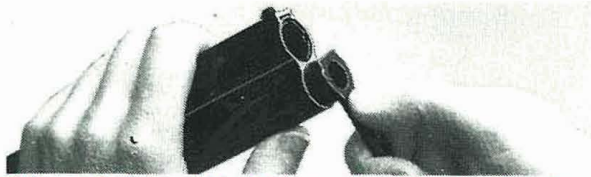

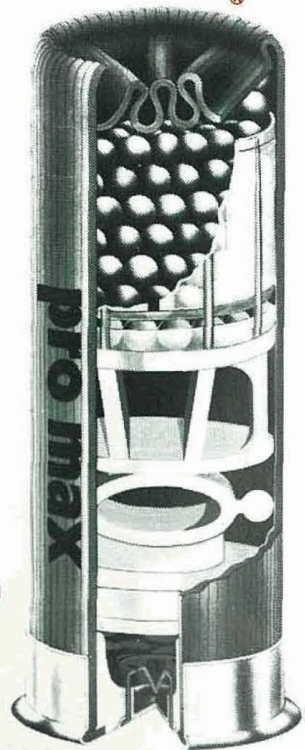

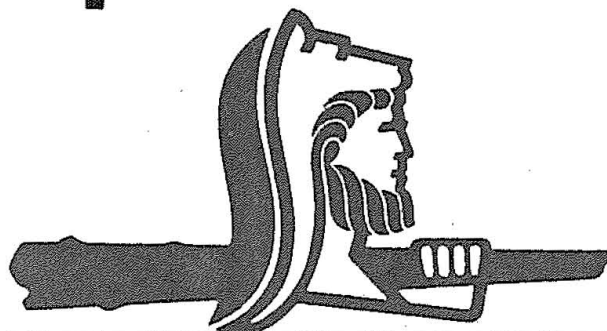

I know that there will be a lot of interest in the carnival results and these are to be seen elsewhere in the magazine.

Thank you State President Len Bird and Secretary Jenny Etheridge, (by now Mrs Col Burt) for making my stay in Tamworth such an enjoyable one. I look forward to an early return to New South Wales.

Following the NSW Carnival the opportunity arose to visit the Apple Isle for the Tasmanian Trap Championships and once again the gun club was well turned out and shooters were again supporting the State Executive who had organised an excellent carnival.

State President Ken Copleman and Secretary Kaye Woods in conjunction with their Executive Members made my visit an enjoyable one, shooting in Tasmania is in good hands, thank you Ken and Kaye.

With the Skeet Nationals now completed we are in full preparation for the I.S.U. Nationals to be held in Brisbane, early February. These will be preceded by the South Pacific Regional Championships and the organisation of these events is well under way. Full details of the South Pacific Championships have not been made available as yet by the organising body, the Australian Shooting Association; they will be published as well as our own National program in the January issue of the C.T.S.N. Dates etc., are published in this issue for early advice.

By all accounts we will have shooters from Hong Kong, Malaysia, Singapore and the U.S. Army Reserve Team competing in Brisbane and this augurs well for a successful competition. Don't forget to mark your diaries for Brisbane, February 1986.

As many of the calls that come into the office relate to the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy there is obviously doubt and confusion over the cover that is provided. Your club Secretary has the full details and should be able

to assist with most queries raised, if not, ask that the question be clarified with the A.C.T.A.

Also the question of should a club become incorporated or not is frequently raised. I believe that it is in the best interests of all clubs to be incorporated irrespective of the size of membership, costs involved are minimal to say the least, if you club is not an incorporated body, then I suggest that you raise the subject at an early committee meeting, you would be acting in the best interest of yourself and fellow members, and would be protected against the many situations that could involve you as an individual should you not belong to an incorporated club.

Reminders that 1986 registrations are now accepted and upon receipt of your subscription a new handicap card will be issued. You may notice a change to the format of the cover, this is to allow for more information to be included on the registration label, an improvement.

The preparations for the Trap Nationals are proceeding and with the enthusiasm being shown by the Echuca Gun Club there is no doubt that 1986 will be one of our better Nationals. For those who may be intending on coming to Echuca for the first time, a pleasant surprise awaits you as Echuca itself and the surrounding areas have a lot to offer visitors. Accommodation is readily available despite the rumors of the town being booked out and you should not experience any difficulty in this respect.

Now that we have reached December and the Christmas Season I would, on behalf of the Executive and the Office Personnel, like to extend to you and your families the compliments of the season, a very happy Christmas and health and happiness for the New Year.

N.S.W.C.T.A. STATE TRAP CARNIVAL - TAMWORTH

Perfect weather — 207 shooters — great scores — what more do you have to have for a successful State Trap Carnival. This years Carnival was hosted by the Tamworth Clay Target Club over the October long weekend. The Club itself must be congratulated for the huge amount of work that they had put in on the grounds and the facilities themselves.

Shooters attended from the whole of N.S.W., Queensland, and a contingent from Western Australia.

Shooters in attendance had the opportunity to meet the new A.C.T.A. Executive Director, Mr. Alan Maher. Alan travelled to Tamworth for the Carnival, and as it was his first attendance at a shoot, spent a great deal of time learning the "ins and outs".

