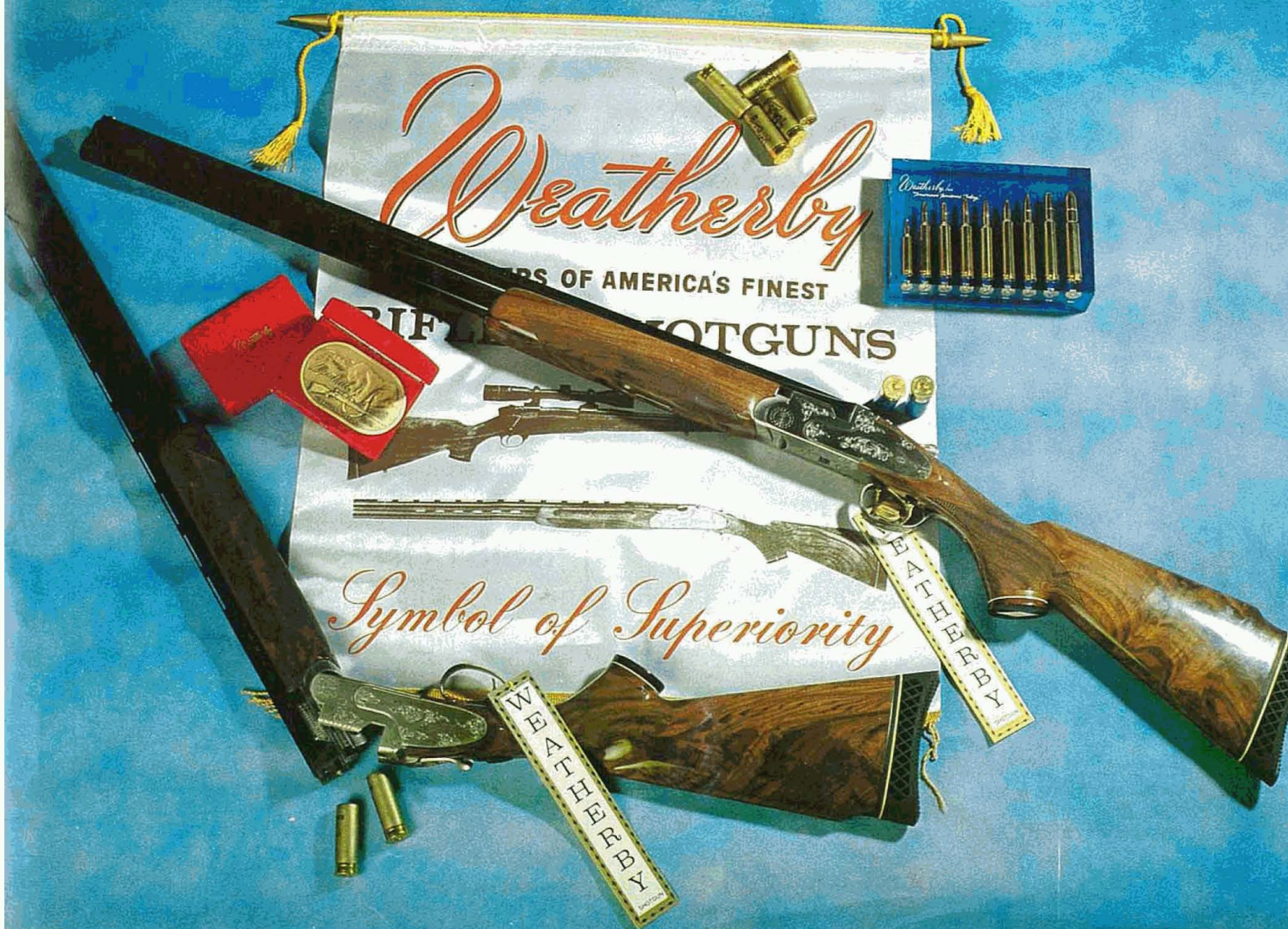

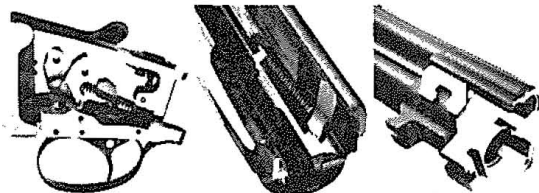

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Russell Mark, Cliff Bailey, and Terry Budd are currently in Montecatini, Italy, competing in the Grand Prix of Nations. Montecatini is the venue for the World Moving Target Championships in September. The grounds have been updated and both Trap and Skeet events will be conducted over the same three days. Montecatini boasts four Olympic Trap and Four I.S.U. Skeet grounds which are quite separate, enabling the organisers to conduct both World Championships simultaneously.

