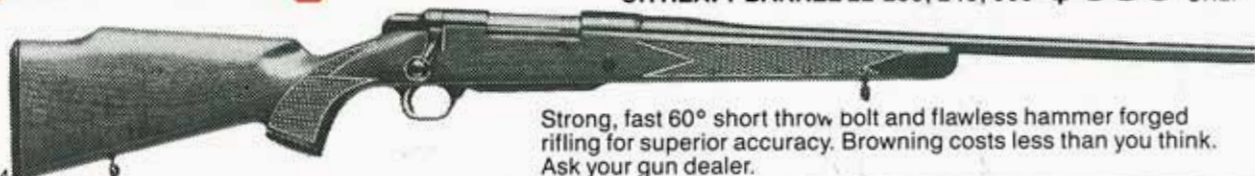

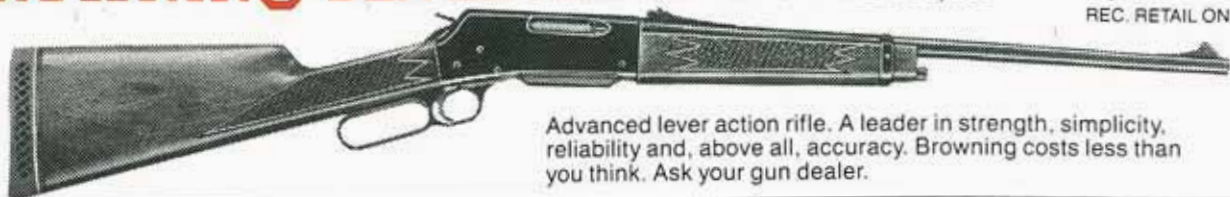

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

A most successful Olympic Discipline Nationals series has just concluded at Melbourne Gun Club.

The presence of so many world stars created an atmosphere that added much to the six days, and provided top competition for our Olympic hopefuls.

U.S. shooters collected 10 of the 12 overall medals on offer in the four events, making a clean sweep in skeet. The Commonwealth Olympic Skeet Championship created a first for the Association with a tie for first overall.

Al Mullins and Dean Clark after shooting 193 a piece, still could not be separated after three shoot-off rounds (the limit under U.I.T. rules), so another gold medal and sash is on order. A full report of the series follows elsewhere in this issue.

Following the Olympic Discipline Nationals, the Australian Shooting Association met with the Australian Olympic Federation Justification Committee. At the completion of this meeting the Australian shooting team for Los Angeles was announced.

The South Pacific Regional Championships New Zealand February 1984

Our Australian team consisted of Jim Ellis, Terry Rumbel and Graeme Boyd in Trench, and Ian Hale, Alex Crikis and Brian Thomson in Skeet.

The team arrived in Christchurch to find cold, windy weather, but warm hospitality. We stayed in the Canterbury University with the teams from the other South Pacific nations. Competing countries entered teams of three in the open competition, and other shooters who had been invited competed in the 'B' Section.

Australia's John Maxwell was entered in this section as an invited shooter by the New Zealand Association as he is their current National Champion. The World Champion, Primrose of Canada also competed in this category.

The Australian teams won both the Trench teams event and the Skeet teams event, a great achievement by the Australians as the teams events are the prime competition in these regional competitions.

All three badge matches were won by Australians, Alex Crikis in Skeet, Terry Rumbel in the Open Event and John Maxwell in the B Event. In the individual events Jim Ellis won the gold medal in the Olympic Trap, John Maxwell won the 'B' Competition and in Skeet, Cameron of New Zealand won the gold with Brian Thomson and Ian Hale second and third.

This competition is regarded highly by the people of the South Pacific Region with representatives from the Pacific Islands, Papua New Guinea, England and Canada competing.

It is with pride that I report to you, that your representatives, represented you with distinction on and off the shooting grounds.

Thanks must go to our hosts, the New Zealand Shooting Federation for their kindness and friendship.

The Trap and Skeet shooters won 15 medals in all, a great achievement and some reward for the time and money these shooters spend to reach international standards.

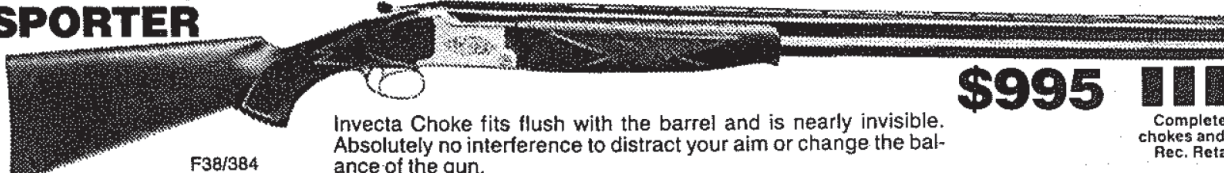

INTERNATIONAL STARS DOMINATE OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

U.S. Shooters take 10 of 12 Overall medals

Melbourne Gun Club was the venue for the Olympic Discipline Nationals from February 24 to 29.

The series was highlighted by the performance of U.S. Army shooters from Fort Benning, who used the 400 targets as a start to their Olympic preparation for Los Angeles.

