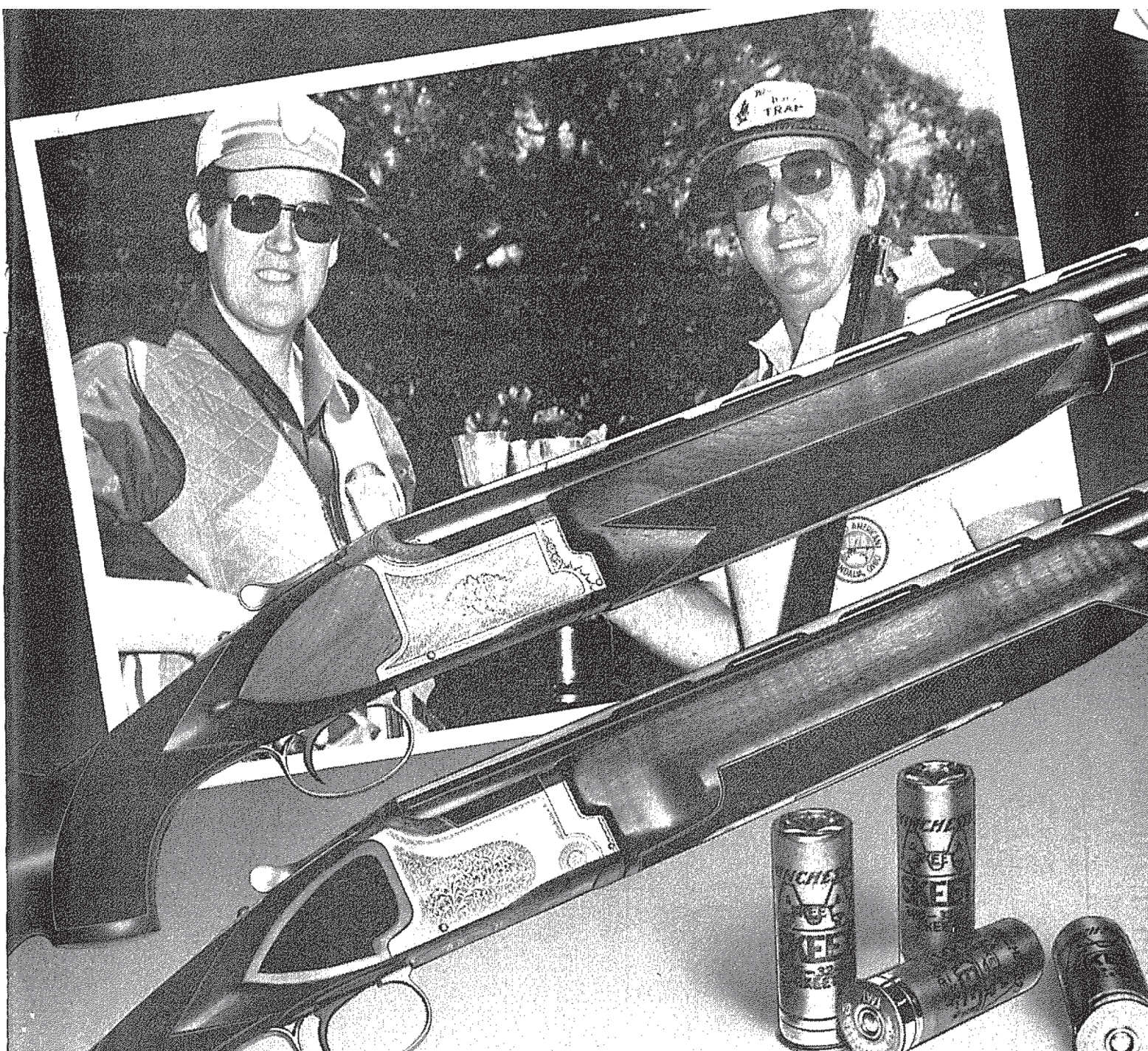

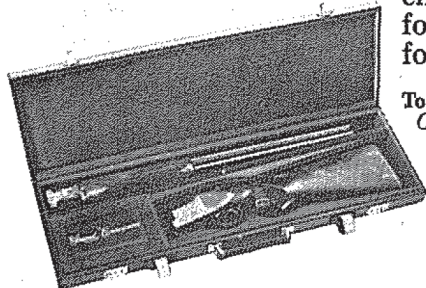

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Australian shotgunners put up what was without doubt the best ever in-depth performance at the recent World Championships in Caracas, Venezuela.

In Olympic Trap, Terry Rumbel shot off for Gold after finishing on 197-200. Terry finished sixth overall in the field of 70 competitors. Greg Long shot his best ever score of 195 to finish 14th, Jim Ellis on 192 was in 23rd place while Ian Buchanan finished 59th on 182.

Greg Long's score was the best ever by an Australian in his first visit to the World Championships. Jim Ellis was the previous best with a score of 194 first up.

Australia finished seventh in the team event, 13 targets behind the winners, Italy.

In Skeet Alex Crikis and Ian Hale both shot very good 195's to finish in equal 14th place. Australia's other representative Graeme Boyd finished 77th in the field of 90 competitors. Three 199's shot off for the medals in this event. Congratulations to the team and coach Peter Quire on an excellent effort.

As 1982 draws to a close, the mind naturally goes back over the year and looks at what has happened. The highlight would have to be the XIIth Commonwealth Games in Brisbane, when the international spotlight was turned on Australia, it's sportsmen and women, and it's administrators and organisers.

Within our own sport we had the National Championships in Brisbane in May, not as big as Melbourne the year before, but still an enjoyable and successful series. On the administrative side the high point in my mind was the formation of the National Referees' Association, and the subsequent meetings which have resulted in the new rules being implemented on January 1.

I was privileged to sit in on all these deliberations and to see the enormous amount of thought and plain hard work that went into producing the new rules. You can all feel proud of these dedicated band of people who have done their very best to produce the rules. I say give the rules a fair trial in 1983. I'm sure many of the criticisms that are currently being levelled at the delegates to the Referees' Association will, after practice with the new rules, be seen to be invalid.

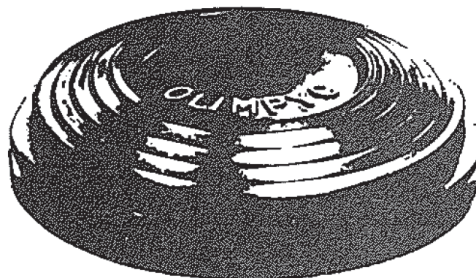

AROUND THE TRAPS

Thursday, September 30, 1982-Saturday, October 9, 1982

One of our Commonwealth's most spectacular sporting events, the XII Commonwealth Games were conducted in Brisbane, Queensland. Shooting being one of the sports contested, Brisbane Gun Club, situated at the Belmont Shooting Range, hosted the Olympic Trench and ISU Skeet. The results have been well published, so I will not detail them here.

However, I must congratulate our competitors, Terry Rumbel, and Jim Ellis in the Olympic Trench, and Alex Crikis and Ian Hale in ISU Skeet, for the dedication they had given and the time and effort they put into their individual disciplines, in their preparation to compete. From their efforts, medals were won for Australia in the teams and individual matches. The sacrifices these shooters make, in an endeavour to place our sport on the highest pedestal, should not be overlooked.

I was fortunate in being able to be present to witness our competitor's performances, as well as talk to many visiting overseas shooters, their managers and coaches, during the competitions. I realise it is costly and difficult to organise, but it would be great for our sport, to have these top competitors competing in this country against our top shots more often.

Over five thousand volunteers assisted with the running of the Commonwealth Games. Shooting required its numbers, and one must congratulate those involved in the running of the shot gun section. Brian Lowry, now living in Brisbane, and who is well known throughout Australia, was engaged as the Competition Director, with Chief Range Officer being the responsibility of Bob Buchan from Melbourne. Their supporting staff were made up from known officials in our sport and administration. Overall, it was a job well done.

Sunday, October 10, 1982

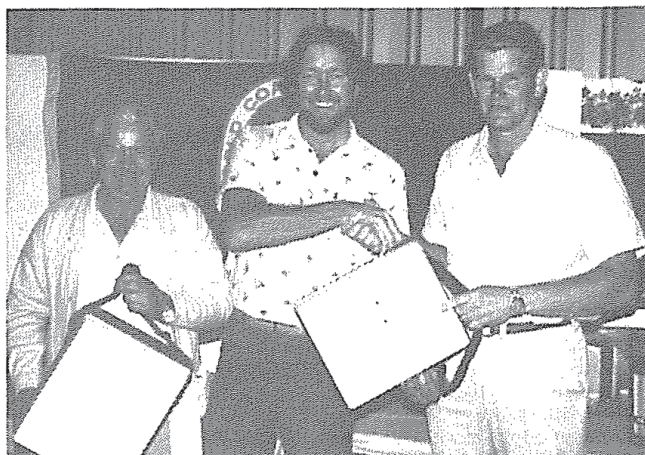
With the Commonwealth Games over, the Australian Shooting Association, the organisation responsible for all our shooting disciplines met at the Queensland Rifle Association headquarters at Belmont, Queensland. Mr David Watts, President of the Australian Shooting Association, congratulated the management and members of the Commonwealth Games shooting team for their magnificent effort in winning seven gold, three silver and four bronze medals. Most business conducted at the meeting centred around the general administration of the ASA.