Amendments to the Firearms Act went through the New South Wales Parliament in Mid March. The State Government plans to set up a Firearms Consultative Committee similar to Victoria, on which shooters will be represented. It is thought the new legislation will come into effect in September of this year.

The Legislation is similar in many respects to Victoria, with minor differences. These include the annual registration of firearms.

Details are sketchy but I understand Neil Berry of Victoria, won the New Zealand Double Rise championship at the recently completed New Zealand Nationals. Australia won both the Team's matches in Trap and Skeet.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

PETER QUIRE

The I.S.U. National Championships and the Australia Games proved to be a great success. The standard of shooting overall has risen over the past three years so that we now have many shooters, right across Australia, shooting world-class scores.

John Harris of W.A. bettered the Los Angeles Olympic Trap score with 194 to win the Australia Games gold medal. Bill Iles also bettered it with 193 to take the silver medal, and Pud Burgess of N.S.W. with a 191 was just one below the 1984 Olympic score.

In Skeet John Summers put in a great performance and his score of 197 in the National Championships is only one below the Olympic gold medal scores. It was particularly pleasing to me to see shooters from all states and territories competing and performing so well. As the teams to represent Australia were chosen at the National Championships and Australia Games it can be said that those teams are truly representative of the Australian clay shooting fraternity.

In the Australia Games five states were represented in the first five places in the Olympic Trap, John Harris W.A. (gold), Bill Iles Vic. (silver), Pud Burgess N.S.W. (bronze), Doreen Aylett Tas. (women's champion), Brett Dunstan Vic. (junior) and a South Australian, Dino Oliviero, tied for equal fifth place with Russell Mark and Graeme Boyd, both of Vic.

The National Trap Championship was won by Terry Rumbel. Terry is a great sportsman and a true champion and ambassador for our sport. Graeme Boyd took the silver medal, congratulations Graeme; and Russell McGowan of N.Z. the bronze. It was good to see our visitors from N.Z. perform so well. Bill Iles and John Harris shared fourth place with Mark Rogers, winner of the junior title. Doreen

Aylett is the I.S.U. National Trap women's champion.

Looking around at the competitors it was exciting to see the number of young shooters present. The encouragement of juniors as a policy is already bearing fruit.

In Olympic Skeet Victoria can be justly proud of the performances of their shooters. The Victorian I.S.U. Skeet and Trap shooters have worked hard and the results can be seen in the placings, Graeme Boyd and Bill Iles both winning silver medals in Trap and Victorians filling all places in both Skeet events, John Summers, Ian Hale and Brian Thomson filling first, second and third places in the National Championship, with Carol Ogden women's Skeet champion and Michael Inguanti junior. In the Australia Games John Summers again won the gold and Alex Crikis the silver and Michael Inguanti the bronze as well as the junior and Carol Ogden won the women's section.

The winners of the interstate teams events are to be congratulated, N.S.W. winning the Trap team event. Terry Rumbel, Jim Ellis and Peter Politi shot 421 to take the event and in Skeet Victoria took the honors with Ian Hale, Craig Meuleman and Michael Inguanti shooting 422.

The team representing Australia at the World Moving Target Championships to be held in Italy in September of this year comprises the top three shooters in both Skeet and Trap over the two events. The Champion of Champions were John Summers and John Harris. They are to be joined by Alex Crikis, Brian Thomson and Michael Inguanti (junior) in Skeet and Bill Iles and Terry Rumbel with Brett Dunstan (junior) trap.

It is obvious that we have a great team, a team to be proud of, and I know that all clay shooters will wish them well and support them where possible. We cannot expect outside sporting authorities to appreciate the calibre of our representatives unless we do too.

