EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism, the Hon John Brown, M.P., has announced grants totalling \$5.285 million to 98 National Sporting Associations, under the

Sports Development Program for 1983-84.

Clay Target shooting benefits by a grant of \$35,000, an increase of \$10,000 or 40% on our grant for the previous year. This is made up of \$5000 for general administration, \$25,000 towards funding the National Coaching director, and \$5000 for coaching projects. The coaching area was the main thrust of our submission for funding assistance for this year.

The shooting sports together received \$129 000, made up

as follows:

We will also share some of the money granted to A.S.A for international competition, and a pre-Olympic preparation grant of \$900 000 allocated to the Australian Olympic Federation to prepare Australian teams for Los Angeles in 1984.

The Hawke Government has certainly backed up its election promises to sport, with the hefty increases in funding under this program.

* * *

As I write the Skeet Nationals at Melbourne Gun Club are about a week away. Motels in the area report heavy bookings, with a contingent of New Zealanders included in the reservations. Competition is expected to be very keen, I'm told the dedicated skeeties have been training hard for the series.

The 1984 Olympic Discipline Nationals in February-March promise to be bigger than ever before. Matt Dryke and Dan Carlisle from the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning are definitely making the trip, as is another top skeet shooter in Dean Clark. Dryke is the current World I.S.U. Skeet Champion, and Carlisle won the World I.S.U. Skeet Championship at Caracas, Venezuela, in 1982, after shooting off with Clark. Both had shot 199-200. Dan Carlisle is also a master of Olympic Trap, being in the shoot-off for the gold at Caracas with 197-200. A fantastic performance after winning the gold medal in skeet. Other top international competitors have been invited to compete in what should be a marvellous pipe opener for the Olympic Games.

Guns, luggage, cartridges (and of course the Lufthansa tour group) quickly cleared customs and, with the aid of a mini bus and Merv's truck the group were soon on their way to the Mt Martha Motel.

Three other members of the team entourage were to arrive from USA later in the week and moved into the local Lilydale Motel.

On Wednesday, the 5th October all team members arrived at Melbourne Gun Club to familiarise themselves with the club's layout and to check the targets. Although it was a beautiful day, the wind soon made conditions very difficult and no good practice scores were returned. 
It must be remembered that the visitors were missing at least two of their better shooters!



A STICKLER FOR SAFETY



Despite his once appearing in a group photograph with both hands resting on the muzzle of a closed gun, the Australian Clay Target Association's first president, Jock Wilson, was a stickler for safety.

Mr Wilson 87, was president from 1937 to 1957.

He lives with his daughter and son-in-law, Clover and Reg Glover, at Almurta, near Korumburra, in Victoria.

He was once invited to speak at a dinner after a trap shoot in England.

He said the slackness in safety that he had seen around the ground that day, would NOT be tolerated in Australia.

ground that day, would NOT be tolerated in Australia.

"They walked about with their guns closed and, in some

cases, closed and LOADED.

"What I said did not go down very well with them; and a

subsequent speaker took me to task.

"Next day that speaker had his gun closed and loaded,

waiting to go out to shoot. A dog jumped up on him, caught the trigger, and somebody was seriously hurt.

"I was greatly distressed"

A few years later, at an annual inter-services shoot at the Nobel GC at Footscray, Mr Wilson reprimanded an English admiral for carrying a gun closed.

"He snorted his disapproval at my rebuke, and continued to carry the gun closed."

"I then told him that, as club president, I was in charge of

the ship that day; and if he would NOT carry his gun correctly, he should leave the ground.

"He left."

110 1010.

NZ Nationals

Mr Wilson was not allowed to compete at the NZ Nationals in '37 because he had not been an NZ resident for six months.

"I had arrived only two days earlier. I reminded them that THEY shot at our Nationals without residential qualifications.

"However, the secretary stuck to the rule.


"They would not even let me shoot for the sweeps — only for the targets.

"As it turned out, I was the only one to break the 25.

"The winner, with 21-25, was a 6'5" Maori who, in his acceptance speech, said his was a very hollow win."

The J. M. Wilson Perpetual Cup that the winner of the Australian double barrel championship gets, perpetuates the memory of the same, old man who was the first life member of the American association not resident in America; and is still a life vice-president of the controlling English body.

