A.C.T.A. INSURANCE COVER

Staff Writer

Following many enquiries received at the National Office regarding the A.C.T.A. Insurance cover for registered shooters, it's timely to summarise the cover currently maintained.

Registered shooters are covered for shooting accidents on grounds of affiliated clubs in practice or competition for injury to person or damage to property up to an amount of \$1,000,000. Things not covered are injuries to persons or damage to property as a result of activity at a working bee, for instance were a club member is injured while repairing a trap, or a stone is accidentally thrown through the windscreen of a car by a lawn mower. These incidents are normally covered by clubs in a voluntary workers policy.

The one shooting accident that is not covered, is the shooter standing on the tracks with his gun resting on his toe, shoots his own foot.

Novice coaching days, or schoolchildren undergoing firearms awareness training and coaching, are covered providing the participants are made honorary members of the

club for the period they are at the club. The easiest way to do this is to maintain a visitors book.

Trappers are not covered under the A.C.T.A. Policy, and as paid employees must be covered under workers compensation policies. Workers compensation legislation varies from state to state.

We are currently investigating insurance cover for shooters with a view to improving the cover for clubs and registered shooters.

VICTORIAN FIREARMS LEGISLATION INTRODUCED INTO PARLIAMENT

The Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Mr Race Matthews, introduced the Firearms (Amendment) Bill 1983, in the Victorian Legislative Assembly on March 24.

Debate on the Bill was adjourned for four weeks, to allow for comments to be considered by the interim Firearms Consultative Committee and the Government.

A meeting will take place on Monday April 18, at which interested parties will make their views known to the Consultative Committee.

The text of the Minister's speech to the House is listed below:

This Bill gives effect to the Government's policies on firearms control which have been public knowledge since well before the State elections early last year and which have been the subject of extensive debate both before and since those elections. Prior to the elections, strong views were expressed by all parties having an interest in firearms both in favour of and in opposition to the Labor Party's proposals in this field. The ultimate judgement on those proposals was given by the people of Victoria through the ballot boxes and reflected the concern held in the community at the escalation of firearms ownership and the extent of firearms misuse.

The Government moved swiftly to keep faith with the mandate given it by the community by establishing an interim Firearms Consultative Committee to develop the broad principles embodied in the policies and to design the procedures necessary for their implementation.

I pay tribute to the members of that Committee for the unstinting way in which they have devoted themselves to their task in recent months: John Phillips, Q.C., then President of the Criminal Bar Association, Bob Buchan, President of the Victorian Clay Target Association and Chief Superintendent John Ibbotson of the Victoria Police Force assisted by Syd Cowling of the Ministry for Conservation and Bob Emslie of my own Ministry.

In the course of its deliberations, the Committee considered the views of all interested parties and developed and refined the state policies to create the equitable and effective system of firearms controls which is contained in this Bill. That such controls are essential is self-evident. Under the present system, unlimited numbers of firearms are too easily obtainable by persons who have little or no knowledge of firearms laws or of safe practices in the handling of firearms. This easy availability has led to an escalation in the number of firearms in the community which in turn increases the potential for abuse, be it the use of firearms in the commission of crime or the accidental mis-use of firearms.

There is no record of the number of firearms, other than pistols, which are legally owned in Victoria but various estimates place the figure at between one and two million. Many firearms are in the hands of responsible persons who use their firearms in the course of earning their living or in the pursuit of their hobbies of target shooting or hunting. Many firearms are also in the hands of gun-collectors who take pride in preserving rare and antique weapons. But there are many firearms owned by persons with inadequate knowledge of the laws relating to the use of firearms or of the safety practices so essential in the handling of firearms.

A large number of firearms in the hands of those with little knowledge of how to use them safely and responsibly is a recipe for disaster. There is thus a need to reduce the rate of increase of firearms in the community and to better educate those persons who wish to own firearms.

This Bill contains a number of provisions designed to achieve that aim by improving the system of licensing persons who wish to own firearms.

An applicant for a shooter's licence will be required to pass a test of his knowledge of firearms laws and safe practices and to satisfy the issuing officer that he has a good reason to possess a particular type of firearm or different types of firearms before a licence to possess those firearms is issued. This latter requirement will not necessarily limit the number of firearms to one as there are many shooting pursuits which require the use of more than one firearm. However, it is designed to restrict the ownership of firearms to a number consistent with the legitimate needs of the licence holder.

Where the issuing officer determines to grant a shooter's licence he will first issue to the applicant a permit to purchase a firearm. This permit will not be valid until three weeks after issue thus providing a "cooling-off" period for any person who has sought to obtain a firearm on the spur of the moment for some nefarious practice.

On receipt of details of the firearm purchased, the issuing office will issue a shooter's licence endorsed with details of the firearm. The holder will also be required to ensure the safe storage of the firearm when it is not in use.

The option of the one-year or three-year shooter's licence has been retained in the Act.

When the holder of a shooter's licence wishes to purchase an additional firearm he will similarly be required to show good reason for owning that additional weapon and for this purpose will need to apply for a permit to purchase a firearm. In order for the issuing officer to determine whether or not the ownership of an additional firearm is justified, he will need to know the number of firearms and types of firearms already owned by the licence holder.

