EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

It was good to see so many entries in the recently conducted Olympic Discipline Nationals.

Incorporating the Australia Games added interest to the series and enabled us to get some limited media coverage. It is hoped that the Games will become a regular festival to give Australian athletes an opportunity to compete against International stars. A chicken and egg situation applied with these Inaugural Games in that being the first, the overseas stars were chary about competing out of season in a new competition, and the foundation lacked the money to attract stars in all sports to give the Games the necessary credibility. Given time I am sure the Australia Games will become one of the major World Festivals of sport.

The legislation scene is hotting up in New South Wales as the State Government plans to pass strict Firearms Legislation amendments.

A public meeting was held in the relevant Minister's electorate on Monday February 4, which was very well attended. Not surprisingly perhaps, no representative from the Government attended the meeting.

A tough fight is ahead with the Government, particularly as the Premier of the State remarked recently at a news conference that he saw no reason why any city people required Firearms.

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1985

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1985 Handicap Cards for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1984 card.
 2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
 3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1985 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
 4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any monies or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
 5. Rule 2.1 (m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of three months.
 6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.
 7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration: Rule 2.7.
 8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board please report to handicapper's office.
 9. If you do not wish to be down graded please advise handicapper's office.

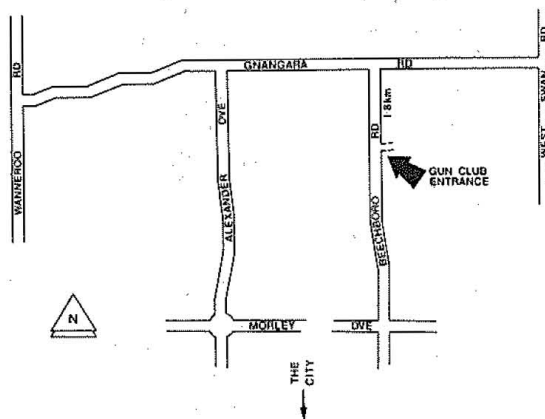

AUSTRALIA GAMES OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

Entries were excellent for the 1985 Olympic Discipline Nationals, incorporating The Australia Games, conducted at Melbourne Gun Club, January 26 to 31.

John Summers took a great double, winning the National Olympic Skeet Championship with an Australian record equalling score, and the Commonwealth/Australia Games Championship by three targets.

Melbourne Gun Club was presented in excellent condition and the weather was kind right through the six days of competition.

NATIONAL OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Entries 107, 29 up on last year. At the end of the day there were 19 scores of 70/75 or better.

In a three way tie for the lead were Terry Rumbel, John Maxwell, and Vic Flower of New South Wales, on 73, one target ahead of Chas Riegert W.A., Geoff Mark Vic., and Alexander Collins Vic. Six shooters were one further back on 71 with seven on 70.

Day two, still nice and warm but overcast conditions. Bill Iles Vic., added a 73 to his first day 71 to lead on 144 from Cliff Bailey N.S.W. 143, Terry Rumbel N.S.W., junior shooter Mark Rogers Vic., together on 142, and New Zealand visitor Russell McGowan on 141. A further six shooters on 140 were still in touch with the final 50 targets to shoot. John Maxwell had a disastrous day, dropping 14 targets to put him out of contention. He just couldn't see the targets leave the bunker.

With so many shooters in with a chance, it was a very tense start to the final 50 targets. Rumbel 25 for 167, Iles 23 for 167, and Bailey 24 for 167, all tied up with the final round to shoot. Two targets back to Boyd, and three to Ellis, Rogers the junior, Harris, and McGowan.

Terry Rumbel handled the pressure well in the last round with 24 to run out the winner on 191. Graeme Boyd added another 25 for 190 and the Silver medal, while Bill Iles dropped three to go into a shoot-off for the Bronze medal with Cliff Bailey, John Harris, and Russell McGowan.


McGowan went clean to clinch the Bronze with Harris and Iles both dropping one and Bailey two.

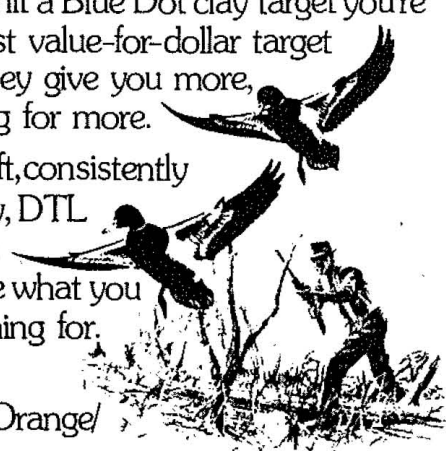

NATIONAL OLYMPIC SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Thirty-eight shooters faced the starter, a big jump in entries on the 24 who shot last year.

John Summers shot the lot on the first day to lead from Hale and Thomson on 73, Meuleman 72, Crikis and Neve 70. After 150 targets it was very tight with Summers two down on 148, Thomson 147, Hale 146 and Crikis 143. These four had moved away from the rest of the field, the nearest to them being junior Michael Inguanti on 139.

