





PASSING OF A PRESIDENT George Biggs

Australian Clay Target Association inaugural President, Mr. Jock Wilson, passed away on May 16 in his 90th year. For the past several years, Jock has lived with his daughter, Clover, in the Wonthaggi district. His other

daughter Robyn, is now living at Echuca. Born in Scotland, Jock saw service with the Scotlish Black Watch in World War I. He came to Australia as a young man in 1921. In the following several years he was involved in various activities, finally establishing himself in the wholesale and retail meat industry. It was around 1930 when he first became interested in Clay Target Shooting at the nobel Clay Bird Club. Clay Target shooting was then in its infancy but starting to grow. It was here

the sport of Clay Target Shooting. Jock was instrumental in Clay Target Shooting being established on a National scale and in 1936 a meeting was called to discuss the matter. Up to this time Clay Target Shooters were controlled by the Live Bird Association. The special meeting decided that an association be formed to be

that Jock became involved in our sport. He was elected to

the Club Committee in 1933 and became very dedicated to

known as "Clay Target Shooters Association of Victoria" — Mr. Horrie James was appointed President with Mr. J.M. Wilson, Vice President. A short time later the name was changed to "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting Association", as the sport was developing on a National level. At this time Jock Wilson was elected President. He continued to serve in this position until his retirement in 1957. His 21 years of service as President is without equal. During this period, Jock's dedication and hard work were responsible for the development of Australian Clay Target Shooting. I first became associated with Jock in 1939 when I first took up Clay Target Shooting. However, War closed everything down until 1945.

Jock visited England and America in 1956. He brought back valuable information that was applied to the development of our sport. He was also a tower of strength as we prepared for Australia's first attempt at staging the 1956 Olympic Games Clay Pigeon Shooting event.

There is no doubt that Jock Wilson's contribution to our sport of Clay Target Shooting is without equal.






• Gold Nugget winners at Esperance Gun Club. L. to R.: Shane Yates and Kevin Aylett, both from Tasmania.



B Grade and David Browning, Salmon Gums W.A. C Grade. Ken Cross, Gemfields Qld, won the veteran High Gun. David Burchard, Esperance, Junior High Gun. Julie Heve, Kalgoorlie W.A., Ladies High Gun. Alan Cole, Southern Cross, W.A. Intermediate High Gun and David Kevill, Cunderdin W.A. taking overall High Gun honours. The tournament was well run and a credit to the organizers. Through this column I extend thanks from all visitors to the Esperance Gun Club committee and members for their friendship and hospitality over this weekend.

National Championships — West Australian Gun Club Perth. No doubt, many shooters who did not attend the recent 1985 Trap Nationals in Perth, W.A. will be awaiting both written and verbal reports as to their success or otherwise. Whilst it is far too early to assess their actual financial success, it is obvious by the number of entries in all events going over budget, a satisfactory result should be achieved. As for the facilities, ten D.T.L. layouts, ten American skeet layouts, three Olympic French and three I.S.U. skeet, all complete with concrete aprons and walks to international standards are what one may call, a clay shooters paradise. The club rooms are not finished as yet, however one could visualise what they will be like when completed.

These too are a standard unequalled anywhere in Australia. Some 1.5 million dollars are being spent on the complex and all construction work is, and has been carried out, by contractors.

It was reported around the grounds that credit for the achievement of such a shooting facility in W.A. would have to go to the late Jules Steiner, whom many of us knew as a dedicated shooter and a great worker for our sport. The end result of this complex will prove that.

Two clubs, previously known as Azzuri and Perth Gun

Clubs have amalgamated and intend to operate on the new complex, and be known as the West Australian Gun Club.

On the lighter side, flag poles were provided for all States to raise their State flag during the opening ceremony at the Nationals. One conscientious State President was afraid his flag would be souvenired, so at the end of each days shooting, he removed it from the pole and placed it in his car boot and returned it each morning to fly again.

It was not until the last day, when folding the flag to place it safely in the car boot he noticed a label bearing the trade mark, "Made in Tasmania".

Thinking that was strange, he checked the flat further and found to his dismay he had been looking after the Tasmanian flag. His State flag, made in N.S.W., had actually been moved to another pole after the opening ceremony on the first day without his knowledge.

How embarrassing. Another well known administrator of our sport forgot to renew his shooting licence before expiry date.

Attended Perth Nationals without one and had to borrow a gun, and get his mates to purchase cartridges for him. He could not pull any strings to get his licence renewed either. He has to go through the full process he and his colleagues set for all future gun licence applicants, even to the three week waiting period.

