HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1985

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1985 Handicap Cards for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1984 card.
 2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
 3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1985 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
 4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any monies or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
 5. Rule 2.1 (m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of three months.
 6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.
 7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7.
 8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board please report to handicapper's office.
 9. If you do not wish to be down graded please advise handicapper's office.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

In answer to Tim Catling W.A. C.T.S.N. March 1985, I would not like to see a reduction of D/B shooting in favour of S/B to improve skills, or save money on behalf of clubs. I believe quite the opposite.

It is a pleasure to watch a shooter with the ability to consistently break targets with his second barrel. I do, however, see a need for a change of conditions for common mark shooting. A championship could be shot in the following manner (rule 2.3H), "AA" shooter compete from 18 metres, "A" 17 metres, "B" 16 metres, "C" 15 metres, the grading procedure to remain the same.

This type of grading will reduce, to a degree, the cost of "shoot off" targets to clubs. It will also give all grades a more equal opportunity at the overall trophy. A backward movement with grading is a fair way for all competitors to improve their skills.

Perhaps as an incentive to move up through the grades, there could be an increase in trophy values from "C" up to "AA". Another alternative for clubs saving money — shoot 50% less championships and shoot the balance in handicap or novelty shooting.

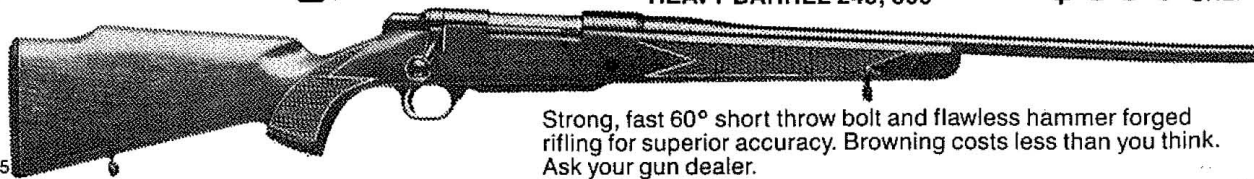

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1985 ANNUAL MEETING

The past year can best be summed up as one of stabilisation by your Association and outstanding performances by many of our shooters, both at International and Club level. The downtrend in our membership has steadied and with a brighter outlook in the rural areas must soon be on an upward plane. I believe we have reached the bottom of the trough and the only way from now on is up.

This will depend to a big degree on the effort put in by the individual club members at club level. It is here that we as an organisation win or lose and it behoves all of us to do whatever we can to keep those new members rolling up so that our coaches can stimulate the interest to remain for more than a couple of years, as is too often the case now.

I would ask that in the forthcoming year we all make a concerted effort to make our own club a little stronger in numbers for several reasons.

Firstly there is the competitive challenge in that there is more fun and satisfaction when you shoot with a large group of people rather than a few. Larger numbers mean more amenities can be provided for your members at Club, State and National levels. The executive load through the whole structure is more evenly spread.

Remember too that pressure is being applied in ever-increasing amounts to curtail our sport by groups of people who do not comprehend why we pursue a sport which entails the use of an implement as lethal as a gun, forgetting about motor cars etc, which are just as bad when misused. To counter this we need the numbers, and every firearm owner should be a member of one of the firearm users' associations.

Therefore, if he is a shotgunner get him to join ours. I am sure many are only waiting to be asked.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING

Our policy of sending teams overseas whenever possible is starting to pay off in that we are getting closer to those elusive Olympic and World Championship Gold Medals and I once more congratulate our nominees for their efforts.

Overseas competition is a prerequisite to Olympic selection and our up-and-coming Champions must be given the opportunity. To this end we have several new faces in our training squads, which now include juniors, although it is very hard for some to overcome the problem of distance.

There is only one cure for this and that is money, and I would hope that State Associations would address themselves to this area at all opportunities so that those shooters disadvantaged by distance but with the capabilities, are assisted as much as possible.

To this end your association has allocated \$500 each to two juniors of the training squad to assist in that training.

State Governments have in most cases money available, particularly in the area of travel if they are approached in the right way, and this National Association is ever grateful for the grants we receive from the Federal Government, in this and other areas such as coaching, which this year will be in the vicinity of \$45,000.

