

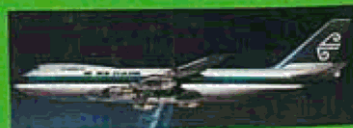

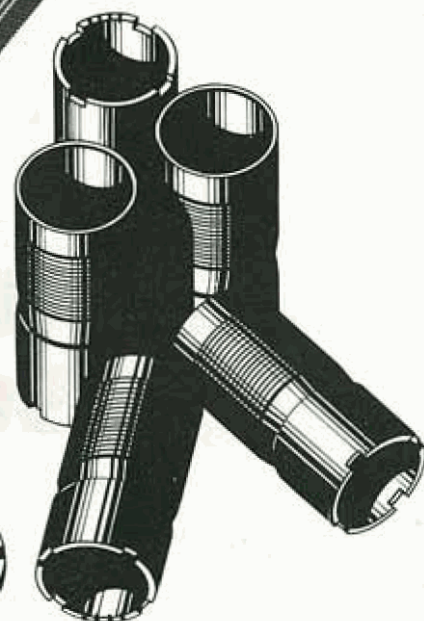

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Planning is well advanced for the first Skeet Nationals in November.

The series will be conducted at Melbourne Gun Club from Wednesday November 16, to Saturday November 19.

Two fifty target events will be shot on each of the first two days, with the Commonwealth Skeet Championship of 100 targets on Friday November 18, and the National title of 100 targets on Saturday November 19. All events will be graded A.A., A., B., C., with junior, lady and veteran prizes.

The State Shoulder to Shoulder teams match for teams of five shooters will be conducted in conjunction with the second event on Thursday November 17, and all Australian teams of 15 open, 5 ladies and 5 juniors, will be chosen on the complete program of 400 targets.

The highest overall scorer over the 400 will be the Champion of Champions, and a team of 5 shooters will be selected over the 400 targets to compete in the U.S.A. in 1984.

In addition a two man teams match for the Adrian Cousens trophy for nominated pairs will be conducted over the 400 targets. Black targets will be used throughout the Tournament and seven layouts will be in operation.

It is hoped to wind up the Skeet Nationals with a barbeque at the Club on the Saturday night and to have a Victorian Government V.I.P. visit during the series.

From the interest being shown by skeet shooters in their very own Nationals, it is clear that the series will be well supported. Many shooters have already donated the cost of medals, with many more expected to do so. Winchester Australia have donated a Beretta Skeet gun as the prize for the Champion of Champions as an indication of their support for the Skeet Nationals.

The Waikato Gun Club, North Island, approx 10 kms, from Hamilton was this year the venue for the New Zealand national titles held in March.

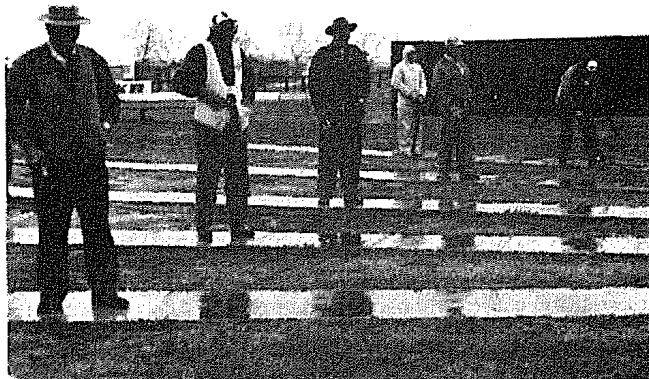
The New South Wales Gun Club, in association with Tooths Brewery Ltd, fielded a six man squad to compete against all comers in D.T.L. and skeet events. This squad of six shooters, who were the winners of the Tooth L.A. New Zealand eliminations for 1982, assembled at Sydney international airport, with their necessary equipment. Qantas being our carrier, proved to be most efficient in looking after all the necessary arrangements and paperwork, required to take twelve guns and ammo out of Sydney.

There were a few problems with the ammo, as only a certain amount is allowed on any one flight, however, over the next few days, it did all eventually arrive at our destination. Thanks to the careful planning by Sergio Zuffo and his excellent command of the English language.

Arriving at Auckland Airport, our mini bus awaited us, which was then, most capably driven for the next ten days by Sergio. It proved its stamina over this period, carrying all our gear and ammo, which as time went by, seemed to shrink in size. We were booked into the Commercial Hotel in Hamilton, and with everything carefully stowed away we were then free to explore and sample the culinary delights of Hamilton.

Early to bed, as we wanted to get in some serious practice the following day, Friday. An early breakfast, all our gear loaded on our mini bus, and to head off in the opposite direction. We were soon well and truly lost, the natives were friendly and two hours later we were there. It seemed they had moved the gun club, but forgot to tell the locals.

The Waikato Gun Club with its sixteen lay-outs, large bar and entertainment centre, was more than adequate to accoma-

date the five hundred or so, shooters who contested the nationals. Our team helped to keep the true image, by keeping the bar takings up, once the shooting was over.

Our first day was spent in practising D.T.L. events, C/D only. Some of the team managed to keep their wallets well stocked. We were disappointed that we were unable to practice skeet as the following day Saturday, saw the start of the national C/Ship. Overall the organisation for the ten days shooting was excellent. The shoot marshalls on their scooters were everywhere. The whole operation was very smooth. If we had a query, there was always someone with the time and the patience to discuss any problems. The grounds were spotless, very few empties on the grounds, the reloading fraternity saw to that. We were able to sell our once fired cases for up to fifteen cents each. Australia is still the lucky country.