Favorite gun

Mr Wilson's favorite gun was a made-to-measure, side-byside French gun.

"I shot them all, including Purdeys. But I did best with one that a former manager of Purdey made for me in a French factory that he went over to manage.

"It was a tightly-patterned hammer gun with short-travel hammers.

"I later got another one of the same make; but hammerless, with ejectors and 28 in. barrels.

"It was great for field shooting. Reg Ansett finished up buying it from me."

Mr Wilson then a Melbourne wholesaler and retail butcher and racehorse owner, was once offered a Purdey for 25 pounds by the son of a Melbourne bookmaker.

"I contacted a friend at Melbourne CIB to find out if a Purdey had been stolen in Victoria. None had.

"I got the detective to check if one had been stolen in Australia. None had.

"Even so, I knew there was something fishy, and did not accept the bargain.

"It turned out to have been stolen in England the previous year."

Greeners

Mr Wilson once air-freighted for 12 pounds 10 shillings a Greener to its English manufacturer for rebuilding.

It came back in mint condition.

"But I never got an account. Next year I was in England, and called at Greeners to pay.

"The manager said if I had enough faith in Greener to

send a gun 10 000 miles, there would NEVER be any charge.

"Calrossie got Greeners to make him a made-to-measure gun on his way to a European championships.

"Calrossie only worked for ICI, and could not afford the eventual cost, and finally admitted it to Greeners.



"Greeners got around it by saying that they had no intention of charging such an outstanding shot as him.

"They weren't wrong; Calrossie won the world live bird championship.

"Yet he and Donald Mackintosh, who also won the world live bird championship, were not good on clay targets; they couldn't win the Nobel GC championship."


"SEND YOUR DOG!"

The Italian firm "Abbiatico & Salvinelli" (also known as Famars) has just completed the full range of the four international gauges (12-20-28 and 410) for its much appreciated classical sidelock Over-Under "JOREMA 800" model.

The project involved six years of preparation and now, after the 28, the 410 and the 20 (made in this order), is the turn of the 12 gauge which has been expected with great interest.


The Jorema 12 gauge is being built in three versions: game, pigeon and trap. The basic features are the same for all three models but the measurements, the barrels, the chokes and the stocks are of different proportions, carefully chosen to satisfy the various uses and needs.

The only mechanical difference are in the fore end release: in the game version it is the same as the small gauge guns while the pigeon and the trap version uses the forward push button release (as traditional side-by-side type).

One interesting feature consists in the interchangeable lugs

which can be replaced, if necessary after very prolonged use. The single trigger mechanism, an "A. & S." creation is non selective. The barrels, as all built by "Abbiatico & Salvinelli", are drawn from a forged nickel-chrome-molibdenum steel and welded in the traditional chopper pump system.

The newly designed locks are made with the screws and the pins exposed in the classical manner or, when required for very special engravings, without screws or pins protruding.



The only way to obtain what could even be considered the "perfect" shotgun for competition shooting would be to have a gun measured and built to suit your person. In the meantime you can do what most others do and remain the eternal optimist, you never know the next gun you pick up may be the smoothbore just made for you.

MAKING SWEET MUSIC!!

That likeable and well known shooting coach Joe. Allotta (also new Vice-President of Hawkesbury Gun Club) invited your correspondent into the Royal Aero (flying) club Bankstown a few weeks ago for a drop of "ginger-beer" . . . it was a hot day. On our way out of the club house, we stopped to admire the new fangled and fancy electronic poker machines. Fascinating gadgets to say the least. Both Joe and myself put a few 20 cents into the very biggest of the space age machines and pulled the handle. Nothing happened except it played some far out MUSIC. We did this almost 6 times each. Same result, nothing but music!!

Both walking out the door, I laughed and said to my shooting mate. "Never mind Joe, we can't win any money Pal, But we sure as hell can make sweet MUSIC!!"

Half way back to the Aero gun club another shooter almost out of breath came running after us calling . . . "Don't you want your money?"

What money? We both blurted together in complete disbelief! Holding out a hat full of 20 cents, he explained "Everytime a machine plays a tune of music . . . you win. When you have completed your playing, you just push the handle or button on the side and the loot falls down into the tray."