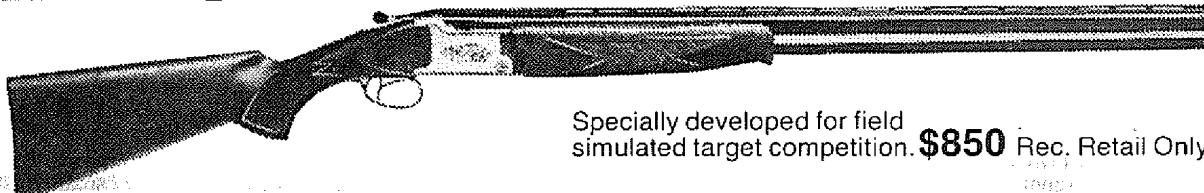
For this reason, the Bill requires that all firearms be registered with a central registry and provides for details of all firearms owned by a particular person to be recorded on his shooter's licence. On the sale of a firearm, the seller will be required to forward a notice of disposal to the registry and the buyer a notice of acquisition so that the registry records can be continually updated. An interim certificate of registration will be issued and amendments made to the details endorsed on the shooter's licence when next it is renewed.

The initial registration of over one million firearms will be an enormous task. To spread the workload of those involved, the holders of existing shooters' licences will be required to notify the registry of all firearms in their possession when first renewing their licences after the commencement of the Act.

Gun-dealers will be required to notify the registry of all stock in hand within six months of the commencement of the Act.

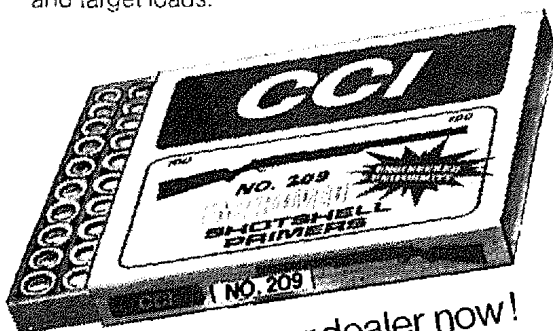

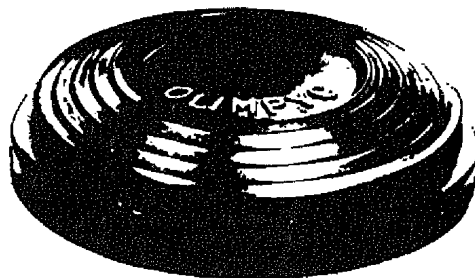

The Firearms Act currently provides for primary producers to obtain a farm permit which authorises the possession and use of firearms on their own land. The Government can see no reason why primary producers who own firearms should not be tested on their knowledge of firearm laws and safe practices as is proposed for applicants for shooter's licences. Consequently, the Bill abolishes farm permits thus requiring the holders of existing permits to obtain a shooter's licence and to register their firearms. However, where firearms the subject of a shooter's licence are only to be used on the land of the primary producer, no fee will be charged for the licence or the registration of the weapons.

I am aware of rumours circulating amongst the shooting fraternity that the proposed registration system is an annual taxing device and that it will create a record of ownership which will be used to confiscate firearms. I wish to scotch those rumours here and now. All holders of existing shooters' licences and farm permits will be entitled to retail all firearms in their possession subject to the payment of an initial registration fee of \$1 for each firearm. I stress that this is a once only registration fee and will not be imposed annually. As I have said, the aim of the legislation is to reduce the rate of increase of firearms in the community not to reduce the present numbers of firearms.

The Bill does, however, empower the making of regulations to prescribe prohibited weapons and ammunition. The Government intends to use this power to prohibit the possession of high-powered military-style rifles and short-barrelled shotguns commonly known as riot guns. There is no place for such weapons in the shooting sports and their existence in private hands creates a threat to the security of the community.

I have previously mentioned gun collectors whose licences currently permit the collection of antique firearms. There are also numerous holders of shooter's licences who collect the more modern firearms and who take similar pride in their collections. However, with the introduction of a limitation on the number of firearms which may be possessed on the strength of a shooter's licence, a provision was required to cater for these collectors. Accordingly, the Bill extends the scope of a gun collector's licence to authorise the collection, not only of antique pistols and other antique firearms, but of the more modern firearms other than pistols.

The gun collector's licence will not authorise the use of such modern firearms and they will be required to be registered. There will be no requirement to register antique weapons. Provision has also been made for the issue of a permit authorising the display of a gun collection at premises other than those specified in the licence. A similar permit will also be available to gun dealers who wish to display and sell firearms other than at the premises specified in a gun-dealer's licence.

Honourable Members will be aware of incidents last year involving the mis-use of air-guns on high-rise Housing Commission estates. These weapons vary in their powers of penetration and whilst not all such weapons are lethal they may all be used in inflict painful injury to persons and

damage to property. Again, the Government sees no reason why the owners of such weapons should not be tested on their knowledge of firearms laws and safe practices and be generally subject to the provisions of the Firearms Act.

Accordingly, the Bill abolishes the current provisions of the Act which exclude air-guns and air-rifles from its operation. Owners of such weapons will be required to obtain a shooter's licence and to register their weapons.

The Bill also amends the conditions attaching to junior permits which currently authorise persons under the age of 18 years to carry shotguns and pea-rifles for the purpose of receiving instruction in their use from licensed shooters. A minimum age of 12 years for the issue of a junior permit will be applied to ensure a uniformity of approach to their issue from police stations across the State and the permit will also authorise the holder to receive instruction in the use and care of centre-fire rifles.

Finally, the Bill establishes a permanent Firearms Consultative Committee comprised of three barristers and solicitors, three nominees of the Chief Commissioner of Police and three representatives of firearms interests. The functions of the Committee will be to advise the Minister on all matters relating to firearms and to hear appeals from persons aggrieved with any decision of an issuing officer in relation to licences and permits. A further right of appeal from a decision of the Committee will be to a Magistrates' Court.

