



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Australian Sports Commission has advised us that the Minister of Sport, the Hon. John Brown, has approved a total grant of \$45,000 to the Association from the Sport and Recreation Development Program for 1984/85.

This is made up of \$5,000 for general administration, \$25,000 towards funding the National Coaching Director, \$5,000 for coaching projects, \$5,000 for attendance at the World Skeet Championships, and \$5,000 for development projects, specifically the conduct of referee seminars to upgrade the standard of refereeing.

This represents an increase of \$10,000 or 29% on our

grant for the previous year.

The shooting sports received a total of \$167,000, made up as follows:

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES



The formation of Nobel Clay Bird Club in 1927 was the signal for other clubs to do likewise, firstly in other parts of Victoria and then Tasmania. During the several years that followed many shooters expressed their liking for clay bird shooting. At the expense of the live bird clubs the new shooting sport also attracted a different type of shooter who was not interested in live birds, but saw the clay bird as an opportunity that would give them more shooting and at less cost, as well as a greater enjoyment.

During the early years of our sport the words clay bird was used to describe the target. However, it was changed to clay pigeon some years later, and finally to clay target in order to remove any reference to live birds. Our first National Association was known as the "Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association". The title was also later changed to "Australian Clay Target Association". It was formed in 1937 and Mr Jock Wilson was appointed President of the new National Association.

In the years between 1927 and 1936 clay bird shooting continued to grow. Numerous small clubs were formed wherever there was an interest created. Their programs were mostly a fun shooting day for small trophies. An afternoon shoot would consist of a five bird and a 10 bird event. More often than not the club was in a corner of someone's paddock, where you had to be careful not to step in fresh pancakes left by the cows.

The trap house often consisted of bales of hay or railway sleepers placed around a stump, to protect the trapper. The trap itself being one of the early I.C.I. Plus type that must be cocked by hand and angled by the trapper at his discretion. You can imagine how slow the target release was. (Fortunately there were no temperamental shooters in those days, you simply took what you got and stayed happy).

Unfortunately, because clay bird shooting equipment was simply not manufactured in Australia prior to World War Two, most clubs could only program shoots when clays (which mostly came from England), were available, likewise cartridges also were imported.

For quite some time the Nobel Club had the only automatic angling trap, it was an American made competition trap known as a Black Diamond. Many of these traps were imported and used throughout Australia until well into the 1950s. The Black Diamond trap was completely automatic angling that could throw targets through a 90 degree angle. However, it had to be handcocked and releas-

ed by hand. This was done by having a tube and rod underground from the trap to a fixture at the rear of the centre shooting track. An upright lever provided the puller with the means to cock the trap and by pulling the lever backward would release the target when each shooter called pull. Result was that most releases were inconsistent.

As I have mentioned earlier, I.C.I. Nobel Company were instrumental in establishing the Nobel Club. They also supplied the ground and equipment.

By early 1929, membership of the Nobel Club had increased and several other clubs had formed both in the city and country. Generally these clubs had been live bird shooters and decided to go over to clays. Obviously a situation was developing whereby registered live bird club members were shooting at clay bird clubs, that were not affiliated with the Gun Clubs Association, who were becoming increasingly concerned by the possibility that they could be outnumbered and loose control of trapshoting and registration fees. This prospect brought about several months of verbal discussion and correspondence with Nobel Club Committee and members for very little gain.

The following copy is a quotation from the original Minute book of the Nobel Club during late 1928 and early 1929.

18/9/28 — Annual meeting Nobel Clay Bird Club a recommendation was made by Mr A.C. Robinson to hold a Clay Bird Championship of Australia. Mr H.G. James supported the motion — unfortunately almost two years passed before this Championship was finally staged.

24/10/28 — Committee meeting, deals with a letter from the Gun Clubs Association. Mr Sutherland explained that he had a word with Mr Turner who thought it would be advisable to compromise with the Gun Clubs Association and ask them to accept 2/6 per each member of the Nobel Clay Bird Club.

