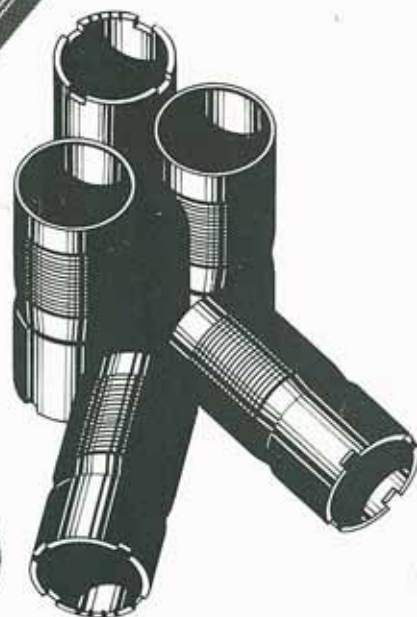

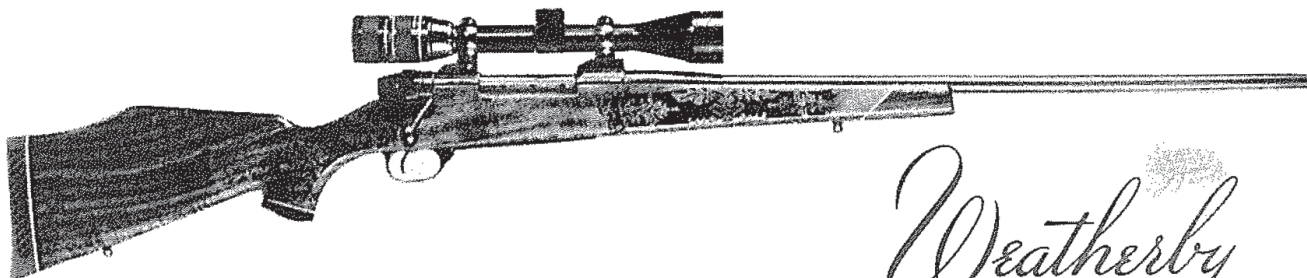

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS NOTES

I have had a few queries regarding the new A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy which came into effect on January 1, 1984.

The major question is in regard to the establishment of the register of voluntary workers. One of the reasons for keeping this register, is that not everyone named will be a registered shooter. Wives and girlfriends for instance, who assist in the kitchen at clubs are not generally registered shooters. They should be named as voluntary workers, working in that capacity.

The other area of query concerns the voluntary workers policy, in that it is not a personal accident policy. It does provide cover for your club, its officers, voluntary workers, and the A.C.T.A. and its officers, should a problem arise, and legal action be taken against the voluntary worker, the club, or the A.C.T.A.

It is important that clubs should lodge the names of voluntary workers as soon as possible with the National Office.

Dear Mr Povey,

I write to congratulate you on the way you presented the case for the revision of the system under which we currently shoot. I warmly support every detail of the case you have presented. I have been shooting at claybirds for the past 35 years, never very good, but like you, always aspiring to shoot from a back mark.

The present system removes much of the challenge for the front marker, there is little joy in beating those of your own calibre from a common mark, but there is excitement and satisfaction for the front marker when he "tosses" a 24 metre gun in a shoot off, and an improving front marker will frequently do this. This is what the "pot hunting" back marker is afraid of. Many of them can no longer shoot well off their mark because they seldom if ever enter handicap events. It is I believe, these shooters who have devised the present system which if not changed will damage the future of clay bird shooting.

"A DOUBLE-BARREL INVESTMENT"

Unless you've been exceptionally lucky or astute during the past decade, any capital you invested in the stock market has not kept pace with inflation.

On the other hand, if you had in 1970 purchased a fine new English, European, or in the odd case an American top line double shotgun — or even a second hand one — your original investment would now be worth up to ten and more times the original 1970 purchase price. That's an appreciation value few have ever stopped to consider.

If a man were to search the countryside for shotguns, most properties would yield at least one "old" gun of aristocratic origins. But in most cases one would find these classic old "diamonds" in a somewhat sad and sorry state.

The "old" gun about the place is as common as the old T Model Ford, rusting away in many country-property rubbish dumps. On the other hand some guns are found in excellent condition, complete with original leather case.

These rare finds bear such noble names as Greener, Cashmore, Holland & Holland or Wakefield.

Now and then you'll find the magical inscriptions Purdey or Boss. These more valuable members of the elite, are more often than not to be found in the "office", in a masculine atmosphere of strong pipes and tobacco, in the company of calendars, rural newspapers, and the overdue book work of the station or smaller property. In many cases their beginning dates to about 1851-91.