For the first time this year, the carnival had total sponsorship from Companies, which as we all know has untold benefits all round. Sergio Zuffo from Olympic Targets sponsored the State Double Barrel, with the State Single Barrel being sponsored by Gambarms, State Point Score by Horsley Park Gun Shop, Champion of Champions by Cadbury-Schweppes, Team High Guns by Fuller Firearms, who also supplied the shells for the State

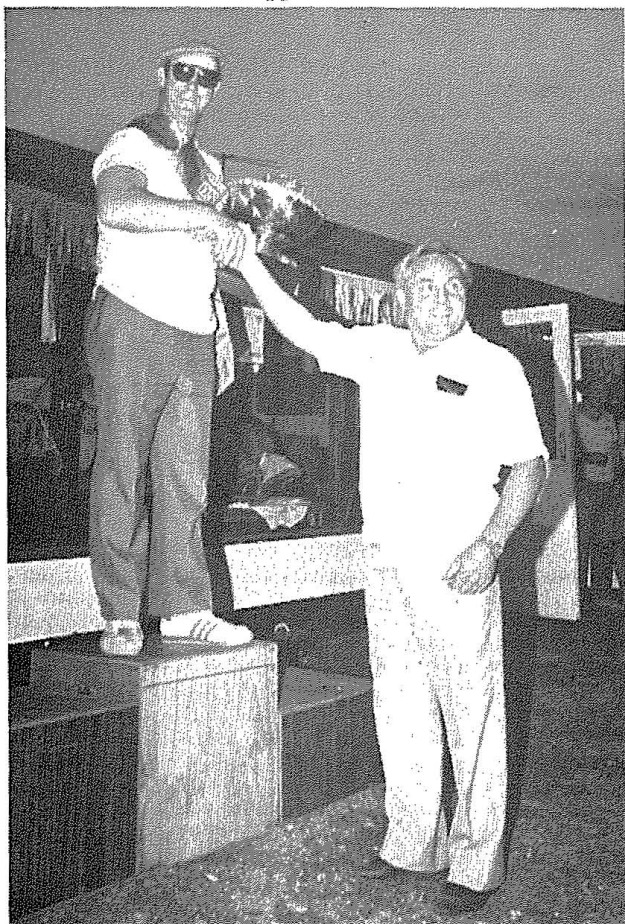
Teams, and the Overall High Guns by Winchester.

Saturday morning dawned clear and sunny, with the temperature reaching 31 degrees by lunch time. The 30 target double barrel cash divide had 43 possibles returned.

After the Official Opening, which was performed by Mr. Noel Park, the Member for Tamworth, with representatives from Tamworth City Council, Parry Shire Council and the Department of Sport and Recreation, in attendance, the 50 target State Double barrel Championship got underway. After two rounds of 25, 35 shooters had returned possibles. The shoot-off for the overall title went until dark!, with the 3 remaining shooters, being Jim Ellis, Ken Denyer and Mal Hass, required at 8.00 am on Sunday to seek out the final winner. Ellis was the victor with 190/190. Queensland visitor, Mal Hass was first in "AA" with 189/190, from Ken Denyer from Moree with 185/186. Guyra shooter, Ray Sweeney received the honours for first in "A" Grade with 148/149, from Upper Hunter shooter Jack Barker on 103/104. In the "B" grade ranks, C. Mason was the winner with 93/94, from Paul Turner on 83/84. The "C" Grade shoot-off went almost as long as the shoot off for overall!! Graham Bolte and L. Russell battled on, before Russell was the winner with 138/139, Bolte taking 2nd in "C" with 137/139, and didn't the handicapper have a smile on his face.

In the Ladies division, Rose Micallef shot a perfect 50/50 to be the winner. Young Michael Diamond showed that he was going to be a force to be reckoned with by returning 49/50 to win the Junior Trophy. Noel Rodgers was the Veterans winner also with 49/50.

The 50 target State Single Barrel was first up on Sunday morning. Again the weather was perfect, and again 207 shooters prepared for the next stage of State Team selection. Only 2 possibles were recorded, and a score of 57/57 from John Finn saw him receive the State Single Barrel Championship sash, Silver N.S.W. Badges, Trophy and the Robby and Pam Smith Perpetual Cup. J.W. Smith was first in "AA", with 50/50, from Jim Ellis on 79/80.

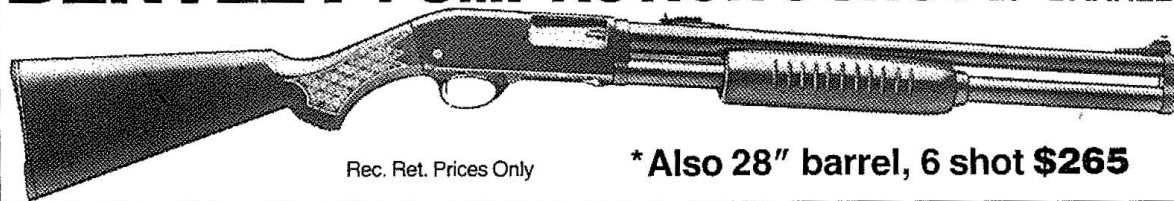


• State DB C'ship Winner Jim Ellis receives his trophy from event sponsor Sergio Zuffo of Olympic Targets.

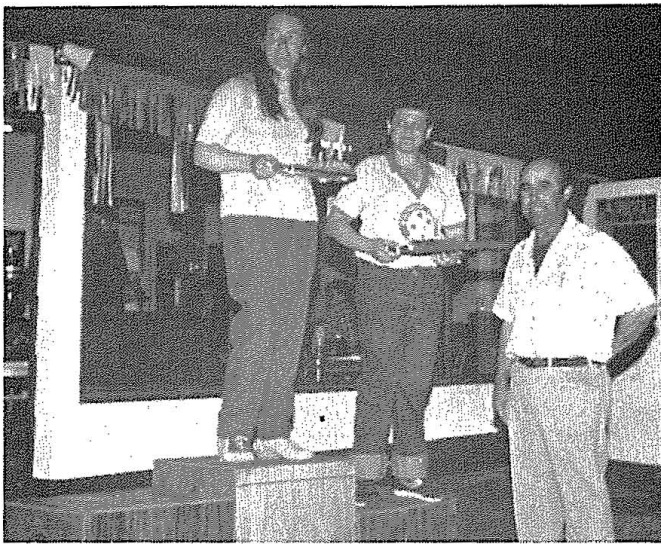

Likeable Hawkesbury shooter Joe Allotta returned 57/60 to win 1st in "B" Grade, and there was not a happier man on the ground, 2nd in "B:" grade went to Guy Evans on 56/60. A 45/50 from L. Russell gave him first in "C" Grade from local shooter, Les Johnson on 50/57. Rose Micallef was again successful in the Ladies Division with 45/51. The Junior Trophy went to Michael Diamond with 48/50, and local "Skeet" shooter, Ray Meville took out the veterans section with 46/50.