Mr Turner, Mr Hall and Mr Bloom all discussed the question and it was finally resolved that we would not join the G.C.A — but would like to harmonise with them wherever possible.

Mr Hall and Mr Bloom were elected delegates to the G.C.A. meetings. The two delegates were instructed that they were not to advise the G.C.A. meeting of our attitude re: joining the G.C.A., but were to listen to what the meeting had to say and bring back their report.

8/11/28 — Committee meeting. Nobel Clay Bird Club, Mr Turner spoke on the G.C.A. Report and thought that it should be made known to all members.

The Secretary maintained that the Committee had power to deal with the matter of the G.C.A. request and the Committee should give a decision immediately.

Vice President Mr F.C. Cliff spoke to the meeting with much feeling on the conduct of the club and was disgusted at the open betting of several men and one man, who was the worse for drink, being allowed to shoot.

Mr Hall informed the Committee that his impression of the G.C.A. meeting was that they only wished our Association with them and control us later and further no reason why we should join.

Mr Bloom also spoke similar to Mr Hall, at this point much discussion had taken place and every member had spoken on the matter.

Mr Cliff then moved, seconded Mr H. James, that the matter of affiliation be deferred to our next General meeting. The Secretary was instructed to advise the Gun Clubs Association re: the outcome of the meeting.

Over the next several months, further discussions were held and finally 22/1/29 a special ballot meeting was held to finalise the issue — result of the ballot — declared 44 against joining Gun Clubs Association; 30 for joining Gun Clubs Association.

Mr Jack Sutherland proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Pool and Mr Miller for the manner in which they handled the ballot.

Unfortunately this ballot was not to be the end of the matter. And sure enough, the problem surfaced again at the next committee meeting of the club.

Mr Guthrie, Manager of Nobel's was present and wished to address the meeting to explain his attitude towards the club and that he wished Nobel Club to join the Gun Clubs Association as his company's policy was to foster all kinds of shooting and he would like to hold Championships on the Nobel ground. While he realised there was a great number of the members who were against joining, he did think it could be overcome by forming two clubs and the second club be called another name and not have to register with the G.C.A.

A great deal of discussion took place by the members of Committee and visitors. Mr Hall very clearly defined the position of the Nobel Club, stating that the club must abide by the majority vote taken at the special meeting called, and asked Mr Guthrie if his company was willing to allow the club to carry on as usual. Mr Guthrie said decidedly yes. It was then agreed to allow Mr Guthrie to take the name of "Nobel" from the present club and that they would rename the club and carry on without joining the GCA

At this point, Mr H. James resigned as Club Secretary. It was then moved and seconded that the name of the club would be Melbourne Amateur Clay Bird Club (Carried).

Mr E.B. Turner Vice President and Mr F.C. Cliff then tendered their resignation which was accepted with much regret.

5/3/29 — Next Committee meeting. Club President Mr Evans, explained to the meeting that he had had an interview since the last meeting was held with Mr Guthrie whose wish it was now that this club retain the name of "The Nobel Clay Bird Club". It was then moved by Mr Bloom, seconded by Mr Hall, that the motion passed at the last meeting relative to renaming the club be recinded, and that the club's name be "The Nobel Clay Bird Club" as originally — Carried.

A motion was then moved and seconded that the secretary write to the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria advising it that Nobel Clay Bird Club had decided not to affiliate with the G.C.A. The Secretary was also instructed to send a circular letter to all members of the Club advising them of the result of the ballot re: affiliation with the G.C.A.

AROUND THE TRAPS

A club membership analysis taken at the end of June, 1984, has shown a decrease in A.C.T.A. registrations, as against the same period last year. This is disappointing for our organisation, and a responsibility rests with all members and club administrators to try and rectify the problem. There is evidence of clubs allowing shooters to compete in open events without producing current handicap cards.

In some cases, on investigating a shooter's complaint, that he had not received his handicap card, and his copy of C.T.S.N., it has been found the complaintant had paid his A.C.T.A. fee to his club secretary, but it had not been forwarded to A.C.T.A. for processing. Through no fault of their own, these shooters compete in events, win grade trophies, and yet do not have a card to produce for recording their 15m performances. This is not good enough for our sport.