Your International Shooting Committee has also been successful in its submission to bring Mr Hans Howar, chairman of the U.I.T. Judges Committee, to Australia in October and he will be conducting three day courses in Perth, Melbourne and Brisbane to certify some local judges for the Olympic disciplines. This will mainly be funded by a Commonwealth Government Grant.

COACHING

We are extremely fortunate in having Peter Quire as our National Coaching Director and I congratulate him on his achievements during the year not only in regard to his appointment as Olympic Coach for all disciplines, and being asked by the National Rifle Association of America to conduct coaching courses in the U.S.A. but on the way he has brought together a coaching council that is really firing in all States.

I sincerely hope on your behalf that he is also successful in bringing Mr. Phil Murray, Deputy Executive Director of the National Skeet Shooting Association of America to Australia for the 1985 Skeet Nationals, to also conduct coaching seminars in each State.

DTL NATIONALS — WAGGA, N.S.W.

Our thanks are extended to the N.S.W.C.T.A. and their organising committee for a job well done in the promotion of our 1984 National Championships. We also commend the host Club for allowing us the use of their grounds and the effort they put into making sure that the facilities provided were up to the standard required for the staging of our major National events.

The profits shown in the accompanying balance sheet is proof of the effort put in by all those who attended to compete, and the voluntary and other labour provided by others so necessary to run a successful National series.

NATIONALS

As you know your association now promotes three separate National series, and the decision taken recently by your Executive, after many years of debate to allow reloads to be used at all of these, will have many ramifications.

The argument for this move has always been that this would ensure a major increase in entries and nullify the disadvantages. Well shooters, the ball is now in your court and your best opportunity to demonstrate this is at the Perth Nationals.

INCORPORATION

I would like to reiterate what has previously been said many times of the necessity for all clubs to become incorporated. It is imperative to protect your individual club members that this be done.

Our latest cover in regard to third party insurance only covers our registered shooters against their own negligence, as proven, plus cover for those voluntary workers registered with the National Office.

It is important that club administrators see that this registration is attended to so that the most minor of our helpers is covered in the event of any unfortunate occurrence. Remember it only takes a note to our Executive Director to effect the cover but it must be initiated before the event.

REFEREES ASSOCIATION

At a recent Sub-Committee meeting of the Referees Association consisting of one member from each State, held in Melbourne, a reappraisal of the new rules was undertaken, bearing in mind that any alterations would only be made if they needed an explanation or it was seen that an addition was needed for safety reasons, or there was any contradiction between one rule or the other.

No major alterations were necessary, but it was decided that a guideline should be formulated in a simplified form to standardise practices around Australia by our referees.

This should be in all referees' hands in the near future and I commend it to your earnest attention.

HEADQUARTERS — 8 MAIN STREET, BLACKBURN — VICTORIA

The feasibility study authorised by your Executive came up with several alternatives, and on the advice of the Premises Development Sub-Committee, we decided to opt for the recommendation that no major development take place at present, up to \$10,000 could be spent on improvements over the next five years, and that we restrict our property ownership to our own needs.

We will enjoy a significant capital appreciation on this property, if we find a suitable alternative, and all options should remain open in this regard.

As a proponent of this conception from my election to your Executive I can only hope that any decisions made in

ANNUAL REPORT 1984

1984 was a year best described as one of stability, with some new initiatives keeping development going.

Internationally, the Los Angeles Olympics held the spotlight, while our first ever Skeet Team competed in the N.S.S.A. World Skeet Championships in Texas in July. The South Pacific Regional Championships were conducted in New Zealand in January with Australia well to the fore.

The Referees' Association did more work on the rules during the year, particularly in the area of the handicapping rules, which culminated in the printing of the rule book in a new format. This has been well accepted, thanks to the work of Neil Hardy who took on the task of putting the rules into a proper order under standard headings.

While membership was slightly down on the previous year, there was a definite slowing in the decline, demonstrating the improvement in the economic situation generally around Australia. The financial result for the year was satisfactory.

In the Firearms Legislation area, New South Wales came under notice with proposed amendments to the Firearms Act being announced by the Government. A period of negotiation and consultation is now underway, which hopefully will make the eventual legislation less restrictive than originally proposed.

Traditionally, this report addresses itself to specific areas of activity; this year does not differ.

1. INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

1984 was again a busy year internationally.

1.1 South Pacific Regional Championships

Australia was represented by Jim Ellis, Terry Rumbel, and Graeme Boyd in Olympic Trap, and Ian Hale, Alex Crikis, and Brian Thomson in Skeet, in these Championships conducted in Christchurch, New Zealand in January.

Both Trap and Skeet Teams won the Teams Match gold medals with Ellis winning the individual gold medal in Trap.

1.2 Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams Match

This event was conducted during the Skeet Nationals in Melbourne and resulted in a win to Australia, represented by Ian Hale, Gary Robinson, Peter Blackmore and Adrian Cousens.

1.3 International Trap Teams Match

This event is open to all countries with shooters at the Trap Nationals. It was conducted in Wagga in April with Australia winning from New Zealand with a score of 248/250. Representing Australia were Denis Lymn, Jim Finis, John Caskey, Bill Iles and Ray Sweeney.

1.4 Glenn Cup

The 1984 competition was conducted during the New Zealand Nationals, with Australia being the victors.

1.5 Mackintosh International Teams Match

England's first win in 31 years in this International Postal Teams Match for the Mackintosh Trophy. England scored 7386/7500 to win from New Zealand 7378, with Australia in third place 7372.

1.6 Ladies International Teams Match

Back to back wins for Australia with the 44 point victory over England in this postal Teams match, shot during the Wagga Trap Nationals. Australia 1434/1500, represented by Deserie Huddleston, Vickie Deeley, Faye Taylor, Joan Longmore, and Christine Wakefield. England 1390, Wales 1358.

1.7 Junior International Teams Match

Two on the trot also for the Juniors in their International Postal Teams Match. This too was shot during the Wagga Trap Nationals, Australia 1432/1500, England 1426, Scotland 1422, and Ireland 1341. Representing Australia were Rohan Penn, Mark Rogers, Andrew Pitt, Fillipo Petriella and Guy Evans.

1.8 Los Angeles Olympic Games

Four shotguns were in the Australian Shooting Team of nine for the Los Angeles Olympics. Jim Ellis and Terry Rumbel Olympic trap, Ian Hale and Alex Crikis Olympic Skeet. Under Manager Peter Anderson and Coach Peter Quire, the team performed extremely well. Jim Ellis 6th, Terry Rumbel 7th, in Olympic Trap, Ian Hale 8th, and Alex Crikis 24th in the Skeet event. Olympic placings go to eighth place, so it was a top performance to have three of our shooters in official placings in the Games Shotgun events.

1.9 World Skeet Championships

A first for the Association during 1984 was the fielding of a team in the N.S.S.A. World Championships in San Antonio, Texas. Bob Buchan managed the team of Adrian Cousens, Reg Clarke, Bob Dower, Brian Thomson and Kevin Perkins. They performed well although beaten in the teams match when the five Americans all shot 250/250.

2. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

2.1 Trap

The 1984 Trap Nationals were conducted at Wagga Gun Club during early April. These were the biggest Trap Nationals since Melbourne in 1981, with entries 35% up on Adelaide in 1983.

The organising committee from the New South Wales Clay Target Association under State President Rob Parker did an excellent job in organising these Trap Nationals, voted by many keen observers as the best they had attended in 25 years.

The Executive Committee thanks all trophy donors for their strong support.

2.2 Olympic Disciplines

The 1984 Championships were held at Melbourne Gun Club in February. Being an Olympic Year, we were able to attract a top field of Internationals, including the U.S. Olympic squad, world champion John Primrose and women's world record holder Susan Natrass, both from Canada.

The Americans dominated the series, taking home ten of the twelve overall medals on offer. A highlight of the week was the exhibition of trick shooting by the U.S. Skeet wizard Matt Dryke.

2.3 Skeet Nationals

The 1984 Skeet Nationals were conducted during November at Melbourne Gun Club. Entries were down on 1983 which was a disappointment to the organisers, after the clamour from the Skeeties to have their own National series. There were some very good performances during the four days, notably Ian Hale breaking the long run record with 487 targets, and taking the High Gun with 399/400.

The Executive Committee is appreciative of the job done by the Victorian Clay Target Association organising committee, and thanks trophy donors for their considerable assistance.

