The 48th Annual General Meeting of the Association was held at the Wagga Boat Club on Friday March 30.

The Accounts, Balance Sheet, and all reports were accepted without question, and the meeting quickly moved to item 5 of the Agenda, Special Business.

This was a notice of motion from New South Wales to recommend alteration to the Articles of Association, to have the make-up of the Executive Committee changed to reflect registered shooter numbers in the States. The motion called for each State to have one Executive Committee member per thousand registered shooters or part thereof, with a maximum of three.

A very spirited debate took place, with the Companies Act being frequently quoted, adjournments, polls being called for etc., until the motion was defeated 64 in favour 93 against.

The turnout for the A.G.M. was the biggest for some years, prompted no doubt by the contentious matter listed under Special Business.


Orders for the shirts will be accepted until the end of May 1984 and the continuation of the project will be assessed at that time.

NEW SOUTH WALES STAGES GREAT TRAP NATIONALS

The New South Wales Clay Target Association very successfully staged at Wagga Gun Club, March 31 to April 5, the biggest Trap Nationals since 1981.

Many keen observers rated the series the best they had attended. Some of these people had not missed the Nationals in 25 years.

Some of the reasons for the success were as follows: The Organising Committee headed by State President and Tournament Director Rob Parker had meticulously planned the Nationals at many meetings held since June 1983. Barney Rooke as trap mechanic threw excellent targets throughout the week. Len Bird and Peter Mould did top jobs as Shoot Marshal and Assistant. Wagga Gun Club President Bruce Tingle and committee man John Power worked tirelessly in co-operation with the Organising Committee during the Nationals to keep the grounds in top shape. Lastly, but very importantly, the weather was perfect for the nine days of pre-National and National competition.

It all added up to entries being 35% up on Adelaide in 1983 and 9% up on Brisbane in '82, very pleasing for the organisers.

SATURDAY MARCH 31, GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

Ian Anderson from New South Wales Gun Club fired the first shot to get the Handicap underway. The entry totalled 516, 168 more than Adelaide in '83, a big crowd being on the ground by 8 am.

As the day went on the possibles started to appear on the board, most of them around the 15-16 metre mark, with one exception Richard Dean, Roma, Qld from 22 metres. Eight shooters in all carded the 50, with the tussle soon down to three, Bill Powell, Hermidale; Steve Haberman, Geelong; and Richard Dean, Roma. Richard stumbled on his 75th target, Steve his 81st, leaving "Button" Powell, 37 year old mechanic from Nyngan, New South Wales, the winner of the 1984 Grand Australian Handicap with the score of 81/81. Bill was delighted to receive the Remington 1100 shotgun donated by Boustead Australia, the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy together with the royal blue sash, Silver Australia badge, and Perazzi Trophy sponsored by Evans and Balfour. Winners of the Hercules Powder in the metreage groups donated by Fuller Firearms, were: 11-15m Garry Lynam, Sydney; 16m Ray Collins, Nepean; 17m Tony Long, Ipswich; 18m Mark Rogers, Echuca; 19m Christine Wakefield, Mildura; 20m Peter Srbinovski, Illawarra; 21m Tony Bradshaw, Victoria; 22-25m Jim Finis, Mildura.

SUNDAY APRIL 1, DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

An entry of 594, 43% up on Adelaide. Again the weather was perfect, cloudless sky, no wind, high 20's temperature. The Wagga background is good at any time; with these conditions and the perfect targets it was no surprise to see at day's end 79 possibles squadded for the shoot-off. After a couple of laps of the ten traps it was soon down to three shooters, the 1982 winner Larry Dimasi from Mildura, Gary McDonald from Griffith, and Stan Collins, Melbourne.


Stan's fine display of sportsmanship when he raised his arm to signify he had seen a chip from Larry's target after Larry had turned to leave the tracks, brought a warm murmur of approval from the large crowd. Finally Larry Dimasi succumbed on his 263rd target to leave it a match in two.

Shoot Marshal Len Bird called a halt when the light started to go. Gary McDonald and Stan Collins had shot 380 at this stage, the contest being adjourned until 8.30 am Monday.

A large crowd gathered in the morning to witness the completion. of the shoot-off. Chairs were carefully positioned to absorb the warm morning sun, all vantage points were taken. It was something of an anti-climax when Stan Collins missed his third target, leaving Gary McDonald the winner of the 32nd Australian Double Barrel Championship.

It was ironic that early on the Sunday morning Gary had looked at the display of trophies for the Double Barrel Championship, and remarked that this was the closest he would ever be to them. Full marks to him for a fine sustained performance to win the blue riband of Australian shotgunning, with 383/383.

He was delighted with the cased Diamond Grade shotgun courtesy Winchester Australia, the J.M. Wilson Perpetual Cup, the Silver Australia badge, royal blue sash, and Perazzi Trophy sponsored by Evans and Balfour.

