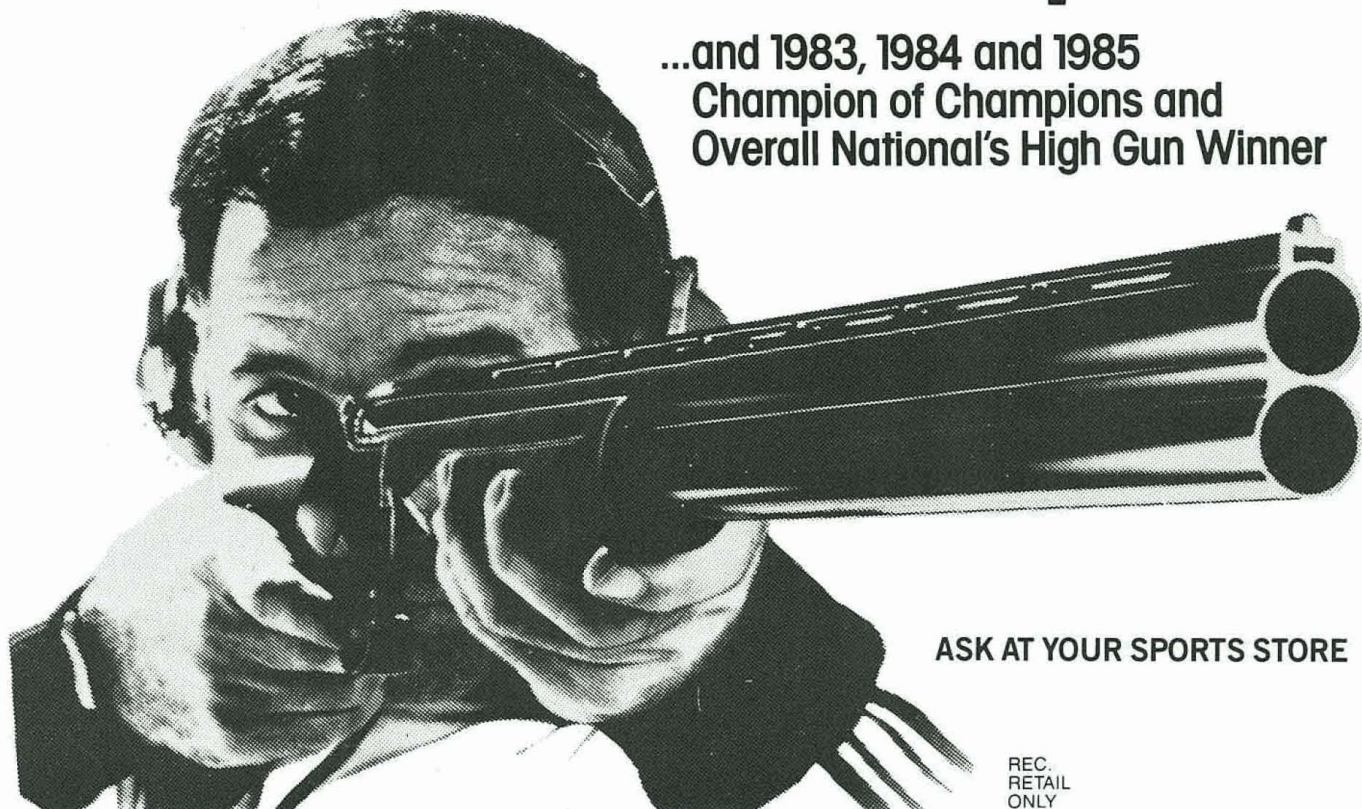

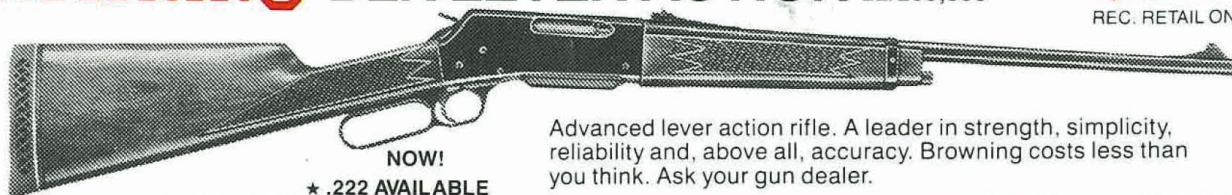

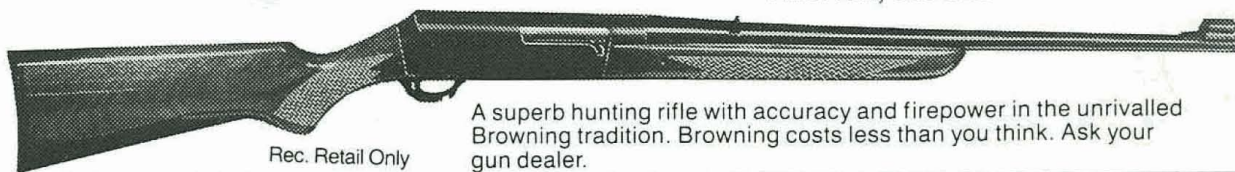

I would also like to draw your attention to the notices printed this month, firstly an early reminder of the Skeet Nationals in November with the full program to be published in next month's magazine then of course there are the I.S.U. and South Pacific Regional Championships being conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club in February, this competition will provide the team to represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games in July 1986 and the World Championships in Suhl, West Germany in September 1986.

The National I.S.U. Championships to be conducted in Brisbane in conjunction with the South Pacific Regional Championships will provide the Australian representatives for both the commonwealth games in Edinburgh, Scotland and the world championships to be held in Suhl, West Germany.

The following selection method has been decided upon:—
Commonwealth Games: Trap and Skeet — 1st & 2nd Past the Post. **World Championships:** Trap & Skeet — 1st, 2nd, 3rd Past the Post.

It is an honor to represent one's country in competition and the team places will be keenly contested.

Good luck and good shooting to all.

Last but not least in the announcement of the venue for the 1986 Trap Nationals Echuca Gun Club in Victoria will be the host Club and will be providing additional facilities that will allow for the installation of Eleven (11) traps.

Please check the notices and make sure that you diarise the dates.

