ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING — 1983

The Association's Annual General Meeting was held at the Sportsmen's Association of Australia Headquarters at Parkside, on Wednesday April 13.

Following acceptance of Annual Reports, the major item of discussion was the use of re-loaded cartridges at National Championships. It was a spirited debate, with both sides putting sound arguments to the meeting. A vote was taken on a recommendation to the Executive Committee that they should permit the use of re-loads, which was narrowly defeated on a show of hands. A recount was called for and the meeting divided rather like a division in the House of Representatives. The result of the recount, 31 in favour of the recommendation, 39 against.

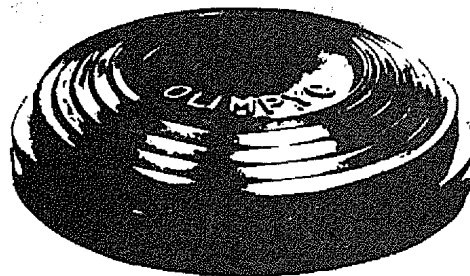

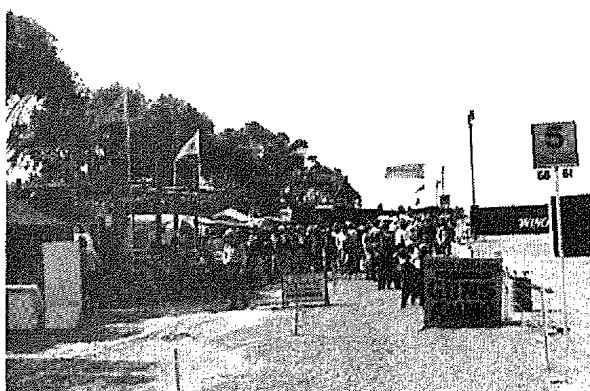

TRAP NATIONALS ADELAIDE 1983

And the rains came

- The Trade Display area was a hive of activity throughout the Nationals.

Adelaide turned on un-characteristic Autumn weather for the week of the Trap Nationals. Rain turned the grounds into a mud heap for a couple of days, but the quick application of shellgrit soon had everything under control.

Attendances were down on Brisbane about 19% overall which was disappointing. The Pre-Nationals on Saturday and Sunday were well patronised with over 300 shooters attending, however the expected increase did not occur during the week of the Nationals.

There is no doubt that the general economic situation did have a serious effect on the numbers attending.

Monday April 11 - Grand Australian Handicap

Mark Vistarini, shooter number 520 from Kerang Victoria, got the shooting underway in the Handicap. The entry was 348, 116 down on Brisbane in '82. The targets were good, in fact very few complaints were heard about angles and distances, except for the Double Rise later in the week.

The first possible came in squad 4, from Peter Forner, Broken Hill. We waited and waited, and so did Peter Forner, the longer the day went, the less likely it seemed that we would have a shoot-off. When the last scores were posted, Peter Forner had won outright with the only 50/50, his long wait was over. Peter is 23 years of age, and is a jeweller, opal miner and cutter from Broken Hill. He had come to the Nationals for experience and was delighted with his Remington Limited Edition Shotgun donated by Boustead Australia, together with the Blue Sash and A.C.T.A. Silver Australia Badge.

In the shoot-off for the minors, Len Cook from Callawadda/Stawell 73/74 was successful from Peter Rose, Sydney 72/74, Jenny Ey, Hopetoun 47/50 was the best of the ladies, Les Mitchell, Melbourne 68/73 was top veteran, and Anthony Smith, Goroke led the junior division with 48/50.

Tuesday April 12, Double Barrel

The blue ribbon event at the Nationals attracted 414 entries. For the winner was a Diamond Grade Trap Gun kindly donated by Winchester Australia, the Royal Blue Sash, the A.C.T.A. Silver Australia badge, and the Perazzi trophy from Evans and Balfour.



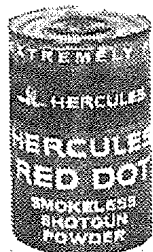

Conditions were fair as squads approached the tracks, and many possibles were to be shot throughout the day.

Fifty two in all were squadded for the shoot-off, mostly AA and A Grade shooters, a couple of B Graders and a lone C Grader, Malcolm Brown from Carlisle, U.K., who had helped our trap team enormously during the U.K. visit in 1982.

Deserie Huddleston was among the possibles, she outlasted many of the men to be in the last 4 in the shoot-off, finally missing her 184th target.

As the shoot-off progressed, all wondered if the light would hold. Greg Hipwell, Cohuna, Vic., dropped his 208th target to leave the battle between Bill Iles, Melbourne and Denis Lymn, Port Lincoln. Ultimately it was Iles who missed his 215th giving the 36 year old farmer Denis Lymn the 1983 Double Barrel title. Denis lives 225 kilometres from his nearest club, and gets some practice with a hand held trap at home on the farm. It was a very thrilled Denis Lymn who phoned the news home to his wife and family.

