EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The sporting community is very pleased with the Commonwealth Government's budget allocation to sport for the financial year 1983/84.

Of particular interest to us is the increase in the funding for the Sport Development Program. This has jumped from \$3.10 million in 82/83 to \$5.59 million, an increase of 75%. This figure represents almost 36 cents per head of population, which starts to approach the level of funding provided to sport by Governments in other countries with whom we wish to compare ourselves, for example, British sport benefits by about 50 cents per head.

The Commonwealth has given sport a higher profile generally with increases in funding to the Institute of Sport, Sport and Recreation for the Disabled, International Standard Sports facilities, and a grant of \$900 000 to prepare Australian Athletes for the Los Angeles Olympics. All sports are now waiting to see what their slice of the cake will be.

Planning continues for the Skeet Nationals to be held at Melbourne Gun Club, November 16 to 19. The Executive Committee has approved the program which is as follows:

Wednesday, November 16

- Event 1. City of Melbourne Skeet Championship 50 targets
- Event 2. National Skeet Carnival Championship... 50 targets

Thursday, November 17

- Event 1. ACTA Skeet Championship 50 targets
- Event 2. All States Skeet Championship 50 targets

Friday, November 18

- Commonwealth Skeet Championship 100 targets

Saturday, November 19

- National Skeet Championship 100 targets

All events will be shot graded AA, A, B, C, with prizes for Veterans, Ladies and Juniors.

The Champion of Champions will be the high scorer over the 400 targets of the series, who will receive the Cec Herbert Perpetual Trophy and a cased Beretta 680 skeet gun with the compliments of Winchester Australia.

The State Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match will be shot in conjunction with the All States Skeet Championship on Thursday November 17 for a perpetual Trophy donated by the Victorian Clay Target Association.

The Hon Race Mathews, Minister for Police and Emergency Services in the Victorian Government will visit the Skeet Nationals on the Saturday, and the series will conclude with a barbeque at the Club on the Saturday night.

The Skeet enthusiasts have their chance to make this first ever Nationals series a big success by showing their support with a large attendance.

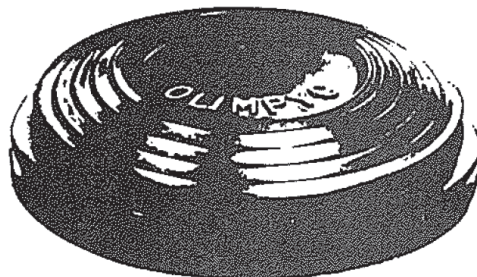

DETERMINED RAY SHOOTS FROM WHEELCHAIR

Ray Mackay, 15, is a student at Bairnsdale Technical School in Victoria's Gippsland region. About 18 months ago, Ray took up claytarget shooting via the firearms safety program offered by his school.

On July 29 last, he attended the 5th Annual Schoolboy-Schoolgirl Clay Target Championships, hosted by the Melbourne Gun Club at Lilydale. There he shot 10/10 in his second round.

Other youngsters produced similar scores. But Ray is a victim of spina bifida, a serious birth defect and has to shoot from a wheelchair.

Ray's teachers paid tribute to his determination. One of them told me how this courageous youngster had worked hard to make the school team for the state championships . . . how he takes part in the house swimming sports, and plans to go for his Bronze Medallion . . . how he participates in hurdles events, using his forearm crutches.

I talked with Ray for a little while. He was obviously pleased with his score, but shy too — as though he saw nothing exceptional in his achievement.

In another sense, the word "exceptional" applies to all the students who attend these annual championships. A parent put it to me in the following words:

"Where else could you find 300 kids who behave so well. You can't fault their conduct. They even clap a good effort instead of yelling and whistling. They don't argue the toss with the referee. They can teach us oldies a thing or two about gun safety and sportsmanship".

Another parent, new to the game, was struck by the contrast with the larrikin behavior he saw at junior football matches. And a third remarked, "If this is what shooting, I mean disciplined shooting, does for the young, there's hope for the country yet".

Despite the economic climate, which made the trip to Melbourne too costly for the distant schools like Mildura, 53 schools nominated competitors — the same as last year. The total entry, at 298 kids, was down slightly. Given economic recovery, the organisers are confident that attendances of 600 to 700 are possible in the future.

The championships are an integral part of the firearms safety courses conducted in many Victorian schools. Consequently, they must be allowed to remain independent from the ACTA and its affiliates. The question of funding was broached with the Victorian Minister for Youth, Sport and Recreation, Mr Trezise, who visited briefly.

Now for the results:

Girls' Champion was K. Hughes of Emmaus College, who broke 17 of her 20 targets. Runner-up was last year's third placegetter, C. Flavel of Rainbow High, with 14/20.