The 1985 Australian National Training Squad is: John Summers, Alex Crikis, Brian Thomson, Ian Hale and Michael Inguanti (junior) Skeet, and John Harris, Bill Iles, Terry Rumbel, Graeme Boyd, Cliff Bailey, Jim Ellis and Brett Dunstan (junior). A warm welcome to all squad members.

Russell Mark, our Commonwealth Games junior award winner, shot extremely well, just missing the squad in a shoot-off. Russell and Geoff Mark are at present shooting in America and Mexico and in April of this year Russell will with several other Australian shooters compete in Italy in the grand prix of nations.

We are hoping that next year's National Championships to be held in Brisbane can be held just prior to the South Pacific Games also to be held in Brisbane. Firm dates have to be set. This would once again give us two major competitions for our I.S.U. shooters to compete in, and as 1986 in Commonwealth Games year the Nationals will again be part of the selection for the Commonwealth Games, so next year's Nationals should be a great international event.

It was very pleasing to those attending that our president Roy Holtfreter was able to attend, as did our vice-president Laurie Connors. 74 clay shooters marched at the opening ceremony. I believe that we were all proud to represent our sport and our country; President Roy and wife Kath Holtfreter and Agnes and Laurie Connors, as well as my wife Barbara, assured me that we were the best-looking athletes there.

All the workers who made this year's championships such a success all deserve gold medals for their performances.

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES — THE WAY IT USED TO BE.

Prior to 1976, all National Championship Tournaments were conducted by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee. The venue was decided yearly as suitable grounds became available.

1947 saw the beginning of what was to become known as A.C.T.A. National Championships. The first shoot was a one-day event to be known as the A.C.T.A. National Champion of Champions title. The event was conducted at the old Coburg Gun Club, North Coburg, in October 1947, and was won by Dave Watson with a score of 49/50. At this time Coburg Club was a two trap ground with no room for expansion. However, the Australian Gun Club ground at East Burwood was developing as a four trap layout and was ready for March 1948 Nationals.

A three-day program was planned to include Australian National Champion of Champions cup; Grand Australian Handicap; Australian Intermediate Championship, Double Barrel and the 2nd International Trap Teams match for the Mackintosh Perpetual Trophy. International Team members were selected from the highest scores in the Champion of Champions event. From 1948 to 1955 the National program was held each year at the Australian Gun Club ground. It was during this period in time that greater interest and development took place in Clay Target shooting Australia-wide. This fact was evidenced from the numbers of interstate shooters to National Tournaments. By 1956 the Royal Aero Gun Club at Bankstown in Sydney had a ground available for the National Championships. It was considered by the Executive Committee and plans were made to stage this first National Tournament outside Melbourne. The Tournament proved a great success in spite of the torrential rain that persisted throughout the program.

The following year — 1957 — saw the Nationals being staged at Southport, Queensland. From this point on all States, in turn as they were able to provide suitable grounds, were offered the opportunity of staging the National Tournament. This action proved to be great promotion for the sport. It took the event to all States so that more shooters were given the opportunity to participate in the National Title.