Our most successful entrant was Platon Zapantis, who carried back several medals and trophies to decorate his den. Platon was also in great demand at the farewell dinner dance at the gun club, when he proved that he could sing a treat, as well as shoot.

Hank Theunissen made the Australian trap team, and shot very well. The rest of us managed to get into a few shoot offs. Generally the opportunity to compete overseas was rewarding experience, it was great to watch the top boys in action. Leo Harrison from the USA with only two spare cartridges on his belt, twenty seven shell for all events, it must be nice to be that confident, and of course our own Bill Iles who shot so well. We only had one days rain. The food and drink was excellent. Side show alley, with its array of guns and accessories made us all want to sell our guns over there. The shooting sports are expensive in New Zealand.

Finally, we would like to express our thanks, to Tooth L.A. for their sponsorship, and hope that the future winners of this event, will have as much fun as we did in the land of the long white cloud . . .

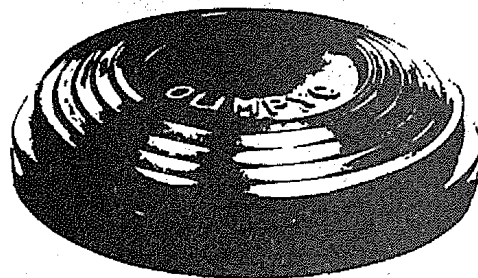

The grounds looked a real picture prior to the rain, which was a result of many hours of work done by the committee, however after the shooters plus families and vehicles had been on the grounds during the carnival, the result was a quagmire leaving many more hours for the committee repairing the damage. My congratulations to these members, the carnival was worth it. I must make a special mention of Kev Ryan, a local member known as "green thumb" who was out spreading grass clippings before leaving the grounds on Monday night.

Apart from the discomfort of shooting in the rain — walking in mud (in places up to ones ankles) — some very good scores were recorded. Including the longest break in Queensland being reset by Doug Smith who shot 422 straight. The former record was held by Pud Burgess from NSW at 408 shot at St George Gun Club some time back.

The ladies in the canteen were also kept very busy all weekend, and the food was greatly appreciated, congratulations girls — a job well done.

The president of the Sunshine Coast branch of the Sportsmens Association, Mr Don McNiven was in attendance for the presentation of trophies on the first day, however due to the failing light

caused by the weather, the shoot off had to be finalised the following morning. Mr McNiven attended on the Sunday morning for this.

One hundred and forty-three shooters nominated on the first day, and the state D.B. Championship was the first event, following a shoot off, the eventual winner was Rob Uebergang of Tamworth N.S.W. who shot 194/194. Rob won the O.W. Smith Perpetual Trophy, the Winchester Perpetual Cup and trophy, the Q.C.T.A. silver badge. Greg Woodbine of Kallangur Gun Club was the winner of the AA Grade his score 193/194. A Grade S. Guest from Leeton 119/120. B Grade M. Bryan from Kallangur 62/63. C Grade M. Andronis from Ipswich 49/50. Winner of the Junior Division Murray Gough from Kallangur 48/50; winner of ladies Bev Grice Sunshine Coast 48/50.

Stevens from Ipswich 53/60. B Grade Quinto Porfiri from Sunshine Coast 41/50. C Grade Desley Ryan from Callide-Dawson 39/50. Desley also won the ladies division while Paul Rehbein of Bundaberg won the Juniors.

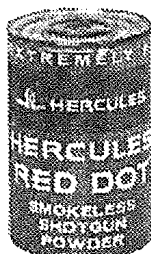

Sunday morning and the weather if anything was worse, the shooters still seemed undeterred, and the same number of shooters attended. The first event was the State Single Barrel Championship, the overall winner was Doug Smith from Brisbane with a score of 63/65 with Richard Dean of Roma winning AA Grade with a score of 62-65. Hugh Cameron from Roma won the A Grade his score 48/50, B Grade was won by B. Goodrich of Callide-Dawson his score 48/50 and C Grade by another Callide shooter Bevan Ryan 46/50.

The Winchester event followed with nineteen possibles being shot. The conditions once again worsened so that the shoot off was postponed to the following morning.

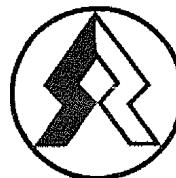

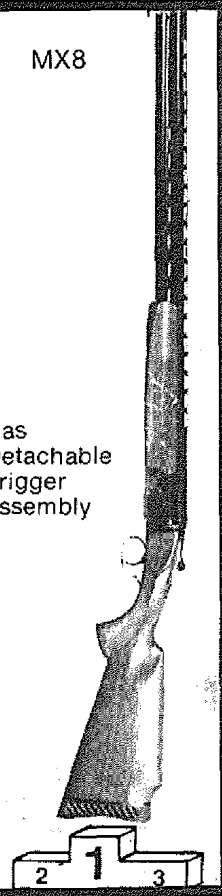
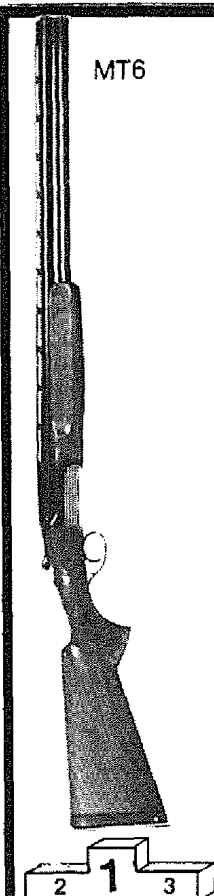

NATIONAL SHOOTING GROUND

Executive Committee

Since 1977 it has been debated for and against by clay target shooters that a venue of sufficient size, centrally situated, easy of access, used by a caretaker club but owned by the Australian Clay Target Association should be established on which to conduct our National competitions each year.

