

# A BEGINNER'S GUIDE TO SHOTGUNNING

Roger Darwon



The number of new shooters taking to shotguns is growing rapidly, but once the decision is made to buy a shotgun, many new shooters face a long list of confusing problems.

Everything these days is so technically advanced we tend to take the perfection of the shotgun and its loads for granted. Yet that "perfection" has been developed in a remarkably short time. We need go back only a few years to find when it was measured in terms of massive fowling pieces, thousands of which are still around.

In fact, during the ammunition shortage around World War 2, many of the old guns were brought back into use to provide family meals in times of need. The sportsmen who dug them out from garages, wood sheds and other well-appointed repositories found them pretty tough to handle — a far cry from modern weapons. Shot-gunners sat down to ponder how the old-timers developed such outstanding skill with the clumsy old blunderbusses. Many, particularly in the late 1800s, scored only a shade poorer than some of the best we know today.

But gunmakers have developed their craft considerably since those days of the swayback cannons, and beginners now have it relatively easy. Let's take a close look at the basics of the art of shot-gunning.

It all starts with correct selection of the gun and the shell for the work you have in mind. The range appears endless — and it's growing every year. Today's keyword is specialisation, and there's no such thing as the allround gun or load for all types of shot-gunning.

First we'll look over the gun types, barrel lengths and bores (barrel diameters) to give the learner some idea of the selection open to him. It's a vast subject — too big to be covered fully in one article — and before I get peppered from all angles I'd better point out that individual

preference plays a big part in any choice. The views expressed by me or any group of experienced shooters or shot-gunners will doubtless be widely divergent, especially in matters of shell loads and gun chokes. In fact, wherever hunters and clay-target shooters gather, shotguns and their loads will always monopolise the conversation.

Before you buy a gun, consider whether your budding J. Newton Thomas is large for his age, or slight. What action type should you consider — an inexpensive single shot with the idea of trading up later, or a more expensive pump or double that the beginner will still be satisfied with 10 years from now? Then, for that matter, how much money can you afford? Do you re-load, which can make a difference in the gauge you should select? Also what kind of hunting do you have in mind? Or perhaps you intend trap shooting?

Chances are a youngster or a small person will not be comfortable with a full-sized stock. "Elementary, my dear Watson", did I hear someone mutter? You'd be surprised at the number of under-sized runts I see every year pushed into an over-sized stock. Fortunately Winchester, Harrington and Richardson, Savage, Ithaca and many others offer break-open single shot beginners' models, with stocks which are from 25 to 50mm shorter than the 355mm length of pull regarded as "standard" by most adult shooters. But almost any shotgun stock can be cut back if need be. While you're at it you could install a rubber butt plate or recoil pad to finish the job.

The break-open single barrel shotgun has several things going for it as a first gun. To begin with, it's safe. It can hold only one load at a time, thus minimising the chance of an accidental discharge from that "empty" magazine. Most models have external hammers that must be cocked before the gun can be fired, so you can see at a glance how safe the gun is. As well, when the action is "broken", or open (as it should be when you're carrying the gun and crossing barriers), there is no way it can be fired.


The single is also usually well-balanced, in contrast to the muzzle-heavy pump or autoloader with its under-the-barrel magazine, which can be most awkward for a teenage shotgunner to swing and shoot. A weightforward gun tends to pull a new or small shooter off balance, and trying to hold such a gun in a proper firing position will quickly tire the young muscles. But if the new gunner is well enough developed to handle the heavier shotgun, so much the better.

Next, let's consider shotgun types and bores. Some of the terms can be daunting to the uninitiated, so I'll try to explain as we go along. Standard shotguns made today

include the single-barrel, single shot — typically the young boy's or beginner's first gun. There is another single shot on the market, a special for single barrel trap shooting.

Next is the old standard, the double barrel. Its barrels are side by side and operated by either one (recoil or perhaps mechanical) trigger, or two triggers. Usually, each barrel has a different choke (a slight restriction, or narrowing in the muzzle-end of the barrel), with the second barrel choked tighter to give a narrower pattern for longer range shots. It will shoot two shots at a time.

Then we have the over/under, also a double barrel, with one barrel above the other. The pump or slide action gun usually holds from three to six shots in a magazine. Ejection of the fired case and chambering of the fresh shell is by moving the handgrip beneath the gun's single barrel.

The automatic is also a single barrel arm with a magazine which holds from three to five shells. It should really be called a semi-automatic, as you have to pull the trigger for each shot. The term automatic really means a weapon that will fire a number of rounds with one single pull of the trigger—and they're illegal. There are two types of actions in semi-auto shotguns—spring-loaded and gas operated.

