If a junior is in top six Olympic Trap or top four Skeet scores, no extra junior is to be selected.

The top three shooters in Olympic Trap & top three in Skeet over the 400 targets will make up the Australian Team to compete in Italy in July.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

There must be a number of people who are scratching their heads and trying to work out just what is going on with the people from N.S.W. At the end of my report on the State Trap Carnival held at Cobar (Dec. C.T.S.N.) I finished off by saying that Gunnedah had agreed to shoot the "Gumtree Bush Shoot" in September '85. Then, at the end of the report on this year's Gumtree, it says Gumtree '85 will be held on the October long weekend.

Therefore, I would now like to try and set the record straight. In May of this year, when we (Tamworth) were allocated the State Carnival for '85 our President, two Vice-Presidents and myself as Secretary approached Vic Eather and the President of Gunnedah, the now late Stan McMaster, explaining our position. Bearing in mind that Tamworth had changed to September in '81 to save a clash, both Vic and Stan agreed that the only sensible and, more importantly, "gentlemanly" thing to do was for them to alter to September for '85. Therefore, after receiving a phone call of confirmation the following week, the dates were altered in the "Blue Book". We started making the agreement known to as many as possible (because we gave the undertaking that we would give them as much help and publicity as we could), and both parties were happy.

Apparently, a meeting was held at some time during the Gumtree, which we were unaware of until receiving a letter on 10th October, and the original decision was reversed. Therefore, we now have the 1985 State Trap Carnival and the Gumtree being staged on the same weekend, that being the October long weekend. This is very disappointing as the Gumtree is only a two-day event, where the State Carnival is a three-day event.

All we can hope for is that both parties have successful carnivals.

I hope this now clears up the misunderstanding that may have been caused by the original reports which were submitted in good faith at the time.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

The Executive Committee met in Melbourne on Sunday November 19, following the Skeet Nationals. Major items of discussion were as follows:

UNREGISTERED SHOOTERS

The matter of unregistered shooters competing in competitions at affiliated clubs was noted with concern. It was resolved that State Associations be responsible for ensuring that unregistered shooters do not participate in competitions.

D.T.L. TEAM TO U.K. 1985

It was decided to send a five-man team plus Manager to U.K. in July 1985, to compete for the Van Diemen's trophy, and the British Open. This team will be picked at the Perth Trap Nationals in April.

FINANCIAL PLAN 1985

The draft Financial Plan for 1985 was accepted, and is published elsewhere in this issue of C.T.S.N.

REFEREE'S ASSOCIATION

The Executive Committee has directed the Referees' Association to produce a guide for referees to achieve a uniform standard of referee practice throughout Australia, and to organise seminars in each State in 1985 to implement these uniform standards.

NATIONALS SUB-COMMITTEE

Long discussions took place on the recommendations from the Nationals Sub-Committee. A roster was set for Trap Nationals for five years: 1986 — Victoria, 1987 — Queensland, 1988 — New South Wales, 1989 — Victoria, 1990 — Tasmania.

At the first Executive Committee meeting in 1986 the venue will be decided for the 1991 Trap Nationals, first meeting in 1987 will decide venue for 1992 and so on. This will avoid the current situation where until this meeting no one knew where 1986 Trap Nationals would be held.

It was resolved to set a three-year roster for Skeet Nationals. 1985 Victoria, 1986 New South Wales be encouraged to meet the facilities criterion which is a minimum of six layouts. 1987 Western Australia.

The 1985 Trap Nationals program format will be as follows: Saturday — Handicap, Sunday — Double Barrel, Monday — Single Barrel, Tuesday — Points, Wednesday — Double Rise, Thursday — Champion of Champions.

The Champion of Champions will be shot from 18 metres.

The Skeet Nationals from 1985 onwards will commence on Thursday and conclude on Sunday, with the Commonwealth and National Championships being conducted on the Saturday and Sunday.

In all future Nationals optional sweeps and optional purses will be conducted, no compulsory sweeps.

RELOADS AT NATIONALS

Probably the biggest decision taken by the Executive Committee for many years was the decision to allow re-loaded shotshells in all National Championships in future. The full ramifications of this decision are not yet clear, particularly in the area of Industry support for future Nationals. It will be interesting to see if there is a dramatic increase in entries at future Nationals following this decision.

SUSPENDED SHOOTER

Suspended shooter Wayne Calaby appeared before the Executive Committee. Following his appearance, his suspension was reduced to three years.

SKEET NATIONALS MELBOURNE 1984

The 1984 Skeet Nationals were conducted at Melbourne Gun Club, November 14 through 17.