The line-up was impressive — in Olympic Trap the field included World Record Holder (200/200) Dan Carlisle, 1983 World Champion John Primrose from Canada, six times Women's World Champion and World Record Holder Susan Nattrass from Canada, Women's Team Gold Medallist at the 1983 World Championships Frances Strodman from the U.S., Wally Zobell, top U.S. shooter vying for a place in the U.S. Olympic Team, Col "Jack" Horner, the shotgun coach at Fort Benning, and Terry Howard, U.S. Air Force, also an Olympic hopeful.

All the top Aussies were there too, after their success the previous week in the South Pacific Regional Championships in New Zealand.

In Skeet the list was just as impressive, 1983 World Champion and World Record Holder (200/200) Matt Dryke, Alger Mullins, and Army Reservist Dean Clark. These three swept all before them, and were quite outstanding in the Skeet events.

All the visitors had ample opportunity to practice, and soon settled down to shooting good scores.

The Commonwealth Championships in Olympic Trap and Skeet got underway on Friday February 24.

Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championship

Conditions were fair for the start of shooting on the Friday morning. At 75 targets, the joint leaders were all on 71, Pud Burgess, Wally Zobell, Russell Mark, Dan Carlisle, Ray Lowry, and Jim Ellis. One target back were John Primrose and Graeme Boyd, with Maxwell and Rumbel on 69.

Day two the Saturday, another 75 targets. At the end of the 150 Wally Zobell U.S. on 143 led from Jim Ellis 142, Terry Rumbel, Graeme Boyd, John Maxwell, and Jack Horner 141. Russell Mark and Dan Carlisle were a target further back on 140.

Susan Nattrass and Frances Strodman were locked together on 124 in the Ladies Division.

Sunday morning, the final 50 targets. The wind had freshened making the targets a little more difficult. Of the leaders Jim Ellis was first to finish, dropping three for 47 and 189. Graeme Boyd also had problems with three finishing on 188.

Russell Mark faltered for 45 and 185. Overnight leader Wally Zobell, was in squad 9, and had shot the first 25 of the final 50. Amid great pressure he ran them clean in his last round to win the title on 193. Dan Carlisle managed 49 for 189, to tie Terry Rumbel and Jim Ellis, and John Maxwell shooting 49 of his final 50, was clear in second spot on 190. The shoot-off for the bronze medal went two rounds. Ellis, Rumbel, and Carlisle all 24s in the first, Carlisle 25 in the second to 24s from Ellis and Rumbel.

Susan Nattrass took the ladies medal and Jan Schuster the juniors.

Commonwealth Olympic Skeet Championship

Twenty-six shooters lined up to contest the Commonwealth Skeet Championship.

The three U.S. shooters led after the first 75 targets. Dean Clark and Alger Mullins on 74, one ahead of Matt Dryke 73, Hale 72, Crikis and Summers 70, with Gunner Cameron, N.Z. Gunner had won the individual championship in the South Pacific Regionals the previous week and had come to Melbourne to compete against the visitors.

Day two, the Saturday, Dryke on 146 led from Clark 145, Hale 144, Mullins, Crikis and Summers 143. Overnight joint leader Mullins started the day badly with 20 but pulled up shooting 49 of his last 50 targets.

Sunday morning, the final 50 to shoot. Round seven saw Dryke and Clark shoot 25s for 170, Mullins 25 for 168 to be tied with Crikis; Hale one further behind.

The last round and Dryke 23, Clark 23, Mullins 25, to be all tied up at 193. Hale 24 for 191 and Crikis 22 for 190. So it was a shoot-off for the medals. Round one Clark and Mullins 24, Dryke 23 to settle for the bronze. Round two Clark and Mullins both 25s. Round three, a repeat of the second: Under U.I.T. rules, three rounds only are to decide ties.

No decision, so equal first to Dean Clark and Alger Mullins. This had not happened before in the history of Olympic Discipline Championships in Australia, and was a fitting finish to a top competition.

Monday February 27

National Olympic Trap Championship

Monday morning dawned fine and hot, with a strong northerly wind, to herald the start of the National titles. After 75 targets of the Trap Championship, Russell Mark and Jim Ellis headed the field on 73, from Terry Howard, Dan Carlisle, John Maxwell and Terry Budd 72, with Wally Zobell and Graeme Boyd 71. Terry Rumbel was disappointed with his 68.

Tuesday morning, rain tumbled down. Thunderstorms the night before had lowered the temperature and shown the visitors yet another facet of the Melbourne weather. Bob Simpson and his wife Dianne from Cairns were feeling the cold, they don't mind the rain, if it's warm.

Despite the rain some good scores were posted, and at day's end three shooters led on 143. They were 20-year-old Russell Mark, Wally Zobell and John Maxwell. Four others were one target back, Terry Howard, Dan Carlisle, Graeme Boyd and Geoff Mark, with Stan Collins on 141. Ellis and Budd 140, Porter 139, Rumbel 138.

Wednesday, the final 50 to shoot for the gold medal.

Russell Mark was drawn number one shooter in squad one and posted a 24 for 167 with one round to go. Howard 25 for 167, Zobell 24 for 167. Carlisle and Geoff Mark 166.

