EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS' NOTES

Another year, another set of challenges for clay target shooting.

As I write 1984 has just finished, so the mind pauses for a moment to look back over the twelve months.

The Olympic Disciplines dominated the year naturally enough, it being the year of the Los Angeles Olympics. Work began early for the O.D. shooters with the National and Commonwealth Championships in Melbourne in February. These were highlighted by the visit of the team from the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning, World Olympic Trap Champion John Primrose, and Womens World Record Holder and six times World Champion Susan Natrass.

The Americans dominated the skeet Championships winning all six medals, and took four of the six medals in Olympic Trap.

Crikis, Hale, Ellis and Rumbel were named in the Olympic shooting team of nine, with Peter Quire as Coach. The team competed in Mexico and Los Angeles in April as a warm-up to the Games and its now history that three of the four finished in the top eight in their events at Los Angeles. Congratulations to the Team and Coach Peter Quire from us all.

In the Standard Disciplines, the Wagga Trap Nationals were a resounding success, being the biggest since Melbourne in 1981. Top marks to the organisers, the N.S.W.C.T.A., for a well run and enjoyable series.

A first for the Association was the Skeet Team's visit to San Antonio for the World Championships. This team under Manager Bob Buchan, performed creditably against tough opposition and learnt much about skeet shooting which is now being put into effect in Australia.

We had a new rule book in August, printed in a new format, which seemed to please most shooters. In fact complaints about the rules which had been constant prior to August, almost completely disappeared.

And so to the New Year. We start off with the Olympic Discipline Nationals incorporating the Australia Games in a couple of weeks. As we are classed as a medium profile sport by the Australia Games Organisers, no money is available to bring overseas stars to Australia to compete. The start list will not be as classy as last year but competition will again be very keen.

We all have our fingers crossed that the new shooting complex in Perth will be ready for the Trap Nationals in April.

The shooting facilities will certainly be ready, but perhaps not the \$400,000 clubhouse. This year will usher in a new era of shooting in the West with the complex boasting ten down the line, ten skeet, and three Olympic trap and I.S.U. skeet layouts. All of this only twenty minutes from Perth city.

We have a Trap Team going to U.K. in July, this team will be chosen at the Perth Trap Nationals. We will also field a team of six shooters in the World Moving Target Championships at Montecatini in September. Another busy year internationally.

On the rules side, the Referees Association will be producing a guide for referees, to bring referee standards around Australia into line. Seminars for referees to upgrade standards will also be held in each State. It is hoped to bring Hans Kowar, Chairman of the U.I.T. Judges Committee, to Australia to conduct courses so that many interested in the Olympic Disciplines may become U.I.T. B Grade Judges.

This all adds up to a busy and exciting year ahead.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING COMMITTEE — STATE TRAINING SQUADS

The following recommendations for the establishment of State Training Squads have been agreed by the International Shooting Committee. Whilst the autonomy of States is recognised in that they set up Training Squads to suit State conditions, the acceptance of these proposals in the States will bring a natural progression forward to the National Training Squad.

RECOMMENDATIONS: To achieve uniformity between the States, it is recommended that State squads should comprise, six senior and one junior (under 21) in olympic trap, five senior and one junior (under 21) in olympic skeet.

SELECTION OF SQUAD: It is recommended that the squads be selected over 400 targets, first past the post. The Junior members to be selected by the same method. The 400 targets should be shot in two eliminations of 200 targets, to save in travel costs.

BENEFITS: 1. The seniors to shoot as a squad at the Nationals, hopefully funded by their State Association and State government. The Juniors to compete at the nationals for the junior positions in the National Training Squad. Hopefully the juniors will also be funded by the State Associations.

2. Training camps, ideally two per year, conducted with the assistance of the National Coach and senior members of the National Training Squad and senior Coaches. If this method is used, the necessity to bring overseas coaches and shooters to Australia to coach will be avoided, and the money used to get squad members overseas for international competition, will be of greater benefit.

3. States should work towards sending their squads to compete in other States championships as well as the Nationals.

BENEFITS FOR JUNIORS: The juniors in the State Squads could be assisted with a grant to enable training, carrying over into the second year as with the National Training Squad so there could be four juniors training with the State Training Squads at any one time.

ELEY-NEWTON THOMAS AWARD

Nominations for the 1985 Eley-Newton Thomas Award closed with the National Office on March 15.

PROFILE ON COURAGE

A young shooter from the Great Southern district of Western Australia has thumbed his nose at a misfortune that would reduce lesser men to rely on a wheelchair for the rest of their lives.

I have so admired his courage and tenacity on the shooting tracks, that I felt a short feature article acknowledging his success would be of interest to readers of this journal.

I first remember seeing Laurie Hull shooting at the Narrogin Gun Club. His awkward stiff-legged walk had me worried that he would over-balance at every step. However he not only made it from track five to track one, he also won the shoot - a handicap airfare event to the 1981 Melbourne Nationals. As one can imagine, the competition in that event was very keen. Laurie subsequently won a trophy at those Nationals in the handicap event scoring 49/50.

Laurie's disability was the result of a motor cycle accident. Now 24, seven years since the accident, it is not surprising that Laurie still has vivid memories.

Without any bitterness, Laurie told me what happened on that fateful day. It was 6 am on August 15th 1978, when he left home on his Honda XL250 Road/Trail Bike for work as a shed hand on a neighbouring property. Upon turning a corner he was confronted with the rising sun shining directly into his eyes. The dazzle caused him to lose control and hit a white roadside guide post, sending bike and rider crashing down a steep embankment.

In the smash, Laurie sustained a badly injured back which paralysed him from the chest down. Unable to get back onto the road, Laurie lay in the ditch alongside his wrecked motorbike for three hours, hearing car after car pass by on the road above - oblivious to his plight.

Finally, with great presence of mind, he pulled a tuft of grass away from the embankment where he lay. When the next vehicle came along, he hurled it; roots, dirt and all high into the air and onto the bonnet of a maintenance truck from the State Energy Commission, which skidded to a halt, then backed up - much to Laurie's relief. The workmen could see at a glance that he should not be moved, so they made him comfortable and called an ambulance from Tambellup on the truck's two-way radio. It was then 9 am.

