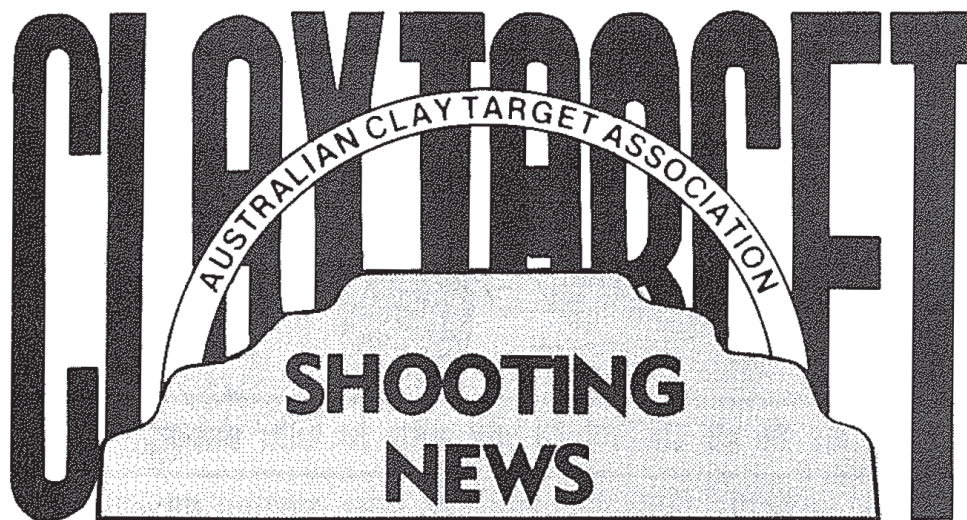

That things are tough in today's world is clear to us all. The recession, or depression as some are calling it, has affected Clay Target shooting like most other things. When things are tough, it behoves all Administrators, from Executive Committee members through State, Zone and Club administrations to look closely at ways and means of improving the lot of the average shooter, who after all is the backbone of the membership of the 290 odd affiliated clubs around Australia.

From my observations, the average shooter above all else, wants to shoot targets. Sure he likes to win, don't we all, but he understands that he will lose a lot more often than he'll win. It is his sport and recreation, and he shoots for enjoyment. He takes a passing interest in what goes on at Zone, State, and National level, but generally is most interested in shooting targets at his own and neighbouring clubs.

This "Average shooter" probably makes up 90% of the registered shooters around Australia, and I wonder do we do enough to help him enjoy his sport. With less money available, the average shooter is shooting less. This is obvious from the numbers turning out at shoots in different parts of the Country. If this smaller amount of money can be made to go further, are we not doing something to help? One way to do this, which is operating successfully at some Clubs, is to run economy days. There are no trophies, only badges and sashes, so consequently nominations are cheaper. One shooter told me recently after enjoying one such day, that the amount he saved in nominations paid for the cartridges used in the days shooting. He'd had a good day's shooting, and enjoyed the company of lots of friends, at a very reasonable cost. It's interesting to note too that Clubs conducting economy days are making just as much money, in some cases more, as they are attracting bigger numbers to their shoots.

This is just one example of what is being done at some clubs, to counteract the problems brought on by the day and age we live in. I know it's not the answer to all the problems that we face at this time, but I mention it to perhaps prompt a bit of thought and a close look at all levels of the Sport.

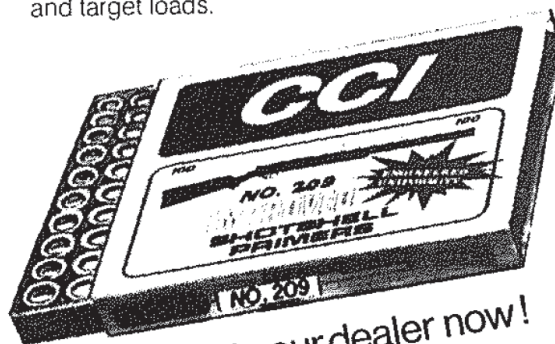

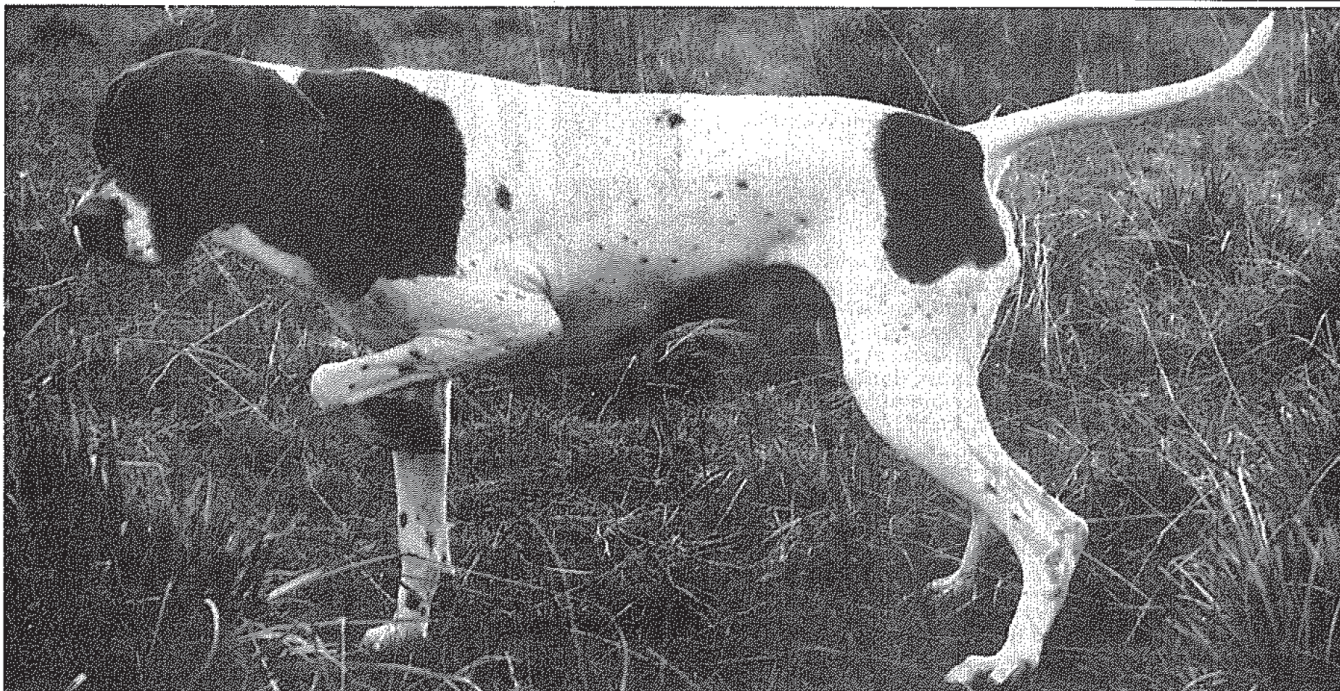

HOW TO SAVE THAT GUN SHY DOG

• "Patch", K.C.C. field trial champion.

How often does this problem come home to us or some of our friends. I will try to give some hints on how we can save or help that gun-shy dog.

A few years ago a shooting friend and myself were awaiting daylight, cold misty rain during the night had made scenting conditions perfect, and my old pointer, a bird-wise veteran and a winner of field trials, was working her territory methodically. Lass, the promising young pointer with one day of the real thing behind her, was cutting up the ground, carrying a high head, proud tail, and a nose alive to the promise on every breath of damp air.

It did not take long before we located our first covey. The quail rose upwind giving us a series of quick shots. I sent my old pointer into seek dead (I never let a pointer retrieve, they are taught to point fallen game) I had a feeling things were going our way.