The series attracted fewer entries than last year, however all the top skeeties were there to battle out the Championships.

The four days intense competition produced some top performances, notably Ian Hale setting a new long run break of 487 targets, his 399/400 to take out the Overall High Gun, and Graham Guy blitzing the big boys to win the National Championship.

Bob Buchan and the Melbourne Gun Club Committee had the grounds in top shape and the Melbourne weather was kinder to the competitors than last year, when rain and low temperatures dampened proceedings somewhat.

Event 1. City of Melbourne Skeet Championship

Entries 123, down 15 on last year. Six possibles at the end of the 50 targets, three B graders, and three in AA.

Brian Herbert and Ross Eckersley were soon out of the shoot-off, Colin Sim, Bob Wilson, Ian Hale and Bill Iles were still in it after 25 targets. Around again, Iles' faltered on his 38th target, Hale the 90th and Colin Sim his 93rd, leaving Newcastle's Bob Wilson the popular winner. Bob received the beautiful Puma Carving set, kindly donated by Eurocut.

Event 2. National Skeet Carnival Championship

Entries totalled 127, down 13 on 1983. Despite the good conditions, only eight possibles were on the board. This wasn't to be a short shoot-off, in fact it wasn't finalised until the next day. It was very soon down to those two great competitors Adrian Cousins and Ian Hale. At nightfall they'd shot 350 and decided to continue the next day.

Finally it was Hale who missed his 460th target. It was a pity there had to be a loser as Adrian Cousins said at presentations, because both had shot so well. Ian Hale had established the new record of 487 targets which was some compensation for missing out on the Championship. The Overall trophy was kindly donated by Russel Fox.

Thursday 15th Event 3. Grand Australian Skeet Handicap

A Baikal skeet gun, kindly donated by Fuller Firearms was up for grabs in the handicap. This was a departure from last year's program format running a skeet handicap, and by the number of entries was not popular with the shooters. 120 nominated, 22 down on event 3 last year which was a graded championship. It also proved an administrative nightmare for the organisers, most of the shoot-off being run in conjunction with the next event. When all the sums had been done, 55 shooters had the possible, which was reduced to three very quickly in the shoot-off proper. These were Peter Blackmore, John Summers and Jim Briggs. Jim still had his original two handicap targets intact when he outstayed Summers and Blackmore to win the handicap with 160/160.

Event 4. All States Skeet Championship

Entries of 126 were up five on the Handicap, but still 14 below last year. The possibles numbered 12, which was reduced to five after one round. Three more dropped off in the second shoot-off round to leave it a match in two between John Woolley and John Summers. On they went until Woolley dropped one, leaving John Summers the victor on 238/238. John received the Overall trophy kindly donated by Olympic Targets.

The home team, Victoria, still smarting after their loss in 1983, turned the tables this year to win convincingly by five targets from Northern Territory, with last years winners South Australia in third place. Following on were Tasmania, Queensland, Western Australia and New South Wales. Representing Victoria were John Woolley, Paul Krumins, Merv Whitelaw, Alex Crikis, and Peter Torok.

Friday Event 5. Commonwealth Skeet Championship

Weather perfect, starters numbered 126, 13 behind 1983. After 50 targets seven shooters were clean, but many faltered in the second visit to leave just two possibles to fight out the Championship. They were Gil Farish and Ian Hale.

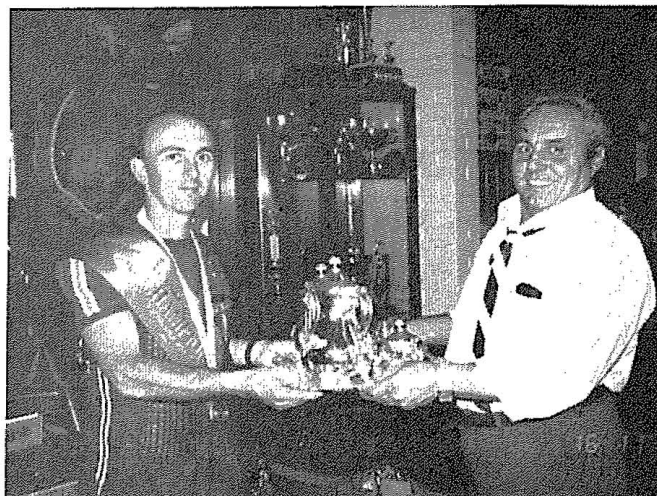
The shoot-off was something of an anti-climax with Hale missing high one, to give Gil Farish the blue Commonwealth sash, the Gold medal, and the Overall trophy again donated by **Olimpyc Targets**. This was a fine return to form as Gil had been unwell for some months, which had severely restricted his shooting.

The Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams Match followed, with Australia being successful by four targets 99 to 95. Representing Australia were Ian Hale, Cary Robinson, Peter Blackmore and Adrian Cousens.

Saturday Event 6. National Skeet Championship 100 targets

The final day, with the National Championship to be decided. Entries 146, against 159 in 1983.

Six shooters had the first 50 on the board, this dropped to three who were clean after the 100 targets. Graham Guy and Peter Blackmore, Melbourne, and Jim Briggs from



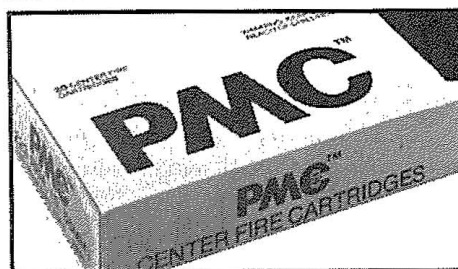
• Commonwealth Skeet Champion Gil Farish, accepts the trophy from donor Sergio Zufo of Olimpyc Targets.

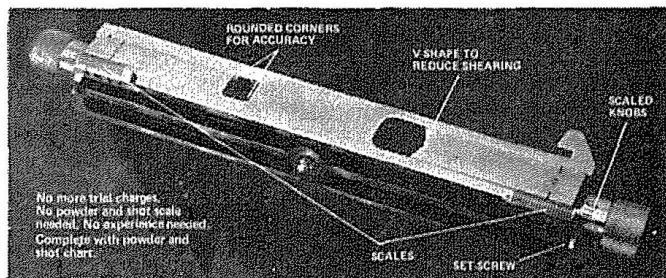

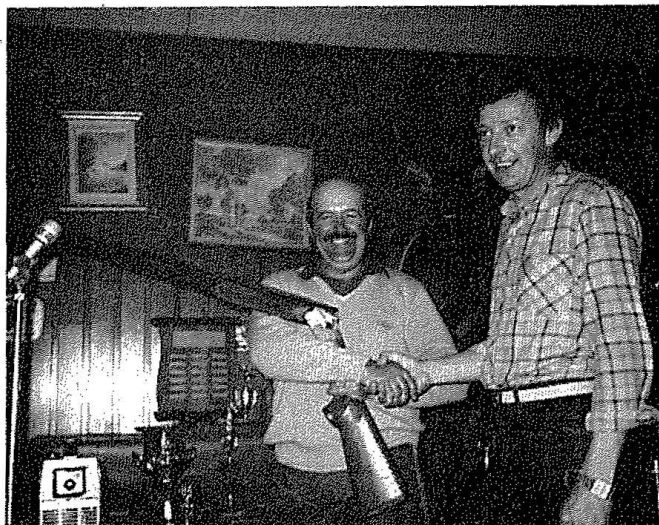

Ian Hale took out the Cec Herbert Overall High Gun trophy, the Beretta 682X shotgun, the A.C.T.A. Gold Australia badge and the Overall High Gun sash with his 399/400.

While Hale had not won an individual Championship he had been in shoot-offs for overall in five events out of six. He had shot 1075 out of 1082 targets in the four days, averaging 99.35% I list his individual scores: Event 1 — 89/90, Event 2 — 459/460, Event 3 — 87/88, Event 4 — 62/63, Event 5 — 100/101, Event 6 — 254/255, and 24/25 for Australia in the Australia/New Zealand Teams Match.

Carol Ogden had a great four days, winning the Ladies High Gun trophy donated by Ringwood Regent and Nunawading Motor Inns, with the top score of 380/400. She had also won the Ladies division in five of the six events, topped the A graders in event four, and been top qualifier for the All Australian Ladies Skeet Team by 11 targets.

Local boy Matthew Dunkley from Melbourne took out the Bill Attwood trophy for the Junior High Gun with 366/400 and another five medals along the way in grades and junior divisions, after a top tussle with Thomas Weis of Darwin, Thomas winning the junior division in four events.