Saturday September 2, 1984. The Victorian Clay Target Association conducted their Victorian School Boy/Girl Championships at Bendigo Gun Club. Thirty entries were received with competitors receiving plenty of support from Mums, Dads, Aunts and Uncles. 

"I AM OFFENDED"

As this paragraph goes to pen, I am right in the midst of the N.S.W. press, radio and television barrage, regarding anti-gun-histrionics. To your columnist, this is nothing new, as over the past twenty years, at some time in some place, this writer has been right in the thick of this well worn media WAR-HORSE, sensationalism. MORE ON THOSE MITCHELL CHOKES

The following is adapted from articles which appeared recently in Ross Williams' column in the sporting pages of the Weekly Times.

Readers may be interested in the progress of the Mitchell choke system, first reviewed in this column in May last year. At last count some 90 guns had been fitted with Mitchell chokes—an average of more than one a week and a pretty impressive record for a specialised custom operation.

The interchangeable tubes are individually made and fitted, the customer specifying the choking he requires. Workmanship is first class. The evenness of the patterns continues to attract much favorable comment and there is no shift in the mean point of impact when tubes are swapped around.

Recently Bob Mitchell altered the design of his tubes in a couple of respects.

One of the changes is, in Bob's own words, "a bit of insurance". Instead of ensuring an exact match between bore diameter and choke entry diameter, which is what he used to do, he now makes a deliberate step down from bore to choke entry. The step is small (about 0.05mm) and any conceivable effect on pattern percentages can be countered during the reaming and honing processes.

Admittedly it doesn't look as nice as an exact match, cont'd on page 16

"SKEET NATIONALS COP SOME FLAK"

I feel, once elected to the National Executive, we work in the interest of all shooters Nationally, as well as for those within our own State, with a heavy responsibility to management of A.C.T.A. affairs, particularly its finances.

This being so, it is important, Executive, State and club administrators encourage and develop the sport of clay shooting within their States, to comply with what is hap-

pening Nationally and Internationally.

When changes are made, they are usually created by pressures from shooters on delegates who represent them around the Executive table. Changes are not possible unless supported by a majority of those voting. Also any major issues are well publicised, and all Executive have the opportunity to discuss fully any items at their State level, prior to casting their vote.

This was born out in the recent change of separating the skeet from the trap Nationals. After all States deliberated this contentious issue, and the vote finally taken, only one State, using its democratic right, fully opposed the move. To my knowledge, that State accepted the umpire's decision and now fully supports the change, as we all should.

Having the above in mind, it was rather surprising for me to read in October 1984 C.T.S.N. under the subheading "SKEET NATIONALS COP SOME FLAK", "Nominations too high", "Why the Skeet was separate from the D.T.L.", "Attendances would improve if the two

were rejoined etc".

Regarding nominations, the organising committee arrived at these charges for events by formulating a budget on ex number of skeet shooters they thought they could expect to attract to the 1984 Skeet Nationals. The budget circulated to all Executive for ratification indicated from an expected income of \$12,900 and expenses totalling \$8,516, a profit of \$4,871 would be appreciated to A.C.T.A. funds.

To reach this sort of return, the labour content to run the tournament had to be all voluntary, with the exception of trappers, a trap mechanic and one office staff. This in itself creates a saving of approximately \$1,600 to \$2,000 on expenditure. Remembering too, if we reduce nominations, we reduce profit, but not the work load. I believe the volunteers want to see reasonable profits from their labours, and the shooting fraternity benefit as a whole, not just individual shooters receiving cheap shooting at the voluntary worker's expense.

I feel sure the same applies to those who donate trophies to our tournaments. The first ever Skeet Nationals received support to the value of \$4,000 in this area. The 1984 Skeet Nationals will receive similar support. Profit from the 1983 venue, around \$6,500 was channelled into A.C.T.A. funds, thus assisting top Skeet shooters from Victoria, N.S.W. and South Australia, plus a manager, with a trip, all expenses paid to compete in America. The sport should further gain from their experiences. I doubt if any of this would have been possible without the running of separate Skeet Nationals.