To this end, flowing from a motion at the 1979 A.G.M., a referendum of all members (clubs) of the Association was held resulting in a vote of 104 for, and 50 against, which when analysed further from the figures supplied by these members showed that 1592 registered shooters voted for, and 854 against.

The Executive at the time naturally took this as a mandate to proceed with the project and the search for a suitable location began, along guidelines roughly as follows:

1. A.C.T.A. should have security of tenure either freehold or a long term lease, and the locality be such that we could eventually establish our administrative headquarters there.
2. There should be sufficient area for a minimum of 30 DTL fields, 10 skeet layouts, and provision for all other facilities required.
3. A viable club close to a known shooter population should use part of the facility on a caretaker basis.
4. The shooting aspect should be between East and South, with a suitable background.
5. It should be easily accessible by air from all States.
6. All services should be available with ample accommodation in the vicinity.
7. Tourist potential, so that shooters and families would return each year.

Subsequently over the last 3 years 15 sites were examined by Management, or others at their request, but to date no location could be found that would fulfil these requirements to a degree that your Executive were prepared to embark on a project of such magnitude and expense, although many hours of debate and discussion went into the matter, and much information, with many offers of assistance, being received from various Shires, Councils and their officers, all of whom could see the benefit to their particular area.

Funds have been allocated for a feasibility study into any location that met the criteria for several years, but if a suitable site does exist it has not come to notice.

Consequently your Executive has decided that the project will be postponed indefinitely, for several reasons, some of which are outlined below.

It is felt that the State Associations who may have aspirations to holding the Nationals on the roster system are holding back awaiting the outcome, and suitable clubs are not being encouraged or helped to expand to a suitable standard.

Also it is not now apparent, because of the length of time between now and when the decision was made (4 years), as to how many of our clubs now support the concept, but would rather place their resources and energy into a similar project in their own State, so long as the roster system applies. Therefore, the Executive believe the alternatives were to proceed with the frustrating search for a location suitable to the majority of shooters, which could take several more years, or retain the roster system on an East West, North South basis as at present laid down, hoping that the State Associations would take up the slack, with A.C.T.A. assistance where necessary. However, you must be aware that we now have

three sets of Nationals titles each year, catering for four different types of clay target competitors. At present only DTL and Skeet can be conducted on a State by State basis at National level and it behoves all of us who wish to see the ISU disciplines prosper to get behind those promoting the establishment of suitable facilities in each State, remembering that although the DTL clubs are the mainstay of the sport we have now progressed to an extent where many of the benefits received by these clubs, such as coaching etc., are directly related to assistance received from Government, who recognise ISU as the world standard.

The Executive appreciate that the actions they have taken as mentioned above will not please everyone connected with the sport but believe they are very responsible decisions, and in the interests of the majority. However, any comments or criticism constructively made would be appreciated and given every consideration.

As a matter of interest we have decided to purchase the property now rented by us at a very favourable price while the market is in a depressed state, using invested funds which are not now producing the revenue they used to; a project which has been spoken of for many years and can be used as collateral towards any other promotion in the future, if required.

EDITORS MAILBOX PART 1.

Dear IAN,

In my travels over the last four years I should have put pen to paper on various subjects but not being a literary giant like the "PUNJAB" I thought I had better not. I would also have to rely on your staff to correct the spelling. Now I have thrown caution to the wind so here we go for a short burst.

I would like to say a few words on the subject of correct trap location in the trap house.

A great number of clubs that I visited have the trap situated in the centre of the house which is not in the proper place. The target does not leave the throwing plate directly in front of the trap. The target leaves the plate between 225 mm to 300 mm to the right of the trap body according to the type of trap. Having the trap in the centre causes the target to break on the side of the trap house when a full right hander is thrown and shooting from lane five the target looks as though it comes out of the ground at the side of the trap house.

You probably have some specifications that could be added to this to explain the situation more in detail.

Our travels have come to a halt for a space of time, I have put the caravan in moth balls and the old Valiant has been given light duties. I would like to say G'DAY to all of the many friends I've made on our trip and thank them all for their hospitality, if it is at all possible I will be back again.

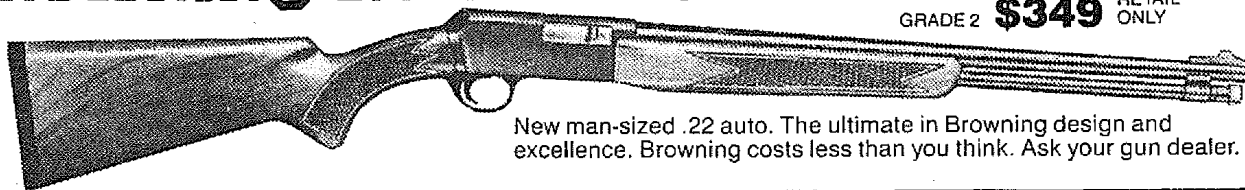

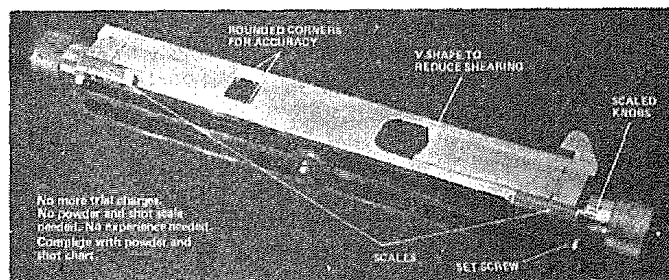

2. Skeet Nationals

This committee is to draw up the format, and budget and report back to the Executive Committee.