Now Joe and I would not wish to imply we are a pair of "hill billies" by any means . . . leastwise we hope not! But after that rather eventful and educational experience, we both think beyond any doubt we would have to go close to winning this months top prize for pure INNOCENCE!!

GUNS ARE MY BUSINESS:

In a lifetime associated with firearms and shooting one manages to gather both expensive and endless volumes and knowledge on the workings and the history of its many sporting activities. Over the past many years one of my most enduring passions, has been the collecting of all ages within the smooth-bores development. Couple this with trade background and one tends to be in the position to locate all manner of rare and interesting works worthy of collecting, that are prime examples of firearms development.

Two shotguns I managed to acquire in recent years are worthy examples of this transitional period into today's modern breech loading shotgun.

The first was the PIN FIRE gun. Of the intermediate period, before the breech loader was successfully married to the centre-fire cartridge, the reign of the pin-fire gun could be



said to be the briefest. But, it enjoyed a world wide popularity and remained in use long after the new found breech loading gun, had in fact rendered the PIN-FIRE obsolete, via the use of what was to become todays centre-fire cartridge. A few lay claim to the invention, but the French gunmaker LeFaucheux is attributed with the invention of the first SUCCESSFUL breechloader. Adopting the pin fire cartridge, he first sold it on the Continent in the eighteen forties. It attracted no attention until it was shown at the Great Exhibition of 1851 (London). The concept was introduced in England, shortly after, by Joseph Lang.

The second gun was the Needlegun: This shotgun, invented by Joseph Needham, (Patent No 184, Oct 1852) Needham's invention (see picture) with barrels fixed to the stock like a muzzle-loader, was in fact designed for chamber-loading with a CENTRAL-FIRE cartridge. The gun is cocket by swinging the finger tab towards the top of the barrel, and pulling the engraved chamber cover outwards in order to insert the cartridge. When the double block is closed into place, the gun is ready to fire (it has slide side safety). While it could be said to be an ingenious arm, in which the striking needle pierces through the outer envelope of the cartridge. It had some success for a time. However, in the transitional period, it was doomed by the quick advance of simpler and better systems. and the new centre-fire cartridge and the guns developed to fire them. For the creative gunmaker of this period it was a very frustrating age indeed, for in this period of time new ideas, new devices tumbled out of the inventors workshop one after another, in what can only be called a period rich in a bewildering succession of new improvements.

LIVE BIRD SHOOTING

The sport of live bird shooting vanished in the period before the second World War (with a few isolated cases best not mentioned). But as our sport had it's beginnings from this type of shooting, it is an interesting subject for historical purposes. We all know that it started on English greens when gentlemen in the 1700's shot pigeons released from under top hatsup until they were replaced with traps that threw glass-balls and later the clay target was to become the means by which our sport arrived at todays means of competition.

However, live bird shooting is still conducted in Spain, Italy and some rare locations in the U.S.A. It's a big money sport, and conducted on very professional lines. Big betting is conducted and some top shots make a full time living off their skill and the wagers and prize money that the sport is all about. For this reason, some makers are still producing high quality guns for these shooters. Most to some degree use side by side doubles, while others opt for special over/unders. Remington Arms U.S.A. produces a 3200 live-bird-model. These are without a doubt some of the finest and most prestigious guns sold in the U.S.A., most are hand finished to the buyers fit and needs and come with hefty price tags. One major change regarding the choice of guns, is that many shooters are going towards the Over/Unders, once the domain of the classic side by side double.

Perhaps the real classic in todays European live bird shooters choice, would be the Perazzi side by side model dho extra. This little wonder of gunsmiths hand finishing side lock will set you back \$44 580 with a gun case. While the live bird shooters are the real professionals in the gunning sports, they select the very best shotgun they can afford. When you're betting for the big money game, it's a case of second place is no place at all.

Before you head off to Mexico, Spain or Italy see Les Turner of Evans & Balfour.

NEW SIDE-LOCK DOUBLE:

My American connection reports that Browning, has introduced a side-lock double on the U.S. market. Side-lock doubles found on doubles from the top English makers of the expensive custom gun makers often in the \$17 000 to \$30 000 and beyond have made quite a few re appearances on Spanish and other made guns over the last few years. The new Browning is a true side-lock gun and not a box lock, with non-functional side-plates, but the real thing. The Browning B-ss Side-lock is steeped in tradition and is available in 12 gauge only with 234 inch chambers and either 26 or 28 inch barrels. On the Stateside market it retails for U.S. \$1,500 which should make it a very good seller with classic double devotees.