1986 will also be the Association's 50th year and naturally we will be honoring the occasion. The official historian, George Biggs has been alerted, not that he was unaware of the occasion, and will be looking for pieces of history that you may have in your possession, old photos memorabilia or in fact anything that you have that relates to our past that could be included.

Please assist George if you can through the A.C.I.A. office. Any pieces of history or photos that you do forward will be returned if requested, as long as we are able to identify the forwarder.

In closing I refer you once again to the important notices that contain the dates of the next three National Shoots and look forward to as many competitors as possible at each and all of them.

REPORT OF AUSTRALIAN TRAP TEAM'S TRIP TO KIPPEN, SCOTLAND FOR THE VAN DIEMEN'S TROPHY MATCH & BRITISH OPEN EVENT JULY 19 & 20, 1985

After some doubts, because of the fire section strike at the Sydney Airport, the team left on time for the U.K. on July 10. The Team consisted of Doug Smith, "Pud" Burgess, Larry Dimasi, Bill Stevens, Arthur Turner and Tim Catling as Manager.

The flight to London was a good one and we arrived at 9.30am. English Summer time. After taking delivery of our mini-bus and finding our hotel, some of the team visited Windsor Castle, which was close by.

After an early night all were fit and ready to go and we headed for Nottingham to visit Peter Howsam, the maker of sidewinder traps. On arrival we found that Peter had set up a six man teams match for us against the local shooters, two of whom were in the English team for Kippen. We won the teams match quite easily and the sweep run with it was won by Doug Smith with 299/300, 2nd was Larry Dimasi 296, 3rd Bill Stevens 294 points.

