Crikis Australia, were tied on 143. Crikis had shot 49 of his 50 targets in this morning session.

To everyone's surprise Woolley dropped a target in his second last round to lead by two on 173. Sykes too had trouble with one to also card 24 and put him on 171 with the last round coming up. Ian Hale went relentlessly on, breaking his 25 to tie with Sykes. He had shot the 75 straight, could he make the perfect score 100/100 for the day and perhaps take the Silver Medal from Sykes.

John Woolley meanwhile in an earlier squad was all concentration as he shot his last round. He dropped one but cruised in typical Woolley fashion to tie up the Gold Medal with a new Commonwealth Record score of 197/200. A very elated John Woolley accepted the plaudits of the crowd as he left the layout, successfully defending the title he had won in Edmonton four years earlier. A hush descended over the ground as Wally Sykes and Ian Hale began their final round. They traded target for target until Sykes missed high five in the doubles. Hale negotiated this station successfully to lead by one with eight targets to go. They both shot the rest to give Ian Hale the Silver Medal with 196, just one behind John Woolley and one ahead of Wally Sykes. A real gutsy performance from Hale to create a new record in Commonwealth Games by shooting the 100 straight.

FIREARMS LEGISLATION AND THE VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT

The policy of the Victorian Government in relation to firearms has been the subject of considerable discussion, and no small amount of distortion. Now that the Government has been in office for some six months, it is time to set out the fundamental points of the proposed legislation and the steps taken by the Government so far.

At the outset, it must be understood that the proposed legislation is a package of reforms designed to: —

- (a) Ensure that owners of firearms have some understanding of the safe use and safe-keeping of firearms.
- (b) Ensure that owners of firearms have a proper use for those firearms.
- (c) Ensure that owners of firearms are, and feel responsible for each individual firearm in their ownership.

To this end the Government proposes to legislate to require that applicants for shooters' licences pass a test (in question and answer form) in relation to firearms and the safe use of firearms. Applicants will also be required to give an assurance of safe-keeping of firearms when they are not in use. This will **not** involve police carrying out a search of the house of every applicant for a licence but is to be seen as an educative measure and as a condition of the licence, the future breach of which should it be found to occur, may be relevant to action in respect of the licence.

Importantly, there will be a cooling off period between the time that an applicant satisfies all the conditions necessary to obtain a licence and the time of the acquisition of firearms. Such a cooling off period will ensure that persons applying for a licence have a serious and continuing interest in owning a firearm and are not just obtaining a firearm on an impulse.

Persons will have to show a good reason for obtaining each additional firearm but there will **not** be any absolute limit on the number of firearms. It is understood that sporting shooters often need a number of different types of firearms or for that matter more than one firearm of one type.

Finally, each firearm will be registered. Registration will be in the form of a notation of the details of the firearm on the licence.

To assist the Government to implement the new laws, the Government has appointed an interim Firearms Consultative Committee. The Committee is made up of Mr. Bob Buchan, the President of the Victorian Clay Target Association and the Melbourne Gun Club, Mr. John Phillips, Q.C., a barrister with extensive experience in criminal law and Chief Superintendent J. Ibbotson of the Victoria Police Force.

The committee has met on a number of occasions and has considered carefully submissions from interested persons. It has also considered detailed estimates in relation to the new administrative arrangements required.

The new legislation will contain provision for the establishment of a permanent Firearms Consultative Committee made up of representatives of shooters, lawyers and police officers.

That committee will have two broad functions: —

- (a) To act as an appeal body to which applicants who have been refused licences or registration at the first instance, can appeal.
- (b) To advise the Government in relation to any particular difficulties in the administration of the new legislation and as to any changes which may be required.

The Government has been particularly fortunate to have the expert assistance of experienced shooters such as Mr Bob Buchan, Mr. George Biggs and Mr. Ian Hicks, in developing an appropriate safety test instruction booklet. There has also been input from representatives of the Hunter Safety Committee which has been most valuable.

I have also had the privilege in recent months of presenting trophies at the Victorian Schoolboys and Schoolgirls Clay Target Championships at the Melbourne Gun Club and opening the Victorian Clay Target Championships at Echuca. In company with Mr. Bob Buchan, I have also visited the Winchester factory at Geelong and we have spoken to firearms dealers in Melbourne, Geelong and country areas.