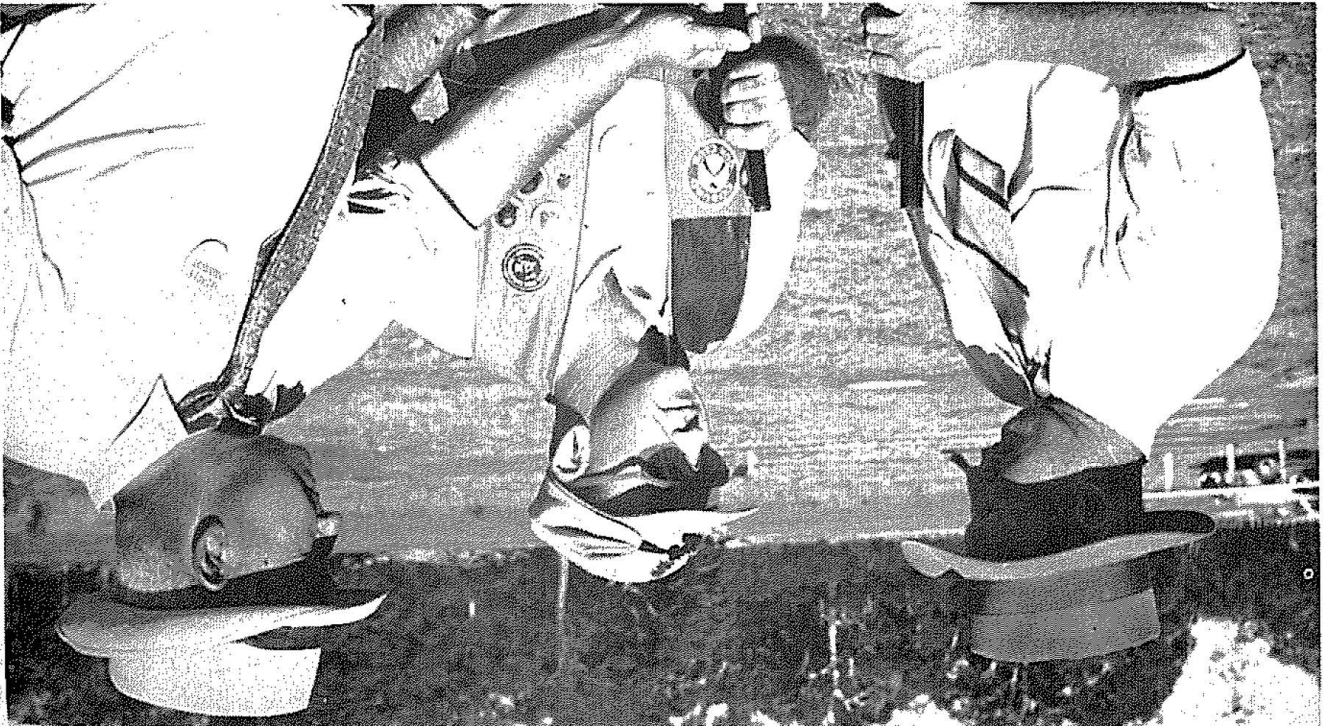

This was the first and only time the A.C.T.A. Nationals were shot on this ground. Actually live bird shooting was banned in Victoria in 1957. The club became a Clay Bird Club for a few years until forced out by expansion of factories in the area.

The Intermediate title was dropped from the National Tournament when graded shooting was introduced.

NSWCTA BULLETIN

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

At our recent Executive Meeting it was decided to shoot future State Championships from the 18 metre mark — this applies to the State Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score which are the State Carnival Events — all other State titles i.e. Double Rise etc will be as per the printed rules.

ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Some shooters have been told that the Zone Championships will also be shot from 18 metres — this is incorrect as Rule 3.15 (a) (b) & (c) clearly state that Zone Championships are to be shot from 15 metres. We will be shooting strictly in accord with the rules as printed and amended so all shooters will be competing in their Zone Championships from 15 metres.

GRANTS

Some of you may not be aware of the fact that we, the NSWCTA, are heavily dependent on financial assistance from the Government, by way of grants. This money is used for specific purposes such as; assistance to send teams to our Nationals — coaching — state carnivals and some other areas. We have been advised that the State Government will be phasing out some of these grants after 1986 and looking at other avenues. In a lot of Cases, we have to meet the grant money on a contributory basis of 50-50; if we don't do this the grant is not approved. Because of these changes which are beyond our control — we will have to look at other avenues of finance — we all realize that the cost spiral is always going up and will continue to do so; we have to meet the challenge or go down — and that's not our way of doing things.

REFEREES

We have now received a current print out showing all Referees in NSW who have not been re-examined — we have an instruction from the National Executive that all referees have to be re-examined so that they are conversant with the current rules.

The Rules Supervisors have been advised and they will be arranging from the Referee Examiners to personally contact each referee to arrange a re-examination. Any Referees who are too far away from an Examiner will be contacted by letter and other arrangements made. Quite a few have been re-examined during the past couple of years but we still have 119 to contact. Our ambition is to arrange a panel of efficient and official referees — with your co-operation we can achieve this aim.