When the ambulance arrived, Laurie recognized the driver - Trevor Prout - a fellow member of the Katanning Gun Club. The ambulance raced him straight to the Katanning Hospital to await the Flying Doctor aircraft which took him through to Perth and the Shenton Park Rehabilitation Hospital. There he underwent extensive X-rays and tests to find the cause and extent of his paralysis.

For the next sixty days, Laurie lay flat on his back, unable to move his legs. Doctors gave him only a slim chance of ever walking again. After those three months, it was into a wheel chair to "learn the tricks of the trade" as Laurie put it.

However, he was determined to prove the Doctors wrong and to one day walk again. Being in top physical shape before the accident and neither a smoker nor a drinker, Laurie's young body was able to slowly mend to the point where on January 19th 1979, five months since the smash, he walked out of the Hospital on two cane walking sticks.

Laurie could not get around without both sticks until December of that year, at which time he would visit his Gun Club on shoot days and sit scoring, wishing he could once again take part in competition.

Finally, the following year, Laurie made it to the tracks on one stick which was dropped on the ground while each shot was fired, then retrieved for him to walk to the next track. His balance was still very poor and scores were only 60% of those he had attained prior to the accident. After three months of perseverance, the stick was left at the gate on the way through to the tracks. All the long days of exercise were beginning to pay off. His scores slowly improved until at last with 94/100, he won an Intermediate Sash at the Albany Gun Club - his first win since the accident.

Laurie's comeback was acclaimed by all who had witnessed his courageous fight. In 1982, against all comers and only one point down, he won outright the State Mixed Target Championship at the Geraldton Crayfish Carnival.

A detailed diary has been kept since his return to competitive shooting, starting on May 4th 1980. It makes interesting reading, the trophies listed; goblets, toasters, an electric can opener, radios etc. would stock a small gift shop. Also recorded here and there are a few dollar in sweeps. One brief entry reads - "March 28th 1983 nominated for Tambellup Sportstar of the Year Award" - for anyone else an honour, for Laurie Hull a triumph over adversity.

He has set himself a goal. One sash every year. A modest goal indeed when one considers the two sashes he won at the Katanning Gun Club on the weekend of November 2nd and 3rd 1984 (one of these being the High Gun Sash). The next day at Cherry Tree Pool Field Shoot he returned the respectable score of 44/56 - "The walk-up station was my down fall" said he with a grin.

I see Laurie as an example to be looked up to by all those who are handicapped, and without doubt, he is a credit to the Sport of Clay Target Shooting.

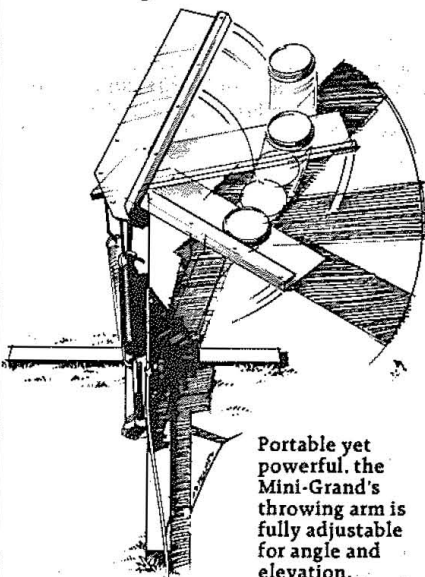

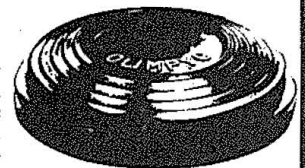

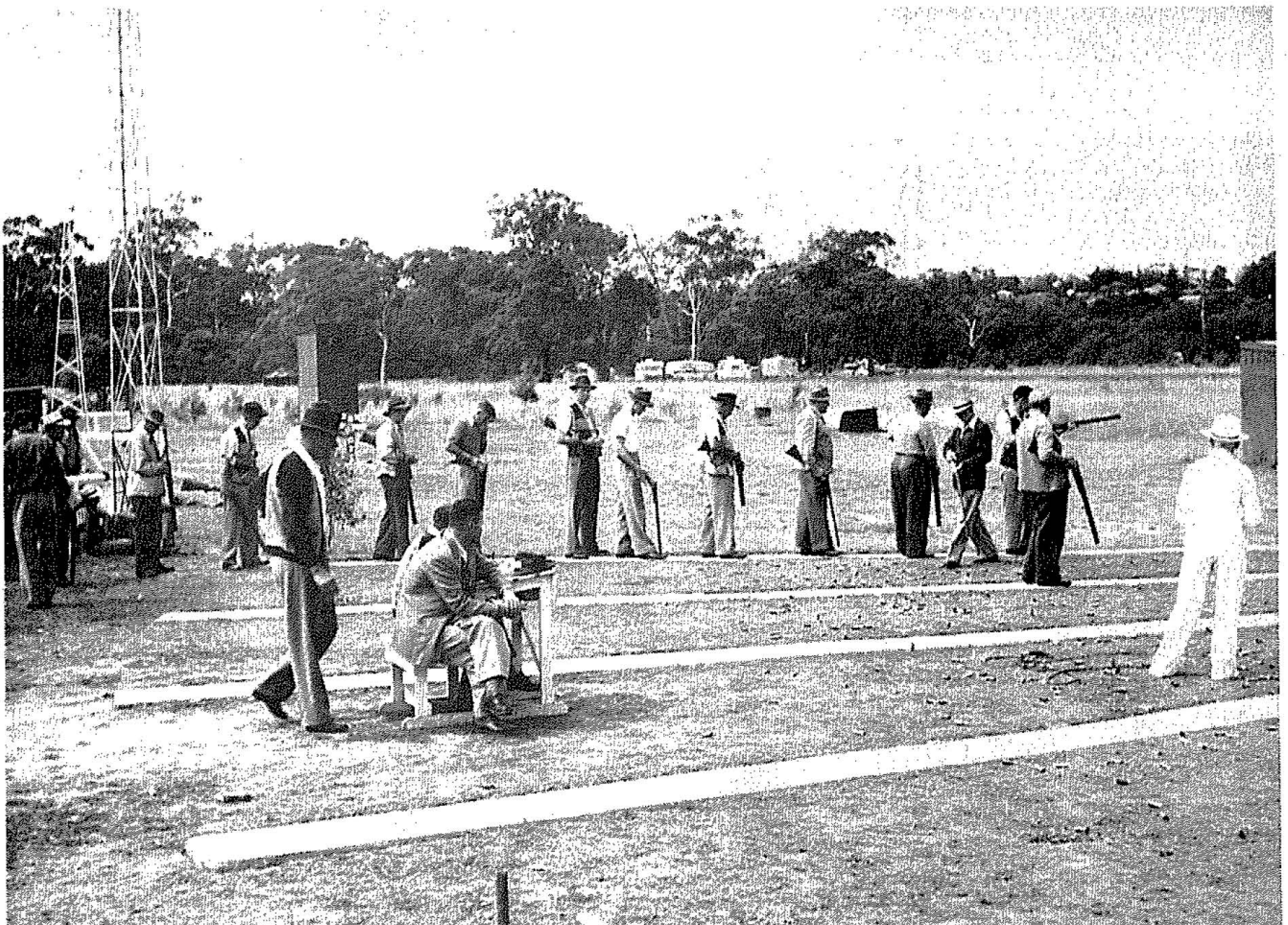
Clay target shooting in Australia took a big step forward, after a decision was made in 1936 to break away from the live bird Association, to form a National Clay Target Association. Unfortunately it was less than three years later that World War Two was to put a stop to all further development for the next five years.

