





### FIRST SKEET NATIONALS GREAT SUCCESS

Despite the typical Melbourne "Spring" weather which ranged from about 12 degrees and rain, to 24 degrees and bright sun, the skeeties enjoyed the first National Championships series.

Melbourne Gun Club was a picture, not a blade of grass out of place when shooting got underway on Wednesday November 16. Junior shooter Andrew Noble from Alice Springs had the honour of firing the first shot in the Skeet Nationals.

The 50 Target City of Melbourne Skeet Championship was the first event. At the end of the 50, 18 possibles were squadded to fight out the title. This number soon fell away leaving Adrian Cousens, Mick Hehir, and Bob Buchan to vie for the overall.

It was Cousens who outstayed them shooting 148/148 to win the championship.

Buchan and Hehir topped AA and A grade. Bob Buchan's performance in this event is deserving of special mention, as he was the chairman of the organising committee for the Skeet Nationals, with most of the work and preparation falling on his shoulders. To shoot 135/136 with all his worries was a top effort.

Event 2, 50 Target National Skeet Carnival Championship. 140 entries, 13 possibles. The rain and cold got to many shooters, particularly those from warmer parts.

None could believe that the Melbourne temperature on the Monday prior to the Nationals was 31°.

The shoot-off was soon down to three, Barney Rooke, Paul Krumins, and Brian Thomson.

The lateness of the hour, and the weather conditions, prompted the shoot marshals to schedule the completion of the event for the Thursday morning.

It didn't go for long, Barney Rooke running 87/87 to win



Thursday, November 17, Event 3, 50 Target A.C.T.A. Skeet Championship. Weather still foul, cold and wet. 143 Shooters squadded, 9 possibles at 50 targets.

This one soon developed into a battle between Reg Clarke, Kevin Perkins, and New Zealand visitor, Merv Pratt. On and on they went until Reg Clarke won with 143/143. Kevin Perkins dropped his 143rd target to win AA grade.

Event 4, The All States Skeet Championship Over 50 Targets, wound up Thursday's program. Again we had nine possibles at the end of 50 targets. Adrian Cousens again showed his superiority by beating John Summers in the shoot off at 141/141.



The black clouds that brought the rain to make conditions difficult the first two days.

As the weather was so bad the organisers postponed the State Shoulder to Shoulder teams match until the Friday morning. This resulted in a win for South Australia on 245/250, by one target from the highly fancied Victorians, with Queensland a further target back in third place. The delighted South Australians were Bob Dower, Ray Kimber, Ben Murphy, Rod Dwyer and National Coaching Director Peter Quire.

With State Skeet rivalries settled the stage was set for the 100 Target Commonwealth Skeet Championship. Entries totalled 140, and at the half-way mark 13 shooters had the 50 straight. The second visit found many of them out however, as we were left with just Jim Briggs from Hobart, and Roley Palmer from Coffs Harbour, clean after the 100 Targets, both A graders. Cousens and Co. managed 99's and shot off for AA.

The shoot-off for overall was full of incident as first Jim Briggs and then Roley Palmer missed high two. On it went round to high one. Jim missed, Roley shot his and it was over.'

This was a very popular win as there is no harder working skeet shooter in New South Wales than Roley Palmer. Roley had shot 125/126 to win the championship.

Taking medals in the grades were AA grade, first Ian Hale, second Adrian Cousens, third John Summers. A grade first Jim Briggs, second Ray Melville, third Peter Dennison; B grade first Ken Holman, second John McGregor, third John Bale; C grade first Ian Sleigh, second Alex Baker, third Barry Howe.

Maree Rooke took the ladies division, Andrew Noble the Juniors and Mick Hehir the Veterans.







The weather was on the improve on Saturday and 159 entered for the 100 Target 14th Australian Skeet Championship. Twenty-one shooters were clean at halfway, all but three fell away in the second 50. We had a shoot-off for overall between Eugene Kavanagh, Adrian Cousens and Brian Bond.

On and on they went, the Melbourne Gun Club Committee Members had the barbecues ready to light for the wind up, should they light them, how much longer could the shoot off go on?

Brian Bond was the first to falter, letting target number 186 go by unscathed.

Both Cousens and Kavanagh were in top form, neither showing any sign of fatigue, their concentration was perfect. Eight shoot-off rounds completed, into the ninth, Kavanagh dropped his 309th a high 3.

The tension mounted, Cousens had to shoot High 3 to win, he did apparently without effort, to cap a marvellous series by winning the National Title. This was his second win in three years, having also won in Melbourne in 1981.

In the grades Eugene Kavanagh topped AA grade with 308/309, second Brian Bond, third John Summers. A grade first Ben Murphy, second Rob Rees, third Neal Dimmick. B grade went to Reg Moody, second Howard Warner, third Rex Orton.

