

With replica trophies being supplied by the Hawkesbury Gun Club, competition will be keen for what undoubtedly will become a most coveted trophy at each annual Skeet National Championship.

Don't forget the Skeet Nationals. Details of which are available elsewhere in this edition.

It will be an opportunity for me to meet some of the people I have been corresponding and conversing with and I also hope to see and meet as many shooters as possible at the Melbourne Gun Club.

A.C.T.A. PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

Please be advised of the extension to the existing A.C.T.A. Policy.

IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT THAT YOUR CLUB ABIDES BY THE POLICY CONDITIONS.

I. School Children

Competing on registered A.C.T.A. Club grounds under the supervision of registered A.C.T.A. Shooter.

Protection applies so long as they (school children) are registered as Club Visitors on the club visitors register and are applying to A.C.T.A. rules and by-laws.

II. National-State-Club competitions

Protection applies so long as the event(s) held is officially ratified and minuted by the affiliated club applying strictly to A.C.T.A. Rules and by-laws.

III. Club Visitors (School Children and Adults)

Must be registered as Club Visitors on the Club Visitors register.

YOUR CLUB RESPONSIBILITY THEREFORE IS:-

- 1. To provide a visitors register which must be signed by all persons described in I. School children, II. Club Visitors
- 2. Ensure that no person engages in shooting of any kind other than they being under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. Shooters.
- 3. To ensure that any event organised by either I. The National Body, II. The State Body, III. Your Club.

Which is conducted at your club, has been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly.

NOTE: FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE REGULATIONS MAY CAUSE EXTREME DIFFICULTY SHOULD A CLAIM ARISE.

WALTZING MATILDA THE LIKELY HIT

PESTA SUKAN GAMES, SINGAPORE

... these were the headlines in the Singapore Newspaper, The Straits Times, on Saturday 3rd August, the first day of the 1985 Pesta Sukan Shooting

Eighteen Australian shooters from New South Wales and Victoria were entered to compete in what was sure to be some of the best competition yet encountered by most, on what is classed as one of the most difficult shooting ranges to be found anywhere.

In all over eighty competitors from nine nations participated in the ten day long annual competition, which was once again so efficiently hosted by the committee of the Singapore Gun Club.

Thanks from all competitors and supporters, both Australian and otherwise, must go to Singapore Gun Club President Milton Tan and 'ever efficient' Secretary Stephen Yap and their committee, for their hospitality and for what once again proved to be a most enjoyable and

closely contested competition.

The majority of Australian competitors, many accompanied by their wives, arrived at Singapore's Changi Airport rather late on Wednesday night 31st July to be met at the luggage collection point by Gun Club members Lai See Pan and Lai Sze Woo who checkd all the firearms, had them cleared through customs and took them off to the safety of the gun club armoury.

Laws regarding firearms in Singapore are extremely strict, and even the locals are not permitted to take their guns home with them. Along with all other firearms, those brought by the Australian competitors were locked away and could only be used on the range during practice and competition.

All the Aussies who arrived early had a few days to acclimatize, do some shopping and get in a bit of practice before the competition commenced. Singapore's shops and plazas are a real eye opener for those who haven't

experienced them before and there would be no doubt that every member of the Australian contingent took advantage of the unbelievable range of well priced watches, electrical equipment, photographic apparatus, clothing or almost anything else one could possibly imagine.

Weather conditions for the competition were just as expected - hot, humid and likely to pour down rain at any moment without a lot of warning. Such conditions certainly made it uncomfortable for the Australian shooters who spent most of their time between shots wiping their shooting glasses, guns and brows.

Having arrived in Singapore from the middle of Australia's winter most of the contingent found the conditions a little bit different to say the very least.

The competitors from the eight other nations, Singapore, Indonesia, Malaysia, Japan, Hong Kong, Belgium, France and Papua New Guinea all appeared less perturbed about the weather conditions having mostly come to Singapore from the Northern Hemisphere summer. The exceptions, of course, were the Indonesians and the Papua New Guineans who are used to similar conditions throughout the year.

Prior to the commencement of the competition officials appointed referees and an international jury was also selected. Australia was represented on the jury by David Menck and Brian Bond. Ex-pat Australian Graham Norris from Port Moresby, (President of the South Pacific Shooting Confederation) represented PNG. Stephen Yap officiated for Singapore whilst the other participating nations were also represented.

Into the competition and after two days of practice the first event got under way at 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 3rd August, following an official opening ceremony at which all competitors were presented to Mr S.S. Dhillon, Secretary-General of The Singapore National Olympic Committee. A cup of tea, a few sandwiches and some local cuisine were then offered to get the competitors in the right frame of mind.

Forty-three shooters from seven nations lined up for the I.S.U. Skeet on a skeet field that often comes as something of a shock to competitors seeing it for the first time. The range is located in a narrow valley with a steep grassy hill directly behind the low house and thick jungle type conditions growing right to the boundary behind the high house. This together with trees outlines on the skyline further up the valley make for a most difficult background.