National champions for 1984 are: Olympic Trap, Terry Howard, USA; Olympic Skeet, Al Mullins, USA; Standard Skeet, Graham Guy, Vic; Double Barrel, Gary McDonald, NSW; Single Barrel, Doug Smith, Qld; Aust/NZ Trap, Jim Finis, Vic; Double Rise, Bill Iles, Vic; Women's Double Barrel, Vickie Deeley, Qld; Junior Double Barrel, Peter Wilson, Vic; Champion of Champions, Tim Catling, WA; Grand Australian Handicap, Bill Powell, NSW.

3. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Mr Roy Holtfreter of Northam, W.A. was elected President of the Association at the Executive Committee meeting held in Wagga after the Trap Nationals. Roy had been Vice President for some years, and a member of the Executive Committee for many years. He took over the Presidency from Laurie Connors of Mildura, Victoria. Laurie had been President of the Association since 1981. For his services to the Association Laurie Connors was granted Honorary Life Registration.

Members to retire from the Executive Committee during the year were Bill Horner and Neville Seis, Northern Territory; Bill Abbott, Victoria; and Richard Dean, Queensland. Taking their places on the Executive Committee were Ian Butcher and Ken Selwood, Northern Territory; Ed Ransom, Queensland; and Tim Catling, Western Australia.

The Committee met twice during the year, following the Trap Nationals in Wagga in April, and after the Skeet Nationals in Melbourne in November.

All Members of the Executive Committee are to be commended for their dedication to the development of the sport during the year.

4. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Grants totalling \$53,650 were received during the year from the Sport Development program. Management thanks the Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism, the Hon. John Brown, and his departmental officers for their considerable assistance during the year.

5. NATIONAL COACHING COUNCIL

National coaching director Peter Quire chairs the National Coaching Council which is made up of the seven State Directors. Perhaps the highlight of the year was the accreditation at level two of 10 coaches from New South Wales under the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme. Other States developed programs for level two during the year which will attract interest from coaches during 1985.

The Executive Committee expresses its appreciation for the work done in the coaching area by State, Zone and Club coaches in 1984.

6. ADMINISTRATION

The in-house micro computer equipment has continued to work very efficiently throughout the year. Computing costs have been reduced to an absolute minimum over the past two years which has fully justified the change to in-house equipment.

Mr Mal Hastie has again through the year been of great assistance with financial advice.

7. MEMBERSHIP

The number of clubs affiliated during 1984 was 300, an increase of eight over 1983.

As indicated earlier, the decline in registrations slowed considerably in 1984, full registrations being down 170 on the previous year. It is clear that many unregistered shooters are competing regularly at some clubs, a situation that is not good for the sport, apart from the insurance and constitutional implications.

The usual high turnover of shooters not registering after one or two years continued in 1984.

8. STATE ASSOCIATIONS

Per capita grants of \$13,470 were returned to the States for the year. This was slightly down on the previous year, reflecting the decrease in full registrations.

State Associations continue to receive funding assistance from State Governments to develop the sport, and send State Teams to the various National Championships.

9. NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD

The Olympic Disciplines National Training Squad was again selected over the 400 targets of the Commonwealth and National Championships held in Melbourne in February.

A major training camp was held in Canberra at the Australian Institute of Sport during November. This was conducted under the Institute's National Training Centre program. Management thanks the Institute staff for their help during this week where much was learnt about squad members and their approach to shooting moving targets.

The 1984/85 squad comprised:

10. LEGISLATION

Following the problems at Milperra in New South Wales, the State Government foreshadowed stricter controls over firearms and promised amendments to the Act. 1985 will no doubt see this new legislation after consultation with the various groups involved. Money has continued to accrue in our legislation fighting fund and no allocations were necessary during the year 1984.

11. PROMOTION

Since his election to the Presidency in April, Roy Holtfreter has visited Queensland, Tasmania and Victoria, to meet as many shooters as possible.

12. AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

The financial position of A.S.A. deteriorated still further in 1984, to a point where at the Annual General Meeting in December, drastic measures had to be taken to correct the worsening situation. The A.S.A. office was closed at the end of the year with the Executive Director now operating from his home. Under new President Dick Willis of A.P.S.U.A., a plan of recovery is being put into operation.