In the grades Stan Collins, Melbourne topped "AA" with 382/383, Larry Dimasi Mildura A Grade 262/263, Dean Freundt, Barmera, B Grade 121/122, and Junior Peter Wilson, Tatura, C Grade 105/106. Bill Bamford of Werribee was top veteran on 48/50. The 4th Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship was run in conjunction with the open event and resulted in a win for Vickie Deeley from Gemfields, Qld, with a score of 63/64. Vickie received the June Gawith Perpetual Trophy, the Silver Australia badge, royal blue sash and crystal bowl. Second was Maree Rooke, Wagga 62/64, and third Pam Wass, Morwell.

MONDAY APRIL 2, SINGLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP


Entries were 496, 119 up on Adelaide the previous year. Weather still perfect, targets the same.





The points were added up, seven down made the team to shoot in the morning for the Mackintosh trophy against the other countries.










National Double Rise Champion 1984, Bill Iles.






The Val and Fred Horton trophy for the oldest competitor went again to Jim Medway of Gunning/Dalton, who turns 93 in a few days.



Hugh Eley, writer for the Capetown "Herald", reports that the olay target shooting of Zimbabwe is in complete jeopardy because NO FOREIGN currency is available to import pitch which, as we all know, is vital for the ingredient, in the manufacture of the clay target. The Clay Target Association of Zimbabwe have already been forced to cancel their National trench and skeet championships. "We have not been able to shoot at the Mashonaland Gun Club for quite some time," said CPSAZ spokesman Jerry Cole, "and our future looks bleak." He went on to say, "The last pitch has been used up and we cannot get the application for foreign currency, as this has been rejected by the Reserve Bank."

It is estimated there are 300 clay target shooters in Zimbabwe, about two-thirds of whom belong to the Mashonaland Gun Club. Ammunition costs \$10 their value for 25 cartridges but without clays the sport has come to a full stop.

Perhaps when we all stop complaining about our own problems here in our Australian land of milk and honey, we might just some way come up with an idea to help out our African neighbours??

Fifteen-year-old Bendigo junior shooter, Kenny Bell won the Australia Day Handicap and secured first prize of an MEC 650 reloader at the Bendigo Clay Target Club. The event was top of the bill on the club's annual Australia Day shoot, which was held on the Monday of the holiday weekend, and attracted 102 shooters.

Shooters faced a fierce head wind, on which many targets proved elusive, dancing in the air like puppets on a string.

First event of the day was the 20 targets Points Score Championship in which seven shooters returned a onepoint-down (59/60) scorecard. Shoot-off targets proved to be even more elusive, as all shooters but one, had failed again in the space of seven more targets. Alf James' 80/81 was the overall winner from Peter Akkermans (77/81) in second place in A grade. B grade was won by Russ Young with 57/60, ahead of Rohan Penn (56/60), while Steve Catena (71/78) and Kenny Bell (70/78) were the placegetters in C grade.

Main event — the 20 targets Handicap — was contested in 3 metreage groups. Only three possibles of 20/20 were returned. Kenny Bell, Len Downie and Eric Bullmore shot-off for the overall win, which was decided in favour of Bell, after Bullmore missed his first target and Downie missed his second. Downie collected the Frontmarkers division prize, Bullmore secured the Middlemarkers, and Terry Boucher, who had scored 18/20, was the winner in the Backmarkers section.

The 25 targets Double Barrel Championship saw eight shooters with solid scores after the 17 squads had shot. The shoot-off for overall honours saw Terry Boucher and junior shooter Dean Woodhatch the last two standing, and on the "nervous" ninth target, both missed their quarry, and let the other shooter off-the-hook. Boucher ultimately won the event on target eleven, taking the A grade prize as well as the overall sash, ahead of Tony Penney, second in A grade. Rohan Penn lasted one more target, in the shoot-off, than Ken Burton, and each won a B grade prize. Dean Woodhatch was the C grade winner with Greg McQuillan placed second in the grade. Fay Taylor was best lady shooter with 23/25, and won in that section.

The Single Barrel Championship, over 20 targets, saw Ken Bruns, Mark Rogers and Jack Haw the only shooters with solid scores, and subsequently shoot-off for the overall win. Bruns was out — first target, and settled for second in A grade. Haw missed his third — to collect the B grade win, leaving Rogers — a 16-year-old from northern Victoria — with A grade and overall. Ken Burton's 19/20 was second in B grade, while Greg McQuillan's 17/20 and Wayne McCarthy's 17/21 were winners in C grade.

The Mixed Distances 15 target novelty event for cash prizes saw three solid scores from Ken Burton, Norm Lindrea and Steve Hemley share the cash.

High Gun awards were presented for aggregate scores over events 1, 2, 3 and 4 on the day's program. In the "Open" section, a creditable score of 120/125 was a winner for Rob Ross, who remarkably had not collected a prize all day in the individual events. Junior (C grade) High Gun was won by Kenny Bell, with a score of 110/125.




CLAY TARGET SHOOTERS HIT THE HEADLINES IN GRIFFITH, N.S.W.

Mt Isa is a mining city situated in the north-west of Queensland, approximately 1900 kilometres from Brisbane. We have most shooting sports represented in the city with an active big bore, pistol, air rifle, SSAA and our ACTA-affiliated Mt Isa gun club.