You can't really say one type of gun is better than the other. Each has its advantages and its limitations, but the single-barrel/single-shot is best for the beginner. The double guns give the shooter two different chokes, or shot patterns, in the one gun or their barrels are in two gauges, giving the shooter a very handy outfit. The repeaters throw only one single pattern, so choke must be something of a compromise. But they offer as many as six shots, which should give even the worst shot time to recover.

There are six standard sizes of shotgun bores — 10, 12, 16, 20 and 28 gauge, and .410 bore. The 10 and 28 gauges are seldom used outside America, so the Australian shotgunner is virtually restricted to four gauges. The words gauge and bore refer to the internal diameter of the barrel. The gun's gauge is based upon the number of round lead balls of a single size that will weigh one pound. Thus, a gun is said to be a 12 gauge when a ball which exactly fits the bore weighs one twelfth of a pound; one sixteenth pound for a 16 gauge shotgun and so on. Just to be difficult in the case of the little .410, a different standard of measurement is used. This figure represents the actual diameter of the bore measured in thousandths of an inch.

Most modern shotgun barrels are 660, 710 or 762mm long. The individual shooter's needs and preferences govern choice. Greater barrel length does not necessarily increase the effectiveness of Australian shotgun shells. Improved sighting obtained over a longer tube, or easier handling of the shorter barrels have little or nothing to do with the velocity or killing power of the shot charge. Modern smokeless powder burns much faster than the old black powder used to, so shorter barrels don't mean sacrificing velocity.

The choke controls the way your shot is grouped on a target. At its greatest the amount of choke in a shotgun barrel is measured only in some cases in thousandths of an inch. The table shows the percentage of pattern (shot) which would be thrown within a 75cm circle at 40m by varying degrees of choke.

Which pattern will suit you? The factor determining the right pattern is the distance at which you shoot your game or clay targets. (For the moment, we'll disregard shot size, which should vary with the different types of game). Few shotgunners can point true enough to kill game regularly at long ranges. For most 40 to 45m should be the limit at which they should attempt to shoot at game.

You'll note I said "point true". That's just what you do with a gun — you point it. You don't aim as in rifle shooting. Most beginners start out aiming their new shotgun, and they have a hard time until they master the new style.

The best possible pattern for any shooter is one which covers the largest possible area of a target yet maintains a density that will not allow the game through without being killed, or clay target to get away without a kill. The average new chum uses shot that's too heavy for the job. He assumes heavier shot will kill more game. That's not the case — heavier (larger) shot has fewer pellets to the charge, which means a more open pattern. A duck, for instance, could get through such a pattern, or, far worse, become a lost cripple. Therefore you owe it to yourself and to the game you hunt to know the pattern density of your shot before you start shooting.

Work it out by shooting several test patterns on paper at around 40 metres. A word of advice though — draw your 75cm circle around the pattern after you have fired it onto the paper. That way you'll get a true picture of the pattern.

Next, let's look at the shot size recommended for use on common game, and I suggest you study this well. It pays to keep a selection of loads of varying shot size at hand when you're gunning for game, as you never know what you'll see next.



Ducks	4 to 7
Pheasants	5 to 7
Grouse	6 to 7½
Rabbit	6 to 8
Quail	7½, 8, 9

The pheasant, a comparatively large bird, is a good example to work on. The vital spots are the head, neck and thoracic cavity (where the neck joins the bird's body). They cover a small area — much smaller than you think at proper shooting range. Relatively small shot will kill the pheasant.

You must hit the vital parts. You can shoot through a pheasant's body with reasonably heavy shot, but if you miss the three vital parts it's a good chance you'll never see that pheasant again after it hits the ground. It will die later, but you'll have failed to add it to your bag and inflicted unnecessary suffering.

As a good guide, a clay target shot at, say, 40m with 3 drams of powder — 31.5g of 7½ shot — should be able to kill any duck or pheasant which is anywhere near the



centre of the pattern.

Long ago trap shooters learned that full choke guns prevent "dusted" targets — those that dart through holes in load patterns. And the same thing holds true in the field. You must keep that shot charge in a tight bunch, to hit your game with enough pellets to make good clean kills. On the other hand you'll have more misses with your full choke gun, but they will be clean misses. A more open bore will nick the game, probably crippling it, and allowing it to escape. And that's poor shooting in anybody's book.

I often find new chums trying to kill game with the tiny .410 bore. Without under-selling this beaut little gauge, I must say that only a few hunters are good enough to kill game with it. It takes a real expert with plenty of gunning experience to make good kills with the little banger. A shooter who tries to kill ducks, pheasant, and medium game birds with the little .410, unless he is an expert, reminds me of a big game hunter going after elk

or deer with a .22 rifle.