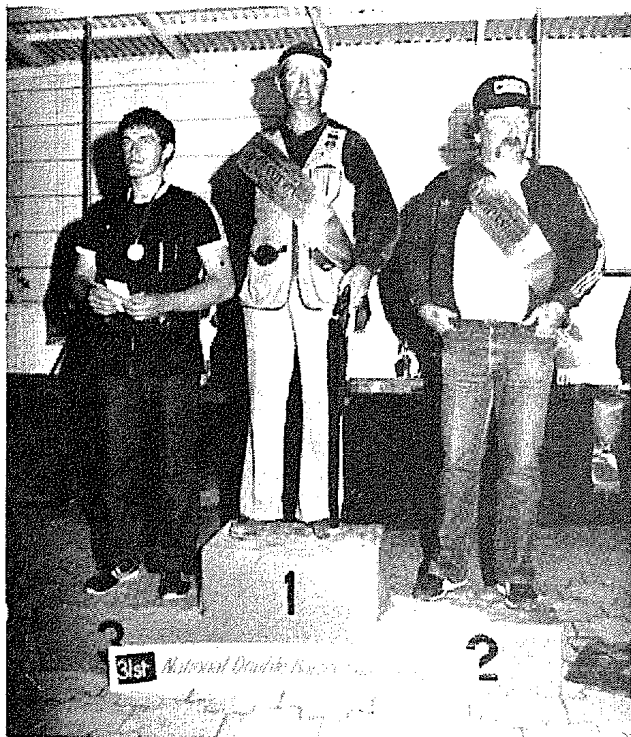

• National Double Barrel Champion 1983, Denis Lymn, Port Lincoln, S.A. shot 215/215 to win the title.

Earlier in the day the Nationals were officially opened by Mr Jack Slater, Minister of Sport and Recreation in the South Australian Government.

In the grades Bill Iles, Melbourne took out A.A. with his 214/215, Adrian Cousens Melbourne, A Grade 122/123, David Hurst, South Australia Gun Club, B Grade 58/59, and Malcolm Brown, Carlisle, U.K. had to find room in his baggage for a canteen of cutlery, on winning C Grade with 50/50.

Ray Melville Tamworth N.S.W. was top veteran on 50/50.

The Third Australian Womens Double Barrel Championship was run in conjunction with the open event and resulted in a win for the second year on end for Deserie Huddleston, Rankin Springs, N.S.W. 50/50. Faye Taylor, Kerang Vic, was second with 63/64 and the much travelled Thelma Meadows, Brisbane, third on 62/64.

Winchester Australia also sponsored the staging of the 3rd Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship, this too being run in conjunction with the open event. Defending Champion David Wilson from Wyong, N.S.W. put together 50/50 to win it again and take home a Winchester 101 Pigeon Grade Trap Gun. In second place was Scott Hetherington, Mt. Gambier, S.A. a placegetter in Brisbane last year, on 50/51 and third was Darren Nicholls, Broken Hill, 49/51.

The Executive Committee is very appreciative of the assistance given by Winchester Australia in sponsoring the 1983 National and Junior Double Barrel Championships.

Wednesday April 13 - Single Barrel Championship

Again the weather was fair for Single Barrel day, not the Autumn sun that we all expected, but thankfully the rain had gone. Entries totalled 377, and possibles were scarce.

There were four in all, Ian Long a B Grader from Maryborough, Vic., Kevin Perkins, Illawarra, J. W. Smith, Royal Aero, N.S.W., and Geoff Mark, Sebastopol, Vic.



• Geoff Mark on the victory dais after his win in the National Single Barrel Championship.

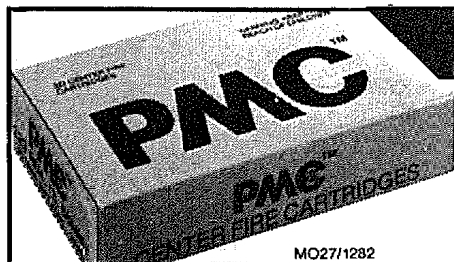
J. W. was the first to go missing his first target in the shoot-off, followed soon after by Ian Long. Perky missed his 58th, Geoff Mark shot his and it was over. Another member of the well known shooting family had won a National title. Geoff runs a book supply business in Ballarat, and was delighted with his win. We were all sorry that his father Brian was unwell and unable to be present to share the triumph.

In the grades Kevin Perkins was tops in AA with 57/58, A Grade went to Ryan Flint, of Frankston/Australian, B Grade to Ian Long, Maryborough, Vic. 55/56 and C Grade to Les Mitchell, Melbourne, 47/50.

The battle of the sisters continued in the ladies division with Christine Wakefield 57/60 edging out Deserie Huddleston 56/60. Les Mitchell was having a good series again winning the veterans division with 47/50, and top junior again was David Wilson of Wyong, N.S.W. David was presented with a Mec Reloader kindly donated by Winchester Australia.

The Glenn Cup match between Australia and New Zealand had been held over from Tuesday because of the late finish to the Double Barrel shoot-off. The Australian team of Denis Lymn, Bill Iles, Greg Hipwell, Deserie Huddleston, David Osborne and Alf James with 119/120 proved too strong for New Zealand.

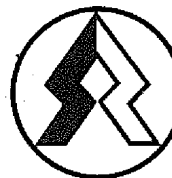

One of the highlights of the whole week was the 4th Interstate Trap Teams match.

All teams were resplendent in State shooting jackets, the prize for the best turned out combination going to the New South Welshman. The embroidered Waratah on the back of each jacket was very striking. Congratulations to all States for taking such trouble to equip teams properly for this important match. Not only did New South Wales look outstanding, but team members Warren Charlton, Adrian Hayes, Kevin Perkins, Robbie Smith and James Smith shot brilliantly to record 124/125 and win the A.C.T.A. cup. Queensland were in second place on 122, then followed South Australia, Tasmania and Victoria on 120, with Northern Territory and Western Australia on 115.