It was in fact, not until 1945-46 that we were able to get moving again, due mainly to shortages of equipment, plus the unsettled state of affairs generally.

However, one event that had received quite a deal of discussion during the early months of 1934 was the Centenary celebrations later that year. A committee meeting of the Nobel Club March 21, 1934 decided to conduct the First Southern Hemisphere Clay Bird Championships. The event was to be staged on the Nobel Club ground on the dates of October 27 and 29 and November 1, 1934 during the Centenary celebrations program. A supporting program was also to be worked out.

A great deal of discussion took place concerning competition conditions etc. It was finally agreed that the event be at 50 birds from 21 yards. The event was to be shot from the centre lane, each shooter would shoot at 5 birds at a visit. (This was the live bird championship style of shooting. It was followed for clay target events and discontinued when more suitable rules were formed by the A.C.T.A. National Committee.)

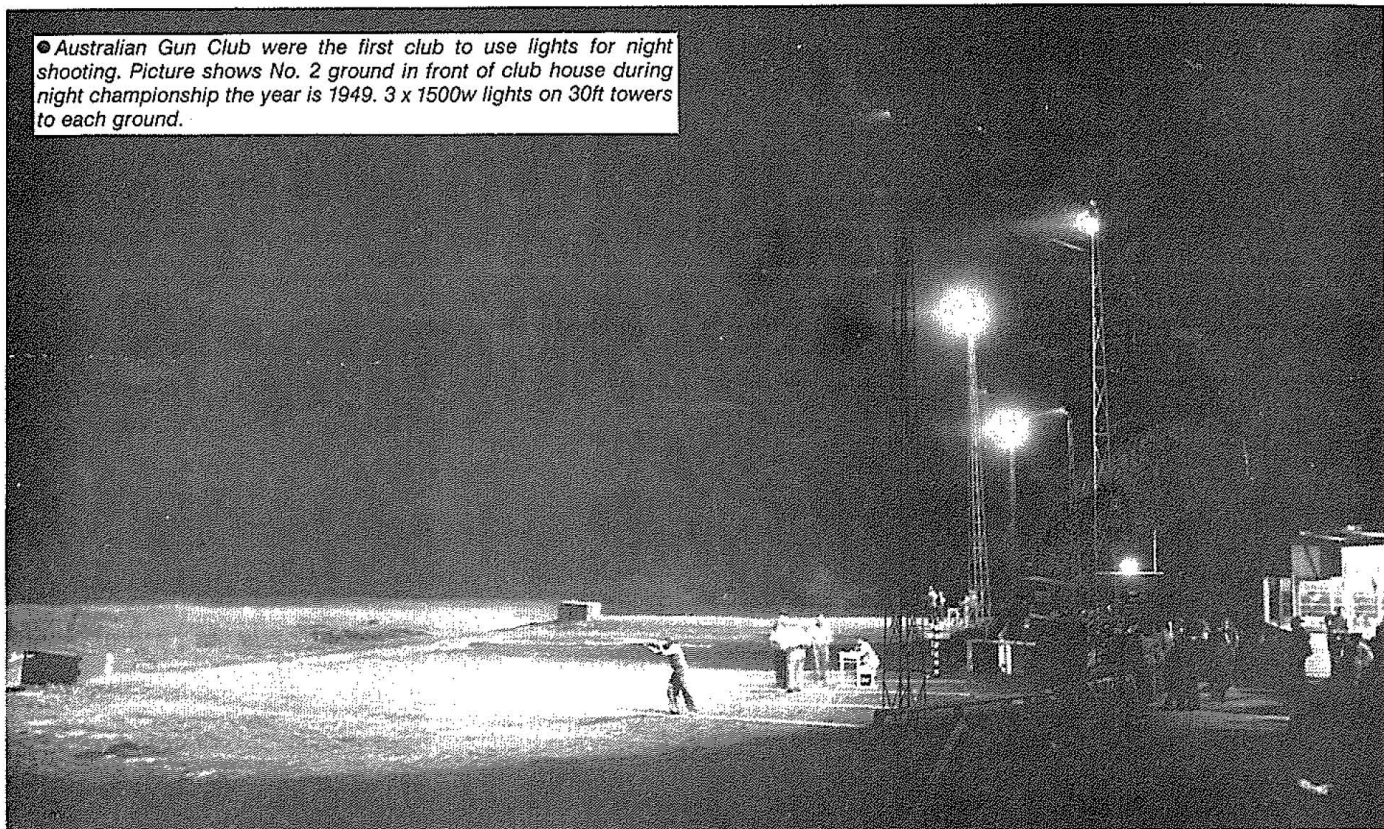

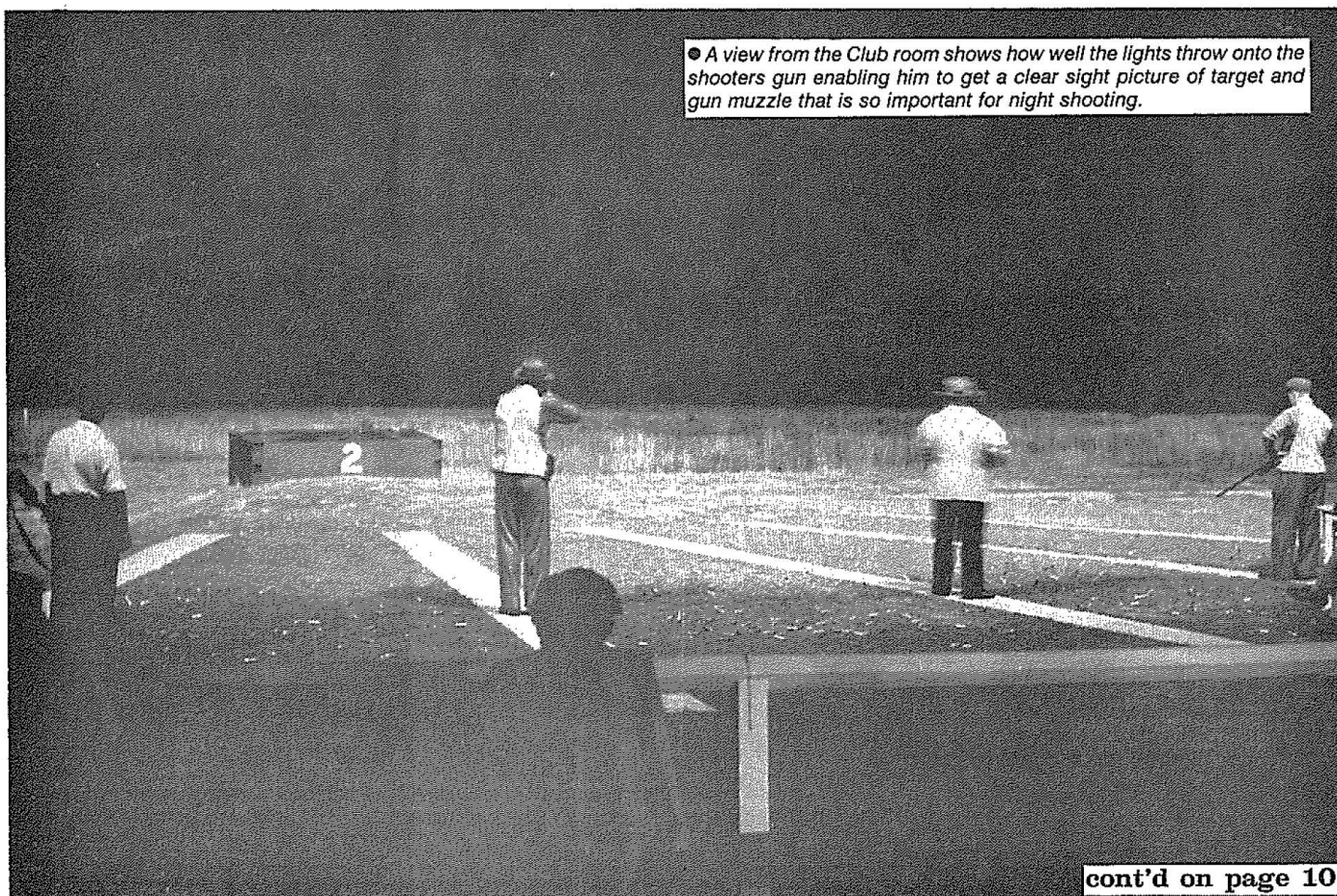

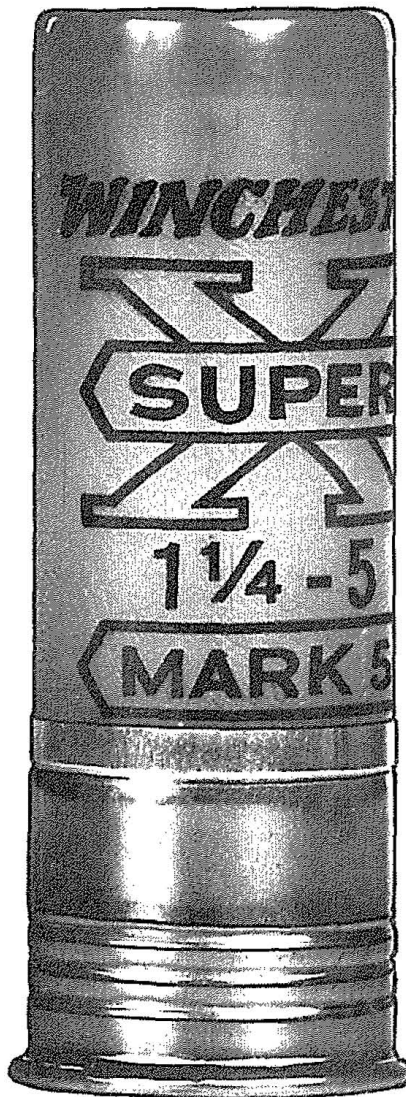

State President of the Western Australian Clay Target Association, Mr Murray Alexander said, Considering the breaks that were expected over the festive season all essential work will be completed prior to a full trial of the complex at the end of February.

This will be followed on March 2-3 with the first competitive shoot to be conducted at the new facility by the Azzuri Gun Club, he said.

Mr Alexander also announced that CADBURY SCHWEPPE'S PTY LTD will sponsor the 1985, 25th Australian Double Rise Championship.

He said, The enthusiasm shown by the Company to participate in our sport goes well for not only the Nationals but other events around the Country.

TRACKS AND TRAPS COMPLETED

He continued "To date 10 Down The Line tracks and traps are in position and completed with only the roofs to be added while all Skeet Houses to the low level are finished.

"A water bore has been successfully sunk while electricity connections are well underway.