With the shoot-offs out of the way, the 50 Target State Point Score Championship, sponsored by Horsley Park Gun Shop commenced. At the completion of the event 3 possibles were on the scoreboard. The overall winner was Guyra shooter, Roger Vidal with a score of 234/234. Roger, along with the 2 other State Championship winners received the Silver N.S.W. Badge, these being presented for the first time this year. Jim Ellis was on the winners dais again for 1st in "AA" with 150/150, from Dick Piotrowski. The sponsor of the event, Peter Abella was first in "A" Grade with 150/150, from Kempsey shooter, Bill Buchanan 178/179. In the "B" Grade division the winner was Tony Aceti with a score of 150/153, from Bill Bachta on 149/153. B. Ringland won "C" Grade with 143/150, from Jeff Roberts on 141/150. The 1985 Ladies Team comprises Mary-Lou Parker, Rose Micallef, Alice Harrison, Margaret McMillan, Glenys Lawrence and Lola Charles. The Junior team is Michael Diamond, Tom Turner, Crain Tilley, D. Mason, Jamie Rodgers and Brett Webb.

A very commendable effort from Michael Diamond who made both the Open Team and the Junior Team.

Monday morning at 8.00 am all teams presented for photos and to receive their Team pockets and badges and the shells kindly donated by Fuller Firearms.

The High Gun of the Open Team went to Bill Buchanan with the only possible 150/150, Mary-Lou Parker received the trophy for the High Gun of the Ladies Team, and after a shoot off that lasted for a full round of 25, Michael Diamond won the Junior Team High Gun.



• Champion of Champions Winner Allan Cramp (centre), Dick Piotrowski (left) and Jim Ellis (right).

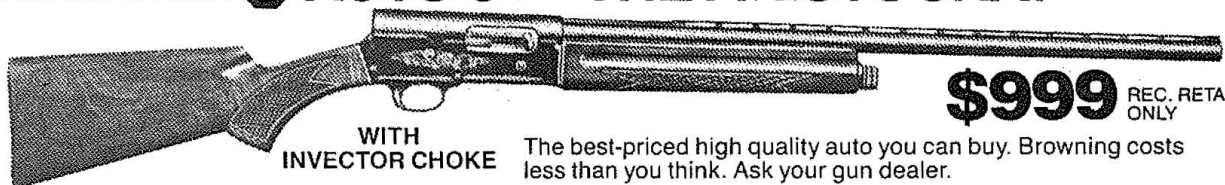

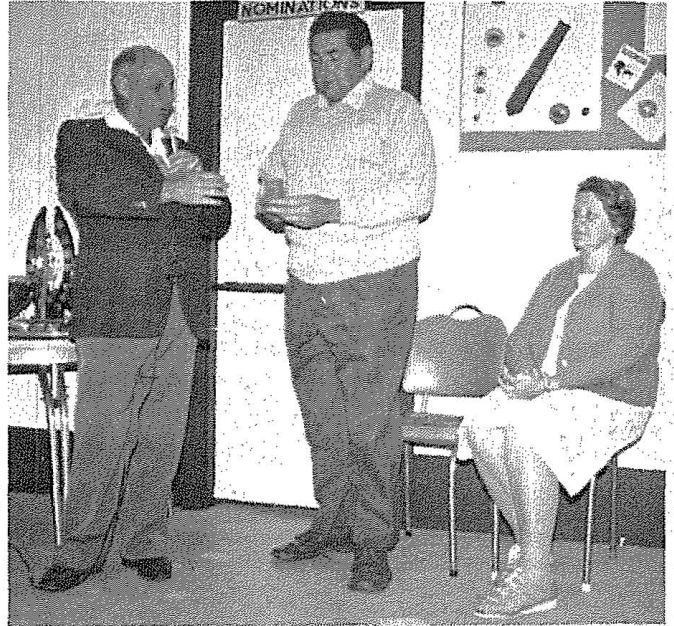

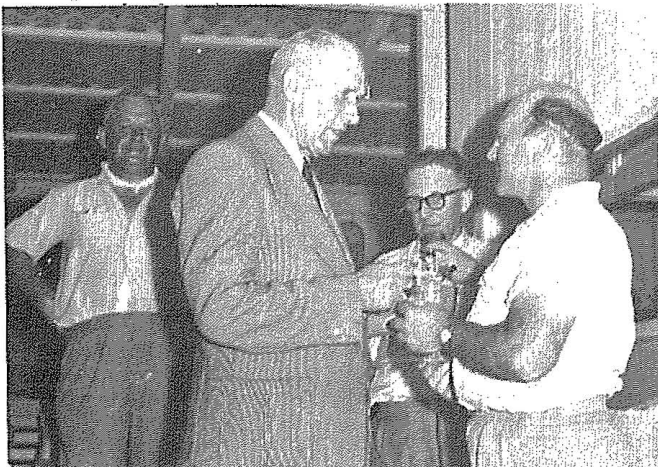
OUR HISTORY IN WORD & PICTURES

By George Biggs, ACTA Historian.



The 1950's saw a great leap forward for Clay Target Shooting in Australia — it was a decade of progress and development. Australia was recovering from the effects of World War 2, equipment in the way of clay target traps and throwers together with new types of guns and ammunition suitable for clay target shooting, was coming into the country more freely. Local targets and cartridges were being distributed throughout the country, new clubs were able to set up without the hassles of being unable to obtain the equipment needed.

1955, 19th ANNUAL MEETING of affiliated club delegates held on the Sunday of the National Championship series was the largest attended in the

history of the Association. Over sixty clubs were represented by appointed delegates, and there were also present a number of interested shooters as spectators.

