


BROKEN HILL GUN CLUB






Broken Hill shooter David Stephenson receives Junior High Gun sash and trophy.

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES — THE WAY IT WAS

THE YEAR 1956:

Was our 20th Birthday and we celebrated the event in a number of ways. Possibly the staging of the Olympic Games Trench Shooting event was the outstanding effort. In this event we fielded a two man team for the first time. All States took part in the eliminations to find the final two shooters, namely John Bryant and Clem Mudford of Victoria.


At this time, Australia wide, there were approximately 280 Gun Clubs affiliated with the A.C.P.T.S.A. A list of Association Handicaps for all registered shooters published in "news" — March 1956, shows there were in excess of 5000 registered shooters throughout Australia.

There were also 151 registered Referees. (Not a bad effort really for the first 20 years considering that during this period we suffered the great depression of the 1930s and World War 2 of 1939-45.)

1956 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Were held at Bankstown Aerodrome — the first occasion the series had been held outside Victoria and was quite successful in every aspect, except for weather conditions. The shooting grounds, the normal rendezvous of the Royal Aero club of N.S.W. (gun society), were in a somewhat unsettled state just prior to the start of shooting, chiefly because officials were unable to spend anything but brief periods in preparation for the big shoot, for one reason the inclement weather.

The night prior to the opening it poured rain and continued throughout the next day. It was decided to defer the opening event, The National Single Barrel Championship, for a period, hoping the weather would clear.



Champs of the 1050s Fred Black (TAS) and Dave Watson (Melb). Dave used the shooting nom-de-plume of "Dock-an-Doris", possibly because of his Scottish upbringing. He won the first post war Champion of Champions in the most unusual conditions. It was 1947 and the last occasion that the event was shot on Kings Birthday weekend. The weather on the day was described as the vilest in the history of the event. The venue was the old Coburg Club's grounds at North Coburg. After the 1947 experience the series was switched to the usual March period, which has proved so satisfactory ever since. Dave won the event with a score of 49/50.

The rain continued, therefore, a late start was the result. However it did not prevent over 160 shooters from nominating. In the hazardous conditions some good shooting resulted. Victory went to Sid Lamb, Goulburn Gun Club secretary and N.S.W. Executive committee member, who came in with the only 50 straight.


The Premier event of the program, the Champion of Champions cup, contested over 50 targets from 20 yards and resulted in several possibles, Clem Mudford, of Melbourne, finally came out the winner with 94/95.

Joe Raleigh of Charleville, Queensland, shooting in great style, took out the National Double Barrel Title for 1956. Joe had to content with heavy rain that came down all day. 233 shooters lined up for the title which was shot under the points score system of 3 & 2 his score was 117/120 from W.N. Bullen Vaucluse N.S.W.

Quote from A.C.P.T.S. News, February, 1955.



BAILEE FARM 2 DAY FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS




 National President Roy Holtfreiter (left) presents on behalf of CIG, the winner's trophy to Robin Bailey.


Robin Bailey did it again at Bailee Farm to win the 1985 Field Championship for the second time in succession.

Consistent shooting placed him in first place on both days which added up to a convincing win over all.

Shane Merkotter won the Junior Award and Keith Norrish the Veterans. Sub Junior top scorer was D. Phillipe.


Best Morning Round on Day One was won by John Eddy, with Steve Clint taking off the Afternoon Round.

• Ted Rose (already the proud owner of a Bailee Farm Field Blackboy Badge) during a shoot-off for the 2-3 Skeet Section.






John Pope, now of Katherine, won the Commonwealth, Night Skeet Championship after a shoot off with Doyle, after both had recorded 47's.





THE GREAT FRED BURNS

by John Monk

It was my very great fortune to spend a lot of interesting time with Fred Burns, certainly one of the greatest shotgunners Australia has ever seen.

Fred was always cheerful, always willing to spend time talking of shooting either traps or hunting in the field. He was always willing to explain anything in the shooting line, whether you were a competitor or not.

And he was as excited about shooting toward the end of his life as he must have been as a boy at Werribee, where his parents had a farm and Fred learned to shoot.

As a boy of 9 years of age, Fred learned to shoot, and to hunt, with a .410 shotgun, on his parents' farm at Werribee, Victoria, and he provided a great deal of the family fare in those days. The Werribee Plains were renowned for their game potential, and Fred had plenty of game on which to practise.