A. Schmedje of Numurkah Comprehensive took the Junior Boys' Championship with 19/20, edging out O. Lanyon of Boort High who scored 18/20.

The Senior Boys' Championship fell for the second time to R. Kelymack of Bell Park Technical School on 19/20. In second place was G. Bergamin of Numurkah Comprehensive, who went to 23/25 in a shoot-off.

There should have been a shoot-off for second place in the Teams' Championship as well. However, Kyabram High left early, thus defaulting to the Horsham Tech team of M. Purcell, B. Geve, A. Bolwell and L. Bell (35/44).

The Champion Team came from Numurkah Comprehensive. A. McKenzie, G. Bergamin, D. Cooper and A. Schmedje shot 35/40 for a solid win.

Trophies, sashes and medallions were donated by the Winchester Division, Olin (Australia) Ltd. Organiser Lyn Barr, Principal of Wangaratta High School, said the Championships could not be held without Winchester's assistance. He praised the company for their ongoing commitment to gun safely education.

The nomination fee of \$4.50 is the same as it was four years ago, he said, and this included targets and shells. Pre-event administration costs amounted to 85c a head. Reading between the lines, therefore, I would guess that the nomination fee is rather less than half of what it would have to be, were there no sponsorship.

Mr Barr also gave special thanks to the team of volunteers from Jeparit Gun Club, who every year trek to the big smoke and run the office for the day.

A Channel 7 news team arrived too late to film the actual competition. However, they did record a demonstration by some of the kids. The item was broadcast by Channel 7 the same night.

AROUND THE TRAPS

Saturday August 6, 1983. Goroke Gun Club attracted fifty shooters to its monthly shoot. The program consisted of a Deauville Doubles, a Double Barrel Championship, and a trophy shoot, with a club four man Team Shield in conjunction with the trophy shoot. The shield for the inter-club competition was donated by Goroke Gun Club President, Neville Block and attracts a great deal of interest from clubs in the area. Neville's club, to his delight, fielded a strong

enough team to win the Shield for 1983. Tex Drummond, one of the club's hard workers, and strong supporters, collected the Double Barrel Championship honors from a strong field.

Sunday August 7, 1983. The Victorian Clay Target Association met at Craig's Hotel in Ballarat, and battled with a long agenda. The State Association has some new faces on its Council. Ray McKenzie, President of Echuca Gun Club, faced his first State Council meeting. "Macka", as he is known by his shooting mates, has taken over the "Port Folio" of Kevin Dobson in the North East Zone. It is obvious Kevin does not intend to make a comeback, as he had handed over to "Macka" his papers complete with special yellow plastic brief case. Jim Taylor, President of Horsham Gun Club, is another of the new faces.

Jim is acting as proxy Delegate for Brian Kelly in the North West Zone, until the next North West Zone A.G.M.

Brian resigned from the Council because of work commitments. From the meeting came a recommendation that a submission be made to Victoria's 150th Anniversary Celebrations committee, seeking financial assistance for our 1985 State Carnivals. All Zones will receive their allocation of funds from the Firearms Training fund Grant for coaching. The moneys carry a request that a report and detail of expenditure, be sent to the State Secretary, detailing all coaching activities and moneys spent on coaching within the Zone. Delegates reported a high activity of shooting within their Zones, particularly at well established clubs. It was also

recommended the VCTA Constitution be revised. It is intended to have it re-written to be more compatible with the ACTA Constitution. 1984 Carnival dates were set, i.e. Trap Carnival, September 7, 8 and 9 at Geelong Gun Club. School Boy/Girl Championship to be conducted on September 6, 1984 at Geelong, prior to Trap Carnival. The Skeet Carnival which will include a Commonwealth, as well as the State title, will be over the weekend of March 10, 11 and 12, 1984, at Melbourne Gun Club. The ISU Skeet and Trench dates are yet to be decided. Wall charts to assist club coaches, are to be sent to all Victorian Affiliated clubs. The charts have been made available, free of charge by the VCTA. However, others may be purchased from the ACTA office should they be required.

Saturday August 13, 1983. I received the honor of an invitation to represent the Australian Clay Target Association at the 25th Anniversary Dinner of the Victorian Field and Game Association, at the Armidale Reception Rooms in Sale, Victoria. Sale is the district where this Association first originated 25-years-ago. Five members of the original foundation Committee to form the Association, were in attendance, to help celebrate the occasion.

State President, Mr Gary Howard, acted as host to the 120 that attended, with Cr Peter Synan, the Mayor of Sale, being amongst the guest list. It was a great night, with a carvery dinner consisting of beef, turkey, venison from the area, and roast wild duck. I was told the duck was the result of a 1982 shooting trip, and from a hunter's deep freeze. This organisation, although it originated and started in Victoria is now Australia wide, with branches in all states of Australia.

