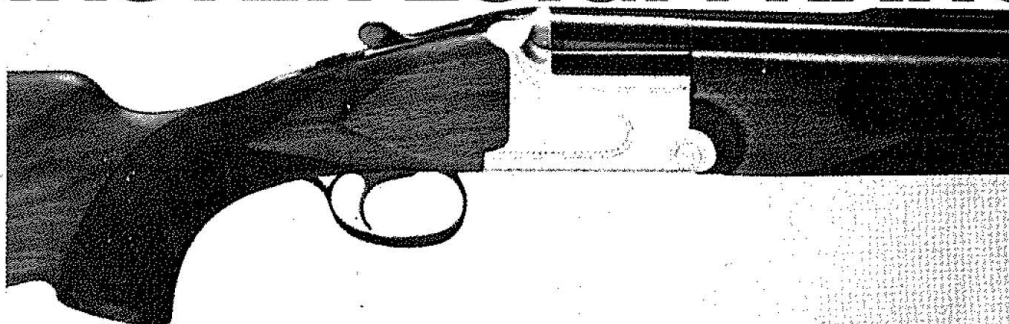

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES By George Biggs

Our participation in the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games gave Australian Clay Target Shooting a great boost. It did in fact bring Clay Target Shooters together Australia wide more quickly than otherwise would have been possible.

It was unfortunate in one that the event was staged at a specially prepared ground at Laverton Air Force Station.

It was not long after the Games were over that the ground was dismantled and the equipment simply disappeared. It was really an unfortunate happening because it was to rob Australian Shooters of the chance to carry on with international shooting competition. However, in 1973, Australia was awarded the World Moving Target Championships. Trap and Skeet events were conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club. An enormous amount of work and a lot of money went into rebuilding the ground. Two olympic trench layouts and two olympic skeet grounds had to go in.

The result was a huge success with twenty-four Countries competing, we fielded both a skeet team and a trench team. The trench team came in equal third, with an Italian team, for a bronze medal.

Since 1974 Australia has sent both trench and skeet teams to World Championships in several overseas countries with only a fair degree of success.

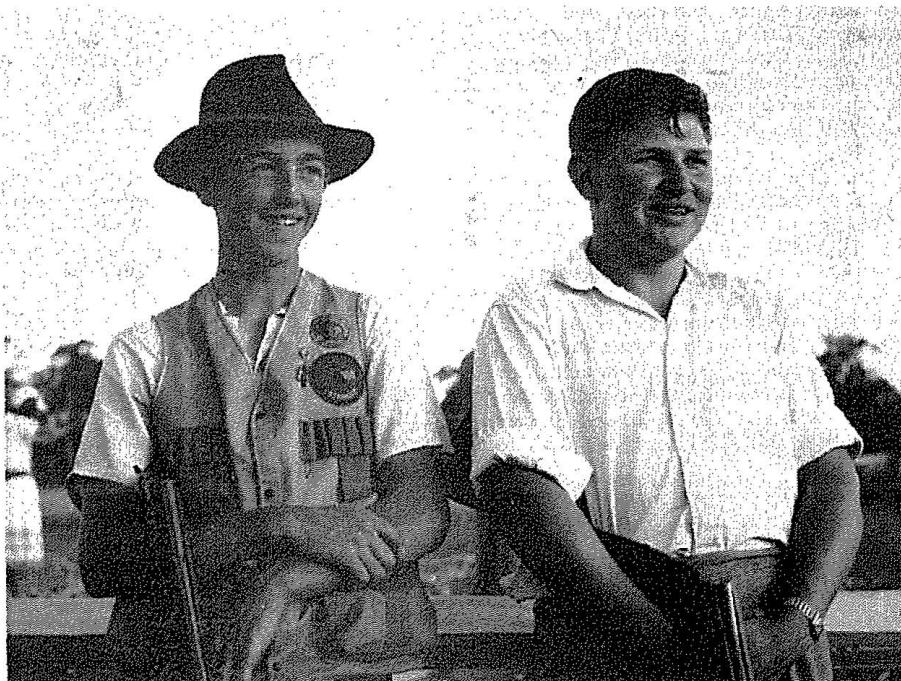
Browsing through Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News, Vol 3, October 1949, it was interesting to read secretary Bill McCullough's 13th Annual report of the Executive Committee, it covered the period of operations and activities of the Association as submitted for consideration and approval, to the 13th Annual meeting of the Association at Scott's Hotel Melbourne November 2, 1949. The report points out that the period under review has been one of continued extension and success.