Wednesday, October 13, 1982

The Sunshine Coast Gun Club were conducting a night shoot, so I attended and became acquainted with a number of new faces on the shooting tracks. This club will be host to the 1983 Queensland State Trap Carnival. A feature of this night shoot was the number of novice shooters being coached by club officials. Barry, husband of State Secretary, Bev Grice, is the club's Accredited Coach, and is kept busy with a weekly program for 30 school pupils being instructed in gun safety and use of firearms.

Sunday, October 17, 1982

Gold Coast Gun Club, shooting a program of skeet and DTL attracted my attention. The club is just off Rifle Range Road, some 25 kilometres from South Port. It is situated in a heavily timbered and mountainous area. Colin Witt, is the club's president, and a resident caretaker attends to preparing the grounds for shoots. It is a well presented club and a pleasure

Wednesday, October 20, 1982

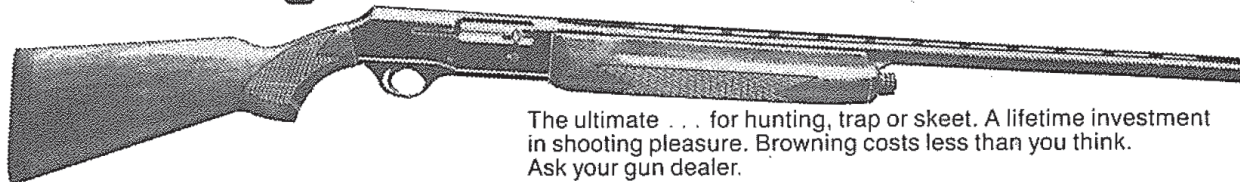

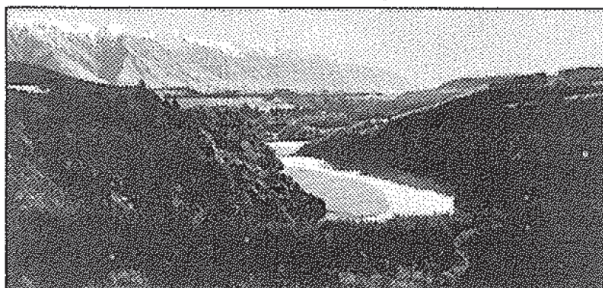

Saturday 23 & Sunday 24, 1982

Toowoomba Gun Club hosted their South Eastern Zone DTL Carnival and attracted some 80 entries over the two days. This club is rather progressive in that it now has skeet, tower, and DTL trap shooting, with ISU skeet also being conducted. Olympic trench is about to be installed. The equipment for this has already been purchased, and the site pegged out on the grounds.

Tom Robertson, President of the club informed me they are hoping to have everything in operation in the near future.

This club, being reasonably close to Brisbane, should be an advantage for ISU shooters. It's back-up facilities are also of high standards, and the hospitality I experienced, and extended to all shooters, assists in its popularity. At the completion of the shoot on Saturday, I was invited to attend a meeting of the South Eastern Zone Council.

Gerry Chizzotti, who would be remembered by many as the shoot marshal at the 1982 Brisbane Nationals, is the Zone President, his wife Jose is Zone Secretary. It is obvious the number of voluntary hours these two put into the administration of our sport would be many. Queensland Executive member, Richard Dean and Bev Grice, their State Secretary, also attended the meeting. Rules changes were a major item discussed. The Zone Council was advised that Rules Supervisor and Referees Association delegate, Eddy Ransom, along with Executive member Richard Dean, would be conducting clinics at various vantage points selected around Queensland.

It is a big State, and quite a responsible action for these two to take. All Referee examiner, referees and shooters attending the meetings will be briefed on the interpretation and implementation of the new rules.

Saturday, October 30, Sunday October 31, 1982

The Queensland Clay Target Association conducted its annual two day Skeet Carnival at Townsville Gun Club. It was the second of such carnivals organised by the QCTA. Seventy shooters vied for the various titles, amongst them, Adrian Cousens from Victoria, Commonwealth Games Gold medalist,

John Woolley from New Zealand, and the "Australian Wanderer" Ted Patterson from Hawkesbury, NSW.

In my travels around the traps, I last met Ted at the opening of the Darwin GC's new grounds in August this year. Ted and his wife are touring Australia, and visiting as many clubs as possible in their travels. Ted tells me he is enjoying the life, even though he sometimes has to double back over his tracks to take in a club shoot, that was not shooting when he was passing.

Weather conditions were warm at Townsville, although pleasant for shooting. Ray Porter from Brisbane Gun Club won the major event on the program sponsored by Winchester Australia, the State Championship. Ray shot the only possible 50-50 to win the event outright. The overall high gun trophy over the program went to Adrian Cousens 195-200.

A feature of the Townsville Gun Club is its situation. The shooting tracks abutt and face the side of a mountain, and because of this it is found white clay targets give the best visibility to the shooter. White targets are the only color used at the grounds for all types of shooting conducted at the club, including Olympic Trench. To those not accustomed to this, it seems strange shooting white targets in broad daylight.

Tom Comerford is the club's president, and has good reason to be proud of the facilities being made available to his club members. The club consists of five DTL traps, four skeet, and one Olympic Trench layout. The club house and toilet facilities are of excellent standard with ample hot showers available for those who wish to take advantage of the camping facilities provided. They are available for visiting shooters, and locals alike. The club also has the services of a full time resident cartaker.

Another feature that impressed me, was the insight by club management to plant 600 mango and 60 avacardo trees, with the vision of an excellent income from the fruits of their labour, in the not so distant future. My information has it, the expected annual income from this venture is quite astounding. When all comes to fruition, what a bonus this will be for their club members.

The welcome extended to all by club president Tom and the QCTA was exceptional, and I recommend to all shooters, travelling by way of Townsville, call in, you will be made most

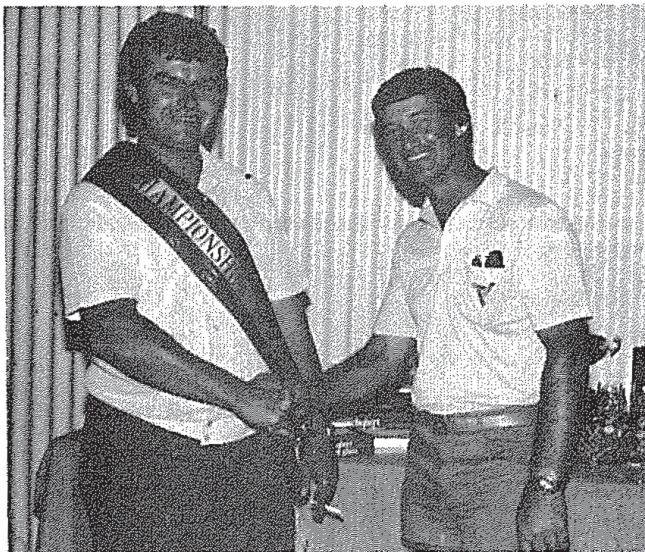

During my stay in Townsville, Neil and his wife Christine extended an invitation to the Connors and Comerfords, to join them for dinner at their home. The main course consisted of a large fish, tastefully baked by Christine, and one Neil spent most of the night trying to convince all he caught on a recent fishing trip. The Queensland State Association, with Neil Hardy at the helm, met on Saturday evening and I was invited to attend. The NSW State Skeet Carnival was conducted by the State Association at Wagga Gun Club. Attendance was down slightly on the previous year, however most of the skeet shooting enthusiasts were there from Victoria and NSW. Weather conditions were hot for shooting.

Three skeet layouts were used for the competition and events consisted of 50 targets. Championships were shot, one visit to a skeet layout. It is the first time I have shot this

sequence on Skeet, however, the shooters accepted the system without any fuss, and it made it easier for the administration using this system, over a three layout ground.

Paul Krumins from Victoria won the NSW State Skeet Championship after a shoot-off with 63-64. Adrian Cousins, the much travelled Victorian skeet shooter, collected two of the championships on the program. NSW won the five man teams match against Victoria. Deserie Huddleston won the Ladies High Gun, with State Team High Gun going to Reg Clarke. Overall High Gun was won by Barney Rooke with a score of 197-200. Executive members Jim Scott and Robbie Parker, who is State President, both assisted in running the shoot and competed in the program.