In the great middle-preservation class of "the old gun about the place", you also find many superbly made guns by Westley Richards, Beretta from Italy, Suhl from Germany, sometimes in the form of a well made drilling (two shotgun barrels and a rifle barrel underneath — the perfect combination — all rounder), sometimes to be found in a shabby state and down on their luck from hard use.

After the second world war many country squires, when the wool clip was king, purchased the more modern Browning over-and-under or the famed Browning semi-auto shotgun. Today these fine guns (like their side-by-side cousins) also have appreciated tenfold in value, and in good condition are worth a tidy sum indeed.

Although they often have bumpy rides in Land Rovers and the property ute, and are apt to be left out in the

weather by the odd uncaring owner, they are sometimes cleaned up by their owners, who just happen to think, "Must send that old gun to a gunsmith soon for a good overhaul."

Today these "old" guns, as they're often called, have appreciated at a rate that would leave the stock market far behind. These fine examples of the gunsmiths' art are fine mechanical illustrations of the mechanical capabilities of this century. Why have they become so valuable?

One of the main reasons is most of the top makers of England have closed forever, thereby making the guns from these gunsmiths rare never to be repeated classics. Their price today, if in good condition, will have gone off the investment graph — provided you have had the luck to have the gun given to you or a member of your family purchased it over 20 or 30 to 50 years ago.

Also, in a world of falling standards and mass production you'd own a true piece of the gunmaker's craft. Unlike stocks and shares, a top make British shotgun or European counterpart can be sold almost anywhere in the world, and, if properly looked after, it'll last for generations.

Some of the top makes that intending buyers should search for — bound to appreciate 500 per cent in the next decade — are Purdey, Lancaster, Dickson, Egg, Westley Richards, Cogswell & Harrison, William Powell, Holland & Holland, Boss. For that matter, consider any English gun, as long as it's Nitro-proofed (meaning not with the old twist-tye steel-barrels) and is in top well looked after condition.

When looking at fine guns for long range investment purposes, the buyer can be confident in his purchase, if he buys a London gun. The same can be said of some of the well made American Double Guns, for these too will appreciate tenfold over the next ten years or so. But in every case they must be by a top maker and in good condition, as all original as is possible, with their fine leather gun cases, as sent from the makers.

At this point, you must bear in mind we are searching out the top line high grade examples of the gun maker's craft. In talking about their investment value, you must remember to buy them now as they may cost you from \$1000 to \$2500, right through the scale to \$10,000 — even \$12,000 and \$15,000 for the high grade Purdey's and Boss, with a similar amount for an L grade Browning over/under. So in order to first acquire them and then to collect them for investment, you will need to know a lot about each item or make, if you are considering this type of investment.

Even on the lower scale of double guns, made from Birmingham works in England and the Remington, L.C. Smith, Parkers, and original Winchester top liners, you will expect to pay from \$700 through to \$3000 and more for well presented examples.

You can be sure no matter which scale, or which grade you start your collection, or search for the "rusty-Diamond" they can only go one way in value ... up.

You may be a lover of fine crafted double-guns and besides looking at them as investments you can enjoy the firearm for its real purpose: that of a shotgun, for the pleasure of shooting feathered and other game. That's something you can't do with your stocks and shares.

By looking after the gun, and giving it every care, you now have more than just an investment, you have a mechanical creation that can be used and enjoyed while it's gaining value.

Your shares on the stock market can take a beating, as we have seen recently. But not the top line gun — it's

going up and up, while other commodities are going down, down and down.

On the overall view, there is no doubt any gun by a top maker, from the English gun trade, European to the early American makers must be considered for future investment purpose. We all can't start off with a brace of topline London guns, so to get your investment going, any make from the above will do.

One vital point to remember: for safety purposes, ensure that if you're intending to shoot the "old" gun that it's in good working order. Check to see if the barrels are not made of Damascus or twist steel. If you're not sure, ask a competent gunsmith.

Make sure you know the chamber length of the gun before you bang away with modern loads. Many fine old guns were chambered for 2½ inch cartridges. The modern 2¾ inch loads impose considerable pressure in the shorter chamber, which will not allow enough room for the cartridge crimp to open. It's a very dangerous habit to fire the longer loads in the shorter chambered gun.

Getting involved with this hobby of collecting guns is the best way to learn and at the same time gain experience in assessing their true worth.

The top line guns' values will continue to increase as mass production replaces the vintage of hand crafted guns made by any of the makers mentioned in this article.

The true collector who treasures his "find", and gathers them back from the edge of extinction, will gain much more than just the real pleasure of shooting them or the added knowledge he will gain by his research and study into their origins and past. ("What a story this old gun could tell, if it could talk.") The proud owner of one of these classic examples of the real gun maker's art will gain a true investment potential for his future, that will be worth more than stocks and shares, as the value of the dollar is eroded by the process of world inflation. For my opinion, that old rusty diamond is worth more than money in the bank.