The final day and John Summers had to shoot the 50 to create a new Australian record. He dropped one in his penultimate round, then went clean in the last to equal the current record of 197, a fine performance. Ian Hale shot the 50 to be just behind Summers while Thomson let three go in the final 50 to take the Bronze medal on 194.

The Interstate Teams Match was won by Victoria represented by Ian Hale, Michael Inguanti, and Craig Meuleman with a score of 422/450, from New South Wales on 395.

Rose, Gavin Searle N.Z., Chas Riegert and Vic Flower 71. Pud Burgess, Graeme Boyd, and Stan Collins were in touch on 70.

The second day saw John Harris stretch his lead to two targets with 147, from Bill Iles 145, Ken Rose on his own in third spot 144, and Boyd, Ellis, Maxwell 143. The group on 142 were Burgess, Rumbel, Russell Mark, and Dino Oliviero.

The final 50 — would Harris be able to hold off the challenges sure to come from the pack?

After the first 25 he was still two in front of Bill Iles, both shooting 24s. Russell Mark had moved into third with 25, Rose and Maxwell both 20 to drop out of contention. Pud Burgess plugged away with a solid 24 to be in fourth spot.

The final round saw Russell Mark drop three, and Pud Burgess go clean to take the Bronze medal on 191. Harris dropped two which meant that Iles could tie by shooting the lot. The twelfth target eluded Bill giving victory to John Harris with the excellent score of 194. John had led all the way, not an easy task in any competition — in a field like this a super effort.

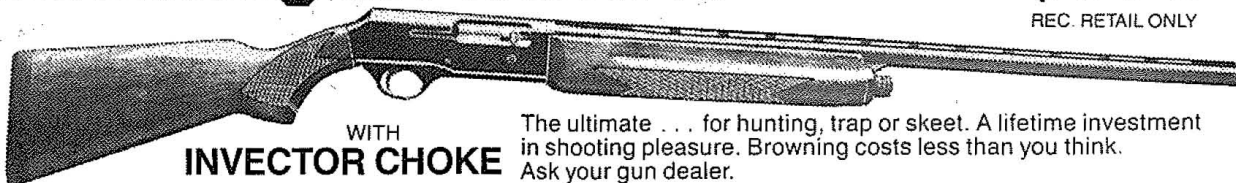

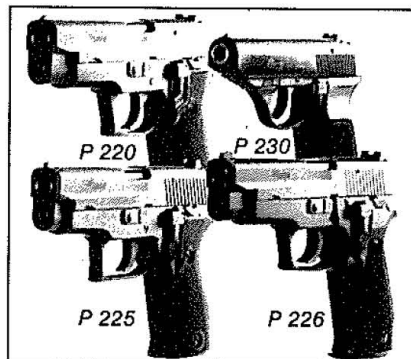

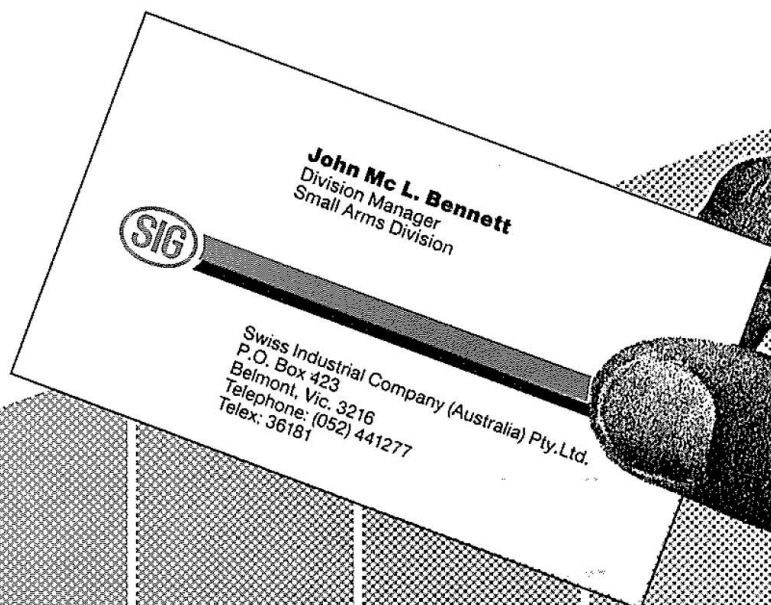

Could Summers crack the Australian record in this event? He was in top form, a new record looked a possibility. Thirty-six shooters had entered, 10 up on 1984.

Day one, Summers in front with 74, Crikis, Hale, and Inguanti, next best on 72, Guy 71.

John Summers moved further ahead on the second day, shooting the lot to total 149, four ahead of Crikis and Inguanti. Next best was Guy 143, Thomson 141, with Hale and junior Colin Siede on 140. Ian Hale had a bad day dropping seven targets, five in one round.