C grade first Fred Thatcher, second Brian Halson, third Ian Sleigh. Karen Williams won the Ladies division with a good 95, Michael Elswyk the Juniors with a top 97, and Mick Hehir the Veterans with 96.


To indicate just how well Adrian Cousens performed throughout the Nationals I list his scores in all events.

In the four 50 Target events he shot 148/148, 62/63, 49/50 and 141/141 to win overall in two of the events.

He shot 50/50 for Victoria in the teams match, 109/111 in the Commonwealth Championship, and finished up with his 309/309 to win the National Title, a total of 868/872 for the four days or 99.54%. Little wonder he took out the overall high gun, the two man teams match with John Summers, was a member of the winning Melbourne Team in the five man club teams match, top qualifier in the All Australian Skeet Team and the five man team to compete in the U.S. in 1984.




The marathon shoot-off continues, Eugene Kavanagh on Station 3.

For winning the Champion of Champions Title over the 400 targets, Adrian received the Cec Herbert Perpetual High Gun Cup, the Beretta 680 Skeet Gun kindly donated by Winchester Australia, and the limited edition skeet belt buckle donated by Barney Rooke.

Andrew Noble from Alice Springs was the winner of the Bill Attwood Perpetual trophy for the Junior High Gun with 353/400. Karen Williams, Melbourne took out the Ringwood Regent and Nunawading Motor Inns Perpetual trophy for the Ladies High Gun with 370/400. Mick Hehir, Geelong, had a great series collecting the Ray Melville Perpetual Trophy for Veteran High Gun with the top score of 391/400.

A pleasing feature of the Skeet Nationals was that the 96 medals on offer for the six events were shared by 66 different shooters.

The success of the series was due in no small way to the tireless work of many people. This list included Organising Committee Chairman, Bob Buchan, Shoot Marshals, Peter Quire and Richard Dean, Kaye Woods and Jan Brunt in the office, Jim and Joan Scott, Bill Abbott, Rob Parker and Mark Holland Scoreboards, Robby McDonald cartridge distribution and Roy Holtfreter grading. Lindsay Baxter kept the traps in top shape all the week and the ladies in the canteen fed us all very well.

Special thanks are due to the Melbourne Gun Club ladies and Committee men for the great barbecue to wind up proceedings on the Saturday night.

A questionnaire was distributed among competitors at the Skeet Nationals. From the comments received, the majority of shooters thought that Wednesday to Saturday were the right days to schedule the Skeet Nationals (68%), 90% of those polled like the program format of  $4 \times 50$  target and  $2 \times 100$  target events. 73% favoured medals only for overall and grade trophies. 75% were in favour of sending a skeet team to the U.S. Shooters were evenly divided on the question of the nominations being too high, 43% thought they were O.K., 45% too high and 72% thought re-loaded cartridges should be allowed for all events at Skeet Nationals. 65% believed that the Skeet Nationals should not rotate around the States, but should be held in the centres of high skeet shooter population.

The 1984 Skeet Nationals will again be held at Melbourne Gun Club during the same period in November.

184 shooters competed at some stage during the 1983 Skeet Nationals, and a lot was learnt from this the first attempt.

# NEW SOUTH WALES I.S.U. SUB-COMMITTEE

At the annual general meeting of the N.S.W. Subcommittee held at Downside International Gun Club on Saturday, October 29th the committee accepted the following guidelines as the basis on which it would run in the future.

A few changes were made to the guidelines which were established last year, the main one being the increasing of the number of members of the state trench training squad. This was increased from six to eight shooters to accommodate members of the national training squad and also offer an incentive to interested trench shooters.

During the meeting the following office bearers and delegates were elected for 1984.

The success of the Trench and I.S.U. Skeet Training squads' recent trip to New Zealand was discussed during the annual meeting and it has been decided that a similar trip, not necessarily to New Zealand, will be investigated for 1984.

Venues for Trench and I.S.U. Skeet Training Squad Eliminations for 1984 have been set as follows — Taree Wingham — Trench and skeet — December 31st,

'83 and January 1st '84. N.S.W — Trench and skeet (State Carnival) — January

21st and 22nd. Griffith — Trench and skeet — May 12th and 13th. Downside — Trench and skeet — May 28th and 29th.

Wagga Wagga — Skeet only — September 15th and 16th. West Wyalong — Trench and Skeet — October 27th and 28th.

A.C.T. - Trench only - November 17th and 18th.