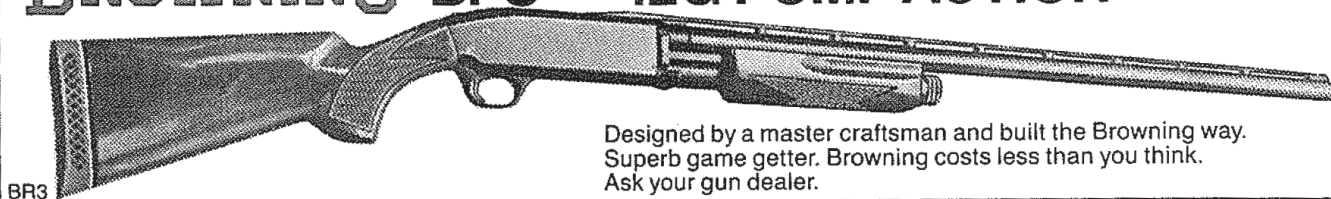

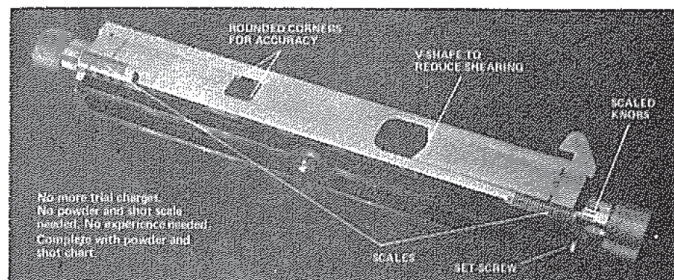

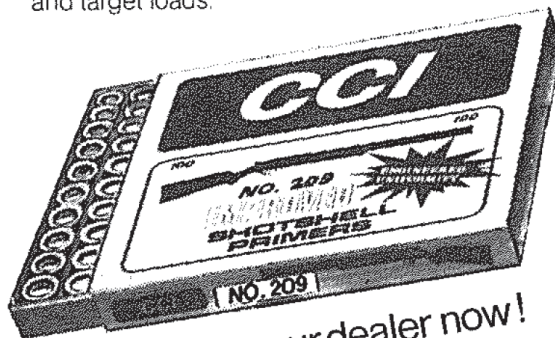

SHOTGUNNING SHORTS

By Roger Darwon

The Ingredients of Winning

What is one of the great fundamentals in the make up of a champion shot, that stands him apart from his fellow clay busters? If you have observed a fair cross-section of top shots over a considerable number of championships, one major factor keeps standing out in the successful competitor. His personality. He displays a remarkable degree of patience, a special willingness to learn by his mistakes, and to correct these very failings.

You will also note, his ambition, drive, and most of all, that magic quality . . . we call the will to win. However, many of these attributes, which we often notice in a champion, were not there in the first part of his education to being a top shot. At least not in the same degree that he has learned to master along that well known road of experience.

One of the most important characteristics of the successful clay target WINNER, is his ability (and/or his coach) to recognise his weakness (and/or his coach to note it) and by himself or with the help of his mentor, to make a determined effort to eliminate any or all of these shortcomings, which hamper his style.

Most shooters and coaches in the championship class, will agree that the hardest barrier to break, is more often the psychological, rather than the physical. Although we are aware that the physical demands are great, and to be successful requires a high degree of physical fitness and stamina. We are also aware each shooter by and large, must face and solve most problems alone and completely isolated on the firing line of each event. His equipment and his mental ability must be in tune, if he intends to WIN.

But most of all his PERSONALITY will be that one great part of his overall make up that will take him head and shoulders over his opponents. The classic example must be without a doubt, Bjorn Borg, the young Swedish tennis player, who in his short career has won so many major championships, plus Wimbledon five times. While he may not be a clay buster, what is the one special quality that shines through with this super sportsman, and one could all take note of?

It's his ice-cool PERSONALITY, that lets nothing upset his one goal, that of mastering his game and winning.

Star quality, beyond the call of duty:

This story is true, and none of the names have been changed to protect the innocent; namely your scribe.

At the 1980 National Championships for clay busters, held at the Perth Gun Club, my old shooting pal George Biggs, insisted I shoot in the skeet nationals. That in itself, is bad enough, seeing I only shoot skeet about every third year, just for fun. When I insisted to George, "No, best if I just watch," he became more determined that Roger D should be right in there mixing it with the best of them.

"Well, I don't have a skeet gun George," I countered, thinking this will get me out of this predicament, as the old master applied more pressure to his idea. Just when I think I

have him beat, up steps my long time NSW shooting pal Mr Rex Northcott (notice I called him Mr) and shoves his new Perazzi-trumpet choked, muzzle braked, mean machine for skeet-gun, into my hands, and promptly agrees with my old pal George. "I think you have him cornered now George!" I mean, what can you do with mates like that . . . tell them to stick their trumpet choked, muzzle-braked-stacked barrelled-spray guns for skeet along with their personality . . . up their jumpers!?

(Well to make a very long story fit the space our Director Ian Hill gives this column).

Anyway, getting back to Perth . . . where was I? . . . oh yes, you guessed it, in goes Roger D's name, nominated for the big event. Not only does George get me to shoot in the skeet along with a bunch of his Victorian "duck-poachers," but somehow he also has the "luck" to shoot in my squad. You guessed it, yours truly first off followed by George, etc, etc (I take my hat off to Perth referee Scotty Gibson) and George (over my left shoulder), who somehow kept me pointing in the right direction, for both of the 25 shots per round in the Nationals.

It's not even worth mentioning how I carded 22x22 for the shoot. But that rare championship quality must go to our remarkable master, George Biggs, who not only shot a fine possible (while coaching me in the elimination rounds) but continued on to become the 1980 Australian National Skeet Champion. Men with a personality and unselfish ability like that are a very rare find today. May you grace the winners circle in 1983 George. We salute you, Pal.

Ask Yourself:

"What Can I Do For Shooting?"

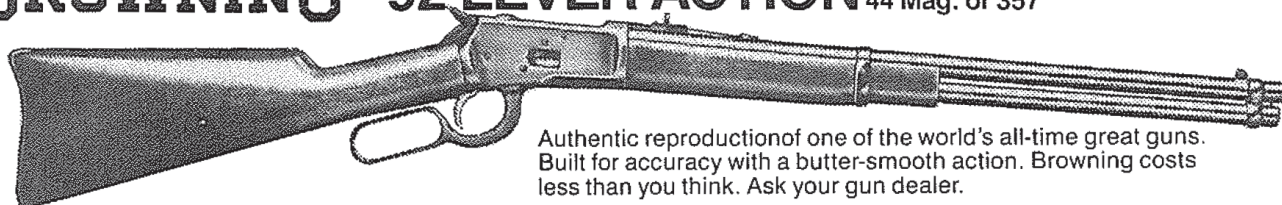
To a large degree, the sport of clay target shooting, in all it's many and interesting forms is a personal thing. Each shooter, knowing that he must master his mental ability, to win. In many cases the individual never goes out of his way to explain the intricacies of his shooting, past, present or future, to anyone not familiar with gunning for sport. Main reason being, he is often sick to the teeth from those who criticise guns and shooting, which we know is formulated in the latters mind from both a 'hostile' press and television image associated with cops and robbers . . . guns and shooting.

Now clay shooters, thanks to our members fantastic performance in Brisbane, the pendulum has swung back in our favour (Even if for a short time). Please note the public soon forget. Now is the time to strike, as they say, while the barrels are still hot. We must all make an all out effort to introduce a non-shooter, to visit our each and individual club, and show them what our sport is all about.

You may not win a gold medal, but one thing is very sure . . . you're bound to win a few more people into seeing what the shooting sports are all about. If you can do that you will beat your critics hands down. Winning the "anti-gun war" is something each and every shooter can contribute to. By making the effort to invite a new member of the general public to see your gun club, you are showing them first hand, we are not such a bad bunch, all things taken into account.

EDITORS MAILBOX

Dear Sir:

My first thoughts on the proposed new rule that if a shooter shoots at a target whether it is legal or not then he must abide by the result, were not favourable. However, after more reasoned thought I am now of the opinion that this approach is correct.

The overwhelming argument for its adoption is that under this rule each shooter shoots at the **same number of targets**. How often have you seen a shooter shoot at a target and then, but only if he misses claim it was not strictly legal. This means in effect that if it is a 25 target event this shooter to shoot a possible has now only to shoot 25 out of 26 (sometimes more).

Cheating is not unknown in Clay Target shooting and anything which minimises it is a move in the right direction.

I note that it is intended to shoot the next Trap Nationals using 5 man squads shooting 5 targets/station.

I'm unable to understand the motive here as it does not decrease the total time/shooter to complete his round when shot under Australian rules. Here the emphasis is on safety with the shooter next in line not being permitted to close his gun until the result of the previous shot is called.

In America where the shooter is permitted to have his gun closed i.e., the No. 1 shooter can be shooting and every shooter up to No. 5 can have his gun closed, shooting is faster but the safety aspect reduced. This approach has resulted in an American shooter being shot by a fellow squad member.