With 50 to shoot Summers was on target for the new record, but put in his worst round for the week, a 22. This still left him two ahead of Crikis with the final 25 to shoot. He cruised through a 24 for 195 and the Gold medal, beating Alex Crikis and Michael Inguanti by three targets, Crikis taking the silver from Inguanti in a shoot-off. Hale was still in the horrors dropping five of the final 50 targets.

Congratulations to John Summers on a fine double.

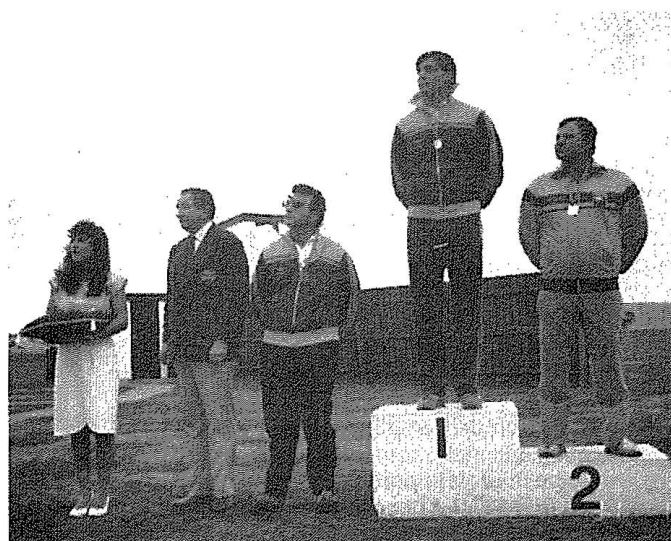

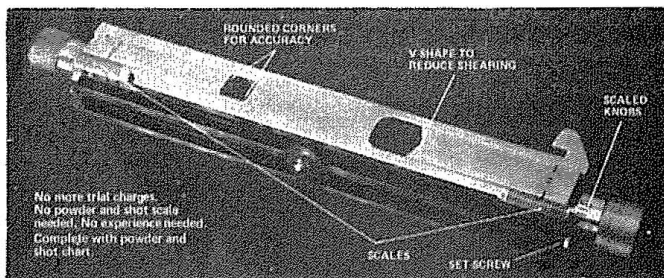

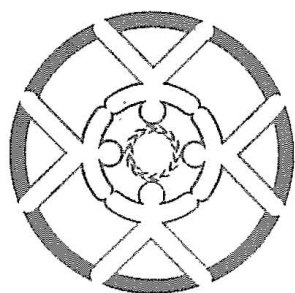

Four Clay Target Shooting events will be conducted as part of the Masters Games. They are Olympic Trap, and Olympic Skeet, commencing August 19, and North American Trap, and North American Skeet, commencing August 23. The events will be shot 100 targets per day, entry fees \$50 (CDN) per event.

Age eligibility for the shooting events is 55 years and over on December 31, 1985.

MASTERS GAMES

At least three Australians will compete at the Masters Games (for the 55 and over age group) in Canada this year and we wish them good shooting overseas. I believe this is the first time trap and skeet have been included so if you feel the young guys are getting the better of you, don't sell the prized greener just yet as I'm sure the competition is just as fierce in this field. Barney Rooke is heading over so I hope to have details when available.

NSW ISU

Skeet training weekend will be conducted at the ACT International Gun Club on 23rd and 24th of March. The trenches get their turn on 27th and 28th April at the same venue.

In attendance will be the NSW training squads plus selected juniors will be invited.

Conducted by NSW coaching director Barney Rooke, speakers will include Jeff Bond and Dick Telford from the Institute of Sport, plus Peter Quire, Jim Ellis and Terry Rumbel. The program will include video, lectures and shooting technique.

Alex Crikis wanted to be mentioned in the ISU report. Okay that's done.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Shooters,

At the last Executive meeting of your association discussion took place as to the desirability or not of having less double barrel shooting in our programmes.

To gauge the reaction of you the Clay Target Shooters of Australia I put forward the following for your comment.

"That D/B shooting should be reduced by 50% and in its place D/B points and S/B should be promoted." Some of the many reasons for reducing D/B shooting are as follows:

1. The cost of expensive shoot-offs to clubs and shooters alike is becoming a burden to our sport.
2. Good technique is not encouraged by D/B events.
3. Shooters not in the D/B shoot-off are waiting about too long for future events.
4. Weekend programmes can and are being very considerably taxed in time by these long and expensive shoot-offs.

On the other hand the advantages of D/B points and S/B, but in particular D/B points, are as follows:

1. The new shooter still gets two shots at the target to get him started.
2. The better shooter has to improve his or her technique to produce a winning score.
3. Clubs conducting events need not fear shoot-offs running half the programme.
4. In rough conditions a shooter may drop a point early in an event and still, with application, have a chance of winning.