Thursday April 14 - A.N.Z. Pointscore Championship

365 Shooters entered for this championship, which was the third qualifying event for the Mackintosh team. The standard had been high in the previous events and it was clear that only top scores would make it into the team.

Conditions had improved on the Thursday morning, and possibles started to appear on the scoreboard. At days end there were nine lined up for the shoot-off, which only went 19 targets for a decision to be reached.

The shoot-off soon developed into a battle between Jim Smith from Royal Aero, and Alf James, Maryborough, Vic. Both had been in top form during the week and had been close to a title. J. W. was too good for Alf in the end winning with 207/207. Jim is a 33 year old slaughterman from Blainey in Western New South Wales, and was thrilled to win his first National title.

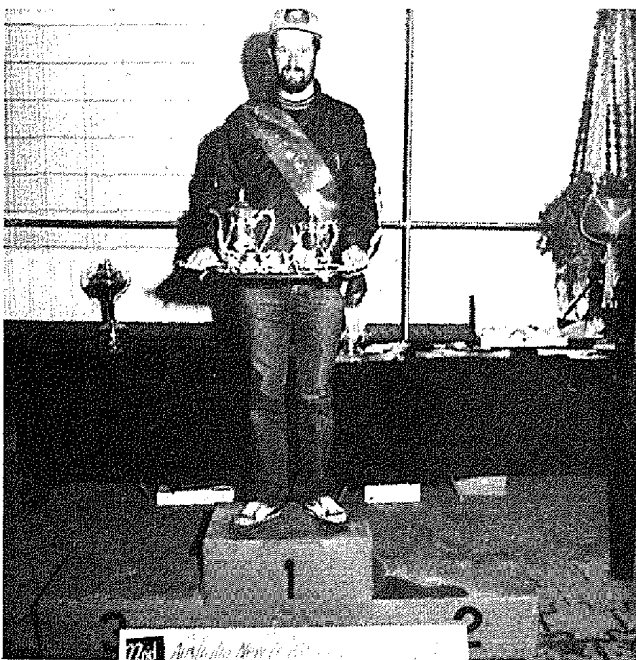
Alf James took out AA Grade with 206/207, first in A Grade was Greg Newey, Warwick, Qld. 152/153, B Grade was won by Noel Deeley, Gemfields, Qld on 161/162, and the C Grade winner was Bruce Ross of Brisbane 146/153.

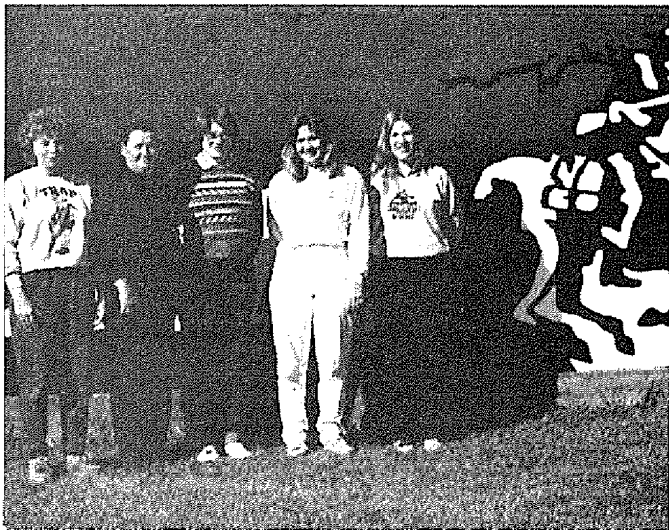

Those with seven points down shot off for the last place in the Mackintosh team, a great improvement on Brisbane, where 14 down was good enough.

Friday April 15 - Mackintosh and Double Rise

Conditions were not good for shooting on the Friday. A strong wind was blowing along the line of traps from the left of the shooters, consequently the Mackintosh team did not perform as well as expected.

High gun went to J. W. Smith of Royal Aero with an immaculate 300 points. Next best was Barry Kable on 299. Jim was delighted to win the Silver Australia badge, and the coveted gold cup after his victory the previous day in the Points Championship.

With team photographs and presentations taken care of, all was set for the Double Rise Championship. Christine Wakefield took the ladies division from sister Deserie by a target with 36/40 and David Wilson, Wyong was still excelling in the Junior ranks, winning another Mec Reloader compliments Winchester Australia, for his score of 42/50.

The 9th International Trap Teams Trophy Match was staged at the completion of the Double Rise Championship. This was open to all countries with competitors at the Nationals, and was won by the "American" team of Leo Harrison and friends with a score of 244/250. Australia, represented by Jim Smith, Alf James, Doug Smith, Barry Kable and Tony Bradshaw, were in second spot just one target behind, third New Zealand and fourth Great Britain.