The proposals embodied in this Bill are designed to achieve the Government's stated policies on firearms controls. Their implementation will go a long way towards alleviating the suffering in the community caused by the mis-use of firearms but their success will depend to a large extent on the attitudes of those who own firearms. The vast majority of shooters are responsible in the pursuit of their pastimes and are to be commended for the continuing contributions they make to the safety of their sport. It is to those firearms owners who do not display such responsibility that the provisions of this Bill are directed and if those provisions impose some slight impositions on the majority of shooters I am sure that they will appreciate that it is to the eventual betterment of the community as a whole.

The major changes to the Firearms Act are as follows:

- (a) Require applicants for shooters' licences to (i) pass a test of their knowledge of firearms law and safe practices. (ii) show good reason for the possession of a firearm or firearms of different types. (iii) undertake to ensure that all firearms will be securely stored when not in use. (iv) wait three weeks before purchasing a firearm.
- (b) Require persons who intend to purchase a firearm to obtain a permit to do so.
- (c) Require the registration of all firearms.
- (d) Require the owners of air-guns and air-rifles to hold a shooter's licence.
- (e) Requires the holder of a permit to forward a notice of acquisition to the Registrar within 48 hours of purchasing a firearm.
- (f) Requires any person who sells a firearm to the holder of a permit to forward a notice of disposal to the Registrar within 48 hours of the sale.

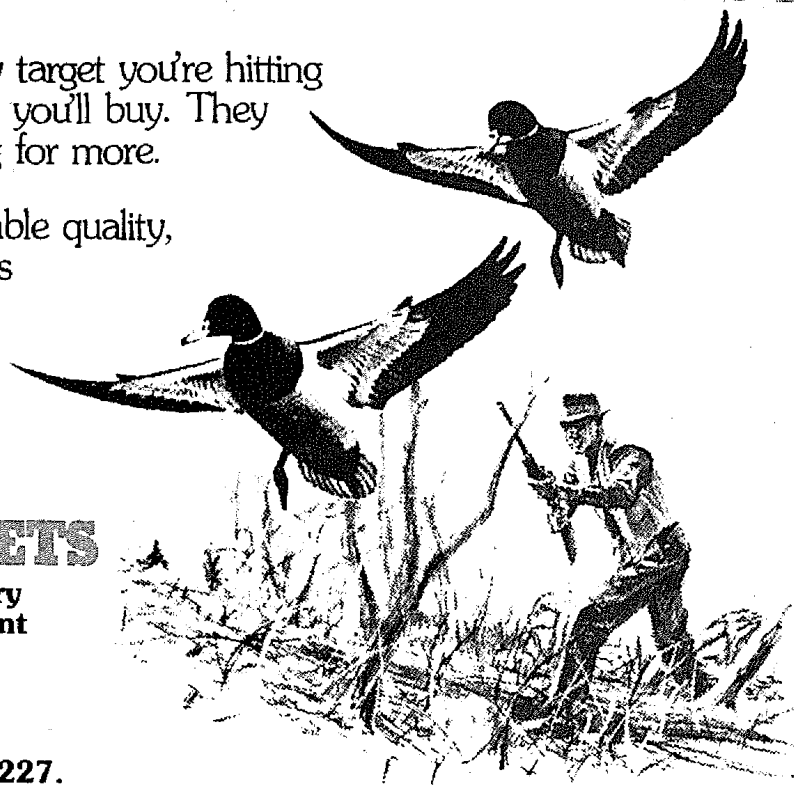

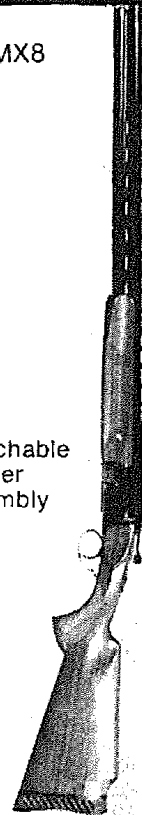
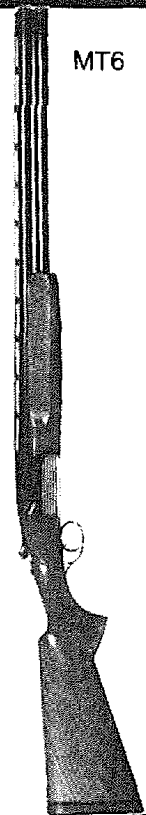

SHOOTING SHORTS

A GIANT STEP BACKWARDS

This writer has purposely waited these three months, before making any written comment on this new rule in trap shooting, whereby a shooter **CAN REFUSE TO ACCEPT A TARGET**.

I was AGHAST, when I first read it; today, after seeing it in operation in this short time, I'm now at the stage tithering on the verge of giving clay target shooting away completely.

This new rule, and you can see I make no attempt to hide my utter dissolutionment, will in the long run, **SPELL THE END OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING**, as we know it.

Such a new rule, has opened the **FLOODGATE** for "CHEATING", and I have witnessed some of the worst cheating in my long association with Clay busting, via the **miss-use** of this new rule.

(The classic, had to be the shooter in a continental event, who refused all the legal-low birds, only accepting the high sitters. He refused no less than 5 low birds???) Other cases too numerous to mention in this space were just as bad. Or the shooter, who I'm sure refused targets, just to get the feel of this new won "power" over the referee.

IF AND WHEN, ANY NEW RULE IS INTRODUCED, the accent must **ALWAYS** be with the fact **the sport has a REFEREE**, who is in charge of each squad. When you **TAKE-AWAY** a referee's control over any game, you are inviting the obvious to take place. This new rule openly invites the "stunt" shooter, or **CHEAT** to take full advantage of a rule which allows so much room, for such antics, and too many avenues for his many crafty capers. **Please don't tell me trap shooting is void of such contestants.**

Last but not least, by the introduction of such a rule; (are the rules committee of our sport saying,) "We don't have any competent D.T.L. referees, capable of running a shoot in the correct manner?"