At the age of 12 years, Fred was overjoyed to be presented with his father's precious double-12 gauge Bonehill.

These were pretty lean times for everyone but the wealthy and the most fortunate, and every penny that came Fred's way was spent in ammunition. Though these were the days when rabbits could be sold and skins also brought in a little money.

Fred managed to get a job with I.C.I., where he was an ammunition tester for the factory in Deer Park. In this job he gained a lot of experience and knowledge which no doubt aided him a great deal in later years.

At the age of 25 he took the Victorian Sparrow Championship. This was the beginning of the big time, and 8 years later Fred was one of Australia's top gunshots.

He became assistant and protege to I.C.I.'s technical officer, Jack Sutherland, who in those days shot under the name of "Calrossie". (Shooting names were popular in those days, and Jack took his from the small South Gippsland town of that name where he once managed a creamery.)

It is of interest that Newton Thomas followed in this position, and also credited Jack Sutherland with teaching him the skills he so thoroughly learned.

Prior to 1938, Fred Burns was commissioned to the Rhenwest Cartridge Company (a great cartridge in their time!), on a highly remunerative basis. This lasted about 4 years and was a great job for a man of Fred's bent and ability. He was their top representative and attended all country and local live bird shoots.

And he was shooting in great company. Names like Bill Downie, Jack Sutherland, Sam Snipe, "Elenara" Harrison and many other great gunners.

About this time he was loading his own cartridges most difficult to obtain during the years of the 1939-45 war — and his service with I.C.I. certainly helped in this.

Somewhere about this time he became the owner of a progressive and profitable gun shop in Barkly Street, Footscray, Victoria. I don't have an exact date on the time of starting this shop, though I remember it very well.

Fred kept on his winning way, and I frequently met him at the old Melbourne Gun Club, at Tottenham, Melbourne, along with many other guests — Newton Thomas, Sam Snipe, Keith Veal, and a very young — and very good — Peter Wray, among others.


By 1958 all live bird shooting was illegal, and Fred kept shooting with clay targets and field shooting. This was the trend until Fred Burns finally retired from business.

But it didn't stop his interest in shooting or shooters, and he began a shooting school for both beginners and experienced shooters. Three days per week, and by appointment only. Some fine shooters went through that school.


Finally Fred retired to Shepparton, Victoria, where he died some years later.

More than 260 championships, and a great life of hunting and competition shooting throughout Australia. Fred's wife Mollie had been by his side always, shot with him, travelled to the shoots, and must surely have been a wonderful companion, and no thumbnail sketch of such a great man would be complete without mention of Mollie, her charm and friendliness.



ST. PIUS X COLLEGE CADET UNIT




Ray Cerny, instructing skeet shooting procedures.

1984-85 was a very interesting cadet year for the members of the St. Pius X College Cadet Unit. The specialist platoon "Small bore, Shooting" had an exciting year despite the failure of the planned highlights of a bivouac and the annual May Camp which was forced to be cancelled due to the drenching rains.

Yet despite these setbacks the platoon maintained high morale, mainly due to the nature of the training program. This encompassed the use of small bore air rifles, .22 calibre rifles and the use of the shotgun. Of all these the skeet shooting proved most popular.



1985 MASTERS GAMES — TORONTO (Canada)

Report by Barney Rooke - Wagga

The world's first Masters Games were held in Toronto (Canada) from August 7th to 25th. These were a multisports festival for mature athletes and catering for some 22 sports. 283 Australians in all made the trip to Toronto and of these only four shotgun shooters — Max Vipond of Melbourne, Kevin Constable of Pillaga N.S.W., Barney Rooke of Wagga Wagga and Roy Randell of Brisbane, who was representing the S.S.A.A.

The shotgun events were Olympic Trench, Olympic Skeet, North American Trap and Skeet. The first events were the ISU Trench and Skeet both 200 target events and shot over two days.

Barney Rooke was the only Australian to shoot the Skeet and the other three shot the Trench. The Trench resulted in a win by R. Shask of Canada. Max Vipond finished 9th, Kevin Constable 13th and Roy Randall 16th.

The ISU Skeet was ably won by A. Harris of USA who shot brilliantly to finish with a 190/200 shooting a 99 in the second 100. Harry Willsie of Canada, a Commonwealth Games Gold Medallist in 1974, was third after a shoot-off with O. Schmid who carded a 24 in the shoot-off to Harry's 23. Barney Rooke finished fifth.