Then it was off to Scotland for our practice days leading up to the Van Diemen's Trophy Match against England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. We found our Dan/Arms shot shells waiting for us and we are very grateful to Mr. Joe Chitpetta of Gamba Arms in Sydney for the sponsoring of the team with shells both in Australia for practice and in Scotland for practice and competition. We found them very fine shells indeed and ones we believe will be used by many in Australia in the future.

The team practised on each of the 4 days before the Teams match and unfortunately the weather was wet and windy so conditions were difficult. The targets in the U.K. are thrown a little flatter than in Australia and in Kippen the red coloured targets were at times a bit hard to see. However, all shot well in practice and the team was keen for Friday's teams match for the Van Diemen's Trophy shot over 100 Targets points scoring 2 & 3 as in Australia.

Australia started about midday after the team from Ireland. The weather was still wet and windy and the team got away to a poor start as the scores below show. It is one of those things that happens to teams some times and the team never recovered from the first round 350/375, although their scores improved in later rounds. It is frustrating that the next day in the British Open the team's score was the best by a big margin.

In the British Open on Saturday July 20 the wet weather continued and out of 340 odd entries only two scores of 299/300 were recorded. Keith Bond of England won the shoot off with a clear round of 75/75 points. Doug Smith, Arther Turner and Pud Burgess all received place money in "AA" grade and Doug Smith shot off against R. Fletton of England for runner up to the High Gun for the two days shooting; with Dick Fletton winning.

It is interesting to note, that while the U.K. shooters do not count targets killed, as we do in Australia, only two shooters shot 199/200 targets for the two days and one of them was our own Arther Turner.

We all attended the Presentation Dinner on the Friday night which was a grand affair with 390 guests, the like of which no Australian shooter has ever seen in our shooting world.

On Sunday the 21st we left Stirling very early to shoot again at Nottingham on our way back to London. The 100 Targets Points event was won by Bill Stevens with 293 points and Pud Burgess was second with 288.

Monday the 22nd saw the team go its separate ways and our minibus returned with the trip at an end.

We would like to thank all who helped us. In particular Joe Chitpetta of Gamba Arms for the Dan/Arm shells, and the A.C.T.A. members for their travel fund money, which make these trips possible and the Commonwealth Government for the grant towards this trip.

In conclusion I would like to say as the Team Manager that the team was a credit to Australia and themselves. There was never a cross word and I was and will always be very proud of them all. Although one or two were little ill with the "wog" they all put 100% effort into all they tried and the good humour and fun amongst them was wonderful to be part of.

We didn't win the Van Diemen's Trophy, but we did leave behind many friends and much goodwill in the U.K.

Well done Bill, Doug, Arthur, Pud and Larry.