Over the years I have seen top make English and European guns purchased in Australia (on the second hand market) for a pittance of their real worth, then resold at what you might consider a big profit; yet at still half and less than half of what they would fetch in England and America.

Next time you're down in the machinery shed or the workshop or when you're rummaging about in the office, take a real close look at that old gun the father or grandfather left you. You may get quite a surprise to find it's one of the real rare diamonds, worthy of a good restoration and valuation for the future. It could be your best hedge against inflation on the investment market.

One last point worth a mention. If you intend becoming a collector of top English, European or American guns for more than shooting purposes, it will take many years of involvement in these firearms.

You will need to make careful and often detailed examination of many hundreds of guns and take the time to have consultations with experts, before you can expect to gain enough experience in determining which gun has the best future capital gain.

QUEANBEYAN/ CANBERRA AUSTRALIA DAY SHOOT

We were pleased to welcome National President Laurie Connors, Southern Zone President Robbie Smith and one hundred and eighteen shooters from the four corners of New South Wales and Victoria to our 4th Annual Australia Day Shoot.

Travellers came from 36 clubs to shoot for the two New Zealand trips, and four shotguns that were the graded high gun trophies.

Saturday started in spectacular fashion with 37 shooting the possible in the 20 targets eyeopener, in ideal weather conditions.

The 45 target Australia Day Grand Prix saw 10 possibles carded, and the winner of the first New Zealand trip was Russell Houn with 55/55. There was an almighty tussle for second place in A grade, with Brian Samuels and Greg Oehm shooting 237/239 before deciding to 'toss' for the honours!

In the third event, the Edments Australia Day Championship, Kevin Thompson and G. Went shot another mammoth 210/210 before Kevin emerged as the winner from the 22 possibles. Sid Kinsey had shot 204/205 before dropping out. The weather was not kind by this stage of the game, and shooters were competing in driving rain — most unseasonable!

Nevertheless Sunday dawned bright and sunny, with hopes high for another good day's shooting. The contest for the graded high guns was on, and 22 shooters started into the shoot-off for the Combined Electrical & Plumbing Services Championship. The overall winner was John Power from Wagga with 113/113, with John Blain and Rex Northcott the close runners-up.

The conditions for shooting the Australia Day Classic, for the second New Zealand trip were far from ideal. Only eight possibles came in, and John Kent emerged as the winner with 85/85. Giving him a run for his money were Bill Iles (84/85) and Tony Salafia (74/75).

The final event of the day which would decide the winner of the high guns was shot in yet more rain. To the referees and scorers who officiated in the poor conditions goes our highest praise. We could not have had any winners without them.

To take out AA grade high gun Bill Iles shot 345/347. He and Barry Kable were tied on 213/215 for the weekend.

Frank Vella shot 212/215 to take A grade, Bob Huddleston shot off with Glen Evans (junior) to take B grade (215/227), and Andrew Newcombe (junior) with 198/215 won C grade. Ladies high gun was won by Christine Wakefield, and Junior high gun by Glen Evans.

Despite the unkind weather conditions there was a lot of very fine shooting over the two days. Four shooters qualified for their 50 break badges, another four for their 75 breaks, one for a 100 break and two for their first 200 break. We saw eight shooters move from C to B grade, two from C to A grade, five from B to A grade, two from B to AA grade and six from A to AA grade. Congratulations to all these shooters on their fine efforts.

Goulburn Workers Gun Club committee and members cannot be commended enough for the invaluable assistance that they gave both before and during the shoot. Sincere thanks also go to our sponsors. Without their continued support we would not have been able to offer such attractive trophies.

You don't have a good shoot without shooters — thank you all for your support, hope to see you all back again next year.

WHAT EVERY SHOTGUNNER SHOULD KNOW

5 MAIN POINTS OF CORRECT STOCK FIT

- A. Drop at comb
- B. Drop at heel
- C. Length of pull
- D. Angle of pitch
- E. Shape of comb

PROBLEMS CONNECTED WITH POORLY FITTING STOCK

- A. Loose cheek position on comb
- B. Loss of gun control
- C. Greater recoil effect
- D. Low shooting
- E. Loss of accurate pointing
- F. Bruised cheek and shoulder
- G. Shooting behind target

If you are one of those shooters who frequently misses the straight away target, check your gun stock for drop at comb measurement. Chances are it's too low.

If you have a problem with your gun bumping and bruising your cheek, chances are you are not mounting and checking it correctly. Actually, no gun should cause discomfort to the shooter, provided the stock fits the person and is correctly mounted to shoulder and face.