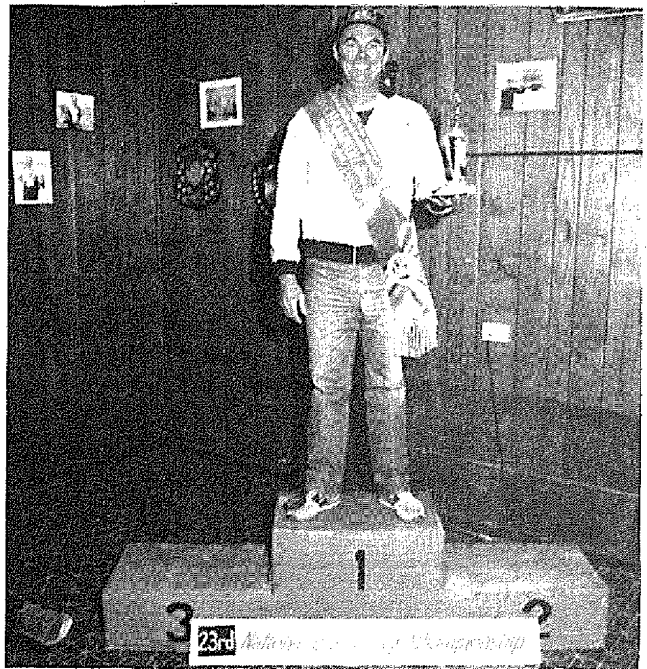

Saturday April 16 - Champion of Champions

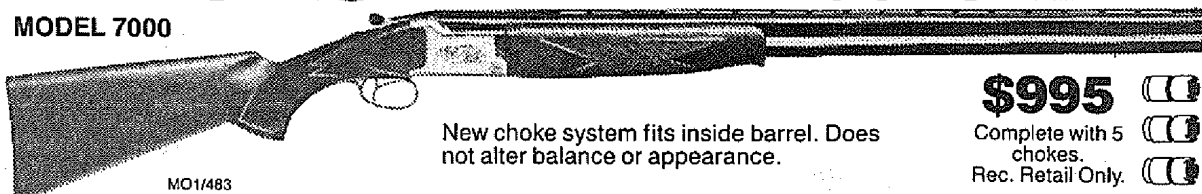

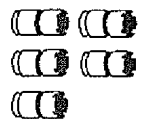

In C Grade Jack Barker from Singleton, N.S.W. took the honours, while the sisters were at it again in the ladies division, with Christine Wakefield beating her sister Deserie by a point with 122/125. Adrian Hayes, Hawkesbury, won the veterans with 120/125, and Andrew Noble, Alice Springs, the juniors and a Mec Reloader from Winchester Australia for his 116/125.

James Smith of Royal Aero received the J.M. Bauman Gold Cup and the A.C.T.A. solid silver medal for his 300/300 in the Mackintosh team shoot. Deserie Huddleston High Gunned the ladies team with 290/300, and Andrew Noble of Alice Springs, N.T., the junior team with 293/300. Andrew was the first winner of the Carlisle and District Gun Club trophy for his performance. This trophy was presented to the Association by the visitors from Carlisle, Malcolm Brown and Peter McGlasson, for perpetual competition in the Junior Team shoot at the Trap Nationals.

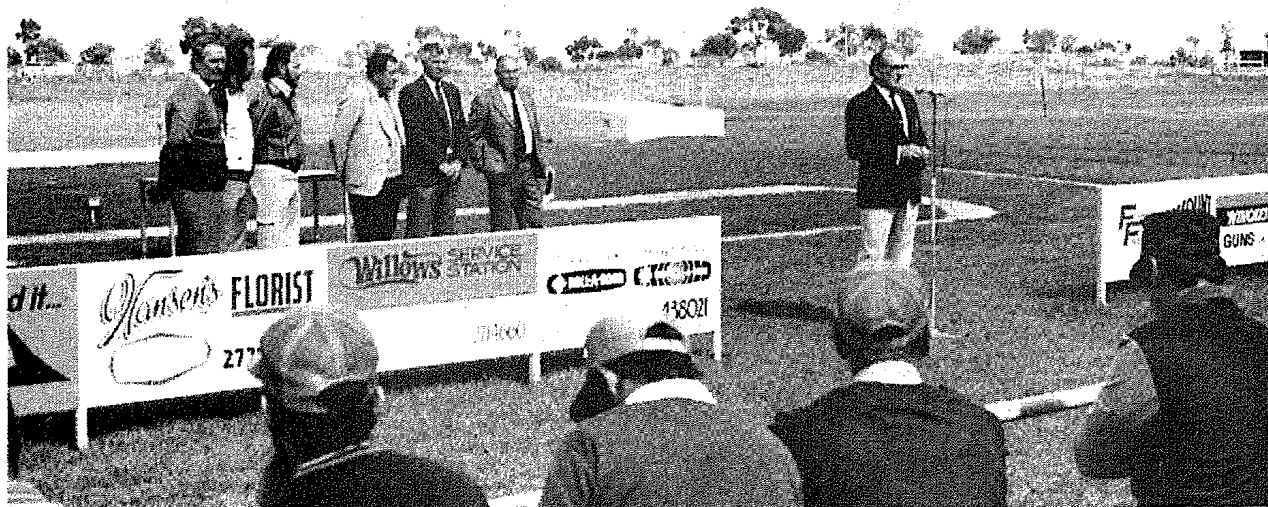

The five targets a lane before moving and 50 targets in one visit system worked well in Adelaide, despite the fears of some.

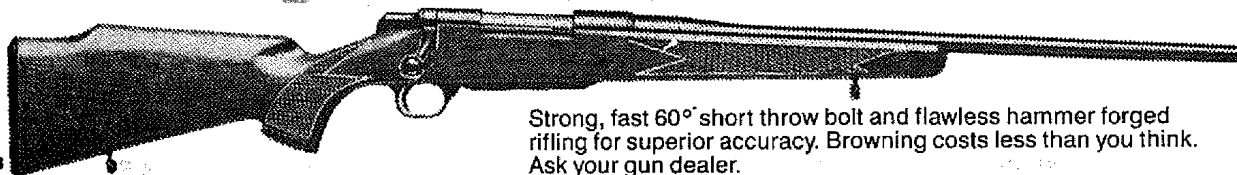
The grounds of South Australian Gun Club were presented in fine shape by President John Byrnes and his hardworking committee and despite the rain early in the week, were well maintained right through the series.