Through our affiliation with A.S.A. we have contact with the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, the Australian Olympic Federation, the South Pacific Shooting Federation, and the U.I.T. (International Shooting Union).

The Association is represented on the A.S.A. Council by Mr R.F. Buchan and the Executive Director.

13. NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

A feasibility study was undertaken during the year to investigate the possibility of developing the premises at 8 Main Street, Blackburn, the site of the National Office. Following this study it was decided to update the premises over a five-year period to make them more suitable as office accommodation.

RULE CHANGES — INTERPRETATION OF REFUSAL RULE REFEREES ASSOCIATION

The Referees' Association met in Melbourne on February 2 to produce guidelines for Referees. This is being done to standardise Referee practices around Australia. A leaflet will be produced in the near future to assist Referees, and seminars will be held in all States to further help in the training of new and old Referees and the introduction of standard practices.

As well as working on the guidelines, the Referees' Association made some changes to the rules as listed below. These changes will come into effect on April 1, 1985.

RULE 2.3 (F)

"Any competitor winning overall in any Double Barrel, Single Barrel, or points championship event from behind his A.C.T.A. handicap mark, will be re-handicapped to that mark, providing he has shot the possible."

RULE 1.3 (B)

"Provided he is standing on the mark from where he is going to shoot and there is no person on a more forward mark, a competitor may drop cartridges into the breech whilst he is waiting his turn to shoot."

RULE 5.12 (B)

Delete second sentence as it is a contradiction of skeet round procedure.

Sentence to be deleted reads — "The competitor must notify the Referee on each occasion he elects to shoot at the incoming target whilst shooting doubles."

New rules to be numbered 1.1 (J) and 5.1 (L). "Powder loads for re-loads should not exceed the manufacturer's recommended specification. Shooters exceeding the recommended load shall be deemed to be in breach of the safety regulations."

The Referees' Association also formalised the following interpretation of the refusal rule: "A shooter may refuse to shoot at any target which he considers to be too high, too low, too wide, too quickly released, too slowly released, at any target he considers to be illegal. There is no limit to the number of targets the shooter may refuse as long as the Referee agrees with the reasons. Obviously, if too many targets are refused for illegality, the Referee must inspect the trap, find the cause, and correct it. If the Referee does not consider that the target refused is illegal, he will ask the shooter why he refused the target. If the Referee is not satisfied with the reason, he will tell the shooter. He will also state that any further targets which are refused, and are considered by the Referee to be legal, will be scored 'lost target'. If the above situation seems likely to arise, it is preferable that a third party, qualified if possible, adjudicates subsequent refusals. The foregoing procedure in no way discriminates against Referees using their judgement, it is meant to assist in equity of competition. A major point missed by older style Referees is that although a shooter may refuse to shoot at an illegal target, he is equally entitled to accept an illegal target, and shoot at it. However, if he shoots at, and misses, an illegal target, the only decision open to the Referee is 'lost target'.


"Similarly, if he hits it, 'three', 'two' or 'one' as the case may be is the only decision to be given.

"A Referee should not call 'No Target' for a fast or slow released target nor if the target seems to him to be too high, too low, or too wide. 'No Target' should only be called in the case of a broken target, a pair of targets emerging instead of a single (or vice versa), or where a safety hazard exists if a shooter elects to shoot at the target.

"The shooter must be the only person to decide if the target is acceptable to him.

"Many older style Referees consider that this rule takes away too many of their decision-making powers. The fact is that the rule puts the decision whether to shoot or not with the sole person who should have to decide — the shooter concerned.

"The Referee must leave the 'No Target' decision where it belongs — with the shooter. If the shooter breaks the target, illegal or not, he is credited with it, if he misses an illegal target, he must equally accept the 'Lost Target' decision."

The practice day was eliminated to allow club members to erect marquees etc. The Norfolk Island Club has only 14 members and it was their sheer determination which carried through and enabled them to run a successful shoot. The club again exceeded themselves in their hospitality shown to all visitors.

Wednesday 6th February was first competition day with the first round of skeet to be shot and the Norfolk Island Points Score Championships. Unfortunately the weather was not too kind and Wednesday saw heavy rain fall for most of the morning. Shooting continued until lunch time when it was called off for the day. These two events were carried on till Thursday 7th when the second round of skeet was shot together with the Double Rise Championship. With the rain and the wind possible scores were virtually impossible and some interesting targets were shot at.