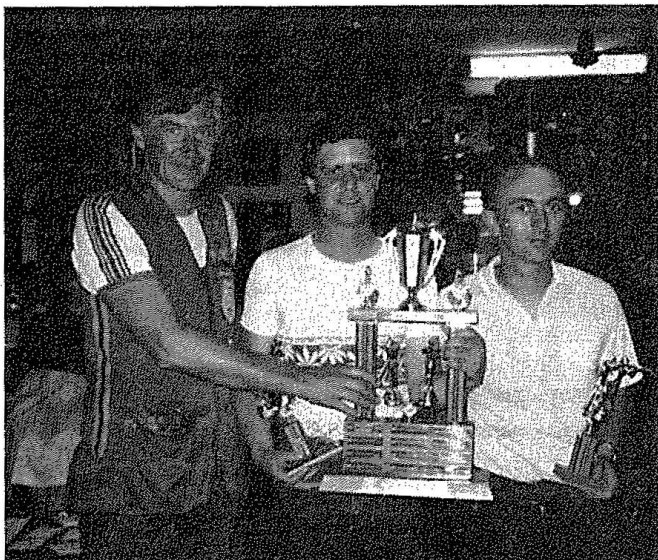
Popular Ted McRae from New Zealand took out the Ray Melville Perpetual trophy for the Veteran High Gun with 378/400. Ray was recovering from heart surgery and was unable to attend this year's Skeet Nationals.

The Two Man Teams Match for the Adrian Cousens trophy was won in fine fashion by Peter Blackmore and Gil Farish from the home club with 791/800, and the Five Man Club Teams Match also stayed at Melbourne with Adrian Cousens, John Summers, John Woolley, Graham Guy, and Alex Crikis shooting 1945/2000 to win.

The ninety medals on offer were shared by 52 shooters, and 768 total entries were received, down 90 on last year. 170 shooters entered one or more events during the four days. A point of concern for the organizers should be that only 146 shooters contested the National Skeet Championship, exactly the same number who shot in the W.A. State Skeet Championship in October, where the numbers to draw from in that State only total 700.

Despite the lower numbers those who did compete enjoyed themselves, and many stayed for the barbecue put on by Melbourne Gun Club on the Saturday night.

The shoot and office staff had worked tirelessly throughout the four days and the financial success of the Nationals is due to their efforts. They included Kaye Woods and Leanne Day in the Office, Shoot Marshalls Peter Quire and Rob Parker, Jim and Joan Scott with Mark Holland scoreboards, Laurie Connors and Rob McDonald cartridge distribution, Jack Matthey, Roy Holtfreter, Geoff Bartlett, Norm Lindrea, Norm Quick, Ken Coppleman and Neil Hardy, handicap cards. Thank you to all for a job well done.

An Excerpt from a newspaper January 4, 1938

Lang Lang, Monday — Allotted by the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association the first annual single barrel Championship at South Gippsland was contested. Conditions were 20 birds at 18 yards. Conditions were difficult. Excellent breaks were made by Browning, J. Lowe, of Lang Lang, 17 straight from a single barrel, and Butledge, 16. The Championship was conducted by Lang Lang Clay Bird Club.



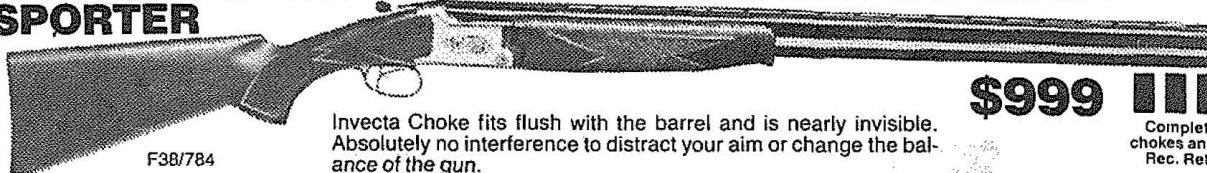



SKEET TEAM TO AMERICA

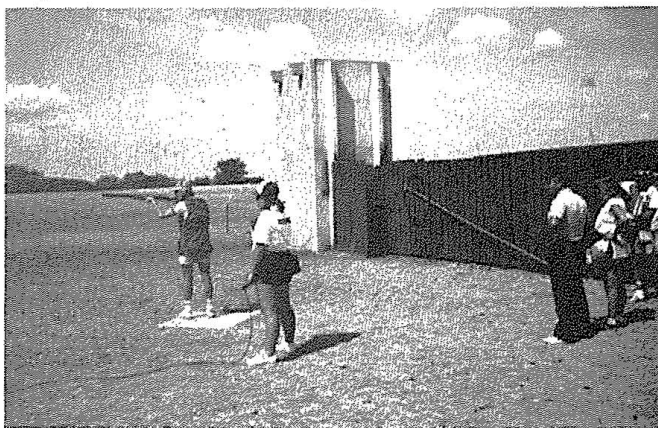
How fortunate all six of us were to be able to visit America and participate in the greatest skeet shooting championships the world has seen.