All things considered, I'd choose the 20g as the ideal gun for someone about to go into the world of shot-gunning. If you happen to buy one with 76mm chambers, it can be fed an astounding variety of ammo ranging from, say, powder-puff 24.5g field loads up to 35g 76mm magnums which are capable of giving the standard 12 gauge a run for its money. (But you can expect the magnum shell to kick in the light little 20, so don't start off with the big ones.)


Chosen wisely, a shotgun will be a life-time investment. Once you've bought it, join a clay target club. They will make you welcome, and help you learn all the gun safety and gun manners which will make shotgunning for you,

a really enjoyable experience.



The other possibles went to Ellis (two) and John Maxwell, Australian representative who won the New Zealand Olympic Trap National Championship in Christchurch last August.


On the second day Narrandera's John Blain scored one round of 25/25, while Ellis scored a 50/50, as did Australian representative Stan Collins of Bairnsdale,


There was a very strong Victorian contingent with Hale and Crikis the Olympic representatives, as well as several Australian Team representatives.

# GLENN WOODHATCH



For the second year in succession Barellan's Sportsperson of the Year Award has been won by a shooter.


Neville Sheehan, along with his wife Maureen, were both nominated by the Barellan Gun Club for their achievements in the sport of clay target shooting.




On the weekend of 27-28 April, Wakehurst Gun Club again played host to police shooters competing in the Annual New South Wales Police Games.




Thirty astute shooters turned out more to compete with the wind than with each other, and so started the 1984 State Titles.

At the end of the first one hundred targets the respective leaders were yours truly, Chas Riegert on 92/100 from John Kevill and John Harris on 90/100. After this there was a gaggle of shooters on 87/100. Not what one would call good scores for a State Title.

With squads listed for Sunday, it was decided to put the starting time back to 10 o'clock.

Sunday was a cool repetition of Saturday, but without the cloud.


The Club Committee had the previous evening drawn lots from the hat and the programme changed from number 3 to number 6. This programme was queried by some shooters as it was the programme practised during the previous week. However the draw remained.

Contrary to last year's results, there was no Royal Plunge into oblivion by the early leaders.

At the completion of the first fifty targets for the day, taking the total shot at (mind you, I said shot AT, not shot) to 150, the State Team was a foregone conclusion.

The 1984 State Trench Team and results are: Chas Riegert 140/150, John Harris 137/150, John Kevill 136/150, David Kevill 132/150, Gordon Beard 131/150, Total 676/750.

In conjunction with the first 150 targets, the Interclub teams event, the Ray McPharlin Perpetual Shield, was competed for. For the fifth year in a row the C.M.T. team of D. Kevill, J. Kevill, J. Harris, K. Hopkins and R. Thomson won the Shield. However, the C.M.T. number two team gave them one hell of a scare this year, being only seven targets behind. Next year it will be a different story. Apart from three C.M.T. teams, the three other teams consisted of Collie (the only other Club to field a full team), and composite teams from E.G.G.C., Esperance, Geraldton, Perth, Azzuri and Northam.

At this stage it looked as though Chas Riegert with a three target lead over the nearest competitor was the next State Trench title holder.

This was not to be so. Chas carded his next round of 22/25 while John Harris returned 24/25. One target the difference in Chas's favour with one round left to go. Oh those holes. Once you fall in one you just can't get out. Another round of 22/25 for Chas and John only has to return another 24/25 to win his second State Trench Title, precisely what happened. Congratulations John. It's finishes like this that create spectator interest. Not that they are planned by any stretch of the imagination.


Several points of interest over the weekend come to mind. The first being the very low scores returned by all shooters. 15-16 targets down in a two hundred target event of National calibre wouldn't win a "chokky frog" to put it bluntly. I think that these results would probably be a lot better if this event was run at a later stage in the year.

A very strong bone of contention at this Club is the lack of support, especially in the I.S.U. disciplines, by other Clubs for State Titles held at Cunderdin. Without fail, every major two-day shoot held by any other Club, ranging from Leonora to Geraldton to Esperance, and every Club in between, has a contingent of at least five to six Cunderdin competitors. Over this two-day shoot for a major State Title, the only Clubs in attendance apart from the host Club were: Esperance: Merve Tester; E.G.G.C.: Merve/Jim Neve, Max Bell; Perth: Robin Bailey and Lex Shipp; Azzurri: Murray Alexander and Andy Waschenko; Geraldton: Wally Johns and Roy Hopkins; Collie: M. Cubic, B. McCrystal, D. Fox, N. Dowey, and I

must apologise to their fifth shooter as I didn't get his name.