Incorrect pitch setting can cause great discomfort and bruising to the shooter's shoulder — especially lady shooters. Pitch is the angle of butt or recoil pad to the barrel rib. If the toe of the butt is digging into your shoulder excessively, then the pitch down angle should be increased.

The shot pattern is controlled by the degree of choke built into the gun barrel — it is a constriction of the tube at a point approximately 2 in. back from the muzzle and is built in by the barrel maker. Density of the shot pattern will naturally vary depending on shot size. However, contrary to what a lot of shooters imagine, the area of pattern does not increase or decrease by varying the shot size — it is the choke that controls pattern area. As an example, a cartridge of 1½ oz. no. 9 shot will have an average of 650 pellets as against 385 of no. 7 but the pattern area will be roughly the same if fired from the same gun.

It's a good idea to fit a recoil pad to any shotgun, be it used for trap shooting or field shooting or any other type of shooting. I've heard shooters say they cannot mount their gun properly when a pad is fitted. If this is the case, the gun they are using does not fit, it is most likely the stock is too long.

Don't worry about the possible effects of wind on your shot pellets. That is, would wind blow my load of 9's about more than 8's or my 8's more than 7's? Tests have proved that wind has no practical effect on shot pattern regardless of size, over the range we use a shotgun.

Be sure to get your footwork correct before calling for the target. Be relaxed, but alert and ready to move with a smooth co-ordinated gun and body movement after the target.

Just before you call for your target, pause for a second to focus your gaze in the area where the target will appear. This practice will enable you to see the target bright and clear. You are then more aware of target behaviour which is the key to better scores. It's a good way to develop concentration.

It's certainly not the end of the world if you discover you cannot shoot with both eyes open, due to the fact that your right should shoot and have a left master eye. When this is the case you must obviously do one of two things — either change over to the left shoulder, or stay with it on the right shoulder, and close the left eye. Actually, some of our prominent shooters do just this, and shoot very well. So don't worry too much about this problem.

The next time you miss a target think for a second and ask yourself: "Did I really see the target leaving the trap? The answer will be for sure: "Well no — not really. I only saw it after it got out a bit further causing me to make a hurried shot. That resulted in a miss."

The remedy for this problem is, after mounting the gun and establishing a gun point on the trap house, pause for a second to properly focus your eyes over the area in which you know the target will appear. Now, completely disregard everything else while you form a quick mental picture of correct procedure for shooting the target.

When this mental picture is complete, call for the target. You will find that the whole action of tracking the target, lead, fire and follow through, becomes easier and more of an automatic action — provided you keep your eye on the target all the way out until it is broken. This technique is one of the basic fundamentals of shooting clay targets either trap, trench or skeet.

Most trap shooters will prefer the front top edge of the trap house as a gun point position prior to calling for the target — however, we have an increasingly small number of shooters showing preference to hold higher over the house and watch for the target leaving the trap under the barrels.

This style does have a lot going for it in that it cuts down on gun movement and tends to make the shooter watch more intensely for the target leaving the trap and this is what we want.

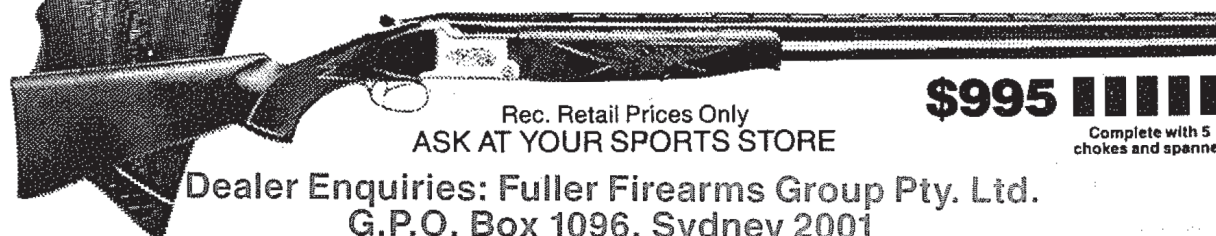

Unfortunately it is only the shooter who shoots two eyes who can adopt this style. Because when the left eye is closed the view of the target leaving the trap is lost. To overcome this problem the one eyed shooter would have to wait for the target to rise above his gun.

In so doing, he cancels out the advantage he would otherwise have.

Proper gun fitting and gun mounting will bring your gun and eye into alignment. You will then be pointing where you are looking. And, if you keep your eye on the target, you should then have no problem — hitting the target!

The successful and most difficult shooter to beat in competition is the one who does his own thing. Target after target, he refuses to be hurried or pushed into shooting faster than he normally shoots. He does, in fact, continue on with his own deliberate style. This style of competition shooting is one I have personally used over the years.