May we leave you this month with a quote from my "old mate" Murphy's-Law: Just when your scribe thought he was getting someplace, up pops Murphy the one and only optimist with this jem of an optimistic salute: "The light at the end of the tunnel, is the HEADLAMP of an oncoming TRAIN!"




The weather broke as shooting finished with steady rain falling for the rest of the day.

WINFIELD CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

Bendigo Clay Target Club's Saturday, October 1 shoot, ended the club's twelfth season of competitive shooting on the home grounds at Woodvale, since the club's move there in October 1971.

The day/night program of five events with the Winfield Champion of Champions shoot-off, which was contested by twenty-one Overall winners of championships conducted by the club over the previous 12 month period. This was the second staging of the event, which has already become one of the most prestigious events on the country Victorian shooting calendar. The shoot-off was over 40 mixed targets, representative in type of the events contested during the year.

After the preliminary shoot-off, four shooters had returned scores of four points-down, which qualified them to continue.

Hipwell was duly declared Winfield Champion of Champions 1983.

Next event was the 50 tgt Bill Coulson Memorial Double Barrel Championship, named to honour the memory of former club coach and stalwart, the late Bill Coulson. Only one possible 50/50 was returned by the 75 shooter — strong field, and accordingly, Russell Mark of Sebastopol was named the Overall & A grade winner. Leigh Knight, Ray Gamble, Terry Boucher and Graeme Thatcher all scored 49/50, and shot-off for second in A grade, with victory going to Boucher on the 71st target. Brian Halson and Terry Bannan took the prizes in B grade, after shooting-off to separate their 47/50 scorecards. C grade was won by Graeme Ruff (46/50) from Jody Lindrea, who defeated Jim Brown in a shoot-off after tying on 44/50.

Event three was 25 targets Grouped Meterage Handicap. Wayne Watts of Bendigo shot the only possible score, and was naturally the Overall winner, gaining a one metre penalty to his handicap, as well as the winner's trophy. The 11-15 metre group was won by Brian Halson with 24/25, the 16-20 metre division saw Jack Haw (30/31) win a shoot-off with Peter Akkermans, Ian Long and Ken Ball, after the four had scored 24/25 each. The backmarkers (21-25) group was won by Bernie Griffin on 25/27, after shooting-off with Ken Burton.

The Handicap was the final event in the year's Club Aggregate. Six nominated events during the year made up the shooters' scores, which were graded according to their "start of the year gradings". A Grade winner was Les Brown

The 20 tgts "Club Anniversary" Points Score Championship was a testing event to finish the "daylight" program with. Three shooters, Greg Hipwell, Alf James and Graeme Thatcher shot 60/60 possibles, and in the resultant shoot-off, Hipwell's 78/78 won Overall & A grade ahead of Thatcher's 77/78. Ron Traill (62/63) was best in B grade, with Frank Vella 59/63 second. Graeme Ruff (57/60) won C grade from Bob Lendon (69/72) who won a decider with Herb Nihill and Jim Brown.

The night program was just one event, the Victorian State Night Mixed Targets Championship, over 40 tgts — 10 DB, 10 SB, 10 Pts and 5 pr D/Rise. Best scores carded were the 3 pts-down 57/60s of Gary Went of Bacchus Marsh and Norm Lindrea of Bendigo. In the shoot-off, Went dropped a single barrel target and target from each pair of double rise, to the single double rise target of Lindrea. Lindrea was awarded the title with 70/74, ahead of Went's 68/74. B grade went to Frank Vella (56/60) from Brian Halson (53/60), with junior shooters Kenny Bell and Dean Woodhatch successful in C grade with scores of 53/60 and 51/60 respectively.

"NEXT Time You Don't Go Without ME"

Way, way out in the Western Division of NSW is a tiny spot called "Ivanhoe." Slightly south is an even smaller dot called "The Mossgeil Hall." On Saturday, September 3, 1983, the paddock of "Barwonnie" Stn on which the Mossgiel Hall stands was covered in cars, people and clay targets. Some 250 station folk had gathered for the Isolated Childrens Parents Association, Ivanhoe Branch's annual fund raising day — a Bush Clay Target Shoot and Picnic Day.