I hope it is not intended that in the future American safety procedures are to be adopted in Australia.

Just in case such an argument is raised, this approach of 5 man squads, 5 targets/station verses six man squads shooting normally was tested at my home club some years ago — the time/shooter to shoot the event was less using six man squads.

Some points to remember when shooting 5 man squads — 5 targets/station: —

1. For every 30 shooters you have 6 squads verses 5 squads using 6 man squads.
2. In America No. 1 shooter elects to take this position and more or less controls the squad.
3. Shooters are always advised never to count targets when shooting. If No. 1 shooter does not do this then the squad does not move smoothly. No. 1 sets himself to shoot and is interrupted and told to change lanes!
4. In America they do not have the hard left and right swingers as we do in Australia. In an important shoot pressure builds up — from what track would you prefer to shoot your last five targets. No. 1 shooter cops track No. 5. Trap is not like Trench in that every shooter, shoots at identical targets. However, moving from track to track after each shot tends to even inequalities.

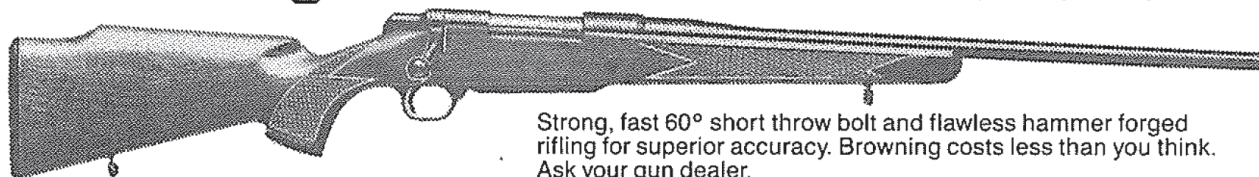

A.C.T.A.'s Participation in the 43rd World Shooting Championships

Australia was represented by 50 shooters at the 43rd World Shooting Championships held in Caracas Venezuela, from October 31 to November 14. These combined World Championships are held every four years, the next to be held in Germany in 1986.

The Australian Clay Target Association was represented by seven shooters, Jim Ellis, Terry Rumbel, Greg Long, Ian Buchanan, Ian Hale Alex Crikis, Graeme Boyd and myself as section Coach and Manager.

The ASA of which we are an affiliate members, organised the trip. We left Australia on October 22, the knowledge that we were representing our Country and Association was brought home to use on our departure from Melbourne, where Ian Hill the Executive Director and Bob Buchan the President of the ISU Sub-committee, along with families and friends, came to wish us luck and good shooting.

We are fortunate to be on such good terms with the American Army officials, who time and again let us avail ourselves of their facilities to train, prior to World Championships. The stay of six days in Fort Benning enabled the team to get over the jet lag caused by the long flight, it also gave the team the opportunity to get their heads down and tails up, and do some serious training.

From a personal point of view it was good to renew friendships made when I attended the advanced Coaching Course in Fort Benning in 1979.

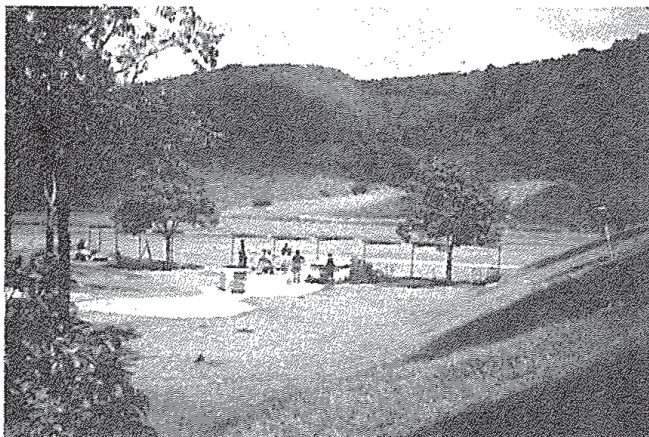
A scratch match was organised for the visiting teams, plus our hosts, the Americans. The Australian shooters performed extremely well with Greg Long shooting the top score of the day in trench, he and Ian Buchanan also won the team event.

Ian Hale top scored in the Skeet, with the Americans winning the Skeet team event. There results boosted our

moral, especially Greg Long and Ian Buchanan, who then started to appreciate their own abilities. Graeme Boyd sadly contracted an influenza virus and had to spend two days in bed.

We left Fort Benning on a high note with all the team shooting excellent scores. Caracas is a busy, dirty city which seems to consist mainly of roads and motor vehicles. The shooting grounds were excellent and we were transported by bus, with an armed guard to and from the grounds each day. We soon became used to the guards armed with machine pistols who were everywhere.

Language differences caused a lot of problems with the interpreters often not speaking good English — let alone Australian. The viral flu caught up with Terry Rumbel when we arrived in Caracas and when he recuperated Ian Buchanan went down with it. Ian Hale suffered a massive reaction on his arm to the yellow fever inoculation, and Jim Ellis unfortunately contracted gastroenteritis the day prior to the competition. Different food and drink are always a problem, but more so in a place like Caracas.

All of the team members trained well and did all that was asked of them despite their various disabilities.

The skeet competition started eight days after our arrival in Caracas. I would have preferred to have arrived with the team only three to four days before competition was to start. Ian Hale and Alex Crikis shot 195-200 to take equal 14th place in the World ISU Skeet Championships. This is an excellent result for Australia.

There were 28 countries represented in the Skeet and 90 shooters in the competition. This is the best result Australia has had in the skeet at the World Championships. To be 14th in that company is quite an achievement. 199-200 shot off for the Gold medal, this gives an indication of the standard, Americans won the Gold and Silver medals and a German the Bronze. The Americans shot 75 targets to decide the Gold Medal.

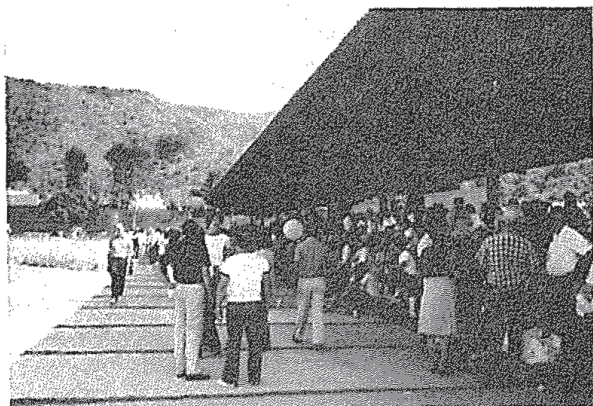

The Olympic Trap was not contested until November 11, 12, and 13. With Jim Ellis so ill with gastric problems and Ian Buchanan with the flu we had a shaky start. Terry Rumbel and Greg Long shot well, going into the second day with scores of 73-75, and 72-75 respectively. The second day Jim felt a little better and shot 75 straight, Ian Buchanan 71-75, Terry Rumbel 74-75 and Greg Long 74-75.

The third day the pressure was really on and the scores were Jim 48-50, Ian 45-50, Greg 49-50, and Terry 50-50. Terry finished with a final score of 197-200, he had qualified to shoot off for gold. Greg finished with 195-200 coming 14th.

A misunderstanding by the interpreter meant that Terry was under the impression that there was an hour and a half wait for the shoot off for the Gold medal, the Australian team all believed that to be so, so he was having a cup of tea 200 metres away when he was given two minutes to be ready to shoot. After running and hurrying he did well to stay in the shoot-off as long as he did, the Spanish and Italian shooters

shared the Gold medal and Australia's Terry Rumbel finished sixth in the World on a countback system that is too complex to explain.

For me, as manager/coach of our team it was a great result from the shooters. At all times they had shown professional dedication to the task they were to perform. They tried their utmost even when they were sick. I know the world is full of "ifs and buts", but if Jim Ellis and Ian Buchanan had not been so ill on the first day of the competition, we would have had the Gold medal in the team event.

I would like to thank the team for their co-operation. I was proud of their efforts, as I am sure you are too. EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

The President Laurie Connors and executive committeeman Bob Buchan whilst attending the NSW Skeet Championships at Wagga took pains to explain to us changes in the rules and procedure of skeet shooting to be implemented in the new year.

Whilst thanking them for taking the pains to explain to us the changes it became apparent that this was the first knowledge the members had of what was going to happen and what further irritated everybody was that they were not given a chance to participate and express their opinion before they became effective.

This breakdown between the executive and the grass roots level has possibly occurred because the information becomes bogged down in the various tiers of the association bureaucracy and also if it finally reaches club secretaries, who too often are DTL shooters, they are not going to call special meetings to discuss proposed skeet rule changes.

There is one direct line of communication between the executive and the grass roots level and that is through the magazine. If these proposed rule changes were published then I have no doubt that those clubs interested would have called meetings and advised the executive of their thoughts on the matter and so the executive would have been able to gauge the rank and file's feelings on the various proposed changes.