All this to me adds up to a very reasonable case for less D/B and more D/B points and S/B. It is not being suggested that D/B shooting be deleted, but only that a little balance be put into our shooting.

So how about it shooters, let your A.C.T.A. delegate and zone delegates know what you think.

In particular the shooters who believe we need more balance in our programmes should make an effort to convey the message, because the D/B enthusiast will for sure, and what we need is a cross-section of opinion.

It is time to think of our future and how costs can be curtailed and shooting numbers increased and this may be one way to do just that.

Hoping to hear comment on the above.

WHY SHOULD I REGISTER WITH THE A.C.T.A.?

Neil Hardy

This question is often asked by shooters new to clay target shooting and often put as "what do I get for my \$30 annual registration fee". Very likely this question receives a blank look in return as he will see little of material value.

In November and December of each year, shooters pay their annual registration fee to their club secretary who will then forward this to A.C.T.A. He will promptly receive his "Registered Shooter Record Card" mailed direct to him, containing DTL handicap and grades for Trap and Skeet (and ISU disciplines if applicable). The registered shooter is immediately covered by our insurance policy for accidents at the club.

The shooter's name is entered on the mailing list for Clay Target Shooting News, our monthly publication, which advises what's happening in clay target shooting. Whilst the bulk of the registration fee is placed in the ACTA general account, \$2.00 is remitted to the shooter's State association to aid their administration, and \$1.00 is allocated to the general travel fund for overseas teams of all disciplines.

The Annual Registered Shooter Record Card: This card allows a shooter to present himself at any registered gun club in Australia (and overseas) and establish the bona-fide of his grading and handicap so that he may compete in that day's events. It provides his own personal record of performance and a record of regular firearms usage in the event of having to justify a licence with the inevitable tightening of firearms legislation.

Clay Target Shooting News: Monthly editions of this magazine keep shooters abreast of current happenings. Many read it from cover to cover delighting in shoot reports of the performance of friends in other states. Regular updates of legislation problems, executive decisions, new products and industry happenings keep you informed.

The Fraternity: Any shooter who has visited other clubs will tell of the camaraderie of the clay target shooting fraternity. When you visit a club the hospitality can be overwhelming and indeed many plan vacations and long service leave around visiting gun clubs and experiencing the hospitality. Clay Target Shooting is a classless society with people from all walks of life — long lasting and valuable friendships are easily made BUT you've got to be a registered shooter to enjoy it.

The A.C.T.A.: Every group or organisation of a common interest must have a governing body and it needs money in order to perform its tasks. The A.C.T.A. provides our shooting rules common throughout the country, it conducts our National Championships, it presents our views to the Government and solicits the grants so necessary to our administration, coaching movement and team representation. Our major source of income is shooter registrations. Of course a shooter may disagree with some of the many decisions of A.C.T.A. but all policy is a majority of opinion of two delegates from each state.

If you shoot alongside an unregistered shooter, be aware that:

He has no insurance cover if he causes or is involved in an accident,

He accepts the benefits of clay target shooting but makes no contribution to it,

and He has no bona-fide for his handicap or grade.

Yes, annual registration is worth the \$30 fee.

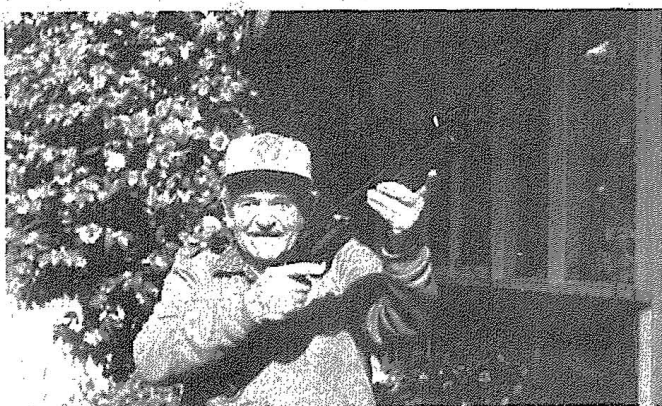

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES THE WAY IT USED TO BE

From the year 1945 clay target shooting was expanding on a pattern that had been developed overseas. The National Executive Committee by this time consisted of

delegates from all States and were busy promoting our sport on a truly National basis.

Clay target shooting was becoming much more competitive, making it necessary to draw up suitable rules of shooting and conditions for the various Championship events. At this time the Association was not financial enough to have a rules book printed, so had to make do with a folding leaflet-type arrangement, which was posted to every affiliated club. A handicapping system was also included with the folder.

Clubs were asked to appoint a club handicapper who would be responsible for members' handicaps. The A.C.T.A. also kept a handicap of all shooters performances in open A.C.T.A. competition. Most competitions were shot from handicap marks — very little Championship shooting was done. Most clubs would have a maximum of three to six Championships each year. It is a far cry from today where many clubs shoot no less than two Championships at every program.



