Things are hotting up again for the Olympic Discipline shooters. The Australian team of Ellis, Rumbel, Boyd, Hale, Crikis and Thomson, flies to Christchurch early in February to compete in the South Pacific Regional Championships. Soon after their return they line up at Melbourne Gun Club for our Olympic Discipline Nationals starting February 24. Further interest is added to these Championships with the news that Canadian Susan Nattrass, former Women's World Champion in Olympic Trap is making the trip to compete. Susan will add more than a little glamour to these Championships.

The line-up is a top one with Matt Dryke, Dan Carlisle, and Dean Clark from the U.S., possibly current World Champion in trap John Primrose from Canada, and Commonwealth Games gold medalist John Woolley expected back in Australia at any time.

National Coaching Director Peter Quire has been appointed Coach of the Olympic Shooting Team to compete at Los Angeles in July/August. Peter Anderson is Section Manager, and along with Peter Quire will have charge of the shooting team of ten competitors.

The make-up of the team will not be known before early March, when nominations for the team from the Australian Shooting Association will be put before a meeting of the Olympic Federation's Justification Commission.

A new Insurance cover for A.C.T.A. registered shooters and affiliated clubs came into effect on January 1. For the first time, voluntary workers at clubs are covered under the scheme which has been arranged through Confederation of Australian Sport Insurance Pty Ltd. AROUND THE SHOOTING RANGES IN GYMPIE

You have all read Laurie Connors "Around The Traps" in the C.T.S.N., well I am writing to tell of my experiences "Around The Shooting Ranges In Gympie".

On the weekend of 19th and 20th November 1983 I was invited by the Gympie Gun Club members to attend the 5th Annual Combined Shooting Sports Inter-club Shoot at Gympie.

This annual event is sponsored by the Mayor of Gympie, Mr. Mick Vernados, who has a Perpetual Trophy for the winning team plus individual team member trophies.

This is an inter-club shoot between the Gympie Clubs of — Field & Game, Sporting Shooters, Pistol Club (including Police Pistol Shooting), Small Bore, Big Bore, Army, and Gun Club.

Each of the clubs had a team of four making 32 team members plus independents from various clubs, these totalled 11. Apart from myself the other outside visitors were Ann Bugden from the Brisbane Small Bore Club, and Mr. R. Peterson from Bundaberg Pistol Club.

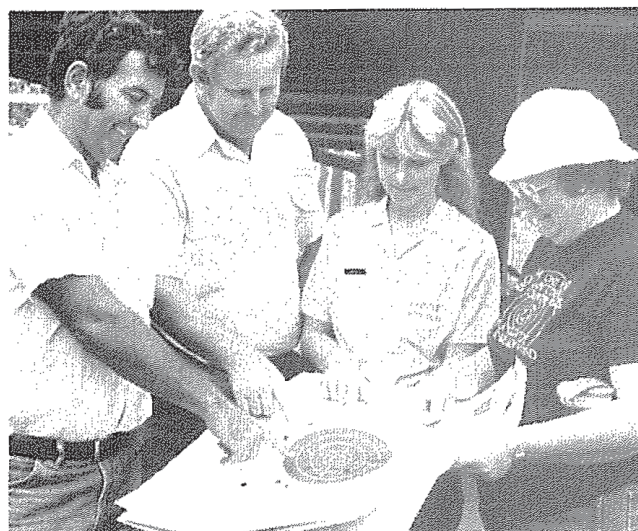
All competitors shot at the Field and Game Range on Saturday afternoon the 19th, we each shot at 20 targets. I had never seen this type of shooting before and found it quite interesting. Field & Game members, Mike Fraser, Ray Fraser and Ray Cavanagh organised the shooters on this range. There was a High Gun trophy for the best score not being a member. This led to a shoot off between Bill Stolberg and Ross Chapman, both clay target shooters, and M. Bone of the Pistol Club, with Bill Stolberg emerging the winner.

We were all issued with a shooting number and a time schedule for Sunday 20th. I was paired with Ross Chapman and we commenced at the Sporting Shooters range at 8.00 am, although Ross and I were late due to having difficulty finding the range, however I must take this opportunity to thank Ross for showing me parts of Gympie I had never seen before. Anyway we shot with .22 rifles with scopes 5 shots at each of the following silhouettes — Chickens at 40 mts, Pigs at 60 mts, Turkeys at 75 mts, Rams at 100 mts. Geoff Pronger and Marg Andrews were the members organising the shooters while we were there.

Next we went to the Pistol Club where we shot .22 pistols at 25 mts at targets. 4 by 5 shot rounds at various time allowances. Then we shot in the Police match with .38 pistols at figures of man again 4 by five rounds at various times. Steve Woodley, Reg Collins, Ann Bateman and Rob Lawson were the members looking after this venue.

Then we went to the Small Bore club where we shot .22 target rifles 50 mts, again we shot 20 rounds in a specified time. From my experience of this shooting, not having shot this way before, would have to be the most uncomfortable shooting of them all. Gwen Skyring and Bob Beard were looking after the shooters at this venue.

From Small Bore we moved to the Big Bore, where we again fired 20 rounds with 308 target rifles 600 yds away. By this time with the rifle shooting, I began to feel like a contortionist, with no feeling left in my left arm due to lack of circulation. Rex Hoffman and Pearce Jackson provided me with enough encouragement to continue at this range, and apart from perhaps upsetting an odd serious shooter with my laughter at some comments from my partner Ross, I did enjoy it.