### STATE I.S.U. SUB-COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

- To be known as the New South Wales International Shooting Union Association Sub-Committee.
- 2. The Committee shall consist of eleven members.
- 3. One Delegate from each Club that has I.S.U. facilities. These Delegates to be elected annually, by their clubs and to be forwarded to the Secretary seven days before the Annual General Meeting.
- 4. Two Delegates may be elected annually, who are not members of the above clubs, but take an active interest in I.S.U. Shooting. These Delegates to be nominated by I.S.U. Shooters, and submitted in writing to the Secretary seven days before Annual General Meeting. All names submitted are subject to ballot at the Annual General Meeting.
- Other members of this committee shall be—
   (a) The N.S.W Coaching Director,
  - (b) A N.S.W.C.T.A. member nominated by that committee,
  - (c) N.S.W. member of A.C.T.A. on the National International Sub-Committee.

- (d) Training Squad Coach if not already a member of the Committee.
- 6. From the Delegates a Chairperson and one Vice Chairperson shall be elected annually. This election should take place as soon as possible after the Annual Meeting and all Delegates have equal voting rights.
- 7. The Chairperson may use his casting vote only in the event of a tied vote of the Delegates.
- 8. The Minute Secretary/Treasurer may be elected annually and elected from the Delegates or outside.
- The Annual General Meeting shall be held at the last Elimination Match for that year. A quorum shall be six members including minimum of four Club Delegates.
- The Sub-Committee shall meet a minimum of twice during the year. A quorum shall be four Delegates including minimum of three Club Delegates.
- All Delegates and I.S.U. Club Secretaries shall be advised in writing twenty one days before Annual General Meeting.
- All Delegates shall be advised in writing twenty one days before Committee Meetings.
- Copies of minutes of all meetings and financial statements shall be forwarded to all Delegates and the Secretary N.S.W.C.T.A. as soon as possible after such meeting.
- State Elimination rounds shall consist of one 200 target, Trench and Skeet, weekend at each I.S.U. Club per year, Six Trench and Six Skeet.
- 15. The N.S.W. I.S.U. Training Squad shall consist of eight Trench and six Skeet Shooters. Their selection will be their four top scores from Elimination rounds attended and will be the Training Squad for the following year.
- 16. Training Squad members shall attend training weekends when required, plus four open shoots (800 targets) per year including the State I.S.U. Carnival. This Carnival shall be compulsory for all Training Squad members except under very extreme circumstances.



# SHOOTING SHORTS

### How to Get Into the Media: Assistance for Publicity Officers:

Over the last year (1983) Shooting Shorts has offered help and assistance to the small number of Gun Club Publicity Officers, who have been in touch, with both material and ways to get each gun club into their local newspaper. For the person who has the task of club publicity officer, it must be noted they will often find their task very frustrative, to say the least.

Understanding the ways of the media is a very difficult task at the best of times. Therefore the roll of publicity officer should be taken on by a very determined person. First study the media.

Think about what you are trying to say, and to whom you are trying to say it. If at all possible, seek the advice of a friendly journalist on what is newsworthy within your organization and where to send your stories for the best coverage.

Build up contact with journalists who are interested in your cause. Someone who cares about a SUBJECT will write a much better coverage, than someone who is not INTERESTED or is hostile to what you are promoting.

Here is one suggestion for getting to know YOUR local news media. Say, for one month get members of your organization to monitor all items in your local paper which might be ideas for your stories.

See how the paper covers other sporting events each time its printed. Remember when you write about OUR sport your directing it out to the general public, who in most cases know little or nothing about CLAY TARGET SHOOTING.

In this case make it when possible a human interest article, i.e. Junior shooter wins local championship. Go into detail about his background, etc, etc in a way "Mr. Joe Average" who will be reading the paper can follow what your coverage is about within our sport.

Just as one local newspaper differs from another, so do the journalists who work for them. Don't sit back because you've made contact with one story, but try to present more every week. If you are going to try for frequent contact with the roundsmen from your paper, take them to lunch or for a drink, get to know them and take the time to brief them on your club.

Try and invite them to your club on shoot days and introduce them to your club officials. If you have an idea for a feature story, try the roundsman first, as they often

do news features or general articles as well as sporting news.

Most local papers run advertising supplements and you might be able to suggest a topic for same. If you can indicate to your local paper where there is interest and where there might be advertising, you can get together a number of your clubs sponsors and put together a very good supplement on your club and Clay Target Shooting.

To date Shooting Shorts has had **SEVEN** publicity officers contact us over the last 12 months, and we in turn have given each assistance to gain more coverage within the pages of THEIR local papers, plus ideas and formats that would get them started. We hope this number will grow right across Australia in 1984.

Lastly at the risk of repeating myself: If you feel your cause has been not given the best of treatment by the media, don't give up. If you believe in something, fight for it. Organize your members to write to the paper, putting their point of view. **EDITORS** and reporters take a lot of notice of public reaction.

The more reaction on a subject the more IMPRESSED they are. They will never know what you want to hear, or what you have to say, if you don't keep presenting facts and more facts about your club.