3. 1984 Trap Nationals

The 1984 Trap Nationals will be conducted at Wagga Gun Club from Saturday March 31, to Thursday April 5. The program is as follows:

Monday April 2 — Single Barrel Championship

4. Purchase of Premises

The Executive Committee resolved unanimously to purchase the premises currently occupied as the National Office at 8 Main Street, Blackburn.

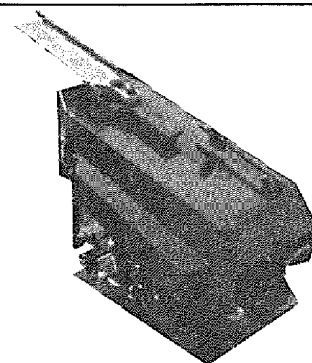

TROUBLE SHOOTING AT SKEET

with George Biggs

GUN HOLDING POSITION HIGH ONE



This target is frequently missed due to the shooter varying his gun hold position prior to calling. This practice will upset his timing, resulting in a desperate stab or a long slow tracking of the target. A good position of gun hold is around 45°, then come smoothly and quickly on to the target. Breaking it over the target crossing point.

It was only recently that a keen skeeter said to me — "George, in every article you write on shooting, you never fail to stress how important it is to have the gun properly fitting the shooter. Is this advice really so important and why is it so?"

Well to cut a long story short, it was 1½ hours later after two rounds of skeet instruction during which time I related to him my personal experiences with gun fitting. At this stage my friend was well able to see my point. The story follows—

When I first came into clay target shooting some 35 years ago, I soon became very much aware of the importance of

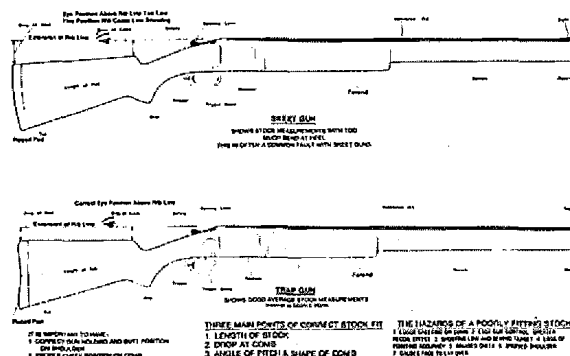
having a gun that would point more consistently on targets than dad's old double barrel gun that I used to hunt rabbits and ducks with etc. It was at this early stage of my clay target shooting career when I became aware of the need to have a gun to suit me in such a way that when I placed the butt on my shoulder, the muzzle would be pointing near to where my shooting eye was looking, ie, at the target. In the years just after World War 11 we had very little choice of shotguns and apart from the old Webley & Scott and Greener double barrels, very little else was available. They were inexpensive to buy, something like two pounds, ten shillings each. They proved an ideal rabbit and snake gun for the farmer.

I finally bought myself a Browning Auto standard model, plain barrel without rib, bored half choke. However, I was far from happy with the standard field stock and its long pistol grip which felt like a cricket bat handle. I went to work on it, fitting a Monte Carlo comb plus a complete new pistol grip, which was needed in order to have complete control of the gun. I was then able to point the muzzle exactly where I was looking. It made shooting better scores easier.

I continued to use the Browning Auto with a great amount of success for several years, finally switching to the over and under as they became available, around 1948.

Clay target shooting was beginning to recover and expand. It became obvious that a change in styles

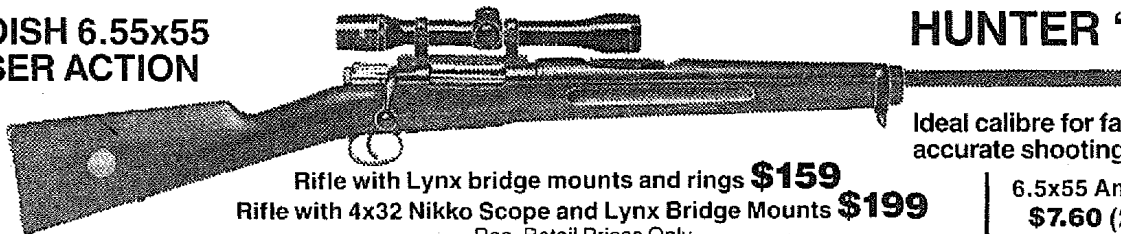
"THE GUN AND EYE ALIGNMENT"



Gun at top of drawing is a skeet gun with too much drop at the heel of the stock. Because of this the shooter's eye will be looking into the back of the action instead of down along the barrel rib. This position is not uncommon with many skeet guns, it will cause low shooting. Compare the eye position on the lower gun, note how the eye position is up above the rib line where it should be, enabling the shot to be fired with target always visible over the front bead. As an example both my trap gun and skeet guns have the very same measurements with one exception — length of pull is ¼ inch shorter on the skeet gun, because I use an off shoulder gun position at skeet.