I object to changing the sequence of singles on station 7, not that it is a matter of great importance but you are departing from American skeet.

This discipline is shot throughout the western world. Three countries, namely America, Canada and Britain, with a combined population of over 300 million people have shot it for over 50 years. For every shot we fire they fire over 100 000 as its shot every day of the week and they have seen no reason to change it.

Are we making rules for the sake of making rules because if so we are going to end up with something other than American skeet.

I feel the executive is going to get some feed back regarding the rule governing "bloopers."

Again, I would like to thank both Laurie and Bob for their time.

Gun Collecting: The Secondhand Gun

Many shooters, with knowledge of and experience in the use and handling of shotguns, quite often stay well clear of offering any advice to the tyro or new shooter who brings along an old gun he has acquired, and seeks advice about it. Some of these old guns, mostly side by side doubles, offered up for examination, fall into what I term a number of categories.

First is the 'sleeper', sometimes known as the 'widow's gun'. This is generally a piece of good quality, a well known maker . . . and sometimes up to a century old. In most cases it looks good, is often well cared for with no obvious faults.

Second we have the 'Discovery'. This is a gun which has not been used for ages and has often been forgotten, comes to light in the turn out of old attics, cupboards, sheds and stables. Sometimes in the renovation of an old house one of these classic old centre-fire hammer guns comes to light.

The third category, is the gun that is 'being used', and since the owner still has all his fingers, one is lead to assume that the gun is sound. It is being offered for sale for any one of a hundred reasons, all of them probably legitimate.

Last but not least, we encounter the fourth type, the gun of great age and dignity, in pristine condition, apparently just as it left the maker's 50 to 100 years ago. Your approach to each of these broad outlines in categories has to be slightly different, and you with experience are in a very similar position to that of the man who advises a younger friend about how to buy a secondhand car.

Be honest when it comes to your knowledge regarding the gun's safety factor. If in doubt get a second opinion from an experienced gunsmith if the gun is to be used. Make sure the gun is proved with proof-marks if it's to be shot with modern nitro cartridges. There are still bargains to be found with the old gun about the place, but please take care, both when offering advice and when you accept that advice.

Choke Markings: What they mean

Browning shotguns, unlike some British makers have their very own "code" to identify each gun's choke. These are the small (asterisk) * on the face of the flat side of the guns breech. From about 1931 some six years after the introduction of the Browning O/under guns, these following markings have been used to identify the individual chokes of Browning shotguns. They are for the record, as follows:

**	(Full choke)
* _	(improved-modified)
**	(Modified)
** _	(Improved-Cylinder)
***	(Cylinder)
**S	(Skeet)

This will give you a better understanding of a Browning gun and its' chokes, should you be considering buying a new or secondhand trap or skeet model. Far too many shooters have over choked guns for their class of shooting. A half (**) and full (*) choked gun is the ideal combination for most classes of shooting, with the exception of back mark handicap shooting.

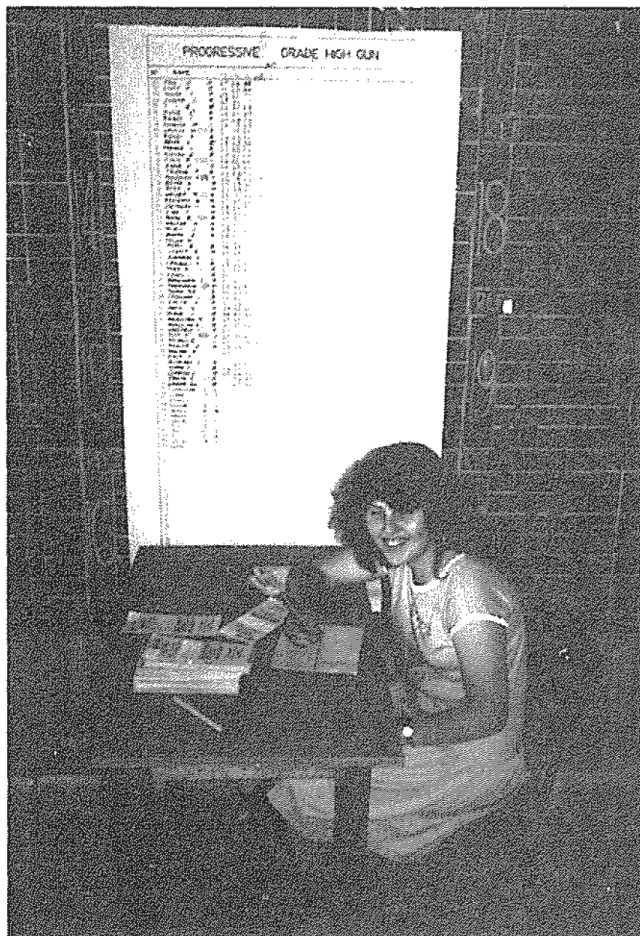

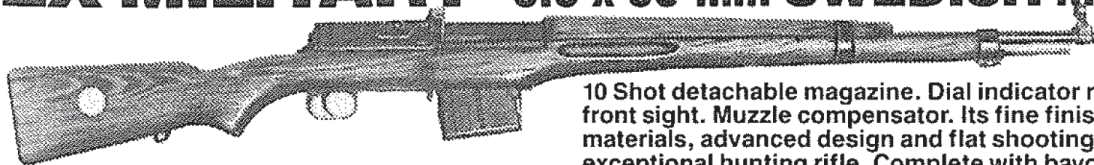
• Carmel, daughter of top shot Larry Dimasi, works on the handicap cards.

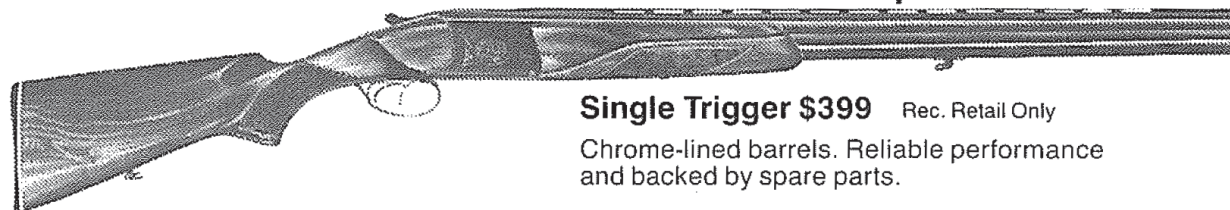

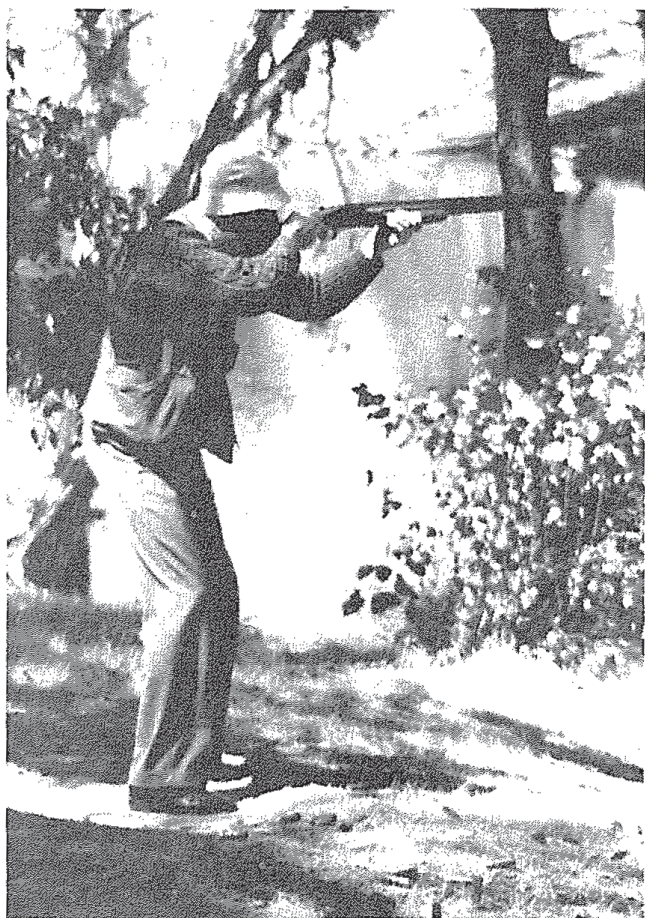

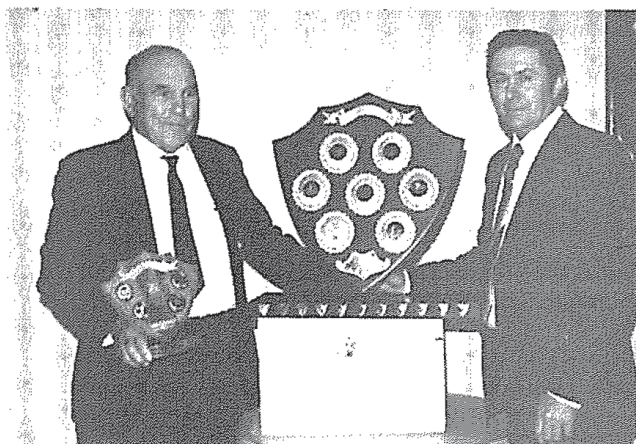

(Cont'd from December 1981 CTSN)