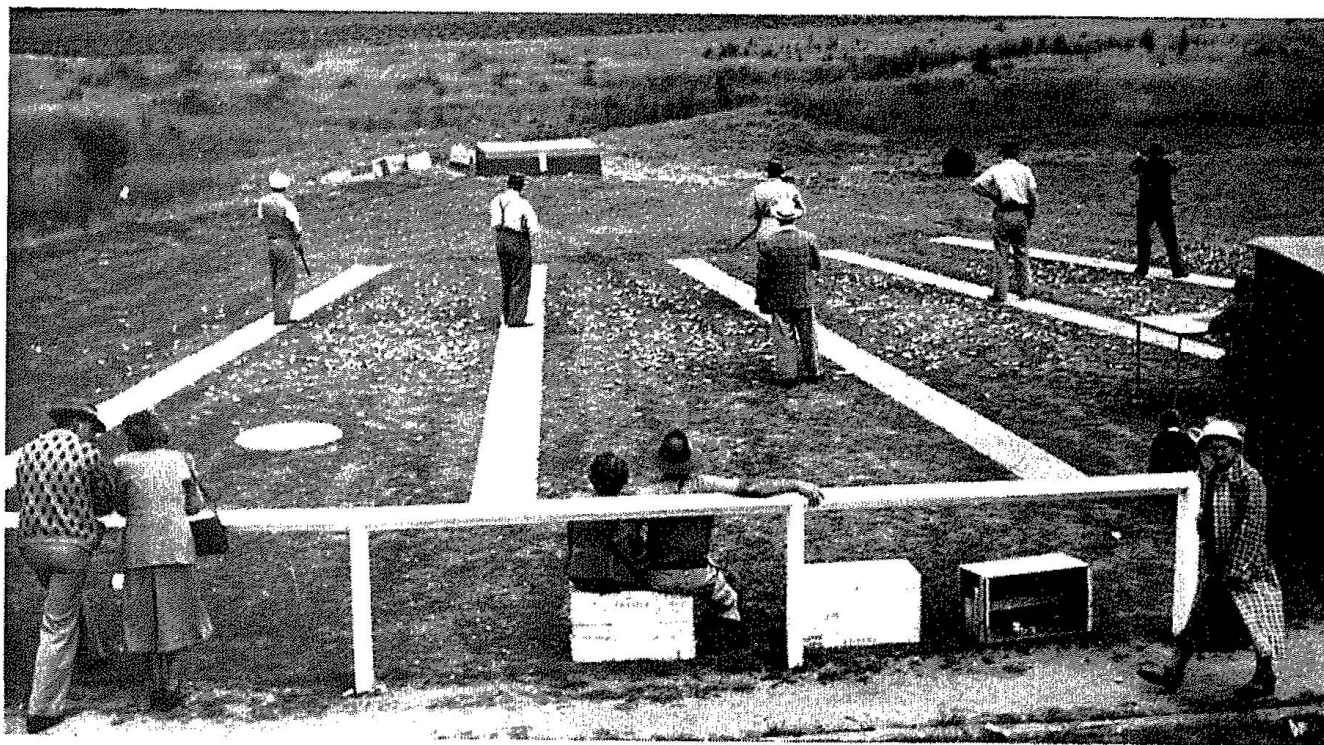
• Three well-known Tasmanian shooters at the 1950 National Championships, Australian Gun Club. Brothers Paul and Sperry Marshall left and right of Jack Tyquin centre. Jack is a former A.C.T.A. President having held the position for several years. He retired from the position in 1969. Both Paul and Sperry Marshall are former

National Championship winners. They also made the International team on many occasions. Sperry was Australia's representative at the World Moving Target Championships in Arizona U.S.A. in the late 1960s. Note their choice of gun, actually autos were very popular at that time and u/os were not freely available.



● 1950 International team at National Championships Australian Gun Club. At that time conditions were that the team be selected from the top 20 shooters. The number was later increased to 25 and finally to 30. Again note the style of gun used, mostly autos and side by side

guns. Shooting jackets were also not in fashion and felt hats were more common than shooting caps. I seem to be the only one wearing a cap.



● The way it used to be.

Before the introduction of self-cocking, electric button release traps, the process of cocking and releasing each target when the shooter called for it, was done manually from a position to the rear of the shooting tracks. A pullers box is shown in the picture right bottom corner. Just forward of this is a scorer at table, and the referee is near centre lane.

Coming back from the trap house and just under ground is a 50mm pipe that extends to the pullers box where it connects to a holding

stand. Inside this pipe is a 25mm rod connected to an upright lever. The operator pushes the lever forward to cock the trap and back to release the target as the shooter calls pull.

The distance between trap house and pullers box was usually around 30 yards. To say the least it was a very laborious and tiring business for the person acting as puller especially over a five or six day National shoot. Result was often erratic target releases if the puller was not an experienced operator.