The next event was Northern American Trap and this was won by Tom Orlick, Canada, shooting 97/96 — 193/200. Barney Rooke finished fourth with a 97/90 — 187/200, Kevin and Roy both 184/200 and Max 169/200.

The final event, the North American Skeet, was won with a perfect score of 200/200 by Harry Willsie of Canada, second place was Frank Csascar with 198/200 and the Bronze Medal to Barney Rooke with 196/200 and he shot 99/100 in the second 100.

The Masters Games were the greatest event on the world calendar where mature athletes were able to compete in their age groups, and shooting was 55 years or older.

It was a great experience to be able to mix with former Olympic medallists, Commonwealth and National medallists from the world over.

Some 8300 competitors participated in the first World Masters Games including Dawn Fraser and Judy Pollock. The next Masters Games are to be held in Denmark during 1989. It is sincerely hoped that many more of our Australian Clay Target shooters would plan to compete in Denmark. I can assure them of a great time.


The standard of shooting maintained its high level in the Zone Point Score C'ship with Alan Cramp showing Jimmy Smith the way with a brilliant 231/231 points.







GREAT GUNS OF OLD -- Roger Darwon

ROGER DARWON* takes us through the evolution of both the firearm and the sporting shooter, from the first shoulder gun to the beginnings of the breech-loading age.

The smell of gunpowder is an ancient obsession.

Firearms in competition form can be traced back to Europe, to around AD1400.

Early competition target clubs can be found on record, as the sport advanced from bow and arrow competition to the new wonder: the shoulder firearm, the Matchlock gun.

The first firearms, actually shot from the shoulder, were developed from man's first attempt at firearms — the cannon.

The inventiveness of early man's ideas on firearms is exemplified by Leonardo da Vinci, who made a compilation of sketches, illustrating some fantastic firearms, many of which even today are still only on the drawing board.

By da Vinci's time (around AD1500) guns had become very much a reality, and the skills and experience of the armourers were employed to produce the art of the gunsmith. While we can trace the existence of guns to around AD1300, it took a while before they gained wide personal use.

It reputedly took years, for instance, before some genius figured out that the touch-hole belonged on the side, not the top, of early muskets.

The hole on top, with its open ring, held loose priming powder.

It also collected rainwater! And if the water didn't put the early musketeer out of business, sometimes a good breeze would.

With the advent of hand-held "guns" or mini cannons, man progressed to the firearm known as the Matchlock.

From this arm, man was on his way to the personalised firearm, even though it had its limitations.

These early mechanical forms of shooting gave us the forerunner of the shoulder-gun, with the shooter sighting along the barrel — thus controlling his own marksmanship and the trajectory of his shot.

As a result of this development, the "new" shooting sportsman could now use both hands to support the gun, while it gave him freedom to use the fingers of the righthand to squeeze-off his shot.

The early trigger (or serpentine) held the burning wick called the match, and when the shooter pulled on it, the "S" shaped serpentine was brought into contact with the cup or touch hole of finely ground gunpowder, setting off the shot.

The match "ignition system" was cotton, linen or woollen cord soaked in a solution of wet gunpowder or saltpetre. It was often lit at both ends as a precaution against going out. Varying requirements later led to the development of both slower and fast-burning matches.


These original matchlock firearms had no springs. The serpentine was attached to the gun stock by a centre-pin, which served as a pivot.

So when the shooter pulled the trigger, the "S" shaped serpentine would come down with the burning wick coming into contact with the primed touch hole, and thus the shooter had "fired" his shot (obviously the origin of the shooting term).

This early form of shooting, with wicks and primed touch holes, was not recommended on wet days.

From this point in history, with the shooting sportsman's need for refinements, the gunsmiths of the day came up with stage two in the evolution of the sporting arm — the wheel-lock firearm, credited to the Germans in 1517 at Nuremberg.

The wheel-lock's mechanism was a logical evolution from the mechanical matchlock firelighters of the time.

With the introduction of the new wheel-lock came the practical adaptation of the sidearm or pistol, and at the same time provided man with a hunting arm to rival the cross-bow.