When all competitors had finished shooting at the Big Bore range we then all assembled at the Army Range, where we used S.L.R. 308 calibre semi-automatic rifles over 200 mts. W.O.2 Doug Austin of the 3rd Platoon A Co. 9A.Q.R. who is the Range Safety Officer with fellow assistants Sgt Kopp and Sgt Knight. After giving us all instructions on safety and how to use the firearm we then fired 20 rounds at silhouettes at different times and positions. This proved too much for me, I had one army fellow putting my safety on and off, and when it came to the squat position they had to hold me up, but the kneel on one leg beat me altogether.

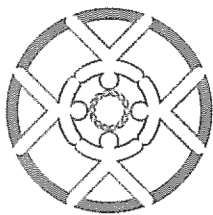

MASTERS GAMES

The Masters Games are for mature men and women whose lifestyle includes the continuation of competitive sport.

The Games celebrate the quality of participation and excellence of performance and provide opportunity for continuing competition worldwide.

The inaugural Masters Games will take place August 7-25, 1985 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

THE FUNDAMENTAL FEATURES OF THE MASTERS GAMES

The Masters Games have been created to:

1. Promote "Sport for Life".
2. Provide long term goals for continuing motivation in sport.
3. Offer broadly based participation in international, multi-sports rather than narrowly selected elite competition only.
4. Encourage mature people from all around the world to take part in sport regardless of sex, race, religion, or age.
5. Be open to either amateur or professional sports people.
6. Encourage women to consider life-long competition in sport.
7. Provide inspiration, by example, to the youth of the world showing that sports competition at a high level can and does continue throughout life.
8. Bring together once every four years in a different city around the world mature sports people who aspire to real athletic competition.

The Masters Games are vastly different from other festivals of sport operating on a quadrennial cycle.

- All competitors will participate as individuals.
- There will be no national teams or squads or official representatives of nations.
- In team events, many teams may be accepted from any one country.
- All participants will compete in the uniform of their sport — not in national colours.
- The games will be held every four years to allow participants to compete in different age classifications in succeeding Games.
- Cities desiring to host the Games must be able to provide suitable existing facilities, this will eliminate the requirements of huge capital costs in new buildings.
- Participants and their families or accompanying friends will be provided with a range of accommodation options from which they will choose housing appropriate to their needs and budget. No new or massive village is required.
- They are self funded as a free enterprise undertaking although there is provision for some government support.

- The ceremonies and cultural opportunities accompanying the Games will be especially designed to meet the needs and wishes of the participants.
- The list of sports included in the Masters Games is not static but could change to reflect the development of Masters Competition.

Athletes competing in the Masters Games are different from competitors in other games, for example, they will:

- Be responsible for their own travel costs.
- Select and pay for the type of accommodation desired.
- Pay a nominal registration entry fee.

The Masters Athletes will receive special package deals for flights and accommodation, and will be able to take advantage of the Games to combine vacation and/or business travel.

WHAT IS A "MASTER"?

Many different terms have been used to define a "Master", most often "senior" or "veteran" athlete has become most popular. In the context of the Masters Games, the term applies to all participants, male and female, who meet the minimum age requirements for inclusion in the mature divisions of their respective sports.

Most often this minimum is 35 years for women and 40 years for men. However, in some sports such as swimming, in which open competition is quite often the preserve of the very young, the minimum eligibility begins at age 25. Many sports have age-based classifications or categories rising in 5 or 10 year intervals.

While a pre-determined level of skill is not a mandatory requirement of participation many Masters are highly skilled. Some will have been international champions and others might have been but for one reason or another did not make it to the top. Still more compete solely for the pleasure of beating their age. Some are latecomers to their sport. Whatever the reason they compete, there will be champions among Masters in the Masters Games.

To be eligible for the Games as Masters, participants must:

- Agree to the eligibility and competition rules set by the specific International Sport Federation and its affiliated national host sport federation.
- Agree to abide by the principles and regulations established by the Masters Games.
- Meet the basic requirement for participation, which is proof of age.

THE SPORT PROGRAM

SPORTS:

The following sports have accepted invitations to be part of the 1985 program:

Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Canoeing, Cricket, Cycling, Diving, Equestrian, Fencing, Ice Hockey, Orienteering, Racquetball, Rowing, Sailing, Shooting, Squash, Swimming, Synchronized Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Waterskiing, Ten-Pin Bowling.

The final program will show a heavy emphasis on lifetime individual sports; include non-Olympic and Olympic events; and be one which can be sustained in high standard facilities.

MATCHPLAY TRAPSHOOTING IS A KNOCK-OUT!

Two shooters locked in head-to-head contest is the scenario for an exciting new competition which has arrived to liven-up the trapshooting scene. This sharp-shooting, fast-loading competition can be shot on any trapshooting field and can accommodate any number of contestants. From beginning to end every shot is fired in the atmosphere of a shoot-off. It is easy on competitors' pockets, pays big prizes and is high on spectator appeal.

What is it? It's a knock-out tournament where in each round, every two contestants in turn, stand on the twenty yard line and take shot at about ten targets each. No call of "pull" is necessary as every target, preceded by a sound, is released automatically at three second intervals.

The winner of each tie goes forward to the next round, in the same way as match-play golf, and gradually the field is whittled down amid the excitement of the onlookers and the growing tension of the surviving contestants. Every tie only lasts one minute and the result is immediately obvious to onlookers.

All the contestants eliminated in the first round have another chance in a second contest. This second competition is run on the same lines as the main competition and also pays cash prizes. Any competitor who is unlucky enough to again shoot badly is then out of contention at only the price of entry and twenty shells.