TROUBLE SHOOTING AT SKEET from p. 14

Clay target shooting was beginning to recover and expand. New firearms manufacturing firms were coming into production. It became obvious that a change in styles of guns was necessary in order to shoot better scores at skeet and trap. And so we began to see a new style of gun, like the over and under etc. Stocks were modified and barrels were bored differently. Raised and ventilated ribs were added to give us a new style shooting iron for clay target shooters. Today changes are still going on in an effort to build the right gun for "Mr Average." Unfortunately I don't have the space in this article to go more deeply into the subject, but suffice to say that "Mr Average" shooter should have his gun checked for personal fit so that he cannot blame the gun when he misses a target.

Unfortunately, a large number of our skeet shooters still don't realise that poor gun fitting and gun mounting is the reason why the average shooter is not a more consistent top scorer.

Of course there are many other reasons why we have a bad day and they are related to the basics of skeet shooting. So it becomes necessary to analyse ourselves from the feet, up to mounting the gun, and firing at the target. Feet and stance position is first on our check list after we know the gun fits us as it should.

HOW TO SHOOT PROBLEM TARGETS

Station one high is sometimes a problem. It is caused by changing the angle of gun hold to an angle that is either further out or closer in than has been the usual pointing position. This action will immediately upset timing, resulting in a desperate stab or a long slow tracking of the target.

Stations two high and six low also bother a lot of shooters. At both these stations, body control is vital. A smooth easy gun movement and follow through begins with a good stance position. Any stance we adopt that causes unnecessary strain is not going to help us because it will cause erratic movement and fatigue.

Station two high is a frequently missed target due mainly to the shooter rushing the target, stopping his gun swing and follow through. Proper routine at two high is like all other stations only more so, i.e., face the centre of the field over station eight where the target is usually broken, now without moving the feet position, turn your body back towards the trap house to a spot about 10-15 feet out from the trap opening. Hold the gun muzzle at this point on line of target travel, concentrate for a second to get a quick mental picture in mind about what you have to do when the target appears. With this clear mental picture in mind call for the target look hard at it, swing the gun muzzle through with it see the lead, fire and follow through. Lead should be about 18 inches of "daylight."

Station six low is more or less the opposite to high two. The difference being that it leaves the trap opening at a lower level. However, it still has to be handled in much the same manner. Keep in mind that low six is climbing more than high two, this means keeping your gun muzzle up on the target right from the start of your swing. This is why we must always have the gun hold position prior to calling, right on line of target travel. This target is frequently missed by shooting low and behind. It is caused by failure to keep gun muzzle up on the rising target. I prefer a left hand position on the forend to be a little further out when shooting low six. Not only does this give me a better muzzle pulling aid, but it also gives more accuracy of point on the fast moving target going from right to left.

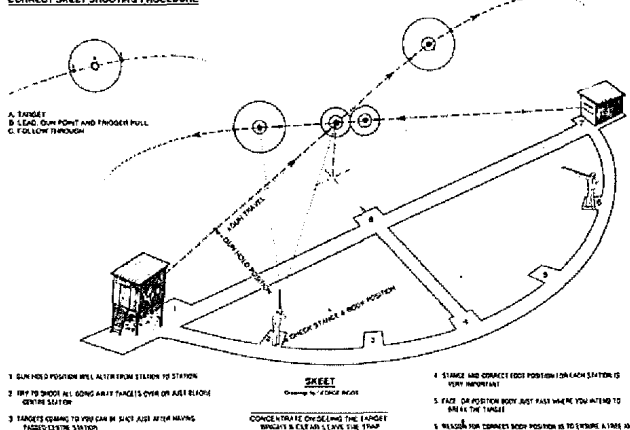
Station two high can be handled in a similar way, except that the left hand is brought a little closer to the guns metal action, something like a couple of inches from the action. The shorter hold will tend to help control accuracy and give more "gun push" at the fast flying high two target.

FOOT POSITION

Position of the skeet shooters feet is important and it will vary from station to station. It is essential that we adopt a balanced and relaxed stance, but still be alert — ready to swing smoothly and quickly after the target when we call "pull."

The good skeet shooter will pay special attention to his feet-placing. Too close together will cause him to be off balance when he begins to swing with the target, he will in fact, tend to move his body only from the hips causing a rolling action resulting in a low shot. Body movement should be from the ankles up. On the other hand too wide a stance will cause a good deal of strain and tension, as well as restriction of movement.

CORRECT SKEET SHOOTING PROCEDURE



1. GUN HOLD POSITION WILL ALTER FROM STATION TO STATION
2. TRY TO SHOOT ALL GOING AWAY TARGETS OVER OR JUST BEFORE CENTRE STATION
3. TARGETS COMING TO YOU CAN BE SHOT AT JUST HAVING PASSED CENTRE STATION
4. STANCE AND CORRECT FEET POSITION FOR EACH STATION IS VERY IMPORTANT
5. FACE OR POSITION BODY JUST PAST WHERE YOU INTEND TO BREAK THE TARGET
6. REASON FOR CORRECT BODY POSITION IS TO ENSURE A FREE AND EASY GUN SWING WITH AND THROUGH THE TARGET

1. Gun hold position prior to calling for target will alter slightly from station to station.
2. Try to break all going away targets over or just before centre station.
3. Targets coming to you can be shot at just having passed centre station.
4. Stance and correct feet position for each station is very important.
5. Face, or position body just past where you intend to break the target.
6. Reason for correct body position is to ensure a free and easy gun swing with and through the target.