Southern Cross Gun Club, W.A. On my way home from the Perth Nationals, I passed this club as a shoot was nearing an end. The club is situated on the Great Eastern Highway, just out of Southern Cross. Like most clubs these days, they are keen to encourage shooters to improve their ability with a shot gun. I was rather impressed to see a coaching session under way at the end of the days shooting program.

Whyalla Gun Club, S.A. Sunday April 28, 1985: By coincidence, this club was also having a shoot as I was passing on my way home from the Perth Nationals, so I pulled up for a shot. Roy Pitt and Gary Bollen shared the first event, a 25 target skeet cash divide, both shot the possible 25/25. Robert Walker shot the only possible 25/25 to win the handicap event and a metre penalty. Bob Puglisi 24/25 was second, with Bob O'Brien taking third trophy. In the last event on the program a 50 target graded event from 15m. Merve Star won A Grade with 71/73. B Grade went to Lee Trebilcock 47/50 and C Grade to Steven Thomas 43/52.

Having arrived in Adelaide and staying for a few days, I had the opportunity along with our National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, to attend the S.A. Olympic Council Fund Raising Dinner. The guest speaker, was the Hon. John Brown, Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism, Minister for Administrative Services.

It was an excellent evening and great to hear of the Minister's success in abstracting funds from the Government departments to channel into the development of sport throughout Australia.

Let's hope he has continued success in this area and our sport reaps some of the benefits.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian.

In answer to Tim Catling CTSN March, 1985, and Les Johnston April 1985. I would NOT like to see D/B shooting reduced by 50%. I agree, it is a pleasure to watch a good shoot off. Others can learn by watching good techniques. I disagree with Tim Catling's No. 2. I believe that using

the second barrel helps many shooters to see where they went wrong if they missed on the first. Regards Points; there is nothing more disappointing to a

new shooter than to lose three points for one lost target early in an event. We need to encourage new shooters not discourage them. In our zone we shoot a good mixture of events, including Points Score both off 15m and handicap.

Les Johnston would have us delete Rule 2.1(b) AND do away with common mark shooting. He insults the intelligence of "C" Grade shooters and "B" Grade shooters too, when he suggests that they are not worthy of the same value trophies as "A & AA" shooters who are already favoured with the overall trophy and sweepstakes as they are the Top Shots.

However I DO agree that we should shoot a balance of common mark and handicap events.

I also believe that if all shooters acted as true sportsmen and women the present grading and handicapping systems would work beautifully, and the sport of Clay Target Shooting would really BOOM, because new shooters are being put off by good shooters cheating to remain in lower grades and on forward marks to take trophies and sweepstakes from beginners.



GUIDELINES FOR REFEREES — TRAP & SKEET

1. Read shooters names from squad sheets and ensure competitors are on correct tracks and marks. For safety reasons ask all shooters to check for obstructions in barrels.

2. The Referee must stand where he has a clear view of targets and competitors, preferably between lanes 2 and 3, approximately 2 metres behind the competitor's shooting mark. If there is excessive back-ground noise, the Referee may move between lanes 2 and 4 in order to hear the competitors call so as to give all competitors equity of competition.

3. Describe the event and procedure for conduct of the event. E.G. "25 Target Single Barrel Championship, shot from 15 metres, 13 targets from trap 1 and 12 targets from trap 2."

4. The referee should ask his scorer to stand close enough to him, so that the Referee can see the score sheet, and the scorer can observe the target as a check referee.

5. Target to be shown by Referees.

- (a) When the competitors are all in position, the Referee must release a target for number 1 shooter to look at on his call.
 - (i) At the beginning of all events.
 - (ii) After any breakdown or delay
 - (iii) At the commencement of all shoot-offs.
 - (iv) On each trap used for a shoot-off.
 - (v) After any break for shells etc. during a shoot-off.(vi) If a competitor received two broken targets in a
 - row, the Referee should ask the competitor "Would you like to see a target."
- (b) If it is a six man squad and there is to be 1 target per shooter eye-opener, number 6 shooter must move up to take the first target, but he must still be shown a target, on his call, before he shoots at his eye-opener target.

6. The Referee must at all times release the target immediately on the competitors call.

7. The Referee must clearly call the result thus: one, lost, three, two, no target, as appropriate.

8. Lost targets must be called immediately, and the referee can change his decision if the target breaks before it hits the ground.

The Referee is to see that the next shooter does not close his gun until the result of the previous shot has been called, and should not release the next target if the competitor calls before the result has been called. Refer Rule 1.1E.