One principal matter of interest has been Australia's first success in international competition. Australia won the Mackintosh International Trophy, which was shot for the second time in the postwar era during the 1949 season.

The Australian Team comprised the first 20 highest scores in the Champion of Champions Cup. The team of 20 men (first 15 scores to count) gained a meritorious win with England (previous holders) in second place, Scotland Third, Wales Fourth, and Ireland 5th. Australia won by 39 points. Australia's high gun honour in the event went to Tasmanian shooter R. Redpath. His score 97/100.

Secretary Bill McCullough reported to the meeting that affiliated clubs and registered shooters have increased in numbers since the last annual meeting. Clubs affiliate since the nominal resumption of competitive shooting, about 1946, have totalled 92, for which 80 clubs are classified as affiliated for the review period. The total of registered shooters has increased to approximately 1800.

Mr. McCullough went on to say that due to increasing registrations the association's finances were continuing to become more and more stabilised.

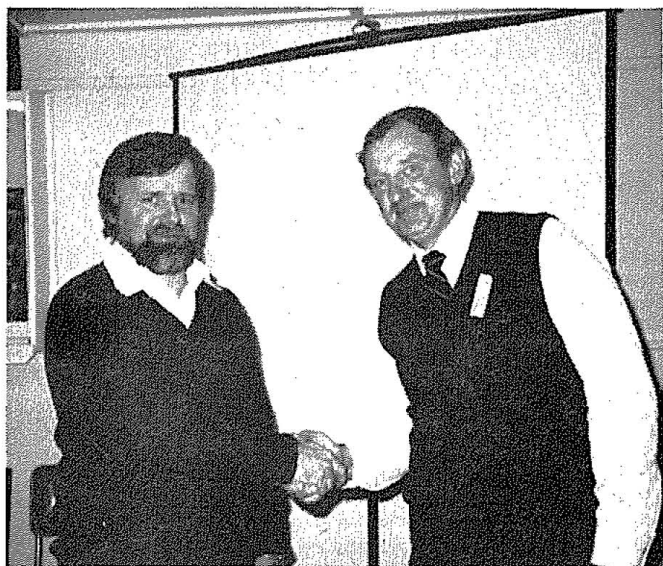

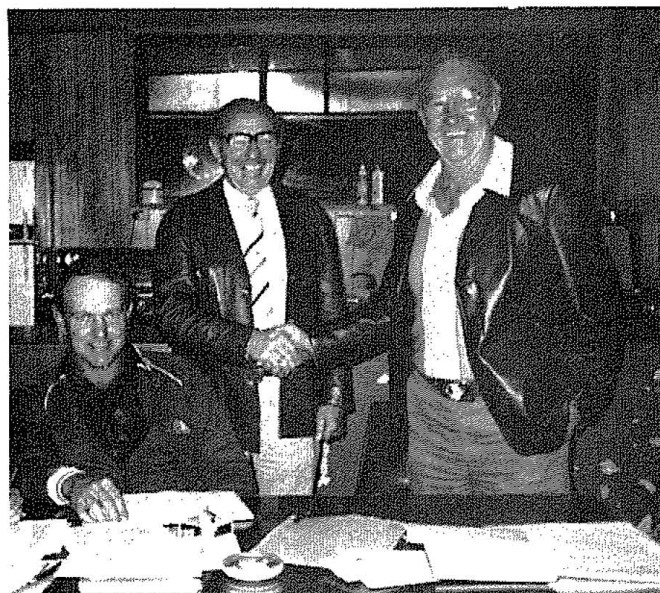

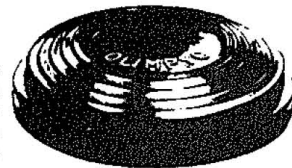

The blazers are "Bowls Blue" which is identical with all the bowling clubs in NSW — These blazers are readily available through any menswear store, either off the shelf or tailor made. Most of these blazers have a piece of material in the pocket which matches the blazer and is placed there for the pocket.