Kevin represented Victoria on the National Executive for several years and was one of the instigators in the formation and development of the Victorian State Association. He is a strong supporter of the sport of clay shooting, evidenced by his making land available for the establishment of the new Echuca Gun Club. His contribution to our sport will be acknowledged at a Testimonial shoot to be organised in his honor by the Victorian Clay Target Association, and the Echuca Gun Club. A Sub-committee has been set up by the V.C.T.A. to organise the function. Sunday November 27, 1983 has been selected as the day for the big event, and shooters should watch C.T.S.N. for further details. It was noted at this meeting, some clubs have not yet paid the Administration Fee of \$10 to the State body. This fee has been increased from \$2 to \$10 the reason being the necessity to help offset rising costs experienced by the State Association in its operation. I would recommend to Victorian clubs, they support their State Association by paying their \$10 as soon as possible. The next major shooting event for Australia, will be the 1983 Skeet Nationals to be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club. This is a first for the National body and its success will rely heavily on the host State, Victoria. All skeet shooting enthusiasts are requested to rally to the cause and support the tournament. A sub-committee has been formed by the State Association to attend to details for the running of the event. A team of five top skeet shooters is to be selected over the 400 target program, with all expenses paid trip to America being their reward. Work is to begin on preparing the State program booklet. Clubs are reminded to get their programs and shoot dates into their Zones, so they may be forwarded to the State Association for compiling in the 1984 booklet.

Monday May 23, 1983

Spent several days at the A.C.T.A. office with Executive Director, Ian Hill. Purchase of our property, 8 Main Street, Blackburn, is well on the way and should be finalised shortly. Our 1983-84 submission to the Department of Home Affairs for financial assistance in coaching, training of our National squad, and International competition was completed and forwarded to the responsible department for consideration. Because of our involvement and success in International shooting, five of our shooters have been recipients of a \$1500 Federal Government Training Grant. They are Alex Crikis, Ian Hale, Greg Long, Terry Rumbel and Jim Ellis. With new faces representing Australia at the 1983 World Championships, let us hope they too, can shoot their way into calculations for a similar grant. To keep our sport on a high plateau, we need Government assistance financially. World Championship results can be used as a talking point to support submission to State and Federal Governments, to assist in the development of our sport.

Wednesday May 25, 1983

With State President, Bob Buchan, I attended a seminar on Public Liability Insurance, conducted by the Sports Federation of Victoria in conjunction with the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation. In attendance, were representatives of Insurance Companies and delegates and officials representing the many different sporting bodies. It was obvious by questions asked, sporting clubs have had difficulty in obtaining suitable cover for their specific sporting activity. The companies represented at this meeting indicated they were prepared to tailor policies to suit sporting bodies on a club, State or National level. The National Executive is already looking at improving its present Public Liability cover. Members will be fully advised when negotiations on the updated policy are finalised and approved. One area of responsibility to all clubs with insurance cover, is Workers Compensation. In Victoria it is compulsory for any employer to take out a Workers Compensation policy to cover em-

ployees. Clubs paying trappers come under this category and it would be in their own interest to make sure they are covered in this area.

Saturday May 28, 1983

Euroa Gun Club were conducting a Double Rise, a District Point Score Championship and a Trophy Handicap event. Forty shooters turned up to compete in the events. Victorian Executive member Bill Abbott was also paying the club a visit and shot the program. Dick English from Wangaratta shot 17/20 to win the Double Rise. Michael Leonard's 75.75 won

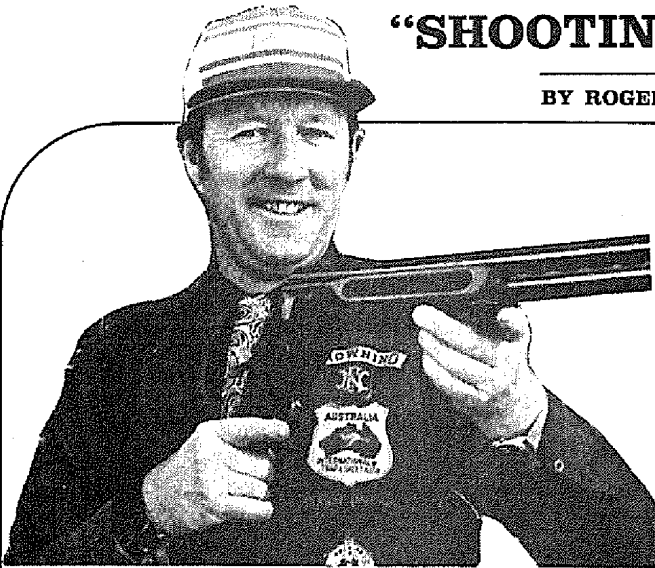

"SHOOTING SHORTS"

BY ROGER DARWON:



"Hear no evil, speak no evil, see no evil!!!"

The laconic Australian and his attitude, "She will be alright Jack!!" often has this writer bemused and in some instances very angry. In my February 83 column, my leader item, covered GUN SAFETY. This drew one letter from a shooter who was (to use his words) "embarrassed", by my coverage of this and other sins. He seemed to be "labouring" under more than a few misconceptions, but I can only deduct from his "letter", he is of the opinion, if you look the other way, such sins will vanish!! It appears I'm not the only person to notice similar problems: Today I was handed a copy of the American "Trap & Field", which is our counter part, the Amateur Trapshooting Association. The leader article, is by the President, under the heading "The President's Page" by Mr Randy Clarke, who had this to say, and I quote him here:

"Last August in the Executive Committee meeting held during the Grand American, two new rules were passed, concerning GUN SAFETY. The first is a rule that no "test" shots will be fired. The reason for this new rule, is very simple, the safety of the trapsetter. A trapsetter knows that he is safe in the house because the only shots being fired are at targets that his machine throws".