The building was erected in the immediate post-war years on land that was part of Vic Fankhauser's orchard, joining the Dandenong Creek. Vic made the land available to the club for as long as it was required. The use of new material for anything other than housing etc. was not permissible for some two or three years after the war, so the building of a club pavilion was difficult. However, ways and means were found to get round by using whatever was available.

The glassed-in section on the left came from the old Nobel Clay Bird which was a forerunner of the Australian Gun Club, and from 1948 through 1958 became the main shooting ground for all A.C.T.A.-conducted competitions such as Nationals etc. Reason being that up to 1958 no other ground existed with suitable facilities for competitions lasting over five to six days, and having to provide for 200-300 competitors.

FROM BARE EARTH TO NATIONAL TITLES

Keith Watson MLA, Director of Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation, Mr. John Graham, Chairman of the Metropolitan Regional Planning Authority, Mr. Bill McKenzie, Member for West Province, The Hon. Gordon Masters, MLC and Hon. Niel Oliver MLC and Member for Moore Mr. Allen Blanchard.

At this time both Clay Target and Archery venues on the Whiteman Park Complex will be inspected.

Preparation and plans for the first Carnival by the Azzuri Club on the new multi-million dollar facility in March are well in hand and is expected to attract a large crowd attendance of shooters and visitors.

The Victorian Clay Target Association is trying to reactivate the State I.S.U. Training Squads. To do this, dates were set for an elimination, and the State I.S.U. titles, with the view of using them both to select the squad from the two disciplines.

Thanks to all those who helped with the refereeing and scoring. You helped make the shoot run smoothly.

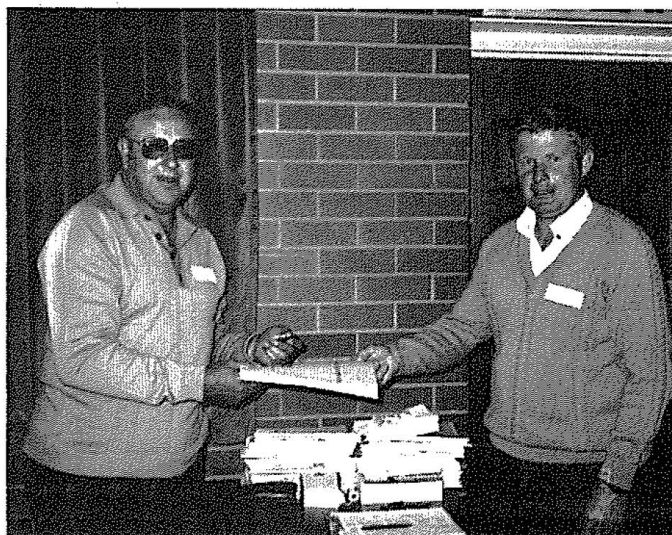

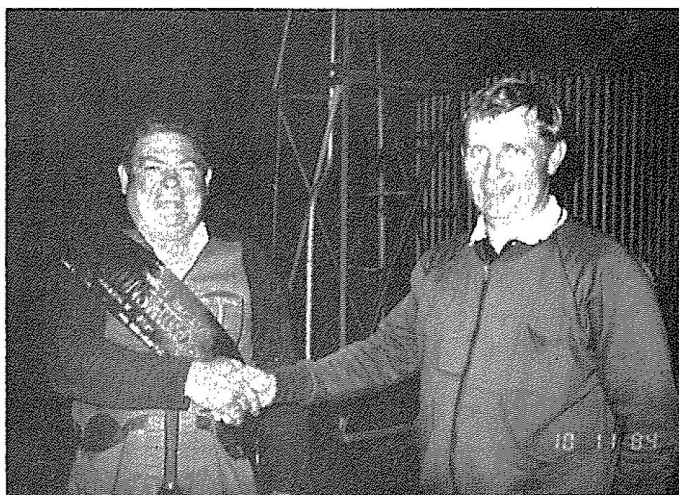
1984 NORTH WEST ZONE CARNIVAL

1984 NSSA WORLD SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Some 800 of the world's greatest shotgunners, including many who were on their way to participate in the Olympics, congregated in San Antonio, Texas, July 19-27, to partake in the 47th NSSA World Skeet Shooting Championships at the National Gun Club in San Antonio.

Shooters from Australia, Korea, New Zealand, Jamaica, Puerto Rico, Spain, England, Germany, Italy and Canada, plus every state in the United States had representatives in this year's tournament.

Highlight of the tournament was the posting of two perfect HOA scores of 550x550 by Robert Uknalis of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Don Kaufman of Garland, Texas. This is the second consecutive year where perfect HOA scores have been shot at the World Championships. In the ensuing HOA shootoff with the .410, Kaufman missed a high two on doubles in the first round and Uknalis thus emerged with his first World Title. Kaufman, by missing his target, emerged as the runner-up, followed by David Starrett of New Boston, Ohio, who took third place over a host of other shooters via the long-run method with a 549x550.