Hundred straights were just like us in Australia shooting 25 straight, and that was with the 410 gauge, 28 gauge, 20 gauge, let alone the 12 gauge. A total of 790 keen skeet shooters attended the 47th Annual Skeet Shooting Championship in San Antonio, Texas. The weather was very hot. Shooters and their families and friends came from all over America as well as many countries of the world.

What I will long remember is the shoot-off in the 410 gauge. I saw a total of 14 competitors shoot 100 straight out of a total entry of 703. In the shoot-off because of darkness they had to go into the next day after shooting 300 straight. Most of the Americans thought it was the best shoot-off in skeet shooting history. The winner was Dave Starrett who has been shooting skeet for 15 years. He has a classic stand-up style, in fact it is copy book. I must not forget our team members, Reg Clarke 93-100, Adrian Cousens 93, Bob Dower 92, Kevin Perkins 94. Our boys put up a great show when one considers that they had not shot a 410 gauge in competition prior to this event.

On day two we were in competition with 28 gauge, not one of the Australian team members had seen a 28 gauge cartridge, let alone used them before. A total entry of 708 had to shoot at 100 targets. There were a total of 62 shooters who shot the possible. We were all delighted when Kevin Perkins got into the shoot-off with his 100/100. This was a great performance from Kevin. The winner of the event was 19 year old Tal Sprinkles. The shoot-off went for three rounds that evening with 23 shooters still in with a chance. The shoot-off was completed four days later and went ten more rounds. Tal Sprinkles has been shooting for six years. Our scores were Kevin Perkins 100, Bob Dower 99, Reg Clarke 96, and Adrian Cousens 98.

The weather really started to get much hotter at this stage of the World Championships and our team members

were starting to feel the effects of coming out of our winter into the Texan summer. This was 20 gauge Championship day, some of the team had used the 20 gauge for field shooting back home but never in competition skeet. 716 shooters had entered the event and at the end of 100 targets 75 shooters had shot the possible. The winner was Alan Clark, age 24. He had been shooting skeet for 15 of his 24 years. The Australian scores were Adrian Cousens 99, Bob Dower 97, Kevin Perkins 99, Reg Clarke 98. These scores were very good considering the little practice the members had had with the 20 gauge. The 20 gauge is a very nice gun to use. I spoke to quite a few American coaches and they were emphatic that if we were to introduce a second gauge into Australia, they recommended the 20 gauge.

Fourth day was the start of the 12 gauge Championship, which was to be shot over 250 targets, 125 each day. This was the event we had really come for, as the team shoot against our American friends was conducted over this 250 targets. The trophy for this event had been donated by Stan Collins, and was made from different types of Australian hardwoods. A total of 718 shooters entered the championship, and each of the two days 125 targets were shot straight on the same ground.

On the Monday morning after 20 shoot-off rounds had been completed, three shooters were still left in. One of these three missed a target in his 21st round, the two remaining shooters decided to complete the match by shooting doubles at station three, four and five. This continued into the 23rd round when the winner emerged as Wayne Mayes. Aged 41, Wayne has been shooting skeet for 17 years. He uses a Winchester Auto 1400 with a Cutts compensator. He's probably the greatest skeet shooting machine ever seen in America.

We spoke to him a great deal and some of his quotes I reproduce here. (1) He never argues with the referee before an event, think about that one. (2) Winning comes first, averages second. (3) Pressure to win: "I try not to put pressure on myself, but on the other shooters." We were interested in his comment on shoot-offs — he doesn't like marathon shoot-offs, they don't prove who is the best shot, only who is the most fit physically and mentally. It is an

endurance test. We shoot doubles everywhere but not at the World Championship in the 12. Wayne certainly advocates doubles for shoot-offs in the 12 gauge.

Our Australian boys did a great job — Kevin Perkins 247, Bob Dower 246, Adrian Cousens 249, Reg Clarke 244 and Brian Thomson 245. I was very proud of the team. It was great to hear the praise the Americans gave to our members. Incidentally the American five did not drop one target between them in this event.

The World Doubles Championship was a great feature of the series; it commenced on the Sunday there were 12 shooters breaking 100 straight. We did not stay to see the finish, as the final was conducted on Saturday July 28 and we were on our way back home. I am informed the shoot-off took many rounds of doubles from stations 3, 4 and 5. The winner was the master of skeet Wayne Mayes. The Champion of Champions Wayne Mayes.