As it turned out we were in for a heart breaking hunt. Birds had come down, and old Patch has sought all down birds. I checked on the young pointer and found her flattened on the ground behind me with the head that moments before had been so high and proud, down between her trembling forelegs. Calling off any further shooting I patted her trying to talk away the quivering fear while under my breath I cursed myself for my stupidity for over-shooting a young dog. I moved back towards the car, encouraging her as she trailed at my heels until, at a slight shifting of my grip on the gun she dropped her tail and left me. If it sounds familiar to

some of you, it is because each year the tragedy repeats itself. One always has that lingering question "how would he have been if . . .". Good bird stock, registered or not, is a product of generations of careful breeding for the functions of seeking, finding, standing on point to seek dead or retrieve.

The fundamental fact is that bird-dogs don't go gun-shy, they are made gun-shy. Every dog, because of his keen ears, is susceptible to fright and actual pain from loud noises. The more nervous timid animals are more prone to the madady, but the real difference is in the way the pup is broken to the gun. In the case of Lass, I made an error in over estimating her tolerance to shooting and allowing two volleys from a pair of 12 gauges to blast her eardrums, without sufficient spacing. That damage was intensified by the fact that in both cases the birds came upwind, denying Lass that total concentration on the birds which would have blotted out the sound of the gun for her.

In Lass' case there were other factors. Firstly by nature she was not nervous, if she had been I would have taken greater caution. Secondly, she had been worked occasionally with the gun before the season without showing any reaction. Thirdly, she had made it through three hours hunting on opening day with only a normal amount of glancing back at the report of the gun. There is no real excuse for such carelessness, if I had gone hunting with her alone for a week, it would have prevented the whole business. It's just that simple. What

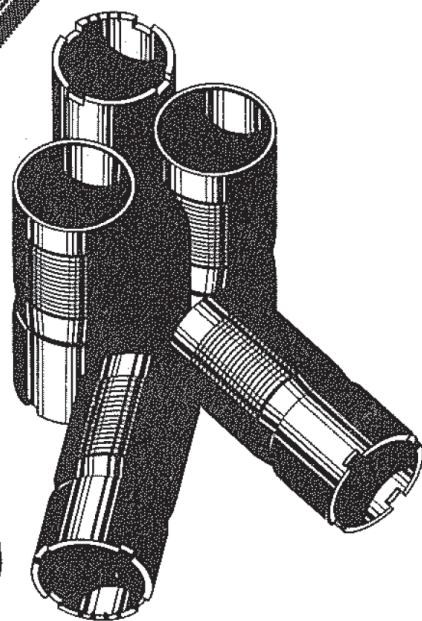
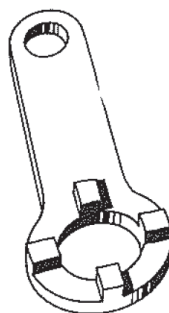

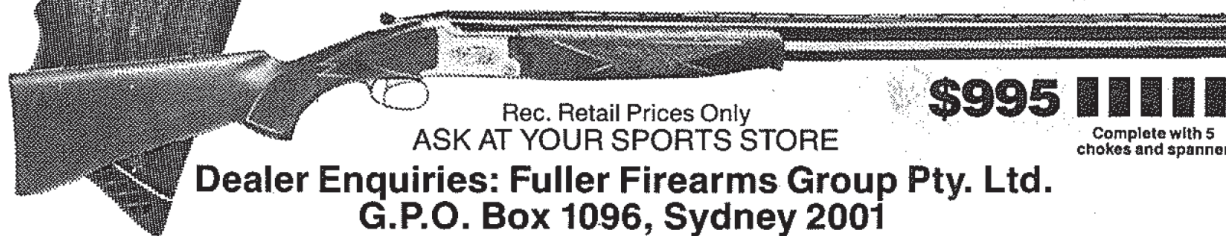

about the future? What about those days you and I are getting ready to take to the field next year or the one after? An ounce of prevention, is worth ten pounds of cure. I have found the best method is to pan-break a puppy before he is 6 months old (it won't work on older dogs). Simply fire over the feeding pan, begin with a .22 at 20 feet moving in a little closer each day until you are firing within only a few feet of the feeding puppy. Repeat the process with a 12 guage, the gun will sound like a dinner bell and the problem is solved forever. If on the other hand you have an older dog, say 7 to 14 months, you will need to take him to the field and fire over him when he is fresh, excited, and thoroughly enjoying himself. Begin at a range of about 50 yards, working in until you can fire a couple of shots at 15 to 20 yards without unduly upsetting him.

One word of caution, if the dog is upset by this procedure STOP. You will need to shift to selective shooting. These types of dogs that get upset by pre-season work with the gun, are best handled by selective shooting.

A dog is like his master, he tends to scarcely hear the report of the gun in the excitement of the actual presence of game. It is a balance of pain and pleasure with every ounce of breeding contending that the love of the hunt will win out. Working on this principle, take care with the skittish pup in bird territory, let him get into birds — pointing if he is broken to it, flushing if he is not. Fire only when he is actually involved. After the pre-season work the real crisis comes. Watch those first ten days of the new season, watch your dog, watch that itchy finger. At the first sign of nervousness a tendency to come in too often for reassurance, a cutting down of his normal range, trailing behind you, apprehension about backing a pointing dog, be prepared to shift over to selective shooting. No quick firing volleys. One shot at a time. Time between shots even if you have to pass up a few birds. Hunt by yourself.

If you have followed these simple, commonsense suggestions, and the dog is still showing signs of apprehension, simply make up your mind to go back to the pre-season procedure of firing only when the dogs attention is engaged by birds.

But what about a dog like Lass, that had already gone gun-shy? It is a tough question. The odds of success are only fair, but it can be done. I did it with Lass as well as others have done with their dogs. Let me clear the air, I did not hold her and fire a starting pistol repeatedly over her head. Although I have heard of this cure, strangely enough it has never been told to me by a good hunter or a good trainer who did it himself. The story mostly starts like this "I know a fellow who once . . ."

What I did was far simpler. I went to a doctor friend of mine and picked up a few tranquilisers prescribed according to weight. I administered one tablet thirty minutes before I took her to the field, I then administered the ABC of selective shooting, (1) plan to hunt alone no other hunter no other dog (2) drop down to a 20 gauge (3) plan on short hunts with a spell in between (4) fire only when your dog is aware of the bird ie., after he or she has pointed or flushed (5) make sure you bring down a bird with each shot (6) go home. I mean one shot one bird. If you miss the first shot, take one more and then go home. There will be more hunts and if the pup flushes some on the way back, so much the better.

After about eight trips out in the field, I took the dog off the pills and started all over again with the ABC rules of selective shooting. Within three weeks of making this dog gun-shy, I was working her along with other dogs, and allowing a friend to shoot over her. You are right, I am very proud of that pointer, which I almost ruined. It adds something extra when I look back through her record of KCC field trials for pointers and setters, KCC Field Champion, winner of Open Field Trials, holder of certificate of merit. She was also a dog that did not lower her colors once to any other dog, whose owner had scoffed at field trial champions. The challenge was always gladly accepted, and I can assure all that I did not let those scoffers at field trials forget the result of their challenge.

Field trials are another subject I will deal with in a later issue.

When you shoot over a well trained field trial dog, it is the difference between riding in a spring cart and riding in a modern car of today.

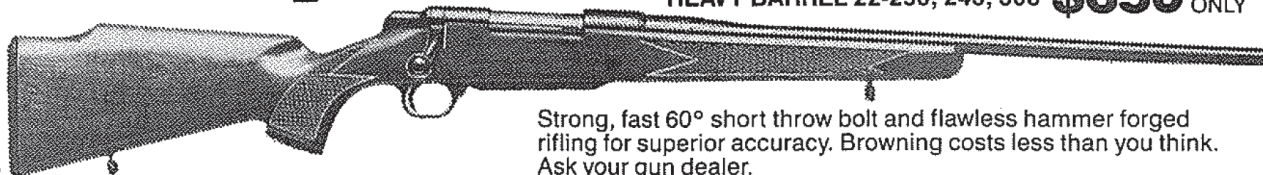

CHAMPION BEATS HANDICAP

• Grant has had to adopt a completely new style after his right arm was paralysed in an accident in November last year.

A PARALYSED right arm is Grant Hyder's daily reminder of how close he came to death on November 5, last year.