I would hope that the above outline of the Government's proposals and the consultation which has been carried out, will indicate that responsible shooters have nothing to fear from the Government's proposals on the manner in which the new laws will be administered.

Everyone in the community should support the strong emphasis on the safety and responsibility aspects of the new laws. I must say that I have been most impressed with the excellent conditions at clay target clubs in relation to safety procedures. Target shooting is a fine sport and the Government does not propose to do anything which will unduly impinge on target shooters. Rather, it hopes to be able to ensure that a greater percentage of firearms owners are as competent in the handling of firearms and as responsible as the average member of the clay target clubs. ○

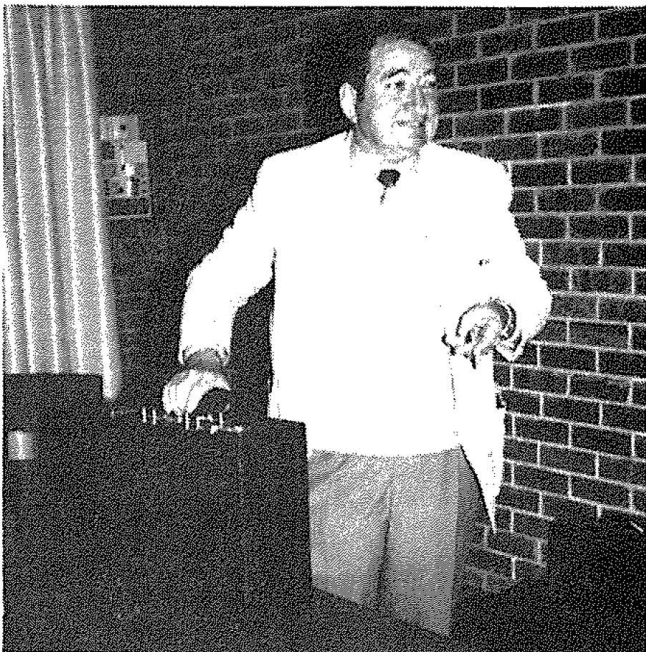

In my opinion this meeting turned out to be very valuable, to those present, and gave the opportunity for all States, to share their overall operational problems, and gain knowledge of how best to improve any shortcomings that may exist within individual States. State Associations play a major role in the success of our operation at a National level, and as well are responsible for the control and development of the sport in general, within their separate States. The pleasing part of this meeting, was the fact that all States had representation at this venue. A recommendation to the Executive from this meeting, was for a State and Club administration manual be compiled and made available for clubs throughout Australia. This was ratified by the full Executive and will be available to clubs in due course.

Sunday 5th and Monday 6th September, 1982

An Executive meeting followed the State Presidents and Secretaries meeting with, for the first time ever, the State Presidents and Secretaries being permitted to sit in on the Executive meeting as observers. State Associations will no doubt be advantaged by their officials having witnessed the National Body in operation. Details for the running of the 1983 National Skeet Championships, to be held in Victoria, at Melbourne Gun Club, were fully discussed and finalised. The tournament is to be conducted in November over four days,

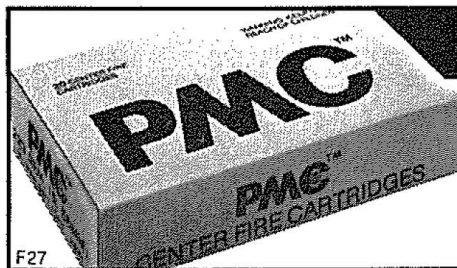
commencing on Wednesday and finishing on Saturday. The format of the program will be four fifty target events over the first two days, followed by two one hundred target Championships, a total of four hundred targets in all. This should please the skeet enthusiasts. Ladies and junior teams are to also be selected at the 1983 Trap Nationals for postal competition, as now exists with the Mackintosh trophy. Arrangements for this to be implemented, were finalised by our Executive Director, Ian Hill, while in Great Britain, with our four man team.