The procedure is:—

Go to your local menswear store and order your blazer — at the same time request a pocket piece of matching material (APPROX. 18cm x 18cm) — send this material with \$6.50 to J.J. CASH, 91 MURPHY STREET, RICHMOND, VIC 3121. ATTN. MR RUSSELL GRANT and ask him to embroider the NSWCTA emblem on it. Mr Grant has a sample and will deliver it within one week from receipt of order.

The pocket is principally gold and is the NSW State Coat of Arms (Lion — Kangaroo etc) with N.S.W. on top and Clay Target Assn. underneath.

This blazer is most attractive and I appeal to as many shooters as possible to purchase one — be proud of your sport and let the rest of Australia know it. We also have State Association Ties which are blue with a red waratah on them. If you purchase both and wear them to the local club you will show that you are proud of your State and your sport.

CALL FOR HUNTING BAN

The Australian Federation of Animal Societies (AFAS) has called for an immediate ban on all hunting in Australia.

This recommendation appears in a 750-page document the AFAS submitted to the Senate Select Committee on Animal Welfare.

Shooters' organisations have expressed grave concern at contents of the document and urge shooters everywhere to treat the threat to their field sports very seriously.

AFAS represents 43 Australian societies with a total membership of around 50,000.

It is a full member of the World Society for the Protection of Animals, which has official consultative status with the United Nations Organisation. Thus it has a lot of clout.

Extracts from the AFAS document reveal serious shortcomings in the evidence presented by the Federation to the Senate committee. One can point to such things as:

Inaccurate statements like: "The MAIN targets (my emphasis) of hunters are feral pigs, feral cats, wild dogs, rabbits, hares, foxes and mallard ducks."

The omission of the huntable native duck species, quail, deer, feral goats and even kangaroo and buffalo from this list is as remarkable as the inclusion of feral cats, wild dogs and especially mallards.

Unfounded claims that are at odds with recent scientific evidence. For example, "The carnage does not end when the hunter leaves the field."

"Ducks and other water birds die slowly from lead poisoning after they ingest the lead shot which builds up on the bottom of waterways and marshes."

Yet F. L. Norman of Victoria's Arthur Rylah Institute found lead pellets in only three ducks (one woodie, two grey teal) out of 1854 captured in Victoria.

H.J. Lavery of Queensland concluded that lead poisoning of waterfowl in that state was of no consequence, having found only limited evidence of it.

Lead poisoning in waterfowl has been a problem in America. But the behaviour patterns of our birds and the very nature of our typical shooting locations are different — hence the above findings.

As a hunter's spokesman put it to me, the glaring inaccuracies merely underline the overall lack of authority in the AFAS submission. The danger, he felt, was that the Senate committee would fail to recognise that lack.

A heavy reliance on media reports, which are too often guilty of selectivity, sensationalism and bias. Such evidence does not have the same standing as statistically valid research.

Similarly, a reliance on rhetorical questions, such as "If commercial farming (of deer) must exist, what justification is left for the hunting of these animals?"

Rhetorical questions have no substance. They are ploys which seek to transfer the burden of proof to someone else and thereby sidestep the need to examine an issue.

Recommendations that are plainly foolish, such as "Future control of feral cats should be achieved not by programs of shooting but by sterilisation of domestic cats, including public education programs in that regard."

Apparently AFAS thinks the cats already in the wild do not breed. Logic would suggest that a multi-faceted approach to feral cat control is necessary.

Instances of begging the question (that is, assuming something which has yet to be proved). Witness this comment on foxes: "Foxes are killed in such numbers that the survival of the species is doubtful."

This assertion is not only highly debatable but also assumes that the survival of the fox is desirable, and implies that a sizeable fox population would be a good thing.

All hunting groups are urging shooters to write to Senator Don Chipp, Chairman of the Senate Select Committee on Animal Welfare, expressing in unemotional terms their personal support for hunting.

PROFILE: VAN DIEMEN'S TROPHY TEAM

The team to represent Australia in the second Van Diemen's Trophy Match has been named after the results were carded at the 1985 Trap Nationals in Perth, Western Australia. The trophy was donated by Dr. Paul Cains for competition between Australia, England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales and is shot for every two years shoulder to shoulder; this year in Scotland in the Mackintosh Match.