On this score, we are well in front of the American's. First our traps are provided with a red flag, that must be up at all times, when no competition is being shot over that trap. Second: should there be a need, if at all, for a test shot to be conducted in Australia, it must be carried out under the complete supervision of the REFEREE. This applies over any trap layout, in Australia. Mr Randy Clarke continued his write-up on American GUN SAFETY rules by saying this:

"The second rule change that was passed, concerned (A.T.A. rule 13) which states. All guns must be unloaded with the actions open at all times; except on the firing line. Violators of these rules subject themselves to immediate disqualification, without recourse with dismissal from the grounds."

The American A.T.A President, went on to explain:

"This rule is ignored by far too many shooters, and the A.T.A Executive-Committee felt that a clear definition of the PENALTY for violation of this safety rule was needed, and outlined the following."

Here let me hasten to say, the American's are catching up with Australia, by the introduction of this very important but much needed stringent rule on their safety requirements; as Mr Randy Clarke concluded his report on their safety issue.

"Shooters who repeat the violation of (A.T.A rule 13), would be notified of a 30 day suspension, for a second violation, while 90 days is the rule for a third violation. Continuing violations would be reviewed by the Executive Committee for further action".

Your "shooting Shorts" columnist can only PRESUME, by saying, I wonder what the "three-monkeys" have to say about that!!! Perhaps if A.C.T.A. (Rule 28) is enforced by referee's, and club/management, our penalties, like the A.T.A. of America, will soon weed out the small percentage of our offenders, that make up the sum total of Australian violators. At the same time, it will give new shooters a more aware set of "values" upon entering clay target shooting.

"SALUTE: TO A GOLDEN OLDIE!!?"

This writer makes no secret, of his respect for senior members of this sport, community or country. Therefore it would be remiss of me not to mention my admiration, as I'm sure all of us would share, for the little Victorian farmer 61 year old Cliff Young who annihilated the other contestants, some half his age in the Sydney-Melbourne marathon road race, and if that was not enough . . . setting a new record for the event. One hell of a lot of Australian's followed his run and many stayed up to cheer him into the home straight and victory. I think all of us ran the last few miles with him step for step, or as it has become known "shuffle for shuffle", and I'm sure a little bit in all of us would have died if Cliff had not made it. But he did, and in doing so he has given something very important to all of us. Have faith in yourself. In the words of the unknown poet it goes like this:

"A WHOLE NEW BALL GAME!!"

The days when the "old soft shoe", was the best way to handle the "political problems" that confront the shooting sports, I'm afraid, are long gone. Softly, softly may have been the accepted manner in the early 1960's . . . but not so today.

All around us the "masses" are making noises, and rather vocal ones at that, for what they require from both the law makers and their elected political parties. There is little doubt that the ones who get what they want, are the ones who put up the biggest and best showing. The reason for these changes in attitude and manner, are mainly due to the instant coverage afforded any group yelling for their "rights". This then becomes instant material for both TV news cameras on the look out, seeking something controversial; or the city daily press competing for headlines over the electronic media. What the shooting sports don't need, are the handful of "doubting-Thomases", who preach their brand of defeatism when the going gets tough. Dogmatic political parties, "eat nice guys" for breakfast, while they pay full attention to ones who make their presence felt. That's my point of view. What's yours?

what detached view point regarding the shooting sportspeople; the men and women, who partake in the various shooting disciplines. Every effort made by members of city clubs to the media, for sports coverage of one kind or another was other than successful. Of late, I must report, there has been the occasional shooting sportsperson covered in the Sydney media. For my money, that's a start in the right direction. The country media however, has for some time responded to our sport, with quite good visual and other reports being published. Bernice, Britian the hardworking Publicity Officer for the Griffith Clay Target Club, reports she has been getting very good coverage in their local "Area News", with three reports per month of shooting events held at the Griffith Clay Target Club. Bernice, not one to let an opportunity pass for OUR SPORT, approached the sports editor of the "Area News", for a weekly shooting column, to cover all firearm sports. The editor responded by publishing the requests under the banner of a logo, that Bernice and fellow Griffith shooters designed and provided for publication. While down Wagga Wagga way their club has been very busy with continued approaches, which have been more than successful in getting clay target shooting and shooters covered in the "Daily Advertiser", which is the "voice" of the Riverina. I put a phone call in to their Sports Director Mr Ted Ryder (whom I knew from the racing days of the gallopers) and he renewed old times and explained they would welcome any shooting news that local clubs had to supply. From this you can deduct that one of the most important roles any club can play . . . is to appoint a very capable and forward thinking person in the very important position of PUBLICITY OFFICER. Their local successes are the foundation on which our sport will receive wider national acceptance.

Hitting Where You Aim:

It's a fact, not known to many, that today's modern - Mass produced makers of shotguns, do not check the accuracy and patterning qualities of their guns in the cheap or popular price range. Cost factors play an important role here. Such individual attention is only reserved for the models that carry the big dollar price tag. True, the cheap guns are proof tested for safety etc, but that's all of the extent given as they come off the production line.

While on the other hand, as would be expected the top line high grade expensive smooth bores are given all the test attention and hand finish needed to put them in the class you're paying for.

The owner of any new shotgun, therefore should take the time and effort to pattern the gun, for several important reasons: More than one man has gone through his share of misses before he learned the hard way, that his gun was not quite shooting "straight". It is important to test fire a few shots with your new trap gun and find out just how it is throwing a pattern, so that you can learn your guns individual point of impact. While it helps to know your guns patterns density, It's just as important even more so to know where your gun is shooting in relation to your shooting performance and style. Discover this and you will be well ahead of the shooter who is too lazy to find out.