The two competitors in each tie stand about two yards apart on the twenty yard line. The first named shooter stands on the left and shoots first. Targets are thrown regulation height and distance but the trap is set to the widest angles. The first round ties are shot from position three with the positions widening as the contest progresses until the semi-finals and final are shot from positions one and five. Both countback and aggregate scores are used to break ties in the earlier rounds but the semi-finals and final are shot to a finish.

No excuses are accepted! Ten targets are thrown for each competitor and he/she is expected to shoot at all ten. Any target not shot at for any reason is "Lost". This includes dud shell, gun malfunction, gun unloaded or any other excuse. The only acceptable reason for not shooting is safety!

The scorecard is carried to the referee by the first named shooter. Shooters wait in lines of two behind the referee until it is their turn to shoot. The completed scorecard is carried back to the club office by the winner of the tie. The referee controls the automatic target release and also records the score.

If the entrance fee is ten dollars then four dollars goes to the club and six dollars to the prize pool. The prize is split two thirds to the main competition and one third to the second competition. In a sixty-four gun event eight monies are paid. Four in the main competition \$128 to

the winner, \$64 to the runner-up and \$32 to each semi-finalist. The second competition pays \$64, \$32 and \$16 each. In a larger event that attracted 256 guns the prize money for the main event would be \$512, \$256 and \$128 each and for the second competition \$256, \$128 and \$64 each.

Automatic target release was originally developed for use in a competition where individual shooters tried their skill at ten targets released at six-second intervals. The warning sound that introduced each target was intended to simulate the sound of the quarry breaking cover. This flurry shooting is great fun and can tie even an experienced shooter in knots if the slightest fumble is made.

Soon, however, the potential for head-to-head shooting evolved into knock-out trapshooting and the one-to-one format has proved very popular with shooters and spectators alike. One feature about automatic target release that has drawn favourable comment is the inherent safety of the equipment. Two of the main safety features are that the control wires carry only 12 volts and the trap-boy always receives a warning bleep one second before the trap arm releases.

Knock-out trapshooting enables all shooters to compete at reasonable cost for worthwhile prizes and it is surprising how many hot-shots are eliminated in the early rounds while an outsider comes through to take the final. Knock-out trapshooting doubles can also be interesting with five seconds between each pair of targets being released. Knock-out skeet doubles from number four position would also make for an interesting competition although this has not yet been tried.

In these recessive times knock-out shooting offers an affordable competition, where top names do not always dominate, together with spectator appeal. It should prove an interesting variation for many shooters and the equipment comes at a price that any club can afford.

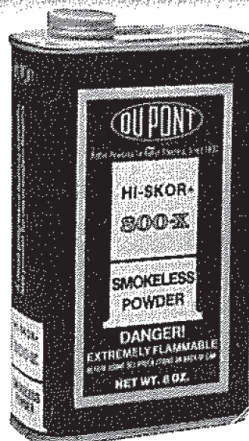

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

The Confederation of Australian Sport Insurances Public Liability Policy has been specifically designed for Sport and all extensions included relate particularly to the Australian Clay Target Association's needs and requirements. This is the first of its type produced in Australia.

The Policy will protect the Australian Clay Target Association, its Committee(s), nominated officials (as appointed by the Australian Clay Target Association) each affiliated club and all registered shooters for their respective legal liabilities.

Therefore, the Australian Clay Target Association is protected for all its sanctioned events, ranging from tournaments and meetings to all officially ratified functions held.

Each affiliated club is jointly protected for its activities as described above and all registered shooters including Association/Club officials, assistants, voluntary workers (official club/association activities) and participants.

All however, must be registered members to participate within the Policy and recognised as such, whilst acting within the scope of their duties in such capacity and conforming to Club/Association rules and by-laws.

This particularly applies to voluntary workers around the club who may assist in the canteens, traps, etc. They must be registered in some way as members of the Australian Clay Target Association.

Extensions included within the Policy are as follows:

- Member to Member
- Food and Drink
- Care, Custody and Control
- Medical and Welfare Facilities
- Tenants Liability
- Hoists, Cranes and unregistered vehicles
- Car Parking
- Cross Liabilities.

In order to establish a register of voluntary workers at affiliated clubs throughout Australia, it will be necessary for club secretaries to establish a list of voluntary workers at their club. The list should contain names of all persons likely to assist voluntarily in the upkeep of grounds, traps, etc., and ladies who assist in canteens, kitchens, etc. It is suggested that the list should be set up as in the following example:

NAME	CAPACITY
W. Smith	Trap Maintenance
M. Smith	Canteen Duties
J. Jones	Ground Maintenance

Please note that the list should contain only names of persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis, paid trappers, trap mechanics or other paid staff, should be covered by Workers Compensation Insurance.

When the list of voluntary workers is compiled, it should be lodged with the A.C.T.A. Office in Blackburn, where a master register of all voluntary workers will be maintained. Additions or deletions to club lists should be notified to the A.C.T.A. Office as soon as possible. ○

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1984

For the 1984 Nationals I have been appointed Handicapper. To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — I would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1984 Handicap Cards for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1983 card.
 2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
 3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1984 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
 4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any monies or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
 5. Rule 71(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of 3 months.
 6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.
 7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 106.
 8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board please report to handicapper's office.
 9. If you do not wish to be down graded please advise handicapper's office.