The third day of competition Friday and the sun came through. Quite a change after shooting for two days in the rain. The Single Barrel Championship and the Ball Trap Championship were conducted on this day. It was in the Ball Trap that we saw a great shoot off between R. Young and R. Nixon both of New Zealand. They shot two full rounds before a winner was decided.

Saturday dawned overcast again but the rain managed to hold off. This was the day for the prestigious Norfolk Island Clay Target Championship — 50T D.B. — and congratulations must go to Bill Arandt from Victoria for a superb 50. Bill was the only possible in this event.

The four days' shooting finished with a dinner and presentation night and this was enjoyed by all. Once again the Norfolk Island members excelled themselves. Unfortunately the Noumean shooters were unable to attend but competition was fierce between the Australians, New Zealanders and the Norfolk Island shooters with 92 shooters competing overall. 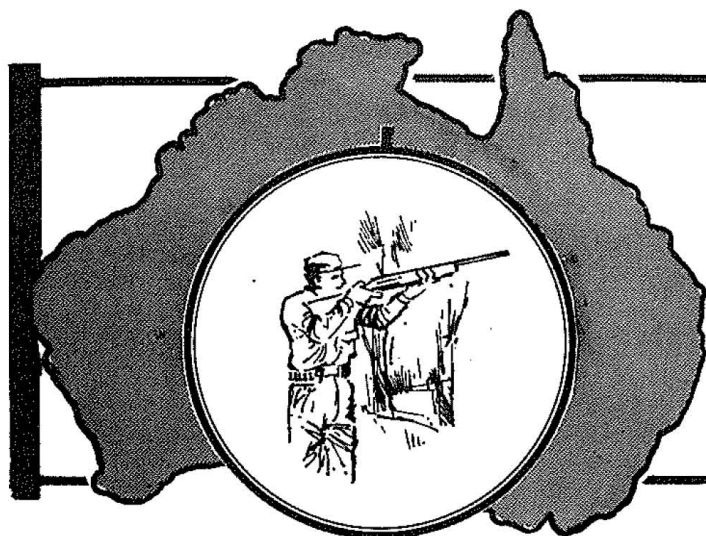
I feel the following of "Boggabri Gumtree" shooters are a different type of shooter and sportsman to the sharks and bad sports you find around most trap shoots.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

I attend some A.C.T.A. registered clubs to shoot Simulated Field, i.e. Wyong, Singleton, Boggabri, Taree and Warren. One problem always seems to arise and cause considerable controversy, that is Gun Position and Mounting.

1. Gun Position

Some shooters adopt the old I.S.U. Skeet position of gun butt visible below the elbow when the arm is in the normal hanging position, others have the stock just below the shoulder.

2. Mounting

This is mainly where the problem lies. Some shooters call for their target, see it appear then mount the gun. Others call for the target while mounting the gun so the gun is in position when the target appears.

As you can clearly see, there is a distinct advantage for some shooters. The basis of the rules of Clay Target shooting is to ensure equity for all competitors.

As these Simulated Field events are becoming more popular at A.C.T.A. Clubs and there are not A.C.T.A. rules to cover Gun Position and Mounting for Simulated Field, could we not adopt Field and Game Association rules which are basically F.I.T.A.S.C. rules, i.e. Parcours de Chasse (Simulated Field).

In its simplified form, the shooter adopts the **Ready Position** — gun butt touching the body with the top of the butt below the level of the armpit. The shooter then loudly calls 'Ready'. The referee or trapper as the case may be, releases the target. As the target appears the shooter mounts his gun, not before.

There are penalties under F.I.T.A.S.C. rules for failure to comply with the above i.e.

- if the shooter is not in the correct Ready Position or shoulders the gun before the target appears, he will receive a warning;
- a second such incident will be No Target; and
- the third and subsequent incidents in the same round will be scored as Lost.

If you could print this article in the News, it may pave the way to some standardization of these two rules at Clubs that shoot Simulated Field.

I was visiting a friend recently and picked up a recent A.C.T.A. magazine and I had an idea that perhaps the trap shooting fraternity may be able to assist.