The organisation plays a vital role in the conservation of our wet lands and wild life, and since its inception has evidence of achieving remarkable results. Their efforts are appreciated by many and let us hope they continue to be involved in looking after the interest of the hunter, and are around for many years to come.

Sunday August 14, 1983. Frankston Australia Gun Club provided a program of Olympic Trench, DTL, trap and American Skeet for the Sunday shooter. Olympic Trench is

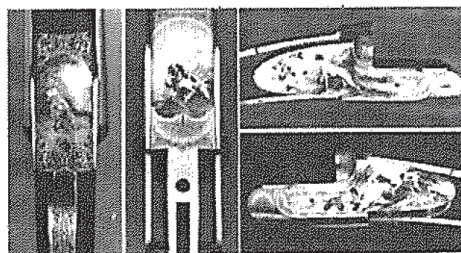
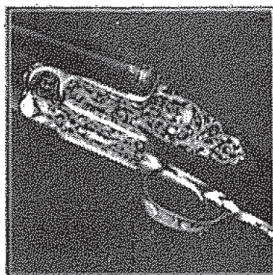

Sunday August 21, 1983 Round four of the South East Zone Premiership was conducted at Frankston Australia Gun Club. Just on one hundred shooters from clubs within the Zone competed. It appears clubs in the Zone have rallied behind the spirit of team shooting and place great importance on being recognised as the top club in the Zone.

Cerberus Gun Club, number one team, collected the honors in this round, and have taken over the lead in the Zone Club Team Premiership, from Korumburra. It is interesting to note

fifteen teams of five shooters competed from nine different clubs, represented in the Zone.

Monday August 22, 1983 Management Committee met at ACTA office. Financial results to end of June on income and expenditure against budget, was a major agenda item discussed. Whilst income is below figures projected for 1983, so too is our expenditure. It is obvious the short fall in income has been created by a slight drop in registration, as well as CTSN advertising.

The result can be attributed to the present economic climate. Another area that has created income reduction, is the

increase in veterans. Sixty-five year olds now register as veterans.

These total 230, as against 27 in 1982. Overall, and keeping in mind, the economic situation is not showing signs of improving, our financial position is fairly stable. There is a need to watch our expenditure and activities very closely, and this is certainly being done.

However, I also see no reason why, under the present economic climate, the Association should not look at how to combat the difficulties and also plan for future development. I believe this is essential if we want to see our sport progress.

SATURDAY 16th

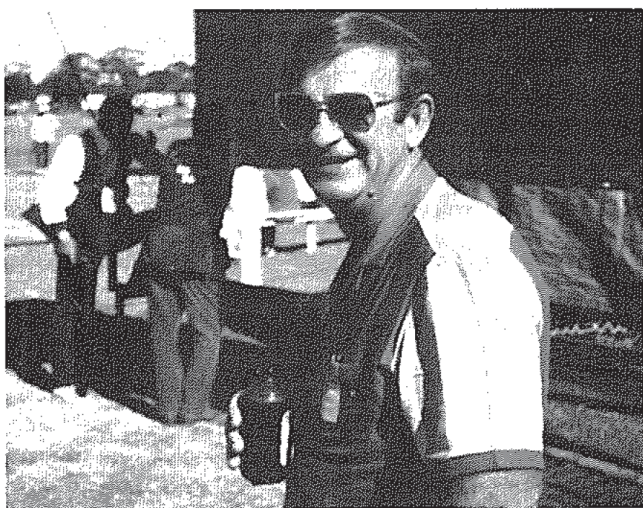
The first day of the Cunderdin State Carnival dawned a beautiful day.

37 shooters from throughout the state commenced the eye opener event of 5 pair double rise in perfect conditions. No cloud, no wind and beautiful sunshine.

David KEVILL of C.M.T. commenced what was to be a good day for him by winning the first event with the only possible scored all day, 10-10. When walking off the tracks David was heard to reply to a query as to his score "for . . . sake, there was only five pair."

The second event commenced with the arrival of a few late starters and the field had picked up to 40 for the 10 pair of Double Rise for the District Championship.

Once again David KEVILL was to the fore, carding 19-20, to take out overall and the first sash for the weekend. The lesser places were keenly contested with a four way shoot off for 'A' grade between Robin BAILEY, Perth, Bob THOMSON, C.M.T., John EDDY, Perth, and Murray ALEXANDER, Azzurri, finishing in that order. 'B' grade was a fighting finish for our fearless leader, Laurie REYNOLDS, to win from Eddie FAIRLESS from Southern Cross. Similarly, a shoot off in 'C' grade

The State Double Rise of 25 pair had an extra starter taking our field to 41.