Rapid changes in light conditions also occur frequently to further aggravate the problem, especially during the first few squads early in the morning.

Round one completed and nineteen year old Victorian Craig Meuleman showed that he was going to be the one to beat. Craig's first round was a perfect 25, the only one of the first round.

Lo Vun Vui and Vincent Teo of Malaysia, Christian Binet of Belgium and Chen So Yim also of Malaysia carded 24s all to be one off the pace.

Two more clean rounds of 25 by Meuleman saw him well out in front at the end of day one.



Day two of the Skeet and Meuleman continued on his merry way. Another clean round and the first ever 100 straight shot at Singapore Gun Club.

Four targets later Craig proved he was in fact human and missed high two single then one more during the round to finish with a good 23. Another 23 in his sixth round saw Meuleman finish day two four targets down on 146/150

Back with the rest of the field Vincent Teo of Malaysia moved into second place at the end of day two on 142/150. Binet and Lo Vun Vui dropped back to equal third with 141/150, Tony Cheun of Hong Kong and Gilbert Sumendan of Indonesia on 139/150 while Ian Hale was still not puting it together and was back on 138/150 with Singaporian all rounder Lee Kum Cheok.

Len Norman from Syndey celebrated his birthday to shoot his only clean 25 of the competition to be on 136/150.

The end of day two also saw the competition of the teams event. A great deal of importance is placed on the outcome of the teams competition and it was not until the final round of the day that the Malaysian 'A' team could show their jubilation. Brian Bond had the pressure right on him and needed a 24 in his sixth round to secure the team gold for Australia. Brian could only manage a 21 (his worst round of the competition), but it was not this round that won Malaysia the Gold. It was the Malaysians' depth and consistency, after 150 targets their team were placed 2nd, 3rd, 10th and 11th overall. Not bad in a field of 43.

50 targets to go in the Skeet and it appeared the Straits Times would be right, Waltzing Matilda would be the likely hit. Meuleman shot another brilliant 25 and finished in his last round with a 24.

A personal best of 195/200 to break the range record by three targets and also record the best ever score shot in

A magnificient effort by the young Australian.

Malaysians Lo and Teo finished with 48 and 46 respectively to come in second and third. Unfortunately Teo finished out of the money as local rules allow for only one individual or team medal per nation.

Browning representative Binet carded the fourth top score, a 186/200, to take the bronze medal.

Canberra's Brian Prosser and Ong of Malaysia both finished well to record the only 25s of the last round but both had left their run too late.

Another two days of shopping and/or practice and it was into the Olympic Trap event. The trench layout in Singapore has been relocated during the past few years and now faces across and down the range instead of down the range as it did previously. Left hand targets still head towards a grassed hill which shows plenty of evidence as to where the shot lands, quite often behind the target. Straight away targets and right hand swingers head towards a major construction, part of the huge shooting facility development being constructed by the Ministry of Defence at a cost of many millions of dollars.

Many new faces appeared at trench practice including the second group of Australians to arrive. The Japanese team also turned up in force as did a fresh team of Malaysians and Singaporians while Merv Whitelaw, Tom Lucas and Graham Thomas were all fresh from their shopping trips.

Four times World Champion Michel Carrega from France, the defending Champion was in attendance as part of the Browning Team. Browning were sponsors of the entire competition.

Browning was also represented by one of their leading gunsmiths, who, despite the language problem (he didn't speak a word of English), was kept very busy giving the large quantity of Browning guns 'a birthday'. All free of charge. It was interesting watching some of the faces when shooters were given their gun back, wondering if they were in fact getting the same old one back.

Round one of the Olympic Trap event completed and the lead was shared by Carrega, Russell Mark and Kwa Eng Cheong of Singapore, all on 24. John Maxwell of Illawarra and Victorian Domingo Diaz both had 23s on the board with a few others including out of luck' 'skeetie' Ian Hale making a name for himself on 22.

The second round saw the lead change with Maxwell taking over the lead on 47/50. Carrega and Mark were joined by a host of others on 45, two off the pace.

Greg Oehm from Moree, a reasonbly newcomer to Olympic discipline shooting, made his presence noticed by recording the first 25 of the competition during his third round.

End of the first day and Maxwell was well out in front on 71/75, K.K. Tang on 69 and 68 for both Carrega and Mark. The rest of the field, numbering 52 in all, were well spread out, Gilbert Sumendap from Indonesia was on 67/75, Diaz on 65 and Greg Oehm on 64.

Three more rounds on the second day and Carrega's 74/75 for the day had him in the lead by one target from John Maxwell on 141/150 and one more back to Russell Mark on 140/150.

150 targets finished and so was the team event. Australian 'A' team had beaten the Singapore 'A' team by a massive 20 targets. The first time in five years the Singaporians had not taken the gold.

Final day of the competition and another 8.00 a.m. start in hot humid conditions saw both Maxwell and Mark fall further behind Michel Carrega after the first round. Carrega posted two 23s for the day to finish with a handy score of 188/200, well below his range record of 197/200 shot in this competition in 1983, but good enough to take the gold for 1985.