As to "Attendances would improve if the two were rejoined". What a backward step this would be. I wonder if that is really what is needed to improve attendances at D.T.L. Nationals??

Six thousand five hundred dollars profit from the first ever Skeet Nationals in 1983, with a good shooter attendance. The 1984 Skeet Nationals, looking every bit as promising. The possibility of top skeet shooters from America being in attendance.

Could any of this eventuate or be possible if our National Skeet Championship was run in conjunction with the D.T.L. Nationals?

Fifty targets over two days, a profit of approximately \$300 gained, if you are lucky, "I doubt it".

The 1984 D.T.L. Nationals at Wagga did not need skeet to attract satisfactory shooter attendance. It will also be interesting to read their final financial results.

As a keen administrator of our sport, I believe the time has arrived for individual D.T.L., American Skeet and Olympic Trench and I.S.U. discipline Nationals. All must be self supportive, and if possible, a sensible profit margin accrued from each one.

As all States now have the necessary facilities, they should do likewise and organise similar carnivals, to suit their own requirements within their State. This is the only way we have any hope of developing the sport and our shooters throughout Australia.

So come on administrators, stop giving our sport "THE KISS OF DEATH", "STOP THE FLAK WITHOUT THE FACTS", and give the sport and shooters the support they deserve

despite its titchiness, yet it is intentional and controlled — much different from the exposed edges left by lazy workmen.

Why has Bob made the change? Well, the advantages of screw-in tubes are obvious, but they are all susceptible to damage during handling — like when you drop them or walk on them. Also it is possible to fail to screw a tube all the way home, either through momentary carelessness or omitting to keep the muzzle recess clean.

If for one or more of these reasons there remains a small gap betwixt the inner end of the tube and the bore, it is possible for gas to force its way into the joint. It may also be possible for wad petals to catch on the lip of the tube. If either happens, the result is likely to be a ruined tube and possibly a split muzzle. Some well-known brands have been subject to this kind of mishap, though one couldn't say it's common.

Bob has always machined an overlapping joint to minimise the chances of wad catching and gas invasion. As I understand it, he hopes that the recently added step will combine with the overlap to make his design even more accident-proof.

Whether the tiny undercut ledge will catch any fouling is something I don't know.

The second change is mostly for looks. The tubes remain the same length as before (51mm) but they sit deeper in the barrel, thus allowing a narrower external collar. In some instances, however, Bob may recommend the older 10mm collar width.



 A winner's smile — Robin Bailey, overall Baillee Farm winner, 1984.







I should add that another article by yours truly on the Mitchell choke system is scheduled to appear in the Shotgun Annual. Since the forthcoming piece was written before this one, it refers to the exact matching of diameters and does not mention the recently incorporated step.

Over a period of 18 months or so, I have written about Mitchell chokes five times, progressively updating the information from earlier articles and repeating some of the basics for those who may not have heard about the system. I've done this because Bob is doing in Australia what precious few around the world have managed to achieve: at last count, two blokes in the U.K., and five in America.

Many people fit choke tubes of one kind or another. Few of them do it properly, for reasons discussed elsewhere. VERY few can manage a true custom-made and custom-fitted job like Bob's. I've heard that someone else is importing American tubes and fitting them here, but the Mitchell system would appear to be unique, at least in this country. If we are talking about the fine details of design and pro-

I firmly agree with the consensus of opinion that due to the very apparent lack of self-demaily many who wear the badge, but shirk the responsibility, the number of those registered at this point of time with the A.C.T.A. is markedly lower than previous years.

Evidence of such a lack of interest, is borne out by the non-existence of Zone Seminars and/or State orientated seminars for reasons known only by those who have the means of convening such meetings, which of course would cause a restructuring of that occasional weekend. Too much to expect I suggest.