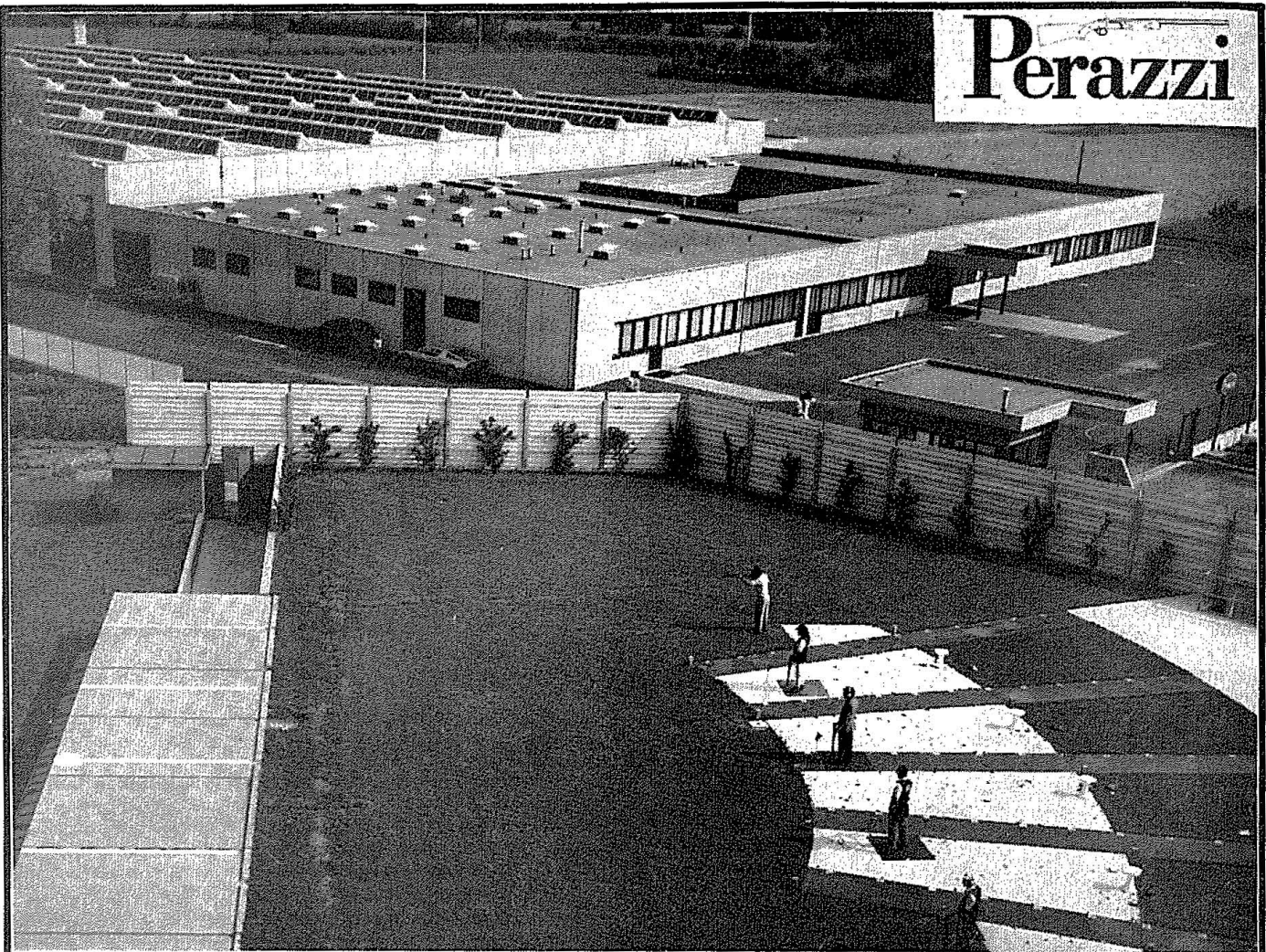

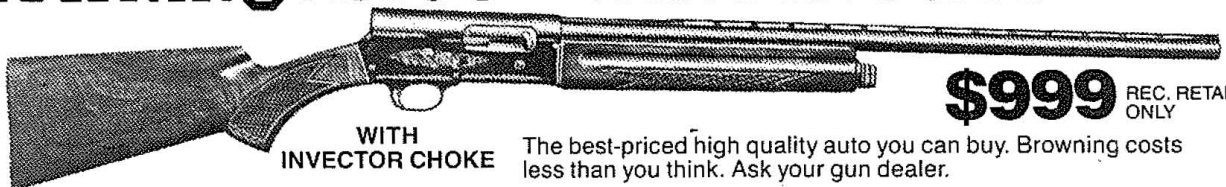

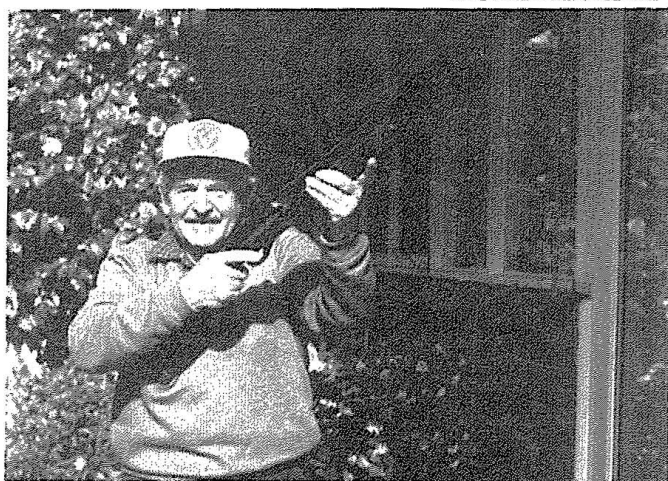

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS & PICTURES

THE WAY IT WAS

It was September 1947, the Australian Clay Trap Shooting Association announced that it was pleased to introduce to shooting sportsmen this, the first issue of "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting news". The publication is the Association's initial essay at providing a regular monthly news bulletin covering Clay Pigeon Shooting happenings throughout all States of the Commonwealth.

The Editor's page of this first issue goes on to say, and I quote, "the Management of the Association gave careful consideration to the idea before agreeing to launch out in an enterprise which will require the fullest support and co-operation of all to ensure its unqualified success from surroundings in all eastern States of the Commonwealth among representative shooting men the result was instantaneous approval." "Hence Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News" makes its bow as a production owned and sponsored entirely by your own Association for the interest of all connected with Clay Target Shooting and the sport in general.

Its contents will include Association open handicaps, personal paragraphs and information, Association directions, instructions and recommendations, letters of interest, suggestions, shoot reports and overseas items as they come to hand.

"Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News" will be issued to every affiliated club and registered shooter, as an additional Association service.