One important decision reached was that the club affiliation fee from January 1, 1956 was fixed at 5 pound = \$10 instead of the figure of 1 pound = \$2.20 as at that present time. It was pointed out that the latter fee was more than 25 years ago, when money values were very different from those prevailing today. The meeting also decided to appoint one representative to the Executive Committee from each of the states of South Australia and Western Australia. New Executive members were Mr. J. Woodrow (SA) and Mr. C. Fletcher (WA). Mr Roy Alexander of 256 Wellington St, Perth was appointed official Referee Examiner for the state of W.A. This will mean that the State representation will comprise of: Queensland 3 members, New South Wales 4 members, Victoria 4 members, Tasmania 2 members, South Australia and Western Australia 1 member each. The meeting decided to rescind the motion, passed at the 1954 Annual Meeting, in regard to the formation of State Associations.





NEW EQUIPMENT FOR THE 1955 NATIONALS

An interesting innovation to be used for the first time during the National Series is the electric automatic releaser. The release is achieved merely by pressing a button held by the referee. The puller, of course, is retained for the purpose of recocking the trap. The electric release has now been in use at East Burwood for some time and has proved very satisfactory. A uniform release is automatic. It is quick and reliable and should prove a boon at the big carnival over March 11th through to 15th.

NOISE POLLUTION — “WHAT CAN IT DO TO YOU?”

From time to time we find that some Act is passed and not invoked — then, after a period of time it is suddenly “brought to life”. The Noise Control Act was introduced in 1975 and, with some amendments is now to be enforced.

All Gun Clubs are to be charged a fee — this, in itself, is extremely unfair as clubs are always situated away from populated areas — because of the safety factor. More importantly — this Noise Pollution Act — if invoked, can “close a club down”, evidence of this is the closure of Royal Aero Club and current problems that NSW Gun Club are experiencing. The basis of our \$5 fighting fund levy was invoked because a Council in Victoria wished to invoke this Act after complaints from residents.

This message is not only to Club Executives but to all shooters in NSW: write or contact personally your local member of State Parliament and register your protest. This Act is a political Act that, not only is another “rake-off” for money, but a very dangerous Act to every Club.

Quite a few clubs are situated miles from their nearest town or residents and yet they are being charged a fee of \$55 for noise pollution — what a joke. All fees, once introduced, are gradually increased, so what about next year and the year after etc etc.

Also, if one person lodged a complaint about “noise” and receives a sympathetic ear from the local Council or Police — it could result in the Club being closed completely — where is our so-called “freedom”?

Shooters — act now — not next week — contact your members and tell them that we do have a few rights left that should be left alone and not taxed.

I believe that this target should also be able to be shot at or refused by the shooter, and if shot at should be deemed to be a legal target and scored accordingly.

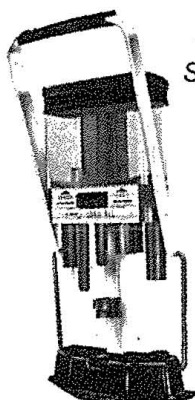

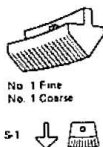

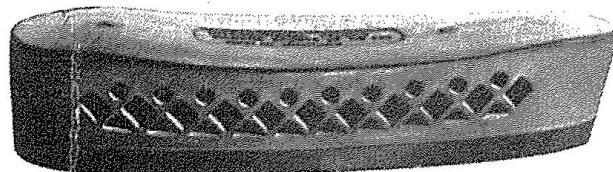

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

NATIONAL COACHING SCHEME

The National Coaching Scheme is operating well, and according to statistics gathered from coaching reports sent to me by accredited coaches throughout Australia, Club and Zone Coaches as well as State Directors are all working hard. 7,541 experienced and 7,197 novice shooters were coached in the 12 months to October, 1985.

The figures for novice shooters are particularly important; if a new shooter can achieve some success they are more likely to stay within the sport. The above figure also includes school children, as the school coaching schemes are operating in all states. State police forces and the armed forces are also making use of our accredited coaches as are the National Parks and Wildlife Services. While these are separate organisations, the contacts with our coaches are avenues to create community recognition of our sport, contribute something to the community and at the same time introduce possible new members to clay shooting.

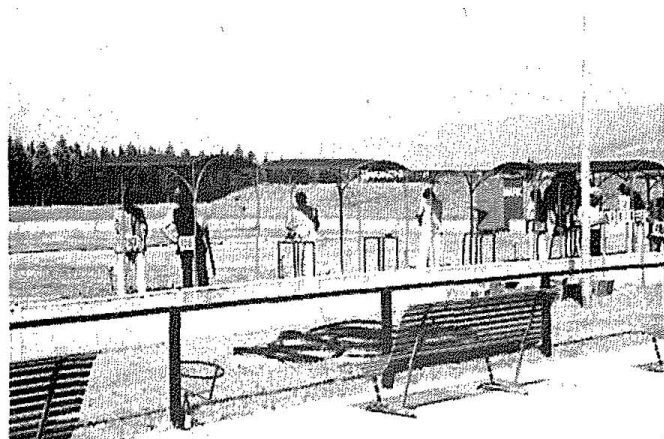
I recently contributed to a study of the coaching accreditation scheme, asked for by the state and federal sports ministers, the findings of that study reflect what many of our coaches have been saying. Coaches in all sports apparently feel that club, zone and state administrators don't recognise the contribution that they as accredited coaches can make to decision making in their clubs etc. Administrators are felt by coaches to undervalue what they do. I personally believe that this situation has changed a little in our sport as the coaches have become more professional and the benefits of their work becomes more obvious.

It is important, I believe to have input by coaches into all levels of decision making, because the accredited coach as part of their job, must look at things from the shooters point of view, consider the shooters feelings and encourage the shooters enjoyment of clay shooting. That being so the coach can act, to an extent as the shooters advocate, and as such should have some input into administrative decisions that affect shooters.

Coaching seminars have been held in most states. I would like to thank the State Coaching Directors for the work that they have done in this last year, and on their behalf thank the Zone and Club Coaches for their continued efforts.

NATIONAL I.S.U. SQUAD

The National Squad has for the first time this year, two juniors as members. Michael Inguanti and Brett Dunstan. The squad attended a training week at the Institute of

Sport in Canberra, where we have the benefit of the experts and equipment. Other sports are now following our lead and have National Squads that compete against each other to represent their sport in overseas teams. This year's squad are currently eliminating to see which shooters will represent us at the South Pacific games.