Final round, Russell Mark 23 for 190, Wally Zobell 23 to tie on 190, Terry Howard another fine 25 to put him in an unassailable position on 192 and give him the gold medal, blue sash and Silver Australia. World Record Holder Dan Carlisle needed to shoot the lot to win the silver, which he did, so we had a shoot-off for the bronze between Wally Zobell and Russell Mark, with Russell winning convincingly 23 to 20. Russell had performed very well throughout the series, had turned 20 during the Championships, made the National Training Squad, and

been the top Australian in the National Championship. He must have a bright future in Commonwealth and Olympic Games competition.

Full marks to Terry Howard, who stuck at his task well all the week, and finally triumphed in the National title. Susan Natrass did it again in the ladies division, as did Jan Schuster in the juniors.

National Olympic Skeet Championship

Monday February 27, day one, Mullins and Clark led on 73/75, from Dryke and Crikis 71, Woolley 70. Ian Hale a disappointing start with 68, Summers 67, Thomson 66.

At 150 targets after two days, the Americans continued to dominate, Dean Clark 146, Al Mullins 145, Matt Dryke 144. The nearest Australian Alex Crikis 139, John Woolley 137, Len Norman 136, Guy 135, Hale, Thomson and Meuleman 134.

Trap problems had upset some shooters in the second 75 targets, with many broken targets appearing from the trap houses.

Final day Wednesday, the last 50 targets for the gold medal. Dryke 48 for 192, Mullins 49 for 194, to tie Clark 48 for 194. Crikis the best of the Australians 49 for 188. Hale disappointed with 44 for 178.

Another shoot-off for the gold medal, blue sash, and Silver Australia badge. Round one, Clark 24, Mullins 24. Round two they went again, Clark 24, Mullins 25 to give Al the title together with the High Gun, as they were tied after the 400 targets on 387. Another fine finish to a top competition.

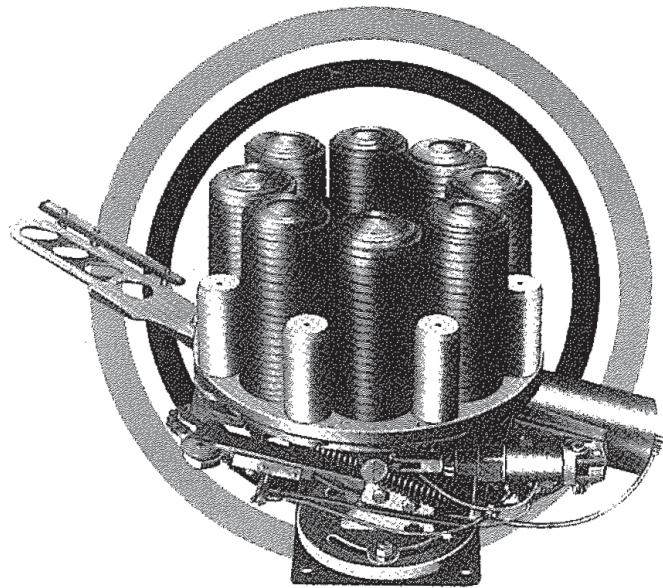

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE 1984 ANNUAL MEETING

The year under review can best be described as one of reasonable success, with goals being achieved in certain areas of our operation. I am confident developments created during 1983, will see our sport consolidate and develop even further in the future.

The running and organising of individual Discipline National Championships, by your National Body, as has been the case during 1983, will amplify this in future years.

Both the Olympic Discipline and American Skeet National Championships proved to be a great success. The first ever Skeet Nationals, conducted by the National Body, at Melbourne Gun Club received overwhelming support.

Their success reflected on the organising committee, Melbourne Gun Club and the generosity of many shooters throughout Australia, individuals and industry, who gave their time and energy, monetary and trophy donations, to promote this venture.

For the National Body, and our sport, it was most successful, and I extend my heartfelt thanks to all concerned.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING

Through our international involvement, and the sending of teams overseas, our shooters now have a goal to aim for in all our shooting disciplines.

This in itself will strengthen our organisation. Our Olympic Discipline shooters still continue to perform well individually, and as a team, with our Olympic Trap Team winning a Bronze medal at the 1983 World Championships in Canada.

Our international involvement in Olympic Disciplines over past years has made a tremendous impact on our sport. This was further evidenced by the number of visiting shooters from other countries who attended for the first time our 1984 Olympic Discipline National Titles held in late February.

COACHING

The Federal and State Governments continue to support us well with funds for coaching. I feel this reflects on our success as competitors, as well as administrators of our sport.

Records accredited to coaching under our National scheme are proving it to be a great success. An area of importance to our future is coaching at the school student level.

Some States have already achieved tremendous results with annual projects involving school students of all ages. It is important for us to continue to be involved within this area.

My congratulations are extended to our National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, for being appointed as the Shooting Coach for the 1984 Olympics. This I deem a great honour for our sport.

D.T.L. NATIONALS — SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Thanks and appreciation are extended to the South Australian State Association, the organising committee,



and their band of workers, who worked tirelessly to give us a grand 1983 tournament.

Thanks are also credited to the South Australian Gun Club for making their facilities available to conduct these Nationals.

Through no fault of the organising committee, these Nationals did not produce the profit margin forecast. One can speculate as to the many reasons why, but this does not make up the lost revenue into our administration.