Its successful continuation will depend on the amount of advertising support given to it by clubs and trading houses. Advertising rates have been fixed at a rate well within the reach of clubs with the smallest of memberships.

The Association has not set out to provide a lavishly printed work for the simple reason that costs would be excessive — perhaps when more settled times arrive a several coloured production will be attempted. For the present a modest authentic news bulletin which will not involve huge expenditure has to suffice.

The Association hopes for full support from clubs and individual shooters. Co-operation between all sections of the Association is to be the watchword for success.

★ ★ ★

By 1948 the number of clubs in Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria was increasing. The introduction of Clay Pigeon Shooting news provided the opportunity for clubs and individual shooters to express their views and suggestions towards the development of our sport. Clubs were now able to report their shoot programs. One such report comes from one of Queensland's oldest clubs to the "news" dated January 1948 as follows Townsville Gun Club Newton Thomas, formerly of Barham (N.S.W.), later of Melbourne (VIC), and now residing at Home Hill (QLD) has blossomed into one of the top liners at Clay Targets in the far north.

Last month shooting in the Queensland mixed birds title at Townsville Gun Club Thomas tied with J.E. Melville (Townsville) and another Home Hill shooter in J. Smith. In the shoot off Thomas was a little steadier than his rivals and won with a score of 29/34 from Melville 27/34 and Smith 22/34. The latter (Smith) led right through to the last section of the event.