Russell Mark finished strongly but too late to catch the Frenchman. Russell's 25 in his last round saw him finish on 187, one behind Carrega with the silver medal. John Maxwell also finished well with a 24 to record a total of 185/200, but unfortunately ineligible to take the third place medal because he was of the same country as another placegetter. Gilbert Sumendap, the consistent Indonesian, finished well on 180/200 to take out the bronze medal from Greg Oehm who shot another clean round of 25 in his last round to come in 5th.

IN THE INTERESTS OF SAFETY

Ross Williams

ON JULY 26, some 373 secondary school students took part in the Seventh Victorian Schoolboy/Schoolgirl Clay Target Championships at the Melbourne Gun Club.

The entrants, from 60 schools, came from widely separated parts of the state. As in 1982/3, the cost of travelling meant that youngsters from distant drought-affected areas were unable to make the trip, and 19 of the schools which had previously participated did not send students. Even so, 24 new schools were represented.

Such events have a long history. Regional championships go back a quarter of a century to a match between Mansfield High School and Wangaratta Technical School. The first state shoot took place in 1979, when 170 entrants met at Jeparit.

In the following year, 223 went to Geelong. Melbourne Gun Club played host to 305 youngsters from 53 schools in 1981, and has continued in that role ever since.

The effects of the drought were not immediately apparent in 1982, as 357 kids nominated from 53 schools. (Unfortunately I do not have the actual attendance figures, but memory says the real figure was closer to 300 than 360). In the next year, however, the state of rural finances was clearly reflected in a lower attendance of 296, again from 53 schools.

The pattern of growth was restored in 1984 — 391 youngsters representing 57 schools fronted up to the traps. And although the number of heads was down a bit this year, the number of schools was up.

Attending these functions is quite an experience. The conduct of the kids is beyond reproach and contrasts strongly with the behaviour of participants and spectators in certain other sports. Politicians and senior police officers have attended, and have been suitably impressed. For myself, I always go home feeling intensely proud of the young Australians I have seen that day.

Why have 'em?

Like the regional championships, the annual state championships are woven into the firearms safety training which now forms part of the curriculum of approximately 150 Victorian post-primary schools. Neither the in-school programs nor the championships are intended to be recruiting vehicles for the clay target movement.


Sure, shotguns predominate in the school programs.

But this is chiefly because the shotgun happens to be a very convenient means to an end. It should not be forgotten that some schools employ fullbore, smallbore and sporting rifles, and air rifles too. Student championships have been conducted in fullbore.

The underlying rationale for such events is as follows: Firstly, the regional and state shoots help to motivate

and eventually to reward the kids who are taking part in school-based firearms safety training. Although everyone knows that only a handful can win prizes, everyone also knows that such occasions are thoroughly good fun. Participation is the thing that provides both the motivation and the reward. Certainly that's how the kids see it, otherwise they wouldn't leave their home town at three in the morning, as some of them do.

Secondly, the championships provide a goal — to be judged trustworthy enough to shoot under the school's name.

Finally, they bring youngsters together in a climate which demonstrates quite forcefully that safety is more than a local concern.

Goal-setting, motivation, provision of rewards and other forms of reinforcement . . . these are integral parts of the educational process. The real role of regional and state championships for school students cannot be grasped unless the underlying rationale is understood first.

THREATS

Unfortunately there are two threats to the future of school-based firearms safety training.

One concerns insurance cover for students who are in attendance at shooting sessions. There are big problems here. But because the situation is in a state of flux, and I'm not up with the latest, I will say no more at this juncture.

And the other? The strength of the school championships has led some elements within clay target ranks to suggest that they should be running such events. At least one shoot has been conducted on this basis. In my opinion, such thinking is extremely narrow and short-sighted, and the long-term effect of an "opposition" series of events can only be destructive.

The championships must continue to be organised from within the education system. They must remain independent of sectional interests. Shooting organisations can (and should) assist in the work, but they must not try to take it over.

Credit where credit's due

For the past seven years, a team of volunteers from the Jeparit Gun Club has ensured the smooth conduct of the shoot by running the office. Coming to the Melbourne Gun Club means two days, a round trip of 800 km and considerable personal expense, and these people deserve thanks and congratulations for a job well done.

Organiser Lyn Barr, Principal of Wangaratta High School, pays tribute to the Jeparit volunteers, and to the sponors, Winchester, without whose backing the State



championships simply could not exist in their present form. Similarly, he thanks members of the Melbourne Gun Club and its president, Bob Buchan, for the provision of their top-class facilities and practical assistance. However, it should not be forgotten that Mr Barr's vision, drive and dedication and the support of his wife have played a key role over the years.

And so to the results:

Girls' Champion was Christine Flavel of Rainbow High School, with a score of 16/20. She was followed by Keiva Lowry of Westbourne School on 15/20. Christine has an enviable record in these state championships. She placed third in 1982, was runner-up in 1983 and won the 1984 event. I believe she is the first girl to take the honors twice.