It is parramount, that this new "RULE", is eliminated forthwith, and full control put back in the hands of the referee. This is **one bloomer** our sport can do without. The new rule was obviously made with honest shooters in mind. However, **it's** an advantage point in favour of the other type of shooter mention above . . . **all normal men would have to agree.**

HOW'S YOUR SHOOTING ETIQUETTE?

IN EVERY AGE, manners have separated civilized GENTLEMEN from the world of CADES, Deadbeats and plain straight out RUDENESS. Within the age, of the gunning sports long history, which stretches back to the 1700's, with men in top hats on English fields shooting live birds for substancial bets, **ETIQUETTE** was foremost and parramount an integral part of the shooting sport.

Correctness and **Social** gesture were always a standard part of the game.

Over the centuries, the sport of clay target shooting came into being, (with a little help from the French and the Americans) and rules and laws being framed to ensure the sport prospered not only in good and fair competition, but as you would expect, in a **SAFE** and **PROPER** manner. It's worth noting here, that when you walk onto the tracks in clay target competition, your following in the footsteps of the traditions and history of one of mans oldest forms of competition, which carried over from the bow and arrow days . . . shooting at targets.

Since the beginning of the gunning sports, the articulate and considerate shooting gentleman has been held in a position of high esteem. 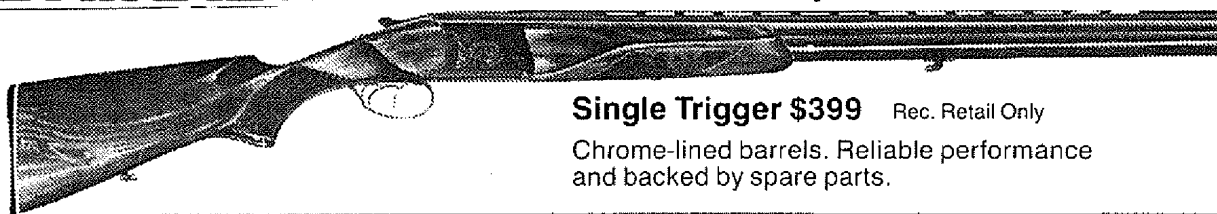
Our sport was founded on good manners, good sportsmanship and shooting etiquette . . . we just need your help to keep it that way.