In the opening .410 bore event, a total of 14 shooters plus one industry gunner broke perfect 100x100s. In the ensuing shootoff that went a record nine rounds, Dave Starrett emerged as the gun champion when runner-up Todd Bender of Covington, Louisiana, missed high two doubles in the ninth round. All in all, it was a shame that there had to be a loser in this shootoff, because both Dave and Todd really put on a good show for the spectators. The third place finisher with 100 straight was Rick Lawry of Hamilton, Ontario, a skeet target manufacturer.

In the 28 gauge event, 1983 20 Gauge World Champion, Tal Sprinkles of Austin, Texas, won the title in the 11th round when runner-up Art Sidereas of Lago Vista, Texas, missed low 4. An interesting sidelight is that Sidereas is Tal's shooting coach! I'd have to say that the student learned well, but the coach didn't do too bad. Third place in the 28 gauge event went to Tom Johnson of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, with his fine 100x100. A total of 62 gunners broke perfect 100x100s in this event.

The 20 gauge event saw Alan Clark of Del Mar, California, last year's Champion of Champions, capture the 20 gauge title over 72 other shooters that broke 100x100. Runner-up honours went to Chip Youngblood of Maitland, Florida, while third place went to Robert Uknalis of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

In the 250-target 12 gauge event, Wayne Mayes of Cleveland, Tennessee, emerged with his second consecutive 12 Gauge World Championship title, defeating 25 other shooters that broke 250x250. Runner-up honours went to Don Kaufman of Garland, Texas, followed in third place by Alan Clark of Del Mar, California. The 12 gauge shootoff went 21 rounds of regular skeet (Clark missing in the 21st round) and then doubles 3-4-5 in the 22nd round (Wayne and Don went straight) and in the 23rd round, Kaufman missed one.

In the concurrent Eastern Open (the first 125 targets of the 12 gauge event), saw Jim Montgomery of Sulfur, Louisiana, take the gun title with 125x125 followed by Walt Badorek of Klamath Falls, Oregon and Wayne Mayes of Cleveland, Tennessee. A total of 83 shooters broke 125x125 on the first day.

In the final 125 targets of the 12 gauge event, the Western Open, Wayne Mayes copped that title with 125x125 followed by Al Magyar of Taylor, Michigan, and

Todd Bender of Covington, Louisiana. A total of 89 shooters broke the last 125x125.

In the NSSA 650 Classic (100-doubles, 410, 28 and 20 gauge targets plus 250-12 gauge targets), Alan Clark of Del Mar, California, emerged as the champion in a shootoff of 649x650s. Runner-up honours went to Don Kaufman followed by Wayne Mayes.

The 750-target event (550 targets regular plus 200 international) saw Randy Borth of Wentzville, Missouri, take that title with 728x750 followed by Tim Gallagher of San Antonio, Texas, with a 715x750 and Tal Sprinkles of Austin, Texas, with a 715x750.

In the doubles event, Wayne Mayes, with his 100-straight, captured this title for the second consecutive year over 11 other shooters with perfect scores. Runner-up honours went to Dave Starrett with his 100-straight. This shootoff went a total of four rounds.

Continuing his domination, Wayne Mayes won his second Champion of Champions title (25 targets each with .410, 28, 20 and 12 gauges), defeating 19 other gunners that broke perfect 100x100s. Runner-up again to Mayes was Dave Starrett of New Boston, Ohio, with his 100-straight.

In the concurrent Lady events, Louise Terry of Johnson City, New York, was the HOA winner with 537x550, the Lady Doubles winner with 98x100 and the Lady Champion of Champions winner with 100x100.

Other lady winners included Susan Bogardus with 99x100 in the 410 bore; Susan Mayes with 100x100 in the 28 gauge and Andrea Graham with 100x100 in the 20 gauge.

In the Junior division, Dan Turner was the HOA winner with 541x550, followed by Noah Schatz with 540. Sid Evans with 250x250 was the 12 gauge winner while Doug Conrad claimed the 28 gauge with 100-straight and Noah Schatz captured the .410 with 98x100.

The Industry division saw Jim Prall of Remington Arms again capture the HOA title with 546x550. Ken Sedlecky of Smith and Wesson was the .410 winner with a perfect score while Asa Oliver of Smith and Wesson took the Champion of Champions and 28 gauge titles, and Tony Rosetti of Remington Arms was the 20 gauge and 12 gauge Industry winner.

In Two-Man Team action, the tandem of Phil Murray and Ralph Petley captured HOA, 12 gauge and 20 gauge honours while Robert Paxton and Don Kaufman were the .410 and 28 gauge two-man victors.

