CONTINUING THE HISTORY OF OUR SPORT IN WORDS AND PICTURES

Australia's first registered clay target club. The Nobel Clay Bird Club.

The club first came into being through the efforts of a small band of enthusiastic clay target shooters who, in 1926, decided that they would prefer to shoot clay birds rather than live birds. And so after several months of fun shooting in a quarry at the back of I.C.I., a factory in West Footscray, a Melbourne suburb, it was decided that all the back of I.C.I. a club should be formed. History was made on Friday September 9, 1927 when at a meeting, held at 380 Collins Street, Melbourne, decided to form Australia's first clay pigeon shooting club. It was to be known as the "Nobel Clay Bird Club".

Prior to the Nobel Club being formed, small groups of shooters in various places would run what could be called fun shoots, using more or less their own rules of competition. One of the more prominent of these clubs was the Victoria Clay Bird Club. This club used a piece of land adjacent to a market garden in Bentleigh, a south eastern suburb of Melbourne. Nobel and Victoria Clubs were actually the two pioneer clubs. They merged in October 1939 and used the Nobel grounds. Shooting continued until several months after War was declared. In the years between 1927 and 1936 numerous clay bird clubs were formed. They were affiliated with what

was known as the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria. This

was a live bird shooting body with headquarters at the original Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham.

original Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham.

1936 was the year when Australia really began to shoot clay targets in an organised manner. Up to this time clay target shooting was controlled by the Live Bird Association and for obvious reasons it was apparent that we had to control our own type of trap shooting.

At a meeting called to discuss the matter, it was decided to proceed in this direction. It was agreed that the name of the Association would be "Clay Target Shooter's Association of Victoria"

2. Horace James

First President of the "Clay Target Shooters Association of Victoria". Horrie as he was known to every shooter was instrumental in clay target shooting being established in Australia.

He was responsible for the formation of Nobel club in 1927 and continued to be involved until it ceased to function when War broke out in 1939.



SIR S. ARGYLE AS TRAP SHOT

Anquetil Sets Record For Shoot-off

ALTHOUGH he did not win any prizes, Sir Stanley Argyle, who was a competitor at the Nobel Clay Bird Club's competitions on Saturday, showed he knew how to handle a gun.

Presenting the trophies to prize-winners, he said he was particularly impressed with the shooting of W. Delaney, 14½, of Burwood, who won the five-bird walk up

from 19 competitors with five straight.

B. Anquetil created a record for a shoot-off at clay birds by breaking 39 targets in succession in the ten-bird event for the Jock Wilson Cup, and was carried off the ground. His great total included only seven second-barrel shots.


Gloucester Cup

SHOUBRA came second with 38-39 (seven second barrels also), and G. Next scores with 17-18. Next scores Vipond third with 17-18. Next scores were H. A. Tilburn 16-18, and W. Tilburn 15-16.


The second big event was the Duke of Gloucester Cup at 15 birds and was won by Shoubra with the fine total of 15 straight.

The cup is held in perpetuity by the club, and each year a replica is presented to the winner. W. Tilburn was second with 17-18, and Col. E. K. Smart third with 16-18.

3. Donald Mackintosh Mr Mackintosh was perhaps the first Australian shooter to make a name for Australia and himself overseas. He was principal of the Melbourne Sporting Goods and Gun Shop of Donald Mackintosh P/L. His firm together with I.C.I. Ammunition Co. contributed greatly to the early development of our sport of clay target shooting.



4. Duke of Gloucester Cup Presented to Nobel Club 1935. It is one of the first perpetual trophies donated for clay target shooting. The cup is still being competed for annually by Frankston/Australia Gun Club.

Unfortunately my attempts to find an early picture of the cup have not been successful. The above picture was taken 22 years later where it was being contested at the Australian Gun Club, Burwood. Conditions of shoot off were that it be contested from handicap marks. The winner was myself with a score of 30/30 from 27 yards.

Joe Harle is doing the presentation.

It was the Australian Gun Club that came into being at Burwood and incorporated both Nobel and Blackburn Gun Club.



and on occasions even today they still are.