THE WORLD MOVING TARGET CHAMPIONSHIPS

The team members to shoot in Italy were Trap, John Harris W.A., Bill Iles Vic., Terry Rumbel N.S.W. and Brett Dunstan, junior Vic; and in Skeet, Alex Crikis, John Summers, Brian Thomson and Michael Inguanti, junior, all of Victoria.

We arrived in Italy in time to compete in a major shoot, "The Grande Italia", unfortunately there was no skeet section to the Grande Italia, as we were informed on arrival that the skeet season had closed in Italy. All of the trench shooters performed well in the "Grande Italia"; there were over 400 competitors, with Bill Iles ultimately taking 2nd place in the Grande Barrage.

Terry Rumbel won another competition, "The Lonato District Championship" against 290 competitors. The European countries are at the end of their summer and have, as have the Americans, a season of hard training and competition. There are major events in Europe almost on a weekly basis during the summer, and the shooters become match hardened, they must shoot top scores under pressure continually. As nearly all of the top world shooters are sponsored, either by Governments or Companies, they can train on a continual basis. None of our shooters can afford to do this, so the lead up competition is important to give our shooters some feel of big match pressure.

There is a great difference in world championships and Olympic Games in that the shooters are representing their country as well as the Clay Target Association and the subconscious desire to perform well for Australia as a team exerts much greater pressure still. As a shooter in these two contests you are competing against the best in the world. 63 nations send their best. In Trap there were 99 competitors, Bill Iles was placed 28th alphabetically with the 11th highest score, John Harris shot equal 13th score and Terry Rumbel equal 14th.

In Skeet 86 competed with Alex Crikis and John Summers sharing 27th place alphabetically with the 7th highest score. Brian Thomson shot the 8th highest score. The two juniors performed extremely well, I cannot speak highly enough of their behaviour and performances. Michael with exception of one round shot excellent scores, being placed 11th with the 7th score. Brett was placed 23rd with the 13th highest score in trap. Brett shot extremely well with consistent scores. We have every reason

to be proud of these two young Australians.

The team members all received a Masters Medal for shooting scores in the top 15%. The shooters' disappointment at not winning medals is understandable, but that will only increase their determination to work hard to win one next time.

Sergio Zuffo of Olympic Targets supplied the team with donations of targets and ammunition for the Juniors.

Winchester also donated ammunition for the team, the support given was really much appreciated by all team members and we look forward to an ongoing association with both Winchester and Olympic Targets.

I take this opportunity to welcome Alan Maher, the Executive Director to our sport, and thank him for his assistance and co-operation.

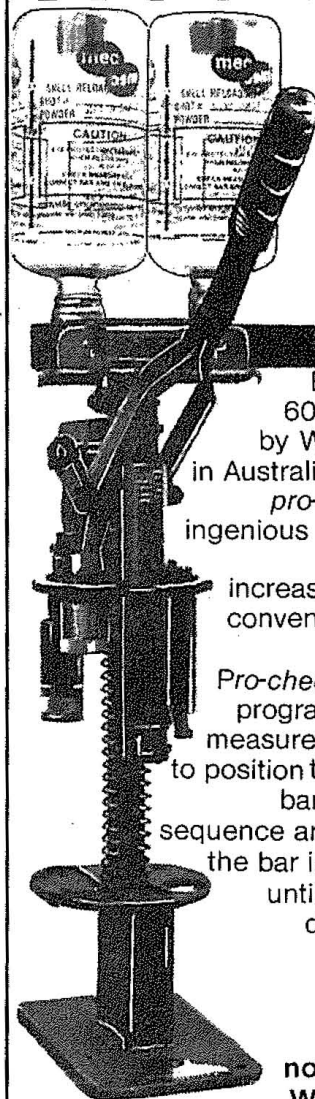

A personal check with the availability of accommodation indicated that although accommodation is filling up, there is still plenty of all types available, i.e. motel, caravan parks, holiday units etc.

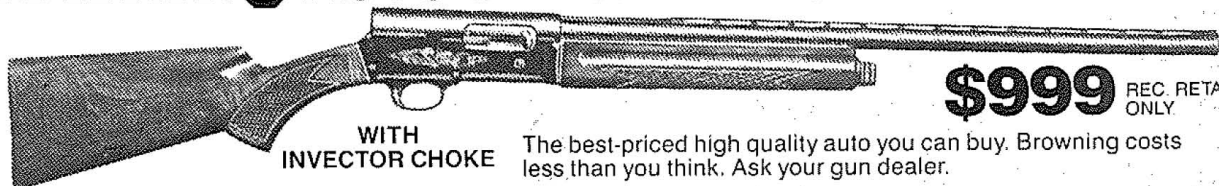

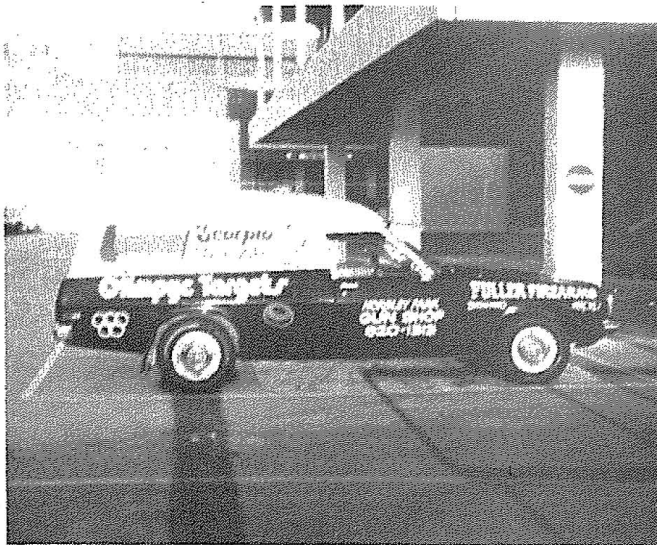

CLAY TARGET SHOOTER WINS SPORTS STAR AWARD

The innovative idea of regional games was spearheaded recently with the holding of the South West Games in the lower corner of Western Australia at Bunbury.