Now the National body is involved in the running of three Nationals each year, and because of the workload they create at administration level, it is imperative a substantial profit be realised from each one.

REFEREES ASSOCIATION

The Association operated for the first time during 1983. Whilst it has had some degree of success with our rules, there are still problem areas, particularly pertaining to the handicap system.

Every opportunity is being given by this panel for interested shooters to assist through the correct channels, in resolving this, and producing a handicap system that will be accepted by shooter majority.

COMPUTER

Our in-house computer, although it gave teething problems earlier, is now in full operation and proving to be everything expected.

Its cost saving to our administration will no doubt prove it to be a sound investment from here on.

OUR PREMISES

The April Executive meeting sanctioned the purchase of the property from where the National Office operates, at 8 Main Street, Blackburn, Victoria.

Although it is satisfactory for our immediate operations the property has future development prospects.

In my view it is also a sound investment against inflation, and even if not developed, will over the years gain in value for the Association.

The Executive approved of a feasibility study to be carried out in 1984 on development possibilities of the site.

The site lends itself to the erection of multiple shops and office space to let, as well as housing our own office administration requirements.

INCORPORATION AND INSURANCE

Clubs, where possible, should make every attempt to become incorporated under their respective State laws, regardless of membership number.

Should an accident occur, incorporation eliminates the possibility of legal action being taken against members officiating at clubs. Likewise, the new updated insurance cover for clubs and registered shooters being offered as from January 1, 1984 by the A.C.T.A. protects members' interests.

Club administrators should familiarise themselves with the guidelines necessary to achieve cover for their members and voluntary workers.

C.T.S.N.

Quotations from several firms for the publication of C.T.S.N. for 1984 were obtained by administration.

This practice is carried out every year in an attempt to have the magazine produced at the best possible price.

Waverley Offset Publishing Group, Geddes Street, Mulgrave, Victoria, was successful in submitting a quote, making it a viable proposition for us to change, from Water Wheel Press in Shepparton.

This action has forestalled any possible immediate increase in advertising costs to clubs and commercial advertisers in C.T.S.N.

FINANCIAL

Clay target administration has not been excluded from the problems created by the economic recession that prevailed during 1983.

It was a tough year, as some of our main sources of income, i.e., shooter registrations, C.T.S.N. advertising and our Nationals profit, were below budget figures. However, administration has succeeded in containing expenditure on some budgeted items below expected costs.

Withstanding all this, I believe perusal of our Financial Statement will indicate the National Body, through its administration unit, achieved acceptable financial results during 1983.

In closing my report, I congratulate my Executive colleagues for the way in which they addressed their responsibilities, and gave their valued time in working to further develop your Association and our sport during 1983.

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION ANNUAL REPORT 1983

Despite the continuing economic problems caused by the recession, further development took place in the sport during the year 1983.

Internationally, while we didn't have the euphoria which accompanied the Commonwealth Games in '82, we again had excellent performances at the World Moving Target Championships in Canada.

Another highlight in 1983 was the First Skeet Nationals series in November which proved to be a resounding success.

The Referees Association continued to tune the rules and still have some work to do to satisfy the majority, particularly in the area of handicapping.

Taking everything into account the financial result for the year was satisfactory. Lower than expected income from registrations, C.T.S.N. advertising, and Trap Nationals profit, made the need for belt tightening in areas of expenditure mandatory. I believe the Association has now weathered the economic storm which has prevailed for each of the two preceding years, and can look forward to a period of stability and growth.

The long awaited amendments to the Firearms Act went through the Victorian Parliament during the year. The legislation is far less restrictive than at first thought, largely due to the consultative attitude of the majority of the firearm organisations, as opposed to the confrontationist attitude of the minority.

As is traditional this report addresses itself to specific areas of activity.

1. International Competition

Australian shotgunners were again very active internationally in 1983.

1.1 International Skeet Teams Match

This event is conducted in Australia and New Zealand in alternate years. It was held during the New Zealand Nationals and resulted in a win for Australia.

1.2 International Trap Teams Match

This event, open to all countries with shooters at the Australia Trap Nationals, was conducted in Adelaide in April. It was won by the American team by one target from Australia. Representing Australia were Jim Smith, Alf James, Doug Smith, Barry Kable, and Tony Bradshaw. In third spot was New Zealand, and fourth Great Britain.

1.3 Glenn Cup

This match for D.T.L. Teams from New Zealand and Australia was also conducted during the Adelaide Trap Nationals. The Australian team of Denis Lymn, Bill Iles, Greg Hipwell, Deserie Huddleston, David Osborne, and Alf James with 119/120, proved too strong for New Zealand.

1.4 Mackintosh International Teams Match

Canada notched their first win for eleven years in this International Postal Teams Match for the Mackintosh Trophy. Canada's winning score was 7383/7500, with New Zealand in second place on 7366, and Australia third with 7295.

1.5 International Ladies Teams Match

The Inaugural International Postal Match for teams of five ladies was shot during the Trap Nationals in Adelaide. This match is conducted between teams from England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia. Australia was represented by Deserie Huddleston, Jenny Ey, Thelma Meadows, Vickie Deeley, and Christine Wakefield, and were successful with a score of 1420/1500 from Wales 1255.