The team is picked from the aggregate results from the Double Barrel 50 points, Single Barrel 50 points, Pointscore 150 points & 100 targets in the Mackintosh team shoot (300 points), thus an overall total being 550 points. The team selection is at the National Titles, every 2 years, with the top 5 "first past the post" plus a reserve being selected. This team, as was our first team, is very strong with a lot of depth. Three of the original members made their way into the team in Pud Burgess, Larry Dimasi and Kevin Perkins as reserve. The team announced is: Tim Catling (Manager), Arthur Turner, Pud Burgess, Doug Smith, Larry Dimasi, Bill Stevens, Kevin Perkins (Reserve).

I was fortunate enough to catch up with all the team upon their selection. After interviewing them all separately, some very interesting comments were made. First of all was the fitness angle, every member highlighted the fact that in this champion team there is quite a difference in age and it is a fact that the "old boys" never looked better and are just as competitive as they have ever been.

Let's while we're on the fitness in our sport angle have a look at Doug Smith, Bill Stevens, Pud Burgess — these Champs have been in the winners circle for a long, long time. The question I asked was "How come you all have been there, so well, for so long?" The overall comment was — if you love your sport, one will endeavour to make oneself as competitive for as long as one can, looking after yourself, and self discipline ensures that.

Bill Stevens says "you can't beat good hard YAKKA" to keep fit and have a good mental attitude. Another interesting fact is that all the team are keen Olympic Trench Shooters, with Pud Burgess and Doug Smith being ex Australian Olympic Trench Members. The versatile Kevin Perkins informs me that he is going to have a crack at Trench seriously. One thing for sure, he will be competitive. Let's have a closer look at each of the teams.

MANAGER: TIM CATLING.

Tim is a member of the executive of the A.C.T.A., also the past State Coaching Director for Western Australia. He is very competitive in his shooting and has been competitive (and still is) for a long time. He has represented Australia 9 times in the Mackintosh Teams, winner of National Titles and has won the coveted sporting event "Cherry Tree — 6 times".

He also plays off 3 on the golf course. Tim's main interests are of course shooting, golf and coaching. Tim is looking forward to the challenge of taking an Australian Team away. He is very happy with the selected team, saying, there is a lot of depth and experience — he is quietly confident the "OZ" will do well. As Manager-Coach, Tim has the confidence of his team and will be an obvious benefit to them.

From the N.S.W. City of Cobar comes "Pud Burgess". The totally competitive Pud keeps "slotting" them in year after year. He has represented Australia 19 times in the Mackintosh Teams, shot the 100/100 4 times in the Mackintosh, has 6 National titles to his credit and has won the High Gun over the Trap Nationals 3 times.

He has represented Australia in Olympic Trench as well. Pud shoots a Browning over / under, choked full / full and

likes to use a 3 dram cartridge with No 7 shot. His best break is 519 straight, Double Barrel.

He plans to prepare himself for the overseas match by developing match pressure at tournaments in Australia. He may train on the slower English Target to obtain a correct sight picture just prior to leaving. Pud is married with 4 children, all of which like to "have a shot".

When he can Pud likes to play tennis and is very active in his community. Pud was in the first team to represent Australia in the Van Diemen's Cup.

Larry Dimasi represents the Mildura Gun Club. Larry, a burly, strong farmer is looking forward to his second Van Diemen's Trophy Team. Larry has represented Australia twice in the Mackintosh Team, was National Double Barrel Champion in 1982 as well as National Series High Gun in 1982.

His longest break is 536 Double Barrel. Larry shoots a Perazzi SC3 with 29½ inch barrel, choked ¾/full. He uses a 3 dram cartridge for first barrel and a 3¾ dram cartridge for the second.

Because of his farm commitments, Larry has to work long hard hours, this he says saves the cost of gym fees as his work certainly uses a lot of energy.

He plans to step up his tournament participation as the time gets nearer to leaving, this will toughen him up for the pressure he will realize in England. Larry is married with 3 girls and is very keen on field shooting and fishing. Larry's big ambition — to represent Australia in Olympic Trench and shoot well.