It's a good way to keep concentration working — so don't allow other shooters in your squad to upset your style!

Contrary to what some shooters may think, the safety catch on your gun is completely divorced from the gun's cocking and uncocking of the hammers. The safety catch is actually a mechanism that prevents the trigger or triggers from being pulled when on safety.

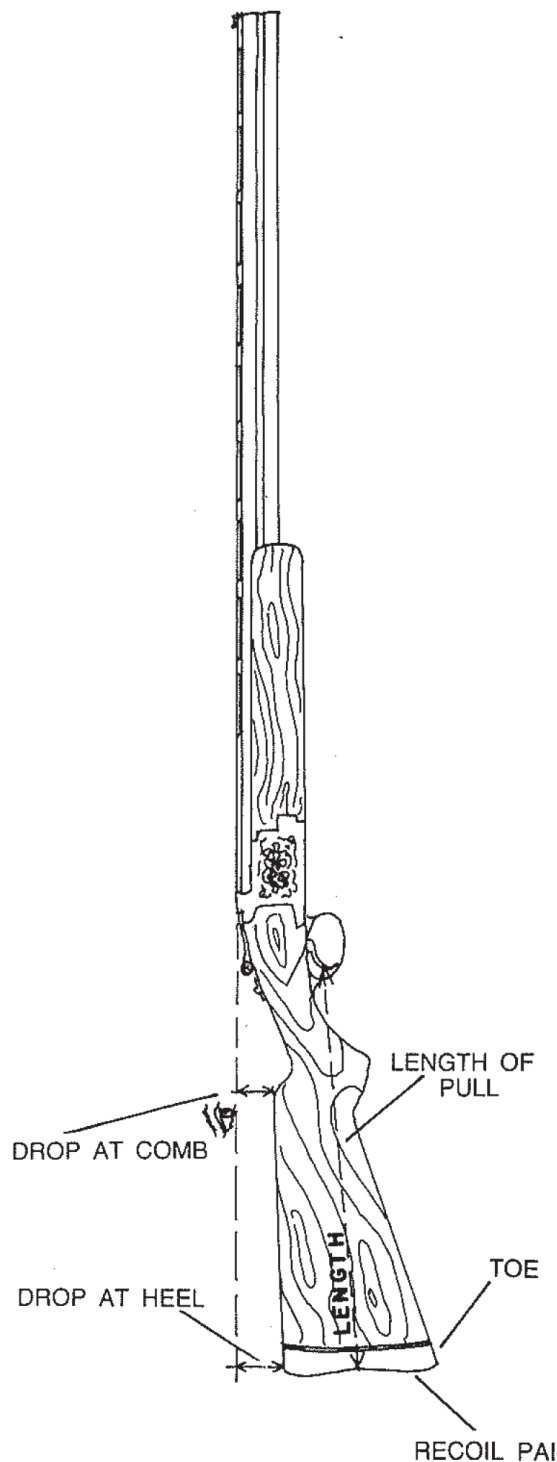
Fact is, the hammers are still cocked so that if the gun is dropped or jarred by a fall, the hammers can operate and fire the shell — even though the safety catch was on "safe".

A great many skeet guns come from the manufacturer with a stock that has too much bend down — or in other words, too much drop at the comb. This problem will result in poor scoring due to your shooting eye being below the rib level when your cheek is resting on the comb. If you suspect that you have this problem, have your gun stock checked out by a competent person.

As the shot pattern leaves the muzzle it begins to lengthen. This is called stringing. Tests have shown that at 40 yards it has strung out to around 8-12 feet and is cone shaped.

Regardless of whether you shoot trap or skeet, the basic technique remains the same:

- Learn the fundamentals involved
 - Learn how to apply them
 - Learn how to practise them always, at all times.
- 1 Proper gun fit
 - 2 Correct gun mounting
 - 3 Body and gun control
 - 4 Good stance position
 - 5 Gun and target relationship
 - 6 Watch for the target leaving the trap. See it bright and clear.
 - 7 Lead the target, fire and follow through.
 - 8 Select a good gun, hold position relative to the trap house.
 - 9 Learn to concentrate
 - 10 Shoot one target at a time and NEVER EVER think about the one you just missed, or how many more you have to shoot.

Proper gun holding will lead to better gun mounting. The position of your right and left hand on grip section and fore-end is very important. An incorrect right hand grip will lock up wrist movement and prevent free and easy movement of proper gun mounting to the correct position on one's shoulder.

Incorrect fore-end hold will also cause problems. Be sure that you are not over reaching with the left hand which will cause restricted gun swing, especially on targets travelling from left to right.

If we use too short a grip on the fore-end, gun swing will become jerky and inaccurate. The ideal position is a little way either side of fore-end centre — depending on length of shooter's arm.