1.6 International Junior Teams Match

This too was the Inaugural Junior Teams Match. The competing countries were similar to those in the ladies match. Representing Australia were Andrew Noble,

Andrew Pitt, Mark Kimber, David Wilson, and Adrian Loxton, who scored 1422/1500 to win from Wales 1345, and Ireland 1230.

1.7 World Moving Target Championships, Edmonton, Canada

The A.C.T.A. sent a team of six shooters under Manager/Coach, Peter Quire. The Olympic Trap team of Jim Ellis, Graeme Boyd, and John Maxwell, shot well in difficult conditions to take the bronze medal behind the U.S.A. and U.S.S.R., in the Teams Match. This was our first team medal since 1973. In the individual Olympic Trap event, Ellis finished 8th, Maxwell 14th, and Boyd 18th.

Skeet shooters Ian Hale, Alex Crikis, and Brian Thomson finished 8th in the Teams match, while in the individual match Hale and Thomson were in equal 29th place and Crikis 33rd.

2. National Competitions

2.1 Trap

The 1983 Trap Nationals were conducted at South Australian Gun Club, near Adelaide, during April. Attendances were disappointing, about 19% down on Brisbane the year before. Because of the fall-off in entries, a smaller than expected profit will result from the series. It was clear that the economic situation had a bad effect on entries in the Trap Nationals.

The Organising Committee from the South Australian Clay Target Association did a good job in organising the series, and the Executive Committee thanks all trophy donors for their strong support.

2.2 Olympic Disciplines

As from 1983 the A.C.T.A. is responsible for the conduct of the Olympic Discipline National Championships. These were conducted at Melbourne Gun Club at the end of April, comprising the Commonwealth and National Championships in both Olympic Trap and Olympic Skeet. Record numbers turned out for both Championships which were very successful.

2.3 Skeet Nationals

The First Skeet Nationals were also conducted at Melbourne Gun Club in the middle of November 1983. Four 50 target, and two 100 target Championships were conducted over the four days of the series. The 100 target events were the Commonwealth and National Skeet Championships. All voted the series a resounding success.

Top scores were posted throughout and the skeet long break record was broken by Eugene Kavanagh, of N.S.W., during the series. Our thanks to the V.C.T.A. Organising Committee and trophy donors for their organisation and support for the First Skeet Nationals.

3. Executive Committee

There were no changes to the Executive Committee for 1983. The Committee met twice during the year, following the Trap Nationals in Adelaide in April, and after the Skeet Nationals in Melbourne in November.

All members of the Executive Committee are commended for their dedication to the development of the sport during the year, and particularly for the assistance given in making the Skeet Nationals such a success.

4. Government Grants

Grants totalling \$35,000 were received from the Sport Development Program for 1983, an increase of 40% over the previous year:

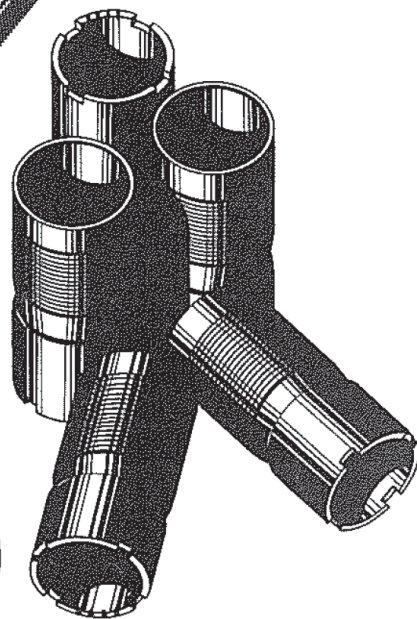
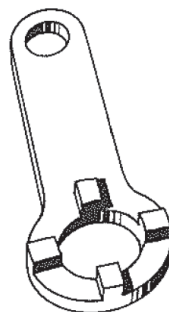

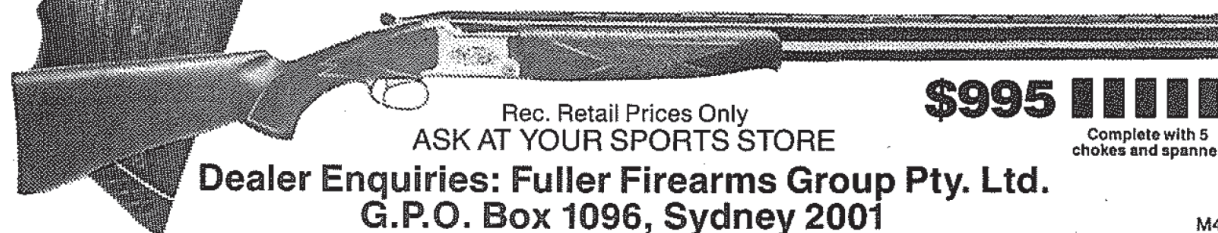

A further grant of \$3,500 was allocated by the Government through the Australian Shooting Association to help fund the team to the World Moving Target Championships.

Management thanks the Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism, the Hon. John Brown, and his departmental officers for their considerable assistance during the year.

5 National Coaching Council

The seven State Directors of Coaching make up this council under the chairmanship of National Coaching Director, Peter Quire. The first Level 2 course under the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme was conducted in New South Wales during the year. Other States are investigating Level 2 courses for 1984.