It must also be noted, a good publicity officer needs tact, ENTHUSIASM, a clear writing style, efficiently well set out details on our sport and a good deal of OPTIMISM. If at first you don't get your material into your local paper . . . swallow your disappointment . . . and keep trying.

### For The Tyro: Understanding Your Shotgun: Assistance for the New Shooter:

\* SHOTGUN GAUGE: The term "gauge", as it refers to guns and cartridges, is an archaic one. It derives from the number of round balls needed to make a pound. For example, a 12-gauge gun has a bore which, if it had no choke, would accept one round ball, twelve of which would weigh a pound (Imperial-weight). Although this outmoded means of measurement is no longer applied in marketing practice, it has remained in use.

Actually, because of the gun's CHOKE, SOLID BALLS for a 12-gauge gun weigh only one once, or sixteen to the pound. Incidentally, the term "bore", synonymous with gauge, is used mostly by British gunners.

In using gauge as an indication of measurement, the smaller the number, the bigger the gauge. In other words, 12-gauge guns have larger diameter barrels than 16-gauge guns, 16's are larger than 20's, etc.

There is however one exception: The .410 bore refers to the actual barrel diameter, .410 inch; being a relatively latecomer to the shotgun group, it got by the older nomenclature.

\* GUN BARRELS: Modern shotgums are equipped with 26, 28, 30, and 32-inch barrels, in 12 gauge (or new metric). Smaller gauges usually come in 26-inch and 28-inch lengths. There is a mistaken notion that the reason why trapshooters have guns with barrels longer than skeet shooters, is because they shoot harder, or they keep a denser pattern for a longer period of time; This is not so.

Let us back track a bit. A guns barrel has to be long enough to allow complete combustion of the cartridges powder charge. Generally, when the shot charge has moved about twenty inches of the barrel length, combustion has been completed (with smokeless powder as far as velocities are concerned); therefore, the trap gun's thirty-inch barrels has no advantage over a skeet gun's twenty-six or twenty-seven inch barrels.


Length of barrel has little effect on velocity. Skeet barrels are shorter because shorter barrels make for faster gun-swinging at passing skeet-targets.

On the other hand, the trap barrels longer length, with more weight out front, steadies the swing and favours a more accurate point and lead for the longer-range, and more deliberate style of gun POINTING, which is usually needed when shooting at predominantly going-away targets.

Sport and recreation were important in the early Australian colonies, almost from our beginnings. In times when the horse was essential to man's mobility, equestrian and shooting sports were predominate.





### EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

This letter is my personal opinion as a member and a competitor of Clay Target Shooting.

I know that this is a controversial matter, but I've felt very strongly against the Percentage Handicap System and the present Handicapping System ever since each was introduced.

If we are to encourage Clay Target Shooting to foster and grow, which I feel should be the ambition of each and everyone of us; then we must encourage clubs and competitors to shoot Handicap events.

Twelve to fifteen years ago, programs at club shoots very rarely had more than one Championship event, the rest of the program, in most cases were Handicap events. The present programs are based on Championships and common mark events, which are to me only aimed at one section of ACTA Members, the semi-professional shooter.

Let's all be truthful with ourselves for a moment and think back to the first few shoots we each attended, shooting in most cases from 12 yards or 11 metres. After a time each of us saw a TOP SHOT of the particular time, competing at a shoot, shooting off 27 yards or 25 metres. I'm quite sure no one can truthfully say that the thought didn't enter their head; "Boy! I hope I can get back there and shoot like that sometime".

I know it has been my ambition to make 25 metres ever since I first competed at a shoot in 1964. I'm not there yet, but I'm still trying.

We must have a Handicap System that is as fair as possible to each and everyone of us. The Percentage System was a "FLOP" because it was so open to abuse. The only way a percentage system could work would be if we were big enough for full Computerisation and had someone strong enough to discard all obvious low scores. Therefore to me a percentage system is only a dream as far as we are concerned for many, many years to come.

The present system is a "FLOP" because:

- Clubs are not shooting Handicap events and therefore new members are leaving our sport because they cannot compete off 15 metres.
- No encouragement whatsoever to new shooters.
- 3. The complete inequality of the present system i.e., A shooter can go to a club and win SECOND place in a Handicap event against seven or eight competitors and get a Metre. Another shooter can go to the Nationals and win the Grand Australian Handicap against 500 or 600 shooters and still only get a metre. Can anyone truthfully say this is an equitable system.
- 4. I know some clubs are shooting what are called Club Handicaps and are being encouraged to do so. There is nowhere in the ACTA Rules that this practice is allowed. Therefore all clubs who follow this practice are breaking the ACTA Rules, also all shooters who compete in these events are breaking the Rules. If this practice is allowed to continue then why have any Rules, which leads on to why have an Association.
- 5. I may be wrong but as I understand the situation, if a club runs a Club Handicap, then as it is not bound by ACTA Shooting Rules, the present ACTA Insurance Policy would not be applicable to anyone hurt in an accident whilst that Event was being conducted. I can just imagine a smart Solicitor rubbing his hands in glee to get the chance to defend an Insurance

Company against a claim lodged by a shooter due to an accident during the shooting of an event not bound by the ACTA Rules.