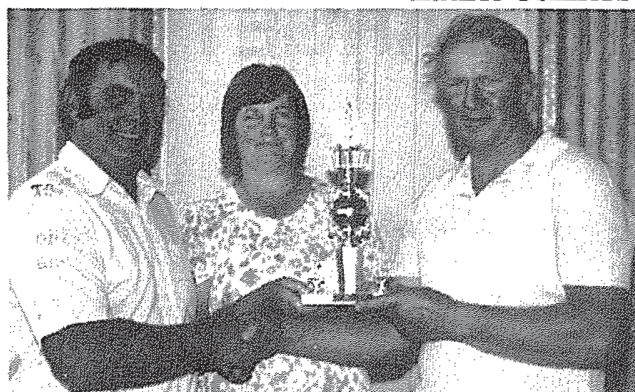



The Interstate Teams match, again for teams of three will be conducted over these same 150 targets.

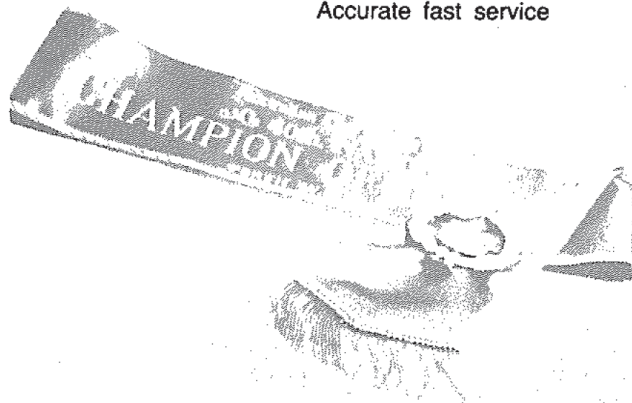

SHOOTING SHORTS

By Roger Darwon



THE SHOOTING SPORTSMAN

One of the many attractions of shooting is that it is a pastime of endless variety. It matters not, which section of the shooting sports you may favour, i.e., RIFLE-SHOTGUN-HANDGUN, once the basic skills have been instilled in you there are many directions in which you can develop. All aptitudes and abilities are catered for. There are shooters of the .22 rifle and handgun who are quite happy in putting together your average or reasonable score, while others strive to become perfectionists, who today use shooting equipment that have almost ceased to be firearms, becoming more like projectile shooting machines. These in the form of what are termed FREE-PISTOLS, can even be electronically operated, counter balanced, and fitted with a grip so complex that it could only be described, as being put-on, rather than held.

Other shooters prefer practical or combat shooting, which offer simulated situations that make very different MENTAL and PHYSICAL demands on the contestant, than formal target shooting. This form of competition shooting measures a shooter's ability to react to a situation quickly, coolly, safely and accurately. In other types of competition, we have today shooting sportsmen and women who use black-powder guns, originals or in some cases even replicas, who in doing so recreate historical adventure, into a flourishing contemporary sporting pastime.

Then there are some who prefer long range target shooting where very different skills and judgement are called for by the rifleman, with weather and direction of wind force playing a great part with his trajectory and ballistic skills.

Shooting is indeed a hobby full of challenge — it can be and is both satisfying and infuriating. Like the clay target shooter who puts together 24 good wins, only to drop his last clay number 25. Shooting in all its many forms of competition, is a hard taskmaster, for, all other things being equal, the shot goes where you send it. There are those who discuss chokes, wear, the variation in muzzle velocity, different loads and powders, but basically a firearm sends its "projectile", i.e., bullet or shot, where you point it and poor results in most cases, can only be blamed on you the shooter. If you're finding problems, seek out one of the many coaches available throughout Australia.


Shooters come into three basic groups, i.e., the new shooter, the advanced shooter and what may be termed the non-coachable shooter. For the new shooter coaching can only take him one way . . . up and better. Next, let's look at the advanced shooter: Coaching advanced gunners or any shooter for that matter is in most cases a difficult task. In this situation you need a coach who is very diplomatic, because the person who has been shooting over a period of years is more likely than not set in his or her ideas and sensitive to advice (even if the advice is asked for from the coach). Last but not least the coach must have the measure of his conviction by showing with a convincing approach as to WHY, for example, the shooter is missing a certain shot.

Lastly, and in brief, the non-coachables: A non-coachable in most cases may be a shooter who has failed to make a team because he has refused to take the coach's advice. He will remain a mediocre shot because of his insistence that he knows more than the coach, who in most cases has put a lifetime into acquiring his vast knowledge that made him a worthy coach. The shooter who will and can be assisted by a good coach and coaching can and will improve out of sight. The shooter who resents advice and constructive criticism should receive no further attention. An experienced coach will recognise such a situation as unchangeable and save himself a lot of time and frustration, which is all part and parcel of the shooting sports, but let's hope that, even in a small way, the above will result in some contribution to the shooting sports, because shooting has added so much enjoyment to my life and I hope the many friends we all share as a result of its competition and sporting accomplishment.


FOR THE TYRO: UNDERSTANDING YOUR SHOTGUN YOUR GUNS: CHOKE

Trap shooting shotguns come with three main choke ranges — 1/4 choke & full, 3/4 choke & full, and Full-choke and full choke, used for back-marker shooting in handicap events. In skeet shooting, seeing that the skeet targets are in most cases passing shots, have no choke but are true cylinder or cylinder bore-guns.