The Executive Committee expresses its appreciation for the work done in the coaching area by State, Zone and Club coaches in 1983.

6. Administration

The in-house micro-computer equipment installed late in 1982 took some time to settle down and produce to its full capacity. During the last part of 1983 it proved its flexibility and at the same time has significantly reduced computing costs.

Mr M. T. Hastie of the Finance Sub-Committee has again through 1983, been of enormous assistance with advice and help with investment of Association funds.

7. Membership

The number of Clubs affiliated during 1983 was 292, a decrease of one from 1982.

Shooter registrations were down on 1982, particularly full registrations. Of the 700 approximately we were down, 230 extra veterans were registered, following the change to the rules regarding veteran registration. This fall-off in registrations again reflected the economic situation throughout the country. As is usual there was a high turnover of shooters not registering after one or two years in the sport.

8. State Associations

Per capita grants of \$13,814 were returned to State Associations during 1983, an increase of \$4,254. Most States are receiving funding assistance for various projects. The Northern Territory Association has been most successful during 1983 in gaining assistance for State teams, to both the Trap and Skeet Nationals.

9. National Training Squad

The Olympic Disciplines National Training Squad was selected over the 400 targets of the Commonwealth and National Olympic Discipline Championships in Melbourne in April. The top three in each discipline represented Australia in the World Moving Target Championships in Canada in June. The squad was in action again in December when eliminations were conducted in Olympic Trap at Downside, to choose the team for the South Pacific Regional Championships.

10. Legislation

New firearms legislation was enacted in Victoria during the year, and much discussion took place in New South Wales and Queensland between the gun users and anti-firearms people. Money has continued to accrue in our Legislation Fighting Fund and no allocations were necessary during the year.

11. Promotion

National President Laurie Connors has continued the tradition of extensive travel to most parts of Australia, promoting the sport and meeting as many shooters as possible. He has visited clubs in Western Australia, South Australia, Victoria, Tasmania, New South Wales, Queensland, and Northern Territory during 1983.

12. Australian Shooting Association

The A.S.A., after the many difficulties experienced in 1982, appointed a new Executive Director in February 1983. He is G. R. (Sam) Smith who came to the job with experience in an industry trade association, and a career as a Commissioned Officer in the R.A.N.

Finances remain a problem for the A.S.A., however new initiatives instituted in the areas of book marketing and supporting memberships have helped somewhat to improve the situation.

Through our affiliation with the A.S.A. we have contact with the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, the Australian Olympic Federation, the South Pacific Shooting Federation, and the U.I.T. (International Shooting Union).

The Association is represented on the A.S.A. Council by Mr R. F. Buchan and the Executive Director.

13. National Headquarters

The Executive Committee decided during the year to shelve indefinitely any plans to proceed with a National Shooting Ground.

A decision was taken however to purchase the property at 8 Main Street, Blackburn, Victoria, currently in use as the National Office. The purchase was negotiated at a very favourable price, and the property lends itself to development some time in the future as it is zoned local business.

No contingent or other liability of the Association has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within a period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the Executive Committee will or may substantially affect the ability of the Association to meet its obligations as and when they fall due.