I believe that Clubs such as Bunbury, Albany, Narrogin and Katanning could at LEAST be able to organise a couple of shooters from their respective Clubs to attend a State Title. Clubs the size of Perth and Azzurri, a total membership around the three hundred mark, can only field four shooters. It's not as though Cunderdin is on the eastern seaboard of the country and you definitely don't need an air fare to get here. Let's hope we can improve on the attendance figures in the future.

# ST. GEORGE GUN CLUB

VENUE FOR THE WESTERN ZONE Q.C.T.A. 7th ANNUAL TRAP CARNIVAL To be held on July 14 & 15, 1984

The St. George Gun Club was formed in September 1936 and was one of the first gun clubs to affiliate with the A.C.T.A. outside Victoria.

In October 1937 the club held its first Annual Shoot, advertised as "Open Clay Pigeon Handicap — 1937 — Double Barrel Clay Bird Championship of Queensland, conducted under the auspices of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association". The St. George Gun Club had just purchased its first automatic angle trap, an Eley, from I.C.I.

The club went into recess for the Second World War and held its first Annual General Meeting to re-establish the St. George Gun Club in November 1945. The St. George Gun Club has shot each year since.

St. George is situated in the Balonne Shire which has an area of 31,183 square kilometres and is important pastorally, as over 1,000,000 sheep and over 140,000

beef cattle are depastured within its borders.

The Balonne River is well known for its fishing (cod over 30kg being caught), and the broad expanses, created by the weir at the town and the E. J. Beardmore Dam (21km upstream), are ideal for water skiing and sailing, etc.

Major Mitchell gave St. George its name when he crossed the river on St. George's Day (April 23rd) in 1846. A claim marks his crossing place. The district now comprising the Balonne Shire was first officially explored in 1846 by Sir Thomas Mitchell, Surveyor-General of New South Wales.

The Balonne-Condamine river system extends for some 1000km above St. George, with a total catchment area of some 70,000 square km. The rainfall over the catchment varies from 490mm at St. George to over 1270mm on the Great Dividing Range to the east of Warwick. The Balonne system is not perennial, but because of its huge catchment area flooding below Dirranbandi can be caused by heavy rain around Warwick.

The entire shire is underlain by the Great Artesian Basin. Generally, the water is of good quality, being suitable for all uses except irrigation. The majority of bores are 600-900 metres deep, with some as deep as 1050 metres. By arrangement with property owners it is possible to bag a wild pig or kangaroo, and also in season some nice black ducks can be taken. The popular yellow belly and Murray cod fish also abound in the rivers.

Amongst the clubs and amenities offered to the tourist in the Balonne Shire are golf, tennis, bowls, football, cricket, squash, rifle and gun clubs. There is also a motorcycle club, youth club and the usual service clubs such as Apex, Rotary and Lions, and for the ladies the Q.C.W.A., Red Cross and Hospital Auxiliary. A pistol club holds competitions. St. George boasts an Olympic sized swimming pool and the local jockey club was the first club in south-west Queensland to have the photo finish, together with its mobile starting stalls.

St. George is well known as one of the larger towns in Australia not on a railway. While this had its drawbacks in earlier days it meant the air was always clean (and it still is!). Bitumen roads and modern transport enable the town to be serviced daily from Brisbane, a distance of some 530km. An air service operates four times per week to Brisbane, Dalby and Goondiwindi. St. George has a reasonable shopping centre together with first-class motels, hotels and other amenities.

Irrigation in the St. George district was contemplated as early as 1922. In 1946 it was decided to build a weir at St. George for town water supply and to provide an initial storage for irrigation in the area. Large areas of land were cleared and by the early 1970s some 52,000ha were under the plough. The irrigation area has demonstrated its suitability for a large range of crops, chief of which is cotton. Other include sunflowers, soya beans and grain cereals.

As is the custom at all water storages constructed by the Queensland Water Resources Commission, picnic shelters, barbecues, toilets and playground facilities are provided in attractive park-like settings adjacent to the E. J. Beardmore Dam.

So, shooters near and far, if you would like to enjoy a great weekend of Clay Target Shooting, and perhaps put in a few more days fishing or hunting, pack up your gear and head out to the Western Zone Trap Carnival being held on July 14 and 15 at St. George in south-west Queensland.



Overall High Gun was won by Tim Catling who goes home with the Sheepskin coat from W.A. Woolcombers Pty. Ltd.




 Darryl Shenton receiving the Winchester Shotgun from the President, Hugh Burchard.