9.At all times ensure that no competitor leaves a cartridge(s) in his gun, after a red signal from the traphouse (breakdown etc) and when moving from lane 5 to lane 1, or anytime competitors or other personnel are in front of him.

10. The Referee must speak to a shooter **immediately** on any breach of the safety rules. If the rules of etiquette are broken, the Referee should speak to the shooter concerned after the squad has finished, depending on circumstances.

11. Providing a shooter does not obstruct the Referee in the execution of his duties, the shooter may walk in front of the Referee when changing from lanes 1 to 5.

12. In Single Barrel competition the Referee must ensure that the second barrel in Double Barrel guns remains clear.

13. The Referee must not restore a target if the competitor opens his gun after a malfunction, unless he has been instructed to do so by the Referee.

14. In the case of a malfunction the Referee shall firstly

check that the safety catch is not in the on position, he shall then check that the action is closed, enquire of the competitor how the action operates, i.e. whether mechanical, or inertia triggers, and then test fire the gun once only.

If the shooter is using a release trigger gun, the Referee will ask the shooter to test fire the gun once only. Under no circumstances will the Referee attempt to test fire it in this case.

15. The Referee should be mindful of the rule regarding squad members disturbing the competitor shooting.

16. A Referee will not call no target to deny a shooter the opportunity to shoot at a whole target, unless a safety hazard exists.

17. Interpretation of refusal rule:

A shooter may refuse to shoot at any target which he considers to be too high, too low, too wide, too quickly released, too slowly released, at any target he considers to be illegal. There is no limit to the number of targets the shooter may refuse as long as the Referee agrees with the reasons. Obviously, if too many targets are refused for illegality, the Referees must inspect the trap, find the cause, and correct it. If the Referee does not consider that the target refused is illegal, he will ask the shooter why he refused the target. If the Referee is not satisfied with the reason, he will tell the shooter. He will also state that any further targets which are refused, and are considered by the Referee to be legal, will be scored "lost target". If the above situation seems likely to arise, it is preferable that a third party, qualified if possible, adjudicates subsequent refusals. The foregoing procedure in no way discriminates against Referees using their judgement, it is meant to assist in equity of competition. A major point missed by older style Referees is that although a shooter may refuse to shoot at an illegal target, he is equally entitled to accept an illegal target, and shoot at it. However, if he shoots at, and misses an illegal target, the only decision open to the Referee is "lost target."

Similarly, if he hits it, "three", "two", or "one" as the case may be is the only decision to be given.

A Referee should not call "No Target" for a fast or slow released target nor if the target seems to him to be too high, too low, or too wide. "No Target" should only be called in the case of a broken target, a pair of targets emerging instead of a single (or vice versa), or where a safety hazard exists if a shooter elects to shoot at the target.

The shooter must be the only person to decide if the target is acceptable to him.

Many older style Referees consider that this rule takes away too many of their decision-making powers. The fact is that the rule puts the decision whether to shoot or not with the sole person who should have to decide — the shooter concerned.

The Referee must leave the "No Target" decision where it belongs — with the shooter. If the shooter breaks the target, illegal or not, he is credited with it, if he misses an illegal target, he must equally accept the "lost target" decision.

Referees are to ensure that "R" for refusal is entered on scorecards. Every refusal must be called either "No Target" or "lost target" by the Referee.

18. The Referee is to see that all competitors remain as a squad until the last shooter has finished.


19. At the completion of each visit to a trap, the Referee must say, "unload your guns and check your scores."

20. In Skeet, the Referee is to ensure that the competitor's feet are within the 1 metre square at each station.

21. The Referee should take up a position as recommended in the accompanying diagram for each station.



The Berela Homes Perpetual Shield went to the Pistol Club No. 1 Team comprising Tony Smyth, John Holmes, Galvin Martin, Bruce Chatfield and W. Cameron with a score of 629.5 from the Clay Target Club's No 1 team of Col Burt, Col Barton, Ross Drain, Ron Bright and Rex Whitten with a score of 572.

Also, for the first time this year, the host club donated all remaining funds to a charity of their choice. The Peel Valley Tamworth Rifle Club elected the Crippled Childrens Association.

The day was highly successful with all shooters expressing favourable comments, and marking their diary with the date for 1986.




PROGRAMMES AND RULES



WHY I USE AN AUTOMATIC

By George Biggs

The following article was published in the first official A.C.T.A. News magazine 1949. At this time Clay Target Shooters had very little choice in the selection of a shotgun. World War 2 had caused production to stop for several years from 1939.