In an impressive display, Rohan King of Rochester High School sealed the Junior Boys' Championship with 19/20. Second place went to Reece Atherton of Wonthaggi Technical School, who scored 23/25 in a shoot-off.

The Senior Boys' Championship fell to Rohan Penn of Echuca Technical School. His score of 20/20 also earned him the High Gun sash. The runner-up, Anthony Smith of Horsham Technical School, scored 28/30 after a strongly contested shoot-off.

Rohan's victory in the senior event was not unexpected as he is the National Double Rise Champion. He has the style and apparently the temperament to take him right to the top.

Echuca Technical School won the Teams' Championship with 67/80. The team comprised Rohan Penn, Simon Keece, Gary Newton and Bryan Watson. Jamie McIntyre, Michael Nagorka, Geoff Flack and Jason Ross totalled 62/80 to earn second place for Hamilton Technical School.

EDITORS NOTE:

Reference to the Insurance Cover for students being a problem has been solved. Clubs have been advised of the necessary procedure and providing that attention is always paid to the policy conditions there should not be any problem.

Max was a member of the Club when it was situated on the Maude Road, Hay and when Live Birds were shot. He was one of the foundation members of the Club when it shifted to its present site at the Showgrounds in the late 1940's.

N.S.W.C.T.A. — EXPLANATION OF LIABILITY

ALL SHOOTERS & CLUB EXECUTIVES — PLEASE READ THIS!

For some time the State Executive have been perturbed by the fact that some clubs are allowing unregistered shooters to compete. I know that many clubs and members do not realize that, in the event of an accident, court action could be taken and any member could be held liable ie: he could have to sell his own home or any other asset to meet the court order.

A simple way to protect your club and your members is to ensure that:

(a) YOUR CLUB IS AFFILIATED

(b) ALL MEMBERS ARE REGISTERED WITH THE A.C.T.A.

You will then have full insurance protection.

In an effort to clarify the position and warn those persons concerned our Legal Monitor, Mr Robert Parker has prepared the following information.

Within the sport of clay target shooting in N.S.W. it would seem that there are two aspects requiring closer scrutiny.

One: Shooters not registered with the A.C.T.A. joining registered clubs and subsequently taking part in registered competition.

Two: A.C.T.A. registered shooters competing on privately owned grounds not registered with the A.C.T.A. and in some cases not licensed by the N.S.W. Police as a shooting range as required by the firearms and dangerous weapons act.

During analysis of these developments within our sport, one cannot but feel that the proposed N.S.W. firearm legislation is perhaps, the single most important contributing factor.

This is to say, because one of the proposed criteria by the N.S.W. Government for a citizen to obtain a shooters licence is to be, mandatory membership of a gun club. Clay target clubs are experiencing an increase in membership for licencing purposes only.

One cannot incriminate a club committee for accepting members in this way, after all, committees are elected by members to operate their club and part of that operation is to raise revenue. Nor can one blame people for attempting to join our clubs in response to proposed restrictive firearm legislation. However, let us look at some of the

Firstly we are confronted with Shooter A. Shooter A. joins an A.C.T.A. registered club to comply with the proposed licencing law but does not register as a shooter with the A.C.T.A. Shooter A, does not subsequently take part in competition.

Secondly we have Shooter B. Shooter B. goes through the same procedures as A, but does compete in A.C.T.A. sanctioned competition.

For the sake of argument, shooter A. comes onto a club ground and signs a visitors book. In the case of an accident, this shooter may be covered by insurance and even be lucky enough to receive full compensation. Then again we all know how fickle insurance companies can be at times.

Just how much insurance cover and of what description does the club have? Are you as a member of that club exempt from liability? In the situation where a club is unincorporated, and an accident occurs with resultant litigation, club members could find that they are personally liable.

In the case of Shooter B., the considerations of shooter A. are still applicable with a few additional problems.

 What of the moral considerations of Shooter B. experiencing the competitive privileges of an A.C.T.A.

- registered shooter without having to pay the prescribed fee
- (ii) What control can there be over the grading and handicapping of this shooter when, there is no proof of registration by way of a registered handicap card?
- (iii) This type of activity does exist and it is contrary to our A.C.T.A. rules. In fact, some unregistered shooters have been known to participate in A.C.T.A. competition, win the event, be duly awarded and accept the relevant trophy.

Where is our sense of fair play? That which Australians are said to be famous for.

When a situation arises for the A.C.T.A. or N.S.W.C.T.A. to deal with governments, for grants or legislative matters etc., the association representatives concerned are always questioned on how many people they represent A.C.T.A. registration lists are the only figures available to our emissaries, therefore, registered members are more vital to our credibility in the long term than unregistered club participants.

Perhaps a way for clubs to maintain this new influx of members and to avoid any unpleasantness, would be to encourage short trial periods of membership without registration during which shooters could go through the learning process and determine whether or not they wish to continue with the sport. During the trial period, no A.C.T.A. competition could be entered into and after the period registration should become mandatory. Perhaps one should be too presumptuous to suggest a lay-by system of registration fees during a new member's trial period of say, three months.