The arm should also have been the millstone that destroyed one of WA's champion skeet shooters.

Instead it has been the reason that spurred 25-year-old Mr Hyder to achieve the near miraculous.

He has hardly enough sensitivity in his hand to know what pressure to put on the gun trigger yet a week ago he won the title of South-West skeet champion.

It is no ordinary style that Mr Hyder has adopted. He has to place his hand in position on the shotgun trigger and then the left arm does all the work in tracking the clay targets.

He shot 71 out of 75 targets at the championship.

It was less than a month ago that the Capel shooter plucked the courage to enter his first competition since the November accident.

And it was a less-than-average effort from a man who has represented WA in four State teams and finished fourth in a national event in 1980.

But it was enough to prompt another try and it was a better result than a couple of weeks earlier when he had almost given up in frustration of ever shooting again.

The first practice had been disastrous and he was ready to quit.

"My brother told me it was a pathetic effort," Mr Hyder said.

"The comment was enough to make me try again."

Intense practice, including 100 targets a day for three days leading to the South-West championship, brought its rewards.

It was a height that Mr Hyder never imagined when thoughts of having to give up shooting forever haunted him directly after the accident.

It happened as he piloted a powerful motorcycle around the Davenport industrial area in Bunbury. On one bend he lost control and slammed into a roadside tree.

If the impact had been a fraction greater, said his doctor, he would have been killed or permanently paralysed.

"At first it was not known how bad the damage was," said Mr Hyder.

"I thought then that I would never be able to shoot again.

"It was hard to imagine that could ever happen.

"I tried to think of ways to build some sort of support so that I could shoot with one arm."

As it turns out Mr Hyder will get the use of his right arm back in about three years through natural body repair.

But he is not going to wait until then to attempt new goals in skeet shooting.

He talked this week of attempting to regain a place in WA skeet teams and he won't settle for simple skeet shooting. Mr Hyder wants to get back into the most difficult style of the sport — ISU and trench shooting — which requires the greatest mobility from the shooter.

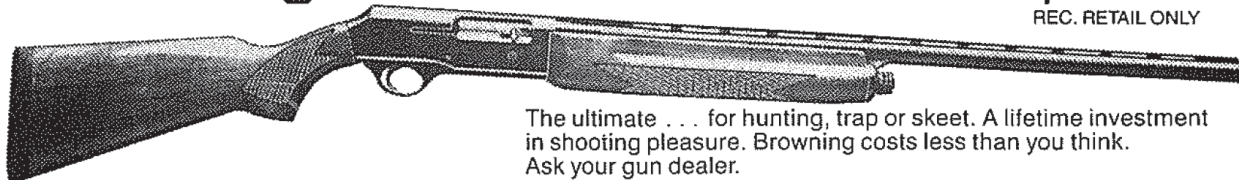
The important events for this year are over but his eye is set on a carnival in Perth in September.

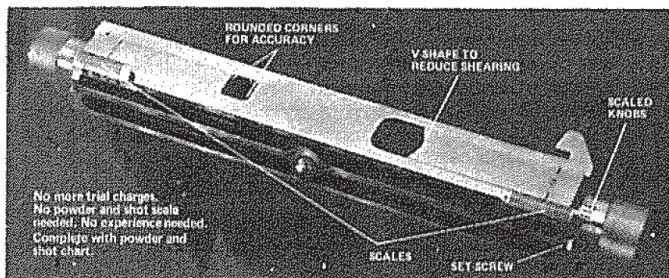

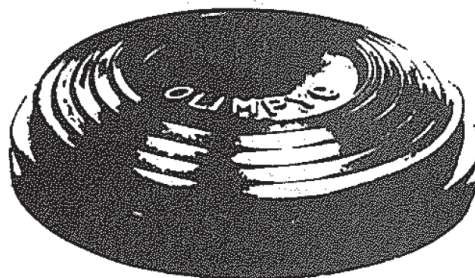

SHOOTING SHORTS

By Roger Darwon



IS YOUR SHOTGUN TRYING TO TELL YOU SOMETHING?

Shotguns are not unlike other tools and sporting equipment. They have a language all their own. Learn to understand it and you and your shotgun will enjoy a most rewarding and often quite successful relationship.

I've always thought it a pity that there's no real language course, no concrete universal dialectal approach to the real understanding of your shotgun's "talk". Because if we could have some finer understanding of it as a tool, your equipment, there is no doubt it would save shooters the world over from a vast amount of trouble, confusion and in some cases disappointment. Simply because in their own quiet or noisy way, (that's when they go bang) do in fact "talk" to their owners, who are shooting them in some form of the sports competitions; passing on handy mostly-unheard or unnoticed "little" hints, even encouraging and warning their owners almost non-stop. Some shotguns are naturally "chatter" than others; and there's always the "shy" one, even ones with the odd split personality trying to confuse you with conflicting "messages". But irrespective of "personality-type", shotguns like all equipment, love to "converse". What a sad pity so much of it falls on uncomprehending ears.

With no help from any known language lessons, or even some sort of speedy mail order course, one has to pick up gun-talk by ear. You have to make an effort to listen first, and then to understand. This takes both patience and time. Some people are of course what you'd call "naturals" and I think I could even say many fall into this category.

The first gun I ever owned as a young boy on my Granfathers farm, a top London-double, he had presented me

with in 12 gauge, but passed away before I was old enough to shoot it, "spoke" to me in no uncertain manner the first time I took it out and went pussy-footing into the hills with it after foxes and the like.

After about an hour on the "trail" one well versed 10 year old shouldered his new acquisition, lined it up on a somewhat unsuspecting runyard, while pulling off a perfect shot, or so I thought, only to find myself and the gun part into two directions . . . and a somewhat petrified fox leave via a third exit, totally convinced there was a madman lose in the hills. At least he lived to tell the story. Likewise so did I, and I can assure you that this rather thunderstruck scribe . . . had a very long talk with the top line London double, that eventful day high in the Great Dividing Ranges down Bethungra way NSW. The lesson was via gun-talk of course, that they can give plenty of re-coil if not held in the correct way. Of course, we could go on and on with this line of reasoning, explaining a whole multitude of things your gun is trying to "tell" you, from subtle noises indicating a spring, or an extractor is about to wear out or even break, to a whole cacophony of seemingly "foreign language". The astute sportsman, who looks after his firearms: shotguns, rifles or even pistols and revolvers . . . will learn one hell of a lot he did not know, once he acquires the method of understanding his firearms language. By now if you have read thus far, you will have discovered something I did all those long years ago, and will not be misunderstanding my meaning and perhaps confusing gun talking methods, in the same chitchat as one who talks to flowers.

Although I'm told they get good results from this method.

In conclusion and to be factual for a moment, as I've pointed out the real trick is in our case, for you to do the listening, if that's at all possible . . . and let the gun do the talking.

SOMETHING'S ABOUT TO HAPPEN!!!

Don't keep getting under our feet, with ill thought-out (however good your intentions) efforts, that to tell you the truth . . . only slow us up, while WE search for detours around such un-needed OBSTRUCTIONS. We are aware, that you're almost to a "man" behind us . . . just stay there until WE ask for your shoulder to-the wheel . . . OK! Thanks.

Oh, by the way if anyone out there is looking for some "overtime" and feel "WE" are not giving of our BEST, you can have my job for a start, you'll just love the conditions, and the "perks" will send you into hysterics. My bank manager has already warned me to pull my head in or he will not sit-back-to-camera much longer. (If in doubt — don't shout, but contact this office!!!). **WE WILL NOT GIVE IN.**

And to be understood is to be levelled down,
And to be grasped is but to reach one's fullness
And like a ripe fruit to fall and be consumed.
Defeat, my Defeat, my deathless courage,
You and I shall laugh together with the storm,
And together we shall dig graves
For all that die in us,
And we stand TOGETHER in the SUN with a will,
And we shall be VICTORIOUS."

OPPOSITION POLICY ON GUN CONTROL

The NSW Liberal-National Party Coalition today announced its opposition to additional registration and regulation of the State's firearm owners.