The rules changes as submitted and recommended by the newly formed Referees Association, were fully discussed, ratified and approved for operation from 1st January, 1983. Some of the rules changes are quite different from anything that has been operating in Australia up until now. However, I personally believe, that the changes recommended, once operating will be beneficial to competitors and all concerned. An essential part of the new rules will be the education of referees, club managements and shooters on their interpretation and operation. This will be the responsibility of all State Associations, in conjunction with the referees Association and rules supervisors. A print out of the new rules will be included, as a lift out section in C.T.S.N. for the advantage of all registered shooters. An opportunity will exist for every shooter throughout Australia to be familiar with the new rules, well prior to 1st January, 1983. The green light was given by the Executive to make the change in our computer operation. Your Executive accepted a report and recommendations, as submitted by Deloitte, Haskins and Sells, regarding our future data processing plans. The new system and equipment will be put into operation and ready for 1983. By making the change from our present system, it is evident, after the initial cost outlay, great savings in our annual expenditure in this area, will be made. A new face appeared on the Executive Committee, in Brian Growden. Brian is from Bordertown S.A. and was elected to fill a vacancy created by the resignation of S.A. delegate, Bob Mules. Prior to his resignation, Bob had the honour of being the most senior member of the Executive in length of time, and represented S.A. for past eighteen years. Another member of the Executive to receive recognition for services rendered, was Roy Holtfreter. Having represented W.A. on the Executive for the past ten years, Roy has been awarded the honour of life Registration. Congratulations Roy, I am sure that would be the sentiments of the many shooters you represent throughout Australia.

Thursday 9th September, 1982

The Victorian Junior Championship was conducted at the Echuca Gun Club, prior to the State Trap Carnival. One hundred and thirty entries were received with the over fourteen section going to Peter Wilson, Shepparton 18/20, under fourteen years Rohan Penn 15/20, and the girls section being won by Trish Connolly, Kyabram. The event consisted of twenty targets S.B. It was for this time of the year, a rather cold day with a strong wind blowing, making it very difficult for good scores to be recorded by competitors. I believe, after witnessing the success of this day, the Victorian Clay Target Association has the opportunity to develop even further, the education and training of students in the use of firearms, whilst they are attending and participating at this annual event. Advanced and novice coaching should be included on the program of future venues.

FROM THE DESK OF NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

In the mail this month I received a letter from a shooter with a problem common to many shooters, so I will publish a copy of my reply in the hope that it may help other shooters as well.

The shooter has been shooting for 14 months and has received help from local Coaches with good results, he is shooting regularly 17 or 18 out of 20. The problem is that he just can't crack 20 out of 20. By the sound of the letter the shooter is keen to do better and practices regularly, but is doubting his own ability to do so. The following is the reply sent.

Dear Shooter,

Thank you for your interesting letter, yours is a problem shared by many, after an initial rapid improvement as a learner, that improvement slows and reaches a plateau, the fact that you are shooting 17 or 18 out of 20 indicates that you are mastering the skill of Clay Shooting.

Without actually seeing you shoot, I cannot comment on your gun mount, stance etc., and you don't mention any particular target, say right swinger, left swinger or straight away, or that it is on any one particular lane that you are having trouble.

This being so, it is my view that you may be helped by some of the following.

Many of our best Clay Shooters do certain things, and think in certain ways, they do it naturally as part of their performance — some without realizing that they do. This occurs in all sports and is not only my observation.

The more skillful we become the slower the improvement, so we must maximise the skill that we do have, this can be done in many ways, one is to view each clay as an individual complete contest, don't be thinking, 'I must shoot 20', as you prepare to shoot, think positively and aggressively that you will break the next clay.

If you can monitor yourself when shooting well, note the way you feel and how you prepared yourself for the successful shot, and try to repeat that each time you shoot.

Perhaps you breathe deeply to relax between shots or stretch, or look away and then at the appropriate time, mount your gun and then push your mind, your thoughts, excluding all else out to where the clay will appear, see it, and then kill it.

It is the ability to create a ritual and repeat it to the exclusion of all else that enables big scores to be achieved. Make each clay shot an achievement and tell yourself so, give yourself a mental pat on the back, talk to yourself, encourage yourself.

Once you have acquired the skill of clay shooting, and it appears that with the aid of the Club and Zone Coaches you have done so, and you have decided that you want to be good at it, not just average, it is important that you develop mental attitudes which are positive and confidence building, and that you develop and practice rituals or strategies and repeat these each time you shoot.