I'd like to tell you what doubles are in skeet. From stations 1 to 7 a pair of targets are released on each station. After completing station 7 the competitor then shoots a pair from each of station 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2. To complete the 25 targets you shoot a single from high 2. All over America they shoot all 12 gauge standard skeet shoot-offs over doubles from stations 3, 4 and 5. When you shoot doubles on 5 you then shoot stations 4, 3 and 4, 5 and so on. I have sold the idea at the Melbourne Gun Club, the shooters love it. I ask all clubs to give doubles a try as it is great. Wayne Mayes and so many other shooters at the World Championships said that skeet will improve when this is done.

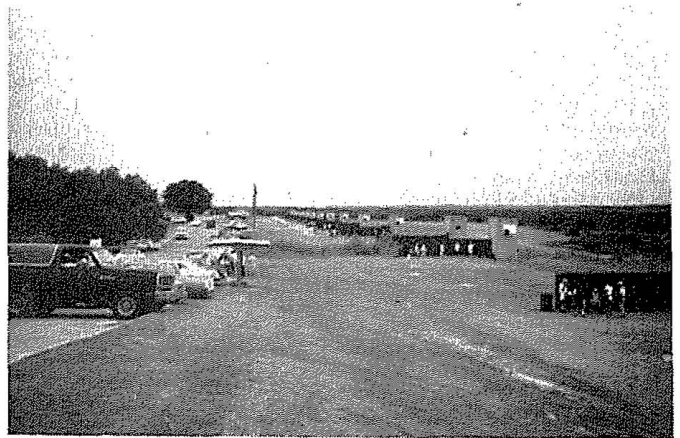
I observed that 99.99% of the shooters at the Worlds have a stand-up style, with the gun stock firmly placed on the shoulder.

At the World Championships they have many teams matches, including husband and wife, parent and child, family team, wheel chair team, which is great to see, two-man teams, five-man teams and industry teams. After each event is completed they have a lucky number drawn out of the hat. It may be number 4 so all of those shooters who were four targets down in the event compete for a trophy and shoot at doubles from 3, 4 and 5 stations. The shooters certainly stayed back for that event. I do hope to see that introduced into our shooting here in Australia.

I do know that all of our team would like to thank the American skeet shooters for their help in so many ways. They are great hosts; one had to be there to appreciate just what they were like. We were fortunate to befriend Phil Murray, Deputy Executive Director of the N.S.S.A., a champion guy as well as champion in the field of coaching and competition. We hope to have Phil with us next year to do some coaching.

I would recommend that each shooter try to go to the World Championships. It is an experience you will never forget and you will be assured of a great welcome by those Americans. One of the great pleasures we found shooting at the Worlds was the referees; it was a pleasure to work with them. To a man they were friendly, courteous, helpful, and perfect on the "pickle", as they called the button. The referee's job is to score as well as use the button; if they can do it, so can we. All credit must go to the squad and referee as to discipline while competing. They all stay as a squad until the last shooter has fired at his last target. They do not tolerate shooters walking off the ground immediately after they have fired their last shot.

I could go on and on about the trip and the lasting impression we will have for so many years to come. To our team I say thank you. To those who did not make the trip, I can assure you the team that represented Australia did us proud. We must thank the A.C.T.A. for funding the trip which I hope will be the first of many other A.C.T.A. teams to follow in the years to come.



• Some of the 36 skeet layouts at the National Gun Club.