STATE CARNIVAL

Tamworth is the host club and is the Country Music Centre of the State — they will be installing two extra traps to give a six trap layout for your convenience — more on this later.

What about your Zone Executives starting NOW to make this Carnival a "real bang on show". The Western Zone have green and gold bunting, flag, banner (The West is Best) etc — what about some of the other zones entering into the spirit of it and try to beat these old "dry westerners"? I think the "Central Hotshots" are ready to put in a run and assist to make a carnival. Get organised and lets make Tamworth Carnival one we will remember!

AROUND THE TRAPS

LAURIE CONNORS

Saturday February 2, 1985

Walmer Gun Club is one that has only been recently established. It is situated just outside the town of Maldon. 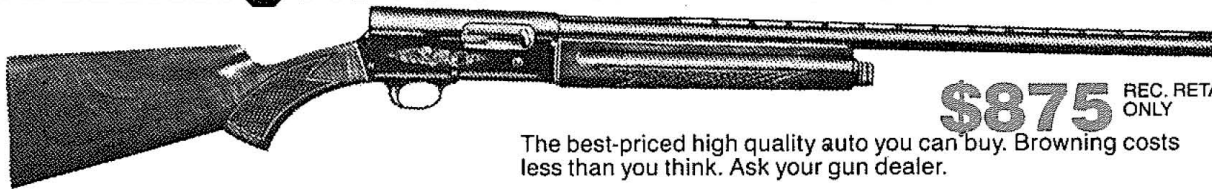
The first event, the City of Bunbury-P.J. Usher Memorial, saw top-class scores, setting the trend for the rest of the day.

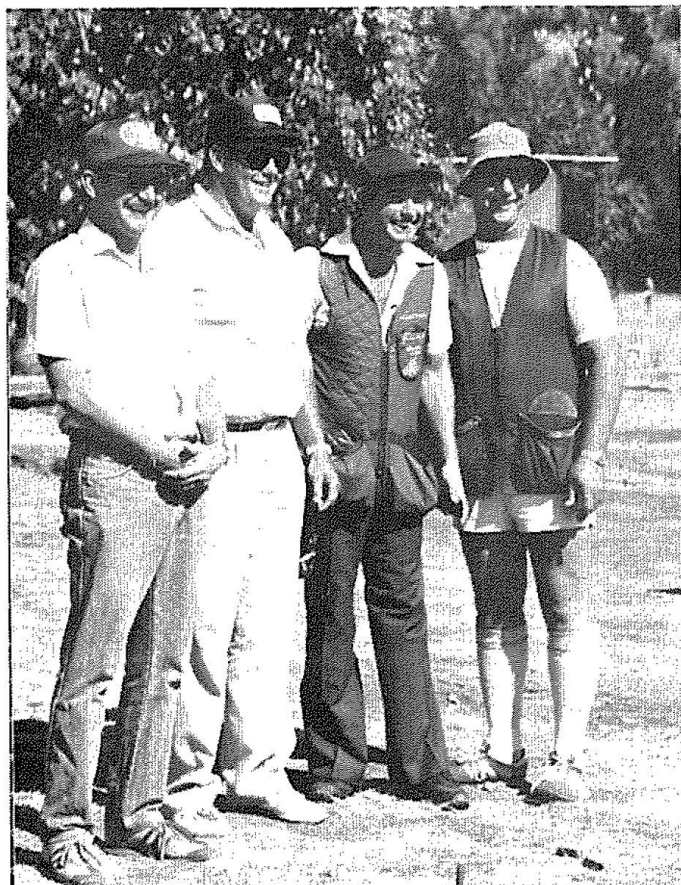
N.S.W. I.S.U. CARNIVAL

Perhaps rightly so because a small minority of irresponsible shooters have done little to endanger shooting as a sport to the public.

Therefore it is imperative for us to recognise the junior members. They are the future of our sport and if handled and encouraged sensibly, they have the potential in a few years to make a substantial mark on the international scene. This I believe is more important than ever before, because to secure the future of this sport we need to make the general public aware of our existence as a responsible and competitive group.

So let's think positive in terms of reducing costs, with the objective of encouraging people to compete, rather than to discourage and restrict the growth of this great sport.