In a joint statement, the Leader of the Opposition, Mr Nick Greiner, and the National Party Leader, Mr Leon Punch, said that they were opposed to complicated, costly and unnecessary regulation on the ownership of firearms.

"The overwhelming majority of gun owners are responsible citizens who will never use their firearms for criminal purposes and who will never be involved in a gun accident. Unless it can clearly be established that further controls will keep guns out of the hands of criminals or reduce accidents, gun owners should not be burdened with further controls.

"Gun accidents among adults are such a minor social problem that it is doubtful whether much can be done to reduce their incidence. There is greater cause for concern about the number of gun accidents among young people, and a Liberal-National Party Government will investigate ways of reducing this problem. The current firearms legislation already makes strict provision for the use of firearms by minors, however, there are limitations to what government can do about it.

"In an effort to cut down on the criminal misuse of firearms, a Liberal-National Party Government will as part of a general review of sentencing practices in the State, investigate mandatory minimum sentences for the use of firearms in the commission of a crime. Experience overseas with mandatory sentencing laws in this area gives encouragement.

"The Liberal-National Party Coalition is firmly committed to reducing the crime rate in New South Wales, but considers that stricter gun control will do little to achieve this objective. Short of removing most of the firearms now in private hands, a policy the Coalition does not support, there is little Government can do to keep guns out of the hands of criminals.

"The Coalition is opposed to adding a further complicated layer of regulation and registration to the existing system of shooter licensing. The costs to the Government and to firearm owners of such a policy are considerable and there is no evidence that it will, in fact, reduce the crime rate," Mr Greiner added.

A Letter via the Editor:

Each year at around this time, a large envelope arrives in my mail, containing a comprehensive catalogue, that promises me a whole host of shooting joys for the coming spring and summer . . . legacy I think from me writing a few articles for it's pages some few years ago. (No it's not the same catalogue many of you are thinking of) I used to publish that one myself.

In the newly arrived publication, I am presented with visions of hunting, shooting in all it's varied forms, to a complete coverage of all the competition shooting sports. It's quite a seductive list, for is not even the average-part-time shooter, swayed by the thought of having the choice from such well presented printed pages covering its contents with such wonderful detail, that any shooter would find a real bounty, right there in his own gun room, or in his hands. More than once I've been tempted into fast action, sending off for one or two of it's mail-order wonders.

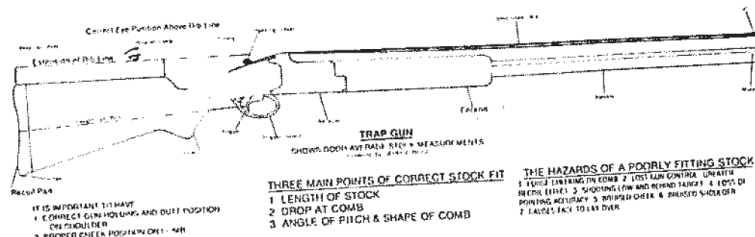
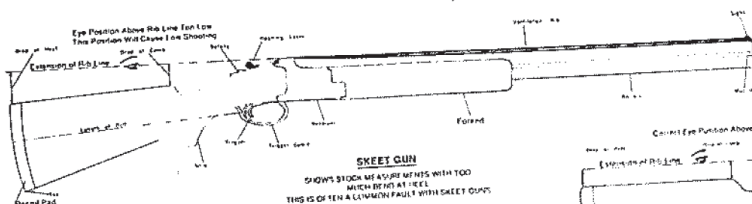
However, I thought I had seen it all, until this week. That was when I found the letter, via the catalogues Editor also in the envelope, which he has forwarded from a young man or boy. It was a small well written note, to say **THANK-YOU**, for the advise I had offered within an article on the "How-to-approach" some years ago. I do believe there may have even been a slight bit of moisture within my eyes, as I read his "excitingly" new discovery, of an article I had penned all that long ago. I still get loads of mail, though somehow, shooting and letters to this scribe, are never quite going to be the same again. For out in the world I've just discovered-for-myself, I have been able to be of assistance to **ONE young soul**. For my money, that's ample reward for the long hours of burning the mid night oil. **Isn't that what it's all about!**

"DOWN THE PASSAGE OF TIME!"

Racing (the gallops) has long attained the title "The sport of Kings", and this may be quite so, but in real fact the gunning sports could if they tried, lay good claim to such lofty salutation. Every monarch in recorded history, in every land from England, Europe, Asia Minor to the vast depths of China has always had a keen ongoing interest in the most "advanced firearms of each time and age when man first found the way to shoulder arms, for both pleasure and defence. The Kings of the Edwardian period, (as defined by Mother-England,) as one of their most social contributions to shooting's more intellectually-sophisticated periods. Earl de Grey was recognised as the best wing shot in England in those times, even the much travelled naturalist — Charles Darwin, was a good keen smooth bore man, and enjoyed hunting, and while King Edward as a youngster coming to the throne, was introduced to sport shooting by his father, who passed onto the boy a way that became a love for shooting by young Edward, he while being considered a good shot, was never classed by the authority of the day, to be a first class shot. But like the members of his world of aristocracy, before and after Edward, they all in their own acceptance of the Shooting-Sports, gave to all of us; even today, a period rich in character, with many a shooter who was a good rib-nudger and practice jokers, with open honest humour which tended, not to be personal and vindictive, but good fun generally without the slightest malicious intent. For those of you out in today's shooting world, who are sufficiently interested in the shooting history, I could not recommend a better reference to the above period than the times of the Edwardian shooting parties 1870 to 1910: The lesson you learn will be to your own advantage.

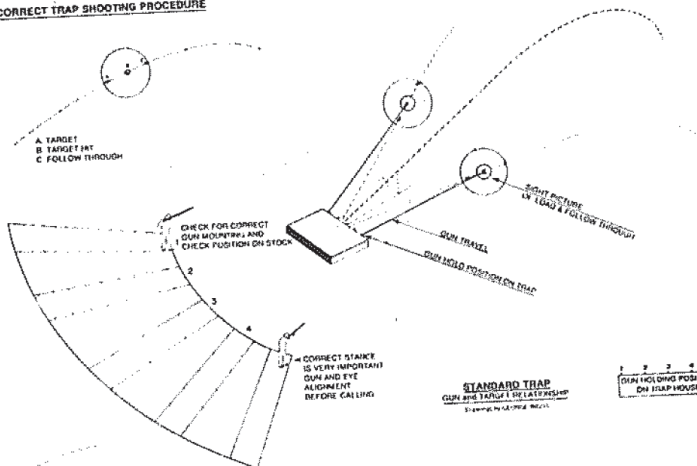

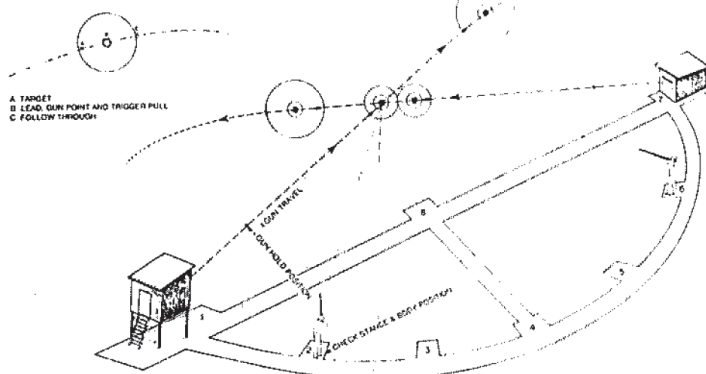

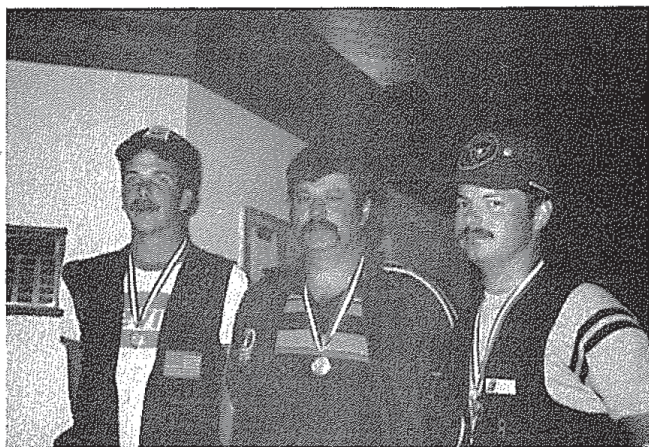

• Canadian Grand Prix — Gold, Matt Dryke U.S.A., Silver Dean Clark U.S.A., Bronze Alex Crikis Australia.