Most clubs have a pattern board. All you need do, is seek the required permission of the appropriate person in charge, in order to use it. Properly applied, what you find out may give you quite a surprise. Lastly — don't try this

operation on club shoot days, but wait until your club has a practice day, before you seek to pattern your new gun.

Top Gunsmith calls by:

My old buddy from Gilgandra (N.S.W.), well known smoothbore artist, Donald G. Patrick, made a short visit to the Sydney Traps weekend of May 22nd. Don sporting his best R.M. Williams gear (minus the horse) with his faithful Browning O/U, spent an enjoyable time smashing clays and talking English double guns, with your scribe. Don, who can spot a top line London gun at a little over 500 yards and a good horse in just under ½ a mile, has a keen eye for quality . . . and few peers in the gunsmithing profession, this side of "black dog creek", or any other place for that matter.

Don, in company with Joe Chiappetta, another devotee of quality guns being the GAMBA agent in Australia, braved the rather wet conditions trying to outshoot each other. From my observations the final result was two very wet clay busters, and a perfect dead heat!

I retired a happy man from the encounter, because when these two get together, even the dullest days take on a bright glow . . . if you get my drift!!!

V.C.T.A. NEWSLETTER

Effective Communication

All organisations including the V.C.T.A. would generally agree that a problem of the times is that of effective communication, in the endeavour to improve expedient and accurate information into clubs it is the intention of the V.C.T.A. to send to all clubs affiliated with our association a newsletter on a regular basis.

V.C.T.A. Administration

The State Council is currently reviewing all administrative procedures with the view to provide the optimum organisation to meet the needs of Zones, Clubs and Shooters. All progressive associations must constantly consider the need for change to ensure that they keep up with the changing times. Plans are well under way in this area, a coaching sub committee has already met and recommendations made have started to be put into effect to the betterment of Victorian Coaching.

V.C.T.A. Administration Fee Increase

At the November meeting of State Council it was unanimously decided that the Administration Fee be increased from \$2 to \$10 being consistent with other States some of which have a fee in excess of \$10 per club. This increase is necessary to help offset rising costs such as postage and photo copying etc. The President earnestly requests your support re this increase which in the majority of clubs represents only a few cents per member.

Firearms Training Grant

The V.C.T.A. was once again very pleased with the grant from the Department of Police & Emergency Services of \$7150 to assist our association in Firearms Training Awareness. Individual clubs who applied for a grant and supplied the necessary information received a share of the grant. A sum of \$500 has also been allocated to each Zone to assist with Zone Training Programs.

Victorian Sports Aid Foundation

The Victorian Sports Aid Foundation is a joint project of the Department of Youth Sport & Recreation and the Statewide Building Society to assist young Victorian Athletes to achieve higher Australian and International ranking. In 1982 Alex Crikis and Ian Hale were successful applicants. If any shooter wishes to apply for a grant I would be pleased to supply further information.

The closing dates of applications are as follows, all applications must be processed through the State Association — 15th April, 1983 — 15th July, 1983 — 15th October, 1983.

State Coaching Program

The V.C.T.A. State Coaching Sub Committee met recently with Mr G. Biggs, the Victorian State Coach, at the Melbourne Gun Club and formulated a program to fully utilise the Firearms Training Grant and the Department of Youth Sport and Recreation Sports Assistance Grant which totalled \$10,450.

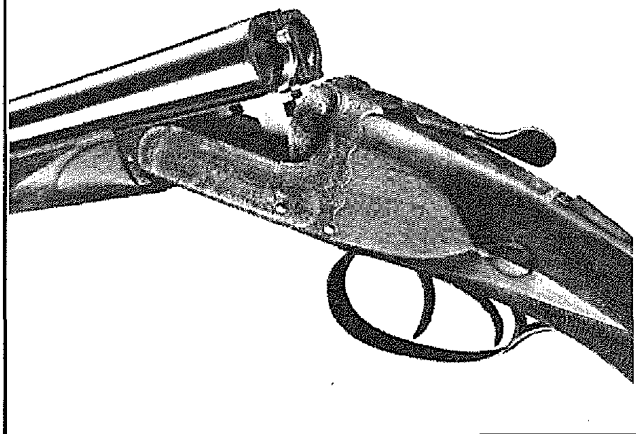

A TALE OF TWO SHOOTERS Two Twenty

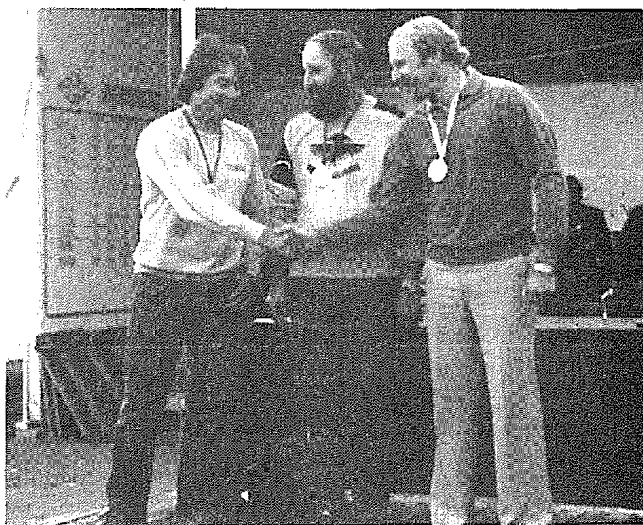