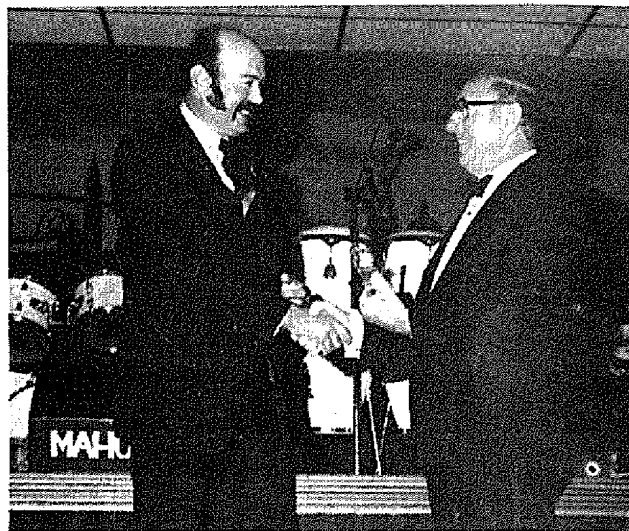

From the 7 year old boy, in a pre-dawn-duck-blind, to the fully fledged male on the competition tracks of the gunning sports, each and every one of them played his unmistakable role in shaping and moulding this writers education, manners and etiquette expected of the gunning sports.

On reflection, the pointers they conferred on me were "gifts of unquestionable value", not to mention the wonderful memories of events and good times well shared. Therefore, I can say without hesitation the passing years will not dull those moments, so fleeting, as we travel through the passage of time.

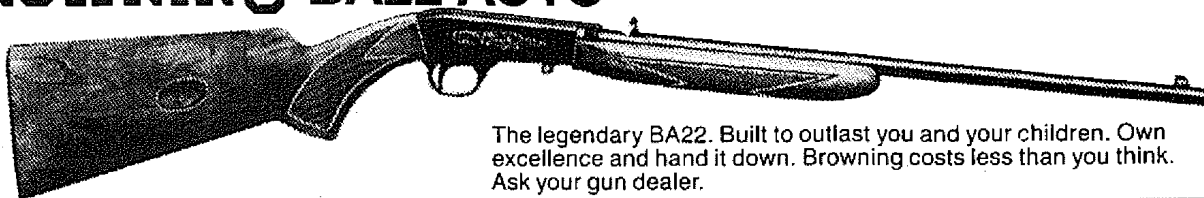
PRAISE: SWEET MUSIC TO THE EAR!

Some critics had claimed that "Flash in the Pan" shooters could make it to the World team or the National Training Squad over the 400 targets of the Commonwealth and National Championships. This proved to be a spurious argument as all competitors agreed that 400 targets over six days demanded the best in ability, dedication, and stamina, to come out on top.

Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championship.

Saturday April 23

It was hoped to complete the Commonwealth Championships in two days, shooting 100 targets each day. It soon became apparent however that with an entry of 111, this would be impossible.

Rain was threatening as the first squads got down to business.

Competition was fierce right from the first round, with a lot of interest being shown in Graeme Boyd's entry in the Trap event. Graeme represented Australia in I.S.U. Skeet in Caracas in 1982, and here he was up against Ellis, Rumbel, Maxwell and Co.

He opened in top form with 25, and was joined by Bill Iles, Geoff Mark, and Terry Rumbel. Ellis 22, and Maxwell a disappointing 21. The second round saw Boyd again with 25, Ellis 25, Iles 24, Mark 24, and Jack Henwood adding a second 24.

Boyd dropped two in his third visit to end the day tied with Bill Iles on 73/75, one target ahead of Geoff Mark and Jack Henwood who put together three rounds of 24. Also on 72 was Kevin Seymour, with Jim Ellis 71, Rumbel and Budd 70. Maxwell was disappointed with 66 and was tied with Pud Burgess.

Sunday April 24

A 10 o'clock start for the second 75 targets meant better light. No 25's from the top contenders but plenty of 24's. Boyd, Mark, Henwood, Budd and Fryer shot solid 24's, Iles 22, Ellis 23, Maxwell 23. Rumbel dropped three to go further behind the leaders.

Maxwell started to hit his straps in the fifth round shooting all 25, and was joined by Geoff Mark and Pud Burgess on this score. Boyd went on relentlessly and although he dropped two, was still with the leaders.

He finished the second day with yet another 24 to be tied with Iles (25), Mark (23), and Henwood (25), on 144/150. Next was Jim Ellis (25) on 142, who was two clear of Rumbel, who in turn was one ahead of Maxwell on 139.

Monday April 25

A twelve o'clock start for the final 50 targets, some wondered could Boyd keep it up. He had led from the start and kept going well with a 24 in the seventh round. Iles did likewise to tie Boyd, Mark dropped two to be one behind, and Henwood shot 22 to make his task harder. Graeme Boyd was the first of the leaders to finish, shooting yet another 24 to total 192.

Bill Iles had to shoot the lot to win outright but had trouble with his 14th and 21st targets to finish on 191, and tie Geoff Mark for second place. Maxwell had maintained his good form with 25 in the last round, and had shot 99 of the last 100 targets.

Much interest was shown in the shoot-off for the silver medal, Iles and Mark both shooting 25 in the first round. Bill Iles added another brilliant 25 to beat Geoff Mark who totalled 21.