I.S.U. Regulations Part 3 Cont'd from February 1982

Chapter 9 Referees and Jury

9.0. 1 The Referee

- a) The shooting must be conducted by a Referee with wide experience in target shooting and a thorough knowledge of guns. His main function is to make immediate decisions regarding "Dead" or "Lost" targets, and he is to give a distinct signal for all lost targets.
- b) The Chief Referee shall be assisted by three (3) assistant Referees who are usually appointed in rotation by the Chief Referee from among the competitors and preferably from those who have fired in the previous squad.
- c) All competitors are obliged to serve in this function.
- d) If a shooter has been designated as assistant referee and fails to present himself or to give a plausible reason for refusing or to provide an acceptable substitute, he shall be penalized by deduction of one target from his final result for each refusal. Subsequent refusal may result in his exclusion from the competition.
- e) The main function of an assistant referee is to watch each target thrown and to give, immediately after a shot, a signal, by raising his hand or a flag if he considers a target "Lost". He must observe carefully if the target is broken before the shot is fired.
- f) One of the assistant referees shall be placed at each side of the range in such a position that he can observe the full length of the shooting area. The third assistant referee will be positioned near the score board to ensure that the score keeper is posting the results correctly for each shot.

9.0. 2 The Referee shall make an immediate decision whether targets are "dead" or "lost", whether a repeat target is to be thrown, whether there are irregular targets, or whether there are other deviations from the rules. If possible he shall call "no bird" or give some other signal denoting this before the shooter has fired his first shot. Irregular targets require an immediate and very accurate decision by the Chief Referee.

9.0. 3 A target declared "NO BIRD" by the Chief Referee must always be repeated whether or not the shooter has hit it. (Art. 6.1.16 - 6.2.24).

9.0. 4 The Referee shall always make the final decision himself. If any of the assistant referees is in disagreement, it is his duty to advise the Referee of this, by lifting his arm or otherwise attracting his attention. The Referee may then arrive at a final decision.

9.0. 5 In controversial cases the Chief Referee must consult the assistant referees before making a final decision.

9.0. 6 The Chief Referee's decisions may be appealed against in matters concerning interpretation and application of the regulations. The Chief Referee's decisions are final and no appeals are permitted against them in matters concerning "dead", "Lost" or irregular targets.

9.0. 7 The Chief Referee and the assistant referees, under the Jury's control, have the responsibility of the application of the safety rules and of the correct conduct of the competition.

9.0. 8 Jury:

- a) A Jury shall be appointed for all competitions sanctioned by the UIT and in which world records may be estab-

lished. A Jury is composed of a minimum of three (3) members. A list of the nominees for the Jury must be submitted to the UIT Secretariat for examination by the UIT Technical Committee and approved by the Executive Committee. The Chairman of the Jury is usually the Chairman or a member of the Clay Target Committee.

- b) The Jury shall make decisions by majority vote. In urgent cases two Jury members who agree upon a solution may make final decisions after consulting with the Chief Referee. It is the responsibility of the Jury to decide matters that cannot be decided by the Chief Referee, except as specified in Article 9.0.6.

- c) It is the duty of the Jury to ensure the correct application of the regulations by both the referees and range personnel.

9.0. 9 It is the duty of the Jury:

- a) to ascertain that the ranges and the organization plans conform to the UIT regulations and the approved program;
- b) to see that the rules of the competition and the program are adhered to by the Organization Office and the competitors;
- c) to ensure that, with the director of the competitions office, all preparations have been made for a correct draw of lots;
- d) to decide on matters that either the Referee or the organizers are unable to solve;
- e) to make decisions regarding penalties and sanctions against competitors who do not adhere to the rules and who conduct themselves in unsportsmanlike manner;
- f) to arrange a working agreement whereby at least 2 members of the Jury will be present on the ranges at all times.

9.0.10 The Jury's decisions cannot be appealed unless a Jury of Appeal has been appointed by the UIT.

Chapter 10 Scoring

10.0. 1 Individual

For each competitor the results of each series must be entered distinctly.

At the end of the competition the total of targets hit by an individual competitor must be made and scores must be ranked in decreasing order of merit.

10.0. 2 Team

According to the method indicated in the previous article scores of each team member must be entered.

With the total of the targets hit by all the members of each team the scores must be ranked in decreasing order of merit.

10.0. 3 Tie breaking rules

- a) Individual: If two or more shooters obtain equal scores, precedence for the first 3 places in the competition is decided by tie shootoff in rounds of 25 targets up to a maximum of three tie breaking series. If after the three series the tie is not broken, the competitors will be classified exaequo. These series will be conducted according to these regulations. However, the stations that are not occupied by shooters shall not be taken by other shooters as provided in Art. 6.1.1. If the tie shooting time is not arranged in advance, the shooters involved must

keep in touch with the Jury, also through their team leader, in order to present themselves within a maximum time limit of 30 minutes.

- b) Individual (4th through 10th place): For these places ties will be broken by the results of the last round of 25 targets. In case of unbroken tie, the round before the last will count, and so on. If the results of all rounds are equal, precedence is decided by counting the last target forward until a zero is found and the shooter with the most hits in succession takes precedence.

- c) Individual — (11th through last competitor): all shooters with tied scores will be listed in equal rank with an appropriate number of spaces left unnumbered below each group before the next individual is listed. Within the tie score, ranking of the names will be alphabetical by family name in the Latin Alphabet.

- 10.0. 4 Team: If two or more teams obtain the same scores, ranking will be decided by the combined score of the team members in the last round of 25 targets, then next to the last, etc. until the tie is broken.

Chapter 11 Team Officials

- 11.0. 1 It is the responsibility of the team leader to be thoroughly familiar with the competition regulations and the programs. The team leader is further responsible to ensure that his competitors present themselves at their shooting stations at the proper time with proper equipment. If a team is small and does not have a non competing leader one of the shooters should be designated as team leader before the competitions begin.
- 11.0. 2 Although coaching is not allowed in UIT competitions many teams have such a member in their teams. This individual is not permitted inside the shooting areas unless he has been appointed to some other competition function, in which case he is prohibited from serving his team members while in the competition official's capacity.
- 11.0. 3 The number of national team members admitted to the competition is established by the UIT in conjunction with the host country. In the case of the Olympic Games team composition is determined by IOC, UIT and the hosting country.

Chapter 12 Results Office Operations

- 12.0. 1 The Results Office
It is the duty of the results office to:
 - a) Prepare a list of competitors and assign numbers to each;
 - b) assist the Jury in the drawing of lots to squad the competitors;
 - c) prepare score cards for each squad;
 - d) ensure that the proper score card is with the correct squad on the correct field;
 - e) receive and verify results and sum up the targets hit at the end of a series;
 - f) tabulate scores and post preliminary scores on the public bulletin board immediately. Sum up every day the official scores within the shortest possible time;
 - g) prepare a preliminary results bulletin for distribution to the press and team officials each day;
 - h) prepare and publish a final results bulletin immediately after the completion of the competition and the close of any allowable protest period;
 - i) send 10 copies of the Official Results Bulletin and any other reports to the Secretariat of the UIT within 30 days after the completion of the competitions.
- 12.0. 2 Scoring
Scoring is done officially on each field and for each round of 25 targets. In UIT supervised events where world records may be established scores will be kept on each field by two (2) separate persons, one of whom will post a permanent

official card, the second person will maintain a large score board for the benefit of both the shooters and the spectators. The person scoring results on the official score card will be positioned at the rear of the firing line near the Referee. Each scorer will mark his card or board independently based on the decisions given by the Referee. At the conclusion of each round the results are compared and any discrepancy must be resolved before the official card is delivered to the Results Office. The results of the large board shall be the determining factor. It is the duty of the assistant referee nearest the large board to ensure that the scorer is posting the Referee's decisions correctly.