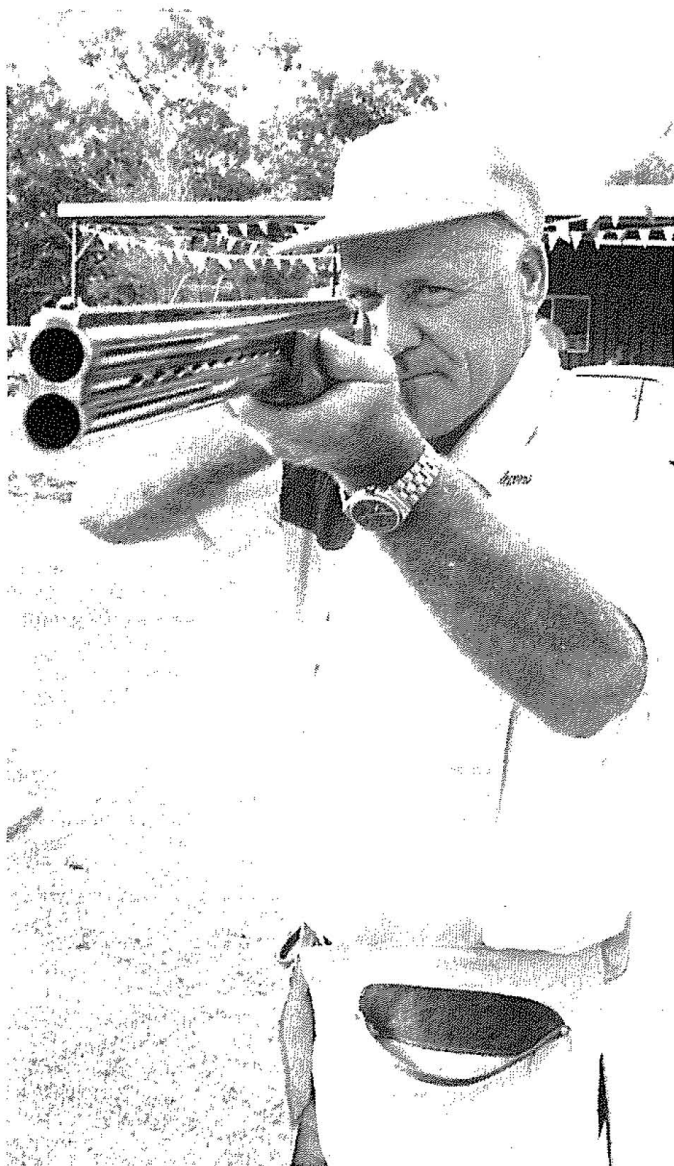
In the Five-Man Team race, the Texas squad of Robert Paxton, Don Kaufman, Phil Murray, Jim Biddle and Ralph Petley won all the team events. New team records were set or tied in the Doubles (494x500), 410 bore (496x500), 28 gauge (500x500), 20 gauge (500x500) and HOA (2742x2750).

In the Preliminary events, Wayne Mayes, for the third consecutive year won the Pre-World HOA. This year he missed one and ended with 399x400. Harold Powell of Abilene, Texas, also finished the Preliminary HOA with 399 and in the ensuing shootoff, Mayes emerged as the champion and Powell the runner-up.

Other Preliminary winners included: Jim Carver, 100x100 — Referee; Wayne Mayes, 100x100 — 12 Gauge Preliminary and 20 Gauge Preliminary; Randy Bates, 100x100 — 28 Gauge Preliminary and Louise Terry, 100x100 — .410 Bore Preliminary. The 50-target Doubles Preliminaries were won by Tim Gallagher, 50x50, and Don Kaufman with 50x50.

In the 200-target International Skeet Championships, a showcase of U.S. Olympic Team members, Matt Dryke of Sequim, Washington, captured the Gold Medals with 197x200 followed by Mike Thompson of Fredericksburg, Virginia, the silver medalist with 195 and Al Mullins, the bronze medalist, with a 194.

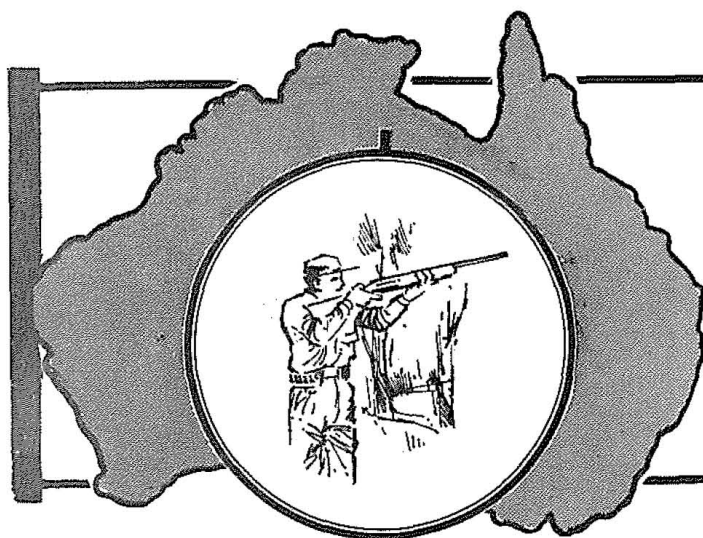