It had been a keen tussle right from the start with Boyd performing brilliantly to lead all the way to the blue sash and gold medal.

With an entry of 20, it was decided to shoot the Skeet over two days, 100 targets each day.

Gil Farish led the skeeties after round 1 with the only 25 but was quickly headed when he followed with 21. Hale and Crikis added 25's to their opening rounds of 23 and 24, and in round 3 it was Hale 25 and Crikis 24 to share the lead on 73. Ex-New Zealander Brian Thomson carded a 25 to be in third spot, three behind Crikis and Hale.

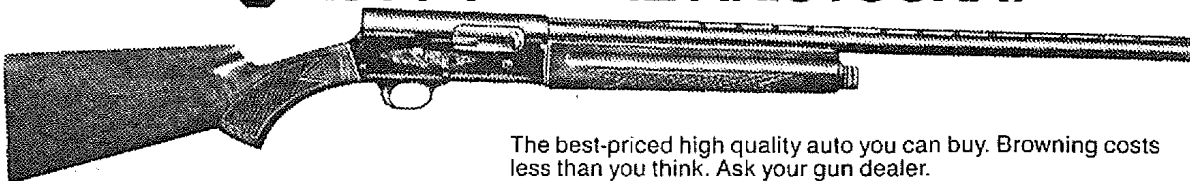

National Olympic Trap Championship Tuesday April 26

Ninety three shooters were squadded for the National Title, so interest was still very high in shooting the 400 targets. Many observers thought that numbers would wane with work now beckoning for most people.

John Maxwell continued his good form of the last two days to open with a 25 to be tied with Terry Rumbel, one target ahead of Graeme Boyd, Jim Ellis, John Porter and Trevor Byrne. Maxwell again carded a 25 in round two as did Russell Mark and Peter Clancy. Boyd again was very consistent with 24. At 75 targets the leader was Maxwell on 73, two ahead of Ellis, Boyd, Porter, and Clancy, with Trevor Byrne on 70. Rumbel, Burgess and Russell Mark were together on 69, with Bill Iles after a disastrous start on 64.

Wednesday April 27

The strain of competing began to show on some faces as shooting got under way. The weather was cool and overcast, with the light fair. Ellis faltered slightly with 22, Boyd another 24. Round five, Ellis and Rumbel 25, Boyd 24 again Maxwell 23. Round six saw Ellis, Burgess and Mark bring in 25's, Boyd and Maxwell 24's, Porter, Iles, Byrne and Clancy 23's. And so with the final 50 targets to shoot in the morning we had joint leaders in Ellis, Boyd and Maxwell on 143, Burgess 141, Mark 140, Rumbel and Porter 139.

Jim and Joan Scott's High Gun board had a lot of watchers to see who was leading to make the World Championship Team and National Training Squad. Boyd 335, Ellis 333, Maxwell 331, Rumbel 327. Burgess, Henwood and Budd were still in touch, Iles looked doubtful standing at 323.

Thursday April 28

Melbourne Gun Club was shrouded in fog at the scheduled 8.30 start time. Proceedings were delayed until the fog started to lift at 9.15.

The vital seventh round completed, Boyd had edged to the front with yet another 24 to lead Ellis by one target and Maxwell by two. Bill Iles was the only top man to shoot all 25 in this round.

The last round, and Maxwell was first to finish with 24 for 189, Rumbel 25 for 188, and then Ellis 24 for 190. Russell Mark, Bill Iles 25's. Graeme Boyd in the leading bunch for all six days was last to approach the final 25. He needed 24 to win outright, and after dropping his ninth target was still in good shape, as he demolished the next fifteen without a problem. And then came his last target, bang-bang, no result, and we had a shoot-off for the blue sash, gold medal and silver Australia badge.

A very deliberate Jim Ellis seemed to take extra care as he broke all 25 targets in the shoot-off. Graeme Boyd missed his tenth to give Jim the National Title for 1983.

Like the Olympic Trap, this would be shot over three days shooting 75, 75, and 50 targets. 24's were the main in the first round being carded by Hale, Thomson, Guy and Kavanagh. Crikis disappointed with 20. In round two Crikis bounced back with 25 to trail the leader Hale by two targets. To end day one we had Thomson, and Crikis shooting 25's and Hale 24. Hale and Thomson led on 71, from Crikis 70.

Wednesday April 27

Ian Hale exerted real pressure right from the start to bring in 25, along with Barney Rooke and Graham Guy. This put Hale three in front of Crikis who was one ahead of Thomson.

Into round five, Hale another great 25, Thomson 25, Crikis 24. Hale made it 75 straight in the sixth round to end the day on 146, six targets clear of Thomson and Crikis.

Thursday April 28

With two rounds to go and Hale six in front, the interest was in the minors. Thomson, Crikis and Farish all 25's in the seventh round, Hale 24 with Barney Rooke.

In the last 25, Ian Hale cruised through a 24 to take out the title by five targets from Brian Thomson, who had just outstayed Alex Crikis for the silver medal. Barney Rooke shot the only 25 in this last round, and had broken 97 of his second 100 targets to finish in fourth spot overall.

A resounding victory to Ian Hale who had missed only 11 of the 400 targets in six days of shooting.

The following are changes made to the Rules at meetings conducted during the Trap Nationals in Adelaide. These changes and additions will be incorporated in the next printing of the rules, which should be available within two months.