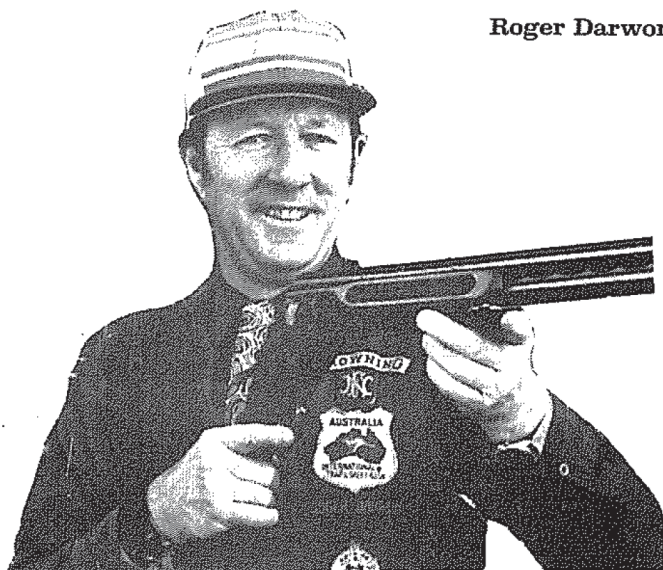

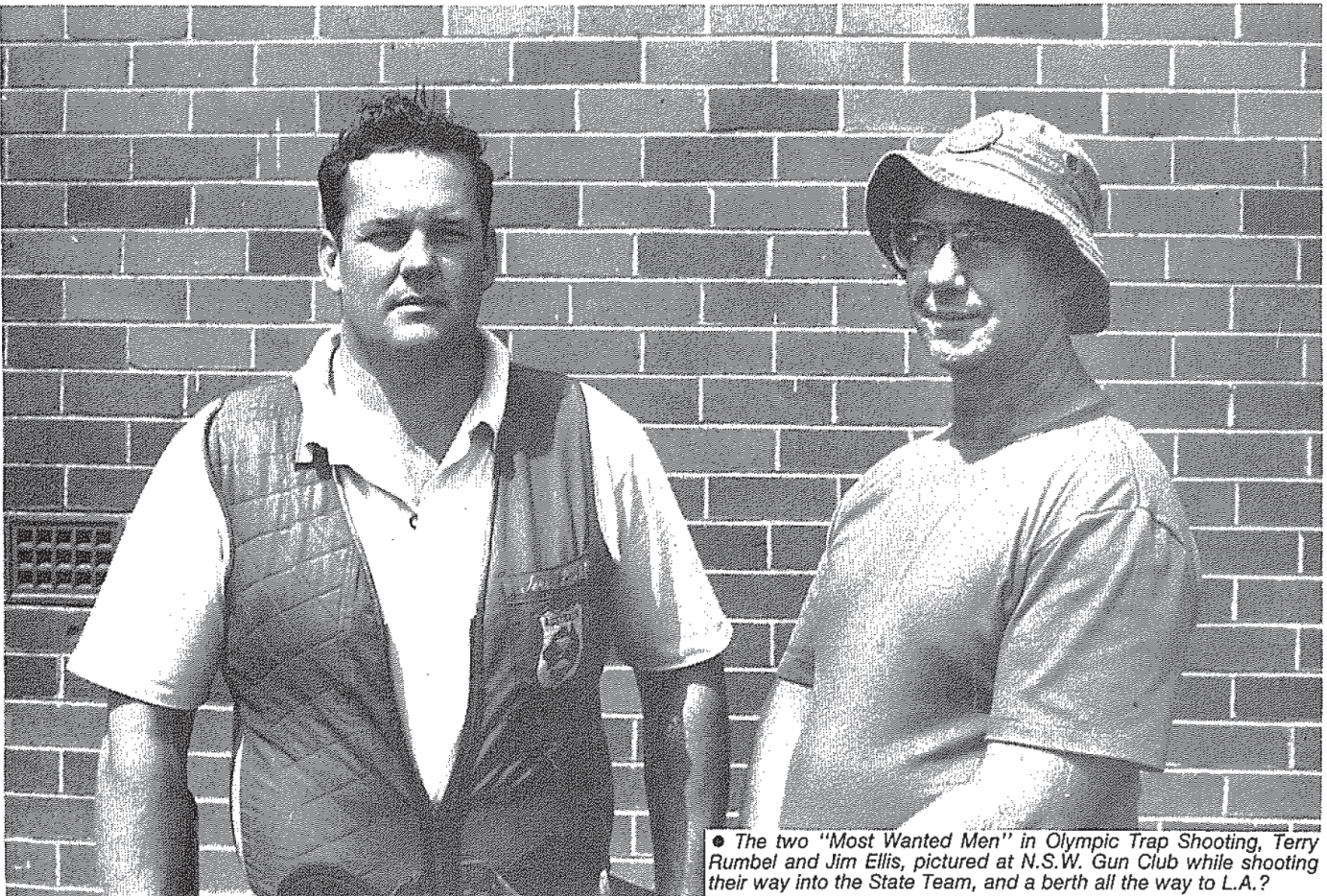

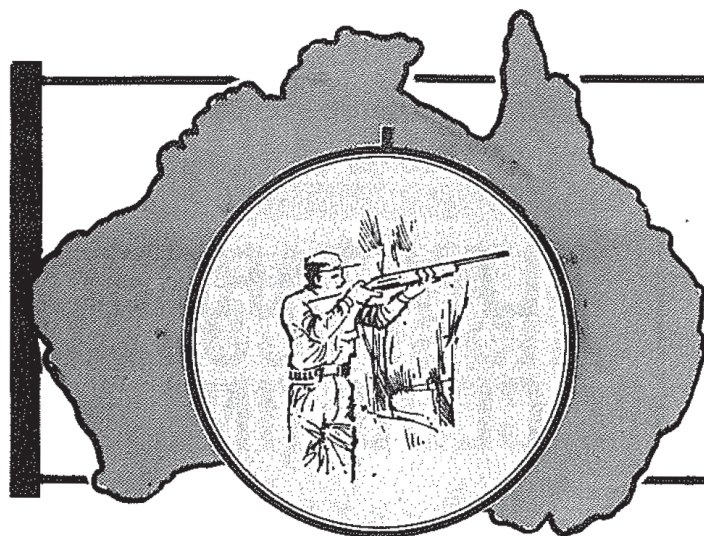

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry in the 1984 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1984 with the Australian Clay Target Association.

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial members of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors **must** produce their 1983 and 1984 registration cards before nominating, to the 1984 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1983 he must produce his 1984 registration card.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the thirty-second Australian Double Barrel Championship, as, in this case, there will be a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship, and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship.

A win or placing in a division or grade does **not** affect the competitor's eligibility for a trophy in another division. **There is only one National Champion resulting from each event.**

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that his or her entry is correctly classified — an indication can be readily found on the daily scoreboard or the progressive scoreboard.

Age Qualifications

Veterans — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on March 31, 1984.

Juniors — are those competitors who, on March 31, 1984 will be under the age of 17 years.

Time of Starting

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30 a.m.