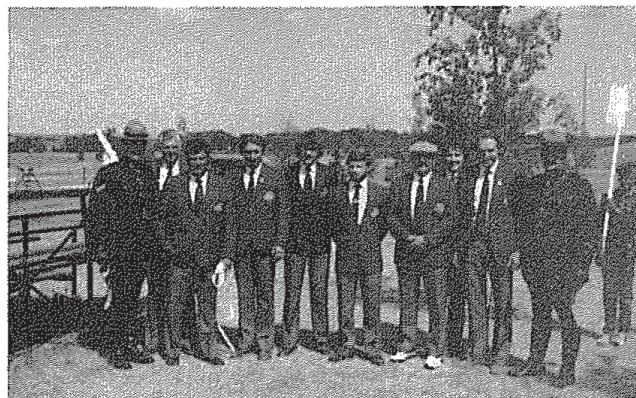

1983 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The conditions for the World Championships were bad, pouring rain, raging winds and icy cold. There was little shelter for the shooters and the water was ankle deep in places. The shooters from warmer countries were not prepared for the extreme cold, as is shown in the results.

The Skeet boys did their best but shivering from the cold and wet doesn't help concentration. There was no shelter from the conditions between shooting other than a very leaky tent. To give some idea of the effect the weather had on shooters our good friend John Woolley from NZ shot 182.

The Australian Skeet team came eighth in the World Championships. There were 66 competitors and individually the Skeet team members results were Ian Hale and Bryan Thomson, 186 both in 29th place and Alex Crikis 185 in 33rd position.

Bryan Thomson as the new boy did extremely well with consistent scores throughout.

Like all sports the luck of the draw made an enormous difference with the cold setting in and the rain falling heavier as the day went on.

The Chinese team wrapped themselves up in plastic bags to try and keep the wind out.

The Australian Trench team shot extremely well considering the conditions and took out the Bronze medal in the World Championships. The USA team won the Gold with 413, Russia the Silver with 399 and Australia Bronze with 397.

This is the best result for an Australian team at a World Championship since they were held here in 1973. Spain came fourth with 392 and Italy fifth with 384. There were 79 competitors in the Olympic Trap event.

The individual results were, eighth in the World Jim Ellis 181, Valduvi of Spain last years gold medalist tied with Jim on 181. Fourteenth in the world John Maxwell with 176, and 18th Graeme Boyd with 175.

Here again it was pleasing to see Graeme Boyd who has switched from Skeet to Trap, and John Maxwell competing at the world championships for the first time, both performing so well.

It was a most successful tour and considering the conditions the Bronze medal was a great achievement. When the Trench team stood on the dais and the Australian flag was raised, it was a very proud moment.

The ISU shooters who represented Australia, won third place in Skeet in the American Open, a Bronze Individual Medal in the Canadian Grand Prix, a team Silver medal in the Canadian Grand Prix and a Bronze team medal in the 1983 World Championships and good individual performances from the Trap team members with 8th, 14th and 18th positions in the World Championships.

Alex Crikis carried the flag for the Australian team at the opening ceremony and march past, and Jim Ellis carried it for the closing ceremony. Just as an interest note, it cost \$75 to enter the Skeet for the Canadian Grand Prix and \$80 for the Trench.

Cartridges were \$210 a case and it cost \$5 a round for practice, as you can imagine this limited practice somewhat.

The team represented you, the clay target shooters of Australia well, they worked hard and were good ambassadors, we were all constantly aware of our responsibility to you the shooters and to the Australian public at large because of the government grants received.

As team manager, coach, I would like to thank all team members for their co-operation, and to personally congratulate our trap team on their efforts.

In the World Championships, Jim Ellis on coming 8th in the world and Alex Crikis for his two thirds in the American and Canadian Opens.

Several competitors and officials remember the World Championships held here at the Melbourne Gun Club and

remarked on how well they had been run and how they looked forward to us having the World Championships here again. From the shooters point of view it would be great to have the home ground advantage and we could field a Junior and Ladies team.

The Canadians and Americans are also keen to attend our ISU Nationals in February.

The Australian shooters are respected as a world force and going into the Olympic year we have at least 10 world class shooters in the Olympic disciplines.

Clay Target shooting as far as a sport in Australia is concerned, is only in its infancy. Because it has no real spectator appeal, it has not developed to the heights of other team and individual sports. Regardless of this, clay target shooting will be a sport that will continue to attract shooting enthusiasts, and be around for many years to come. Already, the sport has produced competitors, who in their own way, and without intention, have helped to set records and unintentionally promote the sports development.

Driving through the Victorian town of Maldon just recently, I called at the residence of such a shooter, I have known and respected for many years. He is one I consider to have an impeccable record in clay shooting. I had the pleasure of being invited to stay for the evening meal. Accepting the invitation, I took the advantage of prying into my host's shooting background.

He told me he had always been a keen hunter, and in his early days, lived off the land, and the gun provided many a tasty morsel for the pot. His first attempt at clay shooting was at the Quambatook Gun Club. He missed more targets than he hit, and because he could not eat the odd one he did bring down, he was not impressed, and gave it away. Some years later, driving past Castlemaine Gun Club, and knowing their Christmas Shoot was on, he called in to have a yarn to friends he knew would be there. He was enticed to enter the main event. Not having a gun with him, he borrowed a Browning Auto and won the "Christmas Hamper".

The win was enough to influence his interest in the sport, and he took it up seriously, winning his first championship sash at Bendigo soon after. Since then he has amassed an outstanding record.

Eight hundred sashes he has won over the years, decorate the hallway and lounge walls of his home, from floor to

ceiling. Amongst them, forty State and twenty Commonwealth titles. His successes include, a member of the Australian MacIntosh team on ten occasions. A winner of the National Single Barrel title 1972, National Double Rise 1974-76, National Points Score 1975. A regular visitor to the New Zealand Nationals for the past seven years, winning the New Zealand Sparrows in 1977 and New Zealand Point Score in 1979.

He is a winner of nine Winchester Tournaments and at Noorat Gun Club was a winner of four of five Championships contested in a one day program. At Euroa Gun Club in 1967 he shot 351 straight to win the Championship on the program and as well, set a Victorian long break record. He won his first gun at the Frankston Australia Gun Club, and has followed it up with a total of thirty-nine in all, and over \$10 000 worth of trophies. In 1967-72-76 and twice in 1973, my host gained the recognition as Bendigo Sportsman of the Month, and achieved the honour of being Bendigo Sportsman of the Year in 1973. He gives recognition to the late Newton Thomas, as being one of the hardest opponents to beat on the shooting tracks.

Reading this, you may have realised, this record belongs to top shot and great ambassador for our sport, Alf James, who started clay shooting at the age of thirty-three. In my travels I often meet Alf around the traps, where he is still a top competitor and adding to his already illustrious record.

A barbecue tea was provided at the end of the program, and made a great social finish to what had been an excellent club shoot.