An alternative system that I feel could and would work is as follows:—

- 1. When a shooter accumulates \$100 in cash or trophy values, he or she is Handicapped 1 metre.
- A shooter winning \$200 or more in any one event is Handicapped 2 metres.
- All cash and trophies won from Handicap marks to be entered on the shooters card for accumulation. Trophy values to be at Club cost price.
- Accumulation not to include, front marker, back marker, ladies, junior or veterans trophies.
- New shooters to start on 11 metres and be assessed by the Club Committee after their first 50 targets.
- No inward movement except on re-registration if requested and then only if no Handicap was applied during the year.
- 7. All accumulated moneys to be carried forward to new cards after re-registration by club secretaries.

To further simplify the Rules, I would suggest that Grading be incorporated with the above Handicap System.

11 to 14 metres = C Grade

15 to 18 metres = B Grade

19 to 22 metres = A Grade

23 to 25 metres = AA Grade

Rule 71 (f) to still apply.

By doing the above we would delete the 14 metre A Grade shooter and even one instance I have seen of 21 metres, C Grade.

If this proposed system was adopted in full, we could delete quite a few of the existing Rules. Club secretaries jobs would be very much simplified and we could do away with Club Handicappers, as handicapping would be automatic, once \$100 had accumulated on a shooters card and his grade would be an automatic follow on of his Handicap.

The Nationals Handicapper would only be required to check Cards of nominating shooters, then enter the winnings of all placegetters for the Grand Australian Handicap on relevant cards, therefore cutting a major cost on the Nationals Budget.

The present Handicapping System is by far the most controversial matter in Clay Target Shooting that I know of. On the shooters grape vine I've heard of complaints Australia wide.

Therefore shooters if your verbal complaints around the tracks are genuine and you are not satisfied with the present Handicapping System then "Put your pen where your mouth is" and write to me and let me know your genuine feelings regarding this suggestion.

It would only take 5 minutes of your time, a stamp and an envelope, to give this suggestion your support.

I don't care if you come from Cairns, Warrnambool, Sydney, Perth or anywhere in between, if you disagree with the present Handicapping System and feel the proposed system would be better, then write to me.

Anyone who has ever tried to convince a Committee that a system is wrong, will fully realize that verbal evidence is useless and to get anywhere at all a person must have written backing and an alternative proposal to put forward.

As far as I'm concerned, if you feel as I do, and cannot make the effort of writing to me, then I'm afraid you will only have one person to blame, yourself.



# SINGLE BARREL'S THE SHOT by Tom Gannon

Single barrel shooting lowers the cost to competitors. It also saves clubs from costly double barrel shoot-offs.

This is the opinion of Mr Jock Wilson, the ACTA's first president.

Mr Wilson, of Almurta, near Korumburra (V) was president from 1937 to 1957.

A trip to America in the 50s turned him into an advocate of single barrel shooting.

He says: "Double rise is the only double barrel event that the Yanks shoot".

In America Mr Wilson saw a 26-year-old Cuban woman win an event with 197 straight — single barrel.

"Her personal best was about 1000.

"When I returned to Australia I told our best shot, the late Newton Thomas, about her.

"Newton was not greatly impressed because in America the target is thrown only 22% degrees each side of a straight line.

"In Australia we shoot in twice as wide an arc, with the extreme left or extreme right much harder to hit.

"I offered to bet Newton 1000 pounds that the Cuban girl would outshoot him. But ICI, for whom Newton worked, never accepted the challenge."

Mr Wilson brought back from America the Ithaca gun company's formula for clay targets that broke if hit by one pellet.

"I gave it to ICI; but I do not know what was the outcome.

"ICI went out of target making. Today Australian target manufacturers produce a clay that does not break despite three or four pellet holes."

### Trench

Trench shooting was unknown in Australia until the '56 Olympics.

Three years before the Games in Melbourne, at his expense, Mr Wilson went to Stockholm where the president and secretary of the World Shooting Organisation lived.

"The president and secretary went to great lengths to stress that competitors should be amateurs.

"For that reason, Australia excluded its best two shots, Newton Thomas and Fred Burns because they worked for ICI.

"However, a lot of competitors were not true amateurs.

"Italy ran first and third. A Russian was second.