Maybe present registered A.C.T.A. members should be doing more to encourage non-registered members to "do the right thing." After all, once registered, shooters are not restricted to participating at their home club only and as you know this opens up endless social avenues for enjoyment within our sport.

Now to look at the second aspect of concern, that of registered shooters competing on unregistered grounds.

One would like to believe that before entering in to this activity a shooter would ask him/herself some relevant questions.

- (a) Is my shooter to shooter insurance valid in this circumstance? Hardly.
- (b) Who is liable if I'm involved in an accident and fault is proved to be mine? Without insurance, this could be my ruination
- (c) Does the owner of this property have a public risk insurance policy? If he does not and there is an accident it could be the ruination of him. Is that what I want?
- (d) Is this property registered in accordance with the relevant section of the firearms and dangerous weapons act? If not, where do I stand if complaint is made and legal action results?
- (e) If anything unforseen happens, just what would be the far reaching consequences to me and my sport generally? Remember, shooters are not the most popular section of our community.
- (f) I signed a paper absolving the property owner of all responsibility in the case of an accident. Just how legal and binding is this document? Does it work both ways?
- (g) If something goes amiss here could the A.C.T.A. members throughout the country suffer because of my action of coming to and competing on an unregistered ground?

All these questions and probably more could have answers contrary to those which you would expect or would like. Perhaps before entering on such a venture we should give some time for the head to rule rather than the heart?

As firearms legislation becomes more restrictive in all its forms, e.g.; weapons licencing, shooter licencing,



RECORD ATTENDANCE AT NATIONALS

By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian



Notes, from the Editor's notebook A.C.P.T.S.A. News April 1950 — records went by the board at the Association's big weekend of shooting over March 11 and 13 last.

In 1949, when 153 shooters faced the traps for the Champion of Champions cup tournament, it was considered by many that the limit, or at least the very near limit, had been reached in attendance figures from the competitive angle. However, this total was shattered in no small way when 214 paid up for the privilege of entering in the big 60 bird event on March 11 — 61 in excess of the previous record high of last year. The fact that such a huge

THE VERY FIRST THOUGHTS OF STATE ASSOCIATIONS

The formation of the State Associations of the A.C.P.T.S.A. began to take shape by mid 1950, by taking this step the Executive Committee is hoping that this new form of clay target shooting administration will become an established fact within the very near future. It is reported that New South Wales council has already been formed, as well as Tasmanian and Victorian groups. The Queensland council will hold its preliminary formation meeting during the course of the big shoot at Roma about the middle of this month.

In view of the rapid development of the sport which has so long been administered from the headquarters in Melbourne, it was felt by A.C.P.T.S.A. officials and many leading shooters in all States, that councils would need to be developed in each State in order to handle the rising amount of local matter requiring attention. The A.C.P.T.A. is heartily in accord with the procedure. It is intended that the A.C.P.T.S.A. should retain its present entity, having the State councils as administering branches. The A.C.P.T.A. will become a form of National council and comprise two or possibly three delegates from each of the State bodies. By this means the viewpoint of every State will be equally represented on the governing body.



EDITORS' MAILBOX

Dear Sir.

The members of the Griffith Clay Target Club wish to register a strong protest against the acceptance of target rule. We feel this rule is a major reason for the disenchantment obvious amongst shooters and is a very real factor in the fall-off of shooter registrations.

Our objections are as follows:

- 1) We do not believe the average shooter has enough time to compute the flight of the target in the split second before firing. Shotgun shooting is reflex shooting and there are very few shooters capable of making a correct decision in time.
- 2) As club referees we do not agree that the shooter should be penalized for any error on our part, particularly as we are not registered referees but shooters doing our best to keep our sport going.
- 3) This rule flies in the face of fundamental sportsmanship in that the competitor is not given the benefit of the doubt when a referee or trapper accidently causes the conditions of competition to change adversely for that competitor.
- 4) When refereeing we believe that we should be allowed the right to give a judgement on how well we have delivered the target to the shooter; if we believe it to be a fast or slow pull we should be allowed to say so; if we feel our action was a contributing factor to the shooter missing that target he should be given another.
- 5) The referee is in a better position than the shooter to judge whether or not a target has left the trap correctly and is on the proper flight path as indicated in the rules governing the correct setting of the traps for the competition. A shooter pays good money to compete and is entitled to expect good, legal targets for his money.

This new rule does not stamp out possible collusion between referee and shooter any more than the old rule did and because it is obvious that the new rule has more disadvantages than advantages, we advocate an immediate return to the old rule where the referee was just that — a referee — not a glorified button pusher.

THE LUIGI FRANCHI STORY

OVER 120 YEARS OF HISTORY, TECHNOLOGY AND TRADITION

The first Franchi came from Como across the river Adda at the time when Brescia belonged to the powerful Venetian Republic La Serenissima.

He left behind a difficult situation: the Duchy of Milan had passed from Spanish to Austrian rule, giving a hard time to anyone longing for freedom. He settled in Brescia, married and started the dynasty that has reached the present days. Originally a silk worker, amidst the Brescians he quickly learned the secrets of iron forging and became one of the masters, keeping up this tradition from father to son.