Frankston Australia Gun Club. Frankston Australia introduced the "FUN" into the sport, shooters have been seeking for some time. Brian Bond, along with the committee and members of his club have introduced what they call "FLUSH SHOOTING". The shooter response has been tremendous according to Graham Ash, their club President. So much so, the club committee is looking at other types of novelty shooting, in an endeavour to increase shooter attendance.

My observation of the 50 target "FLUSH" event, with a case of shells as first prize contested on this day, convinced me they are on a winner. The event consists of teams of three shooters facing five targets released simultaneously.

Three shooters stand at, or near the 25m mark, in specially erected safety cages, approximately 2m apart. Five targets are released simultaneously, one from skeet high and low houses, and a pair from a trap set to the left hand side of the shooters, and one target coming from a trap set directly in front of the shooters, with the target flight being towards and over the competitors heads.

There is no problem as far as the safety aspect is concerned, and very little expense is required to set it up. Teams can re-nominate once in the event if they wish. giving them an opportunity to improve their score. Nominations rolled in, and organizers faced difficulty in getting the event completed before failing light. There were some strong teams entered, however M. Inguanti. D. Cunningham and A. Sutherland recorded 140/150 to take the honours. Eighty-two shooters were recorded in the attendance register, and it is some time since the club has had the pleasure of entertaining so many at a club shoot. In the other events on the programme, Fred Heinze shot 60/60 to win the Points Championship, Terry Boucher from Bendigo made it a double, collecting both the single with 22/22 and the Double Barrel honours with 70/70. 





PRODUCT REVIEW



THE HULL COMPETITION 12 GAUGE, HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

It was in 1924 in the United Kingdom that Mr. S. Bontoft first hit upon the idea for the beginning of what today is the HULL Cartridge Co. At first he simply had cartridges loaded in small quantities, for sale around the farming community, and from those humble beginnings the Hull Company was soon to grow. Sydney Bontoft's youngest son Peter, joined the firm when he was discharged from the army in 1948.

By 1963 together with another son Ken, who had spent his early years in the R.A.F. as an engineer, joined the family and todays operation of the Hull Cartridge Company got into full swing. By 1967 Hugh Clarke joined Hull as sales director and with his knowledge of the trade in the United Kingdom bigger things started to take on the market place.


In the early days of Hull Cartridge Co, and because of their early beginnings their general policy from past trading was to supply direct to the shooting man.

As its founder Sydney Bontoft had started in this way, they found this arrangement worked well at first, but growing pains made it obvious that, if Hull was to expand and meet the growth challenge to any extent it would be necessary to supply the trade, thus bringing Hull into contention as a top line range of shotgun cartridges. This system was adopted and the company has grown from strength to strength.

In 1957 Hull Cartridge Co, were appointed the sole distributors in the United Kingdom, for the American, Remington Arms Co Inc. Also in their loading operations Hull had been buying empty primed cartridge cases from Fiocchi Munizioni of Italy, and in 1968 Hull Cartridge Co secured their second big agency by being appointed the sole distributors for the giant Italian cartridge company throughout the U.K. Fiocchi products that Hull merchandise include empty primed cases, also 12 gauge trap cartridges; which includes nickel shot, 12 gauge skeet, 28 gauge, 410 gauge 2" and 2½" plus the 9mm Flobert and, 22 ammunition, also the Pardini free pistol and Pardini air pistols.

While Mr. Peter Bontoft, pointed out to C.T.N. previewer the company's main concentration is on the production of plastic cased cartridges, Hull still receive a considerable demand for their original and traditional paper casing loads. Reason for this is that many shooters still prefer the look and feel of the paper shell, and another feature Peter was quick to add was ecologically, the paper case discarded by field shooters will rot down and not litter the place.

Today Hull Cartridge Company cater for a wide aspect of shotgun shooting needs and amongst the shells made and available are the following loadings 12 gauge, 16 gauge, 20 gauge. These are made in competition loads for the clay target shooter and also a wide range of loads for the field shooter. For testing purposes Hull have their own 40 yard test range and pattern facility, which also incorporates pressure testing on all their gauges and loadings. All velocity is measured on the Hull Co's electronic computer system.