Mental rehearsal also helps, but this has to be practiced as well to be effective. Firstly visualize yourself at the Club where you are to compete, see the layout and the tracks, see yourself perform your ritual or strategy of say deep breathing or talking to yourself, or what ever it is that you do, then see yourself looking down the barrel, see the Clay pull the trigger and see it break. Mental rehearsal is no good if you are just visualizing some impersonal movie-like sequence in your mind, you have to be there, you have to prepare, you have to shoot the clay.

In our sport, partly because it is an individual sport, it is easy not to develop the competitive, aggressive feelings necessary to produce winning performances, that is why it is necessary to talk to yourself, to think positively, tell yourself you can shoot that clay. Set yourself goals, even when practicing, if you don't expect to shoot your average or better even in practice, it is a waste of time and money.

To summarize my suggestions are —

1. Practice your skill, learn to know the comfortable feel of stance, gun mount, follow through etc. when you successfully break a Clay, and if you miss, learn to monitor yourself, perhaps the follow through was not correct, perhaps you lifted your head, or held it too high. If you learn to monitor yourself you will then be able to consciously try and recapture the correct procedure and the feel of successfully breaking a clay. Also check your own monitoring with the Coach.
2. Develop a personal strategy or routine that suits you and that you practice along with the actual skill of clay shooting. This will help you when the pressure of competition is on. If you go through your routine, the importance of the competition, or the distractions about you won't intrude as much.
3. Make each target a complete competition, if you miss one, you then can start again with the next, forgetting what went before or what comes after
4. When you are ready to fire, concentrate to the exclusion of all else on the clay, when you have shot, relax until you prepare again.
5. Mentally rehearse before a competition and practice that mental rehearsal at home. This is useful too, if you drop two or three in a row, stop yourself mentally and see yourself breaking a clay.
6. Handle your gun regularly, it must feel like an extension of yourself. Use your gun to increase the strength in your arms and chest and shoulders by raising and lowering it.
7. Try to be physically fit, I don't mean that you should embark on any intensive training, but stamina is important, if you practice your skill of clay shooting regularly this certainly helps, but the concentration required in Clay Shooting uses much energy and it is often tiredness that causes us not to perform well. As we become physically tired, so we have to increase the mental control, being fit then is important.
8. The sports scientists have identified three distinct components of a successful sports performance they are:
 1. Skill
 2. Scientology
 3. Biology

They have concluded that it is possible to put in excellent performances if we are strong in only two of these three areas and there will be occasions when people will win who are only strong in one of these, but how much better are our chances if we develop all **three**. All my preceeding suggestions are aimed at just that.

9. Lastly as you appear to have been shooting for 14 months continually have a break, perhaps 2 or 3 weeks from actual competition. You can handle your gun and practise mental rehearsal, but don't over do that. Do something else you like doing and come back refreshed, with your aims and routines firmly in your mind, start again with **confidence**. ○

CAS SURVEY

At the 1981 Annual General Meeting of the Confederation of Australian Sport, it was resolved that a survey should be conducted with the objective of determining how people perceived the objectives and performance of the Confederation.

The task has been given to Fitsport, which is a division of the Physical Education unit at the Footscray Institute of Technology (Melbourne).

Over 1800 carefully designed questionnaires have been distributed, and the survey controllers plan to present their first report at the 1982 AGM of CAS.

The target "audience" chosen to receive the survey forms has been selected from the following categories — National Sporting Federations, State Sporting Federations, Federal and State Government Departments, media, members of the Confederations Coaches Assembly, and coaches accredited through the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme.

The results of the survey will provide a useful base on which CAS Directors can develop policies.

SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS

The closing date for nominations in the 1982 Sport Australia Awards has passed and the tremendous performances recorded by Australia at the Commonwealth Games appear to have swelled the numbers.

Voting procedures will commence shortly, and the finalists in the eleven categories will be invited to the Presentation Dinner, to be held at the Ballroom of Melbourne's Southern Cross Hotel on December 15.

The presentations will be televised live on Seven Network.

The Confederation's Sport in Schools Committee has been restructured under the Chairmanship of Mrs Wendy Ey of Adelaide. The Committee includes representation from the Australian Council for Health Physical Education and Recreation (ACHPER) and its first objective is to produce a policy statement in the form of a widely distributed leaflet.