After Napoleon's time and a return of the Austrian domination, the Franchi family took part in the Italian war of independence 'the Risorgimento' fighting alongside Garibaldi; Martino Franchi died for him at the Mentana battle.

By 1968 the dynasty was already well introduced in the Brescia firearms industry.

The genealogical tree branches out more and more and the Franchi take interest in several fields. During the 1st World War they associated with the Gregorini of Lovere (which becomes Franchi-Gregorini) at present Innocenti-Sant'Eustachio the Dalmine and Metallurgical Tempini. They own mines in the valleys of Val Camonica, Val di Scalve and Val Seriana, as well as special cast iron blast furnaces and hydroelectric plants.

After the war and the inevitable jolts of reconversion of the industries completely devoted to war production it is Luigi Franchi that succeeds in distinguishing himself. With a partner he takes over the Angelo Duina Company which becomes Colturi & Franchi, then Lorenzotti and Franchi and finally Luigi Franchi s.p.a.

The concern continues to expand and to penetrate new markets, thanks to the Franchi loving care and skilful management.

It passes without any damage through the ruins of the 2nd World War and in the post-war period starts again with dignity and intelligence, foreseeing new market chances by the steady increase of its production range.

Alongside the outstanding side-by-sides, the range is extended from sporting over-and-under shotguns to the conception and development of a lightweight automatic shotgun when production a few years ago reached the unexpected goal of over 1 million units.

Presently, times have evolved and Luigi Franchi has become part of a world famous group which has based its success on the most advanced technologies.

A capable staff of executives has been added to the management of the firm, professional experts in the field of firearms production, which have devoted to Franchi decades of tireless efforts.

Today more than ever a firearm with the Franchi name entitles the owner to that glow of extra pride.

The first shotgun of remarkable renown produced by Franchi was the Aquila side-by-side. External hammers, lavishly engraved and marked with the inscription Luigi Franchi, Brescia on the left hammer pin, it featured a triple lock, Greener system.

A beautiful shotgun, whose only flaw was to be perhaps a bit expensive. This was happening in 1916.

The economic version of the Aquila was the Nibbio, followed two years later by the Diana model, last shotgun with external hammers to be produced by the firm.

A shotgun destined to become legendary was produced in 1930: the Imperiale model, followed in 1935 by the Littorio. Both models had a common specification: Holland and Holland type side locks. Franchi adopted this very costly solution and facts proved it was the right one.

In fact this increased the strength of the shotguns, improving also the line and elegance. The Imperiale and the Littorio were used for competition shooting and from them originated the Imperiale Montecarlo Extra series, still produced at present and standing at the world's highest quality level. There is no need to point out all the inestimable qualities of this shotgun. The names of famous owners and countless victories at World Championships speak for them.

Besides these famous firearms, in the years between the two wars Franchi also produced an over-and-under, a magnificent shotgun to meet new market demands, based on the Boss system, featuring a monobloc with lateral locking lugs and H&H type side locks.

In 1945 the factory had to face the problem of reconversion from war to civilian products. The shotgun that allowed it to employ with great profit the highly skilled workers was the automatic.

It was inexpensive, universal and, in some cases, irreplaceable.

The first one came out in 1946 but a real rise in quality was obtained in 1948 thanks to Mario Franchi. For a long time Franchi had been interested in light metal alloys, and Mario Franchi had the courage to use one of them for the realization of the automatic, thus producing the 48/AL, the lightest shotgun in the world (2.800 kg = 6 lbs. 3 oz.). Well over one million units have been produced to date with lasting success.

1946 also saw the birth of the Airone, the first post-war side-by-side, which became the Astore 1947, with hammerless Anson & Deeley type box locks. It was a very strong, elegant and well balanced shotgun, already showing what was going to be Franchi's strongest attribute: quality workmanship and perfection.

Right after Franchi presented the market with an overand-under which was bound to become famous: the Alcione. Notwithstanding the higher production costs involved in the production of these firearms, Franchi had already reached such a stage of industrial development as to be able to offer this over-and-under at a competitive price.

The shotgun became a great and lasting success.

Franchi superior technology in the employment of light metal alloys led to the realization of another series of very successful firearms: the Falconet over-and-unders, chosen by field and mountain shooters who prefer to carry a lighter shotgun (less than 3 kg = 6.5 lbs.).

At present the Franchi production range includes the following firearms: Highly prestigious side-by-sides and over-and-unders of the Montecarlo Extra series, completely hand made to individual specifications.

Anson & Deeley type box lock side-by-sides of very accurate workmanship such as the Astore 1 Super de Luxe, Astore 2 etc.

Franchi over-and-unders of the Alcione series, renewed in line, engraving, mechanism, to perpetuate a name which is famous in the gunmaking art.

Extra light over-and-unders of the Falconet series, also redesigned to offer the shooter the most modern shotgun on the market.

Competition shotguns for Trap, Skeet and Sporting disciplines which have given the possibility to thousands of shooters to improve their performance. Moreover Franchi produce commercially a wide range of revolvers, .22 rifles, air rifles, recoil pads and special gun oils.