At the completion of the event, Murray ALEXANDER, our State President, had excelled himself in scoring 46-50, to win outright. Shoot offs for the grades resulted in Robin BAILEY, Perth, taking 'A' grade from David KEVILL, C.M.T. and Darryl WIESSE, Narrogin. 'B' grade went to Eddie Fairless,

Southern Cross, from Frank FAIRLESS (guess where), and Allan PEARSE, C.M.T. 'C' grade was a fierce three way battle with Bob COUZENS, Southern Cross, victorious over Eddie EATON, C.M.T., and Brent HUMPHREY, Northam.

So efficiently did the shoot run that the scheduled program was finished before three o'clock. As many shooters had heard about Trench but had never seen or shot it, an extra event of 25 Trench was organised for their benefit. A trophy was also made available. 30 shooters took part with four shooters in a shoot off for the win (all four were from C.M.T.). David KEVILL shot brilliantly with 50-50 single barrel to win from Ivan HALBERT, John FISSIOLI and Elliott HARRIS. This type of shooting put David as hot favorite for the point score events for the next day.

SUNDAY 17th

With Pool Trap closed, the first event of 25 District Point Score got under way. Once again weather conditions were absolutely perfect. During the course of this event, the one and only problem for the weekend arose. One of our new SPIETH machines developed a fault of overheating the motor for cocking. It was watched very closely until the end of the event then replaced with a Winchester machine.

David KEVILL continued his form from the previous day to take the event with 73-75, making sash number two. In the shoot off David had to shoot an extra 51-51 to win from Murray ALEXANDER, Colin HINKLEY, Narrogin, and Jeff HOPKINS our local Junior. John HARRIS, C.M.T., also in the shoot off failed to run a place. 'B' grade was won outright by Eddie FAIRLESS from Allan PEARSE with Tod HARRIS and Laurie REYNOLDS equal third.

'C' grade likewise was won outright by Peter ILEY of Bunbury with B. O'BRIEN, Goodooga (N.S.W.) in front of A. COLE of Southern Cross.

A special welcome is extended to our one and only Interstate shooter in B. O'BRIEN.

The second event of the day and the State Point Score over 50 targets commenced with a total field of 68 shooters.

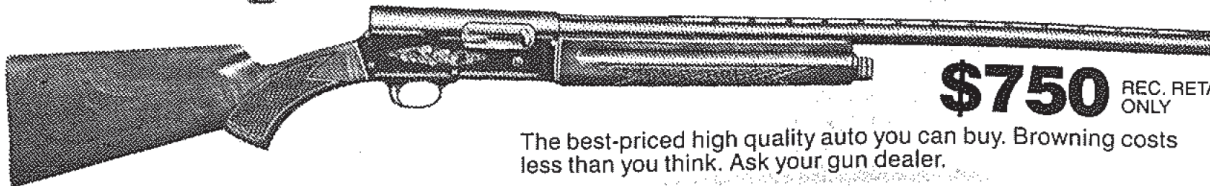
After the first round, several long faces left the tracks with more points lost than won. The leaders at this stage were, Colin HINKLEY down one point, Murray ALEXANDER, John HARRIS and Bob THOMSON down two points.

About this time a slight zephyr of a westerly breeze over our left shoulders had an unusual effect on some shooters. One of C.M.T.'s top shooters in John HARRIS did a most uncharacteristic stunt and returned a second round score of 61-75, completely missing 4 targets. A similar fate befell Bob THOMSON who returned a 69-75. Murray also slipped a bit, needing his second barrel 4 times. In his second round, three shooters carded possibles of 75-75, there were Roy HOLTFRETER of Northam, Ron BAKER of Geraldton and myself Chas RIEGERT of C.M.T. As all three of us were in squads three and four, this left the remainder of the first round scores to finish. By the time squad ten got onto the tracks, all eyes were on Colin HINKLEY as all he required was 74-75 to win the event outright from myself already on 147-150.

After 24 targets, Colin was on 72-72 with only his last to go. With such intense pressure, the second from last shooter in the last squad missed his last target. Colin came in much dejected with himself to run second on 146-170.

The final results being Chas RIEGERT, C.M.T., winner from Colin HINKLEY, Narrogin, Darryl WIESSE, Narrogin, and then three shooters equal being Don WATTS, C.M.T., David KEVILL, C.M.T. and Murray ALEXANDER, Azzurri.