The games are held on a shire basis rather than a club basis. Thirteen shires participated with a total of 8,500 competitors in 15 sports ranging from Equestrian events to swimming.

With the style of the games modelled on the Olympics, each event winners were presented with gold, silver and bronze medals. The closing ceremony saw a march of the medal winners.

Over 100 competitors were involved in the clay target events which were held over two weekends at the Bunbury clay target club.

The first weekend was devoted entirely to skeet with both I.S.U. and standard skeet being shot. Skeet standards were high with 97/100's shooting off. Trap, shot the following weekend over 100 targets, saw scores and attendance expectedly high.

It was on a high note that clay target shooting made its mark. The sportsperson of the games as voted by a panel of judges on personal performances was Bunbury shooter June Roach who won gold in the women's division of every event with scores comparable to the A grade men's division.

It was found during the week of the games that the extra involvement from everybody, invoked a sense of comradeship not normally seen. It was for this reason that the clubs involved in aiding the shires to establish the format, now thoroughly recommend the regional games concept.

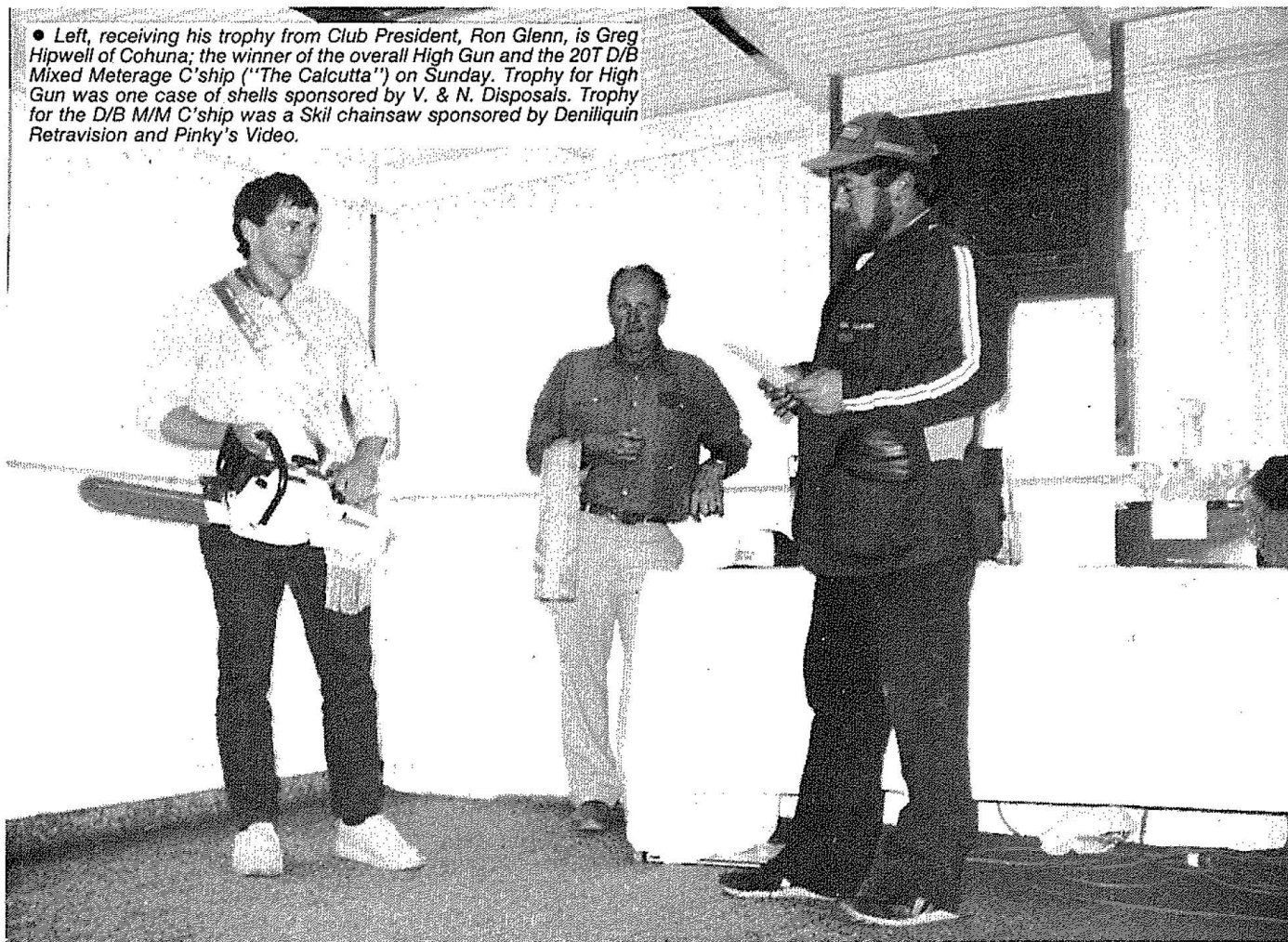

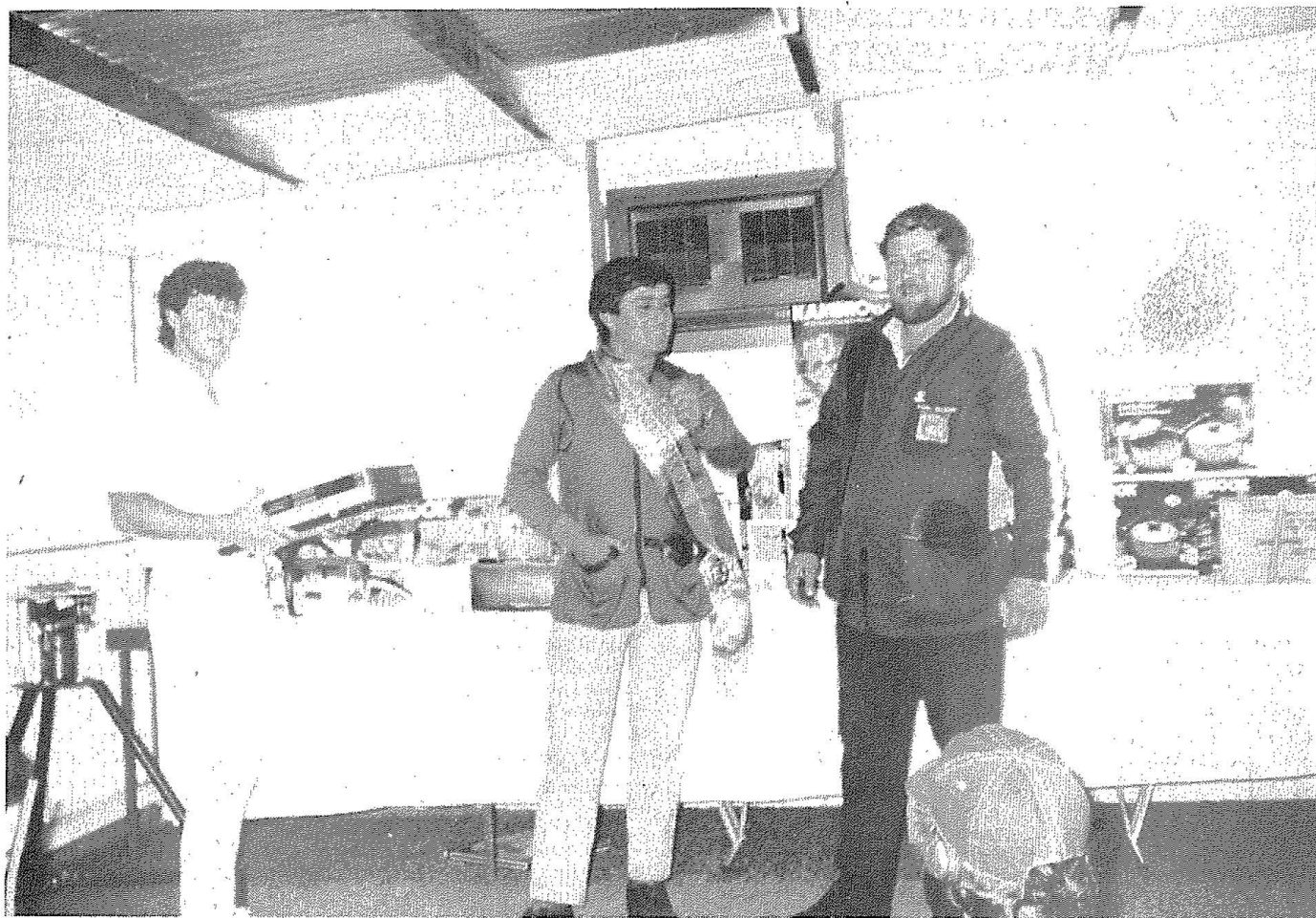

OBITUARY

CLIVE G. EVANS

Cunningham, Warwick, Queensland

Clay target shooters of Australia, and Queensland in particular, have lost one of their oldest and longest shooting members in the passing on October 16th 1985, of Clive Evans at the age of 97 years.

Clive shot actively until the last two or three years and had maintained an active interest in the performances of Australia's top shooters since then. He hit top form in the 1920s and followed live pigeon shooting as well as clay shooting.

In 1934 he won the Southern Hemisphere Clay Pigeon Championship in Melbourne and was runner-up in the Southern Hemisphere Live Pigeon Championship in the same year.

He shot in Brussels and Monte Carlo in the '30s and was a regular competitor in Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane clubs where he was a backmarker on handicap until the close of live bird shooting.

During his sixty-five years of trap shooting he won trophies and championships too numerous to mention including winning a championship at Ballandean Gun Club in his 85th year.