English Double Barrel side by side guns were most popular in the immediate post war years. In fact, there was really nothing else except the Browning automatic 5 shot which had been available for many years. It was an inexpensive gun compared to English doubles. I well remember buying my first "Greener" double side by side that cost me around £36 (\$72) compared to this, we could buy a Browning Automatic for f14 = \$28. Was it any wonder the auto became popular? Of course neither type of gun was really designed for Clay Target shooting. They were in fact a field gun and had to be modified stock wise, for Clay Target Shooting. It was at this stage of my shooting career I became very much aware of the importance of stock fit.

Many times I have been asked why I use and how I like the automatic shot-gun? A discussion of this subject resulted in the Editor of our Australian "News" seeking a story on what may be termed a subject not without interest to many shooters.

The history of my association with shooting goes back to my earliest youth when a small boy on my father's cattle property in Queensland. In that particular part of Queensland game and wild life abounded in plenty. Every boy is veritably born with "a rifle in his hands" and as his age advances, whether on foot or horse back, his rifle is always close at hand. Naturally under these circumstances I learnt to use the rifle with a fair amount of success. At fast moving game with an automatic rifle we seldom missed. This brings to my mind, an often repeated statement, that to be outstandingly successful in shooting either in the field or over traps, one must take up the gun early in life. The younger one is the easier it becomes to judge distance and speed. As instancing this point I recall many occasions of riding after kangaroos and shooting from the saddle at this fast moving target. It will be noted that a keen sense of distance and speed is essential when shooting in this fasion, otherwise you shoot well behind the target.

Returning to live in Melbourne I acquired by first contact with the shotgun about 1938 — a very light double barrel job. How well I remember the "kicks" this one gave me. I found that I was never happy looking along "two barrels" — I much preferred the single line straight to the target. Late in 1939 I decided to try my hand at clay pigeons using a double barrel gun. After a season or two I felt it was the Browning Automatic single barrel gun for me.

My shooting improved immediately. If you take the time to read over what I have already said you will observe that I am leading up to my main points and these are, (1) my early days of shooting were done with a rifle — which meant looking along one barrel only, (2) I consider that the single barrel weapon is much easier to handle and a much quicker gun to aim accurately, (3) the automatic gun is a single trigger job, therefore the grip does not have to be relaxed for the second shot, (4) with a single barrel one does not have the tendency to "cross-fire" (which often happens when shooting with a double barrel gun), (5) the killing range and the patterns are usually exceedingly good, (6) the recoil which is taken up by the snubbing device lessens the sore shoulder and headache, (particularly in long events over traps).

I have heard the automatic gun coming in for a lot of criticism from time to time — some say the mechanism becomes faulty and other complaints. Against this I mention that 95% of the American shooters use the automatic and pump gun (and these boys generally can shoot) also it is important to remember that automatic weapons must be kept clean, lightly oiled and re-loaded shells should not be used. I consider that most of the faults lie with the man behind it and not the gun. I have been told that my own shooting would be better if I dropped the idea of the automatic, but the foregoing is my experience and my own opinions.

In concluding let me say that no matter how good your gun is, if the stock does not fit the shooter concerned he will never put together a good scoring string. He will lack co-ordination with body, head and eyes and fast timing is impossible. The shooter should always remember to keep his cheek down on the comb, not as we often see a shooter lift his head to watch the bird and forget to take the gun along with him.

West Darling Championships 11th 12th May, 1985.


A milestone and a proud episode in the history of Broken Hill Gun Club. Surpassed only, by Charles Rasps discovery that Broken Hill was a lead producer.

Record attendance of 139 shooters, competing the two day programme in ideal conditions.

In recent years, a decision was made, (not without a great deal of misgiving) by the excutive, to extend to activities of the club. Major expansion was centred around two important events of the year, the West Darling Championships held in May and the Silver City Championships in September. The enormity of this venture was the increase in trophy value from \$100 to the incredible amount of \$6,000, Considering the isolation factor of Broken Hill, with Mildura the nearest shooting centre at a distant 300 kms, this venture was undertaken with a lot of opposition. Contrary to gloomy speculation, it was an immediate success, a gamble that paid off. Shooting attendance accelerated from an average of 20, to around the 100 mark, with a culmination of a record of 139 shooters, at the recent carnival.

Broken Hill is now firmly established as a leader in Clay Target competition.

This determination to succeed was demonstrated prior to the 1983 Centenary Championships. With just two weeks to the shooting date, the Club-house was razed by fire, Consternation! Yes. Panic? No. The hastily convened meeting of club officials was adamant the shoot must proceed. A concerted effort by members to clean up the



debris and erect temporary premises, plus outside assistance from organisations foreign to Clay Target Shooting, enabled the club to conduct a successful meeting.