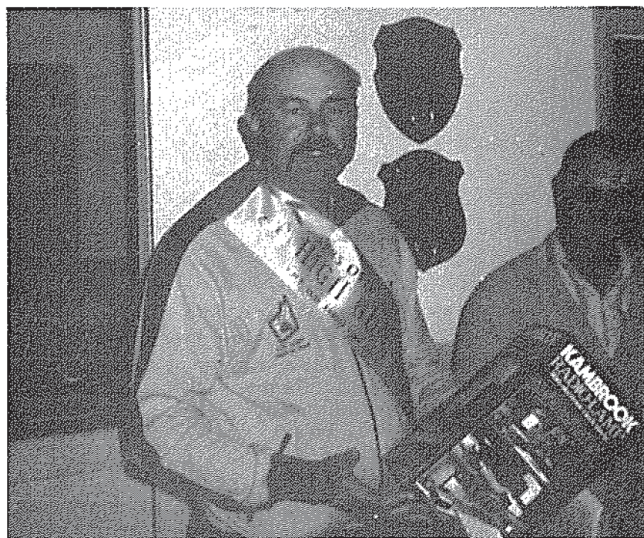

As a result many shooters were not impressed with right hand swingers from lane one. As a result of comments received, the angles on these machines were reduced on

Sunday to be compatible with other Club's machines. I personally feel that an effort should be made by ALL Clubs to ensure that whatever machine they use, the targets thrown should make the maximum angles. In this manner they may learn to shoot competitively instead of making derogatory comments about the difficulty of targets. The effect of shooting these targets can only improve the shooters skill.

C.M.T. Gun Club extend their thanks to all shooters who attended. Each Club represented had at least one winner take home a trophy. The clubs represented were: AZZURRI, BUNBURY, COLLIE, C.M.T. EDGEHILL, GERALDTON, GOODOOGA (N.S.W.), NARROGIN, NORTHAM, PERTH, SOUTHERN CROSS (QLD).

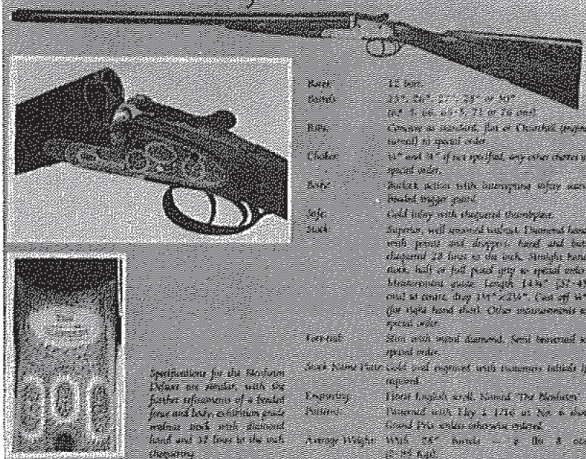

His father-in-law's first job was in the Mallee, lumping bags of wheat in a mouse plague.

"You went to put on your boots in the morning, and they would be full of mice. Ran all over your face, too.

"The first day I thought I was going to die.

"The second day I wished I could!"

Soon, Jock was driving cattle and pigs along dirt roads through Melbourne suburbs.

He bought a butcher's shop in Albert Park. By the time he retired at 70, he owned 23 shops and three abattoirs.

"I never wanted to be a millionaire, they don't put pockets in shrouds."

Jock's horses won over 200 races. Most were jumpers. Van Perri was one of them.

His driver's licence is still current, but he seldom uses it.

He was the first president of the Australian Clay Target Association; and spent three years in organising the trench shooting on the RAAF base at Laverton for the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne.

The early days of clay target shooting in Australia will be recalled in future articles.

SPORT NEWS

BUDGET HAS GOOD NEWS FOR SPORT

The Confederation of Australian Sport is very pleased with the amounts allocated to Sport, Recreation and Fitness in the 1983/84 Budget.

The President of the Confederation of Australian Sport, Mr Wayne Reid OBE said in Melbourne recently "The amount of \$5.59 million allocated to the sports development program represents the first time that any Government in Australia had provided the level of funding which the sporting community believed was a responsible level of funding. This amount is an increase of 75 per cent on the allocation last year of \$3.19 million and represents almost 36c per head of population, which starts to approach the level of funding provided the sport by governments in other countries with whom we wish to compare ourselves; for example, English sport benefits by about 50c per head."

"The Confederation is pleased to see that funding to the Australian Institute of Sport program is increased from \$4.5 million to \$5.35 million and the disabled sports received a 100 per cent increase to \$400 000."

Mr Reid said "The prime objective of the Confederation when it was established in 1976 was to obtain a responsible level of funding for sport from Governments, and it was very satisfying to the organisation that such an objective had finally been achieved."

ABT POLICY CHANGE IS THREAT TO SPORT

The moves to eliminate accidental or incidental exposure of tobacco company signage had developed into one of the greatest problems facing Australian sport.

Mr Wayne Reid, President of the Confederation of Australian Sport, said this in a memorandum sent to member associations.

"If the Australian Broadcasting Tribunal decides to apply a harsher interpretation to the relevant section of the Television Broadcast Act, it will have done what various attempts at Legislation have so far failed to do — effectively remove a major lawful source of sponsorship from sport", Mr Reid said.