The wheel-lock used a stone or flint to ignite the powder charge. When the trigger was pulled, it allowed a main spring to activate the rapid rotation of a steel wheel. The serrated edges of this wheel rubbing on the flint threw a shower of sparks into the pan. With some degree of luck it fired the shot.

The original concept of the wheel-lock firing mechanism is associated with clockmakers, and there are many examples of clocksmith and gunsmith who combined to produce the intricate workings.

The wheel-lock gave the hunter mobility, firepower, speed of shooting and control: plus the element of surprise and concealment.

For the first time he could now move around with his loaded gun, minus the tell-tale "bonfire" of a burning match, needed for 'fire-ing' each shot.

With the wheel-lock also came the shooting sportsman's first brush with the law of the day, over the "right to bear arms".

The Emperor Maximilian forbade manufacture of the wheel-lock in AD1517.

Further bans were placed on the use of wheel-lock firearms within the city limits of Ferrars in 1522, and similar bans ensued at Modena, Milan and Florence.

However, these bans were no more effective than those of an earlier Chinese emperor, who had tried to impose on the cross-bow in the dim distant past of AD1200.

The wheel-lock had its historical span from 1517, when

the German Kiefuss invented it in Nuremburg, until about 300 years later, when the Paris gunsmith Le Page built a wheel-lock on special order for a German customer in 1829.

Any surviving wheel-lock firearms today are works of art. The plainer weapons went to the scrap heap, as no one thought of collecting obsolete firearms until into the early 19th Century.

It's open to conjecture whether the English ever built wheel-lock firearms. King Henry VIII did, however, import German gunsmiths, as had his predecessor, Edward III. It is recorded that the German gunsmith C. Kalthoff came to London with his family patents in 1658.

The wheel-lock, while being a great improvement on the clumsy matchlock was still a complicated and expensive arm to make. It was difficult to maintain and required constant service by a skilled gunsmith. The need for a less complicated and expensive arm, finally led to the Dutch invention, the "Snaphaunce".

This arm was generally applauded as an advanced instrument which could function for years without much service.

The pinning down of the definition of "Snaphaunce" is a recent one. Only about a century ago it was defined by the French version of the name, meaning any kind of gun (or arm) with a gun-lock mechanism that went "snap" when fired.

It worked on much the same system as a wheel-lock. When the trigger was pulled a connecting rod opened the pan covers, letting the flinted-stoned spark into the powder and "presto", ignition. And still with lots of luck, it fired.

The sporting shooter of the day was now moving into the more advanced age of firearms: not so cumbersome, with better 'combustion' quality.

For the gun to fire still required the spark to fire the gunpowder mixture. But the Snaphaunce could be loaded and primed in advance.

Once loaded, with the pan cover closed to retain the primed charge, and also to keep out moisture, the firearm was ready for instant use.

By the use of flintstone to ignite the charge, the old method of the burning match was now eliminated, and speed of use was increased tenfold.

Having turned this major corner, the development continued through various stages and systems, including Miquelet, flintlock and percussion.

There's an element of charm associated with the names given to some of these early firearms. In the case of the Dutch Snaphaunce, the name was derived from the demise of a chicken thief, shot while raiding the farm of one Pieter de Vroom, on the outskirts of Zutphen, in 1551.

History records that de Vroom shot and killed the poacher. The thief was an army deserter.

The authorities viewed the shooting as justifiable homicide (probably because of the victim's record). They accepted de Vroom's claim that the man had died of wounds inflicted by pecking hens, which in Dutch was Snaphaunce. The name stuck to the new firearm.

Another firearm of the period, the Miquelet, derived its name from the Spanish or Portuguese waterfront gangsters who no doubt gave the arm plenty of use.

The Miquelet (or Mediterranean lock): It was once said Spanish gunbarrels were essential for shooters who preferred guns that did not blow up! The typical Spanish or Miquelet lock became the standard for the Arab Empire (this is how they beat the Russians and Italians) and parts of Italy. Miquelets even found their way into South Russia and the Cossack tribes.

Even today, some Russian miquelets survive in the Kremlin armoury. The firing system is similar to earlier guns. When the hammer shifts, the flint in the hammer's jaw strikes a spark into the powder pan — thus ignition and the shot is fired . . . fingers crossed!

Flintlock: This arm is more correctly termed the French lock. The French played perhaps the biggest part in firearm development, but in many cases other nations beat them to getting prominence for their effort.