Today as ever the Franchi name stands for quality the world over.


I.S.U. SKEET SEES THE LIGHT: AUSSIE JUNIORS EXCEL IN SINGAPORE:


These young people are enthusiastic and are enjoying a healthy growth rate in the sport.

"INCORPORATED COMPANY" or "PUBLIC RISK INSURANCE"

Recently — we have been advised to consider forming each individual Club into an Incorporated Company. I believe each Club Executive should investigate this very thoroughly before proceeding.

There are advantages and disadvantages to each avenue and all Clubs must make their own decision to suit their

own particular requirements.

The principal reason for consideration of a Company structure is to limit the liability of club members in the event of an accident where negligence is proven. Should this matter be taken to court, an award could be given against the Club or one, or all of its members — joint and severally. To clarify this — each member could be held liable to contribute monies from their own pockets to meet the court award.

There are two avenues available:

- 1. Formation of an Incorporated Company
- 2. Public Risk Insurance
- 3. Formation of a Company:

This avenue will cost the Club in excess of \$600 and will render the Club liable to pay Income Tax on all interest on investment income and some other forms of income as follows:

Under \$416 — No Tax

\$416 to \$2250 — at 55° in the dollar allowing for the \$416 concession.

Over \$2250 — Taxed at 46¢ in the dollar.

Also, the Club will be required to effect a Public Liability policy to a value of \$2,000,000.

Each year certain returns have to be rendered, including your Company Income Tax Return which will involve the Club in expensive accountancy fees.

The advantage is that it will limit the liability of each member as the Company is separate body and may be sued or may sue as the case may be.

PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

This is relatively inexpensive and, if obtained to cover person to person and Club, could prove to offer the same full protection as the Company. I referred a copy of our Association Public Risk Insurance Policy to a Solicitor and he states "In his opinion the insurance cover our Association holds at present gives each person full protection."

The above information is given after consultation with the Corporate Affairs Commission — Australian Taxation Office and a Legal Firm. I do not accept any responsibility for the above and I stress that it is a brief summary of the position. The Executive of each Club should discuss the matter with their local solicitor and then ask their Commitee to act in the best interests of their members.

A TREATISE ON MEMBERSHIP DECLINE

Over the last 12-18 months each issue of the C.T.S.N. has mentioned at least once, the concern felt over the continued loss of members, and the vain hope is repeated that a "drive to encourage clay target shooting" will reverse the statistics.

The reports of annual shoots generally begin: "Although a fall in attendance from last year . . . everyone enjoyed themselves.'

Following is an assessment of where the losses occur and the reasons given by a majority of those interviewed

- (a) have given the sport away
- (b) shoot less
- (c) are generally unhappy and now considering joining

Losses fall into 3 main categories:

- (i) New shooters who join and stay a relatively short while and then resign.
 - (ii) Shooters of long standing but not A or AA grade.

(iii) Older aged shooters.

Members of each group give as their main reason for shooting less or for resigning as monetary cost. Not the money in itself, but they perceive the cost to the "average shooter" is appreciably more than to the A or AA member. This means that majority is not getting value for money. Put another way, the A and AA grade shooters are being subsidised by the "average shooter".

This is obviously brought about because of:-

- 1. the preponderance of fixed mark shooting.
- 2. the ineffectiveness of the present handicap system.
- 3. the rules as they are now.

Observations on the above.

- 1. As has been quoted in several "letters to the Editor", fixed mark shooting results in
- (a) many co-called "canny" shooters managing their scores in order to remain in the grade they choose. The honest shooter suffers.
- (b) protracted shoot-offs wherein the A and AA members indulge in perhaps 120 or so "free practice targets" while the average shooters sit around for an hour or so awaiting the next event, aware that their money is paying for the clay targets being used. An oft-heard remark, "I've come 100 miles to shoot - not sit about and pay for someone else's targets to this extent."
- (c) The grading system divides the big clubs into cliques which tend to be separate entities, and the top groups appear most elitist to the newcomer. This is NOT a good
- (d) In small clubs it often happens that there is a great shortage of competitors in one particular grade - perhaps only one shooter in a grade. The problems here are obvious but not often encountered in the big clubs, hence are not sufficiently considered.
 - 2. Handicap System.
- (a) Many handicaps are shot in so-called metreage groups. Why is this so? Apparently so the back markers will be assured of a trophy. This whole method of shooting is an admission that the handicap system, at the moment, is unsatisfactory. The most blatant support for this statement is that, whereas in former times there was a consolation "front-marker" trophy for the inexperienced shooters, quite often there is now no such trophy, but a 21-25 metre trophy!!
- (b) Another situation causing dissent is when, say, eight people in the 15-18 metre group shoot 20/20 in handicap and go on to shoot another 20 targets or so before a winner emerges. Apart from the winner, no one gets anything. However, at the same time someone in the 19-25 metre group who has shot only 17/20 wins an equally valuable trophy, with no metreage penalty.
 - Rules favour the most competent shooters.