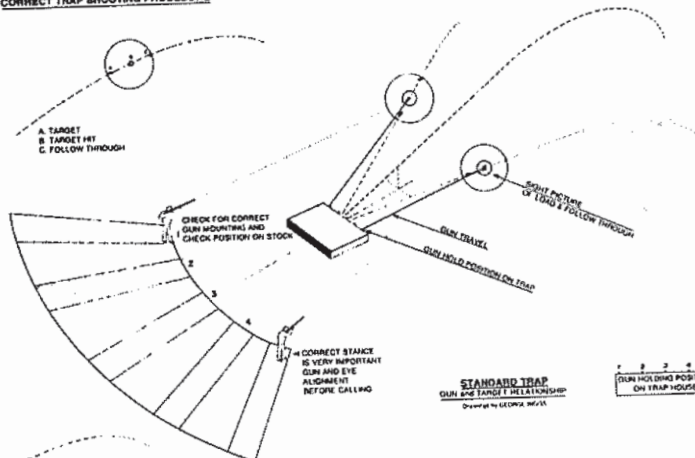

There are several degrees of choke in a trap gun as stated above: Full-choke, Improved Modified, Modified Choke, and Improved Cylinder. Full-choked barrels are designed for longer range shooting, they tend to make the shot-pattern more dense at longer distances. Improved Modified choke falls between full choke and modified choke. The best all round choke combination suitable to down the line clay shooting would be $\frac{1}{2}$ choke with full choke on the top barrel of your over under gun.

Not long after the breech loading shotgun was perfected in the 1860-70s the choke boring was invented. It was found that by constricting ("choking") the gun's bore at the muzzle, a narrower, denser pattern of shot was thrown, thereby extending the gun's effective range. Of course a complete feature could be written on this very subject, but the above will cover the main basic towards understanding choke for the new shooter.

YOUR GUNS: SHOT PATTERNS

Shot patterns are closely associated with your gun's choke. The amount of choke in a gun affects the spread of your gun's shot pattern. The best measure for testing your new gun's shot pattern is a distance of 45 good paces. Patterning a shotgun means shooting at a stationary target, that will keep a record of the shot pattern for your perusal. The best by far is a paper target large enough for a 30-inch circle to be outlined in easy to see black stencil, with the outline of a clay target (flat side) right in the middle. Sift the sight picture over your gun's sights and fire a shot. Take down the results and repeat again and again several times for each barrel.

With today's modern loads and choked guns, by and large what you need to know most of all, more than how many pellets fall into a given area, is just how your gun is shooting high or low, left or right of how you the shooter is aiming it. If you're a perfectionist you will want to learn this by doing the above test on your new gun. Some may consider this knowledge is not worth gaining, but let me assure you no intending good shot should ever take his equipment for granted.

Each shotgun delivers a different pattern and in most cases the pattern will change with the use of different loads. Most of all this pattern operation will also denote whether the gun is shooting where the shooter is looking, and whether the gun FITS the shooter. Remember a shotgun should be patterned at the start of each new season, and most of all after any alterations have been made to it. As a matter of interest chokes of the following constriction will produce the following results within a 30-inch circle at around 40-45 yards:

Full-choke — 65-75% of pattern
Improved Modified choke — 55-65%
Modified Choke — 45-55%
Improved Cylinder Choke — 35-45%
Cylinder Bore — 25-35.

Once again, if you're not sure of the correct procedure with patterning your new gun, seek out your club's coach (and when he has time). I'm sure the results he can assist you with will not only improve your understanding of your shotgun, but the enjoyment you will gain from the clay target sports.

REFEREE MUST BE IN CHARGE

It has always been a bone of contention with this writer when the rules of the "game" are altered, putting the referee in a position where he is not in complete control of the "game" (see May 1983 issue, leader par titled "A Giant Step — Backwards"). This rule where a shooter could then refuse to accept a target has been changed back to the referee's control, thank goodness. Likewise

the same treatment must be given to the rule, where IF A SHOOTER shoots at a target he must accept the result. This "new" rule clearly takes control of the "game" away from the referee, like the rule mentioned above. The majesty of the referee and his control over any sport can only be maintained if he has complete control over the "game".

Over the last few years, in some areas, a lack of good referees owing to the passing on of former top line referees may have crept into the clay sports. But the way to correct this deficiency in the standard of refereeing, is not to change the rules of the "game", but to assist new and upcoming referees so that they via good schooling in the role of the referee's task, can and will become top line arbitrators of the rules of clay target shooting.

At the same time we must make sure that double standards are not permitted to creep into the clay target sports rules, that is, rules for the top "players" and rules for the "bunch". For my money there are no exceptions. At times it may appear difficult for a referee to make a big decision, when it could even go so far as to mean disqualification of a competitor. But should such an event or incident take place, then the referee must be in full control and handle the situation at hand with NO EXCEPTIONS.

Lastly, the referee is there to control not only the rules of the "game" but the safety factor as well. Therefore, under no circumstances should a referee EVER try to referee and keep score at the same time. It must become mandatory, a part of the RULES of clay target shooting, for all referees to have the assistance of a scorer at all times, with no exceptions. No referee is capable of performing his obligation, if he tries to do both tasks at the same time. All referees owe it to our sport to assist new members in their schooling to become proficient in learning to become referees. The end result can only improve our sport for all.

HITTING THE NAIL RIGHT ON THE HEAD

That likeable referee, N.S.W. State Delegate and State Handicapper Albert Povey of Wagga Wagga has hit the offending nail right on the head with the well documented outline in his letter to the Editor's Mailbox in last month's issue of C.T.S. News, see page 22, January 1984. His letter should be a document worthy of close perusal by club committees right across Australia. Not only is it well thought out, but more than explains why some clubs are not growing and encouraging new members. All clubs must maintain a reasonable number of handicap events, and if possible at least a 15 target event at each shoot, with more progressive handicap events throughout the year.

This writer was at a club (not long ago) where some of the new shooters had never seen a handicap event... fair dinkum, so what chance would they ever have of progressing within our sport, or for that matter gaining the valuable experience that only being able to start on the front mark would give them. The clubs that heed his advice can only progress, those that don't I guess will find out in due time.