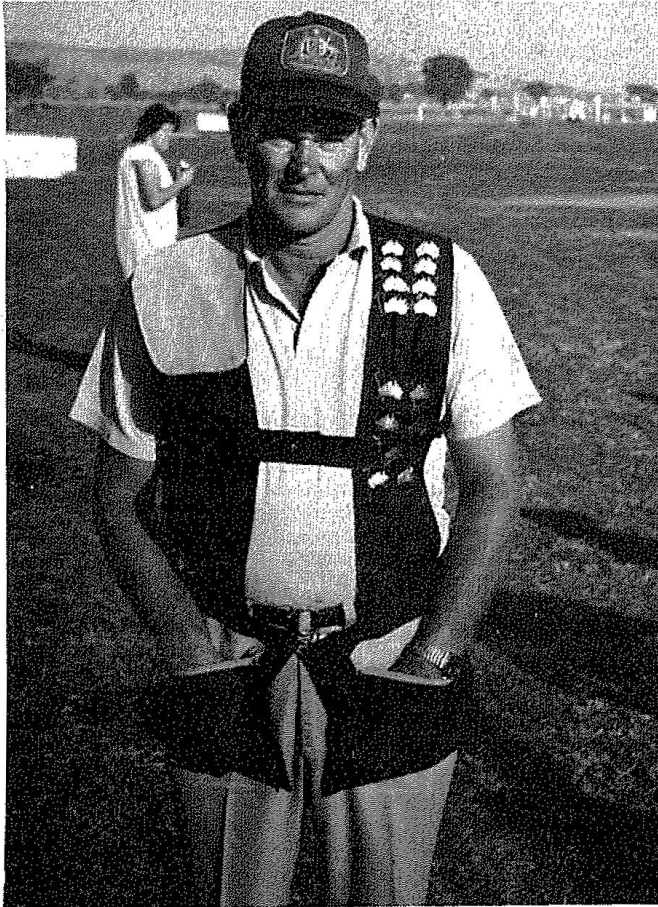

Many who attended the Trap Nationals series in the last few years will have observed some of our champion trap shooters wearing a jacket for the Macintosh Team photographs with their "Silver Australia" badges on display. These badges were originally donated by IMI (later Eley) and awarded to the overall winner of a National Championship and the Macintosh Team highgun.

The late Newton Thomas commenced the practice of wearing these badges for the team photograph and, following his death, Warren Charlton, Pud Burgess and Doug Smith have agreed to wear their badges whenever they make the team. Amongst them these shooters have won thirty-plus such badges — a tremendous achievement.

NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD 1985

International Shooting Committee

The Executive Committee has approved the following recommendation from the International Shooting Committee for the make-up of the National Training Squad for 1985.

SQUAD NUMBERS

The National Training Squad in the Olympic Discipline will comprise: six adult Olympic Trap shooters, plus one junior (under 21) Olympic trap shooter; four adult Olympic skeet shooters, plus one junior (under 21) Olympic skeet shooter.

SELECTION OF SQUAD

The squad will be selected over the 400 targets of the National and Commonwealth Championships in each discipline, first past the post for both adult and junior shooters. Should a junior trap or skeet shooter be in the top six in trap or four in skeet, no extra junior is to be selected for the squad, for the particular discipline.

RATIONALE

A full squad could comprise ten adult shooters and two juniors. The juniors must be given overseas competition with the adult squad members, otherwise all the coaching and assistance in Australia is wasted. It is very obvious to all involved in I.S.U. shooting internationally that it is competition in big international events with the added pressure and stress, as well as the higher standard of competition, that produces champions in our sport.

The overseas competition is so important, not only to match-harden our competitors, but to make them eligible for selection for Federal Government funding, eligible for selection by the Olympic Federation, and eligible for assistance from State Government.

STATE MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

1. All Australian teams to be selected from the National Training Squad.

2. At least two squad training sessions per year.
3. If possible a training session at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra.
4. Squad members eligible for Government funding, if they have the overseas standards to be recommended.

JUNIOR BENEFITS

Junior members of squad to receive an amount of money, in the year he or she is a member. If the junior misses selection to the squad in the following year, and another junior takes his place, the first junior will receive a lesser grant but will still be eligible to train with the National Training Squad. He will not, however, be eligible for selection for overseas teams. To be eligible for the grant in the second year, the first junior must have maintained or improved his scores.

This will mean that at any time there could be four junior shooters training with the National Training Squad.

CONDUCT OF SQUAD MEMBERS

Sportsmanlike at all times.

OBLIGATIONS OF SQUAD MEMBERS

All squad members will be encouraged to compete in at least two State Olympic Discipline Championships during the year of membership of the squad. Junior members of the squad must shoot at 400 registered targets in their particular discipline during the year.

VALE

It is with deep regret that we of the Boggabri-Gunnedah Gun Club announce the sudden death of our President Stan McMaster who was taken with a heart attack at Port Pirie, South Australia whilst on a fishing holiday.

Stan aged 57 was well known in the north of New South Wales and Southern Queensland.