Rule 56F

It now reads, "on the fourth and subsequent malfunction in any one event. However, at the end of each 100 targets in any one event, the malfunctions that have occurred shall be cancelled, and the count shall re-commence from zero."

These same words are to be added to Skeet Rule 48J.

Skeet Handicapping Formula

The Referees' Association changed the percentages for skeet grading to bring them into line with D.T.L. They are now:

- "AA" 97% and over
- "A" 94% and under 97%
- "B" 87% and under 94%
- "C" under 87%

Skeet handicapping and grading is as follows:

Grading	Handicap
"AA"	0
"A"	1
"B"	2
"C"	6

Trap Rule 54J and Skeet Rule 46I

The following are considered malfunctions of ammunition, i.e., failure to fire when firing pin indentation is clearly noticeable:

1. When only the primer fires
2. When the powder charge has been omitted
3. When the powder charge is not ignited

Components of the load remaining in the barrel shall be considered as evidence of defective ammunition. The referee must decide.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

After suffering several months of Shooting Shorts by Roger Darwin, the May issue was the final straw. In particular I took exception to the section titled A Giant Step Backwards.

The rule regarding the refusal of a target has been in operation for four months now and from what I have observed, this rule has indeed been a step forward. No longer do we have arguments on the tracks in regard to the legality of missed targets. If for any reason a shooter does refuse a target, he still has to shoot at a repeat and must shoot at the required number of targets in any one event. No longer do we have shooters being let back in after a miss. Any competitor who persistently refuses legal targets can be dealt with by club management. Also at the recent Nationals in Adelaide, the rules were changed slightly to allow the referee to control this problem.

In the past four months I have only observed one legal target refused, and that shooter promptly missed the repeat,

Rule 60E Double Rise

Added to the end of this rule:

"In this case the result of the first shot shall be scored, and a proof pair thrown to determine the result of the second shot only."

Rule 108

The words "over graded and over handicapped" be added to this rule.

Refusals

Added to the note after Trap Rule 54C and Skeet Rule 46: "If in the opinion of the referee, legal targets are being refused, the referee may call lost target."

Skeet Rule 49 (a)

Added to the procedure for Station 8:

"The squad will advance to Station 8 where they will stand in their shooting order behind the referee on an imaginary line drawn between the centre of Station 8 and Station 4."

Skeet Time Limit.

To be added:

"A shooter must stand on the station, position himself load his gun and call for his target within 12 seconds after the shooter preceding him has completed his firing or after the referee has given the signal to commence firing or to resume firing.

Non compliance with the above will draw a warning from the referee. Subsequent occurrences during a 25 target series will be penalised one target each."

Classification

If a shooter elects to shoot in a grade higher than his percentage indicates after 400 targets, he must stay in the higher grade until he has shot at a further 400 targets to be downgraded. **NOTE:** If the shooter elects to shoot in a grade higher than his percentage indicates, the club handicapper is to mark his card "prefer A Grade" etc.

Sweepstakes

All sweepstakes events will be shot compulsory division, with a maximum nomination of \$8.00.

Clubs have the option of taking 60% and returning 40% to shooters in sweepstakes events.

so much for cheating. This period of time includes regular weekly competition in Victoria and also several days at the Adelaide Nationals. If Mr Roger Darwin has observed shooters blatantly cheating, perhaps he could help by reporting the facts to his State Association for action, instead of bleating in the "News".

As a referee I do not feel that my control has been taken away. To the contrary, as there is less pressure involved one can put all his concentration into releasing the target on call and watching for small chips etc.

A good referee can still call No Target before the shooter has shot on a bad pull, particularly if he is on the ball.

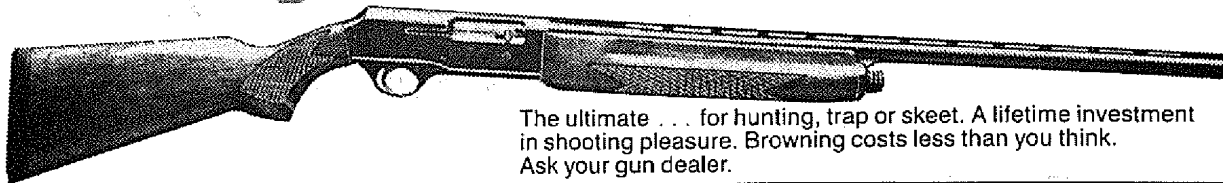

Saturday 9th to Saturday 16th April, 1983.

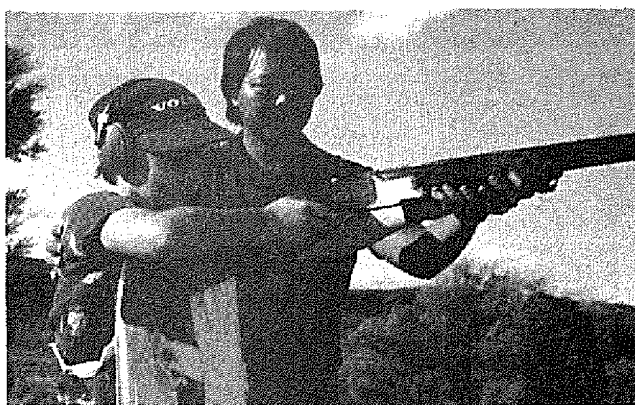

Sunday 17th April, 1983.

The National Executive met for a full day meeting at the Sombrero Motel in Adelaide, after the completion of the National Championships. Items of interest to come out of the meeting are that the 1984 National Championships will be held at Wagga Wagga N.S.W. from 31st March, 1984.