Wednesday, July 6th 1983

With weather conditions wet and cold throughout most of Victoria, it gave the opportunity for many shooters I know, to take the advantage of the conditions, with the excuse "it's too

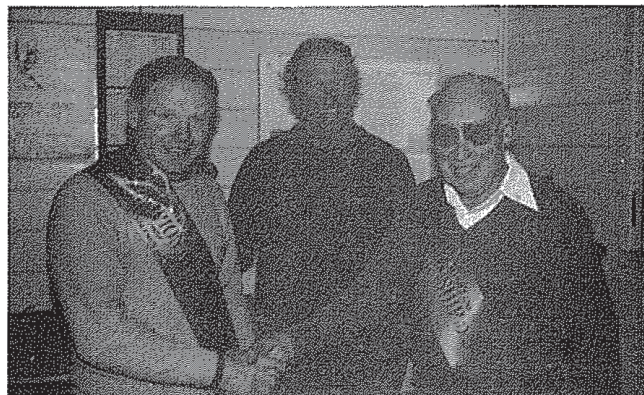
Thursday 7th, Friday 8th, July 1983

My responsibilities have had me attend the ACTA office over these two days. 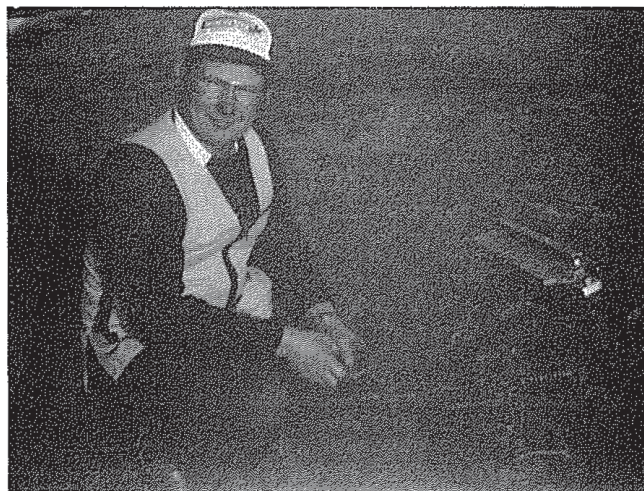
• President of Kyneton Gun Club, Geoff Moore, with championship winners Norm Patterson, left, and Frank Apted.

THE GOOD OLD DAYS

TWO TWENTY

How often does one hear someone speak about "the good old days" as applied to sport, business or just the everyday way of living?

When the expression is voiced by shooters it gets down to days when one only needed to go about twenty miles (sorry 33 km) outside the metropolitan area to get good field shooting which included hunting for quail, rabbits, snipe, hares and ducks. Although most times we asked permission of the land owner, there was no need to be worried provided we kept away from his stock and behaved in a respectable manner. More often than not, after an afternoon's shooting, the owner would join us for a cup of tea made "billy style" or something a little stronger out of a bottle. During the farewell often the owner would say to call again and would recommend a certain area of his property for collecting a good bag.

Of course the topic of trap shooting comes up, and shooters especially mention the scores shot, as compared with the scores put up these days. Many a present day shooter would be sceptical when told that a possible shot in a five, yes five bird event, stood a good chance of winning that event. At the Blackburn ground, a ten bird event points score 2 and 1 resulted in the then president of the A.C.P.T.S.A. and a new shooter drawing, after both had missed one target and pulled a second barrel on another. The shoot-off did not go for long as the president missed with his first barrel and broke it with the second. The new shooter shot his target with the first shot to win the event. During those days a Melbourne sporting paper gave shooting a very good cover and reported the events of that particular shoot with the following heading, "Young Amateur Shooter Wins Main Event at Blackburn Gun Club".

This gets us back to the expression "the good old days", then one has to make one's standard as to whether winning an event as above is good, or shooting a possible of say twenty targets and then being prepared to shoot it out with several others to any number up to a hundred and often more. ●

CANADA WINS MACKINTOSH TROPHY

It is ten years since Canada won the Mackintosh Trophy postal competition. Their shooters amassed the very good total of 7383/7500 to win it this year from New Zealand 7366, and Australia in third place on 7295.

This was Canada's fifth win in the history of the competition. Good news followed with Australia winning both the Inaugural Postal competitions for Ladies and Juniors.

The Australian Ladies Team scored 1420/1500 to win from Wales 1255. In the Juniors, Australia won with 1422/1500, from Wales 1345, and Ireland 1230. Congratulations to both Australian Ladies and Junior Teams. ●

IN RETROSPECT

Thank you to those shooters who have supplied me with old magazines.

I am now able to come up with some nostalgia, which I hope to bring to this journal each month. CTSN was first published in 1947, and I am spending many hours reading up to 1975.

The early days of shooting were different in many ways to today. As an example an advertisement for September 20, 1947 for Camberwell District Clay Target Club offered a program of 5 bird DB sweep, 5 pair Double Rise, 5 pair Deauville Doubles, miss out Double Barrel.

In this year Duxbac (Horrie James), achieved an ambition that most shooters dream of, winning his 50th Championship. It was the Blackburn Gun Club's Double Barrel Championship. One thing is clear from reading about 1947, is that most clubs had one Championship per month, applied for through the ACTA.

"Calrossie" won his 100th Championship at 71 years of age, this was a fantastic performance with so few Championships being conducted, not like today where you can go to some metropolitan clubs and shoot three and sometimes six Championships and win maybe two or three in the one day.

Many members will be interested to know that in the early years, the Champion of Champions Cup was the only National Title contested. In 1947 it was shot at the North Coburg Gun Club on June 16, and was won by "Doch-an-Doris" D. Watson, Ashburton Vic 49/50. Second was "Duxbac" H. James, Bentleigh Vic 44/50. The famous "Calrossie" was equal with three other shooters on 41/50. Some way back in the field was our own George Biggs on 39/50. Also on this day the Australian Teams Championship was decided with Coburg No. 1 Team first on 68/80.

Published in one of the 1947 CTSN's was the start of the "10 years ago" column. It told us that the 1937 Champion of Champions winner was the late Lew Bertram. He won it at the old Nobel Ground at West Footscray. His score it said was "an unbeatable 60/60 to win from Duxbac-H. James 59/60". It goes on to say that "Bertram carried on to break another 17 making his straight run break of 77 — not bad shooting for one day". (What do you think in 1983?)

As a lot of older shooters will remember, shooters here in Australia sent food parcels to English shooters soon after the war. Here is one reply — shortened by me to save space — "My wife at the news that she is going to get some cooking fat has been going about our cottage singing like a bird. I must thank you for the fat and dried fruit, it will help us very much". Unreal isn't it in today's circumstances?

At the 1947 Executive Committee meeting it was disclosed that the number of affiliated clubs had risen from 29 to 55, and registered shooters totalled 2929.

Also in 1947 The Melbourne Gun Club opened its Skeet ground at Tottenham, Vic, and on this day it held the Victorian State Skeet Title. The winner was J. Byrne with 17/20, the late Fred Burns was near with 14/20. I wonder what Ian Hale and Alex Crikis think of these scores.

In the same year Coburg Gun Club arranged a Melbourne Cup shoot. In the morning a 20 pound D/B Handicap was conducted and in the afternoon a 25 pound contest. The advertisement went on to say that the Victorian Tower Championship would soon be conducted, and that very few clubs had that type of shooting.

In Tasmania 80 guns turned out for the Tasmanian State D/B Championship at Hobart Gun Club. It was won by J. Bryant (Blackburn) Vic 40/40, Alf Poxon of Launceston was third 29-30, and second was J. McCraith (Essendon) Vic. And by the way a shooters' registration fee in 1947 was 10/- per year, how many of us have forgotten how to write the symbol 10 bob or 10 shillings.

I have an old Ballarat Gun Club constitution and program 1899-1900, I wonder if anyone has an older one.

Next month 1948-49 and some other State's news. I need magazines from 1969 to 1974 if anyone can help.

Soon some very interesting photos of those old top shots and advertisements.

The name of the State Association has been changed and in the future it will be known as the Tasmanian Clay Target Association. The complete change over will take some time so clubs are asked to bear with us during the transition period. After many years of hassle we were delighted to hear recently that the Police Offences Act has been amended to allow juniors to compete under adult supervision at approved clubs. The National Director of Coaching Mr Peter Quire has been invited to Tasmania to carry out coaching clinics. Clubs are asked to give their support to this venture and to take full advantage of the expert knowledge of coaching which Peter has to impart.