Are we to be made to appear so complacent and disinterested as those who supposedly carry the flag or can those of us who genuinely care, about the plight confronting us, depend on and receive from our State Executive Zone Compittees and State Coach above all the urgent necessary action to relieve a potentially destructive situation we find ourselves in, to retrieve the sport so hard fought for and so precariously ours.

In closing may I extend the appreciation of those from within my Club, who gave of their time and the lads who competed, to Winchester for their promotion, Melbourne Gun Club for the facility, and of course the few who repeatedly carry out the task of organising the whole competition from which so many derive so much enjoyment and pleasure.

A 100 MILE DRIVE IN SECOND GEAR 4WD

All the roads which lead to the Mossgiel Hall in western NSW are dirt, and when it rains, only a four wheel drive vehicle will SOMETIMES get you back to the bitumen and home at your designated time of return.

A foundation member of the club, Martin was presented with 'Foundation Life Membership' in a moving ceremony.


He is moving to Kangaroo Island and they must have known he was coming, they opened their first Gun Club on the Island just a few months ago.

At another station if you didn't pick up the clays quickly, they were soon lost amongst the trees.


The layout was designed to be as similar to shooting in the field as possible. Springsure Gun Club is fortunate to have enough land to run this type of shoot.



NARROGIN SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

GUN SAFETY AND AWARENESS COURSE, 1984

During term 2 of this year, a Gun Safety and Awareness Course was undertaken by some 25 year 11 and 12 students from the Narrogin Senior High School from early July to mid August, covering a period of some seven weeks.

The course was initiated through combined efforts of Clay Target member and coach Darrell Wiese and Field and Game member and coach Chris Johns. A unique situation was created with the combination of Field and Game and Clay Target interests.

Senior students were contacted and preliminary details were outlined. There was a great deal of initial interest and enthusiasm shown by the students. Many of the students at the school live on or come from farms where firearms are a normal part of their recreation, but whether they understand all safety procedures and the wide range of interesting sidelines is open to debate.

With this initial interest, the fine detail of the course to be offered was still to be finalised. A meeting was conducted with all aspects of the course discussed.

The final course outline was printed but, before the course could proceed, permission had to be granted by the Education Department of Western Australia. A submission was prepared by the principal Mr Brian Walters, highly recommending the course on the basis that it was both educational and practical in nature. It is now history that approval was given to run the course during time allocated to Physical Education and Recreation.

When it was announced that the course had received the "green light" 25 upper school students, all boys, signed up with their parents' consent.

The course itself included the following student activities:

(a) A video on Clay Target shooting;

- (b) Reloading instruction;
- (c) Ammunition manufacture;
- (d) Safety procedures in shooting, reloading and carrying;
- (e) Cleaning procedures;
- (f) An address by the Police;
- (g) An address by a member of the Fisheries and Wildlife Department;
- (h) An address by Mr Malcolm Higham on the History of Firearms and a display of Malcolm's private collection;
- (i) A Field and Game instruction and competition;
- (j) A full Clay Target instruction (in Trap and Skeet) and competition.

The reaction from the students participating in the course was fantastic. During the week, many students would constantly ask about arrangements of the future sessions and the 19 students in the session two course, were always early for the bus.

As a culmination to the course, students were given a written test and their shooting scores were recorded each week in order to assess the overall performance of each student. It was pleasing to note that the standard was very high in both the written test and the shooting scores.

At the final days' presentation ceremony, the dux and runner-up for each year was announced and awards were presented.

Achievement certificates were presented to all the students who satisfied the course requirements.

In reflecting over the course, I was particularly pleased with the extent of Media coverage given to this course as it definitely assisted the overwhelming success that this course achieved.

Finally, sincere thanks to Darrell Wiese and Chris Johns for their time, expertise and enthusiasm and their initiative is an example for others to follow. Our appreciation also goes to Mr Lex Shipp of "Winchester Australia" for supplying reloading components and trophies for the course.


BIRTHDAY SHOOT, NOVEMBER 26 & 27, 1983 D. Oliviero