ACADEMIC: NEW HEAD OF SPORT INSTITUTE

Former VFL footballer, and a sports academic, Dr. John Cheffers has become the new executive director of the Australian Institute of Sport, based in Canberra. Sports, Recreation and Tourism Minister (Federal) Mr. John Brown announced on 21st December 1983. Dr. Cheffers said he saw his job as "an old-fashioned search, discover and development mission". The thorny question of sports elitism arose first-up.

"Some people believe there is a necessary separation between sporting excellence and participation in sport for all — that's nonsense," said Dr. Cheffers.

"Sporting excellence is the tip of the iceberg. You never know when anybody developing from youth is going to achieve world-class performance or ultimacy. You can't separate ultimacy from participation . . . you mustn't."

By now your preparations for the 1984 Nationals should be underway. See you next month.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

Staff Writer

The Executive Committee met in Melbourne on Sunday November 20, following the Skeet Nationals. Major items of interest on the agenda were as follows:

1. Referees Association

Dissatisfaction was expressed at the rules on grading and handicapping. After reference to the Referee's Association it was resolved to publish a notice inviting comment from interested shooters on this aspect of the rules. The Referee's Association is to meet prior to the Trap Nationals to consider the comments received.

2. Financial Situation

The Executive Committee discussed the financial situation to the end of September. Income for the year to date was down on budget because of lower than expected registrations and magazine advertising. Expenditure had been kept down during the period, and a small surplus was expected at the year end.

The 1984 financial plan was accepted by the Executive Committee, and is published elsewhere in this issue.

3. Review of Skeet Nationals

The Skeet Nationals were thought by all to have been a success. Entries were up on those budgeted for, and the voluntary assistance given by so many people should ensure the financial viability of the series.

A recommendation to the Referee's Association following the Skeet Nationals was that the same number of targets be the basis for Skeet grading to bring it into line with D.T.L. grading.

4. 1984 Trap Nationals

A detailed proposal and budget for the staging of the Trap Nationals at Wagga was put before the Executive Committee. It was decided that six man squads would shoot one target per lane, 50 targets on one trap, with a pause between rounds of 25 targets to replenish ammunition. Sufficient shells to shoot the 50 targets must be taken to the layout.

For the first time at the Trap Nationals, an optional \$5 purse will be conducted on all events with the exception of the Comark Deauville Doubles. This will be divided 60%, 30%, 10%, off the gun. Compulsory sweeps are included in nominations for all events except the Deauville Doubles.

Cartridge purchases at Wagga will be conducted in the same way as at Adelaide, with cartridges of the competitor's choice being purchased with the nomination.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association will be conducted in the evening of Friday March 30, the night before the commencement of the Trap Nationals.

The wind-up to the Trap Nationals will be a barbecue at the Wagga Gun Club, at which High Gun awards will be presented.

5. Nationals Sub-Committee

A Sub-Committee was appointed by the Executive Committee to look at all aspects of National Championships. This move is necessary now that we are running three separate series of National Championships.

6. Official Historian

It is felt that the need exists to appoint an official historian to the Association to collate lists of previous winners of National titles, and compile a history of the Association's early years.

Victorian shooter George Biggs, who has a great knowledge of the early years and is most interested in the history of clay target shooting, has indicated his willingness to accept the position.