- (a) Optional sweepstakes for fixed mark shooting, unless otherwise advertised, are not in groups, but overall. Often in State events these are compulsory sweepstakes obviously a benefit for the A and AA classes.
- (b) The newer shooter frequently shoots at an illegal target - misses - and is astounded at the rule which designates that HE is the judge of legality. What infuriates him is when he suspects (as many of the squad also do) that a lurk-merchant has refused his weakest bird on the pretext of a "slow release", and then proceeds to shoot a "possible".
- (c) If a B/16 shooter earns a metre to go to 17 metres, he is then only one metre in front of an AA shooter graded on 18 metres. This difference is not sufficiently great.
- (d) Cash handicaps at the moment have to be shot out. and this does not appeal to the "average" shooter who has been very lucky to shoot a possible.

Older shooters are penalised in several ways. In fixed mark shooting they lack the stamina to win a shoot-off in any grade from B grade upwards. Those who have been AA grade are not permitted to drop below A grade despite their honest B grade (or worse) performances. Similarly A cannot regress below B. Many shooters over the age of 60 drop out before the official "veteran" age of 65 years. Most lack the stamina for a long shoot-off, so their competitiveness is greatly limited. Shepparton and some other clubs have apparently seen the futility of this rule and advertise THEIR veteran age at 60 years. Some older guys who are non-competitive shoot for "targets only", but they are the ones who love shooting more than golf.

It is felt that these inequities have grown "like Topsy". as most clubs are run by A graders who see the world through the eyes of A graders, so it IS NATURAL THAT THIS HAS HAPPENED, and no blame is intended. The newer shooter is not a forceful person in club management, so, instead of rocking the boat, he leaves and plays golf or another sport.

Talking of Sport. It is felt the A.C.T.A. in itself is too centralised, and instead of trying to formalise shooting, should be making the statement, "A gun club is formed to serve the wishes of the locals and, to be viable, needs to attract members by catering for their preferences, be it S.B., D.B., Points, Continental or whatever."

Suggested Remedies.

Let us realise everyone likes to win just once in a while, so make it possible for everyone, on his day, to feel he can do just that.

1. A more equitable handicap system. (This would require a lot of revision and would also incorporate a scale, e.g., of 16.18.20.22. for minimum handicaps for C, B, A and AA.)

- (a) encourage clubs to revert to the old practice of having only one championship (fixed mark) event each day.
 - (b) be more sociable and less separatist.
 - (c) reduce shoot-offs, and so,
 - (d) be less costly.
 - (e) encourage "pride in handicap"
 - (f) make optional sweeps more equitable.
 - (g) be fairer for everyone.
- 2. Revise the grading system.
- (a) After 250 targets reject the two lowest scores and average the remaining 200.
 - (b) Allow shooters to regress (with adequate safeguards).
 - 3. Lower the veteran age to 60 years.
- 4. Revise rules which are a nonsense, inadequate,

It is sad to report that a Territory 'institution', the 'Ballongilly Shoot' may not be held this year. Originally held on the Queen's Birthday weekend, it was forced to change when the N.T.C.T.A. used this long weekend for the State Trap Carnival. Last year's shoot, for \$1000 prizemoney, was reasonably well attended, and enjoyed, particularly by Greg Chan, who returned to Darwin with the lion's share of the cash. Hopefully Pauline and Ernie Rayner will be able to promote this excellent shoot in future years.

Well, Bob Pearce is the latest shooter to benefit from graham 'Scrubby' Joiner's search for the perfect gun. Bob bought the Perazzi 'reject' as soon as it went on the market. What now, Scrubby? On the subject of personalities, a well-known local shooter, imported from N.S.W. a couple of seasons ago was having a very uncharacteristic round of skeet, firing with little interest, and mumbling harsh words to all and sundry. Brian Mark enlivened the Calcutta auction with his repertoire of rich and risque recitations, and got top money auctioneering the shooters also. Thanks, Brian.



LEONORA GUN CLUB'S ANNUAL GOLD NUGGET SHOOT REPORT

This year's shoot was held over the weekend of July 6th and 7th, with sixty eight shooters from Newman, Geraldton, Perth, Bunbury and the Goldfields Clubs of Esperance, Southern Cross, Kambalda, Kalgoorlie, Laverton and Leinster.

The programme included the Commonwealth Continental Championship sponsored by the Leonora Stores, The State Double Rise Tower Championship sponsored by the Central Hotel, in addition to two gold nugget shoots for which Leonora's annual shoot is reknown.

Highlights of the weekend's shooting were the success of Geraldton junior shooter, Mike Boschetti, the commissioning of the Club's third DTL layout with its automatic trap and the keen competition between Kalgoorlie's Jim Neve and Collie's Max Cubic for the championship honours.

Mike Boschetti, competing away from his home town for the first time, was in excellent form over the two days which culminated in his taking out the Junior High Gun (129/155), the C grade State Mixed Targets Championship (56/60) and second in the C grade Commonwealth D/B Continental Championship (43/51).