The 1983 State Trap Carnival will be held at the Tasmanian Gun Club on the weekend of October 29-30, 1983. The program will be as follows—Saturday: Double Rise, Double Barrel and Inter-club Shield. Sunday: Single Barrel, Points Score and State team events.

The Open, Lady and Junior team will be selected over three events at the Carnival.

Allocation of State Championships will be made at the next state meeting in September and Club Secretaries are reminded that application forms must be returned to the State Secretary before the closing date of August 31. A sum of 50 cents per shooter will be levied on all clubs conducting state titles in 1984.

I would like to extend congratulation to the incoming state committee and trust that we can continue to give service to the shooters of our state in the coming year.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

Since the most discussed topic in letters in the "News" is the general dissatisfaction with various aspects of the shooting rules, I feel it incumbent upon me to advise the following, with the thought that it might diffuse an issue many shooters consider to be the main cause of:

(a) general dissatisfaction; (b) referees resigning; (c) fewer becoming referees, and (d) many shooters not re-affiliating.

Ed Ransom did a good job of explaining the rules at the Brisbane seminar, attended by 44 shooters but the majority present disagreed strongly with: (a) some of the rules themselves (b) their complexity, (c) syntax, (d) repetition, and (e) the referee not being the judge of equity.

The main basic complaint was that with such major changes the rules had not been submitted to states or shooters for discussion.

The clubs in SE Zone have given these rules a fair trial and decided they are unsatisfactory. Acting strictly according to A.C.T.A. direction of going through club, zone, and state, these clubs are in the midst of compiling a set of rules ratified by shooters in the zone. All clubs have been given a tentative set of rules covering shooting procedures for trap, a questionnaire on doubtful points and a tape of discussion lasting 30 minutes. On their return, the feed back will be collated and a "Final Trial Set" of rules will be issued and tried out for about two months, after which the Final Set will be submitted to the other zones and states.

Intense interest has been shown outside the zone and some other clubs in QLD and NSW have been included in the survey, at their request. This has needed co-operation by the clubs, intense work organising the rules themselves, patience and time.

What of the outcome? Shooters in QLD and NSW are not very different from anywhere else — while we cannot agree on everything, these rules should reflect the views of the co-operating clubs. It obviously is too cumbersome to poll too many clubs outside our division but any club wishing to co-operate in the "Final Trial" stage would be welcome and we would be pleased to have their input.

It should be emphasised this is being done in an effort to help shooting, the A.C.T.A. and you, fellow shooters, NOT as an anti-establishment move but according to A.C.T.A. procedure.

Bev Grice is doing a grand job for shooting in QLD, it is significant that in her notes she says the rules cause most discussion. It is our aim to have the rules simple and more or less self explanatory. Most shooters polled so far, would in the meantime prefer to revert to the 1981 rules.

Be that as it may, any criticism of the venture should NOT be directed at the officials of the SE Zone, but at me personally, as the instigator and chief organiser of the project.

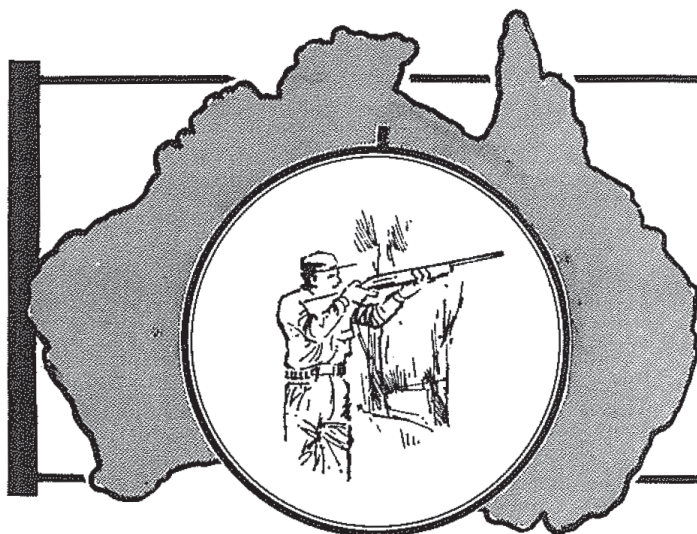

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

Re: Editor's Mailbox, August, 1983.

I am in full agreement with Mr Sullivan in regard to the expense of clay target shooting being the main offender and major cause of dwindling profits because of lack of support.

The sooner shooters all over Australia start to realise that it is no longer profitable to hold National championships in areas of small ACTA membership at the expense of the affiliated majority, the sooner we will turn our steady decline in profits from our Nationals around. There is no business person I know that would continue to prop up a section of a business that continually shows losses, particularly if that branch of the business was continually draining funds from the corporate body which could be used to consolidate and expand in a profitable direction.

My suggestion would be to allocate all National championships to the eastern states for the next 5 years to ensure good attendances and profitability then re-appraise the feasibility of re-allocation to other states.

In regard to our ordinary club shoots showing signs of lessening support, maybe we should be leaning more towards economy type shoots, i.e. sashes or badges in each grade only and do away with expensive prizes. We could probably look at re-designing our optional sweep system so those that want to pay big noms to qualify for a chance of monetary gain can do so by backing themselves to shoot possibles and those of us that shoot for enjoyment can do so at a reduced cost.

I don't entirely agree that the A.C.T.A. should not be buying offices and computers as I think that they are conducive to an efficient and profitable future in this day and age, although I do agree that the A.C.T.A. should be looking into business investment of some sort (not clay target manufacture) maybe commercial property or other areas that involve minimal or no staffing and have potential for capital gain.

I also think it is about time that ALL our National executive start supporting the majority of our shooting population and their delegates and start making decisions that are in the short term profitable to the A.C.T.A. and the majority and in the long term beneficial to ALL.

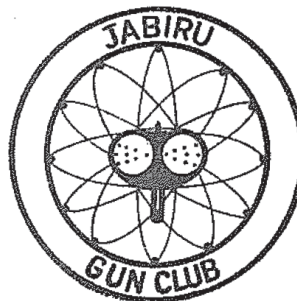

NEW SOUTH WALES CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER

It has been brought to the attention of the NSW State Association Executives that certain club secretaries have taken to abusing and otherwise being rude to our State secretary and one of our zone secretaries. This is a pathetic state of affairs and one which will not be tolerated.

Let's examine the facts:

Club secretary — voluntary.

Zone secretary — voluntary, often a club secretary.

State secretary — over-worked, under-paid, often a Zone and club secretary into the bargain, a human being who does not have to tolerate abuse from anyone.

Disagree on policy if need by all means, but, please don't resort to base personal insult. Give some consideration to your fellow office bearers, no one in this game gets things particularly easy.

I read that attendances were up at the 1983 ISU National Championships, this will of course be encouraging to the organisers and devotees of the disciplines involved. I wonder how much of this increase is due to holding the championships closer to the greatest concentration of Australian Clay Target Shooters?

The N.S.W. State Association sanctioned the formation of two new clubs last month. One at Coleambally and the other at Canowindra. I would like to extend to the management and members of these clubs all the best of luck for the future and I look forward to hearing further news of their progress.

Often the State Association is criticised for allowing so many small clubs to start up. However, it is my opinion that if each of these new clubs introduce one or two new members to the game then progress and success has been achieved.

When the team for the world moving target championships left for Canada once again there was no fanfare or glitter — no television or printed press interviews as there are with other sports. How quickly the media have forgotten what was news at the recent Commonwealth Games. Admittedly, even then, a little force had to be used to get the media boys onto the right track, but it doesn't look as if they learnt very much.

Shoulder to shoulder teams are selected at our State Carnivals each year, they consist of the top five of the State Trap or Skeet team. Everyone else in that team automatically becomes a reserve, that is to say number six to number fifteen qualifiers inclusive and in order.

If the top five are not available at the Nationals on the day that the State shoulder to shoulder teams match is to be held someone has always volunteered to search the grounds for the next qualifier, (reserve). If number six cannot be located then number seven is sought and so on.