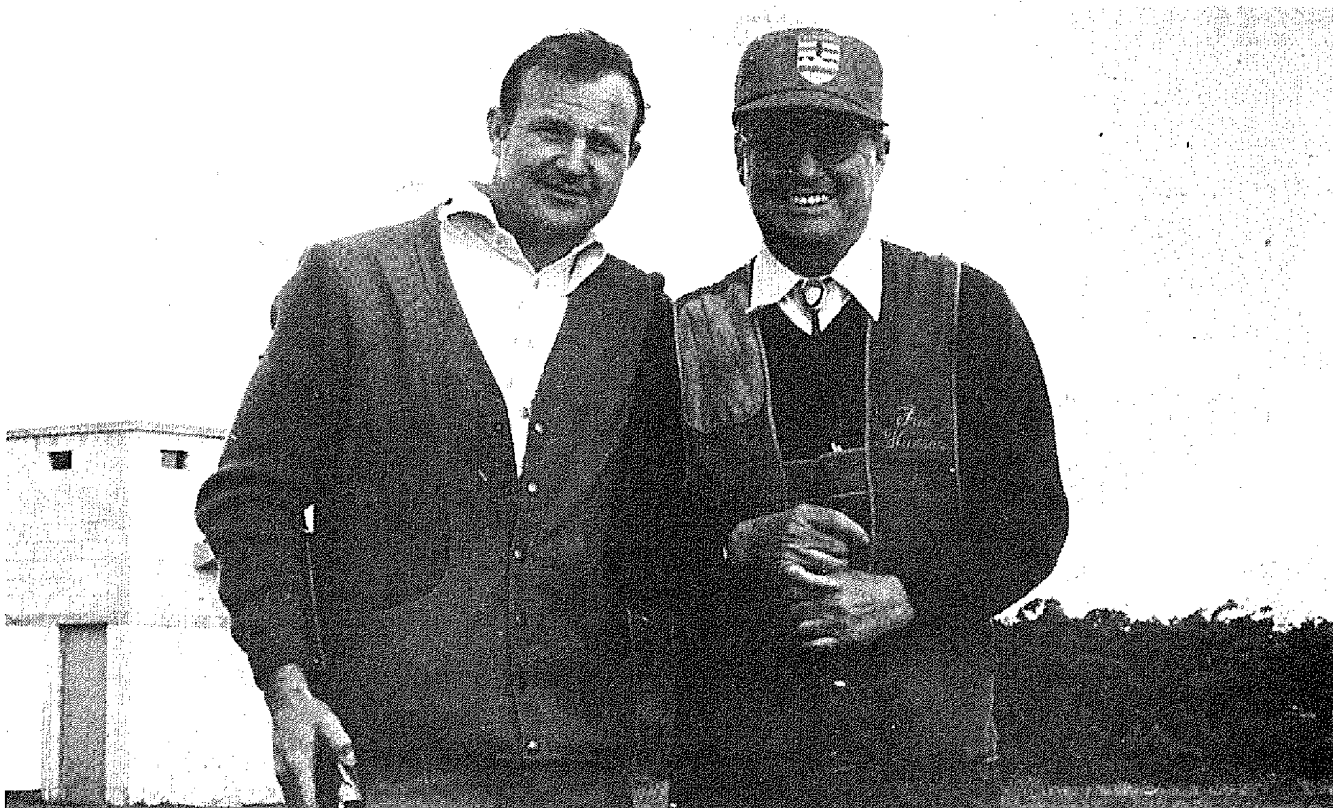

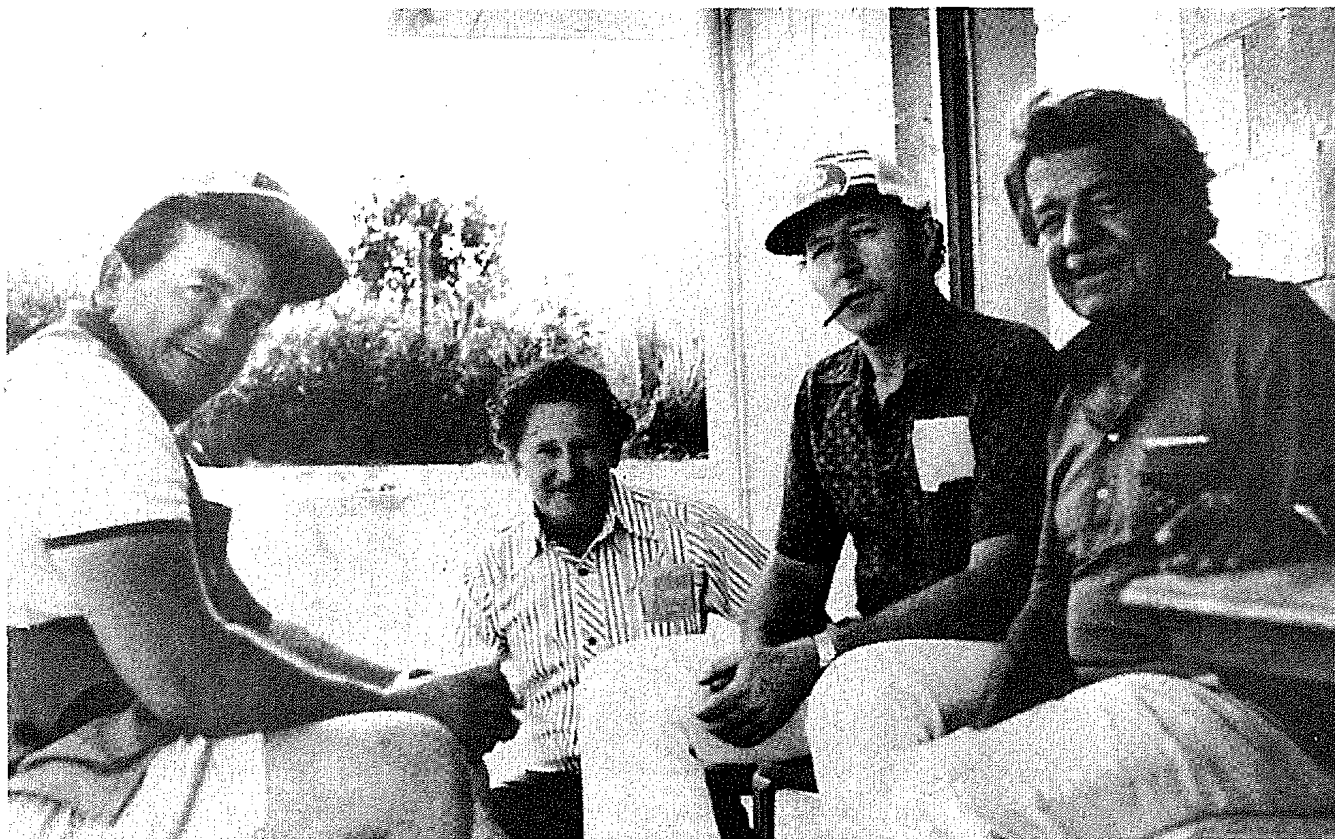

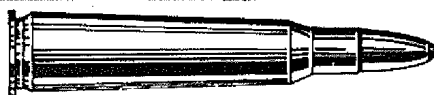

- (g) Requires an applicant for a shooters' licence who already possesses firearms to notify the Registrar of details of all such firearms to pay a registration fee of \$1.00 for each firearm.
- (h) Increases the fee payable for the issue or renewal of a basic shooters' licence from \$5.00 a year to \$10.00 a year.
- (i) Requires the holder of a shooters' licence who wishes to purchase an additional firearm to demonstrate good reason for possessing that particular firearm and that he has a good knowledge of Firearms laws and safety practices relating to that particular type of firearm prior to the issue of a permit authorising the purchase of the firearm.
- (j) Restricts the issue of junior permits to persons over the age of twelve years and increases the fee for the issue or renewal of such permits from \$2.00 to \$5.00 a year.
- (k) Exempts holders of Interstate group permits from the requirement to register their firearms whilst temporarily in Victoria.
- (l) Provides a right of appeal against the decisions of the Registrar or authorized officer of Police to the Firearms Consultative Committee.
- (m) Provides a further right of appeal against an order of the Committee on an appeal to a Magistrates' Court.

The leader of the National Party in Victoria, Mr Peter Ross-Edwards, issued the following statement:

The National Party is totally opposed to the State Government's plan to register all firearms in Victoria.

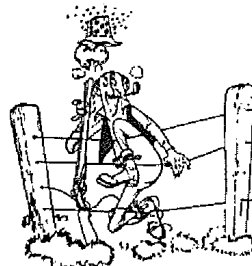
He said the Party believed that if a law-abiding person wanted to purchase a firearm, he or she should be allowed to do so without requiring the permission of a public servant.