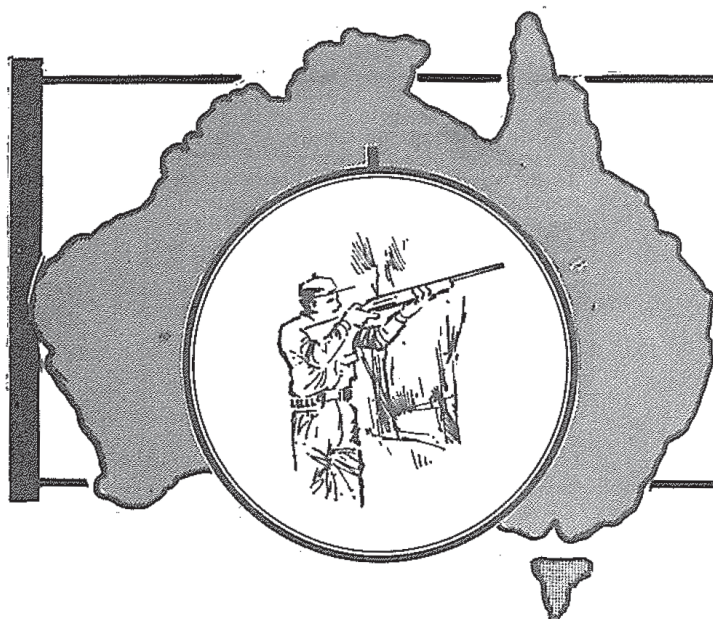
- 12.0. 3 When a round has been completed and the results have been compared and read aloud, the Chief Range Officer and each shooter must sign or initial the sheet so that it may be quickly returned to the Results Office. Failure to sign the sheet before it leaves the field eliminates all right to protest of scores other than erroneous transcribing, which are posted as final results from the sheets.

Chapter 13 Protests

- 13.0. 1 If a shooter or his team captain disagrees with a Referee's decision, protest may be initiated by raising an arm and saying "protest" or "appeal". The Referee shall then interrupt the shooting temporarily and, after having heard the opinion of the assistant referees, will make his decision. There is no appeal against a decision on a hit or missed target, in which case the Referee's decision is final. It is not permitted to retrieve clay targets from the field to determine whether or not they have been hit.
- 13.0. 2 If the shooter or the team captain are still not satisfied with the final decision of the Referee they shall not delay the shooting. They may make a notation on the score card that the shooter is continuing under protest which must be resolved by the Competition Jury.
- 13.0. 3 Protests to the Competition Jury may be made verbally or in writing. Either must be accompanied by a 10 dollar fee. If the protest is upheld the fee will be returned; if the protest is denied the fee will be turned over to the UIT together with the written protest and the Jury's decision.
- 13.0. 4 If a Jury of Appeal has been appointed for the competition (See Art. 9.0.10) and the shooter or team captain is dissatisfied with the decision of the Competition Jury, he may submit the details in writing to the Jury of Appeal. If a Jury of Appeal has not been appointed for a competition, the Competition Jury is the last resort.

Chapter 14 Records — Championships — Master Badges

- 14.0. 1 Records: Records may be established in World Championships, Olympic Games, Continental Games and Championships.
Records are recognized for individual and team shooting according to the UIT General Regulations.
- 14.0. 2 Championships: The World Championships shall, as a rule, be organized annually except in the same year as the Olympic Games. At all such Championships UIT Regulations will govern. Continental Games and Championships will be organized according to the Constitution and General Regulations of the Continental Organizations. UIT Regulations will govern the conduct of the competitions.
Master Badges: Special Master Badges and Champion badges will be awarded according to the General Regulations of the UIT. ○

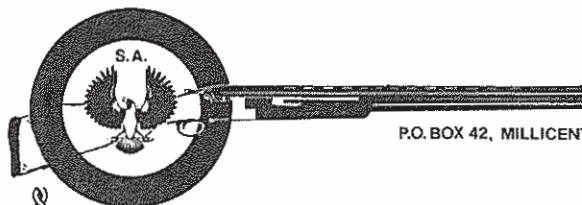

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION

Abridged Rules

JANUARY 1, 1983

NOTE: These abridged rules are intended as a ready aid to referees, they are not intended to replace the rules, with which all referees must be familiar.

1. Where a trap is not throwing legal targets, to height and distance according to the markers, it must be adjusted immediately this becomes evident.
2. Shooters must stand within the shooting square.
3. (a) A target if legal when fired upon is to count even if it falls outside limits because of wind or some other factor.
(b) A referee or button pusher shall release the target instantly in response to the competitors acceptable call.
(c) If a shooter fires at what is considered to be an irregular target or a fast or slow released target, he shall abide by the result.
4. Release trigger guns must be clearly labelled in red and brought to the notice of the referee at each visit.
5. A competitor may appeal against the decision of a referee only in regard to interpretation and application of the rules. There is no right of appeal against a decision as to whether a target is legal or whether it has been missed.
6. (a) A target must be thrown for No. 1 shooter on his call at his first and subsequent visit to each trap or after a break in shooting.
(b) When 6 shooters are in a squad, No. 6 shooter is to shoot first at sighter targets, followed by No. 2, 3, 4 and 5, and 1.
7. In handicap events competitors must shoot from their approved handicaps. If the competitor shoots from any other mark, the target is lost.
8. The referee has power to alter his decision. If altering his decision on "lost target" or "balk" etc., during the competition this must be done before the shooter in question shoots his next target or before he leaves the tracks, should this be his last target.
9. All malfunctions, faulty cartridges and misfires must be recorded on score sheets as "M" for malfunction. The referee must inspect the firearm before making his decision (obstruction in barrel "No Target".) Only three (3) malfunctions in any event are allowed although the competitor will start again after 100 targets in a protracted event or shoot off. Competitors refusing targets scorer to mark "R".
10. (a) A refusal is a "No Target" refer Rules 54 (a) (b) (c). If in the opinion of the management an excess of refusals is recorded, the management has the right to check the shooter, referee and equipment.
(b) "No Target" will be called if a competitor shoots from the wrong lane or out of turn. Shooters must shoot in the order as listed on the squad sheet.
(c) "Lost Target" shall be called if a competitor shoots from the wrong handicap.
11. In the event of a misfire of the second barrel, in a double barrel event, the competitor must fire a live cartridge in the general direction of the target, and is permitted to score with the second barrel only. If the competitor accidentally breaks this target with the first barrel, "No Target" shall be called, and another thrown, if he again breaks this with the first barrel, lost target will be scored. If in the opinion of the referee the first shot was fired before the target was visible, "Lost target" shall be scored.
12. A simultaneous or near simultaneous discharge will be regarded as a malfunction and called "No Target" if within the malfunction limits.
13. If a competitor fires his second barrel after a misfire with the first where this is possible, he will abide by the result.
14. A balk may be granted, whether or not claimed, if an extraneous occurrence materially interferes with the equity of the competitor after he has called for a target.
15. In points scoring where a competitor fires his second shot after a misfire on the first and breaks the target the score will be:
 - (i) 3 if there was no detonation of either primer or powder in first barrel.
or
 - (ii) 2 if there was a detonation in first barrel. If target missed with second shot score will be "Lost Target".
16. Double targets, double rise shall be shot squad system and called by the referee, 1 - 1, or lost - 1, 1 - lost or lost - lost, whichever the case may be, each target to count one point. In the event of a tie to be shot off squad system 5 pairs, total 10 points until finality. A competitor must shoot at a complete pair of targets.
17. In double targets it is no target and the referee shall declare "no target" when
 - (a) only one target is thrown.
 - (b) both targets are broken by one shot.
 - (c) there is an allowable misfire on either shot.
 - (d) the gun breaks down so either shot cannot be fired.
 - (e) one or both targets are thrown broken even though the shooter fires one or both shots.
 - (f) if one or both targets of a pair are not within the prescribed angle or height limit, it is "no target" if the shooter does not fire either shot. If the shooter shoots at an illegal first target and the second target is legal, he must also shoot the second target. However, a shooter is not required to shoot at an illegal second target even though he shot at the first target which may have been either a legal or an illegal target.
 - (g) When both targets are not released simultaneously.
 - (h) One target or both targets are thrown at a wider or narrower angle or angles than is prescribed subject to the following conditions. Both targets shall be called "lost" if the shooter deliberately shoots at the same target twice. This rule is not applicable to a gun "doubling" or "machinegunning" these are malfunctions and are not deliberate second shots.
18. (a) (i) **Double Barrel.** Double barrel shall be shot with two barrels permitted and a score on either barrel to be of equal value.
(ii) **Single Barrel.** Single barrel the competitor is permitted to load one cartridge only in the gun.
(iii) **Points Scoring.** Points scoring shall be shot as double barrel where a score on the first barrel is scored three points, a score on the second barrel is scored two points and no points for a loss with both barrels.
Double Targets. Double rise shall be shot squad system and may be off handicap or championships marks and called by the referee, 1 - 1, or lost - 1, or 1 - lost or lost - lost, whichever the case may be, each target to count one point. In the event of a tie to be shot off squad system 5 pairs, total 10 points until finality.
- (b) **Deauville Doubles**
 - (1) Deauville doubles shall be shot with four competitors on the tracks at one time, the first pair using lanes 1 and 5 and the second pair using lanes 2 and 4. After shooting first round of 5 pairs, competitors then change lanes, first pair taking lanes 2 and 4 and second pair taking lanes 1 and 5. Tie shoots shall be conducted first miss-out from lanes 2 and 4, one team at a time. The competitors may arrange between themselves which lane they will take, and who will call for the release of the clay targets, which will be released instantly on the competitor's acceptable call. In the event of a false call by either competitor they must abide by the result. Only pairs will count and as 1 point. Either competitor can help his partner.
 - (2) Any faulty cartridge, misfire or malfunction in Deauville Doubles does not entitle the competitors to another pair of targets and they must abide by the result.
- (c) **Walk Up**
Walk-up events shall be shot double-barrel from No. 3 lane, squad system. The competitor shall load his gun

at the 22 metres mark; when ready in this position he commences to walk at a normal walking pace, holding his gun in such a position that the butt of the gun must be level with his hip and cannot be mounted to the shoulder until the target is released. The Referee/puller shall release the target between the 20 metres and 15 metre marks inclusive, the mark being unknown to the competitor, having previously been determined by an indicator or dice. No. 1 competitor shoots at one target, he then returns to the rear of the squad each competitor doing the same in turn.