Approval was also given by the Executive for the purchase of the property, from where we now operate, namely 8 Main Street, Blackburn. This will be a great acquisition for your Association and give us an asset to build on in the future. When the deal is completed, it should be realised you will all be share holders in a valuable piece of Real Estate in Melbourne. The international Sub-Committee was also elected at this meeting. It consists of Bob Buchan, Victoria, Jim Scott N.S.W., Richard Dean and Jim Kelly, Queensland, and National Training Squad Manager/Coach, Peter Quire from S.A. Bob Buchan has again been elected Chairman of the Committee.

The responsibilities of this Sub-committee cover all facets of our shooting i.e. Trap (Down the Line), American Skeet, Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet. Some shooters and administrators are under the impression this Sub-Committee represents the U.I.T. or Olympic disciplines only, this is not so.

Saturday 23rd to Thursday 28th April, 1983.

The first ever Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet Nationals conducted by the National body were at the Melbourne Gun Club. A record number of shooters entered the events with 110 being received in the Commonwealth Trench and 20 in the Commonwealth Skeet titles. Graeme Boyd, Victoria, captured the trench title 192/200 and Ian Hale, Victoria taking out the Commonwealth Skeet title 195/200.

First in the National Trench Championship was Jim Ellis 215/225, second Graeme Boyd 214/215 and third John Maxwell 189/200. The National I.S.U. Skeet Graded Championship went to Ian Hale 194/200, second Brian Thomson 189/200 and third Alex Crikis 188/200.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

I wish to register my opposition to either photograph presented in the April C.T.S.N. by Roger Darwon under the heading ETIQUETTE being labelled "right".

Mr Darwon obviously does not recognise that some shooters hold views on safety that are more stringent than his, as it was his own experience that prompted your publication of these photographs. It is my contention that both methods of gun portage shown are not in the best interests of safety. In neither case is the breach readily visible to "at a glance" checking by other shooters/spectators and in both cases the barrels are aligned at body height.

Furthermore, guns carried in such a fashion produce a cavalier image of clay target shooters when seen by the general public. Safety considerations aside (which they never should be) our sport cannot afford any erosion of public respect in these days of gun restriction lobbying.

Finally, it is the responsibility of every shooter to acquiesce gracefully should they encounter a club or a Shoot Marshall that demands safety procedures more rigorous than his/her own, or those promulgated by the A.C.T.A.

SUN. 27-3-83

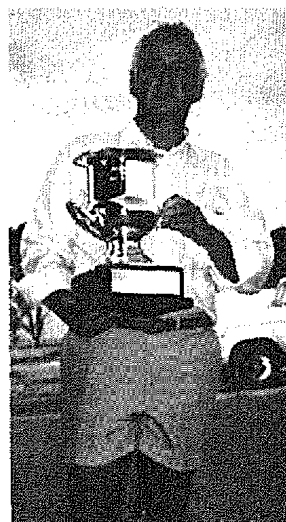

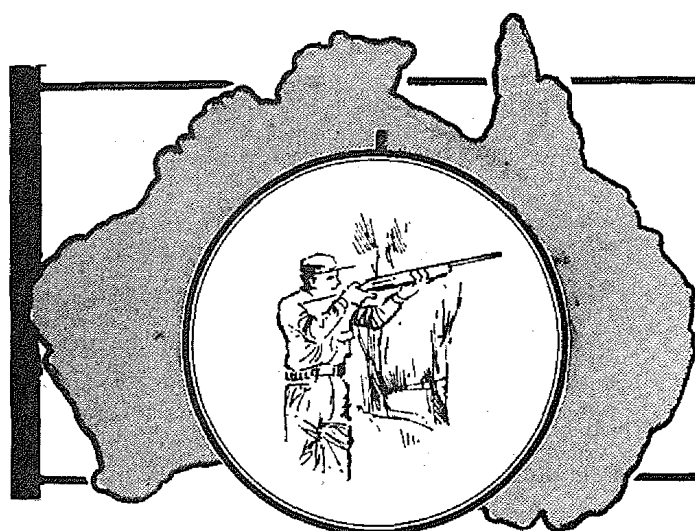
Leo Harrison convincingly won High Gun 394/400.

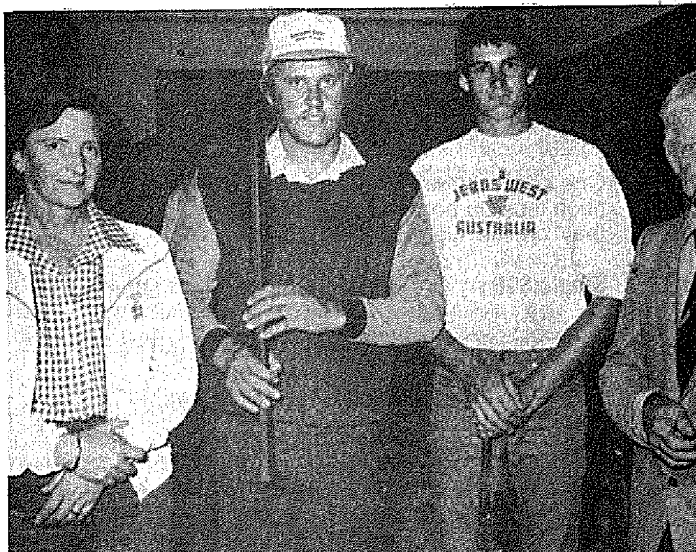