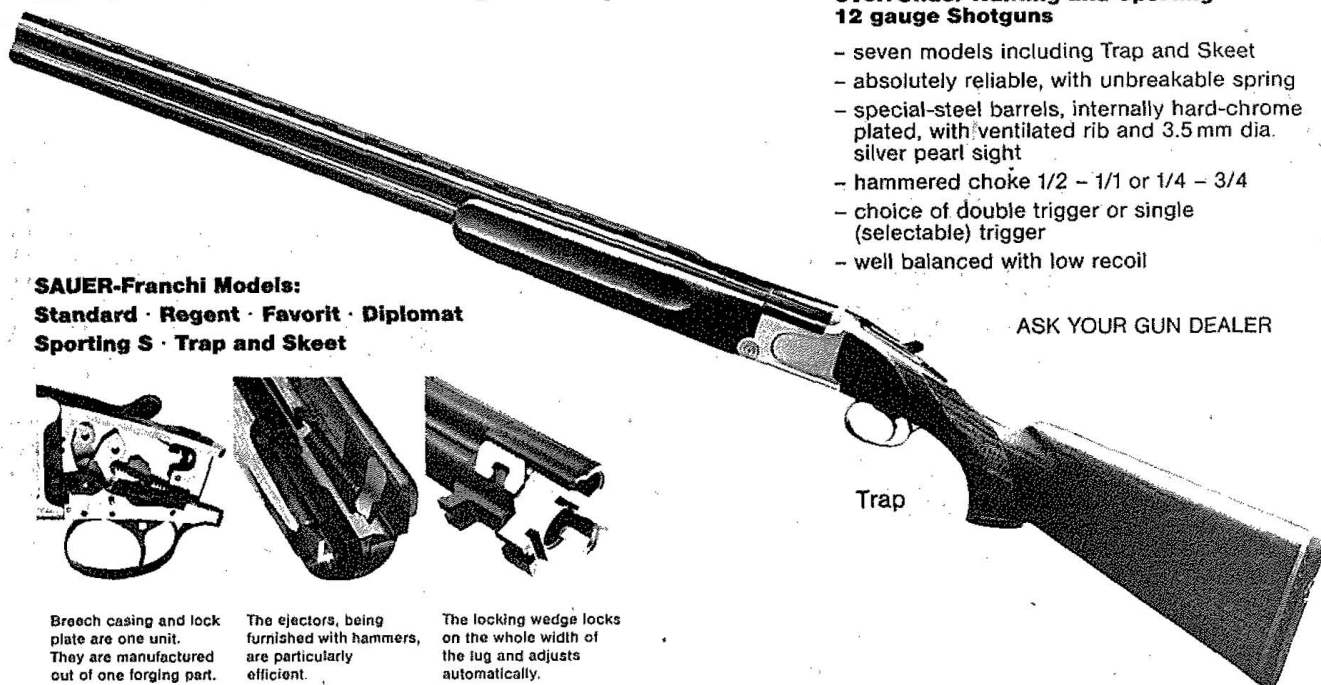

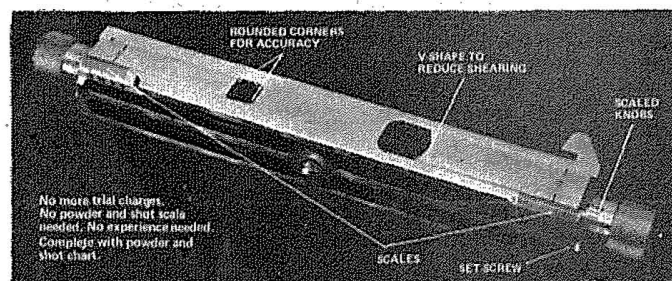

Townsville Gun Club was first formed in 1913. It is the oldest club in Queensland followed by St. George 1937, Cunnamulla 1938 and Roma 1948.

In the same January copy of "News" came the advice that the club had reopened with an all day shoot on the local shooting ground on Saturday November 8. The club's

pre-war Secretary, John Houston, has been reappointed. Hay Gun Club must surely be one of the oldest clubs in N.S.W. Its beginning goes back to the early days of live bird shooting competition. As was the case with most of our older clubs. Hay Gun Club was for quite a time one of the strongest and most popular in N.S.W.