Competitors will be called only once for their squad — any competitor who misses his or her squad without a reasonable excuse shall be penalised one target. All competitors who miss their squads will be re-squadded in the last details

Cartridges

Only cartridges purchased through the A.C.T.A. may be used in National Championships. Nominations include the cost of cartridges for each event, two packets for the Single Barrel and Double Rise Championships, three packets for the Double Barrel, and ANZ Points Championships, and four packets for the Champion of Champions Cup.

Cartridges of the competitors choice may be used in the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, provided that the shotsize is 6 or smaller, and that the total shot load does not exceed 36 grams (1 ¼ oz.).

Targets and Traps

Targets throughout the program will be black and will be supplied by Olmpyc Targets. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electrically operated. The traps used will be Winchester "White Flyers".

Classifications

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that the entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or the High Gun scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, and **open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.**

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Cash Prizes

In all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, cash prizes will be awarded to the overall winner, and to first to fifth place-getters in each grade.

These cash prizes are calculated as follows: **Overall winner** receives 50¢ per nomination in the event. **Grade winners** receive 50¢ per nomination in the particular grade. Second each grade receives 40¢ per nomination in the grade, third 30¢, fourth 20¢, fifth 10¢.

Shoot-Offs, Continuation of Events

In case entries are so numerous that, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the Management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time it considers necessary.

In such a case, the competition will re-commence where it left off, weather permitting, no later than 8.30 a.m. on the next day.

Authority

This program shall control the 1984 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

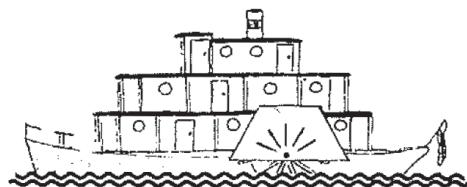

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association I.S.U. Sub-committee conducted two elimination rounds, each of 200 targets, to select a team of three to represent Tasmania in the inter-state team event at the Olympic disciplines Nationals.

The Tasmanian Gun Club, Evandale was the venue for the first round on January 7th and 8th, 1984. Shooting on the first day commenced in ideal conditions and this was reflected in the scores recorded. Possible rounds were scored by Roy Garwood, John Murphy and Robbie Elmer (2) and at the end of the first day John Murphy held a three point lead over his nearest rival.

Due to the small number of shooters in attendance shooting was completed early and shooters adjourned to Murphy's local "watering hole" to refresh themselves. It was here that the southerners issued the challenge — not in the field of clay target shooting but at the pool table. The result — well, all one can say is that as a pool hustler Murphy should stick to shooting.

Day two and although some shooters, plus the book-keeper, were showing the effects of the night before, competition was again very keen. Leon Gray was the only shooter to score a possible but several shooters posted scores of 24.

John Murphy with a score of 190/200 took out the High Gun Award for the first 200 targets.

The second elimination round was conducted at the Hobart Gun Club on January 28th and 29th. Saturday's competition was to select the six member State Trench

NATIONAL ATHLETE AWARD SCHEME GRANTS FOR 1984 ANNOUNCED

One hundred and sixty-five athletes and 16 teams will benefit from grants announced today under the Federal Government's National Athlete Award Scheme.

The Scheme provides awards to world ranked athletes and teams, and to athletes who demonstrate potential to achieve a world ranking, to assist them with the costs associated with competition and training.

In announcing the grants, the Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism, Mr John Brown, said that the doubling of funds for the scheme this year to \$500,000 had enabled the Government to substantially increase the number of awards to our top sportsmen and sports-women and also to increase the value of the awards.

Although the majority of funds have been allocated to our world ranked athletes and prospective Olympic performers, 66 awards have also been made to our young, talented athletes, a 300% increase over last year. Mr Brown said that this increased emphasis on our potential athletes was part of a longer term program aimed at the 1986 Commonwealth Games and the 1988 Olympics.

The awards are spread across a large number of sports from the most popular to the smaller, developing sports such as Ice Skating and Trampolining.

Mr Brown said that the increase in the number and value of the awards demonstrated the Government's commitment to the promotion of sport generally, and its support for the nation's outstanding athletes.

"Sport has traditionally occupied a prominent place in Australia," Mr Brown said. "Nothing has underlined this more than the high level of interest in all the major sporting events which have taken place in Australia this summer.

"Our athletes are often centre-stage overseas, and these grants reflect the pride Australians feel for their sporting representatives who, after all, are among our country's greatest Ambassadors."

Among those receiving awards are Gary Honey, Darren Clark, Glynis Nunn and Sally Pierson, athletes ranked in the top eight of the world; swimmers Anna McVann, Angela Russell and Lisa Curry; world champion windsurfers Robert Wilmot, Greg Hyde and Thomas Luedecke; world squash champions Vicki Cardwell and Robyn Friday and world champions in Gliding, Hang Gliding, Powerlifting, Waterskiing and Surfing.

Mr Brown said that the awards help to compensate athletes for the high cost associated with their sporting careers. Awards are generally paid to the national sporting bodies for their disbursement to the individual athletes.

Sixteen teams will also be assisted including Netball and Men's Hockey, both current world champions. Mr Brown said team awards were designed to assist national sporting teams to achieve a high level of international performance. Team members could also be compensated for costs incurred in training and competition as was the case for individual athletes.

Award levels for individuals range from \$1,500 to \$5,000 depending on the ranking achieved and the team awards are from \$5,000 to \$30,000 depending on team size and performance achieved.