"For publicity purposes and communication, telephone lines have been laid while the foreground of the traps has been cleared and landscaped.

"As mentioned previously the Club House to cost around \$400,000 was successfully tendered for in December and work will be well underway by the time this story goes to press.

"Although it will not be completed fully by the Nationals the facilities available will cover all requirements of competitors, organisers and visitors. This enormous modern building will have copious areas of covered walkway and verandah available for all to utilise.

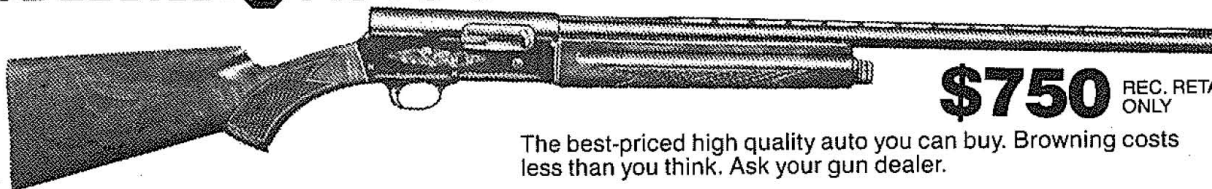

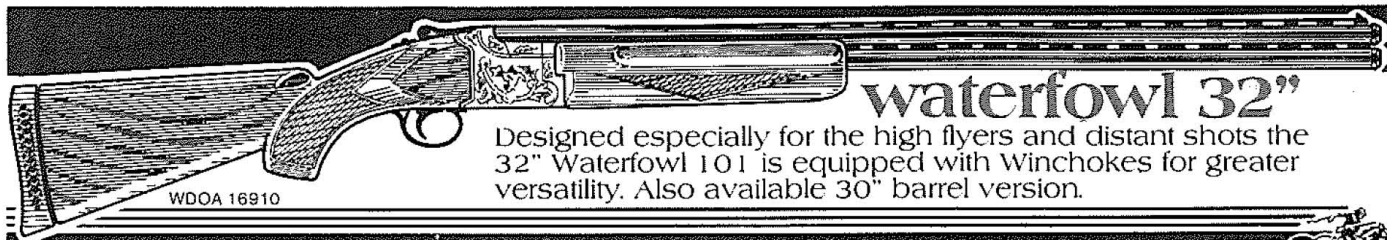

BERETTA'S S682X TRAP GUN

by Pat Browne



● The S682X has a unique locking system, the two holes on sides of monobloc accept pins which protrude through the action face.

It has been a long time since we have had anything new from Beretta. In fact it was back in 1979 we looked at the update when Armi Beretta changed their S58 series to the S680 series. There have been some minor variations since then but now we have the S682X Trap Gun. It is not that different to the earlier models but there are enough significant differences for us to have a close look again.

To refresh your memory, the last significant changes to this series of guns was the tidying up of the trigger mechanism, sears and locking mechanism and a general face-lift of external characteristics.

The S682X has this tidy up again but added is the tendency to start specialising. The S682X is a specialist Trap Gun and a good one at that.

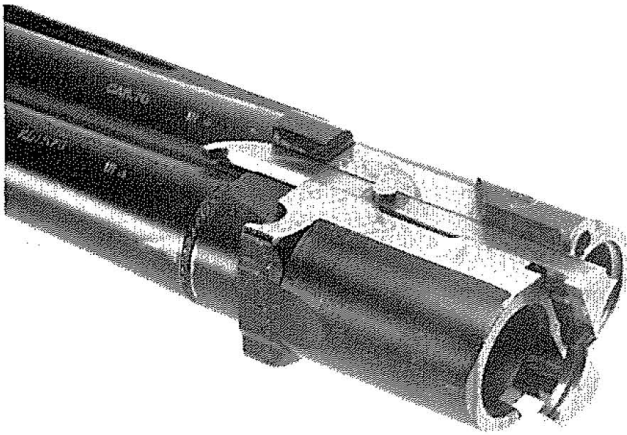
Out of the case it is a real fine looking gun. With an all new finish which we will discuss later, it is one of the most distinctive guns I have ever seen.

The gun weighs in at 8 lbs. (3.86 kg) which puts it in the heavy class, but this is what the trapshooters are looking for, particularly in the States where this gun will be a hit. I have not seen the gun mentioned in overseas mags yet but it will come, rest assured. The overall length is 47" with 29" barrels up. This is a sensible compromise. European guns these days have 75 cm barrels as standard for the competition games and this translates to 29 inches, so what we have is the metric version of the 30" trap gun.

The gun is a basic boxlock, of the S68 series and whilst the configuration is the same as most boxlocks, the locking system is rather unique. There are no underlugs as such, but a 'bifurcated' lump system that is a feature of all the S series from Beretta.

MONOBLOC HAS A LOT TO DO

The barrels are sleeved into a monobloc which is not really of conventional design, this monobloc has a lot more to do. Whereas the normal, or what most regard as normal, under and over gun has a hinge pin and underlocking, Beretta does things a little differently. In essence, Beretta have taken the under locking lugs off and replaced them with lugs on the action sides and locking by two pins in the action face. Two crescent shaped recesses on the monobloc engage with the two bifurcated lugs inside the action sides. This system has a lot going for it as it makes for a very slim action and improves that vital leading hand-barrel-eye relationship which is so important in the competition shotgunning field. For those not familiar with that statement, it means that the slimmer the action is, the closer the hand on the forend is to the axis of the bottom barrel and the higher the controlling hand is on the pistol grip. All this makes for a more responsive gun that points smoothly and accurately.