"Every day for two months before the Games I was out at the Laverton air base where the lay-out was installed.

"Gosh, I was relieved when it was over.

"Everything went well.

"The only disappointment was that not a soul said thank you.

"Nevertheless, there was the satisfaction of having tackled something new, and done it well."

### New clubs

In Mr Wilson's 20 years as president he opened 42 clubs in the eastern states.

"I was given the honor of firing the first shot — and made sure that I never missed the first official target.

"Not that I was a champion shot, but I had my pride.

"However, I had to pull the second barrel to break the target at the opening of the Geelong club, where targets fly out over the sea."

Mr Wilson remembers Australia's first car shoot at Rainbow. "It was 114° in the shade — and there was no shade! Hay later became THE place for car shoots."

### Horse racing

By the 50s, Mr Wilson was better known as a racehorse owner than as ACTA president. His horses, mostly jumpers, won over 200 races.

He was at an outback Queensland town for a carnival weekend trap shoot when the racing club president asked him to act as a steward because the other steward was sick.

"Come the day of the meeting, the other steward was too drunk to officiate, and I had to deal with a protest by the rider of the second horse against the first.

"The rider claimed that the winner went inside a peg around the back of the course.

"We drove around to the peg where it was evident that EVERY runner had gone inside the peg.

"The protest was dismissed.

"At the same meeting there was a close finish in the mile race for Grass Fed horses.

"The judge — he was drunk, too — couldn't separate them and yelled: 'Go around again, you bastards!'

"Around they went again. The second time they came in like Brown's cows."

### V.C.T.A. NORTH WEST ZONE CARNIVAL

On the 5th and 6th of November the North West Zone conducted its fourth annual trap carnival.

The venue for the weekend's shooting was the Jeparit Gun Club. The grounds were in great condition and the near ripe barley crop in front of the trap houses, which is owned by the club, made an excellent backdrop for black targets as they left the traps.

Congratulations must go to the club management, members and ladies for their excellent work in both the kitchen and office — special thanks to Frank and Margaret Pitt.

Weather conditions over the weekend were warm although Sunday was overcast. Both days were windy and scores were generally low. Of the 58 shooters who attended, the highest break shot over the two days was only 81, by Graeme Durbridge of Bordertown.

The zone again made \$500 available to be shared amongst the top five shooters over the N.W. # TEST REPORT:

# INCHESTER DIAMOND GRADE TRAP STORY & PHOTOS BY BOB THRUSTON

IF YOU ARE LOOKING FOR "INNOVATIVE" FEATURES IN YOUR NEXT TOURNAMENT GUN, YOU'LL WANT TO TAKE A CLOSE LOOK AT THIS OFFERING.

In our March 1982 issue, I promised A/S readers are indepth test of Winchester's exciting line of Diamond Grade trap and skeet guns, a line now being imported into the U.S.A. Our selected test gun is a handsome 30" Diamond Grade Trap, the basic over and under about which the entire Diamond Grade tournament line is tailored. Trapshooters will find they can choose between 30" and 32" barrel lengths, plus a choice of Monte Carlo or straight stocks. Skeet buffs may select from 27" 12 gauge, a gun with barrel cuts at the muzzle end, or any of 20, 28, or .410 models. Both the trap and the skeet guns feature a number of clever factory "extras", such as anatomically designed triggers and barrels offered with laser set points of impact. Additionally, innovative stock designs are part of the Diamond Grade factory package. These stocks will either please a number of America's discriminating tournament shooters or be a cause of serious complaint to a number of others. As we see it, this stock design is not intended to please everyone. However, with Olin only planning to bring some 2,000 units into the U.S. for each of the next few years, they don't have to come to market with a "compromise" offering. The new Diamond Grade tournament line is intended for shooters who know what they want. If you are looking for custom proven tournament features - features already being used by some of the better shooters in America, then you'll have to consider looking at this product. However, if you are left-handed, we'll save you a trip to your local sports store. With its present stock conformation, this import is suitable only for right-handed shooters. I have been assured that if demand is present for the gun from southpaws, then Winchester will tune-up their Geiger tracing machines and start offering left-handed stocks accordingly. Our bet is this won't be too long. This gun is a winner, and should create quite a demand. It will be in short supply for the next few years, we'll estimate.

### TECHNICALLY SPEAKING . . .

The fundamental design is based upon improvements to the Winchester 101, a veteran seller for the past nine years. The 101 was first introduced to the American market in 1963. The maker of the gun is Olin Kodenshia Company Ltd., of Japan. The Diamond Grade line itself is already generating sales in Europe. Initial shipments were made in September of 1981. The U.K. market

received the earliest guns, quickly followed by Germany, Scandinavia, Italy and France. Some 1,000 units were delivered to Europe, allowing Winchester to receive market feedback at the 1981 Game Show in England. In 1982, the Diamond Grade gun line debuted in the U.S. at the Shooting, Hunting, Outdoor Trade & Conference Show in Atlanta, Georgia in January. It was also heavily promoted at the 1982 Nuremburg Show in Germany in March of that year. With both the European and American markets offering only a few thousand guns, early demand worldwide has helped to keep surplus scarce. Not really a bad business situation in these economic times.