He has asked member associations to put their views before the Tribunal before it is "too late".

He says they should not defend the tobacco industry, but point out that sponsorship signs at sporting venues should not be classified as commercial advertisements.

Mr Reid said the Tribunal, which is not directly linked to sporting bodies, should not be placed in the position of being responsible for setting sporting development back years in this country.

"It is a sad fact that the Tribunal can do this by simply varying an interpretation which has proven totally acceptable to an overwhelming majority of Australians," he said.

"If it does so, a precedent will have been established which will mean that other industries that are identified by vocal groups in the community as undesirable can be affected in the same way."

Mr Reid said that in a country of 15 million, sources of sport sponsorship were severely limited and the \$10.8 million annually from the tobacco companies would be an irreversible disaster for all sporting activities.

"If the tobacco industry is eliminated, all sporting bodies will still be seeking sponsorship, but then the total of funds will be reduced by 23 per cent — from \$47 million to \$36 million."

"This would set sport against sport in a battle for funding major events to a level never previously seen in Australia," Mr Reid said.

NATIONAL SPORTS CONGRESS EXPANDS TO THREE DAYS

The 1983 TAA National Sports Congress has been considerably expanded from the format used previously. The presentation of the Sport Australia Awards will be the first component.

This function will take place at "Leonda" Restaurant, Melbourne, on Tuesday, December 13.

The following day, Wednesday, December 14, will be the first day of the two-day Annual General Meeting of the Confederation of Australian Sport. Following the format first tried last year, the Coaches Assembly (CASCAs) Annual General Meeting will again be integrated with that of Confederation.

However, the afternoon of Wednesday will be set aside for workshop discussions. During this period, delegates will debate issues which are seen to be significant for 1984 and beyond.

Recommendations arising from these workshops will be discussed in a plenary session at the commencement of the second day. Following these discussions, the General Meetings of CAS and CASCAs will be reconvened and are scheduled to conclude late in the day.

The new format will provide delegates with the opportunity to canvass the subjects important to them, and to be totally involved in the proceedings.

The dates are — December 13: Sport Australia Awards; December 14 and 15: Annual General Meetings and Workshops.

Meanwhile, the traditional sponsors' luncheon, known as the Sport Australia Luncheon will be held on the first day of the Annual General Meetings, immediately preceding the workshop activity on Wednesday, December 14.

TAA has maintained its historic link with this project by again agreeing to be the prime sponsor of the Congress.

All team members were very happy with their practice, the targets and weather were spot on. The balance of the day was used on a small trip over Lillteton Harbor.

Thursday morning was a rest day so the team headed for Arthur's Pass, a drive of some 120 km. This time of the year the mountains around Christchurch are all covered in heavy snow. We were able to visit the ski fields and one of the many rangers lodges where the boys had a long talk with the ranger and learned a lot about New Zealand.

Friday was the official practice day and each team member put through a couple of rounds each and again all were very happy with their performance.

I would like to take this opportunity to appeal to all referees registered or not to referee by the current set of rules. If we continue to have different interpretations of the rules by referees, this breaks down the equity of the competition.

Come on shooters — write to the Editor and tell us through the News if you think that Second place getter in handicap events should be penalised one metre. I suggest that if enough of you write and say you disagree with this rule, it might be changed.

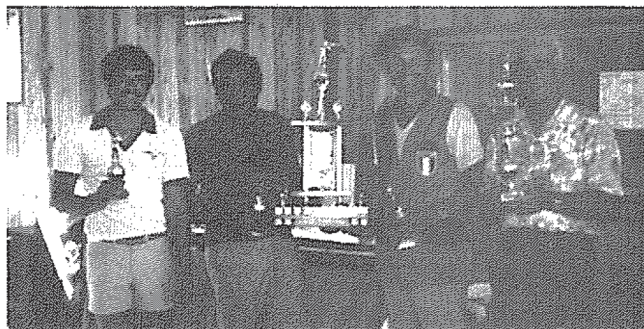

Junior shooter Tom Turner Jnr was in three shoot-offs, being successful in all of them.