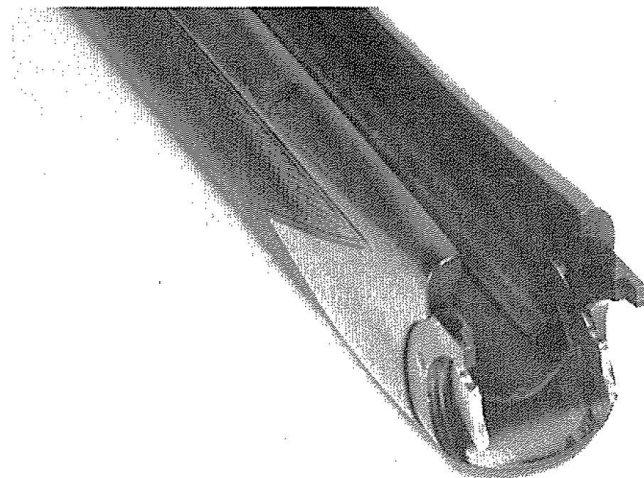


● There are no underlugs, lockup is a combination of the bifurcated lumps and the action pins. Crescent shaped recess engage with the hinge spigot in action side.

Most top guns have this, the big brother of this gun, the S04, is a classic, so too is the Perazzi and others. We do however destroy some of this relationship with the high stock on the trap gun but correct a little with a high rib. So, it is all essentially compromise. When you get it all right then you have what is called a 'good' trap gun. This S682X is a 'good' trap gun, the boys at Beretta have done their homework and come up with the right combination.

The slim action of this gun belies the strength in the action. I have seen earlier models of this gun perform faultlessly for 10 years and more over the traps. This is the place that any gun gets a good hammering, but they are still there breaking targets. So the action is tried and tested.

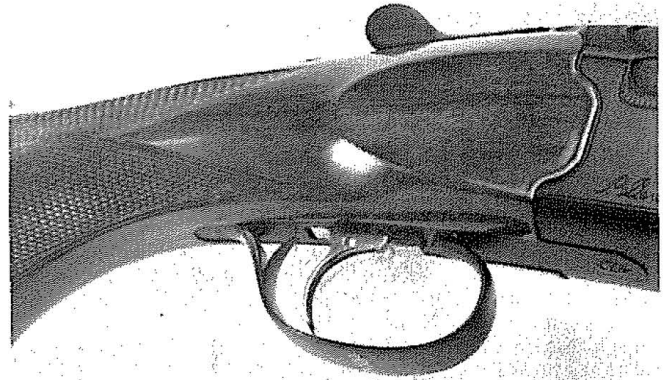
But there some other features that bear mentioning. If the action ever does shoot loose then the tightening procedure is very simple. The pivot pins, set into the action sides can be removed and replaced with a simple hex wrench. Together with this, the shoulder locking lugs can also be replaced. So maintenance problems are solved.

A TRIGGER TO ADMIRE

Back in the days when the 600 series was being updated the majority of refinements were in the trigger mechanism. The S58 had a problem with primer drag. Whilst the firing pins were spring loaded the main hammer spring was so strong it would hold the firing pin down after firing with the resulting wear and tear on firing pin faces. A simple mechanical modification solved this problem and the same mechanism is incorporated in the S682X. On hammer fall, the hammer

stops just short and its momentum carries it forward for pin strike. What in actual fact is happening is that the gun has rebounding hammers of sorts.

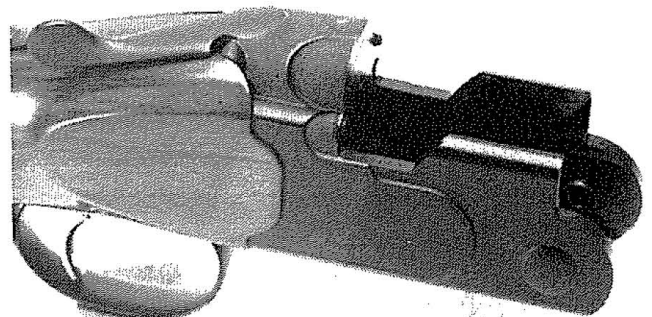
Hammers are coil spring powered and second barrel setting is by inertia, still the best and most reliable in the competition world. This is not to say that mechanical triggers are no good, but more to the point that inertia triggers get you into less trouble.

Sears were also updated in the 600 series and this has carried through to this gun.

An interesting innovation is the adjustable position of the single trigger. The idea is good. There are plenty of trap gunners who have to change their trigger style because of short or long fingers. The S682X has solved this problem by putting the trigger on a grooved slide. Just undo the locking screw and slide the trigger to the optimum position. Top marks for this feature. The trigger is .275" wide is well shaped and gilt plated.

Triggers pulls ran at 6 lbs for bottom and 6.5 lbs for the top. There was little or no slack and the let-off was crisp. But then again, Beretta triggers have always been excellent.

Safety is in the conventional position on the top tang. As is the norm these days there is no barrel selection incorporated, this feature has found to be redundant in competition guns, something I agree with and the result is a simpler and more reliable trigger mechanism.

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE BLUEING

Probably the most striking feature of this S682X is the finish. When you first see it you wonder if Pietro has gone all the way and black nicked the whole gun. But no, it is something quite new. The boys at Beretta have teflon coated the whole box and dice. This gives the gun quite a sinister look, but a look that catches the eye. The coating is called 'Brunton' and covers all the exposed metal parts. From what I can gather it is baked on and acts as a protective covering. In firing tests the coating has come away from the action face, but then all the action is there. On the outside however, normal wear and tear does not seem to mar the finish. The big bonus is that with normal usage the gun will not rust on the exposed surfaces.

PLAIN IS BEAUTIFUL

With the stark black finish there is very little other ornament. The classic 'P. Beretta' appears on both sides of the receiver and on the floor plate is repeated together with the gun's origin, 'Gardone VT' and the model 'S682X'. Made in Italy appears in the recess that accommodates the forend iron when the gun is open. The word 'Trap' appears on the bottom of the trigger guard and the Beretta logo is set in the bottom of the pistol grip. That completes the ornament and the gun is very distinctive for it, any more and it would be overdone.

With the plain finish comes a fitting that is excellent. The wood to metal and metal to metal fit is excellent. The stock sits a little proud where it meets the action, intentionally one would think, as it is very even and well finished. The checkering is as good as one would see on any gun. The forend is extensively chequered and even the inside is finished, a point often overlooked in guns where the maker does not care.

BIG, BIG STOCK

With trap guns I like a big fat stock which allows you to tailor it to your shape. You cannot do this with a skimpy handle. The stock on this gun is big. A glance at the measurements panel will show you just how big. Complimenting this big stock is a well shaped pistol grip and a 'wundhammer bulge', a palm swell in other words. Comb flutes are a feature on the montel carlo stock and the whole stock is complimented by a factory fitted Pachmayer 'white line' recoil pad.