From sunny Queensland hails Doug Smith, (Smithy) representing the Brisbane Gun Club. Doug has represented Australia 22 times in the Mackintosh Team, has been Team High Gun 6 times and since 1960 has won 10 National Titles. Doug competed for Australia in the 1973 World Titles in our Bronze Medal Trench Team, also in Trench for Australia at the 1974 Commonwealth Games in New Zealand. His longest break is 505 Double Barrel. He shoots a Browning choked ¾ and full and likes a 3 dram No 7 cartridge.

Doug plans to shoot at tournaments to build up match pressure prior to leaving. Because of painful back problems, Doug is unable to enjoy tennis and golf as he once did, however he enjoys hunting and fishing.

A Cobar Gun Club representative, boilermaker Arthur Turner is looking at his first trip away from Australia. At 24 Arthur has a fine future in front of him. He has represented Australia 3 times in the Mackintosh Team, was Overall Series High Gun in 1983 and this year, 1985, also 1985 Champion of Champions National Title winner. Arthur shoots with a 30" Browning, choked ¾ and full.

He likes a 3 dram in the first barrel and a 3¾ dram cartridge in the second with No 7 shot. Arthur's preparation is to have a bit of a spell after his Nationals build up and success. He has just started a gym course and will build up his competitive edge by way of tournaments as his leaving time gets closer. Arthur is engaged and apart from his fiancée, his other interests are fishing and tennis.

Another well known Australian from the Sunshine Coast is Bill Stevens, representing the Brisbane Gun Club. Bill is the State Director for Coaching in Queensland and enjoys his coaching. Bill has represented Australia 10 times in Mackintosh Teams. He has 2 National Titles and has high gunned the Mackintosh Team. His longest break is 289. Bill has represented Australia at Vandailia in 1979. Bill shoots an IAB Shotgun with 32" barrels, ¾ and full is his choking and likes a 3 dram No 7 cartridge both barrels.

For preparation, Bill is going to be doing some physical fitness training as he is not working at the building game and believes he needs a little more work to keep in trim, he is going to start with some brisk walking then finish up with jogging.

He will set himself up the same as he always does, using tournaments to keep up the sharp edge. Bill is married with 4 children, the 3 boys all shoot and are very competitive. When Bill gets time to himself he loves to go fishing.

Kevin Perkins, (Perky) represents Illawarra Gun Club from N.S.W. Kevin is one of Australia's versatile shooters and is reserve for this team. Kevin competed for Australia in the first Van Dieman's Trophy Team and backed that up a year later by representing Australia at San Antonio World Skeet Titles. Kevin has represented Australia 7 times in the Mackintosh Team, has a long break of 297, he

has been runner up 3 times in National Championships, Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Double Rise.

He plans to prepare himself with 100 targets a week plus match practice. He will be bike riding to keep himself on the line. Kevin is married to his greatest fan Judy, they have 2 boys who feel golf is their forte.

When not shooting, Kevin also enjoys a game of golf.