Peter Bontoft was quick to also point out another very special service provided by his company, and one which runs parallel with their own brand production. This is their highly successful custom loading service, which in effect offers leading gunmakers and retailers the opportunity to have their own name printed on both the cartridge and the 25 pack carton, which gives them total individuality. Also the company can actually adjust the production to match the exact specifications laid down by each individual customer, CUSTOM needs, in both paper and plastic cases. In effect this means a load will be produced to your requirements, with exactly the power, velocity and patterns requested. Peter explained the service to be a viable proposition is based on a individuals order requirement of 25,000 cartridges per annum. One off orders could be considered on custom loading if the customer was prepared to bear the total expense of the full preparation.

Perhaps today, any visitor entering the modern, well appointed Hull Cartridge Company factory, would find it difficult to believe that behind all the high-technology of the automated loading machines and testing service lies a history that spans back over half a century, when the company founder, the late, Sydney Bontoft (who sadly passed away last year) first started to load 12 gauge cartridges for outlying farmers.

The Company today has grown to over 45 on the workforce, which is headed by the three directors, Ken and Peter Bontoft and Hugh Clark, plus Peter's son and daughter have also joined the business. Average sales of Hull cartridges is now well over 20 million a year, which is not bad when one considers the difficult times over the

VALE — ERIC EVANS

THE PASSING OF A PIONEER OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

In the 1940s Eric Evans was one of the early pioneers of clay target shooting in the Riverina town of Griffith, N.S.W.

Before the change to clay targets the club had shot live birds — a practice which he had deplored and of which he would have no part.

As the township grew, the club was forced to leave its site in Lake Wyangan Road and in about 1947 was relocated to the present grounds behind the Griffith Airport.

Eric Evans is one of the early members who are part and parcel of the history of the Griffith club — a very active member who served as vice president and committeeman for many years before failing health forced him to take a back seat.


He won many championships in and around the Riverina, and was proud to represent Australia in the No. 1 International Match Team of 1955, rubbing shoulders with such greats as Newton Thomas and George Biggs who were members of the same team.

He introduced his son Ian to the sport as a young teenager, and was delighted when Ian's son Glen followed in both their footsteps to become a member of the Grif-

fith Clay Target Club in 1981.











EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian.

I am hoping that you will reserve space in our next C.T.S.N. and print the following concerns that I have and that I feel all shooters should consider.

After travelling hundreds of miles to visit many clubs I feel inspired to write this letter. I would suggest that many clubs and committees should stop and take stock of their actions. At a time when most clubs are losing members it is time, we the shooter, turned the table to try building numbers. I have found that clubs are disillusioning new shooters by throwing targets at faster and harder angles.

All the average shooter wants is to shoot a possible and enter a shoot-off — the best shooter will still end up winning. New shooters who shoot eight targets out of 10, will be inspired to join our clubs and numbers will grow.

In short, what should happen, is for clubs to use holes three and four on their traps to help shooters gain confidence. But my knowledge of many clubs shows that they have drilled a sixth hole, others use hole five — this helps clubs by reducing shoot-offs but at the same time disillusions new shooters who perhaps only score four out of 10 and, therefore, fail to join and are lost forever. I would further suggest that it should be illegal to use extra drilled holes in traps, as this upsets grading as well. Good shooting to all.



The Budge Shield has an interesting history in olay target shooting in Gippsland. Charles Budge, a champion shotgumer for many years through to the 'fifties, and a foundation member of Morwell Gun Club which was established on land originally leased from the Budge family free of charge, was a motivator of team shooting between the Gippsland clubs and donated the shield bearing his name, over 30 years ago.

The District of Gippsland has six gun clubs comprising Bairnsdale, Foster, Morwell, Korumburra, West Gippsland and a new club this year — Wonthaggi.

An annual meeting each year decides the dates for which each club on a normal shoot day programs the 20tgt D.B. Handicap event for a squad of five shooters selected on a point E.O. handicap. The overall score of the teams decides the winning club, and a high gun throughout the year is keenly contested.

It is interesting to note that some of the more fancied shooters who would expect to be sure of a place in the squad fall by the wayside to a lesser shooter who just happens to shoot a clean 30/30 in the point E.O., and that's what handicap shooting is all about!

Allegiance to this type of District team shooting is very strong — perhaps the South East Zone of the V.C.T.A. is successful due to strong teams from the Gippsland clubs in the Zone. It's great to shoot some good scores for yourself at your club or when visiting, but to shoot for your club, town or district — that's tops.