Providing all other measurements of stock are correct.

For the trap or skeet shooter who takes his shooting seriously and shoots regularly throughout the year I'd suggest he have his trigger pulls checked every 9 to 12 months. At the same time have the action and locks cleaned.

Any good gunsmith would be able to do this work for you.

Always incline the body SLIGHTLY FORWARD from the waist. This action of leaning into the shot will help maintain body balance during the act of firing.

I'd recommend fitting a recoil reducer. A good make of recoil reducer does work and will reduce recoil and barrel flip. It will also provide better gun control for the clay target shooter.

THERE ARE SIX VERY IMPORTANT BASIC FUNDAMENTALS INVOLVED IN SHOOTING MOVING TARGETS.

1. Correct type of gun and proper gun fitting.
2. Proper gun mounting on shoulder.
3. Proper gun and eye alignment.
4. Proper gun and target relationship. "Sight picture and lead, fire and follow through."
5. Correct stance and body control. (Use body to help swing.)
6. Eyes focused to pick up target as it leaves the trap house.

See the target bright and clear is a key to successful shooting.

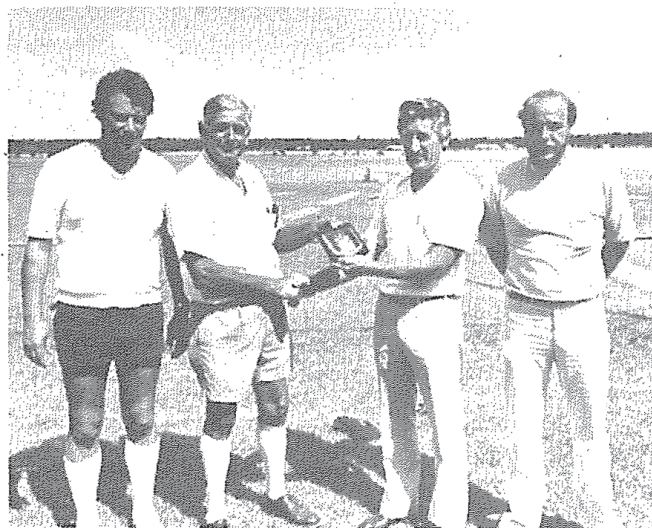
We were supposed to be holding the NSW Walk Up Championship, instead we were holding a "furrowed brow and weebegone looks" contest.