### THE WINCHESTER 101

What can we say about the predecessor 101? It kicked like hell! It was a durable tool, and sold fairly consistently, but not in great number to the knowledgeable tournament crowd. If you were into punitive trap or skeet — endless weekends of jousting with recoil, then you avoided the 101 like a case of herpes. How does the Diamond Grade Trap rate in the record department? Not too shabby at all! In fact, we'll state that it not only offers less apparent recoil than the Model 101, but also improved handling characteristics as well.

### INNOVATIVE STOCK DESIGN OFFERED

Closely checking our trap O/U demo, one is immediately conscious of a slight cast-off to the right. Cast is present to throw recoil away from a right-handed shooter's face. There is also an added "twist" outward at the toe of the pad. The idea is "old hat" in Europe, but innovative to many American shooters. The gun will mount to the shoulder without the toe of the pad sticking into the shooter's chest. Designed for easy and quick mounting, the pad of the Diamond Grade Trap gun fits quite comfortably into the muscle area of the shoulder. A shooter's shoulder muscle rolls towards the collar bone when the gun is raised to the firing position. The idea is to fit the pad into the slight hollow between the collar bone and the shoulder joint. Recoil is absorbed on the tensed shoulder muscle directly. The toe out position of the Pachmayr pad on our test gun never pressed against my chest or my collar bone, a problem I have always had in mounting straight stocks. Long ago I had my own trap gun adjusted similarly to the dimensions of our test guns. If you are a student of the "old school", a shooter who really believes a straight stock is only for trapshooting, then you won't like this stock design. For the rest of you, this type of stock design has already proved itself to

the top Italian and English shooting champions, plus a darn lot of our American greats who don't advertise the fact.

Winchester has added additional square inches to the pad surface itself - that portion which fits against the shooter's shoulder. The reason? More surface area to distribute recoil. The pad on our test model was quite familiar. It is Pachmayr's "Old English" model, a 3/4" pad with a 1/4" black spacer. The name on the pad says Winchester - just a bit of private label camouflage, of course. Notably, this pad has rounded edges and no serrations on the shoulder mounting surface. The pad is flat. It really is an excellent choice for the classical lines of the Diamond Grade. The pad itself is placed on the stock to create only about 3/4" of down-pitch. I measured this a couple of times to be sure. With the gun offering a unique stepped rib, the shooter finds himself standing more erect, placing his head in a more upright position. Consequently, he does not need a gun with typical two to three inches of down-pitch. I found this gun traced quickly. It will make you shoot a bit faster than normal, all the result of the higher rib and higher stock configuration. (Axiom: When raising the rib — you must raise the stock as well.) Just how high is the stock raised, you wonder? Drop on the forward part of the Monte Carlo stock of our test gun measured 1.7/16". The back of the Monte Carlo (not the heel pad) measured 1-5/16" creating a slight slope, back to front on the comb.

### STOCKS FACTORY DRILLED FOR A RECORD UNIT


All stocks on the Diamond Grade series of tournament guns are factory drilled to accept a recoil reducer. According to Larry Larson, Director of Gun Design and Research for Winchester, a survey of the American market indicated the preparation for a reducer installation would assist American gun sales. It will certainly aid the shooter. Winchester's motivation was to drill a hole "exactly" parallel to the bore of the barrel, to be sure no amateur gunsmith would drill it differently, thereby defeating their best efforts at eliminating apparent recoil on the new gun design. Good thinking, we say!

### A RIB DESIGN TO ADMIRE

One trait common to all truly fine tournament guns is a rib design that facilitates easy sighting. Poor rib mechanics can ruin an otherwise excellent gun. On our test model, the rib is quite notable. It is a solid, completely silver-soldered rib, that begins as a smooth, nonmatted ramp at the breech end of the barrel. It gradually climbs for 7-3/4", then is stepped up to an even 1/2" above the barrel. The rib runs the entire length of the barrel. The top is cross-hatched with parallel cuts at right angle to the rib. Down the centre of the rib is a thin line. The beginning rib width is 7/16" at the stepped ramp. From here it handsomely narrows to just "" at the muzzle. The rib height that began 1/2" at the ramp has now dropped to 3/8". This rib design is excellent; it can't be faulted. Getting more technical, it is supported on the upper barrel by posts on either side of six vents, each 2-5/8" wide. This ventilated rib is solid . . . it should stand up to abuse quite well.