The only comments from shooters as they were presented with their Trophies, amid the smoke blackened ruins, was praise for the dedication, guts and determination of the people concerned, to commit chaos to harmony at such short notice.

Let us briefly glance at some individual performances.

Undoubtedly, Russell Mark took top honors. A long break of 530. Outright Handicap Winner from 21-25m, with a 20/20 score, overall & A, west Darling Gift & West Darling D/B Championship with respective scores of 350/350 & 94/94 & High Gun Trophy award 194/195.

The tireless action of shoot marshall Bob Davis, shepherding the stragglers from the boundary fence to the shooting tracks. Reminiscent of Bob's station round-up days.



This year the programme will include a Saturday afternoon event and social evening, with the Field shooting held on the Sunday.


A cash jackpot prize of \$500 is offered for a possible score, and a sash for the Top Shot.



A CONDENSED HISTORY OF CUNNAMULLA AND THE CUNNAMULLA GUN CLUB

*(special thanks to Reg Barden for his assistance and recollections)

Major Thomas Mitchell discovered the Warrego River in 1846, however it was Kennedy who followed the River lower in 1847 and described the superb river frontage country as equal to the best he had seen in Australia.

In 1859 Samuel Smith settled the area, calling his spread "Cunnamulla Station". The outstation "Burrenbilla" became the main station when, in 1868, a reserve was created for the town of Cunnamulla. Purchased in 1913 by Carl Schmidt, Burrenbilla is still owned by younger members of the Schmidt family although much has been resumed. Many shooters who have travelled to Cunnamulla to shoot have stayed at Burrenbilla not realising it is Cunnamulla's oldest property.

Cunnamulla is the main centre of the Paroo Shire which covers an area of more than 47,000 sq.km. It is linked to Brisbane by road, rail and air services. Wool growing is the main industry of the district and the area is known for its high lambing percentages, and quality wool. Beef cattle are also raised but the unreliable rainfaull prevents farming.

The Australian gemstone, the opal, is mined at Yowah to the west, and many tourists visit each year. The opal festival and lizard race promote the district, becoming more popular each year.

Cunnamulla offers a wide variety of sporting amenities, golf, tennis, bowls, cricket, basketball, pistol shooting and of course Clay Target Shooting.

Over 60 years ago, before clay targets were used, live bird shooting using starlings and galahs was in vogue.

A trapped bird was put in a drop sided cage and placed in the centre of a large circle and on signal the sides dropped. The rules were simple: (i) The bird must be in the air before a shot was fired (ii) The shot bird must fall within the circle (iii) Wounded birds had to be retrieved before they flapped over the circle or they were "lost". Young lads were paid a halfpenny or one penny to retrieve wounded birds for the shooter before they were "lost". Clay Targets were introduced in the early 20s, but the club was abandoned during the big drought of the late 20s and the depression of the early 30s.

In 1935, the late Wally Scheiwi and Col McDonald formed enough support and the Cunnamulla Gun Club was re-opened, and shot on the edge of the sandhill at the southern end of Wick Street. All the shooting in the early

days was done from one plus trap with one track straight from the centre of the trap and marked from 12 yards to 16 yards and later back to 19 yards. Bookmakers were an integral part of every shoot and they would call the odds about every shooter. You could back yourself for either every shot, each event or the whole shoot, as could anyone and many spectators were there just to bet.

During the war, the club did not shoot but Reg Barden, being keen on shooting, kept the club open and paid all affilliation fees. He obtained clays and cartridges from Melbourne so the club could start shooting when the war was over. Renamed the Cunnamulla Diggers Gun Club after the war, and given permission to shoot on the Race Track enclosure, the gun club moved to its present site. Races were held in the afternoons, having been preceded by a morning shoot.

In the early days when you joined a gun club, you would be affiliated with the Australian Clay Pigeon Club and they'd send you a badge with your registered number on it. Numbers got so large the idea was abandoned. Reg Barden still has his original badge no 868, so there weren't many shooters about in those times. Mr Barden remembers being invited to shoots in Dubbo, Parks and Orange. He was a back marker on 19 yards and shot at many different clubs.

Buster Schmidt, (Life Member and former President of Cunnamulla Gun Club) and Rolf Arthur have had continuous membership since 1938. Dave Webster also joined in 1938 although his membership was broken with war service. Foundation member, Reg Barden is still a strong club supporter.

AUSTRALIAN RECORD SET AT Q.C.T.A. 1985 STATE TRAP CARNIVAL