The palm swell is common to most high grade Beretta's but it stamps it as a right hander's gun. You will have to talk to the boys at Geelong about the availability of stocks for the southpaw. If you are left handed you will not be able to shoot the gun in this form. There is a modicum of 'cast-off' and a good deal of 'twist'. This form of stock has become very prevalent of late, it is a good idea and it shows the stock-makers are doing their homework. In firing tests the gun was a delight to shoot due to these features.

SHOOTS UP A STORM

In firing tests we put some 472 shells through the gun. It was a joy to shoot over the traps. Fast, responsive, precise

pointing are all adjectives you can apply. But to sum it up in one word you would say it was a 'comfortable' gun to shoot. Its good weight, big stock, comfortable forend and solid action combined with superb triggers and shooting light loads had several of us coming back to the rack to pick it up time and time again. When one puts several guns in the rack for testing, it is interesting to see the one that is most popular amongst the testing staff. This S682X was tops.

Observations during tests showed that the ejection, and it has selective ejectors, was crisp, even and well timed. In heavy shooting sessions the high rib and the side vents made the gun shoot cool with no hazing or mirage effects. There was little or no 'new gun stiffness', which says a lot about the final fitting.

PATTERNS TRUE TO FORM

At the pattern plate the results were as expected. We patterned with the new Beretta Blue #8's. It was the standard pattern test at 40 yards.

The bottom barrel measured out at 30 points of choke which puts it in the improved modified or three quarter choke. The top was full with 45 points. Both these figures returned the regulation figures, 68% and 74%.

The bottom barrel shot about 8" high at 40 yards and so did the top. It is not often you get the point of impact as precise as on this gun, it was a pleasure to test one that had everything right.

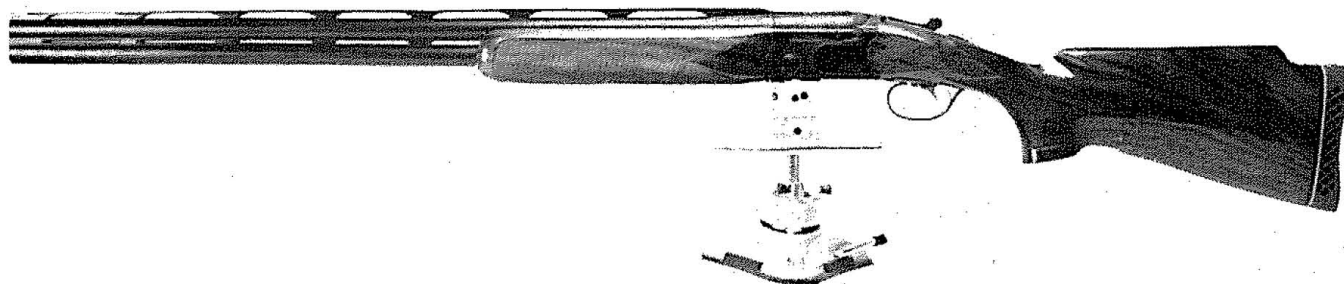
A CASE TO BE PROUD OF

The boys at Geelong tell me that the gun will come in the latest of Beretta Cases. It is a beauty. Made from some type of high impact plastic, it is superbly fitted. It has room for the disassembled gun, the stock and action are firmly held with a velcro strap. The barrels and forend sit snugly in their recess and there is room for your cleaning gear. Even your snap-caps have clip-in recesses to hold them firmly. The carrying handle is flush with the outside of the case and moulded in. Under the handle is an excellent combination lock and there are toggle clamps on either end. If you travel a lot to shoots, you will really appreciate this case. One hopes that they will make the case available as an accessory.

The current RRP of the S682X is \$1580. At this price it represents good value for money. One would expect that when they are released on to the market this price will be negotiable. If you can get one at a couple of spots down on the abovementioned price it is a steal.

What is happening is that the gunmakers at Beretta are starting to specialise. Apart from the S04 and to a lesser extent the so-called 'Trap' versions in the S600 series there has never really been a fair dinkum Trap Gun from Beretta. This S682X is a fair dinkum trap gun, from its front 'ray-bar' bead to its Pachmayer pad. The specialist trigger, the big stock, the high rib, the ventilated side ribs all combine to stamp 'For Trap Shooters Only' on this gun.

So, if you are in the market for a superbly built specialist trap or trench gun, look very carefully at this one, it goes into my 'top 5' for the competition gunner.

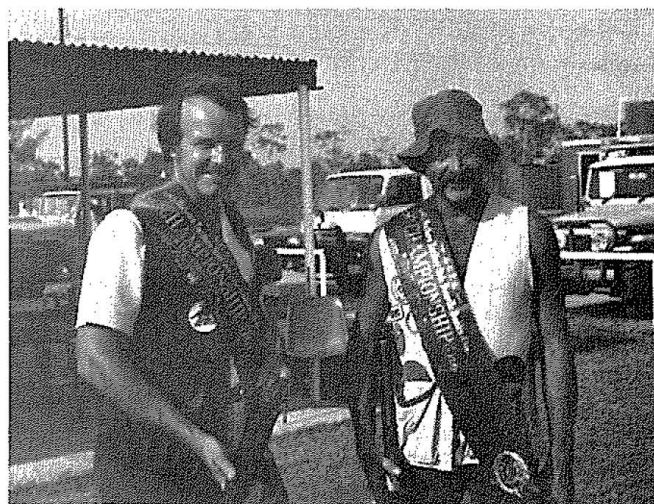

Competition numbers swelled to 162 as some shooters competed only in this teams event for which they had qualified in elimination rounds earlier in the year.

The Riverina Zone Junior team of Glen Evans, Andrew and Patrick Pendlebury, all from Griffith, won the junior competition convincingly by some 30 points to bring home the inaugural NSW CTA Edgewood Junior Zone Team Perpetual trophy, donated by Rob and Mary-Lou Parker.