"If this public servant decides not to issue a permit, then the applicant is placed in the position of having to go to the considerable expense and frustration of appealing to an appeals committee," Mr Ross-Edwards stressed.

He said the proposed legislation, as foreshadowed by the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Mr Mathews, would have no effect on reducing crime.

"The effect of the registration would be to take away the right of law-abiding citizens to purchase the firearm of their choice, unless they first obtain a permit.

"The huge cost involved would naturally be borne by those people registering firearms," Mr Ross-Edwards said. It is hoped to print a report of the April 18 meeting and any changes, in the next issue of this magazine. ○



EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

I read the column by Roger Darwon in the March '83 copy of A.C.T.A. Shooting News and are disturbed by the news presented of firearm licencing.

Probably the most serious misconception by shooters is that logic must necessarily play an important role in the community anti-gun stand. Rather the situation is that the subject generates an emotional response. This is not meant to be a criticism of the general public as it seems reasonable to me for them to be somewhat fearful of guns — after all the initial purpose and still predominate use of guns is as weapons i.e., all armies are equipped with them as killing implements.

If it is recognised that the general feeling of the community is one of fear of such machines then it is surely reasonable for them to require some control — this is a normal emotional response.

Logic has its part to play in the laws which result from this emotional reaction. In Victoria at the moment laws are being drawn up dealing with gun licencing, and I understand that the Government is giving due and careful consideration to legitimate gun use. I discussed this with the A.C.T.A. representative on the gun licencing review group recently and he assured me that he was receiving a fair and reasonable hearing, that the Government was respecting and responding to clay target shooters needs.

Certainly the worst thing that shooters can do is align themselves with any political party, they must always remain on the high ground. A result of political alignment is that if the party you backed is elected then they can take any action against you they think fit, you have nowhere else to go. If your party is not elected then the group you tried to appeal has a mandate to hammer you. It is silly to paint yourself into a corner, there must always be room to manoeuvre.

Touching only superficially on the history of shooter/gun licencing in Australia we find that Western Australia has the tightest gun laws — introduced I understand, by a Conservative Government.

South Australia has probably the next tightest gun laws — introduced I understand, by a Conservative Government.

Victoria had gun licencing introduced by a gconservative Government. For those who cared to listen at the State Skeet Carnival in Mildura some four years ago a Government member (Conservative Govt.) gave notice of an intention to tighten gun laws — he also indicated a rationalising of some aspects of the then existing laws.

In New South Wales shooter licencing was introduced by a Conservative Government.

Your author, virtually daring the Premier in N.S.W. to react, is foolish. The Government in all States, can gain support by manipulating the emotional content of gun control — this is recognised by all parties.

When licencing was introduced in N.S.W. the Manager of N.S.W. Gun Club put to the then Liberal member for the area that he would loose votes as a result. The local member replied that the fact of the matter was that votes would be gained not lost — he was of course, correct.

My copy of the A.C.T.A. Shooting News for March did not arrive. The copy I have is that which was sent to the editor of the Sunday Telegraph (Sydney). I understand that the Editor does not read the magazine — the reason may simply be

pressure of reading matter forwarded to him. However, I shudder to think of his reaction to this article, he could well imagine us as a group of fanatics who need to be contained.

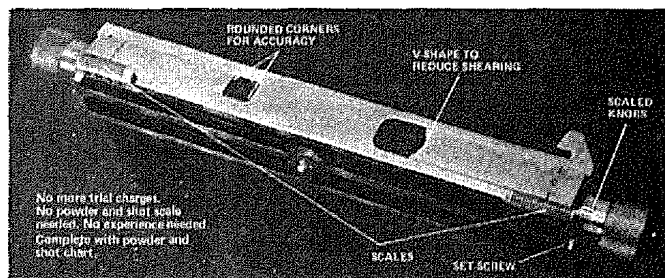

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

In the December 1982 issue of ACTSN on page 62 I read a letter by G. W. Burnett. I should like to correct two impressions that could be left in readers minds by that letter.

Self loading traps are **not** generally used in the USA for registered trapshooting though they are very commonly used for skeet shooting. Clubs often have one or two that they used for practice shooting.

Self loading traps for trapshooting would slow down the shooting considerably due to the time it would take to refill the magazine between squads. We now, with hand-fed traps

(most commonly the Winchester electric trap, which you use to a considerable extent also) figure on shooting six squads of five men, 25 targets each, per hour on a trap field. At our Wisconsin state trap shoot we averaged 6 1/6 squads per hour per trap over a 7 hour period by actual timing. We set up our schedule on the basis of 6 squads per hour, and commonly gain a bit on that.

At our Waukesha Gun Club we have one or two self-loading traps installed most of the time, but use them only for practice. We replace them with hand fed traps for all of our tournaments. At the state shoot we use 28 traps for the tournament and one trap for practice. Even that practice trap then is a hand-fed one.

You have no need to worry about the trap boy not being able to feed the trap fast enough using the "Yankee" style of shooting with each shooter shooting 5 targets per lane before moving. Incidentally, when we were at Adelaide in 1972 at your Nationals a squad of 5 Americans put on a demonstration of Yankee style shooting and the trap boy did not lose any fingers — and we deliberately shot extra fast. I have been in a squad at the Grand when we shot 5 men, 25 targets each, in exactly **six** minutes. Normally it is about 10 minutes.

Hope that we see some Australians at the Grand again this year.