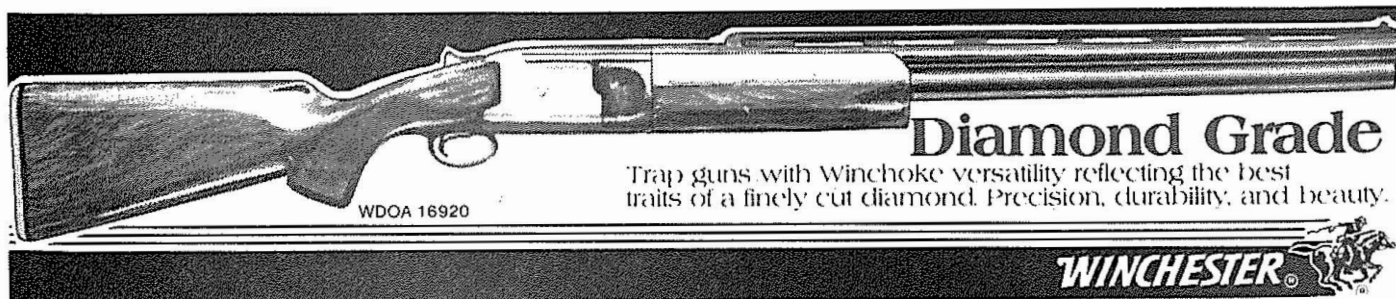

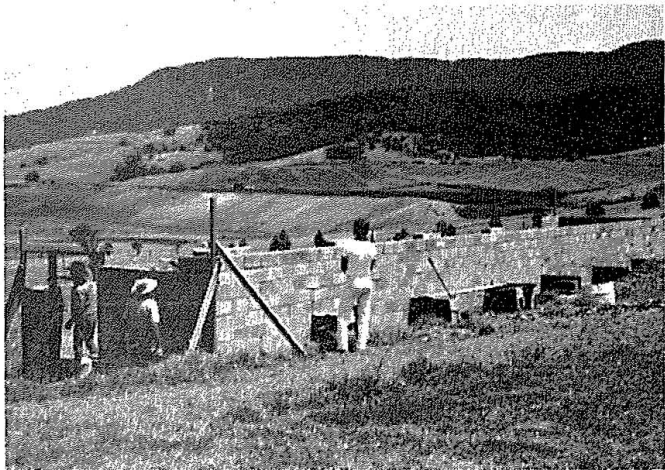


• The Illawarra Gun Club Clubhouse; a two-storey brick construction with an upstairs entertainment area for all the family to enjoy.

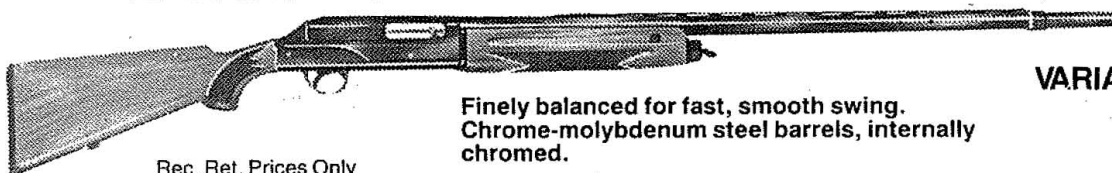

The South Australian State Association conducted their State Skeet Carnival at the S.A.G.C. over this weekend. To take advantage of the shooting facilities available at this club, the S.A. International Shooting Committee also organized a two day trench program for interested trench shooters over the same weekend. Both disciplines were well patronised with the Skeet titles receiving record entries, and running into failing light before being completed on the second day.

The trench titles consisted of 75 targets on the Saturday and 100 targets on Sunday. Sunday's events had to have the number of targets reduced because of the high entries. By doing this the organizers were able to complete the program before dark. It must have been gratifying to the State Association and shooters alike, to see so many competing in both disciplines.

Dower and Cousens both carded the possible 50/50 in the third event, the State Title. Adrian eventually came out the victor winning his first ever S.A. State Skeet title with 85/85.

Craig Bently captured the honours on the first day of the Olympic Discipline event with 73/75. Dino Oliviero shot 72/75 and won the honours on the second day and Greg Warden was overall High Gun on 142/150.

Many who attended the Trap Nationals series in the last few years will have observed some of our champion trap shooters wearing a jacket for the Macintosh Team photographs with their "Silver Australia" badges on display. These badges were originally donated by IMI (later Eley) and awarded to the overall winner of a National Championship and the Macintosh Team High Gun.