At the recent Confederation Board Meeting, it was decided that the "sport in schools" campaign is to have foremost ranking in CAS priorities.

Performances recorded during the successful staging of the Commonwealth Games have re-established a degree of confidence in Australia's sporting abilities.

A combination of the pageantry of opening and closing ceremonies, and the regular playing of Advance Australia Fair to signify medal wins brought a lump to the throat of literally millions of Australians.

Who said patriotism and national pride were no longer fashionable?

The Games results should provide a springboard from which a campaign for medals at the 1984 Games can be launched.

More importantly, the Commonwealth Games success has concentrated the media spotlight on sport generally, and has proved beyond doubt that sport remains the most effective means of bringing diverse community interests together. ●

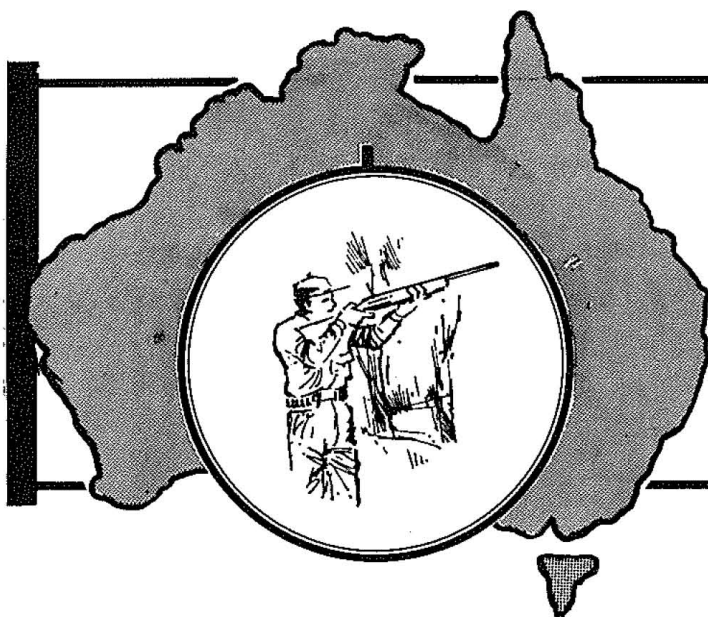

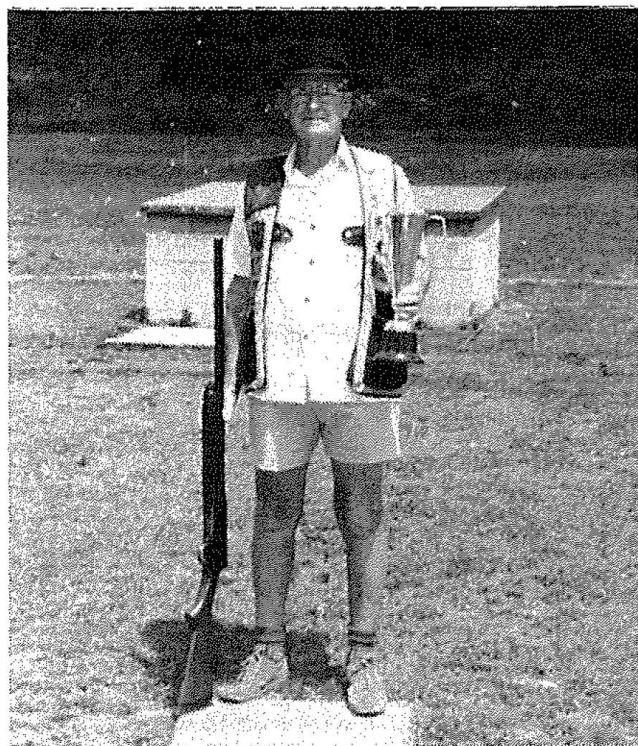

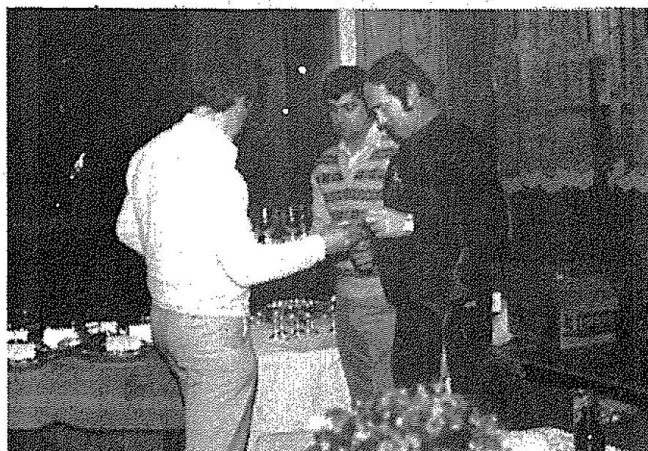

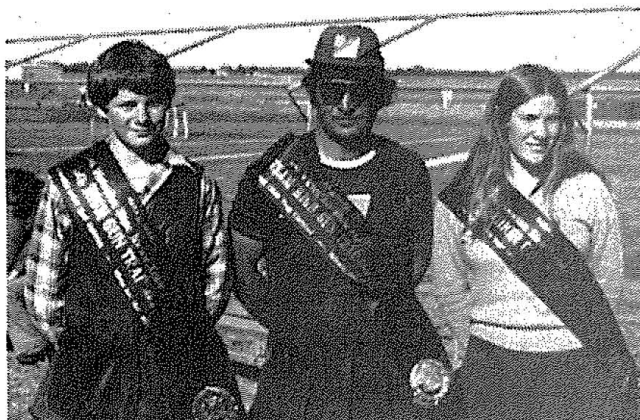

• State Team High Guns. L. to R. Junior Peter Wilson, Open Jim Finis, Ladies Christine Wakefield.

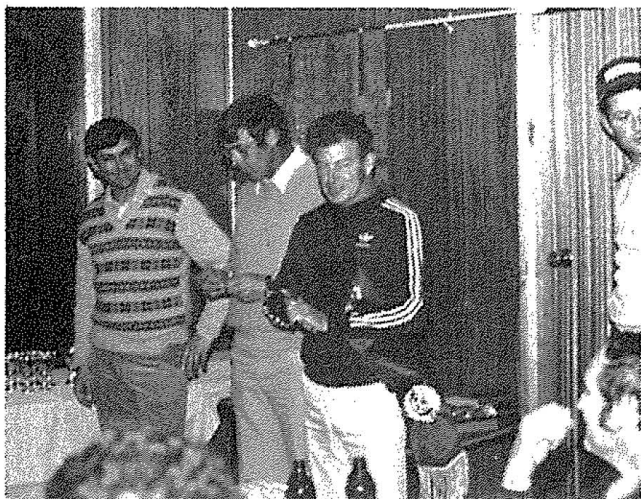

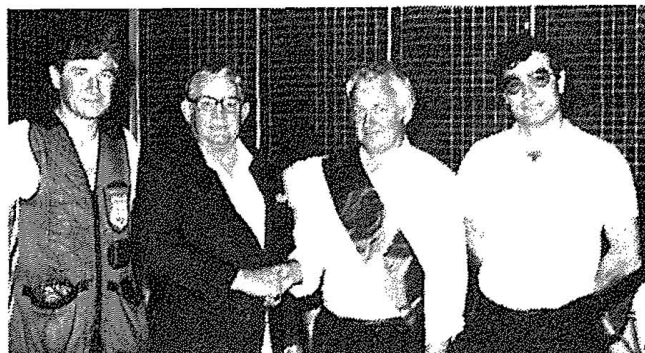

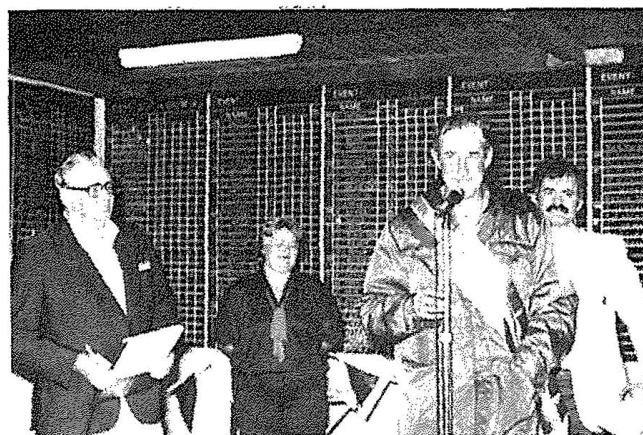