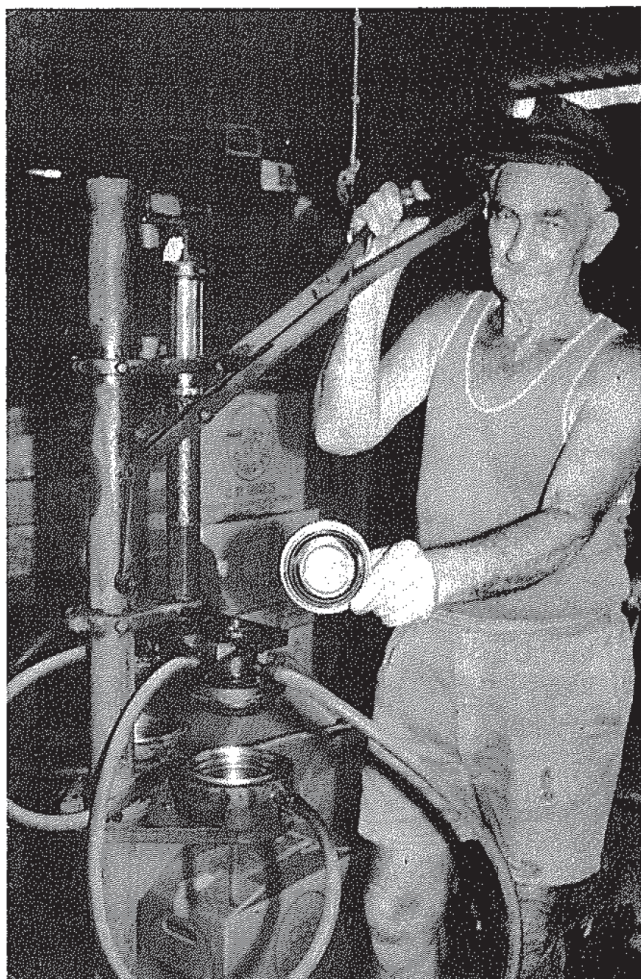

TUESDAY, JANUARY 17, 1984

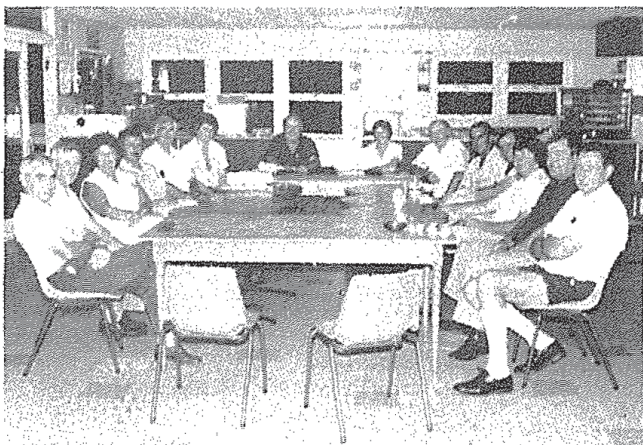

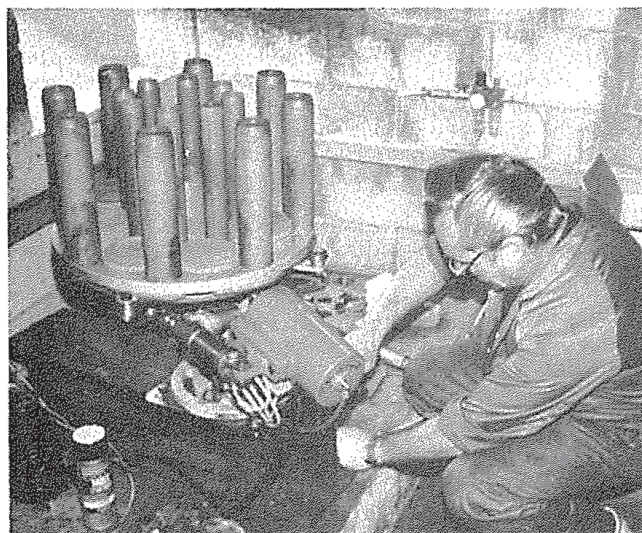

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1984

For the 1984 Nationals I have been appointed Handicapper. To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — I would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1984 Handicap Cards for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1983 card.
2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1984 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any monies or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
5. Rule 71(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of 3 months.
6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.
7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 106.
8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board please report to handicapper's office.
9. If you do not wish to be down graded please advise handicapper's office.

SHOTGUNS & CARTRIDGES FOR GAME & CLAYS

Gough Thomas

Enjoyment and success in game shooting depend heavily on the right choice of basic equipment, so that the shooter must have a sound knowledge of his essential equipment. Gough Thomas uses his long experience as Gun Editor of the Shooting Times to guide the reader towards the ideal choice for his particular requirements.

The present edition has been thoroughly updated and virtually doubled in size, to enlarge the shooter's understanding of modern guns and cartridges, especially for the benefit of competitive clay pigeon shooters, and game shooters anxious to improve their performance in the field. SKILL ACQUISITION

Peter Quire

Skill is the ability to perform some task well. We are skilful if we complete a task or performance in such a way that we achieve the exact result that we set out to achieve.

Acquiring skill involves much the same process whether the skill is playing the piano, ballet dancing, playing football or in our case shooting Clay Targets. This being the case it is timely to point to the fact that sports people on a whole do not practise their skill anywhere nearly as much as does a concert pianist or a ballet dancer. 6 hours a day is usual for them to not only gain the skill but to improve and maintain it.

Rodney Marsh, in his book states "When I had nobody to throw the ball I would spend hours hurling the ball against a wall at all different angles and catch, catch, catch. I would count how many I'd take without dropping one, sometimes reaching 1,000 without a miss."

I am not suggesting that Clay Shooters should practise to that extent, very few could afford it, but I am pointing out that practice is extremely important in the gaining of any skill.

How do we learn a skill? Firstly we must have some idea in our minds as to what the skill involves. This first idea provides the basis for forming a plan that will guide our actions. Information is the basis of all actions. In any sport the athlete uses information to plan and prepare in action or the performance of a skill.

Information given is the only way a Clay Shooter will know how correct or incorrect his performance is. Information is used to modify actions so that the level of skill improves. You will see that in the refining of a skill, relevant and usable information is essential.

The description of the actions involved in the skill must be clear, not vague. Directions and descriptions must reduce the uncertainties the individual has.

It is my view that a very important part of the 'Art' of Coaching is the ability to describe the skill clearly, in a way that is easily understood by the shooter.

To pass on the correct information to the shooter requires close observation by the Coach. For example if you observe that the shooter has shot behind the clay, then it is the job of the Coach to describe what had happened and then correct the error that caused the shooter to shoot behind the clay — it may be that the shooter did not follow through.

By describing the result and the reason for it the Coach enables the shooter to make a new mental picture and so keep refining the skill process.