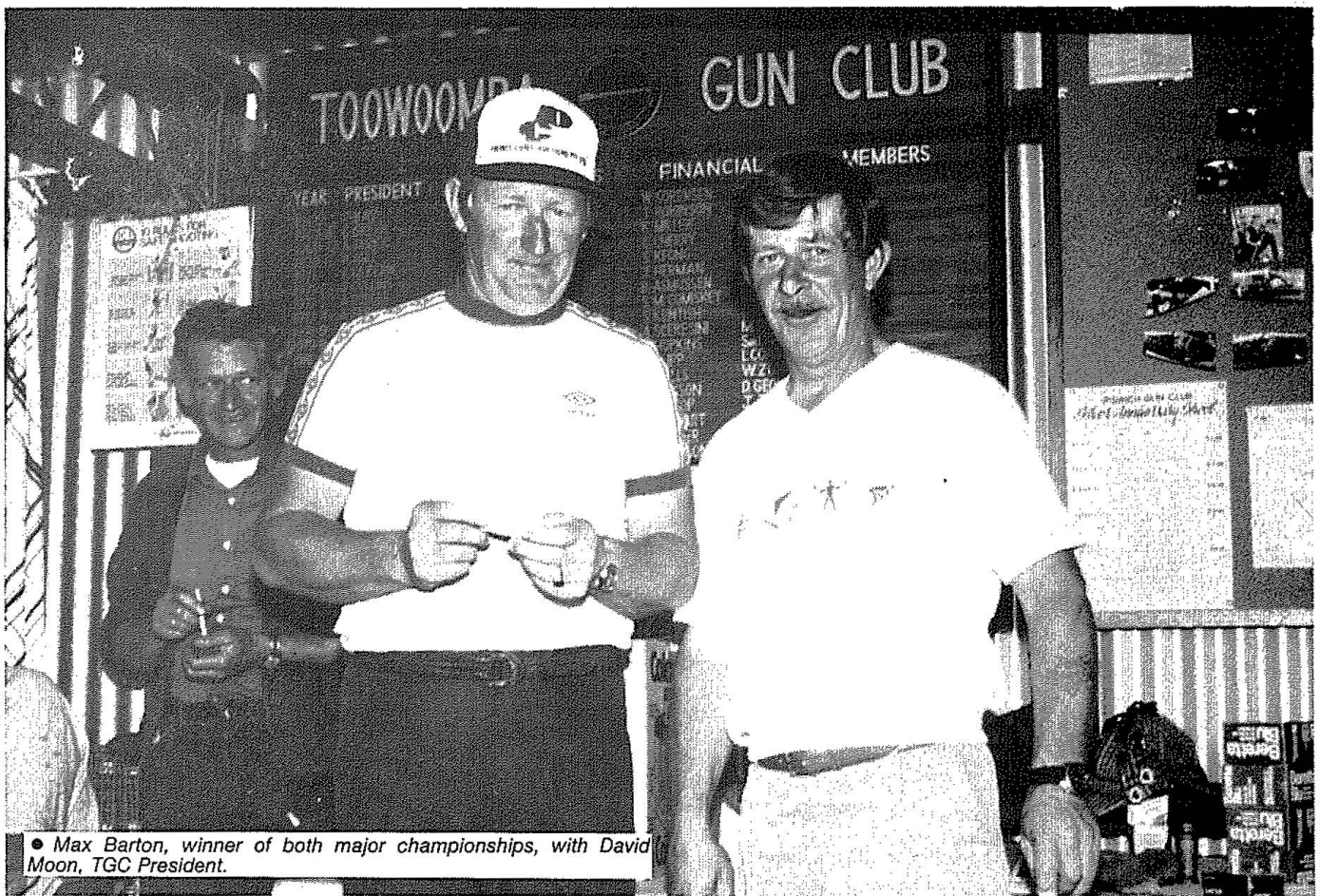

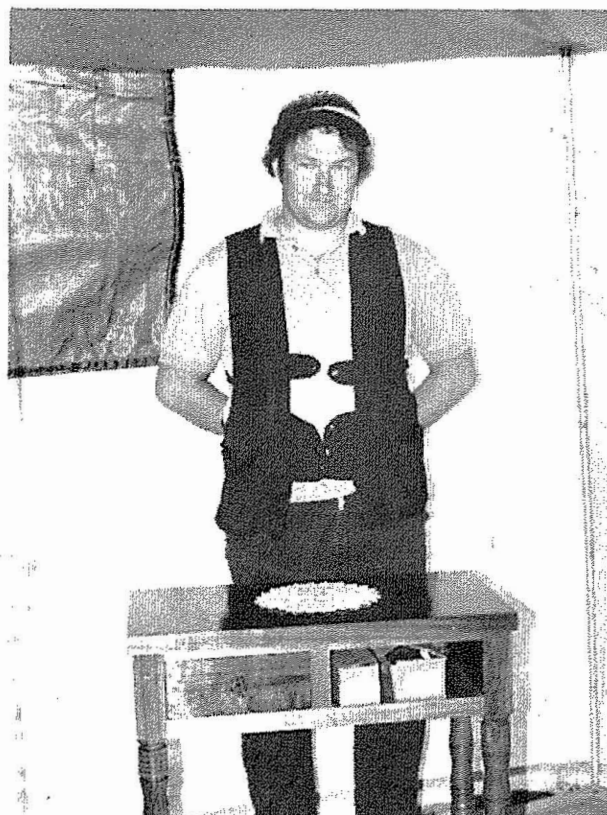

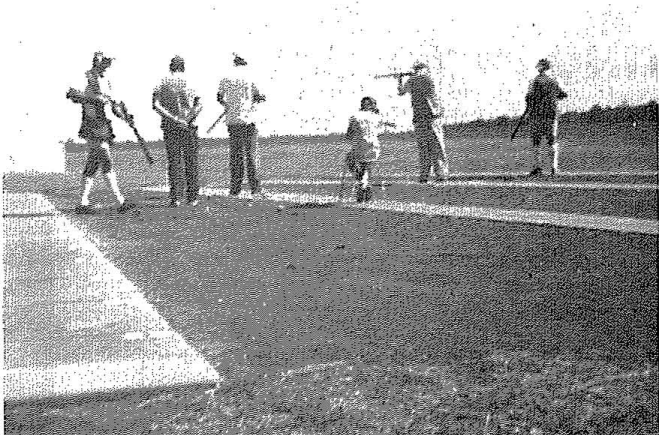

The hearing dogs concept was initiated in Minnesota in 1975, and Lions of Australia has sponsored and developed a training complex in Verdun, 20km from Adelaide. Dogs are trained to assist deaf people by making them aware of callers at the door, response to telephone calls and warning their masters of dangers their affliction may prevent them from detecting.

In specific instances the dog can be trained to alert its master to a baby crying, alarm clocks, whistling kettles or other special needs.

Most shooters have an affinity with dogs and this unique cause is well worth your support. If you are free on New Year's Day make the trip to Geelong — your attendance would be appreciated by the Geelong Club and the local Lions.

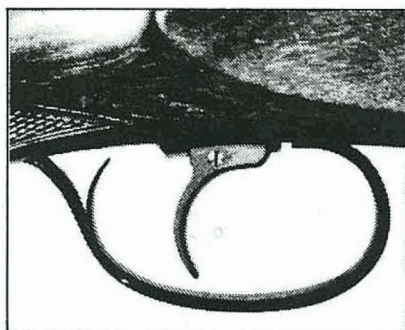

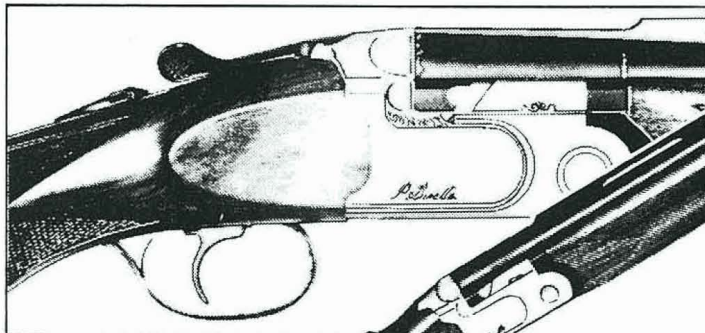