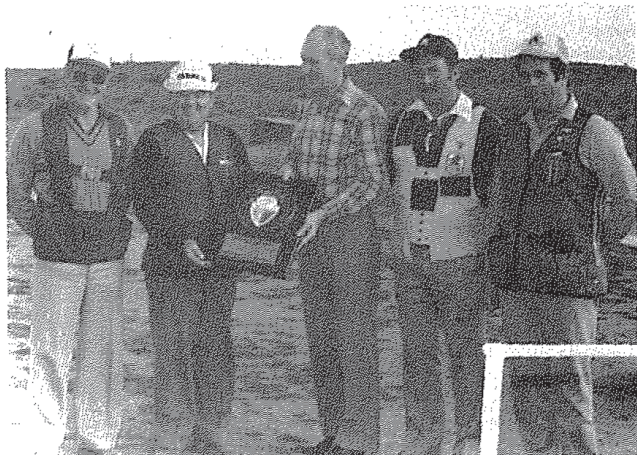

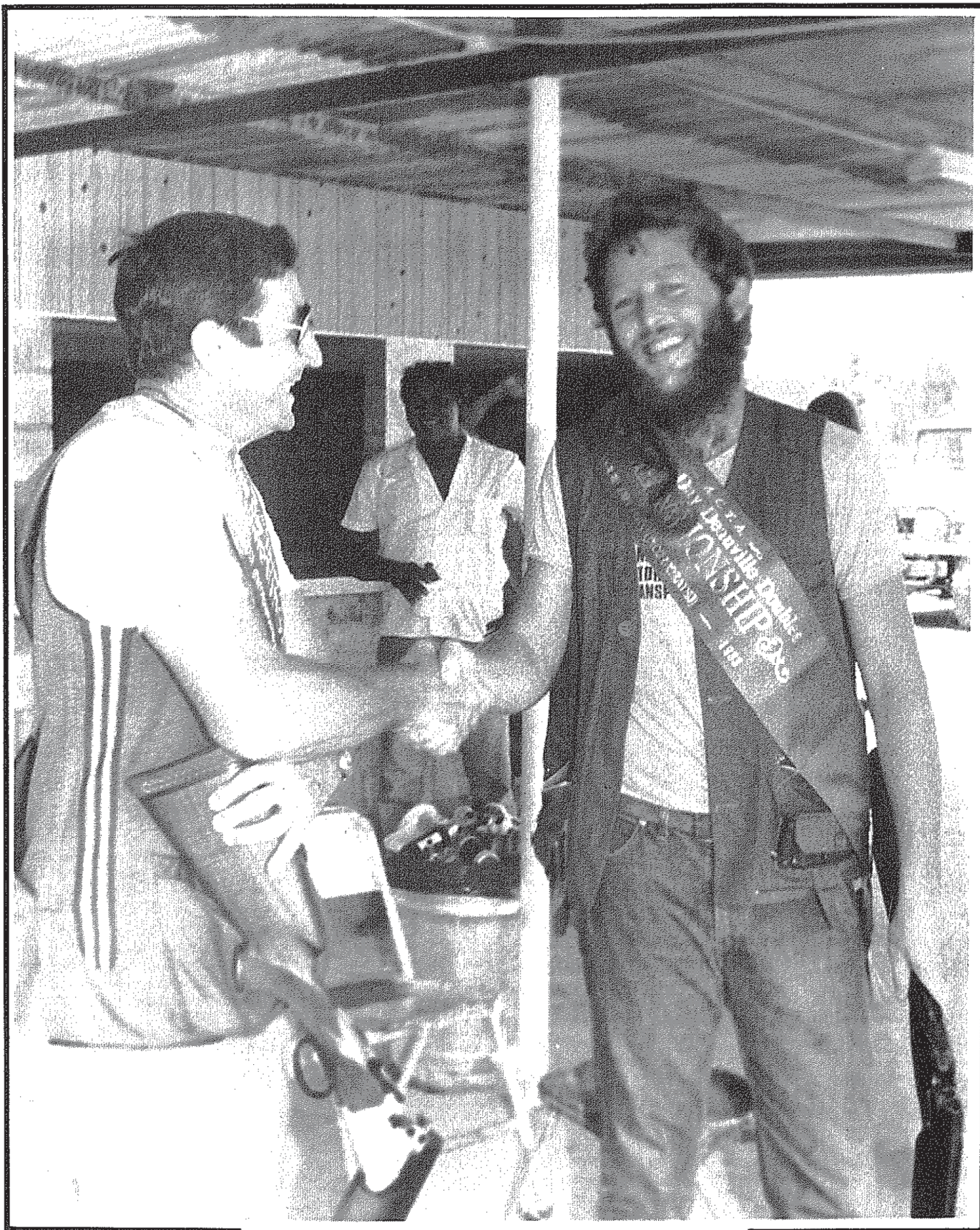

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

I am writing in reply to Mr. A. Povey's letter which appeared in this month's Shooters News, condemning the present system of handicapping.

Like Mr. Povey, I have had many years experience of Shot Gunning. My first taste of this sport was at Alexandra, Victoria, away back in the early 1920s. I cannot recall any system of handicapping in those days, but a few years later I remember all new shooters were asked to shoot off 12 yards and if anyone was lucky to have a win, they would be asked to move back one yard, if it was a trophy event the same system applied, depending of course on the value of the trophy, a shooter could keep on winning, provided he accepted the handicap worked out by the Club.

For a shooter to move forward again he would have to shoot a full year without winning or by winning only a certain amount decided on by the Club or handicapper. All trophy values based on what the Club paid for it.

I am very sincere when I say the present handicapping is all wrong and unfair. A young shooter or a person who has done little or no shooting is trying hard to hit a few clays off 11 metres. They go along to a shoot where there is perhaps one only handicap event, which may suit the beginner, but the other 6 or 7, perhaps 8 events are Championships, which means all shooters are put on the Common Mark, in other words 15 metres.

Now I will ask, is it right to expect those young lads to move back 4 metres while the top shooters move forward 4 or maybe 5 or 6 metres. If this sounds right to the average sportsman, well it is time for me to find another sport.

Hoping there are other members who see what I mean and do as Mr. Povey says "Put Pen to Paper" and voice your opinion on this very important subject. I would like to say I agree with Mr. Povey's suggestions on his grading system, provided it is thrashed out and thoroughly investigated.

I myself shoot on a front mark, not for the same reason which this may indicate, some years ago I was brought forward from 25 metres or yards as it was then, to my present mark.

This was brought about by eye troubles and my age which is 78. All this is apart from my intention of writing to back up Mr. Povey's letter of January 1984, Shooters News.

NEW PRESIDENT FOR CAS

The Confederation of Australian Sport has a new President. He is Mr. Leslie J. Martyn, of Frankston, Victoria, who succeeds Mr. Wayne Reid.

Mr. Reid retired recently, after seven years in the top position. CAS was formed in November, 1976 as a lobby group, and under the leadership of Mr. Reid, has initiated many worthwhile projects on behalf of its Member Associations.

These include the creation of the Australia Games — a multi sport festival to be inaugurated in Victoria in January 1985; a national coaching accreditation scheme; a sports injury insurance scheme; and most importantly, the peer recognition system known as the Sport Australia Awards.

Mr. Martyn has been Vice President for the past two years, and is also President of the Australian Commonwealth Games Association. He has been a top competitor in weightlifting and after a stint as a coach, became involved in sports administration.

Until recently, Mr. Martyn was the President of the Australian Amateur Weightlifting Federation.

Mr. Martyn has assumed the Presidency at a time when the Confederation has a number of projects in train which are of considerable interest, and importance to its Member Associations.

Probably the most important in the long term is the decision taken at the 1983 Annual General Meeting of the Confederation to identify the objectives its Members see as the basis of planning for the direction of sport nationally through the 80s.