Mental rehearsal is vitally important in gaining a new skill, especially so in Clay Shooting. The learner can be taught to practise the skills of the task in his own mind, so it is easy to see that it is vital that the shooter has had clear correct information allowing the mental picture that is rehearsed to be the correct one.

The skill of Clay Target Shooting can also be improved by "dry runs", that is, without having a cartridge in the gun, handling the gun and swinging it at a target with the correct follow through. The more these things are done the easier the skill becomes.

The correct stance and balance required becomes automatic and there is then less for the shooter to have to consciously think about.

A skill, then is the performance of a task in such a way that the desired result is achieved repeatedly with the minimum of effort. The skill is gained by the presentation of the correct information in such a way that the learner makes a clear mental picture of the task and then by sending the message from the brain to the eyes to the brain again and then to the rest of the body, achieves the desired result.

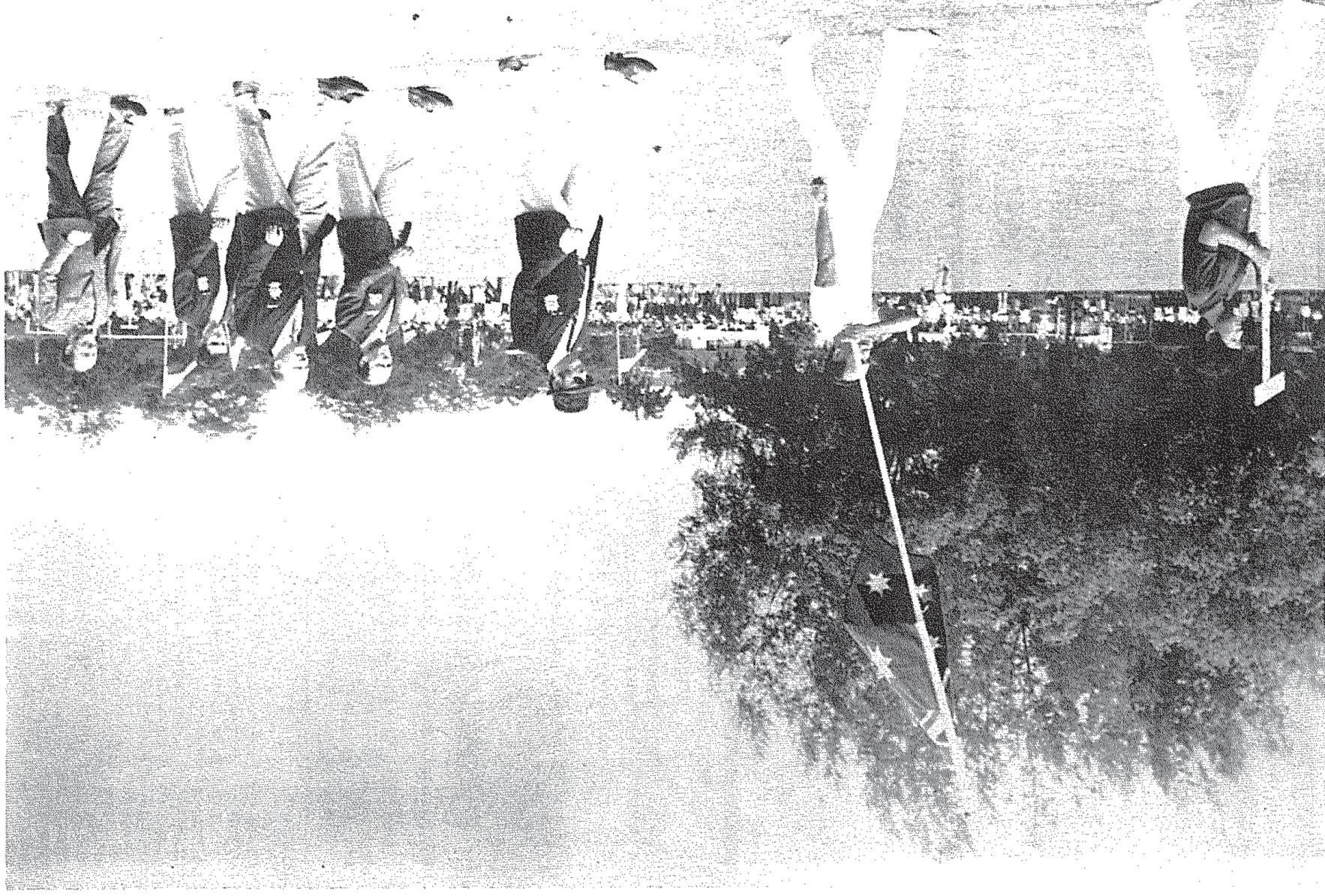