Finding these reserves is a tedious and frustrating task and one done from courtesy rather than of a mandatory nature. Why is the search for reserves carried out at the last possible moment? Because we always hope that the top five competitors will arrive for the event.

I would like to sincerely thank the friends of the N.S.W.C.T.A. who went out of their way to help with the State Shoulder to Shoulder Team at Adelaide this year.

While on the topic of State Teams, It is considered bad sportsmanship to sign up for teams events and then leave half way through thereby letting your teammates down and in the lurch with no chance of filling the gap you have left.

If this happens in future the N.S.W. State Executive is prepared to take severe action against the offender. We fully appreciated the fact, that in some cases the situation may be unavoidable, all parties concerned would then be notified and understanding would be reached.

The Executive of the N.S.W.C.T.A. consider that "TO LEAVE A TEAM PART WAY THROUGH A COMPETITION WITHOUT GOOD REASON IS UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOUR OF THE WORST KIND AND WILL, IN FUTURE, TREAT THE OFFENCE ACCORDINGLY."

It has been noticed that some clubs are not passing on to the A.C.T.A. office quickly enough, shooters registrations. If you find that this is happening to you please contact your state secretary.

Club secretaries please note, you are only holding shooters registration money in trust and it is an offence to hold it unnecessarily long.

Shooters don't forget to ask your club secretary for a receipt when you do pay your subs; already we have heard of cash payments to clubs, no receipts and a resultant non record of the shooter concerned being affiliated with the A.C.T.A.

Because some could interpret the way the Nationals are shot a contravention of the A.C.T.A. shooting rules the State Association is coming under increasing pressure to allow zones to conduct their championships from 18 metres. We have been unable to permit this, believing that two wrongs don't necessarily make a right, even though the N.S.W.C.T.A. delegate to the A.C.T.A. referees assn, acting on advice from many of this States shooters has been pushing to have a distinction in our championships by shooting them from different meterages. Once again we must realise that our governing body knows what is best for the majority of shooters, we only have to ask to find that out.

Wagga Gun Club is a hive of industry already; ground preparations are well under way for the 1984 National Championships. Organising sub-committees have been formed and have commenced their co-ordination activities.

Coffs Harbour Gun Club and the Northern Zone Committee have preparations for the N.S.W. State Skeet Carnival almost complete and challenges have been issued to Victorian and Queensland skeet shooters to join us there in August.

The Committee of the Illawarra Gun Club is working in top gear to put one of the best State Trap Carnivals ever on the October long weekend, 1983. Knowing the ability and dedication of Bill Jones and his crew I'm sure they will achieve their goal.

The NSW State Coaching Director, Barney Rooke has held the first level two accreditation seminar at Wagga. He tells me that the most interesting part of the seminar was Robbie Smith's lecture pronouncing the effects of alcohol, sex and sleep on a shooter. Barney is not too sure if Robbie was talking from experience or theoretical study of the subject.

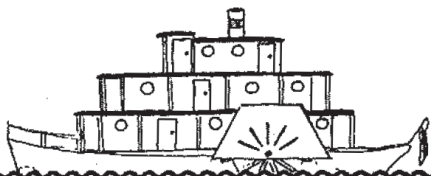

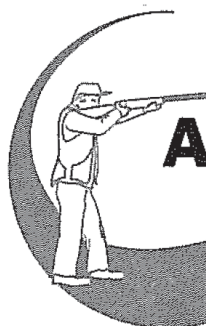

SUGGESTIONS ON PREPARING TO TO COMPETE AND COMPETING

By T. CATLING

The following are 10 points on how one could be preparing with bigger competitions in mind:—

- (1) PRACTICE: Always practice at full pressure. Better 25 targets with maximum concentration, than 50 or 70 anyhow.
- (2) DRY PRACTICE: Practice your muzzle control. Five minutes per day will do wonders. Learn to control the muzzle of your gun by following along: House guttering, power lines, tree branches, corners of rooms, picture rails etc. Practice in front of a mirror also. Dry practice is great and "Oh so cheap!"
- (3) MENTAL PRACTICE: Mental simulation of the task at hand. You should have done it so many times PERFECTLY in your mind that the event will be just like practice and a formality.
- (4) The minutes prior to any event should not be of great pressure if you have followed faithfully and practiced 1, 2 and 3 above. A few slow deep breaths will disperse tension.
- (5) At the start of any event 'Make a Bird' of the first 2 or 3 Targets. By that I mean do not rush or try too hard, just shoot within yourself, making sure you see the target CLEARLY.
- (6) Build up a little saying, that you can repeat each time you load your gun to take a target — Such as "See it, then shoot it" or "See it then shoot it smoothly". This will stop the tendency of jumping the target.
- (7) Make sure you call clearly, so as to receive even and good releases from the referee. Many referees are unfairly blamed for poor releases when in fact it is the shooter's poor call that is at fault.
- (8) Make sure you have enough shells for the round and of the shot size you prefer to use. Often the fact of running low on shells or shot size gets the mind off the job at hand, which is — SHOOTING EACH TARGET AS AN INDIVIDUAL EVENT. Remember from 15 metres shot size has very little, if any, bearing on your score.
- (9) Build up a good steady rhythm in your shooting that will fit in with most squads, as it will help you shoot better without developing extra pressures.
- (10) Remember to shoot your own targets and let everything else take its course. You cannot be running the squad in your mind and shoot well. Concentrate on your own shooting of the targets — "ONE AT A TIME". Relax after each shot you have and then build up concentration again just before your next turn.

Remember if you have practiced the above 10 points, then you can expect to perform well and you should think positively in that vain.

SUCCESSFUL LEVEL 2 COACHING SEMINAR AT WAGGA

A seminar to introduce candidates to Level 2 of the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme was conducted at Wagga Gun Club over the Queen's Birthday weekend.

The seminar got underway on the Friday evening with presentation of the course outlines and showing of the Dennis Waitley tape, "Psychology of Winning".

Dr Robert Murphy, a lecturer from the Riverina College of Advanced Education, spoke to the assembled group on the Saturday morning. He has the ability to present his material in a way that all can understand. So interested were the coaches that Bob Murphy ran an hour overtime in his presentation, which covered Skill acquisition, how coaches can produce skilled movement, by knowing the areas of perceptual mechanism, decision mechanism, and the effector-muscular mechanism. The coaches were very interested in Dr Murphy's thoughts on how to receive feedback, how to develop practice sessions, how to receive knowledge of results and apply them to each individual and mental practice. Dr Murphy's lecture was rated tops by all who attended the seminar.

Saturday afternoon was taken up with specific input on the role of the Level 2 coach. Much emphasis was put on the importance of coaches and administrators being able to work together in harmony, as both have the ultimate success of shooters and clubs at heart.

Each coach was given a specific subject and had to present a written paper to the seminar. The papers were evaluated on research and presentation with all coaches performing very well. A highlight was Rob Smith's presentation on the subject, "What effects smoking, alcohol, sleep and sex have on an athlete's performance." Rob had obviously spent many hours researching his subject as evidenced by him spending one minute on each of the first three sections, and three minutes on the last one!!

Time was spent on the Sunday morning being given expert advice on the use of video equipment by George Pender. The coaches were split into three groups, each with equipment, and after many attempts were producing good video tape of shooters on the tracks, which was then used for coaches to criticise.

George Biggs spent Sunday afternoon on Skeet instruction, both theory and practical work. George's knowledge of the skeet game was of enormous assistance to all coaches.

To wind up the seminar on the Monday morning new found skills were used to make a 20 minute video-tape of safety, gun mount, stance, and fault correction. This tape when edited will be available for clubs to use.

By lunchtime it was time to finish with an open discussion, and thank yous to John Harding, Regional Director Dept of Sport, Leisure and Tourism, who sponsored the seminar, George Biggs and Pud Burgess for their help and participation, and Dr Bob Murphy for his inspiring lecture. Thank you also to George Pender for his expert instruction in the use of video equipment.

To the coaches who attended, I thank you all for your participation, you are volunteer workers for our sport whose one aim is to ensure greater enjoyment through improvement in performance.