Another vital project is the establishment of a policy in respect to Children In Sport, and the maintenance of fair play codes.

The new Vice President is Miss Eunice Gill, who has recently retired from the lecturing staff at Melbourne University. Miss Gill has been a top netball coach and administrator for many years, and for the past two years, has been Chairman of the Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly.

In business, Mr. Martyn is a successful hotelier and company director, with extensive interests on the Mornington Peninsula in Victoria.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

In reply to Mr. A. Povey, January Shooting News.

I am what could be called an "itinerant" shooter. I shoot at the local club when it suits me, such factors as weather, family commitments and other (pistol) shooting commitments sharing my time.

It could be as much as three months between shoots during which I get very rusty in the shooting department. I then may go to several shoots in rapid succession. The result being a rapid increase in percentage of targets shot. All this means that I am still in "C" Grade, still on 14 metres and have a collection of trophies to look at. Whilst this looks good on the trophy shelf, it does not help the image of trap shooting as a sport.

I would further like to see all shoots scores recorded against handicap including Christmas shoots, Legacy shoots or whatever.

I would suggest that to test the system proposed, that one sizeable club adopt the system for twelve months and experience its advantages (and pitfalls) and report its findings.

News Item

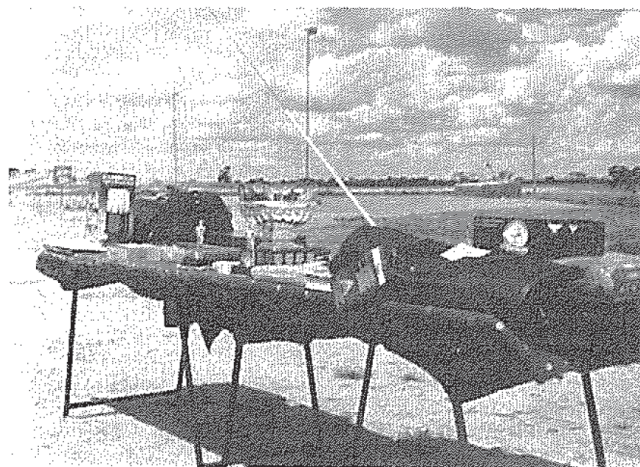

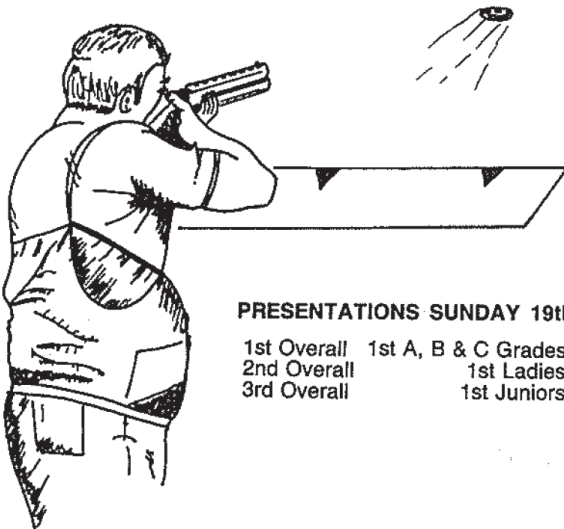

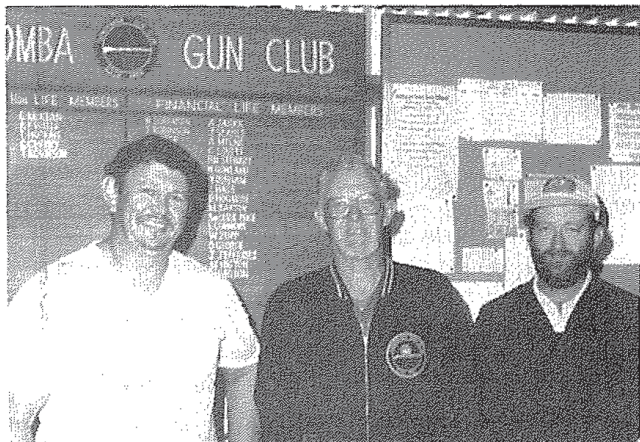

Q.C.T.A. INTRODUCING ... MR. JOHN PAUL

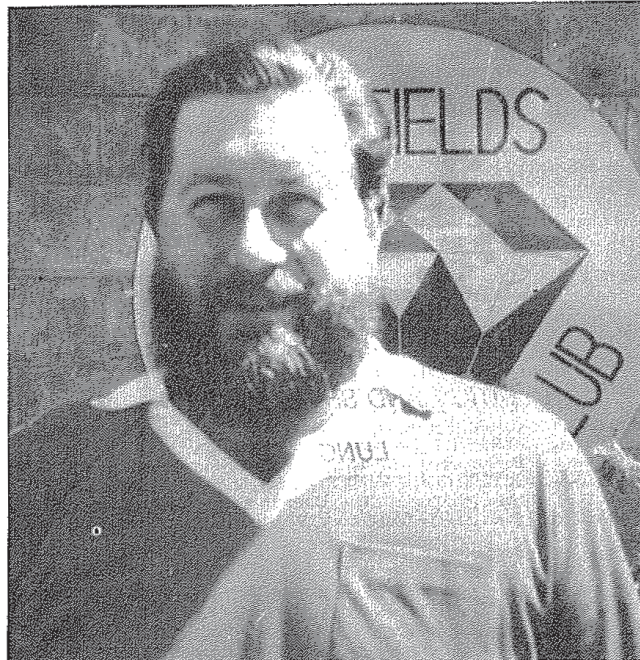
John was born and raised in New South Wales.