(d) **Walk Up Position of Safety**

- (1) A loaded gun shall be deemed to be in a position of safety when it is the competitor's turn to shoot and he faces and points the gun in the general direction of the trap house, having the gun in the gun-down position.
- (2) Having fired at the target, or in the event of a no target, the competitor shall open his gun and remove all live shells and fired cases before attempting to turn around and return to the rear of the squad or to recommence his walk.

(3) **Mixed Targets**

A mixed target event shall be a combination of a series of double barrel, single barrel, points score and double rise targets. Shot squad system under rules applicable to the appropriate section with target numbers and shooting marks in accordance with the appropriate championship and can be shot in any order.

(f) **Tower Events**

- (1) Tower events may be shot double barrel, single barrel, points scoring and double rise squad system, competitors in a straight line left to right, with centre No. 3 competitor standing in front of the centre of the tower. Whilst at the firing point the competitor must not turn towards the tower, but must face directly to the front throughout the competition.
- (2) Shooters stand 3 metres apart at the rear of the concrete track, as for down-the-line trap shooting. The track is 1.5 metres from the front to rear and each shooter must stand at the rear of this track until it is his turn to shoot. He then steps forward up to, but not over, the leading edge of the track which then puts him 1.5 metres in front of a vertical line from the centre pivot point of the trap. After shooting, he breaks his gun and returns to the rear of the track.
- (3) When Number 5 shooter has shot, he walks to the rear of the Tower, and around to the No. 1 station.
- (4) The trap shall be 10 metres above the ground plus or minus 1 metre mounted on a tower. Targets shall be thrown at standard angles, i.e. 45 deg. either side of the centre line. Tower targets shall be thrown within a minimum of 75 metres and a maximum of 85 metres, measured laterally from the base point of a vertical line from the centre pivot of the trap. The targets shall leave the trap as near to horizontal as practical.

(g) **Continental events shall be shot double barrel, single barrel and points scoring.**

- (i) low targets shall be thrown 1.5 metres above the level of the centre lane at a point 10 metres from the trap.
- (ii) high targets shall be thrown 5 metres above the level of the centre lane at a point 10 metres from the trap.
- (iii) distance — the low target shall be thrown a minimum 45 metres and a maximum of 55 metres.
- (iv) angles — flight of targets shall be thrown at unknown angles a maximum of 45 deg. right and left of the centre lane.

19. **Ties**

- (a) Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Championships shall be shot off squad system, first miss out. All competitors to commence on the same trap. Competitors shall close up when commencing at each trap or at the recommencement of shooting after a

break for ammunition where the shoot-off is being solely conducted on one trap. Shoot-off competitors shall carry enough shells for a complete run over each trap or for at least 25 targets where the shoot-off is being conducted over one trap.

Competitor allowed five (5) minutes to replenish ammunition, failure to comply "lost target".

Competitors shall be re-squadded at the commencement of each run over a line of traps or immediately there is only one survivor of a run over a particular trap (i.e. no competitor shall be required to commence a run over a trap on his own unless he is the last competitor in the shoot-off).

- (b) Deauville Doubles. First miss-out shoot from lanes 2 and 4 as per rule No. 64 (a).
- (c) Double Rise. To be squad system as per Rule 63 (a).
- (d) Walk-up. To be shot squad system as per Rule 65, best of five targets until finality.
- (e) Mixed Targets. To be shot from No. 3 lane 2 double barrel, 2 single barrel, 2 points score, 2 pair double-rise. Total 14 points until finality in any order. Double barrel, single barrel and points scoring shoot-off in Tower to be shot squad system, first miss out.

20. **High Gun**

The high gun for a shoot shall be over the advertised program or such events as the club, at its discretion, has advertised. In the event of a tie for High Gun, where such program included varied types of events the shoot off shall consist of rounds of two of each type of targets (D, B, S.B., D.B. Points, D.R. two pairs off the prescribed marks where applicable) on the High Gun program, all to be shot from the centre lane in any order with the highest scorer, over the full round, to be the winner. Points score events **must** count as points to determine High Gun.

21. Referees and Management are responsible for the safe handling of guns on shooting grounds.
22. Shooting, holding the gun in any position other than orthodox i.e. to the shoulder, is prohibited (with the exception of a physical disability). Any competitor acting in this way will be immediately suspended by referee or management and reported to the Executive Committee in writing. Minimum penalty three (3) months suspension. All guns carried on or about the shooting ground must be held in a position of safety, with the breech open and unloaded at all times. Shooting on the grounds at any place other than the firing point at legitimate targets only is prohibited except where a pattern plate is installed.
23. If the scorer is incompetent at scoring the referee has the right to change the scorer before commencement or during the event.
24. The referee shall announce the conditions for the event before the squad begins competition.
25. No gun whose gauge is larger than 12 gauge is permitted nor shall any barrel(s) length be shorter than 63 centimetres overall.
26. The referee or Management may challenge the load of any competitors ammunition.
27. **Procedure**
A competitor must be at the firing point within two minutes after having been called by the official referee, scorer or a member of the Club Management. Failing therein, he may be disqualified or penalized with loss of targets and may be re-squadded in the last squad at the discretion of the Club.
28. (a) Except when shooting five targets per lane, all competitors in a squad shall automatically change lanes, once having fired his shot, a competitor may move back along his own shooting lane but he may not move off his shooting lane until the next competitor has fired his shot, excepting the shooter on number (5) lane who having removed the cartridges from his gun before turning round may proceed to number one lane and not reload until on that lane. No competitor shall close his gun to fire until all persons on the shooting tracks have withdrawn to a handicap mark at least equal to his own.
- (b) All members in a squad must remain at the shooting tracks until the last competitor has shot.

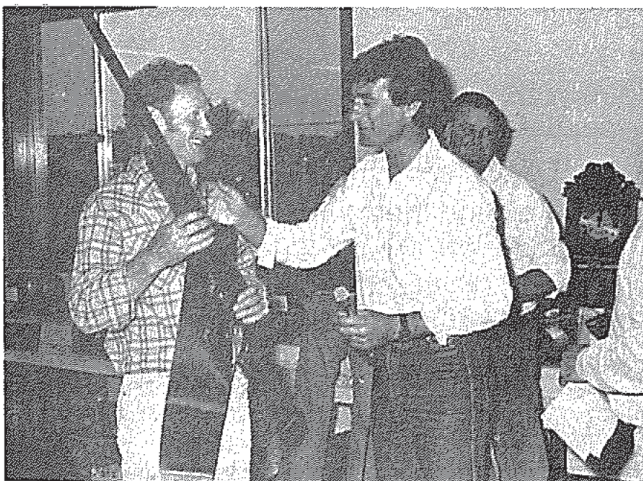

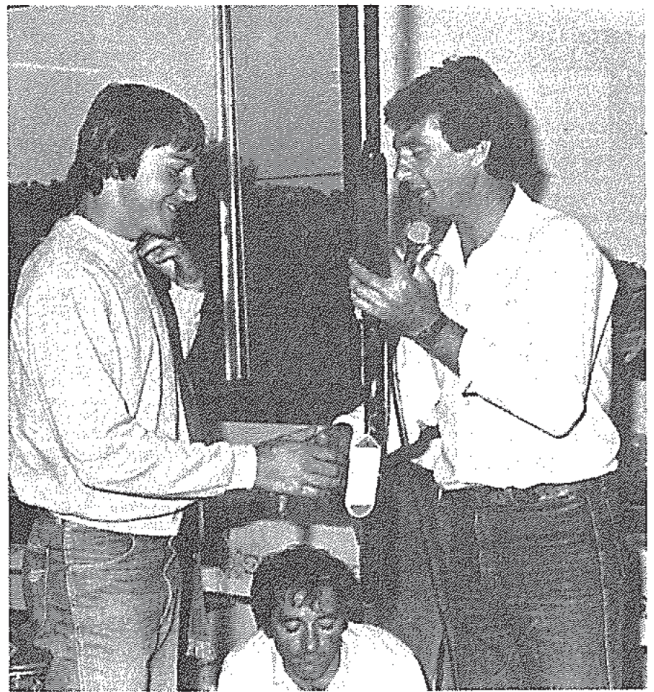