When the trigger was engaged, the pressure of the sear spring released a tumbler allowing the cock (holding flint) to fall — showering sparks into the ignition pan which uncovered via the fall of the hammer. Presto, it fired (hopefully).

From here, firearm invention went into a transitional phase, Gunpowder had been improving over the centuries from a weak and often unpredictable propellant — to the point where it could be manufactured to do a specific job.

First came the corning of powders for more uniform explosion. Next, powder was glazed with ground graphite, which resisted moisture and kept the charge usable for longer.

By the late 1600s, powders were getting to the stage where it was possible to calculate how long it would take a batch to burn and ignite its charge.

The time was ripe for the arrival of the percussion system.

According the UK history, the first percussion firearm was built by the legendary English gunsmith Manton possibly against his better judgement — to a design by Col. Hawker.

Other weaponers are believed to have constructed similar devices, but Hawker and Manton brought it to commercial reality.

Powder and shot were loaded down the barrel by ramrod, as in previous systems. But instead of firing the shot with sparks on to powder, Hawker and Manton used a percussion cap.

Set off by the impact of the hammer, the cap detonated the charge in the barrel.

The cap was the forerunner of today's primed cartridges: shotgun shells, rifle-bullets, etc.

From this point, the earlier flint and wheel systems faded into obscurity. Today they're collector's items worth sometimes thousands of dollars.

As the gunsmiths advanced to further development for the armies and sporting shooters of the time, we find early instances of breech-loading firearms: single-barrel arms, still combined with the flintlock ignition system.

The royal gunsmith to the Saxon Court in Dresden built an eight-groove, tip-down breech-loading flintlock around 1700. This gun was opened by pushing a convenient lever in front of the trigger-guard.

It used a cartridge-case made of steel, which was expensive to make and never thrown away but recharged for repeated use. This cartridge-case came complete with its own primer pan and steel.

By now the gunsmiths were well on the way to today's true breech-loading modern arm, which had developed into the diverse range of rifles, shotgun and pistols available to sporting shooters.

With the coming of the true breech-loading arm, thanks to the French gunsmiths like Samuel Johannes Pauly and Le Faucheux, the renaissance shooter now had a firearm that would give him speed of use, and eliminate all the worry of flint, ball, ram-rods, powder flasks and wetweather problems encountered with such systems.

The shooting sportsman was now set to enter the 20th Century on a scale that would have astounded the shooters of some 500 years before.

Throughout the various stages of both the guns' and the sporting shooters' development, we can trace their part in the social and economical development of each period in history.

For many it's part of the romance, the mysteries and also the skills of men through the renaissance ages. Today, men pit their skills to acquire rare examples of the early gunmaker's art.

Besides the collection value, it's also historical evidence. That reminder of the tangible reality in a passage in man's history, which has nearly vanished from us.

One wonders what kind of expression would be on the face of the shooter from 600 years ago, brought by time machine for a look at firearms and the sporting shooter of today.

One thing he would find, besides the advanced technology, is a loss of individual freedom for the firearm enthusiast. The modern sporting shooter faces a more complex set of delusions and restrictions than at any other time in history.

But man's reliance on the firearm for personal security and sport — and his fascination for the adventurous days of old — will be hard to break.




Robert Vale Conlon (Vale to all who knew him) was born 23rd September, 1901, and passed away 16th January, 1982.

He never fired an angry shot at a clay target until January 1st, 1966 at the age of 64. As it took him 20 shots at 10 targets before he finally broke one, he decided that the sport held a challenge he could not resist.

Over the next fourteen years Vale mastered the art of clay busting and went on to win many championships in Tower, Olympic, Trap, D.T.L. and Skeet.

The most notable of these achievements was the State Tower Championship at Hobart Gun Club with a score of 126/126 in 1974 at the age of 75 years.

After his death the club ran into difficulties and, due to the downturn in the economy, was closed down. However with the introduction of the R.V. Conlon Perpetual Trophy we hope his contribution to the Huonville Gun Club and Clay Target shooting in Tasmania in general will remain forever in our minds.

Vale made many contributions to Clay Target shooting but the one that stands at the forefront in my mind is the lesson that with determination and practice and a desire to achieve a goal, even late starters can be very successful in our sport. Vale Conlon was honoured and respected by all Tasmanian shooters as a gentleman and great sportsman (Information supplied by: Claude Conlon, Huonville.)