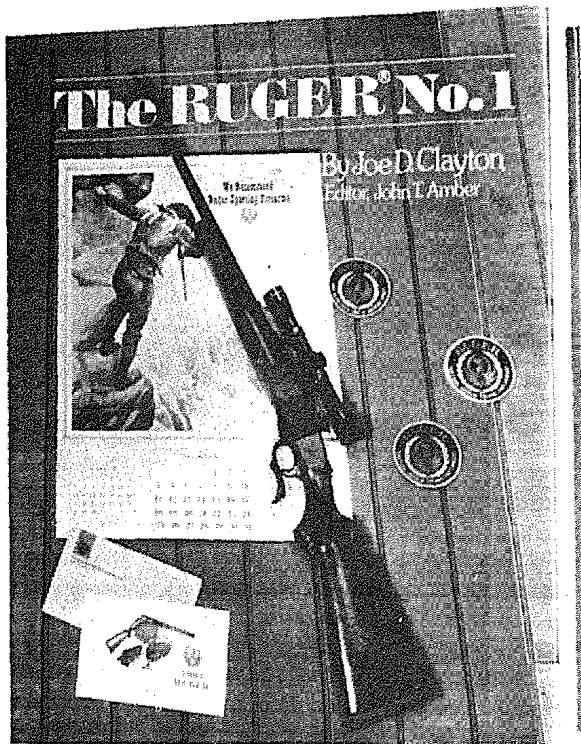

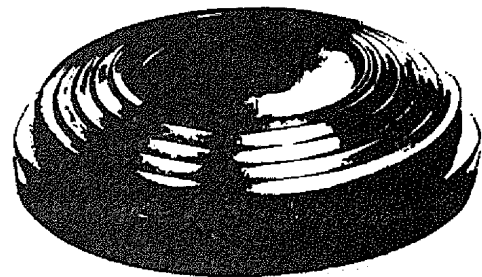

Confederation of Australian **SPORT** NEWS

Federal Department of Sport

The sporting community has welcomed the appointment of John Brown as Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism in the Federal Government by the Prime Minister, Mr Hawke.

Mr Brown has been a strong supporter of many of the new initiatives promoted by sport. In fact, the Policy he formulated on Sport and Recreation nominates as its targets for achievement the aims of the Master Plan for Sport produced by the Confederation of Australian Sport in 1980.

An especially pleasing feature is the establishment of a separate Ministry for Sport, Recreation and Tourism. A similar department last existed under a Labor Government headed by Mr Gough Whitlam.

The Executive Director of the Confederation of Australian Sport, Mr Garry Daly said, "Despite the tight economic conditions that Australia is experiencing, sport must have the level of support proposed by the new Government because of the benefits to the community that arises from a fit, healthy, active and proud sporting nation. The creation of a Ministry for Sport, Recreation and Tourism is tangible evidence of the awareness of the Federal Government of the relevance of sport to Australians. The Confederation looks forward eagerly to consultations with Mr Brown on the programmes and initiatives that will ensure Australian sportspeople continue to get the best possible encouragement.

"Sport in Schools is one of the major factors in the Confederation's range of activities, and great encouragement is taken from the Government policy recognition that the sports education program needs to be greatly improved."

C.A.S. Board Report

The first C.A.S. Board meeting for 1983 was held early in March with an extensive agenda being tabled. The Minutes of the meeting are enclosed, and the following summary covers some of the more important subjects.

One of the most significant factors is the degree to which policies promoted by the Confederation on behalf of sport, featured in the election statements of the two major political parties prior to the recent Federal Election.

Such matters as the establishment of an Australian Sports Aid Foundation, the extension of the international standard facilities program, were major factors in the Liberal policy statement and the then Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, Mr Tom McVeigh also expressed an opinion that the Sports Development Program allocation should be increased to \$7.5 million.

The Labor Policy consisted of objectives lifted directly from the Confederation's Master Plan produced in 1980. Of course, the 'big news' was the promise of a Ministry for Sport.

Turning to more general items, the Confederation Board has approved the licencing of the "SPORT" logo, and its first 'commercial' appearance will be a part of an Australian Wool Corporation promotion at the Sydney Royal Easter Show.

Sports injury insurance continues to be news and the recent development by C.A.S. Insurances Pty. Ltd. of a Public Liability Policy for sport has really caught the imagination of a wide cross-section of the community.

In support of the new cover, a brochure titled "SPORT, THE LAW AND YOU" has been produced, and has been supported by advice from the Chairman of the Law Reform Commission, the Hon. Justice M. D. Kirby. In addition, Mr Justice Kirby attended a media conference in Melbourne at which the publication was launched, and his involvement received wide coverage.

Sport Australia Awards, 1983

The 1983 Sport Australia Awards have occupied a great deal of planning time, in recent days, and it is tangible evidence of the sponsors' positive attitude towards the project that with only one exception, they have already confirmed their commitment for the 1983 series.

International Liaison

The second general conference of the International Assembly of National Confederations of Sport will be held in Magglingen, Switzerland late in May. Australia will be represented by Mr Wayne Reid, C.A.S. President and President of the world body, and Mr Garry Daly, C.A.S. Executive Director.

The Asia Pacific and Oceania Region of IANCS is becoming stronger, and has developed a series of objectives directed at improving the coaching and administrative elements of sport in the region.

Coaching Manuals for Distribution

Subject to final approval being received from the Australian Government Publishing Service, the Confederation of Australian Sport has become a distributor for publications associated with the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme.