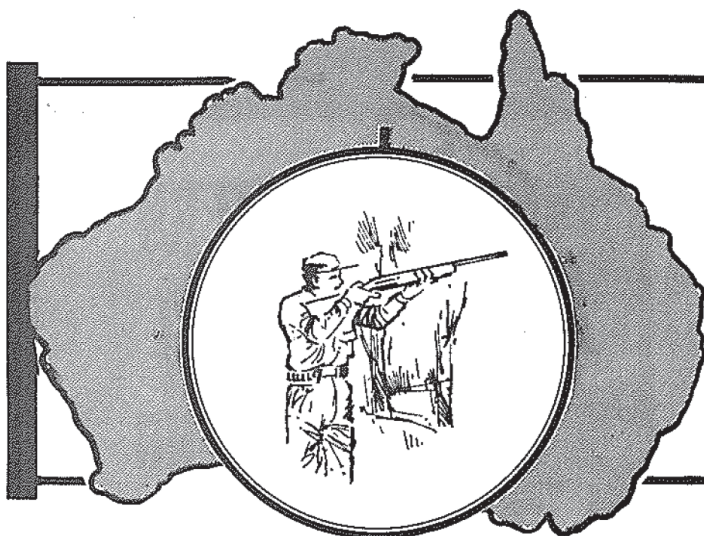
There were only three junior shooters present and they all won their first championship, this must be some sort of record.

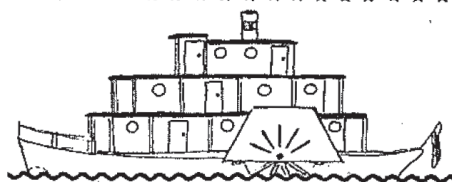

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Part 5

Dear Ian,

At page 63 of the August issue of "Shooting News" you published a letter from Mr M. Sullivan, President of the Macarthur Gun Club which he describes as a small club. He raises questions regarding the cost of shooters' registrations, and suggests that we are losing members to the Field and Game Association because of their lower fees.

I notice also that at page 12 the A.C.T.A. President expresses concern over the loss of 2000 members per year.

Until about 15 years ago, members had handicap cards for D.T.L. only. Since then, several different types of shooting have been introduced, and it is evident that each has added to the cost of maintaining the A.C.T.A. office etc. In South Australia there are several small clubs with facilities for D.T.L. only. There are many members who shoot only D.T.L., and it seems to me that their fair share of the cost of running the A.C.T.A. is far less than the share of others who participate in a wider range of events.

I am not the first member to think of this proposition, which should be the basis for a solution to Mr Sullivan's problem. There should be a fee for each of the disciplines, and the system could be controlled through the handicap cards. It would result in a decrease in registration fee for members who shoot, say, D.T.L. or skeet only, and perhaps about the same as now for those who shoot in two disciplines and varying degrees of increase for those with the wider interests.

I am not going to engage in the popular game of Knocking Roger Darwon, as he does a lot more for the sport than I do. However, I would like him to get down to a level of English that I can understand. At times, he is way over my head. An example is in the material under the heading "The Case of the Extinct Species" at page 10 of the August "News". All that I can deduce from it is that Roger has a Purdy, Don Fleetwood has one also, and that Don discourages the shooting of sitting ducks. Surely, I have missed the point.

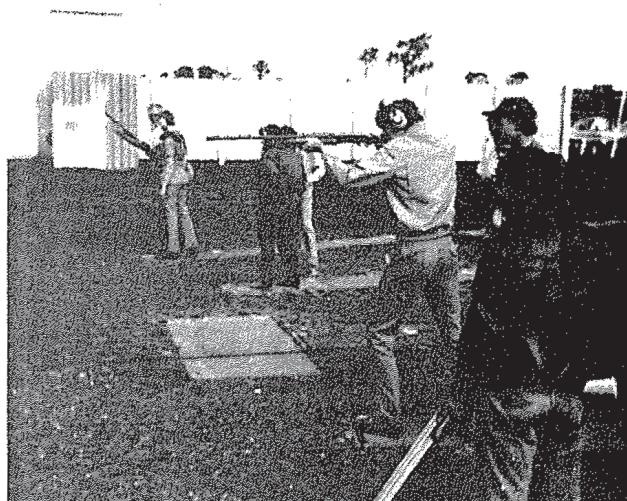

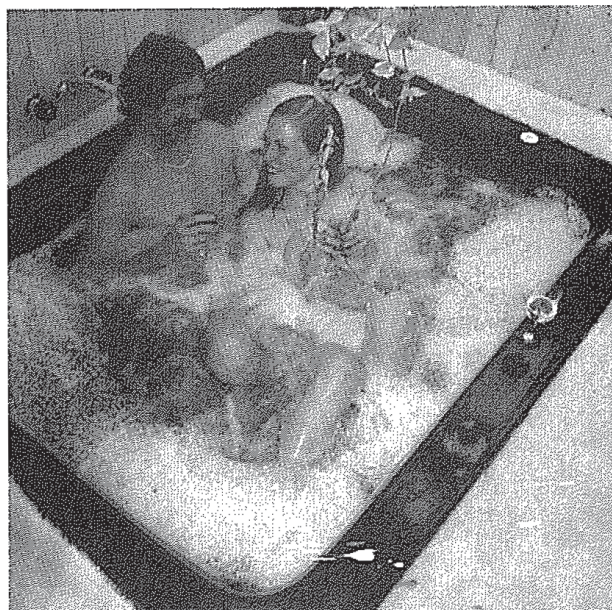

EDITOR'S MAILBOX Part 6.