The late Newton Thomas commenced the practice of wearing these badges for the team photograph and, following his death, Warren Charlton, Pud Burgess and Doug Smith have agreed to wear their badges whenever they make the team. Between them these shooters have won thirty-six trap championship badges.

This photograph of Pud Burgess and Doug Smith, taken at the recent Trap Nationals Series at Perth, shows Pud with nine "Silver Australias" and Doug with fifteen. Immediately after this photograph the Macintosh Team event was shot and Doug won a sixteenth "Silver Australia" for the team high gun. A list of Doug's wins has appeared in the January 85 copy of C.T.S.N.

Pud Burgess has won nine "Silver Australias" and has been a member of the Macintosh team on twenty occasions (he has attended twenty five Nationals) which includes a run of thirteen years straight from 1965 to 1978. Here is a list of those wins:

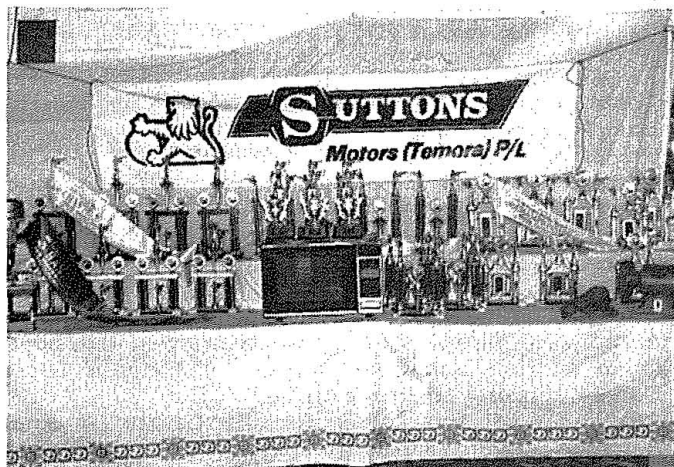

Despite the lack of support, the trophy lineup was good, referred to by many as the best ever seen at an I.S.U. shoot. All grade winners in all events were presented with good trophies and a specially struck "one off" championship badge.

Four events were conducted in each discipline, each over 50 targets. The standard was very good from the larger than normal field of I.S.U. Skeet shooters but something was obviously wrong down at the trench layout.

The field of over 40 'trenchies' failed to card a 25 between them for the entire weekend.

The first event in the trench, The Sub Championship, was won overall by Illawarra shooter John Maxwell on 46/50. Terry Rumbel and Cliff Bailey ended up tied for AA Grade after three extra rounds, John Fryer from Newcastle took out A grade while B grade went to local shooter Bill Farber and C grade to John McBride.

The Pacific Coast I.S.U. Skeet Championship once again proved National American Skeet Champion, Graham Guy, was seeing them well to take out overall with 73/75 from fellow Victorian Craig Meuleman who won AA Grade. A Grade once again went to Guy Bedington, B Grade to Barney Rooke and C Grade to Steve Subonj.

First event on Sunday, The Eastern States Trench Championship saw a good win to Cliff Bailey from AA winner Terry Rumbel and A Grade winner Robert Thompson. B Grade once again went to Col Barton and C Grade to John McBride. Cliff's score was a good 47/50.

The Eastern States I.S.U. Skeet Championship saw yet another good win to "Gerry Gee", with a 73/75, well clear of Len Norman who won AA. A Grade remained with Guy Bedington, Michael Banicek took out B Grade and Steve Subonj once again won C Grade.

The final event in the Trench went to Graham Bookallil with a fine 47/50, Cliff Bailey remained in good form to take AA Grade, Arthur Turner jnr won A Grade while Col Barton and John McBride continued to dominate B and C Grades respectively.

The Port Jackson I.S.U. Skeet Championship, the final event on the program, once again proved Graham Guy too strong for the field. Brian Thompson again took out AA Grade, local identity Christian Naudin won A Grade, B Grade went to Bob Kennett after a shoot off in the dark and Steve again won C Grade.