Three books are involved - they are:

- * "You're the Coach", the level one approved manual. C.A.S. price: \$2.35
- * "Towards Better Coaching", the level two approved manual. C.A.S. price: \$12.00
- * "Level One Workbook", C.A.S. price: \$3.00

Dawn Fraser Appointment

Recent media reports have indicated that Ms. Dawn Fraser has been employed on a full time basis by the Confederation. These statements are not strictly correct - from the enclosed Minutes, it will be seen that in invitation has been extended to Ms. Fraser to act as a convenor for the "Children in Sport" Committee. A proposal has been placed before a potential sponsor, which if successful, could lead to Ms. Fraser being employed by the sponsor, with C.A.S. having first call on her time.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

by Peter Quire

One of the most difficult problems that shooters and coaches come across is flinching. The causes can be either psychological or physical or a combination of both.

The physical causes of flinching include,

MUZZLE BLAST: Muzzle blast and the noise associated with it can be very wearing, with the flinch developing slowly over a number of years without the shooter being aware of it. Excessive muzzle blast is caused by the use of heavy load shells and short barrels. If muzzle blast is the cause of the flinch the shooter is advised to give up shooting for a period and to start again with light load cartridges, best quality ear protection and a longer barrel if possible. Flinching caused by muzzle blast is one of the reasons that we advocate shooters should always wear ear protection.

FAULTY GUN FIT: If the size of the butt of the gun is too small, it does not give enough surface area to distribute the recoil, the recoil will then be much more severe. If the gun is not fitted with a recoil pad the recoil will also be greater, if the stock is too short or too straight there will be greater recoil.

When the pistol grip of the gun is too short, the hand is pushed up against the trigger guard, making the trigger finger bent and doesn't give the finger enough leverage, this can also cause bruising of the second finger. Bruising of the second finger can also be caused by the use of a light gun with heavy cartridges. The trigger finger placed too far through the trigger causes bruising of the second finger. Even if the trigger pull is too heavy it can cause the shooter to flinch.

THE COMB OF THE GUN STOCK BRUISING THE CHEEK: Incorrect gun positioning on the shoulder is the main cause of cheek bruising, other causes are a badly shaped gun stock, too much pitch down or up, or a stock too long, can cause bruising by bringing the shoulder too far back, which then makes the shooter put his head forward and down across the comb, where the cheek bone has direct contact with the stock, this then causes the shooter to lift his head as well as flinch. If the butt is too far out on the shoulder it has the same effect.

Because all of the above cause physical pain or discomfort, and this pain or discomfort occurs repeatedly, flinching will result.

PSYCHOLOGICAL CAUSES: The fear of missing causes flinching, if we are more afraid of missing than we are positively anticipating the target to break, fear becomes the dominant emotion and will cause flinching.

Flinching then is the result of fear, fear of being hurt or the fear of missing and losing. Our mind subconsciously sends the message that we are about to be hurt and our body reacts.

If the cause is because of poor gun fit, this can be rectified but for the flinch that is caused by the fear of noise or the fear of missing, a rest from shooting might be the answer.

A release or reverse trigger can be a great help because the action requires just the relaxation of the finger rather than a pulling action.

Many top shooters have had this problem at some time in their career, but have worked out the cause of the flinch and with a positive mental attitude to the problem over-come it. ○

John Mosher is a very practical fellow and his book is a very practical treatment of many projects that appeal to practical shooters, the making of their own particular brand of nick nacks.

In four sections and 24 chapters he discusses most of the requirements for crafting shooting accessories.

Section one deals with tools and materials and although aimed at the American market can easily be converted to Australian conditions. Mosher likes to work with simple basic tools.

In section two he delves into projects for the range. Bench-rests, both permanent and portable are described together with rifle rests both sandbag and adjustable. Mosher also outlines how to print your own targets and how to make an adjustable portable target stand to hold them. Plans are also included in this section for a portable chronograph stand.

Projects for the shooters home bench are covered in Section three. Various stands, racks and bins are described. A stand and carryall for powder charging equipment and one for turrethead powder measures get full treatment as does a turret to store dies. He also describes how to make a component dispenser, a rifle rack, a checkering cradle and even the humble wooden cleaning rod.

Section four is devoted to the workbench itself. Firstly Mosher discusses the reloading benchtop and then describes the construction of six complete benches. They range from the simplest economy model through to the biggest and most comprehensive loading centre you have ever seen.

As Mosher points out, shooters are doers and they love to tinker. To this end he has supplied a book that will fire the imagination of those who like to retreat to the workshop and play with the accessories that make the shooting game so rewarding.

The book is written by a practical man and whilst the amount of illustration is a bit lean there are full step-by-step instructions for each project together with a full list of materials. For the shooter with a do-it-yourself leaning, be he novice or expert, this book will be a welcome addition to the shelf, even if it is only to fire the imagination.

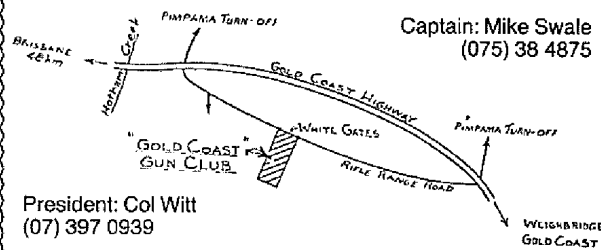

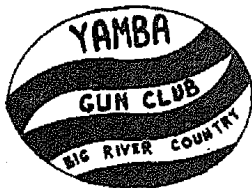

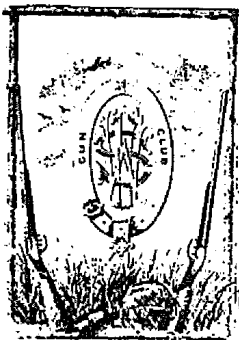