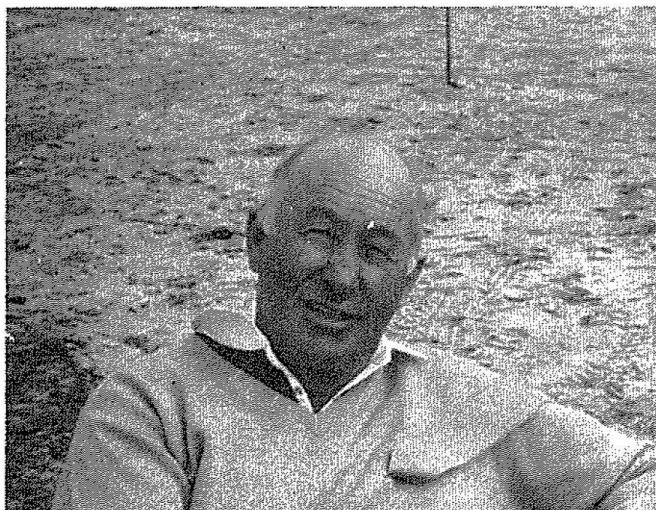

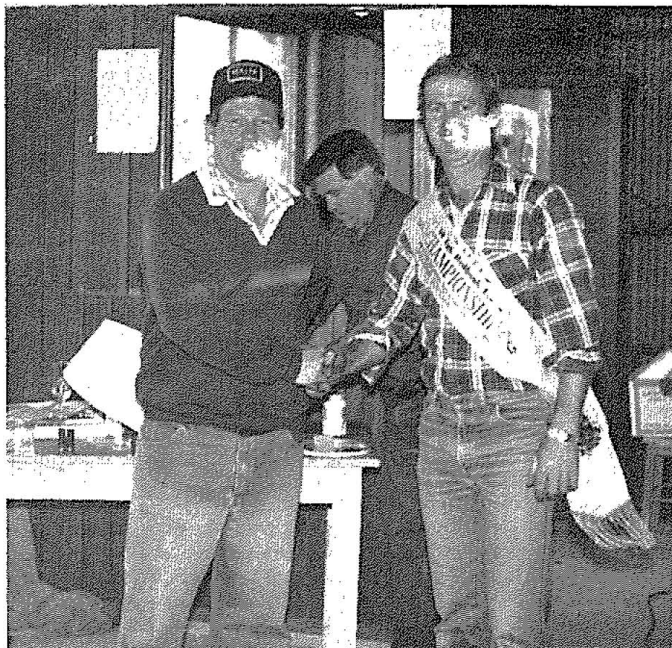
The High Gun for the weekend was won by our Club President, Bruce (Killer) Smith, with consistent shooting to score 176/200.

We all enjoyed ourselves and hope to see you next June a long weekend for our 4th Annual Simulated Field Shoot.

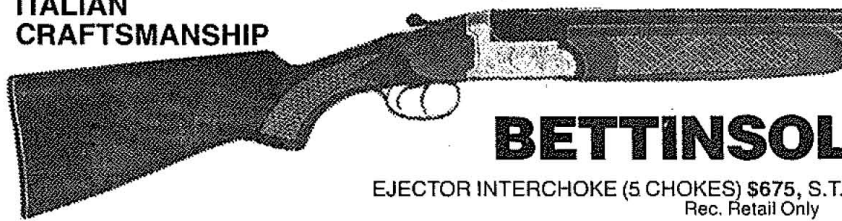


● Jack L. Barker (left) is congratulated by Club President Bruce Smith on his win in the Redbank Creek Championship.

With the cost of shooting still going through the roof, perhaps it is time that Clubs looked at reducing the number of targets in some events during a programme to lure uncertain shooters along for at least one event on a shooting day. Every person who comes through the door assits a Club to remain operational.

SAFETY SECTION

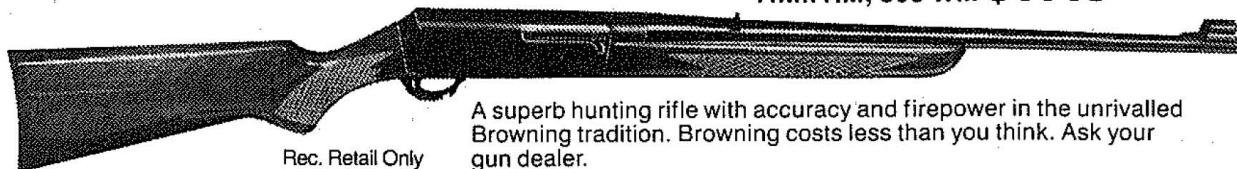
Noticed on the tracks; an experienced shooter, a notorious gun-closer and dry-firer anywhere when the fancy takes him, was berating a beginner for walking along to his layout with his gun closed. 'What are you doing that for? Don't you know how dangerous it is? Where did you learn that from?', and the quick as a flash reply, 'From you, over at the Clubhouse.' ... Exit one less-smart, but perhaps safer shooter.

Ever since the ruling came from the Referees' Association regarding loading shotgun shells only in accordance with manufacturers' specifications, I have been amazed at the number of supposedly intelligent shooters who persist in loading in excess of manufacturer's specifications. The fault seems to stem from shooter ignorance, coupled with complacency. Too many shooters using the fast-burning American powders, particularly Red Dot, 452 and 700X, reckon that it's safe enough to load a couple of grains over the recommended limit of these powders, rather than move up to a slower burning powder, such as Green Dot, 473 or 800X.

With shooters stoking 20 grains, and in one case, about 21 grains of Red Dot, would seem to make a nasty accident, if not a fatality, a 'dead set moral' to happen. The trouble