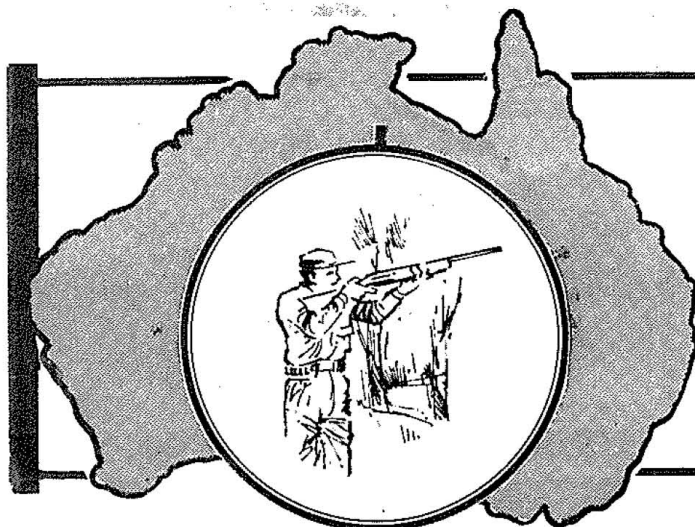

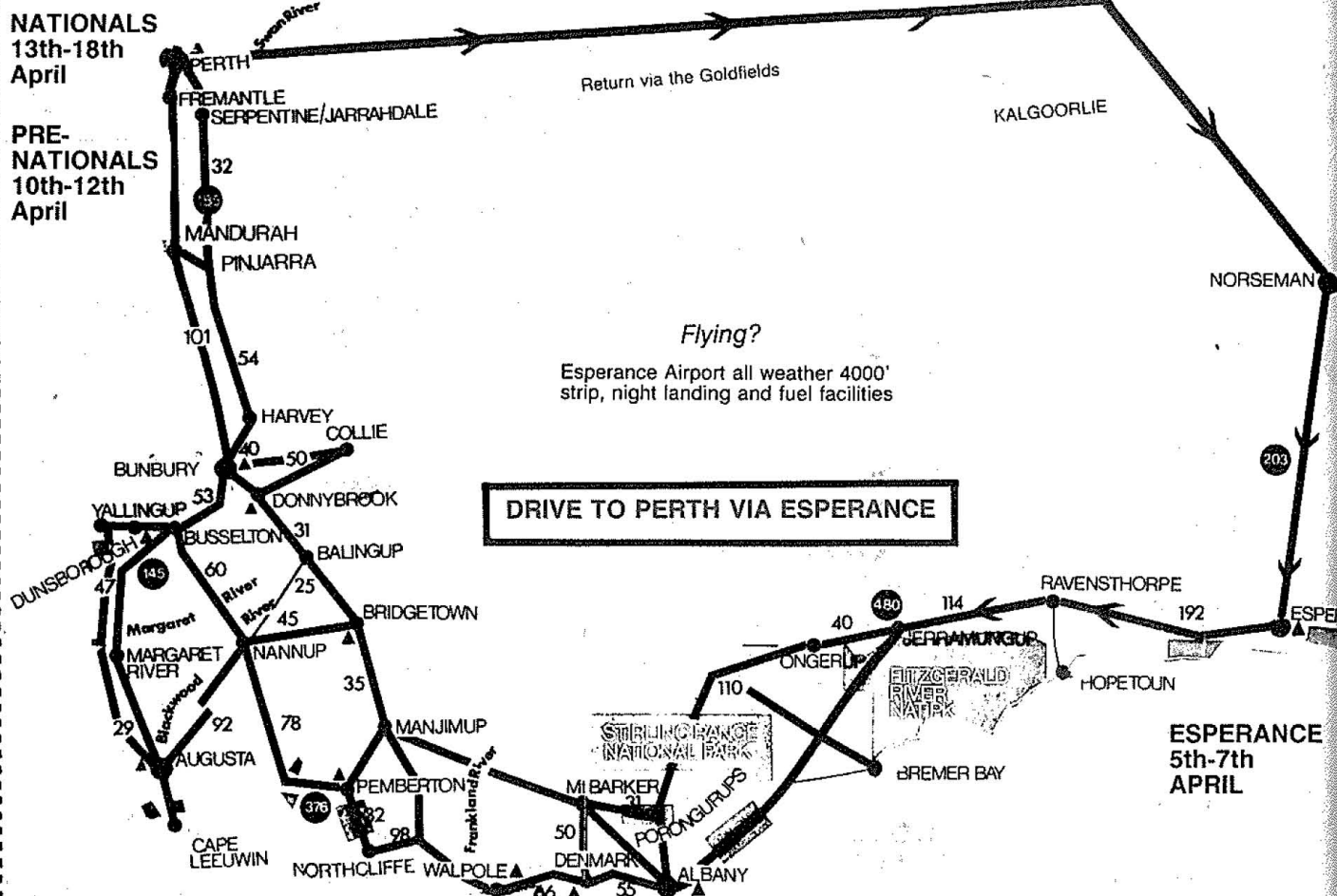

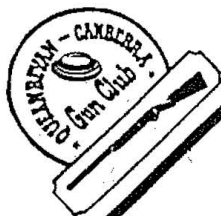