Dear Ian,

In the 1983 Annual General Meeting some discussion was given to the subject of: "Using new shells as against reloads at the Nationals". Both sides were aired:

For: Money made from, Sponsorship gained by and, Equality, everyone on the same level etc.

Against: Cost, Shooters are used to their own reloads, Confidence in them and, Encouraging more shooters to shoot at Nationals by lowering costs, etc.

After a motion to use new cartridges was passed by one vote, I asked the Chairman: "Would it be in order to demand a recount?" A recount followed with delegates taking sides of the room. "For" to the right and "Against" to the left. The motion was passed by a significantly larger number.

I was supposed to represent my club as delegate as our club's delegate couldn't attend. Due to a mix-up my name was not submitted on the delegates roll, hence my interest in the recount. Had I voted the first count would have been even.

Not being a delegate I listened and watched. The passing of cards that went on before the second count could explain the difference in number of votes cast, It also leads me to think that this system of naming delegates and enforcing the card system is not infallible.

In my opinion the successful future of our sport lies in the encouragement of everyone to attend and participate, especially in Nationals. If not being able to use reloads discourages anyone (and it seems to) then I disagree with it. If companies put extra mark-ups on products to cover generous donations then this also is not helping our future.

It seems to me that people who want to use new shells are preventing those who don't from being allowed to. This is unfair. I have heard it said that "having confidence in your shells is half the battle". Having to use new shells disadvantages reloaders. I personally like fast one ounce first barrel loads so I'm not catered for.

For twelve months of the year we are given the option of using reloads and rules police the event catering for anything detrimental to competition. "Hassels" are relatively rare and the rules cover them too. The money made from cartridge sales could surely be made up by better management. If dealers can discount and still make money why can't the A.C.T.A., by dealing directly with companies? Shooters still have to use reloading components so why should sponsorship diminish? Competition "equality" levels work for the rest of the year, why not for Nationals?

I think the cost of our sport is the biggest limiting factor to our success, limiting numbers. We can't produce Champions by cutting our potential to do so. It must also be in ammunition companies interests to encourage the sport to increase participation, encourage reloaders.

I can remember attending an Annual General Meeting in Adelaide when a National ground was a rising dream. There was a lot of controversy about this but again the average shooter was expected to pay. A lot withdrew. That dream has just been shelved. I think it is time to give the system a shake up in an effort to gain strength in new members and give everyone a chance to take part.

There are my personal opinions, I hope they are read, thought about and commented on, particularly if you are not getting a "fair go". Let's pull together, think also of the "average" shooters who sponsor the "winners" and our sport will prosper.

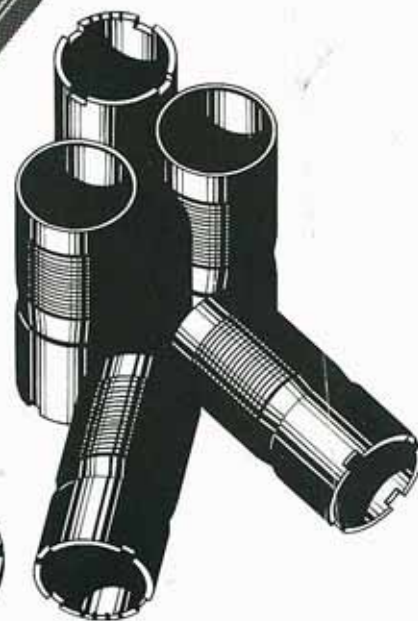

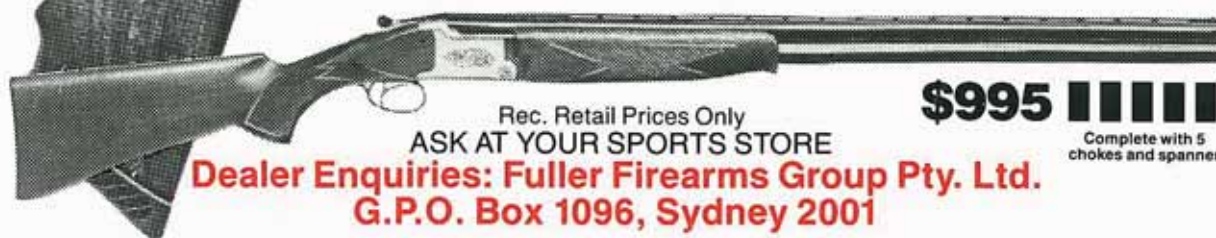