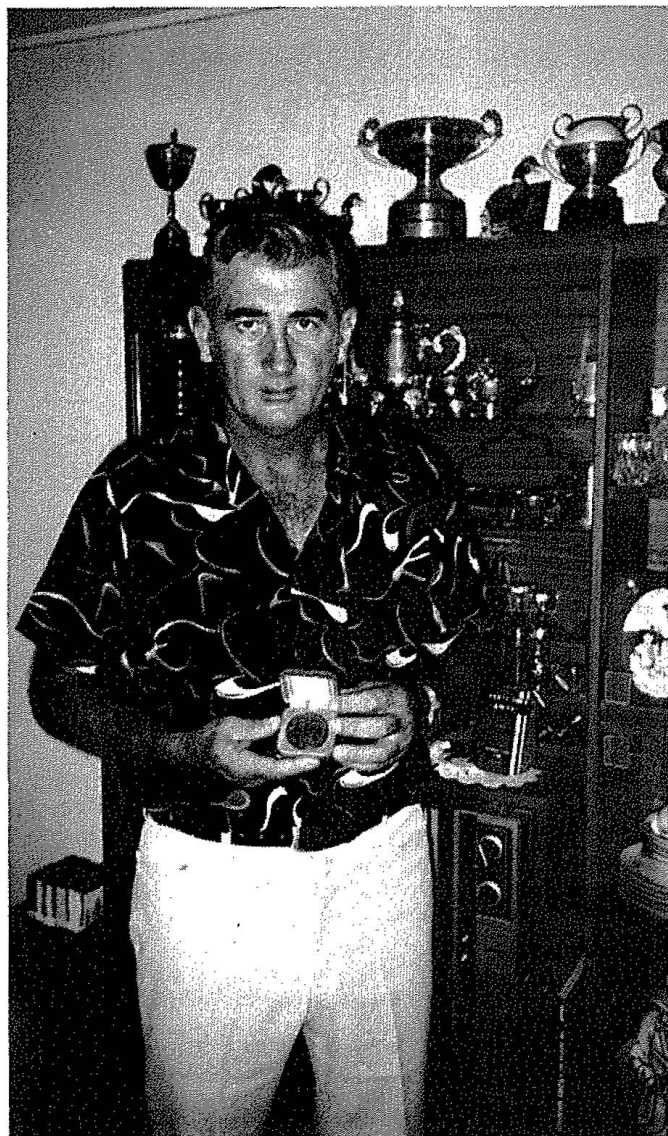

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry in the 1985 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1985 with the Australian Clay Target Association.

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1984 and 1985 registration cards before nominating, to the 1985 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1984 he must produce his 1985 registration card.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the thirty-third Australian Double Barrel Championship, as, in this case, there will be a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship, and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship.

A win or placing in a division or grade does not affect the competitor's eligibility for a trophy in another division. There is only one National Champion resulting from each event.

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that his or her entry is correctly classified — an indication can be readily found on the daily scoreboard or the progressive scoreboard.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 13, 1985.

Juniors — are those competitors who, on April 13, 1985 will be under the age of 17 years.

TIME STARTING

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30 a.m.

Competitors will be called only once for their squad — any competitor who misses his or her squad without a reasonable excuse shall be penalised one target. All competitors who miss their squads will be re-squadded in the last details.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships.

The Organising Committee will have cartridges for sale at the following prices:

TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets throughout the program will be Red Banded Black and will be supplied by Olmpyc Targets. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electrically operated. The traps used will be Winchester "White Flyers".

CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that the entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or the High Gun scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, and open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

CASH PRIZES

In all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, cash prizes will be awarded to the overall winner, and to first to fifth place-getters in each grade.

These cash prizes are calculated as follows: **Overall winner** receives 50c per nomination in the event. **Grade winners** receive 50c per nomination in the particular grade. Second each grade receives 40c per nomination in the grade, third 30c, fourth 20c, fifth 10c.

SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

If for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the Management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time it considers necessary.

In such a case, the competition will re-commence where it left off, weather permitting, no later than 8.30 a.m. on the next day.

AUTHORITY

This program shall control the 1985 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Management Committee, through the Tournament Organising Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 1985 Trap National program, change or modify the program in any way.