The grounds were slashed and prepared under the combined efforts of the Mossgiel Hall Committee and ICPA members. Griffith Clay Target Club members travelled 120

miles out west to provide traps and clays, and sweat of the brow to run the shoot — and "run" was the operative word!

The five members Keith Sim, Ian Evans & son Glen, Mark O'Mahoney and Bernice Britain were kept moving all day by the 66 competitors who shot the 45 target program. They were very grateful to Brian Salomon of Foster Gun Club, Victoria, for his able assistance, especially in the morning's practice rounds when he gave each squad a talk on safety and procedure for the day before starting.

Mossgiel lads, Terry Huntley and Brian Sheil's local knowledge was invaluable when it came to rounding up the shooters who fitted the names on the squad cards. Bernice Britain, carrying out the secretary's task in a 12ft Marque tent, had the same problem all day as shooters came in asking, "When do I shoot next?" Never having seen them before that morning, she was stumped. "Who are you?", she invariably replied.

While the shooting was in progress those ICPA members not directly involved were down at the Hall organising pony rides, foot races, and paint-ins for the children, trading tables, refreshments and barbecues, raffles and "Guess how many are in the jar" competitions. However, all this came to a sudden halt when Event Four was announced — 'Five targets Ladies event is next'.

OLYMPIC SHOOTING TEAM ELIMINATIONS

International Sub-Committee

Further to the notice in November C.T.S.N., we wanted to make a few things clear to shooters attending Downside for the eliminations on December 3, 4, and 5.

1. The eliminations at Downside are simply that, there are no

trophies, badges, or sashes.

2. There is no guarantee that shooters who are not members of the National Training Squad, or who do not have a world ranking, will be able to shoot the 400 targets. Only one layout is available, and time will probably preclude all shooters shooting 400 targets.

3. Skeet eliminations will not be held at Downside, but on a suitable date and venue to be advised.

Sport Australia Awards.

The 1983 Sport Australia Awards will be highlighted by the fierce competition for recognition between the outstanding performances produced by Australians this year.

The marathon performances by Robert de Castella, the ultra marathon effort of Cliff Young and the unique achievement of the Australia II crew represent rare levels of achievement. So, too, do the other world championship and world record performances that have liberally been dotted throughout the

Once again this year, famous Australian sportspeople will be honoured as presenters including the incomparable Margaret Court, Australia's quiet achiever of the 50's John Landy and Rugby Union's Nick (now Sir Nicholas) Shehadie.

In just four years, the Sport Australia Awards have established themselves in the eyes of the Australian Sporting community because they are based on the peer recognition

The Awards will be presented at a presentation dinner telecast nationally by the seven network from the Leonda Restaurant, Melbourne on December 13, 1983.

The Prime Minister, the Hon R. J. L. Hawke as patron of the confederation has accepted an invitation to present the principal awards.

TAA continues its sponsorship for the fourth successive year whilst the individual category sponsors — Adidas, Coca-Cola, Hardy's Wines, Rank Xerox, Sports Exacto, BHP

and Elders IXL remain unchanged. A new development for 1983 is reflected in the establishment of a classification known as "certificate of outstanding achievement." Nominees in this section, plus the non-winning nominees in the Awards, will receive a unique Sport Australia Awards certificate of outstanding achievement as recognition of the performance for which they were nominated.




The shooting sports are all well represented in the area with Rifle, Pistol, Sporting and Clay Target clubs all holding regular shoots. The ACTA affiliated Roma Gun Club has 43 registered shooters and shoots twice monthly. It has a three trap layout, 2 of which are lit, and expects to open its' first Skeet layout before Christmas.

The Recipients: The Roma High School at present has no assembly hall and over the past 3 years \$70 000 has been raised by the schools P and C association to start construction on a hall. Our members tend to focus on local projects when discussing charity because we have found they are better supported by the community.



The 200 target Commonwealth title and 200 target National Championship in both Trap and Skeet will be used to select the National Training Squad for 1984.


The shooters with the top six scores in Olympic Trap and the top four scores in I.S.U. Skeet over the 400 targets, will become members of the 1984 National Training Squad.


The Interstate Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match will be conducted in conjunction with the National Championship.