Two of the juniors, Glen Evans and Andrew Pendlebury, also represented in the Riverina Open Team with Bruce Charles (Barellan), Les Graham (Barellan), John Blain (Narrandera), George Ceely (Narrandera), Grant Ceely (Narrandera), Mark O'Mahoney (Griffith), Keith Sim (Griffith), Dave Wallace (Griffith), Mick Pommer (Griffith) and Ian Evans (Griffith).

Andrew Pendlebury's score of 144/150 points won the Riverina Zone Open Team Perpetual High Gun trophy. He also won the C grade division in open competition for the NSW Point Score Championship, as well as the individual junior trophy.

In doing so he broke all 50 targets — his six points lost being second barrel hits — and gained his 50 Break Badge plus the Doug Osborne trophy for the longest break from a junior competitor over the three-day carnival.

The Riverina missed out on trophies in the NSW Single Barrel Championship, but John Blain, Narrandera, and Glen Evans, Griffith, shot consistently enough over the three major events to gain places in two of the State teams.

On the final day of the carnival, Blain represented in the open NSW trap team and Evans in the junior NSW trap team for a postal teams' competition between the states, results of which will not be known till later in the year.

"UNDERSTANDING PROOF MARKS AND CARTRIDGE DESIGNATIONS"

Most cartridge cartons carry explicit guidance as to the gauge, chamber length, and proof level of guns in which the cartridges in that carton may be used safely and properly. This information includes, for guns bearing all accepted proof marks, (see sample of some of these proofs in this article). These proof marks include the service pressure (i.e. the maximum pressure level to which the shotgun can be subjected in normal use) in tons per square inch and for guns under British proof prior to 1955. For guns bearing European proof marks the information given is the proof pressure in Kg per square centimetre.

Any special feature (such as Magnum loads) are particularly stressed so that users of these cartridges have adequate information to enable them to assess the suitability of the cartridge for the gun they intend to use.

Nevertheless, this preview adds to this information by listing all the current range, as near as possible, together with shot loads, recommended gun chamber size, and likewise suitable Nitro proof marks (Nitro proof, pressure,

and/or loads) stamped on the shotgun. For those purchasing a shotgun for the first time, it will explain these important markings on the barrel and action (although professional gun dealers will normally explain these pointers to you). Anyone having an old gun . . . perhaps a family heirloom, then by the use of this preview will be able to tell whether it has been nitro-proved, for use with modern nitro-powder loaded cartridges. In addition to the British proof marks, the reader will note a fair cross-section of the main foreign, or European proof marks, which are expected to be found on such makes. The countries concerned have Proof Houses established by law and fulfil certain other conditions stipulated by the British Proof Houses. Reciprocal agreements are in force with these countries. All modern cartridges are loaded with smokeless powders (unless otherwise stated) and must be used only in guns which have been nitro-proved and in SOUND CONDITION.

Additionally arms will bear markings to indicate the maximum mean pressure* of cartridges for which the arm has been proved together with the nominal gauge (in a diamond, as \diamond) and chamber length. Shotguns will also bear marks to indicate the nominal bore diameter, as found at 9 in. from the breech, shown in decimals e.g. .729 in.

*In exceptional cases maximum service loads may be marked in lieu of service pressures.

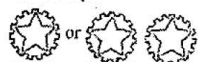

There are other marks used to indicate bore diameter and chamber length in millimetres, but they are always in addition to the above-mentioned. In Belgium no alteration may be made of bore diameter without reproof. Furthermore, barrels are weighed and marked as to their weight at proof. Reduction in the weight of the barrels due for instance to enlargement or for any other reason may render the barrel out of proof. Barrel weights are shown, for example: 1 kg 229.

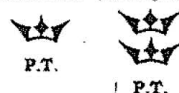

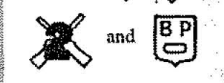

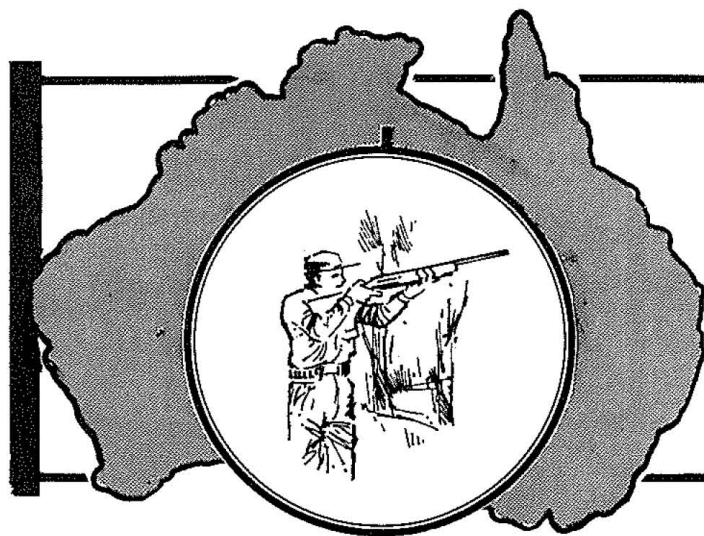

PLEASE NOTE: The only way to establish whether an "old" or well used gun is in proof, i.e. that the bores have NOT BEEN MATERIALLY ENLARGED to a potentially dangerous state, is to take your gun to a qualified gunsmith and ask him to check the BORES with his BARREL GAUGES. AT PROOF, guns are stamped with these marks indicating bore diameters: (see illustration with this preview, as a sample). On the modern under/over shotgun and the semi auto in common use today these proof marks can still be found, but to the naked eye they will be very small, and found around the side of most barrels near the extractors and on the side of the gun's action face. All modern o/u guns are proofed for the modern NITRO powders used in the modern cartridges.

Let me stress JUST ONE MORE TIME, if in doubt about the suitability of any shotgun or any cartridges for use therein, PLEASE have the issue checked FIRST, with a professional gunsmith or if you are the member of a gun club, search out YOUR CLUB COACH, who is there to help you, and be guided by his vast experience. The "bloke" you take for granted may be YOURSELF.

* This preview simply concentrates on NITRO proof marks and omits provisional proof, black powder proof and any other special marks.