### WINCHOKE SYSTEM ON BOTTOM BARREL!

Our test gun would make an ideal trap doubles gun, although we didn't test it on the twins. Measurement of the individual bore for both barrels was .733. The lower barrel is Winchoked (screw-in choke tubes for the uninitiated). The removable choke system is patented by Winchester, but copied worldwide in the tournament and field aftermarket. Each gun comes with four tubes:



Modified, Improved Modified, Full and Extra-Full. We shot the gun with the Modified tube on the bottom barrel and enjoyed excellent results on 16 yard targets, shooting at 4,000 foot elevation on a very windy day. Specifically, this Winchoke (Modified) offered 11 points of constriction (.722). It was a mite open for our choice in a modified boring. The top barrel measured .695 thousandths (38 points of constriction). It was a tight full-choke by any standard. Unfortunately, we didn't have the weather conditions to do proper pattern testing. However, we recall reading literature stating that Winchester sets exacting impact points for all their Japanese-made rifles and shotguns, using modern laser technology. We saw no evidence that this gun would shoot anything but excellently in the hands of any experienced shot. Again, two barrel lengths are offered - 30" and 32". We'd like to test the 27-1/2" skeet gun on live pigeons, provided we could get Winchokes on both barrels - a pending option we expect to see announced in January of 1983 at the Dallas, Texas S.H.O.T. Show.

### **BASIC DESIGN & SPECIFICATIONS**

The basic gun is a box-lock design weighting just about nine pounds. Overall length with 30" barrels measured 47-1/2". Length of pull was 14-1/2". The pistol grip would be considered a three-quarter grip of about 2-3/4" size. Notably, the comb is positioned so that if you have a tendency to roll your grip to the high side, not staying beneath the gun, you are still in good shape. In other


words, your hand will not run into the comb. Somebody did their homework in this regard.

The safety is of the thumb-operated type, a la venerable 101. Styling of the Diamond Grade Trap finds the wood a high quality semi-fancy Black American walnut. Our test gun offered excellent feathering of the grain on both sides of the stock and about the forend. Speaking of the forend, it is of somewhat rakish design, a semi-schnaubel type that narrows at the muzzle end. It measures about  $10 \cdot 1/2$ ", longer than on the 101. Checkering is excellent, a modified sharp diamond pattern of medium lines per measured inch. The attention to detail on our gun was obvious. Wood-to-metal fit was absolutely the finest seen on any production gun tested this year.

### BARREL ... ENGRAVING ... TRIGGER SYSTEM

The barrels of the Diamond Grade Trap are deeply blued. A small white bead is set exactly 14-3/8" from the muzzle. A larger Bradley-type bead is on the end of the ventilated rib. The receiver is a soft, silver-grey. It sports conservative floral engraving on both sides of the receiver and underneath. A raised and accented diamond appears on either receiver side. Underneath the receiver, about two inches forward of the trigger guard, an engraved "Diamond Grade" is written in nice looking scroll. The name Diamond Grade carries a Winchester tradition of many years' heritage. Honoring another age, two black ebony diamonds are located in the stock of the

wood. The first is on the top, in the centre of the pistol grip. The second is located in the grip cap area. There is no grip cap. The only flourish added to this gun is its gold trigger — an "anatomical" trigger. It is perhaps the gun's most distinctive trait.

Gun designer Larry Larson explained the design of the Diamond Grade trigger to me in January of 1982 —

"We knew we wanted an inertia-type trigger, and were very pleased with the success of the 101 trigger system. We used it exactly as it was perfected in the Diamond Grade line. It offers the endurance and consistency required of a tournament quality trigger. Our repair history and shooter comments on the 101 system were excellent."

Larson then explained the anatomical trigger design—
"We shaped the trigger to assist the trigger finger in
gaining a 'feel' for shooting. This design puts your finger
in the most comfortable place possible. It can't slip on
the trigger, and is ideal for the angle of pull. We believe
the final touch to our debut effort in offering a high
quality factory tournament line is encompassed in this
trigger. Most trigger systems are flawed in their concept.
This unique design will create consistent pulls time after
time—the same poundage applied with each firing."

There you have it, the first of a new breed of Winchesters. A/S rates the Diamond Grade Trap an impressive entry in the highly competitive tournament market.





Price Range: Approximately \$1,500 for the O/U. Gun is available as a single barrel trap with an unsingle high rib, plus a combination trap set. Monte Carlo or standard stocks. Complete four gauge skeet version offered with unique muzzle vents. Can be expected to appear in 1983 with Winchokes available for both barrels. Combo trap set should be available at approximately \$2,000 retail, perhaps slightly higher. Unsingle trap can be purchased separately at price similar to O/U.




